India's mood conservative after 76 years of freedom

This Independence Day, 76 years after we attained freedom from British rule, should be of a quieter kind after the excessive enthusiasm that the government of Prime Minister Narendra Modi wanted to generate to mark 75 years of Independence last year with its loud and frenzied "Ghar Ghar Tiranga" (Tricolour in every home) slogan. The 75th anniversary of freedom was indeed a milestone but people went about their own way as the government sought to hyper-ventilate the patriotic feeling. This year, the government has quietened down quite a bit, and it leaves people the breathing space to reflect on what Independence Day means, and how three quarters of a century of Independence have fared.

This has always been a journey of hope beset with challenges, and as each decade passed the hope persisted and the challenges changed. So, by the time India's Independence turned 75, the hope has survived and it seemed that there are possibilities of better days. But it's an accumulated national capital that strengthened the hope. Prime Minister Narendra Modi and the BJP, which happens to be in power, wanted to make much of it. But the people let the day pass as any other day even as they faced the day-to-day crises of rising prices and the hunt for jobs. India was indeed a different place on its 75th anniversary of freedom from where it started out in August 1947. The country's economy was at a much prosperous level, a culmination of the incremental improvements that came about through tardy and

radical policy measures, changes in the world and the opportunities that had opened up as a consequence. It does not matter that Mr Modi and his colleagues will want to take credit for taking the Indian economy into the bracket of the top five economies in the world. This has been mainly due to the 1991 economic reforms that had opened up the markets in India. The decades leading up to 1991 had sort of prepared the ground for the 1991 take-off of the economy, as it were.

The Indian Institutes of Technology (IITs) and the Indian Institutes of Management (IIMs), which were set up in the 1960s on the American model at a time when the Soviet-inspired planning era was at its height, produced graduates many of whom migrated to the West, but these institutions had laid the foundations of an internal revolution in services. At the other end of the higher education spectrum, came India's nuclear, satellite and space programmes which put the country into the circle of high energy and high technology orbit. And India's universities, with all their limitations and flaws, began to churn out technical undergraduates and graduates to man the revolution in the information technology-related communications services sector. It would seem that there has been a certain serendipity in how things worked in India's favour though the foundations were laid at a time when the bright future was not easily discernible on the horizon.

The 1960s and 1970s were buffeted by enormous economic crises even as India's stable future was being shaped. And the education system and the related services sector came to the fore in the 1980s and 1990s when the IT sector assumed the leadership of the economy, and India gained prominence in the launch of satellites with their communications potential. The rocket launches that made possible putting the satellites into geo-synchronous orbits opened up the prospects of India getting into space exploration, and the beginnings of the Moon and Mars missions.

It is in the late 1980s that India and the world came to recognise the existence of the large Indian middle class which turned the tables in favour of India. An estimated 300 million comprised the Indian middle class at that time even as 40 per cent of India's population was struggling below the poverty line. In the decades since then, the middle class had stabilised and even expanded a little, but more people came out of the poverty trap and moved into the new middle class, which the BJP was quick to recognise.

The emergence of the new middle class, the poor who moved up from below the poverty line, happened in the years between the middle 1980s to around the middle of the second decade of this century, say from around 1985 to 2015, a span of 30 years.

And herein lies the political transformation of the country, from being a country with a majority of people living in poverty till the 1980s under ostentatiously socialist-oriented Congress governments at the Centre to that of the middle class-oriented economic reforms-minded governments of the Congress, the BJP-led NDA government of Atal Behari Vajpayee and the Congress-led UPA government of Dr Manmohan Singh. This prepared the ground for the emergence in 2014

of a right-wing ultra-nationalist government of Mr Modi, with its associated majoritarian ideology of Hindutva. The political changes in India seem to follow the economic changes, where the programmes of economic development have given way to economic expansion, and it also changed the class character of Indian politics. The poorer classes have migrated into lower middle class status with aspirations. The BJP and Mr Modi are appealing to the sentiments of this class which are culturally and politically conservative.

The question arises about what happens to the sense of freedom when Indian society is turning conservative. There is a desire for freedom to enjoy much more in terms of material advantages and pleasures, which is a marker of progress in the country's history. At the same time, there is not much desire for freedom to break barriers in social and cultural terms. There is less zeal to change things.

But there are sparks of confrontation and conflict as the new segments from traditional Indian society join the ranks of the new lower middle class, and lay claim to the same material pleasures and advantages. The BJP, which is the ruling party, is following the path of least resistance, and trying to take advantage of society's conservatism and sidestepping all the fault-lines. The emancipated Indian middle class and the lower middle class is yet to set out on the adventurous journey of seeking new horizons. It needs a streak of rebelliousness in imagination and a sense of daring in physical terms. It could happen sometime in the future and then the country's politics will move away from its present conservative moment.

'Riots' in India are different from mob fury in other nations

he word "riot" is defined as a "violent distur-

do not appear to have the capacity to control the damage and those who are counted as our most competent chief ministers have failed on this count. It is also true that the violence is justified in the minds of many, including those who lead the State. In a newspaper interview published a few years ago, the chief minister of Uttar Pradesh was asked: "The Muzaffarnagar riots took place under the last government but of the 44 cases decided, there has been acquittal in 43 cases. Why isn't your government filing appeals?" The chief minister replied: "The chargesheets in the Muzaffarnagar cases were filed by the previous government. The (riots) were the result of biased policies and failure of that government under which the whole society was differentiated on the basis of caste, belief and religion. There is nothing like that in our government. On the question of appeal, we will do that if needed. If there is no need, why should we unnecessarily intervene in the matter of the court?" The root of such violence is an underlying sentiment existing perennially in a large part of our society, and kept stoked through politics. An external trigger then sets it afire: an assassination in 1984, an act of vandalism in 1992 or an incident on a train in 2002.

here is that of spontaneity. The riots referred to in the instances above were not anticipated. In India, we are aware that the deliberate raising of the temperature will have consequences. Lodi in 1526 and died in Agra five years later aged 47 - onthe site of another building apparently made earlier. How much earlier was the previous structure built? BJP MP from Baghpat Satyapal Singh, when he was still an IPS officer, wrote an article ("Proving the historicity of Ram", Rediff.com, April 14, 2008) in which he determined that Lord Ram lived 8,69,108 years ago. Meaning 500,000 years before the appearance of homo sapiens! That is, of course, only if one believes in the theory of evolution, which Mr Singh, who headed education in India through his human resources development portfolio in the first Narendra Modi government, says he doesn't. It will be interesting to see how the world views us as we now go about resolving this pressing matter in Kashi judicially and how we will anticipate and control what will come after the survey is over. It will be too much to hope that the State is mindful of the potential consequences and doing what it can to mitigate them as yet another crisis approaches. Lastly, to go back to where we started, a riot in India is how we define what happens when the majority inflicts organised violence on a minority community. When the minority responds, and again we are seeing this in Manipur, this violence is classified differently in India and given another name.

▲ bance of the peace by a crowd". Generally, the world over, the word is understood elsewhere to mean the fury of society against the State. For example, the Paris riots in 1968, which began with student protests against imperialism and capitalism. Or the Los Angeles riot of 1992, following the acquittal of the police officers who assaulted Rodney King.

In 2011, after the fatal police shooting of a man named Mark Duggan, there were riots in cities across England in which five persons were killed and 3,000 arrested. In the riots that broke out in France this year after the killing of a 17-yearold by the police, three people died, of whom two perished in fires.

This word, then, does not capture the meaning of a "riot" as it is understood in India, that of organised violence against citizens by other citizens.

During an episode of such violence, the State steps aside and allows, till the violence naturally cools down, the passion of the majority to reveal itself as arson, rape, loot and murder. Elements of the State often actively participate in the violence, feeling the same strong emotions as the mob it is meant to subdue. We can see evidence of this unfold before us.

He was an academic, a scholar of languages, who kept a record of what was done to him and others in Germany in the 1930s. There is something happening daily on this front, no matter what else goes on in the economy, or in Manipur or at the border in Ladakh.

Action at the Kashi Vishwanath temple this month will produce similar sentiment as was produced by the events in Ayodhya earlier. The decision handed down by the Supreme Court in the latter matter has not been discussed in politics as a property dispute, which is how the court views it. It has instead been projected as vengeance and retribution against a building made five centuries ago — Babur defeated Ibrahim

In his Independence-Day speech, PM Modi calls for war against corruption, dynasties, appeasement

Addresses people as 'mere parivarjano', says the next five years a golden period of India's journey towards developed nation status; promises to return to the Red Fort in 2024 to report national progress

NEW DELHI, Aug 15 (Agencies): Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday addressed people as "my family members", urging them to declare war on corruption, dynastic politics and appeasement in order to achieve the goal of transforming India into a developed nation by 2047.

Addressing the country from the ramparts of the Red Fort on the 77th Independence Day, the prime minister listed past achievements of the government and laid the roadmap for the future promising to return on August 15 next year to report further progress.

Noting that India was not going to stop in its onward march now, the PM listed "corruption, family-based parties and votebank politics as the three evils sapping national capacity and potential."

"I seek your help to eradicate some evils that have crept into our society in the past 75 years," said the prime minister listing the need for propriety, transparency and impartiality to make India developed by 2047.

Noting that there was never any dearth of capacity in India, PM said the country could "no longer shut its eyes to these evils".

"Some aberrations have



become such a part of the social system that sometimes we close our eyes to them. This is not the time to close eyes. If we have to counter these evils, we have to look them in the eye and fight the evils," the PM said. He said corruption had sapped vitals of all systems and a "war against corruption in all sectors is a must".

He also spoke of the country being shackled by dynastic politics which "has snatched rights of the people".

"The third evil is appeasement which has blemished our national character. These three challenges are suppressing our capacity. We have to create an atmosphere of hate for corruption. Just like we can't tolerate dirt around us we should understand that corruption is the biggest social dirt," said the PM as he exuded confidence of a win in the 2024 Lok Sabha elections while noting that he had converted the promise of change made in 2014 into trust and had been re-elected in 2019 on that

trust. Promising to keep fighting corruption, the PM slammed family-based parties as a "disease".

"These are parties of the family, by the family and for the family. This is their political slogan. Dynasties and nepotism are enemies of talent. Ridding nation of dynasties is important for national progress," said the PM.

He added that appeasement politics had "murdered and destroyed social justice". "If the nation wants develop-

ment we have to develop a

mood of non-tolerance for corruption. We can't allow future generations to live the way we lived. We must leave them a better country," urged the prime minister repeatedly calling the people "mere priya parivarjano (my dear family members) instead of "bhaiyo aur behno (brothers and sisters)."

Describing himself as a member of the country's families, the PM said, "I live for you. If I dream I even dream for you..."

Earlier in his address, the PM called for unity asking people to be mindful of upholding and nurturing national unity with their actions.

He termed national character as a catalytic agent in national progress anywhere and called to strengthen it, even as the PM listed his government's nineyear achievements on varied fronts.

He said the country would soon be among top three global economies on the strength of the trinity of "democracy, demography and diversity".

The prime minister expressed distress on the Manipur violence saying what happened there should not have happened. He assured people of early restoration of peace there.

Grandchildren of cook who refused to poison Mahatma Gandhi await land promised by President Rajendra Prasad

PATNA, Aug 15 (Agencies): Grandchildren of Batak Mian, a cook who defied the orders of a British officer to poison Mahatma Gandhi during Champaran Satyagraha in 1917, still await the entire land promised later by independent India's first President Rajendra Prasad in 1952.

Mian, who had to endure brutal torture and eviction from his land at the hands of the British for his patriotic act, died in 1957. According to popular accounts of the 1917 event, the incident took place when Mahatma Gandhi visited Motihari, the then headquarters of undivided Champaran district, to enquire about the appalling condition of indigo farmers. Erwin (known only by his first name), the British manager of an indigo plantation, had invited Gandhi for dinner and asked his cook, Batak Mian, to serve him milk laced with poison. 

No Independence Day Functions In Himachal As Monsoon Fury Kills 55

NEW DELHI. Aug 15 (Agencies): At least 55 people have been killed in Himachal Pradesh after heavy rainfall battered the State, triggering landslides, a cloudburst, and blocked roads. All cultural programmes to be held at the Independence Day functions were suspended in view of the tragic fatalities due to rains.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi, addressing the nation from the ramparts of the iconic Red Fort in Delhi, said that recent natural disasters had caused "unimaginable troubles" for families across the country.

"I express my sympathies towards all of them and I assure them that state and central governments will work together," he told the crowd.

Chief Minister Sukhvinder Sinah Sukhu on Tuesday said the death count is likely to go up and said that Solan, Shimla, Mandi, and Hamirpur are among the worst-affected districts in the state.

"Around 55 people have lost their lives in the state till now. The death figure might go up. Restoration work is being done on a war footing. Chandigarh-Shimla 4-lane highway along with other arterial roads has been opened," he said, adding that as many personnel as possible are being deployed in relief and rescue work.

Union Home Minister Amit Shah said teams of the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) are engaged in relief and rescue operations in rain-hit Himachal Pradesh and termed the loss of lives due to the deluge as "extremely distressing".

Seven people died after a cloudburst incident in the Solan district last night, while nine others were killed in a landslide at a Shiv Temple in the Summer Hill area of Shimla city.

In a second landslide, five bodies have been pulled out of the rubble in the Fagli area while 17 persons were rescued, Shimla SP Sanjeev Kumar Gandhi told news agency PTI on Monday.

The Indian Meteorological Department has predicted that isolated heavy rainfall are likely to continue over Himachal Pradesh during next two days and over Uttarakhand and northeast India during next four-five days.

NASA terms July as hottest

month on record ever since 1880

WASHINGTON, Aug 15 (Agencies): The US space agency has confirmed that July was the hottest month on record ever since 1880, as heatwaves and wildfires hit the cities in the US and Europe.

According to scientists at NASA's Goddard Institute for Space Studies (GISS) in New York, July 2023 was hotter than any other month in the global temperature record.

Overall, July 2023 was 0.24 degrees Celsius warmer than any other July in NASA's record, and it was 1.18 degrees Celsius warmer than the average July between 1951 and 1980.

High sea surface temperatures contributed to July's record warmth. NASA's analysis shows especially warm ocean temperatures in the eastern tropical Pacific, evidence of the El Nino that began developing in May 2023.

"NASA data confirms what billions around the world literally felt: temperatures in July 2023 made it the hottest month on record. In every corner of the country, Americans are right now experiencing firsthand the effects of the climate crisis, underscoring the urgency of President Biden's historic climate agenda," NASA Administrator Bill Nelson said in a statement.

"The science is clear. We must act now to protect our communities and planet; it's the only one we have."

Parts of South America, North Africa, North America, and the Antarctic Peninsula were especially hot, experiencing temperatures increases around 4 degrees Celsius above average.

Overall, extreme heat this summer put tens of millions of people under heat warnings and was linked to hundreds of heat-related illnesses and deaths.

The record-breaking July continues a long-term trend of human-driven warming driven primarily by greenhouse gas emissions that has become evident over the past four decades.

According to NASA data, the five hottest Julys since 1880 have all happened in the past five years.

"Climate change is impacting people and ecosystems around the world, and we expect many of these impacts to escalate with continued warming," said Katherine Calvin, chief scientist and senior climate advisor at NASA Headquarters in Washington, DC.

27 killed in petrol station fire in Russia's Dagestan

MOSCOW, Aug 15 (Agencies): At least 27 people were killed and over 100 injured in an explosion and fire at a petrol station in Russia's Caucasus republic of Dagestan, the emergency situations ministry said Tuesday.

"A total of 102 people were injured as a result of the incident, of whom, unfortunately, 27 died," the ministry said on Telegram.

The explosion in the city of Makhachkala took place at a fuel station after a fire had broken out, the Russian Federation's Investigative Committee for Dagestan said on Telegram.

"A fire occurred during car maintenance work, followed by a bang, as a result of which people

Aid agencies urge immediate action on war-torn Sudan

GENEVA, Aug 15 (Agencies): Four months into Sudan's conflict, the situation is spiralling out of control, with mass displacement and millions on the verge of famine, humanitarian organisations warned on Tuesday, urging immediate international action.

Since Sudan's conflict erupted on April 15, the country has been plunged into a humanitarian crisis, with more than six million Sudanese people "one step away from famine", the heads of 20 global humanitarian organisations pointed out in a statement.

"There is no excuse for waiting," said the statement, signed by the heads of United Nations agencies, along with organisations including Save the Children and CARE.

The signatories called on the parties to the conflict to "end the fighting" and to "grant us safe and unfettered access"

Darfur and the capital, Khartoum, have been plagued by four months of fighting between Sudan's army,



led by General Abdel Fattah al-Burhan, and the paramilitary Rapid Support Forces (RSF) of his former deputy, Mohamed Hamdan Daglo.

"The situation is spiralling out of control," the statement said, pointing out that more than 14 million children need humanitarian aid and over four million people have fled the fighting.

At the same time, they warned, "time is running out for farmers to plant the crops that will feed them and their neighbours".

"Our humanitarian appeals can help some 19 million people in Sudan and neighbouring countries. However, the two appeals are just over 27-percent funded," they said.

"Please change that."

The signatories assured the people of Sudan that their organisations would "continue to push for access to all people and in all areas of Sudan to bring humanitarian supplies and essential services"

Russia claims Ukraine's military resources are 'almost exhausted'

MOSCOW, Aug 15 (Agencies): Russian defence minister Sergei Shoigu said Tuesday that Ukraine's military resources were "almost exhausted", as Kyiv wages a gruelling counter offensive to recapture lost territory.

"Despite comprehensive assistance from the West, Ukraine's armed forces are unable to achieve results," Shoigu said at a security conference in Moscow.

"Preliminary results of the hostilities show that Ukraine's military resources are almost exhausted," he said.

He added that there was "nothing unique" about Western weapons and that they were not invulnerable to Russian arms on the battlefield.

Bigger targets ahead

After another ACT title, Indian team driven by greater challenges

CHANDIGARH, Aug 15 (Agencies): It would not be very constructive to read too much into India's triumph in the Asian Champions Trophy. Apart from an obvious morale boost before the Asian Games, the title victory tells very little about the team's progress during its transitional period.

India are still just months into their journey under a new coach, Craig Fulton, who has taken it upon himself to bring major changes to the team's playing style.

After a mixed bag of results in the Pro League in Europe, Fulton has won his first title with the team, but at a tournament that has little context. The sixteam tournament, held irregularly since its inception in 2011, has been scheduled at odd windows. It is either seen as a preparatory tournament before major events — in the case of the 2013, 2018 and 2023 editions — or an afterthought when it was held almost immediately after the Olympics in 2012, 2016 and 2021. In 2013, India had even fielded the junior team as the event preceded the Junior World Cup.

This time, the tournament was held too close to the Asian Games, raising concerns about the players not peaking at the right time going into a major event. As the Asian Games title also guarantees an Olympics berth, the pressure on Fulton to deliver in Hangzhou would be immeasurably greater. It was evident that he was not happy with the timing of the event, indirectly telling the administrators to "not have back-to-back tournaments". "If you said to me to win the Asian Games and lose this final, I would obviously vouch for winning the Games," Fulton said.

However, it is India's inability to get over the line in crunch knockout matches that has kept them from winning more titles in Asia.

Fulton admits that making the Indian players mentally stronger will be his biggest challenge. Therefore, he would be pleased by the fighting spirit shown by his team in the final, winning 4-3 India were served well by

Craig Fulton wants to add variety to India's game, which would make the team adaptable to different situations. He wants India to take a more contained approach, frustrating their opponents with a compact defence and then hitting on the counter. A bigger challenge, though,

would be to make India play the possession-based hockey Fulton wants. It is one aspect of India's game that even Reid wanted to change. By building attacks more patiently, a team can dominate possession and dictate the pace of the game. What Fulton wants requires

not only a high fitness level but also great tactical maturity, which means it could take some time before the results are visible. The new style, though, has potential for even greater success.



NEW DELHI, Aug 15 (Agencies): It was on this day in 2020 when World-Cup winning captain MS Dhoni announced his retirement from international cricket. Dhoni, who was captain of the teams that won the ICC Men's T20 World Cup in 2007, the ICC Men's Cricket World Cup in 2011 and the ICC Champions Trophy in 2013, announced his retirement from international cricket on August 15 in 2020. Taking to Instagram, the wicketkeeper-batter had shared a video and captioned the post, "Thanks a lot in limited-overs cricket. Dhoni played 350 ODIs with his highest score being 183 against Sri Lanka. He also remains the only captain to win all major ICC trophies (50-over World Cup, T20 World Cup, and Champions Trophy).

Referred to as 'Captain Cool', Dhoni is known for his calmness and exquisite captaincy on the field.

His agility behind the stumps gave India many breakthroughs. His knack and cricketing intelligence has made him famous for review calls and many have jokingly remarked to change the 'Decision-Review System's' name to 'Dhoni-Review System'.

In December 2014, he announced his retirement from Tests and gave a chance to young players like Wriddhiman Saha. Dhoni called time on his Test career after playing 90 Tests and scoring 4,876 runs at an

average of 38.09. Under Dhoni's leadership, India also managed to attain the number-one ranking in Test cricket.

The 42-year-old popular player has cricket left in him and led Chennai Super Kings to their fifth IPL trophy in 2023.
