Amarnath Yatra: Shrine Board opens online helicopter booking for pilgrims

JAMMU, June 17 (Agencies): Shri Amarnath Shrine Board has opened online helicopter booking for the pilgrims of Shri Amarnath Yatra starting from

July 1.

The 62-day long pilgrimage is starting from July 1 and ending on August 30 (Rakshabandhan).

According to official sources, the online booking for helicopters has started for the service to be available from Srinagar, Baltal and Pahalgam routes.

Sources however, said that the fare for this year's yatra has also not been hiked.

As of now, more than 2.5 lakh have registered online for the yatra, sources said adding that around five lakh devotees are expected to visit this year to the cave Shrine.

Sources further added that the booking for helicopter tickets will be done through the official website of the Shri Amarnath Shrine Board (SASB).

Calls upcoming River Front and Srinagar Plaza a major future attraction

SRINAGAR, Jun 17: Chief Secretary, Dr Arun Kumar Mehta on Saturday conducted an extensive tour of the Srinagar city to make on spot assessment of ongoing developmental and beautification works being carried out under Srinagar Smart City Mission.

The Chief Secretary was accompanied by Divisional Commissioner Kashmir; Deputy Commissioner Srinagar; Commissioner SMC & CEO Srinagar Smart City; VC Lakes Conservation and Management Authority; VC, SDA and other concerned officers from line departments.

During the tour, the Chief Secretary visited Moominabad Bata-



maloo, Tatoo Ground, Jhelum Riverfront Development Project, Traditional Souq Market and Craft Center, GhantaGhar, Srinagar Plaza, Nishat Garden precinct, Northern Foreshore Road, and Shalimar Canal.

Dr. Mehta observed that the developed Jhelum Riverfront together with Srinagar

Plaza near GhantaGhar are going to become major attractions in the city. He directed the concerned officers to further accelerate the pace of work and ensure completion of all these projects at the earliest.

Reviewing the progress of Dal Lake cleaning at Nishat, the Chief Secretary expressed satisfaction over the

body. He said that the water body looks much better than earlier, but also emphasized on greater efforts for even better outcome. He directed the VC, LC&MA to expedite the Houseboat sewerage connections and shift their focus towards the cleanliness of interiors of the lake also. SRINAGAR, Jun 17: Additional Chief Secretary (ACS), Home, RK Goyal on Saturday reviewed the status of various services related to Arms licenses including issuance and renewal of individual arms licenses, being provided through NDAL-ALIS portal.

The ACS advised the District Magistrates to extend assistance to the general public desirous of availing various

services including issuance and renewal of arms licenses, utilizing the online NDAL-ALIS platform.

He impressed upon them to take immediate steps for timely processing of applications received for grant of Individual Arms Licenses strictly in terms of the instructions issued vide Government Order No. 30-Home of 2023 dated 18.01.2023.

In order to have

speedy verification of antecedents from the CID, he asked them to employ dedicated electronic channels by the licensing authorities.

In the meeting, it was reiterated to strictly adhere to the provisions contained in the Arms Act and the Arms Rules, so that the bonafide applicants, eligible for grant and renewal of these licenses are facilitated as envisaged in the online services being provided through NDAL-ALIS portal of Government of India.

The meeting was attended by Special DG, CID, Divisional Commissioner Jammu, Divisional Commissioner, Kashmir and all the District Magistrates of the UT.

BJP ready for assembly polls in J&K: Raina

SRINAGAR, Jun 17 (Agencies): The BJP on Saturday said it was ready for assembly elections in Jammu and Kashmir and appealed to the Election Commission to announce dates for the polls in the Union territory.

Addressing a party

rally here, Jammu and Kashmir BJP president Ravinder Raina said, "Former chief minister Omar Abdullah accused us a couple of days ago of running away from elections. I request the EC with folded hands to announce the dates for elections in Jammu and Kashmir."

Raina said the party was confident of forming the government in Jammu and Kashmir as Prime Minister Narendra Modi had worked for peace in the Union territory and welfare of its people.

"BJP is completely ready for the assembly elections in JK. We are confident that the people of Kashmir will wholeheartedly vote for BJP



this time. The work done by Modiji for the poor and the underprivileged will make the people of Kashmir vote for BJP.

"BJP is ready for all elections — be it Lok Sabha, assembly, or local bodies. No one needs to be scared, the people have to decide and the verdict will come in the political battlefield. I am confident that BJP will form the next government in JK," he

added.
Launching the party's "Har Ghar Chalo" campaign, Raina said the aim of the Modi government was to work for the welfare of the poor.

"We want the poor to be happy, we want to serve the poor. Everyone should feel this government belongs to him, everyone should feel that they are getting justice," he said.

Making a pitch for the next year's Lok Sabha polls, Raina said, "We want BJP to win Lok Sabha elections from Kashmir."

He appealed to the

people of Kashmir to give one chance to BJP. "We will work for development and welfare of the people. We will work for communal harmony and brotherhood," he added.

Talking to reporters after the rally, Raina said Modi has brought peace to Jammu and Kashmir which has made the BJP popular in the Union territory.

"Modi sahib has worked for the welfare of people of Jammu and Kashmir, brought peace to Jammu and Kashmir. It is the reason that BJP is moving ahead in JK," he said.

Illegal driving license racket involving J&K residents busted by Ahmedabad Police

AHMEDABAD, June 17 (Agencies): The Ahmedabad City Crime Branch officials have busted a gang which issued fraudulent driving licenses, using addresses of Indian security forces battalions, to residents of Jammu and Kashmir.

Acting on a tip-off from the Military Intelligence Ahmedabad, Pune Branch, the Deputy Commissioner of Police, Crime Branch, discovered that agents operating within Ahmedabad and Gandhinagar RTOs had connections with individuals from Jammu and Kashmir. These agents were reportedly fabricating driving licenses by submitting falsified documents to the RTO office.

Sadhus from across India reach Jammu for upcoming Amarnath Yatra

JAMMU, Jun 17 (Agencies): Sadhus from across the country have started flocking to the winter capital Jammu to join the annual Amarnath pilgrimage which is scheduled to start in the Valley next month.

Over 200 Sadhus, including women, have arrived at their traditional Ram Mandir base camp in the old city's Purani Mandi area and are upbeat to offer their prayers at the 3,880-metre high holy cave shrine in south Kashmir Himalayas, housing the naturally formed ice-

Shivling.

The 62-day long pilgrimage will commence on July 1 from the twin tracks — the traditional 48-km Nunwan-Pahalgam route in the Anantnag district and the 14-km shorter but steep Baltal route in the Ganderbal district.

The first batch of pilgrims, including a group of Sadhus, is leaving for the Yatra from Jammu on June 30.

"I am performing the Yatra for the first time and waiting eagerly to reach Kashmir, the name of which fills our chest with pride as Kashmir to Kanyakumari is India," a 58-yearold sadhu from Andhra Pradesh, Vasudevanand Sarawari, said.

The sadhu reached the Ram Temple after conducting 'Char Dham', a pilgrimage of four holy places — Yamunotri, Gangotri, Kedarnath and Badrinath — by foot.

"I am thankful to my Lord for giving me an opportunity to seek his blessings by joining the Amarnath pilgrimage this year. One should perform the Yatra at least once in the lifetime," he said amid chants of "Bham Bham







ing Sanskrit. Every year, the Shrine Board spends Rs. 5 crore on the Gurukul.

He suggested that the Gurukul be upgraded as a Adarsh Sanskrit Mahavidyala under a Central Government Scheme of Central Sanskrit University, New Delhi, the intake

capacity of the institution can be increased significantly. Central Sanskrit University (earlier Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan), New Delhi, is the nodal agency of the Ministry of Education, Government of India for Sanskrit language. Under the scheme this University provides recognition and financial assistance to Sanskrit Schools / Gurukuls / Pathshalas of India. Ninety-five (95) percent of the financial needs of the recognized Adarsh Sanskrit College is funded by this. The University already is funding 5 Adarsh Sanskrit Colleges in Bihar, three in Uttar Pradesh, two in Himalayan Pradesh, two in West Bengal, two in Haryana, two in Tamil Nadu, two in Manipur and one each in some other states. But, there is no Adarsh Sanskrit Mahavidyala (College) in the state till date. Therefore, "Shri Mata

Vaishno Devi Sanskrit Gurukul" located in Katra, equipped with educational and material resources, operated by Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Shrine Board, should be recognized as "Adarsh Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya". now social media followers have


taken precedence," he laughs.

In Gujarat, Shah to conduct aerial survey of areas affected by cyclone Biparjoy, hold review meet

BHUJ, Jun 17 (Agencies): In the wake of Cyclone Biparjoy, Union Home Minister Amit Shah arrived in Gujarat's Bhuj on Saturday to take stock of the situation.

The home minister, accompanied by Gujarat Chief Minister Bhupendra Patel, is set to conduct an aerial survey of the cyclone-affected areas of the


Shah will also hold a review meeting in Bhuj following the aerial survey.

Both ministers would also assess the surveillance conducted from Delhi for the past three days.

As Cyclone Biparjoy weakened and moved towards south Rajasthan on Friday after ravaging the Kutch and Saurashtra regions, the Gujarat government is facing the immediate challenge of restoring electricity in some 1,000 villages and clearing roads of fallen trees.

While the cyclone weakened after making landfall on the Kutch coast of Gujarat on Thursday evening, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) said that northern Gujarat should brace for heavy rainfall.

There was no loss of life on



account of cyclone Biparjoy (which means calamity in Bengali) in Gujarat, the government

Advance planning and mass evacuation of over one lakh persons helped the state achieve "zero casualty", Chief Minister Bhupendra Patel was quoted as saying in a press release.

To restore electricity, 1,127 teams are working in the districts of Kutch, Devbhumi Dwarka, Jamnagar, Morbi, Junagadh, Gir Somnath, Raikot and Porbandar, said the release, adding that the forest department teams removed 581 fallen trees from the roads.

Among 1,09,000 persons shifted from coastal areas to temporary shelters, there were 10,918 children, 5,070 senior citizens and 1,152 pregnant women, the

government release said.

The cyclone made landfall along the Saurashtra-Kutch coast near Jakhau around 6:30 pm on Thursday, bringing incessant rains and wind speeds as high as 140 kmph.

The landfall was over by 2.30 am on Friday, and several parts of Kutch, as well as Devbhumi Dwarka, Jamnagar, Rajkot and Morbi districts in Saurashtra regions, were battered with very heavy rainfall of 100-185 mm on Friday accompanied by strong wind of up to 95 kmph, the State Emergency Operation Centre (SEOC) said.

In all, 175 talukas of the state received some amount of rainfall during the day, it said

The storm caused extensive financial loss to the state power utility Paschim Gujarat Vij Company Limited with 5,120 electricity poles getting damaged, relief commissioner Pandey said.

As many as 4,600 villages were left without power, but electricity supply was restored in 3,580 villages, he added.

At least 23 people were injured due to cyclone-related incidents while many houses were also damaged, he said.

Gujarat also experienced strong surface wind of up to 35-45 kmph gusting to 55 kmph on Friday.

North Gujarat districts such as Banaskantha, Patan, Mehsana and Sabarkantha witnessed strong surface winds of 65-75 kmph gusting to 85 kmph.

Parts of Jamnagar, Kutch, Devbhumi Dwarka, Rajkot, and Morbi received heavy rainfall in six hours since Friday morning, data provided by the SEOC

The cyclone is now headed towards south Rajasthan and the NDRF has already positioned a team in Jalore as heavy rains may lead to flooding, an official told agency.

2 injured as security forces, mobs clash in Manipur's Imphal; attempts at torching houses of BJP leaders



IMPHAL, Jun 17 (Agencies): Two civilians were injured as mobs clashed with security forces overnight in Imphal town and attempts were made to torch the houses of BJP leaders, officials said on Saturday.

In separate incidents, automatic gunfire was reported from Kwakta in Bishnupur district of Manipur and Kangvai in

Churachandpur district through the night.

An attempt was also made to loot Iringbam police station in Imphal West. However, no weapons were stolen.

Army, Assam Rifles and Manipur Rapid Action Force held joint marches till midnight through the state capital to halt rioters from congregating.

A mob of approximate-

ly 1,000 people came together to try and burn down buildings near the palace compound.

RAF fired teargas and rubber bullets to dis-

perse the crowd Another mob tried to set the house of Biswajeet, an MLA, on fire. An RAF column, however,

dispersed the crowd.

Another mob surrounded the BJP office after midnight at Sinjemai, but could not do any harm as an Army column dispersed it.

Similarly, a crowd tried to vandalise the home of Sharda Devi, BJP (women's) president near Porampet in Imphal around midnight. Security forces managed to disperse the youth.

Gujarat: One dead, policemen injured as mob hurls stones to oppose plan to raze dargah

JUNAGADH, Jun 17 (Agencies): One person died apparently after being hit by a stone, while at least five police personnel were injured in Gujarat's Junagadh city after a group of people hurled stones and torched a vehicle to oppose the civic body's plan to raze a dargah to clear "encroachment", officials said on Saturday. The incident occurred on Friday night near Majevadi Darwaja in the city, during which the police lobbed tear-

gas shells and batoncharged the protesters to control the situation, and later rounded up 174 people, they said.

The exact reason behind the civilian's death would be known after the post-mortem. but the police suspect that he died after being hit by a stone hurled by the mob. "On June 14, the Junagadh Municipal Corporation issued a notice to a mosque near Majevadi Darwaja to produce documents regarding the ownership

of land. Agitated over the notice, around 500-600 people gathered near the religious structure and blocked roads on Friday night," Superintendent of Police Ravi

Teja Vasamsetty said. DSP of Junagadh and other staff, who were present at the site, tried to convince them. After nearly an hour-long deliberations aimed at finding a peaceful resolution of the matter and clearing the protesters' road blockade, some stones were thrown at

the police staff around 10.15 pm, he said.

Shouting slogans, some people, agitated over the notice to the dargah, charged towards the police personnel and tried to attack them, he added.

Police lobbed teargas shells and batoncharged to disperse the unruly crowd. Junagadh DySP, three sub-inspectors and two other police personnel were injured in the incident, but all of them are out of danger, he said, adding that a mob also set a vehicle on fire. "A civilian died and it appears that stone-pelting was the cause of his death. But we are waiting for a post-mortem report to know the exact cause. Police teams rounded up 174 people in a combing operation,"

Vasamsetty said. Police personnel are deployed in the area to avoid any further untoward incident and efforts to nab all those involved in the clash are being taken, he said

KOCHI, Jun 17 (Agencies): A Kerala court on Saturday sentenced controversial self-styled antiques dealer Monson Mavunkal to life imprisonment for raping a minor girl a few years

Imposing a fine of Rs 5.25 lakh on Mavunkal. Additional District and Sessions Court (POCSO) Judge K Soman also sentenced the convict to imprisonment under various sections of the IPC and

Mavunkal, found guilty of repeatedly raping the daughter of his maid since 2019, was sentenced to imprisonment for the remainder of life under IPC Sections 376(2)(n) (commits rape

19-year-old arrested for sending woman's morphed

repeatedly on the same woman) and 376(2) (f) (being a relative, guardian, or teacher of, or a person in position of trust or authority towards the woman, commits rape on such woman)

He was also given rigorous imprisonment for life under various sections of the POCSO Act. All sentences shall run concurrently.

The case against Mavunkal was that he raped his maid's daughter, when she was a minor and after she became an adult, on the false promise of providing her financial assistance for education.

He had argued that the rape cases were foisted upon him by the police to keep him in prison, as they were unable to find anything incriminating in the cheating cases against him that they were investigating.

A native of Cherthala, Mavunkal, who claims to be in possession of rare and historic antiques, was arrested by the crime branch wing of the Kerala police, which has been investigating a case against him pertaining to cheating different people of Rs 10 crore.

He was arrested on September 25, 2021, in one of the cheating cases and has been in jail since then and is now accused in around

3 killed, 10 injured as Delhi-bound passenger bus collides with stationary truck in MP

MORENA, Jun 17 (Agencies): Three people were killed and around 10 injured, two of them critically, after a Delhi-bound passenger bus collided with a stationary dumper truck in Morena district of Madhya Pradesh. police said on Saturday.

The incident occurred on Friday night near Baba Devpuri under Saraychhola police station limits, an official said.

"A sleeper coach bus going to Delhi from Gwalior collided with a stationary truck. Three persons were killed and around 10 suffered injuries. Two of them were critically injured and taken to Gwalior for treatment," SP Shailendra



Singh Chouhan said.

The bus driver, a passenger and a helper of the dumper truck were killed,

NEW DELHI, Jun 17 (Agencies): A 19-yearold youth was arrested from Bihar for allegedly

creating a fake social media profile and sending vulgar messages and morphed photos of a woman to her fiance and family, police said on Saturday.

The accused has been identified as Shubham Kumar, a resident of Makar Saran in Bihar, they said.

On March 20, a woman



filed a complaint here alleging that her finance and family received her morphed photos and

vulgar messages from a fake social media id which led to their engagement being

called off, a senior police officer said.

During investigation, it was found that Shubham created the fake id and allegedly sent them the messages.

He was apprehended from Muzaffarpur, **Deputy Commissioner** of Police (Dwarka) M Harsh Vardhan said.

Shubham said he is in a relation with the woman's sister-in-law who, due to some family reasons, asked him to ensure the engagement is cancelled, police said

In order to defame her, he created the fake id and sent vulgar messages and morphed photos of the complainant to her fiance.

Objectionable material has been recovered from his mobile phone, and investigation is being carried out to corroborate the claims about the sister-in-law, the DCP said.

Mamata govt, poll body move SC challenging court's order on central forces' deployment

KOLKATA, Jun 17 (Agencies): The West Bengal government and the State Election Commission on Saturday jointly moved the Supreme Court challenging the deployment of central forces during panchayat polls in the state, ordered by the High Court.

According to sources within the Commission, the decision was made after senior officials of the State Election Commission and the government held a meeting with the state's legal advisors on Friday.

The Calcutta High Court had directed the SEC to requisition and deploy central forces across West Bengal for the Panchayat elections in the state within 48 hours on Thursday.

The division bench,

presided by Chief Justice T S Sivagnanam, had directed the SEC to follow the requisition orders for all the districts that were rocked by violence over filing of nominations for the July 8 Panchayat elections. It was noted during the hearing that no appreciable steps were taken since the order was passed on June 13. Opposition leaders,

including BJP's Suvendu Adhikari and Congress MP Adhir Ranjan Chowdhury, had approached the court to request the deployment of central forces to ensure peaceful elections. They cited instances of widespread violence during the municipal elections in 2022 and the Kolkata Municipal Corporation elections in 2021 as

grounds for their peti-



Meanwhile, violence continued to plague various parts of West Bengal during the nomination filing process. Since June 9, when the filing commenced, incidents of violence have

disrupted the process in

different regions of the

state The opposition parties, including BJP, Congress, and CPI (M), have accused the ruling TMC of employ-

ing strong-arm tactics to prevent opposition candidates from submitting their nominations. Clashes erupted in

South 24 Parganas and Bankura districts with supporters from opposing parties engaged in hurling bombs and vandalizing cars in their attempts to obstruct each other's nominations. Similar confrontations unfolded in the Canning area.

The miscreants resort-

ed to bomb attacks and stone-throwing, prompting the police, including the Rapid Action Force (RAF), to employ tear gas shells to restore order. Around seven individuals were detained for their alleged involvement in the violence. At least three more persons were later detained in Indas, Bankura district, in connection with the disturbances. The state is preparing

for its three-tier panchayat elections, which encompass a substantial electorate of approximately 5.67 crores. Voters will exercise their democratic right to elect representatives for nearly 74,000 seats across zilla parishads, panchayat samitis, and gram panchayats.

21-Year-Old From Bihar Dies By Suicide In Kota After Poor NEET Result

KOTA, Jun 17 (Agencies): A 21-year-old medical education aspirant from Bihar allegedly committed suicide here after failing to get desired marks in the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test (NEET) in two successive attempts, officials said on Saturday.

Roshan (21), a resident of Samastipur district, was found dead Thursday evening by his brother Suman who also prepares for competitive exams in Kota but resides separately, they said.

Police said no suicide note has been recovered from Roshan's room in Mahaveer Nagar Police station area, but they believe he hanged himself from the ceiling fan apparently because he failed to qualify NEET-UG with good marks even at his second attempt.

The NEET results were announced earlier this week.

Roshan and his brother Suman had been preparing for the entrance exam and living at separate locations in Mahaveer Nagar area, circle officer of the area DSP Harshraj Singh told.

Roshan had gone to his uncles' place in Delhi and returned to Kota on Thursday morning after which he spoke to his mother, Singh said.

Later in the day, when his parents called, Roshan did not respond after which they asked Suman to go to his PG and check.

When Suman reached there, he found his brother's body hanging from the ceiling fan in his room on the 3rd

floor of the building, the CO said.

He was rushed to a hospital where he was declared brought dead, the officer added.

Roshan had been preparing for the NEET-UG for two years in Kota, and he scored 400 marks out of 720 in this edition of the NEET-UG, the officer said.

Police said they have lodged a case under section 174 of CrPC (enquire and report on suicide) to probe the incident. They said his family reached Kota Friday afternoon and the body was handed over to them after postmortem.

This is the 12th case student suicide in Kota in the past six months. At least 15 students took to the extreme step in 2022.

Competition shouldn't veer into conflict, says US state secy Blinken ahead of China visit

WASHINGTON, Jun 17 (Agencies): US Secretary of State Antony Blinken said that his coming visit to China aims to open up better communications "by addressing misperceptions and avoiding miscalculations."

"Intense competition requires sustained diplomacy to ensure that competition does not veer into confrontation or conflict," Blinken said.

"That is what the world expects of both the United States and China."

Blinken will hold talks Sunday and Monday in Beijing on the first trip by a top US diplomat in nearly five years.

The trip was rescheduled after the United States cancelled a planned Beijing visit by Blinken in February after Washington said it detected -- and later shot down -- a Chinese spy balloon.

The first goal of the trip to China, Blinken said in a press conference, is "to establish open and empowered communications, so that our two countries responsibly manage our relationship."

He said the aim was also to set the record clear on US interests and values, and to explore areas of possible cooperation, including on global economic



stability, fighting drug trafficking, and climate and health issues.

He added he would raise the

issue of US citizens detained by China.

China has detained a number of US citizens on various charges, including Kai Li, a businessman accused of spying in 2016, and David Lin, an America pastor held since 2006.

Blinken was speaking in a joint press conference with visiting Singapore Foreign Minister Vivian Balakrishnan.

Balakrishnan said the Asian region had its eye on US-China relations, calling it "the challenge of the century."

"This is a very important and critical moment, not just for the

United States and China," he

"The rest of the world will be watching. So we hope and believe that you will be able to manage the differences," he

The visit comes as relations between the two superpowers have been particularly strained, on the issue of Taiwan, on China's ambitions to expand its political and security influence around the globe, and on economic relations.

Washington officials recently said China has set up intelligence operations in Cuba, just off the southeastern US coast.

And on Thursday a major US cybersecurity firm, Mandiant,

said online attackers with clear links to China are behind a vast cyber espionage campaign targeting US government agencies

Earlier this week Daniel Kritenbrink, the top State Department official for East Asia, stressed that the United States was "realistic" about what Blinken could achieve in China.

"We're not going to Beijing with the intent of having some sort of breakthrough or transformation," Kritenbrink told reporters.

In Beijing Friday, Chinese foreign ministry spokesperson Wang Wenbin said the United States needs to work together with China to improve relations, Xinhua reported.

"The United States views China as its 'primary rival' and 'the most consequential geopolitical challenge.' This is a major strategic misjudgement," said Wang in a press briefing.

He stressed that competition was not a zero-sum game and that US demands should not deprive China of its legitimate right to development.

"This is not 'responsible competition,' but irresponsible bullying. It will only push the two countries towards confrontation and create a divided world," said Wang.

Arnold Schwarzenegger says he'd 'absolutely' run for US President in 2024 if he were eligible



LOS ANGELES, Jun 17 (Agencies): Hollywood veteran Arnold Schwarzenegger has said that he would run for the US president in 2024 and also win the race if he was allowed by the Constitution.

During his appearance on Max and CNN's "Who's Talking?" interview series, Schwarzenegger was asked whether he would throw his name into the race for US president if he were eligible.

"Well, yes, of course. I mean, I think the field was wide open in 2016. And I think the field is open right now. I mean, think about it. Who is there? There really isn't a person who can bring

"Who is here today that people say, 'Okay, he's not too old or he's not too this or too that,' or is that because it's now a question about who you vote against rather than who you vote for?" the 75-year-old actor said.

The action movie star is no stranger to US politics, as he served two terms as governor of California from 2003 to 2011.

When the host asked him whether he would run for the presidency in 2024, the actor replied, "Absolutely. Put me in because it's a no-brainer. I see so clearly how I could win that election." Schwarzenegger said he could see many people voting him into office.

"It's like me and California. When (I) was running for governor, it was clear that people were looking for a new answer, not a rightwing or left-wing politician, but someone who could bring the nation together and doesn't see the other party as the enemy," he added.

Schwarzenegger was born in Austria and is ineligible for the US president post because the Constitution requires the nation's top leader to be a "natural-born citizen."

King Charles III Saddles Up For Birthday Parade

LONDON, Jun 17 (Agencies): Trooping the Colour, the annual military parade to mark the British sovereign's official birthday, takes place on Saturday, with King Charles III inspecting troops on horseback.

The colourful display of regimental precision and pageantry is the first of 74-year-old Charles's reign, and also the first time a ruling monarch will ride at the event since his mother Queen Elizabeth II in 1986.

Charles's actual birthday is on November 14 but British sovereigns celebrate twice -- once in private and again in public.

The June parade tradition began in 1748 under King George II, who wanted a celebration in better summer weather,

as his own birthday was on October 30.
The televised event gets under way from 10:00 am (0900 GMT), with a procession from Buckingham Palace to Horse Guards Parade in central

London.
Some 1,400 soldiers, 400 musicians and 200 horses are taking part, led in the parade by Juno, a 10-year-old shire mare, alongside three other Drum

Horses -- Perseus, Atlas and Apollo.

Drum Horses are the most senior animals in the army and hold the rank of

They are traditionally named after figures from Greek mythology.

The minutely choreographed event has its origins in the display of colours

Amid Ukraine counterattack, Putin says first batch of nuclear weapons moved to Belarus

MOSCOW, Jun 17 (Agencies): Russia has already stationed a first batch of tactical nuclear weapons in Belarus, President Vladimir Putin said. Putin said his deployment of tactical nuclear weapons to Belarus was a reminder to the West that it could not inflict a strategic defeat on Russia, reported news agency.

Addressing Russia's flagship economic forum in St Petersburg, Putin said, "I see no need for Russia to resort to nuclear weapons for now. These would only be used if Russia's territory or state was threatened."

Belarus is a key Russian ally and served as a launchpad for Putin's full-scale invasion of Ukraine in February last year. Moscow's first deployment of such warheads - shorter-range nuclear weapons- could potentially be used on the battlefield.

"As you know we were negotiating with our ally, (Belarusian President (Alexander) Lukashenko, that we would move a part of these tactical nuclear weapons to the territory of Belarus - this has happened," Putin was quoted by agency as saying.

"The first nuclear warheads were delivered to the territory of Belarus. But only the first ones,

Talking about Ukraine's counteroffensive measures, a defiant Putin said, "Russian forces in Ukraine had so far not had any meaningful success. Kyiv's forces were suffering heavy losses and had "no chance" against Russia's military."

The Russian leader's comments follow claims from Belarusian President Alexander Lukashenko this week that his nation received the first part of the "bombs and missiles from

Russia," as per reported by The Hill.

"We have missiles and bombs that we have received from Russia," adding, "The bombs are three times more powerful than those [dropped on] Hiroshima and Nagasaki," Lukashenko was quoted as saying by Fox News.

The deployment of nuclear weapons to Belarus comes at a time when Ukraine has upped the ante against Russia and its forces are advancing in southern sectors of their counter-offensive against Russian occupation troops. Ukrainian forces around the devastated city of Bakhmut, captured by Russia

last month, were trying to push Russian forces out from the outskirts of the town.

Criticising Putin's decision, the US government said there is no indication the Kremlin plans to use nuclear weapons to attack Ukraine. "We don't see any indications that Russia is preparing to use a nuclear weapon," US Secretary of State Antony Blinken said after Putin's comments, BBC reported.

The Russian leader announced in March he had agreed to deploy tactical nuclear weapons in Belarus, pointing to the US deployment of such weapons in a host of European countries over many decades. The Russian step is nonetheless being watched closely by Washington and its allies as well as by China, which has repeatedly cautioned against the use of nuclear weapons in the war in Ukraine.

Tactical nuclear weapons are small nuclear warheads and delivery systems intended for use on the battlefield, or for a limited strike. They are designed to destroy enemy targets in a specific area without causing widespread radioactive fallout, BBC said in a report.

While addressing the central general council meeting of the party, PML-N, Sharif said that he was waiting for his elder brother to return to Pakistan and then hold the party meeting so he could hand over the PML-N's president back to him.

It is pertinent to mention that Nawaz Sharif has been in self-imposed exile in London since November 2019 owing to health reasons.

"The election commission's sword was hanging which is why this meeting was held," the Prime Minister added.



Premier Shehbaz was given the PML-N's presidency after his predecessor - Nawaz, the three-time prime minister - was disqualified by the Supreme Court and barred from holding any party office, according to Pakistan's Geo News.

He also said that the PML-N needed young leadership, and commended Maryam Nawaz for

Pakistan's top court banned him from holding any public office for life for hiding unpaid salary from his son in the Panama case.

A year later, the court while announcing the verdict on petitions challenging the Elections Act 2017 said that a person disqualified under Articles 62 and 63 cannot serve as the head of a political party, Pakistani news channel Geo News reported.

At least 25 killed in rebel attack on Ugandan school near Congo border

KAMPALA, Jun 17 (Agencies): Ugandan police say at least 25 people have been killed in a suspected rebel attack on a school near the Congo border.

Police said in a statement Saturday that the Allied Democratic Forces carried out the attack late Friday night on a school in the border town of Mpondwe.

Lhubiriha Secondary School, which is privately owned, is located about 2 kilometres (1.2 miles) from the Congo border.

"A dormitory was burnt and a food store looted. So far 25 bodies have been recovered from the school and transferred to Bwera Hospital," the statement said, adding that eight others are in critical condition.

The statement said Ugandan government troops tracked the attackers into Congolese territory.

It was not immediately clear if all of the victims were students.

The local Daily Moni-

tor newspaper, citing unnamed security sources, reported that the attackers "abducted several" others before fleeing. Winnie Kiiza, an influential political leader, condemned the "cowardly attack" on Twitter. Kiiza, a former lawmaker from the region wrote, "Attacks on schools are unacceptable and are a grave violation of children's rights," adding that schools should always be "a safe place" for every student."

The Allied Democratic Forces, or ADF, is accused of launching many attacks on civilians in recent years,

notably on civilian communities in remote parts of eastern Congo.

The ADF has long opposed the rule of Ugandan President Yoweri Museveni, a U.S. security ally who has been in power since 1986.

Established in the early 1990s in Uganda, the ADF later was forced to flee into eastern Congo, where many rebel groups are able to operate because Congo's central government has limited control there.

The ADF has ties with

the Islamic State group.

Ugandan authorities for years have vowed to hunt down the ADF's fighters at home and abroad.

ED attaches Rs 45 Cr assets of Former NSG Officer in Fraud-Linked Money Laundering Case

(NSG) on deputation from the Border Security Force (BSF) and was posted as a team commander (equivalent to deputy commandant rank) at the garrison of the commando force located at Manesar in Gurugram, near Delhi, it said.

The alleged fraud in the name of giving NSG contracts came to the fore in January last year after the Gurugram Police arrested the NSG officer who was allegedly posing as an IPS officer working in the commando force, his wife Mamata Yadav, sister Rituraj, who was working as a manager in the Axis Bank sector 84 branch in Gurugram, and a few others, the ED said.

The agency said probe found that Praveen Yadav opened a "forged" bank account in the name of EMD (earnest money deposit) for central warehouse NSG, Manesar with Axis Bank, Gurugram and had given forged documents to all the complainants (interested contractors) projecting these as documents to have been issued by the force for upcoming tenders for works at NSG campus.

"Through various accounts maintained by Praveen Yadav including bank account in the name of EMD for central warehouse NSG Manesar, he received money fraudulently from the complainants and cheated them," the ED alleged.

This money has either been "layered" through various bank accounts or invested in the trading accounts or been used for making payments for the purchase of movable and immovable properties with the help of Mamata Yadav, Rituraj Yadav, Naveen and Dinesh Kumar, it said.

The ED said it was found that the accused "diverted" the funds to purchase land and luxurious cars.

Illegal driving license racket involving J&K residents busted by Ahmedabad Police

information, the police inspector M.S. Trivedi of the crime branch spearheaded a private investigation. Legal action has since been initiated against the accused individuals, Santosh Singh Madhavsingh Chauhan and Dhaval Vasantakumar Rawat.

Chauhan was working as an RTO agent in Gandhinagar in 2015. It was here he started fabricating driving licenses for various Indian security force personnel. His connections in Jammu and Kashmir, who weren't employed by any Indian security forces, would supply him with the necessary identification details. These details were then used to create fraudulent documentation, which were uploaded to the RTO website to obtain the driving licenses.

Rawat, who worked with Chauhan for two years, was also implicated in the scam. He

was privy to Chauhan's tactics and started operating on a similar modus operandi, colluding with a contact in Jammu and Kashmir. He digitally created false documents, uploaded them to the RTO site, and received driving licenses bypassing the usual verification process.

The duo has been implicated in creating over a thousand illegitimate licenses, charging between Rs 6000 and Rs 8000 per license. They would accept payments through digital platforms like Google Pay. Both the accused are currently in custody as the investigation continues.

The accused, Dhaval Vasantkumar Rawat, collaborated with Santosh Singh Chauhan for two years and gained intimate knowledge of the fraudulent driving license operation, from which Chauhan was earning a significant income. Rawat was involved in distributing these false licenses, often dispatching them to the addresses of security force battalions, under the direction of Ayan Umar, a co-conspirator based in Kashmir

Umar would provide Rawat with the Aadhaar card and photograph of the individual for whom the driving license was intended. Subsequently, Rawat would digitally create a series of documents on his laptop – including a service certificate, defense motor driving license book, confirmation letter, and an Army canteen card.

India Strongly Pitches For A Sovereign Rating Upgrade In Talks With Moody's

S&P and Fitch rate India 'BBB-' and Moody's at 'Baa3', the lowest investment grade.

NEW DELHI, Jun 17 (Agencies): India strongly pitched its case for a sovereign rating upgrade as Chief Economic Advisor V. Anantha Nageswaran and senior government officials met executives of Moody's Investor Services. The government is hopeful of an upgrade after discussing various rating parameters such as the budget, disinvestment targets, and borrowings, according to a senior government official who spoke on the condition of anonymity. S&P and Fitch rate India 'BBB-' and Moody's at 'Baa3', the lowest investment grade. The outlook is stable. The official also highlighted that other emerging economies, were rated higher than India.

Moody's acknowledged the positives of the Indian economy, but a rating action won't be a knee-jerk reaction, the same official quoted earlier said.

According to a second official, who also spoke on condition of anonymity, these meetings happen every year and are a series of interactions that take place over the course of the

Nageswaran expects that India's FY23 growth projection will be over 7.2% when the final estimates firm up in FY26.

India will aim to stick to its fiscal deficit glide path, he said while speaking in Lucknow on June 9. The government hopes to achieve a fiscal deficit of 4.5% of the GDP by FY26, which is a key consideration as India pitches for a higher rating.

According to him, "...there is no second opinion on achieving the fiscal deficit number and getting a better credit rating." "This is not a question of prestige but about putting more money in the hands of the people, as a better credit rating would bring down interest rates," he said.

"A change in credit rating from even 'BBB-' to 'BBB+' could reduce the cost of borrowing by 100 bps," he told the gathering in Lucknow.

Germany hails EU deal on

BERLIN, Jun 17 (Agencies): Germany's economy minister welcomed a deal Friday among European Union countries to increase by more than a third the bloc's renewable energy target for 2030.

Representatives of the 27 member states approved a package raising the current goal of 32 per cent to 45 per cent by 2030. About 22 per cent of the EU's total energy consumption came from renewables in 2021, meaning the new target will double the amount in less than a decade.

The deal includes a number of exceptions to cover the interests of various member states, including specific clauses on hydrogen produc-

"The new European rules will trigger an investment boom for renewables and make it legally binding," said Economy Minister Robert Habeck, whose

portfolio includes energy and climate.

Russia's war in Ukraine has accelerated the EU's green transition. The bloc reduced its dependency on Russian fossil fuels and increased its renewable energy use over the past year.

Under the new rules. countries that fail to add enough solar, wind and other forms of renewable energy each year could be fined by the EU. The share of renewables must increase by 0.8 percentage points annually until 2025, after which it will have to rise by 1.1 percentage points.

This will amount to more than 100 gigawatts of new wind and solar capacity installations across the bloc each year, Habeck's office said.

The energy, housing, industrial and transport sectors will each have specific targets for renewable energy use.

The agreement had been held up by France and several eastern European countries demanding that hydrogen produced with nuclear power should be counted toward renewable energy targets. The German government, which opposed this, said that will now not be the case, though there will be "a bit more flexibility" on hydrogen targets for countries that meet their renewable energy goals.

Separately, countries agreed to introduce binding quotas for the use of e-fuels - made using renewable energy - in the aviation sector, starting with a share of 1.2% in 2030 that rises to 35% by 2050. Biofuels made from waste products and other renewable resources will need to make up a further 35% of aviation fuels used by the midcentury.

RBI imposes Rs 20 lakh penalty on Manappuram Finance

MUMBAI, Jun 17 (Agencies): Reserve Bank has imposed a penalty of Rs 20 lakh on Manappuram Finance for noncompliance with certain provisions of the NBFC norms.

This penalty on the Thrissur-based gold loan company, which by AUM is the second largest such pure-play lender, is based on the deficiencies in regulatory compliance and is not intended to pronounce upon the validity of any transaction or agreement entered into by the company with its customers, the central bank said.

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) conducted a



statutory inspection of the company concerning its financial position as of March 2021, and an examination of the risk assessment report, inspection report, supervisory letter, and all related correspondence pertaining to the same, had revealed non-compliance with the aforesaid directions to the extent it did not classify certain gold

loan accounts with overdues of more than 90 days as non-performing assets

It also did not ensure maintenance of the mandated loan-to-value ratio in certain accounts during FY21.

Further, the regulator said the penal action is based on the unsatisfactory response from the company.

Facebook plans to lower minimum age for Quest account to lure preteens into virtual reality

NEW DELHI, Jun 17 (Agencies): The corporate parent of Facebook and Instagram plans to open a digital gateway for kids as young as 10 years old to enter virtual reality through the Meta Quest headset, despite rising concerns about children spending too much time on social media.

Meta Platforms, which oversees a social media empire created by Facebook founder Mark Zuckerberg, disclosed it will lower the minimum age for a Quest account from 13 years old to 10 years old in a Friday blog post. The Menlo Park, California, company framed the change coming later this year as a family-friendly way for more people to explore artificial realms that Zuckerberg touts as the "metaverse."

The move to lure preteens into a virtual world filled with digital avatars and other technological fabrications comes just weeks after U.S. Surgeon General Vivek Murthy called upon tech companies

The company also is providing parents with extensive guidance when assessing whether they should allow a 10to -12-year-old to use a virtual reality headset. One section of the guide cites "a growing body of research examining the positive effects of VR in medical/clinical contexts, including interventions to support the development of social competence skills, to distract from painful or anxiety-inducing medical procedures, and to support specific skill development in specialized populations," such as children with cerebral

palsy. By expanding the potential audience for the Quest, Zuckerberg appears to be taking another significant step toward his goal of sculpting the metaverse into a sphere that eventually will be as popular as Facebook and Instagram have become since he started the company in a college dorm room nearly 20 years ago.

The metaverse so far has mostly been a digital ghost town, even though millions of Quest headsets have been sold. The Meta division that oversees the Quest headset and Metaverse lost \$13.7 billion last year while bringing in \$2.2 billion in revenue.

What's more, Meta

is facing formidable new competition from Apple, which last week unveiled a headset called Vision Pro that's capable of thrusting users into virtual settings, too. The highend headset, priced at \$3,500, received enthusiastic responses in carefully staged demos, but it won't be in stores until sometime early next year. Meta already has announced the next Quest headset will cost USD 500 as a way to get more people to buy it before the Vision Pro is released and now is taking steps to get preteens on board.

Study shows HIV can lie dormant in brain of the University of



NEW YORK, Jun 17 (Agencies): HIV can lie dormant in the brain, and discontinuation of treatment can reignite the progression of infection to AIDS, finds a study.

As a part of its life cycle, the human immunodeficiency virus-1 (HIV) inserts a copy of its DNA into human immune cells. Some of these newly-infected immune cells can then transition into a dormant, latent state for a long period of time, which is referred to as HIV latency.

Although current therapies, such as current antiretroviral therapy (ART), can successfully block the virus from replicating further, it cannot

eradicate latent HIV. If treatment is ever discontinued, the virus can rebound from latency and lead to AIDS.

Scientists have been searching for where exactly these latent cells are hiding in the body.

The research, published in the Journal of Clinical Investigations, confirms that microglial cells -- which are specialised immune cells with a decade-long lifespan in the brain -- can serve as a stable viral reservoir for latent HIV.

"We now know that microglial cells serve as a persistent brain reservoir," said first author Yuyang Tang, Assistant Professor of Medicine in the Division of Infectious Diseases and member North Carolina HIV Cure Center.

"This had been suspected in the past, but proof in humans was lacking. Our method for isolating viable brain cells provides a new framework for future studies on reservoirs of the central nervous system, and, ultimately, efforts towards the eradication of HIV," Tang added.

Now that the researchers know that latent HIV can take refuge in microglial cells in the brain, they are now considering plans to target this type of reservoir.

Since latent HIV in the brain is radically different from the virus in the periphery, researchers believe that it has adapted special characteristics to replicate in the brain.

"HIV is very smart," said senior author Guochun Jiang, Assistant Professor in the UNC Department of Biochemistry and Biophysics.

"Over time, it has evolved to have epigenetic control of its expression, silencing the virus to hide in the brain from immune clearance. We are starting to unravel the unique mechanism that allows latency of HIV in brain microglia"."

"In addition, the increased risk of mortality associated with being a clearly 'evening' person appears to be mainly accounted for by a larger consumption of tobacco and alcohol. This is compared to those who are clearly 'morning' persons," said Hublin.

This research, co-led by Jaakko Kaprio, from the Finnish Twin Cohort study at the University of Helsinki, followed 22,976 men and women aged 24 years and from 1981 to 2018, taking into account education, daily alcohol consumption, smoking status and quantity, BMI, and sleep duration. It is published in the journal Chronobi-



ology International. At the start of the study, the twins were asked to pick from four possible responses: 'I am clearly

a morning person'; 'I am to some extent a morning person'; 'I am clearly an evening person'; 'I am to some extent an evening person'. In 2018, when the study ended, the researchers checked with the nationwide registers for participant deaths.

Results showed that compared to morning types (13,123 participants), night owls (9,853) were younger and drank/smoked more.

'Definite' evening people (2,262) were also less likely to report getting 8 hours sleep.

Of the total participants, 8,728 had died by 2018.

While the researchers found the chance of dying from any cause to be 9 per cent higher among 'definite' night owls compared to early birds, smoking and alcohol had largely caused these deaths, not chronotype.

This finding was highlighted by the fact nonsmokers were at no increased risk of dying, they said.

The causes of deaths from alcohol included related disease as well as from accidental alcohol poisoning.

7,591 of the twins in the study had identified as 'to some extent' and 2,262 as 'definite' evening types. The figures for morning types were 6,354 and 6,769, respectively.

It was a bold move to declare after 78 overs of a first innings, the earliest any team has ever declared in an Ashes series, but it's not out of character for this team. That is now five first innings declarations from England in 14 Tests.

whether they would stick with their attacking principles, proved his more reserved approach is still as effective as 'Bazball'.

Many experts predicted in-form England, who had scored at almost five runs per over in 11 Test wins from 13 under Brendon McCullum and skipper Ben Stokes, would struggle to still score freely in an Ashes series against such a strong Australian bowling attack.



Trent Alexander-Arnold gives England something different in midfield: Coach Gareth Southgate

LONDON, Jun 17 (Agencies): Trent Alexander-Arnold's goalscoring performance in midfield against Malta was praised by England coach Gareth Southgate, who said the 24-year-old gives England "something different" in the position. Alexander-Arnold scored a stunning long-range goal and made an excellent pass to set up the opener as England cruised to a 4-0 victory, maintaining their unblemished start to Euro 2024 qualifying and keeping them top of Group C.

Under Southgate, the 24-yearold has struggled to hold down a starting spot and has only earned his 19th cap since making his debut in 2018, with the England coach preferring Reece James, Kyle Walker, or Kieran Trippier at full-back.

It was his first appearance in an advanced role for England since being used as a play-



maker against Andorra in 2021. However, following his outstanding performance on Friday, Southgate stated that he wants to tap into Alexander-Arnold's creativity.

Southgate praised his adaptability and said his starring performance proved he could play the role, revealing that he first told him about his plans to use him there four weeks ago in a phone call.

"I've got no questions in my head he can do it," Southgate said. "It's just learning some nuances of the role, without the ball especially, but he's very

"We talked about it four weeks ago on the phone and he's excited about it. He showed

exactly what we think he could be capable of and he gives us something different to our other midfielders.

"Inevitably, a lot of what happens is going to be dependent on his club. The fact he's been playing partly in there with the ball, albeit a bit deeper, has helped his transition."

Alexander-Arnold, wearing the number 10 shirt, said he hoped it would help him secure a regular spot in Southgate's team.

"I haven't played it too much, but it feels comfortable," he said. "It feels natural. It's somewhere I can see myself playing. I want to make sure I am regularly on the team sheet, and that was a good foundation to build on.

"The role I've been playing with club football, it's opened a new avenue for me. It's still early doors, it's only one match, but it's important that when I get the opportunity, I take it."

'MS Dhoni Took Permission From Me': Suresh Raina On Veteran's **Inclusion In CSK's Playing XI**



CHENNAI, Jun 17 (Agencies): The MS Dhoni-led Chennai Super Kings took a tough call towards the end of IPL 2021 by dropping their star player Suresh Raina to make place for Robin Uthappa. It was a match against Delhi Capitals that saw CSK's then new recruit Uthappa getting a chance. He was traded to the side from Rajasthan Royals ahead of IPL 2021. Back then, Dhoni had informed at the toss that Raina was injured. However, the player never returned into CSK's playing XI for the remainder of the season.

During an interaction with Robin

Uthappa, Raina revealed that giving an opportunity to the right-handed batter was a tactical move and that CSK skipper Dhoni consulted him for it.

"When MS Dhoni and I talked, I suggested him that 'you should try Robin Uthappa'. He (Dhoni) took permission from me to play you and I said him that 'he is the guy to give you the final, trust me'," Raina told Uthappa on JioCinema. Raina added that he missing out on the final XI 'was not in the dictionary of Dhoni', but the batting southpaw convinced his skipper by saying that Uthappa deserved to be in the team.

"MS Dhoni said that 'see we have played since 2008 but I want to win this season. Now, you tell me what to do'. I said 'play Robin at number 3 and make sure he is in the playing XI till final. If you win, CSK will win. Whether I play or him, Robin and Raina are same'," the CSK great added.

While Uthappa scored 115 runs across four matches in IPL 2021 with a strike rate of 136.90, CSK went on to win the title by beating Kolkata Knight Riders by 27 runs in the final.
