


Retrieval of encroached land of **Dussehra Ground demanded**

Legalising of gay marriage: The key is mobilising of public support

n October 17, the Supreme Court of India passed a ruling that it cannot legalise same-sex marriages at this juncture. The Chief Justice of India, Justice D.Y. Chandrachud, said that there was "a degree of agreement and a degree of disagreement on how far we have to go" on same-sex marriages and that making such a law was the domain of Parliament.

The judgment was no doubt a disappointment to the petitioners who had sought a positive outcome that would ensure equality and non-discrimination in the laws pertaining to marriage, succession and adoption for the lesbian, gay, bisexual, trans and queer or questioning, intersex, asexual and more (LGBTQIA+) community, rights which are currently assured to only heterosexual couples.

Leading up to this judgment, the five-judge bench headed by the Chief Justice Chandrachud heard arguments in the case in April and May this year. During the arguments, the Centre told the Supreme Court that any constitutional declaration made by it on the petitions seeking legal validation for samesex marriage may not be a "correct course of action" as the court will not be able to foresee, envisage, comprehend and deal with its fallout. On May 3, the Centre told the court it would constitute a committee headed by the Cabinet Secretary to examine the administrative steps that could be taken to address the "genuine humane concerns" of same-sex couples without going into the issue of legalising their marriage.

Some same-sex marriage petitioners had urged the apex court to use its plenary power, "prestige and moral authority" to push society to acknowledge such a union which



would ensure them to lead a "dignified" life like heterosexuals. Unfortunately, this did not happen.

Same-sex couples in India face significant legal and social challenges. They are afraid to come out, even to their friends and family. They cannot adopt children or have a child by surrogacy; they do not have automatic rights to inheritance, maintenance and tax benefits; after a partner passes away, they cannot avail of benefits like pension or compensation; they cannot be party in living will or right to life decisions, as they are not the next of kin, not related by blood or marriage. These rights are available to heterosexual couples.

Chief Justice Chandrachud stressed that marriage was not a static, stagnant or unchanging institution, but the Supreme Court cannot compel Parliament or the state Assemblies to create a new institution of marriage. And nor is the Special Marriage Act (SMA) unconstitutional just because it does not recognise same-sex marriages or redraft its provisions to substitute "man" and "woman" or "husband" and "wife". The right to enter into a union must lead to a recognition by the State for fulfilment of such a right.

The October 17 judgment affirmed

that same-sex couples have a right to enter into union and it is the State's duty is to ensure such unions and couples get protection and a bouquet of rights and that they and unmarried couples can jointly adopt children.

However, the State has fallen short of doing this, and will not be able to do this.

On a positive note, the judgment called to task the Central Adoption Resource Authority (CARA) regulation that restricted queer and unmarried couples from adopting children. The CARA is a statutory body affiliated to the ministry of women and child development and the nodal body for adoption of Indian children, regulating and monitoring all adoptions taking place in India, including inter-country adoptions. The CJI said the law did not preclude unmarried couples from adopting, and that the Union of India had not proven restricting unmarried couples from adopting was in the best interest of children. "CARA has exceeded its authority in barring unmarried couples," he

The judgment admitted that this moment was an opportunity to remedy the historical injustice and discrimination, and thus governance needed to grant rights to such unions or marriages. But between the five judges, it was a minority view. The judgment also says that the courts must exercise restraint and leave it to the legislature to decide this issue with debates, discussion and policy decisions. Yet, in India's current political climate, it is difficult to debate and discuss these issues that could result in policymaking.

After a decade-long battle in 2018, the Supreme Court struck down the colonial-era law that criminalised same-sex intercourse. Since then, surveys have shown that the acceptance of homosexuality has grown. According to a Pew survey published in June 2023, about 53 per cent of those polled believed that homosexuality should be accepted. But there is still much opposition to same-sex unions and many sections of society believe that marriage is for procreation, not recreation.

The LGBTQ+ community, as a minority, is one among many others in seeking equality and non-discrimination in a country that has a long history of inequality and discrimination based on religion, caste, class, race, ethnicity, gender, sex and linguistics. While the Constitution of India guarantees rights on paper, it has been a struggle for the disenfranchised to secure their rights.

And this may not change any time soon. Rights struggles take time, patience and challenging work such as building consensus within the groups, developing clear plans, strategies and timelines, while anticipating obstacles and identifying allies.

By petitioning the Supreme Court, the LGBTQ+ groups are keeping the agenda of same-sex marriage and subsequent rights on the table and in view of the public. This is a good move. However, the arduous work lies in engaging the public to support their demands. That is the next step.

Fatima Sana Shaikh on epileptic seizure on Dhak Dhak sets: I am much better today, touched that Dia Mirza cared for me

Actor Fatima Sana Shaikh calls herself blessed for her last release Dhak Dhak. With the Tarun Dudeja film, she ticked off her dream to ride a motorcycle as the film revolves around four women who take on a bike journey to Khardung La. In an interview, Fatima revisits her memories from the making of the film.

The 31-year-old actor says, "I feel lucky to live my life through work, and got a chance to visit Khardung La. Every character adds value to my life and with Dhak Dhak, I have connected with all the women." The film also stars Dia Mirza, Ratna Pathak Shah and Sanjana Sanghi. The film was wrapped up in 42 days, all the way from Delhi to Leh.

Fatima recalls falling under the weather. "Sometimes the weather used to be problematic, and there were altitude problems as well. It really hit me hard. But, in the end, it was worth it, it turned out to be a good film."

The film brings together women across all age groups, as represented by Fatima, Dia, Ratna and Sanjana. Fatima had to deal with an epileptic seizure during the Dhak Dhak shoot. It was Dia Mirza who revealed it some time ago and shared how helpless she was upon seeing the actor. Fatima shares her health update, "This is something I live with. I am recovering and I am much better today.

She continues, "It's not a big event for me because I live with it. I have seizures and then I carry on with work. Of course, it's difficult for somebody else to see, they care about me. I think not many people have seen it happening, so for them, it can be very traumatic. I am touched that Dia cared because a lot of people don't have the awareness...the person who goes through the episodes knows how difficult it is. Everyone on the sets was very supportive. I always inform everyone that I have epilepsy and might get an episode so I need a break."

So what happened on the sets? Fatima says the seizure struck when she insisted on finishing a shoot without a break.

Talking about Dia being worried for her, Fatima adds, "She knows I have recently come back from multiple episodes. I am on medications. She was worried because it's very taxing on the body."

Fatima on epilepsy struggles at work

Often people face difficulties at work while dealing with epilepsy. Has there been any major problem at work? Fatima replies candidly, "Honesty, I've never faced it in the film industry; people have been extremely supportive. You tell them that you have a problem and they will help you. Beyond anything your craft is most important. Everybody has some baggage or injuries and it keeps happening. Other than that, of all the people I have worked with, everyone has been quite welproblem at work. Woh apni khud ki insecurities hoti hain (sometimes people are insecure)."

"For me, I am in a completely different place in my life. For working-class people, it's extremely difficult. Nobody wants to see you having a seizure at work. There's a stigma attached to it. People don't get married, they don't get a job or let babies near you. Kids with epilepsy don't get an education because nobody wants to take their responsibility. There's no awareness, people think mata aa gayi, bhoot-preet hai ya kuch ho gaya (seizures are due to God or demonic possessions); it gets scary for people to deal with it. In industry, it is different for me... maybe because I am an actor. Had I been a technician, maybe things would have been different... that I don't know."

Fatima looks forward to better medicines and medical advancement in order to treat epilepsy in future. She believes it spreading awareness is the key to bringing a change in society. Till then the actor has no qualms to talk about her condition and encourage others.

Fatima Sana Shaikh: Even today when I tell people about epilepsy, they don't understand She says, "The more you talk about it, the more awareness you will create. It will get normalised. We often use the word as a slur--are isko toh mirgi aa rahi hain. Isme kuch galat nahi hain (there's nothing wrong with it), simply because we don't know about it. Even today when I tell people about it, they don't understand what it is. I explain to them what it is and when the next episode comes. There are variations in episodes too and I prepare accordingly. I tell people around about it too and that's fine. I cannot be mad at the world for not understanding my condition. Even I didn't under-

stand at one point." Fatima's next wish

After riding a motorbike and travelling about 966 km on the road, Fatima now has a new goal on her bucket list. She tells us, "I want to climb mountains." "I want to explore different worlds and different characters. An actor's life is very exciting," she signs off with a smile. Fatima will be next seen in Meghna Gulzar's Sam Bahadur.



PM Modi hails Cabinet nod to Jamrani Dam Multipurpose Project's inclusion under PMKSY-AIBP

The project will cost Rs 2,584 crore

NEW DELHI, Oct 26 (Agencies): Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Thursday hailed the Union Cabinet's approval to the inclusion of the Jamrani Dam Multipurpose Project of Uttarakhand under the accelerated irrigation benefit programme, saying it is a significant stride towards a prosperous and sustainable Uttarakhand and Uttar Pradesh.

The government on Wednesday approved the inclusion of the project under the Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchayee Yojana-Accelerated Irrigation Benefit Programme (PMKSY-AIBP), which will cost Rs 2,584 crore.

The project envisages the construction of a dam near Jamrani village across river Gola, a tributary of river Ram Ganga in Nainital district of Uttarakhand. The dam will feed the existing



Gola barrage through its 40.5 km length of canal system and 244 km long canal system completed in 1981.

In a post on X, Modi said, "This decision by the CCEA will bolster irrigation, enhance hydro power generation and provide clean drinking water to over 10 lakh people."

"It is a significant stride towards a prosperous and sustainable Uttarakhand and Uttar Pradesh," he said.

Modi also hailed the government announcing a subsidy of Rs 22,303 crore on phosphatic and potassic (P&K) fertilisers for the current rabi season.

"This Cabinet decision will ensure access to fertilisers at affordable prices for farmers," Modi said.

In another post, Modi hailed the the Union Cabinet's approval to a memorandum of cooperation between India and Japan on a Semiconductor Supply Chain

The memorandum of cooperation between the two countries was signed in July.

"This decision by the Cabinet is great news for the sector. It will strengthen the semiconductor supply chain and create job opportunities," Modi said.

He asked the commanders to enhance operational preparedness and examine the rapidly changing global geo-political situation and assess them in the Indian context.

He said new trends had emerged in the field of air warfare and there is a need to analyse and learn from them to strengthen the defence preparedness. He exhorted the Indian Air Force (IAF) to focus on strengthening the air defence systems, use of drones and making headway in the field of aerospace to protect

India's air domain. "There are new challenges emanating from the global security scenario. We must always be ready to deal with them," he said.

The minister was briefed on the operational preparedness of the IAF by Air Chief Marshal VR Chaudhari.

Rajnath praised the stellar role played by the IAF during the recent Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief missions in Himachal Pradesh, Sikkim and other flood-affected areas.

The conference, which is held bi-annually, involves discussions on charting the IAF's way ahead, given the current geo-political environment and technological imperatives.

ED raids premises of Rajasthan Congress president in paper leak matter, summons CM Gehlot's son in FEMA case

JAIPUR, Oct 26 (Agencies): Turning the heat on the ruling Congress in poll-bound Rajasthan, the Enforcement Directorate on Thursday raided the premises of state Congress president Govind Singh Dotasra in Jaipur and Sikar as part of a money-laundering probe into the alleged exam paper leak case and summoned Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot's son in a foreign exchange violation case.

Besides the premises of Dotasra, a former minister for school education, the agency is also searching the premises of party candidate from Mahua seat in Dausa, Omprakash Hudla, and some others, official sources said.

An armed escort of central paramilitary force CRPF accompanied the ED teams.

Congress The slammed the Centre over the ED's action against its leaders in Rajasthan and accused dra Modi of taking the help of probe agencies in fighting polls and said people would give the BJP a befitting reply.

Chief Minister Gehlot said the ED raids are being done every day in the state "as the BJP does not want that the Congress's guarantees reach the women, farmers and the poor".

Elections to the 200member Rajasthan Assembly will be held on November 25. The results will be declared on December 3.

Dotasra is the party candidate from Lacchmangarh seat of Sikar against BJP's Subhash Maharia. He is also the sitting MLA from this seat while Hudla is an independent MLA and the Congress has fielded him from the Mahua assembly seat this time.

The money-laundering case stems from FIRs filed by the Rajasthan Police against the accused.

The accused "in connivance with each other leaked the question paper of general knowledge of senior teacher grade II competitive examination, 2022, which was scheduled to be conducted by Rajasthan Public Service Commission (RPSC) on December 21, 22 and 24, 2022 and provided

it to the appearing candidates for the consideration amount of Rs 8 lakh-10 lakh per candi-

date," the ED had said. Former Rajasthan Public Service Commission (RPSC) member Babulal Katara and two other people identified as Anil Kumar Meena and Bhupendra Saran were arrested by the ED in this case.

The agency also summoned the Rajasthan chief minister's son Vaibhav Gehlot for questioning in a case related to alleged contravention of the foreign exchange

Vaibhav has been asked to depose before the federal agency's office either in Jaipur or in New Delhi on Friday, sources said.

The summons is linked to the recent ED raids against Rajasthanbased hospitality group Triton Hotels & Resorts Pvt Ltd, Vardha Enterprises Pvt Ltd and its directors and promoters Shiv Shankar Sharma, and others.

The agency had searched the group and its promoters for three days in August at locations in Jaipur, Udaipur, Mumbai and Delhi.

Rattan Kant Sharma's alleged links with Vaibhav Gehlot are allegedly under the scanner of the ED and it is expected to question and record his statement under the Foreign Exchange Management Act (FEMA).

Unaccounted cash of Rs 1.2 crore was seized by the ED after these searches.

Soon after the action against its leaders in Rajasthan, Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge alleged that agencies such as the ED, Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) and the Income Tax Department become the real 'panna pramukh (party workers)' of the BJP as soon as elections come.

"Seeing its certain defeat in Rajasthan, the BJP made its last throw of the dice. After Chhattisgarh, the ED has also entered the election campaign in Rajasthan and started action against Congress lead-Knarge said.

"The dictatorship of the Modi government is fatal for democracy. We will continue to fight against the misuse of agencies,

and the public will give a befitting reply to the BJP," the Congress chief said in a post on X.

Ashok Gehlot said the Congress launched guarantees for women of Rajasthan on October 25 and the ED action against Dotasra and Vaibhav Gehlot came just a day later.

13 killed in road accident in Karnataka



CHIKKABALLAPUR, Oct 26 (Agencies): Thirteen people were killed when the SUV they were travelling in crashed into a stationary tanker here on Thursday morning, police said.

The accident occurred on the outskirts of the district headquarters town of Chikkaballapur at around 7 am, they said.

The vehicle was plying from Anantapur district in Andhra Pradesh to Bengaluru when the driver crashed into the stationary tanker on NH- 44 killing 13 passengers, including four women.

Preliminary probe has stated that the victims, including the driver of the four wheeler, who also died in the accident, hail from Anantapur district. The exact cause of the accident is yet to be ascertained. However, low visibility due to fog is suspected to be one of the reasons which needs to be verified, a senior police officer said.

The victims who hailed from Gorantla in Anantapur district do not belong to the same family, he said.

"Twelve people died on the spot in the accident while one critically injured person who was being treated at a nearby hospital succumbed to injuries. All of them were travelling in the vehicle from Anantapur to Bengaluru and on the way, the vehicle collided with a stationary tanker," DL Nagesh, Superintendent of Police (Chik-

kaballapur), told agency. A case of accident under relevant sections of the Indian Penal Code has been registered and efforts are being made to identify and contact the family members of the victims, police said.

5 killed, 22 injured as bus overturns in Maharashtra's Beed

CHHATRAPATI SAMBHAJINAGAR, Oct 26 (Agencies): Five people were killed and 22 others injured when a speeding private bus overturned in Maharashtra's Beed district on Thursday morning, police said.

The accident took place at Aashta Fata between 5.45 am and 6 am when the bus was on way from Mumbai to Beed, located about 120 km from here, they said. The bus was moving at a high

speed. Its driver apparently lost control over the wheels and as a result it met with the accident, the police said.

Five persons were killed in the accident. Four of them were residents of Beed district and one was from Yavatmal, Ashti police station in-charge Santosh Khetmalas told agency.

Besides, 22 people were injured in this accident. They were taken to various hospitals for treatment, he said.

Karnataka woman dies by suicide after harassment by **Instagram friend**



UTTAR KANNADA, Oct 26 (Agencies): A young woman in Karnataka died by suicide after she was allegedly harassed by a person she befriended on social media platform Instagram, police said on Thursday.

The victim has been identified as 24-year-old Nethra Gowali, a resident of Hadavalli village

Uttara Kannada district. The woman's father had lodged a complaint against her Instagram friend Govardhana Moger and urged legal action against him.

According to the police, the accused was known to the victim for a year but he started forcing her to fall in love with

When she refused his advances, he started harassing her to return all the money he had spent on her.

The accused had also blackmailed her that he would make her personal photos viral on social media, the police said, adding that she took the drastic step on Wednesday after being unable to bear the harassment.

The Bhatkal Rural police have registered the case and taken up the investigation.

NEW DELHI, Oct 26 (Agencies): Delhi police today arrested the mastermind in a sextortion racket who had blackmailed several people across the country. Mahendra Singh, who was caught in Haryana's Mewat, had been running the scam for the last few years.

He came under the police radar after a Delhi man lodged a complaint that he was being blackmailed. The man had first received a call from a woman who agreed to an intimate video call with the victim.

Posing as a cop, ACP Ram Pandey, Mahendra then called the victim and demanded money to delete the video. He demanded 9 lakh from the man with a promise of deleting the video, in which the victim was naked, police said.

Despite the victim paying him the amount, he called again and demanded 15 lakh more to not pursue the case. Mahendra threatened to

send the man's family to jail if he did not pay.

Police say the victim was so scared that he did not tell anyone about it initially. But he confided in his friend several days later, who urged him to lodge a police complaint.

Police immediately launched a probe and spent days searching for Mahendra, who was finally arrested from Mewat. Police found a swipe machine, BharatPe, a pen drive, a 16 GB memory card, and an iPhone in his possession.

Investigation revealed that there were several other victims whom Mahendra had blackmailed similarly. The 36-year-old confessed that while calling victims, he would either use the name ACP Ram Pandey or call himself a YouTuber and threaten to make their objectionable videos public.

22 die in shooting incidents at US bowling alley, bar; gunman at large

A spokesperson for Maine Department of Public Safety urges residents to stay in their homes with their doors locked

WASHINGTON, Oct 26 (Agencies): At least 22 people were killed in two mass shooting incidents in the US state of Maine, authorities said, adding that a "person of interest" who is "armed and dangerous" had been identified.

In a statement on Wednesday night, the Lewiston Police department said the 40-year-old person of interest Robert Card, who is currently absconding, should be "considered armed and dangerous", CNN reported.

"Law enforcement is attempting to locate Robert Card 4/4/1983, as a person of interest regarding the mass shooting at Schemengees Bar and Sparetime Recreation this evening. CARD should be considered armed and dangerous. Please contact law enforcement if you are aware of his whereabouts," the statement added

On Wednesday evening, the police department said they had responded to two locations in Lewiston -- a restaurant called



Schemengees, and Sparetime Recreation, a bowling alley, the BBC reported.

The two locations are at a distance of 6.5 km from each other. Also confirming the incident, Maine State Police said in a post on X: "There is an active shooter in Lewiston. We ask people to shelter in place. Please stay inside your home with the doors locked.'

The Central Maine Medical Centre said it was reacting to a "mass casualty, mass shooter event" and is coordinating with other hospitals in the area to treat the injured.

Although the number of injured was not immediately clear, reports have suggested that at least 50 to 60 people were hurt.

Meanwhile, the Androscoggin County Sheriff's Office released two images of a suspect, showing a bearded man in a brown sweater carrying a firearm walking into a building

"Law enforcement in Androscoggin County are investigating two active shooter events. We are encouraging all businesses to lock down while we investigate.

The suspect is still at large," the Office said in a Facebook

Police also shared a photo of a white vehicle, saying its front bumper was believed to be painted black, and asked anybody who recognised it to contact police.

Lewiston Public Schools Superintendent Jake Langlais has announced that schools in the district would be closed on Thursday.

A statement from the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) said Secretary Alejandro Mayorkas had been briefed and was continuing to monitor the situation.

"DHS is working closely with our federal, state and local partners to support the Lewiston community," it said.

The Justice Department said that federal agencies were assisting state and local law enforcement.

Lewiston is a town of about 38,000 people located about 35 miles north of Portland, Maine.

Heartbreaking video of Al Jazeera's Gaza reporter as he weeps over his son's body; his wife, daughter also killed in Israeli strike



GAZA, Oct 26 (Agencies): Three family members of Wael Al-Dahdouh, Al Jazeera Arabic's bureau chief in Gaza, were killed amid the raging conflict in the Hamas-controlled enclave, Palestinian security and medical sources said.

On Wednesday, an Israeli raid on two houses in the Nuseirat refugee camp killed several people, including the wife, son and daughter of Al-Dahdouh, the medical sources claimed.

"Despite being forced to relocate to the southern part of the Gaza Strip in search of safety, the Al-Dahdouh family was targeted," Xinhua news agency quoted a statement released by the Hamas-run Ministry of Interior in Gaza as saying.

The relocation followed Israel's evacuation call ordering some 1 million people to move to the southern part of

the besieged enclave on October 13. Footage on Al Jazeera English news channel shows Al-Dahdouh entering a hospital to see his slain family mem-

In a statement released on X, Al Jazeera confirmed the death of Al-Dahdouh's family members and extended

"The Al Jazeera Media Network extends its sincere condolences and sympathy to our colleague Weal Al-Dahdouh on the loss of his family in an Israeli airstrike," the statement said.

"Al Jazeera is deeply concerned about the safety and well-being of our colleagues in Gaza and hold the Israeli authorities responsible for their security," it added.

According to the Palestinian Journalists Syndicate, 24 journalists have been killed, some with their families, and dozens more have been wounded since the beginning of the Israeli airstrikes on the Gaza Strip.

Hamas launched a surprise attack on Israel on October 7, firing thousands of rockets and infiltrating Israeli territory, to which Israel responded with massive airstrikes and punitive measures, including a siege on the enclave with supplies of water, electricity, fuel, and other necessities being cut off.

The ongoing Israel-Hamas conflict has so far killed more than 6,500 Palestinians in the Gaza Strip and more than 1,400 people in Israel.

Israel conducted overnight raids with tanks in Gaza ahead of 'next stage': Army

JERUSALEM, Oct 26 (Agencies): Israel said Thursday that a column of tanks and infantry had launched an overnight raid into Hamascontrolled Gaza, striking "numerous" targets before retreating to home soil

The military announced the incursion into the north of the Palestinian territory hours after Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu declared preparations for a ground war were underway

The Israel Defense Forces described the operation as a "targeted raid" that hit "numerous terrorist cells, infrastructure and anti-tank missile launch posts".

It said the operation was "preparation for the next stages of combat" adding that "the soldiers have since exited the area and returned to Israeli territory".

Black-and-white video footage posted by the military showed a column of armoured vehicles and bulldozers winding toward what appeared to be a border fence and breaking through it.

AFP verified the location as south of the Israeli city of Ashkelon but could not verify when the footage was recorded.

video Another appeared to show an airstrike and later buildings being struck with munitions, sending debris flying high into the air, along with a thick plume of smoke.

Just hours earlier Netanyahu had delivered a nationally televised address to Israelis still grieving and furious after Hamas's bloody October 7 attacks, telling them "we are in the midst of a campaign for our existence".

The shock attack saw throngs of Hamas gunmen pour from Gaza into Israel, killing 1,400 people, mostly civilians, and kidnapping 222 more, according to offi-

cial tallies. Israel has retaliated with heavy bombing that Gaza's Hamas-run health ministry said has killed more than 6,500, with the toll expected to rise substantially if tens

Israel has cut off Gaza's normal supply corridors for water, food and other necessities, and fewer than 70 relief trucks have entered the impoverished territory since the war began.

None contained fuel, which Israel fears Hamas will use for rockets and explosives.

Aid agencies have warned that more people will die if medical equipment, water desalination plants and ambulances stop operating because

Since October 7, Israel has launched thousands of strikes in Gaza, but it has also hit targets in Lebanon and Syria.

Late Wednesday, Lebanon-based Hezbollah fired what Israel said was a surface-to-air missile at an Israeli drone. Israel's military said it had intercepted the missile and "struck the source of the launch".

Hamas, Hezbollah and Syria's government are backed by Iran, which denies Israel's right to

Tehran's top diplomat on Wednesday accused Israel of carrying out "genocide" in Gaza. Jordan's King Abdullah

became the latest leader to warn that ongoing violence could "lead to an explosion" in the region. His wife Queen Rania accused Western leaders of a "glaring double standard" for not condemning Israel's killing of Palestinian civilians in its bombardment of Gaza.

Violence has also risen sharply in the occupied West Bank, where health officials said more than 100 Palestinians had been killed, mostly in raids by Israeli troops or in clashes with Israeli settlers.

US working with G7 countries to compete with China's Belt and Road: Biden

WASHINGTON, Oct 26 (Agencies): The US is working with other G7 members to compete with China's Belt and Road Initiative through a network of infrastructure projects, including a railroad connecting Saudi Arabia with Europe, President Joe Biden said.

On the sidelines of the G20 Summit in September, key leaders of the world led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Biden had announced the launch of the ambitious India-Middle East-Europe Economic Corridor.

"We are going to compete on that (Belt and Road Initiative) and we're doing it in a different way. The Belt and Road Initiative has ended up in debt and a noose for most of the people (nations) who have signed on," Biden said at a Rose Garden news conference with visiting Australian Prime Minister Anthony Alba-

He said that they are working with G7 partners to provide infrastructure for those nations.

The Group of Seven (G7) comprises the UK, Canada, France, Germany, Italy, Japan and the United States.

"We want to, for example, at the G20, we were able to act on a proposal to build



a railroad all the way from Riyadh all the way through the Middle East, Saudi Arabia, Israel, up through Greece, and not the railroad, but pipeline across the Mediterranean up into Europe," Biden said in response to a question.

The US president said that his previous comment of "extreme competition" with China was not conflict. "I talked about how we're going to compete with China in every way according to the international rules, economically, politically, and other ways, but not -- I'm not looking for conflict," he said in response to another question.

Albanese is headed to China next month. Biden was asked "What do you make of China's re-engagement with Australia?" and "Can Australia trust Beijing, and can Australia do business with China?.

"Trust but verify is the phrase. And look, China is having their own internal and external difficulties right now. China's economic growth is stagnant compared to what it was. China has engaged in activities that Russia and many other activities have -- that

others have engaged

in terms of intimidation

and dealing with other

countries," Biden said. "But the fact is that I have met with Xi Jinping more than any other world leader has. I've had over 68 hours of private meetings, with simultaneous interpreters starting back when I was vice president because it wasn't appropriate for a president of the United States to be meeting with the vice president," he said.

Biden said that subsequently, in addition to that 68 hours, "I've also had another, as they tell me they keep meticulous contact. I think. 12, 15 hours of discussions".

He said that last week, he requested USD 3.4 billion in supplemental funds to boost submarine production and maintenance to meet port AUKUS. The AUKUS pact,

which is a trilateral alliance between the UK, US and Australia, is seen as a counter to an aggressive China in the strategic Indo-Pacific region, which included its claim over most parts of the disputed South China Sea.

"When we put together the deal, I was asked by Xi Jinping, well, we're just trying to surround China. I said no, we're not surrounding China. We're just making sure that the sea lanes remain open. 

K-Pop Star G-Dragon Under Investigation For Alleged Drug Use: Police



SEOUL, Oct 26 (Agencies): K-pop star G-Dragon -- of the wildly successful but problemplagued band BIGBANG -- is under investigation for alleged drug use, police said Thursday, becoming the latest in a string of South Korean entertainers to face such a probe.

South Korea has extremely tough legislation on illegal drugs, and even Koreans who take drugs like marijuana legally overseas risk prosecution upon returning to

their home country.

This year, President Yoon Suk Yeol called for more stringent measures to eliminate drug traffickers, saying the country was no longer "drug-free".

Police in Incheon told agency on Thursday that they had "opened an investigation" into G-Dragon's case, but declined to provide details of the allegations against

The disclosure comes less than a week after police launched an investigation into "Parasite" actor Lee Sun-kyun, who stands accused of using marijuana and other psychoactive drugs.

Local news reports said that Lee -- previously celebrated for his wholesome image -- was being dropped from his ongoing television and commercial projects.

Earlier this month, another high profile actor, Yoo Ah-in, was indicted for alleged drug use.

G-Dragon's group BIGBANG is one of South Korea's most successful boy bands, having sold at least 140 million records worldwide since their debut in 2006.

But its members have often been in the limelight for misconduct.

Group member Seungri retired from show business in 2019 amid mounting criminal investigations, and was later sentenced to 18 months in prison for offering up women to potential investors for sexual services, among other

Rapper T.O.P -- who in May revealed he had "withdrawn" from BIGBANG -- received a suspended jail sentence in 2017 for using marijuana.

G-Dragon himself was also investigated for marijuana use in 2011, although he was released without indictment at the time.

Why is India's small-car segment shrinking

There seem to be many reasons: drop in incomes, increase in aspirations and perhaps a side-effect of a 'K-shaped' recovery post-Covid

CHANDIGARH, Oct 26 (Agencies): A recent Indian auto-sales data by the Society of Indian Automobile Manufacturers (SIAM) and reports by several auto experts revealed some very interesting trends.

According to the figures released by the apex national body that represents all major vehicle and vehicular engine manufacturers in India, sales in the small car segment are not as robust as earlier.

Only 35,000 small cars were sold in the July-September quarter as compared to nearly 77,000 in the same period in 2022, as per reports.

Experts say sales of "entry-level cars" (as small cars are also referred to as) have been declining since CovidD. For these three months in particular, the sales of small cars slumped 75% and of motorcycles and scooters (other popular modes of transportation for lower income groups and rural areas) by 39% and 25%, respectively.

Interestingly, however, the second important trend noticed was from the sports utility vehicles or SUV segment and



ently, their demand increased as according to reports the sales of domestic utility vehicle were up by 23% in the quarter.

The reasons

Apparently, small cars are no longer small in price as compared to the mid-segment passenger vehicles, thereby making them unaffordable for the segment which would have naturally graduated to them had their income increased.

Another problem seems to be the interest rates on car loans, which are crucial to determine the decision to whether or not to buy a new vehicle. The rise in repo rate increases the rate of interest on all types of loans, home, business, car, everything.

the sentiments. They say that the prices of small cars increased due to regulatory changes, making them unaffordable. In other words,

incomes did not increase, rather in many cases, they decreased in the post-Covid era, while the demand decreased.

"The ability of people to buy these cars has been affected, which is a sign of delayed economic recovery in rural and semi-urban areas in the post-pandemic period. Rural income levels are lower than earlier, which is a disturbing factor not just for auto-manufacturers but for all consumer goods manufacturers. The bottom line is that the demand in the rural/

semi-urban areas is not as robust anymore," they add.

The drop in sales of entry-level cars should worry the manufacturers this festive season, as this does not seem to be a temporary phenomenon. The counter argument that perhaps the same people want to spend more and buy a better car as the median level in prices has increased does not work with sceptics.

"The income of rural buyers is no longer what it used to be; the same is true for semiurban areas post the pandemic. The divide between urban and rural has widened and the fact that the sales of high-end cars is increasing proves the point that the recovery has been more K-shaped.

"The farm incomes have been affected after the ban on wheat and rice exports. Besides, the rainfall mismatch, excess in some and deficit in other, added to the dampening of the mood," they add.

Luxury cars cruise While sales of small cars are declining that of luxury vehicles seem to be on the cruise.

The surge, experts say, is being driven by buyers in all categories-firsttimers as well as those upgrading to premium products because of easier access to loans, etc. Many in middle and upper classes who during Covid period could not indulge on expensive clothes, eating out, holidays, etc. had sufficient money post-pandemic to splurge on expensive cars and luxury items.

However, this is also indicative of widening gaps between segments.

Sign of 'K-shaped' recovery?

A K-shaped recovery is when one sector of the economy rebounds from a recession while another sector continues to decline.

Obviously, this affects wages and incomes in both sectors.

There are many reasons for this widening gap, including the stock market which boomed through the pandemic while some key sectors tanked. The most affected was the unorganised and MSME sectors, resulting in decrease in incomes and high levels of joblessness.

Rupee falls 6 paise to 83.23 against US dollar in early trade

MUMBAI, Oct 26 (Agencies): The rupee stayed on downward track for the third consecutive session and depreciated by 6 paise to 83.23 against the US dollar in early trade on Thursday, tracking a firm American currency and negative equity market sentiment.

Forex traders said the Indian currency was also pressured due to massive selling of equities by foreign investors even as the crude oil prices hovered close to USD 90 a barrel amid geopolitical tensions in the Middle East.

At the interbank foreign exchange market, the local unit opened weak at 83.19 and then touched the lowest level of 83.23 against the greenback, registering a loss of 6 paise from its previous close.

This is the third day of fall in the rupee. It dropped 4 paise on Monday, followed by a dip of 1 paisa on Wednesday. Forex markets were closed on Tuesday on account of Dussehra. On Wednesday, the rupee closed at 83.17 against the US

Concerning level of lead, cadmium in chocolate, finds study but that manufacturers and processors

NEW YORK, Oct 26 (Agencies): Consumer Reports said that it had found "concerning" levels of lead and cadmium in a third of various chocolate products it tested recently, and called on Hershey to reduce the amounts of heavy metals in its chocolate.

The non-profit consumer group said 16 of the 48 products from various makers that its scientists tested contained potentially harmful levels of lead, cadmium or both.

Consumer Reports tested products in seven categories: dark chocolate bars, milk chocolate bars, cocoa powder, chocolate chips, and mixes for brownies, chocolate cake and hot chocolate.

Products found to contain excessive metal content included a dark chocolate bar and hot chocolate mix from Walmart, cocoa powder from Hershey's and Droste, semi-sweet chocolate chips from Target, and hot chocolate mixes from Trader Joe's, Nestle and Star-

Only milk chocolate bars, which have fewer cocoa solids, were found not to contain excessive metal content.

Consumer Reports has said long-term exposure to the metals can result in nervous system problems, immune system suppression and kidney damage, with greater danger to pregnant women and young children.

The US Food and Drug Administration told the nonprofit that experts consider chocolate a "minor source of exposure" to lead and cadmium internationally,

remain responsible for ensuring their food's safety.

Wednesday's study followed Consumer Reports' findings last December that 23 of 28 tested dark chocolate bars contained excessive lead or cadmium, including Hershey products sold under its own brand and the Lily's and Scharffen Berger brands.

Consumer Reports food policy director Brian Ronholm said Hershey, as a "leading and popular brand," should commit to making its chocolate safer. The nonprofit did not on Wednesday ask other manufacturers for the same commitment.

In March, Hershey Chief Financial Officer Steve Voskuil said his company was looking to reduce levels of lead and cadmium, saying the metals are elements in soil that can occur naturally in a chocolate product.

"We would love to eradicate it completely," Voskuil said.

Consumer Reports said more than 75,000 consumers signed an earlier petition for Hershey to reduce heavy metals in its chocolate, and that it is now again petitioning the company.

Hershey referred a request for comment to the National Confectioners

Association. "Chocolate and cocoa are safe to eat and can be enjoyed as treats as they have been for centuries," said Christopher Gindlesperger, a spokesman for the trade group.

NEW DELHI, Oct 26 (Agencies): A new study has highlighted the advantages of short exercise breaks infused in our daily routines.

In a world where sitting for long periods is linked to a higher risk of early death, new findings suggest that just 20 to 25 minutes of daily exercise can help counteract these risks.

This study, published in the British Journal of Sports Medicine, involved researchers from the University of Troms, in

Norway and Aarhus University in Denmark.

They looked at over 12,000 adults aged 50 and older in Norway and Sweden to see if exercise could help protect them from the dangers of a mostly sedentary or inactive life.

The results were clear. People who sat for over 12 hours a day had a 38% higher risk of early

But this risk could be reduced by doing at least 22 minutes of exercise each day.

Activities like brisk walking, light hiking, biking or even doing chores were all helpful.

These results support other studies that show even short bursts of exercise can counteract the health risks of sitting for a long time.

The research also found that the more you exercise, the lower your risk of early death, regardless of how much you sit.

This is consistent with other research showing that exercise has many health benefits,

including better mood, more energy and a lower risk of diseases like heart disease and cancer.

Exercise is especially important for people who sit a lot. For example, an extra 10 minutes of exercise each day was linked to a 35% lower risk of early death for those who sat for more than 10.5 hours a day.

Even just 11 minutes of exercise a day can significantly reduce the risk of early death.

Maxwell, Warner set up Australia's record 309-run win over Netherlands

Glenn Maxwell's 40-ball effort is the fastest World Cup century. It is the fastest by an Australian in ODIs. He is the first Aussie to score 100-plus runs in the final 10 overs.

NEW DELHI, Oct 26 (Agencies): Australia achieved what they set out to do against Netherlands. The Pat Cummins-led side registered a thumping 309-run victory to improve their net run rate from

-0.193 to +1.142, a muchneeded boost in their quest to reach the semifinals.

When Cummins elected to bat first, the plan was to post a big total and dismiss the Dutch cheaply. It worked like clockwork as the day saw many records being broken.

It started with David Warner, who scored his second successive ton to lay the foundation. The opener scored a 92-ball 104 to get his sixth World Cup hundred, going past Ricky Ponting's five and equalling Sachin Tendulkar's mark.

The finishing touches were then given by the mercurial Glenn Maxwell, who lit up the sky with an astonishing eight sixes and registered the fastest century in a World Cup.



Incidentally, this is the same ground where South Africa's Aiden Markram had broken the record with a 49-ball ton only weeks earlier. Maxwell, who also hit nine fours, needed nine balls fewer than Markram.

"Not something I set out to do. Just situation of the game," Maxwell said. "Huge confidence booster knowing I've got that in my locker," he added.

Josh Hazlewood, Cummins and Mitchell Marsh too chipped in with wickets while Adam Zampa cleaned up the tail to register yet another four-wicket haul. The 309-run victory was the biggest in the tournament's history.

Pandya to miss more action



NEW DELHI, Oct 26 (Agencies): Star all-rounder Hardik Pandya is likely to sit out of India's next two World Cup matches as he is yet to recover from his ankle injury from last week.

Pandya had slipped in his follow-through while bowling against Bangladesh in Pune on October 19 and missed the clash against New Zealand in Dharamsala on October 22 due to

the injury.

He had reported to National Cricket Academy (NCA) on Monday in Bengaluru for his injury management.

"Hardik is still under medication. While the swelling on his left ankle has subsided considerably, he will start bowling only towards the weekend. Right now, important is to give him time to recover," an NCA

source said.
Since India are in a

strong position to make the semifinals, having won all their five matches so far, Pandya could easily be rested for the next two matches that will allow him complete recovery before the knockouts.

"Pandya has suffered a bad sprain but fortunately not a fracture. The BCCI medical team wants to take maximum precaution. He is likely to miss next two to three matches. The team wants him fully fit for the knockout stage," added a BCCI source.

Pandya is likely to undergo a fitness test tomorrow and BCCI's medical team will ascertain his comeback date depending on how smoothly he is able to bowl full tilt without any apparent discomfort or pressure on his left ankle.


