Body of 25-year-old **Youth Found** in Kotranka Rajouri

SRINAGAR, Aug 23 (Agencies): Body of a 25-year-old youth was found in Kotranka area in Rajouri district, officials said.

They said that body of one Shabir Ahmad, son of Shakeel Ahmad, a resident of Samote Budhal was found lying opposite to Jamia Masjid Kotranka.

"A police team reached the site soon after and took the body into its possession", they said.

Confirming it, SHO Kotranka Shakil Manhas said that they have registered a case under section 174 CRPC to ascertain the cause of death of the youth.

In a first, **Police** attaches property of drug peddler in Sopore town

SRINAGAR, Aug 23 (Agencies): Sopore: In a first of it's kind, Jammu and Kashmir Police attached the property of a drug peddler in Sopore town of north Kashmir.

A senior police official said that a property belonging to Muzaffer Ahmad Bhat @Tanga. son of Noor Mohammad Bhat of Batpora Sopore has been attached. The seized property include house on six marla land.

Muzzafar is involved in number of NDPS cases at Police Station Sopore and NCB Jammu, a top police officer said, adding that he is currently lodged at Kot Balwal jail in Jammu.

Reliable sources said that the whole family of Bhat is involved in drug abuse trade and have multiple FIRs registered against them.

Article 370 | No intention to interfere with other special provisions, centre tells SC

NEW DELHI, Aug 23 (Agencies): During the hearing on pleas pertaining to Article 370, Solicitor General Tushar Mehta on Wednesday submitted before the Constitution Bench that the Union government has absolutely no intention to interfere with the special provisions of the Constitution applicable to north-east states or any other part of the country.

"We must understand the difference between temporary provision, which is Article 370, and special provisions with regards to other states, including the north-east.



The Central government has no intention to touch any part (of the Constitution) which gives special provisions to the North East and other regions," he said, in response to an intervention application filed in pleas challenging the stripping

down of the special status granted to Jammu & Kashmir.

Advocate Manish Tewari, appearing for an intervenor- a former minister from Arunachal Pradesh, argued that interpretation which will be given by the Constituother special provisions like Article 371, the six sub-parts which apply to North East under Part XXI of the Constitution and the VI schedule which applies to Assam, Tripura, Meghalaya and Mizoram.

17 killed after under-construction railway bridge collapses in Mizoram; PM announces Ex Gratia



AIZAWL, Aug 23 (Agencies): At least 17 workers were killed and several others are feared trapped after an under-construction railway bridge collapsed near Sairang area of Mizoram on Wednesday, police said.

Nearly 35-40 workers were present at the site, about 21 km from Aizawl, when the incident occurred around 10 am, they said.

"Seventeen bodies have been recovered from the debris so far... many others are still missing," a police officer said.

JAMMU, Aug 23 (Agencies): A resident of the Chatha area in Jammu District sustained injuries due to a low-intensity explosion that occurred at his brother's residence.

Farooq, Omar hopeful of successful moon landing of Chandrayaan-3

SRINAGAR, Aug 23 (Agencies): National Conference leaders Faroog Abdullah and Omar Abdullah on Wednesday expressed hope that Chandrayaan-3 will successfully complete its journey to the moon later in the day.

The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) on Wednesday said it is all set to initiate the Automatic Landing Sequence (ALS) for its ambitious third Moon mission Chandray-



aan-3's Lander Module (LM) to touch down on the lunar surface this evening.

The LM comprising the lander (Vikram) and the rover (Pragyan) is scheduled to make a touch down near the south polar region of

the Moon at 6.04 pm, a

feat not achieved by any country so far. "We are very hope-

ful that the journey of Chandrayaan-3 will be completely successful today. We are eagerly waiting for the pictures and videos from the part of the moon where no country has so far managed a softlanding.

"If the Chandrayaan landing is successful, which we are very hopeful of, we will join the elite league of countries that have managed this feat," Omar Abdullah told reporters at the party office here.

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144 dengue cases reported in JK

SRINAGAR, Aug 23 (Agencies): Dengue cases are on the rise in Jammu and Kashmir with health officials stating that around 144 such cases have been reported in the Union Territory. The State Surveil-

lance Officer, Dr Harjeet Rai said that 144 cases of dengue have been reported in J&K. "Dengue cases are projected to surge postmonsoon and people are advised to take "preemptive" measures to combat the painful mosquito-borne disease in the absence of any vaccine."

Dengue caused by viruses carried by infected mosquitoes has always been a health concern and people need to take precautions to protect themselves from falling prey to the virus, he said.

Meanwhile, the doctors have advised the people to use mosquito repellents and wear full sleeves shirts so as to save themselves from mosquito bites, which they said choose to breed in stagnant water accumulated by water logging mainly during monsoon.

They said the mosqui-

toes that spread dengue are active during the day. "Cover as much of your body as possible and use mosquito nets if sleeping during the day and spray the nets with insect repellents,"

they said. The most common symptoms, as per doctors, are fever and headache, eye pain (typically behind the eyes), muscle, joint or bone pain, rash, nausea, and vomiting.

"If anyone has stomach or belly pain, tenderness, vomiting (at least 3 times in 24 hours),







In a statement issued here today, Rattan Lal Gupta, Provincial President of J&K National Conference, asserted that the demand for

the removable of the Toll Plaza from Sarore is well-founded and reflects the concerns of the people. He emphasized that the citizens' peaceful demonstration for getting justice is a democratic right and should be met with understanding and cooperation.

Gupta pointed out the paradox between the statements of Union Minister for Highways Nitin Jairam Gadkari and the actions of the Regional

Officer of NHAI P Shiva Shankar, who falls under Gadkari's jurisdiction. While Minister Gadkari clearly stated in Parliament that the distance between two toll plazas should not be less than 60 kilometers. However, the NHAI Regional Officer cited different provisions to justify the establishment of two tolls at Sarore and Ban.

ribal people, who account for 8.6 per cent of India's population, about 110 million people, can be broadly classified into three groupings. The first grouping consists of populations who predate the Indo-Aryan migrations. These are termed by many anthropologists as the Austro-Asiatic-speaking Australoid people. The Central Indian Adivasis belong to this grouping.

Late Prof. Nihar Ranjan Ray, one of our most distinguished historians, described the Central Indian Adivasis as "the original autochthonous people of India", meaning that their presence in India predated by far the Dravidians, the Aryans and whoever else settled in this country. The anthropologist Verrier Elwin states this more emphatically when he wrote: "These are the real swadeshi products of India, in whose presence all others are foreign. These are ancient people with moral rights and claims thousands of years old. They were here first and should come first in our regard."

The other two much more recent groupings are the Caucasoid, such as the Banjaras, Gujjars, Meenas and other North Indian tribes; and the Sino-Tibetan or Mongoloid tribal people, mostly of the northeastern regions who migrated relatively recently. These two broad tribal groupings have fared much better in the post-Independence period. Clearly, all Scheduled Tribes are not Adivasis. There are some 573 communities recognised by the government as Scheduled Tribes and therefore eligible to receive special benefits and to compete for reserved seats in legislatures, government jobs, universities and schools. Most of these benefits have gone to the non-Adivasi tribals.

Unfortunately, like indigenous people all over the world, India's Adivasis too have been savaged and ravaged by later people claiming to be more "civilised". They are now easily its most deprived and oppressed section. The biggest tribal group, the Gonds, number about 13 million; followed by the Santhals, with about seven million. Central India is home to the country's largest tribes, and, taken as a whole, roughly 75 per cent of the total tribal population live there. These are the now troubled Adivasi homelands.

On December 16, 1946, welcoming the Objectives Resolution in the Constituent Assembly, the legendary Adivasi leader Jaipal Singh stated the tribal case and apprehensions explicitly. He said: "The whole history of my people is one of continuous exploitation and dispossession by the non-aboriginals of India, punctuated by rebellions and disorder, and vet I take Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru at his word. I take you all at your word that now we are going to start a new chapter, a new chapter of independent India where there is equality of opportunity, where no one will be neglected." The Adivasis paid dearly for taking Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru at his word. Even if the provisions of the Constitution were implemented in some measure, if not all of its spirit and word, the present situation would not have come to be.

In the early days of our Republic, Jawaharlal Nehru, on the advice of people like Verrier Elwin, sought to insulate the tribal areas from the predations of the new order that was emerging in India. The migration of outsiders into the traditional Adivasi homelands continues unabated. Despite this, there are still 332 tribal majority tehsils in India, of which 110 are in the

Northeast. Thus, there are 222 Adivasi majority tehsils with a population of over 20 million, or about one-third of the Central Indian Adivasi population

The Fifth and Sixth Schedules under Article 244 of the Indian Constitution in 1950 provided for self-governance in specified tribal majority areas. The Fifth Schedule covers tribal areas in nine states of India -- Andhra Pradesh, Jharkhand, Gujarat, Himachal Pradesh, Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Odisha and Rajasthan. The Fifth Schedule provides protection to the Adivasi (tribal) people living in scheduled areas from alienation of their lands and natural resources to non-tribals.

This seldom-enforced con-

stitutional safeguard is now under imminent threat of being amended to formally effect transfer of tribal lands to non-tribals and corporate bodies. This move has serious implications for the very survival and culture of the millions of tribal people in India. In 1999 the Government of India issued a draft National Policy on Tribals to address the development needs of tribal people. Special emphasis was laid on education, forestry, healthcare, languages, resettlement and land rights. The first NDA government even established a ministry of tribal affairs. The draft was meant to be circulated

society groups. It never was. The draft policy is still a draft, which means there is no policy. But it must also be stated that this sudden concern for tribals was mostly motivated by the fears of conversion to Christianity that would have precluded their assimilation into the Hindu Samaj. Thus, even though the states of Chhattisgarh and Jharkhand were carved out of Bihar and Madhya Pradesh,

between MPs, MLAs and civil

real tribal issues relating to their culture, way of life and aspirations were not addressed. Political power has still, by and large, eluded them. Not to be left behind, the UPA government drafted the Scheduled Tribes (Recognition of Forest Rights) Bill in 2005 but did not act upon it due to pressure mounted by self-styled wildlife activists and the wildlife tourism lobby.

Much has happened since Independence and the failed promises of the Constitution. But it is still possible to retrieve some of the original promises. As provided by the Constitution, all tribal majority areas must be consolidated into administrative divisions whose authority must be vested with democratically chosen institutions. This body could be called the Adivasi Maha-panchayat and enabled to function as a largely autonomous institution. All laws passed by the state legislatures must be ratified to the satisfaction of the Mahapanchayat. Instead of the state capital-controlled government, the instruments of public administration dealing with education, health, irrigation, roads and land records must be handed over to local government structures. The police must also be made answerable to local elected officials and not allowed to be a law unto themselves.

Till then the lament of a popular folk song of the Gonds will hold true: "And the Gods were greatly troubled/ In their heavenly courts and councils/ Sat no Gods of Gonds among them./ Gods of other nations sat there/ Eighteen threshing-floors of Brahmins/ Sixteen scores of Telinganas/ But no Gods of Gonds appeared there/ From the Glens of Seven Mountains/ From the twelve hills of the valleys."

PM Modi To Witness Chandrayaan-3's Moon **Landing Attempt Virtually**

Chandrayaan-3 Updates: Excitement is running high across the country and schools are marshalling students to watch a live telecast of the event.

NEW DELHI, Aug 23 (Agencies): Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who is in South Africa to attend the BRICS Summit, will today virtually witness the landing attempt of India's moon mission - Chandrayaan-3.

Chandrayaan-3's lander module, comprising of the lander Vikram and the rover Pragyan, will attempt to land on the south pole of the moon at 6.04 pm today. If successful, India will become the first country to land a spacecraft on the lunar body's south pole.

Excitement is running high across the country, with prayers being held for Chandrayaan's success, schools marshalling students to watch a live telecast of the event and space enthusiasts organising parties to cel-



The 600 crore Chandravaan-3 mission was launched on July 14 onboard Launch Vehicle Mark-III (LVM-3) rocket, for a 41-day voyage to reach near the lunar south pole.

The module would undergo

internal checks and await the sunrise at the designated landing site, ISRO has said, adding that the powered descent -- to achieve soft-landing on the Moon's surface -- is expected to be initiated at around 5:45 pm

A day before the scheduled touch-down, ISRO on Tuesday confirmed that the Chandrayaan-3 mission is on schedule.

India's second attempt to land on the moon after a failure in 2019 is being seen as a display of the tenacity of its scientific institutions

During that attempt, PM Modi had flown to Bengaluru to watch the planned touch down of the lander. Even the mission failed, the space agency witnessed a heartfelt moment between the Prime Minister and former ISRO chief K Sivan.

PM Modi hugged and consoled Mr Sivan as he broke down, hours after the space agency announced it lost contact with the lander.

Minor sexual assault case: Court extends judicial custody of suspended Delhi govt officer Khakha by 14 days



NEW DELHI, Aug 23 (Agencies): A court here on Wednesday extended by 14 days the judicial custody of suspended Delhi government officer Premoday Khakha, who allegedly raped a minor several times and impregnated

His wife Seema Rani's judicial custody, who is accused of giving the girl medicine to terminate her pregnancy, was also extended by 14 days.

Both were produced before Additional Sessions Judge (POCSO) Richa Pari-

Counsel for the accused, Umashankar Gautam said both the accused will be now produced in court after completion of their judicial custody on September 6.

Khakha had allegedly raped the girl several times between November 2020 and January 2021. She was staying at the residence of the accused, a family friend, after her father passed away on October 1, 2020, the police had said.

The couple was arrested on Monday after the victim recorded her statement before a magistrate at a hospital.

A case has been registered under provisions of the POCSO Act and Indian Penal Code sections 376(2)(f) (being a relative, guardian or teacher of, or a person in a position of trust or authority towards the woman, commits rape on such woman) and 509 (word, gesture or act intended to outrage the modesty of a woman), police said.

IPC sections 506 (criminal intimidation), 323 (voluntarily causing hurt), 313 (causing miscarriage without woman's consent) and 120B (criminal conspiracv) have also been invoked in the case.

Near miss at Delhi airport, Vistara planes get same time landing, take-off clearance

NEW DELHI, Aug 23 (Agencies): A major incident at the Delhi airport was averted on Wednesday after two Vistara planes were given clearance for landing and take-off at the same time.

According to the details, flight UK725 (from Delhi to Bagdogra) was in the process of taking off from the newly inaugurated runway, while another Vistara flight (from Ahmedabad to Delhi), which had landed on a parallel runway, was moving towards the end of the

The takeoff was aborted after instructions were received from the Air Traffic Control (ATC)

Following the incident, the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) de-rostered the air traffic controller. An official later confirmed the aviation regulator would probe the incident.

Speaking about the incident, an official who was aware of the developments told news agency, "Both were

given permission at the same time but ATC took control immediately. The ATC officer on duty asked the Vistara flight to abort take-off."

The Delhi-Bagdogra flight returned to the parking bay from the active runway immediately after take-off was aborted. Airport officials said if the take-off was not stopped at the right time, a major

accident could have happened. "Normally, a take-off clearance is not issued to an aircraft on one runway unless the aircraft on the second runway has landed," an official told ANI.

"However, due to a lapse, if the aircraft is permitted to take off from one runway and the aircraft approaching on the second runway decides to abort the landing and carry out a go-around to climb ahead, the flight path of the two aircraft in the air may come in conflict since the runway they were aligned to were closely spaced," he added.

ED raids 'political vendetta' to tarnish INDIA bloc's image before 2024 Lok Sabha polls: Congress

RANCHI, Aug 23 (Agencies): The Congress, a constituent of the ruling JMM-led coalition in Jharkhand, on Wednesday described ED raids on the premises linked to a state minister's son and some others as a 'political vendetta' at the behest of the BJP government at the Centre to tarnish the image of opposition bloc INDIA before the 2024 Lok Sabha polls.

Several of the places raided by the ED as part of a moneylaundering investigation in connection with an alleged liquor scam in the state were linked to senior Congress leader and Finance Minister Rameshwar Oroan's son Rohit Oraon.

"The ED raids are nothing but an action of a political vendetta at the behest of the BJP at the Centre to tarnish the image of the INDIA alliance before the 2024 parliamentary elections,"



Jharkhand Congress president Rajesh Thakur told agency. He demanded that the Enforcement Directorate (ED) should clarify its stance first.

The Congress leader asked, "Is the ED conducting similar raids in the entire country, or liquor is sold only in Jharkhand, Delhi and Chhattisgarh?"

Hitting out at the Centre, Thakur demanded to know whether there is no scam in BJP-ruled states.

About 34 places in the state capital Ranchi, Dumka, Deoghar and Godda districts are being searched by officials of the Central probe agency.

The premises of the senior Oraon are being covered as the father and the son live in the same house. Business and residential premises of some liquor businessmen are also being covered, officials said.

The current investigation is being conducted under the provisions of the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), they said.

Rameshwar Oraon, 76, who holds the portfolios of finance, planning and commercial tax in the Jharkhand cabinet represents the Lohardaga (ST) assembly seat.

Oraon, a retired IPS officer of the 1972 batch, has earlier served as a Union cabinet minister under prime minister Manmohan Singh

Thakur also questioned the timing of the ED summons to Chief Minister Hemant Soren on August 15.

The ED had sent a notice to Soren to depose on August 14 at the agency's office here and record his statement under the PMLA, which he skipped.

"The ED was in such a haste that it chose August 14, the eve of Independence Day, to summon the CM," Thakur said. Soren had alleged in a letter

to the ED that he was being targeted for not being aligned with a political party at the Centre.

Terming his assets as not illegal, the CM has asked the ED to withdraw the summons.

"All Of Us Waiting": Anurag Thakur Ahead Of Chandrayaan-3's Lunar Landing

JAIPUR (RAJASTcies): Union Minister of Youth Affairs Anurag Thakur on Wednesday extended his wishes to the ISRO team ahead of the attempted lunar landing of Chandrayaan-3.

The Union Minister said that all of us are waiting for the moment when Chandrayaan-3 mission becomes suc-

Speaking to reporters, Mr Thakur said, "...India has made a huge leap in the Space sector. All of us are awaiting the moment when Chandrayaan-3 mission becomes successful. This will put India among the very few countries in the world that have made significant contributions to the Space sector..."

Meanwhile, the Indian Space Research Orga nization (ISRO) on Wednesday said that it is all set to initiate the Automatic Landing Sequence (ALS) ahead of the attempted landing of the country's lunar mission.

A post on ISRO's offi-

cial handle on X, formerly Twitter, read, "All set to initiate the Automatic Landing Sequence (ALS). Awaiting the arrival of the Lander Module (LM) at the designated point, around 17:44 Hrs. IST. Upon receiving the ALS command, the LM activates the throttleable engines for powered descent."

The attempted soft landing of Chandrayaan-3 on the moon's south pole has been scheduled for around 18:04 IST, with the



powered descent of the Vikram lander expected at 1745 IST.

The live telecast of the landing operations at Mission Operation Complex (MOX) will begin at 1720 IST. Live broadcast of the landing will be available on the ISRO website, its YouTube channel, Facebook, and public broad-

caster DD National TV from 17:27 IST on Aug 23, 2023.

This mission, if it turns out to be fruitful, will make India the only country to have marked its presence on the lunar south pole which is considered to be difficult for its rough and harsh conditions, and fourth - after US, China, and

Russia - to have successfully landed on the moon's surface.

The spacecraft was launched from the Satish Dhawan Space Centre in Andhra Pradesh's Sriharikota on July 14. A GSLV Mark 3 (LVM 3) heavy-lift launch vehicle was used for the launch of the spacecraft that was placed in the lunar orbit on August 5 and since then it has been through a series of orbital manoeuvres been lowered closer to the moon's surface.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who is in South Africa to attend the 15th BRICS Summit, will virtually witness the historic landing attempt on the lunar surface as part of the country's third lunar mission — Chandrayaan-3.

Pindar river in spate following heavy rain in Uttarakhand's Chamoli; Tharali town faces threat of flood



GOPESHWAR, Aug 23 (Agencies): The water levels of the Pindar river and its tributary Pranmati in Uttarakhand 's Chamoli district rose again on Wednesday following heavy rain, threatening to flood places located along their banks.

Both Pindar and Pranmati are in spate once again, following which a flood-like situation has arisen in Tharali town located on the banks of

Pindar, Additional Information Officer Ravindra Negi said.

Intermittent heavy rain has been lashing areas close to the banks of the Pindar and the Pranmati since August 13, he said.

Landslides also continue to block several roads in the hill district.

The Badrinath National Highway is blocked due to landslide debris at Chhinka and Maithana near Chamoli. The road

Schools in Dasholi and Nandnagar blocks of the district have been closed in view of heavy rains.

2 workers killed, 1 injured in explosion at Noida factory

NOIDA, Aug 23 (Agencies): Two workers died and another suffered injuries after a pressure pipe exploded at a spare parts-manufacturing company in Noida, police officials said on Wednesday.

The incident took place on Tuesday inside the factory of United Drilling Tools private limited located in Sector 81, under Phase 2 police station area, they said.

"Three workers suffered injuries and were taken to a hospital where two were declared dead by doctors while the third is undergoing treatment," a police spokesperson said.

Those killed in the explosion have been identified as Manoj Kumar Singh, 45, and Ishwar Dutt Sharma, 60, while the injured worker is Rajveer Singh, 45, the

The bodies were sent for post-mortem and other legal proceedings were being carried out in the case, the police said.

Sachin Tendulkar is Election Commission's national icon; to encourage greater voter participation ity to exercise our votina rights.

NEW DELHI, Aug 23 (Agencies): As the Election Commission battles urban and youth apathy towards voting, cricketing legend Sachin Tendulkar was on Wednesday appointed a "national icon" of the poll panel to encourage greater voter participation in elections.

Tendulkar was made the national icon as the EC gears up to hold assembly polls in five states sometime in October-November and Lok Sabha election in 2024.

A memorandum of understanding was signed between Tendulkar and the poll panel. As part of the three-year



agreement, the cricketer will spread voter awareness. Addressing the gathering,

Tendulkar said India is the biggest democracy in the world and it is our prime responsibil-

He reminded the gathering that he had said that in his second innings, he would continue to bat for India.

Election Commissioner Anup Chandra Pandey said the "pitch" on which EC plays to encourage voters to come out and exercise their franchise is "tough". But he expressed confidence that Tendulkar would come out with flying colours.

Election Commissioner Arun Goel said the voter turnout was the maximum at 67 per cent in the 2019 Lok Sabha polls. He said more needs to be achieved in enhancing

voter turnout.

He said in spite of extending the best of facilities at polling stations for voters, some pockets had seen poor voter turnout. The poll panel has recognised urban and youth apathy as one of the prime reasons for poor voter turnout in certain cities.

Last year, the Commission had recognised actor Pankaj Tripathi as a national icon. Earlier, during the 2019 Lok Sabha election, stalwarts such as MS Dhoni, Aamir Khan and Mary Kom had been the EC's national icons.

18 bodies found in Greece as firefighters battle wind-driven wildfires across the country

The discovery near city of Alexandroupolis comes as hundreds of firefighters battle dozens of wildfires across the country amid gale-force winds

ALEXANDROUPOLIS, Aug 23 (Agencies): Firefighters found the burnt bodies of 18 people believed to have been migrants who had crossed the Turkish border into an area of northeastern Greece where wildfires have raged for days.

The discovery near the city of Alexandroupolis came as hundreds of firefighters battled dozens of wildfires across the country amid gale-force winds. Two people died and two firefighters were injured in separate fires in northern and central Greece.

With their hot, dry summers, southern European countries are particularly prone to wildfires. Another major blaze has been burning across Tenerife in Spain's Canary Islands for a week, although no injuries or damage to homes was reported.

European Union officials have blamed climate change for the increasing frequency and intensity of wildfires in Europe, noting that 2022 was the second-worst year for wildfire damage on record after 2017.

In Greece, police activated the country's Disaster Victim Identification Team to identify the 18 bodies, which were found near a shack in the Avantas area, fire department spokesman Ioannis Artopios said.

"Given that there have been no reports of a missing person or missing residents from the surrounding areas, the possibility is being investigated that these are people who had entered the country illegally," Artopios said.

Alexandroupolis is near the border with Turkey, along a route often taken by people fleeing poverty and conflict in the Middle East, Asia and Africa and seeking to enter the European

Greek President Katerina Sakellaropoulou expressed sorrow at the deaths in a state-

"We must urgently take effective initiatives to ensure that this bleak reality does not become the new normality," she added, referring to the recurrent wild-

Avantas, like many nearby villages and settlements, had been under evacuation orders, with push alerts in Greek and English sent to all mobile phones in the region.



The fire service said it was investigating the causes of the blazes, in coordination with the police and secret service. In recent days, several people have been arrested or fined for accidentally starting fires.

But the discovery of the 18 bodies triggered a backlash by some who accused migrants of starting fires.

Late Monday, police said they detained three men in Alexandroupolis suspected of kidnapping and illegally holding 13 migrants. One of the suspects was a man seen in video posted on social media shutting a group of migrants in a trailer and accusing them of "intending to burn us," a statement from national police headquarters

Government spokesman Pavlos Marinakis issued a statement condemning vigilante acts. Overnight, a massive wall

of flames raced through forests toward Alexandroupolis, prompting authorities to evacuate eight more villages and the city's hospital as flames reddened the sky.

Deputy Health Minister Dimitris Vartzopoulos, speaking on Greece's Skai television, said smoke and ash in the air around the hospital were the main reasons behind the decision to evacuate the facility.

The coast guard said patrol boats and private vessels evacuated an additional 40 people by sea from beaches near Alexandroupolis.

In the northeastern Evros border region, a fire was burning through forest in a protected national park, with satellite imagery showing smoke blanketing much of northern and western Greece.

New fires broke out in several parts of the country on Tuesday, including in woodland northwest

of Athens and an industrial area

on the capital's western fringes. Small explosions echoed from the industrial area of Aspropyrgos as flames reached warehouses and factories. Authorities shut down a highway and ordered the evacuation of nearby settlements

With firefighting forces stretched to the limit, Greece appealed for help from the European Union's civil protection mechanism.

Five water-dropping planes from Croatia, Germany and Sweden, and a helicopter, 58 firefighters and nine water tanks from the Czech Republic flew to Greece Tuesday, while 56 Romanian firefighters and two aircraft from Cyprus arrived Monday. French firefighters helped tackle a blaze on the island of Evia on Monday.

"We are mobilizing actually almost one-third of the aircraft we have in the rescEU fleet," said EU spokesman Balazs Uivari.

The fire risk level for several regions, including the wider Athens area, was listed as "extreme" for a second day Tuesday. Authorities banned public access to mountains and forests in those regions until at least Wednesday morning and ordered military patrols.

In Spain, firefighters battled to control a wildfire burning for a week on the popular Canary Islands tourist destination of Tenerife. It is estimated that the blaze, which has scorched 150 square kilometers (59 square miles), has already burnt a third of Tenerife's woodlands.

More than 12,000 people were

evacuated during the past week. Authorities said Tuesday that 1,500 have been able to return to their homes. Authorities have described the fire as the worst in decades on the Atlantic archi-

Large parts of Spain were under alert for wildfires as temperatures exceeded 38 degrees Celsius (100 degrees Fahrenheit). While Spain's south often has extremely high temperatures, the country's weather agency issued an alert for the northern Basque Country, where temperatures were forecast to reach 42 degrees Celsius (107 degrees Fahrenheit) Wednesday.

Greece's deadliest wildfire killed 104 people in 2018, at a seaside resort near Athens that residents had not been warned to evacuate. Authorities have since erred on the side of caution, issuing swift mass evacuation orders whenever inhabited areas are threatened.

Last month, a wildfire on the island of Rhodes forced the evacuation of some 20,000 tourists. Days later, two air force pilots were killed when their water-dropping plane crashed while diving low to tackle a blaze on Evia.

In Italy, authorities evacuated 700 people from homes and a campsite on the Tuscan island of Elba after a fire broke out late Monday, while in Turkey authorities evacuated nine villages in the northwestern Canakkale province. Turkish media also said that authorities reduced maritime traffic in the Dardanelles Strait in case firefighting vessels need to be deployed to

According to the Italian Society of Environmental Geology, more than 1,100 fires in Europe this summer have consumed 2,842 square kilometers (about 1,100 square miles), well above an average of 724 fires a year recorded from 2006-2022. The fires have removed wooded areas capable of absorbing 2.5 million tons of carbon dioxide a vear.

"When we add the fires in Canada, the United States, Africa, Asia and Australia to those in Europe, it seems that the situation is getting worse every year,? said SIGEA president Antonello Fiore.

Sri Lanka 'processing' China's request for research ship docking that may raise security concerns in India



COLOMBO, Aug 23 (Agencies): Sri Lanka is currently processing a request by China to allow a research ship to dock in the country, a Foreign Ministry spokesperson said on Wednesday, a year after a visit by a Chinese spy vessel to the Island nation raised security concerns in

"The Chinese embassy here has made an application and the ministry is currently looking at it," Priyanga Wickramasingha, the foreign ministry spokesperson, told agency. No dates have been fixed yet for the visit, she said.

The Chinese despatch their vessels to Sri Lanka on a regular basis. Two weeks ago, the Chinese People's Liberation Army Navy warship HAI YANG 24 HAO arrived in the country on a two-day visit.

It was reported that the arrival of the 129-metrelong ship was delayed due to concerns raised by India.

In August last year, a similar visit by the Chinese ballistic missile and satellite tracking ship, 'Yuan Wang 5', which arrived in the southern Sri Lankan port of Hambantota elicited strong reactions from India.

There were apprehensions in New Delhi about the possibility of the vessel's tracking systems attempting to snoop on Indian defence installations while being on its way to the Sri Lankan port.

However, after a considerable delay, Sri Lanka allowed the ship to dock at the strategic southern port of Hambantota, being built by a Chinese company.

Cash-strapped Sri Lanka considers both India and China equally important partners in its task to restructure its external debt. China is one of the top lenders to Sri Lanka.

Sri Lanka owes USD 7.1 billion to bilateral creditors, including USD 3 billion to China.

The negotiations for Sri Lanka's external and domestic debt restructuring must be concluded by September, the time for the International Monetary Fund's review of its USD 2.9 billion bailout extended in March this year.

The island nation was hit by an unprecedented financial crisis in 2022, the worst since its independence from Britain in 1948, due to a severe paucity of foreign exchange reserves.

8 killed, 15 injured in bus accident in Nepal

KATHMANDU, Aug 23 (Agencies): A passenger bus skidded off the main highway and plunged into a swollen river in Nepal's Bagmati province on Wednesday, killing at least eight people and leaving at least 15 others injured, according to a media report.

The accident happened when the bus en route to the scenic city of Pokhara from Kathmandu veered off and fell into the Trishuli River at Chalise in the province's Dhading district, myRepublica. com reported.

"In the accident, at least eight people have been killed and 15 more injured. The number of those killed might go up. Rescue is ongoing," Deputy Superintendent of Police Santulal Prasad Jaiswar at the District Police Office, Dhading, was quoted as saying in the report.

He said that the bus was partly submerged in the Trishuli River after the accident, but rescuers were able to pull out many of the passengers alive from the wreckage.

The river had been swollen by continuous rainfall during the monsoon

KYIV, Aug 23 (Agencies): A Russian drone attack hit grain infrastructure in Ukraine's southern Odesa region on Wednesday, the local governor said, the latest strike since the collapse of a deal allowing safe shipments from the Black Sea. "There are hits on production and transshipment complexes... Granaries were among the damaged objects," Oleg Kiper wrote on Telegram, adding there were no civilian casualties.

Air defence forces had destroyed nine Iranian-made Shahed attack drones during the strike, Ukraine's southern military command said in a statement. "The enemy targeted granaries and a production and transshipment complex

in the Danube," it said. "A fire broke out in the warehouse, the fire was promptly contained. Firefighters continue their work." Since exiting the United Nations-brokered deal Moscow has pounded Ukraine's southern Odesa and Mykolaiv regions that are home to ports and infrastructure vital for shipment of grain. Last week the first civilian cargo ship sailing through the Black Sea from Ukraine arrived in Istanbul in defiance of the Russian blockade.

"I think the last mission failed because something went wrong. This time, I am sure we have overcome those difficulties and soon Chandrayaan-3 will be on the moon. We are looking forward to space travel soon by an Indian rocket to the moon and also Mars in the future," Farooq Abdullah said.

Excited students in Jammu and Kashmir were seen cheering for the successful landing of Chandrayaan-3's lunar module on the moon's surface, calling it a proud moment for the country.

"In sha Allah it will land successfully on the moon's surface. We hope and we cheer for its successful landing," Rather Abid Ashraf, a student of Class 12 at the Government Boys Higher Secondary School, Jawahar Nagar, here, said.

Ashraf said it is not only about ISRO's mission, but it is also about showcasing how India is rising. "I want to applaud the ISRO team which has worked hard to achieve this tremendous feat. This is the first ever mission launched by any space agency all over the world which will land on the moon's south pole and will do in-situ experiments there," he said.

Cash-strapped Vodafone Idea to pay dues of Rs 2,400 crore to govt by September

NEW DELHI, Aug 23 (Agencies): Telecom service provider Vodafone Idea is planning to pay dues of Rs 2,400 to the government by September 2023, according to a report. The telco recently cleared pending dues of licence fees and spectrum usage charges of about Rs 450 crore for the March quarter of 2022-23.

Last week, the telco informed in an exchange filing that one of its promoters is ready to infuse Rs 2,000 crore in the event of any fund requirement for meeting its impending payment obligation to the Department of Telecommunication (DoT).

The company also announced that DoT requested to defer its annual 5G spectrum purchased

instalment by a month, and it was ready to pay the interest on the amount. The telco, in a letter to the government, proposed to pay an instalment of Rs 1,680 crore, which was due on August 17 2023

According to the report, the company has sought 30 days

to clear the spectrum payment, and the company is also gearing up to clear the licence fee payment by September. The late payment of the spectrum instalment will attract a 15 per cent interest rate on an annual

The company will have to pay

nearly Rs 1,700 crore for spectrum instalments and about Rs 710 crore for licence fee dues with interest. The total amount pending to be cleared by September is over Rs 2,400 crore. In its earnings report for April to June 2023, the company posted a loss of Rs 7,840 crore. However, its average revenue per user (ARPU) increased by 3 per cent sequentially to Rs 139.

The company stated that its 4G customer base grew from 122.6 million to 122.9 million compared to the previous quarter. During this quarter, the company lost 4.5 million mobile subscribers, bringing its user base to 221.4 million as of June 2023.

Centre says India's coal stock 'sufficient' to meet power demand



NEW DELHI, Aug 23 (Agencies): As the power demand touched a new high in August due to faulty monsoon, coal minister Pralhad Joshi assured that there is sufficient stock of coal in the country. The minister, in a tweet, said nearly 80 million tonnes (MT) of coal is available with thermal power plants and Coal India Limited.

"In view of the surge in power demand across the country, took stock of coal production and offtake in a meeting with senior officials of the coal ministry. The country has sufficient coal stock, almost 80 MT coal is available with thermal power plants and Coal India," tweeted the minister on Tuesday.

During the meeting, the minister also deliberated on boosting coal transportation via the rail-sea-rail route.

According to the Grid Controller of India, the maximum power demand met on August 21, 2023, is 205981 MW and the peak shortage was 9109 MW.

However, the maximum demand met on August 17 was 234 GW, the highest ever on record. In May 2023, the maximum demand was met at 221.7 GW.

The reason for the jump in power demand in August is sultry weather and the requirement for irrigation as some parts received less rainfall. According to government data, coal stocks at power plants declined to 32 million tonnes from 34.9 million tonnes in the first 20 days of August.

Maruti Suzuki's Baleno, Brezza, Grand Vitara to undergo crash tests



NEW DELHI, Aug 23 (Agencies): As the government introduced the much-awaited Bharat New Car Assessment Programme (Bharat NCAP), India's largest carmaker Maruti Suzuki said it will initially provide Baleno, Brezza and Grand Vitara models for crash tests.

"Any car that is launched in India follows the mandatory safety standards set by the government and is therefore safe. For consumers seeking extra safety or manufacturers offering extra safety features, the Bharat NCAP system is an authentic and objective rating system to empower the customer to make an informed choice," said Rahul Bharti, executive officer, corporate affairs, Maruti Suzuki India.

It will be important to see how much MSIL scores in the Bharat NCAP as the company models have scored low ratings in the Global NCAP tests. One of MSIL's selling cars, WagonR, had scored 1 star (out of five stars) while other models such as AltoK10, Swift and S-Presso have ratings of 2 and 3 stars. Besides MSIL cars, Hyundai Motor India (HMIL) models have also received underwhelming safety ratings in the Global NCAP with most models scoring two and three stars.

"We welcome the Bharat NCAP safety initiative by the government of India and believe this effort will raise safety standards, empower consumers with vital information, and make Indian roads safer for all," said Unsoo Kim, Managing Director and CEO, of Hyundai Motor India. The Korean carmaker will supply three models initially for crash tests.

Mahindra & Mahindra and Tata Motors, the two homegrown companies that have received high ratings in Global NCAP, welcomed the new initiative but did not say which models will be sent for the new tests. Tata Motors' Nexon and Punch, and Mahindra's XUV300, Scorpio-N and XUV700 have a five-star Global NCAP safety rating. Mahindra's popular Thar has received four stars. Bharat NCAP has already received requests to test 30 models from automakers ahead of its launch on October 1st, 2023z.

High levels of exposure to Covid virus may reduce protection from vaccination, prior infection: Study

The findings were published recently in the journal Nature Communications

NEW DELHI, Aug 23 (Agencies): High levels of exposure to the SARS-CoV-2 virus may reduce or overcome the protection that Covid-19 vaccination and prior infection provides, according to a study conducted in the US.

The findings, pub-

The findings, published recently in the journal Nature Communications, suggest that in densely crowded settings, control measures that reduce levels of exposure to the virus -- such as masking,

improved ventilation, and distancing -- may afford additional benefit in preventing new infections among people who have been vaccinated or previously infected.

The study was performed to understand whether the immunity gained after vaccination or a prior infection was less effective or "leaky" in situations where people are exposed to high levels of the virus.

"It's really hard to find a population, such as the residents of the Con-



necticut Department of Correction, where we know the type of exposure somebody has and we know their vaccination and prior infection status," said Margaret Lind, lead author of the research paper, and an associate research scientist at Yale University, US.

The researchers tracked infections among 15,444 residents of Connecticut correctional facilities between June 2021 and May 2022, when the state experienced two epidemic waves due to the emergence of the Covid-19 Delta and Omicron variants.

They also determined which people had resid-

ed with a Covid-19-positive cellmate and, as a result, had high exposure to the Covid-19 virus.


The study found that during the Delta and Omicron epidemic waves, immunity acquired after a vaccination, prior infection, and both vaccination and infection (hybrid immunity) was weaker when residents were residing with an infected

New study identifies gene 'fingerprint' for brain ageing, sheds light on memory decline

NEW DELHI, Aug 23 (Agencies): A new study offers insight into the cognitive decline of normal ageing, shedding light on how ageing contributes to neurodegenerative conditions such as Alzheimer's and Parkinson's diseases. Most of us who have reached their middle age must have experienced a slowing memory and cognition. Until now, scientists did not have a clear picture of the molecular changes that take place in the brain to cause it.

Now, a study on mice has determined that the most pronounced changes occur in the white matter, a type of nervous system tissue that is integral to transmitting signals across the brain.

The study that identified a gene "fingerprint" for brain ageing also examined two treatments — caloric restric-



tion and infusions of plasma from young mice — that affect certain regions of the brain, with the plasma appearing to slow the age-related memory

In many neurodegenerative diseases, certain areas of the brain are more vulnerable to damage, but there was a lack of clarity on the exact reason.

"I saw this study as a way to explain that somewhat mysterious regional vulnerability," said Tony Wyss-Coray, PhD, a neurology professor who led the study that examined gene expression in different regions of the mouse brain as it matures.

This study by Stanford scientists was published on August 16 in Cell journal.

The research team sampled 15 regions in both hemispheres of the brains of 59 female and male mice aged 3 to 27 months. They identified and ranked the top genes expressed by cells found in each region of the brain and identified 82 genes that are found frequently and vary in concentration in 10 or more regions.

The team used these genes to develop a common ageing score, assessing how gene activity in different regions of the brain change with age.

The researchers found that white matter, which is found

deep in the brain and contains nerve fibres protected by white-coloured myelin, showed the earliest and most pronounced changes in gene expression for mice 12 and 18 months old. According to Wyss-Coray, these mice are about as old, in mouse years, as a person in their 50s.

Past work has shown that ageing disrupts an otherwise stable gene expression pattern in the brain, turning on genes that regulate inflammation and the immune response, and turning off genes responsible for protein and collagen synthesis. The inflammation and immune response affect the integrity of the myelin sheath, the insulation layer around nerves responsible for transmitting signals across the brain

"White matter has been a rather neglected area in

ageing research, which usually focuses on the neurondense regions like the cortex or hippocampus," Hahn said. "The fact that white matter is emerging in our data as an area of particular vulnerability to ageing opens up new and intriguing hypotheses." Interventions to slow the genetic shift that leads to the decline in specific regions of the brain could be beneficial in addressing neurodegenerative disease as well as the general decline associated with ageing.

During the study, the team explored two interventions — caloric restriction and injections of plasma from young mice — to evaluate whether they protected against the region-specific shifts in gene expression. Each intervention began when the mice were 19 months old and lasted four weeks.

HARARE, Aug 23 (Agencies): Former Zimbabwean cricketer Henry Olonga has put to rest the speculations surrounding the supposed demise of fellow cricketing legend Heath Streak. Hours after tweeting about Streak's death, Olonga shared that Streak is indeed alive and well, contradicting his earlier tweet.

In an attempt to clear the air and dispel any false information, Olonga took to Twitter to share the update. He stated, "I can confirm that rumours of the demise of Heath Streak have been greatly exaggerated. I just heard from him. The third umpire has called him back. He is very much alive folks."

"Sad news coming through that Heath Streak has crossed to the other side. RIP Zimbabwe cricket legend," Olonga had earlier posted on messaging platform X. formerly known as Twitter.

Alongside this reassuring message, Olonga also shared a screenshot of his recent conversation with Streak on WhatsApp. It is imperative to note that these conflicting reports may have caused confusion and concern among cricket enthusiasts.

The news of Streak's apparent death had spread rapidly, causing distress among fans and fellow cricketers alike. Nonetheless, with Olonga's update, the cloud of uncertainty surrounding Streak's well-being has been lifted.

Streak was one of Zimbabwe's most recognised players, appearing in 65 Tests and 189 ODIs, accumulating 4933 runs and collecting 455 wickets across all forms.

Streak is the first Zimbabwean player to have scored 1000 runs and taken 100 wickets in Tests, as well as 2000 runs and 2000 wickets in ODIs.

Streak's family had already stated that the legendary cricketer was battling illness and receiving treatment.

"Heath has cancer and is undergoing treatment under one of the most respected oncologists in South Africa," his family said in a statement at the time.

"He remains in good spirits and will continue to fight this disease in a similar vein to that which his opponents faced during his revered days on the cricket field."

World Athletics Championships: Disappointment for India as Jyothi Yarraji fails to qualify for 100m hurdles semis

BUDAPEST, Aug 23 (Agencies): National record holder 100m hurdler Jyothi Yarraji failed to qualify for the semifinals of the World Athletics Championships as she finished seventh in her heat in yet another disappointing performance for India here.

The 23-year-old Yarraji clocked 13.05 seconds-well below her national record of 12.78s—to finish seventh in heat number four and 29th overall.

The first four finishers in each of the five heats and the four other fastest athletes (24 in total) qualified for the

The last semifinals qualifier clocked

Tokyo Olympics silver medallist Kendra Harrison of USA led the semifinal qualifiers with world season leading time of 12.24 seconds.

Krishan Kumar also failed to make it to the men's 800m semifinals after finishing seventh in his heat with a time of one minute 50.36 seconds. He has a personal best of 1:45.88

The first three finishers in each of the seven heats and the three other fastest athletes (24 in total) qualified for the men's 800, semifinals.

Reigning Asian champion Yarraji was expected to at least qualify for the semifinals, but she failed to live up to the expectations in her first World Cham-

She had become the first Indian to



win gold in women's 100m hurdles in the Asian Championships last month. Indian athletes have disappointed so

far in the world championships here. On the opening day, national record holder 3000m steeplechaser Avinash Sable failed to qualify for the final round after finishing a disappointing seventh

in his heat race. Three Indians brought up the rear in the men's 20km race walk final while young Shaili Singh also failed to make it to the women's long jump final.

Ajay Kumar Saroj ran his personal best of three minutes 38.24 seconds in men's 1500m heats but that was not enough to qualify for the semifinals, while none of the three Indians in the men's triple jump—Praveen Chithravel, Eldhose Paul and Abdulla Aboobacker-made it to the final round.

Santhosh Kumar Tamilarasan and Sarvesh Anil Kushare had crashed out in the 400m hurdles heat race and high jump qualification round respectively.


Bajrang, Deepak Punia to skip World **Championships trials after Sports Ministry** clears foreign training proposal

NEW DELHI, Aug 23 (Agencies): The Sports Ministry's Mission Olympic Cell (MOC) has cleared wrestlers Bajrang Punia and Deeepak Punia's proposals to miss the World Championships trials and train abroad till the Asian Games, after receiving desired fitness certificates from the two athletes

The Sports Authority of India (SAI) wanted Olympic-medallist wrestler Bairang to attend the trials for the World Championships or provide fitness certificate, if he wants exemption from this week's exercise in Patiala.

Bajrang wanted to skip the trials for the World Championships on August 25 and 26 and train at a foreign location to prepare for the Asian Games in Hangzhou beginning September

Bajrang, one of the six wrestlers to sit in protest at the Jantar Mantar against outgoing WFI chief Brij Bhushan



Sharan Singh, and Commonwealth Games goldmedal winner Deepak Punia (86kg), are not keen to compete in the World Championships in Belgrade from September 16, and instead want to undergo long training stints to prepare of the Asian Games.

"On 18th August Bajrang's proposal to train in Kyrgyzstan from 21st August to 28th September (39 days) along with coach, strength & conditioning expert,

"Meanwhile, Deepak has also submitted his response and medical certificate on August 22nd. As the two have submitted the requisite documents, SAI has now requested the athletes to provide the dates for their travel. The tickets for the same will be booked on the first available flight as soon as their response is received.'

While Bajrang has sent a proposal to train

in Issyk-Kul, Kyrgyzstan (August 21-September 28), Deepak, on the other hand, wants to train in Khasavyurt (Russia) for five weeks (August 23 to September 28) to prepare for the Asian Games.

The World Championships is the first qualification tournament for the 2024 Paris Olympic Games and SAI is unhappy that two of the country's top wrestlers want to skip the trials and the showpiece event.

While Bajrang, the

65kg grappler, who won the 2020 Tokyo Olympics bronze, has also demanded physiotherapist Anuj Gupta, personal coach Sujeet Maan, strength and conditioning expert Kaazi Kiron Mustafa Hasan and sparring partner Jitender Kinha to accompany him, Deepak has requested the services of coach Kamal Malikov and physiotherapist Shubham Gupta for the training stints.

Cricket South Africa Announces Equal Match Fees Across Genders

CAPE TOWN, Aug 23 (Agencies): South Africa became the latest country to provide equal pay across genders after they announced all their cricketers would receive the same match fees for international matches according to the ICC. The Proteas join New Zealand and India as countries that have announced pay parity across the genders. This decision comes on the back of the landmark announcement from the ICC earlier this year that saw equal prize money for men's and women's teams at ICC events

The latest news from South Africa comes on the back of a highly successful 18 months for the SA national women's team, which saw them reach the semifinals of the ICC Women's Cricket World Cup in New Zealand in 2022 and then make it all the

way through to the final of the ICC Women's T20 World Cup earlier this year.

This was the first time in the history of SA cricket a senior team had reached the final of a World Cup.

Leading figures from cricket across the country gathered in Tshwane on Tuesday to announce an updated structure to their domestic women's competition and equal pay for both male and female players at the international level.

Teams in South Africa's domestic competition will now be allowed to contract up to 11 players - five more than the previous and will also be able to add more full-time coaches and support staff to their set-up.

Cricket South Africa CEO Pholetsi Moseki said the changes announced were an important stepping stone to build on the legacy provided from hosting the T20 World Cup earlier this year and will help further grow women's cricket in the country.

"We are thrilled to unveil the Professional Women's Cricket League, an initiative that celebrates the remarkable achievements of our national women's cricket team and paves the way for an even brighter future," Moseki said as quoted by ICC.

"The professionalisation of the women's domestic structure aims to elevate the women's cricketing landscape by providing a platform for local talent to shine, fostering a culture of sporting excellence, while inspiring the next generation of players. With the success of South African cricket on the global stage, we believe that this will be a steppingstone for local talent, creating an environment

that fosters growth, resilience, and a deep love for the sport," Moseki added.

"Professionalising the women's domestic structure has been met with enthusiasm from fans, players, and sponsors alike. We call on brands to continue showing their support for women's cricket, recognising the league's potential to redefine the narrative around women in sports in the country," Moseki signed off.

The changes to match fees for South Africa's women's cricketers will begin next month when they travel to Pakistan for a sixmatch white-ball tour against the Asian side.

South Africa will play three T20Is in Karachi from September 1 and then a further three 50-over contests in the same city from September 8.
