#### **Active** Coronavirus cases in India Dip to 6,168; 535 fresh cases reported

NEW DELHI, May 25 (Agencies): India has recorded 535 new coronavirus infections, while the active cases have decreased to 6,168 from 6,591, according to the Union Health Ministry data updated on Thursday. The death toll has increased to 5,31,854 with five deaths which includes three fatalities reconciled by Kerala, the data updated at 8 am stated.

The Covid case tally was recorded at 4.49 crore (4,49,88,426).

The active cases now comprise 0.01 per cent of the total infections, while the national COVID-19 recovery rate has been recorded at 98.80 per cent, according to the health ministry

The number of people who have recuperated from the disease surged to 4,44,50,404 and the case fatality rate was recorded at 1.18 per

# family dead as tree falls on tent in Kishtwar

JAMMU, May 25 (Agencies): Four members of a tribal nomadic family died in Jammu and Kashmir's Kishtwar district on Thursday morning when a pine tree fell on their tent, officials said.

The incident took place in the Bhalna forest area of Keshwan belt, they said, adding that highspeed winds and heavy rainfall uprooted the big

"A pine tree fell on a tent pitched by the nomadic family in the forest belt. In this tragic incident, four family members lost their lives early today." Senior Superintendent of Police, Kishtwar, Khalil Poswal said.

The family was going towards Dachan with its sheep and goats, and had halted in Bhalna forest due to heavy rains, they said.

### J&K Police debunks claim 'Disruptive Illegal Organisation' caused Kishtwar accident that killed seven

JAMMU, May 25 (Agencies): The Jammu and Kashmir Police on Wednesday rejected as fake news claims that a "disruptive illegal organisation" was behind a road accident near the Dangduru power project site in the Kishtwar district that killed seven people.

Senior Superintendent of Police (Kishtwar) Khalil Poswal asserted that it was a road accident, caused after the driver of the vehicle lost control at a sharp curve and it rolled down a hill.

The People's Anti-Fascist Front (PAFF) claimed on social media that it was behind the



accident.

"A fake news circulating on social media by a disruptive illegal organisation claiming responsibility of (the) accident of a vehicle at Dangduru today is baseless and unfounded," Poswal

"The statement of (the) PAFF is refuted and the general public is requested not to pay heed to any of the rumour spread by such disruptive organisations," he added.

Anyone found involved in spreading the fake news will be strictly dealt with, he said. The accident occurred near the Dangduru power project site in the remote Dacchan area around 8.35 am, the police said.

Seven people were killed and two critically in the accident. All the victims were workers at the power project site. The injured were rushed to a hospital by rescuers and local residents. the police said.

### **Intermittent rains** continue, MeT forecasts more as mercury drops in J&K

SRINAGAR, May 25 (Agencies): Intermittent rains continued even as the weather department here on Thursday forecast "fairly widespread to widespread intermittent light to moderate rain" in Jammu and Kashmir till May 26.

A meteorological department official said, Srinagar received 6.6mm of rain in last 24 hours till 0830 hours, Qazigund 11.6mm, Pahalgam 20.1mm, Kupwara 5.9mm, Kokernag 21.0mm, Gulmarg 7.8mm, Jammu 0.8mm, Banihal 27.3mm, Batote 42.4mm, Katra 3.4mm and Bhaderwah 19.4mm.

From May 25-26, he said, there is possibility of "fairly widespread to widespread intermittent light to moderate rain/ thunder/lightning with possibility of hailstorm and gusty winds at few places.'

From May 27-28, he said, intermittent light rain/thunder/lightning is expected at few places.

"Fairly widespread intermittent light to moderate rainthunder/lightning with possibility of hailstorm & gusty winds at few places," he said regarding forecast from May 29-30. Regarding temperature, the meteorological department official said that Srinagar

recorded a low of 10.8°C against 13.5°C on the previous night and it was 0.9°C below normal for the summer capital.

Qazigund, he said, recorded a low of 8.0°C against 12.6°C on the previous night and it was below normal by 2.3°C for the gateway town of Kashmir.

Pahalgam, he said, recorded a low of 6.1°C against 9.2°C on the previous night and it was 0.1°C below normal for the famous tourist resort in south Kashmir's Anantnag district.

In Kupwara town, he said, the mercury settled at 11.4°C against 12.4°C on the previous **Turn to page 9**



# **EDITORIAL**

# **ORGANIC FARMING**

rganic agriculture is a technique in which synthetic fertilizers and pesticides are not used or are used in very small quantities, in which crop rotation, animal waste, green manure, and compost etc. are used to increase production and maintain the fertility of the land. Is used for.

Organic farming system is based on ancient agriculture, in which favorable relationship was established between earth and human beings, instead of synthetic chemicals, excreta-urine of animals and remains of plants etc. were used. Food grains were full of nutrients.

In this type of agriculture, the use of inorganic fertilizers and pesticides is completely prohibited in agriculture, which are harmful for the environment, land and consumer.

We can also call Integrated Organic Farming System as Complementary Farming System or Dependent Farming System or Integrated Farming System because in this all the components of agriculture (such as crop production, fruit production, vegetable production, cattle rearing, bee keeping, forestry etc.) are dependent or complementary.

In this, these components are integrated in such a way that there is little or no competition and complementarity is maximum so that the residue of one can be useful as a nutrient for the other and this cycle continues like this. Due to which there is no or less need for external resources so that the cost of agriculture decreases and income increases.

There are many ways to do organic farming in India, farmers choose different agricultural methods according to their convenience, the goal of all these methods is the same.

With continuous production, there is a deficiency of nutrients in the soil, as a result of which the fertility of the soil decreases. Maintaining soil fertility with the help of essential nutrients is called soil management. Soil management in organic agriculture is done with the help of bacteria present in the remains of animals and animals.

Many types of micro-organisms are present in agricultural land, some of which are harmful to the soil. Natural pesticides or synthetic chemicals are used in small quantities to protect the soil from them and for better yield, this process is called chemical management.

Biological pest control is a process in which other micro-organisms are used to destroy weeds, mites, insects, etc.

The primary objective of organic farming is the management of weeds, because weeds also grow in the same land where crops are to be grown. They absorb essential nutrients from the soil for their growth. Due to which the production of agriculture is affected.

To eliminate or reduce the weeds, they are harvested or with the help of thin plastic foil, most of the land is covered so that their production can be controlled.

This method of organic farming is very famous in India, in this method, at the same time, at the same time, different types of crops are grown in the same field, due to which there is no shortage of nutrients in the soil and their fertility is maintained. It is a central government scheme, launched in 2015 by the Ministry of Agriculture and Welfare in the North Eastern states (Sikkim, Arunachal Pradesh, Meghalaya, Manipur, Mizoram, Nagaland, Tripura and Assam).

Keeping in mind the present scenario, it will not be an exaggeration to say that if human beings have to maintain their existence on the earth, then adopting organic farming should not be a means of meeting their needs, but it should be a compulsion, because the synthetic fertilizers are increasingly being used in the present agricultural system. The use of chemicals has badly affected not only the land but also the environment and human health.

### Ex-chief secy's return as KCR adviser kicks off a controversy

he recent appointment of ex-chief secretary of ex-cniei secreting Somesh Kumar as the chief adviser to Telangana's CM K. Chandrasekhar Rao has sparked controversy and raised concerns among babu and political circles. Having taken voluntary retirement in February, the 1989 batch IAS officer from Andhra Pradesh has been given a three-year term in the rank of a Cabinet minister. This has led many to question the potential overshadowing of senior serving babus due to his reported close proximity to the chief minister and his penchant to be in the spotlight.

Sources have informed DKB that the CMO already comprises a substantial number of retired officers from the IAS, IPS and other all India services.

According to the CMO's official website, there are a dozen advisers to the CM, of whom eight are former bureaucrats. It is widely believed that these advisers, during their tenure in service, impressed the chief minister with their work.

Now with the appointment of Somesh Kumar as the chief adviser, political and babu observers remain watchful, waiting to see how Mr Kumar's addition to the CMO will impact the functioning of the government and the roles of senior officials.

Ravneet Kaur takes the helm

at CCI at a crucial time

The appointment of Ravneet Kaur as the new chairperson of the Competition Commission of India (CCI) for a period of five years comes at a crucial juncture. Amidst months of delay and speculation, Ms Kaur's selection brings hope for the much-needed revitalisation of the regulatory body.

This move by the Centre, occurring ten months before her retirement, is a significant step towards ensuring fair competition in India's evolving business landscape.

Ms Kaur's extensive experience as a senior Punjab IAS officer, coupled with her notable track record, positions her as a promising leader for CCI. With the regulatory mandate of CCI being intensified through recent amendments to the law, the addition of manpower and infrastructure becomes imperative.

Interestingly, this is the third senior appointment the Centre has announced after the Karnataka election results. Earlier, the government had cleared the appointment of Praveen Sood as CBI director and IRS officer Suman Sharma as UPSC member.

The top post at CCI fell vacant after Ashok Kumar Gupta demitted the chairman's office on 25 October 2022, having completed his four-year term. Later the government gave member Sangeeta Verma the charge of acting chairperson and also

invited applications for three more members. CCI has to have a chairperson and not less than two and not more than six other members, as per the Competition Act.

Ms Kaur has held several positions in the government over the last two decades, including as chairperson of the India Tourism Development Corp between 2017 and 2019. With her extensive experience in the government and a proven track record, Ms Kaur's leadership is expected to revitalise the functioning of CCI and reinforce its role in ensuring fair competition, considering that the panel is currently investigating some of the world's biggest companies including Apple, Amazon and Walmart's Flipkart for alleged anti-competitive practices.

Different strokes for different folks!

Everyone in India knows that the country is run on a simple principle: Show me the man, and I'll show you the rule. In fact, rules change depending on how influential or otherwise the person likely to be affected by the rules is.

The recent appointment of Karnataka IPS officer Praveen Sood as the new director of the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) has revived talk about this adage. Some keen observers have pointed out that while senior Haryana IAS officer and whistleblower Ashok Khemka was not con-

sidered for Central deputation because he did not have any experience of serving at the Centre, the personnel ministry did not apply this condition in Mr Sood's case. He, too, apparently has no experience of having served on Central deputation and has not been empanelled, yet he has been named the CBI chief.

Interestingly, there's another interesting trend in the appointment of CBI chiefs. Some observers have noted that the BJP has on two similar occasions, brought in state police chiefs from states in which it lost elections to the Centre as CBI chiefs! They cite the example of IPS Rishi Shukla from Madhya Pradesh and Subodh Jaiswal from Maharashtra. So, Mr Sood's appointment is not an anomaly since there is clearly a precedent.

A similar logic was also given when Gen. B.S. Rawat was made Chief of the Army Staff (COAS) over two senior generals since they did not have combat experience.

Not surprisingly, the bureaucratic rulebook seems like a mythical creature, forever elusive and ever-changing, and can only be deciphered by a chosen few!

# Modi Pacific foray: China, Quad, islands & diaspora

Prime Minister Narendra Modi has just concluded a whistlestop tour of three Pacific nations, including Japan where he attended the Group of Seven summit as a guest invitee. He began his tour in Hiroshima, as one of the eight guests the Japanese PM had invited to the G-7 meet, where Ukraine's beleaguered President Volodymyr Zelenskyy stole the show with his unexpected appearance.

The Ukraine war continues to dominate the security threat perception of most G-7 members. Hiroshima was also where Mr Modi had his first face-to-face meeting with Mr Zelensky. India so far has used philosophical sophistry to avoid naming Russia as the aggressor or seeking Russian withdrawal from militarily usurped Ukrainian territory. Mr Modi's earlier phrase that "this is not an era of war" has now evolved into: "For me, it is an issue of humanity". It is unlikely that either Mr Zelenskyy or the G-7 nations supporting Ukraine militarily would take solace from that. China, which began with similarly evasive statements, has transitioned towards working actively to stop the war. It has even named a special envoy for Ukraine. China's President Xi Jinping has been going through the motions of engaging both sides and consulting other major players. Thus, India could not have remained passively concerned, especially when reports surfaced of Indian private sector refiners making a killing exporting refined Russian oil to Europe.

The G-7 summit's outcome is spelt in the "Leaders' Statement on Economic Resilience and Economic Security". They agreed to foster mutually beneficial partnerships to create resilient and sustainable value chains. They identified four

vulnerabilities -- natural disasters, pandemics, geopolitical tensions and coercion. The last relates to the Chinese use of economic coercion when any nation is perceived as defying its geopolitical priorities.

The motive behind building resilient supply chains is the disruption seen over the last three years, first due to Covid-19 and then the Ukraine war. Resilient critical infrastructure refers to the digital domain and the fear of China using companies like Huawei to gain intrusive supremacy. The call to counter the undermining of international rules and norms is a direct critique of Chinese conduct in its maritime neighbourhood and the Russian breach of Ukraine's territorial integrity.

What then is the takeaway from the Hiroshima G-7 summit? Japan's Prime Minister Fumio Kishida and his foreign minister travelled extensively abroad to gauge the mood in the developing nations, now dubbed as the "Global South". In 2009, then US President Barack Obama, following the financial crisis of 2008, had the G-7 accept a widened consultation mechanism, to include rapidly growing nations like India, China and Brazil. This is how the G-20, which India chairs this year, was born. His successor Donald Trump appeared to agree, and described the G-7 as "outdated". While the GDP of the G-7 collectively had a 70 per cent share in global output in the 1980s, it had shrunk to 45 per cent by 2021. Even more interestingly, in PPP terms the share of the five Brics nations -- Brazil, Russia, India, China and South Africa -- now exceed that of the G-7.

The G-7 members are aware that to really counter China they need to have an outreach strategy to the Global South. China is seen by most of Africa and Latin America as more stable and less questioning

about the domestic politics of most nations. According to the Economist magazine, Japan thus evolved the view that the G-7 must use arguments like threat to the rule of law and respect for sovereignty and territorial integrity of nations rather than evangelically pursuing human rights and democracy. Most nations can relate to concrete arguments impinging on their own existence, but not so much to nebulous prescriptions of liberal democracy.

The second leg of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's tour took him to Papua New Guinea. Its Prime Minister James Marape took everyone by surprise by touching his guest's feet. Thereafter, they co-hosted a summit of the 14-nation Forum for India Pacific Islands Cooperation (FIPIC). For some time, China has been making inroads into this sensitive cluster of islands with extensive maritime economic zones. India would have to coordinate with its Quad partners to be able to bring development assistance that matches the Chinese proposals under the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI). The G-7 also realises that they must listen to the Global South and address their financial and economic issues.

The final leg of Mr Modi's sojourn was a two-day Australian stopover. The original raison d'être was the proposed Quad summit, which got shifted to the sidelines of the G-7 due to US President Joe Biden's political commitments back home.

Normally the PM's visit also would have got postponed as the Australian Prime Minister had been to India earlier this year. Summits, in order to be productive, need some gap to allow decisions to be implemented. But the huge diaspora event that had been organised in Sydney, hosted by the Indian Australian Diaspora Foundation, beckoned. The venue, with a capac-

ity of 20,000, was mostly full.

The Indian diaspora is now 2.5 per cent of Australia's population, numbering over 600,000. Mr Modi had last visited Australia in 2014, soon after assuming office. If postponed, he may not have easily found another slot for Australia with the Lok Sabha polls over the horizon.

The inauguration of "Little India", a neighbourhood dominated by persons of Indian origin, reflects that the Indian diaspora is finding roots. Similarly named areas exist even in New York. Australian PM Anthony Albanese, overcome by the crowd's euphoria, turned hyperbolic in praising his Indian guest's star power.

Modi, perhaps mindful of past Opposition criticism of his partisan lectures while abroad, largely focused on India-Australia relations. His penchant for acronyms was on mark when he said the relationship has matured from the 3-Ds --democracy, diaspora and dosti --to energy, economy and education. Australia is a favoured destination for Indians seeking quality education at a reasonable cost, with the possibility of immigration.

The Economic Cooperation and Trade Agreement (ECTA) between India and Australia is operational, enabling almost 85 per cent of Australian exports to enter India tariff-free. Australia is an outstanding source for minerals, metals and gas, including huge reserves of rare earths that the world requires for a transition to carbon neutrality. It is thus a natural strategic and economic partner for India.

However, hugs and slogans aside, Australia is a US ally with deeper security commitments than India favours. But the shared worries over China, the growing Indian diaspora and the natural complementarity of their economies heralds a productive partnership.

# Kisan Sampark Abhiyan: 1.5 lakh farmers participate across J&K; 1367 panchayats covered in five weeks

SRINAGAR, MAY 25: Achieving a significant milestone in an online skill development programme, the Jammu and Kashmir government has recorded enthusiastic registration of farmers across all districts of the UT under 'Daksh Kisan', a first of its kind hybrid skilling programme designed exclusively for farming community.

"Over 12000 farmers have registered themselves in the Daksh Kisan Portal till now and around 3000 farmers have been enrolled in skilling course of their choice. Besides, a substantial number of farmers have already progressed to advance level of completion of the online skilling course", an official spokerperson informed while giving details about ongoing Kisan Sampark Abhiyan.

"Daksh Kisan- is a Learning Management System (LMS) for skill development of farmers. A first of its kind in the country, DAKSH KISAN, has been developed by Agriculture Production Department, where 121 skilling courses as per the agro-climatic zones of J&K are available for free to the farmers. A simple scan of the QR code at the back of pamphlet is being provided to farmers during Kisan Sampark abhiyan which takes them to Daksh Kisan Portal where he can register for free and undertake any skilling course of his/her liking", he added.

Attributing the credit of this rare accomplishment to ambitious 'Kisan Sampark Abhiyan', the offcial said that the initiative launched

on 24th April 2023 has completed five rounds till this week with coverage of about 1367 panchayats. Nearly,1.5 lakh farmers across all districts of J&K have attended the orientation programme during these five rounds of orientation programmes.

This massive farmer's orientation exercise is being undertaken by Agriculture Production department in J&K whereby ambitious targets of reaching out to farmers in each and every Panchayat has been envisaged under the Kisan Sampark Abhiyan in next 4 months. The farmers outreach exercise has been planned under the recently launched Holistic Agriculture Development Programme (HADP).

The orientation programme is being organised simultaneously across all the districts of the UT. The programme has been designed to be conducted on first three days of every week. An exhaustive district specific calendar has been issued by the Government.

The Resource persons for the orientations are Officers and Officials drawn from the Agriculture, Animal/Sheep Husbandry, Horticulture, Sericulture and Fisheries Departments. An innovative tool of describing different schemes/programmes using short films has been put in place. A total of 49 videos of schemes under HADP and other Centrally Sponsored Schemes is being shown to the farmers across the venues in J&K. Under LMS, video lectures and

textual material is being made available in Kashmiri, Urdu, Dogri and Hindi. Besides, specialised modules on business development and financial management have also been included to ensure that the farmers are not merely trained but become a skilful entrepreneur. After completion of online courses, the farmers shall be sent for 5-7 days to Krishi Vigyan Kendras in their respective districts for practical hands-on training in their chosen skilling course. On successful completion of the skilling course, the farmers shall be provided certificates by SKUAST J/K.

Additionally, a question answer session after each screening session of videos is being held to clear the doubts of farmers. The farmers are also being provided with pamphlets of all the schemes in the three languages (Hindi, Urdu and English) in the shape of a booklet, which also contains the information about the contact details of all the departments under the agriculture production department of the UT.

The farmers are also being educated about the mode of application under these schemes using the KISAN SATHI- the IT Dashboard of the schemes developed by APD. A baseline survey and skill gap study of farmers is also being carried out simultaneously during the Kisan Sampark abhiyan. The data of around 1.4 lakh farmers has been captured till date using IT tools for having a holistic assessment of the state of Agriculture and farmers in the UT.

Turner died Tuesday, after a long illness in her home in Ksnacht near Zurich, Switzerland, according to her man-

She became a Swiss citizen a decade ago.

Few stars travelled so far she was born Anna Mae Bullock in a segregated Tennessee hospital and spent her latter vears on a 260,000 square foot estate on Lake Zurich and overcame so much.

Physically battered, emotionally devastated and financially ruined by her 20-year relationship with Ike Turner, she became a superstar on her own in her 40s, at a



time when most of her peers were on their way down, and remained a top concert draw for years after.

With admirers ranging from Beyonc to Mick Jagger, Turner was one of the world's most successful entertainers, known for a core of pop. rock and rhythm and blues favourites: "Proud Mary," "Nutbush City Limits," "River Deep, Mountain High." and the hits she had in the '80s, among them "What's Love Got to Do with It," "We Don't Need Another Hero" and a cover of Al Green's "Let's Stay Together."

Her trademarks were her growling contralto, her bold smile and strong cheekbones, her palette of wigs and the muscular, quick-stepping legs she did not shy from showing off. She sold more than 150 million records

worldwide, won 11 Grammys, was voted along with Ike into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in 1991 (and on her own in 2021) and was honoured at the Kennedy Center in 2005, with Beyonc and Oprah Winfrey among those praising her.

Her life became the basis for a film, a Broadway musical and an HBO documentary in 2021 that she called her public farewell.

The show chronicles the story of a serial killer on the loose in the backdrop of myths and religion.



# Need to focus on technological advancement in defence sector: Rajnath Singh



NEW DELHI, May 25 (Agencies): India must focus on advancement in defence technology in view of "double threat" along the borders, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh said on Thursday in an oblique reference to challenges along the frontiers with China and Pakistan.

In an address at a conference, Singh underlined the need for extensive research to develop defence technologies for the country to meet various security challenges.

"For a country like India, it becomes very important because we are facing a double threat on our borders. In such a situation, it is very important for us to move forward in terms of technological advancement," he said.

"Today we are one of the largest armies in the world, the bravery of our army is discussed all over the world. In such a situation, it becomes imperative that we have a technologically advanced army to protect the interests of the country," he added.

The defence minister's comments came in the backdrop of the lingering border row in eastern Ladakh and Pakistan's continuous support to cross-border terrorism.

In his remarks, Singh also called for collaboration between the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) and academia for ensuring desired technological advancement.

"The only way for this advancement is research. It is the need of the hour that both DRDO and academia work in tandem," he said "The more this partnership grows, I think India's research sector will also grow in the same proportion. Scientists and experts from both the DRDO and academia are sitting here," he said.

"Although all of you will connect with each other through partnership, I want all of you to try to connect with each other at the individual and institutional level as well," Singh added.

Referring to various challenges facing the country, Singh said collective efforts and partnership are needed to confront them effectively.

"Today we see many major challenges in front of us. When it comes to the defence of the country, then these challenges become more widespread," he said.

"No institution can deal with these challenges alone. The most important thing we can do to address these challenges is collective effort and partnership," he said.

Singh said the partnership between DRDO and academia would also help DRDO develop dual use technologies.

"In this way, if the partnership between DRDO and academia is established, then DRDO will move towards the development of dual use technology," he said.

Dual use technologies are those used for defence as well as civilian purposes.

# HC asks Delhi govt to hold stakeholder consultation on draft of advocates protection bill

NEW DELHI, May 25: The Delhi High Court Thursday asked the Delhi government to examine and hold stakeholder consultation on the draft of the 'Advocates Protection Bill' which seeks to protect and ensure a safe atmosphere for legal professionals in the wake of the killing of a lawyer in April.

The high court was informed that the Co-ordination Committee of District Courts Bar Associations in the national capital has prepared the draft of the bill and it has been sent to the Delhi chief minister and law minister.

"Let the same be placed on record along with the index. Let steps be taken by the Delhi government for examination of the draft bill and let stakeholder consultation be held by it.

"After the stakeholders consultation on examination of the draft bill, let the action taken report be filed. List on September 6," Justice Prathiba M Singh said.

Advocate K C Mittal, representing the Coordination Committee of District Courts Bar Associations, informed the court about the first

draft of the bill having been sent to the chief minister and law minister for consideration.

The high court was hearing a plea by lawyers Deepa Joseph and Alpha Phiris Dayal seeking enactment of a law for protection of advocates and ensuring a safe atmosphere for them.

On April 12, the high court had asked the Centre and the city government to respond to the petition and also sought a status report from the Bar Council of Delhi and the coordination committee, which submitted it is already in the process of drafting an 'Advocates Protection Bill' and holding consultation with public officials.

Advocate Robin Raju, representing the petitioners, had earlier informed the court that Rajasthan has already enacted a law for protection of advocates.

Advocate Virender Kumar Narwal, 53, was shot dead in southwest Delhi's Dwarka by two motorcycle-borne assailants on April 1.

In their plea, the petitioners have said there has been an "alarming rise" in incidents of vio-

lence inside the court premises in the city and it was "high time now" for a decision to be taken for enacting a law to guarantee protection to the legal fraternity and help remove the fear that has got embedded in their minds.

The petitioners have stated their concern about their own safety has been "aggravated by seeing the visuals and video of the cold-blooded murder of an influential and senior member of the Bar", and if such a bill is not passed in Delhi, the audacity of criminals to commit crimes against lawyers will increase.

"The scenario par-

ticularly post the death of advocate Virender Narwal has created an atmosphere that does not feel favourable to practice the profession without fear and hence it impinges upon the right to practice any profession or to carry on any occupation, trade or business to all citizens under Article 19(1)(g) of the Constitution of India and also violates Article 21 of the constitution that guarantees protection of life and personal liberty," the petition said. It said Rajasthan has already passed a law which provides for police protection to any lawyer who is attacked or against whom criminal force and criminal intimidation has been used while prescribing a punishment for the offender.

It said advocacy is considered a noble profession which also involves risks and threats and a safe atmosphere is essential for practising the legal profession without fear.

"The petitioners are constrained to move this court as they have felt a sense of despair among fellow members of the Bar as well. The murder of Late Virender Narwal has compelled the petitioners to think about their own safety," the plea has said.

"Only an Act that guarantees protection to the fraternity of lawyers practicing in Delhi will help remove the sense of fear that has embedded in the minds, particularly among young first-generation lawyers like the petitioners herein due to the repeated acts of firing inside court premises and altercations to state the least," the plea has said.

# AAP slams Delhi Congress for 'politics of convenience' on Centre's ordinance on Delhi services

NEW DELHI, May 25: Senior AAP leader Saurabh Bharadwaj on Thursday lashed out at the leadership of Congress' Delhi unit alleging them of doing "politics of convenience" on the issue of the Centre's ordinance on the Delhi services matter.

Addressing a press conference here, Bharadwaj said that while the Delhi Congress is refusing to extend any support to AAP on the Delhi services issue, former Chief Minister Sheila Dikshit had passed a resolution in the Delhi Assembly in 2002 against the central government ruled by the BJP.

"Sheila Dikshit had condemned the central government orders earlier and said that it is violation of all democratic traditions. She had passed a similar resolution in the Delhi Assembly in 2002 against the Centre that had said they don't recognise Government of NCT of Delhi and that there can be only one government in Delhi," the Delhi minister said.

"What the Delhi Congress is doing is politics of convenience and is working for the BJP. The statements are coming from such leaders who have been sidelined by the party," Bharadwaj

Earlier, Congress leader Sandeep Dikshit had said that AAP's allegations that it is not being allowed to work in Delhi is merely "an excuse" and a reflection of its "uselessness".

Senior Congress leader Ajay Maken had also strongly opposed extending any support to Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on the issue saying the Congress should not oppose the proposed legislation to be brought in Parlia-

ment on the Delhi services issue, replacing the ordinance promulgated by the Centre last week.

Kejriwal has sought the support of various political parties on the issue of the Centre's ordinance on the administration of services in the national capital and on Tuesday, he met West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee. He also sought Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar's support during their meeting earlier this week.

He is appealing to other parties too for support on the issue. The AAP has said that rejecting the proposed legislation to replace the ordinance will be a litmus test for the opposition unity.

25 (PTI) The Supreme Court on Thursday refused to grant anticipatory bail to the directors of a private firm, who have been named as accused in a case lodged in connection with construction of a flyover in Ahmedabad which was closed for public use due to the damage caused to it because of alleged use of sub-standard mate-

The apex court was hearing a plea filed by four directors of the firm, which had constructed the flyover near a bus terminal at

Hatkeshwar, challenging the order passed by the Gujarat High Court this month dismissing their applications seeking anticipatory bail.

"It is not a case for anticipatory bail," a vacation bench of Justices J K Maheshwari and P S Narasimha said, adding, "within four years, your bridge is going to collapse. Sorry."

An FIR in the case was lodged in April 2023 for the alleged offences punishable under various sections of the Indian Penal Code, including 406 (punishment for criminal

breach of trust) and 420 (cheating).

According to the prosecution, the firm had obtained the tender for construction of the flyover and allegedly used inferior quality material which caused severe damage to it.

In its order, the high court had noted that the flyover was commissioned for use in 2017, and within a span of four-five years, it was required to be closed for public due to the damage.

These directors had contended before the high court the design of the flyover did not

support plying of multi axle heavy load vehicles. The use of such vehicles for about three

years had resulted in

the damage, they said.

During the arguments before the apex court on Thursday, senior advocate Mukul Rohatgi, appearing for the petitioners, said the bridge was completed in November 2017. He said the authorities allowed very heavy traffic on the bridge, and due to the plying of multi axle heavy vehi-

# Sitharaman appeals to oppn parties to rethink on boycott says Sengol is a civilisational symbol

CHENNAI, May 25: Asserting that power transfers never happen merely at the shake of hands, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Thursday appealed to opposition parties to reconsider their decision to boycott the dedication of the new Parliament building scheduled on May 28, saying it is a "temple of democracy."

Addressing reporters here, she said 20 "aadeenams" (pontiffs) from Tamil Nadu have been invited for the inauguration, where the 'Sengol' will be installed, as did in 1947 to symbolise the power transformation from the British. Prime Minister Narendra Modi is scheduled to inaugurate the new Parliament building on Sunday.

Sitharaman addressed a press conference at the Raj Bhavan here in the company of TN Governor RN Ravi, his Telangana and Nagaland counterparts, Tamilsai Soundararajan and La Ganesan, respectively, Union Minister L Murugan and TN Minister PK Sekar Babu.

The ruling DMK in Tamil Nadu, one among the 19 opposition parties in the Centre that are boycotting the inauguration, dubbed the Sengol (sceptre) a symbol of monarchy and

insisted it had nothing to do with democracy.

Responding to the opposition taking exception to the inauguration by PM Modi, instead of President Droupadi Murmu, Sitharaman said in a veiled attack on the Congress that its former chief Sonia Gandhi had laid the foundation stone for the Chhattisgarh assembly building instead of the Governor of that state earlier.

It was strange that those who censured the President, now find themselves morally motivated, Sitharaman said.

"I am surprised by their allegation. These parties saw the President coming from a tribal background and took up a bitter campaign against her. Leaders of the opposition parties spoke ill of her and said she will be a rubber stamp and that she represents evil forces," Sitharaman said.

"But the Prime Minister gave her due respect. Those who ran a bitter campaign then are now suddenly speaking for her," the finance minister said.

Asked for her comments on the

boycott of the inauguration by sever-

al political parties, she replied, "Par-

liament is a temple of democracy and these parties should reconsider their decision and participate."

Telangana Governor Dr Tamilisai Soundararajan said certain political parties seem to have the habit of playing politics as per their convenience.

"I was not invited for the inauguration of the Assembly complex which was inaugurated by the Chief Minister (K Chandrasekar Rao). Some parties know how to play politics, when to invoke the name of governor or the chief minister, as per their convenience," she added.

Sitharaman said the unveiling of the golden Sengol marks an important event in the history of Indian Parliamentary democracy.

"The Rajya Sabha is part of the Parliament complex and the Sengol will be placed in the Lok Sabha signifying an important event in the temple of democracy and also Tamil Nadu's connection to the symbolic transfer of power through the Sengol," she

"Never ever power transfers are done at the shake of hands. There are many things which go to make the events sanctified and the Sengol represents one such sanctifying event. This talks about the civilisational link," she said.

On whether the embossment of Lord Ganesh and Goddess Lakshmi images on the sceptre be accepted by people of all faiths, she said that when the British left India there were Christians and Muslims in the country. None had objected to those images when it was given to Lord Mountbatten and later handed over to the first Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru.

"Indonesia, a Muslim majority nation, for instance, has Ganesh and Lakshmi on their currency notes. They find nothing wrong to display their civilisational symbols," she said and expressed hope that the Sengol too would find acceptance.

Sitharaman further said TN has a "big proud part" to the episode of handing over of the Sengol to Nehru, symbolising the power transfer from the British to the people of India in

This was done on the advice of the Tiruvavaduthurai adheenam after the late CR Rajagopalachary discussed it with the Shaivite pontiff following Nehru's consultations with him.

As many as 20 'aadeenams' from Tamil Nadu, including Tiruvavaduthurai, Perur and Madurai have been invited for the May 28 inaugural event, she said.

In Tamil, the word 'Aadeenam' refers to both a Shaivite monastery and the head of such a math.

"The pontiffs will attend the event, there will be Oduvars (scholars in Shaivite scriptures and hymns) who will recite the Thevaram. In 1947 also the Sengol was handed over to Nehru when othuvargal recited Kolaru Pathigam," she said.

Meanwhile, the DMK lashed out at the government for the invitation to the pontiffs, asking if religious heads of other faiths have been invited.

DMK spokesperson and former MP TKS Elangovan said Sengol represents monarchy.

"Sengol is an identity of a monarchy. In a monarchy there was no sperate judicial system, the king was the chief justice, the king was head of defence, head of administration; king controls the entire nation. The king renders justice to his subjects," he told PTI.

He said in a democracy there is no role for the Sengol.

# Imran Khan says 'undeclared martial law' in Pakistan files plea in Supreme Court

Pakistan's former prime minister Imran Khan has filed a petition in the Supreme Court against the government invoking Article 245 in several provinces, terming it "undeclared martial law"

Under Article 245 of Pakistan's Constitution, the army can be called in to aid the civil administration to defend the country.

Khan has filed a plea in the Supreme Court, challenging the invoking of Article 245 in Punjab, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Balochistan and Islamabad and calling it "undeclared martial law".

In his petition, the 70-year-old Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) chief said the arrests, investigations and trial of citizens under the Army Act 1952 were "unconstitutional and void and of no legal effect and amounts to negation of the Constitution, the rule of law and independence of the judiciary."

He said that the "dismantling of PTI through forcible quitting of party membership and office are unconstitutional and void being against Article 17 of the Constitution," the Dawn news-

#### South Korea US troops hold large live-fire drills near border with North Korea SEOUL, May 25: The South Korean and US

militaries conducted large live-fire drills near the border with North Korea on Thursday, despite the North's warning that it won't tolerate what it calls an invasion rehearsal on its doorstep.

The drills, the first of five rounds of live-fire exercises through mid-June, mark 70 years since the establishment of the military alliance between Seoul and Washington. North Korea typically reacts to such major South Korean-US exercises with missile and other weapons tests.

Since the start of 2022, North Korea has test-launched more than 100 missiles, but none since it fired a solid-fuel intercontinental ballistic missile in mid-April. It says the tests are a response to expanded military drills between the US and South Korea, but observers say North Korea aims to advance its weapons development and then wrest greater concessions from its rivals in even-

The US-South Korean firing exercises, called "Combined annihilation firepower drills," are the biggest of their kind. The drills have been

Defence Ministry. The drills involved 2,500 troops and 610 weapons systems such as fighter jets, attack helicopters, drones, tanks and artillery from South Korea and the United States, according to the South Korean Defence Ministry. The most recent exercises in 2017 drew about 2,000 soldiers and 250 weapons assets from both countries.

The drills simulated artillery and aerial strikes on front-line North Korean military facilities in response to an attack. The troops later practiced precision-guided attacks on simulated targets in the rear areas to "completely annihilate" North Korean military threats, according to a ministry statement.

It said South Korea will seek to establish "peace through overwhelming strengthen" to counter North Korean

North Korea didn't immediately respond to the start of the drills. Last Friday, its state media called the drills "a typical North Koreatargeted war rehearsal," saying it "cannot but take a more serious note of the fact" that the exercises are a few kilometres from its frontier. The North's Korean Central News Agency said the US and South Korea would face unspecified "corresponding responses" to the drills.

Earlier this year, the South Korean and US militaries conducted their biggest field exercises in five years. The US also sent the nuclear-powered USS Nimitz aircraft carrier and nuclear-capable bombers for joint exercises with South Korea.

Moon Seong Mook, an analyst for the Seoulbased Korea Research Institute for National Strategy, said North Korea could use the South Korea-US drills as a pretext to resume testing activities. He said domestic issues such as North Korea's push to increase agricultural production during the rice-planting season could still affect its decision on weapons tests.

"North Korea can't help feel some burdens over the South Korea-US joint firepower drills being held for the first time in six years and in the strongest manner," Moon said.

In a meeting last month, US President Joe Biden and South Korean President Yoon Suk Yeol announced steps to reinforce their deterrence capabilities such as the periodic docking of US nucleararmed submarines in South Korea, strengthened joint training exercises and establishment of a new nuclear consultative group. Biden also issued a blunt warning that any North Korean nuclear attack on the US or its allies would "result in the end of whatever regime" took such action.

Kim Yo Jong, the powerful sister of North Korean leader Kim Jong Un, said the Biden-Yoon agreement revealed the two countries' "most hostile and aggressive will of action" against the North.

# Iran unveils latest version of ballistic missile amid wider tensions over nuclear program

TEHRAN, May 25: Iran unveiled on Thursday what it dubbed the latest iteration of its liquid-fuelled Khorramshahr ballistic missile amid wider tensions with the West over its nuclear

Authorities showed off the Khorramshahr-4 to journalists at an event in Tehran, with the missile on a truck-mounted launcher.

Defence Minister Gen. Mohammad Reza Ashtiani said the missile could be prepared for launch in a short period.

Iranian officials described the missile as having a 2,000-kilometre (1,240-mile) range with a 1,500-kilogram (3,300-pound) warhead. They also released undated video footage pur-



portedly showing a successful launch of the missile.

The Khorramshahr-4 is named after an Iranian city that was the scene of heavy fighting during the Iran-Iraq War in the 1980s. The missile also is called Kheibar, after a Jewish fortress conquered by the Muslims in the 7th century — in what is now

Saudi Arabia. Regional tensions likely played a role in Iran's missile display on Thursday. A miniature example of Jerusalem's golden Dome of the Rock on the Al-Aqsa Mosque compound, a holy site in both Islam and Judaism that Jews call the Temple Mount, stood next to the mobile launcher.

Iran views Israel as its archenemy and arming anti-Israeli militant groups in the Palestinian territories and surrounding

Tensions between the two nations are high, particularly as Iran enriches uranium closer than ever to weapons-grade levels. The Khorramshahr would be able to reach Israel.

It remains unclear, however, why the missile has been called Khorramshahr-4 as only two other variants of the missile are publicly known.

# Head of Russian private army Wagner says his forces are handing control of Bakhmut to Moscow

KYIV, May 25: The head of the Russian private military contractor Wagner claimed on Thursday that his forces have started pulling out of Bakhmut, in eastern Ukraine, and handing over control to the Russian military, days after he said Wagner troops had captured the ruined

Yevgeny Prigozhin, Wagner's millionaire owner with longtime links to Russian President Vladimir Putin, said in a video published on Telegram that the handover would be completed by June 1. There was no immediate comment from the Russian defense ministrv.

It was not possible to independently verify whether Wagner's pullout from the bombedout city has begun, and the Ukrainian General Staff said on Wednesday that heavy fighting was continuing inside the eastern city after a nine-month battle that killed tens of thousands of people.

Prigozhin's Bakhmut triumph delivered a badly needed victory for Putin, whose invasion of Ukraine in February 2022 has lost momentum and now faces the possibility of a Ukrainian counteroffensive using advanced weapons supplied by Kyiv's Western allies.

Top Ukrainian presidential advisor Mykhailo Podolyak said on Thursday that Ukraine's counteroffensive was already underway, cautioning that it should not be anticipated as a "single event" starting "at a specific hour of a Writing on Twitter,

Podolvak said that "dozens of different actions to destroy Russian occupation forces" had "already been taking place yesterday, are taking place today and will continue tomorrow."

Prigozhin has a longrunning feud with the Russian military leadership, dating back to Wagner's creation. He has also built a reputation for inflammatory and often unverifiable headline-grabbing statements.

During the 15-month war in Ukraine, he has repeatedly and publicly chastised Russia's military leadership, accusing them of incompetence and failure to properly provision his troops as they spearheaded the battle for Bakhmut.

Wagner's involvement in the capture of Bakhmut has added to Prigozhin's standing, which he has used to set forth his personal views about the conduct of the

"Prigozhin is ... using the perception that Wagner is responsible for the capture of Bakhmut to advocate for a preposterous level of influence over the Russian war effort in Ukraine," the Institute for the Study of War, a Washington think tank, said.

His frequent critical commentary about Russia's military performance is uncommon in Russia's tightly controlled political system, in which only Putin can usually air such criticism.

His flat statement of what he would do over the next week in Bakhmut came a day after he again broke with the Kremlin line on Ukraine.

He said its goal of demilitarising the country has backfired, acknowledged Russian troops have killed civilians and agreed with Western estimates that he lost more than 20,000 men in the battle for Bakhmut.

Meanwhile, Russian unleashed a barrage of Iranian-made Shahed 36 drones against Kyiv in its 12th nighttime air assault on the Ukrainian capital this month but the city's air defences shot down all of them. Ukrainian authorities said on Thursday.

The Kremlin's forces also launched 30 airstrikes and 39 attacks from multiple rocket launchers as well as artillery and mortar attacks across Ukraine, the Ukrainian military said.

In Russia, meanwhile, the Foreign Ministry announced on Thursday that five Swedish diplomats are to be expelled from the country.

According to the statement, the decision is a response to Stockholm's "openly hostile step" to declare five employees of Russian foreign missions in Sweden "personae non grata" in April.

Moscow additionally announced its decision to close its consulate in Göteborg in September, as well as its "withdrawal of consent" to the activities of the Swedish consulate in St. Petersburg.

# PM Shehbaz visits gutted Radio Pakistan building in Peshawar during May 9 protests

PESHAWAR. May 25: Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Thursday announced the immediate start of work for the restoration of the historic building of state-run Radio Pakistan here which was set ablaze during May 9 violence following the arrest of former premier Imran Khan.

Sharif visited the building of the national public broadcaster in Pakistan and lamented the way in which it was burned

On May 9, there were violent protests following the arrest of Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf chairman Khan that led to several deaths and dozens of military and state installations being destroyed by his supporters.

For the first time in Pakistan's history, the protesters stormed the army headquarters in Rawalpindi and also torched the Corps



Commander's House in Lahore.

Radio Pakistan's headquarters was also set on fire in Peshawar. Radio Pakistan is the oldest existing broadcasting network in Pakistan.

Sharif, also the President of the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) party, expressed his dismay over the loss of a precious and historic archival record that was completely destroyed and torched by the violent

"The way the archives were burned down... nations protect their identity with their lives so that the coming generations can benefit from it. But here the archives were burned down," he said.

Director General Radio Pakistan Tahir Hassan briefed the Prime Minister in detail about damages caused to the structure by the angry

mob for two days. Sharif praised the bravery and national spirit of Radio Pakistan

employees. He also distributed cheques of financial assistance for the two staff members who bravely countered the violent mob that attacked the building of the national broadcaster, media reports said.

He said the ransacking and arson of the Radio Pakistan Peshawar building severely hurt the twenty-two million people of Pakistan.

"Torching the national broadcaster and its archival record that was preserved since the independence of Pakistan by arsonists is not patriotism, but enmity with the nation," he said.

Sharif said those who were involved in, ransacking, torching and miscreants activities would be dealt with iron hands according to the law and the Constitution.

"There is no difference between the miscreants of May 9 episode and the terrorists and they will be punished accordingly law of the land," he

During the visit, Prime Minister Sharif also announced payment of the pending two months' salaries to Radio Pakistan employees. On Wednesday, he

said only those people who are behind the May 9 incident will be arrest-

Chairing the Federal Cabinet meeting in Islamabad, he said the culprits will be brought to justice as per the Constitution and the law.

At the outset, Chief Medical Officer Dr Rakesh Magotra informed the meeting about the agenda, roles and responsibilities of the members of DLCC under NTCP.



The Divisional Coordinator NTCP, Shiveta Raina threw light on the prevailing tobacco usage scenario of the Jammu and Kashmir UT besides gave details of the penal and enforcement provisions of COTPA-2003. She also gave an overview of WHO Framework Convention on Tobacco Control (FCTC) and strategies on effective implementation of COTPA-

During the meeting, Key provisions of COTPA-2003 were discussed, including the prohibi-

tion of smoking in public places, advertisement restrictions, sale restrictions to minors, and regulation of trade and commerce

related to tobacco products. The Deputy Commissioner emphasized on the active participation of all stakeholders in enforcing COTPA-2003 and raising awareness among the general public, particularly the youth, about the hazardous effects of tobacco use

To curtail tobacco usage, the DC called for stringent measures and

regular enforcement activities. He also called upon Chief Education Officer Kathua to incorporate awareness messages on tobacco's ill effects during morning assemblies by organising Poster Making and other such competitions. He further asked the Hols to exercise strict vigil to ensure that no tobacco products are sold within 100 yards of any educational institution.

# origins in the brainStudy offers hope for individuals with chronic pain

In a groundbreaking study, researchers have made a significant breakthrough in understanding chronic pain by identifying a specific brain area linked to this condition. Utilising advanced machine learning tools and analyzing data collected over several months, the research team, which included scientists from the University of California, San Francisco, successfully pinpointed biomarkers associated with chronic pain disorders caused by stroke or amputation.

Published in the esteemed journal Nature Neuroscience, the study offers promising insights into how pain is represented within the brain and explores potential avenues for alleviating the suffering experienced by individuals with chronic pain. With chronic pain being a leading cause of disability worldwide, this research carries immense importance for improving the quality of life for those affected.

Unlike acute pain, which is typically a response to injury or illness, chronic pain persists over an extended period and is often resistant to conventional treatments. Neuropathic pain, specifically, results from damage to the nervous system itself. While it commonly arises from nerve injuries within the body, the individuals participating in this study exhibited pain originating from the brain. This unique form of pain poses a



considerable challenge to effective treatment and can severely impact the daily lives of those afflicted.

By gaining a deeper understanding of how chronic pain is manifested in the brain, researchers hope to develop innovative strategies to modulate brain activity and provide much-needed relief to individuals suffering from this debilitating condition. The identification of specific biomarkers associated with chronic pain represents a significant step forward in unraveling the mysteries of this complex phenomenon and offers new possibilities for future therapeutic interventions

"When you think about it, pain is one of the most fundamental experiences an organism can have," said Prasad Shirvalkar, associate professor of anaesthesia and neurological surgery at the University of California, San Francisco, and lead author of this study.

"Despite this, there is still so much we don't understand about how pain works," said Shirvalkar.

In this study, the researchers looked directly at changes in brain activity in two regions where pain responses are thought to occur - the anterior cingulate cortex (ACC) and the orbitofrontal cortex (OFC) - as participants reported their current levels of chronic pain.

"Functional MRI studies show that the ACC and OFC regions of the brain light up during acute pain experiments. We were interested to see whether these regions also played a role in how the brain processes chronic pain," said Shirvalkar.

"We were most interested in questions like how pain changes over time, and what brain signals might correspond to or predict high levels of chronic pain?" said

Shirvalkar. Four participants, three with post-stroke pain and one with phantom limb pain, were surgically implanted with electrodes targeting their ACC and OFC. Several times a day, each participant was asked to answer questions related to how they would rate the pain they were experiencing, including strength, type of pain, and how their level of pain was making them feel emotionally.

They would then initiate a brain recording by clicking a remote-control device, which provided a snapshot of the activity in the ACC and OFC at that exact moment.

Using machine learning analyses, the research team was able to use activity in the OFC to predict the participants' chronic pain state.

In a separate study, the researchers looked at how the ACC and OFC responded to acute pain, and found that brain processes acute vs. chronic pain differently, though more studies were needed to establish that, they said.

# New findings shed light on chronic pain World Schizophrenia Day: Towards awareness and acceptance

A Beautiful Mind, released in 2001, was the biographical movie of legendary mathematician John Forbes Nash Jr. The movie made people understand that mental problems can be treated with the love and support of family, friends, and society. The movie traced Nash's emergence as a brilliant mathematician even as he struggled with one of the most debilitating mental diseases, schizophrenia.

Schizophrenia is known to affect one in every hundred people. One of the most disabling and economically burdening diseases, schizophrenia mostly affects young adults. Men are twice as likely to develop the condition as compared to women, and people with the condition have double the risk of death due to suicide than the general population.

Apart from mental well-being, the disorder also affects a person's social and occupational life. Most of the time, they are isolated or worse, get thrown out of their families due to the frustration of the caregivers or poor understanding of the illness. Due to the behavioural changes, people suffering from the disease end up on the streets or become addicts.

Often, persons with schizophrenia are portrayed as dangerous, violent or psychopathic in movies and television shows. Ironically, they are just the opposite. A person suffering from schizophrenia is not more dangerous or 'criminal' than anyone else. Instead, they are often victims of violence, abuse or fraud. They are more likely to harm themselves and are aggressive only when provoked or ridiculed.

Usually, the affected person may not have the ability to seek professional help. This is why the society needs to have a better awareness of the disease.

What is schizophrenia?

The term schizophrenia comes from the Greek words 'schizin' (split) and 'phren' (mind), roughly translating to "splitting of mind". The word intends to show how

there is a dichotomy in the way a person with the disease thinks, speaks and perceives the world. The affected often have their own 'imagined' world in which they live and believe, detached from reality. It can lead to self-absorption and excessive communication with oneself

Schizophrenia is not entirely genetic, though the presence of illness in the family plays a role.

Symptoms of schizophrenia include muttering to oneselfpatients may hear voices commanding them or discussing things with them—and having false, unshakable beliefs that cannot be changed by evidence. These are termed 'hallucinations' and 'delusions' respectively. They may also suffer from suspicion (they may feel people are conspiring against them) and muddled or disrupted thoughts expressed through unusual behaviour and incomprehensible speech.

There can also be another set of symptoms like poor emotional response or expression, poor self-care/personal hygiene, withdrawn behaviour, lack of attention or concentration and troubles with memory. Sometimes, inappropriate social attitudes and smiling can occur as the 'sense of social context' is lost. Research, however, shows that patients with schizophrenia are rarely violent.

How can we help? Although schizophrenia is a serious mental disorder, it is highly treatable. Specific medications called antipsychotics are used effectively for the treatment. This should be started early, along with psychological counseling that can help an individual suffering from

schizophrenia attain complete

recovery.

More than two-thirds of the patients can improve much with proper treatment. Patients need to continue medication and treatment as per the advice of the doctors and need to be in regular touch with them.

Contrary to popular belief, these medicines are not addictive drugs

and do not 'damage the brain'! Antipsychotic medications will take at least four weeks to show their effects and need to be continued until the patient recovers. Research shows that the rate of recurrence of problems is higher if medicines are stopped suddenly and hence it is vital to have a regular discussion with the doctor.

The earlier the treatment begins. the better it is. Besides medication, vocational rehabilitation is vital. For a complete recovery, apart from a reduction of symptoms, patients need to regain their jobs, relationships and daily activities. For the meaningful social participation of those living with schizophrenia, it is important to do away with the stigmas associated with the disease.

What can we do?

Awareness, identification and care are the three main pillars of managing any mental disorder. Community awareness about the early signs of the illness, sensitising the family members and primary health care workers are extremely important in this regard. All stakeholders need to assume collective responsibility.

# Indian archer Prathamesh Final call on Asia Cup venue to be taken wins World Cup gold; Ojas-Jyothi reign supreme

NEW DELHI, MAY 25: Teenage Indian archer Prathamesh Jawkar produced the biggest upset of his rising career, stunning world number one Mike Schloesser of the Netherlands to grab a maiden World Cup gold medal in the men's individual compound section here on Saturday.

India bagged two Gold in the non-Olympic compound section with the mixed team duo of Ojas Deotale and Jyothi Surekha Vennam opening the country's tally by upsetting top-seeded Koreans in the Stage 2 of the World Cup.

This was a successive World Cup gold medal for the mixed pair duo that had also won in the Antalya leg last month.

Prathamesh, who had earlier eliminated the Korean duo of Kim Jongho and Choi Yonghee, continued his giantkilling act to defeat the Dutchman 149-148 in the men's compound individual final.

That the 19-year-old dropped just one point from 15 arrows en route to defeating the two-time former world champion showed his incredible shooting at the highest level.

The one-point miss came in the first end



as both the archers remained neck and neck after starting off with 29-all.

Second, third and fourth ends saw both of them hitting the target at ease before the 29-year-old Dutchman finally faltered in the fifth end, capping a 9 to hand the Indian teenager his first World Cup gold.

Continuing its dream run, India's compound mixed team duo of Deotale and Jyothi earlier shocked heavyweights Korea to grab successive World Cup gold medals.

The pair carried forward its new-found chemistry and shot with composure to pip the top-seeded Korean team 156-155.

Both the Indian duo and the seasoned Korean pair of Kim Jongho and Oh Yoohyun

shot identical 39s out of 40 in each of the first three ends.

In the final end the Koreans cracked under pressure as Deotale and Jyothi came up with a 39 again to seal their back-to-back World Cup gold medals.

Having made an early exit in the individual section, Jyothi had a perfect start to the final, even as her 20-year-old partner struggled for a perfect

Ojas, however, complemented well and brought out his best when Jyothi missed the 10 a couple of times, as the duo showed perfect chemistry at the highest

Locked 117-117 heading into the final end. Jyothi shot a 10 with her final arrow, while a measurement was needed on Oh Yoohyun's final

arrow to confirm the Indians' victory.

"Throughout the World Cup, our co-ordination and shooting process were very good. And in the final too, we focused on our shooting process," Jyothi said.

Jyothi has now made a strong start to the 2023 World Cup season with three gold medals including one in the individual section at Antalya

The Vijayawada archer is now dreaming big with the World Archery Championships in Berlin a couple of months away.

"World Championships are the most important event for us. And winning the gold medals is a big boost to our confidence. We look to continue the momentum," she added.

# after IPL final BCCI Secy Jay Shah

NEW DELHI, May 25: A final decision on the country -- or countries -- hosting the Asia Cup will be taken on the sidelines of the IPL final, which will be attended by a host of top Asian Cricket Council (ACC) dignitaries, BCCI secretary Jay Shah said on Thursday.

"As of now, the decision with regards to hosting of Asia Cup hasn't yet been finalised. We are busy with IPL but the top dignitaries of Sri Lanka Cricket (SLC), Bangladesh and Afghanistan Cricket Board are coming to watch the IPL final. We will have a discussion and take a final decision in due course," Jay Shah told PTI.

The hosts for this year's Asia Cup is Pakistan but with the Indian cricket team not travelling to the neighbouring country without the Central government's permission,

PCB chairman Najam Sethi had proposed a 'Hybrid Model' where four games are supposed to be hosted in their country.

It has been learnt from ACC sources that Sethi's proposed Hybrid model that Sri Lanka, Bangladesh, Nepal and Afghanistan play four preliminary matches in Pakistan with India playing all its games at neutral venues, looks like a feasible solution although ACC had made no formal statements.

The two India-Pakistan games will also be held in Sri Lanka although the PCB wants them in

"ACC head Jay Shah will summon an executive body meeting where a formal announcement will take place. The PCB doesn't mind playing India at a neutral venue. While they would prefer Dubai because it would lead to more gate receipts, it is open to playing in another country (read Sri Lanka) provided the ACC matches the gate receipts amount (USD 0.5 million) that Sri Lanka Cricket (SLC) received in 2022 from the Indo-Pak games in Dubai," an ACC source privy to development told PTI on conditions of anonymity.

While PCB maintains that playing the World Cup in India is subject to government clearance and is a matter to be treated in isolation from Asia Cup hosting rights, it is a foregone conclusion that neither BCCI, nor ICC or the host broadcasters will be agreeable to an India-Pakistan World Cup match taking place in Bangladesh.

The window for the Asia Cup this year is between September 1-17.

# Sindhu Srikanth Prannoy enter quarterfinals of Malaysia Masters

KUALA LUMPUR, May 25: Star Indian shuttlers PV Sindhu. HS Prannov and Kidambi Srikanth booked their places in the quarterfinals of the Malaysia Masters Super 500 tournament with contrasting wins over their respective rivals here on Thursday.

While double Olympic medallist and sixth seed Sindhu disposed of Aya Ohori of Japan in straight games in women's singles, Prannoy had to dig deep to get the better of Shi Feng Li of China in a tough three-game men's singles contest. Later in the



day, Srikanth prevailed over India Open champion and eighth seed Kunlavut Vitidsarn of

Thailand. Taking the court first, world No. 13 Sindhu extended her domination over Ohori, ranked 28th, taking just 40 minutes to beat the Japanese 21-16, 21-11 in



the round of 16. It was her 13th win over the Japanese in as many meetings.

Sindhu will face China's Yi Man Zhang in the quarterfinals.

World No. 9 Prannoy then overcame a game deficit to beat world No. 11 and reigning All England champion Li 13-21,

21-16, 21-11 in one hour and 10 minutes to book his berth in the lasteight stage. Prannov will next meet Japan's Kenta Nishimoto, who has claimed victories in 2022 Japan Open and Spain Masters this year.

Coming into the match with a 0-3 head-to-head record, Srikanth notched up a 21-19, 21-19 win over Vitidsarn to also make it to the quarterfinals.

"But missing out on a few games he really centralised and focussed him on what direction he wants to go. Because he's so incredibly skilled with the bat in hand he needs to bring every part of the game together.

"He should be dominating international cricket. But sometime it takes people some time to navigate how they can do that consistently. He certainly had an extra bit of fire in his belly the other day."

Watson feels that the pitch at the Arun Jaitley Stadium doesn't suit the Capitals batting

"The pitches here in Delhi haven't been great. They are probably great if you have a different type of set up to the team... if you have a lot of Indian top order batters. But that's not the make up of our team."

After posting their first 200 plus score of the season in Dharamsala earlier this week, skipper David Warner had said that the Delhi batters are struggling to figure out the best total at the slow and inconsistent pitches at

"As we saw when we are able to play in good, traditional cricket wicket, true surface, ball doesn't really turn a lot but is going through nicely we saw what can happen with our overseas players, Prithvi that's our strength," Watson said.

"But we come here to Delhi unfortunately with the amount of cricket being played on this wicket block, it's very dry and doesn't have much grass, which exposes the set up of our batting at the moment. Hopefully, the conditions will be a bit more suitable for

"What stood out for me was the consistent leadership, with MS Dhoni and Stephen Fleming and just the calmness they have through out the franchise.

"CSK don't chop and change their team too much. They have a very settled team without making too many changes, they really understand what their roles are, that's something at DC we need to get better at, to provide the calm within the team, the franchise."

"You need the foreign players' experience but the team that does consistently the best is the one with high performance Indian players because there are 7 or 8 of them and have an impact on the season.
