30 wooden residential sheds damaged in Parimpora blaze

SRINAGAR, Oct 1 (Agencies): At least 30 small wooden residential sheds were damaged in an early morning fire incident on Sunday at Parimpora area of Srinagar, officials said.

An official told the news agency KNO that at about 4:15 am in the morning, the control room in Srinagar received a call regarding the fire incident in Parimpora Srinagar and fire tenders rushed

to the spot.

Upon their arrival at the scene, about thirty small wooden residential sheds were found involved in the fire, and due to timely and swift action by the fire and emergency services, the fire was soon brought under control. However, all the sheds have suffered damage in the incident.

He further added that the cause of the fire is being ascertained.

To ensure the smooth movement of participants, the Boulevard Road in Srinagar will be temporarily closed for general traffic from 5:00 AM to 9:00 AM on the day of the event. As a result, traffic advisory measures have been put in place:

Heroin worth crores recovered in Ramban, two arrested

BANIHAL/JAMMU, Oct 1 (Agencies): Police have recovered 30 kg of cocaine worth Rs 300 crore in international market from a vehicle in Jammu and Kashmir's Ramban district, a senior police officer said on Sunday, claiming to have busted a narcoterror module.

According to the official, two Punjab residents were arrested following the recovery of one of the biggest narcotic haul this year from Banihal area along Jammu-Srinagar national highway.

Earlier, the recovered narcotics was believed to be heroin but after investigation it turned out to be cocaine.



"At about 10.30 pm on Saturday, Ramban police led by Senior Superintendent of Police, Mohita Sharma intercepted one vehicle at Railway Chowk Banihal coming from Kashmir towards Jammu

and recovered about 30 kg cocaine, having an approximate value of Rs 300 crore in international black market and apprehended two persons," Additional Director General of Police, Jammu zone, Mukesh

Singh said.

He said the successful recovery resulted in the busting of a narco-terror module.

Police arrest 403 drug peddlers, recover drugs Worth Rs 12 Cr in Baramulla

SRINAGAR, Oct 1 (Agencies): Police have arrested 403 drug peddlers, including 62 hardcore ones, and recovered drugs worth Rs 12.28 crore in Jammu and Kashmir's Baramulla district this year, police said on Sunday.

They said as of September 30, the police have filed 231 cases under the Narcotics Drug and Phototrophic Substances (NDPS) Act, resulting in the arrest of 403 drug peddlers, which include 62 hardcore drug peddlers who have been booked under PIT NDPS PSA.

Additionally, properties of drug peddlers worth Rs 2.1 crore, including three houses, three



vehicles, and cash worth Rs 1.2 crore, have been attached as well.

The contraband seized included brown sugar 2.670 kg worth Rs 3.47 crore, heroin 4.262 kg worth Rs 5.96 crore, charas 11.245 kg worth Rs 56.22 lakh, pomegranate straw, and cannabis powder 194.492 kg worth Rs 1.16 crore. Police have also seized

28 vehicles during this year until September.

However, the Baramulla Police, under its relentless campaign against drug peddling, has achieved remarkable success, as the number of registered cases has significantly dropped in recent months.

Commercial LPG prices hiked by Rs 209

NEW DELHI, Oct 1 (Agencies): Jet fuel or ATF price on Sunday was hiked by 5 per cent — the fourth straight monthly increase since July, and commercial cooking gas (LPG) rates were raised by a steep Rs 209 per 19-kg cylinder, in line with the firming up seen in international benchmarks.

However, the price of domestic LPG – the one used in household kitchens for cooking purposes – remained unchanged at Rs 903 per 14.2-kg cylinder.

Aviation turbine fuel (ATF) price was increased by Rs 5,779.84 per kilolitre, or 5.1 per cent, in the national capital to Rs 118,199.17 per kl from

84-year-old man transforms regular bicycle into e-cycle using solar power

UDHAMPUR, Oct 1 (Agencies): An 84-yearold man from Jammu and Kashmir's Udhampur transforms a regular bicycle into an ecofriendly e-cycle powered by solar and electricity.

Munshi Ram, an 84-year-old resident of Udhampur, Jammu and Kashmir, has transformed a regular bicycle into an e-cycle. Inspired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi's "Vocal for Local" and "Green India" initiatives, he used discarded laptop batteries and e-waste to build his e-cycle.

Alarge number of local residents visited his house and shop to see his e-cycle and praised



him.

Munshi Ram charges his e-cycle using both solar energy and electricity, promoting sustainability and ecofriendliness. He installed a solar panel on the rooftop of his house to generate the solar energy needed to charge his cycle

Living by the belief that necessity fuels innova-

tion, he shared his motivation for embarking on this pioneering project.

"I've always preferred

self-reliance over public transport, and it bothered me that I couldn't easily visit my parental home in Patyeri, Jindrah, which is approximately 31 kilometres from here. So, I decided to take matters into my own hands," said Munshi Ram.

Drawing attention to the environmental concerns associated with electronic waste, he emphasized the importance of reusing discarded laptop batteries.

"Many people dispose of batteries and electronic waste indiscriminately, which harms our soil and environment. We must strive for our country to embrace green energy solutions to ensure a cleaner and healthier environment, free from electronic waste and other pollutants," he said.





CAREER PLANNING

areer planning is the responsibility of the employee. Of course, the organisation has to provide opportunities for development of the employees and their careers to meet the requirements of the organisation. This means assisting the employees to achieve a better match between personal goals and the opportunities that are available in the organisation.

Career Planning refers to the process of finding a suitable job based on your interest, personality, skill set etc., choosing an educational program, changing jobs within your industry or to a different one and also that helps you to climb the success ladder in your current job. The career planning system manifests its importance in attracting competent people, providing suitable promotional and advancement opportunities, providing challenging work, enabling to develop, boosting morale, increasing motivation, utilizing managerial reserves, and in retaining the talents. Career progression refers to making progress in one's career through a series of right moves. Career development means actions undertaken by a person to achieve the career goals.

Career planning is the responsibility of the employee. Of course, the organisation has to provide opportunities for development of the employees and their careers to meet the requirements of the organisation. This means assisting the employees to achieve a better match between personal goals and the opportunities that are available in the organisation.

Sometimes, there may not be enough positions at higher level for upward movement of even high performers. Therefore, career planning efforts need to focus on those areas that offer psychological success instead of vertical growth. Psychological success is basically a feeling of personal achievement and fulfillment. In the current business environment, the career of a person may cover many organisations and different positions compared to earlier years when the employees were less mobile and organisations were more stable.

A career planning system coordinated within an organisation's staffing system fosters a well-integrated mechanism for meeting the present and future HR needs of an organisation. The system is designed to enhance the career satisfaction of employees and to improve the organisational effectiveness.

This will help the individual to explore, choose and strive to derive satisfaction from his/her own career. Career planning should not focus only on vertical hierarchical growth but should also offer psychological success. It is not an event or an end in itself, but a continuous process for developing human resource in order to achieve maximum result.

The career plan of an individual employee and the career path in the organisation should not have many differences. If the individual employee cannot convert his/her career plan into reality in the organisation, he/she may quit the organisation.

Therefore, organisations have the responsibility to provide support to the employee to plan his/her career, so that both their needs are satisfied. Career planning is not the same as human resource planning, as it only talks about the individual employee and his/her growth in the organisation. Of course, it assists in succession planning by giving a clear picture of the individual's potentials.

HR planning is a broad concept which helps the organisation in performing all HR related activities, separately deciding sub plans for them. HR plan helps in analysing and estimating the need for and the availability of employees in an organisation. However, career planning assists in HR planning by providing information on the strength and willingness of employees

In everyday parlance, the word 'career' is used in a number of different ways. People speak of 'pursuing a career', 'career planning', and attending 'career workshops'. Job fairs are held where information is available about different career options for college students.

A career then is a sequence of positions occupied by a person during the course of his or her life. This may be considered as an objective perspective of career. In a subjective sense, it refers to where one is going in one's work life. The subjective viewpoint is more-or-less held together by a self-concept that consists of perceived inclinations and abilities, basic values, career motives, and needs.

New architecture not likely to change character of Parliament

n 1911, the British decided to shift their capital from Kolk-▲ata to a new city, New Delhi. The entire project, including the imposing Viceroy's palace (now Rashtrapati Bhavan), and the North and South Blocks, leading through a wide boulevard, King's Way, to India Gate, took twenty years to finish. In 1931, the new capital was inaugurated, intended to be a monumental assertion of British rule, a way to awe the 'natives' into accepting continued colonial hegemony. But it was too late. By then the freedom movement had gathered renewed momentum. The British had to leave their grand creation, New Delhi, in 1947.

I recall this to illustrate that often in the construction of new edifices, there is a fatal gap between the probable ideological intentions of the architects, and the reality that follows. On September 19, 2023, Prime Minister (PM) Modi formally jettisoned the old Parliament, and moved to the grandiose new one adjacent to it. In his statesmanlike speech to bid farewell to the old, he hoped that the new Parliament would also lead to better, less disruptive, more cooperative and dignified parliamentary proceedings, where debates would be carried out with civility and decorum. He further assured the Speaker that, on his part, he would ensure that all members of his party would conform to this new resolve.

However, just as the intentions of the British with regard to their grand new capital were belied, the PM's hopes — and promises — about the new Par-

liament were also shattered, that too in its very first session. Ramesh Bidhuri, a BJP MP in the Lok Sabha (LS), used language against Kunwar Danish Ali, a Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP) MP, that left the nation shocked. Full of invectives, and unmentionable abuse about him and Muslims in general, it was a disgraceful reminder that however beautiful the new Parliament may be physically, its spirit is even uglier than that of the old. Nothing has changed, but things could only perhaps worsen.

Over the years, political discourse in the world's largest democracy, has reached a new low. Abuses, slurs, racist comments, and undesirable personal attacks, have become the new normal. The worst exceptions of the past, when Parliament was indeed a forum for civilised discourse, have become the best examples of parliamentary proceedings today. But rarely, have we ever witnessed, in the very temple of our democracy, the kind of abusive and racist language used by Bidhuri against Danish Ali. What is worse is that two respected BJP MPs, Harsh Vardhan and Ravi Shankar Prasad, who have been senior ministers, could be seen laughing at the disgusting language used by their party colleague.

To be fair, Rajnath Singh, Raksha Mantri, stood up to express "regret" at what Mr Bidhuri had said. But there was no outright condemnation either by the PM, who is also the Leader of the Lok Sabha, nor by any other senior leader of the BJP. On the contrary, there was a concerted attempt the very next day by some BJP leaders to con-

done Mr Bidhuri's unpardonable language by saying that he was "provoked" by Danish Ali's alleged derogatory remarks about the PM. Mr Ali has denied these allegations, but if true he, too, needs to be chastised by his party leader, Mayawati, and to render an apology.

However, there is little doubt that Mr Bidhuri's language has shamed his party. In the past, too, Prime Minister Modi has expressed sorrow for the comments made by senior members of his party, including MPs and ministers. In 2019, 'Sadhvi' Pragya Thakur Singh, a member of the LS, said inside Parliament and outside, that Godse, the assassin of Mahatma Gandhi, was a "deshbhakt" (patriot). Although she attempted a halfhearted apology for her outrageous comment, the PM said that he will never be able to forgive her. But she has remained a BJP MP. Will she be given a ticket again by the party in 2024? Sakshi Maharaj, another BJP LS member, had said the same thing in 2014. There were reports that Mr Modi was "annoyed" by his comment, but no punitive action was taken, except for Sakshi Maharaj apologising for his comment. In the same year, 'Sadhvi' Niranjan Jyoti, a minister in the Central government, said in a public speech before the Delhi Assembly polls, that voters had to choose between "ramzadon" and "haramzadon" an obvious and condemnable slur on a particular minority. In spite of this, she was let off with a perfunctory rap on her knuckles and continues to be a minister. BJP MP Parvesh Varma, called for the total boycott of Muslims at a public speech in Delhi in 2022. No action was taken against him either.

Opposition parties are not entirely blameless. I have no sympathy for the Opposition's unruly behaviour, its repeated use of coarse language and routine breach of parliamentary decorum. But the perception must exist that punishment for unacceptable conduct will be impartial. Adhir Ranjan Chowdhury, leader of the Opposition in the LS, of whose leadership and language I am not an admirer, was immediately suspended from the House for a much lesser offence, and his case referred to the privileges committee. Similar punishment has been meted out tomany other Opposition MPs in both Houses. Yet so far, the Speaker has only expunged Mr Bidhuri's vile expletives and issued him a warning, but nothing more. This certainly reflects on his impartiality. What is worse is that Mr Bidhuri has now apparently got a pat on his back by his party, by being given charge of Tonk constituency from where Sachin Pilot is the Congress candidate — in the forthcoming Rajasthan Assembly elections.

What precedent does this set? Mr Modi's noble hope, that the new Parliament will also see qualitatively new parliamentary proceedings, was laudable, but previous precedents do not augur well. There is too much hate, bigotry and mistrust for this to happen. The truth, alas, is that just as new clothes don't change the character of a person, the new building is unlikely to change the character of our Parliament.

Why BJP MPs worried in Rajasthan; Hiren Joshi is PM's right hand

olitical activity has Jpicked up speed now **▲** that key Assembly polls are round the corner. While leaders of major parties have hit the campaign trail, the Bharatiya Janata Party has taken the lead in declaring the names of candidates for the year-end Madhya Pradesh election. But the inclusion of seven Lok Sabha MPs, including three Union ministers, and a senior party functionary in the list has not gone down well with those chosen as none of them wish to contest state elections. There is talk that Union minister Prahlad Singh Patel and BJP national general secretary Kailash Vijayvargiya have been included essentially to deny tickets to their family members. Mr Vijayvargiya's son Akash is an MLA from Indore and Patel's brother Jalam Singh Patel represents the Narisnghpur constituency in the state Assembly. Both these MLAs have courted controversies during their tenure which has not gone down well with the BJP leadership. Akash Vijayvarigya was in the news three years ago when he attacked a civic official with a cricket bat following an argument over a demolition drive. Jalam Singh Patel has been named in several criminal cases and in one

such instance, he was also

arrested. Mr Vijayvargiya has reason to worry as he has been allotted a constituency in Indore which he has not contested before while Prahlad Patel is nervous because he owes his victory to his brother's organisational skills and grassroots connection. There is a likelihood that his brother may not put in his best effort this time as he is not in the fray himself.

After the Bharatiya Janata Party chose to field sitting MPs and Union ministers in the Madhya Pradesh Assembly polls, it is believed the same experiment could be repeated in poll-bound Rajasthan. This has got the Rajasthan MPs worried as they are obviously not keen to contest for Assembly polls though these appear to be favourable for the BJP. They are not inclined to move to state politics after enjoying a stint on the national political stage. Former Union minister Rajyavardhan Singh Rathore, who represents Jaipur Rural constituency in the Lok Sabha, is among the jittery Lok Sabha MPs from the desert state. He has been spending a lot of time in his constituency and campaigning hard in the hope of contesting next year's Lok Sabha polls. He is concerned that if he is fielded in the Assembly polls and is elected, he will not be considered for a Lok Sabha seat. He has been nursing hopes of becoming a minister at the Centre again, post 2024 elections. Meanwhile, the Congress is enjoying the predicament of BJP MPs, with one senior leader cackling, "Thank God, we have zero MPs from Rajasthan and Madhya Pradesh."

While the Bharatiya Janata Party has been quick to select its candidates for the coming Assembly polls, the Congress is still to get its act together. According to party insiders, Madhya Pradesh Congress chief Kamal Nath is taking his time as he expects more defections from the BJP in the coming days. This is worrying sitting legislators and other party hopefuls who feel their names could be axed to accommodate as the newlyinducted leaders will be given preference in ticket distribution. Then there is a tussle with poll strategist Sunil Kanugolu who is believed to have been told by Kamal Nath that candidate selection should be left to the party and that he should focus on drawing up campaign pitches on different issues.

A favourite topic of discussion in Delhi is to identify the most powerful and important person in the Prime Minister's Office. The names of principal secretary P.K. Mishra and national security adviser Ajit Doval come to mind immediately but it is low-key Hiren Joshi, OSD, communications and information technology,

who is said to be extremely close to Prime Minister Narendra Modi. Not only does Mr Joshi handle the PM's social media accounts but he also enjoys easy access to Mr Modi. Little wonder then that people who wish to meet the PM first line up to meet Mr Joshi, who is invariably too busy with work to meet them in a hurry.

The decision by several members of the Opposition bloc, INDIA, to boycott the talk shows conducted by 14 television news anchors has often been ignored by enthusiastic Congress members, much to the annoyance of the party's media department. For instance, Congress Lok Sabha MP Ravneet Singh Bittu recently participated in a debate on the downturn in India's relations with Canada which was conducted by a prime time news anchor who figures in the list of 14 put out by the INDIA grouping. Similarly, a young Youth Congress member was also seen in conversation with a "banned news anchor". While she was reprimanded and issued a notice, the Congress media department appeared reluctant to pull up Mr Bittu for flouting the party diktat. The Punjab leader, it was said, would be issuing an apology. It is still being awaited. This preferential treatment meted out to Mr Bittu has also caused a lot of heartburn in the party.

Dysfunctional state of Indian Red Cross Society in J&K

He also raised the issue of shortage of staff/doctors in hospital/PHCs and schools having more students, less staff/teachers than required in Bani that has led to the suffering of people.

In view of the suffering of the people, he appealed to the Govt to deploy the required number of field officers, staff and doctors in the educational institution, and hospitals so that the people do not suffer.

He also demanded basic amenities in Bani and road infrastructure while expressing surprise as to why the construction of the bridge has not been started

yet.
During a week-long tour in Bani, he said that he met people from different segments of society where the developmental works are in deplorable condition.

"Field officer's topranking posts in Bani – Lohaimalhar Constituency are vacant that includes BDO Duggan, BDO Dugain, BDO Lohai-Malhar, CDPO Bani, Naib Tehsildar concerned, etc. The shortage of field officers, doctors as well as staff members in different Govt Departments in Bani and other areas has adversely affected the development," he said.

He criticised LG administration for its failure on the developmental front and accused them of neglecting the genuine demands of the people in Kathua's remote and peripheral areas.

He said that the Lohai Malhar-Katli road has been closed for the last three years, and its DPR is being changed instead of opening the road for the commuters to ensure proper road connectivity to the remote areas.

He also took up the issue of poor work by the Tourism Department to promote the tourism sites in Bani, Lohai Malhar and other areas. He demanded that the tourism sites must be explored for the promotion of tourism so that employment can be generated at the local level.

She always thought composing music for an entire film in Bollywood would mean extremely high pressure and working in a somewhat corporate structure. Lamenting the current non-exchange of artists between India and Pakistan, she says for her, it is not about opportunities lost vis-a-vis audiences and markets, but the fact that it shrinks an artistic community.

"The movie we created was not supposed to be a bazillion crore hit. It was just special and important for a special and important artist who we all believed in, and who believed in us. That kind of camaraderie between neighbours is so enriching -- and I say that from experience," says the artist whose first outing in India was with the film 'Madras Cafe'.

All set to perform live at Times Square in New York in collaboration with renowned 2023 Pollack Prize winner artist Shahzia Sikander, Pulitzer Prize-winning composer Du Yun, and



interdisciplinary artist Eddy Kwon on September 30, she says: "To be right there in Times Square and perform live, while the square is immersed in Shahzias work, just thinking about it feels like a dream. It is exhilarating and surreal. Collaborating with Du Yun, and Eddy Kwon for 'Reckoning' has been an enchanting journey. To be a part of this synergy of art and music, coming together in this historic public celebration is one of the best things that could happen."

For someone who sings in multiple languages, she laughs when asked which one is closest to her. "Pashto makes me think of home, Urdu and Hindi open up my imagination, Persian feels like a warm hug, Kashmiri feels like being transported to a magical land, Turkish is nostalgia and Punjabi is the closest friend -- like a yaarana."

a yaarana."
Co-founder of the band 'Sandaraa' (with Michael Winograd), a project she calls closest to her heart, Bangash, ended up playing with him entirely by chance in the US, and on that gig, they decided to play together again. Soon after, the band came together.

"We shared the same vision of the band as co-founders but really Michael is the captain of the ship. He got a stellar group of Brooklynbased musicians from Klezmer, European, Jewish music, heavy metal, Jazz, Turkish and Arabic styles. I learned so much about musical aesthetics and diversity working with them. The vision is to build bridges between cultures and tell stories with music that blur the lines between the past, present, and future."

She feels being in Sandaraa validated much of her "weirdness". "All that home could not understand about me... I found space to sing Sabzal Samagi's Balochi classics and Haji Saifoos comic Persian ghazals to audiences all over North America."

For someone who believes collaborations are the best way to learn and grow as one gets 'barkat' associated with sharing, she asserts that the same ascertains that one truly gets to experience other worlds musically. "But most importantly your relationships and your community expands and you feel a part of something big and universal."

Ask her about the

secret of the extremely interesting music scene in Pakistan, she admits it sometimes surprises her considering how tough it can get for artists there. "But then I wonder whether the output is exciting for precisely the same reason that it is challenging, which is the lack of a structured industry and a hyperresponsive market. In some ways that allows us to work in our silos and stay focused on our own expression without the burden of imagining success. Creating without a keen focus on the audience is freedom." With diverse influences

including Popular music from the West starting from the '50s, South Asian folk and films, ghazals and Semi-classical music, Pop music from the '60s till the '90s from Turkey besides a whole range of music from Afghanistan and the Middle East, the singer who is also learning from Ustad Naseeruddin Saami says the training in classical has completely changed her life and musical expres-

"The most obvious change is in my voice itself. What it can do and where it can go has expanded. Learning Khayal has transformed my relationship with myself, it's really brought a sense of quiet self-assurance and helped me integrate all of my musical influences into one perspective," she says.

During the Pandemic, Bangash recorded her solo album, with a crew of musicians and producers based out of L.A. Though that one is yet to release, she recording another one. "There is also a collection of regional songs that I am recording based out of Dubai," she concludes.

Jasmin Bhasin: I have lost roles because castings are happening on the basis of social media following

Actor Jasmin Bhasin has been on a hiatus from the daily soap scene for the past three years, and she reveals it has not been an intentional move for her.

"I would not say that there is a specific intention behind staying away from TV," tells Bhasin, who was last seen in Naagin 4 in 2020, adding, "I have been open to the opportunities. But, since the last few years, I am in the process of transforming into other mediums of entertainment, like OTT space and movies, maybe that's why I

am being missed from the scene. I am working really hard towards it".

When it comes to her web debut, the actor also reveals that she is still waiting for the right script to come her way. Bhasin explains, "I have been planning to enter the OTT space since the last two years, but unfortunately I haven't come across any script which I feel should be my OTT debut, because I have always been really careful in choosing roles."

"Fans hamesha mujhe appreciate karte hain, so they really value and wait to see what I am going to do next, that's why I am looking for a good solid script for my OTT or Bollywood debut. Things are not able to materialise, but I am not going to give up till things don't happen because I don't believe in giving up. I am waiting for it to happen and I'm trying my best," the 33-year-old adds.

What kind of role is she expecting? "I definitely want to get into a space where I get to prove myself as a performer and actor," Bhasin asserts, adding that the castings are now dependent on your social media following. "Because now, I believe that a lot of castings are happening on the basis of your social media following. Somewhere I feel that as an actor who has been doing this for 15 years and acting is my craft, still you lose projects because you are not that popular on social media, it is kind

of disheartening. You have put in years of labour, pain, and sweat, so when you lose good projects which you really want to do only because you just want to act and not make other things a priority," she elaborates.

Ask her if stereotyping might be the reason behind getting less opportunities, she defends the television medium, saying, "Aisa toh nahi hua hai I think. TV actors are kind of stereotyped and put in a box unfortunately, but I strongly feel that we should use it as a strength. Doing television is not easy because we work for 12-15 hours daily. Television actors are kind of pros and can give better output. Television is underestimated, but it is one of the strongest mediums."

Having said that, she quips, "Many times I have also been typecasted and I've lost roles that 'Oh, she has done television, we don't want a television face'. Why not?".

Another thing that she has been waiting for is her projects going on floors. "There are a few projects, but they have been in the pipeline for two years. Things materialise but they don't end up on floors due to some or the other reason. I am just waiting and praying for my stars to align and bring those projects from the pipeline to the floors," shares Bhasin, who was last seen in her Punjabi debut film Honeymoon (2022).

An ex-gratia of ₹ 2 lakh from PMNRF would be given to the next of kin of each deceased. Those injured would be given ₹ 50,000: PM @narendramodi," the PM's official X handle said.

On Saturday, a Tenkasi-bound tourist bus fell into a gorge and toppled after the driver lost control of the vehicle, killing 8 people.

The toll went up to nine with the death of one more woman today.

The victims had arrived in the hilly district for a pleasure trip and were returning home when the mishap occurred.

3.1 Magnitude Earthquake Hits Assam's Dhubri, No Deaths Reported



DHUBRI, Oct 1 (Agencies): An earthquake of magnitude 3.1 occurred in Assam's Dhubri district in the early hours of Sunday, an official statement said.

National Center for Seismology said that the earthquake occurred at 3:01 am at a depth of 17 Km.

Taking to X (former Twitter), the National Center for Seismology (NCS) said, "Earthquake of Magnitude:3.1, Occurred on 01-10-2023, 03:01:33 IST, Lat: 26.08 and Long: 90.05,

Depth: 17 Km, Location: Dhubri, Assam, India." Earlier, an earthquake of magnitude 3.0 jolted Uttarakhand's Uttarkashi district on Monday.

"Earthquake of Magnitude:3.0, Occurred on 25-09-2023, 08:35:54 IST, Lat: 31.07 & Long: 77.98, Depth: 5 Km, Location: Uttarkashi, Uttarakhand, India," NCS said in a post on X.

Mild earthquakes measuring 2.8 and 2.1 on the Richter Scale struck Himachal Pradesh's Mandi and Chamba districts in September.

Manipur needs power-sharing arrangement to unite all communities: Netaji's nephew Sugata Bose

KOLKATA, Oct 1 (Agencies): Describing the situation in Manipur as "tragic", Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose's grand-nephew Prof Sugata Bose called for working out a "just power-sharing arrangement" in the northeastern state in order to bring all three communities—Meiteis, Kukis and Nagas—on the same page.

Bose, who was earlier a Lok Sabha MP, pointed out in an interview to PTI that members of all the three communities had joined Netaji's INA in 1944 and fought shoulder to shoulder in the battlefields of Bishnupur and Ukhrul districts in an advance into India.

He said there was a need "to work out a just power-sharing arrangement in Manipur (which would engage all three communities and address their grievances)."

"We need to draw upon the best legacy of the past armed struggle against the British to bring the three communities together again," added Bose, who holds the Harvard University's Gardiner chair in history.

The Meiteis account for 53 per cent of the state's population and live mostly in the Imphal valley. Tribals – Nagas and Kukis – constitute another 40 per cent of the population and reside in the hill districts surrounding Imphal.

"The situation in Manipur is truly tragic... for short-term political gains, one community has been played against the other. That kind of political game must stop," Netaji's grandnephew said.

For the last five months, Meitei and Kuki communities have rioted against each other, resulting in the deaths of more than 175 people. Thousands have been rendered homeless and forced to live in makeshift refugee camps.

Initial grievances and accusations include bull-dozing of villages, which had sprung up on forest lands, and an Imphal



High Court order asking the state government to send a recommendation to the Centre on demands for scheduled tribe status for Meiteis, which the tribal communities resented. These were compounded by rival accusations of ethnic cleansing and involvement in the drug trade by both communities

"Manipur, along with the rest of the northeast, should be given a voice in decision-making at the Centre," Bose said.

He recounted that a large number of Manipuri youth from Kuki, Meitei and Naga communities joined the INA in its march towards Imphal. Of these volunteer soldiers, 15 Manipuri young men and two women joined other INA troops in the retreat to Rangoon, suffering hardships as they fought a

gallant rear guard action

against seasoned British

troops.

"These freedom fighters from Manipur included M Koireng Singh, the first chief minister of Manipur after Independence," Bose pointed out

INA's advance nearly 80 years ago had been three-pronged – the Gandhi brigade led by Col Inayat Jan Kiyani moved into the hills of Palal and Tengnoupal, east of Imphal; Col Shah Nawaz Khan led the Subhas Brigade into Ukhrul, while Col Shau-

kat Malik led the Bahadur group into Moirang in Bishnupur district, just 40 km from Imphal town.

Colonel Shakuat Malik raised the Tricolor at Moirang in Bishnupur district on April 14, 1944 with help from Koering Singh and Naqi Ahmed Chaudhary, a Manipuri Muslim.

There is also a version that Netaji Subhas Bose visited an INA camp near Churachandpur, a largely Kuki-dominated town in July 1944, to visit his frontline troops and interacted with villagers there.

The region where INA first entered the country has since then been largely a backwater for independent India. Cut off from the rest of India by Bangladesh, except through the 'Chicken's Neck Corridor' in West Bengal's Siliguri, northeast India has faced insurgencies, race riots compounded with increasing population pressure and few job opportunities.

IAF aircraft makes emergency landing in MP, all 6 persons on board safe: Police

BHOPAL, Oct 1 (Agencies): An aircraft of the Indian Air Force (IAF) with six persons on board made an "emergency" landing at a village in Madhya Pradesh capital Bhopal on Sunday due to a technical snag, a police official said.

The pilot and the five crew members are safe, Berasia police station inspector Narendra Kulaste, who was at the spot, told PTI over phone.

The incident took place at around 8.45 am, he said.

The aircraft, of IAF's III HU unit, made the



"emergency" landing in a sugarcane field near a lake in Dungariya village, nearly 60 km from the Bhopal district headquarters, he said.

The aircraft, on way to Jhansi from Bhopal, developed a technical fault, the official said.

A team of the IAF has reached the site to fix the technical problem.

Another team of technicians is expected to reach Dungariya village from Nagpur shortly, he

AFSPA extended in 4 districts of Assam, withdrawn from 4 others

GUWAHATI, Oct 1 (Agencies): The Assam Police on Sunday said the Armed Forces (Special Powers) Act or AFSPA has been extended in four districts of the state for six more months.

At the Assam Police Day 2023 celebrations here, DGP Gyanendra Pratap Singh said the 'disturbed area' tag, which allows enforcement of the AFSPA, has, however, been withdrawn from four other districts.

"From today, only four districts in Assam will have AFSPA. These are Dibrugarh, Tinsukia, Sivasagar and Charaideo," he said.

The AFSPA has been withdrawn from Jorhat, Golaghat, Karbi Anglong and Dima Hasao with effect from October 1, Singh said.

The Assam Government had last extended the 'disturbed area' notification under the AFSPA for another six months with effect from April 1 in these eight districts.

The AFSPA empowers security forces to conduct operations and arrest anyone without any prior warrant, besides giving immunity from arrest and prosecution to the forces if they shoot someone dead.

I-T Department attaches second property in benami assets case against Mukhtar Ansari

LUCKNOW, Oct 1 (Agencies): The Income Tax department has attached a second land property worth about Rs 10 crore in Lucknow as part of its ongoing alleged benami assets possession probe against gangster-politician Mukhtar Ansari and his family.

The department's Benami Assets Investigation wing, headquartered here, has codenamed the comprehensive probe Operation Panther. It has found that the 'benamidar (in whose name a benami property is standing)' of the 3,234-square feet plot at 13-C/3 in Lucknow's Dalibagh area is a Ghazipur-based woman named Tanveer Sahar.

Official records accessed by PTI show that the department attached the plot under Section 24(3) read with Rule-5 of the Prohibition of Benami Properties Transaction Act on September 29 as it found that the linked people are "very influential" and that the property is located in a prime location and can be disposed of clandestinely.

While the plot's stamp valuation is just over Rs 76 lakh, official sources pegged its market value

at about Rs 10 crore.
In April, the department attached

the first property in the case against Ansari, located at Mauja Kapurpur NZA under Sadar tehsil in Uttar Pradesh's Ghazipur district, and identified his alleged associate—Ganesh Dutt Mishra—as the benamidar of this about Rs 12 crore-worth land.

The taxman unearthed the latest asset (in Lucknow's Dalibagh) after prolonged questioning of Mishra and records obtained from the Uttar Pradesh Police and the revenue department and financial documents from various agencies, including banks.

It found Mishra mortgaged the Dalibagh property as collateral for a Rs 1.60 crore loan taken from the Union Bank of India in 2014 by a company named Aaghaaz Project and Engineering Private Limited, whose shareholders were Ansari's wife Afsan Ansari, son Abbas Ansari and father-in-law Jamshed Raza. The property was released by the bank after the loan was paid back and it was transferred to the alleged benamidar Sahar in November 2020.

The tax department suspects that Sahar—the wife of Niyaz Ahmad and a resident of Mahanagar in

Lucknow—is an associate/aide of the Ansari family.

The Income Tax department found that Sahar has never filed an Income Tax Return and did not have a sufficient source of income to purchase the Dalibagh plot that has been attached under the anti-benami law, apart from a few others. The department concluded that Sahar was a "dummy owner or benamidar" of the property. The tax officials also summoned her for questioning but she is yet to depose before them.

Income Tax department sources had earlier said that they were working to attach about 20-21 more alleged benami properties of Ansari's family, estimated to have a market value of over Rs 100 crore, as part of Operation Panther. Ansari, lodged in the Banda jail, faces 61 criminal cases in different states. He has so far been convicted in six. A Varanasi court in June sentenced him to life in prison for the murder of Awadhesh Rai, Congress leader Ajay Rai's brother, more than 30 years ago.

In April, he was sentenced to 10 years in jail by a court in Ghazipur under the Gangsters Act.

IMD issues 'red' alert for Goa, predicts heavy rain

PANAJI, Oct 1 (Agencies): The India Meteorological Department (IMD) on Sunday issued a 'red' alert for Goa, forecasting heavy rain in the coastal state over the next 24 hours.

The nowcast weather warning issued by the IMD predicted "moderate to heavy spells of rain accompanied with winds of speed 40 to 50 kilometres per hour gusting to 60 kmph."

The IMD said clouds were present in the morning over Pernem, Tiswadi, Bardez, Bicholim and Sattari (all in North Goa district) talukas of the state.

"More clouds are approaching from the Arabian Sea. More talukas are also likely to get affected as clouds are moving generally in the north-eastern direction," the IMD said.

The State Disaster Management Authority (SDMA) has activated its control rooms in both the North and South Goa districts.

"Extremely heavy rains are forecast for Goa in the next 24 hours. Members of the public are advised not to venture into waterlogged or flood-prone areas," the SDMA said.

Drishti Marine, the state government-appointed lifesaving agency, advised people not to venture into the sea due to the high water levels and rough weather conditions.

Pro-China Opposition candidate Mohamed Muiz wins Maldives presidency

PM Modi congratulates Mohamed Muizzu

MALE (MALDIVES), Oct 1 (Agencies): Opposition candidate Mohamed Muiz won the Maldives presidential runoff on Saturday, securing more than 53 per cent of the vote, local media reported.

The election has turned into a virtual referendum on which regional power — India or China — will have the biggest influence in the Indian Ocean archipelago nation.

Mihaaru News reported that incumbent President Ibrahim Mohamed Solih had received 46 per cent of the vote and that Muiz had won by more than 18,000 votes. Official results were expected on Sunday.

"With today's result we have got the opportunity to build the country's future. The strength to ensure the freedom of Maldives," Muiz said in a statement after his victory. "It's time we put our differences aside and come together. We need to be a peaceful society."

Muiz also requested that Solih transfer former president Abdula Yameen to house arrest from prison.

It was a surprise win for Muiz, who entered the fray as an underdog. He was named only as a fallback candidate closer to the nomination deadline after the Supreme Court prevented Yameen from running because he is serving a prison sentence for money laundering and corruption. Yameen's supporters say he's been jailed for political reasons.

"Today's result is a reflection of the patriotism of our people. A call on all our neighbours and bilateral partners to fully respect our independence and sovereignty," said Mohamed Shareef,

Solih has insisted that the Indian military's presence in the Maldives was only to build a dockyard under an agreement between the two governments and that his country's sovereignty won't be violated.

Muiz promised that if he won the presidency, he would remove Indian troops from the Maldives and balance the country's trade relations, which he said were heavily in India's favour.

Ahmed Shaheed, a former foreign minister of Maldives, termed the election verdict as a public revolt against the govern-

New Zealand Prime Minister tests positive for Covid-19, to work 'via zoom'



SYDNEY, Oct 1 (Agencies): New Zealand Prime Minister Chris Hipkins has tested positive for COVID-19 and will work remotely while isolating, his office said on Sunday, two weeks out from a general elec-

Hipkins has cold and flu symptoms that began on Saturday and would isolate for five days or until he returned a negative test, the prime minister's office said in a statement.

"He will continue with engagements he can undertake via zoom," the statement said.

The positive test will keep Hipkins temporarily on the campaign sidelines ahead of the Oct. 14 general election, as his struggling incumbent Labour party seeks to win another term in office.

Hipkins on Sunday was due attend a Samoan church service in Auckland, but a spokesperon said Deputy Prime Minister Carmel Sepuloni would attend in his place.

The prime minister's office said further updates on his schedule "will be provided in due course".

The government lifted all remaining COVID-19 requirements in August, but health authorities still recommend that people stay home for five days if feeling unwell or if they have tested positive to Covid-19.

Iran ready for 'anti-terrorism' cooperation with Pakistan

TEHRAN, Oct 1 (Agencies): A top Iranian military official has said that Iran's armed forces are ready for any form of cooperation with Pakistan in the "all-out fight" against terrorism.

Chairman of the Chiefs of Staff of the Iranian Armed Forces Mohammad Baqeri made the remarks on Saturday in a message to Pakistani Chief of Army Staff Asim Munir to extend his sympathy over a deadly "terrorist" bomb blast at a religious gathering in Balochistan, which

The blast has killed

at least 50 people, and more than 50 others sustained injuries, according to police and health officials.

The preliminary reports and police investigation showed that it was a suicide attack. No group has claimed responsibility for the blast yet.

In a message addressed to his Pakistani counterpart Arif Alvi, Iranian President Ebrahim Raisi condoled with the Pakistani government and people, and condemned the "terrorist" bomb attack.

Australia Reels Under Sweltering Heat Amid Bushfire Threats



SYDNEY, Oct 1 (Agencies): Australia's southeast on Sunday sweltered in a heat wave that raised the risk of bushfires and prompted authorities to issue fire bans for large swaths of New South Wales state

New South Wales state. The nation's weather forecaster said temperatures would be up to 12 degrees Celsius (53.6 degrees Fahrenheit) above average in some areas, with Sydney, capital of Australia's most populous state New South Wales, set to hit 36C (96.8F).

At Sydney's Kingsford Smith Airport, the temperature was already 28C (82.4F) at 10 a.m. (2300 GMT), more than five degrees above the September mean maximum temperature, according to forecaster

Australia faces a highrisk bushfire season as it experiences an El Nino weather event, recently announced, which is typically associated with extreme events like wildfires, cyclones and droughts.

State Emergency Services Minister Jihad Dib said the "scorching" heat lifted the risk for bushfires in the week

"Not only is it hot, it's dry and it's windy and those conditions combined are the perfect storm," Dib said, announcing the start an official bushfire danger period.

Fire authorities on Sunday issued nine fire total bans for parts of the state in a bid to reduce the chance of bushfires.

Australia's last two fire seasons have been quiet compared to the catastrophic 2019-2020 "Black Summer" of bushfires that destroyed an area the size of Turkey and killed 33 people.

(Agencies): Slovakia's leftist former Prime Minister Robert Fico was on course to beat his progressive rival in a parliamentary election after a campaign in which he pledged to end military aid to Ukraine, partial results showed on Sunday.

With 90% of voting districts reporting in the Saturday election, Fico's SMER-SSD party led with 23.69% of the vote. The liberal Progressive Slovakia (PS) followed with 15.68% and the HLAS party, which could become the kingmaker for forming the next government, was third with 15.43%.

Former Fico colleague and HLAS leader Peter Pellegrini kept his options open on future coalitions in televised comments as results became clearer.

A government led by Fico and his SMER-SSD party would see NATO member Slovakia joining Hungary in challenging the European Union's consensus on



support for Ukraine, just as the bloc looks to maintain unity in opposing Russia's invasion.

"We do want to evaluate everything, so we will wait for the final count," said Robert Kalinak, a SMER-SSD candidate and long-time Fico ally, adding the party would comment on the full results later on Sunday.

Exit polls had favoured PS as the winner, but projections from two Slovak news sites based on results with 90% of districts reporting pegged Fico as the winner with a margin of about 5 or 6 percentage points.

The PS party has advocated maintaining

Slovakia's strong backing for Ukraine, and would also likely follow a liberal line within the EU on issues such as majority voting to make the bloc more flexible, green policies and LGBT rights.

The first party across the line was expected to get a mandate from President Zuzana Caputova to lead talks on forming a parliamentary majority and, if successful, a government.

The final districts to report, from large cites, were expected to favour PS, but the gap behind Fico appeared too large to bridge.

PS leader Michal Simecka did not give up hope he could form the next government, depending how possible smaller allies end up.

"It remains our aim for Slovakia to have after this election a stable pro-European government that will care for the rule of law and which begins to solve and invest into areas key for our future," Simecka, a former reporter and Oxford graduate, told supporters.

With no party projected to win an outright majority, forming a new government will hinge on results for more than half a dozen smaller parties, from libertarians to far-right extremists.

Any coalition that PS could potentially form would likely need to include more right-wing or socially conservative parties, which would blunt its socially progressive and EU-integration drive.

The incoming government in the nation of 5.5 million will take over a ballooning budget deficit forecast to be the highest in the euro zone.

Fico has ridden on dissatisfaction with a bickering centre-right coalition, whose government collapsed last year, triggering the election six months early. In campaigning, he stressed concern about a rise in the number of migrants passing through Slovakia to Western Europe.

Fico's views reflect traditionally warm sentiments towards Russia among many Slovaks, which have gathered strength on social media since the Ukraine war started.

He has also pledged to end military supplies to Ukraine and strive for peace talks - a line close to that of Hungary's leader, Viktor Orban, but rejected by Ukraine and its allies, who say this would only encourage Russia.

The far-right Republika party, which was seen as a possible ally for Fico but unacceptable to others, may not win any seats, partial results and media projections showed.

US Senator threatens to block military aid to Egypt on human rights ground

WASHINGTON, Oct 1 (Agencies): The chairman of the US Senate Foreign Relations Committee vowed to block military aid and arms sales to Egypt if it does not take concrete steps to improve human rights in the country.

Democratic US Senator Ben Cardin issued the threat in a statement, saying "it is imperative that we continue to hold the government of Egypt, and all govern-

ments, accountable for their human rights violations."

The announcement came a day after US Representative Gregory Meeks, the ranking Democrat on the House of Representatives Foreign Affairs Committee, said he had asked the State Department to pause a portion of military aid to Egypt conditioned on human rights

criteria. The stepped-up pressure follows the September 22 federal indictment of the then-chairman of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, Democratic Senator Bob Menendez, tied partly to allegations that he had accepted bribes in exchange for wielding his influence to aid Egypt's government.

Menendez denies

wrongdoing and has pleaded not guilty.
The Egyptian embassy

in Washington did not

immediately respond to Car

immediately respond to a request for comment on Cardin's announcement.

Cardin, who replaced Menendez as head of the Senate panel, said Egypt must show

progress in efforts to accelerate the release of political prisoners and "provide space" for human rights defenders, civil society advocates, political opposition and independent media.

"I intend to exercise fully the committee's oversight responsibilities and my authorities to block future foreign military funds as well as the sale of arms to the government of Egypt if it does not take concrete,

meaningful, and sustainable steps to improve the human rights conditions in its country," he said.

Washington has long provided Egypt with large amounts of military and other aid, ever since the Arab world's most populous nation signed a peace deal with neighbouring Israel in 1979.

Much of the aid has been withheld in recent years over concerns about human rights abuses under the government of President Abdel Fattah al-Sisi. But President Joe

Biden's administration announced this month it had decided to waive human rights restrictions on \$235 million of the aid, citing security benefits to the US. It is currently withholding \$85 million of the aid, a fraction of the \$1.3 billion a year allocated to Egypt.

Substances (NDPS) Act was registered at Banihal police station and investigation set into motion, Singh said.

"This operation was developed on intelligence generated by SSP Ramban and her team who have been continuously waging war against drug smugglers and peddlers," the ADGP said.

He said a large number of notorious peddlers and smugglers have already been booked by the team of Ramban police.

"A total of 104 cases (under NDPS Act) have been registered in 2022 while 36 such cases were registered in 2023 till date following the recovery of 2,500 kg poppy straw, 10 kg charas, 200 grams heroin and 200 tablets," Singh said, adding 158 accused have been arrested and three detained under the Prevention of Illicit Traffic in NDPS Act.

Banihal Station House Officer Mohd Afzal Wani identified the arrested smugglers as Sarabjeet Singh of Jhalandhar and Honey Basra of Phagwara in Punjab.

While three kilograms of the narcotic was found hidden on the top of the vehicle, 27 kgs were recovered from their luggage,

Wani said the smugglers tried to escape when signalled to stop and were chased and subsequently arrested.

The officials said the high-grade cocaine was smuggled from across the border and being taken from north Kashmir to Punjab.

Commercial LPG prices hiked by Rs 209

Rs 112,419.33, according to a price notification of state-owned fuel retailers.

The increase comes on back of the steepest-ever 14.1 per cent increase (Rs 13,911.07 per kl) effected on September 1, and a 8.5 per cent or Rs 7,728.38 per kl increase on August 1.

The fourth straight increase in prices of jet fuel, which makes up for 40 per cent of an airline's operating cost, will increase the burden on already financially strained

On July 1, ATF price had gone up by 1.65 per cent or Rs 1,476.79 per kl. In four increases, ATF prices have gone up by a record Rs 29,391.08 per kl.

Alongside, oil firms raised the price of commercial LPG - the one used in establishments such as hotels and restaurants - by Rs 209.

A 19-kg commercial LPG cylinder will now cost Rs 1,731.50 in the national capital and Rs 1,684 in Mumbai.

The increase reserves most of the Rs 157.5 per cylinder cut in commercial LPG price effected on September 1 and Rs 100 cut effected from August 1.

Saudi contract price (CP), the benchmark used for pricing of LPG, has increased following a firming up trend in crude oil prices witnessed in last few weeks over supply concerns.

Oil companies, which had on August 30, cut domestic LPG rates by Rs 200 per 14.2-kg cylinder, did not change the price of 14.2-kg cylinders.

State-owned Indian Oil Corporation (IOC), Bharat Petroleum Corporation Ltd (BPCL) and Hindustan Petroleum Corporation Ltd (HPCL) revise cooking gas and ATF prices on the 1st of every month based on the average international price in the previous month.

Petrol and diesel prices continued to remain on freeze for a record 18th month in a row. Petrol costs Rs 96.72 per litre in the national capital and diesel comes for Rs 89.62 per litre.

State-owned fuel retailers are supposed to revise petrol and diesel prices daily, based on a 15-day rolling average of benchmark international fuel prices, but they haven't done that since April 6, 2022.

Prices were last changed on May 22, when the government cut excise duty to give relief to consumers from a spike in retail rates that followed a surge in international oil prices.

Why the US job market has defied rising interest rates and expectations of high unemployment

Grim forecasts from economists had predicted that as the Federal Reserve jacked up its benchmark rate ever higher, consumers and businesses would curb spending.

WASHINGTON, Oct 1 (Agencies): Last year's spike in inflation, to the highest level in four decades, was painful enough for American households. Yet the cure — much higher interest rates, to cool spending and hiring — was expected to bring even more pain.

Grim forecasts from economists had predicted that as the Federal Reserve jacked up its benchmark rate ever higher, consumers and businesses would curb spending, companies would slash jobs and unemployment would spike as high as 7% or more — twice its level when the Fed began tightening credit.

Yet so far, to widespread relief, the reality has been anything but: As interest rates have surged, inflation has tumbled from its peak of 9.1% in June 2022 to 3.7%. Yet the unemployment rate, at a still-low 3.8%, has scarcely budged since March 2022, when the Fed began imposing a series of 11 rate hikes at the fastest pace in decades.

If such trends continue, the central bank may achieve a rare and difficult "soft landing" — the taming of inflation without triggering a deep recession. Such an outcome would be far different from the last time inflation spiked, in the 1970s and early 1980s. The Fed chair at the time, Paul Volcker, attacked inflation by escalating the central bank's key short-term rate above 19%. The result? Unemployment shot to 10.8%, which at the time marked its highest level since World War II.

A year ago, in a high-profile speech, Chair Jerome Powell warned that the Fed was prepared to be similarly aggressive, saying its rate hikes would cause "some pain" in the form of higher unemployment. The Fed, Powell said pointedly, would "keep at it," a play on the title of Volcker's autobiography, "Keeping At It."

Over time, as the job market has displayed surprising resilience, Powell has adopted a more benign tone. At a news conference last week, he suggested that a soft landing remains a "possible," if not guaranteed, outcome.

"That's really what we've been seeing," he said. "Progress without higher unemployment, for now."

How have the Fed's rate hikes managed to help substantially slow inflation without also causing dire consequences? And can the job market and the economy maintain their durability even with the Fed intending to keep borrowing rates at a peak well into 2024?

Here are some reasons for the economy's unexpected resilience and a look at whether it might endure:

Replenished supplies have helped cool inflation

The idea that defeating high inflation would require sharply higher unemployment is based on a long-time economic model



that may prove ill-suited for the post-pandemic episode.

Claudia Sahm, a former Fed economist, suggested that those who assumed that surging unemployment was a necessary price to pay for conquering inflation believed that the price spikes of the past 2 1/2 years were driven mostly by overheated demand. Shut-in consumers did ramp up their spending on patio furniture, exercise bikes and home office equipment as stimulus checks landed in their bank accounts.

But to quell demand-fueled inflation, the Fed's policies would have needed to crush spending, causing sales to plunge and forcing businesses to cut jobs. Yet inflation has cooled even as Americans as as whole have continued to spend freely on shopping, traveling and entertainment.

"The fact that we have the economy healing without unemployment moving up, without consumption slowing a lot—that suggests that really the driver of this was something else," said Alan Detmeister, a former Fed economist now at

Detmeister and other economists increasingly think that the supply disruptions of the pandemic and Russia's invasion of Ukraine played the biggest role in accelerating inflation. Even as spending on goods soared, spending on services declined, leaving overall demand roughly

in line with pre-pandemic trends. This inflationary episode, Detmeister said, may end up more closely resembling the one that occurred after World War II than the one of the late 1970s and early 1980s. After World War II, manufacturing output slowed as factories retooled from wartime production. At the same time, many returning servicemembers moved to the suburbs, and demand spiked for homes, appliances and furniture. Even so, inflation eased once output resumed.

In a recent study, Mike Konczal, a director at the Roosevelt Institute think tank, found that the prices of nearly three-quarters of goods and services have declined as quantities have increased. This suggested to him that rising supplies have been the primary reason why inflation has declined. (The figures exclude volatile food and gas prices in order to capture

underlying trends.)
It's unclear how much longer this trend can continue to help slow inflation. Susan Collins, president of the Federal Reserve Bank of Boston, said Friday that the supply rebound has indeed eased inflation in goods. But the cost of most services, she said, "has yet to show the sustained improvement" that's needed to bring inflation down to the Fed's 2% target.

Konczal remains optimistic. Inflation is slowing in many services categories, including restaurants, laundry services and veterinary care, even without much of a drop in demand.

"The disinflation we're seeing," he wrote in his study, "is therefore broad and could continue."

The job market has changed Another supply improvement has occurred in the job market: The supply of labor. Since the Fed began raising rates last year, about 3.4 million people have begun looking for work. One big driver factor has been a rebound in immigration that followed the easing of pandemicera restrictions.

And more job-seekers are still coming off the sidelines. The proportion of adults in their prime working years — ages 25 through 54 — who either have a job or are looking for one has reached its highest point in two decades.

At the same time, businesses appear to need fewer workers. But instead of cutting jobs, they are seeking fewer new employees. The number of open jobs has sunk from more than 12 million last year to 8.8 million in July, though it's still well above its pre-pandemic level. And fewer people are quitting jobs in search of higher pay elsewhere.

Powell noted last week that fewer job openings and more workers mean the labor market has been brought into better balance. This has taken the pressure off companies to raise wages to find and keep workers. Still, with inflation having eased, hourly pay is now growing faster than prices.

Even among businesses that worry about the economic outlook, many are more reluctant to cut jobs than in the past. Jay Starkman, CEO of Engage PEO, which provides human resources services to small companies, said many employers seem "hung over" from the rapid layoffs and then rapid

rehiring that occurred during and after the pandemic recession of 2020.

"Employers today are saying, 'Well, my business is a little down. I can stomach holding on to these employees for now. I really don't want to go through having to find and then train good employees again.' "

Consumers and businesses have kept going

Another reason why high interest rates haven't caused unemployment to jump is that many households and companies were better insulated from rate hikes than in the past.

Americans as a whole saved a sizable chunk of the thousands of dollars of stimulus checks and enhanced unemployment benefits they received during the pandemic. Those savings helped propel consumer spending well into this year.

Fed officials are watching to see how long those savings will continue to buoy spending. Americans are running up more credit card debt, a sign that their savings are running out. Bank of America has said that credit card balances for its upper- and middle-income clients remain below pre-pandemic levels but have grown sharply for lower-income groups.

Businesses, particularly large ones, also took advantage of lower rates in 2020 and 2021 to refinance debt, thereby locking in lower payments. As a result, rate hikes haven't necessarily raised their borrowing costs. Over time, according to a report from the Federal Reserve's Boston branch, much of that borrowing will have to be refinanced at higher rates. Profit growth could then suffer, and companies may lay off workers.

For now, some businesses are also benefiting from government subsidies in legislation pushed by the Biden administration, including measures to boost investment in infrastructure, renewable energy and semiconductor manufacturing. Spending on new factories has jumped in response.

"We've had a supply-side revival — driven, in part, by public investment," said Daleep Singh, chief global economist at PGIM Fixed Income, and formerly a top economic official in the administration.

Last week, the Fed's policy-makers revised their economic projections to show core inflation — excluding volatile food and energy — amounting to 2.6% by the end of next year, down from 4.2% now, according to the Fed's preferred measure. At the same time, they foresee unemployment edging up to just 4.1% — lower than their June forecast of 4.5% for 2024.

"If we actually get an outcome like that ... without a recession, that's a really good outcome, given the scope of the shock," said William English, a former senior Fed official who is now a professor at Yale School of Management.

Online gaming companies to collect 28% on full bet value, offshore platforms to be GST registered from October 1

NEW DELHI, Oct 1 (Agencies): From October 1, online gaming companies will charge 28 per cent GST on full value of bets, while offshore platforms too would be required to have GST registration to operate in India.

The finance ministry notified October 1 as the appointed date for the amended provisions in Central GST and Integrated GST laws to come into effect.

E-gaming companies, however, flagged that since many states are yet to pass amendments in their respective State GST (SGST) laws, this notification by the union government in CGST and IGST laws will create confusion.

According to the changes to the Central GST Act, online gaming, casinos and horse racing will henceforth be treated as "actionable claims" similar to lottery, betting and gambling and subject to 28 per cent Goods and Services Tax (GST) on full face value of bets.

The amendments to Integrated GST (IGST) Act makes it mandatory for off-shore online gaming platforms to take registration in India and pay 28 per cent tax in accordance with the domestic law. The amendments will also provide for blocking access to online gaming platforms located overseas in case of failure to comply with registration and tax payment provisions.

In its meetings in July and August, the GST Council, comprising finance ministers of Centre and states, had approved amendments to the law to include online gaming, casinos and horse racing as taxable actionable claims, and clarified that such supplies would attract 28 per cent tax on full bet value.

Parliament last month passed amendments to the Central GST and Integrated GST laws to give effect to the Council's decision. Following that, rules for valuation by these companies were also notified on September 6.

The finance ministry has now notified that October 1 will be the appointed date for implementation of these provisions. In a letter to Revenue Secretary Sanjay Malhotra, All India Gaming Federation (AIGF) sought to know that with around 15 states yet to make changes to their respective State GST laws, what would be GST treatment that ought to be adopted by online gaming companies registered in those states in relation to deposits received from players of those states. It requested the Centre to "reconsider these notifications and suspend them till all the states pass their respective amendments, in line with the scheme of GST and the judgment of the Supreme Court of India and in the meanwhile, address the aforesaid issues vide necessary clarifications so that at an operational level, the industry has some clarity and can accordingly align its processes and technology."

EY Tax Partner Saurabh Agarwal said online gaming companies will also need to create a data repository to store customer information and other data required for undertaking GST compliances in India for a specified period of time.

"It is important for online money gaming companies to comply with the new GST regulations in order to avoid any penalties in the future," Agarwal said

KPMG Indirect Tax Head & Partner, Abhishek Jain said with the said provisions being made effective from October 1, industry needs to ensure appropriate readiness for adoption of the revised taxation.

"While most provisions for the revised taxability have been notified, ambiguity on certain matters continue including classification of the supplies made, time of supply, transition provisions, etc," Jain said.

AIGF Spokesperson said the central government has notified the applicability of the new GST regime for online gaming from October 1, 2023. However, it seems that multiple states have not passed the amendment to their State GST Act.

"This is creating a conundrum where the online gaming companies in such states will have to charge CGST but not SGST. At the same time in states where the amendment has been done, both CGST and SGST will be charged.

"In this light the industry is hoping that the government will take cognizance of the situation and allow reasonable time to the industry for transition," the AIGF spokesperson said.

The GST Council in its meeting in August had decided that the amended provision to classify these supplies as actionable claims and clarifying the taxation provisions would come into effect from October 1.

A review of the implementation was proposed to be carried out after six months, which is April 2024.

A host of online gaming, like Dream11, and casino operator, like Delta Corp, have received GST show cause notices in this month for alleged short payment of taxes. Separately, a show cause notice was sent to GamesKraft in September last year for alleged GST evasion of Rs 21,000 crore.

While the Karnataka High Court has ruled in favour of the company, the Centre in July filed a Special Leave Petition (SLP) in the Supreme Court. While staying the HC order, the Supreme Court listed the matter for next hearing on October 10.

Apple to hire more people in UK to work on AI: Tim Cook

LONDON, Oct 1 (Agencies): Apple CEO Tim Cook has revealed plans to hire more employees in the UK, as the iPhone maker aims to double down on work in the field of artificial intelligence (AI)

Cook, who has always called layoffs as a "last resort", told PA news agency during his visit to the country that Apple is looking to ramp up hiring in Britain.

When asked about AI and jobs in the UK, he said: "We're hiring in that area, yes, and so I do expect (investment) to increase."

Cook said that AI was behind several prominent features on Apple products. "It's literally everywhere on our prod-

"It's literally everywhere on our products and of course we're also researching generative AI as well, so we have a lot going on," he was quoted as saying in the report. "Al is behind the Fall Detection on the (Apple) Watch, it's behind Crash Detection, it's behind Afib (atrial fibrillation) detection, it's behind the ECG, it's predictive typing on iPhone," Cook added.

Culture Secretary Michelle Donelan said Apple's decision was "another vote of confidence in our burgeoning tech sector"

"Apple's ongoing investment in brilliant British talent highlights our global credentials as both an AI and technology superpower," she posted on X.

Apple also revealed that it now supports more than 550,000 jobs across the UK through direct employment and other means, and has a new office in Cambridge where several hundred staff are working on AI, machine learning and other projects, reports Standard.

Blood substances to help identify long Covid-19 patients discovered in new research

Long Covid patients also exhibited an increased antibody circulation and markedly lower levels of hormone cortisol, released by body under stress, compared to those not infected by SARS-CoV-2.

NEW DELHI, Oct 1 (Agencies): Blood biomarkers for long Covid, or specific blood substances indicating the disease, have been identified, and could be used to accurately distinguish patients with the disease, scientists report in a new research published in the journal Nature.

The long Covid patients also exhibited an increased antibody circulation and markedly lower levels of the hormone cortisol, released

by body under stress, compared to those not infected by SARS-CoV-2, they said.


The antibodies circulating also included those that help the body fight non-Covid viruses, such as the Epstein-Barr virus, which is a human herpes-causing virus linked with many cancers, the scientists from Yale University and other US institutes found by analysing the

patients' blood samples.
"The work is a decisive step forward in the

development of valid and reliable blood testing protocols for long COVID," said principal investigator David Putrino, from the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai, New York, US.

Further, "the findings can inform more sensitive testing and personalised treatments for long COVID patients," said Putrino.

For the study, the researchers recruited 271 patients between January 2021 and June



2022 and grouped them as such - those with no prior SARS-CoV-2 infection; those fully recovered from a clinically confirmed case of COVID-19; those with active long COVID symptoms for at least four months after confirmed COVID-19 infection.

The researchers analysed the patients' blood samples and applied machine learning algorithms to determine the biomarkers most effective for identifying patients with long-term COVID-19.

The patients were also

asked to respond to questionnaires enquiring about their symptoms, medical history, and health-related quality of life.

The researchers said that the algorithm was 96 per cent accurate in

identifying people with and without long Covid and that it detected the condition based on the distinct features exhibited by the affected participants' blood - those of enhanced antibody circulation and low levels of cortisol production.

"These markers need to be validated in larger studies, but provide a first step in dissecting the disease pathogenesis of long COVID," said co-principal investigator Akiko Iwasaki, professor of immunobiology and

of molecular, cellular & developmental biology at Yale School of Medicine.

"There is no 'silver

bullet' for treating long COVID, because it is an illness that infiltrates complex systems such as the immune and hormonal regulation. Complex illnesses require complex treatment solutions and we need more rapid research to better understand long COVID and discover new and promising therapies," said Putrino.

Gavaskar picks this team as favourites for ICC **Cricket World Cup**

Indian batting legend highlights importance of warm-up matches ahead of world cup

NEW DELHI, Oct 1 (Agencies): Indian batting legend Sunil Gavaskar has picked England as his favourite for the ICC Cricket World Cup, citing their batting and bowling talent as a reason.

"The defending champions, England because of the kind of talent that they have at, at the top of the order, the batting order, they have got two or three world-class all-rounders who can change the game with both bat and ball. They have also got a very good bowling line-up, experienced bowling lineup, so at the moment in my book certainly," Gavaskar said on Star Sports.

He also highlighted the importance of warm-up matches and shared his experience of having a great team bonding in the 1983 World Cup.

"It affects massively because when you talked about that 1983, we played their two games against the minor counties, we lost both those games but there was so much to learn from both those games. Mind you, that was early June,



towards the end of May specifically and it was really cold and the pitches were green and the ball was seeming around, so even minor county bowlers can make you look a little ordinary and that is exactly what happened but it gave us a lot to think about," he said.

"The fact that we had just beaten the West Indies in the West Indies a couple of months earlier, gave us the belief that sure this is just the kind of wakeup call that you need. This is just the kind of thing that you need to know that in England, the pitches are going to be different, the conditions are going to be different, and the ball will move around in the air off the surface, so better be prepared for that.

"But the best part about travelling in England is that you are travelling in a team bus, where there is very little chance of groups being formed because the coach itself is such that you keep moving around, people bump into each other, they are a bit of a mateship, leg pulling, if I might call it that, a little bit of teasing here and there and then maybe watching a little bit of the video, which is put up in a video

movie. But it builds a spirit of togetherness, you understand each other and I think that is probably one of the best things that can happen. In an aircraft, when you travel from, what can you do in an aircraft? You cannot go and talk to the person behind in your seat, that's very difficult. So I think that is what helped us in 1983 for sure," he added.

Irfan Pathan has also named his World Cup favourites.

"I am very excited to see how India performs and I really think they are one of the favourites, for sure because especially last couple of series, like Asia Cup, and the way India played against Australia as well in the home conditions. India beat Pakistan by 10-2 in hockey; captain Harmanpreet hits four

HANGZHOU, Oct 1 (Agencies): Captain Harmanpreet Singh found the net four times as a rampaging India hammered Pakistan 10-2 to record their biggest-ever win over the arch-rivals in a one-sided Pool A match to book a semifinal berth in the men's hockey competition at the Asian Games here on Saturday.

Harmanpreet scored in the 11th, 17th, 33rd and 34th minutes while Varun Kumar (41st and 54th) struck twice. Mandeep Singh (8th), Sumit (30th), Samsher Singh (46th) and Lalit Kumar Upadhyay (49th) were the other goal getters.

Pakistan reduced the margin through Muhammad Khan (38th) and Abdul Rana (45th) as India toyed their opponents for large part of their penultimate pool match.

This was the 180th match between the two teams and the 8-goal margin win was the biggest-ever in the history of India-Pakistan hockey.

India's earlier biggest victory margin was 7-1 against Pakistan registered in 2017.



Pakistan's 7-1 win in the final of 1982 Asian Games in New Delhi was their biggest win against India.

India, thus, exacted revenge of that humiliating loss 41 years ago through Saturday's match. India collected 12 points from four consecutive wins to stay on

top of the pool. India will play Bangladesh on October 2 in their last Pool A match.

Pakistan earned their second penalty corner in the 28th minute but failed to get past veteran Indian goalkeeper PR Sreejesh.

Just seconds before halftime, Sumit struck with a fierce reverse hit. The Pakistanis went for a review but lost and trailed 0-4 at the halfway mark.

India made it 5-0 three minutes after the change of ends with Harmanpret converting another penalty stroke after the ball hit a Pakistani player's foot.

Initially, the referee gave a penalty corner but India successfully reviewed for a penalty stroke.

It turned into a rout for Pakistan as India earned three backto-back penalty corners and Harmanpreet struck his fourth goal of the day with a fine drag

Varun, Shamsher and Lalit too joined the party with field goals in the 41st, 46th and 49th minutes.

"People Were Telling Me I Was...": **Virat Kohli Opens Up On Frustrating Time Ahead Of World Cup**



HYDERABAD, Oct 1 (Agencies): Virat Kohli will be featuring in his fourth ODI World Cup as Team India look to end a 10-year drought for an ICC trophy. Kohli, who made his World Cup debut in 2011, was part of the MS Dhoni-led side that defeated Sri Lanka to lift the trophy in Mumbai. After overcoming a rough patch, Kohli has been in tremendous form this year in ODIs, scoring five centuries, while also becoming the fastest batter to register 13,000 runs in

the format. With 47 ODI

centuries in total, Kohli is on the cusp of surpassing his idol Sachin Tendulkar's all-time tally of 49 as he gets set to lead India's charge at the World Cup.

Reflecting on his rough patch, Kohli said the past few years have been a massive learning curve for him.

"The last two and a half years have taught me a lot. Those angry celebrations are a thing of the past. I have had many suggestions, lots of advice has come my way; people were telling me I was doing this wrong, that wrong," Kohli told ICC.

"I picked out all the videos from the best time I had, same initial movement, same approach towards the ball and it was just what was happening inside my head, I wasn't able to explain it to anyone," he added.
