Traffic movement disrupted on Srinagar-Jammu highway after landslide

SRINAGAR, Oct 19 (Agencies): Traffic movement was disrupted on Srinagar-Jammu national highway after a landslide at Shalgri in Banihal area late last night, officials said today.

He said that there was an acute congestion between Ramban and Banihal due to a landslide at Shalgri, accident at Nachlana, breakdown of trucks and movement of deras.

He urged the commuters to follow lane discipline and plan their journey accordingly.
Earlier, an official said that the movement of traffic was halted on both sides of the highway due to landslide at Shalgri.

The official said that men and machinery are on job to clear the debris of the landslide.

Trooper shoots himself dead in J&K after wife commits suicide in Rajasthan

SRINAGAR, Oct 19 (Agenciews): A Border Security Force (BSF) trooper shot himself dead in J&K's Kupwara district after learning that his wife had committed suicide back home in Rajasthan.

Officials said that head constable, Rajendra Yadav of BSF was posted in Kupwara district of the Valley. When he learnt that his wife, Anshu Yadav had hanged herself from a fan in her house in Dheerpur village of Rajasthan on Tuesday, the BSF trooper shot himself dead with his service revolver.

Officials added that the couple had fought on the phone before the wife took the extreme step.

They had been married eight months back. "The body of the BSF trooper will reach his home on Thursday", officials said.

Adopt whole of Government approach in Governance: Jitendra Singh tells J&K Administrative Service officers

NEW DELHI, Oct 19 (Agencies): Union Minister Jitendra Singh on Thursday asked the officers of Jammu and Kasmir Administrative Services to adopt a "whole of government" approach, pointing out that the days of working in silos are over.

Addressing the 6th Capacity Building Programme for Officers of J-K Administrative Services organised by the National Centre for Good Governance in the national capital, the Union Minister asked the officers to identify the schemes having commonality and adopt an integrated approach of execution for better efficiency and result, benefitting the common



man.

Noting that there is a change in the demography of central and state civil services due to the advent of technology even in the rural and remote areas and the democratisation of resources, Singh said the toppers in the central civil services are increasingly from states such as Punjab, Hary-

ana and Jammu and Kashmir, owing to these twin factors.

Singh said public policy in India is currently aimed at enhanced transparency and accountability in governance, with the focus on fiscal federalism, transforming rural India, and improving the quality of public service delivery.

"India has improved

systems of grievance redressal to make them more relevant to our times, and has tried to address any lingering sense of injustice springing from an administrative act by simplification of administrative processes and strengthening institutions. It is to this end that digital advancement has enabled citizens grievance redressal," the minister said.

Singh also promised to implement a call centre approach in Jammu and Kashmir, currently being implemented at the Centre to personally ascertain the satisfaction level of the persons having redressed their grievances.

CIK raids multiple locations in Kashmir, says social media misused for threats



SRINAGAR, Oct 19 (Agencies): Counter Intelligence Kashmir (CIK) on Thursday conducted searches at five locations in Kupwara, Srinagar, Anantnag and Pulwama districts of Kashmir.

The searches were conducted in pursuance to search warrant obtained from the Court of Special Judge Designated under NIA Act Srinagar in case FIR No.

07/2023 U/S 153-A, 505, 506 IPC, 13, 18, 18-B, 39 UAPA registered in P/S CIK Srinagar, said an official.

He said the case pertains to a "deep conspiracy hatched by terrorist organization (s) with their associates in Kashmir valley in conspiracy with handlers sitting across who are uploading criminal content on different social media platforms which

are not only seditious in nature but are also spreading anti India narrative aiming at glorifying/glamorizing terrorists and also inciting and luring gullible youths to take up arms against sovereignty of India by joining terrorist ranks."

"During preliminary investigation, it was revealed that some of these individuals/entities were profiling individuals, especially those who would like to take a different and independent stand against secessionists or terrorists and who are in support of peace, order and a violence free society, as legitimate targets of vilification and violence, said the official.

Delhi-LG approves increase in monthly relief to Kashmiri migrants

NEW DELHI, Oct 19 (Agencies): In a major relief to Kashmiri migrant families in Delhi, Lieutenant Governor VK Saxena has approved the enhancement of eligibility criteria for obtaining Adhoc Monthly Relief (AMR), being paid to these families, from Rs 10,000 per month to Rs 27,000 per month, said an offical statement from LG Office.

This enhancement in eligibility will increase the number of beneficiaries being covered by about 70 per cent. Now, beneficiaries earning upto Rs.27,000 per month rather than the previous amount of Rs



10,000 per month will be eligible for AMR, added the statement.

This enhancement comes after a long gap of 16 years, when the eligibility for AMR was doubled from Rs 5,000 per month to Rs 10,000 per month, in 2007. In 1995, the GNCTD had fixed the eligibility for AMR amount at Rs 5000 per month

The LG also approved bifurcation and addition of names in the Kashmiri Migrant Cards issued by GNCTD to facilitate, grown and married children of migrants, to get their own cards made and accordingly become entitled to AMR as separate units and families.

The registered Kashmiri Migrant families will now be allowed to declare their family and allow splitting of the family due to an increase in size. Birth in the migrant family would lead to an addition to the family and the death of a member would lead to the deletion of that

Man impersonating as IAS officer arrested for defrauding local resident in Budgam: Police

SRINAGAR, Oct 19 (Agencies): Jammu and Kashmir Police on Thursday said to have arrested a person impersonating as an IAS Officer for defrauding a local resident in Central Kashmir's Budgam district. He said that on Octo-

ber 18, 2023, the Budgam Police Station received a formal written complaint from Ghulam Hassan Malik, a resident of Aalipora Putlibagh, about an alleged impersonation scam. The applicant accused an Ayush Koul, also known as "Vicky," residing at Rose Lane No. 06, Rajbagh, Srinagar, of posing as an IAS offi-

cer and defrauding him of INR 6.5 lakh under the pretext of securing government employment for the applicant's son.

"In response to the complaint, an FIR No. 302/2023 was registered under sections 419 and 420 of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) in police station Budgam. During the investigation, the primary suspect, Ayush Koul, was apprehended", he said.

It was revealed that Koul had an accomplice, identified as Burhan Bashir, a resident of Nundresh Colony, Bemina. Both Ayush Koul and Burhan Bashir were arrested.

JKPCL, RUVNL to purchase 1,000 MW power from SJVN

NEW DELHI, Oct 19 (Agencies): Discoms Jammu & Kashmir Power Corporation Ltd (JKPCL) and Rajasthan Urja Vidyut Nigam Limited (RUVNL) have agreed to purchase power from energy producer SJVN Ltd.

"JKPCL and RUVNL have given their consent for purchase of 600 MW and 500 MW power, respectively, against a capacity of 1,000 MW at a tariff of Rs 2.57/kWh," SJVN said in a regulatory filing on Thursday.



CAREER DEVELOPMENT

areer development is a process that takes place over the life span and on the assumption that biological, psychological, sociological, and cultural factors influence carrier choice, career changes, and career withdrawal across the stages of development. All these are based on development theories. The developmental career theory choices life span is of three stages in an individual's lifetime.

It consists of activities undertaken by the individual employees and the organisation to meet career aspirations and job requirements. An important requirement of career development is that every employee must accept his/her responsibility for development as all development is self-development.

Although career planning is mainly an individual process, the employing organization can assist through career counselling offered by the personnel staff and the supervisors, through workshops to assist the people in evaluating themselves and in deciding open developmental programmes, through careerplanning work book made available to interested employees, and through the dissemination of information about jobs, within the organization and outside the organization.

Career Managements is the other subset of career development. Two decades on, India plans to strengthen diplomatic corps

fter nearly two decades since the last Amajor restructuring of the Indian Foreign Service (IFS) cadre, the Modi Sarkar has approved a proposal to increase the cadre's strength by 215 officers over the next five years. This significant decision stems from India's growing influence and a desire to play a more prominent international role. It comes close on the heels of the success of India's hosting of the G-20 summit apart from several India-led international initiatives.

Sources have informed DKB that the cadre review and restructuring must be seen in the context of India's rising influence and the government's plans to open nine new Indian missions in the coming years. Veteran observers say that the move is reminiscent of the Indian Revenue Service (IRS) cadre's expansion during the 1990s, coinciding with India's economic growth.

The ministry of external affairs (MEA) has disclosed that the average number of senior government functionaries' visits to countries with Indian missions has increased from around 9-10 per year to nearly 35-40 visits in 2023. This has necessitated the need for more specialised personnel both in New Delhi and at India's missions abroad.

This view was endorsed earlier by the parliamentary standing committee on external affairs, which also recommended expanding India's diplomatic corps to match its global aspirations, highlighting the understaffing of the IFS compared to other countries. The IFS currently constitutes only 22.5 per cent of the ministry of external affairs (MEA) workforce.

Interestingly, the move has provoked commentators to argue that all services need more officers, not just the IFS. Apparently, by some calculations, India's babu strength peaked in 1986, with 19,000 officers per million people. Since then, the ratio has fallen to around two per cent, well below the Asian average of 2.6 per cent. Some may recall Modi's call for maximum governance and minimum government. Clearly, that viewpoint is being jettisoned in the light of new realities.

Transfers raise questions: Will auditing stay honest?

The recent transfers of Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) officers who were closely involved with key audit reports presented recently in Parliament have raised concerns about the integrity of auditing processes. These reports unveiled corruption and irregularities in Central ministries and departments.

Of particular concern are the transfers of three Indian audit and accounts service officers, two of whom were responsible for audits revealing corruption in the Dwarka Expressway project and Ayushman Bharat. Another officer, who

initiated the Ayushman Bharat audit, was also relocated. In the case of Atoorva Sinha, principal director of audit for infrastructure, overseeing the CAG report on highway projects, his report exposed irregularities and massive cost overruns in the Dwarka Expressway proj-

The timing and circumstances of these transfers, combined with the sensitivity of the reports involved, have raised questions about the auditing process. The public hasn't forgotten the tumultuous period during the UPA government when the CAG reports on the 2G scam and coal block allocation scam played a pivotal role in questioning the government's credibility.

The CAG Girish Chandra Murmu has argued that transfers and postings are administrative matters, but it is equally important to maintain public trust in the auditing process. Mr Murmu, who assumed office in 2020, emphasises that reading ulterior motives into these transfers is presumptuous, but the concerns remain. And in the absence of a credible explanation, the public is likely to wonder: Will anyone audit honestly?

RTI anniversary shadowed by challenges

Implemented 18 years ago, the Right to Information Act, once celebrated for empowering citizens to seek information from government bodies, now stands at a crossroads. Recent data sheds light on a concerning backlog of appeals and complaints under the RTI Act, creating a major roadblock to transparency and accountability. In June this year, a staggering 3.2 lakh appeals and complaints languished unresolved in 27 information commissions across the country.

One of the primary reasons for the backlogs is the failure of Central and state governments to take timely action to appoint information commissioners to the Central Information Commission (CIC) and state information commissioners. A study also found that six commissions, including the CIC and state ICs of Manipur, Chhattisgarh, Maharashtra, Bihar, and Punjab are currently without a chief. The CIC is reportedly working with only four commissioners, even though seven posts are vacant. In fact, chief information commissioner Y.K. Sinha's tenure ended earlier this month. During his tenure, Sinha managed to reduce the number of pending cases before the commission by more than 50 per cent.

However, four commissions in Jharkhand, Telangana, Mizoram and Tripura are defunct as no new commissioners have been appointed after the incumbents demitted office.

Usually, the anniversaries of such historic legislation should be marked by progress and rejuvenation. But unless these serious challenges are addressed, the age of transparency and accountability may be ending in India.





NEW DELHI, Oct 19 (Agencies): Rajya Sabha Chairman Jagdeep Dhankhar has referred a complaint against five BRS members, including party's floor leader K Keshava Rao, over "displaying placards" in the House during its meeting on September 18 to the privileges committee for investigation.

The complaint against Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) members was filed by BJP leader Vivek Thakur.

Thakur filed a notice under Rule 188 of Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the Rajya Sabha against K Keshava Rao, Damodar Rao Divakonda, Ravichandra Vaddiraju, K R Suresh Reddy and B Lingaiah

The complaint alleged that the BRS members "contemptuously" displayed placards in



the Rajya Sabha while it was in session on September 18, 2023, in gross violation of the wellestablished rules of conduct for members of the Upper House, thereby causing unwarranted disturbances in its proceedings and lowering its dignity.

"On consideration of the facts, the Chairman, Rajya Sabha has referred the matter under Rule 203 of Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the Council of States (Rajya Sabha) to the Committee of Privileges for examination, investigation

and report," an official communication from the Rajya Sabha secretariat said.

In another communication, the Chairman has extended time to the Department-related Parliamentary Standing Committee on Education, Women, Children, Youth and Sports for examination and presentation of report on 'The Prohibition of Child Marriage (Amendment) Bill, 2021'.

"Chairman, Rajya Sabha, has granted an extension of time for a period of three months i.e. till 24th January, 2024 to the Department-related Parliamentary StandingCommittee on Education, Women, Children, Youth and Sports for examination and presentation of report on The Prohibition of Child Marriage (Amendment) Bill, 2021," the order said.

"Large-Scale Corruption In Telangana": Rahul Gandhi Says KCR 'Losing' Polls



HYDERABAD, Oct 19 (Agencies): Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Thursday said that he could feel that the Chief Minister K Chandrasekhar Raoled BRS party is losing the upcoming Assembly polls in Telangana. Speaking at a corner meeting on the way from Bhupalpally to Peddapalli during the Congress' ongoing 'Vijayabheri' Yatra

in the state, he said the upcoming electoral battle is between Dorala (feudal lords) Telangana and Prajala (people's) Telangana.

"I feel that KCR is going to lose the elections. This is a fight between Dorala Telangana and Prajala Telangana...a fight between Raja and Praja," he said. Attacking Chandrasekhar Rao, Rahul Gandhi said even after ten years, the chief minister of Telangana continues to distance himself from the people.

Alleging that there is large-scale corruption happening in Telangana, Rahul said referring to KCR, all the controls in the state are with one family only.

The AICC leader further said the BJP attacks all opposition leaders and cases are filed using the ED, CBI, and Income Tax Departments, but KCR is spared.

He said when he raises the issue of caste census to be taken up in the country, there is no word either from Prime Minister Narendra Modi or KCR.

PMO imposter case: CBI conducts searches at premises of Ahmedabad-based Maayank Tiwari

NEW DELHI, Oct 19 (Agencies): The CBI has conducted searches at the premises of Ahmedabad-based Maayank Tiwari who was allegedly posing as a high-ranking official of the Prime Minister's Office, and was trying to force an eye hospital chain to "forget" more than Rs 16 crore owed to it by an Indore-based hospital, officials said.

A number of documents were seized during searches conducted recently, and are being examined, they said. The agency said Tiwari has not been arrested so far.

Tiwari had allegedly called and sent messages from his mobile phone, asking the promoters of Dr Agarwal's -- which runs a chain of eye hospitals -- to settle a dispute with the hospital in Indore, which allegedly had to return Rs 16 crore to the hospital chain, they said.

It is alleged that Dr Agarwal's had entered into an agreement with two doctors who ran the Indore-based hospital to join the franchise for which over Rs 16 crore was paid, they said.

The Indore hospital allegedly started violating the terms of the agreement which resulted in a dispute, and Dr Agarwal's wanted their money back and the termination of the agreement, they said.

The matter went to the High Court which appointed an arbitrator to negotiate. The arbitrator, in an interim injunction, asked the Indore hospital to deposit Rs 16.43 crore within four weeks

During the dispute, the promoters of Dr Agarwal's allegedly started getting messages and calls from Tiwari to forget the alleged dues and settle the matter with the doctors running the Indore hospital.

When the Prime Minister's Office came to know, it immediately asked the CBI to probe the alleged impersonation of a PMO official.


"Prima facie, this is a case of impersonation of PMO official and misuse of the name of the PMO, since neither this individual nor the professed designation exists in this office," the PMO said in a complaint to the CBI.

Supreme Court issues notice to Delhi Police on pleas filed by NewsClick founder and HR head against arrest under UAPA

NEW DELHI, Oct 19 (Agencies): The Supreme Court on Thursday issued notice to the Delhi Police on petitions filed by News-Click founder Prabir Purkayastha and its HR head Amit Chakravarty challenging their arrest and subsequent police remand in a case under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA) - an anti-terror law.

Directing the Delhi Police to respond to the petitions filed by Purkayastha and Chakravarty, a Bench led by Justice BR Gavai posted the matter for October 30.

The order came after senior advocates Kapil Sibal and Devadatt Kamat, representing Purkayastha and Chakravarty, respectively, urged the Bench to hear the matter urgently as the accused



have been in jail since their arrest on October

Purkayastha and Chakraborty have challenged a Delhi High Court verdict dismissing their petitions against their arrest and remand under the UAPA.

The top court had on Monday agreed to list the matter urgently after Sibal mentioned it before the bench headed by Chief Justice DY Chandrachud. On

Wednesday, the Justice Gavai-led Bench had posted the matter for hearing on Thursday, saying it needed to go through the files.

Purkayastha and Chakravarty arrested by the Special Cell of the Delhi Police on October 3 after a case was lodged by the Delhi Police against the duo under UAPA for allegedly receiving money to spread pro-China propaganda. According to the FIR, a large amount of funds to the news portal allegedly came from China to "disrupt the sovereignty of India" and cause disaffection against the country.

Purkayastha conspired with a group -- People's Alliance for Democracy and Secularism -- to sabotage the electoral process during the 2019 general election, police alleged. On October 10, the trial court sent them to judicial custody for 10 days.

The Delhi High Court had last week dismissed petitions filed by Purkayastha and Chakravarty challenging their arrest and subsequent police remand under stringent provisions of the UAPA.

Holding that there was no "procedural infirmity" or violation of legal or constitutional provisions in relation to the arrest and the remand order was sustainable in law, Justice Tushar Rao Gedela had rejected their petitions for being "devoid of any merit".

The high court had sought to emphasise that offences under the UAPA directly impacted the stability, integrity and sovereignty of the country and were of utmost importance since they affected national security.

However, in view of the recent Supreme Court verdict in Pankaj Bansal's case, the high court had said it would be "advisable" that the police henceforth provide the grounds of arrest in writing to an accused after redacting "sensitive material".

Rajasthan Assembly polls: No differences in Congress over grant of tickets, says CM Ashok Gehlot

NEW DELHI, Oct 19 (Agencies): Rajasthan Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot on Thursday said he wants to leave the state's top post but the post is not leaving him and probably may not leave him.

He, however, also said that there would be something in him that the party high command had chosen him to lead the state thrice but any decision taken by the leadership going forward would be acceptable to all

83-Year-Old Man, Son's Live-In Partner, 30, Killed By Grandsons

KANPUR, Oct 19 (Agencies): An 83-yearold man and his son's live-in partner were stabbed to death allegedly by his grandsons in Uttar Pradesh's Kanpur Dehat district in the early hours of the morning today, police said.

Ram Prakash Dwivedi, 83, and his son Vimal's live-in partner Khushbu, 30 died, while Vimal, 63, was critically injured in the incident that took place in Amrodha town, thev said.

According to locals, there was friction in the family over Vimal's live-in relationship with 30-year-old Khushbu.

The accused, 42-yearold Lalit and his stepbrother Akshat, 18, went to their father Vimal's house and thrashed him, Ram Prakash and Khushbu. The two then stabbed Ram Prakash and Khushbu multiple times, said Superintendent of Police BBGTS



Murthy.

While Vimal was trying to get out of his house, Munna, who earlier used to live with the Dwivedi family, saw him. Munna immediately informed Vimal's elder brother Kamal, who lives in the adjacent house.

Vimal was rushed to the district hospital and later shifted to Lala Lajpat Rai (LLR) Hospital in Kanpur, where his condition is stated to be

critical, police said. After receiving information about the incident, police acted promptly and arrested Akshat and Lalit while they were trying to run away to evade arrest, Mr Murthy said.

The two were apparently unhappy with their father over his live-in relationship with 30-year-old Khushbu, said Additional Superintendent of Police Rajesh

Kumar Pandey. During intensive interrogation, they confessed to having killed Ram Prakash and Khushbu, he said.

Naga Sadhu Strangled Inside Temple At Ayodhya, **Accused Missing: Cops**

AYODHYA. Oct 19 (Agencies): A 44-yearold Naga Sadhu, Ram Sahare Das, was strangled to death in the Hanumangarhi temple complex in Uttar Pradesh's Ayodhya on Thursday, the police said.

According to the police, Mr Das's disciple, Durbal Das, discovered his lifeless body in his room at the ashram late on Wednesday eve-

A deep mark was visible on Mr Das's throat, police said.

Police and forensic experts arrived quickly at the scene and began their investigation. They are searching for Umesh Shukla, son of Rishabh Shukla, who lives in the same complex and is considered

a suspect. Mr Shukla is

currently on the run. The CCTV cameras installed in the temple premises were also found switched off.

This is the second incident at Hanumangarhi within a month. A few days ago, a Naga Sadhu died by suicide in the same area. The police are yet to

ascertain the motive for the murder.

However, they are investigating all possible angles, including personal rivalry and robbery.

IIT-Khargapur student suicide: Kin allege 'unnecessary pressure' by faculty

KOLKATA, Oct 19 (Agencies): A day after a fourth year student of IIT-Kharagpur was found dead in his hostel room, his parents on Thursday held a section of the institute's faculty responsible for their son's apparent suicide.

They alleged that K. Kiran Chandra was forced to take the extreme step owing to "unnecessary" pressure by the faculty.

This morning, the victim's father and uncle arrived at the university from their home state Telangana and claimed that Kiran was under tremen-



dous pressure from a section of the faculty over completion of a project within a specific period.

"The institute authorities could have informed us if Kiran was lagging somewhere. Unable to bear the pressure, our son resorted to the extreme step," the victim's father said.

However, the victim's father and uncle confirmed that they will not initiate any legal proceedings against the IIT-Kharagpur authorities as it not bring back the victim.

Meanwhile, the IIT-Kharagpur has also confirmed the death as "suicide" in a statement issued

Since last year, the institution has been in the national headlines because of mysterious deaths of students within the campus.

In October 2022, a student Faizan Ahmed died under mysterious circumstances within the institute campus.

In his case too, the body was recovered from a hostel room. The matter reached the level of Calcutta High Court.

Again in June this year, another student Suriya Dipen was found dead in the campus.

Israel-Hamas conflict: UK PM Rishi Sunak arrives in Israel

Will warn against Gaza war escalation

BEN-GURION AIRPORT (ISRAEL), Oct 19 (Agencies): British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak arrived in Israel on Thursday to demonstrate solidarity with a country reeling from an Oct. 7 rampage by Hamas gunmen and to hold talks with his Israeli counterpart Benjamin Netanyahu.

With Israel's counter-offensive against Hamas in Gaza spiralling, Sunak will share his condolences for the loss of life in Israel and in the Palestinian enclave and warn against further escalation, his office said.

"Above all, I'm here to express my solidarity with the Israeli people. You have suffered an unspeakable, horrific act of terrorism and I want you to know that the United Kingdom and I stand with you," Sunak told Israeli reporters after landing.

Sunak was due to visit other regional capitals after Israel.



In an early statement, he said a Gaza hospital blast on Tuesday that caused mass Palestinian casualties should be "a watershed moment for leaders in the region and across the world to come together to avoid further dangerous escalation of conflict", adding that Britain would be at "the forefront of this effort".

"Every civilian death is a tragedy. And too many lives have been lost following Hamas' horrific act of terror." Sunak said.

At least seven British nationals have been killed and at least nine are still missing since the attack on Israel, Sunak's spokesperson said.

Alongside Sunak's visit, British Foreign Secretary James Cleverly, who visited Israel last week, will travel to Egypt, Turkey and Qatar over the next three days to discuss the conflict and seek a peaceful resolution, his office said.

Britain said the three countries were "vital to international efforts to uphold regional stability, free hostages and allow humanitarian access to Gaza".

Cleverly will meet with senior leaders there to discuss efforts to prevent the conflict spreading, the urgent need to open the Rafah crossing with Egypt to let aid reach those who need it and for Hamas to release hostages, Britain said.

US House lawmaker receives death threats after voting against Jordan for Speaker

WASHINGTON, Oct 19 (Agencies): US Representative Mariannette Miller-Meeks has received "credible death threats," she said in a statement, after voting against Representative Jim Jordan for Speaker of the US House of Representatives.

Jordan, a hardline conservative, was formally nominated by a majority of his party last week but has been unsuccessful in getting the necessary 217 Republicans to back him in two House votes so far, with more lawmakers from his own party opposing him on Wednesday than in the first vote on Tuesday. A third vote is expected to take place on Thursday.

Miller-Meeks, a Republican who represents a politically competitive district in Iowa, voted for Jordan the first time but switched to vote for Representative Kay Granger, chair of the House Appropriations Committee, on Wednesday afternoon.

Since then, Miller-Meeks said in a statement, she has received "a barrage of threatening calls" in addition to multiple death threats. She added that the authorities have been notified and her office is fully cooperating.

"One thing I cannot stomach, or support is a bully," she said. "I did not stand for bullies before I voted for Chairwoman Granger and when I voted for Speaker designee Jordan, and I will not bend to bullies now."

It was not immediately clear who made the threats.

"We condemn all threats against our colleagues and it is imperative that we come together," Jordan said in a post on X, formerly known as Twitter. "Stop. It's abhorrent." Jordan has struggled to win over both moderates who do not feel he understands the issues their districts face, and others who have expressed concern about Jordan's ability to unite

Although lawmakers who are withholding their support have said Jordan himself has been courteous and kind in conversations attempting to win them over, many have spoken out about the bullying tactics of his supporters.

"The last thing you want to do is try to intimidate or pressure me, because then I close out entirely," Representative Mario Diaz-Balart, a Republican who has refused to support Jordan, told reporters earlier this week.

Israel will let Egypt deliver some aid to Gaza as doctors struggle to treat hospital blast victims

KHAN YOUNIS (GAZA STRIP). Oct 19 (Agencies): Israel said that it would allow Egypt to deliver limited humanitarian aid to the Gaza Strip.

The first crack in a punishing 10-day siege on the territory came a day after a blast at a hospital killed hundreds and put immense strain on Gaza's struggling medical system.

The announcement to allow water, food and other supplies happened as fury over the blast at Gaza City's al-Ahli Hospital spread across the Middle East, and as US President Joe Biden visited Israel in hopes of preventing a wider conflict in the region.

There were conflicting claims of who was behind the explosion on Tuesday night, but protests flared quickly in the region as many Arab leaders said Israel was respon-

Hamas officials in Gaza quickly blamed an Israeli airstrike, saying hundreds were killed. Israel denied it was involved and released a flurry of video, audio and other information that it said showed the



blast was instead due to a rocket misfire by Islamic Jihad, another militant group operating in Gaza. Islamic Jihad dismissed that claim.

The Associated Press has not independently verified any of the claims or evidence.

Israel shut off all supplies to Gaza soon after Hamas militants rampaged across communities in southern Israel on October 7.

As supplies run out, many fami-

lies in Gaza have cut down to one meal a day and have been left to drink dirty water.

The bloody devastation at al-Ahli threw the siege's impact into sharp relief. Video from the scene showed the hospital grounds strewn with torn bodies, many of them young children. Hundreds of wounded were rushed to another Gaza hospital where doctors, already facing critical supply shortages, performed surgery on the floors, often without anaesthesia.

Biden said Egypt's president agreed to open the crossing and to let in an initial group of 20 trucks with humanitarian aid. If Hamas confiscates aid, "it will end", he said. The aid will start moving on Friday at the earliest, White House officials said.

Egypt must still repair the road across the border that was cratered by Israeli airstrikes. More than 200 trucks and some 3,000 tons of aid are positioned at or near the Rafah crossing, Gaza's only connection to Egypt, said the head of the Red Crescent for North Sinai, Khalid Zayed.

Israel's endgame? No sign of post-war plan for Gaza

DUBAI/WASHING-TON, Oct 19 (Agencies): Israel is vowing to wipe out Hamas in a relentless onslaught on the Gaza Strip but has no obvious endgame in sight, with no clear plan for how to govern the ravaged Palestinian enclave even if it triumphs on the battlefield.

Codenamed "Operation Swords of Iron", the military campaign will be unmatched in its ferocity and unlike anything Israel has carried out in Gaza in the past, according to eight regional and Western officials with knowledge of the conflict who declined to be named due to the sensitivity of the matter.

Israel has called up a record 3,60,000 reservists and has been bombarding the tiny enclave non-stop following Hamas's assault on southern Israel on October 7, which killed about 1,400 people, mostly civilians.

The immediate Israeli strategy, said three regional officials familiar with discussions between the US and Middle Eastern leaders, is to destroy Gaza's infrastructure, even at the cost of high civilian casualties, push the enclave's people towards the Egyptian border and go after Hamas by blowing up the labyrinth of underground tunnels the group has built to conduct its operations.

Israeli officials have said that they don't have a clear idea for what a post-war future might look like, though.

Some of US President Joe Biden's aides are concerned that while Israel may craft an effective plan to inflict lasting damage to Hamas, it has yet to formulate an exit strategy, a source in Washington familiar with the matter said.

Trips to Israel by Secretary of State Antony Blinken and Defense Secretary Lloyd Austin this past week had stressed the need to focus on the post-war plan for Gaza, the source added.

Arab officials are also alarmed that Israel hasn't set out a clear plan for the future of the enclave, ruled by Hamas since 2006 and home to 2.3 million people.

"Israel doesn't have an endgame for Gaza. Their strategy is to drop thousands of bombs, destroy everything and go in, but then what? They have no exit strategy for the day after," said one regional security source. An Israeli invasion has yet to start, but Gaza authorities say 3,500 Palestinians have already been killed by the aerial bombardment, around a third of them children - a larger death toll than in any previous conflict between Hamas and Israel.

Biden, on a visit to Israel on Wednesday, told Israelis that justice needed to be served to Hamas, though he cautioned that after the 9/11 attacks on New York, the U.S. had made mistakes. The "vast majority of Palestinians are not Hamas", he said.

"Hamas does not represent the Palestinian people." Aaron David Miller, a Middle East expert at the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace, said Biden's visit would have given him a chance to press Israeli leader Benjamin Netanyahu to think through issues such as the proportional use of force and the longer-term plans for Gaza before any invasion.

'CITY OF TUNNELS'

Israeli officials, including Netanyahu, have said they will wipe out Hamas in retribution for the attack, the deadliest in Israel's 75-yearold history. "We are of course thinking and dealing with this, and this involves assessments and includes the National Security Council, the military and others about the end situation," Israeli National Security Council director Tzachi Hanegbi told reporters on Tuesday. "We don't know what this will be with certainty." "But what we do know is what there will not be," he said, referring to Israel's stated aim to eradicate Hamas. This might be easier said than done.

"It's an underground city of tunnels that make the Vietcong tunnels look like child's play," said the first regional source, referring to the Communist guerrilla force that defied U.S. troops in Vietnam. "They're not going to end Hamas with tanks and firepower."

Two regional military experts told Reuters that Hamas' armed wing, the Ezzedine al-Qassam Brigades, has mobilised for an invasion, setting up anti-tank mines and booby-trapped explosive devices to ambush troops.

Israel's coming offen-

sive is set to be much bigger than past Gaza operations that Israeli officials had previously referred to as "mowing the grass", degrading Hamas's military capabilities but not eliminating it. Israel has fought three previous conflicts with Hamas, in 2008-9, 2012 and 2014, and launched limited land invasions during two of those campaigns, but unlike today, Israel's leaders never vowed to destroy Hamas once and for all. In those three confrontations, just under 4,000 Palestinians and fewer than 100 Israelis died. There is less optimism in Washington, though, that Israel will be able to completely destroy Hamas and U.S. officials see little chance that Israel will want to hold onto any Gaza territory or re-occupy it, the U.S.

A more likely scenario, the person said, would be for Israeli forces to kill or capture as many Hamas members as they can, blow up tunnels and rocket workshops, then after Israeli casualties mount, look for a way to declare victory and exit. The fear across the region is that the war will blow up beyond the confines of Gaza, with Lebanon's Hezbollah and its backer Iran opening major new fronts in support of

source said.

Hamas Iranian Foreign Minister Hossein Amir-Abdollahian warned of a possible "preemptive" action against Israel if it carried out its invasion of Gaza. He said last weekend that Iran would not watch from the sidelines if the US failed to restrain Israel.

Arab leaders have told Blinken, who has been criss-crossing the region this past week, that while they condemn Hamas' attack on Israel, they oppose collective punishment against ordinary Palestinians, which they fear will trigger regional unrest. Popular anger will ratchet up across the region when the body count rises, they said.

Washington has sent an aircraft carrier strike group to the eastern Mediterranean and is concerned that Hezbollah might join the battle

from Israel's northern border. There has been no sign, however, that the U.S. military would then move from a deterrent posture to direct involvement. The regional sources

said Washington was proposing to re-energise the Palestinian Authority (PA), which lost control of Gaza to Hamas in 2007, although there is huge doubt whether the PA or any other authority would be able to govern the coastal enclave should Hamas be driven out. Miller, a former US Middle East negotiator, expressed deep skepticism about the potential for establishing a post-Hamas government to rule Gaza. "I could paint you a picture more appropriate to a galaxy far, far away and not on planet Earth on how you could combine the UN, the Palestinian Authority, the Saudis, the Egyptians, led by the US marshalling the Europeans, to basically convert Gaza from an open-air prison to something much better," he said.

In the meantime,

calls for the creation of humanitarian corridors within Gaza and escape routes for Palestinian civilians has drawn a strong reaction from Arab neighbors. They fear an Israeli invasion will spark a new permanent mass wave of displacement, a replay of the 1948 Israeli war of independence and 1967 Arab-Israeli war. Millions of Palestinians who were forced to flee then have remained stranded as refugees in the countries that hosted them. East Jerusalem, captured by Israel in the 1967 war and then annexed, and Israeli settlement expansion across occupied territory are at the core of the conflict with Palestinians. Netanyahu has openly embraced the religious and radical farright, promising to annex more land to be settled by Jews. Hundreds of Palestinians have died in the West Bank since the start of the year in repeated clashes with Israeli soldiers and settlers, and there is widespread concern that the violence might engulf the territory as nearby Gaza burns. "Whatever worst-case scenario you have, it will be worse," a second regional source said about the potential for the conflict to spread beyond Gaza.

10 civilians killed in Russian attacks on Ukraine, Kyiv reports progress in south

ZAPORIZHZHIA (UKRAINE), Oct 19 (Agencies): Russian attacks overnight and on Wednesday killed at least 10 civilians in Ukraine, while senior Ukrainian military officials said their troops had made some headway in counteroffensive operations in the southern theatre. President Volodymyr Zelenskiy,

in his nightly video address, said the death toll had risen to five from four in a morning missile strike on a residential building in the southeastern city of Zaporizhzhia. Officials said a 31-year-old

woman was killed in an attack on the village of Obukhivka in the central region of Dnipropetrovsk and a man and a woman were killed in an overnight attack on the southern region of Kherson. On Wednesday evening,

Ukraine's Interior Ministry said two bodies had been pulled out from under the rubble of a food shop hit by a Russian missile near the southern city of Mykolaiv.

Local officials in Sumy region, on the Russian border, said an "infrastructure site" had been hit in a drone attack, but provided no further details

"The evil state continues to use terror and wage war on civilians. Russian terror must be defeated," Zelenskiy wrote on the Telegram messaging app.

The apartment building in Zaporizhzhia suffered serious damage to one entrance from the third to the fifth storeys, he said. A picture posted by Zelenskiy on Telegram showed the building with a gaping hole in the middle, its entrance destroyed and windows smashed.

In Obukhivka, near the city of Dnipro, residents said a strong explosion blew out windows and knocked people to the ground.



Officials said about 20 houses were damaged.

"A woman all covered in blood ran out from one of the houses, shouting and crying. I think that her daughter died," Victor, 32, a construction worker, told Reuters television. "We entered the house and saw a dead girl."

SOUTHERN ADVANCE CON-**TINUES: GENERAL**

General Oleksandr Tarnavskyi, in charge of Ukraine's operations in the south, said Ukrainian forces were proceeding with their planned advance towards the Sea of Azov.

Troops from the Tavria, or southern, group of forces "are continuing their offensive. They have had partial success to the south of Robotyne," Tarnavskyi wrote on Telegram.

Robotyne is one of a group of villages in the south that Ukraine wants to secure as part of the advance - aimed at severing a land bridge linking Russian positions in the south and east.

Oleksandr Shtupun, a spokes-

person for southern troops, also reported progress near Robotyne. Shtupun told national television that shelling had eased around the town of Avdiivka, the focus of fierce Russian attacks in the past week west of the Russian-held town of Donetsk. But troops in the sector were preparing for a variety of scenarios.

Ukrainian troops are also trying to recapture land in eastern regions. The General Staff, in its evening report, said its forces had repelled attacks in several areas of the

1,000-km (620-mile) front line including 15 around the long-contested town of Maryinka in Donetsk region and 10 further north near Kupiansk.

Russia's Defence Ministry gave few details of its troops' operations, but said a depot of Ukrainian aviation equipment had been destroyed in central Dnipropetrovsk region.

Agency could not verify accounts from either side.

member. Apart from this, a non-migrant girl marrying into a migrant family will be added as a member of the Kashmiri migrant family.

There shall be mandatory Aadhar seeding of data relating to the family members eligible for AMR. Also, the payment of relief to the migrants will be only through the Aadhar Payment Bridge System/PFMS, which will be as per the extant norms.

AMR is provided to the J&K migrants under the "Security Related Expenditure (Relief & Rehabilitation)" introduced by the Central Government in 1989-90, for supporting the relief and rehabilitation of those who were uprooted from the Kashmir valley during the militancy. In Delhi, AMR was provided to the migrant families registered by GNCTD during 1990-93.

At present, approximately 2000 families in the national capital are being paid AMR at the rate of Rs 3250 per person per month, subject to a maximum of 04 people per family. Out of this amount, Rs 1000 is the share of the GNCTD, and Rs. 2250 is the share of the Government of India, which is reimbursed by the MHA.

The monthly expenditure incurred on AMR is approx. Rs 2.50 crore. The number of beneficiaries is, however, expected to increase by nearly 70 per cent after factoring in an increase in the number of "units" because of the raising of the eligibility criteria and the rise in the number of family members due to splitting and addition that will now be allowed.

Google to start manufacturing its pixel devices in India from 2024

NEW DELHI, Oct 19 (Agencies): Technology giant Google on Thursday announced the manufacture of its flagship smartphone, Google Pixel, in

The company, at its annual Google for India event, said the newly-launched Pixel 8 will be its first Made in India phone and would be available in the Indian market from 2024.

"We shared plans at Google for India to manufacture Pixel smartphones locally and expect the first devices to roll out in 2024. We're committed to being a trusted partner in India's digital growth," Google CEO Sundar Pichai wrote on X (formerly Twitter).

Google said it will partner with international contract manufacturers to manufacture Google Pixel phones in India. The US-based company is also in talks with homegrown contract

manufacturers like Dixon, Lava and Bharat FIH. "We will start manufacturing Google Pixel series smartphones in India. India is a priority market for Pixel smartphones, and we're committed to bringing the best of our hardware and underlying built-in software capabilities to people across the country," said Rick Osterloh, Senior Vice-President at Google.

Telecom Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw, who was present at the event, said it is good for both India and Google that its Pixel 8 phones will be manufactured in India.

The Minister informed that India has taken big strides in smartphone manufacturing with \$44 billion worth of mobile phones being manufactured in the country.

Vaishnaw also said that within one year of the 5G launch, the country already has installed

375,000 5G sites across the country. He said the country is among the top two countries with a 5G ecosystem.

Google Pixel has struggled to attract consumers in India.

Google introduced Pixel smartphones to the Indian market in 2016 but currently holds less than a 1% market share. Meanwhile, its competitors have strengthened their market positions in the mobile market.

According to CyberMedia Research, Google enjoys a 1% market share globally but only a negligible 0.3% market share in India.

Prabhu Ram, Head-Industry Intelligence Group at Cyber-Media Research (CMR) called it strategic moves essential for Google to establish a strong presence in the Indian market.

"Google's Make-in-India gambit for the Pixel phones marks the beginning of a series

of strategic moves essential for Google to establish a strong presence in a highly competitive smartphone market, which offers substantial growth opportunities," he said.

Faisal Kawoosa, Founder and Chief Analyst at Techarc, said with this announcement Google is upping its game with regards to Pixel in India. "This is a really very significant step. We have all seen somewhere Google has been shying from the Indian market in terms of commitment, or I would say in terms of faith. With this announcement, the company has shown faith in the Indian market. I would say it's a big step big leap of faith in India which reinforces its journey in India," said Kawoosa.

Google recently launched in India its Pixel devices, the Google Pixel 8 and Pixel 8 Pro, priced at Rs. 75,999 and Rs. 106,999, respectively.

Tata Group may consider \$1 billion fresh capital into super app venture: Report

NEW DELHI, Oct 19 (Agencies): The Tata Group is actively contemplating an injection of an additional \$1 billion in fresh capital into its ambitious super app venture, reported Bloomberg News quoting people familiar with the matter. This comes after the conglomerate invested a substantial \$2 billion earlier this

The additional funding, expected to be channeled into Tata Digital Pvt., aims to propel the app's operational efficiency and user-friendliness, ensuring a more seamless digital experience, added the report.

This approach aligns with the playbook followed by one of its major competitors, Reliance Retail Ventures. Notably, Reliance Retail



Ventures has consistently secured funding from external sources, with recent investments from entities like Qatar Investment Authority and KKR & Co. valuing the venture at \$100 bil-

It is important to note that deliberations on these financial strategies are currently underway, and specific details of Tata Group's additional capital injection into the super app venture may undergo modifications.

The conglomerate has maintained a tight-lipped stance on these developments, with no official comments available at this time.

Tata Neu, India's inaugural super app since at least mid-2020, drew inspiration from China's widely used Alipay and WeChat platforms. Despite its promising

Honda, GM plan driverless taxis in Tokyo in 2026



TOKYO, Oct 19 (Agencies): Japan's Honda and US auto titan General Motors announced on Thursday that they planned to launch a driverless taxi service in Tokyo in 2026, helping tackle labour shortages in an ageing society.

Co-developed by San Francisco-based selfdriving car operator Cruise, the project will offer "an entirely new kind of mobility experience" in Japan, Honda said in a statement.

"This will be a major step toward the realization of an advanced mobility society," its chief executive Toshihiro Mibe said.

The project is also aimed at "helping address societal issues facing Japan, such as the taxi and bus driver shortage", Honda added.

Autonomous vehicles are being pushed by Japan's government as the country battles a rapidly ageing population and persistent labour shortages. In 2020, Japan

became the first country in the world to allow a vehicle capable of taking full control in certain situations to operate on public roads.

Auto giants from Toyota to Nissan are also trialling self-driving buses and taxis.

Honda's newly announced service will feature a "vast cabin space" capable of accommodating six passengers, stripped of a driver's seat and a steering wheel.

It will "pick up custom-

ers at a specified location and drive them to the destination, entirely through self-driving", with customers able to complete the whole process on a smartphone app, according to Honda.

"Dozens" of the driverless cars are expected to be launched in Tokyo in early 2026, with the developers then hoping to expand the project to a fleet of 500, and to areas outside central Tokyo.

"The benefits of AVs (autonomous vehicles) -- from safety to accessibility -- are too profound to ignore," Mary Barra, chair and CEO of GM, said.

But self-driving cars are no stranger to controversy, with safety under scrutiny as operators including Cruise increasingly gain traction in California.

New AI tool to listen to your voice & detect diabetes with 89% accuracy

NEW YORK, Oct 19 (Agencies): Determining whether a person is dia betic could be as easy as having them speak a few sentences into their smartphone, according to a groundbreaking study that combines voice technology with artificial intelligence in a major step forward in diabetes detection.

Scientists from Klick Labs in the US used six to 10 seconds of people's voice, along with basic health data, including age, sex, height, and weight, to create an AI model that can distinguish whether that individual has Type 2 diabetes.

The model, detailed in the journal Mayo Clinic Proceedings: Digital Health, has 89 per cent accuracy for women and 86 per cent for men.



For the study, researchers asked 267 people (diagnosed as either non- or Type 2 diabetic) to record a phrase into their smartphone six times daily for two weeks. From more than 18,000 recordings, scientists analysed 14 acoustic features for differences between non-diabetic and Type 2 diabetic individuals.

Using signalprocessing, scientists were able to detect changes in the voice caused by Type 2 diabetes. Surprisingly, those vocal changes manifested in different ways for males and females, Kaufman said.

Almost one in two, or 240 million adults living with diabetes worldwide are unaware they have the condition and nearly 90 per cent of diabetic cases are Type 2 diabetes, according to the International Diabetes Federation.

The most frequently used diagnostic tests for prediabetes and Type 2 diabetes include the glycated haemoglobin (A1C), along with cose (FBG) test and the OGTT.

Yan Fossat, vice president of Klick Labs and principal investigator of this study, said the new non-intrusive and accessible approach offers the potential to screen vast numbers of people and help identify the large percentage of undiagnosed people with Type 2 diabetes.

"Our research underscores the tremendous potential of voice technology in identifying Type 2 diabetes and other health conditions," Fossat said.

"Voice technology could revolutionise healthcare practices as an accessible and affordable digital screening tool."

ICMR completes clinical trials of world's first injectable male contraceptive; study claims it's safe

NEW DELHI, Oct 19 (Agencies): The Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) has completed the clinical trials of the world's first injectable male contraceptive which showed that it is safe and highly efficacious without any serious side effects.

The findings of the phase-III clinical trial, which involved 303 candidates aged 25-40 years, were published in the international open access Andrology journal last month.

The open-labelled and non-randomized, multicentre hospital-based phase-III clinical trials were carried out at five different centres (New Delhi, Udhampur, Ludhiana, Jaipur and Kharagpur) and coordinated by the ICMR, New Delhi.

Permission to conduct phase-III clinical trial was granted by the Drugs Controller General India (DCGI) and approved by the institutional ethical committees of the respective centres.

As part of the study, 303 healthy, sexually active and married men and their healthy and sexually active wives who came to the family planning clinic and department of urology or



surgery for vasectomy or No Scalpel Vasectomy (NSV) were identified.

The men were injected with 60 mg of Reversible Inhibition of Sperm under Guidance (RISUG).

"The overall efficacy of RISUG with respect to achieving azoospermia was 97.3 per cent and based on pregnancy prevention was 99.02 per cent without any serious side effect," the study stated.

"In the history of contraceptive development, RISUG presents the highest effectiveness compared to all other contraceptives both male and female as they were at the threshold of induction into a mass contraception program," it said.

According to the study, with an ever-increasing world population, there is an urgent need to develop modern methods of male contraception for population control.

Even though vasectomy is quite effective as a contraceptive measure, some major limitations of this method call for the development of improved techniques. An ideal male contraceptive approach should have minimally invasive drug delivery system with a one-time injection, long-term effectiveness with negligible side-effects and the option of reversal. "To achieve these

goals, a novel male contraceptive approach of Reversible Inhibition of Sperm under Guidance (RISUG) has been developed, which has the potential to become for mass use as once injectable and reversible male contraceptive method. Significant features of this method include localized injection and no detectable interaction with other body parts unlike the hormonal injectable contraceptives," the study said.

Cricket World Cup 2023: Rohit Sharma On Verge Of Achieving Historic First In ODI Cricket

NEW DELHI, Oct 19 (Agencies): Rohit Sharma is on the verge of adding a massive record to his already illustrious career as the Indian cricket team skipper can become the first batter from his country to hit 50 sixes in a calendar year. Right now, Rohit has 47 sixes and if he can hit 3 more sixes in the course of the Cricket World Cup 2023, he will be able to achieve the historic first. Overall, West Indies legend Chris Gayle and former South Africa star AB De Villiers are the only cricketers to achieve this feat. De Villiers tops the list with 58 sixes back in 2015 - a record that Rohit can potentially break considering the number of games left.

Meanwhile, Australian legend Ricky Ponting believes a "laidback" Rohit Sharma is the ideal



captain to lead India to their third ODI World Cup title, the second on home soil after the 2011 triumph.

With three convincing wins

under their belt, India have made a perfect start to their World Cup campaign. India defeated Australia by six wickets in their tournament opener, before registering emphatic eight and seven-wicket wins over Afghanistan and Pakistan to sit on top of the points table.

"He's very laid back, Rohit. Very laid back with everything he does. You can even see that by the way that he plays. He's a pretty laconic sort of batsman as well, and that's the way he is both on and off the field," Ponting told the ICC website.

Rohit took the captaincy reins from Virat Kohli in both the white-ball formats in December 2021.

"But I think Rohit will be fine with it. He's a terrific bloke and has been a great player for a long time, and he's done a great job as leader of India." The Men In Blue last won the World Cup when the tournament was jointly hosted by India, Sri Lanka and Bangladesh in 2011.

World Cup 2023: Good reasons why England have won two tournaments recently, McCullum backs Jos Buttler side

Won't tinker with winning combination: Paras Mhambrey

PUNE, Oct 19 (Agencies): India bowling coach Paras Mhambrey today made it clear that the team will stick to its winning combination against Bangladesh even if it means that Suryakumar Yadav and Mohammed Shami would have to wait to play in this edition of the ODI World Cup.

With emphatic wins against five-time World Cup winners Australia, Afghanistan and Pak-

istan till now, the Indian team management does not think it is right to unsettle the winning combination. "It is important to maintain the start. Mohammed Siraj and Jasprit Bumrah have edged out Shami till now and left-arm wrist spinner Kuldeep Yadav's selection means Ravichandran Ashwin has been sidelined. "Honestly, it is never easy to see. But right now the conversations are on, we had a clear chat with him (Shami).

Whenever we select a squad the message from us is clear that we pick a team we feel is the best for that wicket," Mhambrey said. "Sometimes you will miss out, someone like him is missing out, someone like Ashwin will miss out and I think that is the communication we had with him (and) we were very clear. It is a difficult decision, honestly we know with the quality that he brings to the team. It is difficult but we have to take the decision, we (can) only have eleven on the field," the India bowling coach added.

Earning their stripes against Bangla Tigers



PUNE, Oct 19 (Agencies): Is there a surprise in store for the fans today as well? The last three days of the ODI World Cup have seen two major upsets — first Afghanistan beat defending champions England, and then Netherlands stunned high-flying South Africa.

Is it the turn of Bangladesh next? It depends on which Bangladesh side turns up against a rampaging India at the MCA International Stadium here today. Will it be the side that beat India thrice in their last four ODI meetings, the most recent coming in the Asia Cup last month, or the team that has struggled in the World Cup so far with just one win and two losses?

Virat Kohli took a guarded approach while replying to the official broadcaster regarding the trend of shock wins in this World Cup. "There are no big teams in the World Cup. Whenever you start focussing only on bigger teams, an upset happens," he said. "You have to play your best against all these bowlers, and if you aren't able to, these bowlers are able to create pressure and increase the chances

of getting you out," he

added. While India may look content with going with the flow, Bangladesh still have many creases to iron out. Their pace battery of Taskin Ahmed and Mustafizur Rahman is just not clicking. Bangladesh's batsmen are performing belowpar and their talisman Shakib Al Hasan is yet to recover from a thigh injury. Shakib did not train on the match eve for the scans till tomorrow morning. "Over the years, I've played a lot against him (Shakib). He's got amazing control. He's a very experienced bowler. He bowls very well with the new ball, knows how to deceive the batsman, and is also very economical," Kohli said of Bangladesh's maverick all-rounder.

Any side with so many problems may not nurture any hope of a turnaround but Bangladesh are not a regular side. They are the underdogs with a bite. You never know which Bangladesh side may turn up on a given day.

In the World Cups, India have a 3-1 upper hand but Bangladesh have pushed India in the quadrennial event repeatedly. In the 2007 World Cup, Bangladesh knocked India out of the tournament with a fivewicket win in the group stage. In 2011, 2015 and 2019, India survived early scares against Bangladesh.

Pune has already witnessed one of the biggest upsets in the World Cup history when Kenya, a non-Test-playing team, shocked a star-studded West Indies by 73 runs in

New Zealand hand Afghanistan reality check

New Zealand were not as forgiving though when they returned to defend their total and bundled out Afghanistan for 139 inside 35 overs to coast to their fourth successive win in the tournament. "Another great performance," Latham, leading the side in absence of injured Kane Williamson, said after



his team soared to the top of the points table. "We were put under pressure some times. The bowlers managed to take wickets when it was needed." Spin is Afghanistan's strong suit and off-spinner Mujeeb Ur Rahman set to work after they won the toss and elected to field.



importantly, his mindset. Pakistan have had a history of attacking batters - Shahid Afridi, Imran Nazir, Saeed Anwar, Aamer Sohail. In the present top three, everyone bats in similar mode. If someone has to take responsibility, it has to be their captain, who bats at No. 3," Gautam Gambhir told Sportskeeda.

"There is no point looking at stats. You may become Pakistan's leading run-getter, but legacy is created by winning tournaments, not individual records. Wasim Akram took

three wickets in the 1992 World Cup final. He did not pick up a five-fer, but everybody talks about it because they won the World Cup. Nobody talks about Mahela Jayawardene's hundred in the 2011 final. Everyone remembers that India won the match."

Gautam Gambhir went to explain his point in detail and even brought up Rohit Sharma's example.

"The team plays how the captain plays. Both Babar Azam and Rohit Sharma scored fifties. One scored a 50, other scored an 80. None of them scored a hundred, but it was the approach that was the difference. If Pakistan were chasing 190, their mindset would have been just to win the game, whether they get there in 35 or 40 overs," he said.

"It is important for the

captain to take respon-

sibility. If the captain is defensive, the team will be defensive. You can't tell the 10 other players in the room that, 'you play positive, I will play [anchor] from one end'." Against India, from 155 for the loss of two wickets, Pakistan were all out for 191 and former Pakistan pacer Shoaib Akhtar rued the loss of opportunity to post a competitive total on a wicket that was batter-

friendly.

"What a waste of opportunity on a great batting wicket. Disappointed. Very disappointed," he posted on X (formerly known as Twitter).
