MeT predicts rain, Snow in Kashmir **Tonight**

SRINAGAR, Oct 9 (Agencies): The Meteorological Department J&K has predicted rain and snowfall in the higher reaches of various locations in Kashmir by Monday evening.

In its latest weather update, the MeT department forecasts snow/rain in the higher areas of J&K, particularly in North Kashmir, by the evening of 9th October.

Regarding today's weather, there is no major forecast for rain or snow in J&K on Monday.

The department also anticipates light rain or snow at isolated places in J&K on Tuesday, 10th October. However, from 11th to 13th October (Wednesday to Friday), the weather is expected to remain mainly dry in the Union Territory.

Armed suspect robs **Indian**origin man's store in US flees with cash

NEW YORK, Oct 9 (Agencies): Police are on the lookout for an armed suspect who robbed a store owned by an Indian-origin man in the US state of Virginia and fled with cash, a media report said.

Shyamal Patel's Smokies Lounge smoke shop on Woods Edge Road was robbed at around 5am on Sunday when the suspect pointed a gun at the clerk, demanding cash, WRIC TV channel reported.

The Chesterfield County Police Department said the masked suspect wore a grey hoodie, dark pants, black shoes, and fled with an undisclosed amount of money.

"A male with an unknown race, about 5 feet and 6 inches tall with a medium build," police said.

Patel told the channel that this was not the first time that his store was robbed at gunpoint.

In April this year, two armed men robbed the store and fled with an unknown amount of cash, Patel said, adding that the men had since been arrested with the efforts of local police.

He suspects that in the most recent robbery, the man is likely his former employee who worked

Polls in J&K will be held at 'Right Time' keeping security situation in mind: EC

NEW DELHI, Oct 9 (Agencies): The Election Commission on Monday said polls in Jammu and Kashmir will be held at the "right time" keeping in mind the security situation there.

Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) Rajiv Kumar said this while speaking at a press conference to announce the schedule for assembly elections in five states

The polls in Jammu and Kashmir will be held when the commission deems it the "right time" keeping in mind the security situation and other polls being held in the union territory, he said.



In response to another ques-

tion, Kumar said announce-

ments of freebies always have the 'tadka' of populism and the public has the right to know from where the freebies will come.

Chhattisgarh, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, Telangana and Mizoram will go to polls on different days from November 7-30 and votes will be counted for the five states on December 3, the Election Commission said, setting the stage for the 2024 Lok Sabha polls semi-

This will be the last set of assembly elections ahead of the Lok Sabha polls next year.

LEADERSHIP _ STYLES

eadership style means the pattern of behaviour a leader follows or adopts for influencing the followers or the subordinates working in the enterprise. What style of leadership a leader adopts depends on an array of factors such as his personality traits, value system and experience.

Leadership style varies from person to person at the same point of time and may also vary from one situation to another situation by the same leader.

Behavioural pattern adopted by a leader while influencing his followers is called as a leadership style. What style of leadership a leader adopts depends on an array of factors such as his personality traits, value system and experience. Leadership style varies from person to person at the same point of time and may also vary from one situation to another situation by the same leader.

An autocratic leader exercises strict control over his subordinates. He dominates the group and gives orders with an expectation of fulfillment without any queries. Such a leader believes in maintaining a formal authority relationships, strictly following one-way communication and has least trust and confidence in his subordinates.

Leaders with authoritative behavioural pattern motivate subordinates with the tools of punishments, threats and penalties. In autocratic leadership style, decision-making is centralised with the leader, subordinates are perceived as mere recipients of orders and work environment is tense.

Participative leader also called as democratic leader invites inputs from the subordinates on company issues before taking any decision. Participative leadership involves all team members both in terms of identification of goals as well as devising policies and strategies to achieve such goals. In this type of leadership, ample freedom of opinion is given to subordinates and two-way communication is encouraged. Democratic leaders use rewards and appreciations as tools to motivate their subordinates.

Under free rein leadership also called as laissez-faire, it may be said that virtually there is no leadership. Though the performance standards and objectives are set, subordinates are given full autonomy to decide and plan how to achieve these objectives. The entire decisionmaking responsibility is passed on to the subordinates with least intervention of leader.

Good leaders use all the three styles of leadership, though, however, only one of them dominates at a point of time.

Authoritarian (Autocratic) style is used when the leader tells his employees what he wants and how he wants it done, without getting the advice of his followers. Some of the appropriate conditions when this style is used are when leader has all the information to solve the problem, he is short on time, and his employees are well motivated.

Some people tend to think that this style is leading by threats and abusing their power. This is not the authoritarian style rather it is an abusive unprofessional style called bossing people around which has no place in a leader's profile.

The authoritarian style should only be used on rare occasions. If leaders have the time and want to gain commitment and motivation from the employees, they should use the participative style.

Participative (Democratic) style involves the leader and one or more employees in the decision-making process (determining what to do and how to do). However, the leader maintains the final decision-making authority. Using this style is not a sign of weakness; rather it is a sign of strength that employees respect and are committed to.

This style is normally used when leader has part of the information, and employees have other parts. A leader is not expected to know everything — this is why he employs knowledgeable and skillful employees. Using this style is of mutual benefit to both, leader and the followers. It allows followers to become part of the team and leader to make better decisions.

In Delegate (Free Reign) style of leadership, leader allows the employees to make decisions. However, the leader remains responsible for the decisions that are made by employees. This style is used when employees are able to analyze the situation and determine what needs to be done and how to do it. The leader cannot do everything. He sets priorities and delegates certain tasks to employees.

Will Michelle replace Biden to take on Trump in 2024?

he's on vacation aboard film director Steven Spielberg's yacht, somewhere in European waters. But when she returns home, the stage seems set for Michelle Obama to have a close encounter with power of the highest kind: as presidential candidate of the US Democratic Party in election year 2024.

Incumbent President Joe Biden is bent on contesting again. But the nearly 81-year-old's cognitive skills are deteriorating fast. He has fallen off bicycles, tripped on aircraft steps, stumbled on wires, staggered into flagpoles and wandered aimlessly on stages after appearances. He mumbles and forgets names, he nods off during meetings, he drops brick after embarrassing brick.

Little wonder that voices have been growing louder for former First Lady Michelle Obama to enter the arena. For it is she, not any current Democratic hopeful and certainly not President Biden, who is likeliest to defeat the current Republican forerunner, former President Donald Trump.

Since the beginning of this year, poll after opinion poll has confirmed Mr Biden's declining ratings, Mr Trump's lead over all the other Republican hopefuls, and Michelle Obama's popularity across the political spectrum.

In a recent Washington Post survey, Mr Biden won the approval of only 37 per cent --10 points lower than Donald Trump.

In a poll conducted by AP/NORC, 88 per cent of Americans (69 per cent of Democrats) think Mr Biden is too old for a second term. Another fear looms large. Even if Mr Biden wins, he is expected to retire mid-term -- and bring his even more unpopular deputy, vice-president Kamala Harris, to

Ms Harris' approval ratings have remained low throughout

her vice-presidency. A recent NBC News survey found that she had the lowest rating (32 per cent) for any vice-president since the 1990s.

But since ditching Kamala Harris alone won't guarantee a victory for the Democrats, it is Mr Biden who is being urged by analysts on all sides of the political divide to bow out of the race.

Earlier this year, the Centre Square Voters' Voice Poll found that Mr Biden may coast to victory over other Democratic potentials like Robert F. Kennedy Jr, former New York City mayor Bill de Blasio or even popular California governor Gavin Newsom. But if pitched against Michelle Obama, he would get only 36 per cent, whereas Ms Obama would win 48 per cent of the vote.

It is early days yet to test Michelle Obama's strength against that of Donald Trump himself. However, the reactions of Republican leaders to the very thought of her candidature show that she is expected to rock the boat.

"If they (Democrats) were to run Michelle Obama, that would put us in a very difficult position because they'd reach for a candidate who is completely plausible, very popular, and immune to criticism," former Trump aide Monica Crowley had warned at a Republican gathering in Florida way back in 2022 itself. More recently, Republican Senator Ted Cruz described what he called "the most likely and dangerous scenario in August 2024". He said that the Democrats will "jettison Biden and parachute in Michelle Obama".

Former GOP vice-presidential nominee Sarah Palin, too, says that the Democrats will go with Michelle Obama. "Don't be surprised. It'll be Michelle O's #2024Election. Biden's out", she posted on X (formerly Twitter).

Ms Obama's support base

consists primarily of Americans below 55, women's groups, childless voters, the LGBT community and young parents.

She may have only been the spouse of a former President, but Michelle Obama qualifies eminently. She is an attorney with degrees from Princeton University and Harvard Law School. She is the author of four books. She has campaigned against Donald Trump in 2020, advocated several causes, worked in non-profit groups, in community service and for poverty awareness. She has faced vile abuse and criticism with grace. "Barack and I have been in the public eye for many years now, and we've developed a thick skin along the way. When you're out campaigning, there will always be criticism... it comes with the territory," she once said.

Michelle Obama has emerged a winner in surveys since the beginning of her husband's presidency. In 2009, she was named popular show host Barbara Walters' Most Fascinating Person of the Year. In April 2012, she received the NCHV Award from homeless veterans along with her husband. In 2015, she received it again. In three Gallup polls from 2018 to 2020, Ms Obama remained "the most admired woman" in the United States.

She has been Time magazine's Woman of the Year and was inducted into the National Women's Hall of Fame.

Further and due to eight years in the White House, Michelle Obama is well-versed with the duties and challenges of the world's most powerful office.

She is much younger than both Mr Trump and Mr Biden. She would be the first woman President and the first fully African-American person to be elected to that position.

And unlike Republican contender Donald Trump, who has not only been indicted but is now being accused of sharing nuclear secrets with a foreign-

er, Ms Obama has an unblemished track record, unmarred by scandals and rumours.

And finally, her children are now old enough for her to focus entirely on the presidency.

The Democratic National Committee has ruled out primary debates ahead of 2024. Still, both voters and senior Democratic leaders have been pushing for candidates to "prove" themselves ahead of 2024.

Interestingly, even African-American Democrats are now demanding in public that current V-P Kamala Harris "prove" herself ahead of the election, and that her being Mr Biden's running mate against "is not a given". Their remarks are being interpreted as a door being opened to let Michelle Obama in.

Conservative website "The Hill" writes that a Michelle victory would revive the charisma of Barack Obama's presidency, one that persists till date. "Giving Michelle Obama the ticket would give Democrats their best chance of winning in 2024," commented the site.

"There are three things certain in life: death, taxes and Michelle is not running for President," Barack Obama had said way back in 2016, when asked whether his wife would ever enter the contest.

Last week, the former President dodged the same question, when leaving a restaurant in Los Angeles. His wife, too, has said that she "never had the passion for politics" and has ruled out her candidature several times.

But to audiences old and young, Michelle Obama has also been an inspirational motivator

"Just try new things. Don't be afraid. Step out of your comfort zones and soar, all right?" she once urged students of Harvard University.

Will she walk that talk now?

Why do we need tests and grades?

arks and rankings are the currency of education and advancement. But they are flawed and unfair assessments. Off the Mark: How Grades, Ratings, and Rankings Undermine Learning (but Don't Have To) by Jack Schneider and Ethan L Hutt, is set in the US, but analyses this global dilemma.

Why do we need tests and grades? To motivate learners, to succinctly record their abilities, communicate these to other institutions, and signal to employers. But they don't work that way: grades goad students, but not their learning. Students

don't waste time on anything that won't be tested. Grading skews incentives, as students cheat or game the system. Marks also sharpen inequalities. The strongest predictor of marks is a student's family and neighbourhood; affluent parents exert more pressure and provide more support.

Then comes the standardised test, first devised in 19th century America for a uniform diagnosis of varied student populations. Unfortunately, they have been used as snapshots of ability that become lasting portraits of inequality. The test-takers did not ask whether the content of the test measured biological intelligence or social opportunities. The standardised test became educational destiny.

But what blanket critiques of standardised tests miss is that they are not all the same. 'Norm-reference' tests, meant to place a student in a particular distribution, can identify those who are very advanced and those who need special assistance. Meanwhile, 'criterion-reference' tests are used to check if a student has reached a particular standard.

This targeted assistance for identified weaknesses can make all the difference to students and can be a tool of educational equity. If someone is near sighted, then they are not told they have a permanent deficiency, they are prescribed glasses. It's when a result is treated as the end of the story, rather than the impetus for intervention, that there's a problem.

School is supposed to be the great equaliser of social opportunity, but it doesn't work that way. Standardised tests do take away the high-stakes pressure of school grades, but both are correlated with socioeconomic status. But then again, so are student essays, for which they often rely on their net- works. Recommendation letters can be hard to parse, a mess of adjectives and writing styles. There is no easy fix for fairness, the only way is to use nuanced judgments, knowing that these useful tools can also be weapons. The predicament of marking and testing is a wicked problem, the whole world struggles with similar frustrations. Countries experiment with different elements

and weights. Zambia assesses students with 75% on national exams and 25% on school grades. New Zealand measures progress in secondary school through a pass-fail system, not grades, reducing both competition and gaming. At higher levels, it adds distinctions for merit and excellence, to let students compete. Singapore has recently flattened its ranking systems, after deciding it was unhealthy. Another way is to peg tests to practice: for instance, instead of multiplechoice questions for history, it makes sense to do what historians do, piece fragments from the archive to offer an interpretation of the past.

The book shows that we need to go beyond the usual either/or framing about marks and exams. We need to look at the specific uses of each tool, and within the context of broader goals. We need to recalibrate rather than reinvent



Rest in peace: British filmmaker Terence Davies passes away at 77



British filmmaker Terence Davies known for Distant Voices, Still Lives, The Deep Blue Sea and The Long Day Closes has passed away. He was 77. Though his films received a lot of praise for their sympathetic portravals of LGBT life, Catholicism, and other common topics, they didn't win a lot of awards.

Born into a large Catholic family in Liverpool, Davies left school at 16 and worked for 10 years as a clerk before attending Coventry Drama School. His first short, Children, was autobiographical, and written while he was at school. He then attended the National Film School, where he made Madonna and Child, another autobiographical work about his years as a

For The Neon Bible in 1995, Davies adapted a novel by John Kennedy Toole, and it received a Bafta nomination for best British film. After Of Time and the City, a documentary that was screened outside of competition at Cannes in 2008 and received a lot of praise, Davies switched to documentaries. The documentary paid homage to his hometown of Liverpool by including several literary, musical, and cinematic allusions.

The Deep Blue Sea, an adaptation of a play by Terence Rattigan, won the NY Film Critics Circle award for Rachel Weisz, and again garnered highly positive reviews. In 2015, he was finally able to complete Sunset Song and followed it with A Quiet Passion, about Emily Dickinson, and Benediction, based upon poet Siegfried Sassoon.

"Today is a historic day in the relations between India and Tanzania. Today, we are tying

our age-old friendship into a strategic partnership," he said in presence of Hassan.

In the field of defence, we have agreed on a five-year roadmap. Modi said, adding it will add new dimensions to cooperation in areas like military training, maritime sphere and defence industries.

The prime minister also noted that India and Tanzania are "unanimous" that terrorism is the "most serious security threat to humanity".

We have decided to increase mutual cooperation in the field of counter-terrorism. he said.

Modi also called Tanzania an important partner in the Indo-Pacific.

Earlier, in the day, the visiting leader was accorded a ceremonial welcome at the forecourt of Rashtrapati Bhawan.

President Hassan arrived here on Sunday on a four-day visit.

"BJP Will Form Government In All 5 States": JP Nadda **After Poll Dates Announced**



NEW DELHI, Oct 9 (Agencies): BJP president J P Nadda on Monday welcomed the election commission's (EC) announcement of assembly polls in five states and claimed his party will form government in all the states with a big majority under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership.

"The BJP will form government in all states with a big majority under respected Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership and will work with commitment to fulfil people's aspirations in the next five years," he said on X, soon after the EC's announcement of the poll schedule.

Five state assemblies of Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Rajasthan, Telangana and Mizoram will go to polls on different days beginning November 7 and counting of votes will take place on December 3.

Prepare 'counter-narrative' to confront Modi's poll propaganda, says Mallikarjun Kharge

NEW DELHI. Oct 9 (Agencies): In view of the upcoming Assembly elections in five states and the general election, Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge on Monday told the Congress Working Committee members to prepare "counter-narratives" to confront "falsehoods" propagated by PM Narendra Modi.

"The Prime Minister's absence in Manipur stands in sharp contrast to his frequent visits to the election-going states. His baseless attacks filled with lies and falsehoods on the Congress party will only increase in the coming days. It is essential that we counter these falsehoods and create our own counter-narrative," Kharge said in his opening remarks made at the CWC meeting under way here on Monday.

Kharge said it is important that the party worked with a meticulous coordination and complete discipline and unity in view of the coming elections.

Kharge asked the CWC members to

make enhanced efforts to highlight government failures and raise concerns affecting the common people.

"Today, our nation faces inflation, unemployment, and government's failure to implement the old pension scheme. The ruling party's divisive tactics and misuse of autonomous bodies pose a threat to democratic stability," Kharge said.

The Congress president asked his colleagues in the CWC, the party's highest decisionmaking body, to "propagate the exemplary work of Congress-led state governments and past Congress governments" to instill faith in the public that the Congress would guarantee a "brighter future".

Kharge said while the Women's Reservation Bill was recently

passed in Parliament, questions remained about its implementation and exclusion of OBC aspitants from the seats reserved for women. "We resolve to implement women's reservation, including extending reservation to OBC women, when we come to power in 2024," Kharge said.

Reiterating the Congress's demand for a caste census, Kharge said it is crucial for effective implementation of government programmes and welfare schemes.

The Gandhis (Sonia, Rahul and Priyanka), chief ministers of the Congress-ruled states and other CWC members are taking part in the deliberations, which is the second meeting of the revamped body constituted by Kharge in August this year.

In the first meeting held in Hyderabad last month, the CWC pledged to rid the country of divisive politics, strengthen social justice, and provide a responsible and responsive government.

Seven people killed after bus crashes into ditch in Uttarakhand's Nainital

NAINITAL, Oct 9 (Agencies): At least seven people, including five women, one man, and one child, were killed after a bus coming from Haryana crashed into a ditch in Nainital district, an official said on Monday.

So far 28 people have been rescued and further rescue operations are underway, a State Disaster Response Force (SDRF) official

The bodies of the deceased have been recovered and handed over to the civil police by the SDRF, they said.

According to the officials, the Disaster Control Room in Nainital notified SDRF on Sunday that a bus thought to be carrying 30 to 33 people had crashed into a ditch at Nalni on Kaladhungi

As per the instructions

of Commandant SDRF Manikant Mishra, SDRF rescue teams from Post Rudrapur, Nainital, and Khairna immediately left for the spot for rescue.

After reaching the spot, it was found that there were 33 people on the said bus that came from Hisar, Haryana, to visit Nainital.

The bus went out of control at the spot and crashed into a ditch about 200 metres deep,



the officials said.

The SDRF rescue team reached the spot and conducted a joint rescue operation with the NDRF, local police, and other rescue units.

26 injured people aboard the bus were rescued and taken to the hospital for treatment in the pitch dark and extremely adverse conditions of the night.

3 charred to death after livestock-laden truck catches fire in Gujarat

ARVALLI, Oct 9 (Agencies): A couple, their six-year-old daughter and 150 goats and sheep were charred to death when a truck they were travelling in caught fire after coming in contact with an overhead high-tension wire in Gujarat's Arvalli district on Monday, police said.

The fire engulfed the vehicle carrying three members of a shepherd family from Rajasthan and their livestock in Bamanwad village around 9 am, a police official said.



The incident took place when the truck driver turned the vehicle towards a grazing land, over which a high-tension wire was running, Sub-Inspector (SI) Komal Rathod said.

"The truck came in contact with the hightension wire and was

engulfed in flames after a short-circuit that killed three members of a family and 150 goats and sheep," the SI said. Rathod further said the couple was in the age group of 25 to 30 years and their identity

was yet to be ascer-

tained.

Bus overturns on Lucknow-Agra expressway, 34 passengers injured

LUCKNOW, Oct 9 (Agencies): A bus travelling from Noida to Varanasi expressway in Uttar Pradesh, overturned after hitting the divider leaving 34 passengers on the bus injured, said police on Monday.

The accident happened in the wee hours on Monday. All injured have been admitted to the Community Health Centre in Fatehabad with nine of them in critical condition.

According to reports, the private bus left Noida for Varanasi carrying passengers at 9.30pm on Sunday night. Around 1.30am the bus reached near milestone 20 of Agra Lucknow Expressway.

As soon as it reached here, the bus went out of control and hit the divider and overturned.

Fatehabad Police and UPEDA security officers Radhamohan Dwivedi, Sovran Singh reached the spot along with the team.

Thirty-four passengers from the bus were taken out in injured condition and taken to CHC Fatehabad. Of these, nine were sent to medical emergency in critical

The police have informed the relatives. Sources said that the bus driver possibly fell asleep and the vehicle went out of control

9 people killed in Tamil Nadu cracker unit fire

Israel intensifies Gaza strikes and battles to repel Hamas, over 1,100 dead in fighting

More than two days after Hamas launched its unprecedented incursion out of Gaza, Israeli forces were still battling with militants holed up in several locations.

JERUSALEM, Oct 9 (Agencies): Israel intensified its bombardments of the Gaza Strip on Monday after declaring war and vowing to destroy the "military and governing capabilities" of the enclave's Hamas rulers, as Israeli soldiers fought to dislodge Gaza gunmen from areas of southern Israel.

At least 700 people have reportedly been killed in Israel — a staggering toll on a scale the country has not experienced in decades - and more than 400 have been killed in Gaza. Palestinian militant groups claimed to be holding over 130 captives from the Israeli side.

More than two days after Hamas launched its unprecedented incursion out of Gaza, Israeli forces were still battling with militants holed up in several locations.

As Monday began, the military said it was fighting Hamas in "seven to eight" places in southern Israel.

Military spokesperson Richard Hecht said it was taking longer than expected to repel the incursion because there were still multiple breaches in the border, which Hamas could be using to bring in more fighters and weapons. "We thought this morning we'd be in a better place," Hecht said.

Meanwhile, Israel hit more than 1,000 targets in Gaza, its military said, including airstrikes that levelled much of the town of Beit Hanoun in the enclave's northeast corner.

Israeli Rear Adm. Daniel Hagari told reporters Hamas was using the town as a staging ground for attacks. There was no immediate word on casualties. and most of the community's population of tens of thousands likely fled beforehand.

"We will continue to attack in this way, with this force, continuously, on all gathering (places) and routes" used by

Hamas, Hagari said. The declaration of war portended greater fighting ahead, and a major question was whether Israel would launch



a ground assault into Gaza, a move that in the past has brought intensified casualties. An Israeli military spokesperson said that the army had called up around 100,000 reservists, and said in a statement that Israel would aim to end Hamas' rule of Gaza.

"Our task is to make sure that Hamas will no longer have any military capabilities to threaten Israel with this," said spokesperson Jonathan Conricus in a video tweeted by Israel's military. "And in addition to that, we will make sure that Hamas is no longer able to govern the Gaza Strip."

After breaking through

Israeli barriers with explosives at daybreak Saturday, the Hamas gunmen rampaged for hours, gunning down civilians and snatching people in towns, along highways and at a techno music festival attended by thousands in the desert. The rescue service Zaka said it removed about 260 bodies from the festival, and that number was expected to rise. It was not clear how many of those bodies were already included in Israel's overall toll.

The Israeli military estimated 1,000 Hamas fighters took part in Saturday's initial incursion. The high figure underscored the extent of planning by the militant group ruling Gaza, which has said it launched the attack in response to mounting Palestinian suffering under Israel's occupation and blockade of Gaza.

Hamas and the smaller Islamic Jihad group claimed to have taken captive more than 130 people from inside Israel and brought them into Gaza, saying they would be traded for the release of thousands of Palestinians imprisoned by Israel. The announcement, though unconfirmed, was the first sign of the scope of abductions.

The captives are known to include soldiers and civilians, including women, children and older adults, mostly Israelis but also some people of other nationalities. The Israeli military said only that the number of captives is "significant."

Civilians on both sides were already paying a high price. The Israeli military was evacuating at least five towns close to Gaza, while the U.N. more than 123,000 Gazans were displaced by the fighting.

Mayyan Zin, a divorced mother of two, said she learned that her two daughters had been abducted when a relative sent her photos from a Telegram group showing them sitting on mattresses in captivity. She then found online videos of a chilling scene in her ex-husband's home in the town of Nahal Oz: Gunmen who had broken in speak to him, his leg bleeding, in the living room near the two terrified, weeping daughters, Dafna, 15, and Ella, 8. Another video showed the father being taken across the border into Gaza.

"Just bring my daughters home and to their family. All the people," Zin said.

In Gaza, a tiny enclave of 2.3 million people sealed off by an Israeli-Egyptian blockade for 16 years since the Hamas takeover, residents feared further escalation.

As of late Sunday, Israeli airstrikes had destroyed 159 housing units across Gaza and severely damaged 1,210 others, the U.N. said. The U.N. agency for Palestinian refugees, UNRWA, said a school sheltering more than 225 people took a direct

hit. It did not say where

the fire came from.

In the Palestinian city of Rafah in southern Gaza, an Israeli airstrike early Monday killed 19 people, including women and children, said Talat Barhoum, a doctor at the local Al-Najjar Hospital. Barhoum said aircraft hit the home of the Abu Hilal family, and that one of those killed was Rafaat Abu Hilal, a leader of a local armed group. The strike caused damage to surrounding homes.

Over the weekend, another airstrike on a home in Rafah killed 19 members of the Abu Quta family, including women and children, when they were huddling on the ground floor in the southern Gaza city of Rafah, survivors

Several Israeli media outlets, citing rescue service officials, said at least 700 people have been killed in Israel, including 44 soldiers. The Gaza Health Ministry said 413 people, including 78 children and 41 women, were killed in the territory. Some 2,000 people have been wounded on each side. An Israeli official said security forces have killed 400 militants and captured dozens

Over the weekend, the Israeli Security Cabinet declared war and approved "significant military steps" in response to the Hamas attack. The steps were not defined, but the declaration appears to give the military and Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu a wide mandate.

In a statement, Netanvahu's office said the aim will be the destruction of Hamas' "military and governing capabilities" to an extent that prevents it from threatening Israelis "for many years.

The declaration of war was largely symbolic, said Yohanan Plesner, the head of the Israel Democracy Institute, a think tank, but it "demonstrates that the government thinks we are entering a more lengthy, intense and significant period of war.

Israel has carried out major military campaigns over the past four decades in Lebanon and Gaza that it portrayed as wars but without a formal declaration.

The presence of hostages in Gaza complicates Israel's response. Israel has a history of making heavily lopsided exchanges to bring captive Israelis home.

An Egyptian official said Israel sought help from Cairo to ensure the safety of the hostages. Egypt also spoke with both sides about a potential cease-fire, but Israel was not open to a truce "at this stage," according to the official, who asked not to be identified because he was not authorized to brief media.

In northern Israel, a brief exchange of strikes with Lebanon's Hezbollah militant group fanned fears that the fighting could expand into a wider regional war. Hezbollah fired rockets and shells Sunday at Israeli positions in a disputed area along the border, and Israel fired back using armed drones. The Israeli military said the situation was calm after the exchange.

Flsewhere six Pa estinians were killed in clashes with Israeli soldiers Sunday around the West Bank.

Over the past year, Israel's far-right government has ramped up settlement construction in the occupied West Bank. Israeli settler violence has displaced hundreds of Palestinians there, and tensions have flared around the Al-Aqsa mosque, a flashpoint Jerusalem holy site.

German woman paraded naked by Hamas was robbed, her credit card used: Report



GAZA, Oct 9 (Agencies): A German woman whose naked, battered body was paraded by Hamas fighters following their surprise offensive against Israel may have also been robbed, according to reports.

Shani Louk's parents have not heard from their daughter since a phone call early on the morning of October 7, just after Hamas launched the first rockets into Israeli territory. But in an interview with German news outlet Der Spiegel, the family said they had received information from her bank that the tattoo artist's credit card had been used in Gaza. Louk's mother, Ricarda Louk, still holds out hope that her daughter might be alive, saying in a video posted to X (formerly Twitter), that she saw her daughter "unconscious in a car with Palestinians.'

"I just don't want to admit it yet," she told Der Spiegel. Shani Louk had been attending an outdoor "Festival for Peace" party near Kibbutz Urim when Hamas fighters invaded. Videos

showed how panic spread through the crowd as the fighters arrived at the event in the desert.

A video of a barely covered young woman on the back of a pickup truck surrounded by Hamas soldiers started circulating on social media shortly after the attack. Her face isn't visible, but her characteristic dreadlocks and tattoos helped her family identify her.

Another video circulating on social media shows the moment an Israeli woman begged for her life as she was separated from her partner and driven away by Hamas fighters into Gaza.

Noa Argamani (25) and her partner Avi Natan were also attending a music festival on Saturday when they were taken hostage. In the clip, Argamani can be heard begging her captors: "Don't kill me!"

In the midst of the attack on Israel by Hamas, it is alleged that the Palestinian militant group committed untold atrocities. Women, children, and senior citizens were among at least 100 Israeli hostages taken during the land-air-sea assault.

"Women, children, elderly, disabled" civilians were "dragged into Gaza" in "unprecedented" numbers, IDF spokesperson Jonathan Conricus said. Some are thought to be alive, but others are presumed dead, he said, adding that this will "shape the future of this war."

Ten Nepali students killed in Hamas attacks in Israel

KATHMANDU, Oct 9 (Agencies): Ten Nepali students have been killed and four others injured in Israel after the Palestinian militant group Hamas launched a wave of rocket attacks in the country's southern region, Nepal's foreign ministry said on Monday.

Hamas carried out a barrage of air strikes in Southern Israel on Saturday, killing over 600 people, including soldiers, and wounding more than 1,900.

The Israel Defense Forces (IDF) in response launched multiple attacks targeting Hamas' key infrastructure. About 1,000 people have been killed in Israel and Gaza in the biggest escalation in decades between the two sides.

In a press statement, the foreign ministry here said 10 Nepali nationals lost their lives in the recent attack by Hamas in Israel.

Out of the 17 Nepali nationals working on a farm at Kibbutz Alumim, an area near the Gaza Strip, two safely escaped, four were injured and one is still missing, it said.

"We have received the information of the sad demise of ten Nepali nationals from the site, where the Hamas had launched an attack," Nepal's embassy in Jerusalem said in a statement.

All 10 people killed in the Hamas attack were students of agriculture from Sudur Paschim University in Western Nepal, according to ministry sources. There are currently 4,500 Nepali nationals working as caregivers in Israel. A total of 265 Nepali students are studying in Israel under the 'Learn and Earn' programme of the Israeli government.

Of them, 119 are from Agriculture and Forestry University, 97 are from Tribhuvan University and 49 are from Sudur Paschim University. All of them are bachelor-level students of agriculture.

"We are trying to identify those killed in the incident. Efforts are being made to search for one missing student. The bodies will be brought back to Nepal soon after the identification is completed," the embassy said.

The Nepal government has also requested the Israeli government that necessary arrangements be provided to the injured people, who are undergoing treatment. The ministry said it was collaborating with the Israeli government and the embassy in Tel Aviv to bring back those nationals who want to return home.

"Nepal government is committed to evacuate its nationals from the war-torn region at the earliest," said the statement issued by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. "A meeting of the coordination mechanism formed under the leadership of Foreign Minister N P Saud is underway at the ministry to take stock of the situation in Israel, to identify Nepalese nationals and to make efforts for rescue Nepalese nationals if necessary," read the statement issued by secretariat of Foreign Minster Saud.

Nepal's main opposition CPN-UML has also asked Prime Minister Pushpa Kamal Dahal to talk to his Israeli counterpart Benjamin Netanyahu to rescue the Nepalis, the Kathmandu Post newspaper reported.

"Issuing statements and informing the House is not enough. The government must play the role of guardian of its citizens at this time of crisis," said Padam Giri, the UML chief whip, in Parliament.

The death toll in Israel is expected to rise as a large number of people have been critically wounded, according to the Israeli military. Palestinian health officials have said that more than 400 people have been killed, with over 2.000 injured.

Hamas is a Palestinian Islamist militant group that has ruled the Gaza Strip since 2007. The Gaza Strip is home to about 2. 3 million people. It is a 41km-long and 10km-wide territory surrounded by Israel, Egypt and the Mediterranean Sea.

China opposes violence and attacks in Middle East crisis, says foreign ministry

BEIJING, Oct 9 (Agencies): China is very concerned about the recent escalation of the Palestinian-Israeli conflict and is opposed to violence and attacks, a Chinese foreign ministry spokesperson said on Monday.

"China opposes actions that escalate conflicts and undermine regional stability. We hope to see an early ceasefire, cessation of war and restoration of peace," spokesperson Mao Ning said at a regular press briefing in a response to a query.

Israel pounded the Palestinian enclave of Gaza on Sunday, killing hundreds of people in retaliation for one of the bloodiest attacks in its history when Islamist group Hamas killed 700 Israelis and abducted dozens more.

"The international community should effectively play its role and work together to cool down the situation," Mao said.

"The only way out of the recurring Palestinian-Israeli conflict is to resume peace talks, implement the two-state solution, push for a comprehensive and proper settlement of the Palestin-



ian issue through political means at an early date, and address the legitimate concerns of all parties.'

Separately, the foreign ministry said it was saddened by civilian casualties, and urged Chinese citizens travelling to the area to pay close attention to the local security situation and avoid going

The ministry said it had immediately activated the consular protection emergency response to help Chinese citizens and institutions in the Palestinian territories and Israel

Turkish air strike on Monday killed 20 Kurdish security personnel and wounded dozens at a training centre for police in Kurdish-held northeast Syria, a war monitor said.

QAMISHLI (SYRIA),

Turkey has been bombing sites in the area since Thursday, hitting civilian and military targets and infrastructure and causing casualties, according to Kurdish authorities.

The Syrian Observatory for Human Rights, a UK-based monitor, said that 20 people had been killed and around 50 wounded after a Turkish warplane targeted a training centre belonging to Kurdish internal security forces, known as the Asayish, on the outskirts of Al-Malikiyah.

The Kurdish force acknowledged the



strike, saying that "a number of our forces were killed and others wounded".

Agency correspondents said that authorities in the area have called for blood donations, while witnesses said that hospitals were full of casualties.

Amid the chaos of Syria's long-running civil conflict, Syria's Kurds have carved out a semiautonomous area in the country's northeast.

Turkey's defence ministry said on Friday that it had launched the new wave of air strikes in retaliation for an attack

in Ankara earlier this month that wounded two security personnel.

At least 20 killed in Turkish strike on northeast Syria

A branch of the Kurdistan Workers' Party (PKK) -- listed as a terror group by Ankara and its Western allies -- claimed responsibility for the first bombing to hit the Turkish capital since 2016.

Turkey launched strikes on PKK positions in northern Iraq hours after the October 1 attack, with foreign minister Hakan Fidan saying days later that the assailants "came from Syria and were trained there"

Kurdish denial

The US-backed, Kurdish-led Syrian Democratic Forces spearheaded the battle to dislodge Islamic State group fighters from their last scraps of territory in Syria in 2019.

Turkey views the Kurdish People's Protection Units (YPG) that dominate the SDF as an offshoot of the PKK.

The SDF, the Kurds' de facto army in the northeast, denied that those behind the Ankara attack had passed through the

Turkish bombings had mostly subsided over the weekend after strikes hit energy infrastructure, including power stations and oil facilities on Thursday and Friday, killing at least 15 security personnel and civilians, according to the Kurdish authorities.

Since 2016, Turkey has carried out successive ground operations to expel Kurdish forces from border areas of northern Syria, and Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan has threatened a new incursion.

Turkey supported early rebel efforts to topple Syrian President Bashar al-Assad and maintains a military presence in northern stretches of the war-torn country which angers Damascus.

In November last year, Turkey launched air strikes on Kurdish-held areas of Syria and Iraq in response to a bombing in Istanbul that killed six people.

The conflict in Syria has killed more than half a million people since it began in 2011 with a brutal crackdown on anti-government protests, spiralling into a devastating war involving foreign armies, militias and jihadists.

The 30-share BSE Sensex plunged 407.19 points or 0.62 per cent to 65,588.44 points in early trade. The Nifty declined 142.70 points or 0.72 per cent to 19,510.80 points.

State Bank of India, Tata Steel, Titan, IndusInd Bank and Asian Paints were among the major lag-

On the other hand IT majors HCL Technologies, Tech Mahindra, TCS, Wipro and Infosys, Hindustan Unilever and Sun Pharma defied the broader market trend and were trading in the positive territory.

The BSE benchmark had climbed 364.06 points or 0.55 per cent to settle at 65,995.63 points on Friday. The Nifty had advanced 107.75 points or 0.55 per cent to end at 19.653.50.

"The Israel-Hamas conflict has introduced a huge uncertainty for the markets. Nobody knows how this war is going to evolve," V K Vijayakumar, Chief Investment



Strategist at Geoiit Financial Services, said. He said that even though it is unlikely to cause major disruption in oil supplies at present, the situation will change if Iran, a major Hamas supporter, is drawn into the war.

"That can disrupt oil supplies causing a spike in crude, which can trigger a risk-off in the market. This is a time to be cautious," he added.

Traders are also expected to remain cautious ahead of macroeconomic data to be announced later this week.

White-collar hiring sees 8.6 pc decline in September: Report

MUMBAI, Oct 9 (Agencies): White-collar hiring witnessed an 8.6 per cent annual decline in September, following a negative trend in sectors including IT, BPO or ITES and FMCG, a report said on Monday.

On a month-on-month basis, however, there has been a growth of almost 6 per cent in job postings.

In September, there were 2,835 white-collar job postings, down by 8.6 per cent compared to the same month last year when 3,103 jobs were posted, according to Naukri.com's monthly 'Naukri JobSpeak Index'.

The Naukri JobSpeak is a monthly Index representing the state of the Indian job market and hiring activity based on new job listings and job-related searches by recruiters on the resume database of Naukri.

The IT sector continued to



face global headwinds and saw the hiring numbers dwindle in the last few months, the survey said, adding that BPO/ITES and FMCG also registered negative growth of 25 per cent and 23 per cent, respectively, in the period under review.

"While the IT sector continues to stay impacted, robust growth in the banking sector is a bright spot. Coupled with the fact that the overall index sequentially

grew 6 per cent, this underscores the resilience of the Indian job market, anchored in sectoral diversity," Naukri.com Chief Business Officer Pawan Goyal added.

The report further noted that the hospitality and travel industry saw maximum growth, as families and solo travellers made the most of the monsoon season.

New job offers for this sector

were highest in Mumbai city with job roles for restaurant manager and guest services were in highest demand in September.

Banking, financial services and insurance (BFSI) and healthcare sectors clocked 7 per cent yearly growth each in September. Branch manager and financial consultant roles saw maximum demand, said the report.

Oil and gas and auto sectors recorded 6 per cent growth each in September compared to the same month last year, said the report.

Meanwhile, the report found that the non-metro cities continued to outshine the metros for job creation in September 2023.

The cities of Vadodara, Ahmedabad, and Jaipur experienced 4 per cent, 3 per cent and 2 per cent growth, respectively in hiring in September over the same month last year.

Experts call for limiting number of vehicles per family to curb air pollution, related ailments



NEW DELHI, Oct 9 (Agencies): Rise in air pollution is linked to growing respiratory ailments in India, experts have said and urged the government to bring a policy limiting the number of cars per family and restricting the number of vehicles plying on roads at a time.

On the sidelines of the 25th National Conference on Pulmonary Diseases (NAPCON-2023), organised by the Indian Chest Society here, Dr Rakesh K Chawla, the chairman of Pulmonology and Critical Care at Jaipur Golden Hospital, said air pollution has shortterm as well as longterm effects on health.

"The immediate effects are in the form of irritation in the eyes and throat. Also, there is an increase in the severity of asthma attacks," said Dr Chawla, who is also the organising chairman of NAPCON-2023.

The conference was organised to discuss air pollution and diseases caused by it as well as the advancements in the field of pulmonology.

long-term effects of air pollution include respiratory diseases and lung cancer, and the worst part is that in a city like Delhi "our children are growing up with poor lung conditions which will result in severity of lung disorders and make India an unhealthy nation".

Dr Chawla said the

"Our governments are not doing enough to combat the growing air pollution levels. It should bring a policy to limit the number of vehicles a family should have and also restrict the number of vehicles plying on roads at a time. Also, carpooling should be promoted," he said.

On October 5, about 18 hospitals came together to train 1,800 such medical students and nurses on the latest pulmonology and interventional techniques, making it the largest one-day training programme, he said.

NAPCON's emphasis on fostering interdisciplinary collaboration is one of its hallmarks, making it a melting pot of ideas where professionals exchange expe-

riences and collaborate on advancements with the potential to revolutionize patient care.

Dr D J Roy, Immediate Past-President of the Indian Chest Society, commented. "Lung diseases are a significant public health concern in India, with a high prevalence of respiratory infections, COPD and lung cancer. NAPCON plays a crucial role in addressing these issues by showcasing cuttingedge research findings and innovative treatment approaches."

Dr Raja Dhar, an expert on the chronic lung condition Bronchiectasis, highlighted the importance of awareness and early detection in combating this common lung disorder in India. "Post-Covid there is

a great need felt by the pulmonologist society to make nurses and technicians an integral part of all training programmes and continuing nursing education to keep them up to mark on the latest advancements in respiratory medicine," the doctor said.

In the previous year, a trio of US economists, including former Federal Reserve Chair Ben Bernanke, received the award for their research into how bank regulation and the provision of public funds to struggling financial institutions can prevent more severe economic crises, akin to the Great Depression of the 1930s.

The announcement of the Economic Nobel follows the Nobel Peace Prize, which was given to jailed Iranian human rights activist Narges Mohammadi. The Nobel Committee awared the Peace Prize "for her fight against the oppression of women" in her country and for "promoting human rights and freedom for all".

Patient's comfort in AI-driven healthcare linked to familiarity: Report

Younger generations have more knowledge as well as confidence in technologies like AI, shows data

NEW DELHI, Oct 9 (Agencies): Patients' familiarity with artificial intelligence (AI) significantly influences their comfort level when considering healthcare facilities utilising this technology, according to a report on Monday.

As the healthcare landscape undergoes transformation due to factors like ageing populations, rising chronic diseases, and shifts in lifestyle choices, technology, particularly AI, is playing an increasingly vital

The report by GlobalData, a data and analytics company, showed that out of patients who were familiar with Al. 60 per cent were either very or quite comfortable with using a healthcare facility that uses AI, while of the ones who were not familiar with AI, only 7 per cent

"Al is already successfully used to detect image-based diseases such as cancer and



the technology is continuously evolving to enable much wider use cases within healthcare. Successful use cases can encourage further adoption and investment in this technology," said Urte Jakimaviciute, Senior Director of Market Research at GlobalData, in a statement.

"Together with the development of a robust regulatory framework, it is imperative to prioritise patient education regarding the technology.

This education should aim to enhance comprehension of Al's utilisation, its potential advantages, and associated adoption risks, ultimately fostering increased trust in AI. Enhanced knowledge empowers individuals to make informed decisions and mitigate biases linked to this technology," Jakimaviciute

The report is based on a survey of 574 patients from India, the US, France, Germa-

ny, Italy, Spain, the UK, Japan, Brazil, Canada, and Mexico between July and August. The survey data also reveals that younger surveyed patients (18-55 years old) were more likely to be familiar with AI than older (56+ years) patients, with more than 50 per cent of them rating their knowledge as moderately or very familiar. Younger generations tend to be introduced to technology earlier in their life and as a result have more knowledge as well as confidence in technologies like AI. "While AI adoption is inevita-

ble, it must be inclusive. Even though younger generations may drive the use and adoption of AI, building a fair and ethical Al system will need intergenerational collaboration. Al use will need to address generationwide issues, and therefore it is essential to ensure that all generations can benefit from the adoption of AI," Jakimaviciute

Hazlewood defends Marsh on Kohli drop catch as **India beats Australia by 6 wickets**

Kohli, whose catch was dropped when he was at 12, went on to score 85 off 116 deliveries

CHENNAI, Oct 9 (Agencies): Australian pacer Josh Hazlewood said Mitchell Marsh dropping Virat Kohli early in the run chase did not play a significant role in the defeat against India in their World Cup opener here on Sunday.

Kohli was dropped in the eighth over off Hazlewood's bowling after Marsh made ample ground from the midwicket region, even as wicketkeeper Alex Carey also ran in, leading to confusion.

"No, I don't think so (it played a role), it was quite early obviously when that catch was dropped," Hazlewood said at the postmatch press conference.

"I didn't think Carey could get there. I think it was Mitch's catch and probably just Carey got quite close in the end so it might have just put Mitch off.

"Yeah, he dropped a catch, it's one of those things that happens and everyone's training hard and working hard off the field to hang on to them. So. yeah, we'll continue on."

The Indian spinners stifled the Australian batters on a humid day at Chepauk as the visitors were bowled out for 199. In reply, India lost three wickets for just two runs in the first two overs with Hazlewood picking



If Hazlewood had held on to the catch, India would have found themselves in bigger trouble at 20/4. Kohli was on 12 when he got the reprieve.

Talking about bowling to the Indians, Hazlewood said that the new ball did the trick before dew made things difficult for them.

"We still felt that new ball was doing enough, whether it was in the air or off the wicket. We knew that spin was going to be tough to play, maybe not as tough as during the day, but still enough to play it.

"And, we certainly felt in the game for quite a while until obviously the partnership grew and grew and they sort of batted us out of it obviously. And yeah, I thought we did a reasonable job early in particular trying to

defend 200. "It obviously felt like it probably spun more in the first half. Definitely, the dew came in, but I think early in our bowling innings it was doing enough and it was

"The wicket was up and down a little bit so you felt in the game as a quick in particular I think, and then I think it got a little bit better to bat on right towards the end." Hazlewood was all praise for the Indian bowlers, especially left-arm wrist spinner Kuldeep Yadav, who took two

wickets, including that of David Warner when the batter was looking good for a big one.

"Yeah, I think he's (Kuldeep) obviously done really well over the last 12 or 18 months. He's always been a good player.

"We've found him tough to play against. Not often you come up against a left-arm leg spinner with great variations, so it's sort of something that's hard to practice against.

"And yeah, he's always been a good player to play against, so I think in general the three spinners bowled really well. They're all a little bit different obviously, but they know the conditions really well and bowled accordingly."

Australia take on South Africa next in Lucknow, a venue where they have not played before.

Asked about the positives from the defeat, Hazlewood said, "Around the country, it's such a big country and the conditions change.

"And, I think you've got to just land on the ground and try and sum up what you think is the best thing to do first and what's going to happen later on.

"It's sort of exciting that everywhere is a little bit different I think, and hopefully, we learn from tonight," he signed off.

to hold a training session at the Gymkhana Ground on Monday afternoon. The press interaction will be held thereafter at the Rajiv Gandhi International Cricket Stadium.

Earlier, the Pakistan Cricket Board had written to the ICC on Monday expressing its disappointment over its journalists and fans not getting their visas yet for the World Cup.

"PCB is disappointed to see that Pakistani journalists and fans are facing uncertainty about obtaining an Indian visa to cover Pakistan's opening game in the ICC World Cup. Pakistani journalists and fans are expressing deep concern and it's putting us under immense pressure. We understand the significant role that journalists and passionate fans play in enhancing the spirit and atmosphere of sports events," the letter said.

"This is an obligation of our host and they are working hard on it with our full support. Every effort is being made to get this sorted," an ICC spokesperson had replied when queried about the PCB's letter

India high and handsome at the Asian Games

From Parul Chaudhary's stunning heist to the squash team's thrilling win over Pakistan, India had many memorable moments.

NEW DELHI, Oct 9 (Agencies): In all, shooters won 22 medals (7G, 9S, 6B) with a number of elite performances across rifle and pistol. You would be hard-pressed to find a more dominating performance in the final than Sift Kaur Samra in the women's 50m R3P. In a discipline that traditionally hasn't been a stronghold, the 22-year-old set a new world record en route. That she beat China's world champion, Zhang Qiongyue, by 7.3 points (in other words, almost by one extra ammo) in the final is a fair reflection of how she blew the competition out of the water. It was also the country's first individual gold of the Games. Mukherjees to the fore

Ayhika and Sutirtha met each other more than two decades ago. They went to the same table tennis academy, went to the same junior clubs. That was the basis of an incredible bond that gave the country one of its most incredible medals in Hangzhou. In front of an extremely loud crowd, they took out the Chinese world No. 2 duo in the last eight guaranteed them a medal. In the last four — when they were bidding to become the first Indian TT players to reach the final -- they ran North Korea

With less than 400m in the gruelling 5000m women's event, it seemed that the event was already over. Yet, on the home straight, Chaudhary, 28, produced a final kick for the ages when she made a move on the inside. Hironaka was looking for the move on the outside but the Indian outsmarted to become the first women's athlete to medal in the 3000m steeplechase as well as the 5000m in the same Games.

Ghosal and Co bring roof down Probably the one team gold

that will still be spoken about by the time the next Games comes around in Japan. Up against Pakistan and in a rocking atmosphere, Abhay Singh, India's last singles player, saved a gold medal point before prevailing over Noor Zaman in a thriller. Saurav Ghosal had brought India back into the tie after Mahesh Mangaonkar had been blanked in the opening

singles rubber.

Badminton boys do history The doubles duo of Satwiksairaj Rankireddy and Chirag Shetty came into the tournament as one of the leading lights of Indian sport. They now go back having enhanced their reputation. They once again showed by how much they had

grown as a pair as they walked through the tournament with minimal fuss. In fact, the only time they faced trouble was when Shetty was down with a flu early on in the doubles tournament. Against South Korea in the final, they didn't even need to get out of third gear to win the country's first gold in the sport at the Games.

Compounding interest

India had one compound bow in their arsenal in 2004. Now, there's a case for saying they are one of the kings of this sport. Medals have come at the rate of knots this year and Asian domination has followed. with a clean sweep in the discipline. Ojas Deotale and Jyothi Surekha Vennam will go back to India as the two most successful athletes of the Games with three gold each.

Dressage gold

Before the Games, a dressage gold would have been one of the unlikeliest gold. A week later, it still feels like a dream because of all the governance issues inside the federation. But four athletes — all of whom moved base to Europe to concentrate on their careers — dared to dream and made the impossible

Politics, officiating mishaps mar China's Covid-delayed Asian Games

HANGZHOU, Oct 9 (Agencies): With no major security incidents and a record gold medal haul for its athletes, China will regard the 19th Asian Games in Hangzhou as a soft power triumph that ticked a number of political, sporting and operational boxes for the hosts.

In reality, the nation's first major sporting event in the post-COV-ID era was marred by diplomatic tensions, slapdash officiating and a dearth of accountability by the organising bodies.

Before its dazzling opening ceremony, the Games were overshadowed by a visa row that prevented three Indian athletes from competing. The martial artists were

from a region of India contested by China, and India's sports minister cancelled a planned visit to the Games in protest.

The Olympic Council of Asia (OCA), which runs the multi-sport event, said it was looking into the issue but never offered another word about it.

The Games' clumsy

official slogan was "Heart to Heart, @ Future" but a more suitable one might have been: "Let things slide." North Korea arrived in force for its first major sporting event since the 2018 Asian Games, having shut its doors to the world — and international drug testers - for

Being non-compliant to the global anti-doping code, the reclusive

nation's flag is banned at multisport events outside the Olympics but flew at Hangzhou with

the backing of the OCA. About 12,400 athletes from 45 countries competed, a year later than scheduled because of COVID-19.

World-class quality was sparse in much of the 40-sport programme but there were some stunning achievements, notably in the pool, where China's swimmers shone.

Having been beaten by Japan for swimming medals at Jakarta, China won 28 of the 41 titles, continuing its resurgence after an impressive world championships in Fukuoka.

Butterfly queen Zhang Yufei and breaststroke king Qin Haiyang combined for 11 golds, earning the Games' MVP awards.

Teenager Pan Zhanle emerged as a threat for the Olympic 100 metres freestyle next year, swimming at world record pace in the 4x100m medley relay.

Dominating in their traditional strengths of badminton, diving and table tennis, China topped the medal table for the 11th successive Games with 201 golds, outstripping their previous best of 199 at Guangzhou in

Second-placed Japan had 52 golds and South Korea was third with 42. Big improvers India were thrilled to finish fourth with a national record 28 golds, and smashed their target of 100 medals overall.

Breakdancers competed at the Games for the first time in a preview of the discipline's Paris Olympic debut.

Esports' debut as a medal event proved a hit. Local fans flocked to see star South Korean gamer Lee Sang-hyeok, better known as "Faker", in the "League of Legends" category.

Rested from the final, Lee joined his teammates in winning gold and a coveted exemption from South Korea's compulsory military ser-

Paris St Germain midfielder Lee Kang-in can also skip military service, with South Korea beating Japan 2-1 in the men's soccer final.

Qatari high jump great Mutaz Barshim cruised

to a third Asian Games gold, but the athletics was marred by controversy and official blun-

An official suffered a broken leg and serious bleeding after being hit by a misthrown hammer.

Olympic and world champion Neeraj Chopra won the javelin but had to re-take his first effort after a long and confusing hiatus, with officials having failed to record his mark.

The women's 100m hurdles descended into farce when China's Wu Yanni had a clear false start only for officials to disqualify Indian rival Jyothi Yarraji.

Eventual silver medallist Yarraji, who was a step behind Wu, protested and officials corrected their decision, but Wu was allowed to run under protest before finally being disqualified.

The men's kabaddi

final between India and Iran was halted for an hour over an officiating dispute that saw both teams stage sit-down protests.

Afghanistan, however, had no recourse when their men's cricket final against India was abandoned because of rain.

With no spare day allocated for the weather and no provision to share the medal, India were awarded the gold purely by virtue of their higher world ranking.

North Korea were sore losers after falling 2-1 to Japan in the men's soccer quarter-finals. Security staff intervened after several of their players mobbed and manhandled the referee on field after the match ended

The Games' drug testers reported seven athletes had been banned for positive tests, including a Turkmenistan athlete who took silver in kurash, the central Asian wrestling event.

Backed by the OCA and the IOC, women represented Afghanistan in cycling, volleyball and athletics, in defiance of the Taliban, which has halted women's sport in the country.

"Nowadays, they are looking for hope," said Afghan volleyballer Mursal Khedri of women athletes in the nation. "By seeing us here they can find hope."
