Covid-19 | India records 3,095 fresh cases

NEW DELHI, Mar 31: India witnessed a single-day rise of 3,095 fresh COVID-19 cases with the active caseload increasing to 15,208, according to Union Health ministry data updated on Friday. The toll has risen to 5,30,867 with five deaths — one each

reported by Goa and Gujarat and three reconciled by Kerala — in a span of 24 hours, the data updated at 8 am said.

The daily positivity was recorded at 2.61 per cent while the weekly positivity was pegged at 1.91 per cent.

The total tally of Covid cases was recorded at 4.47 crore (4,47,15,786).

The active cases now comprise 0.03 per cent of the total infections while the national recovery rate has been recorded at 98.78 per cent, according to the ministry website.

The number of people who have recuperated from the disease is at 4.41 crore (4,41,69,711) while the case fatality was recorded at 1.19 per cent. According to the ministry website, 220.65 crore Covid vaccine doses have been administered under the nationwide drive so far.



Stigmatic termination order cannot be passed without detailed enquiry: DB

SRINAGAR, May 13 (Agencies): A Division Bench of the High Court of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh, comprising Chief Justice N Kotiswar Singh and Justice Wasim Sadiq Nargal, delivered a significant judgment stating that the termination of an employee cannot be carried out without conducting a thorough investigation and providing an opportunity for the employee to be heard. The court clarified that Rule 187 of the J&K Police Manual, which grants powers to take action against a probationary employee within three years of their enrollment, cannot be applied to permanent employees. The ruling was made in response to a writ petition filed by Shamim Ahmad, a con-

stable in the Jammu and

Kashmir Armed Police. Ahmad sought to challenge a judgment and order dated July 1, 2021, issued by the Central Administrative Tribunal (CAT) Jammu, which dismissed his petition against the discharge order without adhering to the principles of natural justice. Additionally, Ahmad requested the quashing of an order dated October 31, 2009, which resulted in his discharge without any investigation or consideration of natural justice. After hearing arguments from Advocate Sarfaraz Hamid Rather representing Ahmad, and Senior Additional Advocate General Monika Kohli representing the UT of J&K, the Division Bench concluded that Ahmad had

been discharged from service on September 7, 1994, based on Rule 187 of the J&K Police Manual, which stated that he had not proven to be a good police officer and had unsatisfactory conduct during the probation period. However, the court noted that a previous writ petition had already quashed the impugned order of November 2, 1994, giving the respondents the liberty to either use Rule 187 or conduct a regular inquiry. Nonetheless, the respondents discharged Ahmad without conducting a detailed investigation and attached a stigma to the order. The Division Bench emphasized that the impugned order was not

Sleaze, hypocrisy, fraud, corruption: The many ills that bedevil UK today

In this week of celebrations over King Charles III's coronation, ignoring the sceptres of the anointed isle, I choose to dwell upon examples of British hypocrisy, sleaze, corruption and fraud. These are not by any means peculiar characteristics of this "seat of Mars". The sin of some other nations puts the UK in the listening side of the confessional. Start with the fun one. A reputable barrister, known for her

defence of left-wing activists and her stances on human rights is one Helena Kennedy KC (King's Counsel). I know of her and met her once through my late ex-wife Mala Sen, whose friend she was. In 1994 Helena had published an essay which criticised the monarchy. "It is understandable that many see it as the fountainhead of snobbery and class division, creating a corrosive culture with its defenders, often sycophantically allied to its continuance because patronage is one of the

pegs which secures its hold." Well said? Helena is now a baroness and as the announcements for the coronation ceremonials of what she called "an institution which surrounds itself with the unworthy notion of aristocracy" were published, we were told that the Queen Consort's rod will be carried in the coronation procession and presented to Her Majesty by -- you guessed it -- Baroness Helena Kennedy.

Okay, as she wrote, she "sycophantically allied... etc". So what? No corruption here!

And so, to more serious stuff involving fraud, corruption and



hypocrisy. Start with the fraud.

A parliamentary investigative committee has concluded that during the Covid-19 pandemic, under the supervision of PM Boris Johnson, chancellor Hedgie Sunak and health secretary Matt Hancock, £4.5 billion was handed out to fraudsters through errors in the furlough and self-employed Covid support schemes initiated by Hedgie.

This calculated sum attributed to "fraud" does not include the exorbitant sums paid out to suppliers of unusable face masks and deficient anti-virus equipment destined for hospitals.

It certainly doesn't include the billions spent on the completely ineffective "Test and Trace" schemes headed by the pallocracy of the BoJo government's ministers, who had little or no expertise relevant to the running of these.

The £4.5 billion and the taxpayers' billions spent on friends in the pallocracy and on benefactors' contracts taking advantage of the pandemic, will never be recovered. And yet, and yet last week Hedgie announced his support for Cruella Braverman's policy of hiring large houseboats into

which they will put asylum seekers because, said Hedgie, it would be cheaper to house them -- to me manifestly the wretched of the earth and some not-so-wretched shysters -- in these flotillas rather than in inland hotels and accommodation. He said the taxpayer was handing out £6 million a week for this accommodation. Even if one accepts this exaggeration, that would mean £6 million multiplied by 52 a year, which amounts to £312 million annually. Is there any comparison to the £4.5 billion that the taxpayer lost to error, corruption and fraud?

The refusal by Cruella and Hedgie to compare the figures of expenditure and the drain on the taxpayer, figures which are made public on the same day appeals, gentle reader, to put it mildly, as evasion or hypocrisy.

According to another parliamentary committee, fraud accounted for 41 per cent of all crime in Britain. I must confess that I regularly receive emails and other notifications that I have won the Nigerian lottery, or that I am beneficiary of the will of a distant relative called Archimedes Dhondy, or that a close friend of mine has had his passport and wallet stolen in some remote part of the world and I am to either send my back account details including any passwords so that my winnings or inheritance can be deposited, or I can buy Amazon credit vouchers and sent them to my destitute stranded friend. I admit that out of sheer

laziness and an attitude that money doesn't make for happiness, I have avoided handing over my bank details to the Nigerian lottery and forfeited a few million pounds in winnings, even though I've never bought a ticket. As for helping a friend who is stranded in some remote part of the world, it serves him bloody well right for going on holiday without offering to pay for me to accompany him.

The fact is that £4.7 billion is lost through fraudulent dealings each year in the UK. The Action Fraud institution of the government gets 300,000 complaints from individuals and 600,000 per year from businesses. Only one per cent of these lead to prosecutions as the City of London police, which oversees Action, Fraud has not been given the manpower or the funds to investigate this volume of fraudulent crime. The home office's attitude to this criminal activity has been to assign two per cent of its newly recruited police officers to the fraud squad.

It's all politics! Cruella probably believes that the victims of fraud can suffer, as putting resources and rhetoric into redressing the wrongs done to them has no real political advantage for her. Rhetoric against asylum seekers has.

The expansion of greenery in the cities will prove to be a valuable investment in solving the problem. In the Consumer Protection Act 1986, the lawmakers defined six basic consumer rights. Right to Safety: Consumers are protected from the marketing of goods and services that are dangerous to their life and property. It emphasizes on the quality of goods and services.

Right to be informed: Right to be informed: Consumers have the right to be informed about the quality, quantity, ingredients, purity, regulatory standards and prices of goods and no such information should be willfully withheld from them.

Right to choose: Whenever possible, consumers should be given access to a variety of goods and services at different prices.

Right to be heard: Right to be heard: The interests of the consumer must be kept in mind. They have the right to form associations which will represent them in all relevant matters.

Right to Consumer Education: Consumers have the right to acquire knowledge to become an informed consumer.

These rights are the basis of consumer protection in India. Additionally, the Consumer Protection Act 2019 introduced five new consumer rights which include Right to lodge complaint from anywhere; Right to seek compensation in view of product liability; right to consumer protection; right to be heard using video conferencing; and right to know why the complaint was rejected. ogists. The hype for Al-generated songs started with David Guetta. In February, the French DJ shared a video of him playing a song that used AI technology to



I don't think AI can actually replace the uniqueness of a person. There are people who are doing digital art, and that's great, but there will be value for people who still use brushes, paint, and oil."



UDP wins Sohiong seat in Meghalaya deferred poll

GUWAHATI, May 13 (Agencies): The United Democratic Party (UDP) won the deferred election to the Sohiong seat, the results of which were declared on Saturday.

The UDP's Synshar Lyngdoh Thabah defeated Samlin Malngiang of the National People's Party (NPP) by 3,422 votes. Thabah polled 16,679 votes against 13,257 by Malngiang.

UDP chief Metbah Lyngdoh was ecstatic. He expressed his gratitude to people for reposing their faith in the UDP and its candidate. "The results were on expected lines. We could feel the pulse of people during our election campaign. I have been a part of the campaign and I could feel people were going to vote for us," Lyngdoh told TNIE.

Assembly election in the state was held on February 27 but Sohiong could not go to that poll due to the demise of the UDP candidate HDR Lyngdoh.

Lyngdoh said various factors, including a sympathy wave, worked in the UDP's favour in the deferred election to the seat.

"People looked at various factors. Our candidate is a very down-to-earth person high in confidence and he was able to get the love of people. Another factor is regionalism. People viewed the UDP as the biggest regional party that could sustain all these years," Lyngdoh said.

With this win, the UDP's tally rose to 12 in the 60-member Assembly. The UDP is an ally of the ruling Meghalaya Democratic Alliance which Chief Minister Conrad K Sangma's NPP heads. The NPP had bagged 26 seats in the Assembly elections. With 11 seats, the UDP had emerged as the secondlargest party.

Apart from UDP and NPP, BJP, Congress, Hill State People's Democratic Party and Trinamool Congress contested the Sohiong polls. A voter turnout of 91.87% was recorded when the by-poll was held on May 10.

IAF to develop Kevlar safety screens for gunners on Dhruv helicopters

CHANDIGARH, May 13 (Agencies): Even as safety concerns continue to dog the Dhruv helicopter fleet, the Air Force has initiated a project to develop Kevlar safety screens to protect on board machine gunners during operations.

The project is being undertaken by IAF's No.3 Base Repair Depot at Chandigarh, which is primarily responsible for the maintenance and overhaul of Russianorigin helicopters.

When required, machineguns are mounted in the doorframe of transport helicopters to provide fire support during special heli-borne operations such as airborne assault, troop insertion or search and rescue missions in hostile territory. Such situations make the gunner prone to enemy ground fire. The Kevlar screens,

G7 finance leaders vow to contain inflation, strengthen supply chains but avoid mention of China

Finance leaders' talks lay the groundwork for a summit of G-7 leaders in Hiroshima next week that US President Biden is expected to attend

NIIGATA (JAPAN), May 13 (Agencies): The Group of Seven's top financial leaders united Saturday in their support for Ukraine and their determination to enforce sanctions against Russia for its aggression but stopped short of any overt mention of China.

The finance ministers and central bank chiefs ended three days of talks in Niigata, Japan, with a joint statement pledging to bring inflation under control while aiding those suffering the most from surging prices.

They also committed to collaborating to build more stable, diversified supply chains for developing clean energy sources and to "enhance economic resilience globally against various shocks."

The statement did not include any specific mention of China or assertions regarding "economic coercion" in pursuit of political objectives, such as penalising the companies of countries whose governments take actions that anger another country.

Talk this week of "economic coercion" by China had drawn outraged rebukes from Beijing. Officials attending the talks in this port city reportedly had balked at overtly condemning China, given the huge stake most countries have in good relations with the rising power and No. 2 economy.

The finance leaders' talks laid the groundwork for a summit of G-7 leaders in Hiroshima next week that President Joe Biden is expected to attend despite a crisis over the US debt ceiling that could result in a national default if it is not resolved in the coming weeks.

Treasury Secretary Janet Yellen has warned that would bring an economic catastrophe, destroying hundreds of thousands of jobs and potentially disrupting financial markets across the globe. No mention of the issue was made in the finance leaders' statement.

The stakes for the global economy and stability are high. Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida said as the finance talks drew to a close.

"The international community is facing a historic turning point, facing divisions and conflicts such as Russia's invasion of Ukraine and Sudan," Kishida said in a statement issued late Friday.

The G-7 will "resolutely reject the threat or use of nuclear weapons and uphold the international order based on the rule of law," Kishida said. "As G-7 chairman, I will convey my strong will to have an impact on history."

The G-7's devotion to protecting what it calls a "rules-based international order" got only a passing mention in the stateturmoil in the banking industry and the potential of a default on the U.S. national debt if Biden and Congress do not resolve soon an impasse over the debt ceiling as the government runs out of funds to pay its bills.

As host of the G-7 this year, Japan was also seeking support for launching a "partnership" to strengthen supply chains to reduce the risk of disruptions similar to those seen during the pandemic, when supplies of items of all kinds, from medicines to edible oil to high-tech computer chips, ran short in many countries.

Tensions with China, and with Russia over its war on Ukraine, have loomed large during the talks in Japan, the G-7's only Asian member.

The G-7 finance ministers and central bank chiefs said they would discuss ways to prevent what they are calling "economic coercion" by China. That drew sharp retorts from Beijing.

China is a victim of economic coercion, Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesperson Wang Wenbin said.

"If any country should be criticized for economic coercion, it should be the United States. The US has been overstretching the concept of national security, abusing export controls and taking discriminatory and unfair measures against foreign companies," Wang said in a routine news briefing.

China accuses Washington of hindering its rise as an increasingly affluent, modern nation through trade and investment restrictions that Yellen said were narrowly targeted to protect American economic security.

Imran Khan back at Lahore residence after securing bail in many cases



LAHORE, May 13 (Agencies): Pakistan's former prime minister Imran Khan reached his residence here on Saturday early morning after a prolonged standoff with authorities in Islamabad during which he was made to stay on the court premises over the provision of security to him despite being granted bail in a number of cases.

The Islamabad High Court (IHC) on Friday granted him protective bail for two weeks in a corruption case and barred the authorities from arresting the former Pakistan prime minister in any case registered anywhere in the country until Monday.

Three different benches of the IHC granted relief to the 70-year-old Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) chief who was escorted to the court amid tight security.

Before his departure for Lahore after securing blanket bails from the IHC in a number of cases related to treason and violence and one related to the Al-Qadir Trust corruption case in which he was arrested early this week, Khan was allegedly made to stay more than three hours in the court by the Islamabad police on the security details.

He left the court premises after a protracted standoff with authorities.

Upon reaching his Zaman Park residence here. Khan was greeted by a number of jubilant PTI workers who showered rose petals on his vehicle, danced to the tune of drums and conducted massive fireworks.

They also chanted slogans in favour of Khan and against the ruling PML-Nled coalition.

The PTI released a video of Khan entering the house where his sisters and other family members welcomed him and enquired about his health.

Khan, who is demanding snap general elections, is facing over 120 cases across the country.

"Islamabad Inspector General of Police (IG) Akbar Nasir tried his best to retain me at the capital's high court. They did not let us leave for three hours, saving that it's dangerous outside," the PTI chief said in a video message from his vehicle in which he was travelling back to Lahore.

He said he told the IG that he would tell the entire Pakistan that he was kidnapping him and upon this he let him ao.

Germany Unveils New \$3 Billion Weapons

Bangladesh evacuations ahead of 'very severe' Cyclone Mocha

TEKNAF, May 13 (Agencies): Bangladesh Saturday moved to evacuate Rohingya refugees from "risky areas" to community centres and hundreds fled an island as the most powerful cyclone in nearly two decades barrelled towards the country and neighbouring Myanmar, officials said.

Cyclone Mocha was packing winds of up to 175 kilometres per hour (109 miles per hour) and meteorological officials in Dhaka classed it as "very severe", with their Indian counterparts calling it "extremely severe".

It is expected to make landfall on Sunday morning between Cox's Bazar, where nearly one million Rohingya refugees live in camps largely made up of flimsy shelters, and Sittwe on Myanmar's western Rakhine coast.

"Cyclone Mocha is the most powerful storm since Cyclone Sidr," Azizur Rahman, the head of Bangladesh's Meteorological Department, told agency.

That cyclone hit Bangladesh's

southern coast in November 2007, killing more than 3,000 people and causing billions of dollars in damage.

Bangladeshi authorities have banned the Rohingya from constructing permanent concrete homes, fearing it may incentivise them to settle permanently rather than return to Myanmar, which they fled five years ago.

"We live in houses made of tarpaulin and bamboo," said refugee Enam Ahmed, who lives at the Nayapara camp near the border town of Teknaf. "We are scared. We don't know where we will be sheltered. We are in a panic."

Forecasters expect the cyclone to bring a deluge of rain, which can trigger landslides. Most of the camps are built on hillsides and landslips are a regular phenomenon in the region.

The storm is also predicted to unleash a storm surge up to four metres (13 feet) high, which can inundate low-lying coastal and riverine villages.

Officials said thousands of volunteers were evacuating Rohingyas from "risky areas" to more solid structures such as schools. But Bangladesh's deputy refugee commissioner Shamsud Douza told AFP: "All the Rohing-

yas in the camps are in risk." Panic has also gripped some 8,000 people in Bangladesh's southernmost island of Saint Martin's with the tiny coral outcrop -- one of the country's top resort districts -- right in the storm's path. Resident Dilara Begum travelled to Teknaf to wait out the storm.

"Many have also left," she said. "It is an island in the middle of the sea. We have been living in fear over the past few days."

Officials said around 1,000 Saint Martin's islanders have done the same, moving 250 boats to Teknaf to try to prevent them being washed away.

Operations were suspended at the country's largest seaport, Chittagong, with boat transport and fishing activities also halted.



BERLIN, May 13 (Agencies): Germany is preparing a new weapons package for Ukraine worth 2.7 billion euros, reportedly Berlin's largest since Russia invaded last year, the defence ministry said Saturday.

"We all hope for a rapid end to this terrible war by Russia against the Ukrainian people, but unfortunately this is not in sight," Defence

Minister Boris Pistorius said in a statement.

"This is why Germany will supply all the help that it can, for as long as necessary," he said.

The package, worth \$3 billion, will include 30 additional Leopard-1 tanks, Marder armoured vehicles, air-defence systems and surveillance drones, the ministry said. Der Spiegel magazine said it would be Germany's largest since the outbreak of the war.

It comes as Ukraine President Volodymyr Zelensky is expected to travel to Rome on Saturday for talks with political leaders, which could be followed by a trip to Berlin.

German officials have not confirmed the visit, but Berlin police have opened an inquiry after details of a possible trip attributed to the force appeared in the media.

Western allies have delivered increasingly powerful weapons to Kyiv since Russia sent its forces into Ukraine in February 2022, though so far not the advanced fighter jets that Zelensky has requested.

Germany last year provided military support worth two billion euros and had earmarked 2.2 billion euros for this year, though details had not yet been finalised.

Berlin has also promised to supply its more advanced Leopard-2 tanks, and has begun training Ukrainian soldiers on their use.

Now BJP won't have courage to 'allow' assembly polls in J&K: **Omar after karnataka poll results**

SRINAGAR, May 13 (Agencies): National Conference (NC) leader Omar Abdullah on Saturday said there is "no way" the BJP will have the courage to "allow" assembly elections in Jammu and Kashmir after its performance in the Karnataka polls.

The Congress, which has won 74 of the 224 assembly seats in Karnataka so far and is leading in 62, is striding towards victory, while the BJP has won 34 and is ahead in 30, according to the latest trends

on the Election Commission website.

"Now there is no way BJP will have the courage to allow assembly elections to take place in Jammu and Kashmir any time soon #KarnatakaElectionResults," Abdullah, the vice president of the NC, said in a tweet. Non-BJP parties,

including NC, PDP and Congress, in Jammu and Kashmir have been demanding assembly elections in the Union Territory. The last assembly polls in the erstwhile state took place in 2014.

In 2018, the then Governor Satya Pal Malik dissolved the assembly after the BJP withdrew support to the Mehbooba Mufti led PDP-BJP alliance. Jammu and Kashmir was put under the Central rule and in 2019, it was divided into Union territories of Jammu and Kashmir

termination but a punitive one. The language used in the order categorized Ahmad as a bad police officer, which the court deemed unlawful. Such an order could only be issued following a proper departmental inquiry. The court emphasized the right to life and personal liberty, including the right to livelihood, as guar-

anteed by Article 21 of the Constitution of India. It stated that before taking any action to terminate an employee's services, a reasonable opportunity must be given to the employee to present their case and comply with the principles of natural justice, which had not been followed in Ahmad's case.

The court further noted that the order of discharge was based on allegations of misconduct, requiring the respondents to conduct a regular inquiry and provide an opportunity for Ahmad to be heard, as per their legal obligation. The court clarified that a discharge order could be issued under Rule 187, even if it was motivated by the incumbent's omissions or commissions. However, such deficiencies should not be mentioned in the termination or discharge order, as it would render the order stigmatic and legally unsustainable. If the discharge order was issued without mentioning any deficiencies, it could be considered a simple discharge and upheld.

Family stages protest as student found hanging in Kathua

Adani to raise Rs 21,000 crore from share sale in two group companies

Group's flagship firm Adani Enterprises Ltd plans to raise Rs 12,500 crore and Adani Transmission Rs 8,500 crore

NEW DELHI, May 13 (Agencies): Billionaire Gautam Adani's group will raise Rs 21,000 crore (over USD 2.5 billion) through share sale in two group companies in the boldest comeback strategy after the portsto-energy conglomerate was rocked by allegations of fraud levelled by a US short-seller.

Adani Enterprises Ltd, the group's flagship firm, plans to raise Rs 12,500 crore, while electricity transmission company Adani Transmission another Rs 8,500 crore, the companies said in stock exchange filings. The board of renewable energy arm, Adani Green Energy Ltd too was scheduled to meet on Saturday for a fundraise but the meeting was postponed to May 24.

The fundraise will be through issue of shares to qualified institutional buyers. Sources aware of the matter said investors in Europe and the Middle East have evinced strong interest.

In a stock exchange filing, Adani Enterprises said its board on Saturday approved "raising of funds by way of issuance of... equity shares having face value



of Rs 1 each of the company and / or other eligible securities or any combination thereof, for an aggregate amount not exceeding Rs 12,500 crore or an equivalent amount thereof by way of qualified institutional placement (QIP) or other permissible mode in accordance with the applicable laws."

Adani Transmission in a separate filing said its board has approved "raising of funds by way of issuance of such number of equity shares having face value of Rs 10 each of the company and / or other eligible securities or any combination thereof, for an aggregate amount not exceeding Rs 8,500 crore or an equivalent amount thereof by way of QIP or other permissible mode in accordance with the applicable laws." This comes three months after Adani Enterprises was forced to abort a Rs 20,000 crore follow-

on public offering (FPO) in the wake of the Hindenburg report. The offer was fully subscribed but the company returned the

money to subscribers. The sources said the company stock which was offered in the price range of Rs 3,112 to Rs 3,276 in the FPO is now available at Rs 1,964 (at Friday's closing price). US short-seller Hindenburg Research in January released a damning report alleging accounting fraud and stock price manipulation at Adani Group, triggering a stock market rout that had erased about USD 145 billion in the conglomerate's market value at its lowest point.

Adani Group has denied all allegations by Hindenburg and is plotting a comeback strategy. The group has recast its ambitions as well as prepaid some loans to assuage investors.


Promoters in March sold stakes worth Rs 15,446 crore in four group companies to leading US-based global equity investment boutique GQG Partners.

The group has been trying to win back market confidence with a series of investor roadshows, early debt repayments, and plans to scale back its pace of spending on new projects.

The funds that Adani Group is looking to raise will be the conglomerate's biggest borrowing since the January 24 Hindenburg report. The money raised is intended to be used for funding the group's expansion projects.

RBI confident of 6.5% growth in current fiscal

Monetary policy on right track, says Governor Das



MUMBAI, May 13 (Agencies): Reserve Bank of India Governor Shaktikanta Das said the cooling off in headline inflation to 4.7% during April is "very satisfying". The Governor said the release of the official data gives confidence that the "monetary policy is on the right track".

He, however, declined to comment if the

release of the numbers will lead the RBI to be less hawkish or change the stance of the policy, quipping that all of it will be clear on the morning of June 8, when the next policy review is scheduled.

Speaking at the book launch of G-20 Sherpa Amitabh Kant's book 'Made in India', Das said the RBI is "quite optimistic and fairly confident" about the country's 6.5% real GDP growth rate in FY24 even though other analysts are not so sanguine.

Admitting that there is a statistical base effect, Das said one must speak to any entrepreneur to understand the growth momentum of higher sales every month.

Das said private investments are also picking up, and enlisted steel, cement and petrochemicals as among the sectors where this is seen.

If India grows at 6.5%, it will contribute 15% of the world growth in the vear, Das said, stressing that this is no mean achievement. Das also said the expenditure on research and development has to go up in both the private and public sector. "We also need to continue with reforms and also ensure that we keep accessing the best of technology," Das said.

Inflation falls to 18-month low of 4.7% in April

It was for the second month in a row that Consumer Price Index (CPI)-based inflation remained within the RBI's comfort zone of below 6%. The retail inflation

NEW DELHI, May 13 (Agencies): Homegrown auto major Tata Motors reported a consolidated net profit of Rs 5,408 crore in the fourth quarter ended March 31, 2023, led by improved volumes owing to strong domestic demand and better chip supplies at its British brand Jaguar Land Rover.

The company had posted a consolidated net loss of Rs 1,033 crore in the January-March quarter of 2021-22 fiscal, Tata Motors



said in a regulatory filing.

Revenue from operations stood at Rs 1,05,932 crore in the fourth quarter as against Rs 78,439 crore in the year-ago period, it added.

On a standalone basis, the automaker reported a net profit of Rs 2,696 crore for the period under review.

Sleep apnoea may raise risk of long Covid, reveals study

Punjab's 1st superspecialty centre, Institute of Liver and

Biliary Sciences, Mohali, to start soon



CHANDIGARH, May 13 (Agencies): Punjab Institute of Liver and Biliary Sciences (ILBS), Mohali, which is going to start its OPD services soon, will be the first government superspecialty institute in any branch of medicine or surgery in the state. The 50-bed institute will offer OPD as well as indoor services.

After Delhi, it will be second such institute for liver diseases in the country.

Apart from offering treatment for all kinds of liver ailments as well as liver transplant surgery, it will also offer DM course in hepatology and gastrointestinal surgery.

Dr Virendra Singh, a liver specialist and former head of PGI's department of hepatology, has been appointed the first director of the institute. He said the institute had started the process of recruitment of super specialists, faculty and paramedical staff for nine specialties that include hepatology, hepatology surgery, anaesthesia and intensive care, radiology, pathology, microbiology, biochemistry, transfusion medicine and hospital administration.

"Looking at the high prevalence of diseases like liver cirrhosis and hepatitis-C in Punjab, such a facility should have come up long back," Dr Singh said, adding that besides offering routine services, the institute would be connected with district hospitals through telemedicine. NEW YORK, May 13 (Agencies): People with obstructive sleep apnoea may be at significantly higher risk of suffering long Covid, according to a study.

Obstructive sleep apnoea (OSA) is a common disorder characterised by repetitive episodes of nocturnal breathing cessation due to upper airway collapse. However, the condition is often underdiagnosed.

The study, published online in the journal 'Sleep', found that observed increases in risk for long Covid in adults with sleep apnoea remained significant even when the research team accounted for obesity, hypertension, diabetes, and hospitalisation at the time of their



initial Covid infection, all known to independently contribute to risk for long Covid.

Women showed an 89 per cent increased likelihood of having long Covid if they had obstructive sleep apnea, compared to a 59 per cent increased chance for men. While the underly-

ing associations aren't clear, women with sleep apnea included in the study may have had more severe conditions than men.

Severity of obstructive sleep apnea was not controlled for, but sleep apnea is more likely to be undiagnosed in women—which could create a sample with women who have more severe cases. Other studies have also found that women may be more likely to be diagnosed with long Covid and seek health care for the condition. "There's still so much to uncover about long Covid, but this study will inform clinical care by identifying patients that should be watched more closely," said corresponding author Hannah Mandel, a senior research scientist at New York University - Langone Health, supported by the US National Institutes of Health (NIH).

"People with sleep apnoea who get infected with Covid should seek early treatment, pay attention to their symptoms, and keep up with their vaccinations to lower the risk of infection in the first place," she added.

The team reviewed data across three research networks of patients who had tested positive for Covid-19 between March 2020 and February 2022. Two networks included adult patients—with 330,000 patients and 1.7 million patients. The third included 102,000 children.

In contrast to the patterns seen in adults, the contribution of sleep apnoea to the risk of long Covid disappeared in children when the researchers controlled for other risk factors, including obesity.

Long Covid is an umbrella term for one or more symptoms that people can experience for weeks, months, or years after a Covid-19 infection. The symptoms include brain fog, fatigue, depression, and sleep disorders.

Traffic-related air pollution weakens brain function

IRVINE (CALIFOR-NIA), May 13 (Agencies): Memory loss, cognitive decline and the activation of neural pathways linked to the start of Alzheimer's disease were shown to be caused by exposure to air pollution caused by traffic in Irvine, according to research from the University of California, Irvine.

Masashi Kitazawa, PhD, associate professor of environmental and occupational health in the UCI Programme in Public Health, is the corresponding and senior author of the study. "The link between air pollution and Alzheimer's disease is concerning, as the prevalence of toxicants in ambient air is not just on the rise globally, but also hitting close to home here in Irvine," he said. The effects of particulate matter on brain function are not limited to what our studies show. The study's results are published in the journal

Toxicological Sciences.

Alzheimer's disease is the most common cause of dementia among the elderly and is a growing public health crisis in the US as well as in several other countries. Despite extensive research on all aspects of Alzheimer's disease, its exact origins remain elusive. Although genetic predispositions are known to play a prominent role in disease progression, growing bodies of evidence suggest that environmental toxicants, specifically air pollution,



may cause the onset of Alzheimer's disease.

Kitazawa and his team compared mouse models at two ages. Researchers exposed a group of 3- and 9-monthold mouse models to ultrafine particulate matter for 12 weeks via ambient air collected in Irvine. A second group was exposed to purified air. The differing ages were used to determine the potential impact of particulate matter exposure during highly vulnerable life stages: developing youth and the elderly.

Researchers conducted testing related to memory tasks and cognitive function and found that both benchmarks were impaired by exposure to particulate matter. Notably, they also discovered that their older models (12 months at the time of analysis) showed brain plaque build-up and glial cell activation, which are both known to increase inflammation associated with the onset of Alzheimer's disease. "Air pollution is one

of the very few prominent, modifiable environmental risk factors in Alzheimer's disease," said co-author Michael Kleinman, PhD, adjunct professor of environmental and occupational health in UCI's Program in Public Health. "Public

ulatory agencies need to accelerate efforts to reduce particulate matter levels in order to reduce the risk of Alzheimer's disease and other serious health conditions." Kitazawa added, "This evidence is alarming, and it's imperative that we take action to adopt effective and evidence-based regulations, spread awareness on lifestyle changes and work together to improve our air quality."

"Look, I agree with Ricky in terms of his sentiment. The only thing I would add is that conditions need to be taken into account. In India, there is no place for anchor batters and scores in this IPL have been high and even higher with Impact Players and sometimes needing 215, 220 to be

in the game," he said. "The way the game has changed, I think Powerplay is slightly more manageable as there are more fielders in the ring. As soon as the field is spread and spinners come into play, people like SKY have changed the game and door with performances and that's all he can do. Indian cricket is blessed to have so many options. Bennama was the aggressor in the second round as he moved around the ring to dodge Deepak's punches but the Indian breached his defence at regular intervals and hit some eye-catching right crosses.

The final round was fought intensely but the Frenchman was successful in blocking Deepak's blows to take the round.

Earlier, the 29-year-old Hussamuddin sustained a knee injury in his quarterfinals bout against J Diaz Ibanez of Bulgaria and decided against risking aggravation. "Hussamuddin gives a walkover due to injury and settles for bronze. He had a knee injury in the last bout after which he had pain and swelling," Boxing Federation of India stated.
