Rajnath Singh inaugurates 90

infra projects in Jammu SAMBA/JAMMU, Sep 12 ed under challenging weather

(Agencies): Defence Minister Rainath Singh on Tuesday inaugurated 90 infrastructure projects of the Border Roads Organisation, completed at a cost of Rs 2,941 crore, in Samba district of Jammu and Kashmir.

Singh, accompanied by Minister of State in the Prime Minister's office Jitendra Singh, was received at the Jammu airport by Lt Governor Manoj Sinha and senior Army and Indian Air Force (IAF) officers.

Singh inaugurated the stateof-the-art 422.9 metre Devak bridge on the Bishnah-Kaulpur-Phulpur Road in Samba district besides 89 other projects virtu-

The Devak bridge is of strate-



gic importance to the defence forces and will facilitate speedy induction of troops, heavy equipment and mechanised vehicles to forward areas and will also boost the socio-economic development of the region, a spokesperson of the BRO said.

The BRO projects include 22 roads, 63 bridges, one tunnel, two airstrips and two helipads across 10 border states and Union Territories of northern and northeastern regions constructconditions, at most inhospitable terrain locations, he said. Of the 89 projects inaugurated

virtually, 36 are in Arunachal Pradesh, 25 in Ladakh, 11 are in Jammu and Kashmir, five in Mizoram, three in Himachal Pradesh, two each in Sikkim, Uttarakhand and West Bengal and one each in Nagaland, Rajasthan and Andaman and Nicobar Islands, the official said.

The BRO completed the critically strategic projects in record time and several of them were constructed in a single working season using state-of-the-art technology, the spokesperson

2 years imprisonment in Cheque bounce case, defaulter to pay Rs 16 lakh to the complainant

SRINAGAR, Sep 12 (Agencies): A Court in Jammu and Kashmir's Baramulla district has sentenced a man to undergo two years' imprisonment in a cheque bounce case and directed the convict to pay Rs 16 lakh compensation to the complainant.

The compensation amount is double the accused had borrowed in 2015 from Abdul Lateef Khan of Boniyaar Baramulla. The court said the complain-

ant during the course of trial has proved that the accused identified as Ameer Khan presently a resident of Sheeri Baramulla has borrowed money.

In the judgmenet, the Sub-Judge Baramulla Iqbal Ahmed Akhoon said the accused had issued the cheques which were

returned unpaid due to insufficiency of funds in the account.

"The complainant has proved his case and the accused is found to be guilty of commission of offence punishable under section N.I. Act and is convicted to undergo simple imprisonment of two years besides that he shall pay double the cheque amount i.e, Rs. 16,00,000. The

fine amount of Rs 16,00,000 imposed on shall be paid to complainant," the order read

A complaint was lodged before the Court on December 21, 2015 on the grounds that the accused Ameer Khan approached the complainant and borrowed Rs 5,28,000 to invest in a business and thereafter he would repay the said amount in two

seven-year RI in culpable homicide case

SRINAGAR, Sep 12(Agencies): A court in Jammu and Kashmir's Kulgam district has sentenced three people to seven years' rigorous imprisonment in a culpable homicide case.

Additional Sessions Judge, Kulgam, Parvaiz Iqbal also imposed a fine of Rs one lakh each on the convicts, Mohammad Amin Bhat, Rauf Ahmed Bhat and Younis Ahmed Bhat.

If they fail to deposit the fine amount, they shall undergo rigorous imprisonment for a further period of six months, the judge said in his order. However, he said, the period of detention already undergone by the accused during the period of trial would be taken into consideration. The three were involved in an altercation with the victim

Kulgam district on September 9, 2016 which led to the latter's death at a hospital in Srinagar.

The judge convicted the three for culpable homicide while noting that the accused did not have any previous enmity with the deceased.





What will special session take up? No one knows, not even the Cabinet...

report was pub-Alished on Saturday, September 9, with the headline "Joint sitting of both Houses to bid farewell to old Parliament building?" The question mark is normal, because few know what the agenda of the special session is. The report reads: "Just ahead of the five-day special session, there is considerable speculation over whether a joint meeting of the two Houses will be convened on September 19 in the iconic Central Hall to say goodbye to the existing Parliament building."

Why would one need five days to say goodbye to a building? And why is there the need for "considerable speculation" in a democracy when laws and changes should be discussed openly and transparently? On this, the report did not offer any enlightenment to readers.

When this special session was first announced on August 31, there began a guessing game on why it was being called so shortly after one session had just ended on August 11. The Winter Session will begin in November, so it is not as if there is no other time for Parliament to meet. Why again this month?

Some said it was to change the name of the country from India to Bharat. Two days of media focus went into that. Ministers defended the move, saying that there was nothing

wrong with it, but were unable to confirm whether or not this change in the nation's name was what the session was for. Another guess was that it had to do with the passing of the Women's Reservation Bill. This was originally passed by the Rajya Sabha in 2008, but since then it has stalled because of a lack of support and demands of sub-reservations within this category for marginalised sections. If this is on the agenda and it goes through, it will set aside onethird of all seats in the Lok Sabha and state Assemblies for women. This is a considerable reform, and if it is indeed this law that is being taken up, one hopes that it passes. But of course, one doesn't know.

Another guess in the media was that the government, for whatever reason, was calling the general election early. They Lok Sabha polls are due in April-May next year, meaning in another seveneight months, but they might be advanced just as the Atal Behari Vajpayee government had done in 2004. This theory has not found many takers, but again, who knows? Vajpayee's gambit to call elections early did not succeed and the government fell, so there will likely be caution on this front.

The most fervent speculation was around something called "one nation, one election", a system whereby all states and the Centre will go into elections every five years together and citizens will vote

for the Assembly and the Lok Sabha at the same time. Will corporation elections also be included? One doesn't know.

What about by elections? And how will the EVMs be set up for multiple elections? One does not know that either, but perhaps wiser minds have already sorted all such things out. A committee has been set up under a former President to look into the idea, but how this committee will meet and give its findings all in time for the special session is unclear.

One more story floated in the media was that the session was about a commission set up in 2017 to look at subcategorisation of OBCs so that reservations could be made more equitable.

The parliamentary form of government carries with it something called collective responsibility, meaning that decisions are jointly owned. But here the Union Cabinet is as much in the dark about decisions as the rest of us are. Two instances from the past will suffice to demonstrate this.

The first was a report from November 10, 2016, head-lined: "Don't bring your phones: Modi's Cabinet meet that took everyone by surprise". The report said Union ministers found out about demonetisation the same day as the rest of us, meaning that it was neither discussed nor debated. Another instance is the BBC's filing of over 240 Right to Information queries

with the government about the national lockdown of 2020. It asked the Union government's departments of health, finance, disaster management and the rest about what they knew regarding the lockdown and how they prepared. The answer was that they did not know and did not prepare.

This form of government, where secrets and major decisions are kept from the Cabinet itself, appears to be continuing, which is why the speculation around this special session. There will be no Question Hour either in this session, and while this is expected, it is not necessary. Even questions asked are not answered in the Lok Sabha, so what is the point of stopping them from being asked?

The Opposition has sent a list of things they would like discussed in the session. These include inflation, joblessness, MSP for farmers, the continuing violence in Manipur, the Adani scandal, communal tensions across India, the Chinese actions in Ladakh and elsewhere, the need for a caste census (or any census, given that the primary one has been inexplicably delayed), the strains on federalism and impact of natural disasters and climate change. It is unlikely that, assuming these are not already on the agenda, they will be taken up by the government.

When even the Cabinet itself has such little say in what should be discussed and passed, why should the Opposition be listened to?

The PLA's weaknesses are now evident on all fronts

fter a four-month gap, the 19th round of talks between the Indian and Chinese generals at the corps commander level was held at the usual Chushul-Moldo border meeting point. Interestingly, for the first time, it was spread over two days (August 13 and 14). Though no breakthrough was made for the Depsang and Demchok sectors, the contentious issues were discussed in some depth.

A joint press statement (which was an achievement in itself) said: "The two sides had a positive, constructive and in-depth discussion on the resolution of the remaining issues along the Line of Actual Control in the western sector. In line with the guidance provided by the leadership, they exchanged views in an open and forward-looking manner."

As usual, it was agreed to resolve "the remaining issues in an expeditious manner and maintain the momentum of dialogue and negotiations through military and diplomatic channels".

The last sentence does not, however, mean that a solution is forthcoming soon, as the formula has been used in most of the statements.

In the meantime, it is interesting to analyse the present state of preparedness of the People's Liberation Army (PLA), which has been repeatedly told by President Xi Jinping, who is also the chairman of the Central Military Commission (CMC), to be "ready for war". The "war" usually refers to the "liberation" of Taiwan, an old Chinese dream. In this context, the visit of three former Indian service chiefs to Taipei has to be noted. Air Chief Marshal Rakesh Kumar Singh Bhadauria, Adm. Karambir Singh, and Gen. M.M. Naravane had travelled

to Taipei on an invitation by Taiwan's ministry of foreign affairs for the Ketagalan Forum. It probably means that New Delhi has started positioning itself in case of a war scenario.

Though it is difficult to predict the future, a careful analysis of the PLA's preparedness shows several weaknesses for a professional modern army.

We shall list a few.

First and foremost, the PLA is the army of the Communist Party of China (CPC). Chairman Xi, as he is called by the PLA, recently published his "Eleven Absolutes" (a sort of Eleven Commandments). The First Absolute is: "The absolute leadership of the People's Party (CPC) is the foundation of the People's Army and the soul of a strong Army. It is necessary to comprehensively strengthen the Party's leadership and leadership in the Army and implement a series of fundamental principles and systems for the Party to lead the Army, and ensure that the troops are absolutely loyal, absolutely pure, and absolutely reliable."

Loyalty to the Party comes before merit or competence; this cannot translate into professionalism. Mr Xi's first commandment wants "to build a People's Army that obeys the Party's command, can win battles, and has a good style of work". What recently happened to the PLA Rocket Force (PLARF) is an indicator that the Party line is supreme. The Chinese (and Taiwanese) social media announced that the commander and deputy commanders of the PLARF were in deep trouble.

When Xi Jinping undertook reforms in the PLA at the end of 2015, the Second Artillery Force, looking after China's strategic missile force, was renamed PLARF, and it was made responsible for China's

tactical and strategic missile force, including nuclear missiles.

On July 6, Lt. Gen. Wu Guohua, the deputy commander of the force, allegedly died; as reports said that he was purged by Xi Jinping and was suspected to have committed suicide; though the official information just mentioned a "brain haemorrhage".

Lt. Gen. Wu passed away at a time President Xi Jinping (also chairman of the Central Military Commission) was on a visit to the Eastern Theatre Command, lecturing the troops to be ready for war.

Then, Gen. Wu's boss, Gen. Li Yuchao, the PLARF commander, was taken away by the Central Commission for Discipline Inspection (CCDI) for investigation.

Further, Lt. Gen. Zhang Zhenzhong, a former deputy commander of the PLARF and current deputy chief of staff of the CMC's Joint Staff Department, was also sacked.

To add to the list, Wei Fenghe, former commander of Rocket Force, and former minister of national defence, was said to be under the scanner.

As it is always good to know the limitations of your purported enemy, let us look at the other weaknesses of the PLA.

China's one-child policy has greatly weakened the PLA as parents are less and less keen to send their one child to war and eventually lose their only offspring. It also means that the soldiers are no longer used to hardship, having been cocooned for twenty years or so by their family; there is certainly less motivation today than during the Long March or Chairman Mao Zedong's

The present Chinese recruitment mode is also a problem; among other issues, a conscripted Army takes more time to accustom to difficult terrains such as on the Indian borders.

Further, the PLA has not fully assimilated the radical reforms introduced in 2016 by Xi Jinping, in particular the combined armed integration.

While Beijing likes to brag about new equipment developed for the PLA (such as laser canons, quantum communication, hypersonic missiles, etc), the personnel manning this weaponry are not fully trained to use the latest technology.

Corruption is a serious issue; we have seen it with the recent beheading of the PLARF. It is a big problem — 100 or so generals were sacked in the past few years — and it is unthinkable in any other Army; corruption in promotion, in businesses, in recruitment, and so on.

Further, hiding the casualties of soldiers, like in the Galwan Valley in June 2020, certainly has a demoralising effect.

In the PLA, the centralised chain of command is cumbersome, officers on the Indian border always have to refer to the higher authorities in Chengdu or Beijing for orders.

The hierarchical difference in the field restricts the analytical process. Orders from senior officers need to be strictly implemented on the ground and if the leadership is targeted during the course of a confrontation, then the force can be in disarray. Too much brainwashing about the Party ideology does not help for the professionalism of the PLA, but what is worrying is that President Xi Jinping seems obsessed by it; in 2022 he started expressing concern about the potential collapse of the Communist Party of China (CPC), with millions renouncing their affiliation to the Party.

And lastly, the recent confrontations in Eastern Ladakh and Arunachal Pradesh have shown that the Indian soldier is a far better fighter than his Chinese opponent.

Hilly, rural areas confronting development deficit under J&K Govt: Rattan Lal

Minister N Biren Singh was not among the signatories.

The signatories, after a meeting with members of newly formed civil society organisation Youth of Manipur at the CM's secretariat on Monday night said the Kuki Zo community's demand for a separate administration was not acceptable to them.

"It is unanimously resolved by all the undersigned members of the legislative assembly that we would stand for the territorial integrity of the state of Manipur and no form of separate administration will be agreed to by us," the resolution read.

On Monday night, thousands of members of Youth of Manipur marched towards the CM's bungalow to meet him, but security forces allowed only some of them past the barricades.

During their meeting with the CM, the YOM members demanded that legal action be taken against the 10 Kuki MLAs who demanded separate administration for the community in Manipur.

They also demanded the convening of a special assembly session to discuss the matter, and the National Register of Citizens exercise in the

Three killed in fresh violence in Manipur

IMPHAL, Sep 12 (Agencies): At least three people were gunned down by unidentified men in Manipur's Kangpokpi district on Tuesday morning, an official said.

He said the ambush took place between Ireng and Karam Vaiphei villages in Kanggui area.

"We do not have much details now. All we know is that the incident took place around 8.20 am when unidentified men gunned down three civilians in an area between Ireng and Karam Vaiphei," the official said.

The incident comes close on the heels of the violence that broke out at Pallel in Tengnoupal district in which three persons were killed and over 50 injured on September 8.

More than 160 people have been killed and several hundred injured since ethnic violence

The cashier who was in the van carrying the cash said the box had 39 lakh.

The guard died during treatment, and the other three are still under medical care.



The entire incident was captured by security cameras. A CCTV clip showed a

man wearing a helmet sauntering around the van, which was parked on the side of the road

with the armed guard standing outside as some men, presumably bank employees, opened the van's back door. Suddenly, another man wearing a helmet

appeared in the frame

and shot the quard in the back at close range. Others scrambled, the man standing in wait pulled out a gun and snatched a backpack from one of the men in the van, as another man pulled out a big box from the back of the van, and all of them fled the spot.

The guard could be seen lying on the road and trying to get up. He is later helped to his feet by onlookers who ferry the injured to a hospital in battery-powered rick-

Maharashtra man kills live-in partner after she files rape case against him

PALGHAR, Sep 12 (Agencies): A 43-year-old man from Maharashtra's Palghar district allegedly killed his live-in partner after she filed a rape complaint against him, police said on Tuesday.

The incident took place between August 9 and 12 and the body of the 28-year-old victim is yet to be found,

The accused, a resident of Vasai area in Palghar, was arrested on Tuesday, Assistant Commissioner of Police,

Vasai, Padmaja Bade said. The victim's family filed a missing person's complaint with the Naigaon police on August 14, an official from Naigaon police station said, adding they suspect the accused disposed of the body in neighbouring Vapi town of Gujarat.

A preliminary probe revealed the accused was angry as the victim had filed a rape complaint based on which a criminal case was registered against him, Bade said

The woman had refused to withdraw the complaint, hence the man allegedly killed her, the official said.

The Naigaon police registered an FIR against the accused on Monday under Indian Penal Code Sections 302 (murder) and 201(causing disappearance of evidence) following a complaint by the victim's sister, she said.

The accused is also facing a case of abetment of suicide lodged against him at another police station in Mira Bhayander-Vasai Virar police limits, the official said without elaborating.

Probe agency ED raids 40 locations in Tamil Nadu in crackdown on sand mafia

NEW DELHI, Sep 12 (Agencies): The Enforcement Directorate (ED) on Tuesday launched a major crackdown on sand mafia in Tamil Nadu, carrying out raids at over 40 locations across the state.

The raids took place at sand mining sites, sales depots and the offices and residences of sand mining contractors at several locations, including Vellore, Chennai, Dindigul, Tiruchi, Karur and Pudukottai, among others.

The ED's investigation into the sand mining scam was triggered by allegations of money laundering and substantial tax evasion within the sand mining industry. It is alleged that while sand was officially sold online with an e-receipt provided at the sand mining depots, there were significant offline sales of sand that weren't consistently recorded.

The probe agency was investigating whether appropriate taxes were deposited into government accounts based on the e-bills issued.

Among those targeted in the raids were industrialists S Ramachandran and Dindigul Rathinam, who hold sand mining licenses, as well as a chartered accountant and a sand mining contractor named Rathinam. These individuals were under the radar of the ED.

Nearly 80 Students Hospitalised Due To Suspected Food Poisoning In Telangana



HYDERABAD, Sep 12 (Agencies): As many as 78 students of a residential girls school in Nizamabad district in the state took ill after having their meals and were hospitalised, an official said

on Tuesday. Several students of Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalaya (KGBV) in Bheemgal town of the district complained of

vomiting and stomach pain after having dinner on Monday, due to suspected food poisoning.

A total of 78 students have been admitted to hospitals in Bheemgal and Nizamabad, the official said, adding it to be a case of mild food poisoning.

All are now stable and undergoing treatment, the official added.

North Korean leader Kim Jong Un arrives in Russia for rare summit with Vladimir Putin

It has sparked Western concerns about a potential arms deal for Moscow's war in Ukraine

SEOUL, Sep 12 (Agencies): Joined by his top military officials handling his nuclear-capable weapons and munitions factories, North Korean leader Kim Jong Un arrived in Russia on Tuesday, where he is expected to hold a rare meeting with President Vladimir Putin that has sparked Western concerns about a potential arms deal for Moscow's war in Ukraine

North Korea's official news agency said Kim boarded his personal train from the capital, Pyongyang, on Sunday afternoon, and that he was accompanied by unspecified members of the country's ruling party, government and military. Jeon Ha Gyu, spokesperson of South Korea's Defence Min-



istry, said in a briefing that the South's military assesses that Kim's train crossed into Russia sometime early ON Tuesday. He didn't elaborate how the military obtained the information.

North Korean state media showed photographs of Kim walking past honour guards and crowds of civilians holding the national flag and flowers, and also of him waving from his green-and-yellow armoured train before it left the station.

Kim's delegation likely includes his foreign minister, Choe Sun Hui, and his top military officials, including Korean People's Army Marshals Ri Pyong Chol and Pak Jong Chon.

Citing unidentified Russian regional officials, Japanese broadcaster TBS reported that Kim's train crossed the border and arrived in the border town of Khasan.

A brief statement on the Kremlin's website on Monday said the visit is at Putin's invitation and would take place "in the coming days." KCNA said the leaders would meet — without specifying when and where

Death toll in Morocco earthquake surpasses 2,600



AMIZMIZ (MOROC-CO), Sep 12 (Agencies): The death toll in the devastating earthquake in Morocco has

risen to 2,681, and the injuries to 2,501, according to the latest statement released by the Moroccan governnent.

The rescue teams dispatched by Spain and the UK have arrived in the village of Amizmiz near the epicentre. Helicopters are seen shuttling back and forth between the tremor-hit old city of Marrakesh and other quake-affected areas, Xinhua news agency reported.

Rescue and relief efforts are also continuing to access the hardest-hit mountainous regions.

There is still a shortage in the supply of gasoline and covers.

The 6.8-magnitude earthquake hit the North African country on Friday.

River of red wine flows through Portuguese town after distillery accident

LISBON, Sep 12 (Agencies): Following an accident at a distillery in the small Portuguese town of Sao Lourenco do Bairro, a river of red wine was seen flowing through the streets there, the New York Post reported.

The incident happened when barrels carrying 600,000 gallons of liquor unexpectedly collapsed.

Soon the incident went viral and the videos posted on social media showed the red liquid running down a steep hill in Sao Lourenco do Bairro on Sunday, which has a population of about 2,000, according to New York Post.

The leak was so large that the wine that spilled might have filled an Olympic-sized swimming pool, causing an environmental alert.

Officials immediately sprang into action, trying to halt the wine before it turned the Certima river into wine. The Anadia Fire Department shut off the flood and moved it away from the river, where it ran into a nearby field,



New York Post reported citing the local media

According to firefighters, the wine flooded a basement at a residence near

Taiwan says it spotted 22 Chinese warplanes and 20 warships near the island

Taiwanese military to continue the monitor the movements of Chinese warplanes and warships

TAIPEI (TAIWAN), Sep 12 (Agencies): Taiwan said on Tuesday it spotted 22 Chinese military aircraft and 20 vessels near the island over the previous 24 hours, as Beijing steps up its military activities in the area.

Over the weekend, the United States and Canada sailed warships through the Taiwan Strait in a challenge to China's sweeping territorial claims. On Monday, China sailed a naval formation led by its aircraft carrier Shandong, about 70 miles (110 kilometres) to Taiwan's southeast. The vessel was expected to conduct drills simulating aircraft, submarine, warship and land attacks, according to Chinese state media.

Thirteen of the Chinese military aircraft reported on Tuesday had crossed the median line



of the Taiwan Strait, an unofficial demarcation zone between China and Taiwan, according to Taiwan's defence ministry.

China claims Taiwan, a selfruled democracy, as part of its territory to be reunited by force if necessary. Over the past year, Beijing has stepped up military activities around the island, including by sending warships and warplanes on a near-daily basis

"The period from July to September this year was the peak period for the Chinese Communist Party's exercises," Maj. Gen. Huang Wen-Chi, the assistant deputy chief with the General Staff for Intelligence of

Taiwan's Defence Ministry, said during a press conference.

"There are a lot of warship activities in the waters surrounding the Taiwan Strait. There was also a large number of warships operating in different areas in the South China Sea and East China Sea," he said.

Huang said the Taiwanese military would continue the monitor the movements of Chinese warplanes and warships.

On Saturday, the USS Ralph Johnson and the Royal Canadian Navy's Halifax-class frigate HMCS Ottawa sailed through the Taiwan Strait. The timing coincided with a Group of 20 leaders' summit in New Delhi.

The US routinely sails through the strait in what it calls "freedom of navigation" operations, which China sees as provocative actions.

Putin calls Trump legal cases 'politically motivated persecution'

MOSCOW, Sep 12 (Agencies): Russian President Vladimir Putin on Tuesday described legal proceedings against former US president Donald Trump as "politically motivated persecution."

The Kremlin, seen as having friendly relations with Trump, has repeatedly spoken out in defence of the former president, who is facing a series of charges linked to election interference.

"As for the persecution of Trump, for us, in the current environment, it's good because it shows the rottenness of the American system," Putin said at an economic forum in the Far East.

"It is a politically motivated persecution of one's competitor."

Putin, who served

in the Soviet security services, added: "And this shows who we are fighting ... As they said in Soviet times: 'the bestial face of American capitalism."

Relations between
Washington and
Moscow, strained by a
it, litany of issues under
it Putin, have hit new



lows since the Kremlin launched large-scale hostilities in Ukraine.

Putin said he did not expect any change in the US foreign policy stance towards Russia regardless of "whoever will be elected president" next year.

He accused Washington of stoking antiRussian feelings among ordinary Americans.

"Current authorities have directed American society in an anti-Russian spirit," the Russian leader said.

"They've done it and now somehow turning this ship in the other direction will be very difficult."

Rescue teams retrieve hundreds of bodies in Derna, one of the Libyan cities devastated by floods

CAIRO, Sep 12 (Agencies): Rescue teams in eastern Libya have retrieved hundreds of bodies from the rubble in a coastal city that has been inundated by devastating floods, a humanitarian agency said Tuesday. Authorities estimated that as many as 2,000 people are believed dead in the city of Derna.

Mediterranean Storm Daniel caused devastating floods in many towns in eastern Libya. But the worst destruction was in Derna, where heavy rainfall and floods broke dams and washed away entire neighbourhoods, authorities said.

Ossama Hamad, prime minister of the east Libya government, said that several thousand people were missing in the city and many were believed to have been carried away after two upstream dams burst.

After more than a decade of chaos, Libya remains divided between two rival administrations: one in the east and one in the west, each backed by militias and foreign governments. The conflict has left the oil-rich country with crumbling and inadequate infrastructure.

The Libyan Red Crescent said early Tuesday that its teams counted more than 300 people dead in Derna. The government in east Libya declared the city



a disaster zone.

More bodies were still under the rubble in the city's neighbourhoods, or washed away to the sea, according to east Libya's health minister, Othman Abduljaleel.

Derna residents posted videos online showing major devastation. Entire residential blocks were erased along Wadi Derna, a river that runs down from the mountains through the city centre. Multi-story apartment buildings that once stood well back from the river were partially collapsed into mud.

Abdul Jaleel said the city was inaccessible and bodies were scattered across it, according to Libya's state-run news agency. He said there wasn't an exact death toll as of Monday night in Derna, but the tally is expected to exceed 2,000 as teams combed through the rubble.

"The situation was more significant and worse than we expected. ... An international intervention is needed," he was quoted as saying.

Emergency responders, including troops, government workers, volunteers and residents were digging through the rubble to recover the dead. They also used inflatable boats to retrieve bodies from the water. Excavators and other equipment have yet to arrive in the city.

Residents described scenes of chaos when floods hit the centre. They heard loud explosions at night and realized that dams outside the city collapsed, sending a wall of water that "erased everything in its way," said Ahmed Abdalla, a Derna resident.

Workers said they buried more than 200 bodies in one cemetery on Monday. Footage overnight showed dozens of more bodies lying on the ground in a hospital yard in Derna.

The storm hit other areas in eastern Libya, including the town of Bayda, where about 50 people were reported dead. The Medical Center of Bayda, the main hospital, was flooded and patients had to be evacuated.

according to footage shared by the centre on Facebook.

Other towns that suffered included Susa, Marj and Shahatt, according to the government. Hundreds of families were displaced and took shelter in schools and other government buildings in Benghazi and other towns in eastern Libya.

Authorities in east and west Libya rushed to help residents of Derna. Foreign governments also sent messages of support to Libya. Egypt, Tunisia, Algeria, Turkey, and the United Arab Emirates were among those that said they would send humanitarian assistance and teams to help with search and rescue efforts.

Derna is about 900 kilometres (560 miles) east of the capital Tripoli. It is controlled by the forces of powerful military commander Khalifa Hifter, who is allied with the east Libya government. West Libya, including Tripoli, is controlled by armed groups allied with another government.

Much of Derna was built by Italy when Libya was under Italian occupation in the first half of the 20th century. The city was once a hub for extremist groups in the yearslong chaos that followed the NATO-backed uprising that toppled and killed longtime dictator Moammar Gadhafi in 2011.

Rain in south China causes over 100 landslides, residents trapped in floodwaters



BEIJING, Sep 12 (Agencies): Days of relentless rain from the remnants of former Typhoon Haikui have caused more than 100 landslides, trapped about 1,360 residents in floodwaters and killed at least seven people in China's south, said state media.

Typhoon Haikui hit southern China eight days ago and has since been downgraded to a tropical storm, but unrelenting rain continues to deluge southwestern Guangxi.

Incessant storms in the last three days in most areas of Yulin city caused 115 landslides that destroyed roads, uprooting trees, inducing floods and leading authorities to issue a warning of emergencies on national and provincial trunk highways, state media said.

Three people remain missing and rescue operations were ongoing.

Further south near the coast, Beihai city was inundated from widespread downpour. Rescuers were seen

treading thigh-deep in waterlogged areas evacuating residents in boats. About 1,360 people were trapped on Tuesday, state media said.

The city's observatory raised its storm warning to the highest in a four-tier alert system after more than 101mm (4 inches) rain poured in a three-hour period on Tuesday morning, and flagged risks of flash floods, geological disasters and waterlogging in urban and rural areas.

Haikui, which weakened to a tropical storm after making landfall in southeastern Fujian province on Sept. 5, had last week wrecked havoc in the populous city of Shenzhen dumping historic rainfall since records began in 1952. Neighbouring Hong Kong was also pelted by the worst storm in 140 years.

Scientists warn that typhoons hitting China are becoming more intense and their paths growing more complex, escalating risk of disaster, even in coastal cities such as Shenzhen that already have strong flood defence capabilities.

China Meteorological Administration forecast heavy rains in the south and southeast parts of Guangxi on Tuesday and Wednesday, with storms in the southwest. Localised hourly precipitation could hit 70mm (2.76 inches) in some areas, it said.

The national forecaster also warned relevant departments and people in Guangdong and Guangxi to be alert to any delayed effects of disasters from frequent rainfall in recent days.

It was later done in March 2014 by amendment in the state legislature whereby entire jurisdiction over the electoral exercise including delimitation of wards was given to the commission. During the day, it climbed 114 points or 0.57 per cent to hit its all-time high of 20,110.35.Among the Sensex firms, Tata Consultancy Services, Larsen & Toubro, Infosys, UltraTech Cement, ICICI Bank, Nestle, ITC



and Sun Pharma were the major gainers.

Power Grid, NTPC, Tata Motors, Tata Steel, Mahindra & Mahindra and Reliance Industries were among the laggards.

Asian Paints, Berger Paints, Kansai Nerolac Paints, Akzo Nobel, and Indigo Paints, command a substantial 90% market share within the paint industry.

Paint industry growth to soften this year,

The top five industry players have demonstrated remarkable growth, registering a robust Compound Annual Growth Rate (CAGR) of 14-15% over the past five years (FY19-FY23).

This growth trajectory notably accelerated during FY22 and FY23 aided by recovery in demand from key user industries, which rebounded after the initial pandemic induced setback.

Increase in competition The paint industry has

seen the entry of several new business conglomerates, including Grasim Industries, Pidilite, and the JSW Group, who have joined the competitive landscape, challenging the established players.

"Even as the newcomers are equipped with robust financial and industrial footing, it is still anticipated that they will require a significant period, estimated at five to seven years, to in the market and secure a meaningful market share from the established industry leaders," the report said.

The top five industry players possess a substantial dealer network spanning the entire country in terms of distribution and market outreach. For example, prominent players like Nippon and JSW Paints, Indigo Paints, allocate nearly 15-20% of their sales budget towards advertising.

Meanwhile, Asian Paints allocate approximately 5% of their sales budget.

Achieving parity will demand substantial time and investment from the new entrants.

"Housing sector growth and demand for repainting amid growing aspirations among people will be the major growth drivers for decorative paints. On the supply side, the industry is expected to augment capacity by 20% in the next three to four years, driven by the capex undertaken

by the new and exist-

ing players. Hence, the competitive intensity is poised to escalate in the long haul," said Yogesh Shah, Senior Director,

CareEdge Ratings.

Increase in demand The paint industry is expected to post a significant growth with the increase in demand from real estate.

"The real estate sector accounts for about 70% of the total paint demand. The demand from real estate is expected to be robust in FY24 on expectation of significant project completion, and increased government spending on affordable housing and infrastructure," said CareEdge Ratings.

Residential housing sales are expected to increase by 10% in the top fifteen cities during 2024.

Demand from repainting, which accounts for 80% of total decorative paint demand, is expected to pick up due to factors such as a growing population, an increase in rental homes and growth in the income levels of consumers.

IT hardware companies may get relaxation on imports this year: Report

NEW DELHI, Sep 12 (Agencies): The government has informed IT hardware manufacturers about its contemplation of implementing a registration mechanism for imports throughout the current fiscal year.

This proposed system would not include quotas or licensing requirements, potentially providing respite for prominent tech giants such as HP, Dell, Apple, Samsung, Lenovo, Asus, Acer, and others operating in the sector, reported The Economic

As per sources quoted in the report, during the ongoing fiscal year, the government intends to solely monitor the origin and value of imported devices as part of an import management system. Companies are expected to be permitted to import the necessary quantities to fulfill market demand.

Quotas and additional compliance measures are anticipated to be introduced in subsequent stages or at the commencement of the next financial year, as per



This pivotal development was conveyed to industry stakeholders during a meeting held on September 8, which was chaired by Rajeev Chandrasekhar, the Minister of State for Electronics and Information Technology.

The meeting witnessed the participation of prominent representatives from industry leaders such as Apple, Dell, Samsung, HP, HPE, Acer, Asus, Cisco, and Intel, alongside industry associations, including the India Cel**lular & Electronics Association**

(ICEA) and the Manufacturers' Association for Information

Technology (MAIT).

An executive who attended the meeting told the business daily that the government wants that the PLI for IT hardware 2.0 scheme to succeed. "Since the majority of the companies will commence manufacturing under the scheme from April 1 next year, there will be a gap in supplies, which can be met only through imports," the executive said

This development follows an

August 3 notification by the Directorate General of Foreign Trade (DGFT), which, citing security concerns, initially categorized the import of specific IT hardware products like laptops, tablets, PCs, and servers as restricted, necessitating a license for imports with immediate effect.

However, due to strong industry pushback, the government extended the implementation deadline to November 1, 2023.

Furthermore, the government has assured companies that it will provide necessary support to bolster local manufacturing under the PLI scheme. Industry executives have expressed concerns that the implementation of import restrictions on November 1 could lead to supply constraints and price hikes.

They also pointed out that the demand for IT hardware has not yet fully recovered to normal levels this fiscal year, given that it experienced a more than 25 per cent decline in the preceding fiscal year.

Indian scientists develop unique way to detect and kill cancer cells


NEW DELHI, Sep 12 (Agencies): Scientists at the Indian Institute of Science (IISc) have made a significant breakthrough in cancer research by developing a new method to detect and kill cancer cells.

The team has created hybrid nanoparticles, composed of gold and copper sulphide, which can destroy cancer cells through heat generation and enable their detection using sound waves.

This innovative approach was detailed in a study published in ACS Applied Nano Materials.

The hybrid nanoparticles exhibit photothermal, oxidative stress, and photoacoustic prop-

When exposed to light, these particles absorb it and generate heat, effectively killing cancer cells. Additionally, they produce toxic singlet oxygen atoms that further contribute to the destruction of cancer



Beyond their therapeutic potential, these nanoparticles also offer diagnostic capabilities. They can absorb light and generate ultrasound waves, enabling the detection of cancer cells with high contrast.

This property could enhance the accuracy of cancer diagnosis as sound waves scatter less than light when passing through tissues, providing clearer images and more precise measurements of oxygen saturation in tumors.

The IISc team's innovation addresses a key limitation of previously developed nanoparticles - their large size. By employing a unique

reduction method, the researchers were able to deposit tiny seeds of gold onto the copper sulphide surface, creating hybrid nanoparticles less than 8 nm in size.

These minuscule particles can potentially navigate through tissues easily and reach tumors, while also being small enough to leave the human body naturally without accumulating.

So far, the nanoparticles have been tested on lung and cervical cancer cell lines in laboratory settings.

The next step for the IISc team is to advance these promising results towards clinical development, marking a significant stride in the fight against cancer.

While openers Rohit (56) and Shubman Gill (58) had added 121 for the first wicket, Rahul and Virat remained unconquered. They stitched together a 233-run partnership for the third wicket. Kohli was unbeaten on 122 off 94 while Rahul was not out on 111 off 106 as India posted 356/2. Virat also became the quickest to reach 13,000 runs in ODIs. The century was also his 47th in the ODIs, only two behind the legendary Sachin Tendulkar.

Injury to Haris Rauf didn't help Pakistan's cause either as the pacer, who bowled five overs on Sunday, didn't take the field on Monday. "He was subsequently taken for a precautionary MRI, which revealed no tear. He is under the observation of the team's medical panel," a statement from the Pakistan Cricket Board read. Babar Azam and Co suffered another injury scare when pacer Naseem Shah left the field holding his wrist. He could not complete the penultimate over of the Indian innings and Iftikhar Ahmed had to bowl the remaining four deliverbefore injury sidelined him. This year he didn't exactly dazzle with the willow but scored two half-centuries in the previous six ODIs before the match against Pakistan to stay in the hunt for a place in the World Cup squad. But something was missing

and even Rahul knew it. For a batter, who had made his ODI debut with a century, not reaching the three-figure mark for more than two years would have been frustrating. He last hit a century on March 26, 2021, when he made 108 against England in Pune. Since then he had played 17 ODIs scoring four half-centuries but the ton was looking elusive before it came against the arch-rivals.

Though Rahul has played maximum matches as an opener it's No. 4 or No. 5 where he has scored the most runs with an impressive batting average so far. At No. 4, where he batted on Monday, his numbers are the most impressive. In 10 matches he batted in that position, he has scored 352 runs including two centuries at an average of 58.66. He is also equally good at No 5 where he has scored 742 runs from 18 matches including a century with an average of 53.

The recent show by the Karnataka batter might relieve Indian team management of a few worries, especially the injury concerns that have given it sleepless nights over the past few months. With Ishan Kishan looking in good touch and lyer apparently having only back spasm, Rahul's form may also lead to a healthy competition among batters giving the management plenty of options in the middle order.

IND vs SL, Asia Cup Super 4s: Upbeat but tired India face Sri Lanka on their 3rd successive match day

COLOMBO, Sep 12 (Agencies): India are set to take the field for the third straight day in the Asia Cup 2023. India defeated Pakistan in the 2-day affair at the Asia Cup on Monday, 11 September. Rohit Sharma's side won by a historic margin and will be facing a very different kind of challenge on Tuesday against cohosts Sri Lanka, who have problems of their own to solve.

For India, the main challenge would be fatigue. Virat Kohli and KL Rahul batted for more than 25 overs against Pakistan on Monday in humid conditions and then fielded for another 32 overs. Virat Kohli was asked about his opinion on playing for the third straight day and he replied that he had never seen anvthing like it. The former captain and the player of the match against Pakistan said that he had adjusted to the Test format and did not think that it would be a very big challenge to play

against Sri Lanka. "I was pushing for runs, I am very happy for that but at one stage, I was thinking that I have a game tomorrow at 3 PM. Luckily, we are Test players, I personally have crossed 100 Tests and so I know how to come back and play again on the next day. It was hot out

there, coming November I would be 35 and hence I need to take care of my body. I know, I will be recovering and playing again tomorrow (chuckles)," Kohli said in the post-match presentation.

India Manage Workload

India captain Rohit Sharma managed his team's workload well in the game. Pacers Jasprit Bumrah, Mohammed Siraj and Hardik Pandya bowled for 5 overs each, while Shardul Thakur bowled 4. Only Kuldeep Yadav broke the 5-over barrier in the match and bowled for 8 overs and picked up 5 wickets - his first 5-fer against Pakistan in ODI cricket.

Changes could be expected for India if they do not recover fast enough. But given that only Kohli and KL batted on the day and most of the bowlers bowled just a little more than T20 quota of overs, it is possible that India keep their changes to minimal.

Indian Grand Prix-5: Priti good: Steeplechaser qualifies for Asiad

CHANDIGARH, Sep 12 (Agencies): As Priti Lamba stepped up to the starting line, she knew it was now or never. The Indian Grand Prix-5 was her last chance to qualify for the upcoming Asian Games in the women's 3000m steeplechase event.

Priti had come agonisingly close to breaching the qualifying mark of 9 minutes, 47 seconds in May with her personal best of 9:47.78 in a goldwinning effort at the Federation Cup. But the Haryana athlete could not match her pace in the next three races as she finished fourth at the Asian Championships with her secondbest time of 9:48.50.

In the Grand Prix today, Priti, running the two-woman race alone almost the whole time, was fighting more of a

Six years back, at her "peak", Priti had suffered a heartbreak when a serious ankle injury put paid to her dreams of participating at the 2018 Asian Games. Knowing that this could be her

last chance of competing in the Asian Games, failure was not an option

for the 27-year-old. "It was a strange race. I felt like I was not able to push myself, yet I was making quick time," Priti said after clocking her personal best of 9:45.13.

"I guess the new track being so bouncy helped me," she added.

"This was my last chance and I am so happy to qualify. Now I can relax a little and then start preparing for the Asian Games," she added.

Fractured dream

Beaming with joy, Priti could not help but acknowledge her supporters. "There was not much sports in our village; we had one physical education teacher, who encouraged me to take up sports," said Priti, who hails from Jawan village in Faridabad district. "He still calls me to know about my progress," she added.

Priti's biggest motivators, though, are her father Jagbir and husband Vicky Tomar, who also coaches her. Jagbir, who works at a petrol station, never failed to take her to training during her early years. "My father's biggest desire is to see me win an Asian Games medal," said Priti, who works in the South Central Railways.

In 2017, though, the Asian Games seemed a distant dream. "I fractured my right ankle at two places while going over a water jump at the national camp, and had to undergo surgery. I was at my peak but lost a whole year," Priti said. "I started training in 2019. At that time, it was Vicky who kept me motivated, otherwise I was ready to quit," added Priti, who runs with a metal plate in her ankle.

Priti, who has shed almost 30 seconds from her time since 2019, said she would improve on her personal best in China.

Straighter run-up, aggressive rhythm key to my ODI success: Kuldeep Yadav

COLOMBO, Sep 12 (Agencies): Left-arm wrist spinner Kuldeep Yadav believes tweaks in his technique, including a straighter run-up and an aggressive rhythm, has helped him to improve his bowling and achieve success in ODI cricket.

The 28-year-old has taken 27 wickets from 14 matches this year, the highest by an Indian bowler in ODIs.

"After the (knee) surgery (last year), my run-up has become much straighter, and rhythm has become aggressive. My hand used to fall over but that has been controlled and now it (hand) is facing

the batsman," said Kuldeep in the post-match press conference.

Kuldeep said he had worked on spin and drift post his surgery to improve his efficiency. "I exerted care not

to lose my spin and drift without losing my pace. If a leg-spinner lands the ball on a good length, he can pick up wickets more regularly and loose balls can be reduced. You can be consistent," he added.

Kuldeep said he worked with NCA physio Ashish Koushik post his surgery to reduce the burden on his knee while landing in the

crease. "I did not want to lose



my zip, nip or drift. After surgery I went for a three-month recuperation at NCA and physio Ashish Koushik said I had to reduce the load on my knee. So, I worked to make my rhythm faster," he said. However, Kuldeep said it took him some time to make the remodelled


