J&K | G20 delegates arrive in Srinagar for 3rd tourism working group meeting

Active Covid cases in Country decrease to 7,623

NEW DELHI, May 22 (Agencies): India recorded 473 new coronavirus infections, while the active cases dipped to 7,623, according to the Union health ministry data updated on Monday. The death toll has increased to 5,31,839 with seven deaths which include one fatality reconciled by Kerala, the data updated at 8 am stated.

The Covid case tally was recorded at 4.49 crore (4,49,86,934).

The active cases now comprise 0.02 per cent of the total infections and the national Covid-19 recovery rate has been recorded at 98.80 per cent, the ministry said.

The number of people who have recuperated from the disease surged to 4,44,47,472 while the case fatality rate was recorded at 1.18 per cent.

According to the ministry's website, 220.66 crore doses of Covid vaccines have been country so far under the nationwide vaccination drive.

MeT forecast fairly widespread rain in plains, snow over upper reaches in J&K

SRINAGAR, May 22 (Agencies)': Amid forecast for scattered to widespread light to moderate rain and thunderstorm from May 23, night temperature recorded a rise in Jammu and Kashmir on Monday.

A meteorological Department official said that from May 23 to 26th there would be "fairly widespread to widespread light to moderate rain/thunder/ lightning with possibility of Hailstorm and gusty winds at few palces. He said a few places over higher reaches may

receive light snowfall. The MeT has already issued "orange warning" for "isolated heavy rain thunder lightning with gusty winds 30-40 kmph" on May 23 in J&K. Also a yellow warning for "isolated thunder and lightning isolated thunder and lightning" has been forecast on May 25 and 26.

SRINAGAR, May 22 (Agencies): About 60 foreign delegates arrived here on Monday for the third tourism working group meeting of the G20 countries, officials said.

This is the first international meeting being held in Kashmir after the abrogation of Article 370 and the bifurcation of the erstwhile state into two Union Territories - Jammu and Kashmir, and Ladakh - in August 2019.

Officials said the delegates from several countries of the G20 grouping arrived in a chartered flight at the Srinagar international airport in the morning amidst tight security.

They said the delegates were taken to the Sher-e-Kashmir International Convention Centre (SKICC), the venue of the meeting, amid heavy deployment of security personnel along the route. The stretch has received a facelift with G20 logos painted on walls and hoardings to welcome the delegates.

Officials said stringent security arrangements have been made to ensure that the event concludes incident-free.

While the Boulevard Road around the SKICC has been made a no-go zone for the three days, there is mas-



sive deployment of security forces on the route taken by the delegates, and the Airport Road to Dalgate stretch, officials said.

They said security has been beefed up across the valley with the elite NSG and Marine Commandos helping police and paramilitary forces to secure the venues of the event, they

RECYCLING BENEFITS

ecycling involves the process of collecting waste materials, breaking them down into blocks that can be turned into new products. There are mainly five types of waste material. This includes paper, steel, glass, aluminum and plastic. All of these have been recycled using various methods.

Paper waste includes paper sheets, newspapers, cardboard and other papers used in offices and educational institutions. Paper has 2 components – wood and water. So firstly through recycling the paper is divided into two parts so that it can be reformed. Contaminations such as ink and dirt are filtered out.

The paper is crumpled and put into hot water. This bath quickly breaks the paper down into tiny strands of cellulose fibers to form a sticky substance called 'pulp' – basically wet wrapping paper. Although the paper is still dirty.

It is then fed through a screen where the remaining impurities such as gum or plastic particles are removed. It is then sent to a de-inker where it is washed which includes air bubbles and soap-like chemicals mainly 'surfactants' which separate the ink from the paper.

The air bubbles carry the ink to the surface and the pulp that settles to the bottom. That pulp is now clean and can be used to make new paper products.

Steel can be recycled again and again without losing any of its properties. High air-pressure system with the help of liquid floating system separates the steel from other metal and it is then lowered by hydraulic machinery exerting enormous pressure.

Sometimes gas and plasma mech is also used. The steel is then melted and reshaped into new items such as cans, utensils, car parts, paper clips, etc.

The glass shatters and breaks into small pieces called 'culettes' not exceeding 5 cm in width. Pieces of glass are sorted into colored, clear, brown and green. The distinct color is important because it is permanent. Glass is made of silica that is melted and molded into new shapes and products.

Like steel, once aluminum is stripped, not much has to be done with it to make it reusable. It is cut, washed and turned into chips which are melted in a large furnace and then poured into moulds.

They are then shipped to manufacturers where they are re-melted and turned into thin sheets that are cut, reshaped and shaped into new products.

Plastic – Plastic is made of 6 different types of chemicals – polyethylene terephthalate, high density polyethylene, polyvinyl chloride, low density polyethylene, polypropylene and polystyrene. Each plastic has a different molecular structure which determines the physical properties of the plastic, which means that some plastics are easier to recycle than others.

Plastics are made from long carbon chains. So some forms of plastic can be melted or cast and some can be reformed while others can be mixed with new plastics and others can only be molded into other shapes for different uses.

Almost anything can be recycled and waste can be reshaped for reuse but there are still some things and materials such as computers, batteries, light bulbs, etc. that are difficult to recycle because they contain a large amount of toxic substances are included. So we have to deal with them responsibly.

Heal Manipur ethnic rifts, or tinderbox may re-erupt

n the surface of it, Manipur is limping back to normalcy after two weeks since an unprecedented explosion of communal violence between two of the state's major ethnic groups -- Kukis and Meiteis.

However, the undercurrents of tension are still palpable, considering that there are still an estimated 45,000 displaced people on both sides of the communal divide roughly running along the foot of the hills dividing Manipur into two broad geographical categories — a small central valley and the hill tract surrounding it.

This central Imphal Valley, at roughly about 2,000 sq km, forms less than 10 per cent of the state's total area, and is the traditional home of the Meiteis. Here modern revenue administration is in vogue, making it open to settlement by all Indians. More than 60 per cent of the state's population of 2.8 million (2011 census) live here. The hill territory constitutes 90 per cent of the state's area but less than 40 per cent of the state's population, mainly Nagas and Kukis, live here and has come to be treated as exclusive for them.

Here, in a tradition inherited from the British demarcation of "Excluded" and "Partially Excluded" areas, no systematic modern land law is applicable. Hence, the customs of each tribe in matters of land and community become the norm in each's sphere. The trouble is, these customs are not only varied, but often inimical to each other. If for shift cultivators wherever they decide to halt becomes their land, this is not tolerated by settled agriculturists. Indeed, the

many ethnic clashes Northeast region has seen, and Manipur is witnessing now, have a lot to do with this inability to develop a common legal denominator on outlook to land.

Hence, the Meteis, who are about 52 per cent of the state's population, came to be restricted within this small valley, sharing it with all Indians who wish to settle here. In modern times, as their living space gets increasingly crowded, the Meitei psychology has come to be gripped by a peculiar sense of siege, made more complex by their layered relation with the hill tribes, which on the one hand is marked by fraternal feelings and on the other deep mistrust. This mutual mistrust is accentuated by usual development disparities between the hills and plains, which the hills see as a result of discriminatory development policies.

The Meiteis' demand for Scheduled Tribe status in recent times is born of this insecurity. But this demand has set off a chain of related insecurities amongst the existing ST communities, who fear their slice of the reservation pie thinning down if Meiteis enter the competition. They also fear Meitei incursion into the hills if they too become STs. This latter apprehension is, however, a fallacy, for even within the existing ST communities, incursions into each other's traditional territorial boundaries are not tolerated. The bloody Naga-Kuki conflict in Manipur, when the Nagas decided to evict Kukis from land they consider theirs in the 1990s, is evidence of this. It is also unlikely Meiteis would be eager leave the valley to settle in the hills even if they were free to do so, but the very knowledge that they are prohibited to do so has heightened their claustrophobia.

Although not stated in their demand, it should also not be difficult to understand the Meitei's sense of injustice at the absence of a "creamy layer" clause in the existing ST reservation, thereby seeing colleagues from similar or better educational and economic backgrounds given preference at job entry points, promotional avenues, tax exemption, etc. This perhaps is a point of intervention even if their ST demand does not fructify.

The state government did not take a decision on the Meitei's ST demand for over 10 years, one, probably because not all Meiteis want it, and two, in anticipation of the opposition from those already in the list. Things took a new turn on March 27. Responding to a petition, the Manipur high court directed the state government to forward its recommendation on Meitei's ST inclusion to the Union government. But even if this were so, the fight should have remained as a battle of legal litigation within the walls of courtrooms and not taken to the streets. But this was not to be. The May 3 rally of the Nagas and Kukis against the court's decision thus became the spark for the fire that followed.

But the spark would have meant little if there were no dry tinder to burn. It is also intriguing that this tinder seemed to be there only in the case of Kukis, not Nagas. What then is exactly the background which can explain this.

Like the Meiteis suffering from a siege mentality, circumstances have made the Kukis suffer from a sense of persecution in recent times. An old narrative that they are nomadic began recently being pushed from certain quarters. It is true that because of a peculiar land-holding tradition among them, Kuki villages have a tendency to proliferate, often causing friction with their neighbours. This being so, Kuki villages, most of them very small, are spread thin practically in all the 16 districts of the state. As a result, even normal government initiatives such as eviction from reserved forests or fight against poppy plantation or a push for citizenship registration, etc, came to be seen by Kukis as targeting them.

This sense of persecution would have made the community more touchy, making them prone to the explosion of the kind seen at Churachandpur on May 3, which spread to several other townships.

Conspicuous by its absence was any meaningful anticipatory intervention by the government. The question remains: what next. If these underlying reasons for the current violence are not addressed and resolved, there can be no guarantee that more such explosions will not happen in future.

Land pressure in the valley will only grow with population increase, and the shifting Kuki population can upset democracy's power balance in the hills, probably setting the stage for another violent conflict between the Nagas and Kukis. For instance, three decades ago, of the 20 hill constituencies in Manipur's 60-member Assembly, Nagas generally returned 12 and Kukis eight. Today, it is 10 each. In the event of the continued trickling in of Kukialigned tribesmen from Myanmar, this balance can still change, and it is predictable where the resistance will come from.

TMC leader Abhishek Banerjee moves Supreme Court against CBI questioning in school jobs scam



NEW DELHI, May 22 (Agencies): The Supreme Court on Monday agreed to hear on May 26 a plea by senior TMC leader Abhishek Banerjee against his questioning by the CBI in the school jobs scam case.

Banerjee, who was on May 20 questioned for over nine hours by the CBI in connection with the probe into the case, has sought the apex court direction that no coercive steps be taken against him by the agency.

Senior advocate Abhishek Singhvi, appearing for Banerjee, mentioned the matter for urgent listing before a vacation bench of Justices Aniruddha Bose and Sanjay Karol.

The bench said the plea would be

heard on Friday.

Banerjee's name cropped up in a complaint filed by Kuntal Ghosh, a local businessman and an accused in the school jobs scam, where he alleged that the central investigating agencies were pressing him to name Banerjee, who is the national general secretary of the TMC, in the case.

The agency's summons came within 24 hours of the Calcutta High Court dismissing on Thursday a petition filed by Banerjee seeking recall of a previous court order, which said that investigative agencies such as the CBI and ED could interrogate him in the teacher recruitment scam case.

An attempt on Friday to get a division bench and, after that, the chief justice of the Calcutta High Court to hear his revision plea did not yield results.

While mentioning the matter before the apex court, Singhvi said Banerjee had already been quizzed for over nine hours by the CBI and the TMC leader is apprehending that he may be arrested if called again for questioning by the agency.

"I (Banerjee) am asking for no coercive step," Singhvi told the bench, while requesting it to list the matter for hearing in this week.

The bench agreed to hear the plea on Friday and told Singhvi to ask his junior counsel to go to the mentioning officer.

Delhi High Court notice to BBC on defamation suit claiming its documentary cast slur on India's reputation

NEW DELHI, May 22 (Agencies): The Delhi High Court on Monday issued summons to the British Broadcasting Corporation (BBC) on a defamation suit filed by an NGO claiming that its documentary cast a slur on the reputation of India, its judiciary and Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

Besides to the BBC (UK), Justice Sachin Datta also issued notice to the BBC (India) seeking its response on the suit filed by Gujaratbased NGO Justice for Trial.

Senior advocate Harish Salve, appearing for the NGO, said the suit for defamation against the BBC is in relation to the documentary which has "defamed" India and the whole system including the judiciary.

social media. I will write to Mumbai Police Commissioner today about it and demand special security," Wankhede told agency.

Wankhede was questioned for the second consecutive day on Sunday in connection with the case.

After coming out of the NCB office, Wankhede said that he will contin-

ue to cooperate in the investigation.

"I am fully cooperating with the CBI and will continue to do it. I answered whatever I was asked by CBI," Wankhede told ANI.

Neither he told the vigilance team who were investigating his misconduct about these chats".

The NCB sources further claimed that Wankhede did not provide the phone through which he was chatting with Shahrukh Khan and along with this he also tried to scare a senior official of NCB when he took over the case.

Wankhede had approached the Bombay High Court against the CBI action against him, from where he was granted protection from arrest till May 22. The next hearing in the matter is on May 22.

Lumpy skin disease spreads again, 100 cattle deaths reported; Centre alerts states

NEW DELHI, May 22 (Agencies): With over 1,000 weekly fresh cases and 100 cattle deaths, the infectious Lumpy Skin Disease (LSD), has started to spread in the country, once again. The disease, last year, had created havoc, across the country, by killing over 1.5 lakh cattle.

As of now, active cases of LSD in the country are hovering around 10,000. The union government, however, claimed that the situation was under

control so fa

Officials told agency that Uttarakhand, Karnataka, Maharashtra, and Madhya Pradesh were the worst affected states.

Rajasthan, Punjab and Haryana, which were among worst affected states last year, have reported no case of so far.

Union government officials have informed that all the states have already been alerted regarding the potential spread of the disease during the monsoon



season, and directed them to expedite the vaccination.

Notably, Lumpy skin disease is caused by the lumpy skin disease virus (LSDV), which belongs to the genus capripoxvirus, a part of the pox-

viridae family (smallpox and monkeypox viruses are also a part of the same family). It does not transmit from cattle to humans.

Rajasthan has had ordered 1.5 crore vaccination from the union

government.

Abhijit Mitra, Commissioner, Animal Husbandry Department, told The Tribune that deaths were being reported only in 5 per cent of the affected cases.

"The disease is not as deadly as it appears. Only those cattle - which have co-morbidities – die due to LSD," said Mitra, adding that vaccination was the key to control the cases and deaths.

He said there was no shortage of vaccines for the LSD in the country.

2 CoBRA commandos injured in encounter with Naxalites in Chhattisgarh

BIJAPUR, May 22 (Agencies): Two commandos of the Central Reserve Police Force's jungle warfare unit CoBRA were injured in an encounter between security forces and Naxalites in Chhattisgarh's Bijapur district, police said on Monday.

Two to three Naxalites also received bullet injuries in the gun fight which took place at around 8 pm on Sunday in Bijapur, located around 400 km from the state capital Raipur, they said.

A joint team of the District Reserve Guard and the CRPF's Commando Battalion for Resolute Action (CoBRA) launched a search operation from Pusnar camp on Sunday evening after getting information about an improvised explosive device (IED) planted between Pusnar and Hiroli villages under Gangaloor police station limits, an official said. At around 8 pm, the gun battle broke

out between the security personnel and

Naxalites in the area.

After a brief exchange of fire, Naxalites escaped into the dense forest,

Constables Nakul and Mohammad Shahid, belonging to CoBRA's 202nd battalion, suffered injuries on their hands and legs in the face-off, the official said.

They were were shifted to the Bijapur district hospital and their condition was stated to be out of danger, he said.

KATNI, May 22 (Agencies): Three women were killed and more than 10 other people injured when a mini truck in which they were travelling overturned in Madhya Pradesh's Katni district, officials said on Monday.

The accident took place at around 9 pm on Sunday when the victims were returning to Jabalpur after visiting a temple at Maihar town in Satna, they said.

The mini truck (loading vehicle) overturned near Piprondh under Madhav Nagar police station limits, Katni district collector Avi Prasad said.

Three women, aged 20, 45 and 50, were killed in the accident. Around a dozen others were injured and are

undergoing treatment, he said.

According to police officials, the deceased and the injured persons were residents of Barela area in Jabalpur.

"Incredibly Surreal": Woman Sees Her Own Heart On Display At Museum, 16 Years **After Transplant Surgery**



LONDON, May 22 (Agencies): In one of the strangest reunions ever, a woman recently visited a museum to see her own heart, which was removed from her body during a life-saving transplant surgery 16 years ago, BBC reported. Jennifer Sutton, who hails from Ringwood in Hampshire, stated that it was "incredibly surreal" to see her own organ placed as an exhibit at Hunterian Museum in London.

"The minute you first walk in, you think, 'That used to be inside my body'," she said. "But it's quite nice too-it's like my friend. It kept me alive for 22 years and I'm quite proud of it

really. I've seen lots of things in jars in my lifetime but to think that's actually mine is very weird," she added.

She expressed how she hopes it would support organ donation, which she described as "the greatest gift possible." She told the BBC that she now leads an active and busy life and intends to "keep myself going for as long as possible.'

When Ms. Sutton first discovered she had difficulty with moderate exercise activity, such as walking up hills, she was a 22-year-old university student. She was diagnosed with restrictive cardiomyop-

athy, which is a health condition that restricts the ability of the heart to pump blood around the body. Doctors told her that she would die if she did not receive a transplant.

In June 2007, she received the life-changing news that a match had been found.

"I remember waking up after the transplant and thinking 'Oh my goodness I am actually a new person. I remember doing a little double thumbs up dance to my family and saying 'I made it I made it," she said.

Ms. Sutton then permitted the Royal College of Surgeons to use her heart for a display and it is now open for all to see at the museum in Holborn.

She said she wanted to take steps for promoting organ donation and added that it made life-defining moments such as her wedding, happen. She further said that she wanted to urge others to live life to the fullest and encouraged anyone putting off plans to "do it today".

Fire destroys historic Philippine post office building

MANILA, May 22 (Agencies): A huge fire destroyed a historic post office in the Philippine capital Manila, officials said Monday.

More than 80 fire trucks were sent to the decades-old landmark after the blaze broke out late Sunday, the Bureau of Fire Protection said.

Thick, black smoke billowed hundreds of metres into the sky as flames gutted the neoclassical Manila Central Post Office that over-

It took firefighters more than seven hours to get the inferno under control.

"The whole building has burned down from the basement all the way to the fifth floor,"



Postmaster General Luis Carlos told DZBB radio.

The cause of the blaze was being investigated, he said.

Fire brigades from across the capital deployed personnel to fight the blaze that left one volunteer firefighter with minor injuries.

Originally built in 1926, the post office was once considered the "grandest building" in Manila, according to its website.

It was destroyed in World War II as US forces recaptured the capital from Japanese occupation forces, and rebuilt it in 1946.

> The Philippine National Museum declared the building an "important cultural property" in 2018.

Letters, parcels and the postal agency's entire stamp collection were in the building and are likely destroyed, Carlos said.

Papua New Guinea, US to sign security pact with eye on China

PORT MORESBY, May 22 (Agencies): Papua New Guinea will sign a defence pact with the United States on Monday, giving US forces access to its airfields and ports as Washington vies with China's growing footprint in the Pacific region.

In a sign of the intensifying rivalry over the South Pacific, US Secretary of State Antony Blinken was not alone in representing major powers in Port Moresby, where the deal is to be signed.

Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi flew into town just hours before him on the eve of a summit Monday with 14 South Pacific island states, asserting his nation's role as a regional power in the face of China's

"We share your belief in multilateralism. We support a free, open, and inclusive Indo-Pacific. We respect the sovereignty and integrity of all countries," Modi told Pacific leaders in opening remarks.

Blinken will meet those same South Pacific leaders as the United States aims to counter China's expanding economic, political and military presence.

But by signing the security deal with PNG Prime Minister James Marape, Blinken will also expand the US military's capacity to deploy in the region. Beijing has snapped up mines

and ports across the Pacific and last year inked a secretive security pact with the Solomon Islands that allows China to deploy troops to the country.

Student protests

The United States fears that a Chinese military foothold in the South Pacific could outflank its facilities on Guam, and make the defence of Taiwan more complicated in the event of a Chinese invasion.

The State Department said the pact with PNG would "enhance security cooperation and further strengthen our bilateral relationship, improve the capacity of the PNG Defence Force, and increase stability and security in the region".

"Port Moresby is no longer the sleepy diplomatic outpost it once was." said Gordon Peake. a senior adviser for the Pacific Islands at the United States Institute of Peace.

"While China might not be

mentioned anywhere in the document, it's an important subtext in this story of deepening US-PNG relations."

Marape last week said the deal would offer Washington movement in the country's waters in return for access to US satellite surveillance to battle "illegal activities on the high sea".

The deal would not prevent him from signing similar agreements with other nations, including China, he said.

China on Friday said it opposes the "introduction of any geopolitical games into the Pacific Island country region," without specifically referring to the deal or Blinken's visit.

"China has no objection to normal exchanges and cooperation between relevant parties and Pacific Island countries." foreign ministry spokesperson Wang Wenbin said at a daily briefing.

The agreement has also

prompted student protests at several universities, PNG's biggest newspaper the Post Courier reported, over fears it gives US forces too much autonomy at some of the country's key entry points.

Bomb squad cars

Security was high in the capital on Monday, with roads blocked and bomb squad cars stationed around its downtown beach area close to where the leaders were meeting. Officers were also patrolling nearby waters on speedboats and jet skis.

Blinken replaced Joe Biden at the summit after the US president cancelled the trip to take part in debt ceiling talks in Washington.

After visiting a US-funded HIV/ AIDS clinic, Blinken was to hold bilateral talks with both New Zealand Prime Minister Chris Hipkins and Marape before inking the defence agreement.

On top of the deal, the US pledged to PNG \$45 million in funding to tackle organised crime, climate change and HIV/ AIDS, as well as protective equipment for its military, the State Department said.

Commander of the US Indo-Pacific Command, Admiral John Aguino, also visited a barracks in Oro Province on Monday where he was met by a military parade, the Courier reported.

3 Palestinians killed in Israeli army raid in occupied West Bank JERUSALEM, May 22

(Agencies): Three Palestinians were killed by Israeli forces in Balata refugee camp in the occupied West Bank early on Monday, the Palestinian health ministry said in a statement. There was no immedi-



ate confirmation of the fatalities by the Israeli military.

The Israeli forces raided Balata refugee camp in the city of Nablus accompanied with bulldozers and blocked ambulances from entering the camp, Palestinian state news agency reported on

UK Opposition Slams Donations To Conservative Party By Indian Businessman

Karan Chanana, head of the global rice brand Amira, is being investigated by ED over claims that bank loans were unlawfully diverted into shell entities and is yet to respond to the allegations.

LONDON, May 22 (Agencies): Britain's Opposition Labour Party is calling for a freeze on the money donated by an Indian rice tycoon to the governing Conservative Party while he is under investigation by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) in India on fraud and money laundering allegations.

Karan Chanana, head of the global rice brand Amira, is being investigated by ED over claims that bank loans were unlawfully diverted into shell entities and is yet to respond to the allegations. He is believed to have donated around GBP 220,000 to the Conservatives through his British company Amira G. Foods since September 2019.

Margaret Hodge, a senior Labour MP and chair of the All Party Parliamentary Group (APPG) on Anti-Corruption and Responsible Tax, told the 'Guardian' newspaper on Saturday that the Tories should establish the source of these funds and freeze the money until the inquiries are completed.

"The Tories have been too dependent on major donors and have not been doing proper checks. They should now be forced to do so by new legislation," she told the newspaper.

It comes after reports from Delhi revealed that the ED conducted search operations on May 2 at 21 locations in India connected to Chanana, the Indian company



Amira Pure Foods and other parties under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act. Charges are yet to be filed in the case as the ED says further inquiries are continu-

"Investigations revealed that the accused entities in connivance with each other as well as other related/unrelated entities have illegally diverted loan funds sanctioned by the consortium of banks by way of transferring loan funds into the accounts of various shell entities under the guise of genuine business transactions," the newspaper quoted an ED statement as saying.

"It was also known that Karan A Chanana had donated to a political party of [the] United Kingdom since 2019...while the accused entity had itself defaulted on repayment loans," the statement adds.

Amira Nature Foods was listed on the New York stock exchange in October 2012,

specialising in Indian basmati rice grown in the foothills of the Himalayas. Chanana, its chairman and chief executive, operated the business from its headquarters in the Gold Tower in Dubai, while its official company registration was in the British Virgin Islands

Its subsidiaries included Amira Pure Foods in India, now under investigation, and Amira G. Foods in the UK, according to corporate filings.

The probe in India follows a consortium of banks headed by Canara Bank filing a report with the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) in November 2020 alleging bank fraud.

Mcap of 6 of top 10 valued firms erodes by Rs 70,486.95 crore; Reliance, TCS biggest laggards

NEW DELHI, May 22 (Agencies): Six of the 10 most valued firms faced a combined erosion of Rs 70.486.95 crore in their market valuation last week, with Reliance Industries and Tata Consultancy Services (TCS) taking the biggest hit following a weak trend in equities.

While Reliance Industries, TCS, HDFC Bank, ITC, State Bank of India and HDFC were the laggards from the top 10 pack, ICICI Bank, Hindustan Unilever, Infosys and Bharti Airtel were the gainers.

Last week, the BSE Sensex declined 298.22 points or 0.48 per cent.

"Markets took a breather last week and shed half a per cent amid mixed cues. The beginning was upbeat, however, profit-taking in heavyweights across sectors pushed the index lower in the following sessions," Ajit Mishra, VP - Technical Research at Religare Broking Ltd, said.



Among major losers, the market valuation of Reliance Industries fell by Rs 27,941.49 crore to Rs 16,52,702.63 crore and that of TCS eroded by Rs 19,027.06 crore to Rs 11,78,854.88 crore.

HDFC Bank's valuation declined by Rs 10,527.02 crore to Rs 9,20,568.10 crore and HDFC's by Rs 9,585.82 crore to Rs 4,99,848.62

Six entities under lens for suspicious trading in Adani shares prior to release of Hindenburg report: SC panel

NEW DELHI, May 22 (Agencies): Six entities including four foreign portfolio investors (FPIs) are under lens for suspicious trading in Adani group shares prior to the release of the damning Hindenburg report. the Supreme Courtappointed expert committee has said

There was a build-up of short positions in the Adani scips prior to the January 24 release of the Hindenburg report, and substantial profits were booked thereafter as stocks crashed, the 178-page report said.

A "short" position is generally the sale of a stock one does not own.

Investors who sell short believe the price of the stock will decrease in value. If the price drops, they can buy the stock at the lower price and make a profit.

Hindenburg's report claimed that the Adani empire was the "biggest con in corporate history" engaged in a "brazen stock manipulation and accounting fraud scheme".

Shares of Adani Group, which denied all allegations, likening the US investment firm's report to an attack on India, fell after the Hindenburg report was



published on January

As the report stirred a political row and petitions were filed for a probe into the empire helmed by billionaire Gautam Adani, the Supreme Court on March 2, constituted the expert committee to investigate if there was any failure to disclose transactions with related parties and if stock prices were manipu-

The expert committee headed by former SC judge AM Sapre found no regulatory failure during the sharp rise in prices of Adani group companies between March 2000 and December 2022 and their dramatic meltdown after January 24.

"While there was no adverse observation with respect to Adani scips in the cash segment, suspicious trading

has been observed on the part of six entities. These are four FPIs, one body corporate and one individual," the report said.

The report did not name any of the six.

"The trading pattern here is suspicious because of the buildup of short positions by these entities in the Adani scrips prior to the Hindenburg report, and substantial profits earned by them by squaring off their short positions after publication of the Hindenburg report on January 24, 2023," the expert committee said.

A detailed investigation is being carried out in respect of the trading of the six entities.

"These being matters under investigation, and the factual findings at this stage being prima facie in nature, the Committee is not delving into the details and names of these persons, or commenting upon the quality of the prima facie evidence.

committee wishes to ensure that the position of the respective parties, including SEBI, is not compromised either way when investigations are pending," the report said.

Financial crime-fight-

ing agency Enforcement Directorate (ED) "found intelligence about potentially violative and concerted selling by specific parties just ahead of the publication of the Hindenburg report, and this may lead to credible charges of concerted destabilisation of the Indian markets, and Sebi ought to be probing such actions under securities laws," it said citing a response from ED.

The report said an analysis in trading of apples-to-port group's flagship firm, Adani Enterprises Ltd (AEL) shares in four patches between March 1, 2020 and December 31, 2022. a month before publication of the Hindenburg report and meltdown of Adani shares, showed the state-owned LIC was the biggest loser as it sold offs 50 lakh shares of the company when prices hovered around Rs 300 and bought 4.8 crore shares when the prices ranged between Rs 1,031 and Rs 3,859.

After a detailed scrutiny of the movement of prices of Adani shares and their sale and purchase by different entities, the committee found no evidence of price manipulation of stocks by firms linked to the Adani group.

Trading in AEL shares was analysed in four periods - March 1, 2020 to August 31, 2020 (Patch-1), September 1, 2020 to September 30, 2020 (Patch-2), October 1, 2020 to March 31, 2021 (Patch-3) and April 1, 2021 to December 31, 2022 (Patch-4).

Stock market regulator Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) informed the committee that "while the price of AEL shares rose significantly, there was no evident pattern of manipulative contribution of price rise which could be attributed to any single entity or group of concentrated entities."

Highest preterm births in India: UN report

NEW DELHI, May 22 (Agencies): India has the highest preterm births — babies who are born alive before 37 weeks of the pregnancy — in the world accounting for about 23 per cent of the preterm births worldwide.

Around 30 lakh preterm babies were born in India in 2020, according to a new report titled "Born too soon: Decade of action on preterm birth" by the World Health Organisation (WHO) and the United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund (UNICEF). India is followed by Pakistan with 9.4 lakh babies getting born before the complete pregnancy.

Almost half (45 per cent) of all preterm births in 2020 occurred in just five countries: India, Pakistan, Nigeria, China and Ethiopia.

"An estimated 13.4 million babies were born preterm in 2020, meaning that 1 in 10 babies worldwide was 'born too soon'," reads the report.

Notably, preterm birth remains the fourth leading cause of loss of human capital worldwide at all ages.

The report also highlights climate change has further threatened women's and adolescents' access to high-quality health services that are essential for preventing and managing preterm birth.

Although the impacts of climate change are being felt in all areas of the world, the people most affected have contributed least to the crisis

The report reveals that around 91 per cent of deaths of preterm babies related to air pollution occur in low middle income countries.

"Climate change has harmful impacts during the perinatal period. It increases the risk of preterm birth by direct pathways such as air pollution caused by burning fossil fuels increases risk by 52 per cent in asthmatic mothers and extreme heat exposure increases risk by 16 per cent," read the report.

The report further states household air pollution was an attributable factor for 15.6 per cent of all low-birth-weight babies and 35.7 per cent of all preterm births, notably in lowincome countries.

Shift work may affect fertility in women, shows Study

WASHINGTON, May 22 (Agencies): According to a study presented at the 25th European Congress of Endocrinology, female mice can be put to shift work-like patterns for only four weeks before their biological clocks are thrown off and their ability to conceive is diminished. The study adds to our understanding of how circadian disruptions affect female fertility and may potentially aid in the development of prophylactic strategies for women who work irregular hours.

The body's internal clocks, which are synced to a 24-hour period primarily by changes in light throughout days, produce the circadian rhythm. The sleep-wake cycle, hormone secretion, digestion, and reproduction are just a few of the biological processes and functions that these clocks control,

but they are readily thrown off by inappropriate light exposure, such as light at night.

The 'master biological clock' is located in the suprachiasmatic nuclei, a small region in the centre of the brain called the hypothalamus. The hypothalamus is also the regulatory centre for reproductive function by acting on the pituitary gland - attached to the bottom of the hypothalamus - which in turn regulates ovarian activity to promote ovulation. Numerous studies in both mice and humans indicate a negative impact on female reproduction when the circadian rhythm is disrupted. However, the underlying mechanisms are not yet fully understood.

Researchers from the Institute of Cellular and Integrative Neurosciences (INCI) and the University of Strasbourg have previously shown that shift work-like patterns for several weeks lead to a reduced pregnancy rate in female mice. Now, in this study, the researchers mimicked longterm shift work conditions in female mice by constantly shifting the light-dark cycle, delaying and advancing light exposure by 10 hours across four weeks, and found that the massive release of the pituitary hormone called luteinising hormone - which triggers ovulation - was abolished. subsequently reducing fertility in these mice.

"The decreased fertility is due to an alteration of the master circadian clock signalling towards the hypothalamic reproductive circuit." said lead researcher Marine Simonneaux. "Specifically, our research shows that four weeks of chronic shift exposure impairs the transmission of light information from the master

peptin neurons, known to drive the timing of the pre-ovulatory luteinising hormone surge." The next step for research will be to look at whether other additional internal clocks are altered after shift work-like patterns. "The circadian rhythm not only requires proper functioning of the master biological clock, but also a synchronised activity of numerous secondary clocks found in other brain areas and peripheral organs, including reproductive organs," said Ms Simonneaux. "Understanding the precise mechanisms by which circadian disruption alters the reproductive function is important, as it may pave the way for potential preventive and therapeutic interventions to reduce some of the negative effects of shift work on women's fertility."

Royal Enfield looking to roll out uniquely differentiated electric bikes: CEO NEW DELHI, May

22 (Agencies): Royal Enfield is developing 'uniquely differentiated electric motorcycles' and has already started investing towards product development and creating a supplier ecosystem around its Chennai-based plant, according to CEO B Govindarajan.

The company, which is part of Eicher Motors, has announced a capex of Rs 1,000 crore for the current fiscal with a focus on various aspects, including EV manufacturing and product development.

Part of the capex would also go into the rolling out of new products from the company's existing internal combustion engine portfolio.

"On the EV journey, we have been making steady progress. I can say Royal Enfield's EV journey is in the top gear now. Our intention is to create uniquely differentiated electric motorcycles with strong Royal Enfield DNA," Govindarajan said in an analyst

The company has commissioned a very capable team and has started committing very

deep investments in terms of product development, product strategy and in the product testing and development area, he added.

"Currently, we have laid a robust long-term product and technology roadmap on the EV and towards developing the supplier ecosystem is what is the focus as of now," Govindarajan noted.

There are a lot of prototypes and testings, which are currently going on, he stated.

"We are very committed. It's in full blast now," Govindarajan said.

Further, he noted that the company has made a strategic investment in Stark Future and now both the teams are working well

"They are collaborating very well to learn from each other and looking at what is the co-creation and the development, which we will do and how do we leverage each other's strengths," Govindarajan said.

In December last year, Eicher Motors announced to acquire a 10.35 per cent equity stake in Spanish electric motorcycle maker Stark

Future for 50 million euros.

On capex plan, Eicher Motors CEO Siddhartha Lal said the board has approved a cash outlay of Rs 1,000 crore towards capital expenditure for the Royal Enfield business in FY23-24.

The company will make investments towards EV manufacturing, EV product development, and of course, product development for our internal combustion engine portfolio, he noted.

When asked about network expansion in the domestic market, Govindarajan said the company currently has about 2,100 retail outlets across India, a mix of studio stores and dealership outlets.

"...the focus of the team is actually to look at how to proliferate then consolidate. That's how we should actually look at any of these strategies. We should not blindly proliferate because we are very conscious of the dealer profitability and we give utmost importance to every outlet's profitability for the dealers," he noted.

How does Mediterranean diet help you stay fit? Study explores its effect at cellular level

NEW DELHI, May 22 (Agencies): The Mediterranean diet has been one of the most popular diets for an individual's health. A new study now reveals how it has an effect at a cellular level that leads to visible changes in the body.

This diet primarily involves eating plant-based foods - lots of fruits and vegetables - and incorporating whole grains, beans, nuts, seafood, lean poultry and unsaturated fat from extra virgin olive oil.

Studies have shown that people who follow the Mediterranean diet tend to live longer,

in fact, healthier than others who mostly have fast food, meat and dairy. But it hasn't been clear why this diet benefits the body on a cellular level.

New research led by the Stanford School of Medicine has now found one of the first cellular connections between healthy fats (monounsaturated fatty acids) and the lifespan of a laboratory worm. The study's findings, published in Nature Cell Biology, hint at a complex relationship between diet, fats

and longevity. Some studies have shown that specific types of fats, or lipids,

can be beneficial. The researchers learned that one of the fats in the Mediterranean diet, called oleic acid, increases the number of two key cellular structures, or organelles, and protects cellular membranes from damage by a chemical reaction called oxida-

The team compared the effect of feeding the worms bacteria grown on laboratory dishes supplemented with oleic acid versus a structurally similar compound called elaidic acid (trans fats which are not beneficial).

"We saw that the numbers of lipid droplets in the worms'

intestinal cells increased if the worms were exposed to oleic acid, and that this correlated with an extension of lifespan," Brunet, senior author and the school's Michele and Timothy Barakett Professor of Genetics said. "In contrast, exposure to elaidic acid didn't increase the number of lipid droplets and had no effect on longevity."

Finally, the researchers showed that oleic acid supplecall. mentation reduced a chemical reaction called lipid oxidation, which damages cellular membranes. In contrast, elaidic acid increased lipid oxidation.

What Kohli did well, Gill did that better as his unbeaten 104 off 52 balls saw Gujarat chase down the target with ease. The tons were Kohli's and Gill's second successive hundred.

"Those who attended the panchayat are elders and we welcome this decision. The mahila wings of all organisations supporting us will be there, so will our women wrestlers. They will hold a panchayat outside the Parliament on May 28," Bajrang said.

He also clarified that none of the male wrestlers or supporters from the protest site will accompany the women to the Parliament.

Wrestling coaches have also welcomed the move to make it an all-women panchayat, which they think will ensure that the protest would remain peaceful.

"We kept calling them (khap elders) from here to make sure that rail roko or something like that doesn't happen," said a coach, wishing to remain anonymous. "We want this protest to be peaceful. We are not against the government or the ruling party. We are here to support the girls, that's all."

He said at the khap

panchayat in Meham, some of the leaders wanted a full-scale protest, including 'rail roko' and 'bus roko' programmes, but the wrestlers present there - such as Sakshi Malik, Satyawart Kadian and his father Satyavan requested them to not take any extreme step.

Following this, the khap leaders decided to call a women's panchayat to press their demand that Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh - accused of sexually harassing female wrestlers — be arrested soon. They also assured the wrestlers of 'extra support' should such a need arise.

Adidas to sponsor Indian cricket team's kit: BCCI Secretary Jay Shah

NEW DELHI, May 22 (Agencies): The Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) secretary Jay Shah confirmed on Monday that German sporting goods multinational Adidas has been signed as the new kit sponsor for the Indian cricket team. Adidas will replace Kewal Kiran Clothing Ltd, maker of Killer Jeans, which came in as interim sponsor after the then-sponsor Mobile Premier League Sports (MPL Sports) pulled out of the deal midway.

"I'm pleased to announce @BCCI's partnership with @adidas as a kit sponsor. We are committed to growing the game of cricket and could not be more excited to partner with one of the world's leading sportswear brands. Welcome aboard, @adidas," Jay Shah tweeted on Monday.

The current sponsor, Killer Jeans, will have its contract expire on May 31, after which the Adidas deal will take effect. Prior to Killer Jeans, MPL was India's kit sponsor. Killer, a clothing brand,



took over the kit sponsorship from MPL, which wanted to end its contract, which was set to expire in 2023. For a three-year deal, MPL paid the Indian board 6.5 lakh per match and 9 crores

The BCCI is also looking for a new primary sponsor after reports surfaced that the current sponsor, Byju's, was willing to end its contract before the deadline in November 2023. India will be hosting the ICC Cricket World Cup this year from October-November. With this being the World Cup year, fans could get to see India's brand-new ODI kit soon.


