#### **Police Book** 3 notorious drug smugglers under PIT NDPS act in Baramulla

SRINAGAR, Oct 20 (Agencies): Police on Friday booked three wanted notorious drug smugglers under the Prevention of Illicit Traffic in Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (PIT NDPS) Act in Jammu and Kashmir's Baramulla district.

The three most wanted notorious drug smugglers, Musadiq Afzal Masoodi, alias Vicky, a resident of Pampore Pulwama, Mohammad Shafi Hajam of Wanigam Bala, and Ghulam Hassan Ganie of Trikanjan Boniyar, have been booked under the PIT-NDPS Act after obtaining formal detention orders from the competent authority, police said in a state-

The booked drug smugglers have been detained and subsequently lodged in Central Jail Kot-balwal

Police said many cases have been registered against these drug smugglers, who were involved in promoting drug abuse by supplying drugs to local youth in Baramulla, Uri, Pattan Boniyar, and other areas of District Baramulla.

Despite their involvement in many FIRs, they did not mend their activities and were again involved in promoting drug abuse by supplying drugs to local youth, they said.

## Nitin Gadkari inaugurates country's tallest national | Pashmina a cultural flag at Attari-Wagah border in Punjab's Amritsar

AMRITSAR, Oct 20 (Agencies): Union Minister Nitin Gadkari inaugurated a 418 feet national flag, the tallest in the country, at the Attari-Wagah border in Punjab's Amritsar district.

Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann was also present on the occasion.

Speaking to ANI on Thursday, Nitin Gadkari said, "It is the golden day of my life. I have come to the Attari-Wagah border for the first time. NHAI has installed the tallest national flag here. This is a place that inspires you to be patriotic. I have done a lot of things in life - tunnels, bridges



but this is the most amazing. I am delighted. I thank the jawans who are guarding our bor-

Earlier last month, the Poonch Brigade of the Indian Army on September 21 unfurled a 72-feet-high national flag at Aiote War Memorial in Poonch to honour the fallen heroes of the district. Indian Army in collaboration with Flag Foundation of India installed the national

The National Flag is a horizontal tricolour of

saffron (kesaria) at the top, white in the middle and green at the bottom in equal proportion. The ratio of the width of the flag to its length is two to three. In the centre of the white band is a navy-blue wheel which represents the chakra.

The top saffron colour indicates the strength and courage of the country. The white middle band indicates peace and truth with Dharma Chakra. The areen shows the fertility, growth and auspiciousness of the land.

Its design is that of the wheel which appears on the abacus of the

## Govt authorities to pay Rs 30 lakh compensation to families of those who die while cleaning sewers: SC

NEW DELHI, Oct 20 (Agencies): Taking a grim view of incidents of sewer deaths in the country, the Supreme Court on Friday said government authorities will have to pay Rs 30 lakh as compensation to the kin of those who die while cleaning sewers.

A bench comprising Justices S Ravindra Bhat and Aravind Kumar

said those who suffer permanent disabilities while cleaning sewers will be paid Rs 20 lakh as minimum compensa-

"The Union and the state governments must ensure that manual scavenging is completely eradicated," the bench said.

Pronouncing the judgement, Justice Bhat said

the authorities will have to pay up to Rs 10 lakh if the cleaner suffers other disabilities

Issuing a slew of directions, which were not read out, the bench directed that the government agencies must coordinate to ensure that such incidents do not occur and moreover, the High Courts are not precluded from monitoring the cases related to sewer deaths.

The judgement came on a PIL. The detailed order is awaited.

As many as 347 people died while cleaning sewers and septic tanks in India in the last five years with Uttar Pradesh, Tamil Nadu and Delhi accounting for 40 per cent of these Turn to page 9

SRINAGAR, Oct 20 (Agencies): The INDIA alliance will win all the Lok Sabha seats in Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh Union Territories in the next election, J&K Congress president Vikar Rasool claimed on Friday.

Talking to media persons here, Vikar said that like in Ladakh Autonomous Hill Development Council (LAHDC)-Kargil elections, INDIA alliance will sweep the forthcoming Lok Sabha election in J&K and Ladakh.



In the first polls after erstwhile J&K was divided and the Union Territory of Ladakh was carved, the National Conference and Congress alliance bagged 22 seats out of 26 in the recently held LAHDC-Kargil elections.

"Like in Kargil, we will sweep the Lok Sabha election and the INDIA alliance will also become victorious here also," he said.

The J&K Congress President added that the party is ready for the upcoming Lok Sabha election and it will contest the poll together with the INDIA alliance.







## **EDITORIAL**

## **BRIDGE GAP**

ndividualism, at first, saps the virtues of public life; but in the long run it attacks and destroys all others and is at length absorbed in downright selfishness."

With the nuclear family concept gaining ground, the traditional hierarchy within the family has broken down. Elders feel like intruders in the home of their own children, people are silently witnessing violence to family life, its health; it is tearing apart the fabric of family as an institution. These distortions may be construed to be causes and consequences of the generation gap that is becoming more and more pointed and pronounced with each passing day.

Teenagers and the youth are increasingly seen to be beyond control and a world unto themselves. More and more of elders their numbers going up rapidly are finding themselves lonely and unable to adjust to the ways of a fast-changing, increasingly busy and self-centered world.

The phenomenon 'generation gap' apparently delineates two sets of different persons having distinct physical and mental make-up, but in reality it is much more than meets the eye. Essentially, it is a difference in attitude or lack of understanding between young people and older people.

No society, group or family set-up is free from the tensions and traumas born out of the generation-gap, where on one end of the spectrum stands the balding or graying head of the family and on the other the defiant and disobedient youth ready to break all barriers so that he or she can assert his/her point of view to the extent of being a 'rebel'. Like the two banks of a river or the cultural contours of the East and the West, the twain fails to meet even halfway.

No doubt, society's values and belief structures rise and fall with changing times. In the modern world mankind has turned inwards to serve the self and worship individuality. There is almost a worldwide trend towards weakening of community and family ties. Human relationship is becoming narrower, confined largely to the nuclear family.

But even within this small unit there is an increasing crisis in the relationship c husband and wife, in the relationship between parents and children.

The problem, though touching and taunting may not defy a solution if both the youth and the age sit together with open minds and come to terms with realities. In a situation where the youth is active and aspiring, the onus lies on it to show reasonable restraint and respect to the elders who claim to have seen better days and behaved differently with their seniors or blood relations.

The older persons, on their part, should give up living in a world of illusions and self-delusion and address themselves to the changed milieu, where their role is passive.

No two generations are alike in their perceptions and preferences. If the younger one is aggressive and assertive, the elder one too is not very polite and pliant. Blaming the new generation for everything that has gone wrong in the society is like showing a red rag to the bull. The generation gap has been the rigorous reality of life since ages.

In the dying years of the present century, the hiatus between the two seems to have become more pronounced and painful because the younger generation is moved and motivated more by career considerations or calculation than by care, concern and compassion for their elders.

In the absence of 'a cause' for which they and their elders may stand and share one platform, crass commercial consciousness has widened the chasm between the two, leaving behind a trail of bitterness, complaints and grudges against each other.

Since each new generation becomes out of tune and touch with the upcoming one, it is in the fitness of things that the youth of today exhibit understanding and adjustment with the older generation now, so that it does not suffer the burden of 'guilt conscience' in its graying or balding period of life.

### 61 years after 1962, be alert for fresh Chinese mischief



ixty-one years have gone since October 20, 1962, When Communist China's founder and overlord launched the Sino-Indian war, with the primary objective of humiliating India's first Prime Minister, Jawaharlal Nehru, known across the world as an apostle of peace, non-violence, harmony and a "live-and-let-live" practitioner of the post-Western imperialism era of the Third World. As a disciple and the chosen successor of Mahatma Gandhi, there could not be a bigger contrast between Nehru and Mao, who was held responsible for millions of deaths on his long march to power in Beijing in 1949.

Democratic India was a symbol of hope to the newly-free nations of Asia and Africa, while the People's Republic of China was a pariah state led by a hostile muscleman of murderous ideology, who had fought against the United Nations in Korea and had brutally invaded and conquered an independent and peaceful Tibet, driving the Dalai Lama into exile in India. The contrast between New Delhi's democratic PM and the Dragon's autocratic ruler was so stark that Mao had to prove himself as a "true" "Son of Heaven" and look beyond the Hwang Ho valley into the sub-Himalayan terrain.

In 1962's aftermath, Mao's evil designs are now in the public domain. The archives reveal that "a meeting took place in Beijing between Mao and a group of Naxal leaders from India in December 1967". Mao "would have ended the border dispute with India by returning the land south of the McMahon Line if a 'people's government' had come to power in New Delhi". This and many such suggestions were made by the Communist Party of China's head, who claimed he didn't want the 90,000 sq km but for the "capitalist and feudal government" in India.

Li Danhui, of East China Norma University, who had access to the Chinese archives, reveals this little-known impor-



tant piece of history: "Because India is an imperialist, feudal and bureaucrat-capitalist government, China had to fight for every inch of land and had been using dilatory tactics in dealing with the issue". Clearly, the objective was to destroy Nehru and bring him down.

As the current "core leader" of the CPC, Chairman Xi Jinping, is a self-proclaimed re-incarnate of Mao, it would be useful to peruse what his demigod (Mao Zedong) had to say in 1938, with utter contempt about the political systems which didn't toe, or fall in line with, the CPC's autocratic brand of criminality: "China's war of resistance was an extraordinary spectacle in the history of warfare. It would in the future influence not only the fate of China and Japan; it would also surge forward the progress of all countries, and in particular of oppressed peoples such as India, to march forward" (Selected Works of Mao Zedong, Volume II).

The point today is that due to the monumental folly of a sizeable chunk of gullible and ignorant Indians' obsession with China and addiction to all things Chinese, the ship of the Indian State is slowly but steadily sailing on to the doomed rocks. If territory was the prime target of Mao in 1962, multiple lipsmacking lucrative economic, commercial and money-spinning ventures are on CPC boss Xi Jinping's radar in 2023.

Today, the Xi brigade's main mission is to ensure that "Delhi must be destroyed". Virtually

all countries of Asia, Africa and Latin America, big and small, are being lured to pay obeisance at Mr Xi's court. One of the key exceptions is India, which stands defiant despite a humongous \$100 billion-plus trade deficit, the erosion of automobile industry caused by the CPC's companies, humiliating and irreversible territorial losses, the addiction of India's cost-conscious customers to cheap

Chinese-made phones and a variety of electronic devices and the destruction of industry by a sizeable number of importloving traders who collude and connive with CPC-sponsored agent provocateurs in the guise of merchants.

Despite this gloomy scenario, however, there's also glimmer of hope. India's much-maligned law enforcement agencies are rendering yeoman's service to the nation on the China front. Court filings by the Enforcement Directorate reveals that "Rs 1.07 trillion (about \$13 billion) have been remitted outside India by Chinese company Vivo to trading companies controlled by its Chinese parent... masking layers, intended to escape the Government of India's notice". "While no profits are shown from 2014-15 to 2019-20 in statutory filings and no income-tax paid, huge sums siphoned off out of India", in July 2022 alone, the ED estimated a figure of Rs 624.7 billion (\$7.5 billion) remitted abroad, mainly to China.

Vivo, however, is just the tip of the CPC's criminal gang iceberg in India. Although the Indian


media does occasionally refer to chronic Chinese shenanigans, a Western media outfit put it much more starkly: "Inside the deadly loan apps that blackmail with nudes: the Chinese-masterminded blackmail scam is using instant loan apps to entrap and humiliate people across India". At a time when President Biden himself is looking ahead to a face-to-face meeting with President Xi at the landmark Apec summit in the United States next month, India is "rocking the Chinese boat" by arresting their nationals for illegally making billions for a Beijing state enterprise run by the CPC as its personal fiefdom! This, when Mr Xi considers he's at the cusp of determining and "shaping the destiny of mankind" along with Mr Biden in San Francisco in November?

The strategy of Xi Jinping is clear. He feels he is a "worthy torch-bearer" of the late Chairman Mao to take on India because that's the last bastion standing in the way between the Dragon Emperor and a large part of the world falling head over heels at his feet!

## Is it worth going to study in a foreign university?

or the past few years, the craze for people from India to go abroad to gain admission to foreign colleges and settle there has been on the increase. According to the government, between 2016 and 2021, 26.44 lakh Indian students went abroad to study. The Associated Chambers of Commerce and Industry of India (ASSOCHAM) estimates show that in the year 2020, 4.5 lakh Indian students went abroad for education and they spent \$ 13.5 billion in this process. In the year 2022, this expenditure was 24 billion dollars that is, about 2 lakh crore rupees. According to the report of Red seer Strategy Consultant, by 2024 this expenthat is, 7 lakh crore rupees, when an estimated 20 lakh Indian students will go abroad to study. If we make a state-wise analysis, till the year 2021, among the students going to study abroad, 12 per cent were from Punjab and Andhra Pradesh each; and 8 per cent were from Gujarat. If seen in proportion to the total number of youth, then 7 out of every thousand youth from Punjab, 4 out of every thousand youth from Andhra Pradesh and at least 2 out of every thousand youth from Gujarat are going to study abroad every year. If we take the cumulative numbers from 2016 to 2022, the situation looks quite alarming. This number is 50 per thou-sand in Punjab, 30 per thou-sand in Andhra Pradesh and 14 per thousand in Gujarat. The exponential increase in the number of students going abroad to study is a matter of concern for many reasons. The biggest concern is that these youth are migrating to foreign countries in search of education and employment and this migration is causing a shortage of labour for the economic activities in the country. There has been huge progress in the

tion, then in 1990-91, only 49.2 lakh students took admission in higher educational institutions; but this number reached 414 lakh in the year 2020-21. Broadly speaking, the number of students taking admission to higher education has increased more than 10 times in the last 30 years. If we talk about higher education institutions, we see that in the year 2021, there were 1113 universities and equivalent institutions, 43796 colleges and 11296 standalone educational institutions in the country. As far as the fee for admission into educational institutions is concerned, in most of the Indian educational institutions it's much lower than the fees in foreign institutions and most of the foreign institutions in which Indian youth are taking admission are of very low standard. So, the question arises why do Indian youth spend huge amounts of money and get admission to foreign educational institutions? The simple answer is that most of the students who

go abroad to pursue higher edu-

cation, actually don't go to get a

higher degree. The real intent of

Indian students going to other countries including Australia, Canada, and European countries including the United Kingdom, is not too keen to get an education. Their real objective is to get employment there. But Indian youth fail to realise that there is a huge shortage of employment in these countries also. In many countries, incidents of violence by local people, against Indians and youth coming from other countries, generally from South Asia, are also being witnessed. Most of the young students leaving the country fail to get employment there and have to return home, due to which they are also facing frustration.

The students are not able to realise that today in Canada, Australia and European countries, where they are taking admission to educational institutions, those educational institutions are giving easy admission to Indian students in their institutions, for profit.

Mystery of mysteries... Surrealism has been used as cinematic device to draw attention to a hard-hitting subject. However, rarely does it make such an impact as in The Fall of the House of Usher. Like the series Painkiller, it takes a look into the murky world of drug companies. The Usher family, owner of pharmaceutical company, is facing a trial for its highly addictive drug.

But this is no courtroom drama or a police procedural. In this reimagining of the short story of the same name and other works by Edgar Allan Poe, Mike Flanagan creates a contemporary riveting drama. The series unfolds like a thriller, flirting with horror if you will. It begins with the death of young members of the Usher family and a confession by its head, Roderick Usher (Bruce Greenwood).

As the eight-episode drama streaming on Netflix goes back and forth, we are led into a compelling maze. One by one we become privy to the life and death of Roderick's children, both legitimate and illegitimate. There is Prospero (Sauriyan Sapkota), who wants to set up



a sex bar, Leo (Rahul Kohli), a video game publisher and a drug addict. Kate Siegel as Camille is the public relations head, T'Nia Miller as Victorine LaFourcade is in charge of clinical trials. Samantha Sloyan as Tamerlane is creating a highend wellness brand. Most of them have twisted lives. Amoral and consumed by ambition... one after another they die. Actors playing the Ushers bring out their fetishes without inhibition and with right degree of off-centre waywardness. The family is not without its moral compass. The real conscience in the series is this mysterious woman Verna (Carla Gugino). Who is she, a victim? At a subliminal level; is she maya or karma?

Flanagan makes us grapple with multiple truths to finally drive home a simple message. The biblical saying 'sins of parents are visited upon their children' is not uttered but its import and that of 'what goes around comes around' hits like a bolt. Madeline's lines in the climax about consumerism pack a punch. Finally, in The Fall of The House of Usher we see the fall of humanity, anatomy of ambition with chilling clarity and as viewers, we get our slice of redemption too.





The 17 Km priority section of the Delhi-Ghaziabad-Meerut RRTS Corridor will connect Sahibabad to 'Duhai Depot' with stations at Ghaziabad, Guldhar and Duhai on the way. The foundation stone for Delhi-Ghaziabad-Meerut corridor was laid by the Prime Minister on 8th March 2019.

Union Minister Hardeep Singh Puri said,"The success of this project is equivalent to Chandrayan 3. Soon we will have the largest metro network in the world."

Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath said, "It is a gift to us in Navratri. In the last nine and half years we have witnessed world class infrastructure under your visionary first RapidX train which will be known as "Namo Bharat".

Polling for 20 seats in the 90-member Chhattisgarh Assembly will be held on November 7 while votes for the remaining 70 seats will be cast in the second phase on November 17.

The counting of votes in Chhattisgarh, along with those in four other poll-bound states, has been scheduled for December 3. The Model Code of Conduct has already come into effect in Chhattisgarh. In the last assembly polls in 2018, the Congress recorded a landslide mandate, winning 68 seats of the 90 seats while the BJP finished a distant second at just 15 seats.

# Army recovers war-like stores in Manipur

All the seized weapons were handed over to Manipur Police as per laid-down procedure



NEW DELHI, Oct 20 (Agencies): The Army after conducting three major successful operations in Manipur have recovered 36 weapons, 1,615 ammunition pieces and 132 other war-like stores.

The war-like stores' recovery is considered the largest since May.
All the seized weapons were handed

over to Manipur Police as per laid-down procedure on Thursday.

Officials confirmed the recovery on Friday.

The three operations were carried out in the ridges of Khamenlok-Gwalthabi, Wakan and Shantipur by the 2nd battalion of the 8th Regiment of Gorkha Rifles. These form part of the Imphal East in Manipur.

The ridges of Khamenlok-Gwalthabi, Wakan and Shantipur separate different villages of two warring communities in Imphal East. Intelligence reports indicated the build-up of weapons, ammunition and other war-like store caches by both the communities on either side of the ridges, officials said.

The weapons cache was probably being built up by insurgents for trying to strike in each other's area.

Army columns at Sagolmang in Imphal East were tasked to carry out extensive surveillance and multiple coordinated search operations on the ridges. The operations were aimed at recovering maximum war-like stores and disrupting any attempts of firing or arson by insurgents and miscreants.

### Mahua Moitra alleges PMO 'forced' businessman Darshan Hiranandani to sign 'white paper, with no letterhead', describes advocate Dehadrai 'jilted-ex'

NEW DELHI, Oct 20 (Agencies): Trinamool Congress MP Mahua Moitra on Friday claimed the Prime Minister's office drafted businessman Darshan Hiranandani's affidavit submitted before the Lok Sabha's ethics committee.

Hiranandani, top real-estate developer, deposed in his affidavit on Thursday that Moitra had provided him her Parliament's login credentials so that he could post questions directly on her behalf.

In the affidavit, the businessman claimed that Moitra thought she could effectively attack Prime Minister Narendra Modi by attacking Gautam Adani and his group.

Hiranandani also alleged that Moitra was getting help from other people like journalist Sucheta Dalal who



were supplying her with unverified information relating to Gautam Adani and his companies. Dalal has denied the claim.

In a statement, Moitra said the contents of the letter were "a joke" and remarked that it appeared to have been drafted by "some half-wit in the PMO who doubles up as a creative writer in the BJP's IT cell".

"The affidavit is on white paper and not on official letterhead or notarised. Why would one of India's most respected/educated businessmen sign a letter like this on white paper unless a gun was put to his head to do it?", Moitra said in her statement on Friday.

Moitra asked why Hiranandani had not read out the affidavit in a press conference or tweeted it. "If indeed he has 'confessed' to this, why is he not releasing it officially rather than through back channel leaks?" she said.

Moitra asked how Hiranandani, who accompanied the Prime Minister abroad recently as part of his business delegation and "enjoys direct access to every minister and the PMO", could be "coerced by a first-time Opposition MP into giving her gifts and giving into her demands".

Moitra, MP from Krishnanagar in West Bengal, alleged that the Prime Minister's Office had drafted the letter and held a "proverbial gun to Darshan and his father's (Hiranandani Group co-founder Niranjan Hiranandani) heads and gave them 20 minutes to sign the letter sent to them".

"They were told they will be finished, the CBI would raid them and all government businesses would stop and all PSU bank financing would be stopped immediately," she wrote.

"Though tragic, it is totally understandable

that Darshan (who is a dear friend) would need to think of what is at stake for him here – namely the continuation of his family businesses built up over decades and the fate of thousands of employees - and buckle under pressure and sign this", Moitra wrote.

On October 15, BJP MP Nishikant Dubey had written to Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla and sought to have Moitra immediately suspended for allegedly taking bribes from Hiranandani to ask questions in Parliament. Dubey cited a letter from advocate Jai Dehadrai to back his charges.

In her statement on Friday, Moitra described Dehadrai as a "jilted-ex with an acrimonious personal history with me who wanted to somehow get back at me".

## Nithari Killings Accused Released From Jail, Another To Remain Behind Bars

Nithari Killings: Surinder Koli and Moninder Singh Pandher, who were convicted of rape and murder, were acquitted by the high court over lack of evidence.

NEW DELHI/NOIDA, Oct 20 (Agencies): Nithari's serial killings' accused Moninder Singh Pandhar was released from a Greater Noida jail today days after the Allahabad high Court cleared him of all charges.

The Allahabad High Court on Monday acquitted Moninder Singh Pandhar in two cases and his domestic help Surendra Koli - who is the main accused in the sensational case - in 12 cases.

Surinder Koli and Moninder Singh Pandher, who were convicted of rape and murder, were acquitted by the high court over lack of evidence. The high court said the prosecution had failed to prove its case beyond reasonable doubt. Koli, however, continues to be a life-term prisoner for his conviction in one case.

The serial killings took place at Moninder Pandher's home in Nithari area of Uttar Pradesh's Noida between 2005 and 2006, according to the CBI.

Surinder Koli worked as a help at Pandher's home, which was dubbed by many as the "house of horrors" after the revelations. Koli would lure the children into the house, where he and Pandher raped and murdered them, it was alleged.



The police said they would chop up the bodies of the children and throw the parts in drains to destroy the evidence.

The discovery of body parts of a missing child in a drain near Pandher's home led to a mas-

sive investigation that revealed the identities of more victims. Disturbing allegations of murder, mutilation, and even cannibalism held the nation's attention for weeks and months.

The police said there were a series of gruesome murders of several more children, after which the case was taken over by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI).

Koli had earlier also confessed to having sex with the dead victims and also eating their body parts.

The duo was also convicted for rape and murder of a 20-year-old woman.

# SC dismisses PIL challenging restoration of Rahul Gandhi LS membership



NEW DELHI, Oct 20 (Agencies): The Supreme Court on Friday dismissed a PIL challenging the restoration of Congress leader Rahul Gandhi's Lok Sabha membership and imposed a cost of Rs 1

lakh on the petitioner.

A bench headed by
Justice BR Gavai said

the petition is an abuse of the process of law as no fundamental right of the petitioner has been violated.

The top court was hearing a plea filed by advocate Ashok Pandey challenging the restoration of Gandhi's membership.

The Lok Sabha Secre-

tariat had restored Gandhi's membership after the Supreme Court on August 4 stayed his conviction in a case related to a remark on the 'Modi' surname.

The Congress leader, who was disqualified from the lower house in March 2023, was reinstated as Wayanad MP.

BJP leader Purnesh Modi had filed a criminal defamation case against Gandhi in 2019 over his "How come all thieves have Modi as the common surname?" remark made during an election rally in Kolar in Karnataka on April 13, 2019.

## 'Hamas, Putin represent different threats': **Biden says if international aggression is** allowed 'chaos can spread to world'

Declares support for Israel, Ukraine; calls it 'vital' for US security

WASHINGTON, Oct 20 (Agencies): President Joe Biden declared it is "vital for America's national security" for Israel and Ukraine to succeed in their wars, making the case on Thursday night for deepening US involvement in a rare Oval Office address as he prepared to ask for billions of dollars in military assistance for both countries.

If international aggression is allowed to continue, Biden said, "conflict and chaos could spread in other parts of the world".

"Hamas and Putin represent different threats," Biden said. "But they share this in common. They both want to completely



annihilate a neighbouring democracy."

He said he would send an urgent funding request to Congress, which is expected to be roughly USD 100 billion over

the next year. The proposal, which will be unveiled on Friday, includes money for Ukraine, Israel, Taiwan, humanitarian aid and border management.

"It's a smart investment that's

going to pay dividends for American security for generations," Biden said.

Biden hopes that combining all of these issues into one piece of legislation will create the necessary political coalition for congressional approval. His speech comes the day after his highstakes trip to Israel, where he showed solidarity with the country in its battle against Hamas and pushed for more humanitarian assistance to Palestinians in the Gaza Strip.

Ahead of his address, Biden spoke with Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy to stress that the US remained committed to backing Kyiv, the White House said.

#### Israel army orders evacuation of northern city of Kiryat Shmona after Lebanon clashes

JERUSALEM, Oct 20 (Agencies): The Israeli army announced plans to evacuate the northern city of Kiryat Shmona on Friday, after days of clashes with Hezbollah fighters along the border with Lebanon.

"A short while ago, the Northern Command informed the mayor of the city of the decision. The plan will be managed by the local authority, the Ministry of Tourism and the Ministry of Defence," the military said in a statement.

Lebanon's Iranbacked Hezbollah and allied Palestinian factions have traded crossborder fire with Israel for days, after Hamas gunmen attacked communities in southern Israel on October 7, killing at least 1,400 people, most of them civilians, according to Israeli officials.

More than 3,700 Palestinians, mainly civilians, have been killed across the Gaza Strip in retaliatory Israeli bombardments, according to figures from its Hamasrun health ministry.

Israel's military said its forces continued to target Hezbollah targets as tensions grew along the border.

"The IDF (Israel Defense Forces) carried out a number of attacks against Hezbollah infrastructure, including observation posts," the army said early Friday.

"In addition, IDF fighter jets struck three terrorists who attempted to launch anti-tank missiles toward Israel.

Israeli authorities have been steadily evacuating communities across the northern frontier, as reservists and columns of tanks and armoured vehicles poured into the

The Shiite Muslim Hezbollah movement, Lebanon's only armed faction that did not disarm after the 1975-1990 civil war, last fought a major conflict with Israel in 2006.

That war left more than 1,200 dead in Lebanon, mostly civilians, and 160 in Israel, mostly soldiers, in a conflict that left deep scars and the border bristling with

OTTAWA, Oct 20 (Agencies): Canada updated the travel advisory for its citizens in India asking them to "exercise a high degree of caution" just hours after the country withdrew 41 diplomats and closed most of its embassies and consulates in India. The move comes amid the bitter row between the two countries over the killing of a Khalistani terrorist

on Canadian soil. "Exercise a high degree of caution in India due to the threat of terrorist attacks throughout the country," the advisory issued by Canada read.

"In the context of recent developments in Canada and India, there are calls for pro-



tests and some negative sentiment towards Canada in traditional media and on social media. Demonstrations, including anti-Canada protests, could occur and Canadians may be subjected to intimidation or harassment. In Delhi and the National Capital Region, you should keep a low profile with strangers, and not share your personal informa-

tion with them," the advisory added.

Earlier today, Canada withdrew 41 diplomats and their family members from India after the Centre threatened to strip them of their diplomatic immunity.

Canada also paused all in-person services at the consulates in Mumbai, Chandigarh, and Bengaluru and urged its citizens in these three cities

to exercise caution. All Canadians in India have been asked to contact the High Commission in New Delhi in case they need assistance.

"Exercise a high degree of caution in and around Bengaluru, Chandigarh, and Mumbai. Consular services in-person are temporarily unavailable in those cities or surrounding areas," the advisory said.

"Petty crime, such as pickpocketing and purse snatching, is common. Criminals may target foreigners, especially in major cities and tourist areas," the advisory read, urging citizens to be vigilant in crowded locations and not carry large sums of money.

## Another setback to Rishi Sunak as UK's ruling Conservatives suffer two big by-election losses

Britain's ailing economy, the worst cost-of-living crisis in decades and several years of scandal and tumult within the Tories helped trigger the historic outcome.

LONDON, Oct 20 (Agencies): Britain's ruling Conservative Party lost two parliament seats to Labour on Friday, another ominous setback for Prime Minister Rishi Sunak and his party ahead of a general election expected next year.

The by-election results -- the latest in a string of traditionally safe Tory seats lost to rival parties in recent years -- saw Labour overturn huge majorities to further fuel hopes of a return to power after nearly 14 years in opposition.

Labour had played down its prospects in the Conservatives' previously "super safe" seats of Tamworth and Mid Bedfordshire, both in central England, which became vacant after their MPs quit, including one following sexual misconduct allega-

But Britain's ailing economy, the worst cost-of-living crisis in decades and several years of scandal and tumult within the Tories helped trigger the historic outcome.

In Mid Bedfordshire, a Conservative-held seat for almost a century, Labour overturned a majority of nearly 25,000 -- the biggest swing at a by-election since 1945.

Jubilant Labour leader Keir Starmer hailed the "phenomenal results" as showing his party "is back in the service of working people and redrawing the political map".

"Winning in these Tory strongholds shows that people overwhelmingly want change and they're ready to put their faith



in our changed Labour Party to deliver it," he added, ahead of a visit to Tamworth. 'Pointer'

Polling expert John Curtice said the results were "extremely bad news" for the Conservatives and suggested they will lose the next general election.

"It is a pointer that, unless the Conservatives can fairly dramatically and fairly radically turn things around, then they are in truth staring defeat in the face,"

Sunak, who is visiting the Middle East following the latest outbreak of hostilities between Israel and Hamas, was yet to comment on the losses.

Ahead of the contests, his press secretary had sought to downplay the Tories' prospects, labelling by-elections typically "tough for incumbent governments".

Sunak has recently made several policy shifts, including cancelling part of a costly high-speed rail link and delaying measures aimed at helping the UK achieve net-zero emissions

He pitched the moves as showing he is a leader willing to take tough decisions in the longterm, despite criticism they were aimed more at drawing dividing lines with Labour.

Former Conservative cabinet member Robert Buckland said the by-elections showed he needed to focus on core issues that matter to voters.

"I'm looking for serious, grownup approaches to the issues that really matter -- on the economy, on housing, on the future for our young people," he told the BBC.

As well as the two safe seats lost Friday, the Tories saw a 20,000 majority overturned by Labour in a July by-election, while the Liberal Democrats have snatched several Conservative seats since 2019.

Labour have also been leading national polls by double-digit margins for over a year.

'Had enough' The winning candidates in this week's contests will now

take their places on Labour's benches in the House of Commons, where the Tories still hold a large overall majority.

The Tamworth poll was triggered when Chris Pincher, who had the seat since 2010, quit after being found to have groped two men in an "egregious case of sexual misconduct".

Then-prime minister Boris Johnson's handling of the case led to a raft of ministerial resignations that spelt the beginning of the end of his premiership.

The Mid Bedfordshire poll was called when former culture secretary Nadine Dorries, a Johnson loyalist who blames Sunak for his political downfall, quit her seat. She accused the new prime minister of having abandoned "the fundamental principles of conservatism".

Sunak succeeded Liz Truss as prime minister a year ago despite having lost a Tory leadership contest to her months earlier, after Truss' short-lived tenure rocked financial markets.

He has struggled to win the support of former Johnson allies and others within his party, as well as the wider electorate. Labour candidate Alistair

NEW DELHI, Oct 20 (Agencies): Reserve Bank of India (RBI) Governor Shaktikanta Das said the war between Israel and the Palestinian terrorist group Hamas has impacted India, but added that the country remains "well placed" on key economic parameters.

"Of course, we are impacted by what is happening all over, no doubt about that, but that's not the headline. The headline is that our macroeconomic fundamentals continue to be sound," he told reporters. "Our financial sector continues to be sound

Eventually, in these uncertain times, what matters is how strong vour macroeconomic fundamentals are and



how strong your financial sector is. I think on both the parameters, India is well placed," Das said

The RBI Governor's statement comes at a time when the escalating conflict in the Middle East has led to a rise in crude oil prices globally - a matter of concern for India, which is one of the largest importers in the world.

Shaktikanta Das went on to say that the country's monetary policy

needs to stay focused on easing inflation, citing the uncertain outlook on food and oil prices.

"In the current situation, monetary policy must remain actively disinflationary to ensure that the ongoing disinflation process progresses smoothly," Das said at an event in New Delhi.

The RBI Governor also said that any increase in domestic fuel prices will have more of an impact on inflation than global crude oil prices.

## Long lines at gas pump unlikely, but Middle East crisis could disrupt oil supplies, raise prices

WASHINGTON, Oct 20 (Agencies): Fifty years after the 1973 Arab oil embargo, the current crisis in the Middle East has the potential to disrupt global oil supplies and push prices higher. But don't expect a repeat of the catastrophic price hikes and long lines at the gasoline pump, experts say.

The Israel-Hamas war is "definitely not good news" for oil markets already stretched by cutbacks in oil production from Saudi Arabia and Russia and expected stronger demand from China, the head of the International Energy Agency said.

Markets will remain volatile, and the conflict could push oil prices higher, "which is definitely bad news for inflation," Fatih Birol, executive director of the Paris-based IEA, told The Associated Press. Developing countries that import oil and other fuels would be the most affected by higher prices, he

International benchmark Brent crude traded above \$91 a barrel on Thursday, up from \$85 per barrel on Oct. 6, the day before Hamas attacked Israel, killing hundreds of civilians. Israel immediately launched airstrikes on Gaza, destroying entire neighbourhoods and killing hundreds of Palestinian civilians in the days that have followed.

Fluctuations since the attack pushed oil prices as high as

The price of oil depends on how much of it is getting used and how much is available. The latter is under threat because of the Hamas-Israel war, even though the Gaza Strip is not home to major crude production.

One worry is that the fighting could lead to complications with Iran, home of some of the world's largest oil reserves. Its crude production has been constrained by international sanctions, but oil is still flowing to China and other countries.

"In order to get a sustained move (in prices), we really would need to see a supply disruption," said Andrew Lipow, president at Lipow Oil Associates, a Houston-based consultant.

Any damage to Iranian oil infrastructure from a military strike by Israel could send prices jumping globally. Even



without that, a shutdown of the Strait of Hormuz that lies south of Iran could also shake the oil market because so much of the world's supplies goes through the waterway

Until something like that happens, "the oil market is going to be like everyone else, monitoring the events in the Middle East." Lipow said.

One reason 1970s-style gas lines are unlikely: U.S. oil production is at an all-time high. The U.S. Energy Information Administration, an arm of the Energy Department, reported that American oil production in the first week of October hit 13.2 million barrels per day, passing the previous record set in 2020 by 100,000 barrels. Weekly domestic oil production has doubled from the first week in October 2012 to now.

"The energy crisis of 1973 taught us many things, but in my mind, the most critical is that American energy strength is a tremendous source of security, prosperity and freedom around the world," said Mike Sommers, president and CEO of the American Petroleum Institute, the U.S. oil industry's top lobbying group. In a speech Wednesday marking the 50th anniversary of the 1973 oil embargo, Sommers

said current U.S. production contrasts sharply with "America's weakened position during the Arab oil embargo." He urged U.S. policymakers to heed what he called the lessons of 1973. "We cannot squander our strategic advantage and retreat on

energy leadership," said Sommers, who has repeatedly criticized President Joe Biden's policies restricting restricting new oil leases as part of Biden's efforts to slow global climate change.

"With an unstable world, war in Europe, war in the Middle East,

and energy demand outstripping supply, energy security is on the line," Sommers said in a speech at the Hudson Institute, a Washington think tank.

"American oil and gas are needed now more than ever," Sommers said. "Let's take to heart the lessons we learned from 1973 and avoid sowing the seeds of the next energy crisis."

For now, the crisis isn't a repeat of 1973. Arab countries aren't attacking Israel in unison, and OPEC+ nations have not moved to restrict supplies or boost prices beyond a few extra dollars.

There are several wild cards in the energy market. One is the supply of Iranian oil. Eager to avoid a spike in gasoline prices and inflation, the U.S. has quietly tolerated some exports of Iranian oil to destinations such as China instead of going all in on sanctions aimed at Iran's nuclear program.

If Iran, which has warned Israel not to undertake a ground offensive, escalates the Gaza conflict — including a possible attack by Hezbollah militants in Lebanon supported by Iran that might change the U.S. stance. "If the U.S. were then also to enforce the oil sanctions against Iran more strictly again, the oil market would tighten noticeably," say commodities analysts at Commerzbank.

Lawmakers from both parties have urged Biden to block Iranian oil sales, seeking to dry up one of the regime's key sources of funding.

Another wild card is how Saudi Arabia would respond if Iranian oil is restricted. Oil analysts say that while the Saudis may welcome recent oil price hikes, they don't want a massive price spike that would fuel inflation, higher central bank interest

rates and possible recession in oil-consuming countries that ultimately would limit or even kill off demand for oil.

A third unknown is whether more oil will reach the market from Venezuela. The U.S. agreed Wednesday to temporarily suspend some sanctions on the country's oil, gas and gold sectors after Venezuela's government and a faction of its opposition formally agreed to work together on election

Venezuelan production could increase in 2024. In the next six months, however, production could ramp up by some 200,000 barrels a day, a relative drop in the ocean, according to Sofia Guidi Di Sante, senior oil market analyst at Rystad Energy.

Wyoming Sen. John Barrasso, the top Republican on the Senate Energy and Natural Resources Committee, slammed the U.S. action as a "gimmick" that appeases a brutal regime in Venezuela.

"Joe Biden's energy policies put America last," Barrasso said, citing the Democratic president's decisions to kill the controversial Keystone XL oil pipeline and sell off significant portions of the nation's Strategic Petroleum Reserve, taking it to its lowest level since the 1980s. The Energy Department said Thursday it will seek offers to start refilling the oil reserve in December, with monthly solicitations expected through May

"He eased sanctions on Iran, which funds terrorism across the Middle East. Now with Israel under attack, Biden is desperate for anything to mask the consequences of his reckless policies," Barrasso said. "America should never beg for oil from socialist dictators or terrorists."

The Treasury Department says it has targeted nearly 1,000 individuals and entities connected to terrorism and terrorist financing by the Iranian regime and its proxies, including Hamas, Hezbollah and other groups in the region.

"We will continue to take action as appropriate to counter Iran's destabilizing activity in the region and around the world," Treasury said in a statement.

## Drug used to treat diabetes could help obese people lose weight: Study

The diabetes drug Mounjaro has helped people with obesity to lose at least a quarter of their body weight, or about 60 pounds on average when combined with intensive diet and exercise, as per a new study.

NEW DELHI, Oct 20 (Agencies): The medicine in the diabetes drug Mounjaro helped people with obesity or who are overweight lose at least a quarter of their body weight, or about 60 pounds on average, when combined with intensive diet and exercise, a new study shows.

Ву comparison, a group of people who also dieted and exercised, but then received dummy shots, lost weight initially but then regained some, researchers reported Sunday in the journal Nature Medicine.

"This study says that if you lose weight before you start the drug, you can then add a lot more weight loss after," said Dr. Thomas Wadden, a University of Pennsylvania obesity researcher and psychology professor who led the study.

The results, which were also presented Sunday at a medical conference, confirm that the drug made by Eli Lilly & Co. has the potential to be one of the most powerful medical treatments for obesity to date, outside experts

"Any way you slice it, it's a quarter of your total body weight," said Dr. Caroline Apovian, who treats obesity at Brigham and Women's Hospital and wasn't involved in the study.

The injected drug, tirzepatide, was approved in the U.S. in May 2022 to treat diabetes. Sold as Mounjaro, it has been used "off-label" to treat obesity, joining a frenzy of demand for diabetes and weight-loss medications including Ozempic and Wegovy, made by Novo Nordisk.

All the drugs, which carry retail price tags of \$900 a month or more, have been in shortage

Tirzepatide targets two hormones that kick in after people eat to regulate appetite and the feeling of fullness communicated between the gut and the brain. Semaglutide, the drug used in Ozempic and Wegovy, targets one of those hormones.

The new study, which was funded by Eli Lilly, enrolled about 800 people who had obesity or were overweight with a weight-related



health complication but not diabetes. On average, study participants weighed about 241 pounds (109.5 kilograms) to start and had a body-mass index — a common measure of obesity — of about 38.

After three months of intensive diet and exercise, more than 200 participants left the trial, either because they failed to lose enough weight or for other reasons. The remaining nearly 600 people were randomized to receive tirzepatide or a placebo via weekly injections for about 16 months. Nearly 500 people completed

the study. Participants in both groups lost about 7%

of their body weight, or almost 17 pounds (8 kilograms), during the diet-and-exercise phase. Those who received the drug went on to lose an additional 18.4% of initial body weight, or about 44 pounds (20 kilograms) more, on average. Those who received the dummy shots regained about 2.5% of their initial weight, or 6 pounds (2.7 kilograms).

Overall, about 88% of those taking tirzepatide lost 5% or more of their body weight during the trial, compared with almost 17% of those taking placebo. Nearly 29% of those taking the drug lost at least a quarter of their body weight,

compared with just over 1% of those taking pla-

That's higher than the results for semaglutide and similar to the results seen with bariatric surgery, said Apovian.

"We're doing a medical gastric bypass," she

Side effects including nausea, diarrhea and constipation were reported more frequently in people taking the drug than those taking the placebo. They were mostly mild to moderate and occurred primarily as the dose of the drug was escalated, the study found. More than 10% of those taking the drug discontinued the study because of side effects, compared with about 2% of those on placebo.

## Sleeping less than 5 hrs a night raises depression risk



LONDON, Oct 20 (Agencies): Consistently sleeping less than five hours a night might raise the risk of developing depressive symptoms, according to a new genetic study.

Both sleep duration and depression are partly inherited from one generation to the next, according to researchers.

The study led by UCL (University College London) researchers and published in the journal Translational Psychiatry, analysed data from people with an average age of 65 and found short sleep was associated with the onset of depressive

"Using genetic susceptibility to disease we determined that sleep likely precedes depressive symptoms, rather than the inverse," said lead author Odessa S.

For the study, the researchers used genetic and health data from 7,146 people recruited by the English Longitudinal Study of Ageing (ELSA), a nationally representative population study in England.

They found that people with a stronger genetic predisposition to short sleep (less than five hours in a given night) were more likely to develop depressive symptoms over 4-12 years, but that people with a greater genetic predisposition to depression did not have an increased likelihood of short sleep.

Short and long sleep durations, along with depression, are major contributors to public health burden that are highly heritable.

"Polygenic scores, indices of an individual's genetic propensity for a trait, are thought to be key in beginning to understand the nature of sleep duration and depressive symptoms," said senior author Dr

Olesya Ajnakina. The research team also looked at nongenetic associations between depressive symptoms and sleep

They found that people sleeping five hours or less were 2.5 times more likely to develop depressive symptoms, while people with depressive symptoms were a third more likely to suffer from short sleep.

They adjusted for a rich selection of factors that could affect the results such as education, wealth, smoking status, physical activity and limiting longstanding illness.

The researchers also found a link between sleeping long and developing depressive symptoms, with participants sleeping longer than nine hours being 1.5 times more likely to develop depressive symptoms than those who sleep an average of seven hours. However, depressive

symptoms were not associated with sleeping longer four to 12 years later, which corresponded to the genetic findings.

"Suboptimal sleep and depression increase with age, and with the worldwide phenomenon of population ageing there is a growing need to better understand the mechanism connecting depression and a lack of sleep," said professor Andrew Steptoe.

Kohli, who plans 50-over chases with a precision of a surgeon, remained unbeaten on 103 off 97 balls as India knocked off the 258-run target with 51 balls remaining. India have now make it four wins out of four games and one more win would virtually put them in semi-finals.

While Kohli hit six fours and four sixes, it was his exemplary running between the wickets in pursuit of his 48th hundred that would be etched in the memory for the longest time.

"I would say, for those

Shanto, who led the team in absence of regular skipper Shakib Al Hasan after he was sidelined with a quad injury, defended the team's preparations against the rampant Indian team.

honest. The place where we were struggling, the top order, it did well," he said.

With no official update on Shakib's availability yet, Shanto said Bangladesh were hoping to have their skipper back in the side soon.

#### Injured Hardik Pandya Likely To Miss India's Cricket World Cup 2023 **Match Against New Zealand: Sources**

PUNE, Oct 20 (Agencies): India all-rounder Hardik Pandya is likely to miss the team's World Cup 2023 match against New Zealand, which will be played in Dharamsala on Sunday, October 22. until Monday. The international break came at the wrong time for Chelsea after they posted back-to-back league wins under Mauricio Pochettino for the first time.

The Blues have finally found their scoring touch, netting six times in victories against Fulham and Burnley, but Arsenal will provide a much sterner test of whether Chelsea really

## Australia, Pakistan need to regain batting, bowling mojo to revive **World Cup campaign**

(Agencies): Australia's cricketing DNA is constructed by meticulousness and Pakistan's by explosiveness.

When they meet each other here on Friday, Australia and Pakistan will have to regain those qualities in batting and bowling to infuse a fresh life into their World Cup campaign, which is yet to go into overdrive.

Pakistan's strength lies in their ability to play fearless cricket in the face of pressure. Make a quick rewind to their glory year of 1992 for a validation of that remark.

But in this World Cup, they caved in at the first hint of real pres-

sure, a match against India. There simply was no fight in their sevenwicket battering by the Men in Blue.

That mammoth chase of 345 at Hyderabad in their second match came on a featherbed against a vastly short of quality Sri Lanka, and taking it as a pointer will be sheer naivety.

Now, the Aussies offer another genuine pressure point to the Green Brigade. A side immersed in its own turmoil, the five-time champions are no India but they are a rival not to be scoffed at.

Pakistan will know that very well because Australia hold a 69-34 advantage in ODIs

and a 6-4 edge in the 50-over World Cups.

Pakistan perforce will have to shed their timidity and it should start from the top. Opener Imam-ul-Haq has made just 63 runs from three matches, and the lefthander needs to give more solid support to Abdullah Shafique, who has replaced misfiring Fakhar Zaman.

They have another problem in the fluctuating form of skipper Babar Azam. Babar, Pakistan's batting mainstay, made a fifty against India, but it was preceded by two ordinary outings against Netherlands and Sri Lanka

Both these batters will have to contribute heavily against the Aussies, who have a pace attack that can potentially damage any batting line-up.

They also have to find a solution for the overreliance of the middleorder on Mohammad Rizwan. The likes of Saud Shakeel, who made a fifty against Netherlands, and the hard-hitting Iftikhar Ahmed need to find the road that leads them to consistency

In the absence of injured pacer Naseem Shah, Pakistan has leaned heavily on the 23-year-old shoulders of Shaheen Shah Afridi but the left-arm pacer is nowhere near his best in the tournament.

Afridi will have to rediscover his pace and swing, the combination that makes him so lethal in white ball formats.

Shadab Khan, their vice-captain and legspinner, has neither been able to chip in with ball nor with the bat in this edition of the World Cup. It will not be a big surprise if leggie Usama Mir comes in place for him on the morrow.

At the other end of the spectrum, the Aussies are in an even bigger hole. The defeats against India and South Africa have put them in an unenvious position where even one more loss can further peg back their semifinal ambitions.

Their victory over Sri Lanka is just a baby step as they have to build on it to reach the knockout stage.

The batters are the main culprits for pushing the Aussies into that squishy place. Apart from Josh Inglis no other Australian batsman has made a fifty in this event, and Marnus Labuschagne is the only batter to have scored more than 100 runs in total.

Imagine, Mitchell Starc (55) has more runs against his name than Glenn Maxwell (49) and almost as many as Steve Smith (65), David Warner (65) and Mitchell Marsh (59) from three matches.

If anything, it shows a

total downtime of their batting unit, and they need to better it against Pakistan

But that does not absolve the Australian bowlers from their faults. While Starc, Adam Zampa and Josh Hazlewood have tried to keep things tight, skipper Pat Cummins remains a loose end in their bowling.

Cummins' mojo in red ball cricket has not really percolated to his white ball outings, at least consistently, and the 30-year-old will have to find his champion self here.

But the only hindrance for that is the smooth deck and shorter boundaries at the M Chinnaswamy Stadium, often a friend of the batters.
