Kashmir shivers at minus 5.8°C, water supply pipes jammed as cold wave grips

SRINAGAR, Dec 14 (Agencies): Kashmir is freezing under intense cold wave with Srinagar city recording the coldest night of this season even as the minimum settled several degrees below freezing point across the valley, officials said on Thursday.

Srinagar city — the summer capital of Jammu and Kashmir — recorded a low of minus 5.4 degrees Celsius on Wednesday night which was slightly lower than previous night's minus 5.3 degrees Celsius.

It was the lowest minimum temperature recorded this winter in the city, the officials said.

Pahalgam in south Kashmir's Anantnag district, which serves as one of the base camps for the annual Amarnath Yatra. recorded a minimum temperature of minus 5.8 degrees Celsius, while the famous resort of Gulmarg in Baramulla district recorded a low of minus 5 degrees Celsius, they said.

Qazigund recorded a low of minus 3.8 degrees Celsius, Kokernag town minus 1.6 degrees Celsius and Kupwara minus

4.2 degrees Celsius. The intense cold wave conditions in the valley has resulted in freezing of several water bodies while water supply pipes in many areas have been

NEW DELHI, Dec 14 (Agencies): As the Parliament is set to convene for Day 11 of the ongoing Winter Session on Thursday, Union Home Minister Amit Shah will move the Government of Union Territories (Amendment) Bill, 2023 in Rajya Sabha for its consideration and passage.

Government The of Union Territories (Amendment) Bill, 2023 seeks to reserve 33 per cent of seats in the Puducherry Assembly for women. The legislation has already been passed in Lok Sabha on Tuesday.



According to the agenda released, the Home Minister will also move the Jammu and Kashmir Reorganisation (Second Amendment) Bill, 2023 which seeks to reserve 33 per cent of seats in the Jammu and Kashmir assembly for women. The legislation has already been passed in Lok Sabha on . Tuesday.

Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman will

move two appropriation bills, The Appropriation (No.3) Bill, 2023 and The Appropriation (No.4) Bill, 2023. Both bills have been passed in the Lok Sabha earlier. BJP MP Rajendra Gehlot and Narayana Koragappa will table the report of the Committee on Welfare of Other Backward Classes on Measures undertaken to secure the representation of OBCs in employment and for their welfare in All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS)' pertaining to the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare.

J&K Admin's directive to Officers: Send monthly reports on public issues, solutions to CS Office

JAMMU, Dec 14 (Agencies): Jammu and Kashmir administration has ordered officers including deputy commissioners to reach out to people at grassroots level, conduct public hearings, and send monthly reports to the Chief Secretary.

The order was aimed at resolving public issues and was issued following the taking over this month of senior IAS officer Atal Dulloo as the new chief secretary of Jammu and Kashmir. According to the order issued by Com-



General Administration Department, Sanjeev Verma, secretaries should conduct a tour every fortnight and conduct public hearing three days a week between 3 pm and 4 pm, except Wednesday.

Similarly, the heads of departments, including the deputy commissioners, have been ordered to conduct a tour every week and hold public hearing three days a week, except Wednesday. "It shall be ensured that the above schedule is followed in letter and spirit as far as possible and no official meetings and engagements shall be scheduled on the tour days and public hearing hours," Verma said in the order. JKSTIC allocates Rs Two Crore for SKUAST research advancements, aimed to support 72 projects

SRINAGAR, Dec 14 (Agencies): In a significant move to boost research and innovation, the Jammu and Kashmir Science, Technology & Innovation Council (JKSTIC) announced a substantial grant of Rs 2 crores to the Sher-e-Kashmir University of Agricultural Sciences and Technology (SKUAST), Shalimar, here on Wednesday.

The funding aims to support some 72 research projects, addressing diverse areas of local importance. Additionally, seed money has been allocated to 17 innovators to develop prototypes for their innovative ideas, laying the groundwork for patents and start-

The announcement was made during a function held at SKUAST, where the grant was officially handed over. The university has consistently held the top position in the region for innovations, patents, and start-ups, making it a pivotal institution in the field.

The event was attended by Saurabh Baghat (IAS), Commissioner Secretary of the Science Technology Department, along with Prof Nazir Ganie, Vice Chancellor of SKUAST, Dr Nasir Shah, Additional Director JKSTIC, Bilal Ahmad, Joint Director JKSTIC and various other departmental heads.

Other notable participants included the Director of Extension, Director of Research, Deans from various departments of SKUAST, faculty members, students, and officers from the Science and Technology Department, highlighting the collaborative spirit among diverse stakeholders.

"Investing in research

projects and supporting innovators is not just a financial commitment but a strategic imperative, Baghat while describing these endeavours as the lifeblood of progress, said. "By funding research and nurturing innovators, we lay the foundation for a brighter, more technologically advanced tomorrow, ensuring that our region remains at the forefront of scientific discovery and innovation."

JKSTIC, formerly known as J&K Council for Science & Technology, was established in 1989 under the Department of Science &

Technology, J&K government. The primary objective of the council is to promote and disseminate science, technology, and innovation in the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir.

Additionally, the council serves as a nodal department for organizing and promoting S&T activities across the region.

"Here, universities, research and development institutions, IITs, NITs, SKUAST, and other entities have contributed their innovations, research findings. patents, and start-up initiatives," Dr Shah said.

He informed that JKSTIC is establishing a centre of excellence, namely the Sub-Regional Science Centre, in collaboration with NCSM, Ministry of Culture,

CHANDIGARH, Dec 14 (Agencies): An interstate illegal arms smuggling racket has been unearthed with the arrest of 10 people, including a Madhya Pradesh-based weapon manufacturer, a top police officer said on

A total of 22 weapons have been recovered, Director General of Police Gaurav Yadav said.

Cases involving JKLF Chief Yasin Malik: 3 witnesses fail to appear before TADA court in Jammu

JAMMU, Dec 14 (Agencies): Three witnesses, including former Kashmir Bar Association president Mian Abdul Qayoom, failed to appear in a special court here on Thursday in connection with the 1989 abduction of Rubaiya Sayeed, while separatist leader Yasin Malik and his associate Rafiq Pahloo appeared before it via video-conferencing.

Pahloo was given a final opportunity by the special TADA court to file objections to an application for the cancellation of his bail in a 1990 case in which four Indian Air Force (IAF) officers were killed case and the abduction case of Rubaiya Sayeed, the daughter of the then Union home minister Mufti Mohammad Sayeed.

"Four eyewitnesses were summoned to appear before the special court. Among them, Mian Qayoom did not appear and submitted a medical certificate that he



is admitted in a hospital. It was said that another eyewitness (number 23) is dead. Both were witnesses in the Rubaiya Sayeed abduction case," Senior Public Prosecutor S K Bhat said.

In the case of the killing of the IAF personnel in a terror attack in Srinagar in 1990, the court had summoned two witnesses for identification, but they could not appear

citing medical reasons, Bhat said, adding that both of them had to come from outside.

Bhat said Jammu Kashmir Liberation Front (JKLF) chief Malik and Pahloo appeared before the court via video-conferencing.

The court would again hear the case of the killing of the IAF personnel on January 18 and the Rubaiya Sayeed case the next

Bhat said Pahloo was given a last opportunity by the court for filing objections to an application for the cancellation of his bail. The court has agreed to summon eyewit-

The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) moved an application in August for the cancellation of Pahloo's bail in the two cases, informing the court that he had violated the bail conditions by allegedly indulging in separatist activities. ■Turn to page 9







JAMMU, Dec 14: Resumption of subsidized helicopter services to the hilly districts of Jammu division during the winter season will provide respite to the people of these areas to great extent and the decision of the Union Territory (UT) administration is highly appreciable.

This was stated by Arvind Gupta, Secretary Jammu and Kashmir BJP & Reasi district Prabhari, while congratulating the people of the hilly districts for getting the helicopter services resumed for the travel/transportation purposes, particular during the winter seasons.

Arvind Gupta said that the hilly districts of



Jammu division namely Poonch, Rajouri, Doda, Kishtwar, upper reaches of Bani and other similar areas receive heavy snowfall in winters every year, which causes lot of inconveniences to the people living there. He said that the means of communication are badly affected due to snowfall. The road transport almost comes to halt for many days and as a result the affected areas get totally disconnected from the outside world.

Arvind Gupta said that the salient feature of the resumption of helicopter services to the snow affected areas is that it will be a subsidized service and the people will get the facility at cheaper rates, which will, thus facilitate more populace to avail the benefits. He said that the service will also be a big boon for the shifting of the patients in case of emergency during the times when the road travelling is not possible due to snowfall and heavy rains.

The heavy rains in these areas also causes landslides. He expressed hope that the administration will ensure hassle fee, regular service of the helicopter to the people in snow bound hilly districts.

weather gripping much of the country, many people are experiencing dry, cracked and painful lips. The cold air, the chilling wind and the centrally heated air inside strips the moisture away from your lips leaving them chapped, flaky, slit, sore, and painful, a condition known as common cheilitis. The harsh winter winds have a significant effect on our body particularly on our lips leaving them dry, chapped, flaky, cracked, and even painful.

Exposure to sun, wind, and cold, dry air can further contribute to chapped lips because the skin on the lips is thinner and more delicate than the skin on the face and the rest of the body.

urthermore, dry lips can be due to other factors like lifestyle disorders, a spike in blood sugar, and blood pressure, an allergic reaction to your toothpaste, lipstick or beauty products and pollution in the environment. The skin on our lips is very thin, sensitive and lacks sweat glands, so they're almost always exposed to the elements. The skin on our lips has just three to five cellular layers, compared to typical facial skin, which has up to 16 layers.

The skin on lips dries out 10 times faster than the rest of the skin on our face.

The harsh winter winds may be the reason your lips feel super tight and dry but that doesn't mean you have to wait till spring to wear your favourite lipstick or get a pictureperfect pout for a selfie.

Nutritional deficiencies can also lead to dry, chapped lips. Sometimes, even cracks may develop. Vitamins A, C and B2 are important for the lips. So, foods like citrus fruits, ripe papaya, tomatoes, carrots, green leafy vegetables, nuts, whole-grains, oats, and milk products may be included in the diet. Of course, it's best to take your doctor's advice before making changes in your diet, especially if you have any medical condition.

Use glossy lipsticks and lip balm. Avoid soap and powder on the lips. Remove lipstick with a cleansing cream or gel. Apply almond oil or cream at night and leave on.

After washing the face, the lips may be rubbed gently with a soft towel to remove dead skin. Apply cream of milk (malai) daily and leave on for an hour. If the lips become dark, add a few drops of lemon juice to the cream of milk. At night, apply pure almond oil daily on the

lips and leave on overnight.

Honey can be mixed with sesame seeds or walnut powder and used as a scrub for the lips. A little almond oil may also be added.

Oils like Argan and Coconut oil also help to nourish the skin on the lips. Argon oil is actually native to Morocco, where it has been traditionally used for food purposes, as well as to treat skin and scalp problems. Today, it is being increasingly used for cosmetic purposes to make cosmetics like moisturisers, creams, lotions, face packs, hair oils, hair conditioners, etc.

Argan oil is rich in unsaturated fatty acids and Vitamin E. Since it contains Vitamin E and antioxidants, it helps to delay the visible ageing sign and even rejuvenate the skin. It protects the youthful properties of the skin, like elasticity and resilience. As it is easily absorbed by the skin, it can be ideal for the care of the lips. The fatty acids also nourish and soften the skin. The oil was used for medicinal purposes to cure skin problems and also heal and soothe burns. It nourishes the skin and improves skin texture. Argan oil can be used directly on the skin. Use only a few drops directly on the lips.

Coconut oil has also been valued for its nourishing and moisturizing ability. It has a great skin-softening ability and helps to make the skin soft and smooth. It may be applied on the lips and is also said to protect the skin from the damage caused by exposure to ultraviolet rays of the

sun. It is said to protect the skin better than cream. It also helps to heal cracks on the lips. In fact, it can be used to remove makeup from the face, including the lips. Coconut oil may be applied on the lips and left on overnight. Or, it can be left on for 15 minutes and wiped off with moist cotton wool. The advantage is that unlike other preparations that may contain synthetic ingredients, coconut oil can be safely applied on the lips and even ingested. Another advantage is that unlike other oils, coconut oil does not become rancid.


Coconut oil and Argan oilbased lip balms and lip creams can also be used for the care of the lips.

Licking your lips seems to be the best idea to make them moist. Licking will make your lips drier and the constant biting can cause bleeding. Once you put saliva on your lips, the air causes the saliva to evaporate pretty quickly, making your lips dry and can leave the delicate skin feeling irritated as well. Digestive enzymes and bacteria in saliva can makes them dry out faster, making your lips even drier overall.

Also, don't touch your lips unnecessarily as the bacteria and germs from your hands can transfer to your lips and can lead to infection.



By 2025, Delhi will have a total of 10,480 buses with electric ones making up 80 per cent of the fleet. This will help cut 4.67 lakh tonnes of carbon dioxide annually, according to the minis-

The new buses are air-conditioned, comfortable, and equipped with CCTV cameras and panic buttons.

"If you do not feel comfortable while travelling, you can press the panic button and immediately the live feed to the command and control centre will start. The feed will also be accessible to Delhi Police that will be able to step in," he said.

4 killed as brick kiln chimney collapses on workers in West Bengal

3 others injured; cause of chimney collapse yet to be ascertained

NEW DELHI, Dec 14 (Agencies): At least four workers were killed and three injured after the chimney of a brick kiln collapsed on them in West Bengal's North 24 Parganas district, police said today.

The incident happened at Dhaltitah village in Basirhat on Wednesday evening while attempting to restart the brick kiln which was closed for a year, they said.

"Four people are confirmed dead and three have been admitted to hospital," a Barishat police officer said on Thursday. "Two persons died while undergoing treatment at a nearby hospital, while two bodies were found



from under the debris. All of them were workers of the brick kiln," a police officer said.

"Two are under treatment at Basirhat Hospital, while the third individual, who is in critical condition, has been transferred to RG Kar Hospital in Kolkata," the

officer added. Among those killed, two were from Faizabad in UP -- Jethuram and Rakesh Kumar, Another deceased was identified as Hafizul Mondal, a local. The fourth person was yet to be identified, he said.

The cause of the chimney collapse is yet to be ascertained, he said, adding that it will be investigated.

In a major security breach on the anniversary of the 2001 Parliament terror attack, two persons -- Sagar Sharma and Manoranjan D -- jumped into the Lok Sabha chamber from the public gallery during Zero Hour, released yellow gas from canisters and shouted slogans before being overpowered by the MPs.

Around the same time, two other accused -- Amol Shinde and Neelam Devi -- also sprayed coloured gas from canisters while shouting "tanashahi nahi chalegi" outside Parliament premises.

Sagar, Manoranjan, Amol and Neelam are now in police custody.

Their accomplice Vishal, in whose house the accused stayed before reaching Parliament, has been detained from Gurugram while a hunt is on for their other accomplice Lalit.

Pakistanis, Bangladeshi politicians are new targets of deepfake, 90 per cent of videos online are pornographic

Women are top target of generative AI's 'chilling effect'

BANGKOK, Dec 14 (Agencies): There was the Bollywood star in skin-tight lycra, the Bangladeshi politician filmed in a bikini and the young Pakistani woman snapped with a man.

None was real, but all three images were credible enough to unleash lust, vitriol - and even allegedly a murder, underlining the sophistication of generative artificial intelligence, and the threats it poses to women.

The two videos and the photo were deepfake, and went viral in a vibrant social mediascape that is struggling to come to grips with the technology that has the power to create convincing copies that can upend real lives.

"We need to address this as a community and with urgency before more of us are affected by such identity theft," actor Rashmika Mandanna said in a post on X, that has garnered more than 6.2 million views.

She is not the only Bollywood star to be cloned and attacked on social media, with top actors including Katrina Kaif, Alia Bhatt and Deepika Padukone also targeted with deepfakes.

The lycra video, said Mandanna, was "extremely scary not only for me, but also for each one of us who today is vulnerable to so much harm because of how technology is being misused". While digitally manipulated images and videos of women were once easy to spot, usually lurking in the dark corners of the internet, the explosion in generative AI tools such as Midjourney, Stable Diffusion and DALL-E has made it easy and cheap to create and circulate convincing deepfakes.

More than 90% of deepfake videos online are pornographic, according to tech experts, and most are of women.

While there are no separate data for South Asian countries, digital rights experts say the issue is particularly challenging in conservative societies. where women have long been harassed online and abuse has gone largely unpunished.

Social media firms are strug-



gling to keep up.

Google's YouTube and Meta Platforms - which owns Facebook, Instagram and WhatsApp - have updated their policies, requiring creators and advertisers to label all Al-generated content.

But the onus is largely on victims - usually girls and women - to take action, said Rumman Chowdhury, an Al expert at Harvard University who previously worked at reducing harms on

"Generative AI will regrettably supercharge online harassment and malicious content ... and women are the canaries in the coal mine. They are the ones impacted first, the ones on whom the technologies are tested," she said.

"It is an indication to the rest of the world to pay attention, because it's coming for everyone," Chowdhury told a recent United Nations briefing.

Deepfakes and the law As deepfakes have proliferated worldwide, there are growing concerns - and rising instances - of their use in harassment, scams and sextortion.

Regulations have been slow to follow.

The US Executive Order on Al touches on dangers posed by deepfakes, while the European Union's proposed Al Act will require greater transparency and disclosure from providers.

Last month, 18 countries including the United States and Britain - unveiled a non-binding agreement on keeping the wider public safe from Al misuse.

including deepfakes. Among Asian nations, China requires providers to use watermarks and report illegal deepfakes, while South Korea has made it illegal to distribute deepfakes that harm "public interest", with potential imprisonment or

India is taking a tough stance as it drafts new rules.

IT Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw has said social media firms must remove deepfakes within 36 hours of receiving a notification, or risk losing their safe-harbour status that protects them from liability for third-party content.

But the focus should be on "mitigating and preventing incidents, rather than reactive responses", said Malavika Rajkumar at the advocacy group IT for Change

While the Indian government has indicated it may force providers and platforms to disclose the identity of deepfake creators, "striking a balance between privacy protection and preventing abuse is key," Rajkumar added.

Women targeted Deepfakes of women and other vulnerable communities such as LGBTQ+ people - especially sexual images and videos - can be particularly dangerous in deeply religious or conservative societies, human rights activists say.

In Bangladesh, deepfake videos of female opposition politicians - Rumin Farhana in a bikini and Nipun Roy in a swimming pool - have emerged ahead of an election on January 7.

And last month, an 18-yearold woman was allegedly shot dead by her father and uncle in a so-called honour killing in Pakistan's remote Kohistan province, after a photograph of her with a man went viral. Police say the image was doctored.

Shahzadi Rai, a transgender member of Pakistan's Karachi Municipal Council, who has been the target of abusive trolling with deepfake images, has said they could exacerbate online gender-based violence and "seriously jeopardise" her

Even if audiences are able to distinguish between a real image and a deepfake, the woman's integrity is questioned, and her credibility may be damaged, said Nighat Dad, founder of the non-profit Digital Rights Foundation in Pakistan.

"The threat to women's privacy and safety is deeply concerning," she said, particularly as disinformation campaigns gain steam ahead of an election scheduled for February 8.

"Deepfakes are creating an increasingly unsafe online environment for women, even nonpublic figures, and may discourage women from participating in politics and online spaces," she said.

In several countries including India, entrenched gender biases already affect the ability of girls and young women to use the internet, a recent report found.

Deepfakes of powerful Bollywood stars only underline the risk that AI poses to all women, said Rajkumar.

"Deepfakes have affected women and vulnerable communities for a long time; they have gained widespread attention only after popular actresses were targeted," she said.

The heightened focus now should push "platforms, policymakers, and society at large to create a safer and more inclusive online environment," she

"Make no mistake ... without law reform, these sorts of miscarriages of justice will continue.

Justin Trudeau says allegations against India made public for 'extra deterrence'

OTTAWA, Dec 14 (Agencies): Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau has said that his decision to make allegations in public about a possible Indian government link and the killing of a pro-Khalistan separatist was intended to "put a chill" on them from repeating a similar action.

The ties between India and Canada came under severe strain following Trudeau's allegations on September 18 of a "potential" involvement of Indian agents in the killing of Khalistani separatist Hardeep Singh Nijjar on June 18 in British Columbia. India had designated Nijjar as a terrorist in 2020.

India rejected Trudeau's allegations as "absurd" and "motivated".

In a year-end interview with The Canadian Press news agency, Trudeau said he decided to make the announcement on September 18 because he expected that information would be eventually leaked through the media.

The prime minister said the message he delivered in the House of Commons that day was intended as an "extra level of deterrence" to keep Canadians safer.

Trudeau said his public statement came after weeks of "quiet diplomacy" that included raising the allegations with India at the highest levels.

"We knew it would be difficult conversations, but we also knew that this was an important moment for India to be demonstrating its leadership on the world stage with the G20," Trudeau said. "And we felt that we could use that as a constructive opportunity to work together."

"Too many Canadians were worried that they were vulnerable," Trudeau

"We felt that all the quiet diplomacy and all the measures that we put in -- and ensured that our security services put in to keep people safe in the community -- needed a further level of



deterrence, perhaps of saying publicly and loudly that we know, or we have credible reasons to believe, that the Indian government was behind this," he said. "And therefore put a chill on them continuing or considering doing anything like this."

Trudeau also said Canada warned India that what it knew would eventually come out and that while Ottawa had managed to keep things "on a diplomatic level" leading up to the G20 summit, it could not control much beyond that.

In the interview, Trudeau said Canada intends to reveal evidence very much in the fashion the US did when "we reach those points in the investigation."

But he noted that US authorities started their investigation into attempted murder earlier.

"Canada is investigating a murder and there are different stakes involved in that and our justice system has different processes," he said. "But that is unfolding."

Last week, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar told the Rajya Sabha that Canada has not shared any specific evidence or inputs with India.

Days after Trudeau's allegations in September, India temporarily suspended the issuance of visas to Canadian citizens and asked Ottawa to downsize its diplomatic presence in the country to ensure parity.

India resumed some visa services in Canada last month, more than a month after they were suspended.

Number Of Journalists Killed In 2023 **Declines Despite Gaza War**

In the first 11 months of 2023, 45 journalists were killed carrying out their work, down from 61 last year, according to the annual report by RSF.

PARIS, Dec 14 (Agencies): The number of journalists killed in the line of duty fell this year, despite reporter deaths in Gaza in the past two months, media advocacy group Reporters Without Borders said Thursday. In the first 11 months of 2023,

45 journalists were killed carrying out their work, down from 61 last year, according to the annual report by RSF.

It was the smallest number since 33 died in 2002, largely due to a major drop in Latin America

While some 63 journalists have been killed in the Middle East since the October 7 start of fighting between Israel and Islamist group Hamas, only 17 of those deaths fell under RSF's

"It takes nothing away from

the tragedy in Gaza but we are observing a regular decline, and are very far from the 140 journalists killed in 2012 and again in 2013" because of the wars in Syria and Iraq, RSF secretary general Christophe Deloire told agency.

The decline is due to efforts by inter-governmental organisations and NGOs to combat impunity, as well as to greater "prudence" by reporters themselves, he said.

Of the 17 journalists RSF counted as killed carrying out their profession in the Middle East since October 7, 13 were killed by Israeli fire in Gaza, three died in Lebanon and one

was killed in Israel by Hamas. RSF in November said it filed a complaint at the International Criminal Court for "war crimes"

for these deaths.

Agency last week said its investigation showed that Israeli tank fire was responsible for killing Reuters cameraman Issam Abdallah on October 13 and wounding six others, including agency photographer Christina Assi. A spokesperson for the Israeli army said the journalists were in an "active combat zone" in southern Lebanon, an answer that Deloire called "not satisfactory." The war in Ukraine cost the life of two reporters in 2023, including AFP reporter Arman Soldin, "the only reporter to have lost their life outside their own country", RSF said.

A total of 11 reporters have been killed since the start of the conflict in February 2022.

Fall in Latin America There was a sharp drop in Latin America where six reporters were killed, down from 26 in 2022. In Mexico alone, the number fell to four from 11 the previous year.

RSF warned that Mexico remains dangerous for journalists, citing continued kidnappings and attacks.

Of the 84 journalists counted as missing worldwide, about a third are Mexican.

The number of jailed reporters declined to 521 from 569 in 2022, with Belarus joining China and Myanmar as "one of the three biggest prisons in the world". Turkey and Iran also repeatedly jail journalists, the report said.

A total of 54 journalists are being held hostage, compared to 65 in 2022.

As Gaza War Rages, US Shows Signs Of Strained Patience With Ally Israel

WASHINGTON, Dec 14 (Agencies): The administration of President Joe Biden has begun to publicly air its differences with the Israeli government over the conduct of the war in Gaza, expressing its exasperation even as it remains largely steady in its support.

Biden referred this week to "indiscriminate bombing" in Gaza, underscoring his frustration with conservative Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, whose government Biden agrees is starting to lose

The Democratic US administration is even beginning to talk about a "timetable" for how long Israel's high-intensity military

operations can continue. Warnings have multiplied in recent weeks, with senior US officials such as Vice President Kamala Harris and Secretary of State

Antony Blinken speaking of the "far too high" number of Palestinian civilians killed, and the gap between commitments made by Israel to respect civilian lives and the reality on the ground.

Israel has pounded Gaza day after day since the start of the conflict on October 7, interrupted only by a brief humanitarian truce at the end of November.

Defense Secretary Lloyd Austin recently warned Israel of what is at stake: "In this kind of a fight, the center of gravity is the civilian population. And if you drive them into the arms of the enemy, you replace a tactical victory with a strategic defeat."

But Washington, Israel's main diplomatic and military ally, has been careful not to openly criticize its ally, and has resisted calls for a ceasefire, which it said would benefit Hamas, despite international pres-

Indeed, the United States appears increasingly isolated in its support, as evidenced by Tuesday's vote in the UN General Assembly calling for such a ceasefire, passed by 153 member states, with only the US and nine other states voting against and 23 abstaining.

'Timetables' The trigger for the war was the bloody October 7 assault by Hamas militants on

Since then, the Biden administration has pressed its ally to unblock humanitarian aid for people in Gaza, work to free hostages kidnapped by Hamas on the day of the attack, and adopt a more targeted military

In private, US diplomats have made no secret of their dissatisfaction with Israel's

As a sign of the US pressure on Israel, National Security Advisor Jake Sullivan will visit Israel on Thursday and Friday, the White House said.

"I will certainly be talking to the PM, the war cabinet and senior Israeli officials about timetables, about how they are thinking about that," Sullivan told the Wall Street Journal, suggesting a shift from the "high intensity military operations of the kind we have seen over the past weeks."

For his part, Biden at the White House received for the first time families of US hostages held in Gaza by Hamas, a senior official said.

What happens post-war?

If there is a shift in the US position toward Israel, it may reflect the domestic political situation as well.

"There is a lot of pressure on the Biden administration among his own party and constituency" on policy toward Israel, said James Ryan, director of the Middle East program at the Foreign Policy Research Institute, a nonprofit think tank.

But any shift also signals "a tacit admission" of limited US ability to influence the

Israeli government, he added. Differences also loom over views on what happens after the war ends.

Washington insists on a two-state solution as the only way to resolve the Israeli-Palestinian question in the long term, which Israel rejects.

As far as who would govern in post-conflict Gaza, the US and Israel are at odds over the idea of handing reins to a revitalized Palestinian Authority.

The bull on the run—Sensex, Nifty hit record highs

Apart from US Fed Reserve outcome, there seem to be some India-centric reasons as well

NEW DELHI, Dec 14 (Agencies): Sensex jumped 796.64 points to hit an all-time high of 70,381.24 and Nifty 222.1 points to arrive at its record peak of 21,148.45 on Thursday after the US Federal Reserve left interest rates unchanged and signalled the possibility of three rate cuts in 2024, according to agency reports.

US Fed effect

Well, not just the Indian benchmark equity indices, markets across the world rallied as the Fed indicated that the tightening of US monetary policy was coming to an end and there could also be a possibility of "lower borrowing costs in 2024".

No change in the key interest rate for the third straight time indicated that the US Fed Reserve was "likely done raising rates after having imposed the fastest string of increases in four decades to fight painfully high inflation," as per agency reports.

The Federal Reserve System is the central bank of the United

It performs five general functions to promote the effective operation of the US economy and, more generally, the public interest. According to its website, its role includes conduct-



ing the nation's monetary policy to promote maximum employment, stable prices, and moderate long-term interest rates in the economy and promoting the stability of the financial system.

Basically the bottom line is that any change in interest rates by the Fed impacts global markets, including in India.

Buoyancy in Indian markets A sharp rise in November retail inflation may have acted as a dampener on some days but the Indian benchmark indices hit multiple highs this December, jumping over many milestones ahead of the US Fed meeting.

Experts say "better-thanexpected" job data in the US helped ease pressure on the Fed trying to keep inflation

under control. India-centric reasons

While the Fed buzz was said to be one of the main reasons for the bull run, experts also sense some specific India-centric reasons for the general buoyancy in the stock markets and one of them may be the indication of "continued political stability" after the big BJP victory in three key states—Rajasthan, Chhattisgarh and Madhya Pradesh.

Another reason could be the current state of the Indian rupee. According to reports, the rupee today rebounded by 13 paise to 83.27 against the US dollar in early trade after the greenback weakened in the overseas markets following the Fed outcome. Notably, the rupee had closed at its all-time low level of 83.40 on Wednesday after retail inflation rose to a three-month high of 5.55% in November, as per

In other words, the rupee reached a new low against the dollar as stock markets hit new all-time highs. Experts say as the rupee went weak, FIIs pumped money in Indian markets. Basically the weakness in rupee allowed them to buy more shares in dollars.

Another reason is also said to be the increased attempts by India to use rupee in global trade—a mark of its geo-political heft.

Earlier this August, India made its first crude oil payment in rupees

India and the United Arab Emirates started settling bilateral trade in local currencies with Indian Oil Corp making payment to Abu Dhabi National Oil Company, according to a statement issued by the Indian embassy in the UAE. The transaction followed one involving the sale of 25kg gold from a UAE gold exporter to a buyer in India at about Rs 128.4 million. According to reports, India is trying to crack similar deals with other countries.

NEW DELHI, Dec 14 (Agencies): Adani Group on Thursday announced to invest Rs. 8,700 crore in Bihar across various sectors, including logistics and agro-industry. Pranav Adani, the Director of Adani Enterprises, while speaking at Bihar Global Investors' Summit said that the investment intended to invest in three additional sectors, creating direct or indirect employment for approximately ten thousand people.

The Gautam Adani-led Adani Group is already present in Bihar, and it has invested Rs. 850 crore in the state.

"I am very happy to share that Adani Group is with the Bihar develchief minister of Bihar, Nitish Kumar. We are currently present in logistics, gas distribution, and agro-logistics, with an investment of Rs. 850 crore, generating direct or indirect employment for three thousand individuals. Now, we aim to increase our investment tenfold," said Pranav Adani.

In the warehouse or godown sector, the company plans to invest Rs. 1200 crore, generating employment for 2000 people. Additionally, in six locations—Purnia, Begusarai, Darbhanga, Samastipur, Kishanganj, and Araria-the silo storage capacity will increase from 1.5 lakh metric tonnes to 2.75 lakh metric tonnes. Adani Agro Private Limited has already commenced work on this project with an investment of Rs. 900 crore.

The company will allocate Rs. 200 crore to enhance its city gas distribution network in Gaya and Nalanda. Pranav Adani stated, "We are also planning to start producing compressed biogas and EV

chargers. This initiative will create jobs for almost 1500 people in the state.'

Adani Group is also contemplating bringing Adani Wilmar to Bihar. In another venture, the company plans to enter the cement manufacturing sector, establishing manufacturing units in Warsaliganj and Mahawal with a cost of Rs. 2500 crore. The goal is to produce ten million metric tonnes annually from these plants, employing around 3000 people directly or indirectly.

The company is also eveing the smart meter manufacturing sector, intending to invest Rs. 3100 crore in cities like Shivan, Saran, Gopalganj, and Vaishali to install smart meters. Adani Group announced plans to install 28,000 smart meters, creating 2000 job opportunities in the state.

Bad news for Tesla as India says 'no proposal' to cut EV import tax

NEW DELHI, Dec 14 (Agencies): The government has said there are no intentions to offer subsidies for the import of electric vehicles into the country. This development appears to be a major setback for the US electric vehicle (EV) manufacturing giant Tesla's ambitions to

enter the India market. In a written reply to a question raised in Parliament, Minister of State for Commerce and Industry Som Parkash clarified that there is no proposal to either provide an exemption from local value addition cost or to provide a subsidy on the import duty on electric vehicles.

"Presently, there is no proposal either to provide an exemption from local value addition cost or to provide a subsidy on the import duty on electric vehicles in India," Parkash's written reply stated.



In his reply, Parkash highlighted some of the existing policy initiatives and measures to create a strong ecosystem to promote industrialisation and domestic value addition, and make India globally competitive.

"Government has also taken various steps to boost domestic and foreign investments in India to enhance local value addition under the Make in India initiative. These include the introduction of Goods and Services Tax, reduction in corporate tax, improving ease of doing business, FDI policy reforms, measures for

reduction in compliance burden, measures to boost domestic manufacturing through public procurement orders, Phased Manufacturing Programme (PMP) and QCOs (Quality Control Orders), to name a few," he said.

Apart from the above, Parkash said the government had also launched the Production Linked Incentive (PLI) Scheme for the automobile and auto component industry with a budgetary outlay of Rs. 25,938 crore to provide financial incentives to boost domestic manufacturing of advance automotive technologies (AAT) products (including electric vehicles and their components).

However, he made it clear that there is currently no proposal to provide a subsidy on EV import duties, a longstanding demand from Tesla, which has been longing to enter the Indian market for years.

The

minister's response comes as a big blow to Tesla's aspirations to sell its EVs in India, potentially leading to an impasse. It's worth noting that Tesla representatives have engaged in discussions with government officials over the past few months, it seems no mutually agreereached so far.

While the government has been pushing for Tesla to manufacture cars locally, the automaker is insisting on lower import taxes ini-

tially to make its globally produced vehicles competitive in the Indian market.

Even during Prime Minister Narendra Modi's US visit in June, Tesla CEO Elon Musk had expressed the company's willingness to make a "significant investment" in India. In return, Tesla has been negotiating for reduced import taxes at the outset.

However, the government's stance on import duties could result in further delays for Tesla's entry into the Indian market.

This development comes shortly after the government and Tesla were on the verge of reaching an agreement that would enable the US automaker to commence car sales in India from next year and establish a factory within two years.

"We wish to issue a clarification regarding the recent media coverage of the alert issued by the Indian Pharmacopeia Commission (IPC) on mefenamic acid. The alert issued by IPC was to advise Doctors and patients to monitor the possibility of an adverse drug reaction (ADR) of mefenamic acid, which does not in any way impact the safety, efficacy and high quality of the brands that are established and supported by clinical studies and real-world evidence," reads the company's statement.

The company pointed out that mefenamic acid, under the names Meftal and Meftal-Spas, has been prescribed in countries such as the USA, UK, Japan, and others for over four decades. With billions of doses administered, the medication has benefitted millions of patients worldwide

At a special session organised by Lucknow University's social work department in association with Head Digital Works (HDW), experts threw light on responsible online gaming and tips for de-addiction from online gaming.

Clinical psychologist Dr P.K. Khatri said: "If anyone around you shows such symptoms then do not hesitate to get help from a counsel-

He said that the biggest issue is that people do not accept that they have developed a gaming addiction. And, even if they do, they do not look for its cure.

"Also, people are unaware about the difference between a psychologist and a psychiatrist. If one is addicted to gaming, then the person should first consult a psychologist, A few counselling sessions by a psychologist may help handle the issue, if not, then approach a

psychiatrist," he added. Students -- if they are fond of gaming -- should do it responsibly.

"Responsible gaming ensures playing online games that have a Random Number Generator (RNG) certificate. Those who have these certificates ensure that outcomes of such games are truly random and not biased towards any particular player or group of players," said head HDW Rohit Chau-

han. He said that this means that every player has an equal chance of winning or losing, and the outcome of each game is not predetermined or influenced by

any external factors. Additional Deputy Commissioner of Police, West, Lucknow and Cyber expert Chiran-

ICC tells Aussie cricketer Usman Khawaja not to wear shoes with Israel war message during Pakistan Test; then he does something else



PERTH, Dec 14 (Agencie): Australia batter Usman Khawaja wasn't allowed to wear shoes branded with a "all lives are equal" humanitarian message, so he wore a black arm band instead on Thursday on day 1 of the series-opening cricket Test against Pakistan.

The International Cricket Council intervened on Wednesday after Khawaja indicated he planned to wear shoes during the match that featured messages to highlight the loss of innocent lives in the Israel-Hamas war.

The ICC's policies for international cricket prohibit displays of political or religious statements on team uniforms or equipment.

Khawaja said he'd abide by the ruling to avoid individual or team sanctions, but would challenge the ICC's stance.

"Freedom is a human right, and all rights are equal," Khawaja said in a social media post. "I will never stop believing that."

Australia batted first in the five-day game, and Khawaja and fellow Australian opener David Warner strode to the pitch along with the Pakistan fielders.

Khawaja, who was born in Pakistan and is the first Muslim to play Test cricket for Australia, wore the black armband to show solidary with people suffering in Gaza.

In pre-game TV interviews, he said there'd been precedents where other cricketers had been allowed to show support for other causes.

"I find it a little bit disappointing they came down hard on me and they don't always come down hard on everyone," he said.

The 36-year-old Khawaja had some high-level support, including from Australia captain Pat Cummins and even up to the nation's federal treasurer, Jim Chalmers.

"What was on the shoes — all lives are equal — I support that," Cummins said. "That's not very divisive. I don't think anyone can really have too many complaints about that."

Chalmers told the Australian Broadcasting Corp radio that the ICC should allow Khawaja to wear the shoes.

"I don't think it's an especially controversial statement and I find it unusual frankly that people want to dispute that," he said.

"The lives on one side of a conflict are not worth anymore or any less than the lives on the other side of a conflict."

Australia vs Pakistan, 1st Test: David Warner silences critics with hundred in farewell series opener in Perth

PERTH, Dec 14 (Agencie): Star opener David Warner shut out the noise and let his bat do the talking as he began his farewell Test series with a hundred on Day 1 of the first Test between Australia and Pakistan in Perth on Thursday, December 14. Warner brought up his first Test century of the calendar year and his 26th overall as he went level with legendary Sir Gary Sobers on the all-time list of Test centurions.

David Warner was under considerable pressure amid his dipping Test form. The superstar opener was backed by the team management and the selection committee, led by George Bailey, to be in the XI for the first Test of their home summer.

However, Warner came out all guns blazing and looked like a man, who was determined to prove his naysayers wrong. After Pat Cummins won the toss and opted to bat on a good Perth pitch, Warner was free-flowing and aggressive. His fired-up body language was evident from the way he kept calling while running between the wickets with his opening partner Usman Khawaja.

Warner punished anything loose and there were plenty of them from the inexperienced Pakistan pace bowling attack in the first session. Shaheen Shah Afridi leaked 12 runs in the first over of the match, helping Australia set the pace early. Khurram Shahzad was impressive on his debut and young Aamer Jamal tried too many things in his first spell in Test cricket. Pakistan lacked

pace as their fourth seamer and part-timer Faheem Ashraf conceded aplenty.

David Warner and Usman Khawaja took the Australian total past 100 in the first session, with the former doing the bulk of the work. The two openers added 126 runs for the first wicket before Shaheen forced an outside edge off Khawaja.

Warner was more vigilant in the second session, but he cashed in on the ordinary bowling on Thursday morning. Warner also hit Shaheen Afridi for a six by going low and scooping one over the fine-leg fielder in a T20 cricket-like shot, leaving the crowd and commentators in awe.

Warner hit 14 boundaries and a six as he got to his first Test hundred in over a year. Warner has been facing the flak for his dipping numbers in Test cricket. In the last four years, Warner has scored only three Test hundreds, including the one in the ongoing Perth Test

Ahead of the Test series, former pacer Mitchell Johnson launched an explosive attack on Warner, questioning why the veteran opener was getting a farewell Test series despite his poor numbers in the recent past. Johnson also brought up the ball-tampering saga, questioning whether Warner deserved to pick his exit date.

Warner is all set to retire from Test cricket at the end of the series at his home ground, Sydney, and it seems the man with the never-say-die attitude is keen on going out on a high.

Didn't know how to come back after loss but now motivated for ultimate prize: Rohit


NEW DELHI, Dec 14 (Agencie): Rohit Sharma had no clue if he would ever get over the disappointment of the World Cup final defeat but the love and understanding of fans has now "motivated" him to make an earnest shot at another ultimate glory.

While Rohit didn't mention which ultimate glory he is talking about but it is fairly believable now that he is looking at leading India in next year's T20 World Cup in the West Indies and USA.

Rohit, who had a dream World Cup as a skipper and batter till the final, was virtually in tears as he left the ground and had gone to England for a break to just relieve himself from the pain.

"I had no idea how to come back from this for the first few days. It was my family, friends that kept me going. They kept things light. It wasn't easy to digest but life moves on and it wasn't easy to move on," said Rohit, on his Instagram fan page, airing his sentiments for the first time since November 19, when the team lost to Australia

However, what Rohit loved was the appreciation and understanding of the fans of the team's brilliant show. Their kind



words were part of his healing process.

"For me to see, people coming up to me, telling me that they were proud of the team, made me feel good. Along with them, I was healing as well. I felt, okay these are the kind of things you want to hear," Rohit said.

While he must have felt for some time that there is nothing more left to achieve, the 36-year-old Indian skipper dropped enough hints that he is now ready for one final date with history.

"People, when they understand what the player must be going through and when they know these kind of things and not to bring out that frustration, that anger, it means a lot for us,

for me definitely it meant a lot because there was no anger, it was just pure love from people that I met and it was wonderful to see that," Rohit said.

"So it gives you motivation to get back and start working again and look for another ultimate prize," he hinted at the T20 World Cup.

Rohit had left for UK for two weeks right after the tournament.

"After the final, it was very hard to get back and start moving on, which is why I decided that I need to get my mind out of this. But then, wherever I was, I realised that people were coming up to me and they were appreciating everyone's effort, how well we played. I feel for

all of them. They all, along with us, were dreaming of lifting that World Cup, along with us," Rohit said.

The support that the team received during the campaign was incredible.

"Everywhere we went during this entire campaign, there was so much support from everyone who came to the stadium firstly and people who were watching it from home as well.

"I want to appreciate what the people have done for us, in that one and half month period. But again, if I think more and more about that I feel quite disappointed that we were not able to go all the way." The 50-over World Cup is the ultimate prize and it does get frustrating when one thinks about it.

"I have always grown up watching the 50-over World Cup. To me that was the ultimate prize, the 50-over World Cup. We've worked all these years, for that World Cup. And it is disappointing, right? If you don't get through it, don't get what you want, what you have been looking for all this while, what you were dreaming of. You get disappointed. You get frustrated as well at times," Rohit said.

Okuhara narrates ordeal, BAI regrets unfortunate incident

NEW DELHI, Dec 14 (Agencie): Japanese shuttler Nozomi Okuhara's recent travel experience in India turned out to be a nightmare. The former World No 1 feared for her safety as she was duped by a taxi driver in New Delhi, before she was forced to anxiously wait for her stay in Odisha, her main destination, where she is currently part of a BWF Super 100 event. She spoke of her harrowing experience after landing in New Delhi and later on her arrival in Odisha. The latter was sorted after the organisers were contacted.

The Badminton Association of India had expressed regret and said they would ensure no such incident takes place in the future. Organising secretary Nileen Kumar, who is also an executive committee member of BAI, explained the reason

for miscommunication. He, of course, said that such thing should not have happened and felt for the harrowing time she had to go through.

However, he said that she

had to fill up a form if she needed accommodation or conveyance some 30 days ago. "This is for everyone Indian or players from abroad," he said. She apparently would have missed filling up the form. "It was unfortunate what she had to go through. On her arrival on December 10 when she was not being able to get a room of her liking I asked her if she needed help but she said she was making her arrangement," he said. "I told her that we will assist her in any form she wanted. We assisted her to get a hotel. We do not want such incidents to happen here. We take care of such arrangements." In



fact, he is the one who met Okuhara in the lobby and extended help. "We know she is a former World No 1 and we would not do such things intentionally," he said. "We take care of our guests. I told the hotel staff to take care of her while she waiting for a room."

The New Delhi chapter was something Okuhara will

never forget. "I was prepared for it (journey), but due to a series of problems, it was a physically and mentally demanding journey," she wrote. After arriving from Hong Kong in New Delhi, she had plans to stay in the city for a night and head to Odisha the next morning. However, trouble began as soon as she landed in the

capital. "The hotel near the airport was not directly connected to the airport, but it was a 10-minute drive from the airport, so I was instructed to take a taxi." Mindful of potential harassment from drivers that is common at airports, she had booked an uber ride for a 10-minute journey to her hotel.

However, after being unable

to locate her ride, she walked outside, where she was approached by several drivers. That's when an opportunist driver approached her and promised to take her to the hotel. Though hesitant, she felt compelled to trust the guy. It was also getting late. A journey that was supposed to be 400 yen (Rs 230 approx), she eventually ended up paying Rs 1,900. Though feeling cheated, she was just relieved to reach her destination. "When I later converted it (Indian currency) into Japanese yen, it was just under 4,000 yen, which was 10 times the cost of Uber. I thought I had been fooled completely, but I was able to arrive safely at the hotel with my luggage, so I was glad."

She could barely sleep that night as there was some uncertainty regarding her stay in Odisha. Moreover, she was unable to get in touch with the Indian officials, which meant her stay at the official hotel was not confirmed. She was also unable to get help from officials from Japan. After reaching the official hotel, she was told that there was no reservation for the Japanese team and she was forced to wait as the hotel tried to get in touch with her travel agency, who made the bookings. She also wrote that she met the organisers in the lobby and sought help.

That's when her agency contacted her and asked her to opt for a new place close to the venue. However, she found the new options to be questionable and was reluctant to move. She also contacted PV Sindhu, hoping to get some assistance. In the end, she found a place where the Indonesian team was staying.
