No caste certificates for Saini community, **High Court** tells admin

SRINAGAR, Dec 1 (Agencies): The Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh High Court has issued an interim order, instructing government authorities to halt the issuance of caste certificates to the Saini community until the government conclusively determines their social status as a socially weak and

underprivileged class. This directive follows a petition by Saini community members opposing their classification as a 'weak and underprivileged class' and expressing their disinterest in availing reservation benefits.

Justice Rainesh Oswal, presiding over the case emphasised that no certificates should be granted to Saini community members until the government makes a final decision on their social status. Existing certificates are also temporarily suspended pending this determination.

"Till the final decision is taken by the government in this regard, no certificate is issued in favour of any member of Saini community and the certificates already issued shall not be given effect thereto, till the status of the Saini Community as socially weak and underprivileged class (social caste) is finally determined by the government," the Court directed.

In the petition, filed by Saini community members led by Suksham Singh, the challenge pertained to the government's declaration of their social status as weak and underprivileged, as outlined in an order dated October 19, 2022, amending the Jammu and Kashmir Reservation Rules,

The petitioner's counsel argued that the government's order was imposed against the wishes of the Saini community, an uppercaste group uninterested in reservation benefits. He highlighted widespread protests and discontent within the Saini community regarding their inclusion among the socially weak and underprivileged.

Responding, the counsel for the respondents stated that the



Ready to hold assembly polls in J&K whenever **Election Commission of India wants: LG Sinha**

JAMMU, Dec 1 (Agencies): Jammu and Kashmir Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha on Thursday said his administration is ready to hold assembly polls in the Union Territory whenever the Election Commission of India directs it to do so.

Taking a swipe at certain political leaders for spreading misinformation about elections, LG Sinha said he would leave Jammu and Kashmir only after successfully conducting the assembly polls.

"Whatever information has been sought by the ECI from J&K about arrangements, have been submitted to them. I want to tell from this platform that whenever



the ECI tells us, the J&K administration is ready to hold elections," Sinha said while addressing a conference, 'Samvaad'.

Referring to the democratic processes in J&K, LG Sinha highlighted that the right to conduct assembly polls lies exclusively with the Election Commission of India. He also criticized political leaders for allegedly misleading the public.

"My task was to ensure that writ of the nation is established in Jammu and Kashmir and that has been established. That was (my) work and I have performed it." he said.

"All top commanders of terrorist organisations have been eliminated. Those who are still alive will soon be eliminated. There is no place for terrorism here," he said.

He said that there is good coordination between the army, CRPF and police. "Attempts are being made by our neighbour to foment trouble here and some incidents took place. There was martyrdoom of some jawans. We will avenge those killings". he added.

On Kashmiri Pandits, he acknowledged the government's efforts in providing jobs and homes for 3,000 people

Woman among 3 drug peddlers arrested in

Baramulla

SRINAGAR, Dec 1 (Agencies): Three drug peddlers including a woman were arrested and contraband substances were recovered from their possession in Jammu Kashmir's Baramulla district on Friday, police said.

A team from Sheeri Police Station Sheeri at a checkpoint in at Kitchama near the Service Station intercepted two men and a woman coming towards Kitchama on a scooty.

During the search, 776 grams of contraband "Heroin" like substance were recovered from their possession.

The trio were identified as Riyaz Ahmad Ganie and Shokeen Ahmad Ganie - both residents of Batangi Boniyar and Saleema Begum, who resides at Mother Sheeri. They have been arrested and shifted to Police Station Sheeri where they remain in custody.

A case under relevant sections of the law has been registered. Investigation was on, police added.

The lawkeepers have also urged people to contact the nearest police establishment or dial 112 if they witness drug peddling or any other crime anywhere. "People are requested to cooperate with the police in curbing the menace of drugs from the society. We reassure the community members that police will act tough against the criminals as per law", an officer said.

Suresh Raina urges youth to register as voters

JAMMU, Dec 1 (Agencies): Former Indian cricketer Suresh Raina on Friday urged the youth to register as voters for the upcoming elections in the country during a visit to the Nirvachan Bhawan here.

Raina is currently participating in the Legends League Cricket matches taking place in Jammu. The fourth and final match in Jammu will feature Bhilwara Kings against Raina's team, Urbanrisers Hyderabad on Friday.

"I urge all youth to participate in elections. They should register for voting first and then cast their votes. The



last date for registration is December 9," Raina told reporters.

"You can choose the future leaders and advocate for rights. As a cricketer, I understand the impact a captain can have on the country. Your role as a voter is crucial," he added.

The Election Commission of India (ECI) has mandated a special summary revision of photo electoral rolls in all parliamentary and assembly constituencies in Jammu and Kashmir, with January 1, 2024, as the qualifying date.

RBI says Rs 2,000 notes totalling Rs 9,760 Cr still with public

MUMBAI, Dec 1 (Agencies): The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) on Friday said nearly 97.26 per cent of the Rs 2,000 bank notes have been returned to the banking system, and only about Rs 9,760 crore worth of the notes are still with the public.

On May 19, the RBI announced the withdrawal of Rs 2,000 denomination bank notes from circulation.

"The total value of Rs 2,000 bank notes in circulation, which amounted to Rs 3.56 lakh crore as at the close of business on May 19, 2023 when the withdrawal of Rs 2,000 bank notes was announced, has declined to Rs 9,760 crore as at the close of business on November 30, 2023," the RBI said

in a statement. Thus, 97.26 per cent



of the high-value currency in circulation as on May 19, 2023, has since been returned to the banking system, it added.

"The Rs 2,000 bank notes continue to be legal tender," the RBI added.

People can deposit and/or exchange Rs 2.000 bank notes at the 19 RBI offices across the country. People can also send Rs 2,000 bank notes through India Post from any post office, to any of the RBI Issue Offices for credit to their bank accounts in India. Public and entities

holding such notes were initially asked to either exchange or deposit them in bank accounts by September 30. The deadline was later extended to October 7. Both deposit and exchange services at bank branches were discontinued on October 7.

Starting October 8, individuals have been provided with the choice of either exchanging the



Srinagar-Leh highway closed for traffic after fresh snowfall

SONAMARG, Dec 1 (Agencies): The higher reaches of Kashmir, including Zojila Pass and the health resort of Sonamarg in the Ganderbal district, experienced snowfall on Friday, resulting in the closure of the strategic Srinagar-Sonamarg-Gumri (SSG) road.

Zojila Pass received 3-4 inches of snowfall, while Sonamarg also saw 3 inches of snow, covering the area in a pristine white blanket.

The Srinagar-Leh

highway was closed to traffic due to the recent snowfall in the higher reaches, including Zojila Pass. Approximately 3-4 inches of snow accumulated at Zojila Pass on the Srinagar-Leh highway, prompting a precautionary halt to traffic movement.

The Border Roads Organisation has deployed its machinery for snow clearance, with an official from the BRO project Beacon stating that the

machines are actively working to clear the snow from the road.

He mentioned that after completing the snow clearance work and as weather conditions improve, a decision will be made regarding the resumption of traffic.

The Silkyara lesson: Can we unite to fight crises?

Then the rescuers tunnelling into the blocked Himalayan tunnel at Silkyara in Uttarakhand's Uttarkashi region broke through to the 41 trapped workers on Tuesday evening, the predictable nationwide elation and relief that followed was bolstered by the realisation that the country could still get its act together on occasion and not always flounder in confusion and incompetence as it has so often done during moments of crises in the past.

For the millions of citizens fixated on the rescue drama played out on television news channels moment by moment for 17 seemingly unending days, the rescue was a gratifying national event. It was also an example of the power of the collective will, and proof of the efficacy of a single-minded, concerted approach to problem-solving.

While most praise deservedly went to the 24 "rat hole miners" and the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) personnel responsible for the final breakthrough, no less noteworthy was the involvement of a plethora of other agencies, including the Prime Minister's Office (PMO), which was overseeing the entire operation, the Army, the Indian Air Force, the State Disaster Response Force, ONGC, various experts and an Australian rescue consultant. The most remarkable aspect of this collective effort was the absence of crossed wires, purposes or intent. They were all unified by the single objective of rescuing the trapped tunnel workers, no matter what it took. In the end, this approach worked brilliantly.

There are lessons to be learnt from the success of this rescue mission, those that will fortify us against and help tackle future disasters. These lessons could also serve as a guide in confronting the major national challenges crippling our democracy such as poverty, malnutrition, social conflicts, insurgencies and so on.

The foremost in the list is the need for single-mindedness of purpose. Too often crisis managers fail when the endgame is not clearly identified. At Silkyara, it was simple: the safe extrication of all trapped workers. In other situations, the aim might not be so clear-cut, and it might require a good leader to articulate the problem and knit all available resources towards solving it. The success of legendary world leaders such as Josef Stalin, Winston Churchill and Frankin D. Roosevelt during World War II is testimony to the importance of focused resolve. Each of them clearly identified the enemy, articulated a goal and rallied their countrymen towards the fulfilling of that overwhelming objective.

In contrast, the American leadership during the 1960s failed to identify what exactly the US was fighting for in Vietnam, why Communism in a backward Asian country was a threat to American citizens and why young Americans should die fighting a war they did not understand. The result was widespread confusion within the United States, a divided polity and a veritable youth revolt. Predictably, the war was lost even though military objectives were being met.

While an enlightened leadership inspired by single-mindedness of purpose is a necessary condition for success, it is not sufficient. The effective leader also needs to combine resources, skills and the collective will. This was much in evidence at the Silkyara operation as it is in every successful response to a crisis.

During the Second World War, the leaders of Britain, United States and the Soviet Union could mobilise their entire populations to contribute to the war effort: young men went to the frontlines, while others manned factories producing war material, women came forth to work at the assembly lines and even children learnt to cope with those hard times. Every effort was geared towards feeding and maintaining the war machine against Nazi Germany and Imperial Japan.

In India, the genius of Mahatma Gandhi succeeded in mobilising the collective will of Indians against their colonial masters. He converted a faltering middle class Independence movement into an enormous, all-encompassing revolt that carried with it the middle class, the workers as well as peasants from the remotest parts of the country. This collective proved unstoppable.

Mrs Indira Gandhi in 1971 achieved a similar feat by uniting the country against Pakistan's depredations in its eastern wing. The country rallied behind her call to liberate Bangladesh despite severe hardships, limited resources and the threat from a powerful superpower. Six years later, the country once again united, this time against her and the repressive state of political "Emergency" she had imposed on the nation.

Most failed states in recent history have one thing in common: the failure to establish a common unifying national vision. Thus, countries such as Somalia, Afghanistan, Yemen, Syria, Haiti, Pakistan, Myanmar, South Sudan and others remain at perpetual boiling point with frequent outbreaks of extreme violence and attendant mass distress. The failure to maintain collective resolve is the first step towards calamity.

The other impediments to success include dissipation of purpose, a failure to stay the course and callousness or laaparvahi, as it is known in Hindustani. The latter is

perhaps this country's worst enemy after corruption. Disasters, both natural and man-made, continue to recur with depressing regularity with no solution in sight. This endless catalogue includes the annual winter haze over North India, the regular floods in many parts of the country that submerge fields and the fortunes of countless people, the indifference to corruption, development projects that drag on for years, and much more. There is sadly no will or single-mindedness to confront such endemic challenges.

The existence of too many aims is another recipe for disaster, the best examples of which come from military history. Hitler's war was doomed the moment he took on the Soviet Union in the East as well as the Allied forces in the West. In India, one fundamental problem is the multiplicity of tasks taken on by governments and the leadership. In this milieu, there is a tendency of prematurely ticking off achievements even when they are half-completed. One such example is the well-intentioned but flagging Swachh Bharat Abhiyan against civic filth.

The country today stands divided, fractious, plagued by conflicting ideas and objectives. Millions of people remain in poverty while many more are doomed to a half existence marked by malnutrition and backwardness. The country's environment is degrading at an alarming rate as an ever-growing population sucks out every natural resource in the race to survive and prosper. Caste, ethnic, communal and economic fault lines have cleaved communities. These constitute a crisis no less pressing the one which we managed to successfully confront at Silkyara. Will the country come together to rescue all those trapped in our darkness?

The PM is in Dubai to attending World Climate Action Summit

NEW DELHI / DUBAI. Dec 1 (Agencies): Prime Minister Narendra Modi has called for ensuring requisite climate financing and technological transfer to developing countries, asserting that it must be recognised that they have not contributed in creating the climate problem but are still willing to be a part of the solution.

In Dubai to attend the COP28 meeting, Modi told the UAEbased Aletihad in an interview that he has always maintained that climate change is a collective challenge that demands a unified global response.

Rising ambitions on climate action must see matching progress on climate finance, he asserted.

India, he said, is optimistic that the meeting will inject fresh momentum into effective climate

He expressed hope that COP28 would bring fresh impetus to effective climate action and international cooperation in advancing the goals of the UNFCCC and the Paris Agree-

"India and the UAE stand as partners in shaping a greener and more prosperous future, and we remain steadfast in our joint efforts to influence the global discourse on climate action," he said.

Speaking on the Indo-UAE ties, he said their partnership in climate action is going from strength to strength, driven by a futuristic vision.

India and the UAE enjoy robust and enduring relations and can join forces in establishing a common grid to enhance energy security, leveraging each other's strengths in the energy sector and providing support to the International Solar Alliance's Global Solar Facility, Modi told the newspaper.



"India and the UAE stand as partners in shaping a greener and more prosperous future, and we remain steadfast in our joint efforts to influence the global discourse on climate action," he said.

It is his sixth visit to the UAE since becoming prime minister in 2014. As countries that share a vision of promoting sustainability and renewable energy, India and the UAE have emerged as leaders in global renewable energy efforts, he said, commending the UAE's unwavering commitment to climate action within the renewable energy sector.

On climate finance, often a sticking point during climate talks, Modi said he has always maintained that it is a collective challenge that demands a unified global response.

"It is essential to recognise that developing countries have not contributed in the creation of the problem. Yet developing countries are willing to be a part of the solution," the prime minister said.

"But, they cannot contribute without access to the financing and technology needed... I have, therefore, advocated

transfer," he said, stressing the importance of ensuring that climate financing flows to the developing world in a practical and assured manner. He added, "I believe climate

"I am happy that during the recent New Delhi G20 Summit, this aspect has been properly addressed, including through a recognition of the need to rapidly and substantially scale up investment and climate finance from billions to trillions of dollars globally from all sources," he said.

The implementation of commitments of developed countries to provide technological and financial support to developing countries needs to be at the forefront of the agenda at COP28, he stressed, adding that rising ambitions on climate action must see matching progress on climate finance.

"At COP28, we hope to have credible progress on the New Collective Quantified Goal (NCQG) on Climate Finance," he said.

On collaboration between the two countries, he said their cooperation spans the entire energy spectrum, with a strong focus on sustainability.

"Our enduring relationship is founded on multiple pillars, and the dynamism of our ties is expressed by our Comprehensive Strategic Partnership," Modi said.

The two nations have been actively collaborating on addressing the pressing global challenge of climate change, he said.

Delving into the "futuristic vision" driving India's partnership with the UAE in the climate domain, he said the two countries have had robust cooperation in the area of renewables since 2014, and during his visit to the UAE in July this year they resolved to take forward their cooperation in green hydrogen, solar energy and grid connec-

The Indian nationals were on October 26 given death sentence by Qatar's Court of First Instance. India described the ruling as "deeply" shocking and vowed to explore all legal options in the case.

An appeal has already been filed against the death sentence and a higher court in Qatar has already admitted the plea.

The appeal has been filed by the legal team of the detained Indian

The Indian nationals, who worked with private company Al Dahra, were arrested in August last year reportedly in an alleged case of espionage.

Neither the Qatari authorities nor New Delhi made the charges against the Indian nationals public.

In its reaction to the ruling by the Qatari court, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) last month said that it is attaching "high importance" to this case and is exploring all legal options.

The charges were filed against the eight Indian navy veterans on March 25 and they were tried under Qatari law.

All of the former Navy officers had "unblemished stints" of up to 20 years in the Indian Navy and had held important positions, including that of instructors in the force, former military officials had said.

CBSE not to award any division, distinction in Class 10, 12 board exams: Official

NEW DELHI, Dec 1 (Agencies): The Central Board of Secondary Education will not award any division or distinction in class 10 and 12 board exams, a senior official said on Friday.

"No overall division, distinction or aggregate of marks shall be awarded. Also, if a candidate has offered more than five subjects, the decision to determine the best five subjects may be taken by the admitting institution or employer," said CBSE **Examination Controller** Sanyam Bhardwaj.

15 private schools in Bengaluru receive bomb threat; students, staff evacuated

BENGALURU, Dec 1 (Agencies): At least 15 private schools in Bengaluru on Friday morning received an email with a bomb threat on its premises, triggering panic among the staff and parents, police said.

The school authorities immediately alerted police, which reached the institutions concerned with the bomb disposal squads and anti-sabotage

check teams, they said. The students and staff were immediately evacuated from the school premises, police said, adding no suspicious objects have been found yet.

As soon as parents got to know about the incident, they rushed to schools in panic to get their children back home safely.

"The email claimed that explosives had been planted on school premises. We received a call from the command centre and immediately rushed our teams to schools which are located in different parts of the city. All students and staff have been safely evacuated from the

school premises and a thorough search operation is being carried out," a senior police officer said.

So far, nothing suspicious has been found and prima facie looks like it's a hoax message. Parents need not panic, our teams are on the ground, he

Last year also, some miscreants sent such emails claiming about a bomb threat to schools in Bengaluru, which later turned out to be a hoax message, police said.

Karnataka Deputy Chief Minister D K Shivakumar visited one of the schools which received the bomb threat. He took information from the school and the police about the situation.

"I was a bit dismayed after seeing the news on TV, as some schools I know and the one near my house were also mentioned. So I went out to check. The police have shown me the mail. Prima facie, it appears to be fake (hoax). I spoke to the police... But we should be cautious. Parents are a bit worried, no need to worry. Police are looking into it," he said.

Shivakumar appealed to parents not to worry and said their children would be safe.

"Some mischief mongers might have done this, in 24 hours we will nab them. Cyber crime police are active, they are doing their job... We should also be cautious and should not

neglect," he added. Meanwhile, Karnataka Home Minister G Parameshwara said the message had come from email id kharijites@beeble.com. The email says bombs have been placed in about 15 schools in Bengaluru and threatened to kill children and staff.

"We are seriously verifying it and its source. I have spoken to the Commissioner and officials and have given the necessary instructions and verification on whether it's true or hoax and measures to be taken accord-

"We will verify as to who is behind it and there is involvement of any terrorist organisation, and take measures accordingly. For now, it cannot be said who is behind it. The message in the email asks people to convert and other things, it will be verified," he told reporters here.

The Home Minister recalled that last year too, a similar threat had come. It was a hoax. This also may be a hoax, but we won't take it lightly. Even if there is one per cent (doubt), we will take it seriously and take measures like sensitising the intelligence and informing central agencies, which the department has to do.

Stating that he is in regular touch with officials and, if necessary, will hold a meeting with senior officials, Parameshwara appealed to parents and the public not to worry.

"First we will focus on checking and clearing in 15 schools, and will look into other schools later with jurisdiction police station officials visiting them," he

Assam Government suspends 15 ACS, APS officers in Assam Public Service Commission 'cash for job' scam

Nearly 70 persons, including over 50 civil and police officials, have been arrested so far in the scam

GUWAHATI, Dec 1 (Agencies): The Assam Government has suspended 15 state civil service and police service officers for their alleged involvement in the Assam Public Service Commission (APSC) 'cash for job' scam, official sources said on Friday.

Out of the 15 officers placed under suspension through orders issued on Thursday, 11 are from the Assam Police Service (APS) and the rest from the Assam Civil Service (ASC).

Of these, two APS officers had been arrested in the case last week. while summons to appear before a Special Investigation Team (SIT) of the state police which is probing the case have been issued to several

others, the sources said. The suspension notifications issued by the Personnel department said these officers were beneficiaries of the

"anomalies and malpractices carried out by the APSC" and they got appointment by "enhancement" of their originally scored marks in the final tabulation sheet based on which the final results were

It said the recommendation of the APSC for recruitment of these officers was "illegal" and the process through which they obtained their jobs "amount to gross misconduct, corruption and

declared.

moral turpitude".

As they are under investigation for criminal offence, allowing them to continue in their present post "may not be in the interest of public service and may cause embarrassment to the government", it said.

In view of it, the officers have been placed under suspension with immediate effect, the notification said.

The evidence-based on which the nowsuspended officers are facing investigation was reported in the one-man Justice (Retd) BK Sarma commission.

It had unearthed "anomalies and malpractices resorted to for the selection of candidates in exchange of money and other extraneous consideration by the APSC headed by the then chairman Shri Rakesh Kumar Paul while conducting the Combined Competitive Examination, 2013/ 2014", the notification added.

The APSC was embroiled in the 'cash for job' scam, which came to light in 2016, and nearly 70 persons, including Paul and over 50 civil and police services officials, have been arrested so far.

Paul was arrested by Dibrugarh police in November 2016 and released on bail in March this year.

The Chief Minister had directed the Director-General of Police (DGP)

to constitute a SIT in September this year to further investigate the

The SIT, headed by additional DGP (CID) Munna Prasad Gupta, is conducting the probe now and has been directed to submit its report within six months to the Gauhati High Court in a sealed enve-

lope. The Chief Minister's Office (CMO) had said last month that the state government has already initiated departmental proceedings against 34 tainted officials of the 2013 batch whose names were mentioned in the Justice (Retd) B K Sarma Committee report.

Similarly, action has been initiated against those candidates of the 2014 batch who were allegedly selected by unfair means with their marks changed during the tabulation process.

Israel-Hamas conflict: Israel resumes Gaza assault after 7-day truce expires

PM Netanyahu says Hamas did not release all women hostages as agreed, launched rockets at Israel

GAZA, Dec 1 (Agencies): Israel resumed combat operations against Hamas in Gaza on Friday after accusing the Palestinian militant group of firing rockets at Israel and reneging on a deal to free all women held as hostages, violating their temporary truce agreement.

The seven-day pause, which began on November 24 and was extended twice, had allowed for the exchange of dozens of hostages held in Gaza for hundreds of Palestinian prisoners and facilitated the entry of humanitarian aid into the shattered coastal strip.

In the hour before the truce was set to end at 7 a.m. (0500 GMT), Israel said it intercepted a rocket fired from Gaza.

There was no immediate comment from Hamas or claim of responsibility for the launch.

"With the resumption of fighting we emphasise: The Israeli government is committed to achieving the goals of the war - to free our hostages, to eliminate Hamas, and to ensure that Gaza will never pose a threat to the residents of Israel," the office of Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu said in a statement.

Hamas was also defiant.

"What Israel did not achieve during the fifty days before the truce, it will not achieve by continuing its aggression after the truce," Ezzat El Rashq, a member of the Hamas political bureau, said on the group's web

Palestinian media and Gaza's interior ministry reported Israeli air and artillery strikes across the enclave after the truce expired, including in Rafah, near the border with Egypt.

In Khan Younis, in the southern Gaza Strip, a Reuters witness said he could hear heavy shelling and see smoke rising in the east of the town. People were fleeing the area to camps



in the west of Khan Younis for cover, he added.

Al-Jazeera reported a number of people had been killed and injured by Israeli raids and shell-

The Israel military confirmed its iets were striking Hamas targets in Gaza.

Images on social media showed large plumes of dark smoke rising over the densely built-up Jabalia camp in Gaza.

Israel has sworn to annihilate Hamas, which rules Gaza, in response to the Oct. 7 rampage by the militant group, when Israel says gunmen killed 1,200 people and took 240 hostages.

Israel retaliated with intense bombardment and a ground invasion. Palestinian health authorities deemed reliable by the United Nations say more than 15,000 Gazans have been confirmed killed.

HOSTAGES HEAD HOME

Qatar and Egypt had been making intensive efforts to extend the truce following the exchange on Thursday of the latest batch of eight hostages and 30 Palestinian prisoners.

Israel had previously set the release of 10 hostages a day as the minimum it would accept to pause its ground assault and bombardment.

Thursday's releases brought the totals freed during the truce to 105 hostages and 240 Pales-

tinian prisoners Among those released were six women aged 21 to 40 including one Mexican-Israeli dual national and 21-year-old Mia Schem, who holds both French and Israeli citizenship.

Photos released by the Israeli prime minister's office showed Schem, who was captured by Hamas along with others at an outdoor music festival in southern Israel on Oct. 7, embracing her mother and brother after they were reunited at Hatzerim military base in Israel.

The other two newly released hostages were a brother and sister, Belal and Aisha al-Ziadna, aged 18 and 17 respectively, according to the Israeli prime minister's office. They are Bedouin Arab citizens of Israel and among four members of their family taken hostage while they were milking cows on a farm.

One of Qatar's lead negotiators, career diplomat Abdullah Al Sulaiti, who helped broker the truce through marathon shuttle negotiations, acknowledged in a recent Reuters interview the uncertain odds of keeping the guns silent.

"At the beginning I thought achieving an agreement would be the most difficult step," he said in an article that detailed the behind-the-scenes efforts for the first time. "I've discovered that sustaining the agreement itself is equally challenging."

ISRAEL AGREES TO PRO-TECT CIVILIANS, BLINKEN SAYS The truce had allowed some humanitarian aid into Gaza after much of the coastal territory of 2.3 million people was reduced to wasteland in the Israeli assault.

More fuel and 56 trucks of humanitarian supplies entered Gaza on Thursday, Israel's defence ministry and the Palestinian Red Crescent Society

But deliveries of food, water, medical supplies and fuel remain far below what is needed, aid workers say.

At an emergency meeting in Amman, Jordan's King Abdullah on Thursday urged U.N. officials and international groups to pressure Israel to allow more aid into the beleaguered enclave, according to delegates.

When the ceasefire first came into effect a week ago, Israel was preparing to turn the focus of its operation to southern Gaza after its seven-week assault to the north.

U.S. Secretary of State Antony Blinken, in Israel during his third visit to the Middle East since the war began, did not comment on the resumption of fighting as he headed for Dubai.

On Thursday, Blinken said he told Netanyahu Israel cannot repeat in south Gaza the massive civilian casualties and displacement of residents it inflicted in the north.

"We discussed the details of Israel's ongoing planning and I underscored the imperative for the United States that the massive loss of civilian life and displacement of the scale that we saw in northern Gaza not be repeated in the south," Blinken told reporters in Tel Aviv, adding the Israeli government had agreed.

'Absolutely inhumane and unconscionable': Indian student beaten, forced into labour for months in US

WASHINGTON, Dec 1 (Agencies): Authorities in the US have rescued a 20-year-old Indian student, who was held captive for months without access to a bathroom, viciously beaten, and forced to work at three homes by his cousin and two other men in an incident described as "absolutely inhumane and unconscionable.'

The victim, whose name was not disclosed, spent months trapped in three homes in the US state of Missouri.

Police descended upon a home on a rural highway in St Charles County. They later arrested Venkatesh R Sattaru, Sravan Varma Penumetcha and Nikhil Verma Penmatsa, and charged them with offences including human trafficking, kidnapping and assault.

Police were dispatched to investigate the home after a concerned citizen became aware of his situation and called 911.

The victim is safe and being treated at a hospital for multiple bone fractures, as well as lacerations and injuries covering his entire body, said prosecutor Joe

Over seven months, the men locked the student in a basement and forced him to sleep on an unfinished floor without access to a bathroom, charges say.

He scavenged for scraps in nearby restaurant dumpsters and was beaten with electrical wire, PVC pipe, metal rods, wooden boards, sticks and a water supply hose for a washing machine, St Louis Post-Dispatch, a major regional newspaper, reported.

"It's absolutely inhumane and unconscionable that one human being could treat another human being like this," said McCulloch at a news conference.

The three defendants are accused of confining and abusing the victim at three different homes owned by Sattaru in Defiance, Dardenne Prairie and O'Fallon, starting in April 2023, according to St Charles County's official web-

Sattaru was identified by investigators as the ringleader and lives in the O'Fallon home with his wife and children.

The main suspect in the case, Sattaru, 35, is additionally charged with human trafficking for the purpose of slavery and contributing to human trafficking through misuse of documentation.

Penumetcha and Penmatsa live in the home where the student was rescued. Authorities said the student had come to the US from India last year with hopes of studying at Missouri University of Science and Technology in Rolla. Instead,

he was taken to Sattaru's homes beginning in April and was forced to begin chores around 4:30 am, work a full day for Sattaru's IT company and then complete a list of evening tasks.

The student told police he regularly got three hours of sleep on a concrete floor in a locked basement where Sattaru monitored him with a surveillance camera, according to court documents.

If the 20-year-old didn't complete the tasks properly, he was severely beaten. Charges say he was forced to strip down naked and was hit all over his body. He was kicked, stomped and lashed, charges say, and his injuries included previous fractures and breaks that did not heal properly.

No one answered the door at Sattaru's home on Thursday afternoon. None of the three men had attorneys listed in court documents.

"They beat him with their fists, they stomped on him, they beat him with electrical wiring, with PVC pipes," McCulloch said. "They forced him to sleep in an unfinished basement, they starved him, and limited his access to the public and to restrooms."

McCulloch commended that citizen for making the rescue possible.

"If you see something, say something. We would much rather check it out and find nothing than have an incident like this that's been going on for nearly a year," McCulloch said.

Because the three suspects are wealthy and have political connections in India, McCulloch said they are being held at the St. Charles County Jail with-

Neighbours in O'Fallon were shaken by the arrests on Thursday.

Many said they'd had pleasant interactions with the family, waving as they passed on the street or playing with children in the cul-de-sac.

"It's shocking, for sure," said Chirag Shah, who lives down the street from Sattaru's home.

And in Defiance, an unincorporated community of less than 100 people known for its wineries, gift shops and position along the Katy Trail, neighbours watched as police flocked to the home beginning Wednesday morning, the paper reported.

Police were told at first by a man in the home that they couldn't come inside, but the 20-year-old eventually came running from the basement. He was trembling uncontrollably, heavily scarred and suffering from bruising and swelling all over his body, charges say.

"Take It Very Seriously": US **After Indian Charged In Alleged Murder Plot**

WASHINGTON, Dec 1 (Agencies): The White House National Security Council spokesperson, John Kirby, stressed on Friday that the US continues to improve its strategic partnership with India. On the other side, he added that the US "takes this very seriously," referring to the indictment by the US Department of Justice against an Indian in an alleged foiled assassination plot.

While speaking at a press briefing, Kirby said, "India remains a strategic partner, and we are going to continue to work to improve and strengthen that strategic partnership with India."

Referring to the US Justice Department indictment of an Indian national in an alleged foiled assassination plot in the US, Kirby added, "At the same time, we take this very seriously. These allegations and this investigation, we take very seriously."

He further said that we are glad to see that India is also taking it seriously by announcing their "own efforts to investigate this.'

"We have been clear that we want to see anybody that's responsible for these alleged crimes to be held properly accountable...," Kirby stressed.

The US Department of Justice unsealed an indictment against an Indian national for his



alleged involvement in a foiled plot to assassinate a US-based leader of the Sikh Separatist Movement and a citizen in New York.

The US Justice Department has claimed that an Indian government employee (named CC-1), who was not identified in the indictment filed in a federal court in Manhattan, recruited an Indian national named Nikhil Gupta to hire a hitman to allegedly carry out the assassination of the Sikh Separatist, which was foiled by US authorities.

The US Justice Department claimed that Gupta, is an associate of CC-1, and has described his involvement in international narcotics and weapons trafficking in his communications with CC-1. The indictment claims CC -1 directed the assassina-

tion plot from India. Moreover, in a news briefing the MEA on Thursday said that a

case filed against an individual in a US court and allegedly linking him to an Indian official is a "matter of concern" and is contrary to government policy.

"We cannot share any further information on such security matters. As regards the case against an individual that has been filed in a US court allegedly linking him to an Indian official, this is a matter of concern. We have said and let me reiterate that this is contrary to government policy," MEA spokesperson Arindam Bagchi said.

"The nexus between organised crime, trafficking and gun running and extremists at an international level is a serious issue for law enforcement agencies and organisations to consider and it is precisely for that reason that a high-level committee has been constituted and we will obviously be guided by its results," he added.

Ospreys despite grounding request

cies): Japan is concerned that the U.S. military is continuing to fly Osprey aircraft despite its request to ground them until their safety is confirmed after an accident this week, Japan's top government spokesperson said on Friday.

Japan, a key U.S. ally, had sought the suspension of all non-emergency V-22 Osprey flights over its territory after one fell into the sea on Wednesday in western Japan. Japan's Coast Guard has said one

confirmed dead, and the search for the remaining

seven aboard continues. The Pentagon said on Thursday that it was still flying Ospreys for now, and that it was not aware of any official request for their grounding.

Asked about that statement, Japan's chief cabinet secretary, Hirokazu Matsuno, said Tokyo had "officially" made the request.

"We are concerned that despite our repeated requests, and in



the absence of sufficient explanation (from the U.S. military), the Osprey continues to fly," he told a news conference.

The Japan Self-Defense Forces (SDF), which also operates Ospreys, has said it would suspend flights of the transport aircraft.

hybrid aircraft in Japan has been controversial, with critics of the U.S. military presence in the southwest islands saying it is prone to accidents.

Japan hosts the biggest overseas concentration of U.S. military power, with the country home to the only forward-deployed American carrier strike group, its Asian airlift hub, fighter squadrons and a U.S. Marine Corps expeditionary force.

Kim Jong Un orders military readiness in North Korea against any 'provocation' with fresh sanctions over the

SEOUL, Dec 1 (Agencies): North Korean leader Kim Jong Un has called for his military to be ready to respond to any "provocation" by the enemy, state media said on Friday, after Pyongyang vowed to deploy stronger armed forces and new weapons along its border with the South.

Tensions on the Korean peninsula have increased since the North last month launched a spy satellite, prompting Seoul to suspend a key clause in a 2018 inter-Korean military accord and Pyongyang in turn to declare it was no longer bound by the

Visiting North Korea's air force command on Thursday for the branch's airmen day, Kim rolled out guidelines to improve the military's combat posture and increase "its capabilities to fight a war to the full," news agency KCNA reported.

"He set forth operational and

tactical policies ... to counter any military provocation and threat of the enemy immediately and powerfully," KCNA said.

That stop was followed by a visit to a fighter wing, where pilots staged a demonstration flight, it said.

Photographs released by state media showed Kim and his daughter dressed in long leather iackets, watching the show.

Kim praised the air force for being "fully prepared to perfectly

carry out their air combat missions under any unfavourable situation," KCNA said. The United States and its allies

have strongly condemned the North's first spy satellite launch as a violation of multiple United Nations Security Council resolutions. But Pyongyang has said it would launch more satellites, calling it an exercise of a right to self-defence.

On Thursday, the United States targeted North Korea satellite launch, designating foreign-based agents it accused of facilitating sanctions evasion. South Korea also announced sanctions on 11 North Koreans. Reflecting the rising strain,

South Korea has suspended tours of the Demilitarised Zone (DMZ) between the two Koreas, a Seoul official said.

Local media reported that North Korean soldiers at the Joint Security Area (JSA) inside the DMZ had started carrying firearms again after the North withdrew from the inter-Korean military deal.

The DMZ tours restarted last week; they had been halted after a US soldier's unauthorised crossing into North Korea while on a tour in July. Private Travis King was later handed back by the North and returned to the United States, where he faces charges.

Workshop 'Peer support for students with disabilities' inaugurated at JU



JAMMU, Dec 1: Sunil Dimple, President of Mission Statehood, on Friday urged Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Home Minister Amit Shah to announce in the Parliament session on December 4 that assembly elections in J&K should be held simultaneously with the parliamentary elections.

Addressing a press conference here, Dimple supported the statement made by Lieutenant Governor (LG) Manoj Sinha that the J&K administration is prepared for assembly elections.

Dimple demanded the restoration of the J&K Dogra State and the implementation of the stand-still agreement and conditions outlined in the Instrument of Accession signed by Maharaja Hari Singh with India during the accession. He demanded a clear stand on Permanent Resident Certificate (PRC), protection of land and jobs,



and the unification of J&K,

Ladakh, POK, Gilgit, and

Baltistan in the J&K state.

Dimple mentioned an

ongoing high-level meeting between RSS (Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh) and BJP (Bharatiya Janata Party) in Jammu, suggesting that they should announce and demand joint assembly and parliament elections in J&K.

Dimple claimed that the verdict on petitions filed regarding the abrogation of Article 370 and J&K statehood will be announced shortly, on or before

December 15. He alleged that the BJP is attempting to divide J&K further with Article 371.

Dimple outrightly rejected the idea of further dividing Jammu and Kashmir into separate Kashmir and Jammu states.

He emphasized that neither a separate Kashmir nor a separate Jammu state is acceptable, and Article 371 is also rejected.

Dimple outlined plans after the installation of a popular government, including the reversal of anti-Jammu Kashmir laws imposed by the BJP. He also expresses the intention to convert and cancel all domiciles into state subject PRC and remove people from other states who entered J&K.

Dimple raises concerns about the whereabouts of the conditions outlined in the stand-still agreement and the Instrument of Accession during the accession of J&K, Ladakh, POK, Gilgit, and Baltistan with India.

(IPL) 2023 season. And he appeared to rejuvenate his career following his omission from the Test series against Australia and Bangladesh. He showcased a counterattacking innings of 89 in the WTC final, propelled by a robust domestic season where he amassed 634 runs at an average of 57. However, his under-

whelming performance, managing only 11 runs across two innings on placid pitches in the Caribbean, signaled the conclusion of his international journey as well. His entry into the WTC final was as a replacement for his Mumbai counterpart, Shreyas Iyer. Now, with lyer making an impres-

Dominica pulls out of hosting ICC T20 World Cup 2024 matches



NEW DELHI, Dec 1 (Agencies): Dominica will be unable to meet the deadline for completing stadium development and the government stated that it will withdraw from hosting their assigned T20 World Cup matches next year. Dominica was one of seven Caribbean countries considered to host the T20 World Cup, and Windsor Park was chosen to host one group match and two Super Eight games. Dominica were recommended as one of the hosts for the ICC Men's T20 World Cup, which

will be held in the West Indies and the United

States in June 2024. "Several tangible actions were taken both at the Windsor Park Sports Stadium and at the Benjamin's Park including the commencement of upgrading and enhancement of the practice and match venues, various assessments and the creation of additional pitches where necessary," a statement from the Dominica government's read.

"However, the implementation timelines submitted by the various contractors revealed that it would not be possible to complete these works within the stipulated timeframe before the commencement of the tournament. As a result, a decision was taken not to host any of the matches in the ICC Men's T20 World Cup 2024 as it would not be prudent for the Government of Dominica to commit to hosting these games.

"In light of Dominica's sterling reputation in hosting international cricket, this decision is considered to be in the best interest of all. The Government of Dominica thanks Cricket West Indies (CWI) for its partnership over the years and looks forward to continued collaboration in the future. The Government of Dominica extends best wishes to the organisers for a successful tournament in June 2024." The ICC is yet to respond to the development.

with SMGS Hospital. This hospital is also burdened by about 10 districts only.

Here, two women are kept on each bed in the ward. Both these big hospitals are treating a large population as per their
