India reports 552 New Coronavirus Cases; Active Covid infections Dip to 6,591

NEW DELHI, May 24 (Agencies): India has recorded 552 new coronavirus infections while the active cases have decreased to 6,591 from 7,104, according to the Union Health Ministry data updated on Wednesday.

The death toll has increased to 5,31,849 with six deaths which includes three fatalities reconciled by Kerala, the data updated at 8 am stated.

The Covid case tally was recorded at 4.49 crore (4,49,87,891).

The active cases now comprise 0.01 per cent of the total infections and the national COVID-19 recovery rate has been recorded at 98.80 per cent, the ministry said.

The number of people who have recuperated from the disease surged to 4,44,49,451 and the case fatality rate was recorded at 1.18 per cent. According to the ministry's website, 220.66 crore doses of Covid vaccine have been administered in the country so far under the nationwide vaccination drive

Man injured in bear attack in Tral

He was suddenly attacked. He received seriously injuries, the victim was later taken to Sub District Hospital Tral by the locals where from doctors reffered him Srinagar hospital for advanced treatment

two others were injured. While expressing solidarity with the bereaved. he demanded adequate compensation to the victim families and free treatment to those injured in the

Seven dead as vehicle carrying power project workers rolls down in Kishtwar

JAMMU, May 24 (Agencies): Seven persons including two from Jharkhand were killed and three others critically injured after a vehicle ferrying workers of a power project rolled down a hill in Kishtwar district of Jammu and Kashmir on Wednesday, police said.

Lt Governor Manoj Sinha, Union minister Jitendra Singh, and leaders from almost all political parties expressed their grief over the accident which occurred near Dangduru power project site in remote Dacchan area around

Since the accident, the officials said, hundreds of workers have been staging a protest at the work site demanding the company to compensate the families of the victims and pay for the treatment of the injured.

Deputy Commissioner, Kishtwar, Devansh Yadav said the accident took place amid heavy rains in the area.

"Seven persons are confirmed dead and three others critically injured in the accident," Senior Superintendent of Police, Kishtwar, Khalil Ahmad Poswal said.

He said the injured were rushed to a hospital by the rescuers who were helped in the operation by locals. According to the officials, the driver of the vehicle lost control while negotiating a blind curve and drove down the hill.



The vehicle turned into an iron mangle after falling down several hundred feet before coming to halt, they said, adding six persons were found dead on-the-spot, while one more succumbed while on way to hospital.

Victims were identified as Itwa Singh and Rahul Kumar of Jharkhand, Sudesh Singh of Kastigarh, Akhter Hussain of Dangduru, Abdul Rashid of Banjwar, Mubashir Ahmad of Doda, and Karan Kumar of Karur.

The injured - Ravi Giri of Bihar, Mohd Gareeb of Ramban, and Varun Sharma of Kishtwar were admitted in Kishtwar district hospital, the officials said. Expressing grief over the loss of lives in the tragic accident, the Lt Governor said, "I convey my heartfelt condolences

to the members of the bereaved families and wish those injured a speedy recovery." "I have instructed the district administration to provide all necessary assistance to the affected persons," Sinha said.

Earlier, Union Minister Jitendra Singh termed the accident "unfortunate" as he assured all possible help to the affected families.

"Just now spoke to DC #Kishtwar Dr Devansh Yadav about unfortunate road accident at Dangduru Dam site...Injured being shifted to district hospital Kishtwar or GMC #Doda as per requirement. All possible help, as required, will be provided," Singh wrote on twitter.

Former chief ministers Ghulam Nabi Azad of Democratic Progressive Azad Party (DPAP) and Mehbooba Mufti of Peoples Democratic Party, Jammu and Kashmir Apni Party president Altaf Bukhari, J&K BJP president Ravinder Raina, the National Conference and the People's Conference also expressed grief over the accident. Senior DPAP leader and former minister G M Saroori visited the injured in the hospital and demanded sterner road safety measures.

"I once again expect that authorities will ensure enough safety measures as occurrence of such accidents are witnessed every alternate day. Smooth traffic movement on such hilly terrain needs immediate attention," Saroori said.

Rain lash plains of J&K, Met predicts more with snow over higher reaches

SRINAGAR, May 24 (Agencies): Rains lashed most parts of Jammu and Kashmir while Meteorological Department on Wednesday predicted intermittent rain in plains and snowfall over the higher reaches of J&K during the next 24 hours.

Currently, the weather is overcast and Cloudy with light rain at scattered places in Jammu & Kashmir. Intermittent Rain cou-

pled with thunderstorms & snowfall over higher reaches at most places of Jammu and Kashmir with the possibility of Hailstorm & strong gusty winds at a few places can't be ruled out in Jammu and Kashmir during the next 24 hours, the MeT office said.

It said the weather is likely to remain generally

cloudy with the possibility of a brief spell of rain or thunderstorm towards late afternoon or evening on May 25-26. From May 27-30 the weather will remain partly to generally cloudy in Jammu and Kashmir.

The MeT office has

advised farmers to suspend all farm operations till the weather improves while commuters have been asked to confirm road status from concerned traffic police prior to embarking on long journeys, especially on the Zojila pass on the Srinagar-Ladakh highway and Srinagar-Jammu road.

Srinagar and its adjoining areas were lashed by rains resulting in a slight drop in day and night temperatures. Srinagar received 6.9mm

JAMMU, May 24 (Agencies): Directorate of Health Services Jammu has cancelled all leaves of doctors and para-medical staff except maternity leave and commuted leave on medical grounds from June 19 in view of the Amarnath Yatra.

According to a circular, Director Health Services Jammu has directed all concerned officials not to sanction or forward leave applications of doctors and para medical staff.

"In view of Amarnath Yatra 2023, all type of leaves of doctors & paramedical staff except maternity leave & commuted leave on edical grounds, stands cancelled from June 19" reads the circular.

It reads that it is impressed upon all the CMOs, medical superintendents and BMOs not to sanction or forward leave applications of doctors & paramedics in view of commencement of Amarnath Yatra.



Admission to children in government schools without TC: Amit Kapoor

Director of Education Department should issue orders immediately

JAMUU, May 24: President of Parents Association Jammu Amit Kapoor has said that children without TC should be admitted in government schools. He said that if children are admitted in government schools without TC in other states of the country including Delhi and Punjab, then why it is not done in Jammu and Kashmir. He has demanded the Director of School Education Department to issue an order in this regard immediately so that children can get admission in government schools without TC.

Amit Kapoor said this while addressing a press conference in Jammu. He said that 25 percent poor children are not being provided free education under the Right to Education Act in private schools, which is a complete violation of this order. He said that some time ago the director of Kashmir had issued an order in



this regard orally but no order has been issued in writing due to which the officials of the department cannot give admission to the children without TC.

Kapoor said that if the

parents of a child have not been able to pay the fees during the Corona period, then they should be given exemption to some extent, but private schools are neither giving free education to 25 percent poor children, nor if any child is unable to pay the fees for any reason. If he is not able to give, then he is being given some exemption of fees. Describing this attitude of private schools as inhuman, Kapoor said that they are depriving

children of their fundamental right to educa-

Kapoor said that the DCs of Jammu, Rajouri and Samba had set up complaints cells but they have not received any evidence so far, while they have also presented several evidences about the highhandedness of private schools. He said that parents of a child could not pay 15000 fees and they were giving 5000 rupees but still their child was not given TC due to which the child's education is hanging in

balance. He has demanded LG Manoj Sinha to intervene in this matter and stop the loot in private schools so that the parents can get relief. He has also demanded the Director of the Education Department to immediately issue an order for admission in government schools without TC so that children can get relief and their education can be saved from getting wasted.

What lies behind China's new role as 'peacemaker'

he People's Republic of China would like to project itself as the world's new "peacemaker" -- as we have seen in the Middle East (between Saudi Arabia and Iran) some time ago, and then later in Moscow.

Well over a year after the sudden invasion of Ukraine by Russian troops on February 24, 2022, Beijing has released a 12-point document which proposes a framework for a political settlement. The Carnegie **Endowment for International Peace** commented: "The document is a laundry list of familiar Chinese talking points about the war. It repeats Beijing's support for the UN Charter and the territorial integrity of states, but at the same time condemns unilateral sanctions, and criticises the expansion of US-led military alliances... China's vague plan is aimed not at actually ending the war, but at impressing the developing world and also rebutting the accusations that Beijing has become a silent accomplice to Moscow."

Beijing's Global Security Initiative (GSI) is another move from Beijing which indicates that China wants to play a bigger international role.

Earlier this year, on February 21, at the Lanting Forum, Qin Gang, China's foreign minister, spoke of his country's new role: "The world today is not a tranquil place: changes unseen in a century are fast evolving, major country competition is intensifying, geopolitical conflicts are escalating, the global security governance system is woefully lagging behind... The choice made by China is clear-cut."

That is why, Mr Qin explained, Xi Jinping proposed the Global Security Initiative, which upholds "the vision of common, comprehensive, cooperative and sustainable secu-

rity, pursues the long-term objective of building a secure community, and advocates a new path to security featuring dialogue over confrontation, partnership over alliance and winwin over zero-sum".

A growing dichotomy

A dichotomy is growing between Beijing's totalitarian policies at home and its supposed peacemaker role outside; it is striking and the real question is: are the two stands reconcilable?

The hardening at home can be explained by the fact that China wants to assume the role of the number one power in the world and it believes that only the strictest adherence to the Communist Party's line can achieve this goal.

It is indeed a fact that the Chinese regime is becoming more and more authoritarian and autocratic. One could take several examples. Reuters cites one: "China is increasingly barring people from leaving the country, including foreign executives, a jarring message as the authorities say that the country is open for business."

The international news agency quotes from a report for the Safeguard Defenders, a human rights group: "Since Xi Jinping took power in 2012, China has expanded the legal landscape for exit bans and increasingly used them, sometimes outside legal justification."

It is estimated that tens of thousands of Chinese are banned from exit at any one time. Reuters concludes: "This contrasts with China's message that it is opening up to overseas investment and travel, emerging from the isolation of some of the world's tightest Covid curbs."

But why do more and more people want to leave the Middle Kingdom? Simply because they can't express themselves freely.

The fact that people like Jack Ma,

the founder of the Alibaba group, has to exile himself in Japan and take an assignment at the University of Tokyo, indeed speaks for itself. The university in Tokyo said: "Ma will work with researchers, serve as an adviser to the college and participate in seminars. He will also conduct research with university staff, especially in the field of sustainable agriculture and food production." What a loss for a China, which today does not accept differing views.

In this context a new report from the Hoover Institution written by Matthew Johnson, an expert on the Chinese Communist Party's politics, about China's strategy to achieve a global edge through the accumulation and control of data, is an eyeopener.

According to Johnson, China's strategy is "to accumulate and control data at a global scale". The scholar believes that the origin of this strategy is a 2013 speech given by Mr Xi at the Chinese Academy of Sciences. The then new Chinese President said: "The vast ocean of data, just like oil resources during industrialisation, contains immense productive power and opportunities. Who controls big data technologies will control the resources for development and have the upper hand"

The way to do this is for Chinese commercial enterprises to "siphon data at a global scale," explains Johnson, who spoke of an "accumulation espionage ecosystem", meaning a network of internal data storage and processing facilities; the data is later "absorbed into military, technology, and surveillance projects in China and is potentially shared with likeminded international partners such as the Russian Federation or the Islamic Republic of Iran".

The point is that the same "vast ocean of data" is used on the Chi-

nese populations (particularly the so-called minorities like the Tibetans and the Uyghurs) to monitor their lives in minutest details.

Johnson's conclusion: "In this sense, China's grand strategy for data is a case study which highlights the current gap that exists between the complexity of the challenge and the (US) current response."

However, it is not clear what the free world can do for the Chinese people living inside the Middle Kingdom. In the meantime, "peaceful" China is preparing to invade Taiwan, the democratically-run island. Like the GSI, it may however lead nowhere; the US strategic platform War on the Rock warns: "A worst-case Taiwan scenario for Chinese leader Xi Jinping would be a major military operation in which the People's Liberation Army fails spectacularly or displays shocking incompetence akin to Russia's in Ukraine. Could this happen?"

The specialised website believes that the bad news is that "even if China's armed forces fail spectacularly, this does not necessarily mean a shorter, less bloody, or less costly conflict. If the People's Liberation Army stumbles badly, Xi is unlikely to call off his military. Where Taiwan is concerned, Xi can be expected to press his armed forces to persist in the fight, producing a protracted conflict in the centre of the Indo-Pacific and profoundly disrupting commerce and stability across the region."

So much for the "peace initiatives"! The other question, of course, is: Do the Taiwanese people, who have tasted freedom and democracy, have to go back to Mao's dreadful days when everyone has to follow the Party... or else.

Certainly not. In Hong Kong, for example, the people themselves have started discovering the difference between freedom and the dictatorship of the Party.

"UNSTABLE PAKISTAN IS DANGEROUS FOR INDIA", SAYS FAROOQ ABDULLAH. OH!REALLY?YOU MUST BE JOKING

n May 12, 2023, Farooq Abdullah made the above statement while commenting on the turmoil in Pakistan after the arrest of Imran Khan in the Al Oadir case. He further added, "The stronger Pakistan remains, the better it is for India too......A stable Pakistan is essential for peace in the subcontinent." A politician's statement need not be taken seriously unless the said politician has graduated to being acknowledged as a statesman. Like many statements issued by him on every issue under the sun, this statement too is meant for the consumption of Farooq Abdullah's support base. Irrespective of the enormous damage done to Kashmir's physical assets as also to its social fabric since its creation and, particularly so in the last over three decades, for a sizable segment of Kashmir's population, Pakistan continues to be an elephant in the room. This segment of population, including Farooq Abdullah, cannot ignore or speak ill of Pakistan. However, he is not the only one in India to think like this. There are many people, particularly among leaders of various political parties in India, who subscribe to the same view.

Stability in any country of the subcontinent could be defined as a period of relative peace, social harmony, increasing and visible level of economic development and absence of political turmoil. If one were to assess Pakistan's years of stability on these parameters, one can safely say that during its existence of nearly seventy five years, Pakistan has seen periods of stability only in brief

spells, perhaps, twice or thrice, when it was ruled by the military, from Ayub Khan to Musharraf, through Yahya Khan and Zia Ul Haque. It was during such periods of Pakistan's stability that the Indian security came under severe strain due to Pakistan's actions.

Gen Mohd Ayub Khan, who later

made himself a Field Marshal, seized power in Pakistan when he deposed its President, Iskandar Mirza in a coup d'etat in 1958. He immediately aligned himself with the United States of America, joining its various military blocks, created to counter the Soviet Union. The Americans needed Pakistani air bases to operate its spy planes to keep an eye on its bete noire, the Soviet Union. In return America opened its purse strings to pour all kinds of aid into Pakistan. Ayub liberalised its economy, privatised state-owned industries, attracting large inflow of foreign aid and investment. Soon Pakistan became south Asia's fastest growing economy. Ayub also completed a number of hydroelectric projects, dams and reservoirs, besides establishing Pakistan's space programme that later succeeded in launching its first uncrewed space mission in 1962. Ayub Khan stayed in power till 1969, when labour unrest and deteriorating situation in East Pakistan (now Bangladesh) forced him to relinquish his post.

Ayub Khan's rule from 1958 to 1969 is termed as Pakistan's decade of stability and development, which saw Pakistan taking huge steps in the development of industries and agriculture. However, stable Pakistan posed a serious threat to India's security, when it launched Operation Gibralter against it. Having had its military weaknesses exposed by Chinese aggression in 1962, Kashmir crisis boiling over the loss of Prophet Mohammad's holy relic from Hazratbal shrine in 1963, followed by Nehru's demise the next year, Ayub saw an opportunity to grab Kashmir from 'weak' India through a full-fledged military operation, preceded by infiltration of its mujahideen to prepare ground for the same. That his misadventure proved futile due to India's counter measures, does not detract from the fact that a stable Pakistan had deliberately threat-

ened India's security. On relinquishing his post, Ayub Khan

handed over power to Gen Yahya Khan to ensure Pakistan's continued stability. Yahya Khan's brief tenure (March 1969-Dec 1971) posed yet another security threat for India. His rejection of peoples' mandate delivered in the elections results of December 1970 led to an armed uprising in East Pakistan. A military crackdown launched by Yahya Khan to suppress the uprising led to the genocide of its own people in its eastern wing by Pakistan Army, forcing nearly 20 million refugees to seek shelter in India's northeastern states. Such a huge influx of refugees put enormous pressure on the limited resources of India, besides threatening the fragile social fabric and economic well being of its north eastern states. Eventually, this grave situation resulted in the 1971

Again Indian security was threatened by Pakistan when it was relatively

After nearly six years of political unrest, Gen Zia Ul Haque seized power in Pakistan in 1977. During his cruel rule of Pakistan, he first jailed the deposed Prime Minister, Zulfiqar Ali Bhutto, and then hanged him to death through what is known as a 'judicial murder'. To ensure his own survival, he joined America and its allies in their war against the Soviet occupation of Afghanistan. Zia Ul Haqe fully exploited Pakistan's geographical access to the land-locked Afghanistan, to its advantage. America became fully dependent on Pakistan to wage a sccessful war against the Soviet troops in Afghanistan. Pakistan also provided refugee camps in Peshawar and Pakistan's several Madrassas to the CIA to train the newly recruited Mujahideen to fight the Communist troops. In return, Pakistan, now called a stalwart non-NATO ally of America, received huge aid in the form of arms, ammunition, dollars and other goodies.Pakistan was once again stable and prosperous.

Being a radical Muslim to the core, Zia co-opted various religious parties/institutions of Pakistan to wage a jihad in Kashmir to grab it by force, leading to the armed uprising in Kashmir in 1989. Pakistan almost succeeded in its nefarious design. Though Zia Ul Haque died in a mysterious Plane crash in August 1988, his plan was carried out to the last

detail by ISI, which had been given this responsibility while Zia was still alive. Once again, Indian security had been greatly threatened while Pakistan had enjoyed a period of stability,

Cut to another period of stability in Pakistan, viz, 1997-2008. Nawaz Sharif had taken over as the Prime Minister of Pakistan in Feb 1997 for the second time. He was a popular Prime Minister who compelled Gen Karamat, the Chief of Staff (COAS) of Pakistan Army to resign as he felt that the latter was exceeding his brief as the Pak Army Chief. Nawaz Sharif made the junior most contender, Lt Gen Pervaiz Musharraf, as the new COAS. However, Musharraf deposed him in 1999 and subsequently became the President of Pakistan. It was during this period of stability, when Pakistan's GDP rose by over 50%, that Pervaiz Musharraf as the COAS, devised a plan to occupy Kargil Heights during severe winter months between October and March when the temperatures drop to 50 deg below zero on those formidable heights, ranging from 16000 ft to 20,000 ft. (called the Winter Posture). As a matter of agreed principle between India and Pakistan, both countries would vacate their posts by October and reoccupy the same in April next year when the climate improved somewhat. In a well planned operation, Musharraf as the new COAS, got its Northern Light Infantry (NLI) units to occupy these heights, when Indian troops had already withdrawn to adopt the winter posture. Such blatant disregard for accepted norms led to the Kargil War between the two nuclearpowered nations. Indian troops finally succeeded in pushing back the intruders at great cost in men and material. This grave threat to Indian security was also created by a stable Pakistan.

Having a stable neighbour is good for any neighbourhood. However, in the case of the India-Pakistan equation in the subcontinent, a stable Pakistan has always posed a grave threat to India's security. Much as its next door neighbour, India would like to see a stable and prosperous Pakistan, yet our experience has taught us that a stable Pakistan is a danger to our security.

Ban on 'The Kerala Story' an insult to Constitution: Kangana Ranaut

Bollywood Kangana Ranaut, on Tuesday, said the ban imposed on The Kerala Story by some states was "unconstitutional" after it was cleared by the CBFC. "Banning a film which has been passed by the Central Board of Film Certification (CBFC) amounts to insulting the constitution. law-and-order situation and a poor audience turnout. Last week, the Supreme Court staved the West Bengal government's order banning the film in the state and asked Tamil Nadu to ensure the safety of the moviegoers.

Gulshan Devaiah asks people to discuss mental health after Nawaz calls depression an urban issue

Mental health awareness can help most people manage life better, said Gulshan Devaiah on Wednesday after the actor expressed disagreement with industry colleague Nawazuddin Siddigui who called depression an illness prevalent in cities and among the rich.

In a series of tweets, the "Dahaad" star said while he didn't want to question Siddiqui's beliefs or opinions, it is important that mental health is discussed openly "even at the risk of being wrong or ill informed". "The idea is to discuss mental health and try and understand it. I do agree that his opinion about depression is a common theme among a lot of people. I myself struggle to understand mental health issues properly. 'But even at the risk of being wrong or ill informed we must try and talk about this freely. It's very manageable for most people with a little bit of awareness," Devaiah wrote on Twitter.

The attempt is to sift through the clutter of extreme opinions to find a place that is useful, the Bengaluru-born actor added. "I don't have a rural upbringing but I have close family members who grew up in villages and have very problematic behaviour because they didn't process their trauma properly and they pass it on to others. Let's try not to be blind or have a blindfold about such matters," he said. In a recent interview with online portal Mashable India, Siddiqui was asked how he stays positive in life.

In his response, the "Badlapur" star - who hails from the small town of Budhana in Uttar Pradesh — said: "Where I come from, if I tell my father 'Abbu, I'm feeling depressed', he would slap me. He would abuse me and ask me to go to the sugarcane fields. Nobody faces depression over there, everyone is happy." The 49-year-old had said he found out about mental health issues such as depression, anxiety, and bipolar disorder after he came to the city, adding one catches these illnesses when they amass wealth. Siddiqui doubled down on his views on mental health in a new interview, explaining he was drawing from his own experience, but added that he "maybe wrong".

Devaiah shared the video posted on channel NDTV 24×7's official Twitter page, saying he respects Siddiqui for his craft but would not take him seriously on the issue of mental health. "If you even just look at alcoholism or addictions, they exist in rural communities and that's mental illness. No addict indulges in addiction because they love it. The addiction is a symptom, the real problem is the trauma they can't heal," he wrote in his previous post.

Tamil Nadu's historic sceptre 'Sengol' to be placed in new Parliament building, says Amit Shah

NEW DELHI, MAY 24: As a major cultural symbol of India's independence, a historic sceptre, 'Sengol', which marked the transfer of power from the Britishers in 1947, will be placed in the new Parliament building, Union Home Minister Amit Shah said on Wednesday. 'Sengol' is a symbol of historic legacy, which was used by former Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru on August 14, 1947, when the transfer of power took place from the British.

Addressing a press conference here, Amit Shah said, "On the occasion of Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav, PM Modi will dedicate the new Parliament to the nation. In a way, it shows his far-sightedness. This is a beautiful attempt to merge our cultural legacy, tradition and civilisation with modernity. Around 60,000 people worked on the construction of this building in record time. The PM will also honour

them.'

"A historical event is



being revived on this occasion. The historic sceptre, 'Sengol', will be placed in the new Parliament building. It was used on August 14, 1947, by PM Nehru when the transfer of power took place from the British. Out of all the promises made by PM Modi for 'Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav', one promise was respect and regeneration of our historic traditions," he said.

The Home Minister added, "The historic incident is from August 14, 1947. It is called Sengol in Tamil, the meaning of this word is full of wealth There is a tradition behind this associated with ages. Sengol had played an important role in our history. When PM Modi got information about this, a thorough investigation was done. Then it was decided that

it should be put before the country. For this, the day of the inauguration of the new Parliament House was chosen."

Recalling the historic event, the Home Minister said that 'Sengol' was chosen as the symbol of the transfer of power after intensive research.

"When the time for

transfer of power came, Lord Mountbatten who was the Viceroy asked former PM Nehru about what should be the symbol of transfer of power to the country as per the Indian traditions. Nehru discussed the issue with freedom fighter and avid historic scholar C Rajagopalachari. He (Rajagopalachari) after doing an intensive historic research said that as per the Indian traditions, 'Sengol' has been

marked as the symbol of

He added, "Based on this, Nehru accepted the Sengol from Adheenam, who were specially brought from Tamil Nadu. Thus, the power was transferred to the Indian hands. It is a realisation that the power came back to the Indians in a traditional method. Nehru accepted the 'Sengol' in the presence Dr Rajendra Prasad and many others. Nehru's aim was emotional unity and academic integration. The event was widely reported in media and even in

historic transfer," Shah

foreign countries." According to historical accounts, C Rajagopalachari had approached the Dharmic Mutt in the Tanjore district of Tamil Nadu - the Thiruvavaduthurai Adheenam. The leader of the

Adheenam immediately commissioned the preparation of the 'Sengol'.

The word Sengol is derived from the Tamil word 'Semmai', meaning 'Righteousness'. It is an Indic civilizational practice from the Chola kingdom, which was among the leading kingdoms in the Indian sub-continent for centuries.

As per the historic tradition, at the time of enthronement, the traditional guru of the preceptor of the King would hand over the ceremonial Scepter to the new ruler.

At the time of the power transfer on August 14, 1947, three people were specially flown in from Tamil Nadu on August 14, 1947 - the Deputy high priest of the Adheenam, the Nadaswaram player Rajarathinam Pillai and the Oduvar (singer) - carrying the Sengol.

The priests conducted the proceedings. They gave the Sengol to Lord Mountbatten and took it back. The Sengol was purified with holy water. It was then taken in procession to Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru's house, where it was handed over to him. A special song was rendered, as specified by the high

Shiv Sena (UBT) has promised support in fight against Centre's ordinance, says Kejriwal



NEW DELHI, May 24: The Shiv Sena (UBT) has promised support to Delhi government's fight against the Centre's ordinance on control of services in the national capital. Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal said on Wednesday.

Kejriwal, along with his Punjab counterpart Bhagwant Mann, AAP Raiva Sabha members Sanjay Singh and Raghav Chadha, and Delhi minister Atishi, met Shiv Sena (UBT) leader Uddhav Thackeray in Mumbai.

Addressing a joint press conference with Thackeray after the meeting, Kejriwal said the BJP was trying to topple the state governments using CBI and ED. The AAP leader claimed that the Shiv Sena (UBT) has promised to support the party to defeat a bill which the Centre is likely to bring in to ratify the ordinance, in Rajya Sabha. The Shiv Sena (UBT) has three members in the upper house.

"This will be like a semi-final in the Rajya Sabha. If the bill is defeated in the Rajya Sabha, then the Modi government will not come back to power in 2024," Kejriwal said.

Further targeting the Centre, the chief minister alleged that the BJP government, through the ordinance, has taken back all the powers given by the Supreme Court. In a democracy, power should vest in the elected government as it is accountable to people, but the BJP neither believes in democracy nor the Supreme Court, he said.

Extending support to the AAP leader, Thackeray said they have come together to defeat forces that are against democracy.

"We have come together to defeat those against democracy. If we miss the train this time, then there will be no democracy in the country. We have come together to save the country and the Constitution," he said.

The Centre on Friday promulgated an ordinance to create an authority for transfer and posting of Group-A officers in Delhi, with the AAP government calling the move a deception with the Supreme Court verdict on control of services.

Kejriwal met West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on Tuesday and the latter has promised support to the Delhi government's fight against the ordinance.

The Delhi CM is likely to meet NCP supremo Sharad Pawar on Thursday.

Earlier, Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar had met in Kejriwal in Delhi and assured his support to the AAP over the issue. PDP leader Mehbooba Mufti and SP leader Akhilesh Yadav, too, have extended support to Kejriwal in his fight against the Centre's ordinance.

Kerala has one of the best records in upholding rights of workers says CM Vijayan

THIRUVANANTHA-PURAM, May 24: Kerala Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan on Wednesday highlighted the steps taken by the state in upholding the rights of workers and claimed that it has one of the best records in the global south in this regard.

Inaugurating the International Labour Conclave here, Vijayan said Kerala has been exceptional in protecting and advancing workers' rights, which has been waning worldwide.

"In terms of providing decent employment, forming unions, workers' cooperatives, welfare boards and pension schemes, and ensuring inclusivity and the protection of migrant rights, Kerala has evolved as a role model. We comply with the main principles of the ILO (International Labour Organisation), including the tripartite structure, in which the government, employers, and employees meet to resolve disputes," the Chief Minister said.

The three-day International Labour Conclave is being organised by the Labour Department in association with the State Planning Board.

He said that since 1957, when Kerala's first state government came to power, "we have implemented a rights-based strategy" to accommodate the requirements of workers in the formal and informal sectors

"By passing the Kerala Minimum Wage Rules in 1958, Kerala's first ministry showed the world how workers' rights can be protected by assur-

ing minimum wages," Vijayan said.

He said a significant turning point in the welfare of the workers, however, was the instituting of the Kerala Welfare Fund Act, which ensured financial contributions by the government as well as employers and employees.

"As a result, a large number of Welfare Boards were set up to serve workers -- including women -- in the informal sectors. The coverage of traditional industries such as coir, handlooms, cashews, and so on is worth citing. In total, there are 24 Welfare Boards in the State which play a crucial role in reducing the livelihood crisis of informal workers," the chief minister said, adding that it was especially evident during the covid-19 pandemic.

He said that in in 1980, the state government brought in a pathbreaking initiative with the implementation of the agricultural workers' pension scheme.

"It was the first major social assistance scheme in India," Vijayan said.

The CM said the recognition of the rights of domestic migrant workers is also an integral aspect of the labour policy in Kerala, with a slew of measures in place to support them.

"We honour them as guest workers. Kerala is one of the most migrantworker-friendly states in the country. They were especially aided during the covid-19 pandemic with free accommodation, food, and medical care," Vijayan said.

He also pointed out that workers in the unorganised sector have access to a number of benefit programmes, including pensions.

"The state has given special attention to women workers, with a focus on their health, nutrition, working conditions, and other rights. Their 'right to sit' in the shops they work in has been legally assured", the CM said.

Speaking about protection of domestic workers' rights, he said that a specific bill in this regard is nearing completion and that it would be the first of its kind in India.

This is apart from the large number of benefits provided to care workers in the state, who are predominantly women. Given the fact that as many as 84 sectors have minimum wages fixed and revised timely, Kerala stands ahead of many other states with respect to wages and benefits, Vijayan said.

"Incidentally, I must point out that as per the RBI report, the highest daily wage rate for male non-agricultural workers in rural India, is in Kerala at Rs 677.6 in 2020-21. It is more than double the all-India average at Rs 315.3," he said.

The country is getting a new Parliament building and it is a moment of pride, and "we do not want any politics to be played at this time", Cheema said here in an apparent reference to the boycott by parties such as the AAP, the Congress and the TMC.

The Opposition parties have said the prime minister's decision to inaugurate the building



by himself, "completely sidelining President Droupadi Murmu, is not only a grave insult but a direct assault on our democracy which demands a commensurate response".

The SAD has decided that party president Sukhbir Singh Badal will attend the inaugu-

ration of the new Parliament building, Cheema said in a video statement and added that it is a big event for the country and all should attend it.

Taking a swipe at the AAP, Cheema said, "I want to ask them that the AAP government is in Punjab. (Arvind) Kejriwal should answer when the president came to Chandigarh, then why the chief minister (Bhagwant Mann) was not present (at the event).

'Muerte Cruzada' in President | Who is Ron DeSantis, the Florida Governor vs Congress battle in Ecuador

WASHINGTON, MAY 24: The Ecuadorian Congress, dominated by leftist parties tried to impeach the centre-right President Guillermo Lasso last month on corruption charges. But the amount involved was insignificant and the alleged crime did not warrant impeachment. It was clearly a Congressional coup attempt to remove the president, democratically elected by millions of voters for a four year term from May 2021 to May 2025.

The Congress wanted to get rid of him because they had the power to do so. It was an attempt to undermine the presidential mandate and abuse of power causing unnecessary political instability.

This was the second impeachment attempt of the Congress. They tried one earlier but could not manage the two third majority. But this time they got the numbers. Faced with this congressional threat, President Lasso resorted to "Muerte Cruzada" (mutual death) provision of the constitution and dissolved the Congress on May 17, before they could pass the impeachment resolution. After this, he is obliged to leave the office at the end of six months and new elections are to be held within six months both for the presidency and the congress. The newlyelected Congress and President will stay in office for the remaining period of the original mandate upto 2025 when the next regular elections are due. The elections are likely to be held on August 20.

The popularity ratings of President Lasso, a centre-right businessman is very low, given the ongoing crime wave, economic problems and protests of indigenous communities. He had held a referendum earlier to push through some reforms. But the referendum was defeated and his party lost seats in the local elections. Lasso has announced that he would not stand for reelection.

In recent years, the Ecuadorian Congress had tasted blood by impeaching two presidents. It had impeached President Abadalla Bucaram in 1997 for "mental incapacity" within six months after his assumption of office in August 1996. He was a colourful and loud leftist. But he did not commit any serious crime warranting impeachment. In 2005, the Congress had impeached President Lucio Gutierrez for "abandoning his position". He had stayed in power for just two years.

Since 1979, when democracy was restored after military dictatorship, five presidents of Ecuador had their terms cut short. In view of this history, President Rafael Correa had got the constitution amended in 2008 with the new provision of 'Muerte Cruzada' to empower the presidency against a hostile congress. President Lasso was the first one to exercise this

Some other Latin American countries have also witnessed unfair and unjustifiable impeachment of presidents by rogue con-

The Paraguayan Congress impeached the leftist President Fernando Lugo in 2012 on a trivial charge when a few protestors were killed by police during a protest. It was a hurried 24-hour express impeachment. The real reason for the removal of President Lugo was that the rightist oligarchic Colorado party which has been ruling Paraguay continuously for the last seven decades wanted to nip in the bud emerging Leftists seeking social justice with pro-poor policies. Lugo was the first and last leftist president in the last seventy years of one party dictatorship.

Brazilian President Dilma was impeached unjustly because she refused to bail out Eduardo Cunha the president of the Lower House who was caught red-handed with several million dollars of illegal deposits in a Swiss bank account. She thought she had the moral right to let him face the law while the crooked Cunha had exercised his right to gang up his corrupt Congressional colleagues to pass the impeachment resolution. Rouseff was naïve and arrogant and refused to follow the established system of presidential deals with congressional leaders. Cunha was later convicted and jailed for corruption.

Pedro Castillo, the Leftist President of Peru was removed from power in December 2022 by the rightist Congress when he had just completed 18 months of his four year term. The rightwing Congress was gunning for him from day one. Frustrated by the machinations of the Congress, he made an amateurish and feeble attempt to dissolve the Congress. But the Congress was faster and removed him from power before he could dissolve it. He has been imprisoned for his constitutional crime of attempt to dissolve the Congress. Poor Castillo was naive and did not have the skills to deal with the corrupt and crooked law makers. He was played and trapped into a wrong decision and punished. He was a mere victim of the Congressional coup.

Before Castillo, three other Peruvian presidents have been impeached: Billinghurst, Fujimori and Vizcarra. Of course, the authoritarian and abusive Fujimori was the most suitable candidate for impeachment. The Congress had many other unsuccessful impeachment attempts against other presidents.

In the presidential system of the Latin American countries, Congress becomes the biggest challenge for presidents who do not have their own party with majority in Congress. With the fragmentation of political parties in the region, very few Presidents have their own parties in majority in the Congress. In such cases, the Congressional members start blackmail and extortion from day one. They threaten impeachment and refuse to pass bills unless they are given back room deals. So most presidents make deals with influential Congress members and let them indulge in corruption. In the notorious Petrobras corruption scandal, it was revealed that all the major political parties and leaders had got their share of the loot, besides the ruling Workers Party of Lula. In fact, President Lula had introduced during his first term "under-the table monthly payment" to Congressional members to get their agreement to pass legislation needed for the country. This was called as the Mensalao scandal. But when this became a public scandal, Lula managed to come out of it with more bribing of the Congress.

The Brazilian Congress should have impeached President Bolsonaro who had committed serious crimes by subverting democracy and causing thousands of deaths by not taking action during the Covid crisis. He mocked and imposed obstacles against vaccination. But the Congress loved him because he gave them a free pass for corruption.

"Muerte Cruzada" could be a solution to other Latin American countries where presidents had become victims of the rogue congresses abusing their power for impeachment. It will deter the impeachment-trigger-happy Congresses from undermining democracy by unjust impeachment of duly elected presidents. It will bring back the balance between president and the congress, prevent political instability and strengthen democracy.

FLORIDA, MAY 24: Capping months of speculation, Florida Governor Ron DeSantis will officially announce his bid for the White House on Wednesday. The Naval officerturned-right-wing leader is expected to declare his candidacy on Wednesday at 6 p.m. ET (IST 3:30 am Thursday) during a conversation with entrepreneur Elon Musk on Twitter.

As he enters the fray for the 2024 White House race, DeSantis will face a formindable enemy in the primary race, none other than former President Donald Trump. Though the poll figures still put him below Trump, DeSantis hopes to win over rightwing influencers and conservative voters by marking his presence on Twitter. His move is viewed as a swipe at the traditional media, which many conservatives tag

as left-leaning. Now that the battleground is set, Trump supporters have targetted DeSantis, mocking DeSantis for using Twitter to annouce his candidacy. "Announcing on Twitter is perfect for Ron DeSantis," a Trump adviser told Fox News. "This way he doesn't have to interact with people and the media can't ask him any questions."

er than Trump, DeSantis was first elected to the House of Representatives in 2012. Interestingly, the Florida Governor was the former protege of Trump, having won his first Gubernatorial election with the former President's backing.

DeSantis was born in Jacksonville, Florida, in 1978 and went on to study history at Yale University. He also graduated from the Harvard Law School. During his second year at Harvard, he was commissioned as an officer in the US Navy and was assigned to its legal arm, the Judge Advocate General's (JAG) Corps. He was honourably discharged from the military in 2010, although he continues to serve in the US Navy reserve.

A stern Obama critic, DeSantish campaigned government" and reduced taxes. A report by BBC quotes DeSantis earlier speech about how his "mission was largely to stop Barack Obama."

Disney's criticism of the law did not go down well with DeSantis, who said "if Disney wants to pick a fight, they chose the wrong guy."

The mega corporation reacted by announcing that it would cancel \$1 billion office campus plan, thereby depriving Florida natives of thousands of employment oppurtunities.

British PM Sunak will not investigate Braverman over speeding fine row

LONDON, MAY 24: British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak has said that Home Secretary Suella Braverman did not breach ministerial rules over her handling of a speeding offence. Sunak added that she won't face an investigation over the row.

Braverman came under the scanner after it was revealed that she asked the help of government officials to help arrange a private driving awareness course so that her speeding violation doesn't come out to the public.

"Last summer, I was speeding. I regret that. I paid the fine and I took the penalty. And at no point did I attempt to evade sanction," Braverman told parliament on Monday, Reuters reported.

"My decision is that

these matters do not amount to a breach of the Ministerial Code," Sunak told Braverman in a letter on Wednesday. "As you have recognised, a better course of action could have been taken to avoid giving rise to the perception of impropriety," he wrote.

Leaders from the opposition had called on Sunak to investigate whether Braverman breached the ministerial code over her handling of the incident.

"In hindsight, or if faced with a similar situation again, I would have chosen a different course of action. I sought to explore whether bespoke arrangements were possible, given my personal circumstances as a security-protected minister," Braverman wrote to Sunak.

Georgi Gospodinov writer wins International Booker Prize for darkly comic memory novel

LONDON, MAY 24: Bulgarian writer Georgi Gospodinov and translator Angela Rodel won the International Booker Prize on Tuesday for Time Shelter, a darkly comic novel about the dangerous appeal of nostalgia.

The book beat five other finalists to the prize, which recognizes fiction from around the world that has been translated into English. The 50,000 pounds (\$62,000) in prize money is divided between the author and the translator.

Time Shelter imagines a clinic that recreates the past, with each floor reproducing a different decade. Intended as a way to help people with dementia unlock their memories, it soon becomes a magnet for people eager to escape the modern world.

Gospodinov, 55, said he began writing his book about the weaponization of nostalgia in 2016, the year of the election of Donald Trump and the U.K.'s Brexit referendum. He said it was a time when anxiety was in the air.

I wanted to write a novel about the monster of the past," he said. "Because you can see in this time that populist politics, actually, they paid us with the empty check of the past.

French novelist Leila

Slimani, who chaired the judging panel, said it was a brilliant novel full of irony and melancholy. It's a very profound work that deals with a contemporary question and also a philosophical question: What happens to us when our

she said. But it is also a great novel about Europe, a continent in need of a future, where the past is reinvented and where nostalgia can be a poison

Gospodinov is one of Bulgaria's most-translated authors. Time Shelter has also won Italy's Strega European Prize for literature in Italian

translated work of fiction published in the U.K. or Ireland. It is run alongside the Booker Prize for English-language fiction, which will be handed out in the

The prize was set up to boost the profile of fiction in other languages which accounts for only a small share of books published in Britain and to salute the underappreciated work of literary translators.

Last year's winners were Indian writer Geetanjali Shree and American translator Daisy Rockwell for Tomb of Sand.

Rodel said she was grateful to the prize for rejecting the belief that that if you're a good translator, maybe you shouldn't even be noticed.

This is a creative process, she said. This is a definite collaborative work of art that we're creating with our authors. I'm just endlessly grateful to the Booker for putting that out in front in this award."

Indian-origin teen who crashed truck into White House barrier says he wanted to kill President Biden WASHINGTON, MAY 24: A box truck is

Police have arrested a man they believe intentionally crashed a U-Haul truck into a security barrier near the north side of Lafayette Square late Monday night | AP A 19-year-old Indian-origin teen accused of

deliberately crashing a rented U-Haul truck into a White House barrier told authorities that he wanted to get inside the mansion to "seize power" and "kill" US President Joe Biden, according to media reports.

US Park Police arrested Sai Varshith Kandula after he crashed the truck into the security barriers on the north side of Lafayette Park shortly before 10 pm on Monday, sending multiple pedestrians running from the scene, The Washington Times reported.

The crash was a good distance from the White House gates, but the incident prompted road and sidewalk closures, and the nearby Hay-Adams hotel had to be evacuated. No one was injured in the crash.

Kandula, of Chesterfield, Missouri, rented the truck on Monday night immediately after flying from St Louis to Dulles International Airport on a one-way ticket, a Secret Service agent said in a statement of facts filed in federal district court in Washington DC, NBC News reported.

He drove the vehicle onto a sidewalk outside the White House and into a metal barrier just north of the White House, according to the document.

Kandula put the truck in reverse and crashed into the barrier a second time before United States Park Police officers took him into custody, according to the document.

Kandula told authorities he had been planning the attack for six months and detailed the plans in a "green book," the document

He "stated his goal was to 'get into the White House, seize power, and be put in charge of the nation," the document states.

"When agents asked how he would seize power, Kandula stated he would 'kill the President if that's what I have to do and would hurt anyone that would stand in my way."

The document was included with a criminal complaint charging Kandula with depredation of property of the United States over USD 1,000, the NBC News report said.

When Secret Service agents asked Kandula about a flag with a swastika he removed from a backpack, he allegedly said he'd bought it online because Nazis have a great history, according to the court document.

He allegedly said he "admires their 'authoritarian nature, Eugenics, and their one world order," according to the document. Kandula identified Hitler as a "strong leader" he admires, the report said.

In the St. Louis suburb of Chesterfield, where Kandula lives, FBI agents were seen entering and leaving his home Tuesday and acquaintances struggled to link the alleged attack with the chill teen they know.

Police in Chesterfield have no records of any interaction with Kandula or calls for service to the family home, Capt Daniel Dunn, Commander for the City of Chesterfield's Bureau of Criminal Investigations, said.

Dunn said that federal agents are in charge of the investigation.

Errion Barfield, who was on the Marquette High School track team with Kandula, remembered him as quiet and unassuming. He was nice and chill, Barfield said in a Facebook message to NBC News. Ain't ever

expected him to do something like that. Kandula was a member of the sizable South Asian population of Chesterfield, a middle-class suburb about 32 kilometres west of St. Louis.

Pranav Nagila, who was a year ahead of

Kandula, said he couldn't make sense of his one-time schoolmate possibly having a Nazi flag in his possession.

I didn't see him as off-putting or anything like that, said Nagila, who just finished his sophomore year at the University of Alabama at Birmingham. He just seemed like a chill person."

Kandula appeared in Washington DC Superior Court on Tuesday and is expected to make an initial appearance in federal court Wednesday afternoon.

A friend of Kandula told New York Post newspaper that he's worried about his state of mind.

The former classmate, who attended school with Kandula said, I feel like something either has gone badly internally inside him or maybe between the family.

Kandula was the quiet kid who enjoyed tennis, according to Aniket Sharma.

He was never open to talking. And anytime I tried, he, it was just only small talk never really anything deep. I always thought he was like a quiet, shy kid, Sharma said.

Sharma, now a Missouri college student, rejected the notion Kandula was a white supremacist or a neo-Nazi.

Sharma spent years living in the same Chesterfield apartment complex as Kandula and his family.

Speaking about those discussing his former friend on Twitter, Sharma said they had never

even met him. In addition to the Nazi flag, investigators recovered duct tape, a backpack and a notebook filled with writing from inside the

vehicle, FOX 5 DC reported.

J&K Govt appoints Grievance Redressal Officers for Persons with Disabilities

SRINAGAR, May 24: The government of Jammu and Kashmir has nominated Grievance Redressal Officers for Persons with Disability in all the concerned departments of the Union Territory.

According to a notification issued here today in this regard, the appointment of these officers has been made to ensure that the persons with disabilities enjoy the rights to equality, life with dignity and respect for his or her integrity equally with others, personal liberty, reasonable accommodation and appropriate environment with zero tolerance for discrimination on the ground of

disability. The document further read that the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 makes it mandatory to follow certain principles for empowerment of persons with disabilities. These inter alia included respect for inherent dignity, individual autonomy including freedom to make one's own choices and independence of persons, non-discrimination, full and effective participation and inclusion in society, respect for difference and acceptance of persons with disabilities as part of human diversity and humanity,

accessibility, equality between men and women and respect for evolving capacities of children with disabilities and respect for the right of children with disabilities to preserve their identities

The notification added that the government in the Social Welfare Department framed the Jammu and Kashmir Rights of Persons with Disabilities Rules, 2021 for effective implementation of provisions of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016.

The sub-rule (2) of Rule 14 of Jammu and Kashmir Rights of Persons with Disabilities Rules, 2021 provides that the Grievance Redressal Officer appointed by every department shall maintain a register of complaints of Persons with Disabilities with various particulars like date of complaint, name of complainant, name of the person who is enquiring the complaint, place of incident, the name of establishment or person against whom the complaint is made, gist of the complaint, documentary evidence, if any, date of disposal by the grievance Redressal Officer, details of disposal of the appeal by the district level committee, and any other relevant information.

PHR app / Health Locker: Is used to receive, store & share medical records between patients &

People's Biodiversity Register is an initiative started by National Biodiversity Authority (NBA), Chennai to document the Biodiversity of the Country and traditional knowledge (TK) associated with it so that IPR's can be protected. According to NBA documentation must be done at Panchyat level. The program started with welcoming Mr. Rakesh Abrol, DFO Research Forest Division, JK



Forest Research Institute and his team by Prof. Veenu Kaul, HoD Botany, University of Jammu. Prof. Susheel Verma, member Biodiversity Council introduced the resource person to the participants and deliberated on the significance of PBRs. Later on Mr. Abrol discussed about the PBR initiative of NBA and role of students in building the PBRs. Further, he elaborated on the procedures to be adopted during docu-

ments. According to him, mentioning geo-coordinates and the name of the person who has documented the TK is mandatory. A small documentary on the PGRs was also visualized wherein the importance and methods of PBR were discussed. Preparation of PBRs involves complete machinery from data collection to Biodiversity Management Committee, Panchyat, Panchyat Simitti etc. Data on traditional knowledge

available with elderly people, Hakims and Vaids is needed to be collected with the benefit sharing module. More than 100 students, research scholars, forest official including Mr. Shashi Kant, Range officer research and faculty members like Prof. Namrata Sharma, Dr. Sikander, Dr. Geeta, Dr. H C Dutt, Dr. Sajan and Dr. Romica attended the program. The program ended with vote of thanks by Dr. Skarma.

Chennai did well to reach 172/7 on a slow pitch in the Qualifier 1 after Hardik Pandya opted to bowl.

Considering the conditions, it turned out to be much more than a competitive total as Gujarat had a rare off day to end with 157 all out in 20 overs. Rashid Khan made the Chennai fans nervous with a 16-ball 30 towards the end but it was not enough for Gujarat.



However, the defending champions will get another shot to make a second successive final in Qualifier 2 on Friday.

Chennai's master tactician MS Dhoni made the best use of home advantage to take the four-time champions to a 10th final in 14 editions. CSK did not take part in 2016 and 2017 edi-

Sakshi and her husband visited Jawaharlal Nehru University on Monday and interacted with students, and Bajrang and Vinesh went to the North

"We want to take our voice to everyone. We could see that a lot of media did not show us sitting at Jantar Mantar, so we are going to citizens directly. We will also go to different parts of the country to address the people and try to get the youth to back us. This is not a fight for wrestlers alone. This is a fight to safeguard 70 crore women of this country," Bajrang said.

'Peaceful march'

The wrestlers thanked the crowd of thousands as the candlelight march remained peaceful.

"We want to thank everyone

for this peaceful candle march. We are equally thankful to those who could not come. You all have contributed to this big fight. Our strength in the numbers here. We feel we have the backing of the country," Bajrang said, standing atop a police barricade.

Vinesh said there was a bit of confusion as the police wanted their supporters to enter the Kartavya Path in one single file.

"They (police) wanted us to come in line but there were a lot of people so it became difficult, but we are thankful it was peaceful. I think this was the first time in years that such a march has happened at India Gate," Vinesh said.

She further added that the women's panchayat scheduled to be held on May 28, the day when Prime Minister Narendra Modi will inaugurate the new Parliament building, will be conducted in a peaceful manner.

Coming of age: Ganemat Sekhon, Darshna Rathore shoot down silver & bronze

ALMATY, May 24 (Agencies): Ganemat Sekhon won silver while Darshna Rathore claimed bronze as India bagged two senior individual medals for the first time in the women's skeet event at an ISSF World Cup here.

Local favourite Assem Orynbay won gold through a shoot-off after she and Ganemat ended the 60-shot final with 50 hits each. Ganemat missed one out of the first two shoot-off targets after Orynbay had shot down two.

It was Ganemat's second individual World Cup medal and a firstever for Darshna, who appeared in her maiden senior final.

Earlier in the day, Darshna qualified for the six-woman final in the second spot, equalling the national record with a score of 120, while Ganemat was fourth with a 117. Orvnbay topped the qualification with a 121.

The final stage included world No. 10 Konstantina Nikolaou of Cyprus among the qualifiers. The Cypriot, however, was the only shooter to miss three of her first four targets in the final, while the other five missed one each. At the end of the first ten targets, Orynbay was



the most accurate with eight hits as four others, including Darshna and Ganemat, followed with

Nikolaou was the first to be eliminated after 20 targets as Ganemat and Czech Republic's Bar-

bora Sumova continued to chase Orynbay, with Darshna trying to catch

up with them. After 30 hits, the field was down to four with Ganemat leading with a 25, followed by Orynbay with a 24 and Darshna and Barbora tied at 22. It was heartening to see the two Indians. in particular Ganemat, getting into the groove

as the final progressed. The Czech was the next to fall at the 40-target mark with a 29 to her name, confirming a historic double for the Indi-

In the men's skeet, none of the three Indians in the field made the final. Mairaj Khan was the best finisher with a 119 for a 16th-place finish, while Gurjoat Khangura also shot a 119 to finish 18th. Anantjeet Singh Naruka was further back with a 118.

SALALAH (OMAN), May 24 (Agencies): India will aim to qualify for this year's World Cup when they begin their title defence against Chinese Taipei in hockey's Junior Asia Cup here today.

The tournament, being a platform for young players in the continent to showcase their skills, is also important as the top-three finishers will qualify for the Junior World Cup, scheduled to be held in Malaysia in December.

India are the most successful side in the history of the tournament alongside Pakistan, with both countries having lifted the trophy three times each.

India have been grouped in Pool A along with Pakistan,



Japan, Thailand and Chinese Taipei, while Pool B comprises hosts Oman, South Korea, Malaysia, Bangladesh and Uzbekistan.

Captain Uttam Singh said playing against the senior India team in Bengaluru had prepared them well for the tournament. "Junior Asia Cup is a big opportunity for us to prove our mettle and implement every-

thing that we have worked on during training sessions," he said today. "Given the good international exposure that we have gained in the last couple of years and the recent practice sessions that we had in SAI Centre, Bengaluru, where we also played against the senior team to hone our skills."

India vice-captain Boby Singh Dhami said the title triumph at the Sultan of Johor Cup last year was a huge morale-booster for the side. "With the World Cup spots up for grabs, we are aiming to give our all on the field. The victory at the Sultan of Johor Cup last year has proven to be a big confidence-booster for us. I believe we are capable of beating any team in the tournament," he said.

No Red card for racism

Vinicius' case puts Spanish FA under pressure

MADRID, May 24 (Agencies): One after another, the racial insults kept coming. The "monkey" chants outside one stadium, the offensive gestures during a game, the effigy hung off a highway bridge.

One by one, Vinicius Junior showed them on a video on Instagram, making sure they were there for everybody to see.

"When will it be enough?" was the message with the video. "Racism is a crime. Not to punish is to be an accomplice.

The president of Spain's football federation acknowledged they have a racism problem after yet another case of abuse against the Real



Madrid forward. Madrid has asked authorities to investigate the latest incident as a hate crime.

Officials, players and other athletes continued to show solidarity with Vinicius, who on Sunday considered leaving the field after facing racist taunts from fans at Valencia during Real Madrid's 1-0 loss

in the La Liga. "We have a problem of behaviour, of education, of racism," Spanish federation president Luis Rubiales said on Monday. "And as long as there is one fan or one group of fans making insults based on some-

one's sexual orientation or skin colour or belief, then we have a serious problem. A serious problem that stains an entire team, an entire fan base and an entire country."

Real Madrid manager Carlo Ancelotti said today he expected the Brazilian to remain at the Spanish club despite facing racist abuse in several La Liga match-"I don't think (he will

leave Spain), because he loves football and he loves Real Madrid. His love for the club is very big and he wants to make his career here," Ancelotti told a news conference. He said Vinicius was "very sad" yet overwhelmed by the "unconditional support" he was receiving "even from rivals."

Seven people were detained by Spanish police earlier today, accused of different hate crimes against Vinicius.
