Night temp drops as rains lash parts of J&K

SRINAGAR, Jun 30 (Agencies): Amid forecast for isolated to scattered light rain and thunderstorm in the next 24 hours, the minimum temperature recorded a drop in Jammu and Kashmir on Friday, officials said.

Also rains lashed parts of J&K during the last 24 hours till 0830 hours today with Srinagar recording traces, Pahalgam 13.2 mm, Kupwara 0.6 mm, Gulmarg 0.4 mm, Batote 0.9 mm, Bhaderwah 1.4mm and Kathua 3.0 mm.

A meteorological department official here said that Srinagar recorded a low of 18.3°C against 20.3°C on the previous night and it was 1.2°C above normal for the summer capital. Qazigund, he said. recorded a low of 16.6°C against 17.5°C on the previous night and it was 1.1°C above normal for the gateway town of the

Kashmir Valley. Pahalgam, he said, recorded a low of 11.2°C against 13.2°C on the previous night and it was 0.4°C above normal in the famous tourist resort in south Kashmir's Anantnag district.

Kupwara town, he said, the mercury settled at 15.7°C against 17.1°C on the previous night and 0.2°C for the north Kash-

Kokernag recorded a low of 16.3°C against 16.7°C on the previous night and it was 1.4°C above normal for the place, the officials said. Gulmarg recorded a low of 11.0°C against 12.2°C on previous night and it was 0.1°C above normal for the world famous skiing resort in north Kashmir's Baramulla district, he said.

Jammu recorded a low of 27.1°C against 26.2°C on the previous night and it was 1.5°C above normal for J&K's winter capital, he said.

Banihal recorded a low of 17.6°C (1.5°C above normal), Batote 17.7°C (0.2°C above normal), Katra 23.5°C(above normal by 1.5°C) and Bhaderwah 16.8° (0.8°C above normal). Ladakh's Leh and Kargil recorded a low of 9.8°C and 13.4°C respectively, the official added.

23-year-old dies after slipping into Shrunz fall

LG Sinha flags off 1st Batch of 3,488 Amarnath Pilgrims from Jammu base camp

JAMMU. Jun 30: Jammu and Kashmir Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha flagged off the first batch of pilgrims for the annual Amarnath Yatra from the Bhagwati Nagar camp here early on Friday morning.

Amid multi-layer security, the first batch of more than 3,488 pilgrims left for the twin base camps in Kashmir to undertake the onward journey to the 3,880-metre-high cave shrine of Lord Shiva in the south Kashmir Himalayas.

The pilgrims were escorted by CRPF troopers with area domination being done by the Army and police on the highway.

The 62-day-long pilgrimage will commence from Kashmir on Saturday on the twin tracks



of the traditional 48-km Nunwan-Pahalgam route in Anantnag district and the 14-km shorter but steep Baltal route in Ganderbal district.

As many as 3.5 lakh pilgrims have already registered for the Yatra so far and the number is expected to increase, officials

Jammu Deputy Commissioner Avny Lavasa said 33 accommodation centres have been set up in Jammu while Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) tags will be issued at the registration centres.

Five counters have been established for the tatkal registration of the pilgrims at Vaishnavi Dham, Mahajan Sabha, Panchayat Ghar and two at Geeta Bhawan and Ram Mandir for the registration of saints.

Getting an RFID tag is mandatory, the official said.

"The Amarnath Yatra started from Jammu today with the flagaing off ceremony by the lieutenant governor. The first batch of pilgrims left for Amarnath," BJP leader Devender Singh Rana told reporters here.

He said the administration has made arrangements for the best facilities for the smooth conduct of the yatra.

IPS officer named as accused in Rs 10 Lakh bribery case in Punjab

CHANDIGARH, Jun 30 (Agencies): Senior IPS officer Inderbir Singh has been named as an accused in an FIR pertaining to an alleged bribery of Rs 10 lakh to let off a suspected drug supplier in Punjab's Tarn Taran district last year, an officer said on Friday.

The name of Inderbir Singh, a deputy inspector general of police, was added to the FIR registered initially on June 30 last year, Senior Superintendent of Police of Vigilance Bureau (Amritsar Range) Varinder Singh said.

The FIR was regis-



tered under sections 213 (taking gift, etc. to screen an offender from punishment), 214 (offering gift or restoration of property in consideration of screening offender), 120-B (criminal conspiracy) of the IPC and relevant sections of the Narcotic Drugs and Psvchotropic Substances Act and the Prevention of Corruption Act.

The case was registered following the arrest of one Surjit Singh with 900 gram opium by personnel of the Bhikhiwind police station in Tarn

Another person, Pishora Singh, was also allegedly held with 250 gram of opium.

Later, the police arrested deputy superintendent of police Lakhbir Singh for allegedly accepting a bribe of Rs 10 lakh from Pishora for not naming him in the

Carrying RFID cards must for Amarnath Yatris for safe Journey: **J&K Govt**



JAMMU, Jun 30 (Agencies): Authorities have directed Amarnath Yatris to collect Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) cards from the designated locations in Jammu and Kashmir before embarking on the Pilgrimage.

The Authorities have cautioned pilgrims not to travel without it.

"It is mandatory for all the yatris to wear the RFID card issued by Shri Amarnathji Shrine Board (SASB) at all times during the yatra", a communiqué said and added "No Yatri shall be allowed to enter the yatra area without RFID card".

The RFID Arbiter Technology Card is equipped with the Radio frequency and linked with the Aadhar card of the yatris which enables every pilgrim to remain traceable if lost the way during the trekking. And it also helps to detect the yatris identity.

Jammu and Kashmir government has issued guidelines for the pilgrims who are scheduled to undertake Amarnath Yatra this year and have asked yatris to follow them for their safe

Directorate of Information and Public Relations Government of Jammu and Kashmir has issued necessary guidelines for the Amarnath Yatris through front page advertisements in Friday Newspapers with the headlines "Do's for the yatris" and "Don't's for the yatris".

The annual 62-daylong Amarnath Yatra begins from July 1 from the twin routes of Pahalgam in south Kashmir and Baltal route in Central Kashmir Ganderbal District amid adequate facilities put in place beside made unprecedented security arrangements.

The first batch of 3,488 pilgrims were flagged off by Jammu and Kashmir Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha from Bhagwati Nagar Yatri Niwas base camp in Jammu on Friday.

The Yatris have been asked to wear comfortable clothes during the yatra period and advised to put on trekking shoes, walk slowly while ascending and take time to acclimatize themselves with the high altitude atmosphere.

Yatris have also been asked to drink an

JAMMU, Jun 30: The **Income Tax Department** has given exemption to some categories for PAN-Aadhaar Linking, for which the deadline is not 30th June 2023.

The Income Tax Department has given a deadline of June 30, 2023. to link Aadhaar card and PAN card (PAN-Aadhaar Linking). If a person does not link Aadhaar and PAN card by the June 30 deadline, then their PAN will become inactive.

That is, they are required to submit a PAN card as an important document for many

government and nongovernment works.

Although the Income Tax Department has given exemption to some categories for whom the deadline for linking Aadhaar card and PAN card is not 30th June 2023.

As per section 139AA of the Income Tax Act, 1961, every person who has been allotted PAN as on July 1, 2017, and is eligible to obtain an Aadhaar number, shall link his Aadhaar with PAN within the deadline of June 30. It is necessary to do.

If this does not happen, then the person's PAN card will become inactive. If the Income Tax Department has extended the deadline of this link like it has been extended many times in the past, then till the next date, you will get time to link PAN Aadhaar card.

The mandatory requirement of linking Aadhaar with PAN does not apply to the categories which include Residents of the states of Assam, Jammu & Kashmir and Meghalaya; on-Resident Indians (NRIs) as per the Income Tax Act, 1961; any person who was of the age of 80 years or more at any time during the previous year; and persons who are not citizens of India.

Those who fall in any of the aforesaid categories are not required to link their PAN with their Aadhaar till June 30, 2023. But they can voluntarily link both the documents if they want. Apart from these four categories, it is mandatory for all persons to link their Aadhaar with their PAN card by June 30.

PAN-Aadhaar linking is not JK, Ladakh to have 677 New Petrol Pumps SRINAGAR, Jun 30

(Agencies): As many as 677 new petrol pumps will be set up in Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh Union Territories to cater to the increasing fuel demand, media reports said.

Indian Express reported that India's BPCL and HPCL, the leading PSU



Oil Marketing Companies (OMCs), would be

setting up 677 new petrol pumps, with 643 new fuel stations in Jammu and Kashmir Union Territory. Of the 643 new petrol pumps, 342 would be set up in the Jammu region and 301 in Kashmir. In Ladakh, a total of 34 new fuel stations would be set up. Turn to page 9



HEALTH EDUCATION

alanced diet is the biggest key to our healthy living. Before planning a balanced diet, one must have knowledge of the essential nutrients present in various food items. All this information can be provided through health education only.

Health education also informs about the causes of various diseases, through which they spread, makes people aware of the importance of good health and makes them realize that the maintenance of good health requires the efforts of all. it occurs.

The simplest and most traditional definition of health is that health is the freedom from disease and suffering. The World Health Organization (WHO), a branch of the United Nations, is responsible for social welfare related to physical, mental health and making every effort to fight disease throughout the world.

In terms of life, health is our most precious gift. Good health is essential for a purposeful existence. A healthy person is one who has these characteristics – soundness and freedom from disease, freedom from unnecessary stress, freedom from social and psychological worries, self-confidence, ability to work efficiently with enthusiasm.

Good health can be achieved only through our efforts and proper health education. We can create a good health only when we are aware of various factors, which affect our health.

For example, if we are aware of the importance of a balanced diet, we will plan our meals carefully. Similarly, if we know how infections spread through air, water, insects and other mechanisms, we will act accordingly so that we are protected from infections.

To provide basic health education to the people, Community Health Centers are established with the main functions. such as educating people about common diseases; their causes, their modes of infection; Prevention, precautions and treatment methods. Also ensuring that the water they use is clean and fit to use.

Considering the large population of our country, it would be wrong to expect that a doctor or a health worker would reach out to each and every individual and educate him/her about various health problems. Such education can be propagated only by the collective effort of more and more people. More and more volunteers, male and formals should be trained and educated

More and more volunteers, male and female, should be trained and educated about the basic issues affecting health. They can further spread this knowledge in their own localities.

Full participation of people in health education helps in tackling various problems related to health through individual and community initiatives. If people are aware of the dangers of polluted water, they themselves will take measures. Through collective effort, they can compel the owner of the industrial unit to stop such abusive practices.

Opposition needs a credible face to counter Modi in 2024

Tt would be useful to remember that Bihar chief minister **▲**and Janata Dal (United)'s old warhorse Nitish Kumar had taken the initiative to arrange for the meeting of the major Opposition parties opposed to the BJP and its leader Prime Minister Narendra Modi. It can be called a motley crowd because as yet there is no articulated strategy in place to fight the 2024 Lok Sabha elections. There has been a statement of general intent that the parties and leaders gathered in Bihar's state capital would like to join hands for a common purpose. Many things need to be sorted out. In many ways it has been a low-key meeting with no grandiose statements. That has been the virtue of this first meeting and it carries the signature of Mr Kumar's unassuming character and style. There were no sparks at the Patna political gathering. The next meeting in Shimla, on July 10 or 12, becomes important on the way forward to Opposition unity.

Apart from the aggressive voice of Aam Aadmi Party leader Arvind Kejriwal, everyone else was busy pondering the issues and options. Some of the observers might even say the need of the hour is the aggression of the AAP, which has defeated the BJP in the Delhi Assembly elections twice, made a small mark in the Gujarat Assembly elections and swept Punjab. Mr Kejriwal has the instinct of an agitator who can amplify small and big issues as matters of life and death. He wanted the issue of the Delhi

government's control over the Union territory's bureaucracy, that had been affirmed by the Supreme Court and nullified by the Narendra Modi government's ordinance, to be one of the burning issues. Other leaders, except the Congress, agreed with him on the issue of the rights of the states and the imperiousness of the Centre, but they were not willing to make it the big issue that can become central in the political campaign. The Congress cold-shouldered it for its own strategic reasons.

Mr Kejriwal is not yet the big leader in the Opposition ranks that he would like to be because the AAP is still a small party holding power in Delhi and Punjab, with 20 Lok Sabha seats, and as Prashant Kishor, the marketing maestro of political campaigns, had shrewdly observed, the AAP has just two per cent of the national vote share, compared to 20 per cent of the Congress. This is indeed the Achilles' heel of the Opposition parties their differences in size and quality. The differences are vital because each of the parties like the JD(U), Trinamul Congress, Nationalist Congress Party and the Communist parties, have their own bases and identities and they are not willing to let go of them.

The Opposition needs to find a clear voice of its own which is pitted against that of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, and unless this is done the battle between the Opposition combine and the BJP looks quite uneven. There is no dominant voice and no dominant party in the Opposition because the Congress, with

its pathetic 53 seats in the Lok Sabha, has become a part of the crowd of small parties with their respective parliamentary strengths like the DMK, TMC, and NCP. There has to be a face and a voice of the Opposition ensemble if it is to be a well-fought political battle.

The Congress wants Rahul Gandhi to be that face and voice and there is enough justification for it because the Congress is the party with a pan-Indian footprint. But there is a problem. After his defeats in the 2014 and 2019 electoral battles with Mr Modi, Mr. Gandhi is at a disadvantage. He has to be seen as a powerful counter-voice to put the fear of God as it were in the hearts of Mr Modi, the BJP and its RSS network. This issue of an Opposition leader is not necessarily that of who will be the Prime Minister. A dominant Opposition leader to cross swords with Mr Modi is what is needed in the heat of the battle. It is not necessary that the same person should be the Prime Min-

And the Opposition parties have to face up to the Congress' dilemma. The dilemma is not that of the Congress alone, but that of the Opposition parties. They need a party which can win more than 100 seats because the others can win only as many Lok Sabha seats as are available in their respective states -- like the DMK in Tamil Nadu and the TMC in West Bengal. The NCP manages to a win a seat or two in states other than Maharashtra. So, it falls on the Congress to pick up seats, or at least the votes, across the country, so that it can take up the position of the dominant party. It is the dominant party with a larger number of seats that has to serve as the nucleus of an Opposition alliance in the election.

Apart from Mr Gandhi, and the aspirational Mr Kejriwal who has not yet proved himself as a good national-level campaigner, there is Bihar's deputy chief minister and Rashtriya Janata Dal leader Tejashwi Yadav waiting in the wings, who is articulate and a forceful voice who could serve as the dominant voice and face of the Opposition. The Opposition leaders cannot say that they will be a chorus against the solo voice of Mr Modi. The Opposition needs to find its own sopranist to counter the Prime Minister.

What is also needed from the Opposition is a national vision and voice of its own which counters that of the BJP/RSS and Mr Modi because in the election the Opposition will be facing the triple combination of Mr Modi, the BJP and the RSS. The nittygritty of seat arrangements can be sorted out by the backroom teams. And they can fight over who would be the Prime Minister once the results are out. Mr Modi's bombast was a key factor in 2014 and 2019. The Opposition needs to counter that bombast with gritty rhetoric. A hardhitting frontline campaigner should convey the many failures and the modest achievements of the Modi government and deflate its grandiose self-image.

India needs a change after 10 years of Prime Minister Modi, but it needs a strong and credible contestant to do that.

Manipur needs a political solution

AST week belonged to PM Narendra Modi. For the people of India, his visit to the US was a resounding success. It was cleverly structured by the External Affairs Ministry to give our Prime Minister maximum exposure as well as the maximum scope to exploit his communication skills.

The Army has told the government that this time a military response alone is not going to help.

Twenty years ago, Modi had been blacklisted by the US and other western democracies for failing to do what his own party chief at that time, Atal Bihari Vajpayee, termed his 'Raj Dharma'. The tide turned when Modi rode into Delhi with a massive mandate from the people. The US and the rest of the world were forced to acknowledge his undisputed leadership of the Indian nation.

Modi's majoritarian Hindutva politics and his gift of the gab have captivated a substantially large slice of the electorate, the core of which resides in Gujarat and Uttar Pradesh. But it is not only his dedicated supporters but also persons like me, who are critical of his doublespeak and autocratic tendencies, who appreciate his dignity, his carriage and his ability to hold his own when interacting with more powerful, and hence more arrogant, world leaders. Their intelligence agencies, like our own, must have given them a candid picture of the man with whom they were going to interact. But finally it would be their national interests that would dominate their thoughts and words, just like those interests would be paramount in our PM's calculations.

The expanding markets in a rapidly developing country like ours and our geographic proximity to a resurgent and rapacious China, with its potential to unbalance the

prevailing world order, will determine the thoughts and actions of the US, presently the leading world power. This world power unrolled the red carpet for Modi and we felt elated and honoured.

Not everyone in India nor in the US is blind to Modi's doublespeak, as some critics term it. The US Congress published an open letter to President Biden, signed by 26 legislators — 13 each from the Senate and the Congress — asking him to remind Modi of the slippage in human, political and other rights during his nine years in office.

Modi's outreach to the Indian diaspora has been truly mind-boggling. It is something that no PM before Modi thought of doing. Indians of all creeds, castes and economic status flocked to the appointed meeting places at the appointed times. Even in Egypt, where the diaspora is small, Indians came to greet him. It warmed the cockles of Indian hearts at home and abroad.

Former US President Obama felt that Modi had to improve on his country's treatment of the minorities, especially Muslims. That remark upset Sitharaman and other BJP bigwigs, introducing the first real sour note into the outcome of the visit. The fact is that Muslims feel alienated under this regime and that is the truth.

Modi's trips to the US and Egypt will boost his support in the 2024 Lok Sabha elections. Unless, of course, the Opposition parties truly bury the hatchet and rise up as one to prevent further humiliation. With Rahul Gandhi and Arvind Kejriwal both adamant on leading the Opposition, the picture of unity is not only hazy but also warped. Arvind is a cleverer and more wily politician. Rahul is a better human being. Rahul's party commands greater support in different corners of the country than AAP. The latter dominates only in Delhi and Punjab. In both places, it has displaced the Congress as the party of preference and that rankles with the Congress think tank. Sulking should not be an option. Smart thinking is what is needed.

In Delhi, AAP has delivered on education and healthcare, the two core functions of any government worth its name. In Punjab, AAP has shown that grassroots corruption that hurts the common man can be tackled with political will and determination. Modi boasts of stopping corruption, but he only refers to big-ticket corruption by ministers and principal bureaucrats. Business houses are finding the atmosphere in the Central corridors of power easier to navigate, but the poorer citizens are still not rid of this perennial curse.

The Modi government's dislike for the Right to Information Act is being felt by RTI activists. Attempts to tinker with the Act by watering down its provisions or by delaying the appointment of Information Commissioners or, even worse, making wrong choices in their appointment should attract an immediate course correction. If Modi truly wants to include each and every Indian in the development paradigm, irrespective of caste or creed, as he himself often proclaims, he should ensure that the RTI Act is strengthened and enforced vigorously.

After his triumphant return to his homeland from his US trip, Modi needs to apply his mind to Manipur. It's known as that tiny piece of the North-East which produces some of India's best sportspersons, prominent among them being boxer Mary Kom. She has been made an MP through nomination to the Rajya Sabha, though I doubt if she can pull her weight in that august House like she did in the boxing ring. If Mary could deliver a punch through her tongue, she would talk

of the threat to life and property in her native state, posed by an incompetent government blessed by the BJP.

The dispute between the plains people, belonging mainly to the Meitei tribe, and the hill people, hailing from Kuki and Naga tribes, is as old as the hills where they reside. The fire was lit a couple of months ago when the Manipur High Court told the state government to consider petitions on the Meiteis' demand for the Scheduled Tribe (ST) status. Since this would eventually deprive the Kukis and Nagas of some of the seats reserved under the ST quota, the tinderbox was lit.

The tinderbox will keep smouldering until a political solution is found. The Army, which has been in the state for long periods to fight insurgent groups that have been involved in an armed revolt for decades, has told the government that this time a military response alone is not going to help. The politicians will have to put on their thinking caps to come up with a political solution.

An added complication is the factor of religion. The people in the plains are Hindus and have been Hindus for ages. The Kukis and the Nagas are Christians and have been Christians for two centuries since American Baptist missionaries converted them in colonial times. Many churches in the valley have been torched and the priests and their helpers killed or beaten. The communal twist could have been ascribed to Hindutva zealots, but the BJP, as a party, had won over the tribals in Nagaland and Meghalaya during this year's Assembly elections. It should use that leverage with its own extremist elements to avoid further bloodshed.

Above all, Modi needs to spend his personal capital and mediate.

Citing agreements signed between the two countries during his visit, he said these will bring new opportunities for youngsters of India in fields ranging from the earth to space, semiconductors and artificial intelligence.

India's youngsters will have access to technologies which used to be out of their reach, PM Modi said, adding that it will boost their skill development.

Companies like Micron and Google will be investing heavily in the country. It is a sign of the India of the future, he said.

Lauding Delhi University's contribution to different aspects of life, the prime minister said it

"India used to have a big share in global GDP. But hundreds of years of slavery destroyed its education centres and stalled growth," he said.

CBI asks Harish Rawat to appear before it in 2016 sting video case



DEHRADUN, Jun 30 (Agencies): The CBI has served a notice to former Uttarakhand chief minister Harish Rawat in connection with the 2016 sting operation, asking him to appear before a CBI court on July 4 to give a voice sample.

Sleuths from the Central Bureau of Investigation arrived at Rawat's residence Thursday morning to serve him the notice but he was not at home

The notice was served to him later in the day when Rawat himself informed the CBI, both on the phone and through a social media post, that he had returned home.

Reacting to the CBI notice, the Congress leader said he and his party had already suffered all the damage the "conspiratorial sting operation could inflict on us" in 2016-17.

"However, I am ready for any kind of persecution in the hope that the law will one day stand by us and truth will prevail," he said, adding, he will fight the battle in the CBI court and beyond.

The sting video in question surfaced in 2016 in the wake of nine Congress MLAs revolting against Rawat, the then chief minister, and joining hands with the BJP, virtually reducing his government to a minority.

The video created a major controversy as it purportedly showed Rawat negotiating a deal to buy back the support of disgruntled party MLAs.

The revolt by party MLAs led to the imposition of the president's rule in the state for a brief period.

Rawat's government was reinstated after he won a Supreme Courtmonitored trust vote in the state assembly.

7 killed as SUV rams into parked truck in UP

BANDA, Jun 30 (Agencies): A speeding SUV rammed into a parked truck here, leaving seven people dead and another seriously injured, a senior police official said on Friday.

The accident took place on Thursday night when a family was taking one of its members to hospital, Deputy Superintendent of Police of Baberu, Rakesh Kumar Singh, said.

While five occupants of the SUV were killed on the spot, two others succumbed to injuries at a hospital, he said.

AMETHI (UP), Jun 30 (Agencies): A man has been arrested in connection with a threatening post on social media against Bhim Army chief Chandra Shekhar Aazad who was shot at by unidentified assailants two days ago, police said on Friday.

A bullet grazed Aazad's abdomen when unidentified assailants opened fire at his car in Saharanpur district's Deoband on Wednes-

day. The car used in the attack has been recovered while the Bhim Army chief was discharged from hospital on Thursday.

In a statement on Friday, Amethi's Superintendent of Police Elamaran G said that taking cognisance of the death threats to Aazad on the Facebook page 'Kshatriya of Amethi', the police on Thursday registered a case under section 506 of the Indian Penal

Code and the Information Technology (IT) Act. Vimlesh Singh (30)

was arrested on Thursday in connection with the post. Prima facie, Singh was not found to be involved in the attack on Aazad, but preventive action was taken to maintain peace and order, the police statement said.

Advance legal action will be taken if any new fact comes to light during the investigation in the case, it said.

Six days ago, a post on the Facebook page claimed that Aazad would be killed by the Thakurs of Amethi in broad daylight. On Thursday, another

post on the same page said that Aazad has been shot in the waist, but "next time he will not survive". It also warned of a massive agitation if any innocent Rajput is implicated in the attack against the Bhim Army chief.

Talking to reporters after being discharged from Saharanpur District Hospital on Thursday, Chandra Shekhar Aazad accused the Uttar Pradesh chief minister of turning a blind eye towards incidents of crime in the state.

"Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath's silence on this incident shows that he is patronising crime in Uttar Pradesh," he

Rain continues in Mumbai; road traffic hit due to waterlogging at some places, local trains slow down

MUMBAI, Jun 30 (Agencies): Road traffic in some parts of Mumbai was affected and local train services slowed down to some extent on Friday morning as moderate to heavy rain continued to lash the metropolis and its suburbs, officials said.

Ever since the southwest monsoon made its onset over Mumbai on June 25, the city has been getting showers. In the last 24 hours, Mumbai, its eastern

suburbs and western suburbs received an average rainfall of 31 mm, 45 mm and 61 mm respectively, an official

The city has been getting moderate to heavy showers since early Friday and the intensity of rain is more in the suburbs, which resulted in waterlogging at some locations, he said.

Commuters complained that the Andheri subway, located between Andheri and

The suburban train services of the Central Railway and Western Railway were normal, the railway authorities

However, commuters on some routes. including the Harbour line that operates services between Panvel and Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Terminus (CSMT), complained of delay in train operations in the morning hours.

A spokesperson of Brihanmumbai Electric Supply and Transport (BEST) said none of its buses were diverted to alternative routes due to rain.

Police are on the spot trying to douse the flames and control the crowds gathered there so that they do not approach the accident site.

"So far it is not confirmed as to how many people died but four persons suffered severe burn injuries," Parawada DSP K V Satyanarayana told PTI on Friday.

Meanwhile, police are arranging ambulances to shift the injured and also making arrangements at NTR Government Hospital in Anakapalli town to treat them, police said.

Fiery protests grip France for third night over deadly police shooting of teenager

More than 400 people were arrested overnight around the country and around 200 police officers were injured, according to police

NANTERRE (FRANCE), Jun 30 (Agencies): French protesters erected barricades, lit fires and shot fireworks at police in the streets of some French cities overnight as tensions mounted over the deadly police shooting of a 17-year-old that has shocked the nation.

Armored police vehicles rammed through the charred remains of cars that had been flipped and set ablaze in the northwestern Paris suburb of Nanterre, where a police officer shot the teen, who is only being identified by his first name,

On the other side of Paris, protesters lit a fire at the city hall of the suburb of Clichy-sous-Bois. The French capital also saw garbage bins set ablaze and some store windows smashed.

In the Mediterranean port city of Marseille, police sought to disperse violent groups in the city center, regional authorities

Tens of thousands of police officers were deployed to quell the protests, which have gripped the country three nights in a row. More than 400 people were arrested overnight around the country and around 200 police officers were injured, according to a national police spokesperson. No information was available about injuries among the rest of the population.

Schools, town halls and police stations were targeted by people setting fires, and police used tear gas, water cannons and dispersion grenades against rioters, the spokesperson said.

Interior Minister Gerald Darmanin said 40,000 officers would be deployed overnight Thursday to Friday, with 5,000 in the Paris region alone.

"The professionals of disorder must go home," Darmanin said. While he said there's no need yet to declare a state of emergency — a measure taken to quell weeks of rioting that followed the accidental death of two boys fleeing police in

The police officer accused of pulling the trigger Tuesday was handed a preliminary charge of voluntary homicide after prosecutor Pascal Prache said his initial investigation led him to conclude "the conditions for the legal use of the weapon were not met." Preliminary charges mean investigating magistrates strongly suspect wrongdoing but need to investigate more before sending a case to trial.

The detained police officer's lawyer, speaking on French TV channel BFMTV, said the officer was sorry and "devastated." The officer did what he thought was necessary in the moment, attorney Laurent-Franck Lienard told the news outlet.

"He doesn't get up in the morning to kill people," Lienard said of the officer, whose name has not been released as per French practice in criminal cases. "He really didn't want to kill."

The shooting captured on video shocked France and stirred up long-simmering tensions between police and young people in housing projects and other disadvantaged neighborhoods.

The teenager's family and their lawyers haven't said the police shooting was race-related and they didn't release his surname or details about him. Still, antiracism activists renewed their complaints about police behav-

"We have to go beyond saying that things need to calm down,

as Brussels, the Belgian capital city and EU administrative hub, where about a dozen people were detained during scuffles related to the shooting in France. Police spokeswoman Ilse Van de Keere said that several fires were brought under control and that at least one car was burned.

The unrest extended as far

Prache, the Nanterre prosecutor, said officers tried to stop Nahel because he looked so young and was driving a Mercedes with Polish license plates in a bus lane. The two boys were electrocuted after hiding from police in a power substation in the Paris suburb of Clichy-sous-Bois.

Deadly use of firearms is less common in France than in the United States, though several people have died or sustained injuries at the hands of French police in recent years, prompting demands for more accountability. France also saw protests against racial profiling and other injustice in the wake of George Floyd's killing by police in Min-

A police spokesperson said 13 people who didn't comply with traffic stops were fatally shot by police last year. This year, three people, including Nahel, have died in similar circumstances.

Judge rejects Donald Trump's request to toss out defamation claims by columnist



NEW YORK, Jun 30 (Agencies): Former President Donald Trump's claims that absolute presidential immunity and free speech rights shield him from the defamation claims of a New York columnist were rejected by a federal judge.

The writer, E Jean Carroll, can continue to press claims that Trump owes her at least \$10 million in damages for comments he made before and after she

won a \$5 million sexual abuse and defamation verdict against him last month, Judge Lewis A Kaplan said in a written opinion.

Trump tried to dismiss the lawsuit on grounds that he is entitled to absolute presidential immunity, his statements were not defamatory and that his statements were opinion protected by free speech rights.

Kaplan said Trump surrendered absolute presidential immunity as a defence by failing to

assert it years ago when the lawsuit was filed. The lawsuit was delayed until recently as appeals courts considered legal issues surrounding it.

Trump countersued Carroll this week, claiming that she has libelled him by continuing to insist that he raped her even after a jury found otherwise.

After a jury returned its verdict last month in Manhattan federal court. Trump made comments on a CNN town hall that prompted Carroll to assert new defamation claims in a 2020 defamation lawsuit.

The jury award resulted from a sexual abuse and defamation lawsuit filed last November after New York state temporarily enacted a law allowing sexual assault victims to sue for damages resulting from attacks that occurred even decades earlier.

China's biggest online travel agency to pay employees 1 billion yuan to have kids

SHANGHAI, Jun 30 (Agencies): Trip. com Group said on Friday it would pay 50,000 yuan (\$6,897.69) to employees for each child they have starting July 1 - the first such initiative by a large private company in China as the country struggles with an ageing population.

The company, one of the world's largest online travel agencies, with 400 million users, said it would pay a parental cash subsidy of 10,000 yuan annually for five years for every child born to its employees worldwide. The programme will cost about 1 billion yuan, the com-

"I have always suggested that the government give money to families with children, especially multiple children, to help more young people fulfil their desire to have multiple children," Trip. com executive chairman James Liang said in a statement.

"Companies can also play a role within their own capabilities to build a favourable fertility atmosphere."


At the invitation of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, President Xi will attend via video conference in Beijing, the 23rd meeting of the Council of Heads meeting of the SCO on July 4 and deliver important remarks, Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesperson Hua Chunying said in a brief press release.

This is the first official announcement about Xi's participation in the SCO summit being hosted by India.

The SCO is an influential economic and security bloc and has emerged as one of the largest transregional international organisa-

The SCO was founded at a summit in Shanghai in 2001 by the presidents of Russia, China, the Kyrgyz Republic, Kazakhstan, Tajikistan and Uzbekistan. India and Pakistan became its permanent members in 2017.

India holds the rotating Presidency of the organisation this year. Ahead of the summit



to be held for the first time under India's Presidency, India on Tuesday inaugurated an exquisitely designed "New Delhi Hall" at the SCO Secretariat in Beijing.

While the SCO's six founding members, Russia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, and Uzbekistan have their halls highlighting their cultures and unique features, India is the first to add its own.

Virtually inaugurating the hall, External Affairs Minister, S Jaishankar in his address said the New Delhi Hall, is conceived to be a "mini-India" showcasing various facets of Indian culture.

"To make you visualise the depth of India's artistic tradition and cultural identity, the Hall has been designed with exquisite patterns and motifs representing the rich architectural craftsmanship found throughout India", he said.

Cambodian PM threatens to block Facebook access in country remarks he claimed

PHNOM PENH, Jun 30 (Agencies): Prime Minister Hun Sen said Friday he could block access to Facebook in Cambodia, after the company said it would remove a video in which he threatened to beat up political opponents.

The warning came ahead of a July 23 election that has been widely dubbed a sham after authorities denied registration to the chief challenger to Hun Sen's ruling Cambodian People's Party.

Facebook announced Thursday it would remove one of Hun Sen's videos in line with a ruling by the Oversight Board for Meta, Facebook's parent company, which also recommended his account be suspended.

The ruling said his speech contained "unequivocal statements



of intent to commit violence" against opposition politicians

Long a prolific Facebook user, Hun Sen announced Thursday night he had stopped using the platform and appeared to have deleted his account.

Speaking to garment workers in Pursat province on Friday, Hun Sen warned that he could block Facebook "for a short period or forever" in Cambodia at any time to prevent exiled opposition politicians from

communicating with

you guys are staying overseas, you are using Facebook for communications, we could block Facebook," he said, appearing to address exiled opponents.

He then urged Cambodians to download other social media platforms, including Telegram, Meta-owned WhatsApp. Facebook of turning a blind eye to "insulting"

After 38 years in power, Hun Sen is among the world's longest-serving leaders.

Hun Sen's Facebook page was launched in 2015 after his opponents, particularly exiled opposition leader Sam Rainsy, used the platform to successfully reach younger voters.

The Cambodian premier now uses the Telegram app to relay his political messages to supporters, and TikTok to engage with youth.

On Thursday, Human Rights Watch (HRW) said the saga was a "face-off between Big Tech and a dictator over human rights issues" that was "long overdue".

Drone strikes target Wagner base in Libya: military source

TRIPOLI, Jun 30 (Agencies): Drone strikes early Friday hit an airbase in Libya's east used by mercenaries of the Russian paramilitary group Wagner, without causing any casualties, a military official told news

agency. The official, speaking on condition of anonymity, said the origin of the overnight strikes on the Al-Kharruba airbase, about 150 kilometers (90 miles) southwest of Benghazi, was "unknown".

The base that was hit is "where members of the Wagner group are located", the official said, adding there were "no victims".

Libya has been torn by more than a decade of stop-start conflict since a 2011 revolt toppled strongman Moamer Kadhafi, which has also drawn in multiple foreign powers.

The North African country remains split between a nomi-



nally interim government in Tripoli in the west, and another in the east backed by military strongman Khalifa Haftar. Alongside fighters from Chad, Sudan, Niger, and Syria recruited as mercenaries, the Wagner group has come to Haftar's help, including in his past failed

The 73-year-old Singh passed away at the Post Graduate Institute of Medical Education and Research here. Singh was elected MLA for the first time from Sirhind in 1980 on a Congress ticket.

He again became a legislator after winning the election from the Kharar assembly constituency in 2002.

He served as the deputy speaker of the Punjab Assembly between 2003 and 2004 during the Amarinder Singhled regime in Punjab.

Singh was expelled from the Congress in 2016 and joined the Shiromani Akali Dal (Taksali) in 2019.

Various political leaders expressed grief over the death of Singh.

Condoling his demise, Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann said in a tweet, "Sad to hear about the passing away of Bir Devinder Singh Ji, the wise leader of Punjab".

Twenty-nine of 81 bodies of Odisha train accident victims identified

BHUBANESWAR. Jun 30 (Agencies): The Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation (BMC) on Friday said 29 of the 81 bodies of victims of the June 2 train accident in Odisha's Balasore, which were kept in AIIMS Bhubaneswar, have been identified.

The process of handing over the bodies has started, BMC mayor Sulochona Das said.

"Of the 81 bodies preserved at AIIMS Bhubaneswar, 29 have been identified based on DNA analysis. We have started the process of handing the bodies to their families," Das said.

The mayor said authorities of Indian Railways and AIIMS Bhubaneswar decided to go for DNA sampling

analysis after there were multiple claimants over

Das said the state government has made arrangements to send all the bodies to their native places.

"Of the 29 identified bodies, five families have already reached AIIMS Bhubaneswar," she said.

Of the 29 bodies, one belonged to a family in Odisha while the others were mostly from West Bengal and Bihar.

It took around 20 days to receive the DNA report from the central laboratory in Delhi, an official said, adding as many as 88 DNA samples were sent for identification of the 81 bodies.

Of the 293 persons killed in the accident

BJP is obsessed with my father and brother, says NCP leader Supriya Sule

MUMBAI, Jun 30 (Agencies): Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) working president Supriya Sule on Friday said the BJP was obsessed with her father Sharad Pawar and cousin Ajit Pawar, comments coming in the backdrop of a war of words between the two parties over the formation of a short-lived government in Maharashtra in 2019.

Hitting out at the BJP, which is part of the ruling coalition in Maharashtra, the Lok Sabha MP from Baramati said the saffron party has no vision either for the country or the state.

Replying to questions on the ongoing war of words between Deputy Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis and the NCP over the short-lived BJP-Ajit Pawar government in November 2019, Sule said Fadnavis has no time to take measures to reduce inflation or ensure women's security.

The deputy CM holds finance and home port-

"He (Fadnavis) just wants to speak on

issues which are not relevant in the present context. He only wants to go back in time and speak about the early morning swearingin and gossip. This is unfortunate. A chewing gum tastes nice in the start, but then it becomes tasteless," she said.

The NCP leader said the Eknath Shinde-led government, which came to power by toppling the Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) ruling coalition in June 2022, is doing everything other than providing good governance in the state.

The Shinde-BJP government completed one year in office on June

"Unless (NCP presi-

dent) Sharad pawar is targeted there is no news," she said.

Fadnavis recently said Sharad Pawar had agreed to form a government with the BJP after the last Assembly polls, but later backed out.

Reacting to it, the NCP chief admitted his party was in touch with the BJP for government formation more than three years ago, but maintained "certain things were done" to expose the saffron outfit and show how far it can go to gain power.

Fadnavis was swornin as chief minister and Ajit Pawar as his deputy in early morning hours at the Raj Bhavan, but their government lasted for just 80 hours.

23,000 street children identified across country being rehabilitated: Official

NEW DELHI, Jun 30 (Agencies): As many as 23,000 street children identified across the country with the help of a web portal are currently being rehabilitated, officials said on Friday. The identification process

was carried out on 'Bal Swaraj', a website where information about such children is uploaded and tracked in order to rehabilitate them, a senior official said. According to officials, these children are categorised into three groups.

The first category consists of children who have either run away from their homes or been abandoned by their families and are living on the streets alone.

The second category comprises children living on the streets with their families.

The third category includes



children who live in slums and are out on the streets during the day but return to their homes at night, they said.

Out of the 23,000 street children, 53 per cent stay on the streets with their families, 43 per cent stay on the street during the day and then return to their homes at night and 4 per cent live alone on the streets, officials said.

The rehabilitation process in all three categories is different. While children who are alone are sent to shelter homes, those who live with their families in slums are linked to welfare schemes, they said.

A majority of children who live

on the streets with their families include those who have moved to a bigger city in search of better opportunities.


Such children are repatriated to their villages and linked to welfare schemes there, officials added.

Explaining the rescue and rehabilitation process, the officials said when a child is rescued and presented in front of the child welfare committee (CWC), a social investigation report and an individual care plan are prepared.

After that, a committee gives recommendations for rehabilitation.

The last two steps consist of linking the child with welfare schemes and then following up on him or her, they added.

Adani-Total Gas Ltd to invest Rs 20,000 crore in 8-10 years to expand city gas

NEW DELHI, Jun 30 (Agencies): Adani Total Gas Ltd, the joint venture of billionaire Gautam Adani's group and French energy giant TotalEnergies, will invest Rs 18,000 crore to Rs 20,000 crore in the next 8 to 10 years to expand infrastructure for retailing CNG to automobiles and piping gas to households and industries, its CFO said.

The company retails CNG to automobiles and pipes gas to household kitchens for cooking purposes in 52 licences that cover 124 districts of the country.

It has 460 CNG stations in the country and about 7 lakh consumers of its piped cooking gas.

It is looking to expand its network of CNG stations as well as a pipeline network that takes the gas to household kitchens and industries, to tap into the country's growing appetite for cleaner fuel.

In the company's latest annual report, Adani Total Gas Ltd (ATGL) chief financial officer Parag Parikh said the company invested over Rs 1,150 crore in 2022-23 (April 2022 to March 2023) for creating additional infrastructure.

"From a long-term perspective, we continue to be optimistic of gas prospects. There is a larger priority to moderate pollution as gas remains a preferred clean energy source with high user safety, customer trust and delivery convenience," Parikh said.

The firm is looking at investing more in creating infrastructure and expanding its network.

"For our city gas distribution



(CGD) business, we intend to invest around Rs 18,000-20,000 crore in the next to 8-10 years to build infrastructure that widens our customer base and sustains revenue growth," he said.

AGTL CEO Suresh P Manglani said the firm's strategy is to fast-track steel pipeline laying and build CNG stations faster across the licenses where it operates for early monetization.

"I am happy to share that your company is going to build over 1,800 CNG stations in the next 7-10 years and committed to connecting every home across all our geographical areas (GAs) desiring to have cleaner and greener piped natural gas in their kitchen," he said.

Besides scaling core business of gas distribution, the firm has embarked on diversifying its bouquet of choice - CNG, compressed biogas (CBG) and EV charging.

"The time is coming when we will have widened our portfolio of service to a range of clean fuels that address different applications for different consumers, reinforcing our positioning as a one-stop comprehensive ser-

vice provider," he said.

India is targeting to increase the share of natural gas, which is less polluting than liquid fuels, in the economy to 15 per cent of its energy mix by 2030 from the current 6 per cent.

And city gas is an area the government is prioritising for

He said the government's move to cap the cost of natural gas will bring stability in prices and prioritise availability to the city gas distribution network.

"This price stability and supply predictability will empower companies like yours to enhance services around this stable pricing and accelerate the country's fuel preference in line with the stated policy."

On new opportunities, Manglani said ATGL has formed two separate units for e-mobility and biomass.

"Foraying into the rapidly growing segment of e-mobility, ATGL has formed a wholly owned subsidiary, Adani TotalEnergies E-mobility Limited (ATEL). Presently, ATEEL is engaged in setting up EV charging infrastructure for two, three and

four-wheelers (including bus) at various locations across the country"

country".

EV charging is a natural fit in ATGL's existing business of CNG retail outlets and is a step towards offering alternative fuel

choices to consumers, he said. ATGL already has 104 charging points at 26 locations across the country.

This it intends to scale it up to over 3,000 EV charging points across the country.

He said the floor and ceiling set by the government for the majority of the gas produced within the country will "ensure a stability in domestic gas prices and get India beyond the gas volatility of FY 2022-23."

Adani TotalEnergies Biomass Limited (ATBL) is ATGL's wholly owned subsidiary to tap into India's huge potential of biomass derived energy.

ATEBL is currently building one of India's largest Compressed Biogas (CBG) plants at Barsana near Mathura in UP with eventual 600 tonnes per day feedstock processing capacity.

In addition to utilizing agricultural and livestock waste as feedstock, the company is also actively seeking opportunities in the municipal solid waste (MSW) segment to expand its CBG production footprint.

CBG is suitable for transportation and utilization in the CGD network.

"ATGL is at the right place, right time and in the right business to capitalise on economies and generate healthy financials across the foreseeable future," the CFO said.

Aspartame sweetener, used in diet sodas and chewing gum, likely to be named a carcinogen by WHO's cancer research agency

Aspartame is authorised for use globally by regulators

LONDON, Jun 30 (Agencies): One of the world's most common artificial sweeteners is set to be declared a possible carcinogen next month by a leading global health body, according to two sources with knowledge of the process, pitting it against the food indus-

try and regulators. Aspartame, used in products from Coca-Cola diet sodas to Mars' Extra chewing gum and some Snapple drinks, will be listed in July as "possibly carcinogenic to humans" for the first time by the International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC), the World Health Organization's (WHO) cancer research arm, the sources said.

The IARC ruling, finalised earlier this month after a meeting of the group's external experts, is intended to assess whether something is a potential hazard or not, based on all the published evidence.

lished evidence. It does not take into account how much of a product a person can safely consume. This advice for individuals comes from a separate WHO expert committee on food additives, known as JECFA (the Joint WHO and Food and Agriculture Organization's Expert Committee on Food Additives), alongside determinations from national regulators.

rulings in the past for different substances have raised concerns among consumers about their use, led to lawsuits, and pressured manufacturers to recreate recipes and swap to alternatives. That has led to criticism that the IARC's

However, similar IARC

assessments can be confusing to the public.

JECFA, the WHO committee on additives, is also reviewing aspartame use this year. Its meeting began at the end of June and it is due to announce its findings on the same day that the IARC makes public its decision – on July 14. Since 1981, JECFA

has said aspartame is safe to consume within accepted daily limits. For example, an adult weighing 60 kg (132 pounds) would have to drink between 12 and 36 cans of diet soda - depending on the amount of aspartame in the beverage - every day to be at risk. Its view has been widely shared by national regulators, including in the United States and Europe.

An IARC spokesperson said both the IARC and JECFA committees' findings were confidential until July, but added they were "complementary", with IARC's conclusion representing "the first fundamental step to understand carcinogenicity". The additives committee "conducts risk assessment, which determines the probability of a specific type of harm (e.g., cancer) to occur under certain conditions and levels of exposure." However, industry and regulators fear that holding both processes at around the same time could be confusing, according to letters from US and Japanese regulators seen by agency.

"We kindly ask both bodies to coordinate their efforts in reviewing aspartame to avoid any confusion or concerns among the public," Nozomi Tomita, an official from Japan's Min-



istry of Health, Labour and Welfare, wrote in a letter dated March 27 to WHO's deputy director general, Zsuzsanna Jakab.

The letter also called for the conclusions of both bodies to be released on the same day, as is now happening. The Japanese mission in Geneva, where the WHO is based, did not respond to a request for comment.

DEBATE

The IARC's rulings can have huge impact. In 2015, its committee concluded that glyphosate is "probably carcinogenic".

Years later, even as other bodies like the European Food Safety Authority (EFSA) contested this, companies were still feeling the effects of the decision. Germany's Bayer in 2021 lost its third appeal against US court verdicts that awarded damages to customers blaming their cancers on use of its glyphosate-based weedkillers.

The IARC's decisions have also faced criticism for sparking needless alarm over hard to avoid substances or situations. It has previously put working overnight and consuming red meat into its "probably cancer-causing" class, and using mobile phones as "possibly cancer-causing", similar

to aspartame.

"IARC is not a food safety body and their review of aspartame is not scientifically comprehensive and is based heavily on widely discredited research," Frances Hunt-Wood, the secretary general of the International Sweeteners Association (ISA), said.

The body, whose members include Mars Wrigley, a Coca-Cola unit and Cargill, said it had "serious concerns with the IARC review, which may mislead consumers".

The International Council of Beverages Associations' executive director Kate Loatman said public health authorities should be "deeply concerned" by the "leaked opinion", and also warned it "could needlessly mislead consumers into consuming more sugar rather than choosing safe no-and low-sugar options." Aspartame has been extensively studied for years. Last year, an observational study in France among 100,000 adults showed that people who consumed larger amounts of artificial sweeteners including aspartame - had a slightly higher

cancer risk.

It followed a study from the Ramazzini Institute in Italy in the early 2000s, which reported

that some cancers in mice and rats were linked to aspartame.

However, the first study could not prove that aspartame caused the increased cancer risk, and questions have been raised about the methodology of the second study, including by EFSA, which assessed it.

Aspartame is authorised for use globally by regulators who have reviewed all the available evidence, and major food and beverage makers have for decades defended their use of the ingredient. The IARC said it had assessed 1,300 studies in its June review.

Recent recipe tweaks by soft drinks giant Pepsico demonstrate the struggle the industry has when it comes to balancing taste preferences with health concerns. Pepsico removed aspartame from sodas in 2015, bringing it back a year later, only to remove it again in 2020.

Listing aspartame as a possible carcinogen is intended to motivate more research, said the sources close to the IARC, which will help agencies, consumers and manufacturers draw firmer conclusions.

But it will also likely ignite debate once again over the IARC's role, as well as the safety of sweeteners more generally.

Last month, the WHO published guidelines advising consumers not to use non-sugar sweet-eners for weight control. The guidelines caused a furore in the food industry, which argues they can be helpful for consumers wanting to reduce the amount of sugar in their diet.



On the one hand, household budgets are going for a toss with the prices of essential commodities skyrocketing and on the other hand, the government keeps feeding them with inflation figures that seem to conjure up a very rosy picture, a picture that is not at all in keeping with reality.

Bhalla said even as the common man pays through his nose for very basic pulses, data released recently has pegged inflation at a mere 17.5 per cent.I feel this economic data is misleading. In reality, it could be more than 25 per cent and it seems the government has not done much on its part to regulate prices of essential commodities. Evidently, the ground realities of the market are far removed from these inflation figures that are being supplied by the government.

Bhalla said with rise in inflation, the purchasing power of average Indian families has also come down. With tomatoes priced at around Rs 120 per kg and ginger at Rs 400 per kg, people are being compelled to forgo these items. He emphasized the urgent need for government intervention to alleviate the burden of price hikes on poor families. Over the past 3-4 days tomatoes have been priced exorbitantly high, ranging from Rs 80 to Rs 120 per kg. There is an average price trend of Rs 30 to 35 for per kg of tomato and Rs 120 to 150 for per kg ginger, Bhalla said.

JAMMU, Jun 30: The month of Shravan (Sawan) has special importance in Sanatan Dharma. Regarding the month of Shravan, Mahant Rohit Shastri, President of Shri Kailakh Jyotish Avim Vedic Sanathan Trust told that some Shiv devotees will start the Shravan month (Shiva worship) from the solar month (Shravan Sankranti) and some Shiv devotees will start the Shravan month (Shiva worship) from the lunar month (Shravan

Krishna Paksha). In this year 2023 Shravan Sankranti is on 16th July Sunday, mostly Shiva devotees start from lunar month and lunar month Shravan Krishna Paksha Pratipada is on 4th July Tuesday, from this day Shravan Lunar month will start. Sawan lunar month will be from 04 July to 31 August.

That is, this time the month of Sawan will be of 59 days. According to the Panchang, this time due to excess month, the month of Sawan is falling for 2 months. Adhik Maas will start from Tuesday, 18th July and will end on Wednesday, 16th August. What is Adhik (Purushottam,

Mal) month? That is, the month in which there is no Surya Sankranti, that month is called Adhik Maas, there is special importance of worshiping Lord Sri Hari in Adhik Maas, due to Purushottam being another name of Lord Vishnu, Adhik Maas is also called Purushottam Maas.

This year Adhik Maas will start from 18 July 2023 and end on 16 August 2023. Creation of Adhik Maas- According to the Hindu Panchag, there are 365 days, 15 Ghatis, 31 Pals and 30 Vipals in a solar year while in a lunar year there are 354 days, 22 Ghatis, 1 Pal and 23 Vipals.

There is a difference of 10 days, 53 Ghatis, 30 Pals and 7 Vipals in both the Sun and Moon years. That's why 1 month is added to the lunar year every 3 years. In that year there are 13 months instead of 12. This increased month is called Adhik Maas.
