Directed Div Com & Dist Admin to provide all necessary assistance to affected persons," the Lt Governor tweeted.

Woman among three drug peddlers arrested in Baramulla: Police

SRINAGAR, Nov 15 (Agencies): Police arrest three drug peddlers, including a wanted woman, and recover contraband substances from their possession in Jammu and Kashmir's Baramulla district.

A police party of Police Station Baramulla at a checkpoint established at Dewanbagh near Grid Station intercepted one lady, police said on Wednesday.

During the search, 60 grams of a contraband brown sugar-like substance were recovered from her possession. She was identified as Afroza Begum, alias Afree, a resident of Ganie Hamam Baramulla, presently staying at Hygam Sopore.

She had been arrested and shifted to PS Baramulla, where she remains in custody, police said.

37 killed, 14 hurt as bus falls into gorge in Doda: Officials



DODA, Nov 15 (Agencies): At least 37 people were killed and 14 injured when a bus carrying passengers skidded off the road and rolled down into a 300-foot gorge in Jammu and Kashmir's Doda district

on Wednesday, officials said.

The bus bearing registration number JK02CN-6555 was reportedly carrying around 40 passengers, the officials said, adding that it skidded off the road near

Trungal-Assar on the Batote-Kishtwar national highway and fell 300 feet downhill.

A rescue operation has been launched and some bodies have been retrieved, they said.

President Murmu, political leaders express shock, sadness over loss of lives bus accident

NEW DELHI/SRI-NAGAR, Nov 15 (Agencies): President Droupadi Murmu, Prime Minster Narendra Modi and political leaders on Wednesday expressed shock and sadness over a bus accident in Jammu and Kashmir's Doda that has killed at least 36 people.

"I am deeply saddened by the news of the unfortunate death of several passengers in a bus accident in Doda district of Jammu and Kashmir. I express my condolences to the bereaved family members and pray for the speedy recovery of those injured," Murmu said in a post in Hindi on X, formerly Twitter.

At least 36 people were killed and 19 injured when the bus carrying passengers skidded off the road and rolled down into a 300-foot deep gorge in Jammu and Kashmir's Doda district on Wednesday.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi said the bus accident was distressing. "My condolences to the families who have lost their near and dear ones. I pray that the injured recover at the earliest," Modi said on X.

He announced that an ex gratia amount of Rs 2 lakh each would be given to the next of the kin of the deceased and Rs 50,000 each to the injured from the Prime Minister's National Relief Fund (PMNRF).

Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge expressed pain and anguish over the loss of lives in the bus accident and urged authorities to speed up the relief and rescue work.

"Pained and anguished to hear about the terrible bus tragedy in Doda, Jammu and Kashmir which has resulted in loss of many precious lives. We urge the authorities to expedite the rescue and relief work," he said in a post on X.

"In this hour of grief, our deepest condolences to the families of the victims. May they get the strength to overcome their losses," he said.

Pakistan National among two Charge-Sheeted by NIA

SRINAGAR, Nov 15 (Agencies): The National Investigation Agency (NIA) has filed a Chargesheet against two accused, including a Pakistan national, in a militancy-related conspiracy case involving plans to disturb the peace and communal harmony of Jammu & Kashmir through acts of violence and terror.

"The accused have been identified as Mohd. Ubaid Malik of Kupwara and Muhammad Dilawar Iqbal @ Maaz Khan Kashmiri @ Maaz Khan @ Maaz Kashmiri @ Azad Kashmiri of Pakistan occupied Kashmir (PoK)," NIA said in a statement.

The statement reads that the duo was involved in a criminal

conspiracy to carry out unlawful activities in Jammu and Kashmir by unleashing attacks on security forces and outsiders.

"Dilwar, a close associate of Jaish-e-Mohammad (JeM) Chief Maulana Masood Azhar Alvi, was engaged in motivating Kashmiri youth as part of a larger conspiracy hatched by proscribed terrorist organisations and their affiliates to carry out terrorist acts and activities in the region," it reads.

It reads that according to NIA investigations, Dilwar was responsible for motivating Ubaid to join the JeM militant ranks.

"Dilwar would incite youth having a militancy background to pursue Jihad by sharing with them inflammatory audio clips and videos as well as images of Maulana Masood Azhar Alvi, showing the latter preaching radical Islam. He would also send videos related to encounters in the Kashmir valley and would provoke the youth to

It added that the accused have been charged under sections 120B & 121A of the IPC, 1860 and Sections 18, 18B, 20 & 38 of the UA (P) Act, 1967.

Govt to introduce battery operated boats in Dal Lake, Jehlum river



SRINAGAR, Nov 15 (Agencies): Jammu and Kashmir Government is all set to introduce battery powered boats in Dal Lake and Jehlum as an

Quoting an official, a media report said that the process of approving boat samples is in

its final stage and two types of boats — eightseaters and 20-seaters — will cruise in the water bodies.

He added that thirtytwo boats will serve the lake and river, crisscrossing even the old city, rich with its built heritage, and the shrines dotting the riverfront.

Reports said that official plan reveals that

boats will use the traditional causeways to cover the five basins of the lake —the Nehru Park basin, the Nishat Bagh basin, the Hazratbal basin, the Nigeen basin, and the Barari Nambal basin.

Officials added that for the first time since the 1960s the Dal lake's backwaters will be opened to visitors, especially the Dalgate-Rainawari-Hazratbal waterway.

DC reviews Health care

scenario in Doda District

Top News Report DODA, Nov 15: To review the health care scenario in the district, Deputy Commissioner Doda, Harvinder Singh on Wednesday chaired a meeting of senior health functionaries here in the mini-meeting hall of DC

office complex

At the outset, Chief Medical Officer Dr Hamid Zargar presented a detailed report on the implementation and achievements under health care schemes and the healthcare facilities being extended to the patients in the district.

The CMO briefed the chair about the functioning of the health department and indicator wise achievements of the department. It was informed that the district has 211 health care institutions, including one GMC, 3 SDHs, 13 PHCs, and 29 NTPHCs. The meeting was also apprised about the staff position in the health care centers across the

Regarding the Prime Ministers National Dialysis programme (PMNDP), it was informed that one dialysis centre is operational at AH-GMC Doda, catering to the needs of erstwhile district Doda.

Referring to Maternal and Pediatric care, it was informed that the AH-GMC Doda has 10 ICU beds for maternal care and 12 ICU beds for pediatrics, while 4 ICU beds for Maternal care have been exclusively kept at SDH Bhaderwah. It was revealed that Oxygen plants at AH-GMC, SDH Gandoh and SDH Bhaderwah are fully functional with the generation capacity of 5400 LPM.

The DC directed the CMO to ensure that the

plants remain functional and are maintained properly. He further inquired about the screening of Non communicable Diseases (NCD), ABHA registration, Awareness and Mega health Camps under Ayushman Bhava, Blood Donation Camps, RBSK screening of Children, Establishment of Maternity care huts at PHCs and CHCs, Positioning/ Stationing of Ambulances, National Tuberculosis Elimination Programme (NTEP), Anaemia Mukht Bharat Abhiyan, Immunization (IMI 5.0), Achievements under Developmental

availability of Doctors at Associated Hospital and other health care centers in the District, the DC asked to send the roster of Consultants and Doctors to the Emergency Response cell of the DC office and give it wide publicity for the information of the general public. He emphasized the streamlining of the control rooms in AH, PHCs, and CHCs, with fully functional helpline numbers. He urged to share the roads leading to all PHCs, & CHCs with the PWD/ PMGSY authorities so that road opening plans for the ensuing winter may be prepared in advance for the better and timely health care to the patients, especially pregnant women. The DC also exhorted the health care officials to strive towards achieving 100% institutional deliveries by mobilizing ASHAs, Anganwadi Workers, and extensive awareness among the pregnant ladies. He called for having complete data proper health care plan for them. He said that the winter, snow, or any other natural or manmade barriers may not prevent the assured health care facilities to the pregnant ladies for their safe delivery.

The DC has instructed the CMO to share and publicize the roster of the RBSK teams for overall health care of the children. He stressed to ensure availability of essential medicines, equipment, and staff in all the health care centers across the district, especially in the rural area, so that the people don't suffer during the ensuing winter. He asked the CMO not to allow any laxity of the staff under him and sanction the leaves with utmost care and prior alternative arrangements so that the health care services of any of the centers don't suffer. He further instructed to relocate the ALS and BLS Ambulances under 108 services as per the needs of the area, as decided in the earlier meetings. He urged to have ALS Ambulances at Assar and Thathri, with the high risk of road mishaps as being the highway towns.

The DC directed the MS Medical College to ensure that the patients are given immediate attention and the referrals to GMC Jammu are minimized.

The DC has emphasized to get the civil works completed as per the set timeline and undergo purchases of the essential equipment etc. under Capex budget within a week's time.

lections are obviously a testing time for political competitors. The intensity increases when the possibility of dislodging the incumbent seems easier than ever before. Confined within the relatively smaller arena of states, Assembly elections tend to appear more ferocious as fights between desperate rivals.

Some outbursts by a few partners within the INDIA alliance, fortified by speculation that all is not well and the Indian National Developmental Inclusive Alliance is a nonstarter as a challenger to the BJP in the forthcoming mother of all Lok Sabha elections in 2024, could be one of two things. One possibility is that the INDIA bloc was a balloon that is now leaking air and will soon collapse, and the other is that all is well with the alliance, even if there is no seamless adjustment of seats between the parties within the INDIA bloc.

The first possibility would make the jittery BJP ecstatic; the second possibility will make it even more nervous as it faces the qualifying races for the 2024 final that have already started in the five states of Mizoram, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Rajasthan and Telangana. If the apparent stresses and cracks within the INDIA bloc grew to the point where mutual distrust between competing parties turned into a classic internecine war of annihilation, it would be reasonable that the BJP, as the principal beneficiary, would be relieved and rejoice.

Anything that hinders the consolidation of the INDIA bloc would rescue the BJP from its knee-jerk concessions necessitated by the

compulsion of political circumstances. In Chhattisgarh, the superstar campaigner of the BJP suddenly announced a five-year extension of the 5 kg per person Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Yojana for 800 million people who need free rations to stave off starvation, or as Narendra Modi put it, "went to bed hungry". The other revealing involuntary admission is by the BJP's election mastermind, Amit Shah, also in Chhattisgarh, on the caste census: "The BJP never opposed a caste census but decisions have to be taken after giving it a lot of thought."

After trashing the Bihar caste survey, this abrupt change of stand is indicative that "Kamandal" politics of the inauguration of the under-construction Ram Mandir at Ayodhya is under pressure from Mandal politics of the poor and civilisationally deprived. That the majority of Indians need the government to step in to keep them fed is a bitter moment of facing the truth; the economy, contrary to the dressed-up data released by the Modi government, is in dire straits, short term and in the medium term. However much the BJP may deplore "appeasement politics", the need to take control and perhaps even credit for a caste census in the future is another clue to how uneasy lies the head that wears the crown. The third initiative by the BJP to promise, albeit in the indefinite and distant future, increased representation for women by reserving one-third of seats in the Lok Sabha and in the state Assemblies, is a concession that garnering support from women voters could decide the fate of the party in this round of elections.

Two concessions during the

campaign and one before the election ball was set rolling adds up to a lot of pressure that the Modi government needs to handle to unseat Ashok Gehlot in Rajasthan, Bhupesh Baghel in Chhattisgarh, K. Chandrasekar Rao in Telangana and retain power in Madhya Pradesh as well as keep MNF's chief minister Zoramthanga in Mizoram glued to its side. The Congress is obviously the principal opponent everywhere.

The twist in this tale of binary politics, however, is the presence of regional parties seizing the opportunity to dig themselves into new territories, turning the electoral battle into multi-cornered fights. The assumption hitherto has been that all multi-cornered fights from within the ranks of the parties in opposition to the BJP hurts the Congress. Party boss Mallikarjun Kharge has named the Prime Minister, home minister and the investigative agencies as additional contestants in every constituency where the Congress, its friends and the BJP are engaged in combat. The BJP, it seems, needs every weapon in the government's arsenal to try sustain the myth of its invincibility.

It's true that when votes are fractured, outcomes are unpredictable. The prevailing wisdom is that divisions within the Congress and splits in the Opposition votes will work for the BJP. It is as likely that regional parties as an alternative to the BJP and the Congress can shave away support to the BJP, lowering its chances of getting past the winning post.

If, however, parties like the Aam Aadmi Party and Samajwadi Party team up with the Congress to back government formation in the pollbound states, it would jeopardise the BJP's post-poll result plans, if it has any, of inveigling susceptible winners from the other side. It would then strengthen the INDIA bloc and increase the BJP's uneasiness, as it would promote the idea of a united Opposition working to oust Narendra Modi and defeat the BJP.

Recent opinion polls, and these can be tricky in anticipating exactly how voters will decide, indicate there is no strong wind blowing in the BJP's favour. When votes are fractured, there the outcomes are unpredictable. The polls also suggest that even after Mr Modi firmly inserted himself into the regional battlefields, uncertainty has not declined for the BJP. The voters are also not definitely anti-Congress or anti-INDIA. On the contrary, voters polled by various surveys are fully aware of what the INDIA alliance is, even though they say they don't think it is working according to a well-defined and easily grasped plan.

From what Mr Kharge has said publicly, it is evident that he is working overtime to drive his party to victory and keep the INDIA bloc together; conversations are ongoing, including with the disgruntled Akhilesh Yadav and Nitish Kumar. The INDIA bloc, as he explains it, will reconvene after December 3 when the election results are out.

Any anticipation that the INDIA bloc is likely to fall apart, because the Congress, unusually, has concentrated its efforts on winning in Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Rajasthan and Telangana, is an ardently desired wish of the BJP. It implies that INDIA partners now regret the formation.

Bamnoli land acquisition: CM Kejriwal sends inquiry report on Chief Secretary Naresh Kumar to LG Saxena

NEW DELHI, Nov 15 (Agencies): Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal has sent to Lieutenant Governor VK Saxena the Vigilance Minister's report alleging "prima facie complicity" of Chief Secretary Naresh Kumar in the Bamnoli land acquisition matter, government sources said on Wednesday.

The Chief Secretary has denied any wrongdoing and termed the allegations against him as "mudslinging" by people with vested interests against whom vigilance action was taken in corruption cases.

The report, which was submitted to Kejriwal by Vigilance Minister Atishi on Tuesday, has recommended Naresh Kumar's removal from the post for alleged corruption in acquisition of 19 acre of land in South West Delhi's Bamnoli

Kejriwal has instructed the Vigilance Minister to send the report to the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) and the Enforcement Directorate (ED) as well, the sources said.

The compensation for land acquisition was allegedly raised from Rs 41 crore to Rs 353 crore but the report has

claimed that the "scale of undue benefits" in the deal was over Rs 897

crore.

The vigilance minister's report was an outcome of an inquiry to a complaint that alleged that the chief secretary's son was employed by a person who was relative of benefited landowners in Bamnoli.

The 670-page report by Atishi alleged that "the scale of the undue benefits is much larger than earlier made out to be in a vigilance report." "The windfall gain for

the Kathurias (landowners) would have been Rs 897.1 crore for the 19.081 acres of land in Bamnoli village based on the illegal and exorbitant arbitration award given by erstwhile DM Southwest, Hemant Kumar. This is much greater than the estimate of Rs 353.79 crore shown in the vigilance report," the report stated.

The report further alleged that the "connections and the chronology give the prima facie appearance of complicity of the chief secretary with Hemant Kumar and the landowners."

It was alleged by the complainant—a

lawyer—that the Delhi chief secretary's son worked in a realty firm, a director of which was the son-in-law of Subhash Chand Kathuria, one of the owners of the land acquired in Bamnoli village in southwest Delhi and who was awarded enhanced compensation for his land.

In a statement on Tuesday, Naresh Kumar had questioned "on what basis such allegations are made specially when the chief secretary has joined only last year that is 2022. Copy of the report is not shared. So on what basis one can respond or report."

According to the report, the minister has recommended removal of Chief Secretary Kumar and Divisional Commissioner Ashwani Kumar from their posts to pave the way for a fair probe.

The divisional commissioner in a press conference on Monday defended the chief secretary saying the complaint against him was part of "dirty politics" as he was actively pursuing corruption cases.

On Tuesday, the chief secretary in a statement said the matter came to light in May when the compensation for 19 acres of land to be



acquired by the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) for the Dwarka Expressway was hiked from Rs 41 crore to Rs 353 crore by the then district magistrate Hemant Kumar, who was later suspended and a CBI inquiry was initiated against him.

The vigilance inquiry into the excessive compensation hike by Hemant Kumar was not initiated suo motu by the chief secretary and the divisional commissioner. "It was done only after the matter was flagged by National Highways Authority (NHAI) that moved court in the matter on June 5 this year," claimed the report.

The chief secretary stated that the matter was already under investigation by the CBI and the minister's report could be sent to

the probe agency so that truth can come out.

The CBI may also probe if there was any "conspiracy" to malign his image by "vested interests including public authorities" against whom action was taken by him, the chief secretary said on Tuesday.

The vigilance minister, in her report, has also recommended that a reference be made to the ED for the likelihood of money laundering in the land purchase by its current owners in 2015 and subsequent "illegal compensation" awarded in 2023 for its acquisi-

Incidentally, the Delhi High Court recently set aside the award of Rs 353 crore for acquisition of land in Bamnoli that was declared by the then district magistrate (southwest) in May this

Five killed in two separate road accidents in Odisha

BHUBANESWAR. Nov 15 (Agencies): Five persons were killed in two separate road accidents in Odisha's Koraput and Sundergarh districts on Wednesday, police said.

The first incident was reported from Koraput district where three persons of a family from Chhattisgarh were killed and another injured as the car in which they were travelling plunged into a 100-metre-deep gorge.

The accident took place at Sunki Ghat near Jodimadeli, police said, adding that the injured person has been rushed to the district headquarters hospital in Koraput.

The car was on its way to Visakhapatnam



in Andhra Pradesh from Rajnandgaon in Chhattisgarh, they added. The deceased were identified as Nandalal Thakar, Gaurav Thakar and Naman Thakar.

The injured person was identified as Rachana Thakar. Police suspected that the accident could be due to fog or sleeplessness of the driver.

In Sundargarh district, two cyclists were killed after a speeding car hit them from behind at Jharmunda village.

The car fled the spot after hitting the bicycle. However, local people managed to chase the vehicle and stop it near Jagatgarh. Police have detained the driver.

Indian Navy monitoring movement of Chinese warships participating in exercise with Pakistan

NEW DELHI, Nov 15 (Agencies): The Indian Navy has been keeping a close watch on the movement of a Chinese submarine and warships that are participating in a naval exercise with Pakistan, government sources said on Wednes-

The Navy is monitoring the Chinese platforms from the moment they entered the Indian Ocean region through the Malacca strait, they added.

China's PLA Navy has deployed a number of platforms, including frontline warships and a submarine, for the Sea Guardian exer-



cise with Pakistan.

As part of India's comprehensive maritime domain awareness, the Navy maintains a close watch on

all the movements in the Indian Ocean region, in line with national security interests, the sources said.

Uttarkashi tunnel collapse: Workers, family members hold protest over delay in rescuing trapped labourers

UTTARKASHI, Nov 15 (Agencies): Workers, family members and others held a protest outside the under-construction tunnel at Silkyara on Wednesday over the delay in rescuing labourers trapped inside for the last three days.

The protesters vented their anger over the absence of an alternative plan when the machines deployed for drilling the rubble to prepare an escape passage for trapped labourers did not work on Tuesday

Falling debris from a fresh landslide on Tuesday hampered efforts to insert steel pipes through the



collapsed part of the tunnel. According to officials, all workers are reported safe, and communication has been established. They are also being provided ration and other essentials through pipes.

The arrival of a replacement machine from Delhi is being awaited by rescuers for the resumption of the drilling operation.

Nearly 40 workers have been trapped behind debris for over 72 hours since a portion of an underconstruction tunnel between Silkyara and Dandalgaon on the Brahmakhal-Yamunotri National Highway caved in on Sunday following a landslide.

According to a list of the trapped workers issued by the emergency operation centre, 15 are from Jharkhand, eight from Uttar Pradesh, five from Odisha, four from Bihar, three from West Bengal, two each from Uttarakhand and Assam, and one from Himachal Pradesh.

NASA, ISRO gearing up to launch joint space mission to map globe every 12 days

BENGALURU, Nov 15 (Agencies): The NASA-ISRO Synthetic Aperture Radar (NISAR) is set to be launched in the first quarter of 2024 after a few tests, particularly those related to vibration, NASA officials have said.

"ISRO is projecting the first quarter of next year. So, I mean, that's ready," NASA NISAR Project Manager Phil Barela said during a media interaction here on Wednesday.

He is expecting the launch of NISAR (spelt as 'Naisar') "not earlier than January" from the Satish Dhawan Space Centre at Sriharikota aboard the ISRO Geosynchronous Satellite Launch Vehicle Mark-II.

The mission, which has threeyear duration, aims to survey all of Earth's land and ice-covered surfaces every 12 days. This will start after a 90-day satellite commissioning period.

Regarding the key tests that are pending to be undertaken, Barela said, "The vibration testing that's underway, but there's a whole slew of performance tests that we need to do."

Battery and simulation tests have to be done to make sure that the system works fine, he said.

"We'll be doing performance testing on the radars and various spacecraft electronics. So, a lot of



testing remains but the big environments test, the only one remaining now, is vibration," Barela said.

NASA Jet Propulsion Laboratory Director Dr Laurie Leshin said the NISAR project is "better than anything that was flown in the past".

"While there are datasets from past missions that can form sort of a baseline, this is a new level of capability that we will have with NISAR," she had told reporters on Tuesday.

"If it's working very well, we will almost certainly extend that mission to get that longer baseline. It is a very important thing to see the Earth change on multi-year timescales. This is what we are looking for," Leshin had said.

According to ISRO, NISAR is a Low Earth Orbit (LEO) observatory being jointly developed by it and NASA.

NISAR will map the entire globe in 12 days and provide spatially and temporally consistent data

for understanding changes in the Earth's ecosystems, ice mass, vegetation biomass, sea level rise, ground water and natural hazards, including earthquakes, tsunamis, volcanoes and landslides.

In a handout, NASA said the proiect aims to understand the dynamics of carbon storage and uptake in wooded, agricultural, wetland and permafrost ecosystems and the response of ice sheets to climate change, the interaction of sea ice and climate, and impacts on sea level rise worldwide.

NISAR will have Synthetic Aperture Radar Instrument (SAR), L-band SAR, S-band SAR and Antenna reflector.

According to NASA, the onboard instruments can even see a minor change of even one centimetre from space.

The SUV-size satellite has a mass of roughly 2,800 kg, which will be powered by two solar arrays providing about four kilowatts of

power.

The six feet tall 'spacecraft bus' will contain the command and communication systems for the instrument payload, which houses the two SAR instruments.

"The 'bus' will also support the radar antenna reflector and its boom. There is enough fuel aboard to support at least five years of

operations," the handout said.

Israeli forces storm Gaza's largest hospital Shifa in 'targeted operation' against Hamas

Soldiers enter buildings, including the emergency and surgery departments, which house intensive care units

KHAN YOUNIS, Nov 15 (Agencies): Israeli forces raided Gaza's largest hospital early Wednesday, where hundreds of patients, including newborns, have been stranded with dwindling supplies and no electricity, as the army extended its control across Gaza City and the north.

Shifa Hospital has become a symbol of the widespread suffering of Palestinian civilians during the war between Israel and Hamas, which erupted after the militant group killed some 1,200 people and seized around 240 captives in a surprise October 7 attack into southern Israel.

The hospital is also at the heart of clashing narratives over who is to blame for the thousands of deaths and widespread destruction in the besieged territory. Israel accuses Hamas of using Palestinians as human shields, while Palestinians and rights groups say Israel has recklessly endangered civilians as it seeks to eradicate the group.

Mohammed Zaqout, the director of hospitals in Gaza, said Israeli tanks had entered the medical compound and that soldiers had entered buildings, including the emergency and surgery departments, which house intensive care units.

"The occupation forces stormed the buildings," he said angrily over the phone. He said the patients, including children, are terrified. "They are screaming. It's a very terrifying situation ... we can do nothing for the patients but pray."

The Israeli military said it was carrying out a "precise and targeted operation against Hamas in a specified area in the Shifa Hospital."

It said it warned "relevant authorities in Gaza" that all military activities within the hospital must cease. "Unfortunately, it did not."

Israel says Hamas has a massive command center inside and beneath Shifa, but has not provided visual evidence, while Hamas and the hospital staff have repeatedly denied the allegations. Hours before the raid, the United States said it had its own intelligence suggesting Hamas used Shifa and other hospitals, and tunnels beneath them, to support military operations and hold hostages.

The military said that the forces raiding Shifa have medical teams and are searching for hostages as part of the opera-



tion.

Israeli forces also claimed control of several key buildings and a downtown neighborhood in Gaza City.

A TRICKLE OF FUEL FOR AID WORKERS

Most of the hundreds of thousands of people living in Gaza City and surrounding areas have fled after weeks of Israeli bombardments. Hardly any aid has been delivered to the the north, which has been without power or running water for weeks.

More than 11,200 people, two-thirds of them women and minors, have been killed in Gaza, according to the Palestinian Health Ministry in Ramallah, and two thirds of the territory's 2.3 million people have fled their homes. About 2,700 people have been reported missing. The ministry's count does not differentiate between civilian and militant deaths.

Almost the entire population of Gaza has squeezed into the southern two-thirds of the tiny territory, where conditions have been deteriorating as bombardment there continues.

The UN agency for Palestinian refugees said Tuesday that its fuel depot in Gaza was empty and that it would soon cease relief operations, including bringing limited supplies of food and medicine in from Egypt for the more than 6,00,000 people sheltering in severely overcrowded UN-run schools and

other facilities in the south.
"Without fuel, the humanitarian operation in Gaza is coming to an end. Many more people will suffer and will likely die," said Philippe Lazzarini, the commissioner-general of UNRWA.

Israeli defense officials changed course early Wednesday to allow some 24,000 liters (6,340 gallons) of fuel in for

humanitarian efforts, officials said. Earlier, they repeatedly rejected allowing fuel into Gaza,

saying Hamas would divert it for

military use.

COGAT, the Israeli defense body responsible for Palestinian affairs, said it would allow UN trucks to refill at the Rafah crossing on the Egyptian border later Wednesday. It said the decision was made in response to a request from the US.

HOSPITALS NO LONGER FUNCTIONING

Thousands of displaced people who had been sheltering at Shifa, along with patients who were able to move, had fled the medical compound in Gaza City through a corridor established by Israeli forces in recent days as Israeli troops encircled the complex and battled Hamas militants outside its gates.

Shifa had stopped operations over the weekend, as its supplies dwindled and a lack of electricity left it no way to run incubators and other lifesaving equipment. After days without refrigeration, morgue stuff dug a mass grave Tuesday for 120 bodies in the yard.

The Health Ministry said 40 patients, including three babies, have died since Shifa's emergency generator ran out of fuel Saturday. Another 36 babies are at risk of dying because there is no power for incubators, according to the ministry.

The Israeli military said it started an effort to transfer incubators to Shifa. But they would be useless without electricity, said Christian Lindmeier, a World Health Organization spokesman

The Health Ministry has proposed evacuating the hospital with the supervision of the International Committee of the Red Cross and transferring the

patients to hospitals in Egypt, but it has not received any response, ministry spokesman Ashraf al-Qidra said.

While Israel says it is willing to allow staff and patients to evacuate, some Palestinians who have made it out say Israeli forces have fired at evacuees.

The White House's national security council spokesperson, John Kirby, said Tuesday that the US has unspecified intelligence that Hamas and other Palestinian militants use Shifa and other hospitals and tunnels underneath them to support military operations and hold hostages.

The intelligence is based on multiple sources, and the US independently collected the information, a US official said on the condition of anonymity to discuss sensitive matters.

Kirby said the US doesn't support airstrikes on hospitals and does not want to see "a firefight in a hospital where innocent people" are trying to get care. BATTLE IN GAZA CITY

Israeli troops have extended their control across northern Gaza, capturing the territory's legislature building and police headquarters. But independent accounts of the fighting in Gaza City have been nearly impossible to gather, as communications with the north have largely collapsed.

Israeli military spokesman Daniel Hagari said Israeli forces have completed the takeover of Shati refugee camp, a densely built district bordering Gaza City's center, and are moving about freely in the city as a whole.

Inside some of the newly captured buildings, soldiers held up the Israeli flag and military flags in celebration. In a nationally televised news conference, Defense Minister Yoav Gallant said Hamas had "lost control" of northern Gaza and that Israel made significant gains in Gaza City.

But asked about the time frame for the war, Gallant said: "We're talking about long months, not a day or two."

The military says its forces have found weapons and eliminated fighters in government buildings, schools and residential buildings.

Israel says it has killed several thousand fighters, including important mid-level commanders, while 46 of its own soldiers have been killed in Gaza.

Betrayal, says sacked UK Home Secy Braverman in no-holds-barred letter to PM Rishi Sunak



LONDON, Nov 15 (Agencies): A day after being sacked as UK's Home Secretary, Suella Braverman burst out fiercely at Prime Minister Rishi Sunak, accusing him of "betrayal" by failing to keep his promises over controlling illegal immigration, or responding aptly to "extremism on

the streets".

"Your plan is not working," she said in a searing letter to her fellow Indian-origin leader.

"Either your distinctive style of government means you are incapable of doing so.

"Or, as I must surely conclude now, you never had any intention of keeping your promises," the controversial right-wing leader said in the letter, the BBC

reported.

"Someone needs to be honest: your plan is not working, we have endured record election defeats, your resets have failed and we are running out of time. You need to change course urgently."

Braverman accused Sunak of betraying his pledge to do "whatever it takes" to stop small boats crossing the Channel - which, she said, was among her conditions to take the post in October last year.

Following her sacking on Monday, Foreign Secretary James Cleverly was moved to the Home Office, while former prime minister David Cameron, making a political comeback, stepped into his role.

A No 10 spokesman thanked Braverman for her service, but added: "The Prime Minister was proud to appoint a strong, united team yesterday focused on delivering for the British people."

The immediate trigger for her removal was accusations of her of stoking tensions ahead of pro-Palestinian marches in London, against the backdrop of the Israel-Hamas war.

Braverman claimed police had applied a "double standard" to protesters, in an article for the Times newspaper.

In her letter, she also accused Sunak of failing "to rise to the challenge posed by the increasingly vicious antisemitism and extremism displayed on our streets".

"I have become hoarse urging you to consider legislation to ban the hate marches and help stem the rising tide of racism, intimidation and terrorist glorification threatening community cohesion," she added, accusing the PM of putting off "tough decisions in order to minimise political risk to yourself".

'Not Israel, but...': Netanyahu vs Trudeau on strikes, civilian killings in Gaza

JERUSALEM, Nov 15 (Agencies): Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu on Wednesday defended the ground operation by Israeli forces in the Gaza Strip, and said that it wasn't Israel, but Hamas, that is deliberately targeting civilians.

Netanyahu's remarks came in response to Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau expressing concern over the mounting death toll in the battered enclave and urging the Israeli government to exercise restraint.

"It is not Israel that is deliberately targeting civilians but Hamas that beheaded, burned and massacred civilians in the worst horrors perpetrated on Jews since the Holocaust. While Israel is doing everything to keep civilians out of harm's way, Hamas is doing everything to keep them in harm's way," Netanyahu said in a tweet.

He also said that Israel has been providing humanitarian corri-



dors and safe zones to civilians in Gaza, while Hamas prevents them from leaving "at gunpoint".

"It is Hamas, not Israel, that should be held accountable for committing a double war crime - targeting civilians while hiding behind civilians. The forces of civilization must back Israel in defeating Hamas barbarism," Netanyahu added.

In his sharpest criticism of Israel since the war against Hamas, Trudeau said that the "killing of women, of children, of babies" in the besieged Gaza Strip must end.

"I urge the government of Israel to exercise maximum restraint. The world is watching, on TV, on social media

agency Reuters quoted

him as saying.

Addressing a news conference in the western province of British Columbia, Trudeau said, "The world is witnessing this killing of women, of children, of babies. This has to stop."

However, Trudeau also said Hamas needed to stop using Palestinians as human shields and should release all its hostages.

He had earlier called for the release of all hostages in Gaza and the delivery of enough aid to address civilian needs.

Cash-strapped Pak sold Ukraine weapons worth \$364 mn: Report

ISLAMABAD, Nov 15 (Agencies): Cash-strapped Pakistan reportedly earned USD 364 million in an arms deal with two private US companies last year to supply ammunition to Ukraine in its war with Russia, according to a media report.

A British military cargo plane flew from the Pakistan Air Force Base Nur Khan in Rawalpindi to the British military base in Cyprus, Akrotiri, and then to Romania a total of five times to supply arms to the war-torn country, a news channel reported.

Islamabad has, however, consistently denied that it has provided any ammunition to Ukraine, a neighbouring country to Romania. Citing details of the contract from the American Federal Procurement Data System, the report claimed that Pakistan signed two contracts with American companies named "Global Military" and "Northrop Grumman" for the sale of 155mm shells.

These agreements to provide weapons to Ukraine were signed on August

17, 2022, and were specifically linked to the purchase of 155mm shells.

The Foreign Office in Islamabad has denied any sale of arms and ammunition to Ukraine, saying Pakistan maintained a policy of "strict neutrality" in the dispute between the two countries and did not provide them with any arms or ammunition in that context. These alleged agreements took place during the rule of the Pakistan Democratic Movement (PDM) — a multi-party coalition that ousted Imran Khan-led government through a no-trust vote in April last year. Then Pakistan Army chief Gen Qamar Javed Bajwa, who had pledged to take Pakistan-UK relations to a "new height", retired in November 2022.

In August 2022, when these alleged contracts were signed, the Ukraine crisis was very much a part of the political discourse in Pakistan, particularly in the wake of the cricketer-turned-politician Khan's visit to Russia on February 24, when Russian President Vladimir Putin ordered an invasion of Ukraine.

Australia Flags Threat From State-Backed Hackers, Singles Out 2 Countries

Australian Signals Directorate singled out Moscow and Beijing as among the country's greatest cyber threats in its latest report.

SYDNEY, Nov 15 (Agencies): Australia faces a "persistent threat" from state-backed hackers, the country's signals intelligence agency said Wednesday, highlighting the particular danger of Russian and Chinese cyberattacks on critical infrastructure.

Australia has been hit by a string of high-profile hacks in the past 12 months, including one late last week that crippled major ports for three days.

Without laying blame for specific hacks or intrusions, the Australian Signals Directorate singled out Moscow and Beijing as among the country's greatest cyber threats in its latest report.

State-backed hackers would probably continue targeting water supplies and electricity grids, the directorate said, and would likely ramp up efforts to steal military secrets from Australia and its allies.

Australia's AUKUS defence pact with the United Kingdom and the United States could be a prime target, the report warned. Under the AUKUS deal, Australia is set to acquire nucle-

ar-powered submarines and develop advanced technology such as artificial intelligence and hypersonic missiles.

"The AUKUS partnership, with its focus on nuclear submarines and other advanced military capabilities, is likely a target for state actors looking to steal intellectual property for their own military programs," the report said.

It highlighted an incident in May in which Beijing-backed hackers briefly infiltrated "critical infrastructure sectors" in the United States, warning that China could deploy similar techniques to gain access to Australian systems.

State-backed hackers are also creating "bespoke tools" to infiltrate government networks, the report warned, pointing to the Russian "Snake" malware network dismantled by the United States this year.

In that case, Russian spies used sophisticated malware to infect government networks and research facilities across some 50 countries.

Asked about the report's find-



ings on Wednesday, Australian Defence Minister Richard Marles said key trade partner China has also been "a source of security anxiety for our country".

Cybersecurity experts have said that inadequate safeguards and company stockpiling of sensitive customer information have made Australia a target for hack-

Major ports handling 40 percent of Australia's freight trade ground to a halt late last week after hackers infiltrated computers belonging to operator DP World.

Medibank, Australia's largest private health insurer, said last November that hackers had accessed the data of 9.7 million current and former customers, including medical records related to drug abuse and pregnancy terminations.

In September 2022, telecom company Optus fell prey to a data breach of similar magnitude in which the personal details of up to 9.8 million people were accessed.

Smoking responsible for 46% of COPD cases- experts

JAMMU / CHANDIGARH, Nov 15: "Chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) is the third biggest killer after heart disease and cancer worldwide. Many people consider increasing shortness of breath and coughing a normal part of aging. In the early stages of the disease, you may not notice symptoms. COPD can develop for years without even causing shortness of breath.

Sharing various facts and myths about lungrelated diseases on World COPD Day Wednesday, a team of doctors from IVY Hospital. Mohali said that one start seeing symptoms in the more advanced stages of the disease. COPD is a progressive form of lung disease ranging from mild to severe. It is characterized by a restriction on the flow of air in and out of the lungs that makes breathing difficult.

Dr Suresh Kumar Goyal senior pulmonologist said, "COPD often occurs in people aged 40 years and above who have a history of smoking. These may be individuals who are current or former smokers. Not everyone, but most (about 90%) people suffering from COPD have smoked. COPD can also occur in people who have long-term exposure to harmful lung irritants such as workplace chemicals, dust or fumes from organic cooking fuels."

Dr Sonal pulmonologist said that the prevalence of COPD in India is around 5.5% to 7.55%. Recent studies show that the prevalence rate of COPD is 22% in men and 19%

Dr Ranjit Kumar Gone from internal medicine

said that COPD is an incurable and progressive condition, which inflames the airways in the lungs and destroys the air sacs. Patients often cough, wheeze and have trouble breathing. Many sufferers have trouble walking short distances and are particularly vulnerable to disease and pneumonia. Often victims require oxygen support 24 hours a day.

India's COPD mortality rate is the highest in the world at 98 deaths per 1 lakh population, which is 3 times the US rate of 33 deaths per 1 lakh population, said Dr Jagpal Pandher from internal medicine adding smoking is responsible for 46% of COPD cases, followed by outdoor and indoor pollution which is responsible for 21% of COPD cases and occupational exposure to gases and smoke is responsible for 16% of COPD cases.

On the other hand, Bajaj Finance lost nearly 2 per cent, and was the top drag on the 50-share index. Power Grid, IndusInd Bank, Dr Reddy's Laboratories and Cipla were the other four companies that ended in negative territory.

The rally in the domestic markets was supported by healthy Q2 results and easing October inflation, both in India and the US.

Aditya Gaggar, Director of Progressive Shares, said, "Following strong domestic as well as global cues, Nifty 50 commenced the day on

a firm note and gradually compounded its gains to settle at 19,675.45, advanced by 231.90 points."

"On a daily chart, the Index has made a long-legged DOJI candlestick pattern and not only breached its falling trendline but also gave a convincing close above its 50DMA (19,580) which shows bullishness in the markets," he noted.

"Now the next critical hurdle for the Index stands at 19,840 while the downside is protected at a strong support zone of 19,550-19,580," Gaggar concluded.

Subrata Roy dies: Undistributed Funds worth Rs 25,000 crore with Sebi in focus

NEW DELHI, Nov 15 (Agencies): Sahara Group chairman Subrata Roy's death has put the spotlight on undistributed funds with over Rs 25,000 crore currently held by the capital markets regulator, Securities and Exchange Board of India (Sebi), reported news agency.

Following his death, the undistributed funds have revived discussions about the regulatory and legal battles faced by the Sahara Group's chief and his group firms, which were accused of employing Ponzi schemes to circumvent regulations—a charge consistently denied by the group.

In 2011, Sebi directed two Sahara Group entities, Sahara India Real Estate Corporation Ltd (SIREL) and Sahara Housing Investment Corporation Ltd (SHICL), to refund funds raised from approximately 3 crore investors through Optionally Fully Convertible Bonds (OFCDs).

Sebi deemed that the funds were garnered in violation of its rules and regulations. After a prolonged legal process, the Supreme Court on August 31, 2012, upheld Sebi's directive for the two firms to refund the

As a result, Sahara was asked to deposit an estimated Rs 24,000 crore with Sebi for further investor refunds, despite the group asserting it had already directly refunded over 95 per cent of the investors.

Details of Sebi's latest annual report, quoted in the agency report, suggested that the regulator issued refunds totaling Rs 138.07 crore over 11 years to investors of the two Sahara Group firms

Meanwhile, the funds deposited in dedicated bank accounts for repayment have exceeded Rs 25,000 crore.

With a majority of bondholders from the two Sahara companies not claiming, Sebi's total refunded amount increased by only about Rs 7 lakh in the last financial year, while the balance in Sebi-Sahara refund accounts rose by Rs 1,087 crore.

According to Sebi's annual report, as of March 31, 2023, it received 19,650 applications involving 53,687 accounts. Refunds have been processed for 17,526 applications, involving 48,326 accounts, amounting to Rs 138.07 crore, including an interest amount of Rs 67.98

However, the remaining applications were closed as their

records were untraceable in the data provided by the two Sahara Group firms.

Under Supreme Court orders and Sebi's attachment orders, an aggregate amount of Rs 15,646.68 crore has been recovered as of March 31, 2023. This sum, along with accrued interest after eligible bondholder refunds, was deposited in nationalised banks, totaling around Rs 25,163 crore as of March 31, 2023.

Meanwhile, in August, the government initiated the refund process for Rs 5,000 crore for depositors whose funds were stuck in four cooperative societies of the Sahara Group.

Union Minister Amit Shah launched the 'CRCS-Sahara Refund Portal' in July, registering around 18 lakh depositors.

The government aims to return the funds to 10 crore investors of the four cooperative societies within 9 months, following a Supreme Court order directing the transfer of Rs 5,000 crore from the Sahara-Sebi refund account to the Central Registrar of Cooperative Societies (CRCS).

West Asia war not to impact oil supply: IEA



NEW DELHI, Nov 15 (Agencies): The war between Israel and Hamas that began in early October will not have major impact on oil supply, said the International Energy Agency (IEA) in its monthly report. As per its November 2023 oil report, concerns about

the conflict escalating into a broader regional crisis, disrupting oil supply, have not materialised.

"Barring large unforeseen outages, world oil supply is firmly on an upward trajectory, with October output up 320 kb/d MoM (thousand barrels per day month-on-month). Record output from the United States, Brazil and Guyana underpin this year's 1.7 mb/d (million barrels per day) increase in global oil supplies, to a record 101.8 mb/d. In 2024, non-OPEC+ producers will continue to lead global growth, projected at 1.6 mb/d, to an unprecedented 103.4 mb/d," reads the report.

Crude oil prices saw a significant volatility in the past two months due to production cuts by major oil producers, Saudi Arabia and Russia, as well as the ongoing conflict between Israel and Pal-

NEW DELHI, Nov 15 (Agencies): Aggrieved by incessant tax demands and disallowance of expenses, a representative of auto and IT industries has written to the tax department in order to bring to its notice specific difficulties that tax-payers encounter during assessment processes,

tax officers are making adjustments based on information provided by other taxpayers.

In the representation made, the industry has given a detailed account of issues faced while complying with the tax rules and made several suggestions to ease the situation.

Elaborating on the difference between turnover reported in GST returns and statutory financial statements, the letter says the difference could be 'on account of the nature and framework of GST provisions and not necessarily because of income not being disclosed in financial statements'.

Aggrieved by incessant notices, industry asks

It cited inter-branch stock transfers, transactions with related parties without consideration, and deferred revenues at the end of the financial year, which are included as part of GST returns but will not be considered for finan-

cial statements.

The industry, therefore, requested the tax department to consider making the GST turnover reconciliation with financial statements part

of the tax audit report. "This would provide tax authorities with additional confidence in the reconciliation, allowing them to focus on other critical items during assessments," it said.

The letter also raised the issue of disallowance of legitimate business expenses, balance sheet items, or disallowance of expenses by alleging non-withholding of taxes on transactions where tax deductions are not required, or expenses are misunderstood by tax officers.

The industry has requested the tax department to issue guidelines advising tax officers to accept the genuineness of expenses in specific situations, such as when the taxpayer has no history of non-compliance or when sufficient supporting documents (e.g., 85-90% samples) are provided.

It also suggested setting materiality thresholds, accounting for the overall tax consequences of non-submitted immaterial details.

"Insignificant values with minimal tax liability impact but requiring significant extraction efforts may be deemed immaterial, avoiding exhaustive scrutiny," read the letter

The industry also suggested that field officers must obtain approval from higher authorities, especially in cases where the quantum of addition proposed exceeds a specified threshold.

The industry is also of the opinion that voluminous information requests by the tax department should be made early on, rather than as part of showcause notices.

It was also suggested that the recording of the assessment process should be easily accessible on the taxpayers' income tax portal.

Quitting smoking can lower diabetes risk by 30-40 per cent: WHO

Type-2 diabetes is one of the most prevalent chronic diseases worldwide

NEW DELHI, Nov 15 (Agencies): Quitting smoking can lower the risk of developing type-2 diabetes by 30-40 per cent, according to a new brief jointly developed by the WHO, the International Diabetes Federation and the University of Newcastle.

that smoking influences the body's ability to regulate blood sugar levels, which can cause type-2 diabetes, the WHO said in a statement.

Evidence suggests

Type-2 diabetes is one of the most prevalent chronic diseases worldwide, accounting for over 95 per cent of all diabetes cases, the UN agency said.

However, it is often preventable, and factors that contribute to developing type-2 diabetes include being overweight, not getting enough exercise, and genetics, according to the WHO.



537 million people have diabetes, a number that continues to rise making diabetes the ninth highest cause of death globally, the statement said. The IDF is a non-profit umbrella organisation of more than 240 national diabetes associations in 161 countries and territories.

Smoking also increases the risk of diabetesrelated complications such as cardiovascular disease, kidney failure and blindness, in addition to delaying healing of wound and enhancing the risk of lower limb amputations, WHO's statement said.

"The International Diabetes Federation strongly encourages people to stop smoking to reduce their risk of diabetes and, if they have diabetes, help avoid complications.

"We call on governments to introduce policy measures that will discourage people from smoking and remove tobacco smoke from all public spaces," said Akhtar Hussain, president of the IDF.

Quitting smoking also reduces the risk of diabetes complications, the UN agency said in its statement.

"Health professionals play a vital role in motivating and guiding individuals with type-2 diabetes in their journey to quit tobacco.

"Simultaneously, governments must take the crucial step of ensuring all indoor public places, workplaces and public transport is completely smoke-free.

"These interventions are essential safeguards against the onset and progression of this and many other chronic diseases," said Ruediger Krech, WHO's Director of Health Promotion. November 14 is observed as the World Diabetes Day.

Short sleep, shift work may raise risk of high BP: Study SYDNEY, Nov 15 The body's circadia

(Agencies): Short sleep lengths, daytime napping, shift work and even long sleep lengths have been linked to an increased risk of elevated blood pressure and cardiovascular disease, according to a new study.

The study, published in Nature Communications, is the first study to demonstrate that independent of other factors including age, sex and Body Mass Index (BMI), circadian rhythm-disrupting behaviours, including shift work, have an adverse effect on blood pressure regulation.

"We found that compromised sleep health or night shift work are associated with elevated blood pressure in both males and females and across all age groups," said lead author Morag Young, Associate Professor from the Baker Heart and Diabetes Institute in Melbourne.

"What we've found is that having circadian



rhythms out of sync even slightly has an adverse impact on blood pressure," Young added.

The study found that

permanent night shift workers who slept less than five or six hours were most at risk, but those working mixed shifts also showed elevated blood pressure. Interestingly, sleeping for too long a period also had a disruptive effect on circadian rhythms, Young said.

"Seven hours of sleep was found to be the optimal length of sleep for maintaining healthy blood pressure," Young said. "We found that too little sleep (less than seven hours) and too much sleep (anything more than seven hours) for adults also had a negative impact.

"Permanent night shift workers showed the greatest elevation in blood pressure, but those people working rotating shifts also showed elevated levels, although not as significant as permanent night shift workers.

"Our data also show that short sleep plus shift work has an additive negative effect on blood pressure." The body's circadian clock governs almost all processes in the human body, including metabolic function, cognition, heart rate and sleepwake behaviour.

Disruptions to the body's normal biological rhythms can leave the body out of sync, creating circadian strain, and thus negative consequences.

"Challenges that disrupt anticipation to daily light-dark cycles, food intake, and activity cues that are induced by nontraditional behavioural and lifestyle factors, like shift work, can adversely impact maintenance of normal biological rhythms at the systemic and cellular level, thereby compromising organ function," Young said.

"Blood pressure follows a well-characterised circadian rhythm, so disruption of this rhythm has significant implications for cardiovascular health outcomes," he noted.

Box office showdown: Sparks set to fly as Indian juggernaut faces tricky New Zealand in repeat of 2019 semifinal

MUMBAI, Nov 15 (Agencies): India have smashed every opponent over the past six weeks, but now comes the moment of truth — and moment of luck, too, says Rohit Sharma, the Indian captain.

"The time has come that you need a little bit of luck to go your way," said Rohit on the eve of their semifinal against New Zealand. "Obviously, we're going to be brave enough. And hopefully, fortune favours the brave."

Rohit's assertion of positivity seemed to reflect a mind coach's words; his comment about luck, the need for luck, however. reflected the underlying fear of the unknown that preys on the mind of a sportsperson.

In any game, there are uncontrollables that sportspersons are wary of; at the Wankhede, which side the coin lands on at the toss could be a decisive uncontrollable — teams batting first enjoy a massive advantage at this ground, right from the first game in 1987, when India batted first against Sri Lanka and piled up 299 in those days of relatively conservative batting.

During this tournament, batting first, South Africa made 399/7 against England and 382/5 against Bangladesh and won with ease; India then smashed 357/8 against Sri Lanka and routed them by 302 runs; Afghanistan made 291/5 against Australia and lost — but that was only due to a freakish innings of 201 by Glenn Maxwell, and the inexperience of the Afghan bowlers.

When the stadium was redeveloped before the 2011 World Cup, the ground became smaller, playing right into the hands of the batsmen. The dice is loaded in favour of the batsmen — in 12 ODIs played at the ground since the stadium's diminution, the team batting first has topped 300 four times, once exceeding 400. The clincher? The average first-innings total here since then is 308, the average for the second innings is 218 — a clear difference of 90 runs.

If that doesn't make the toss perhaps the 'luck' Rohit talked about — critical, nothing would. The mantra would be — bat first, pile up a huge score when the conditions favour the batters, then rock the opposition with movement in the air and off the pitch, as India did against Sri



What India did to Sri Lanka, New Zealand can do to India under the lights — they do have the resources in Trent Boult, the tall left-handed paceman who can make the ball angle across and then suddenly bend it back into the right-hander. Under the lights at the Wankhede, the ball has swung prodigiously — Boult could be quite a handful here, as he was in Manchester on July 9-10, 2019, when New Zealand beat India at the same stage of the World Cup.

India have struck fear into the hearts of the opposition. especially their pace bowlers - and their spin bowlers, and their batsmen! The pace trio of Mohammed Shami, Jasprit Bumrah and Mohammed Siraj has taken 45 wickets; spin twins Ravindra Jadeja and Kuldeep Yadav have another 30; Virat Kohli, Rohit Sharma and Shreyas Iyer have accumulated 1,518 runs, average 72.28; KL Rahul and Shubman Gill have 347 and 270 runs, respectively. Really, it seems India have all their bases covered, as Rohit

"The first (part) of the tournament, we chased the first five games, then the next four games we batted first," said Rohit. "So, in terms of the areas that we wanted to cover, I think we've covered almost every bit. We do understand the importance of this week, but I don't think we need to do anything different from what we've been doing in this tournament.'

Yes, but a bit of luck would be most welcome.

Everybody wants a piece of Rachin

Rachin Ravindra, 24 in four days, is a bald man's envy he seems to have such a full head of hair as could be enough envy of batsmen of all sorts, hairy or bald — the Wellington-born young man, son of migrants from India, has scored 565 runs in nine innings, average 70.62, with three hundreds

and two 50s. He's inspired myths, too, with the internet buzzing with the news that his name is a combination of the names of two legends, Rahul Dravid and Sachin Tendulkar. In fact, he himself seemed to have bought into this, having said: "Back in the day when Mum and Dad were deciding the names, they both liked Rahul and Sachin, so "Ra" from Rahul and "chin" from Sachin, but that was a long time ago. We don't talk about it much

anymore." That's a pleasing and plausible story, but his father now says the son got his facts wrong. He was named Rachin because it "sounded good, was easy to spell, and short", says the dad, Ravi Krishnamurthy, who obviously possesses accurate information. He added that Rachin wasn't named "with the intention to make our child a cricketer". But he's turned out to be guite a useful cricketer, as Kane Williamson acknowledged with his native effusiveness. "Yeah,

good player, right?" Kane and Everest

Kane Williamson is still cool. He was the losing captain in the 2019 World Cup final, and shrugged off the defeat that July 14 with remarkable stoicism, saying: "Yeah, obviously, just gutted.'

"Only five of these have been released so far!" he says. All this sounds a bit fishy to those used to the idea of brick and mortar companies, but Vijay Kumar and his friends are sure they've got a

ICC Cricket World Cup 2023: On song, India look to tame Kiwis



MUMBAI, Nov 15 (Agencies): Kane Williamson and Rohit Sharma, most laidback and coolest of men, cultivate forgetfulness. Williamson doesn't wish to remember that his team lost four matches in a row before qualifying for the semifinals of the World Cup. Rohit doesn't wish to dwell on the fact that India have regularly suffered losses to New Zealand in knockout matches of ICC events, including the 2019 World Cup semifinals and the 2021 Word Test Championships final.

When they clash in the semifinals of the World Cup here today, the two captains and their teams would wish to banish unpleasant memories go in with a clean slate, as it were. Williamson has forgotten the four losses which had left the team staring at the abyss. "Come finals time, everything starts again," Williamson said. "When you get to finals, things start again." Manjit Singh demands release of pending economic package for DPs

Seeks on spot recruitment for unemployed youth in Army, paramilitary, J&K Police

RAMGARH, Nov 15: Apni Party Provincial President, Jammu, and Former Minister, S. Manjit Singh has demanded release of the pending economic package for the Displaced Persons that was sanctioned by the previous Govt of India.

"The DPs have suffered for decades after their displacement from different places of Jammu region following hostility between two countries in 1947, 1965 and 1971. These unexpected situations forced them out of their homes and fertile agricultural fields," said Manjit Singh while addressing a worker's meeting in Ramgarh that was organized by District President Legal Cell, Samba, Adv Sahil Bharti and other leader



of Apni Party to discuss the issues of DPs, and border residents in Ramgarh.

In his address, he said that the DPs who were displaced from their own lands were settled in the border belt of Jammu in different locations in hostile conditions. However, these DPs managed to survive for all these tough years with no reservation in education, jobs and other sectors.

"These people lived a life under poverty while agriculture and labour work was their main source of earning. It was due to the years of suffering that the then Govt of India sanctioned Rs 25 lakhs in favour of each DP family in J&K. But this amount was not released completely," he reminded.

He said that around Rs 5.5 lakhs was released and many DP families complained that the revenue department and other related departments were asking them for formalities that were not possible for them to

In the backdrop of the development and pending package, he said that it becomes imperative for the Govt of India to release the pending amount of economic package in favour of the DPs in Jammu and Kashmir so that it could help them for their uplift-

ment.

He also demanded reservation in jobs, professional education and educational institutes. He also demanded that the Govt should hold on to spot recruitment drives for the unemployed youth of DPs in defence, paramilitary and J&K Police.

Meanwhile, he said that the DPs of 1965 and 1971 should be provided proprietary rights on the land they were given by the Govt and accordingly, the land deficiency should be fulfilled as per the promises made by the Govt in the past.

"The DPs are holding insufficient land in many areas, and they should be provided prescribed land at par with other DPs to end the land deficiency among the DPs," he added.
