Ladakhis concerned over grazing land 'Taken over by China': Rahul Gandhi in Leh

LEH, Aug 20 (Agencies): Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Sunday claimed that Prime Minister Narendra Modi's assertion that not an inch of the land in Ladakh has been taken over by China is not true.

The people of Ladakh are concerned about their grazing land "taken over by the Chinese Army," Gandhi, who is on a tour of Ladakh, said after paying tributes to his father and former prime minister Rajiv Gandhi on his birth anniversary.

"All the people (in Ladakh) say the Chinese Army has intruded and taken over our grazing land and they (people) cannot go there now. They are clearly saying this even as Prime Minister (Narendra Modi) says that not an inch of land was taken over which is not based on truth," Gandhi told reporters.



Most Corruption complaints against Home Ministry, Railways, Bank Officials in 2022: CVC

NEW DELHI, Aug 20 (Agencies): The highest number of corruption complaints last year were against employees of the Union home ministry, followed by those working for the railways and in banks, according to the Central Vigilance Commission's latest annual report.

In total, 1,15,203 such complaints were received for all categories of officers and employees across central government departments and organisations in 2022, it stated. Of these

according to the report, 85,437 were disposed of and 29,766 were pending -22,034 for more than three months.

The Central Vigilance Commission (CVC) has prescribed a time-limit of three months for chief vigilance officers, who act as a distant arm of the probity watchdog, to examine complaints, an official said.

While the home ministry received 46,643 complaints against its employees last year, 10,580 were received by the railways and 8,129



against home ministry

employees, 23,919 were

disposed of and 22,724

by banks, according to the report Out of the total complaints were pending disposal -19,198 pending for more than three months, it said.

The railways had disposed of 9,663 complaints, while 917 were pending disposal — nine for more than three months, the report, which was made public recently, stated. Banks had disposed 7,762 corruption complaints and 367 were pending - 78 for more three months.

There were 7,370 complaints against employees of Government of National Capital Territory Delhi, it stated. Of these, 6,804 were disposed of and 566 were pending - 18 for more than three months.

The report stated that 4,710 complaints were against employees of the housing and urban affairs ministry (including the Central Public Works Department), the Delhi Development authority, the Delhi Metro Rail Corporation, the Delhi Urban art Commission, the Hindustan Prefab Ltd, the Housing and Urban **Development Corporation**

ESSENTIALS FOR DEMOCRACY

he term 'democracy' has been in use in the tradition of Western political thought since ancient times. It is derived from the Greek root 'demos' which means the people, 'cracy' stands for rule or 'government'. Thus, literally, democracy signifies 'the rule of the people'.

Democracy in Lincoln's famous words is "Government of the people, for the people, by the people." As a form of Government, it is the best. Democracy rules out the use of force. Decisions are not imposed but arrived at through negotiations and consensus.

But a system which is based on the ballot rather than the bullet requires some essential conditions for its success. Social inequalities including disparities in wealth wreck democracy. Communalism, casteism, regionalism are all inimical to democracy.

The success of democracy requires absence of ignorance; proper education will produce a wise leadership and a vigilant public and 'Eternal vigilance is the price of democracy'. A free and fair press is another vital necessity for democracy to flourish.

It ventilates public opinion and enables the government to frame policies in the interests of the masses. No Democracy can succeed without a strong and effective opposition.

Strong opposition excises a healthy restraint on the ruling party and prevents it from subjecting the people to arbitrary and despotic rule. It is to India's credit that despite the absence of many essentials of democracy, it is still the world's largest democracy.

In short, the success of democracy lies on the above enumerated essentials and ultimately ensures a good life to the citizens.

Democracy is the latest, and the best form of government to be evolved by kind. It has taken centuries of experimentation to arrive at it.

There are certain conditions which are absolutely necessary for the successful functioning of a democratic government. One of the most important essentials is a constitution.

BJP eyes amity with Pawars... AAP still keeping an open mind?

he Bharatiya Janata TParty finds normalized a bind in Maharashfully engineered a split in the Nationalist Congress Party and improved its numerical strength in the state assembly. The party realises that it needs a strong Maratha leader in order to enjoy an upper hand over its political rivals in next year's Assembly polls. Its internal surveys are said to have shown that chief minister and former Shiv Sena leader Eknath Shinde has limited influence while deputy chief minister Ajit Pawar, the new entrant to the ruling coalition, could deliver the Maratha vote but he would be better placed to do so if he is elevated as chief minister. The BJP is constrained from doing so as it could mean alienating Mr Shinde and the group of Shiv Sena legislators who could even be tempted to join hands with Uddhav Thackeray. With NCP veteran Sharad Pawar scoring over the younger leaders, the BJP is learnt to have advised his nephew Ajit Pawar not to attack his uncle and instead try to win him over to their side with an offer of a berth in the Union Cabinet. Though Mr Pawar has denied these reports, he is keeping everyone guessing about his periodic meetings with his nephew.

Mr Pawar, remarked a former Congress leader, cannot be trusted and yet no one can afford to alienate him.

Though Delhi chief minister Arvind Kejriwal has found a place in the anti-BJP grouping, INDIA, the other Opposition parties continue to be wary of him and feel he cannot be trusted. There is a section in this bloc which is convinced that Mr Kejriwal could still walk out following the passage of the Delhi Services Bill for which he wanted the support of the other opposition parties. The BJP, which is making all-out efforts to create fissures in the INDIA bloc, has figured that Mr Kejriwal could still be persuaded to go solo since he has supported the Modi government on several issues including the abrogation of Article 370 and the need for a Uniform Civil Code. In fact, a senior BJP minister, who was seated a distance away from Mr Kejriwal at the Independence Day programme, moved to sit next to the chief minister and continuously questioned him about his decision to align with a dynastic party like the Congress and whether he would concede seats to it in Punjab and Delhi. Even as Congress leaders K.C. Venugopal and Jairam Ramesh are finalising Rahul Gandhi's East-West Bharat Jodo Yatra, beginning October

2 from Gujarat, the party is mulling over how it can to bring its allies on board. This is crucial as the Congress would not like to give the impression to the other members of INDIA bloc that they are being upstaged, especially since the Yatra route is likely to go through Bihar, West Bengal and Jharkhand before it ends in Arunachal Pradesh. The Congress is expected to impress upon its allies that the Yatra could be used to boost the INDIA alliance. When the Bharatiya Janata Party extended a special invitation to Lok Janshakti Party leader Chirag Paswan at the last meeting of the National Democratic Alliance, it was obvious this was aimed at strengthening the saffron party's Dalit base in Bihar as it needs all the help it can get after the Janata Dal (United) walked out of their alliance. Efforts were also come unstuck as three MPs – Chandan Singh, Been Devi and Mehmood Ali Kaiser – who had aligned with Paswan's uncle during the split are said to be exploring other options. They are learned to be in touch with the JD(U) and may switch sides closer to the 2024 Lok Sabha elections. If this happens, it may be difficult for a weakened LJP to contribute substantially to the BJP's kitty of seats.

As all political parties start preparing for the 2024 general election, there are signs of concern among the Bharatiya Janata Party MPs about their political future. Many point out in private conversations that they could face the axe on the ground that the voters were unhappy with their performance when the truth is that they were unable to deliver because they were not given sufficient functional autonomy. Others are nervous that the BJP's over-dependence on Prime Minister Narendra Modi's popularity has not allowed them to evolve and acquire their own identity. And then there are the first-time MPs who are particularly worried as there is every possibility that they may not get a ticket again. The BJP leadership has, on several occasions in the past, axed its sitting legislators. The experiment proved to be a success.

Education makes citizens vigilant and also gives them the boldness to criticize government measures which are ill-conceived or harmful. In fact, education produces wise leadership and an enlightened and alert public.

Obviously, if opportunities are made available in the right direction under the well thought out guidance of experts who understand the psychology of children and adolescents, then this scheme can prove to be a significant initiative in expanding the horizons of imagination and creativity of the students.

Rao criticizes recent Ordinance & Legislative Actions by Central Govt

JAMMU, Aug 20: Kuldeep Kumar Rao, a member of the State Organization Building Committee and Manifesto Drafting Committee of the AAP in Jammu and Kashmir, expressed his concerns regarding the recent developments surrounding the Delhi AAP government's authority over officers and the central government's legislative actions.

Rao highlighted that the central government had issued an ordinance to nullify a Supreme Court order that granted the Delhi AAP government control over officers dealing with matters other than public order, police, and land. The ordinance transferred the superintending jurisdiction over the entire officer cadre in the National Capital Territory to the Lieutenant Governor. He criticized this move, claiming that the central government's intention was to diminish the powers of the Kejriwal government. He further asserted that the Modi government's actions showed a dis-



regard for the people's mandate and the apex court's directives, indicating an intention to undermine the elected government of Delhi.

Expressing disappointment with the passage of the Delhi services bill in both houses, Rao condemned what he referred to as a "cowardly act" by the central government. He labeled the ordinance and the services bill as a violation of the federal values of the constitution, warning the people of Delhi that the BJP could potentially continue to exert control even after electoral losses.

Rao also commented on the recent

bill introduced by the central government in the Rajya Sabha, which aimed to change the process of appointing the Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) and Election Commissioners (ECs) by removing the Chief Justice of India (CJI) from the selection panel. He criticized various policies of the BJP, including those related to farmers, GST, education, foreign policy, and more, suggesting that they are contrary to the laws and the Indian constitution. He noted that several key ministries are being managed by ministers who were not elected to the Lok Sabha but were appointed to the Rajya Sabha by the ruling dispensation. 

16 killed, 11 injured after bus catches fire in Pindi Bhattian area of Pakistan's Punjab



ISLAMABAD, Aug 20 (Agencies): As many as 16 people were killed and 11 others were injured after a bus caught fire on the Faisalabad Motorway near the Pindi Bhattian area of Pakistan's Punjab early on Sunday, Pakistanbased Geo News reported citing police.

The bus carrying 35 to 40 passengers was en route from Karachi to Islamabad, Geo News reported citing rescue officials. According to District Police Officer Doctor Fahad, the bus caught fire after it collided with a pickup van that was carrying diesel drums, Geo News reported.

Fahad said the most injured passengers were in critical condition, according to Geo News. Drivers of both vehicles died, the report stated further, adding that people, who were nearby at the time of the accident, tried to pull the passengers out of the bus by breaking windows.

As Pakistan celebrated Independence

Day on August 14, its Punjab province witnessed a wave of road accidents leaving 17 dead and 1,773 others injured in 1,659 traffic accidents, Dawn reported. Lahore reported the highest number of road accidents.

On August 14, Lahore's major government hospitals witnessed an extraordinary burden on the patients who suffered injuries in road accidents.

According to the official data compiled by the Emergency Service Department (ESD), nine people died, and 1,338 others were injured in 1,234 road accidents reported all over the province on August 13.

The accident and emergency wards of the major government hospitals in Lahore witnessed an extraordinary burden of patients who suffered injuries in road accidents on August 14, as per Dawn.

The road accidents during the celebrations also left several persons disabled for life as the ESD stated that 99 people suffered deep head injuries and 187 others multiple fractures.

According to the official data, out of a total of 1,773 injured persons, 850 landed in hospitals with serious and critical wounds, while 891 others suffered minor injuries.

North Korean hackers target **US-South Korea military drills**

SEOUL, Aug 20 (Agencies): Suspected North Korean hackers have targeted a joint US-South Korea military exercise being held this week though classified information has not been compromised, South Korean police said on Sunday.

South Korean and US forces will on Monday begin 11-day Ulchi Freedom Guardian summer exercises to improve their ability to respond to North Korea's evolving nuclear and missile threats.

North Korea objects to such exercises saying they are preparations by the US and its South Korean ally for an invasion of it.

The hackers were believed to be linked to a North Korean group that researchers call Kimsuky, and they carried out their hack via emails to South Korean contractors working at the South Korea-US combined exercise war simulation centre, the Gyeonggi Nambu Provincial Police Agency said in a statement.

"It was confirmed that military-related information was not stolen," police said in a statement on Sunday.

North Korea has previously denied



any role in cyberattacks.

The Kimsuky hackers has long used "spear-phishing" emails that trick targets into giving up passwords or clicking attachments or links that load malware, according to researchers.

South Korean police and the US military conducted a joint investigation and found the IP address used in the hacking attempt matched one identified in a 2014 hack against South Korea's nuclear reactor operator, police said.

At that time, South Korea accused North Korea of being behind that cyberattack.

"The Sad Truth Is...": Elon Musk **Amid Row Over New Changes In X**

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug 20 (Agencies): Elon Musk recently made a shocking announcement that his social media platform X would scrap a feature that allows users to block tweets from specific accounts. While the move is being criticised by many, Musk today defended it saving that they may fail, but will still try to create a "great social network".

"The sad truth is that there are no great "social networks" right now. We may fail, as so many have predicted, but we will try our best

to make there be at least one," Musk said in a tweet. Blocking has been a popular safety tool that helps users protect

themselves from unwelcome interactions on X. It ensures that blocked accounts won't see your posts — and that their posts won't show up in your feed. The blocked account also can't direct-message you.

Musk has repeatedly cited a desire for free speech as motivating his changes, and lashed out at what he sees as the threat posed to free expression by changing cultural sensitivities.

Since the tycoon bought the social media platform for \$44 billion last October, its advertising business has collapsed, in part because of its looser approach to blocking hate speech, and the return of previously banned far-right accounts.

"Loudest Pop": Massive Chunk Of Ice Falls From The Sky, Damages House In US

MASSACHUSETTS, Aug 20 (Agencies): A massive ice chunk fell from the sky and hit a house in the US state of Massachusetts on Sunday, damaging the roof of the home, New York Post reported.

Homeowners Jeff Ilg and his wife, Amelia Rainville, believe that the piece of ice fell from an airplane traveling to Boston Logan International Airport. The ice chunk, estimated to be 15 to 20 pounds, thankfully didn't the couple or their two children.

"We heard an explosion, basically. The loudest pop, bang I've ever heard," Mr ILg said.

When they heard the loud bang, they hurried upstairs to check on their children, who were sound asleep despite the noise. They

then ran around the house to find out what happened. Mr IIg said he saw a giant partial block of ice on the back step, and debris scattered around the backyard and on the roof.

"I had no idea what this was. It was hard to wrap my head around it. There wasn't a cloud in the sky," Ilg told Boston 25 News.

Because it was night, he couldn't exactly see the damage to his home. Meanwhile, his wife called the police and then he spotted a hole in the roof. He ran up to the attic to see if there was a hole.

The impact on the outside was about 18 inches to two feet in diameter, he said, but the damage to the inside was bigger.

Mr. Ilg and his wife gathered



about 10 pounds of the ice in bags, but there was still a lot more of it around.

US, Japan and Australia plan joint navy drills in disputed South China Sea, say **Philippine officials**



MANILA, Aug 20 (Agencies): The United States, Japan and Australia are planning a joint navy drill in the South China Sea off the western Philippines this week to underscore their commitment to the rule of law in the region after a recent show of Chinese aggression in the disputed waters, Filipino security officials said Sunday.

On Aug. 5, Chinese coast guard ships used water cannons against Philippine vessels in the contested waterway where disputes have long been regarded as a potential flashpoint and have become a fault line in the rivalry between the U.S. and China in the region. The drill will include three aircraft and helicopter carriers sailing together in a show of force and undertaking joint drills. Their commanders are set to meet with Filipino counterparts in Manila after the offshore drills, two Philippine security officials told The Associated Press. Both spoke on condition of anonymity because they are not allowed to publicly discuss details of the planned drills.

The U.S. plans to deploy an aircraft carrier, the USS America, while Japan would send one of its biggest warships, the helicopter carrier JS Izumo.

The Royal Australian Navy would send its HMAS Canberra, which also carries helicopters, one of the two officials said, adding that the joint drill was planned a few months ago.

The Philippines would not be part of this week's drills due to military logistical limitations but is open to becoming a participant in the future, the official said.

The United States, Japan and Australia were among several countries that immediately expressed support for the Philippines and concern over the Chinese action following the tense stand-off earlier this month

Philippine officials said six Chinese coast guard ships and two militia vessels blocked two Philippine navy-chartered civilian boats taking supplies to the Philippine forces stationed at the Second Thomas Shoal. One supply boat

was hit with a powerful water cannon by the Chinese coast guard while the other managed to deliver food, water, fuel and other supplies to the Filipino forces guarding the shoal, the Philippine military said.

The Chinese coast guard acknowledged its ships used water cannons against the Philippine vessels, which it said strayed without permission into the shoal, which Beijing calls Ren'ai Jiao.

"In order to avoid direct blocking and collisions when repeated warnings were ineffective, water cannons were used as a warning. The on-site operation was professional and restrained, which is beyond reproach," the Chinese coast guard said. "China will continue to take necessary measures to firmly safeguard its territorial sovereignty."

The Philippine military said on Saturday that it would again attempt to deliver basic supplies to its forces in the Second Thomas Shoal, but didn't provide further details.

The mission "to the shoal is a clear demonstration of our resolve to stand up against threats and coercion and our commitment in upholding the rule of law," the Armed Forces of the Philippines said in a statement.

Following the incident, Washington renewed a warning that it is obliged to defend its longtime treaty ally if Philippine public vessels and forces come under armed attack, including in the South China Sea.

CBDT notifies rules for valuing rent-free accommodation perquisite provided by employers

'Employees enjoying rent-free accommodation would see rationalisation of perquisite value leading to a reduction in taxable salary, increasing the net take-home pay'

NEW DELHI, Aug 20 (Agencies): Employees drawing substantial salaries and having rentfree accommodation provided by their employers will now be able to save more and get a higher take-home salary as the income tax department has revised norms for valuing such perquisites.

The Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT) notified amendments to the Income Tax Rules for valuing perquisites of rentfree or concessional accommodation by employers to employees. The rules will come into effect from September 1.

The Finance Act, 2023, had brought in an amendment for the purposes of calculation of 'perquisite' with regard to the value of rent-free or concessional accommodation provided to an employee, by his employer. The rules for calculating perquisites have been notified now.

"The categorisation and the limits of cities and population have now been based on the 2011 census as against the 2001 census earlier," the income tax department said in a statement.

He further said this change will lead to disproportionate benefits for higher-income employees who receive expensive accommodations. Lower-income employees with more modest accommodations might not experience significant tax relief. Moreover, this shift might prompt corporate employers to strategically revisit and potentially reshape their existing compensation frameworks, particularly if they can capitalize on tax



New rapid blood test to detect 18 infectious, inflammatory diseases in kids

Diagnostic test based on patient's gene expression could drastically improve the diagnosis of childhood diseases, say researchers

LONDON, Aug 20 (Agencies): An international team, led by British researchers, has developed a simple blood test which may be able to rapidly diagnose, detect and distinguish between 18 infectious or inflammatory diseases-including group B Streptococcus (GBS), respiratory syncytial virus (RSV), and tuberculosis.

Using a single sample of blood, the test could enable clinicians to diagnose the cause of fever based on the distinctive pattern of genes being "switched on or off" by the body in response to specific illnesses.

While current tests for some of the conditions can take several hours, days or even weeks,

In the study, researchers explored an approach focused on detecting the pattern of a patient's gene expression in blood that occurs in response to specific infections and inflammatory conditions.

Using data from thousands of patients (including more than 1,000 children with 18 infectious or inflammatory diseases) the team was first able to identify which key genes were switched "on" or "off" in response to a range of illnesses-providing a molecular signature of disease. Machine learning was then applied to identify which patterns of gene expression corresponded to the specific disease areas and pathogens-focusing in on a panel of 161 genes for 18 conditions. NEW YORK, Aug 20 (Agencies): Older adults who play digital puzzle games have the same memory abilities as people in their 20s, a new study has shown. The study, from the University of York, also found that adults aged 60 and over who play digital puzzle games had a greater ability to ignore irrelevant distractions, but older adults

Living alone puts people with cognitive decline at high risk: Study NEW YORK, Aug

20 (Agencies): Living alone puts people with cognitive decline -- a group whose numbers are predicted to swell as the population ages globally -- at high risk as they forget appointments, mix up medications and have no one to contact in an emergency, according to new research.

For such patients, living alone is a social determinant of health with an impact as profound as poverty, racism and low education, according to the study published in JAMA Network Open. An estimated 1 in 4 older Americans with dementia or mild cognitive impairment lives alone and is at risk of practices like unsafe driving, wandering outside the home, mixing up medications and failing to attend medical

appointments.

"These findings are an



care system, which fails to provide subsidised home care aides for all but the lowest-income patients," said Elena Portacolone of the University of California-San Francisco (UCSF) Institute for Health and Aging.

In this study, researchers interviewed 76 healthcare providers, including physicians, nurses, social workers. case workers, home care aides and others. The providers raised

concerns about patients missing medical appointments, failing to respond to follow-up of a crisis", according to a case manager.

These patients were at risk for untreated medical conditions, selfneglect, malnutrition and falls, according to the providers.

One consequence of the shaky infrastructure supporting these patients was that they were not identified until they were sent to a hospital following a crisis, like a fall or reaction to medication mismanagement, the study noted.

"In an era when Medicare is going to spend millions of dollars for newly approved drugs with very marginal benefits, we need to remember that Medicare and other payers refuse to pay far less money to provide necessary supports for vulnerable people with dementia," said senior author Kenneth E. Covinsky of the UCSF Division of Geriatrics.

Polls must to end political uncertainty in J&K: Rajesh

JAMMU, Aug 20: Jammu Warriors Front (JWF) Chief Rajesh Gupta on Sunday alleged that the people are fed up with the center's administration in Jammu and Kashmir and called for an assembly election soon to end the "political uncertainty" in the region.

"There was no change on the ground. We were hopeful that the situation would improve but it did not,"



Gupta said. "Instead, confusion has increased. We are living in a vacuum because no assembly held in more than nine years," he said.

JWF President said that the central government had promised to hold the assembly elections after the completion of the delimitation exercise, but even after the commission submitted its report long back, it is vet to announce the election dates.

"I have not heard if the next step will take place or not after the completion of the ongoing special summary revision of electoral rolls...they elections have been need to end this uncertainty and tell us when the elections are going to take place," he said. "The common man is fed up with the governor's rule. I am seeing this for the first time. Otherwise, my experience tells me that people are satisfied with such a rule because they feel there is no political intervention in administrative decisions.

"But today, the people of both divisions, of Kashmir and Jammu, cannot wait for an election." he said.

Urban Indian women more prone to PCOS: experts

JAMMU / AMRITSAR, Aug 20: An increasing number of women in the reproductive age are suffering from a hormonal disorder-Polycystic Ovarian Syndrome (PCOS). According to gynecologists, there is a need for more awareness about this condition, which persists throughout life and can be controlled through proper diet and lifestyle.

An estimated one in five (20%) Indian women suffer from PCOS. If not monitored in time, the condition can have serious health implications, pointed out our experts. Dr. Jagpreet, gynecologist at Ivy

Hospital, Amritsar said that PCOS

is not a disease, but a condition that can manifest in different ways.

"While young women may suffer from irregular menstruation, experience hirsutism (unwanted malepattern hair growth) and obesity, in slightly older age groups, it can lead to infertility and increased risk of miscarriage.

Conceiving with PCOS can be difficult, with about a 40% chance that if the mother has PCOS, the female baby will also have PCOS, Dr. Jagpreet maintained. .

She further said that women with PCOS are at a higher risk of diabetes, high blood pressure and other health complications. The greater the peripheral fat, the greater the hormonal imbalance.

An ideal body mass index (BMI) is 25, but when one is obese, the BMI goes above 27-28 and it becomes worrisome.

PCOS is a lifelong health condition, but it can be controlled with proper diet and ideal body weight", said Dr. Jagpreet. PCOS arises from bad lifestyle habits but it also has side effects and needs to be treated. Because it's not life-threatening, people don't care enough about it, she said.

Dr Jagpreet says PCOS is common in obese women. About 80% of PCOS patients are obese. Urban Indian women may be at higher risk due to their poor lifestyle, eating habits and lack of physical activity.
