NEW DELHI, Oct 24 (Agencies): The Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) on Monday notified the appointment of Delhi High Court judge Justice Sachin Datta as the presiding officer of the Unlawful Activities Prevention Act (UAPA) Tribunal to review the ban imposed on Jammu and Kashmir Democratic Freedom Party (JKDFP).

In accordance with the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA), the Central Government had

officially declared the JKDFP as an unlawful association on October 5 through a notification published in the Gazette of India.

'Godspeed, Bobi': World's oldest dog, dies in Portugal aged 31

LISBON, Oct 24 (Agencies)Bobi, the world's oldest dog, has died aged 31 in Portugal, Guinness World Records said on Monday.

A purebred Rafeiro Alentejano who spent his entire life in a village in central Portugal, Bobi lived for 31 years and 165 days, breaking a record held since 1939 by an Australian cattledog that died at 29 years and five months.

"Despite outliving every dog in history, his 11,478 days on earth would never be enough for those who loved him," said Karen Becker, a veterinarian



who met Bobi several times and who was the first to announce his death on social media. "Godspeed, Bobi.

He was declared the world's oldest dog in February this year. Bobi's breed, which traditionally has been used as sheepdogs, usually has a life expectancy of 12 to 14 years.

Dr Jitendra visits 'Skyroot' Startup Private Rocket Unit, hails 'Unshackling' of Space

JAMMU / HYDER-ABAD, Oct 24 (Agencies) : Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) Science & Technology; MoS PMO, Personnel, Public Grievances, Pensions, Atomic Energy and Space said here today that "unshackling" of the Space sector by Prime Minister Narendra Modi has led to StartUp boom, as a result of which, within a short span of just about four years, the number of Space StarUps has gone up from a mere single digit to over 150, with some of the earlier ones like the "Skyroot" turning into lucrative entrepreneur.

During a visit to the newly setup facility of Skyroot here in a premises of 60,000 Square Feet which is possibly India's largest Rocket factory in private sector, Dr Jitendra Singh said, Skyroot is not only example of India's superlative talent and scientific acumen but it also has message for all of us that a huge potential was lying dormant for several decades before Prime Minister Narendra Modi came and broke the taboos of the past and opened India's Space Sector for Public Private Partner-

Vikram-1 is expected to mark yet another first for India, since the country opened up the Space sector to private players in 2020 in a landmark reform.

"The success of Skyroot is an inspiration to India's vast youth talent pool aspiring to set up their own Startup ventures, especially in new and emerging sectors including Space, Bio-Tech, Agriculture and Energy," said Dr. Jitendra Singh. The Minister said that

Delhi May Need West Asia Policy Shift Amid Support for Israel

-n past decades, Israeli commentators would often rue

L that New Delhi treated Tel Aviv like a "mistress": happy to engage intimately in private but disowned in public. They legitimised the relationship formally with the concurrent opening of embassies in 1992, but the crucial military supplies from Israel to India in the 1965 and 1971 wars is one for the spooks. Even more clandestine was the purported goahead by Indira Gandhi in 1982 of an Osirak-style operation (Israeli jets daringly blew up an Iraqi nuclear reactor in 1981) to similarly destroy Pakistan's nuclear facilities at Kahuta. Last-minute intervention by then US President Ronald Reagan is said to have abrogated this India-Israel mission. But despite such commonality of threats and mutual understanding, Delhi's support for the Palestinians deterred normalising relations with Israel. Contrary to popular perceptions, India's dichotomous stand on Israel wasn't just idealism, but rooted as much in realpolitik. With its energy needs from West Asia at stake, sizeable foreign exchange remittances from the Indian diaspora, and also over 50

invaluable votes in forums like the United Nations -- officially not recognising Israel due to "morality" had some solid practicalities, that remained unstated. It was an arrangement which worked well as Israel was content to work in the shadows, as that also meant it knowingly compromised its own equation with Washington, which was a firm Pakistan ally in 1965, 1971 or even 1982 when the Kahuta operation was murmured.

History and geography have made Israel extremely practical, and they work along with any country, irrespective of its ideology, if it does not endanger Israeli interests. Even today, despite all tensions besetting the United States and China and Russia, the Israelis harbour no major aversion to either and are willing to engage with both (Washington had to veto technology transfer to Beijing). For all its bloody past, it had normalised relations with Jordan and Egypt long ago, and more recently with the United Arab Emirates and Bahrain. Talks with Saudi Arabia behind closed doors is the worst kept secret and Tel Aviv is similarly understanding of the societal concerns implicit for the Saudi authorities, to come out in the open about the same immediately.

With India, Israel was always extra-understanding. Jawaharlal Nehru had indulged in grandstanding on Palestine, but had also reached out to Israeli Prime Minister David Ben-Gurion after the 1962 China tensions, Ben-Gurion had privately replied: "I am in total agreement with the views expressed by Your Excellency (Nehru) that it is incumbent upon us to do all in our power. All states big or small must be guaranteed of their sovereignty. We believe that every possible support should be lent to every measure contributing towards easing of tension on your borders so that India will once again be able to devote its undivided energies under your distinguished leadership to construction and development".

During the Kargil War, when India still faced some technology sanctions, Israel had ignored international concerns and expedited supplies of mortar ammunition, laser-guided missiles, Heron and Searcher UAVs, etc. Since then, India has become Israel's biggest and most dependable purchaser of weapons, besides a "strategic partner" and co-producer of weaponry. However, all along, India hadn't diluted support for a "two-state solution", that envisages a sovereign state of Palestine. Admittedly, the hypersensitivity on Palestinian concerns had got diluted (tellingly in 2015, India abstained from voting against Israel at UNHRC) -- though, the same lukewarmness about the Palestinian issue could also be said about the Arab sheikhdoms that were on a rapprochement overdrive with Tel Aviv.

The recent attack by Hamas on Israel led to the unprecedented shedding of ostensible "neutrality" by New Delhi, which entailed playing a mealymouthed "please all" position for some time. Prime Minister Narendra Modi's new tweet --"We stand in solidarity with Israel at this difficult hour" -- is unprecedentedly one-sided, and the Palestinians have Hamas to blame for that. While the neighbouring sheikhdoms have offered platitudinous contexts to rationalise Hamas' attacks, make no mistake, the sheikdoms can never support a pro-Iran militia like Hamas. They were forced into adopting a "justifying" stance only as a continuation of Ummah sensibilities -- but in the deeply sectarian divide in West Asia, beyond the public postures, the Arab sheikhdoms fear the Iran and its proxies like Hezbollah, Houthis, Hamas, etc, far more than Tel Aviv.

New Delhi, therefore perhaps felt empowered to take an untraditional and overtly pro-Israel stance for the first time. In one dramatic stroke, Hamas laid to waste the high ground that the Palestinian cause always evoked, even as the world put it on the backburner, as practicality had necessitated thawing relations with Israel. While breaking ranks with the Hamas may not be publicly possible for the sheikhdoms (as yet), the widely believed intent of disrupting the Mideast peace plans at Iran's behest will afford a short rope to Hamas' belligerence. Such intolerance with Palestinian militias running amok had similarly backfired with Operation Black September, when the Jordanians had attacked the PLO in 1970-71 or when Lebanese forces carried out the Sabra-Shatila massacres against Palestinian militias in 1982. Now even pacifist nations like India are reneging on "neutrality" over the Israeli-Palestinian issue, as Hamas has simultaneously discredited the Palestinian position. The Middle East will now increasingly look like the landscape of the past and New Delhi will have to recalibrate its own stand in line with its needs and, as always, there may be a slip between the cup and the lip. For now, it will be Advantage Israel.





NEW DELHI, Oct 24 (Agencies): Defence Minister Rajnath Singh on Tuesday performed "Shastra Puja" in Arunachal Pradesh's Tawang and celebrated Dussehra with Army soldiers at the strategically key region near the frontier with China.

The defence minister said all efforts are being made to strengthen the nation's military prowess through indigenous production of defence equipment.

"No amount of appreciation



is enough for the way you are guarding the border in difficult circumstances. I want to tell you that people of the country are proud of you," he told the troops.

The defence minister expressed gratitude to the soldiers for their "unyielding spirit, unwavering commitment and unparalleled courage" while guarding the borders in tough conditions, and ensuring that the nation and its people are safe.

After performing Shastra Puja (worship of weapons) with the troops at Tawang, he noted that Dussehra signifies the victory of aood over evil.

In his address, he described the "righteousness and dharma" over three years.

of the brave armed forces personnel as the living testament to the ethos of the festival of Vijayadashmi.

The defence minister said the valour and commitment of the armed forces is one of the main reasons behind India's rising stature globally and that it is now among the most powerful nations.

Indian and Chinese troops are locked in an over three-year confrontation in certain friction points in eastern Ladakh even as the two sides completed disengagement from several areas following extensive diplomatic and military talks.

India has been maintaining that its ties with China cannot be normal unless there is peace in the border areas.

The Army has significantly bolstered deployment of troops and weaponry along the nearly 3,500 km-long LAC, including in the Sikkim and Arunachal Pradesh sectors following the eastern Ladakh standoff.

CHENNAI, Oct 24 (Agencies): Three empty coaches of an Electric Multiple Unit (EMU) derailed at suburban Avadi here early on Tuesday, resulting in delayed running of a number of passenger services on the busy route.

No passengers were involved in the incident, which happened around 5.40 am on Tuesday, the Southern Railway said. While four coaches were initially said to have derailed, Southern Railway later clarified it was three.



Retired assistant commissioner of police jumps from multi-storey building in Mumbai

MUMBAI, Oct 24 (Agencies): A 70-yearold retired Assistant Commissioner of Police (ACP) allegedly died by suicide by jumping from a multi-storey building in Matunga area of central Mumbai, police said on Tuesday.

The exact reason behind the incident, which took place on Monday evening at Ganga Heritage building on Deodhar Road, is not yet known, an official said.

Pradeep Prabhakar Temkar retired from the Mumbai police in 2014, the official said, adding that he was suffering from depression for the past few years and was undergoing treatment. Temkar ended his life



by allegedly jumping from the seventh floor of the building, he said. A case of accidental death has been registered at Matunga police station and a probe is under way, the official said.

3 Junior Doctors Suspended For Thrashing Patient's Relatives In UP's Meerut

MEERUT, Oct 24 (Agencies): Three junior doctors of Lala Lajpat Rai Memorial Medical College here were suspended after being booked by police for allegedly assaulting the relatives of a boy who was brought to the hospital for treatment, officials said on Tuesday.

The principal of the college has also constituted an inquiry committee to probe the matter.

The incident took place on Monday night when the fiveyear-old child, Kunal, was brought to the hospital after he injured one of his hands. It was alleged that four to five junior doctors thrashed the family



members of the boy, Circle Officer Arvind Kumar told agency, quoting the police complaint. According to the complaint, the child was crying as he was in pain so the relatives asked the doctors to give him "proper treatment". This enraged the doctors and an argument ensued between the two sides follow-

ing which, the family members, including women, were allegedly thrashed, police said. When police reached the spot,

the accused doctors fled, they said.

Kumar said the incident is being investigated and a case under sections 147(rioting), 323 (voluntarily causing hurt), 504 (intentional insult) and 506 (criminal intimidation) of the Indian Penal Code has been registered against the unidentified doctors based on the complaint filed by the family members.

Giving details about the incident, LLRM College Principal Dr R C Gupta said the child had injured his thumb and the doctors were taking photographs to check the depth of the wound. However, the family members snatched the mobile phone with which the photographs were being taken and asked the doctors to treat the child. An argument ensued and soon a fight broke out between the two sides. he said.

Taking cognizance of a video of the incident that is circulating on social media, three junior doctors have been suspended and an inquiry committee has been formed to probe the incident, Gupta said.

secretary of the Uttar Pradesh unit of Jamiat Ulema-e-Hind, said the madrasas in the state are "being harassed by serving them illegal notices only to target a particular community".

"The madrasas are providing free of cost education to the students, they will not be able to pay the fine of Rs 10,000 per day," Husain said.

Meanwhile, according to a senior official in Lucknow, about 4,000 madrasas in the state are under the scanner

for receiving foreign funds.

The state government has set up a three-member special investigation team (SIT) to investigate 4,000 madrasas, most of them run along the Indo-Nepal border, which are allegedly receiving funds from abroad, the official said.

The SIT will examine if the money received by them was used in any illegal activities, such as terrorism or forcible religious conversion, the official added.

7 killed as SUV rams into bus in **Tamil Nadu**



TIRUVANNAMALAI, Oct 24 (Agencies): Seven men, including five workers belonging to Assam, were killed when the SUV in which they were travelling collided head on with a state government bus near Chengam in the district, police said on Tuesday.

The accident occurred when the SUV carrying 11 people, mostly workers, was proceeding to Krishnagiri. It rammed into the Tamil Nadu State Transport Corporation bus coming

here from Bengaluru on the Tindivanam-Krishnagiri national highway on Monday night, police said.

Seven workers, among the 11 travelling in the SUV, were killed on the spot, while the injured have been admitted to the Government Hospital, Tiruvannamalai.

The deceased have been identified as Bhinmal Tirth, Kuncha Rai, Dallu, Nicholas and Narayan Sethi, from Assam, and Punith Kumar, the driver, and Kamaraj, from Krishnagiri district. They were all workers at a factory near Hosur and were returning after a visit to Puducherry on Ayudha puja day.

The passengers of the TNSTC bus and the crew, as well, however, were not injured, police said.

Hamas releases 2 more hostages from captivity in Gaza

The 2 elderly hostages have an emotional reunion with their families

TEL AVIV, Oct 24 (Agencies): Amid the ongoing Israel-Hamas war, the terrorist group on Tuesday released two more hostages, The Times of Israel reported, adding that they were identified as Nurit Cooper and Yocheved Lifshitz.

According to the report, a military helicopter ferrying the two freed hostages landed on the roof of Ichilov Hospital in Tel Aviv.

Citing a nurse at the Ichilov Hospital, The Times of Israel reported that Cooper and Lifshitz appeared to be in good health after arriving at the Israeli Medical Centre, directly upon their release from Hamas captivity in Gaza.

The two elderly hostages had an emotional reunion with their families. the nurse told The Times of Israel.

Both the freed hostages were



on medication that they may not have received during their two weeks of captivity.

The nurse said the hospital authorities would come to a better understanding of their condition in the morning, The Times of Israel reported. Earlier. Hamas's Qassam Bri-

gades published a video showing the two hostages being

handed over to members of the International Red Cross.

In the video, the two women, wearing identical purple robes, walk unsteadily holding the hands of masked gunmen, who also offer them snacks and drinks. Both appear terrified through much of the footage, according to The Times of Israel.

US National Security Advisor Jake Sullivan posted on X that Washington welcomes the release of these hostages and is continuing to work for the release of the remaining hostages, believed to be numbering over 200. Earlier, two American hos-

tages, identified as Judith Tai Raanan and her 17-year-old daughter Natali Raanan, were released by Hamas, CNN reported, adding that both were from Chicago.

According to their family members, they had been visiting some relatives in Nahal Oz, a farming community in southern Israel, and were released on "humanitarian grounds" due to the mother's poor health.

They were released following negotiations involving Qatar and Hamas, according to CNN.

DOHA, Oct 24 (Agencies): Qatar's ruling emir has said that Israel should not be given "a green light for unconditional killing". This was Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad Al-Thani's first public statement since Qatar started making efforts to bring about a ceasefire and mediate between Israel and Hamas

"We say enough ...," the emir said during his annual speech to open the Gulf Arab state's advisory Shura council, Reuters reported.

He further said that Qatar calls for a "serious regional and international stance" against the dangerous escalation of the war, which "threatens the security of the region and the world".

"We do not accept double standards and acting like the lives of Palestinian children to delay their ground offensive lest civilian casualties keep mounting. The leaders of the US, Canada, France, Germany, Italy and the United Kingdom on Sunday reiterated their support for Israel, but urged the country to adhere to international humanitarian law and protect civilians. US President Joe Biden also told Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu that henceforth, there will be a "continued flow" of humanitarian aid to the Gaza Strip.

Israel has been striking Gaza with relentless rocket strikes in retaliation for Hamas's October 7 attack, in which the terrorist group killed 1,400 Israelis and took more than 200 hostages. More than 6,000 people, with over 4,500 in Palestine alone, have been killed in the war so far.

Moscow destroys 3 Ukrainian unmanned boats off Crimea: Russia's defence ministry

MOSCOW, Oct 24 (Agencies): Russian naval forces destroyed three uncrewed Ukraine-launched boats in the northern part of the Black Sea off the Crimean Peninsula, Russia's defence ministry said on Tuesday.

"Anti-sabotage missiles and bombs hit the area where the unmanned boats were detected," the ministry said on the Telegram messaging app. It added that an anti-mining

In September, Kyiv said it damaged two naval vessels and struck Sevastopol's port infrastructure in what appeared to be the biggest attack of the war there.

The Kremlin uses Sevastopol and the Black See Fleet to project power into the Middle East and Mediterranean and - during the war in Ukraine - to impose a de facto blockade on Ukraine's seaborne food exports via the Turkish straits.

Pakistan successfully conducts training launch of Ghauri Weapon System

ISLAMABAD, Oct 24 (Agencies): Pakistan on Tuesday successfully conducted a training launch of the Ghauri Weapon System, according to a statement by the army, a week after holding the flight test of the ballistic missile Ababeel Weapon System.

The purpose of the launch is "aimed at testing the operational and technical readiness of Army Strategic Forces Command (ASFC)," the statement said.

The launch was witnessed by Commander ASFC, senior officers from the strategic forces, scientists, and engineers of the strategic organisation.

The Commander of the ASFC also appreciated the scientists and engineers for their contributions towards the enhancement of Pakistan's strategic capability, the statement said.



Tuesday's training launch of the Ghauri Weapon System took place days after the US imposed sanctions on three Chinese companies for supplying missile-applicable items for Pakistan's ballistic missile programme.

China, an all-weather ally of Pakistan, has been the main supplier of arms and defence equipment to Islamabad's military modernisation programme.

President Arif Alvi, Interim Prime Minister Anwaar ul Haq Kakar and Services Chiefs congratulated the participating troops, scientists, and engineers on the successful conduct of the training launch.

Earlier on October 18, Pakistan had successfully conducted the flight test of the Ababeel Weapon System to further strengthen its deterrence. That test of the ballistic missile system, a statement by the Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR) - the media wing of the army had said, was aimed at "re-validating various design, technical parameters, and performance evaluation of different subsystems."

Russian President Vladimir Putin suffers heart attack, found lying on floor: Reports

MOSCOW, Oct 24 (Agencies): Russian President Vladimir Putin reportedly suffered a heart attack and was "resuscitated" after collapsing in his bedroom in Moscow, reports the mirror.co.uk.

As per the website, Putin, as per a statement posted on a Telegram channel, is "terminally ill".

The channel - General SVR suggested all recent appearances by the Russian dictator, including foreign visits, have been carried out by a body double or doubles.

It claimed that doctors had to resuscitate Putin before taking him to a special intensive care facility located within his official residence.

"Doctors performed resuscitation, having previously determined that the president was in cardiac arrest," reported the channel. "Help was provided on time,



the heart was started and Putin regained consciousness."

There was no immediate response from the Kremlin to the claim but officials have previously strongly denied Putin, 71, suffers from health problems.

The post on General SVR – which

claimed. without having ever provided any proof, to have an inside source on his entourage - continued: "At about 21.05 Moscow time, security officers of Russian President Vladimir Putin, who were on duty at the residence, heard noise and sounds of falling coming from the president's bedroom.

Two security officers immediately followed into the president's bedroom and saw Putin lying on the floor next to the bed and an overturned table with food and drinks.

The channel alleged that "the president was moved to a specially equipped room in his residence, where the necessary medical equipment for resuscitation had already been installed", adding that the president's condition was "stabilised" and he is "under constant medical supervision".

NEW DELHI, Oct 24 (Agencies): Chief Justice of India D Y Chandrachud has said that fashioning entirely a "new legislative regime" to allow same-sex marriages falls under the domain of Parliament and striking down provisions of the Special Marriage Act for it would have amounted to coming out with a prescription "worse than the disease itself".

The observations on recent same-sex marriages verdict and other key aspects of Indian judiciary were made by the CJI in the 3rd Comparative Constitutional Law discussion co-hosted by the Georgetown University Law Center, Washington and the Society for Democratic Rights (SDR), New Delhi, on the topic -'Perspectives from the Supreme Courts of India and the United States'. Justice Chandrachud, who is in the US, referred to the Special Marriage Act and said it was a secular law to

deal with the marriage of heterosexuals belonging from different religions and holding some of its provisions for not allowing same-sex marriages would not have been the perfect thing.

> "It was argued that the Special Marriage Act is discriminatory because it applies only to heterosexual couples. Now, if the Court were to strike down that legislation, the consequence would be as I said, in my judgement, it would amount to going back to the position as it obtained even before independence, which was that there was no legislation at all for people belonging to different faiths to get married. "So striking down the

legislation... would not be adequate and would have been like coming out with a prescription which is worse than the disease itself," the CJI said on Monday. So one of the key questions was, does the court have the juris-

into this domain and to mandate that there is a right to marry under the Indian Constitution, the CJI said. "By a unanimous ver-

dict of all the five judges on the bench, we came to the conclusion that while we have progressed a great deal in terms of decriminalising homosexuality, and recognising people belonging to the queer community, as equal participants in our society. But legislating on the right to marry is something which falls within the domain of Parliament, and we couldn't by judicial decisions, lay down the law and venture into a very complex area which is not just confined to marriage, but which goes into other areas like marriage adoption, succession, inheritance tax," he said.

On October 17, a five-judge Constitution bench headed by the CJI unanimously refused to accord legal recognition to same-sex diction to essentially get marriage, saying there



was "no unqualified right" to marriage.

However, the CJI and Justice S K Kaul were in minority on the issues of right to form civil union and right of adoption of queer couples.

The CJI spoke candidly about him being in minority in the samesex marriage judgements rendered by four judges of the Constitution bench.

He said the CJIs have been in minority on rare occasions.

"But there are 13 significant cases in our history where the Chief Justice has been in a minority. And, I do believe, sometimes it is a vote of con-

science and a vote of the Constitution and I stand by what I said," the CJI said. "Therefore, we said

> that, well, it's time for Parliament to act. Apart from that, that's where I got into a minority. I said, though we cannot therefore entrench into the domain of Parliament. Nonetheless, there were sufficient foundation principles in our Constitution, to allow for recognition of same sex unions in terms of civil unions," he elaborated. "Three of my colleagues, another colleague joined me in this, but three of my colleagues felt that to rec-

ognise a right of forming unions was again beyond the judicial domain, and that it must be left to Parliament," he said.

On the fundamental issue as to whether same sex couples should have the right to form binding unions and cohabit traditional relationships, three of my colleagues, though they recognised that they do have the right, said, "we cannot elevate this to a constitutional right", the CJI said.

"The other area in which I was in a minority was whether same sex couples have the right to adopt... I said that well, same sex couples, queer couples have the right to adopt a child because under Indian law, a single individual can adopt a child, a woman can adopt a child. So, I said if they are together, there is no reason to deny them the right to adopt the child merely because they are

in a queer relationship," he said.

"So on the broader aspect, there was a unanimity, but on the right to form unions and adoptions, I was in a minority of two as against three of my colleagues," the CJI said.

He also referred to the 2018 by judgement and said that the top court had decriminalised same sex consensual relations between adults of the same gender or sex.

"And that was important in itself. But that was not the end of the evolution of LGBTQ rights in India. And, we have this clutch of petitions which came up before us for hearing where same sex couples chose to espouse their right to marry under the Indian Constitution," he said. The economic crisis has prompted an acute shortage of essential items like food, medicine, cooking gas and other fuel, toilet paper and even matches, with Sri Lankans for months being forced to wait in lines lasting hours outside stores to buy fuel and cooking gas.

India to surpass Japan to become third largest economy by 2030: S&P Global

After two years of rapid economic growth in 2021 and 2022, the Indian economy has continued to show sustained strong growth during the 2023 calendar year

NEW DELHI, Oct 24 (Agencies): India, the world's fifth largest economy in the world, is likely to overtake Japan to become the world's third-largest economy with a GDP of USD 7.3 trillion by 2030, S&P Global Market Intelligence said in its latest issue of PMI.

After two years of rapid economic growth in 2021 and 2022, the Indian economy has continued to show sustained strong growth during the 2023 calendar year.

India's gross domestic product (GDP) is expected to grow 6.2-6.3 per cent in the fiscal year ending in March 2024, being the fastest-growing major economy this fiscal year. Asia's third-largest economy grew by a stellar 7.8 per cent in the April-June quarter.

"The near-term economic outlook is for continued rapid expansion during the remain-



der of 2023 and for 2024, underpinned by strong growth in domestic demand," S&P Global said.

The acceleration of foreign direct investment inflows into India over the past decade reflects the favourable long-term growth outlook for the Indian economy, helped by a youthful demographic profile and rapidly rising urban household incomes.

"India's nominal GDP measured in USD terms is forecast to rise from USD 3.5 trillion in 2022 to USD 7.3 trillion by 2030. This rapid pace of economic expansion would result in the size of the Indian GDP exceeding Japanese GDP by 2030, making India the second largest economy in the Asia-Pacific region," it said.

By 2022, the size of the Indian GDP had already become larger than the GDP of the UK and also France. By 2030, India's GDP is also forecast to surpass Germany.

The US at present is the world's largest economy with a GDP of USD 25.5 trillion. It makes up for a quarter of the world's GDP. China is the second largest economy with a GDP size of about USD 18 trillion, which is almost 17.9 per cent of the world GDP. Japan is a distant third with USD 4.2 trillion GDP, followed by Germany with USD 4 trillion GDP.

S&P Global said the long-term outlook for the Indian economy is supported by a number of key growth drivers.

Suzuki confirms plans to double India production capacity by 2030

NEW DELHI, Oct 24 (Agencies): India's largest carmaker Maruti Suzuki will double its production capacity to 4 mln vehicles per year in the next six years from around 2.25 mln at present, the company's parent, Japan-based Suzuki Motor Corporation said at an investor event in its home country. This confirms source-based media reports that the company plans to double its production by 2030.

At present, it has a production capacity of around 1.5 million at its two units in Haryana – one at Manesar and the other at Gurgaon.

In addition, Suzuki Japan operates a plant in Gujarat that has the capacity to produce nearly 750,000 units. Suzuki Motor Co recently said it plans to transfer this plant to Maruti Suzuki to simply the management of the Indian operations.

Moreover, Maruti Suzuki is in the process of putting up its third plant in Haryana at Kharkhoda. This will be its largest plant, with a production capacity of 1 million units, and is scheduled to start operations in the next financial year.

In its presentation, Suzuki Motor Co also said it will create an extra capacity of 1 million units per year by 2030, without revealing any details.

Demand Issues Meanwhile, Maruti Suzuki is yet to fully utilize its existing production capacity of 2.25 mln in India.

For example, last financial year, it produced only 1.91 million vehicles at its three plants, and in the first half of this year, it has produced 9.8 lakh units

This is primarily because of lack of demand, as some of the core models for Maruti Suzuki – such as Alto – are seeing low demand from customers, even as SUV models such as Brezza, continue to do well. Due to a shift in the market towards SUVs, and away from hatchbacks, Maruti Suzuki has seen a fall in its market share in the country over the last four years.

It had a market share of close to 50% in 2018, which has fallen to around 42% now.

However, with increased focus on SUVs, the company has been able to improve its market share in recent months, and has emerged as India's biggest maker of SUVs.

In the presentation made in Japan, Suzuki said its aim is to recapture the 50% market share milestone by 2030, by when it expects to be selling 3 million vehicles out of the total 6 million that will be sold in India.

Key to its strategy will be the launch of its first battery-powered electric vehicle by next financial year, and plans to have at least 6 such models out by 2030.

India will see largest energy demand growth: International Energy Agency

NEW DELHI, Oct 24 (Agencies): India's demand for electricity for running household air conditioners is estimated to expand nine-fold by 2050 and will exceed total power consumption in the whole of Africa today, the International Energy Agency (IEA) said on Tuesday. In its latest World Energy Outlook, the IEA said India will see the largest energy demand growth of any country or region in the world over the next three decades.

It projected India's energy supply to rise from 42 exajoules (EJ) in 2022 to 53.7 EJ in 2030 and 73 EJ in 2050 under stated policy scenarios, and 47.6 EJ by 2030 and 60.3 EJ by 2050 as per announced pledges.

Oil demand is seen rising from 5.2 million barrels per day (bpd) in 2022 to 6.8 million bpd in 2030 and 7.8 million bpd in 2050 under the stated policy scenario. Under the announced pledges, this demand is seeks 6.2 million bpd in 2030 and 4.7 million bpd in 2050.

The IEA said over the past five decades, India has witnessed over 700 heatwave events, which have claimed over 17,000 lives. Fuelled by its geographic and meteorological conditions, air conditioner ownership in India has been steadily rising with growing incomes, tripling since 2010 to reach 24 units per 100 households. "The impact of cooling needs on electricity consumption is already clear," the Paris-based agency said. "Electricity demand is sensitive to temperatures, and in India's case there is a sharp increase in demand as temperatures cross the 25-degree Celsius threshold..

Electricity consumption due to space cooling increased 21 per cent between 2019 and 2022, and today nearly 10 per cent of electricity demand comes from space cooling requirements.

"Household air conditioner ownership is estimated to expand ninefold by 2050 across the IEA scenarios, outpacing the growth in ownership of every other major household appliance including televisions, refrigerators and washing machines," it said.

"Residential electricity demand from cooling has increased ninefold in the Stated Policies Scenario (STEPS) by 2050..

IEA said by 2050, "India's total electricity demand from residential air conditioners in STEPS exceeds the total electricity consumption in the whole of Africa today..

In the Announced Pledges Scenario (APS), however, electricity demand for air conditioners is nearly 15 per cent lower in 2050 as it is in the STEPS as a appliances and the adoption of demand response measures enable the same cooling needs to be met with less energy. This reduces peak electricity demand growth by nearly one-quarter compared to STEPS. Given that

growth has slowed to reach replacement levels, its urban population has increased by 74 per cent and per capita income has tripled by 2050. Industrial output expands rapidly, for example through a tripling of output of iron and steel, and doubling of cement, plus there is a ninefold increase in residential air conditioner ownership by

2050. "As a result, demand for oil and natural gas increases in STEPS by nearly 70 per cent between 2022 and 2050, while coal demand increases by 10 per cent, even as solar PV makes inroads into electricity generation. As a result, India's annual CO2 emissions still rise nearly 30 per cent by 2050, which is one of the largest increases in the world," the outlook said.

In the APS, the increase in clean energy investment changes the outlook. In STEPS, solar provides nearly 45 per cent of total generated power by 2050; in the APS, it crosses 50 per cent. In both the STEPS and APS, India achieves its target of 50 per cent non-fossil power generation capacity by 2030. Clean energy investment in the APS, over and above that in the STEPS, also drives faster growth in electromobility, lowemissions hydrogen, grid,, expansion and other clean energy infrastructure. "As a result, India's annual CO2 emissions fall sharply in the APS by over 40 per cent from current levels by 2050, even though its GDP quadruples over this period," it added.

LONDON, Oct 24 (Agencies): Artificial intelligence-(AI) based cancer diagnosis is as accurate as those made by doctors, but is inferior when it comes to treatment decisions, according to a study.

In the study published by The Lancet Digital Health, researchers compared the accuracy in diagnosis and therapy recommendation of skin cancer using two different algorithms in smartphone applications with that of doctors.

The results show that the AI application generally performs well in diagnosis. However, doctors were clearly superior when it came to treatment decisions.

The research team from Medical University of Vienna in Austria tested the AI application under realistic clinical conditions in two skin cancer centres.

The prospective study consisted of two scenarios, with AI being used in scenario A for changes suspicious of skin cancer and in scenario B for patients with many moles. The AI-assisted application was compared in both cases with both medical experts and less experi-

> enced physicians. In scenario A, 172 suspicious pigmented lesions (of which 84 were malignant) were examined in 124 patients; in scenario B, the research team analysed 5,696 pigmented lesions (of which 18 were malignant) in 66 patients. Two different Al-based smartphone applications were used: a novel 7-class AI algorithm and an ISIC algorithm already used in

nary studies. In scenario A, the 7-class AI algorithm

showed equivalent diagnostic accuracy compared to the experts while it was significantly superior to the less experienced physicians. The ISIC algorithm, on the other hand, performed significantly worse compared to experts, but better than the inexperienced users.

In terms of treatment decisions, the 7-class algorithm was significantly inferior to the experts but superior to the inexperienced users.

The results suggest that an AI-assisted smartphone application for skin cancer diagnosis makes similarly good diagnostic decisions as experts in a real clinical scenario. When it came to treatment decisions, however, the experts were superior to the AI.

"The AI application tends to remove more benign lesions in the treatment recommendation than experts would. If you take this into account, the AI application can certainly be used. It should also be borne in mind that if it is used uncritically, too many false-positive findings would have to be clarified," said dermatologist Harald Kittler from the varsity.

LONDON, Oct 24 (Agencies): Electric bicycles have been identified as a type of moderate-intensity exercise that may aid in the prevention and treatment of type 2 diabetes, a new study has found.

The study, published in the journal Frontiers, said that engaging in e-cycling was perceived as an easier way of managing diabetes than diet or other types of exercise, largely due to the enjoyment of riding. "Physical activity (PA) is a key component in the management of type 2 diabetes.

Gutsy Afghanistan slay Pakistan by 8 wickets as Babar and Co. stare at elimination

This was Afghanistan's second upset win of the tournament after their shock victory over defending champions England

CHENNAI, Oct 24 (Agencies): A spirited Afghanistan team continued its giant-killing spree to literally push Pakistan on the brink of elimination with a eight-wicket victory in a World Cup game.

On a challenging Chepauk track, a target of 283 was certainly not the easiest of chases but Kolkata Knight Riders' Rahmanullah Gurbaz (65 off 53 balls) teed off in style while his partner Ibrahim Zadran (87 off 113 balls) dropped anchor at the other end in an opening stand of 130 which laid the perfect platform.

While experience is worth its weight in gold in these kind of games, Afghanistan did well enough to chase down the target in 49 overs, exposing the frailties of Pakistan bowling unit which just didn't turn up on the day.

Having lost seven ODIs against Pakistan, Afghanistan was missing out on that finishing touches which was required and all the four batters did play their parts to perfection in what was their highest run-chase in history of 50 over format.

This is Afghanistan's second win after beating defending champions England in New Delhi and with four points are now placed sixth in mid-table muddle.

Pakistan, for time being, stay put on fifth place but after a hattrick of defeats, another loss against South Africa later this week, will in all likelihood shut the knock-out doors for the 1992 champions.

Seasoned Rahmat Shah (77 not out off 84 balls), whose straight six down the ground off Hasan Ali was a visual treat, showed admirable situational awareness even as Pakistan bowlers did put pressure on him during the second phase of the chase. He repeated the same shot off the same bowler to put

Afghanistan within sniffing distance of victory.

He got good support from skipper Hashmatullah Shahidi (48 not out, 45 balls), who reverse swept an off-colour Shadab Khan against the turn during crucial juncture which spoke volumes about his temperament.

The duo added 96 runs for the third wicket in some of the most difficult batting conditions. The sense of happiness and elation after hitting the winning boundary was there for everyone to see

The 21,000 odd sporting crowd at Chepauk also gave the team a nice standing ovation.

The match that was played on the same track as the India versus Australia game had both grip and turn on offer but 282 for 7 by Pakistan was by no means a poor effort if one takes quality spin bowling unit that Afghanistan possesses.

If spin is Afghanistan's strength, it is certainly Pakistan's biggest weakness as bowlers of Shadab (0/49 in 8 overs) and Usama Mir's (0/55 in 8 overs) quality don't win World Cups.

In Indian domestic cricket, there are better wrist spinners than these two and one of the best in the world, Yuzvendra Chahal hasn't got a look-in in this Indian team. When Afghanistan started

chase, Gurbaz, who hit nine fours and a six, wasn't overawed by Shaheen Shah Afridi,

Hasan or Haris Rauf. The Pakistanis bowled too many boundaries in the first 15 overs as Gurbaz took the likes of Rauf and leg-spinner Usama Mir to the cleaners and also hit off-spinner Iftikhar Ahmed for his only six.

Strong on the off-side, Gurbaz repeatedly peppered the point and backward point region as Pakistani bowlers bowled short and wide outside the off-stump. In one Rauf over, eighth of

the innings, Gurbaz got four boundaries and save the last one, which was a streaky inside edge, three were cuts or slashes through point region.

Pakistan's fielding was rubbish to say the least as most fielders tried putting blame on others in full public view, including skipper Babar Azam, who lost his cool after failing to stop overthrows. Earlier Babar struck a composed half-century before useful cameos by lower-order batters guided Pakistan to a reasonably good total if one takes the track into account.

Opener Abdullah Shafique made 58 off 75 balls and Babar got 74 off 92 balls, but had it not been for the efforts of Iftikhar Ahmed and the returning Shadab Khan, Pakistan would

have finished with far less than what they eventually achieved. While Iftikhar smashed his way to a 27-ball 40, Shadab contributed a breezy 40 in 38 deliveries

Expecting a slow pitch, the Afghans moved in with four spinners. However, the track turned out to be better than expected.

The Pakistani openers Shafique and Imam-ul-Haq (17) began on a cautious note and managed a 56-run stand. While they brought up the side's 50 by the eighth over, Shafique was targeting pacer Naveen-ul-Haq. Also, spinner Mujeeb Ur Rahman was expensive in the first 10 overs of the powerplay. The first delivery of the second powerplay saw the Afghans

earn the first breakthrough, with Imam falling to speedster Azmatullah Omarzai off a short ball. Nevertheless, the Men in

Green barely panicked as Shafique joined forces with skipper Babar and put up a 54-run partnership for the second wicket.

At this point, spinners Mohammad Nabi and Rashid Kahn operated in tandem to keep things under control, not allowing the two batters in the middle to free their arms.

In the meantime, Shafique brought up his third ODI halfcentury, while Babar looked to mix aggression with caution. Noor Ahmad was the most successful Afghan bowler with

CHANDIGARH, Oct 24 (Agencies): Bedi Paaji was a class apart — God does not create men like him anymore. The man had a heart of gold. Exploits in cricket aside, Paaji was an avid reader and he conversed in impeccable English, which not many of us would perhaps easily understand. A multi-faceted figure, his loss is irreparable. He will forever stay in our hearts, be it for his acumen as a spin bowler or his contribution to cricket off the field.

He did for our cricket, for the cricketers from the North, is phenomenal. Be it Chetan Chauhan, Surinder Amarnath, Mohinder Amarnath, Surender Khanna, all would vouch for the fact that he made us realise the need to beat Mumbai, the serial Ranji Trophy winners, if we had any ambition of playing for the country.

He turned us into a fighting unit. Kapil Dev and Yashpal Sharma, the only ones in the North Zone team who were not from Delhi, also owed him big. In fact, Bedi Paaji captained Kapil in his first tour of Pakistan in 1978. He was a hard taskmaster, but also loved you more than your parents did and was magnanimous. I remember I had scored a century in the 1979-80 Ranji Trophy finals against Mumbai, where I went



from 82 to a 100 with three sixes and we won it on account of the first innings lead. I walked into the dressing room and Bedi Paaji opened his kitbag, asking me to take my pick. I chose a Gray-Nicolls bat and a pair of Patrick shoes. Those were prized possessions back in the day. We used to have Firefly shoes that would get worn out very soon and there was this man, who was happy to help us out.

He would spend on us from own pocket and personally visit injured players to check on them.

He led from the front and fought for us. He would take on the authorities if we were put up in rat-infested rooms and would object to the team getting pakoras after practice, for he wanted us to have boiled eggs, and fruits

for vegetarian players. And then he had no qualms in telling us off if we performed poorly. Be it Mohinder Amarnath or anyone else, it never mattered to him. If you had done well on the

field, his go-to phrase was "have a glassy" (beer).

My first interaction with him happened when we had just returned to Delhi from the Vizzy Trophy, where I led the team in 1978-79. As we arrived by train, I heard someone call out my name, saying: "Bedi Paaji wants to see him." I was in my shorts, but had kept a blazer and leather shoes in my bag.

I dressed to the tee and went straight to the

dressing room, where I saw Madan Lal in shorts with a towel on his shoulder. Paaji, who too was in a towel, saw me and said: "Kirat come here, have a glassy". "Get ready, you will play Ranji Trophy this year," he added, while asking me to choose a gear from his bag. I chose a bat, but he picked up another and said: "No take this one, it's Grade A!'

The Feroz Shah Kotla, now Arun Jaitley Stadium. should have been named after Bishan Singh Bedi. It would have been befitting to the legendary spinner.
