UPSC updates guidelines on choice of DGPs

he Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) has updated its guidelines for the selection of state director-general of police (DGPs). According to these amendments issued last month, only police officers with at least six months left before retirement will be eligible for consideration for the position. Moreover, IPS officers on central deputation will not be assessed for a state DGP's role if the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) informs the state government that they cannot be relieved.

These changes were made to clarify existing unwritten norms and discourage states from appointing DGPs on the brink of retirement or using acting DGPs to bypass the UPSC process and extend their tenure, as some states, including BJP-ruled states, have done. Sources say that states such as Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, Andhra Pradesh and Telangana have all appointed "in-charge" DGPs or DGPs with "full additional charge". For instance, Uttar Pradesh has not had a full-time DGP since 2022.

Notably, former Punjab DGP V.K. Bhawra has gone to court against the appointment of Gaurav Yadav as acting DGP by the Aam Aadmi Party government of Bhagwant Mann. Mr Bhawra's transfer in the middle of his term, despite UPSC rules stipulating a

fixed two-year tenure for a state DGP, prompted this challenge. Earlier this year in June, Punjab passed legislation to independently appoint the state DGP. However, the Punjab Police (Amendment) Bill, 2023, is still pending the Governor's assent to become law.

Interestingly, in 2021, the Centre had proposed to amend the IAS cadre rules to depute IAS, IPS and IFS officers to the Centre without necessarily taking the state government's nod. At the time there were massive protests from the states, and the proposal was shelved. Wonder how the states will take to these new guidelines.

A puzzling U-turn on appraisal system

In a startling reversal, the Modi Sarkar has disavowed its own 360-degree appraisal system for senior civil servants, specifically for those at the level of joint secretary and above. This abrupt change in stance, now asserting that "no such system exists in the Government of India", raises some troubling questions about the Modi Sarkar's accountability and its commitment to a transparent and merit-based selection process.

At the time it was introduced in 2015, the government had gone to great lengths to extol the virtues of the 360-degree appraisal system. It stated that the new system was a comprehensive response to the shortcomings of the

previous process, which fell short of capturing the "essential" qualities of integrity and capability during the evaluation. In fact, the Delhi High Court upheld the new system in 2017, underscoring its legitimacy.

So, why this volte-face? The government's new-found denial of the system is a puzzling and concerning development and will be seen as signifying a lack of consistency and a willingness to change fundamental procedures without clear rationale. Why would the department of personnel and training (DoPT) file such an affidavit before the Central Administrative Tribunal (CAT) circuit bench?

Sources have informed DKB that this was done in response to a petition filed by Indian Forest Service (IFS) officer Sanjiv Chaturvedi of the Uttarakhand cadre who approached the tribunal claiming that he was not being empanelled as a joint secretary at the Union level. To junk an entire system to snub an individual officer, who even if he has been a bugbear for the government due to his whistleblower image, definitely sounds like overkill!

Railways' shake-up raises eyebrows

The upper echelons of the Railways underwent a transformative rearrangement. Ten senior railway officers from the Indian Railway Management Service (IRMS) have been cleared for appointment as General Manager.

What's particularly intriguing is the reshuffling of two general managers, who held pivotal positions, into relatively low-key roles. This unexpected development has set tongues wagging within the close-knit railway circles. Rumours suggest that the roots of these decisions may perhaps be traced back to certain significant developments last month.

In a noteworthy departure from the established guidelines, S.K. Jha, previously the general manager of Northeast Frontier Railways' Construction division, was laterally appointed as the director general of the Indian Railway Institute of Civil Engineering in Pune, displacing Ram Karan Yadav, who assumed Mr Jha's role. A similar deviation from the norm occurred as C.V. Raman, the general manager of North Eastern Railway, was transferred to the office of the secretary to the divisional personnel officer (railway stores), railway board. This move involved a temporary upgrade of the Level 15 post to Level 16, set to last until September 30, 2025.

Sources who are close to the situation have informed DKB that the decisions might be influenced by feedback from investigative agencies and undisclosed information. These undercurrents have, therefore, cast an enigmatic veil over the possible motives behind these lateral shifts.

OF IMPROVEMENT

Some students may face challenges with certain topics covered in the QA section. These could include geometry, number systems, or any other topic.

It is, therefore, necessary to identify your weak points early on in your preparation and dedicate additional time to enhance your knowledge of these topics.

With consistent practice and a focused approach, you can overcome these challenges and improve your performance.

4. EFFECTIVE TIME MANAGEMENT

Effective time management is an essential aspect of preparing for the CAT exam, especially in the Quantitative Aptitude section.

In this regard, consistent practice with time-bound exercises can enhance your speed and accuracy. Furthermore, practising with a timer can mimic exam conditions and boost your time management skills.

5. IDENTIFYING AREAS OF STRENGTH

There are often multiple methods to solve a problem, and students are advised to familiarise themselves with these shortcuts as they can save them the necessary time during the exam.

However, it is essential to note the underlying concepts as shortcuts are meant to optimise your knowledge, not replace it.

7. FOCUSSING ON SELECTIVE TOPICS

Lastly, while it is necessary to cover all the topics in the CAT syllabus, it is equally important to allocate more time and effort to areas that hold more weight in the CAT exam.

Students who don't have an engineering background should lay emphasis on topics like arithmetic and algebra as they are likely to be included more often in the question paper.



Delhi's air quality severe; slight relief likely ahead of Diwali

NEW DELHI, Nov 9 (Agencies): The air quality in Delhi was recorded in the 'severe' category on Thursday morning, with a marginal improvement expected just ahead of Diwali as meteorological conditions are likely to become slightly favourable.

The city's Air Quality Index (AQI) stood at 420 at 8 am on Thursday, compared to 426 at 4 pm on Wednesday. The AQI map prepared by the Central Pol**lution Control Board** showed clusters of red dots (indicating hazardous air quality) spread across the Indo-Gangetic plains.

Neighbouring Ghaziabad (369), Gurugram (396), Noida (394), Greater Noida (450), and Faridabad (413) also reported very bad air quality.

According to officials at the India Meteorological Department, a change in wind direction from



northwest to southeast due to a fresh western disturbance affecting northwest India will help reduce the contribution of smoke from stubble burning, but slow wind speed will counteract this

However, once the

western disturbance passes, the wind speed will increase from around 5-6 kmph, at present, to around 15 kmph on November 11, which will help disperse pollutants ahead of Diwali, the official said.

In view of the worsening air pollution, the Delhi government on Wednesday rescheduled the December winter break of all schools, which will now be from November 9 to November 18.

Mobile internet ban lifted in four Manipur district HQs unaffected by violence: Officials

IMPHAL, Nov 9 (Agencies): The Manipur government has lifted the mobile internet ban in four hill district headquarters which have not been affected by ethnic strife, officials said on

The internet ban was withdrawn on a trial basis in the district headquarters of Ukhrul, Senapati, Chandel and Tamenglong, which are Naga-majority areas, they said.

The move comes after the Manipur High Court had directed the state government to operationalise mobile towers, on a trial basis, in all those district headquarters that have not been affected by the ethnic clashes

The mobile internet services



in the four hill district headquarters resumed on Tuesday, the officials said.

Asked about the resumption of mobile internet services, an official of the Ukhrul district administration said, "Only in district headquarters, a few selected mobile towers have been operationalised. But the connectivity is poor. The restoration will be

done on a trial basis."

At a recent function in Ukhrul, state Transport Minister Kashim Vashum had said the services would resume in the four dis-

Barring a few days in September, mobile internet has remained banned in Manipur since May 3 when ethnic clashes broke out. Manipur has

remained gripped by recurring bouts of violence since ethnic clashes first erupted in May More than 180 people have

been killed since then.

The clashes have occurred over several grievances that both sides have against the other, however, the flashpoint of the crisis has been a move to give Meiteis Scheduled Tribe status, which has since been rolled back and an attempt to turf out tribals living in protected forest areas.

Meiteis account for about 53 per cent of Manipur's population and live mostly in the Imphal Valley, while tribals, which include Nagas and Kukis, constitute 40 per cent and reside mainly in the hill districts.

Mahua Moitra says TV channel securing access to Ethics Committee report amounts to 'serious breach of privilege' nel got access to the report one day



NEW DELHI, Nov 9 (Agencies): TMC MP Mahua Moitra on Thursday wrote to Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla saying a TV channel securing access to the "confidential draft report" of the Lok Sabha Committee on Ethics investigating the cash for query charges against her amounted to "serious breach of privilege".

The channel belongs to the Adani Group, she pointed out.

Moitra wrote that serious breach of Rule 275(2) contained in the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in Lok Sabha took place as the TV chanbefore it was to be presented before the Lok Sabha Committee on Ethics.

"It is even more shocking because this media channel is majority owned by the Adani Group against whom I have raised very serious issues of corporate fraud and breach of financial and securities regulations, in the Lok Sabha,' Moitra wrote in her letter to Birla.

"I have been targeted for speaking out against this corporate giant and it is absolutely shocking how a channel owned by this group has access to a confidential committee report which is the subject of my alleged unethical conduct." Moitra wrote in the letter.

Saying that there is clearly a total breakdown of all due process and laws of the Lok Sabha, Moitra told the Speaker that his "inaction and lack of response" to her previous complaint is "unfortunate".

Moitra' missive came shortly before a meeting of the Lok Sabha Committee on Ethics is to be held at 4 pm on Thursday to finalise the draft report with regard to its findings in the cash-forquery probe carried out by the Committee against her.

The TV channel on Wednesday claimed exclusive access to the report and gave wide coverage to the report.

2 Dead, 29 Injured After Deadly **Bus Fire On Gurugram** Jaipur Highway

NEW DELHI, Nov 9 (Agencies): A deadly fire erupted on a moving double-decker sleeper bus along the Delhi-Gurugram Expressway Wednesday night, leaving two passengers dead and 29 others with severe injuries, police said today. The blaze, which broke out at 8:30 pm, plunged the bus into a blazing inferno, leaving those on board scrambling for survival.

Those injured were admitted to Gurugram's Civil Hospital in Sector

"All injured have suffered 30 to 50 per cent burns but are stable," a doctor at the hospital



said.

The incident took place on the main expressway connecting Delhi and Jaipur, near the Jharsa flvover.

"Three fire engines were rushed to the spot after we received information that a sleeper bus with registration number AR 01 K 7707 had caught fire on the carriageway," Fire Department Deputy Director Gulshan Kalra told news agency.

Horrifying visuals from the incident showed the bus engulfed in flames, with plumes of smoke rising into the night sky.

US carries out new airstrikes at 'Iran-linked weapons site' in Syria

45 US troops have suffered traumatic brain injuries or minor wounds

WASHINGTON, Nov 9 (Agencies): The United States, for the second time in recent weeks, carried out strikes against a weapon storage facility in eastern Syria that the Pentagon said was used by Iran's Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) and affiliated groups.

As tensions soar over the Israel-Hamas conflict, US and coalition troops have been attacked at least 40 times in Iraq and Syria by Iran-backed forces since the start of Octo-

Forty-five US troops have suffered traumatic brain injuries or minor wounds.

In a statement, US Defence Secretary Lloyd Austin said the strikes were conducted by two US F-15 fighters and were in



response to the recent attacks against US forces. Austin said the attacks against US troops must stop.

"If attacks by Iran's proxies against US forces continue, we will not hesitate to take further necessary measures to protect our people," Austin added.

A senior US military official, speaking on condition of anonymity, said the military had watched the location in Deir al Zor province for some time and was confident there were no civilian casualties.

The official said the military had tracked a "couple" of people

near the facility overnight, though they were not believed to be civilians and an analysis was ongoing to see if anyone

The United States has occasionally carried out retaliatory strikes against Iranian-backed forces in the region after they attack American forces.

On October 26, US forces attacked two facilities used by the IRGC and groups its backs.

The United States has 900 troops in Syria, and 2,500 more in neighbouring Iraq, on a mission to advise and assist local forces trying to prevent a resurgence of Islamic State, which in 2014 seized large swathes of both countries but was later

Joe Biden team says election night wins show path to 2024 victory

WASHINGTON, Nov 9 (Agencies): A sense of vindication swept through the White House and Biden campaign after Democrats' strong showing in offyear elections, despite a slew of recent polls showing US President Joe Biden's popularity is low.

"Pollsters, pundits, if I had \$1, for every time they've counted Joe Biden or the Democrats out, I probably wouldn't have to work anymore," Sam Cornale, executive director of the Democratic National Committee, told Reuters. Democrats "won time and again, and we will next November," he predicted.

Biden faced questions this week, including from some in his own Democratic Party, about the wisdom of his 2024 re-election bid after a series of weak polls. Some segments of the diverse Democratic coalition have lost faith in Biden, frustrated by his Israel stance, the lack of movement on climate change, or high prices.

A Sunday New York Times/Siena College

poll showed Biden behind Republican frontrunner Donald Trump in five of six battleground states. Reuters/Ipsos polls show Biden's popularity has fallen to 39%, its lowest level since April.

Tuesday's victory by Democratic incumbent Governor Andy Beshear in Kentucky over a wellregarded Republican opponent, the passage in Republican-voting Ohio of a constitutional amendment guaranteeing abortion rights and Democratic wins in the battleground state of Pennsylvania showed the overall strength of the positions of Biden's party.

The Ohio result shows abortion rights remain a winning political issue for Democrats after the conservative majority on the US Supreme Court ended the constitutional right to an abortion, overriding public opin-

Whether victories for Democrats this week are a definitive sign of strength for Biden's reelection is unclear.

Voters who turned up on Tuesday in state and local elections and

those who will vote in the presidential election in November 2024 could be vastly different, exit polls suggest. In Ohio, for example, exit polls from NBC showed voters skewed Democratic on Tuesday, although Trump won the state by 8 percentage points in 2020.

Republican political strategist Mary Anna Mancuso said polls today offer little indication of what will happen in 2024 but that Tuesday's results may spell trouble for her party.

"There's a margin

of voters, specifically suburban women, who are defecting from the Republican Party," she said. "They are protecting their bodies over their tax cuts." Vice President Kamala Harris made a sudden appearance on the White House driveway on Wednesday to highlight the abortion issue and offer a fresh glimpse of Democrats' coalescing 2024 message - their party, not the Republican party, will protect Americans'

personal rights. "Last night, I think the American people made clear that they are pre-



pared to stand for freedom and for the individual freedoms and the promise of freedom in America, and by extension, it was good night for democracy," said Harris.

The election results showed that "the government should not be telling a woman what to do with her body," Harris

Biden, who turns 81 this month, currently faces no serious primary challengers and has raised tens of millions of dollars for his re-election campaign. His fundraising has surpassed that of Trump, 77, the current Republican frontrunner who backed the losing Kentucky governor candidate.

"At every turn, MAGA Republicans have embraced Donald Trump's agenda to restrict our freedoms,

and voters aren't going to have it," Cornale said.

India remains a strategic partner, free to decide its stance on any particular crisis: White House



WASHINGTON, Nov 9 (Agencies): India, which remains a strategic partner for the US, is free to decide on its stance on any particular crisis or contingency around the world, including in the Middle East, the White House has said.

The remarks by John

Kirby, Coordinator for Strategic Communications at the National Security Council in the White House, came in response to a question if the US sees any role for India in resolving the Middle East crisis given that New Delhi has good relations with both Israel and Palestine.

Hamas gunmen launched an unprecedented assault on Israel from the Gaza Strip on 7 October, killing more than 1,400 people and taking more than 200 hostages.

Israel has been carrying out strikes on Gaza since then in response and has now also launched a ground offensive. More than 10,500 people have been killed in Gaza, according to the Hamasrun health ministry.

"India is a key strategic partner, and I think you saw that on full display when Prime Minister

(Narendra) Modi was here," Kirby told reporters at a news conference on Wednesday, referring to the Indian Prime Minister's state visit to the US in June.

"But we'll leave it to the Indian government and to the prime minister to decide what their stance is going to be on any particular crisis or contingency around the world, to include the Middle East," Kirby said.

India had described Hamas's multi-pronged attack on Israeli cities on October 7 as terror strikes but at the same time called for strict observance of the international humanitarian law following concerns over civilian casualties in Gaza in view of Israel's counter-offensive.

"They (India) remain a key strategic partner. And we're dedicated to advancing that partnership every single day," Kirby said.

Woman sues ex-Grammys CEO for sexual assault, accuses **Recording Academy of negligence**

NEW YORK, Nov 9 (Agencies): A woman filed a lawsuit against former Grammy Awards CEO Neil Portnow, accusing him of a 2018 sexual assault, and against the Recording Academy for negligence.

The woman, who was not named, filed the lawsuit in state Supreme Court in Manhattan under the Adult Survivors Act.

The measure, passed last year, created a temporary window for those who allege sexual assault to file past the state's usual deadlines. In the lawsuit, the

woman, described as an internationally known musician who once played at Carnegie Hall, said she met Portnow in early 2018 and had set up a meeting to interview him at his hotel in New York City later that

"US Can't Get Tough With China Because...": Vivek Ramaswamy board of Boeing and otherwise.

WASHINGTON, Nov 9 (Agencies): The US cannot "get tough" with China because it depends on it for a modern way of life, Indian-American Republican presidential candidate Vivek Ramaswamy has said, asserting that Washington needs to declare economic independence from Beijing.

The 38-year-old multimillionaire biotech entrepreneur made the comment on Wednesday during the Republican Party's third presidential debate in Miami, Florida.

Indian-American presidential candidate Nikki Haley, Florida Governor Ron DeSantis, former New Jersey Governor Chris Christie, and South Carolina Senator Tim Scott participated in the debate. Former US president Donald Trump, who is leading the race, did not participate in the debate again.

"Here's why we can't get tough with China. It's because we depend on them for our modern way of life. And we have to declare economic independence from our enemy," Mr Ramaswamy said.

"That's the Declaration of Independence that Thomas Jefferson, at the age of 33, would have signed. And today, if he were alive, that's the Declaration of Independence that I will sign as the next president," Mr Ramaswamy said

in response to a question. Underlining that the actual defence industrial base of the US depends on China for the supply chain, he said, "For the F-35 jets,

for the ships that we're building. Think about this. Why are we stockpiling that if it isn't to actually be strong against our enemy, China? We depend on them for that. Just like we depend on them for pharmaceuticals. Just like we depend on them for semiconduc-

"We need politicians who are independent of the forces that increase our dependence on China. My message to Xi Jinping is this, you are done buying land in this country. You will not donate to universities in this country. US businesses won't expand into the Chinese market until you play by the same set of rules," Mr Ramaswamy said.

He added that the US needs to increase its naval capacity by at least 20 per cent over the next several vears.

"I think we have to, at minimum, be able to meet our AUKUS agreement standards. Right now, we are at risk of not even being able to meet our AUKUS standards with Australia and the UK. So, what we need to do is have a plan that reverses the trajectory of the divest to invest programme by 20 per cent

over the next three years," he said. The AUKUS pact is a trilateral alliance between the UK, the US and Australia, seen as a counter to an aggressive China in the strategic Indo-Pacific region.

During the debate, Mr Ramaswamy alleged that fellow Indian-American Republican presidential



great friend of America while serving as the US Ambassador to the UN, "When she was UN Ambassador, called them literally her words, not my, 'Our great friend'. You can't be fair-weather fans of the right policy. Get to the root cause. Even US companies in Silicon Valley are regularly doing it," he said.

Haley denied the allegations. "When he talks about me praising China, he doesn't know the fact that the reason China was praised was because I negotiated with China and Russia the largest set

I did it by making sure that we held them accountable for everything that they did. That's the reason we got out of the Human Rights Council. That's the reason we called them out," Ms Haley said in defence.

The two Indian Americans clashed on the debate stage multiple times. It started when Ramaswamy called Haley, former US vice president Dick Cheney in threeinch heels. The former South Carolina governor was the only woman on the debate stage.

"You have the likes of Nikki Haley, who stepped down from her time at the UN, bankrupt or in debt is -was her family. Then, she becomes a military contractor. She joins the

And is now a multi-millionaire. So I think that that's wrong when Republicans do it or Democrats do it. That's the choice we face," he alleged.

"Do you want a leader from a different generation who's going to put this country first, or do you want Dick Cheney in three-inch heels?" Mr Ramaswamy said.

Haley blasted Mr Ramaswamy when her turn came soon thereafter.

"Yes. I'd first like to say they're five-inch heels, and I don't wear them unless you can run in them. The second thing that I will say is: that I wear heels. They're not for a fashion statement. They're for ammunition," Ms Haley said amidst

cheers from the audience. She also blasted Mr Ramaswamy, asking him not to bring her daughters into the debate.

Mr Ramaswamy mentioned her daughter during the portion of the debate that discussed the ban on TikTok.

"I want to laugh at why Nikki Haley didn't answer your question, which is about looking at families in the eye. In the last debate, she made fun of me for actually joining TikTok, while her own daughter was actually using the app for a long time. So, you might want to take care of your family first before preaching to anybody else," he said.

"Leave my daughter out of your voice," a furious Ms Haley

responded.

"Adult daughter," Ramaswamy said as he was booed. "And that's actually the point. You have her supporters propping her up. That's fine. Here is the truth," he said.

Talking about the multiple bills signed in August by Florida Governor Ron DeSantis prohibiting Chinese citizens from purchasing land in the state, Mr Ramaswamy said, "Bring in the CCP to South Carolina. What he left out though, Ron, and to be honest about it, there was a lobbying-based exemption in that bill that allowed Chinese nationals to buy land within a 20-mile radius of a military base lobbied for by one of your donors. So, I think we have to call a spade a spade." Ramaswamy also asserted that his administration would ban any US company from transferring data to the Chinese.

"Here is a story most people don't know. Airbnb hands over US user data to the Chinese Communist Party (CCP). Now, that's a USowned company. So, this is the problem when you have Republicans that temporarily go the way the winds blow, and now it's popular to talk tough on China," he said. The Supreme Court of India has a sanctioned strength of 34 judges and is presently functioning with 31 judges.

"The Supreme Court has a huge backlog of cases. In view of the ever-mounting pendency of cases, the workload of judges has increased considerably. Bearing in mind the above, it has become necessary to ensure that the Court has full working judge strength, leaving no vacancy at any point in time. Bearing in mind the above, the Collegium has decided to fill up all the three existing vacancies by recommending names," the recommendation stated.

It stated that the Collegium deliberated on and discussed the names of Chief

Justices and senior puisne judges of the High Courts eligible for appointment to the Supreme Court.

"Judgements authored by those falling in the zone of consideration for elevation to the Supreme Court were circulated among the members of the Collegium well in advance for a meaningful discussion on and assessment of their judicial acumen. The Centre for Research and Planning of the Supreme Court has prepared a compilation of relevant background material to assist the Collegium," it added.

The S&P BSE Sensex was down 41.44 points at 64,874.50 at around 9:50 am, while the NSE Nifty 50 fell 33.90 points to 19,409.60. Broader market indices were mixed in early trade as volatility rose slightly, signalling uncertainty.

Among sectoral indices, Nifty Bank, Nifty IT, Nifty Financial Services fell along with Nifty FMCG, which was the top loser. However, auto stocks gained nearly 0.8 per cent and provided support to the benchmark indices.

The top five gainers on the Nifty 50 were M&M, Hero MotoCorp, Apollo Hospitals, BPCL and IndusInd Bank. On the other hand, the top drags in early trade were Tata Consumer Products, Tech Mahindra, ONGC, Hindalco and Reliance.

Aditya Gaggar, Director of Progressive Shares, said, "Indian equities continued to advance but with



movement, a strong bullish candle above the hurdle of 19,500 will boost the conviction in the momentum. The immediate resistance stands at 19,500 while the downside is protected at 19,315." He highlighted that

NEW DELHI, Nov 9 (Agencies): Lenders of grounded low-cost airline Go First are planning to legally challenge a move that could allow lessors to reclaim aircraft, reported news agency.

Quoting sources with direct knowledge of the matter, the report suggested that Go First lenders are planning to challenge the Directorate General of Civil Aviation's (DGCA) interpretation that would retrospectively apply changes to bankruptcy law, allowing essors to reclaim planes

The government had last month modified its bankruptcy laws to exclude leased aircraft from assets subject to freezing during bankruptcy proceedings. This change has sparked a dispute between Go First's lessors, who are eager to recover their planes, and the airline's lenders, who fear the value of the airline will deteriorate if the planes are released. It may be noted that Go First owes its lenders over Rs 6,500

The Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) has stated that the law changes will apply retrospectively, providing relief to the lessors. However, Go First's lenders argue that the changes should only apply prospectively, as the airline was already under bankruptcy protection when the law was amended. Lenders are concerned that releasing the planes could diminish interest from potential bidders for the airline and put their own recovery of funds at risk.

"Without the planes, the value of the airline will deteriorate. The amended law seems to have deterred bidders already," a banker at a state-run bank with exposure to Go First told agency.

The Delhi High Court is scheduled to near the ongoing dispute between lessors and Go First next Friday. Lenders' plea, if allowed by the court, would be a setback for lessors and mean that more than 50 Airbus planes of Go First would continue to be grounded in India.

In a previous court hearing, Dubai Aerospace Enterprise Capital and ACG Aircraft Leasing alleged that some of their plane parts had gone missing and

that some jets were corroding. Go First's bankruptcy filing lists Central Bank of India, Bank of Baroda, IDBI Bank, and Deutsche Bank among its

Meanwhile, the airline received an expression of interest from Jindal Power last month. The last day to submit bids for the airline is November 21.

RBI chief warns about India's 'recurring' food shock problem


India has experienced periodic surges in the prices of essential food items such as tomatoes, onions, milk, cereals, and pulses throughout the year.

NEW DELHI, Nov 9 (Agencies): Despite recent declines in retail inflation, India remains susceptible to "recurring and overlapping" food price shocks, cautioned Reserve Bank of India (RBI) Governor Shaktikanta Das.

Addressing a gathering in Japan, Governor Das said the need for monetary policy to remain vigilant and actively disinflationary to gradually align inflation with the target while supporting economic growth.

"In these circumstances, monetary policy remains watchful and actively disinflationary to progressively align inflation to the target, while supporting growth," Governor Das said in a speech delivered in Japan.

India has experienced periodic surges in the prices of essential food items such as tomatoes, onions, milk, cereals, and pulses. While retail inflation eased to a three-month low of



5.02 per cent in September, sharp price spikes in certain food items remain common.

Earlier this year, tomato prices skyrocketed, exceeding Rs 300 per kg in some regions. Similarly, onion prices soared 70-100 per cent in most areas just a month ago, despite the government's efforts to sell buffer stocks at subsidized rates.

Persistently high prices of cereals and pulses further worsen India's food shock woes, disproportionately affecting poorer households.

Given the already upward trend in inflation due to rising global crude oil prices, sudden price spikes of essential food items pose a significant risk of further inflationary pressures in the coming months.

Nevertheless, the central bank projects an average inflation rate of 5.4 per cent for the

current year, notably lower than last year's 6.7 per cent. This projection, however, hinges on the government's effectiveness in addressing production shortages of essential food items.

While buffer stock sales have helped bring down tomato and onion prices, the same cannot be said for cereals and pulses.

Governor Das underscored the central bank's heightened vigilance and readiness to take measures necessary to align inflation with its medium-term target.

Despite inflationary challenges, India's economy remains relatively strong compared to the global scenario, the RBI chief indicated.

He pointed to India's on-track growth and "eminently manageable" current account deficit. Additionally, he highlighted the healthy balance sheets of banks and corporates.

To help 2024 voters, Meta says it will begin labeling political ads that use AI-generated imagery

WASHINGTON, Nov 9 (Agencies): Facebook and Instagram will require political ads running on their platforms to disclose if they were created using artificial intelligence, their parent company announced.

Under the new policy by Meta, labels acknowledging the use of Al will appear on users' screens when they click on ads. The rule takes effect sometime in the new year and will be applied worldwide. A specific date has not been set.

Microsoft unveiled its own election-year initiatives on Tuesday, including a tool that will allow campaigns to insert a digital watermark into their ads. These watermarks are intended to help voters understand who created the ads, while also ensuring the ads can't be digitally altered by others without leaving evidence.

The development of new AI programs has made it easier than ever to quickly generate lifelike audio, images and video. In the wrong hands, the technology could be used to create fake videos of a candidate or frightening images of election fraud or polling place violence. When strapped to the powerful algorithms of social media, these fakes could mislead

and confuse voters on a scale never seen.

Meta Platforms Inc. and other tech companies have been criticized for not doing more to address this risk. Wednesday's announcement by Meta - which came on the same day House lawmakers held a hearing on deepfakes - isn't likely to assuage those concerns.

While officials in Europe are working on comprehensive regulations for the use of AI, time is running out for lawmakers in the United States to pass regulations ahead of the 2024 election. Earlier this year, the

Federal Election Commission began a process to potentially regulate Algenerated deepfakes in political ads before the 2024 election. President Joe Biden's administration last week issued an executive order intended to encourage responsible development of AI. Among other provisions, it will require Al developers to provide safety data and other information about their programs to the government.

Democratic U.S. Rep. Yvette Clarke of New York is the sponsor of legislation that would require candidates to label any ad created with AI that runs on

any platform, as well as a bill that would require watermarks on synthetic images, and make it a crime to create unlabeled deepfakes inciting violence or depicting sexual activity. Clarke said the actions by Meta and Microsoft are a good start, but not sufficient.

"We stand at the prec-

ipice of a new era of disinformation warfare aided by the use of new A.I. tools," she said in an emailed statement. "Congress must establish safeguards to not only protect our democracy but also curb the tide of deceptive AIgenerated content that can potentially deceive the American people."

The U.S. isn't the only nation holding a highprofile vote next year: National elections are also scheduled in countries including Mexico, South Africa, Ukraine, Taiwan, India and Paki-

Al-generated political ads have already made an appearance in the U.S. In April, the Republican National Committee released an entirely Al-generated ad meant to show the future of the United States if Biden, a Democrat, is reelected. It employed fake but realistic photos showing boarded-up storefronts, armored military patrols in the streets, and waves of immigrants creating panic. The ad was labeled to inform viewers that AI was used.

In June, Florida Gov. Ron DeSantis' presidential campaign shared an attack ad against his GOP primary opponent Donald Trump that used Al-generated images of the former president hugging infectious disease expert Dr. Anthony Fauci.

"It's gotten to be a very difficult job for the casual observer to figure out: What do I believe here?" said Vince Lynch, an Al developer and CEO of the Al company IV.Al. Lynch said some combination of federal regulation and voluntary policies by tech companies is needed to protect the public. "The companies need to take responsibility," Lynch said.

Meta's new policy will cover any advertisement for a social issue, election or political candidate that includes a realistic image of a person or event that has been altered using Al. More modest use of the technology — to resize or sharpen an image, for instance, would be allowed with no disclo-

Besides labels informing a viewer when an ad contains Al-generated imagery, information about the ad's use of Al will be included in Facebook's online ad library. Meta, which is based in Menlo Park, California, says content that violates the rule will be removed.

Google unveiled a similar AI labeling policy for political ads in September. Under that rule, political ads that play on YouTube or other Google platforms will have to disclose the use of Al-altered voices or imagery.

Along with its new policies, Microsoft released a report noting that nations such as Russia, Iran and China will try to harness the power of Al to interfere with elections in the U.S. and elsewhere and warning that the U.S. and other nations need to prepare.

Groups working for Russia are already at work, concluded the report from the Redmond, Washingtonbased tech giant. "Since at least July

2023, Russia-affiliated actors have utilized innovative methods to engage audiences in Russia and the west with inauthentic, but increasingly sophisticated, multimedia content," the report's authors wrote. "As the election cycle progresses, we expect these actors' tradecraft will improve while the underlying technology becomes more capa-

New Covid variant JN.1 could be more infectious

NEW DELHI, Nov 9 (Agencies): A US health agency has unveiled a new Covid variant called the JN.1. Scientists are worried that JN.1 could be more infectious and

even resist vaccine immunity. The JN.1 strain was recently detected in the United States in September and has now been discovered in 11 other countries, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)

What is the JN.1 strain?

The JN.1 strain is a descendant of the BA.2.86 Covid variant, also known as Pirola, which came from Omicron. As per the CDC, the BA.2.86 has a total of 20 mutations on the spike protein, which is a concern because viruses use spike proteins to latch onto the

cells of the host. The health agency explained that there is only a single change between JN.1 and BA.2.86 in the spike protein. "Because of this, the spike protein is also part of a



virus that vaccines target, meaning vaccines should work against JN.1 and BA.2.86 similarly. For example, initial scientific data show that the updated 2023-2024 COVID-19 vaccines help our immune systems block BA.2.86. We expect JN.1 will be similar," wrote the CDC in the last week of October.

The agency added that while new variants like BA.2.86 and JN.1 are attracting attention, right now, 99 per cent of SARS-CoV-2 variants are part of the XBB group of the

Omicron variant. And JN.1 makes up less than 0.1% of the SARS-CoV-2 variant

"Neither JN.1 nor BA.2.86 is common in the United States right now. In fact, JN.1 has been detected so rarely that it makes up fewer than 0.1 per cent of SARS-CoV-2 viruses," CDC wrote on its site.

The agency stated that treatment and testing by the SARS-CoV-2 Interagency Group (a group of scientific experts representing many government agencies) will remain effective against both BA.2.86 and

As long as we have Covid-19, we'll have new variants. "Nearly all represent relatively small changes compared with previous variants." wrote CDC, adding, "Regardless of the variant, all SARS-CoV-2 viruses spread the same way. So it's important to protect yourself and others by staying up to date with COVID-19 vaccines, improving ventilation and staying home when you're sick."

Record 7.5 million people globally diagnosed with TB in 2022: WHO NEW DELHI, Nov 9 (Agenpines, which together accounted

cies): 7.5 million people were diagnosed with tuberculosis (TB) in 2022, the highest recorded since World Health Organization (WHO) began global TB monitoring in 1995, according to a report featuring data from 192 countries and areas

The WHO 2023 Global Tuberculosis Report also shows that globally, an estimated 10.6 million people fell ill with TB in 2022 from 10.3 million in 2021.

The report underscores a significant worldwide recovery in the scale-up of TB diagnosis and treatment services in 2022. It shows an encouraging trend to reverse the detrimental effects of COVID- 19 on TB services.

The increase in diagnosis is attributed to good recovery in access to and provision of health services in many countries, WHO

India, Indonesia and the Philip-

for over 60 per cent of the global reductions in the number of people newly diagnosed with TB in 2020 and 2021, all recovered to beyond 2019 levels in 2022, it said.

"For millennia, our ancestors suffered and died with TB, without knowing what it was, what caused it, or how to stop it," said Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus, WHO Director-General in a statement.

"Today, we have knowledge and tools they could only have dreamed of. We have political commitment, and we have an opportunity that no generation in the history of humanity has had, the opportunity to write the final chapter in the story of TB," Ghebreyesus said.

Geographically, in 2022, most people who developed TB were in the WHO Regions of South-East Asia (46 per cent), Africa (23 per cent), and the Western Pacific (18 per cent), with smaller proportions in the Eastern Mediterranean (8.1 per cent), the Americas (3.1 per cent), and Europe (2.2 per cent). The total number of TB-related

deaths (including those among people with HIV) was 1.3 million in 2022, down from 14 million in 2021, according to the report.

However, during the 2020-2022 period, COVID-19 disruptions resulted in nearly half a million more deaths from TB. It continues to be the leading killer among people with HIV, it said.

The report noted that multidrugresistant TB (MDR-TB) remains a public health crisis. While an estimated 4,10,000 (4.1 lakh) people developed multidrug-resistant or rifampicin-resistant TB (MDR/ RR-TB) in 2022, only about two in five people accessed treatment.

There is some progress in the development of new TB diagnostics, drugs and vaccines. However, this is constrained by the overall level of investment in these areas, according to WHO.

"The tickets for the three marquee games – first semi-final (November 15), second semi-final (November 16) and the all-important final on November 19



will go live at 8 pm on November 9 on the official ticketing website 'tickets.cricketworldcup.com'.

"This will be the last chance for cricket fans wanting to experience the magic and thrill of the World Cup and to witness in person the crowning of a new champion," the BCCI said in a release.

India, South Africa and Australia have qualified for the semifinals. The battle for the fourth spot is between New Zealand, Pakistan and Afghanistan who all have four wins from eight games.

Big Ben turns back clock

PUNE, Nov 9 (Agencies): England snapped their five-match losing streak at the World Cup, as a century by Ben Stokes set the tone for a 160-run victory over Netherlands that kept his team's Champions Trophy qualification hopes alive.

Netherlands got off to a sluggish start chasing 340 as England reduced them to 104/5 midway through the innings before they eventually folded for 179 in 37.2 overs.

Wesley Barresi (37), Sybrand Engelbrecht (33), skipper Scott Edwards (38) and Teja Nidamanuru (41 not out) all got starts but the Dutch were unable to keep the momentum going in the face of some superb spin bowling

Adil Rashid claimed 3/54 while spin partner Moeen Ali bagged 3/42 with seamer David Willey claiming 2/19.

The win lifted England off the bottom to seventh in the 10-team standings with four points, above Bangladesh, Sri Lanka and the Dutch on net run rate. All teams now have a game remaining.

Stokes earlier hit an 84-ball 108 for his first World Cup ton while Dawid Malan (87) and Chris Woakes (51) smashed half-centuries as beleaguered England's batting clicked into gear again to get them to 339/9 in 50 overs at Pune's MCA Stadium.

"I'm more pleased for us to get a victory, to be honest," said Stokes. who was named the Player of the match. "Tough World Cup and it's nice to get back on winning terms today. It was (a typical Pune pitch). It was a nice wicket to bat on. The only thing was just on back of a length a bit of tennis-ball bounce. I tried to take it deep as I possibly could and cash in at the end."

Kiwis look to take off against Sri Lanka

BENGALURU, Nov 9 (Agencies): New Zealand's bowling unit has been underwhelming at the World Cup, and skipper Kane Williamson today hoped returning pacer Lockie Ferguson could impart some fire to their attack alongside new ball pair Trent Boult and Tim Southee.

Ferguson had missed the last couple of games with right Achilles injury. His presence could be vital for New Zealand as they face Sri Lanka in a mustwin match here today.

"He (Ferguson) balances out our attack nicely and made some really valuable contributions in the tournament and brings a bit of experience as well. So naturally comes in and bowls with that high pace and it complements our new ball bowlers. We'll have to have a look at the surface and decide on our balance," Williamson said today.

Williamson backed left-arm pacer Boult to come good in the crunch game against the Lankans.

Boult has taken 10 wickets from eight matches but has not been able to make an impact with the new ball as he often does

"He's world class. The second half (of the tournament) or a few of these games that we've had, the pitches have been very good and players have been playing well. It can be quite dependent on the assistance you might get as well with the new ball. He's very experienced and done that on a number of occasions," he added.



Williamson praised batter Rachin Ravindra for his consistent efforts in the showpiece. "He is clearly an amazing talent and just entered the side and walk into a World Cup and not just any World Cup but here in India and do what he's done is amazing, he said."

A forecast for rain has added an unknown element to New Zealand's final World Cup group stage match against Sri Lanka, captain Kane Williamson said.

New Zealand occupy the last semifinal slot available but only by virtue of having a better net run-rate than Pakistan and Afghanistan, with all three teams tied on eight points after eight games. "We'll still have to very much see what the pitch is like.

There's been a lot of weather around and it could look different tomorrow," said Williamson. "There's lots of things that we can't control and the weather is one of those."

Team Director Seeks 'Divine Help' To Save Pakistan's Cricket World Cup 2023 Semifinals Dream

NEW DELHI, Nov 9 (Agencies): The race for the semi-finals have intensified. Three teams - Pakistan, New Zealand, Afghanistan are on eight points from as many matches. With only one spot left in the top-four, the three side's last game will be crucial. Not even a win may be enough if the other team is ahead on run-rate. Pakistan team director Mickey Arthur sought "divine help" on Monday as the 1992 champions braced for one last push to squeeze into the World Cup semi-finals before piling on the praise for "game-changing" opener Fakhar Zaman. Pakistan have recorded back-to-back wins over Bangladesh and New Zealand to reignite their campaign with Zaman returning from a knee injury to hit 81 and then a blistering 81-ball 126 not out against the Kiwis. With eight points from as many games, Pakistan not only need



to beat England in their last game in Kolkata on Saturday but also hope New Zealand lose to Sri Lanka in Bengaluru two days earlier or that the match is washed out.

Afghanistan can also edge out Pakistan depending on result in the last match.

"Who knows how we are going to go in this competition," said Arthur, who is in his second stint in charge of Pakistan after a spell between 2016-2019.

"I have a real feeling we're going to get to the semi-finals but let's see what happens. What we do know is that it will in our hands come Satur-

"With a little bit of divine help, we can get to the semi-final but we have to play well. We played the perfect game once, I think, and that was against Bangladesh."

If Pakistan do qualify they will likely set up a mouth-watering clash with arch-rivals India in Kolkata on November 16 for a place in the final.

Arthur hailed the match-winning displays of Zaman.

"Since Fakhar has come in he has just been unbelievable," said Arthur of the 33-year-old left-hander.

"Sometimes in campaigns like this it takes something to just ignite it and Fakhar certainly ignited that for us.

"We know when he plays well he is exceptional. I have always been a massive backer of Fakhar because I think he can change games."

Chasing a daunting 402-run target to beat New Zealand -- revised to 342 in 41 overs after rain -- Zaman lifted his team to 200-1 before the match was halted with Pakistan 21 runs ahead of DLS system.

Zaman hit 11 sixes and eight boundaries in his 11th ODI hundred, his first in two World Cups.

"Obviously, Fakhar coming into the side breathed a new lease of life into us. It was tough not having him at the start. His form coming into the competition was a little bit patchy."

Zaman scored just 65 runs in four Asia Cup matches and 12 against the Netherlands in the

World Cup before he was benched.

He then had a recurrence of a knee injury that forced him to withdraw mid-way through last year's Twenty20 World Cup in Australia.

"He (Zaman) changes games whenever he bats, the longer he bats the more dominant we become," said Arthur.

"So, it is really important for us that we keep Fakhar in this type of form and it's really important that he takes this form and aggression and precision with his batting into the game against England."

Arthur said his team need to bring their best game against England, despite the defending champions' having lost six of their seven matches.

"Let's hope we are saving ourselves for a batting, bowling and fielding performance against England and then what will be, will be."

Who Will India Face In World Cup Semi-finals: All Three Scenarios Explained

New Zealand, Pakistan and Afghanistan are on eight points each and are separated only by Net Run-Rate.

NEW DELHI, Nov 9 (Agencies): Following Australia's sensational victory on Tuesday night that sealed their lastfour clash against South Africa, it will largely be a three-way battle among New Zealand, Pakistan and Afghanistan to identify hot-favourite India's semifinal rival. New Zealand, Pakistan and Afghanistan are on eight points each and are separated only by Net Run-Rate. The Kiwis, who face the struggling Sri Lanka in their last group match at Bengaluru on Thursday boast the highest NRR of 0.398 among the three teams.

The last edition's runners-up need to win by a handsome margin and hope that Pakistan (0.036) and Afghanistan (-0.038) do not win.

The Black Caps' late struggle -- they have lost four matches in a row with poor bowling -- and a rain forecast for their match in Bengaluru has added some more spice to the intriguing scenarios.

India-Pakistan semifinal at Eden? An India-Pakistan semi-final clash on Thursday at Eden Gardens is still possible. For this to happen, Pakistan will have to play out of their skin against England here on Saturday.

The Babar Azam-led side, which is slowly getting its rhythm back, need to win big and will have the advantage of playing after New Zealand and Afghanistan's game.

Afghanistan, the tournament's most improved team had Australia on the mat before snatching defeat from an advantageous position, take on title-contenders South Africa in Ahmedabad on Friday.

So when Pakistan take on England at Kolkata on Saturday they will have the advantage of knowing the exact run-rate equation. For Afghanistan to qualify as the fourth team, they have to win against power-packed South Africa by a huge margin to eclipse the NRR of New Zealand and Pakistan.

But if New Zealand

The Dutch take on England in Pune later in the day before clashing with table-toppers India in their concluding group league match in Bengaluru on November 12.

For them to make the

cut, Dutch have to produce two more massive upsets so that they can improve their negative net run-rate (-1.504), which seems too unrealistic and also hope that New Zealand, Pakistan and Afghanistan lose their respective matches by significant margins.
