India logs 310 new Covid-19 cases, Active infections Dip to 4,709

NEW DELHI, May 29 (Agencies): India has logged 310 new coronavirus infections, while the active cases have decreased to 4,709 from 4,972. according to the Union Health Ministry data updated on Monday.

The death toll has increased to 5,31,866 with two deaths, the data updated at 8 am stated.

The Covid case tally was recorded at 4.49 crore (4,49,90,054) The active cases now comprise 0.01 per cent of the total infections, while the national COVID-19 recovery rate has been recorded at 98.80 per cent, the ministry said.

The number of people who have recuperated from the disease surged to 4,44,53,479 and the case fatality rate was recorded at 1.18 per cent. According to the ministry's website, 220.66 crore doses of Covid vaccine have been administered in the country so far under the nation wide vaccination drive.

MeT predicts intermittent light to moderate rain till June 2 in J&K

SRINAGAR, May 29 (Agencies): Meteorological Department on Monday predicted intermittent light to moderate rain coupled with thunderstorm to occur in Jammu and Kashmir.

Currently, the weather is partly to generally cloudy at most places with the possibility of intermittent light to moderate rain or thunderstorm very likely to occur towards late afternoon or evening at many places of J&K on Monday.

It said intermittent light to moderate rain, thunderstorm, and lightning with the Possibility of hailstorms & gusty winds at scattered places till June 2. "There's No forecast of any Major Rainfall", the MeT office said.

The weather is likely to remain dry from June 3-6.

It has also advised farmers to postpone farm operations of spraying, and harvesting of crops till June 2 amid inclement weath-



Terror Funding Case | Delhi HC issues notice to Yasin Malik on NIA plea seeking his death penalty

NEW DELHI, May 29 (Agencies): The Delhi High Court on Monday (May 29) issued a notice to separatist leader Yasin Malik, who is presently serving a life term, on a plea by the National Investigation Agency seeking death penalty for him in a terror funding case.

A Bench of Justices Siddharth Mridul and Talwant Singh also issued warrants for production of Malik before it on August 9. Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, who appeared on behalf of the National Investigation Agency (NIA), argued that the accused indulged in terrorist and

secessionist activities and should be awarded death penalty by treating the matter as a "rarest of rare" case.

"In view of the ground

that Yasin Malik, sole respondent in this appeal, has inter alia pleaded guilty to a charge under section 121 IPC which provides for an alternate death sentence, we issue notice to him... to be served through the jail superintendent," the court ordered.

Let warrants be issued for his production on the next date of hearing, it added.

On May 24, 2022, a trial court here had awarded life imprisonment to Jammu Kashmir Liberation Front chief Malik after holding him guilty for various offences under the stringent Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA) and

the IPC. Malik had pleaded guilty to the charges, including those under the UAPA, and he was convicted and sentenced to life imprison-

In its plea before the high court for enhancement of the sentence to death penalty, the NIA said if such "dreaded terrorists" are not given capital punishment on

NGT panel suggests banning civil construction in subsidence-hit area of Doda

NEW DELHI, May 29 (Agencies): A National Green Tribunal panel has recommended banning civil construction in the land subsidencehit area in Jammu and Kashmir's Doda district and rehabilitating the affected families to a safer location.

The authorities in February evacuated several families after their homes developed cracks and also declared

unsafe a mosque and a religious school for girls in the Nai Basti hamlet of Thathri town.

The situation had drawn similarities with Joshimath, the gateway to famous pilgrimage sites like Badrinath and Hemkund Sahib and international skiing destination Auli, that is facing a major challenge due to land subsidence.

The authorities, however, refused to compare the two. The nine-member

Lady drug peddler arrested in Kashmir

SRINAGAR, May 29 (Agencies): Continuing its crackdown on drug peddlers and their accomplices, Awantipora Police successfully apprehended a female drug peddler in the Pampore area.

According to a statement, the Police acted on specific intelligence and set up a special checkpoint at Gallander, under the leadership of SHO PS Pampore Syed Ageel Shah-JKPS Dy.SP(P), and under the supervision of SDPO Pampore Shri Imtiyaz Ahmad Mir-JKPS. As

a result, they arrested a female drug peddler identified as Safeega Begum, wife of Mohammad Shaban Ganie. residing in Lelhar Kakapora.

The police spokesperson reported that the lady drug peddler was found in possession of 1 kilogram and 800 grams of charas powder. The recovered drugs are considered a significant seizure in the fight against drug trafficking.

Five families rendered homeless as blaze damages three houses in Bandipora

BANDIPORA, May 29 (Agencies): In a fire incident that took place on Monday afternoon in the picturesque Kaloosa neighborhood of Bandipora district in north Kashmir, three residential properties were

damaged, forcing five families living in them to seek shelter elsewhere. An eyewitness said that the fire erupted

from one of the homes

in Ganae Mohalla and rapidly engulfed the adjacent houses as fire and emergency services, along with J&K police and army rushed to the spot to douse the flames.

The witness said that the department along with police was on the spot dousing the flames, however, the cause of the fire is yet to be known.

Qazigund shuts against opening of a Liquor Shop

SRINAGAR, May 29 Agencies): Qazigund town, located on the Srinagar-Jammu Highway in South Kashmir's Kulgam district, observed a complete shutdown in protest against the opening of a liquor shop.

All the shops in the town were closed, as locals have been demanding the immediate closure of the said liquor shop.

"It will be a source of waywardness and give

rise to moral corruption. The government claims to act tough against drug peddlers but allows wine shops to operate freely. This duality is evident," expressed a local resident.

Another local resident stated that the opening of a liquor shop would have a counterproductive and disastrous impact on the youth. "It's crucial to keep the youth away from drugs and liquor instead of encouraging them to purchase and consume alcohol with government permission," he emphasized. Protests against the

establishment of liquor shops in various parts of the Kashmir Valley have been witnessed in the past as well. Recently, Muslims, Sikhs, and Pandits jointly staged a protest against the same issue in North Kashmir's Uri, which led the administration to close down the liquor shop.

4 armed men loot Rs 40 lakh from petrol pump in Punjab's Sirhind

FATEHGARH SAHIB, May 29 (Agencies): Four armed men looted Rs 40 lakh from the salesman of a petrol pump at Bhatmajra village near Sirhind.

Harmeet Singh, employee of the pump, said he, along with a gunman, was going in a car to deposit Rs 40.8 lakh at the SBI Sirhind City branch. He said as they approached Madhopur Chowk underbridge, four armed men arrived in an i-20 car. They fired four rounds, snatched the gunman's gun and decamped with the cash. They fled towards the Rajpura side.

Reacting to the statement made by Union Secretary Mines Vivek Bhardwaj that the union government would auction the lithium resources of J&K before December, Harsh Dev Singh, former minister and JKNPP president, has questioned the locus of the union secretary in interfering in a matter which falls within the domain of state/UT

"The centre's move, as evident from the mining secretary's statement is therefore not only unprecedented and violative of existing laws but is also an attempt to invade into the arena of the state government," said Singh.

Harsh Dev Singh said the centre seemed to be desperately attempting to usurp the rich lithium resources of J&K which otherwise belongs to and is property of J&K,

Ministry of Mines, as announced on 2 May which should be left to the elected government to be formed in the state in future. Pertinent to mention

that, Ministry of Mines secretary, Vivek Bharadwaj had stated that the union government has "completed the consultation process with stakeholders on the amendment of the offshore mining act," and that its auction would be held before December.

Plastic is very light and used by people and thrown here and there, due to which it reaches the water sources by flying through the air. Apart from this, packaged foods also come in plastic packing and people who go for picnics and camping throw these bad plastic bags at the same time, due to which it creates serious problems like water pollution

Animals do not understand the difference between plastic bags and thrown food, due to which they eat plastic along with food thrown from garbage cans or places and it gets stuck in their digestive system and on eating plastic in large quantities It gets stuck in their throat and they die of suffocation.

Apart from this, the plastic which is consumed by them in small quantities gets collected in their paint, due to which it causes many diseases in animals.

Plastic bags are mostly made of polypropylene, which is made from petroleum and natural gas. Both of these are non-renewable fossil fuels and their extraction produces greenhouse gases, causing serious problems like global warming.

Although plastic bags have become an integral part of our daily life, yet stopping their use is not as difficult as it seems. Plastic has been banned by the government in many states of our country but still people are using it indiscriminately and it is still easily available in the mar-

As Assembly polls & 2024 LS loom, is Modi now missing his magic masala?

Thether anyone likes it or not, the fact is that the BJP is a single-pillar structure. The new BJP has been built on the shoulders of Prime Minister Narendra Modi. Hence, it follows that he is bigger than the party. The organisation is an instrument for him to gain power. And the power belongs to him as he has built the party. Simple and clear.

The "single pillar" has always been shown as the boon of the world's largest party. Mr Modi is like the mythological Atlas or Hercules holding up the heavens. Those who question the PM are almost always portrayed as the "enemies of the nation".

It flows from this logic that what the PM says in Parliament is gospel. Nothing less. The disqualification of Rahul Gandhi was set in motion as he was incessant in asking awkward questions, and therefore had to pay for his blasphemy. There's nothing wrong with that, so the faithful feel.

As a political commentator put it aptly, Mr Modi's strategy is of "eloquence" on certain issues and "silence" in some others. It has so far paid off handsomely. He had put this to good use by turning into a "Mauni Baba" on issues uncomfortable to him, or on which he wants these to resolve themselves to his advantage.

Being the "single pillar" of the world's largest party, Mr Modi is accorded kid glove treatment

in most of the media, especially the electronic media, given the government's influence. India has further slipped in the world press freedom index. The media knows the government has a lot of clout due to its resources and knows it disciplines those who don't behave as per its expectations.

However, the Karnataka campaign showed that the PM, hailed by his followers as the greatest communicator of our time, is increasingly becoming hollow and, as a result, failed to deliver.

Alarm bells must be ringing in the ruling party over the failure of its star campaigner to leave a decisive mark despite spending days in the southern state and doing several roadshows. The Bajrang Bali and Bajrang Dal references were atrocious, which showed that a desperate leader was willing to go to any extent to win the election.

What compounded matters further for the BJP was the robust resistance to its campaign by local leaders like Siddaramaiah and D.K. Shivakumar who batted effectively. Things may become difficult for the BJP in states where the Congress has strong local lead-

The Adani issue has made an impact on the credibility of the PM. While his government has stonewalled any debate in Parliament on the alleged megascam by the business group, and the media too is not pursuing it diligently, the message has gone that Mr Modi and his governmet have much to hide.

The Congress' emphasis on bread-and-butter issues in the campaign, against the BJP's Bajrang Bali focus, led to loss of face for the ruling side.

The lesson for the BJP from the debacle in Karnataka is shocking. If it failed to work on the ground and did not show results, the high-profile campaigning will not take off. More important than that is the realisation that if the Prime Minister has nothing new to offer and nothing new to say, he too will not be able to lift a campaign. "Ek Modi sab par bhari" will remain a myth.

The BJP's "Waterloo" in Karnataka has changed things a lot. The supreme leader was shown to have feet of clay. This is unthinkable for all those brought up on the fable of Mr Modi's invincibility.

In fact, the Karnataka polls were a "Modi versus Rahul" contest, in which Mr Modi lost and Mr Rahul Gandhi won.

This is bound to stir the pot. The mellowing voices in the Opposition on the issue of unity is a grudging admission that the Congress has to be given a prime place if stiff resistance is to be offered to the Modi-led BJP. As the Modi government enters its crucial tenth year and the Lok Sabha polls are just over 10 months away, the threats are growing by the day. It is no more smooth sailing for the BJP, as the waters are becoming choppy, and the winds have started blowing violently.

It is being revealed that while Mr Modi campaigned in 47 Kar-

nataka seats, the BJP could succeed in only 15. The BJP has in the past used such occasions to ridicule Rahul Gandhi's leadership by keeping up-to-date statistics of his campaign and the result. It is now on mute mode.

The blunting of the effect of its best campaigner will bother the BJP no end. Unless and until remedial measures are taken to bring a better narrative, the ruling party will continue to feel beleaguered. After nine years of Mr Modi in power, the Opposition has suddenly tested the waters. Things are not going to be the same again.

Mr Modi without the magic masala is a flop for the BJP. The ruling party will remain in denial, but its defeat in Karnataka is due to Mr Modi's defeat. He is undoubtedly the biggest asset the BJP has.

That Karnataka is haunting the BJP is evident from the voices coming out of the pollbound states. The discomfort is indicated by MP chief minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan's statement that "Karnataka-Farnataka is not going to have any impact here" because this is Madhya Pradesh.

There is a growing realisation that the BJP will have to fight every inch in the coming Assembly polls in Chhattisgarh, Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh and Telangana. The Lok Sabha polls too will not be a cakewalk.

PM Modi flags off Guwahati-New Jalpaiguri Vande Bharat Express

The prime minister symbolically waves a green flag on screen

GUWAHATI, May 29 (Agencies): Prime Minister Narendra Modi virtually flagged off North East's first Vande Bharat Express from Guwahati to New Jalpaiguri in West Bengal on Monday.

The prime minister symbolically waved a green flag on screen, to launch the train from Guwahati station where Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw, Assam Governor Gulab Chand Kataria and Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma were present.

The Vande Bharat Express will boost tourism, education, trade and employment opportunities in the North East, the prime minister said on the occasion.

The semi-high-speed train between Guwahati and New Jalpaiguri



will further strengthen connectivity between and West Bengal.

During the last nine years, the North East has witnessed infrastructure development with all states connected with the railway network. Modi said.

"Infrastructure is for all without any discrimination, reflecting true social justice and secularism," the prime minister said.

The state-of-the-art train will provide the people of the region the means to travel with speed and comfort besides boosting tourism in the region.

The Guwahati-New Jalpaiguri Vande Bharat Express will cover the journey in 5 hours 30 minutes, while the current fastest train takes 6 hours 30 minutes to cover the distance.

GSLV-F12 successfully places 2G navigation satellite into intended orbit: ISRO

SRIHARIKOTA (AP), May 29 (Agencies): The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) on Monday successfully launched a second generation navigation satellite, using a GSLV rocket with a cryogenic upper stage to do the job.

NVS-01 would augment the country's regional navigation system, providing accurate and real-time navigation.

At the end of a 27.5-hour countdown, the 51.7-metre-tall, 3-stage Geosynchronous Satellite Launch Vehicle lifted off at a prefixed time of 10.42 am from the second launch pad at this spaceport, situated about 130 km from Chennai. This was GSLV's 15th flight.

The second generation navigation satellite series dubbed as a significant launch would ensure the continuity of NavIC (Navigation with Indian Constellation) services -- an Indian regional satellite navigation system, similar to the GPS, providing accurate and real-time navigation.

Signals from NavIC are designed to provide user position accurate to better than 20



metres and timing accuracy better than 50 nanoseconds.

ISRO Chairman S Somanath congratulated the entire team for the "excellent outcome" of the mission.

"NVS-01 has been placed in precise orbit by GSLV. Congratulations to the entire ISRO team for making the mission happen," he said in his postlaunch address from the Mission Control Centre.

Today's success came after the GSLV F10 'debacle,' he said referring to the anomaly in the cryogenic stage of the launch

vehicle in August 2021, following which the then mission could not be realised

He expressed joy that "corrections in cryogenic stage and lessons learnt have really paid benefits" and credited the Failure Analysis Committee for addressing the problem.

Somanath further said NVS-01 is a second generation satellite with additional capabilities. The signals will be more secure, civilian frequency band has been introduced, he said. This was one of the five of such sat-

The rocket, a little short of 20 minutes after it took off, deployed the 2,232 kg satellite into the intended Geosynchronous Transfer Orbit (GTO) at an

altitude of about 251 km. NVS-01 carried navigation payloads L1, L5 and S bands and the second generation satellite also has an indigenously developed rubidium atomic

clock. It is for the first time that an indigenously developed rubidium atomic clock has been used as the scientists earlier opted for imported ones to determine date and location.

Ahmedabad-based Space Applications Centre has developed the clock, and according to ISRO, it assumes significance as it is an important technology that only a handful of countries possess.

ISRO developed the NavIC system to meet the positioning, navigation and timing requirements of the country, particularly with regard to civil aviation and military requirements.

NavIC was earlier known as the Indian Regional Navigation Satellite System (IRNSS).

Wrestlers will be allowed to protest at any suitable place other than Jantar Mantar: Delhi Police

NEW DELHI. May 29 (Agencies): A day after the Delhi Police cleared the sit-in site of the protesting wrestlers, the security force on Monday said they would be allowed to demonstrate at a suitable place in the city other than Jantar Mantar.

"The demonstration by the wrestlers was going on smoothly at the notified place of Jantar Mantar. On Sunday, the protestors flouted the law, ignoring our repeated requests. Hence, we

cleared the site and ended the dharna," the **Deputy Commissioner** of Police (New Delhi) tweeted in Hindi.

"If the wrestlers apply for permission to stage their sit-in again in future, they will be allowed to do so at any suitable notified place other than Jantar Mantar," it said. Wrestlers Vinesh

Phogat, Sakshi Malik and Bajrang Punia along with other protesters were booked for rioting and obstructing public servant in discharge of



duty on Sunday after a scuffle with security personnel who tried to stop them from marching to the new Parliament building as it was

being inaugurated. Soon after, the Delhi Police cleared the site of their over-month-long sit-in at Jantar Mantar and said they would not be allowed to return there.

The police said 700 people were detained across the national capital. As many as 109 protesters, including the three wrestlers, were detained at Jantar Mantar. Women detainees were released later in the evening on

fixed with a man from Prayagraj and was scheduled for Sunday. According to police,

the woman was against the match as she had an affair with a local boy, who was known to her

cousin. The two planned an elopement with the help of her cousin.

Police said her lover and her cousin reached the woman's house on the motorcycle and the three sped away after dodging the relatives who were busy in the wedding preparations.

They had barely travelled a kilometre when they met with an accident and the three died on the spot.

Pandey said the bodies had been sent for post-mortem.

7 college students killed in Guwahati road accident

GUWAHATI, May 29 (Agencies): Seven students of Assam Engineering College were killed and six others injured in a road accident in Guwahati on Monday, police said.

Ten third-year students left the college premises in a car early on Monday morning, and their speeding vehicle hit a road divider and then collided with a pick-up van in Jalukbari area of the city, an officer said.

"Seven students died on the spot, while three others were admitted to the Gauhati Medical College and Hospital in a critical condition." he

Three occupants of the pick-up van, including the driver, were also critically injured and admitted to the hospital, the officer added.

Delhi teen stabbed, bludgeoned to death by 'boyfriend' a police officer said.

NEW DELHI, May 29 (Agencies): A 16-yearold girl was stabbed to death allegedly by her boyfriend in northwest Delhi's Shahbad Dairy area, a video of which is being widely shared on social media, police said on Monday.

The accused allegedly stabbed her multiple times before bludgeon-

ing her with a stone. The body of the victim, a resident of JJ Colony in Shahbad Dairy, was found lying in the street,

She was passing through the street when

she was accosted by the accused, who stabbed her multiple times, the officer said. The couple was in a

relationship but had a quarrel on Saturday. On Sunday, the victim planned to attend the birthday party of her friend's son but was accosted and stabbed repeatedly. She was also hit with a stone, he

The police said the post-mortem would confirm how many times the victim was stabbed.

The accused is absconding and a search is under way to nab him.

A case under Section 302 (murder) of the Indian Penal Code has been registered at Shahbad Dairy police station on the basis of the complaint lodged by the victim's father, the police added.

Man Beaten Up For Objecting To Firecrackers Near Temple In Thane: Cops

THANE, May 29 (Agencies): A 28-yearold man was allegedly beaten up by four persons after he objected to their act of bursting firecrackers near a temple in Maharashtra's Thane district when an event was being held there on Monday, police said

A local festival was underway at the temple of a Goddess in Tippanna Nagar in Kalyan area where some people were playing drums.

At around 1.30 am, some persons started bursting firecrackers near the temple which disturbed the event following which one of the devotees approached them to inform about the disturbance caused by their act, an official from Khadakpada police station told agency.

The persons got angry and allegedly beat up the man severely and also hit him with a stone, causing head injury to him, he said.

The victim was given first aid at a local hospital, the official said.

Based on the victim's complaint, a case was registered against four persons under Indian Penal Code Sections 323 (voluntarily causing hurt), 324 (voluntarily causing hurt by dangerous weapons or means), 504 (intentional insult with intent to provoke breach of peace) and 34 (common inten-

tion). No arrest has been made so far, the official said, adding that a probe is on into the incident.

ETAWAH, May 29 (Agencies): Two people were killed when their autorickshaw was hit by a bus that had lost control after being rammed by a truck in the Friends Colony area, police here said on Monday.

The accident occurred late on Sunday.

The truck rammed into the bus from behind, causing its driver to lose control and hit the autorickshaw, Additional Superintendent of Police (City) Kapil Dev

Singh said.

The victims were identified as Vivek Kumar (43) and Suresh (42).

The drivers of both the bus and the truck fled after the accident, the police said.

A probe is underway.

2 Teenage Girls Drown In River Yamuna In UP's Prayagraj: Cops

PRAYAGRAJ, May 29 (Agencies): Two teenage girls drowned while taking a bath in the Yamuna river in the Lalapur area of this Uttar Pradesh district on Monday, police said.

Cousins Jagriti and Shreya alias Pari -- both aged 16 -- were visiting their native village from Delhi, Senior Sub-Inspector Chandrika Yadav of the local police station said.



The pair had gone to take a bath with their younger cousin when they drowned, Chan-

drika Yadav said.

The bodies have been recovered and sent for post-mortem, he added.

NEW DELHI, May 29 (Agencies): Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Monday urged Lieutenant Governor V K Saxena to take strict action over the murder of a minor girl in Shahbad Dairy here and said it was his responsibility to maintain law and order in

Taking to Twitter, Kejriwal wrote, "A minor girl was brutally murdered in Delhi. This is very sad and unfortunate. The criminals have become fearless, there is no fear of the police. LG sir, law and order is your responsibility, do something."

Senior AAP leader Atishi also slammed the Lieutenant Governor (L-G) and said the Constitution has given the L-G the "responsibility of protecting people" of the Union Territory.

"I want to remind the L-G that the Constitution has given him the responsibility of protecting the people of Delhi. But he spends all his time to halt the work of Arvind Kejriwal. I request the L-G with folded hands to pay attention to the safety of the women of Delhi as they are not safe here at all," she tweeted.

The 16-year-old girl was stabbed to death allegedly by her boyfriend in northwest Delhi's Shahbad Dairy, a video of which is being widely shared on social media, police said on Monday.

The accused allegedly stabbed her multiple times before bludgeoning her with a stone.

Reacting to the incident, BJP leader Kapil Mishra said, "This painful murder has happened in Delhi. Shraddha has not got justice yet. Do not know how many more Shraddhas will become victims of this brutality.

Delhi Commission for Women Chairperson Swati Maliwal slammed the Delhi Police and alleged that "no one is afraid" of the police or law

in the national capital. "What was the fault of the 16-vear-old girl that she was brutally killed on the road? No one is afraid of police and law in Delhi There will be no limits to cruelty if there is no action in this case," she said.

The body of the victim, a resident of JJ Colony in Shahbad Dairy, was found lying in the street, a senior police officer said. She was passing through the street when she was intercepted by the accused, who stabbed

her multiple times, the

officer said. The couple was in a relationship but had a quarrel on Saturday. On Sunday, the victim planned to attend the birthday party of her friend's son but was intercepted and stabbed repeatedly. She was also hit with a stone, he added.

The police said the postmortem will confirm how many times the victim was stabbed.

The accused, identified as Sahil (20), has been arrested from Bulandshahr in Uttar Pradesh, police added.

North Korea notifies neighbouring Japan it plans to launch satellite in coming days

This may be an attempt to put Pyongyang's first military reconnaissance satellite into orbit

TOKYO, May 29 (Agencies): North Korea on Monday notified neighbouring Japan that it plans to launch a satellite in coming days, which may be an attempt to put Pyongyang's first military reconnaissance satellite into orbit.

Japan's coast guard said the notice it received from North Korean waterway authorities said the launch window was from May 31 and June 11 and that the launch may affect waters in the Yellow Sea, East China Sea and east of the Philippines' Luzon Island.

Japan's coast guard issued a safety warning for ships in the area on those dates because of the possible risks from falling debris.

Japan's coast guard coordinates and distributes maritime safety information in East Asia, which is likely the reason it was the recipient of North Korea's

To launch a satellite into space, North Korea would have to use long-range missile technology banned by UN Security Council resolutions.

Its past launches of Earth observation satellites were seen as disguised missile tests.

Japan's Chief Cabinet Secretary Hirokazu Matsuno said the launch would violate U.N. resolutions and was a "threat to the peace and safety of Japan, the region and the international community." Defense Minister Yasukazu Hamada ordered Japan's Self Defense Force to shoot down the satellite or debris, if any entered Japanese

Matsuno said it was possible the satellite would enter or pass above Japan's southwestern islands including Okinawa, where the United States has major military bases and thousands of troops.

Japan has already been on standby for falling missile debris from North Korean launches earlier this year and has deployed missile defense systems such as PAC-3 and ship-to-air interceptors in southwestern Japan.

Japan's Prime Minister Fumio Kishida said he instructed officials to do their utmost to gather and analyze information related to the launch and inform people about it, his office said.

Earlier this month, North Korean state media reported leader Kim Jong Un had inspected a finished military spy satellite at his country's aerospace centre and approved the satellite's launch plan.

Monday's launch notice did not specify the type of satellite.

Last week, rival South Korea launched its first commercialdevelop. Other weapons systems on his wish list include solid-propellant ICBMs, nuclearpowered submarines, hypersonic missiles and multi-warhead missiles. The North's satellite launch

plan comes amid heightened tensions on the Korean Peninsula.

Since the start of 2022, North Korea has test-launched more than 100 missiles, some of them nuclear-capable weapons that place the U.S. mainland, South Korea and Japan within striking distance.

North Korea argues its testing spree is meant to issue warning over expanded military drills between the U.S. and South Korea, but observers say North Korea aims to modernize its weapons programme then win greater concessions from its rivals in future dealings.

Last week, the South Korean and U.S. militaries conducted large-scale live-fire drills near the border with North Korea as the first of five rounds of exercises marking 70 years since the establishment of their alliance.

North Korea warned Monday that the U.S. and South Korea will face unspecified consequences for their "war scenario for aggression on" North Korea.

"We'd like to ask them if they can cope with the consequences to be entailed by their reckless and dangerous war gambles that are being staged under the eyes of the armed forces of (North Korea)," the North's official Korean Central News Agency said.

ISLAMABAD, May 29 (Agencies): Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) Chairman Imran Khan has urged the country's top judiciary to take suo motu notice of the alleged abuse, including "reports of rape", of its female party workers and supporters who were arrested following the May 9 riots, Pakistan based news agency reported.

Imran Khan's allegations come hours after Pakistan Interior Minister Rana Sanaullah claimed in a press conference that intelligence agencies had intercepted a call revealing a plot to stage a fake encounter and rape incident by members of the PTI.

The minister claimed that among the plans

revealed during the intercepted call was a plot to raid and open fire at a PTI worker's house, resulting in casualties that could be shown to the world as gross human rights violations. The second plan was to stage an act of rape, the recording of which would be shared with global media outlets to propagate the alleged abuse against PTI, according to news agency.

The PTI chief, however, said he was convinced of the reports of the kind of treatment being meted out to the party's women workers in jail.

Imran Khan while addressing PTI supporters from his Zaman Park residence in Lahore, said: "After

[Rana Sanaullah's] press conference, I have no doubt. The PTI women workers, the way they were detained and thrown in jail, and the way they were being treated...we also heard [reports] of rape."

The PTI chief claimed that the interior minister's statements could only mean two things. "Either they are afraid that these women, when they are released, will tell the stories of what happened to them, and [the government is] preparing for this scenario. Or that they are scared they have done something they cannot manage, so they want to preemptively create a narrative that this was all a big conspiracy and PTI did this themselves".

Imran Khan stated that he is getting reports of abuse from various locations. However, he added that such reports did not mention Adiala Jail but the female workers were being kept in deplorable conditions and the judiciary must take notice of the situation, according to news

Erdogan to continue ruling Turkey for a third decade

ANKARA, May 29 (Agencies): Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan has won presidential runoff, according to unofficial results.

Erdogan secured 52.10 per cent of votes while his contender Kemal Kilicdaroglu, 74, the leader of the centre-left Republican People's Party (CHP) and presidential nominee of the opposition bloc, received 47.90 per cent, after 99.49 per cent of ballot boxes were opened, Xinhua news agency reported, citing the results delivered by the semi-official Anadolu Agency.

In the first round of the presidential election on May 14, Erdogan earned 49.52 per cent of the vote while Kilicdaroglu received 44.88 per cent.

Neither secured more than 50 per cent of the votes needed to call a



winner in the first round, therefore an election runoff was held for the first time for the presidency.

The twin elections saw a high voter turnout at 86.98 per cent, with almost 54 million citizens going to the polls.

In the last two weeks, the two candidates focused to appeal to nationalist votes in their campaigns.

They both pledged to focus on problems regarding refugee issues and vowed to end terrorism as the May 14 results showed an increase in support for nationalist parties.

Erdogan was promising a new "Turkish century" if he is re-elected. He also stressed his presidency as a requirement for harmony among state institutions and stability in the country as his alliance held the majority at the

parliament.

China To Send First Civilian To Space On Tuesday: Space Agency

JIUQUAN, May 29 (Agencies): China will send its first civilian astronaut into space as part of a crewed mission to the Tiangong space station on Tuesday, the country's Manned Space Agency said.

"Payload expert Gui Haichao is a professor at Beijing University of Aeronautics and Astronautics," China Manned Space Agency Spokesperson Lin Xiqiang told reporters Monday.

Until now, all Chinese astronauts sent into space have been part of the People's Liberation Army

Gui will be "mainly responsible for the on-orbit operation of space science experimental payloads", Lin said.

The mission commander is Jing Haipeng, and the third crew member is Zhu Yangzhu.

They are set to take off from the Jiuquan Satellite Launch Centre in northwest China on Tuesday at 9.31 am (0131 GMT), the Manned Space Agency said. Under President Xi Jinping, plans for China's "space

dream" have been put into overdrive. The world's second-largest economy has invested billions of dollars in its military-run space programme,

with hopes of eventually sending humans to the Moon. Beijing is trying to finally catch up with the United States and Russia after years of belatedly matching their milestones.

China is also planning to build a base on the Moon and the country's National Space Administration said it aims to launch a crewed lunar mission by 2029.

Indian-Origin Gangster Shot Dead Outside Wedding Reception Venue In Canada

OTTAWA, May 29 (Agencies): In a suspected case of gang conflict, a 28-year-old Punjab-origin man, who was on Canadian police's most violent gangsters' list, has been shot dead by unknown people at a wedding venue in Vancouver city of Canada.

According to reports in the local newspaper Vancouver Sun, Amarpreet (Chucky) Samra was on the dance floor at Fraserview Banquet Hall with other wedding guests less than 30 minutes before he was shot on Fraser Street between just before 1:30 am.

Both Samra and his older brother, Ravinder, who is also a gangster, were invited guests at the wedding. They were aligned with the UN Gang.

A few guests told



media persons that some unidentified men had walked back into the hall and ordered the DJ to stop the music. At the time around 60 guests were present at the venue.

"Multiple 9-1-1 callers reported one man had been shot outside a South Vancouver banquet hall near Fraser Street and South East Marine Drive at 1:30 a.m. Patrol officers performed CPR on the victim until paramedics arrived, but he died from his injuries," the police statement reads.

Investigators believe

this was a targeted shooting related to the ongoing gang conflict. The investigation remains ongoing. Anyone with information that could assist investigators is asked to call the Vancouver Police Homicide Unit at 604-717-2500, it further reads.

In August 2022, Canadian police issued a rare warning about 11 men linked to extreme levels of gang violence. The police have warned the public to avoid being near them. Of the 11 men mentioned in the warning, nine were of Punjab origin including Amarpreet and his brother Ravinder.

The British Columbia Police said they were linked to a slew of killings and shootings in the province. It asked the public to avoid being near them.

ROME. May 29 (Agencies): Four people died when a boat carrying tourists overturned on Lake Maggiore in strong winds, Italy's fire brigade said Monday.

The boat tipped over Sunday off Lisanza, at the southern end of the lake in northern Italy,

after the weather suddenly turned stormy.

"The bodies of four people have been recovered," fire brigade spokesman Luca Cari told news agency.

Israel's intentions at Homesh and the other three settlements dismantled in 2005 have drawn repeated rebukes from Washington, which has said it is "deeply troubled" by moves to resettle the area.

Most of the internation-

al community considers Israeli settlements, home to 700,000 people in the West Bank and east Jerusalem, to be illegal and obstacles to peace. The construction at Homesh comes at a time of soaring violence between Israel and the Palestinians in the West Bank, much of it concentrated in the northern part of the territory. Israel has been staging

near-nightly raids since last spring in response to a spate of Palestinian attacks against Israelis. Israel captured the West Bank, the Gaza Strip and east Jerusalem in the 1967 Mideast

The Palestinians seek those territories for their hoped-for state.

"The natural diversion and drainage channels within the area may be restored or renovated immediately so that the surface run-off could be diverted. Proper drainage and sewer plan for the entire area to be developed and implemented," they said.

The committee said construction outside the affected area can be allowed only after geo-technical assessments such as soil

"No subsurface engineering activity may be allowed within an area circumscribing 500 metres of the affected location," it said.

Since the affected area is situated just above the Chenab river channel, it suggested constructing a gabion wall of suitable dimension on the riverside to stop erosion. The panel said a retention wall of around 400 metres with weep holes can be constructed near the base of the landslide area (at the toe of the slope) at the road level to stop further slope failures.

The affected settlement was established majorly on "Shamlat land (village pasture land)" prior to 2014 when Thathri became a municipality, according to the subdivisional magistrate, the report stated.

The panel said in its report that it did not observe any "extant construction by-laws applicable".

411 billion transactions in FY 2026-27 from 103 billion in FY 2022-23, the report said.

"It is estimated that UPI will record 1 billion transactions per day by FY2026-2027, going from 83.71 billion transactions in 2022-23 to 379 billion transactions by 2026-27," it added.

It further said the credit card segment continues to grow at a healthy rate, as card (both debit and credit) payment is one of the most used instruments for

retail digital payments after UPI. The volume of transactions in credit cards is expected to surpass debit cards by FY 2024-

While credit card issuance is expected to grow at a healthy CAGR of 21 per cent in the next five years, debit card issuance is expected to have a stagnant growth with a CAGR of 3 per cent in the same period, the report said.

"The decline in debit card usage is because the major use case of debit card transactions is cash withdrawal, which can now be replaced by an easier way of withdrawing cash using UPI," it added.

Mihir Gandhi, Partner and Payments Transformation Leader, PwC India, said that in the next five years, the payments industry is expected to focus on ecosystem expansion

and new use cases for existing payment platforms.

"Areas like embedded and ecosystem finance, digital lending based on payment transactions and offline payments will drive the next phase of growth for the payments industry. In the ever-evolving Indian payments landscape, innovation and inclusion are paving the way for a seamless digital economy," Gandhi said.

The PwC report further said revenue through the credit card business accounts for nearly 76 per cent of the overall cards' revenue in 2022-2023, making it a lucrative business segment for banks, NBFCs and FinTech.

The revenue for credit card issuance increased by 42 per cent in 2022-2023 compared to 2021-2022 and is likely to grow by a CAGR of 33 per cent for the next five years, it added

Opposition can say what it wants: FM Nirmala Sitharaman on Rs 2,000 withdrawal

NEW DELHI, May 29 (Agencies): Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Monday took a dig at the Opposition for criticising the Reserve Bank of India's move to withdraw Rs 2,000 notes from circulation.

Sitharaman said the RBI achieved its motive with Rs 2,000, which was introduced to quickly remonetise the economy after high-value Rs 1,000 and old Rs 500 notes were scrapped.

"The RBI has achieved its motive here...Opposition can say what it wants...Rs 2000 notes introduction was an attempt at remonetisation," Sitharaman said while speaking at a press conference to mark 9 years of the BJP- led NDA government in Mumbai.

Reacting to the former finance minister and senior Congress leader P Chidambaram's comment after the withdrawal of the Rs 2,000 note, Sitharaman said: "He should not make frivolous statements and understand the process".

Earlier this month, the

RBI withdrew Rs 2,000 notes from circulation but requested people not to panic as it will continue to be legal tender. The central bank has, however, asked citizens to get all such currency notes exchanged or deposited at banks before September 30,

It may be noted that



the RBI has not yet decided on whether the existing Rs 2,000 notes will be scrapped after the September deadline and the central bank governor Shaktikanta Das said a decision will be taken only after assessing how much of the Rs 2,000 notes actually come back.

JioCinema signs deal another major streaming deal to take on rivals Netflix, Amazon



NEW DELHI, May 29 (Agencies): Reliance's JioCinema has signed another major streaming deal to take on rivals Netflix, Disney+ Hotstar and Amazon in India after striking a partnership with Warner Bros Discovery in April.

JioCinema, which recently introduced premium pricing for content on its platform, has signed a partnership with NBC Universal Media as it aims to increase premium Hollywood content for Indian viewers on its platform.

The two companies confirmed in a joint statement that they have struck a multi-year deal which will give JioCinema's premium subscribers access to popular shows such as Downton Abbey, Suits and The Office.

The new deal comes just a month after JioCinema signed a content streaming deal with Warner Bros Discovery for popular shows such as Succession and Game of Thrones

The aggressive push by Reliance to increase popular content on its streaming platform, in addition to premium sports content, could lead to a massive disruption in the OTT streaming space, which has been dominated mostly by foreign players.

As of now, JioCinema has just one premium plan for customers and the subscription cost is Rs 999 for a year.

The premium plan offers several benefits, including full access to a library of Hollywood movies and TV shows, highquality video and audio streaming, and the ability to watch on up to four devices simultaneously.

Exercise may lower Parkinson's disease risk in women by 25%

LONDON, May 29 (Agencies): Women engaging in regular exercise such as cycling, walking, gardening, cleaning and participating in sports may have about 25 per cent lower risk of developing Parkinson's disease, suggests a study.

The study, published in Neurology, the medical journal of the American Academy of Neurology, does not prove that exercise lowers the risk of developing Parkinson's disease. It only shows an association.

"Exercise is a low-cost way to improve health overall, so our study sought to determine if it may be linked to a lower risk of developing Parkinson's disease, a debilitating disease that has no cure," said study author Alexis Elbaz, of the Inserm Research Center in Paris, France.

"Our results provide evidence for planning interventions to prevent Parkinson's disease," Elbaz said.

The study included 95,354 female participants, with an average age of 49, who did not have Parkinson's at the start of the study. Researchers followed participants for three decades during which 1,074 participants developed Parkinson's.

Over the course of the study, participants completed up to six questionnaires about the types and amounts



of physical activity they were getting.

They were asked how far they walked and how many flights of stairs they climbed daily, how many hours they spent on household activities as well as how much time they spent doing moderate recreational activities such as gardening and more vigorous activities such as sports.

Among the participants in the highest exercise group, there were 246 cases of Parkinson's disease or 0.55 cases per 1,000 person-years compared to 286 cases or 0.73 per 1,000 person-years among participants in the lowest exercise group. Personyears represent both the number of people in the study and the amount of time each person spends in the study.

After adjusting for factors such as place of residence, age of first period and menopausal status, and smoking, researchers found those in the highest exercise

lower rate of developing Parkinson's disease than those in the lowest exercise group when physical activity was assessed up to 10 years before diagnosis; the association remained when physical activity was assessed up to 15 or 20 years before diagnosis. Results were similar

after adjusting for diet or medical conditions such as high blood pressure, diabetes and cardiovascular disease.

Researchers also found that 10 years before diagnosis, physical activity declined at a faster rate in those with Parkinson's disease than in those without, likely due to early symptoms of Parkinson's disease.

A limitation of the study was that participants were mostly healthconscious educators who volunteered to participate in a long-term study, so results may be different for the general population.

The cadre strength is around 3,500. If that was not enough to deal with, doctors have been constantly and consistently quitting the Health Department — a trend that is fast catching on.

At the General Hospital in Panipat, for example, two newly recruited MBBS doctors have resigned while a third doctor, an MS (Ortho), worked for five months before choosing to not report for work. As many as 10 doctors absenteed themselves from duty since 2018 and three have resigned. This is one of the many general hospitals grappling with shortage as doctors are choosing to walk away from government jobs.

Realising the gravity of the situation, the Health Department constituted a three-member committee on May 5 this year. The committee, comprising the Health Sec-

government jobs? retary, the Chief Medical Officer Jhajjar, Dr Brahmdeep, and medical officer Dr Nishikant, has been asked to identify the reasons for the high attrition rate in the Health Department. For the HCMSA, it is a case of "too little, too late".

> Rajesh Khyaliya says, "We have been raising the issue for several years now. The root cause is the few promotional avenues available to the doctors. Nearly 95 per cent of the doctors who join as medical officers get only one promotion during the service and retire as senior medical officers (SMO). Hardly 4 per cent get promoted to the rank of Civil Surgeon and higher designations. In 2015, the medical officers were given the status of Class I officers, but they don't get the facilities or treatment as per their rank. It is very disheartening to see them struggling even before clerks for trivial issues."

Meanwhile, no formal meeting of the committee has been held so far after its chairman was transferred about a week back. Sources maintain that the committee has sought a report on the total number of doctors who have quit their jobs in the past few years. Many senior doctors are opting for voluntary retirement while the younger ones are either quitting or absenting themselves from work.

According to the HCMSA, as per the

Indian Public Health Standard (IPHS) norms, a total of 241 MDs (Medicine) are required in the state, but merely 50 are working. Of the 193 gynaecologists needed, only 95 are working; of the 231 anaesthetists, just 100 are on the job. The state requires 146 paediatricians, but has only 65; 143 surgeons are needed, but 75 are

Why doctors are quitting Haryana

Among the other reasons the doctors underline for the "disappointment" with government jobs are unsatisfactory working conditions, heavy workload due to the poor doctor-patient ratio, unsafe environment, lower salaries compared to private hospitals, VIP duties and the medico-legal cases that result in pressure from various quarters. The doctors also point out that the government pays 1.5 times more salary to the contractual doctors working under the National Health Mission (NHM) compared to regular doctors.

"There is an acute shortage of specialists in the department. Each time a specialist joins duty at a government facility, patients from adjoining districts also start flocking for treatment. Ideally, a doctor can examine around 100 patients a day as it takes time to diagnose, note down the patient's history and then write tests and prescriptions. However, at government hospitals, the doctors are attending to 250-300 patients. This is a cruel joke on both the patients and the doctors," Khyaliya points out. He says there is a need for at least 10,000 doctors in the government sector to smoothly run operations, but the present cadre strenth is barely 3,500.

A senior health official in Ambala explains, "Higher salaries in private hospitals, VIP duties, MLR duty, court evidence and the workload are some of the major reasons why doctors are leaving government jobs. At private hospitals, they have defined roles and get perks in addition to annual increments." While all these rea-

sons hold good, pursuing higher studies or specialisation is another big factor behind youngsters quitting. "They get recruited and start working till the time their admission to postgraduate courses is confirmed. Once they get a seat, they quit or just absent themselves from work. This contributes to the growing shortage as well," another senior doctor explains. An ENT specialist who resigned last year states, "I was posted in Naraingarh and had to resign after I got admission in a post graduation course. I applied for leave but could not get it even without pay. I was left with no option but to resign as I had to pursue my Masters degree."

However, there are instances where doctors have joined duty, worked for a few months or a couple of years, improved their "market value" by working in the government set-up and switched over to the private sector. "The heavy workload in terms of patients visiting government hospitals makes the doctors way more experienced than they can ever be if they join the private sector. This experience increases their market value and also facilitates them in setting up their private

cer maintains. "Some doctors leave their jobs to pursue higher studies while others start private practice after gaining experience and building an equation with the patients. Most of the specialists feel overburdened. Better salaries, an improved working environment, and formation of a specialist cadre are very important if the government wants to retain the doctors," a doctor suggests.

Health Minister Anil Vij says, "We don't have data of how many doctors have left in the last few years. We will need to compile it after taking information from various districts. A committee has been formed to ascertain the reasons for doctors turning away from government jobs and it will give recommendations to ensure we can retain them. WEINHEIM, May 29 (Agencies): National record holder Jyothi Yarraji ran her second career-best 100 metres hurdles race to win gold at the Kurpfalz Gala event at Weinheim in Germany.

The 23-year-old Yarraji clocked 12.84 seconds at the World Athletics Continental Tour Challenger level meet, just two seconds outside her national record time of 12.82s, which she had set last year.

This was her first international 100m hurdles race of the season.

Another national record holder Amlan



Borgohain clocked 20.66s against a headwind of 0.2 m/s to win gold in the men's 200m race.

This was his third career-best timing. His national record set last year stands at 20.52s.

Meanwhile, Parul Chaudhary clocked her personal best of 9:29.51s in the women's 3,000m steeplechase to finish third at the Los Angeles Grand Prix in the USA, a World Athletics Continental Tour Gold level meet. Her earlier best was 9:38.29s which she had

clocked last year.

French Open 2023: Carlos Alcaraz is the favourite to win title, says coach **Juan Carlos Ferrero**

PARIS, May 29 (Agencies): Carlos Alcaraz's coach Juan Carlos Ferrero said that the Spaniard is the favourite to win the men's singles title at the French Open 2023. Alcaraz is the top-seeded player in the men's draw and is set to face Italy's Flavio Cobolli on Monday, May

Last year, Alcaraz became the youngest ATP World No.1 after winning the US Open by beating Casper Ruud in the final. Ferrero, who won the French Open back in 2003, said that Alcaraz has been on top of his game while playing on clay.

"During the pandemic he watched a bit of the final. Kids today are much more about highlights than entire matches. We joke a lot, and he tells me that I didn't used to hit the ball very hard. At the end of the day, I try to get him to see the body language, the mannerisms and the way to handle moments in that kind of match," Ferrero was quoted as saying.

"Carlos has played better than anyone during the clay season, but you have to do that every day at every tournament, as I tell him. We



have an average day, your opponent plays well and you lose. Everything points to Carlos as the favourite, we've heard it many times and we know that," he added. Alcaraz didn't make a

great start to the year

after he pulled out of the Australian Open due to a thigh injury. But he made a strong comeback by winning the Argentina Open, Madrid Open, Indian Wells Masters and Barcelona Open. He also finished as runners-up in the Rio Open.

"If MS Dhoni Isn't Captain, He Won't Even...": Virender Sehwag On Thala's Future

NEW DELHI, May 29 (Agencies): The arrival of 'Impact Player' rule gave many players the opportunity to prolong their careers. The likes of Faf du Plessis and Rohit harma were seen making use of the rule in the Indian Premier League (IPL) 2023 season. But, such a step was never opted by Chennai Super Kings skipper MS Dhoni. Though Dwayne Bravo feels Impact Player rule will help Dhoni play a few more years, former India cricketer Virender Sehwag disagrees. In a chat, Sehwag explained who Impact Player rule doesn't apply to Dhoni. As there continues to remain a debate around

Dhoni's future in the IPL



beyond this season. Sehwag feels the veteran wicket-keeper batter can continue to play, but not as an Impact Player.

"It's not difficult (to play cricket in 40s), if you're fit. MS Dhoni hasn't batted too much this year. He's not aggravating his knee injury. Often, he would come in the last two overs. If I count the total balls he faced. I think he would've faced 40-50 deliveries this season," Sehwag said on Cricbuzz.

"Impact Player rule doesn't apply on MS Dhoni. Because he's playing only for captaincy. He has to stay in the ground for captaincy. Impact Player rule is for someone who doesn't field but bats, or

a bowler who doesn't need to bat. Dhoni has to field 20 overs; if he's not the captain, he won't even play as Impact Player. Then, you will see him as mentor or coach or Director of Cricket," he aded.

When Bravo was asked about Dhoni's continuity after IPL 2023 season, he had said: "100 percent (when asked if Dhoni will return to play for CSK in 2024?), especially with the Impact Player rule. He can keep prolonging his career."

The IPL 2023 final could potentially be Dhoni's last. The 'Thala' hasn't ruled out a return but is looking to buy some time before he makes the final call.

French Open 2023: Jessica Pegula wins all-America battle against Danielle Collins, Daria Kasatkina through to R2

PARIS, May 29 (Agencies): American tennis player Jessica Pegula made a strong start at the French Open 2023, defeating compatriot Danielle Collins in straight sets. Pegula, the No. 3 seed, overcame Collins, the 2022 Australian Open runner-up, with a 6-4, 6-2 victory in the opening round.

The win sets up Pegula for a second-round clash with Camila Giorgi of Italy. Pegula has been flying under the radar compared to other favourites in the tournament, but her consistent performances at the majors over the past year have caught attention.

She reached the quarterfinals at last year's French Open and has made it to the quarter-finals in three out of four Grand Slam tournaments. Pegula has a major chance to advance even further this year, as her seeded quarterfinal opponent, Maria Sakkari, was eliminated early in the tournament. With a strong return game and solid stats on clay, Pegula looks poised to make a deep run at Roland

"Playing Danielle first round, she's not seeded this week but it's really tough," Pegula said on court. "I know that she



hasn't been playing on clay, but I didn't think that mattered. I still thought she played at a really high level. I had to stay focused today to get the win."

Number nine seed Daria Kasatkina closed out the opening day of the French Open 2023 with a 6-3, 6-4 win over Germany's Jule Nieimeier. The

26-year-old Russian awaits the winner of Monday's clash between former Marketa Vondrousova and American Alycia

Parks in the second round. Kasatkina, who was the semifinalist last year, hit fewer winners than Niemeier, who reached the quarterfinals at Wimbledon in 2022. However, Kasatkina made fewer unforced errors (23) compared to Niemeier (48). Kasatkina, competing in the same quarter as Aryna Sabalenka and Zheng Qinwen, capitalised on eight out of 12 break points, securing a victory in straight
