Fire engulfs Darsgah building in **Ganderbal**

SRINAGAR, Nov 5 (Agencies): A destructive fire engulfed a building owned by Darsgah TALEEM UN NISA NAQSHBANDI in Gutlibagh area of Central Kashmir's Ganderbal District, earlier this

morning. Officials reported that the blaze had already consumed the entire wood storey of the building by the time the fire tenders along with DO Gutlibagh and his Escort could reach the scene

Despite the challenging circumstances, fire crews managed to bring the flames under control, though the building sustained significant damage. The exact cause of the fire is still under investiga-

Local resident Ab Ahad praised the swift response of the community, which helped prevent the fire from spreading to neighboring houses. He also expressed his gratitude to Do Gutlibagh and his team for their collaborative efforts in containing the blaze.

In a fortunate turn of events, DO Police station GutliBagh and his team narrowly escaped harm while assisting locals in their firefighting efforts. The incident serves as a testament to the importance of rapid response and community cooperation during emergencies.

Unidentified dead body found at railway crossing in Nowgam

SRINAGAR, Nov 5 (Agencies): Police on Sunday said that a dead body of an unidentified male has been found at railway crossing on NH 44 around early moring hours by a police party of Police Station

Nowgam.

In a handout, the police said that no injury mark has been spotted on the body upon initial observation. Upon preliminary verification, it was observed that this individual, purportedly in his late 30s, had been lying outside in the severely low temperatures overnight and as a result, he died due to the extreme

Draft reports on bills to replace Criminal Laws likely to be adopted on November 6

NEW DELHI, Nov 5: A parliamentary committee scrutinising three bills to replace the existing criminal laws will meet on November 6 to adopt draft reports, days after some opposition members had sought an extension for the panel to go through the measures in greater detail.

On October 27, the standing committee on Home could not adopt the three draft reports as some opposition members pressed for more time to study it.

Some opposition members had urged panel chairperson Brij Lal to seek an extension of three months

Security tightened after tiffin boxbased IED found on Sidhra-Narwal **Highway stretch in Nagrota**



JAMMU, Nov 5 (Agencies): Security has been tightened in Jammu's Nagrota after a tiffin box-based improvised explosive device (IED) was found on the Sidhra Narwal highway stretch on Saturday evening.

A 2 kg IED was recovered at the National Highway yesterday, after which security has been tightened on the highway. Jammu and Kashmir Police averted a bid to target the National Highway.

"A Tiffin Box-based IED weighing around two kilogrammes was found after searching the area, which has now been taken into possession after successful detonation," Jammu and Kashmir Police said in the statement.

Earlier, according to the police, around 5.30 pm, they received information that a suspicious object had been found on the Sidhra Narwal highway stretch of Jammu, near a police checkpoint.

On receiving the information, a police team, along with Police

2047 SRINAGAR, Nov 5 (Agencies): authorities have identified untrained teachers. Rehbar-e-Taleem (ReT) teachers, and Regularised Rehbar-e-Taleem (RReTs) tutors as 'threats' to the School Education Department. They also stated that they will closely monitor the objectives of private

educational institutes, which, according to the Planning and Monitoring Department, also pose a threat to the depart-

According to the news agency KNO, the Planning Department and Monitoring Department, in their 'JK Vision Document 2047,' list these threats as "Untrained teachers. ReTs. RReTs in government schools, and monitoring the objectives of private educational institutes."

The authorities have outlined the following targets in 'JK Vision Document 2047';

All schools will be equipped with ICT facilities for 100 percent coverage, making J&K a Digital Hub where education will be delivered through E-mode.

Vocational Education schools will align with the vision of NEP-2020, providing basic vocational skills.

Every student will have the liberty to choose their preferred subjects, and teaching for these subjects will be acces-

Digital platforms like DIKSHA will offer e-content for all subjects and

Government launches aggressive retail sale of onions at Rs 25 per kg tion (HACA) is ensuring

(Agencies): The Centre has taken a proactive approach to address the rising prices of onions by initiating an aggressive retail sale of onions at a subsidised rate of Rs 25 per kilogramme.

According to a press release by the Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution, this move is in response to the delay in the arrival of the kharif crop, which has contributed to an increase in onion prices.

The government has set a Minimum Export Price (MEP) of USD 800 per metric tonne and has enhanced buffer procurement, with over 5.06 lakh tonnes of onions already procured.

To make onions affordable and readily available to consumers, the Department of Consumer Affairs has



started the retail sale of onions through various outlets and mobile vans, according to the press release.

The National Cooperative Consumers' Federation (NCCF), the National Agricultural Cooperative Marketing Federation of India Ltd. (NAFED), Kendriya Bhandar, and other state-controlled cooperatives are involved in this initiative.

These organisations are selling onions at a subsidised price of Rs

25 per kilogramme. As of November 2, NAFED has established 329 retail points across 21 states, including stationary outlets and

mobile vans. Similarly,

NCCF has set up 457

retail points in 20 states, read the press release. Kendriya Bhandar has initiated retail supply in Delhi-NCR, starting on November 3 and Safal Mother Dairy is set to begin this weekend. In southern states, the Hyderabad Agricultural to consumers. The government main-

tains an onion buffer to manage price fluctuations between rabi and kharif crops. This year, the buffer size has been increased to 7 lakh metric tonnes from 2.5 lakh metric tonnes in the previous year, read the press release.

The procurement of onions is ongoing, with 5.06 lakh metric tons already procured.

The proactive measures have started to show results, as onion prices in the Maharashtra's Lasalgaon market have declined by 24 per cent from Rs 4,800 per quintal on October 28 to Rs 3,650 per quintal on November 3.

BRIDGE GAP

ndividualism, at first, saps the virtues of public life; but in the long run it attacks and destroys all others and is at length absorbed in downright selfishness."

With the nuclear family concept gaining ground, the traditional hierarchy within the family has broken down. Elders feel like intruders in the home of their own children, people are silently witnessing violence to family life, its health; it is tearing apart the fabric of family as an institution. These distortions may be construed to be causes and consequences of the generation gap that is becoming more and more pointed and pronounced with each passing day.

Teenagers and the youth are increasingly seen to be beyond control and a world unto themselves. More and more of elders their numbers going up rapidly are finding themselves lonely and unable to adjust to the ways of a fast-changing, increasingly busy and self-centered world.

The phenomenon 'generation gap' apparently delineates two sets of different persons having distinct physical and mental make-up, but in reality it is much more than meets the eye. Essentially, it is a difference in attitude or lack of understanding between young people and older people.

No society, group or family set-up is free from the tensions and traumas born out of the generation-gap, where on one end of the spectrum stands the balding or graying head of the family and on the other the defiant and disobedient youth ready to break all barriers so that he or she can assert his/her point of view to the extent of being a 'rebel'. Like the two banks of a river or the cultural contours of the East and the West, the twain fails to meet even halfway.

No doubt, society's values and belief structures rise and fall with changing times. In the modern world mankind has turned inwards to serve the self and worship individuality. There is almost a world-wide trend towards weakening of community and family ties. Human relationship is becoming narrower, confined largely to the nuclear family.

But even within this small unit there is an increasing crisis in the relationship c husband and wife, in the relationship between parents and children.

The problem, though touching and taunting may not defy a solution if both the youth and the age sit together with open minds and come to terms with realities. In a situation where the youth is active and aspiring, the onus lies on it to show reasonable restraint and respect to the elders who claim to have seen better days and behaved differently with their seniors or blood relations.

The older persons, on their part, should give up living in a world of illusions and self-delusion and address themselves to the changed milieu, where their role is passive.

No two generations are alike in their perceptions and preferences. If the younger one is aggressive and assertive, the elder one too is not very polite and pliant. Blaming the new generation for everything that has gone wrong in the society is like showing a red rag to the bull. The generation gap has been the rigorous reality of life since ages.

In the dying years of the present century, the hiatus between the two seems to have become more pronounced and painful because the younger generation is moved and motivated more by career considerations or calculation than by care, concern and compassion for their elders.

In the absence of 'a cause' for which they and their elders may stand and share one platform, crass commercial consciousness has widened the chasm between the two, leaving behind a trail of bitterness, complaints and grudges against each other.

Since each new generation becomes out of tune and touch with the upcoming one, it is in the fitness of things that the youth of today exhibit understanding and adjustment with the older generation now, so that it does not suffer the burden of 'guilt conscience' in its graying or balding period of life.

To foil wider conflict, Israel must stop sacking of Gaza

s the adage goes, one man's terrorist is another man's freedom fighter! What is the definition of terrorism? Where does a fight for freedom end and terrorism start? Is it legitimate to resist occupation by violent means? Does a "root causes" argument justify the wanton slaughter of innocent men, women and children and taking scores hostage?

Is a disproportionately asymmetric conventional response to an outrage perpetrated by semi-state actors warranted? Is the Hamas militia comprising terrorists or freedom fighters? Is the doctrine of "collective punishment" being perpetrated by Israel in Gaza justifiable by any interpretation of the jurisprudence of modern warfare? Does it or does it not constitute an egregious use of overwhelming superior technological and military power against hapless civilians and, therefore, qualify as a war crime in terms of Article Eight of the Rome Statute of the **International Criminal Court?**

These, and many other ticking definitional time bombs, have been reignited by the unfolding situation between Israel and the Hamas that controls the Gaza Strip.

Why did the Hamas do what it did on October the 7th, 2023? After all, they were fully aware that the Israeli response would be overwhelmingly disproportionate. Who made the cold hard cost-benefit calculation and why that notwithstanding what Israel and its principal ally, the United States, would unleash the benefit would be worth the cost, notwithstanding the horrific price the people of Gaza strip would have to pay?

The answer to this conundrum is provided by none other than Prince Mohammed Bin Salman of Saudi Arabia who, in an interview to Fox News on Sep-

tember 20, 2023, admitted that Saudi Arabia and Israel were exploring a modus vivendi midwifed by the United States that could enable a broader reconciliation in the Middle East. He said, "We got to see where we go. We hope that will reach a place that will ease the life of the Palestinians and get Israel as a player in the Middle East."

For the Palestinians who really do not repose much trust in their fellow Arabs and their internecine machinations that now stretch back over seven decades, this must have been the proverbial red rag. For if a two-state solution has not seen the light of the day seven decades of down the line, it is not only because of Israel's intransigence but equally because the diffidence of the Arab neighbours of the proposed Palestinian state.

If Saudi Arabia, the keeper of the holiest shrines of Islam, was willing to a deal with the Zionists on the back of the now formalised reconciliation efforts in the Greater Middle East, initiated by the Abraham Accords between Israel, on one hand, and the United Arab Emirates, Bahrain, Morocco and Sudan, on the other, and also the parallel process brokered by China between Saudi Arabia and Iran, then effectively the aspiration of a Palestinian homeland would be as good as dead.

The dispute between Israel and Palestine is a conflict rooted in two differing ideas of nationalism: Zionism and Arab nationalism — the expression of national identity and culture through nationhood.

These dynamics influenced the inaugural Zionist Congress in 1897, designating Palestine as the Jewish national home. Simultaneously, in the Levant, Arab intellectuals inspired by Western technological progress and disillusioned by the crumbling Ottoman Empire, established Al-Fatat (the Young Arab Society) to promote a new Arab nation

The British disaster at Gallipoli during the First World War intensified British desperation, leading to the Balfour Declaration on November 2, 1917, which pledged "the establishment in Palestine of a National Home for the Jewish People".

This declaration contradicted the May 16, 1916, Sykes-Picot Agreement, which divided Arab territories between Britain and France, with Palestine falling to Britain. Ironically, this agreement, contradicted the 1915 McMahon-Hussein Correspondence, where the British promised the Arab peninsula, including Palestine, to Sharif Hussein bin Ali of Mecca in exchange for his revolt against the Ottomans. Thus, in the most insidious spectacle of chicanery, the British promised the land of a third country to three different entities.

Post the First World War, the British and French partitioned the Middle East, with the British administering Palestine. The division of institutions for Christians, Muslims and Jews polarised society enabling the British to use their notorious divide-and-rule tactics.

This polarisation ignited Palestinian national identity leading to resistance against British rule that the British suppressed with Jewish militias. At the same time, millions of Jews surviving the horrors of the Holocaust migrated to Israel. Their persecution created a greater support for Zionism and a separate Jewish state. Recognising the hot potato that the Palestine-Zionist conundrum had become, Britain handed the Palestine issue to the United Nations. On November 29, 1947, the UN General Assembly adopted Resolution 181(II), advocating a two-state solution for Palestine. This was strongly opposed by Arab states, culminating in the First Arab-Israeli War of 1948.

The Six-Day War of 1967, and the Yom Kippur War of 1973, expanded Israeli territory and

deepened Palestinian displacement. The Oslo Accords in the 1990s aimed at a two-state solution but was set back by the assassination of Israeli Prime Minister Yitzhak Rabin and the death of President Yasser Arafat. The Second Intifada, beginning in 2000, brought violence and suffering to both sides. In 2005, Israel unilaterally withdrew from Gaza; however, the Palestinians elected Hamas, causing a paranoid Israel to construct settlements in the West Bank.

Hyper-nationalism leads to unnecessary conflicts. The current Israeli government represents an extreme form of Zionism, while Hamas embodies a radical perspective of Palestinian nationalism and anti-Semitism.

It, therefore, begs a question: Can there be any equivalence between Hamas depredations and Israel's retaliation? The answer is an unqualified no. The Israelis are acting out of anger at themselves over their colossal intelligence failure and making the hapless men, women and children the cannon fodder of their wrath. This challenges the basic percepts of humanity and its civilisational ethos.

If the conflict widens, it will engulf the entire Middle East and make the United States' position in the Islamic world untenable, given that it has military bases/military presence in Bahrain, Djibouti, Egypt, Iraq, Jordan, Kuwait, Oman, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Turkey, UAE and security arrangements with a host of other countries in GCC and the wider Middle East. All of whom without exception today stand with the Hamas irrespective of the fact that they may be gnashing at the teeth to have been put in such a situation. The Hamas has succeeded in squarely putting the Palestinian Question front and centre on the Middle Eastern Table.



Women soldiers, sailors, air warriors to get maternity, childcare leave benefits on par with officers in Armed Forces

At present, women officers get maternity leave of 180 days with full pay for each child, subject to a maximum of two children



NEW DELHI, Nov 5 (Agencies): Defence Minister Rajnath Singh has approved a proposal to grant maternity, child care and child adoption leave to women soldiers, sailors and air warriors on par with their officer counterparts.

The Defence Ministry on Sunday said the decision is in line with Singh's vision of "inclusive participation" of all women in the Armed Forces, irrespective of their ranks.

It said the measure is going to improve the work conditions for women in the military as it will help them balance their professional and family lives in a better manner.

"Defence Minister Rajnath Singh has approved a proposal for extension of the rules for maternity, child care and child adoption leave for women soldiers, sailors and air warriors in the armed forces at par with their officer counterparts," it said.

"With the issuing of the rules, the grant of such leave to all women in the military, whether one is an officer or any other rank, will be equally

applicable," the ministry

added.

At present, the women officers get maternity leave of 180 days with full pay for each child, subject to a maximum of two children. Childcare leave of 360 days is granted in total service career (subject to the child being less than 18 years of age) to women officers, according to officials.

Child adoption leave of 180 days is granted after the date of the valid adoption of a child below one year of age, they said.

"The extension of leave rules will go a long way in dealing with women-specific family and social issues relevant to the armed forces," the ministry said in a statement.

"This measure is going to improve the work conditions of women in the military and aid them to balance the spheres of professional and family life in a better manner,' it said.

The ministry said in line with the Narendra Modi Government's commitment towards utilising "Nari Shakti" (women power), the Three Services have spearheaded a paradigm shift with the inclusion of women as soldiers, sailors and air warriors.

"With the recruitment of women Agniveers, the armed forces will be empowered with the bravery, dedication and patriotism of women soldiers, sailors and air warriors to defend the land, sea and air frontiers of the country," it

"From being operationally deployed in Siachen, the highest battlefield in the world, to being posted on warships as well as dominating the skies, Indian women are now breaking barriers in almost every field in the armed forces," the ministry said.

"In 2019, a significant milestone was also achieved through recruitment of women in the Indian Army as soldiers in the Corps of Military Police," it added.

Singh has always been of the view that women should be on par with their male counterparts in every field.

BRS MLC Kavitha's Bharat Jagruti to take up legal battle for quick implementation of women's reservation legislation

HYDERABAD, Nov 5 (Agencies): Ruling BRS MLC in Telangana K Kavitha on Sunday said the Bharat Jagruti, a cultural organisation led by her, is discussing with legal experts on taking up a legal battle for the quick implementation of women's reservation legislation.

As per the advice of legal experts, Bharat Jagruti would implead itself in the petitions pending in the Supreme Court on the matter, she said, according to a release from her office.

Khalistani Terrorist Threatens To Blow Up **Air India Flight On Nov 19**

NEW DELHI, Nov 5 (Agencies): Designated terrorist Gurpatwant Singh Pannun, the founder of the banned Sikhs for Justice (SFJ), has released a new video asking Sikhs not to fly in Air India aircraft after November 19, as their lives can be under threat.

He claimed that Air India would not be allowed to operate on November 19.

Pannun claimed that Delhi's Indira Gandhi International (IGI) Airport would remain shut on November 19 and that its name would be changed. He highlighted that this is the same day on which the final match of the ongoing Cricket World Cup will take place.

This is not the first time that SFJ chief Pannun



has issued a threat. In September, he urged Hindu-Canadians to leave Canada amid a diplomatic row between India and Canada over the killing of Khalistani terrorist Hardeep Singh Nijjar.

social media, said pro-Khalistan Sikhs have consistently shown loyalty to Canada. He then went on to threaten Indo-Canadian Hindus, urging them to leave the

Lawyers asked the Canadian Immigration Minister to ban Pannun's entry into Canadian territory.

Hindu Forum Canada's Lawyer wrote to the Minister of Immigration of Canada, Mark Miller, stating that Pannun's recent comments have caused distress and trauma not only within the Hindu community but also among Canadian citizens at large.

Hindu Forum Canada is a not-for-profit humanitarian organization based in Ontario that advocates for policies that enhance the wellbeing of minority groups in Canada.

Earlier in September, Khalistani secessionists held a so-called 'Referendum' in Surrev. British Columbia. Designated terrorist Gurpatwant Singh Pannun, the founder of the banned Sikhs for Justice (SFJ), was present at the gathering of the Khalistani separatists held at the Guru Nanak Singh Gurudwara in Surrey, Vancouver.

Notably, the ties between India and Canada have been strained after Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau alleged the involvement of "agents of the Indian government" in the killing of Nijjar in June.

GAZA/AMMAN, Nov 5 (Agencies): Palestinian news agency WAFA said the Israeli military attacked a Gaza refugee camp on Saturday, killing 51 people, mostly women and children, as calls for a ceasefire by the Arab world were rejected by the United States and Israel.

With the death toll in Gaza mounting, pro-Palestinian demonstrators staged protests in cities around the world on Saturday, calling for an end to the nearly month-old war.

WAFA said the Maghazi refugee camp in the central Gaza Strip had been hit by an Israeli bombardment on Saturday

Agency could not independently verify the WAFA report.

The Israeli military did not immediately respond to a request for comment. Israel says it is targeting Hamas, not civilians, and that the militant group is using residents as human shields.

A spokesperson for the Hamas-run health ministry in Gaza, Ashraf al-Qidra, said a large number of people were killed in the attack, without giving a figure, and scores severely injured were taken to hospital.

Gaza health officials said on Saturday more than 9,488 Palestinians have been killed in the war, which began when Hamas fighters launched a surprise attack on southern Israel on October 7, killing 1,400 people and taking more than 240 others hostage.

Foreign ministers from Qatar, Saudi, Egypt, Jordan and the United Arab Emirates met US Secretary of State Antony Blinken in Amman on Saturday and pushed for Washington to

This year had already been the deadliest for West Bank residents in at least 15 years, with some 200 Palestinians and 26 Israelis killed, according to U.N. data. Since the war in Gaza began, 121 West Bank Palestinians have been killed.

Daily attacks by Israeli settlers have more than doubled, U.N. figures show, even though most of the deaths have occurred during clashes with Israeli sol-

ENCIRCLING GAZA CITY

Israel last month ordered all civilians to leave the northern part of the Gaza Strip, including Gaza City, and head to the south of the enclave.

The Israeli military has since encircled Gaza's biggest city and is engaging in fierce street fighting with Hamas militants.

US special envoy David Satterfield said in Amman on Saturday that between 800,000 and a million people had moved to the south of the Gaza Strip, while 350,000 to 400,000 remained in and around Gaza City.

Gaza's living conditions, already dire before the fighting, have deteriorated further. Food is scarce, residents have resorted to drinking salty water and

medical services are collapsing. The UN humanitarian office OCHA estimates that nearly 1.5 million of Gaza's 2.3 million people are internally displaced.

Thousands spend night under open sky in Nepal after earthquake kills 157 people, damages their houses

People use plastic sheets and old clothes to keep them warm



KATHMANDU, Nov 5 (Agencies): Thousands of people in western Nepal's mountainous region were forced to spend Saturday night under the open sky in the biting cold after a strong earthquake in the area killed 157 people and left a trail of destruction.

Bhawana Pun, who woke up on Friday midnight after her house was shaken by the 6.4 magnitude earthquake in the Nalgad Municipality of Jajarkot district, recalls the terror due to which she could not sleep on Saturday night too.

The whole night she witnessed the vehicular movement on the road and the snoring of her neighbours who were sleeping in the open near her house.

She had no courage to go inside the cracked house as aftershocks were occurring time and

"The houses have been severely damaged. Thus, people are sitting outside of their houses," said a local resident from Jajarkot, the epicentre of the earthquake, the most devastating in the country since 2015.

Jajarkot, about 500km northwest of Kathmandu, and Rukum districts of western Nepal were worst affected by the quake. About 253 people were injured.

Around 159 aftershocks were recorded on Saturday, Nepal's National Earthquake Monitoring and Research Centre said.

The Ministry of Home Affairs has dispatched initial relief supplies via the Army's helicopters.

Prime Minister Pushpa Kamal Dahal 'Prachanda' on Saturday toured the quake-hit region with a medical team.

During the visit, he gathered information about the extent of the damage and inspected the affected areas. Later, he returned to Surkhet from Jajarkot, along with seven injured people and their family members.

The Nepal government has said it is not in a hurry to seek foreign help for search and rescue operations, and in the management of relief distribution and other logistics in the wake of the devastating earthquake.

"We are yet to make any decision on accepting foreign aid." Prachanda said during the visit.

Speaking to the Kathmandu Post newspaper, a government secretary said the country is capable of dealing with the aftermath of the disas-

"We have enough stock of logistical materials that we received during the Covid pandemic. We have trained personnel and enough supplies for relief and rehabilitation," the secretary said.

A Cabinet meeting, chaired by Prime Minister Prachanda on Sunday, is expected to decide on a special relief package for the victims of the quake.

The government on Saturday decided to provide Rs. 50 million each to Jajarkot and Rukum West districts for immediate relief to the victims.

The disaster management committee will also meet on Sunday after the Cabinet meeting.

State security agencies, in coordination with local government and humanitarian organisations, have mobilised teams for search and rescue operations following the earthquake.

Close to 4,000 personnel from the Nepal Army, the Armed Police Force, and the Nepal Police have been deployed in parts of Jajarkot and Rukum districts for rescue operations. Dozens of volunteers from the Nepal Red Cross Society and other organisations have been mobilised.

According to Nepal Army spokesperson Brigadier General Krishna Bhandari, personnel from three battalions, including medical and aviation teams, have been sent to the two districts hit hardest by the earthquake.

A battalion has anywhere between 800 to 1,000 personnel. Many of the soldiers mobilised are trained to search collapsed structures for people and provide quick responses.

"We primarily focused on search and rescue operations on day one. As the first 72 hours are considered the golden period, we will prioritise search and rescue for a few more days," Nepal Army spokesperson said. "However, relief distribution too will go hand in hand from now onward." The Army is using five aircraft, including a Sky Truck, to ferry rescue and medical teams to affected areas while also airlifting the injured and deceased.

Deputy Inspector General Kuber Kadayat, also the Nepal Police spokesperson, said hundreds of people have been affected by the disaster. However, as they were more focused on search and rescue, details of the affected are yet to be ascertained.

"We will start collecting data on the affected and the number of the houses damaged or destroyed once the search and rescue phase is over," he told the paper.

Because the earthquake destroyed bridges and triggered landslides in places, rescue teams found it difficult to reach the affected areas

Earthquakes are common in Nepal, which is situated on the ridge where the Tibetan and Indian tectonic plates meet and advance two meters closer to one another every century which results in pressure which is released in the form of earthquakes.

SHANGHAI, Nov 5 (Agencies): Australia's Prime Minister Anthony Albanese, starting the first visit to China by a leader of his country in seven years, said on Sunday it was "in all our interests" to have a bilateral relationship with dialogue and cooperation.

Australia will continue to work constructively with China, he said in a short speech at the annual China International Import Expo in Shanghai, which was opened by Premier Li Qiang.

Albanese is the first Australian leader to visit China since 2016, part of an effort to patch up relations that had deteriorated over several years due to disputes over Chinese telecoms firm Huawei, espionage and COVID-19.

Cooperation During "Positive" China Visit

In the speech, Albanese described the relationship between the two countries as "mature" and said it was "energised by the complementary nature of our economies".

"Along with the other economies in our region, Australia and China have prospered thanks to the certainty and stability that is made possible by rules-based trade," Albanese said, according to an official transcript.

Albanese's government has worked to stabilise ties with China since coming to office last year, and China has lifted most trade blocks imposed in

a 2020 diplomatic dispute that cost A\$20 billion in commodity and food exports.

"We continue to highly value the World Trade Organisation, whose role as an independent and respected umpire benefits us all," Albanese said, without directly mentioning any dis-

Albanese, on Monday, will meet President Xi Jinping in Beijing, where the prime minister has said he will raise concerns over rising tensions in the South China Sea.

On arriving in Shanghai late on Saturday, Albanese said it was in Australia's interests to have a positive and constructive dialogue with its major trading



Albanese said on Saturday, before leaving for China, that the much-anticipated visit to meet with Xi and Li marked a "very positive step" in stabilising strained bilateral ties.

Netanyahu fights for political survival to beat of war drums

JERUSALEM, Nov 5 (Agencies): Israelis, deeply divided since Benjamin Netanyahu returned to power last year, have united against Hamas in war, but experts predict the veteran leader will be fighting for his survival when the conflict ends.

In the shock that gripped Israel after Hamas's October 7 attacks, the country has closed ranks behind the military operation that the 74-year-old ordered to "crush" the Palestinian mili-

But according to experts, security lapses exposed by marauding Hamas gunmen could become the biggest -- and possibly fatal -- blow to Israel's longest-serving prime minister, already battling legal and political trou-

"Support for Netanyahu and his coalition was draining even before October 7, and since the outbreak of war it has fallen much further," said Toby Greene, a politics lecturer at Israel's Bar-Ilan University and researcher at the London School of Eco-

"If an election were held now he would lose badly." Beloved as "King Bibi" and "Mr Security" by his supporters and condemned as the "crime minister" by critics and protesters, Netanyahu has long dominated Israeli politics.

But the latest opinion polls suggest a drop off in support for the tough-talking Netanyahu and his right-wing Likud

Many are bitter over the lack of protection, especially Israelis living in communities near the Gaza border that bore the brunt of the attacks that Israeli officials say killed 1,400 people, mostly civil-

Under Netanyahu, a former commando unit officer who has always projected himself as a resolute defender of Jews, the sense of security shared by most Israelis has been shattered.



'Every decision'

While military and intelligence agencies have acknowledged security failures, Netanyahu has not accepted any blame for Hamas's surprise attack.

Netanyahu's allies have stayed quiet about his role, and some rivals have joined his war cabinet, defending the Israeli bombing campaign that the Hamas-run health ministry says has killed nearly 9,500 people in

the besieged Gaza Strip. Reuven Hazan, a political science professor at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem, called Netanyahu a "brilliant" politician now playing for time.

"He already knows that he is fighting for his survival and every decision he takes in this war is geared to ensuring his survival."

When asked if he would consider quitting, Netanyahu recently told a news conference: "The only thing I intend to have resigned is Hamas." But Netanyahu, whose first term in office dates back to 1996, has been forced onto the defensive.

The leader of Israel's most right-wing government in history admitted he would have to give "answers" about the attacks, but only after the war is over.

And he has apologised for a since deleted social media comment accusing the intelligence services of failing to warn him of the Hamas

To get the wily Netanyahu out of office, he will have to resign or lose the parliamentary majority held by the coalition of his party with far-right and ultra-orthodox Jewish parties.

Leading tech tycoon Amnon Shashua has said the Netanvahu administration must be "immediately" ousted over its "failures, dissonance and incompetence".

'Damaged' leader Pressure on Netanyahu had been building before the

attacks, and experts say a showdown is just a question of time.

The premier, who has led Israel for nearly 16 of the past 27 years, is still fighting three corruption cases in

The nine months leading up to October 7 saw mass protests over his hardline government's divisive judicial overhaul that opponents called a threat to Israeli democracy.

Israel had been "ripping itself apart" before Hamas's attacks, said Hazan.

But "there is no politics now because of the war", he added.

"At some point politics will come back. Then there will be questions, and then the protests will come back."

When the war ends, the government is likely to order a commission of inquiry -either a governmental one with relatively little power, or a more independent national

commission. If Netanyahu is found to be at fault over the attacks, his political problem could become critical The government has

warned the war will take months and Netanyahu is not obliged to call an election for three years, but observers struggle to see him lasting that long. "Everybody knows that he

is damaged," according to Hazan, who said there were "signs" that coalition members "know that the game is Polls indicate Israelis' pre-

ferred candidate was now centrist leader Benny Gantz, a minister without portfolio in the war cabinet who was in the opposition before the war erupted.

"Netanyahu's legacy has been shattered by both the division he has sown through the judicial overhaul and the multiple failures that enabled the October 7 attack," said Greene.

"Many Israelis consider these two issues to be linked.

The government procured tomatoes from producing states and provided them to consumers at highly subsidised rates, significantly reducing retail prices, read the

In addition to onions, the government has also taken steps to ensure the affordability and availability of pulses through the "Bharat Dal" initiative, offering subsidised prices of Rs 60 per kilogramme for 1 kg packs and Rs 55 per kilogramme for 30 kg packs. Bharat Dal is available for retail sale and for supply to the military, paramilitary forces, and welfare schemes through various cooperative organisations.

To date, 3.2 lakh metric tonnes of Chana stock have been allocated for conversion, with a substantial portion being milled and distributed through 3,010 retail points across 282 cities.

The government plans to make over 4 lakh tonnes of Bharat Dal available to consumers nationwide in the near future.

J&K police introduces GPS tracker anklet to track movement of terror-accused on bail

already in use in Western countries such as the USA, United Kingdom, South Africa, Australia and New Zealand where it is used to track the movement of accused persons on bail, parole and house arrest and accordingly de-congest prisons to a

It said that the accused Ghulam Mohd Bhat is undergoing trial for being associated with different terrorist organisations and being involved in terror financing at the behest of the proscribed terrorist organisation Hizbul Mujahideen.

The accused was arrested after police had registered a First Information Report under sections 17, 18, 21, 24, and 40 of UAPA at Udhmapur police station.

"He was arrested while attempting to transport proceeds of terrorism to the tune of Rs 2.5 lakhs at the behest of Hizbul Mujahideen," it said.

The police statement said that during the pendency of the bail hearing, the accused sought to be released on interim bail.

It is pertinent to note that the accused Bhat was also convicted by NIA Court Patiala House Delhi in another case for being associated with a terrorist organisation and for conspiracy for a terrorist act.

J&K police is the pioneering police department in the country to provide affixing of GPS tracker anklets to persons seeking bail, it added.

As palm oil, sugar prices ease, biscuits and cakes become cheaper

After being forced to raise prices by 20-23%, Britannia has started implementing price cuts as some commodities prices have started declining.

NEW DELHI, Nov 5 (Agencies): Now satisfy your daily cravings without burning a hole in your pocket: Just keep in mind the calories. Thanks to cooling down inflation, major FMCG player Britannia is seeing price cuts in its commodities.

Over the last one year, consumers have been hit hard by rising prices of daily packaged goods such as biscuits, cakes, beverages etc.. But relief is on the horizon.

"The cumulative price increase in the inflationary environment was about 20 to 23%. And from there, it is reduced by one and a half to two percent," said N Venkat Raman, the Chief Commercial Officer of India's largest biscuit-maker Britannia said this week on a call to discuss the company's second-quarter results.

What Raman is referring to is the relentless rise in prices of packaged consumer goods, including home care and personal care items, seen in the market over the last year.

Companies such as Britannia Industries, Hindustan Unilever Ltd and ITC were forced to jack up prices as prices of key commodities — such as flour, milk, vegetable oil, sugar and crude oil — started rising sharply from around mid-2022.

While these companies held off on price increases of their finished products for some time, eventually, they had to throw in the towel and pass on the higher prices to consumers in the form of price hikes of the finished products — to the extent of 20-30%.

For example, the company said prices of key raw materials — palm oil, sugar, and packaging materials — continued to ease during the three months ended September. Palm oil prices, for example, fell 7% during the quarter, while sugar prices corrected 1%.

However, on the negative side, the price of flour — a key ingredient in biscuits and cakes — rose 5% compared to the preceding quarter.

Rising Competition

One of the problems faced by big companies like Britannia when raw material prices start declining is increased competition from informal players — such as local bakeries.

"On the regional players, I think, we, I would not say that for the full quarter, this has been a big issue," said the management "But yes, for the first, let us say, month, month and a half, this was something that was an issue. So, we did take some pricing actions. And we will continue to be vigilant on that."

we've got to make sure that we keep that within that band of 20 per cent," said Varun Berry, Vice-Chairman and Managing Director.

Hard lessons

Because of the price cuts, Britannia has seen a flattish revenue growth of just 1% in the last year. But, at the same time, operating profits grew by 21% in the latest quarter due to lower input costs and a slew of costcutting measures put in place over the last one year to protect the margins.

"We have had more than Rs 2,000 crores of cost reduction during this period and that continues to be a pillar for us even in the future," said Berry. "Cost efficiencies have been a very strong pillar for our profit growth," he added.

Meanwhile, the company continues to remain cautious on commodity prices as the downtrend has not been uniform across all commodities.

For example, flour and sugar which constitute a large component of its raw material have been witnessing an increase in price for a period of time. At the same time, a low palm oil price, however, is giving a little breathing place for the company.

"I think it is important that we watch out for commodities as we go forward because things could escalate. And hence, we are being very, very vigilant on making sure that we keep these costs under control," said Berry.

"We will make sure that we take measured pricing corrections wherever necessary if the commodity situation remains positive," he added.

October rings in new hope for India's auto industry Suzuki with 1.72 lal



NEW DELHI, Nov 5 (Agencies): India's automobile industry vroomed back into life in October with both four-wheelers and two-wheelers doing exceptionally well.

Broker ShareKhan said much of the growth can be attributed to inventory replenishment ahead of the festival season.

Two-wheeler sales rose 11.9% in October compared to the previous month, while cars, vans and SUVs reported a 9.2% increase, according to numbers compiled by Sharekhan. The tractor segment, meanwhile, saw a 17.7% jump.

The numbers showed that the recent momentum seen in premium vehicles continue to be intact, even the mass segment seems to be seeing some movement this festive season, going by sales trends. However, noted Sharekhan, the volume of commercial vehicles, such as pick-up trucks

and lorries, has declined 5.7% on a month-on-month basis during September, which was deemed to be a strong

month in terms of sales. Four-wheelers As has been the trend

in recent months, the 9.2% increase in the passenger vehicle secgment was fueled by strong demand in the utility vehicle segment. All the top players in this segment recorded favorable sales momentum, with Maruti Suzuki Ltd topping the charts.

In the passenger vehicle segment — comprising cars, vans and SUVs — Maruti Suzuki reported the strongest growth at 10.8%, followed by Tata Motors at 6.7% and Mahindra & Mahindra at 5.9%. The superlative performance of Maruti Suzuki was ascribed to the company's increasing focus on SUVs.

Maruti Suzuki broke the company's all-time record by selling 1.99 lakh units. Excluding exports too, it was a record month for Maruti Suzuki with 1.72 lakh units sold in the country.
Two-wheelers

When it comes to the two-wheeler segment, the performance was mainly driven by domestic sales while exports took a back seat.

Bajaj Auto Ltd saw the best performance with a 24.5% jump in sales, followed by TVS Motor Co with 8.7% and Royal Enfield with 7.5% and Honda Motorcycles and Scooters at 7.2%.

In terms of market share, Hero Motocorp was at the top with 5.75 lakh units sold in October, followed by Bajaj Auto with 4.71 lakhs, TVS Motor with 4.35 lakh.

Sharekhan said the 11.9% month-on-month jump in two-wheeler volumes was faster than the 7.2% increase it had penciled in, despite subdued exports.

"OEMs and dealers are indicating a double-digit kind of growth during the ongoing festive season and observing an improvement in demand for entry-level products also," it said, adding that entry-level and rural demand does tend to pick up pace during the festive period.

"..however, the sustainability of demand from the rural segment is critical. Currently, most players are playing the premiumisation trend in the domestic market and enhancing their product portfolio according to customer preferences," it noted.

Panchkula-based company gives cars to employees as Diwali gift

CHANDIGARH, Nov 5 (Agencies): A pharmaceutical company in Haryana's Panchkula said it has gifted 12 cars to its employees and plans to give similar rewards to 38 others for their "hard work and loyalty" during this Diwali.

In a statement, Mits Healthcare Private Limited said it has given cars to its employees as a Diwali gift.

The company's director M K Bhatia, who referred to his employees as "celebrities", presented the cars to 12 "star performers".

The company also



plans to give cars to 38 more employees in the near future, it said.

Reliance to acquire Arvind Fashions' Sephora retail division

NEW DELHI, Nov 5 (Agencies): A subsidiary of Reliance Retail Ventures Limited (RRVL) is set to acquire Arvind Fashions' beauty brands division, Arvind Beauty Brands Retail Limited, which currently markets products from the renowned LVMHowned beauty chain, Sephora.

This strategic deal, valued at just over Rs 99 crore, is expected to further enhance Reliance's portfolio of international brands.

This acquisition follows earlier reports in local media suggesting that



Sephora and Reliance Retail had terminated discussions regarding a potential retail partnership in the Indian market. Reliance Retail, in response, launched its own beauty retail platform, Tira, in April, positioning itself to compete with established players like Nykaa and the Tata Group.

The agreement has been finalised at an enterprise value of Rs 216 crore rupees, according to a regulatory filing by Arvind Fashions.
Following the

announcement, Arvind Fashions' shares experienced a notable surge of 11.5 per cent per cent, and were trading over 5 per cent just before market closing.

The beauty division, which includes Sephora products, contributed a revenue of Rs 337 crore during fiscal year 2023, representing approximately 7.6 per cent of Arvind Fashion's total revenue.

RRVL also released a press release confirming the development, saying

that as part of the partnership with Sephora, its subsidiary Reliance Beauty & Personal Care Limited will take over the current India operations of Sephora's 26 stores across 13 cities from Arvind Fashions Limited.

During this period of transition, the stores and website will be operating business as usual. Reliance Beauty & Personal Care Limited operates the beauty business for RRVL and this partnership will boost its portfolio of offerings, the statement added.



Test of Character: Unbeaten India face formidable South Africa in battle for top spot

A win and 16 points would confirm India's top spot with a match left against the Netherlands

KOLKATA, Nov 5 (Agencies): The top spot is at stake and an unconquered Indian team will certainly feel a sense of deja vu when it takes on a red-hot South Africa on Sunday in what will be a battle of equals in the World Cup.

It promises to be a fascinating contest and Virat Kohli and Ravichandran Ashwin can't escape that "been there in this position" feeling since they were part of the World Cup squad that had a similar run in 2011.

The only game that India had lost in the 2011 edition was against South Africa when an unheralded Robin Peterson had smashed Ashish Nehra for 19 runs after Indian batting imploded in Nagpur despite a hundred from Sachin Tendulkar.

Kohli, who is one short of record-equalling 49th ODI hundred, and Ashwin are the only players in the current squad who were part of India's title-winning run.

On Sunday, Rohit Sharma's players need to guard themselves from complacency and emulate the all-conquering Australian team of 2007 which won the World Cup without losing a single game.

A win and 16 points would confirm India's top spot with a match left against the Netherlands.

The die-hard Indian fans however won't mind law of averages catching up before the knockout stage and not feel the heat when it matters most.

South Africa's batting line-up, filled with power-hitters and game-changers will test India's 'pace galacticos' before the semi-finals

An unprecedented demand of tickets has added to the excitement to the Eden contest which in bigger picture will determine



the group toppers heading into the semi-finals.

SA's batting vs Indian pacers Consistently racking up those humongous scores, it has been a challenge bowling to South Africa in this World Cup.

They had notched the tournament's biggest score of 428/5 batting first against Sri Lanka in their opening match.

In all of their five matches they have batted first South Africa have posted 300-plus totals with their chief enforcer being De Kock who leads the runchart with 545 runs from seven matches.

Their only weakness has been chasing which was exposed by the minnows Netherlands who bundled them out for 207 inside 43 overs defending a modest 245.

The Proteas also made a mess of their 271-run chase against Pakistan before tailender Keshav Maharaj sealed an edgy one-wicket win.

India on the other hand have showed they can chase and defend well.

Chasing would be easy with dew around at the Eden but South Africa would be wary to bat second and would look to Shami 2.0: 'No rocket science' "Eat. Sleep. Take five-wicket haul. Repeat" -- reads a post from the ICC in praise of Indian pacer Mohammed Shami's second five-for in three matches in this World Cup.

Call it a twist of fate but Shami has made the biggest difference to this Indian team following premier all-rounder Hardik Pandya's ankle injury that ruled him out of the World Cup.

It forced a twin change with Suryakumar Yadav and Shami brought in place of Pandya and Shardul Thakur for the New Zealand match.

Since then, Shami has been on a roll taking 14 wickets in three matches at an average of 6.71

Shami calls it 'no rocket science' but the way he has consistently hit Test match lengths and get those late movements, has made India's three-pronged pace attack the most lethal, something that was evident when they skittled out Sri Lanka for 55 en route to securing a record 302-run win.

While Jasprit Bumrah has added a menacing slower yorker to his repertoire, Moham-

med Siraj has given him a perfect support with the new ball.

They have taken 10 wickets -- five each -- in the powerplay as India have been most economical of the 10 teams in this crucial phase.

Half of the battle will be won if the duo manages to give early breakthroughs by sending back in-form De Kock and Rassie van der Dussen, who have six centuries between them in this World Cup.

Another interesting battle will be the battle between Heinrich Klaasen, who is known for taking on the spin attack, and Kuldeep Yadav and Ravindra Jadeja.

'Batting might'

Having missed centuries against Australia (85), New Zealand (95), Sri Lanka (88), Kohli on his 35th birthday, would be eager to finally get that recordequalling 49th ODI hundred.

Rohit has a penchant to score daddy hundreds at his 'favourite' Eden Gardens and he too would be keen to be back among runs after getting out for 4 against Sri Lanka at his home ground.

Virat Kohli at 35: Journey to top started at Garden of Eden 14 summers ago

KOLKATA, Oct 5 (Agencies): The entire Mohun Bagan cricket team was on celebratory mode having just won the P. Sen Trophy at the Eden Gardens back in 2009, barring one individual.

From a distance, the architect of that crown was quietly sitting on a famous white coloured cane-chair, forever planted outside the Eden dressing room. He looked at the celebrations with utmost nonchalance.

Virat Kohli was all of 20, already an U-19 World Cup captain, touted as the next big thing in Indian cricket but a solitary half-century in five ODIs wasn't a reflection of what one was going to witness over the next decade.

As Kohli steps onto field on his 35th birthday, against South Africa in-front of a packed crowd on the same hallowed turf, there would be an over-riding feeling among the handful who had watched the genius in the making 14 summers ago.

In extreme heat and humidity, Kohli scored 184 off just 121 balls in that final match against Town Club. It was not even a decent club attack but in those challenging conditions, it was unbelievable domination from a future superstar.

"Bahot tough thaa. Lag raha tha skin phat raha hai (It was tough. The heat was unbearable)," Kohli told reporters that day apart from answering the customary questions on his possible comeback into the Indian side.

But that 'club class' hundred was the pre-cursor or trailer for the full length feature film released around six months later on Christmas eve when he scored his first of his 48 ODI hundreds -- 107 vs Sri Lanka at this very ground.

It was still a chubby-cheeked Kohli, not the chiselled-jaw world class athlete, who forged a beautiful partnership with Gautam Gambhir.

Post-match, Gambhir called up Kohli and handed his player of the match cheque to the young player as a mark of encouragement from a senior player.

Who knows the world record equalling 49th hundred might just happen at the same venue where it all started. There won't be 70,000 'Kohli masks' in the stands but when have "Viratians" (as his die-hard partisan fans identify themselves) needed to mask up. They have Kohli in their hearts and a prayer

on their lips for the 49th ton on what could be the best strip for batting thus far in the competition.

"He is not tensed about his 49th hundred. His job is to contribute to team's cause and he has done that. We still discuss about the game.

"For me, what stands out is his discipline, dedication and above all staying so rooted and humble in this journey," childhood coach and mentor Rajkumar Sharma told agency on the eve of his favourite student's birthday.

More than Guru-Shishya, Rajkumar-Kohli share a father-son bond. And now Kohli's elder brother Vikas and sister Bhawna's kids also train at the iconic West Delhi Academy in Paschim Vihar.

On Sunday, the coach has planned an intimate birthday celebration along with family members before getting on to watch his ward in action.

But before that Sharma does have another challenge: to deal with the requests of close to 50-odd Bangladeshi journalists, who all want to interview him on the 'Making of Virat', something he has spoken about a zillion times.

Life might come to a full circle for world cricket's most bankable megastar, a phenomenon big enough for a global body to market his name to get into the Olympics. He is Virat Kohli. He is everything. A precocious talent, wayward with rough edges, a fitness freak, a manic run-machine, a social media game-changer blessed with eloquence to match for, fiercely protective but an elegant public figure.

His persona has changed and one can see how free and charged up he has been after relinquishing his captaincy. On November 5 last year, Kohli was asked about his celebration plans and he had said that everything will happen after the T20 World Cup final in Melbourne

The CAB's plans to have a public birthday celebrations didn't get BCCI's nod. May be the legend himself wants to keep everything on hold till November 19. On that day, he won't mind Mohammed Siraj and Shubman Gill carrying him on their shoulders at Motera.

That will be the best and belated birthday gift for the man who has carried Indian team on his shoulders for more than a decade.

Australia knock defending champions England out of World Cup with 33-run win

England were dismissed for 253 in 48.1 overs by Australia, ending their slim hopes of making it to the semifinals

AHMEDABAD, Oct 5 (Agencies): Adam Zampa produced three timely strikes in the middle overs as Australia knocked out defending champions England out of the ODI World Cup with a 33-run win, their fifth consecutive victory.

Australian batters were guilty of not converting starts but still managed to post 286 against arch-rivals England. Marnus Labuschagne (71 off 83) recorded his highest score of the tournament.

England, whose formidable batting line-up has massively underperformed in their title defence, had a good opportunity to pick up a win after four consecutive losses.

Amid heavy dew, Ben Stokes (64 off 90) kept the chase alive while batting alongside Dawid Malan (50 off 64) and Moeen Ali (42 off 43) before Zampa landed the killer blows to stop England at 253 in 48.1 overs. Chris Woakes (32 off 33) tried his best towards the end but it wasn't enough.

Zampa first had outof-form England skipper Jos Buttler (1) caught in the deep before getting rid of Stokes in a soft dismissal. It was a short ball on the leg side and Stokes ended up offering a simple catch to Stoinis at short-fine leg. It was all over for Eng-



land when Moeen's slog sweep off Zampa arrived straight into the hands of David Warner at deep mid-wicket.

England batters including Stokes, Moeen and Dawid Malan did exhibit the stroke play they are known for but could not stay long enough to see their team through.

Left-arm pacer Mitchell Starc got the ball to swing in the powerplay. He got lucky in the first ball of the England innings as Jonny Bairstow got a faint edge to one swinging down the leg-side.

Joe Root was set up by Starc with a series of inswingers before he pushed one wide and the England number three got the outside edge. Australia's sharp fielding also contributed to their fifth win in a row.

Earlier, Labuschange, Steve Smith (44 off 52), Cameron Green (47 off 52) and Marcus Stoinis (35 off 32) were among the batters who failed to cash in on their starts. Leggie Adil Rashid (2/38) was frugal as usual while pacer Mark Wood (2/70) was back to his menacing ways, using the short ball to hurry the opposition batters, especially Green.

Chris Woakes (4/54) delivered with the new ball for the second game in a row, removing the dangerous opening duo of David Warner (15) and Travid Head (11). He also struck twice in the death overs.

England were able to get the early wickets after putting Australia in to bat. Head handed a regulation catch to Joe Root at first slip off an angled away ball from Woakes.

Three overs later, Warner mistimed a pull to give Woakes his second wicket, leaving Australia at 38 for two in the sixth over.

Smith and Labuschagne, who both have not had the best of times in the tournament, then shared a 75-run stand off 96 balls. It was hard work in the middle for

the seasoned batters who found the boundaries hard to come by.

Following Smith's fall, Josh Inglis (3) tried to up the scoring rate but fell while attempting a reverse sweep off Rashid.

Green, who looked uncomfortable against the short-pitched stuff from Wood, did hit some crisp boundaries off the other bowlers. His cover drive off Woakes was the highlight of his knock. He saw his leg stump uprooted after missing a slog sweep off left-arm pacer David Willey.

Stoinis then got into the action depositing Rashid and Liam Livingstone into the stands over deep mid-wicket before getting caught in the same spot off a short ball from the latter.

It seemed Australia would not able to use their full quota of overs but Adam Zampa's timely cameo of 29 from 19 balls took the team close to 300.

ICC World Cup: Pakistan pip New Zealand by 21 runs via DLS method to keep semis hopes alive

BENGALURU, Oct 5 (Agencies): Fakhar Zaman hit an extraordinary hundred and the weather gods too smiled on 'unpredictable' Pakistan, who miraculously kept their semifinal hopes alive after walking away with a crucial 21-run win over New Zealand through DLS method in World Cup.

Zaman (126 off 81 balls) and skipper Babar Azam (66 off 63 balls) helped Pakistan to 200 for 1 in 25.3 overs when the skies opened up for the second time to end the proceedings.

At that point Pakistan were 21 runs ahead of the DLS calculations in a daunting chase of 402 which was revised to 342 in 41 overs.

New Zealand will feel gutted after making a mammoth 401 for six, riding on Rachin Ravindra's 94-ball 108 and comeback man Kane Williamson's 79-ball 95.

Pakistan now have eight points with a match to go against struggling England, while New Zealand (NRR: +0.855), also on eight points, will face on-their-way-out Sri Lanka in their final league game.

Pakistan (-0.424), however, still remain at the sixth place on the table behind Afghanistan (-0.330) because of the net run rate.

Those calculations apart, those with a sense of history will trace these fateful happenings to Pakistan's campaign in the 1992 World Cup when weather and mathematics helped them first to the semifinals and then eventually to the title.

But for all that, Pakistan on this need to be indebted to the power



of Zaman, who carted the New Zealand bowlers around the park with utter disdain. The left-hander had

missed a large part of the tournament with an injury but Zaman produced a freak innings at the most opportune time to keep Pakistan in the race to the last four stage.

Zaman conjured his hundred in just 63 balls as he never gave a breathing space to the Kiwis bowlers – pacers or spinners.

His preferred scoring area was the arc between mid-wicket and long-on and the New Zealand bowlers kept on feeding to his strength. At the other end, Babar was a comparatively quieter presence but with Zaman in full flow he did not have to attempt anything colourful.

Earlier, Ravindra made a hundred with talent written in bold letters over it, while Williamson nearly made a century on comeback as New Zealand piled up a mammoth score.

Pakistan bowlers did not have enough variations to counter a smooth Chinnaswamy Stadium pitch as Ravindra and Williamson ran them ragged after the Kiwis were asked to bat first.

It was also only the second instance in this event that a team crossed the 400-run mark after South Africa did that against Sri Lanka in New Delhi.

The 180 runs that Ravindra, who registered his third century of the tournament, and Williamson made off 142 balls for the second wicket gave New Zealand a confident launching pad after defeats in their last three matches.

Williamson and Ravindra accelerated linearly for a large part of their alliance - well-taken singles and twos interspersed with those occasional hits to and over the ropes.

Williamson joined the action after a 68-run opening stand between Ravindra and Devon Conway, and the right-hand, left-hand combination gave a torrid time to Pakistan.

They were relentless but rather methodically. In fact, they scored only at 5.90 runs per over between 11th and 20th over before pressing the accelerator in the subsequent overs.

Even then their batting was all about class. Williamson's backfoot punch off pacer Haris Rauf that pierced the mid-off region carried all the oomph quotient with it and he did not spare spinners as well.

Pakistan gave the containment duty to offspinner Iftikhar Ahmed but Williamson greeted him with two fours in succession - one through mid-off and the other over mid-wicket.

Ravindra's off-side play with zero trigger movement was a sight for the sore eyes. A flowing cover drive off pacer Hasan Ali and a withering square cut off Ahmed gave a touch of elegance, while a well-timed pull off Rauf that landed on the second tier stand over mid-on gave his innings a bit of muscle.

Ravindra brought up a popular hundred with a single off pacer Mohammad Wasim, as a good weekend crowd loudly chanted 'Raachin Raachin.' The 90s kids would easily have visualised stands filled with that reverberating 'Saachin Saachin' chants at that moment.

However, the double barrel firing came to an end when Williamson fell well within sight of his 14th ODI hundred, an attempt to clear the fence off Ahmed ended in a finely judged catch by Fakhar Zaman at long-on. Ravindra too did not last long as his pull off Wasim was snaffled at square leg by Saud Shakeel.

Glenn Phillips (41 off 26 balls) too chipped in with some typical beefy blows as the Black Caps innings switched on the afterburners.

In total, New Zealand made 114 runs in the last 10 overs to give Pakistan a steep mountain to scale down. But Pakistan indeed did that – by bit of luck and lot of pluck.
