Kashmiri fraudster having links with Anti-**National** elements arrested by **Odisha STF**

BHUBANESWAR, Dec 16 (Agencies): A team of the Special Task Force (STF) of Odisha Crime Branch with the help of Dharmasala Police have arrested a Kashmiri fraudster having links with some suspicious anti-National elements from Jajpur.

A team of STF with the help of local police officials and in presence of witnesses on Saturday conducted a raid at Neulpur under Dharmshala, Police station of Jajpur district and arrested one Sayed Ishaan Bukhari @ Ishaan Bukhari @ Dr Ishaan Bukhari,

Sayed Ishan Bukhari, son of Sayed SaifeUddin Bukhari from Kupwara in Jammu & Kashmir is at present residing at Neulapur under Dharamshala Police station of Jaipur aistrict.

He was arrested for impersonation. cheating, forgery and links with anti national elements under sections 419/420/465/ 467/468/471/120(B) IPC r/w. Sec. 66 C/66 D of IT Act, 2000.

During the raid, many incriminating materials including more than 100 documents were seized. The accused was found to be impersonating as a Neuro Specialist Doctor, an Army Doctor, an officer in the Prime Minister's office, a close associate of some high ranking NIA officials, STF said.

Numerous forged documents like medical degree certificate issued by Cornel University of USA, Canadian Health Services Institute, Christian Medical college Vellore were seized from his possession.

Some blank signed documents, affidavits. Bonds, several Identity cards, ATM cards, blank Cheques, Aadhar cards, visiting cards were also seized from

his possession. It was found that the accused has married at least 6-7 girls from various parts of India including Kashmir, Uttar Pradesh. Maharashtra and Odisha. He was also active on various websites, Apps



Maternity leave doesn't lead to service break, rules J&K High Court

SRINAGAR, Dec 16 (Agencies): In a significant ruling, the Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh High Court has maintained an approved leave of any nature maternity or otherwise - shouldn't be considered as a service break and that the employee should be considered as being in active service. The court clarified that

the act of taking leave, irrespective of its kind, does not constitute a break in service nor does it lead to a reduction in the overall length of service rendered by the employee by the duration of the leave

Justice Sanjeev Kumar made these observa-



tions in the case of six female banking associates who were denied consideration for promotion to the Assistant Manager Cadre because the J&K Bank had deducted their maternity leave period from their total service, reported Live Law.

The petitioners, who

had been working as Banking Associates in the J&K Bank for last seven severs had availed maternity leave during their probation period, however the bank had excluded this leave period from their total service, making the petitioners ineligible for promotion under the

"Seniority-cum-Selectivity Channel", which requires seven years of regular service.

Jahangir Iqbal Ganaie while contesting the Bank's decision argued that maternity leave is a sanctioned leave and cannot be construed as a break in service. Excluding maternity leave from service computation discriminates against women employees based on sex, violating Article 14 and 16 of the Constitution, he contended.

He further argued with vehemence that even the J&K Bank Officers Service Manual, 2000 does not provide for such a break in service nor can it be said that **Turn to page 9**

MHA directs all IPS Officers to submit their immovable property return-2023 by January 31 Next Year



NEW DELHI, Dec 16 (Agencies): The Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) has directed all the Indian Police Service (IPS) officers across the country to submit their Immovable Property Return 2023 by January 31 next year.

The Ministry conveyed the direction in a written note circulated at the beginning of this week to the Chief Secretaries and the Director General of Police (DGP) of all state governments and Union Territories (UTs), stating, "The Immovable Property Return for the

by January 31, 2024

year 2023 is required to be filed online latest at https://ips.gov.in or https://sparrow-ips. eoffice.gov.in by using existing nic-e-Mail ID and password."

The note with the header "Online filing of Immovable Property Return (IPR)-2023 by IPS officers" was issued on December 11 with a reminder that in terms of Rule 16 (2) of All India Services (Conduct) Rules, 1968, every member of the service shall submit his or her Immovable Property Return (IPR) in the prescribed form by January 31 every year in respect of the previous year ending December 31."

Intelligence suggests 250 militants present at launchpads across Border, J&K security on alert: BSF

SRINAGAR, Dec 16 (Agencies): About 250 to 300 militants are present at launchpads across the border "waiting to infiltrate" Jammu and Kashmir, a top BSF officer said on Saturday.

The officer, however, added that security forces were alert and would foil any cross-border infiltration attempts.

"There are intelligence inputs that 250-300 militants are waiting at launchpads, but we and the Army have dominated all the vulnerable patches and are alert," Inspector General, BSF, Ashok Yadav told reporters in Pulwama district of south Kashmir.

He said the brave jawans of the BSF and Army were alert in the border areas and would foil any infiltration attempts. "We are confident of foiling any

infiltration bid." Yadav added. He said the connect between the

security forces and the people of Kashmir has increased over the last few years. "If people cooperate with us, we can take developmental activities forward in a bettei way," he said.

Cold wave continues to sweep Kashmir



SRINAGAR, Dec 16 (Agencies): Mercury plummeted further in south Kashmir but recorded a rise in central and north of Valley with Srinagar recording a low minus 1.3°C on Saturday.

A meteorological department official said today's minimum temperature in Srinagar was below normal by 0.3°C. Qazigund recorded a minimum of minus 3.8°C against minus 2.8°C on the previous night, he said. The minimum below normal for the gateway town of Kashmir, the official said.

Pahalgam recorded a low of minus 5.1°C against minus 5.0°C on the previous night and it was 1.3°C below normal for the famous resort in south Kashmir.

Kokernag, also in south Kashmir, recorded a minimum of minus 3.6°C against minus 1.9°C on the previous night and the temperature was below normal by 0.7°C for the place, the official said.

Parliament security breach: Mastermind Lalit Jha destroyed 5 mobile phones before his arrest, say Delhi police

NEW DELHI, Dec 16 (Agencies): Delhi police sources have revealed that mastermind Lalit Jha in the Parliament security breach case destroyed five mobile phones before coming to Delhi and was misleading the investigating team. According to the Delhi

police, Jha destroyed not four but five mobile phones after fleeing to



Rajasthan's Kuchaman. Investigation has revealed that Lalit first destroyed the phones of the four accused and before coming to Delhi he destroyed his own phone too.

According to Delhi Police sources, Lalit is continuously misleading the investigation team.

The investigation team has written a letter to the cellular company seeking information about Lalit and the remaining four accused.

Whatever Lalit and the other accused are telling the police, the Special Cell team is going on the ground to verify it, Delhi police sources said.

According to sources. most of the statements which the accused have given are proving to be just mere words to mislead the police.

Udhampur farmers yield over 3,000 quintals of Mushrooms, Earn Rs 6 Cr in revenue

JAMMU, Dec 16 (Agencies): In a significant accomplishment, the farmers of Udhampur in Jammu and Kashmir cultivated over 3,000 quintals of mushrooms, resulting in a revenue of at least Rs 6 crore.

The Chief Agriculture Officer of Udhampur, Sanjay Anand, said in the current year, the UT has added 500 new growers who planted about 1 lakh bags of mushrooms.

"In the current year, we have planted about 1 lakh bags of mush-



rooms. We have also added about 500 new growers to our network. Over 1 lakh bags of mushrooms have been cultivated in the district of Udhampur, yielding over 3,000 quintals of mushrooms. This has resulted in a revenue of

at least Rs 6 crore for the farmers of Udhampur," Anand said.

The chief agriculture officer said mushroom cultivation is a good source of income for women and the elderly in Udhampur, adding that with proper training and guidance, anyone can succeed in this occupation.



J&K Congress passes resolutions demanding Statehood, Assembly election

JAMMU, Dec 16: Jammu and Kashmir Pradesh Congress Committee (JKPCC) on Saturday passed two resolutions at its executive committee meeting demanding the restoration of statehood for the Union Territory and the assembly election.

JKPCC also demanded an immediate filling of all vacant posts in all government and semi-government institutions in a fast-track mode and called for the constitution of a "high-level independent commission" for the investigation of recruitment scams.

The resolutions were passed under the command of AICC In-charge, J-K Affairs, Rajni Patil.

"Today we held the meeting of the political affairs committee in which we passed two resolutions – one political and another socioeconomic. We are hold-



ing the meeting to debate the issues. We are discussing the J-K situation and hearing workers' viewpoint on it," Patil told reporters here.

She said the party will accordingly formulate the policy according to them.

"They (Supreme Court) have kept the deadline of September 24... We want restoration of state-hood. We want guarantees for jobs. We want an early assembly election

so that we have a council of ministers and MLAs here," she said.

An assembly election has not been held in the region for more than five years.

The Congress unit said the deferring also of urban local body and panchayat elections has left no trace of democracy in Jammu and Kash-

The party has already raised the issue with

the government seeking elections to these bodies under the State Election Commission in accordance with amendments

SCs, STs and women.
The party also demanded the implementation of 33 per cent reservation for women in J&K since the delimitation has taken place in the Union

73rd and 74th, with due

reservation to OBCs like

Territory.
"We are in favour of 33

per cent reservation for women. It was our commitment," Patil said.

The party in one of the resolutions demanded the restoration of the old system of recruiting youths to the army with special focus on those from the border areas, including the LOC.

The Congress in these resolutions criticised the "authoritarian approach" of the current administration towards its employees and demanded a resolution of their long pending issues.

The Congress demands an immediate revision of the package and enhancement of the relief component of Kashmiri migrants, Patil said.

The party also demanded that in order to give relief to the common man the scale of free ration should be doubled and the old scale of subsidised sugar to each family be restored.

VIJAY DIWAS

ijay Diwas is celebrated every year on 16 December in India. The war between India and Pakistan began on December 3, 1971, which lasted for 13 days and ended officially on December 16. After this war the Pakistani army surrendered to the Indian armed forces. Pakistan Army Chief General A.A. Khan Niazi surrendered with 93,000 soldiers to the Indian Army and Mukti Bahani of Bangladesh. This success of the Indian Army is celebrated every year as Vijay Diwas.

Every year 16 December is celebrated as Vijay Diwas or Victory Day. On this day, tribute is paid to those soldiers of the nation. Who sacrificed their lives for their country in this war. Another fact is that Bangladesh was born on this day. Therefore, Bangladesh celebrates its Independence Day every year on 16 December. Tributes are paid to the martyrs on Vijay Diwas across the country.

Before 1971, Bangladesh was a part of Pakistan, known as 'East Pakistan'. Reports claimed that the people of 'East Pakistan' were beaten, exploited, raped by women and brutally murdered by the Pakistani army.

India opposed the oppression of people in 'East Pakistan' by the Pakistani Army and supported the people of East Pakistan. At that time there was huge discontent in 'East Pakistan' against Pakistan military officer General Ayub Khan.

On December 3, Pakistan attacked 11 Indian airfields and in response to which India attacked the eastern and western areas of Pakistan. After this, the Indian Government ordered the Indian Army to wage war against Pakistan to save the people of 'East Pakistan'. Field Marshal Manekshaw was leading this war from India's side.

More than 1400 Indian soldiers were martyred in this war with Pakistan. Indian soldiers fought this war with complete bravery and did not allow Pakistani soldiers to make even a single move. Pakistan suffered huge losses in this war. After which this war ended in just 13 days. After this, on 16 December 1971, Pakistan Army Chief General A.A. Khan Niazi surrendered to India with about 93,000 soldiers.

For this reason, every year 16th December is celebrated as Victory Day and every year the Prime Minister of India as well as the entire country pays tribute to those brave soldiers of India. Who sacrificed their lives for the country in this war.

Both the superpowers America and the Soviet Union were indirectly involved in this war. Seeing all this, on December 14, the Indian Army attacked the house of Pakistan Governor in Dhaka. At that time all the big officials of Pakistan had gathered for a meeting. Pakistan was shaken by this attack and General Niazi sent a ceasefire proposal. As a result, the surrender process began at approximately 2:30 pm on December 16, 1971, and at that time approximately 93,000 Pakistani troops surrendered.

Thus, on December 16, 1971, Bangladesh was born as a new nation and East Pakistan became independent from Pakistan. This war is considered a historical war for India. That is why December 16 is celebrated as 'Victory Day' across the country to commemorate India's victory over Pakistan. It is said that around 3,900 Indian soldiers were martyred and around 9,851 were injured in the 1971 war.

Vocational exposure is Solution of employability

(Skills, a growth mindset, cultural intelligence, and digital literacy to create innovators)

Industry stakeholders must bring cognitive skills, a growth mindset, cultural intelligence, and digital literacy to create innovators and entrepreneurs in the country

India's GDP growth has brought optimism against the backdrop of an unbalanced world economy. In this scenario, the focus is once again on skilling initiatives. Skill India Mission and the skill development of the new generation are crucial for building 'Viksit Bharat' by 2047. The New Education Policy (NEP) 2020 emphasizes the need for every youth to be empowered with skills starting from school time, to become important stakeholders in a development revolution.

Today, education is not limited to what is taught in schools, colleges, and universities. The scope of learning has widened due to the evolving market and digital advancements. Acquiring market-driven skills will provide great placement opportunities to the youth and strengthen the foundation of 'Viksit Bharat'.

India has a demographic advantage that needs to be harnessed by building the capacity and infrastructure for skilling, reskilling, and upskilling both existing and new entrants to the workforce. The goal was to increase the proportion of formally skilled workforce from the current 5.4% to at least 15% by 2022-2023. However, the India Skills Report 2022 by Wheebox shows that the overall youth employability in

India is only 48.7%. While several government-led skilling initiatives are covering some ground, they are not enough to meet the targeted supply of 109 million workers.

According to the latest Periodic Labour Force Survey (PLFS) data, 86% of those aged between 15 and 59 years have not received any vocational training, while the remaining 14% received training through diverse formal and informal channels. The conversion of this pool into human capital requires a dedicated focus on skilling and education. There is ample evidence to prove that upskilling the youth could lead to increased incomes, higher profitability, and greater productivity in the economy.

The NEP has set a clear goal to increase the gross enrolment ratio in higher education, including vocational education, to 50% by 2035. We are determined to achieve this goal by adding 3.5 crore new seats to higher education institutions (HEIs) focusing on a flexible curriculum with creative combinations of subjects, integrating vocational education with mainstream education, and allowing multiple entries and exits with appropriate certification. We will establish Multidisciplinary Education and Research Universities (MERUs) at par with IITs and IIMs to provide the best possible education to our students.

We are committed to providing vocational exposure to at least 50% of learners through school and higher education by 2050. We firmly believe that every child should learn at least one vocation and be exposed to several more. With over 15 lakh schools teaching 25.38 crore students, India has one of the largest education networks in the world, and we are determined to make it

even better

However, we acknowledge that achieving this ambitious goal requires sustained, concerted efforts, willpower, and steadfastness in implementing critical reforms. We need to invest in setting up skill centres in every high school across the country and recruit vocational teachers. Adding technical and vocational education and training (TVET) institutions to our schools is also essential. We are confident that, as India aspires to be the world's third-largest economy by 2030, investing in our education system is not a big task. We will do what it takes to make India a world leader in skill.

It is vital to impart skill training to our young children so that they can develop an interest in entrepreneurship. This will expose them to emerging technologies such as artificial intelligence, drones, the Internet of Things (IoT), Real Time Analytics, and so on. Automation and data exchange are at the core of the fourth Industrial Revolution -Industry 4.0, and therefore, we need to train our young brains accordingly. While a few of them may join the government and services sector, most of them will find their way into the manufacturing and service sector, which is filled with opportunities in our country.

Although some skilling schemes have been restructured, the problem has not been fully addressed. For instance, when the government introduced the Garib Kalyan Rozgar Yojana (GKRY) in 2020 to address skilling and unemployment issues caused by reverse migration, it did not work out as expected. Many reports suggest that GKRY's market demand-driven skilling initiatives were not successful and did

not reach the intended beneficiaries. This indicates a systemic problem that affects the talent ecosystem in India. Therefore, instead of merely making youths 'Labharathi' (Beneficiary), we should equip them with the necessary skills to make them Workman)

The informal sector employs around 93 per cent of India's working population, which puts them at a high risk of exclusion. To mitigate this risk, marginalized groups need to be engaged through both online and offline channels. Common Service Centers (CSCs) can help with last-mile reach, while user-friendly and vernacular interfaces can benefit job and skill seekers across different segments. The Talent NODE is not a silver bullet, but with an innovative and inclusive approach, it can help between 50-80 million people find better job opportunities that match their skills and aspirations. An interconnected ecosystem can create a million different opportunities, enabling India's youth to become job-ready and contribute significantly to the country's development.

It is crucial for industry stakeholders, including the government, private, and public sectors, to bring cognitive. This will help the youth to be job-ready and contribute significantly to India's development as a developed nation.



'Friends' actor Matthew Perry died from effects of drug ketamine



Matthew Perry died from the acute effects of the anaesthetic ketamine, according to the results of an autopsy on the 54-year-old 'Friends' actor released on Friday.

The Los Angeles County Department of Medical Examiner said in the autopsy report that Perry also drowned in "the heated end of his pool," but that it was a secondary factor in his October 28 death, deemed an accident.

The report says coronary artery disease and buprenorphine, which is used to treat opioid use disorder, also contributed.

Perry was declared dead after being found unresponsive at his home in the Pacific Palisades area of Los Angeles. Investigators performed the autopsy the following day.

The actor had taken drugs in the past but had been "reportedly clean for 19 months", according to the report. The coroner said he was reported to have been having ketamine infusion therapy to deal with depression and anxiety, and his last treatment was two weeks before his death.

Perry had played pickleball earlier in the day, the report says, and his assistant, who lives with him, found him face down in the pool after returning from

The assistant told investigators Perry had not been sick, had not made any health complaints, and had not shown evidence of recent alcohol or drug use.

Perry was open about discussing his struggles with addiction dating back to his time on 'Friends'in the 1990s.

"I loved everything about the show but I was struggling with my addictions which only added to my sense of shame," he wrote in his 2022 memoir. "I had a secret and no one could know."



Girlfriend narrates chilling details of murder attempt by bureaucrat's son in Maharashtra, says 'he invited her to hotel at 3 am and...'

In a social media post, Priya Umendra Singh alleges 'my boyfriend rammed his car over me and left me dying in pain on the street'

THANE, Dec 16 (Agencies): In a chilling incident, Ashwajit Gaikwad, the son of a top Maharashtra bureaucrat, allegedly mowed down his girlfriend with his SUV in Thane recently, seriously injuring her.

The victim, Priya Umendra Singh, 26, a professional beautician, has narrated her shocking ordeal of the murderous attempt on her life in a social media post.

"Need justice...Culprit Ashwajit Anilkumar Gaikwad, son of Anilkumar Gaikwad, Joint Managing Director of Maharashtra State Road Development Corporation," said Singh on her post.

She also named Ashwajit's friends, Romil Patil, Prasad Patil and Sagar Shelke, all Thane residents, in her post, plus her boyfriend's driver-cum-bodyquard, Shiva.

Singh has tagged Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Chief Minister Eknath Shinde, Deputy CM Devendra Fadnavis, Union Minister Smriti Irani and Shiv Sena-UBT's Aditya Thackeray, in her post with an emotional header: "My boyfriend rammed his car



over me and left me dying in pain on the street."

Despite several attempts by IANS, Anilkumar Gaikwad who was recently elevated as the MSRDC Vice-Chairman and Managing Director – was not available for comment on the serious allegations against his 34-year-old son, or the incident that happened in the CM's home

The alleged incident occurred on Ovala Road in the Ghodbunder area of the district, and Singh has suffered grievous injuries in the stomach, back and arms; her right leg is broken



and in a cast.

Singh also detailed how she was allegedly abused by Ashwaiit and his friends, how he invited her to the Courtvard Hotel around 3 am on December 11. There, a bitter fight ensued, when Ashwajit allegedly assaulted her, and then his friends Romil, Prasad and Shelke also joined in the attack.

As the situation appeared to worsen, she went to take her bag and mobile from the SUV but the youths allegedly attempted to cause her grave harm by first bulldozing the SUV into her back near a divider, then

returned and drove it over her right leg, before speeding away in the darkness.

Surprisingly, Shiva, the SUV driver, turned out to be a good Samaritan, he left them and rushed to help the bleeding and crying Singh, and also informed her family about the assault. Later, they alerted the Thane police

The prime accused Ashwajit and his friends allegedly warned the woman against involving the police and even boasted that they would use the political clout of the Gaikwad family.

Meanwhile, based on the complaint by Singh - who is in the ICU of Titan Medicity Hospital - the Kasarvadavali police have lodged a complaint against Ashwajit, Shelke, and the Patil duo (said to be linked to a retired police official), but no arrests have been made so far, even as the victim's post went viral on social media.

Tribal singer beaten to death for molesting specially abled girl in Ranchi

RANCHI, Dec 16 (Agencies): A 35-year-old tribal singer was beaten to death for allegedly molesting a specially-abled girl in Jharkhand's Ranchi district, a police officer said on Saturday.

Three persons have been arrested in connection with the case, the officer said.

11 years after Nirbhaya rape, DCW chief Maliwal says nothing has changed, crimes against women in Delhi have only gone up

NEW DELHI. Dec 16 (Agencies): Nothing has changed in the past decade and crimes against women in Delhi have only gone up, DCW chief Swati Maliwal said on Saturday on the 11th anniversary of the Nirbhaya incident -a brutal gang-rape and assault case that stirred an outpouring of anger and grief, followed by the passage of several new sexual assault laws in the country.

A 23-year-old physiotherapy intern, who came to be known as 'Nirbhaya (the fearless one)', was raped and

assaulted by six men in a bus in south Delhi on December 16, 2012, before being thrown out of the moving vehicle. She died from her injuries on December 29 in Singapore's Mount Elizabeth Hospital, where she was flown by airambulance.

"A tragic incident happened with Nirbhaya in 2012 when she was gang-raped. That girl died in agony," Maliwal told agency.

"At the time of the incident, people came out onto the streets to seek change. But despite years after that tragedy,

we stand at the same place. Crimes against women are increasing day by day. Nothing will change until the criminals are scared that the system would not spare them for such crimes," she added.

The Delhi Commission for Women chairperson called for certainty and swiftness in punishments and said governments should take such sensitive cases "seriously".

"We need certainty and swiftness in punishments and such matters need to be taken seriously by governments.



Police strength and (the number of) fasttrack courts should be increased. We need a system where justice is assured swiftly and systematically," Maliwal

said.

"Every December 16, politicians talk big about bringing change but (those are) all in vain," she claimed.

Of the six men accused

in the case, Ram Singh allegedly died by suicide in jail, days after the trial began. A juvenile accused was released in 2015 after spending three years in a correctional home.

The other four --Mukesh Singh (32), Pawan Gupta (25), Vinay Sharma (26) and Akshay Kumar Singh (31) -- were convicted. They were hanged in Tihar Jail on March 20, 2020.

"After the Nirbhaya incident, a stringent law was introduced that made some difference.

accept a rape victim's complaint, an FIR can be lodged against him too. Through the Delhi Commission for Women, we always ensure that cases of crimes against women are registered," Maliwal said.

If a policeman doesn't

Asked about a recent National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) report that said crimes against women had shot up in Delhi, Maliwal said there is no fear of punishment in those who commit such atrocities.

Delhi recorded the highest number of crimes against women among the 19 metropolitan cities in India in 2022, according to the latest NCRB report. "I think police strength

should be increased and they must be held accountable for their negligence. Are there enough CCTV cameras in police stations? What action is taken against the cops for their negligence?" Maliwal asked. She also suggested that schools should add to their curricula topics that teach boys to make women feel safer and respect them.

Israeli strike on school kills Al Jazeera cameraman in Gaza, wounds reporter

Cameraman Samer Abu Daqqa and correspondent Wael Dahdouh had gone to the school in the southern city of Khan Younis after it was hit by a strike earlier in the day

CAIRO, Dec 16 (Agencies): An Israeli strike killed a Palestinian cameraman for the TV network Al Jazeera and wounded its chief Gaza correspondent as they reported at a school in the south of the besieged territory, the network said.

Cameraman Samer Abu Daqqa and correspondent Wael Dahdouh had gone to the school in the southern city of Khan Younis after it was hit by a strike earlier in the day. While they were there, an Israeli drone hit the school with a second strike, the network said.

Dahdouh was heavily wounded in his arm and shoulder, while Abu Daqqa fell bleeding to the ground. Speaking from a hospital bed, Dahdouh told Al Jazeera he was able to flee, bleeding, from the school and found several ambulance workers.

He asked them to look for Abu Daqqa, but they said it was too risky and promised another ambulance would come for him, Dahdouh said.

"He was screaming, he was calling for help," said Dahdouh, his right arm heavily bandaged.



Later that evening, Al Jazeera reported that an ambulance tried to reach the school to evacuate Abu Daqqa, but it had to turn back because roads were blocked by the rubble of destroyed houses.

Abu Daqqa continued to bleed for several more hours, until a civil defense crew found him dead on Friday evening, the network said in a statement.

According to the Committee to Protect Journalists, Abu Daqqa is the 64th journalist to be killed since the conflict erupted between Hamas and Israel on October 7. That number has 57 Palestinians, four Israelis and three Leba-

nese journalists.
The 45-year-old Abu Daqqa, a Khan Younis native, joined Al Jazeera in June 2004, working as both a cameraman and an editor. He leaves behind three sons and a daughter.

The Israeli army did not immediately respond to an Associated Press request for comment about Abu Daqqa's

Qatari-owned Al Jazeera

said in a statement that it holds Israel "accountable for systematically targeting and killing Al Jazeera journalists and their families".

In late October, Dahdouh's wife, son, daughter and grand-child were killed in a strike on the home where they were sheltering in central Gaza. The network at the time accused Israel of intentionally targeting his family.

Earlier this month, a strike killed the father, mother and 20 other family members of another Al Jazeera correspondent, Momen Al Sharafi.

Dahdouh is well-known as the face of Palestinians during many wars. He is revered in his native Gaza for telling stories of suffering and hardship to the outside world.

Israel's air and ground assault over the past 10 weeks has killed more than 18,700 Palestinians, according to the Health Ministry in Gaza. The war broke out following Hamas's brutal attack on southern Israel. That assault killed around 1,200 people, mostly civilians, and resulted in some 240 being taken hostage.

Israel Mistakenly Kills 3 Hostages, Netanyahu Calls It "Unbearable Tragedy"



JERUSALEM, Dec 16 (Agencies): Three Israeli hostages were killed in firing by the Israel Defense Forces (IDF), said the military on Saturday. The IDF said it assumed the hostages were "a threat" and fired at them during combat in Gaza's Shejaiya district.

The three were among the people taken as hostages by Hamas terrorists during its surprise attack on Israel on October 7. Two of them have been identified as Yota Haim and Samer Talalka, while the IDF said the family of the third deceased requested that his name not be broadcast.

Hamas terrorists had taken around 240 people as hostages on October 7 and released more than 100 women, children and foreigners during a weeklong truce in November. In exchange, 240 women and children imprisoned by Israel were released.

Speaking on the incident, the military

said, "The IDF emphasizes that this is an active combat zone in which ongoing fighting over the last few days has occurred. Immediate lessons from the event have been learned, which have been passed on to all IDF troops in the field. The IDF expresses deep remorse over the tragic incident and sends the families its heartfelt condolences. Our national mission is to locate the missing and return all the hostages home."

The Israeli army's chief spokesman, Rear Admiral Daniel Hagari, said it was not clear if the hostages had escaped their captors or been abandoned, according to a report by the news agency.

Recently, Israeli troops have been engaged in fierce battles against Hamas terrorists in Shejaiya.

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu called the killing of the three hostages an "unbearable tragedy" and said, "Together with the entire people of Israel, I bow my head in deep sorrow and mourn the fall of three of our dear sons who were kidnapped."

He added that his heart goes out to the families grieving the loss of the three hostages. The Israeli PM also praised the soldiers in the military who are involved in the "sacred mission of returning the abducted even at the cost of their lives".

"Even on this difficult evening, we will bind up our wounds, learn the lessons and continue with a supreme effort to return all our abductees home safely," said Netanyahu.

California men charged with running drugs to Australia, New Zealand disguised as car parts, noodles

LOS ANGELES, Dec 16 (Agencies): Four California men have been charged with running a drug ring that sent hundreds of pounds of cocaine and methamphetamine to Australia, New Zealand and Papua New Guinea disguised as shipments of everything from car parts to instant noodles, federal prosecutors announced.

Hoang Xuan Le, 42, of Tustin and Tri Cao Buinguyen, 38, of Garden Grove were arrested and pleaded not guilty, according to the US attorney's office

were arrested and pleaded not guilty, according to the US attorney's office.
Trung Buinguyen, 40, of Lakewood and Narongsak Champy, 28, of Long Beach are fugitives, prosecutors said.

All are charged with conspiracy to export and distribute controlled substances while Le and Tri Buinguyen also are charged with distributing methamphatamine

They could face up to life in prison if convicted. Prosecutors contend that from at least 2017 to last year, the men shipped drugs overseas by air, sea and the US Mail. The drugs were hidden in



"commercial products such as instant noodle packets, car parts, emergency kits, and subwoofers," said a statement from the US attorney's office.

In 2018, for example, the ring shipped 113 kilograms (249 pounds) of methamphetamine and 100 kilograms (more than 220 pounds) of cocaine disguised as garlic seasoning, prosecutors said.

Investigators eventually seized 755 kilograms (1,664 pounds) of methamphetamine and more than 100 kilograms (more than 220 pounds) of cocaine valued at more than \$65 million, the US attorney's office statement

Ukraine forces shoot down 30 Russian drones over Kyiv, other cities in one day

KYIV, Dec 16 (Agencies): Ukraine's air defence and mobile groups of drone hunters shot down 30 out of 31 Russian drones over 11 regions across the country on Saturday, the air force said.

A series of explosions resounded throughout the Ukrainian capital Kyiv as air defence units engaged Russian drones. Reuters witnesses said.

"This is the sixth air attack on Kyiv since the start of the month," said Serhiy Popko, head of the city's military administration.

"Tonight, after three days of ballistic threats, the enemy again launched Shaheds on the capital. The drones attacked in groups, in waves, and from different directions," Popko said.

There were no casualties and no major damage reported in



Kyiv, Popko said.

The Ukrainian air force said the Russian military launched Iranian-made Shahed drones from three different directions in Russia targeting 11 different regions in the centre, north and south of the country.

The air force said in a statement on the Telegram messaging app that fighter jets,

anti-aircraft missile units and mobile fire groups of drone hunters repelled the Russian drone attack

Kyiv Mayor Vitali Klitschko said anti-aircraft units went into action as groups of the Russian drones flew across the outskirts of the city and targeted areas

near the city centre.

Anti-aircraft activity was heavy,

Klitschko said, in the Darnytskyi district on the east bank of the Dnipro and explosions also struck historic Podil on the opposite bank.

The Reuters witnesses reported loud blasts just after midnight. A new series of explosions over the next 45 minutes also hit areas near Kyiv's central districts.

Overnight air alerts in many Ukraine regions lasted for about five hours

Russian drone attacks on Ukrainian cities and regions have become increasingly frequent. Ukrainian officials have said Russia is targeting the nation's power and energy infrastructure during and ahead of the critical cold months of winter. Moscow has denied targeting Ukraine's civilian infrastructure.

US homelessness up 12% to highest reported level as rents soar and coronavirus pandemic aid lapses

About 653,000 people were homeless, the most since the country began using the yearly point-in-time survey in 2007.

WASHINGTON, Dec 16 (Agencies): The United States experienced a dramatic 12% increase in homelessness to its highest reported level as soaring rents and a decline in coronavirus pandemic assistance combined to put housing out of reach for more Americans, federal officials said.

About 653,000 people were homeless, the most since the country began using the yearly point-in-time survey in 2007. The total in the January count represents an increase of about 70,650 from a year earlier.

The latest estimate indicates that people becoming homeless for the first time were behind much of the increase.

A rise in family homelessness ended a downward trend that began in 2012.

"For those on the frontlines of this crisis, it's not surprising," said Ann Oliva, chief executive officer at the National Alliance to End Homelessness, an advocacy group.

Housing and Urban Development Secretary Marcia Fudge said the data underscored an "urgent need" to support proven solutions that help people quickly exit homelessness and that prevent homelessness in the first place.

Going back to the first 2007 survey, the U.S. then made steady progress for about a decade in reducing the homeless population as the government focused particularly on increasing investments to get veterans into housing. The number of homeless people dropped from about 637,000 in 2010 to about 554,000 in 2017.

The numbers ticked up to about 580,000 in the 2020 count and held relatively steady over the next two years as Congress responded to the COVID-19 pandemic with emergency rental assistance, stimulus payments, aid to states and local governments and a temporary eviction

moratorium.

Jeff Olivet, execu-

tive director of the U.S. Interagency Council on Homelessness, a federal agency, said the extra assistance "held off the rise in homelessness that we are now seeing." He said numerous factors are behind the problem.

"The most significant causes are the shortage of affordable homes and the high cost of housing that have left many Americans living paycheck to paycheck and one crisis away from homelessness," Olivet said.

Within the overall rise, homelessness among individuals rose by nearly 11%, among veterans by 7.4% and among families with children by 15.5%.

People who identify as Black make up about 13% of the U.S. population but comprised 37% of all people experiencing homelessness. People who identify as Hispanic or Latino make up about 19% of the population but comprised about 33% of those experiencing homelessness. Also,



more than a quarter of the adults experiencing homelessness were over age 54.

HUD said that rental housing conditions were "extraordinarily challenging" in 2022, with rents increasing at more than twice the rate of recent years. It noted that trend has subsided since the January count. Such relief could show benefits when volunteers and housing officials around the country begin the next homeless count in just a few weeks.

Officials also noted that President Joe Biden's budget for this fiscal year has recommended guaranteed vouchers for low-income veterans and youths aging out of foster care, among other investments designed to reduce homelessness.

More than half the people experiencing homelessness in the country were in four states: California, New York, Florida and Washington. While about 28% of the nation's homeless are estimated to be in California, its increase was only about half the national rate. New York's homelessness went up more than three times the national rate, according to HUD's report.

New Hampshire, New Mexico and Colorado along with New York saw the largest percentage increases in homelessness. In all, the number of people experiencing homelessness increased in 41 states and the District of Columbia, and decreased in just nine states.

Dave Giffen, executive director of The Coalition for the Homeless in New York City, said the cost of rental housing soared after the pandemic.

"So when we saw the

pandemic-era protections go away, we did start to see homelessness starting to increase again. We saw more people being evicted, housing instability," Giffen said. "But then all of that got kind of masked by the sudden, very rapid influx of new asylum seekers, and that is a crisis for which the city and state were more unprepared to deal with."

Starting in the summer of 2022, New York City's homeless shelter system has been overwhelmed by waves of international migrants who are being bused into the city from southern U.S.

border states. More than 150,000 migrants have been in the city's shelters for some period of time

Mayor Eric Adams has pleaded with the federal government for aid to help defray the cost of housing migrants, which he says will run into the billions of dollars over the next few years. He has chastised the governor of Texas, for arranging to bus migrants out of that state to New York. Adams, a Democrat, has also asked for legal and bureaucratic changes that would allow migrants to get work permits more easily.

HUD did not get data that enabled it to separate out the specific impact of migrants and asylum seekers on homelessness, but some communities indicated it did affect their increase. The Biden administration has provided more than \$1 billion in grant funding to cities and states to fund critical needs for migrants. It's also identifying potential federal land and buildings that

can be made available for shelter and other services for migrants, said a senior HUD official not authorized to publicly discuss the report.

HUD also sought to highlight improvements and noted that some communities bucked the national trend. Chattanooga, Tennessee, and the surrounding region, for example, saw a 49% drop from the 2022 count to this year's. Chattanooga increased efforts to more rapidly connect people to permanent housing and boosted efforts to prevent people from becoming home-

Other communities highlighted for a drop were Dallas, which experienced a 3.8% decrease, and Newark and Essex County, New Jersey, which saw a 16.7% drop. Houston has closed numerous homeless encampments across the city and saw a 17% reduction in unsheltered homelessness. San Jose, California, and Tucson, Arizona, were also cited for improvements.

Maternity leave doesn't lead to service break, rules J&K High Court

a person on leave duly sanctioned by the competent authority, shall be deemed out of service.

Advocate Adil Asmi who defended the J&K Bank stated that the Policy for Promotion requires seven years of "actual regular service" in the Banking Associate Cadre and Maternity leave, even though sanctioned, does not constitute active service.

Justice Kumar who dismantled the Bank's stance emphasized that any employee, including those in the J&K Bank, availing leave duly sanctioned by the competent authority, is always deemed to be in service. This principle, he declared, applies equally to maternity leave, which cannot be used to penalize or disadvantage women employees.

Dealing with the argument of the respondent Bank that while reckoning seven years of service, the Bank is entitled in law to deduct the period of maternity leave, if any, availed by a Banking Associate during probation Justice Kumar recorded, "I am not impressed with the argument raised on behalf of the respondent Bank...A person on leave duly sanctioned by the competent authority shall be deemed to be in actual regular service of the Bank. Residency i.e. actual length of regular service does not mean the only such service during which an employee is on active duty.

The bench added, "If this argument of the learned counsel for the Bank is accepted, it would mean that the period of leave of whatever kind availed by an employee after the period of probation, shall also be deductible while reckoning seven years of

service".

In a scathing critique of the Bank's reasoning, Justice Kumar declared the exclusion of maternity leave from service computation as "arbitrary, discriminatory,

and violative of Articles 14 and 16 of the Constitution.

"That apart, the Policy for Promotion of Workmen approved by the Board of Directors on 13th July 2022, also does not lay down any such condition. It is thus wrong to contend that the respondent Bank is entitled in law to deduct the period of leave availed by a Banking Associate during his/her probation", the bench maintained.

In light of these observations, J&K Bank was directed to recognize the period of maternity leave taken by the petitioners during their probation as actual regular service in the Banking Associates Service (BAS) cadre.

Further declaring the petitioners eligible to partake in the promotion process for JMGS Scale-I Officers Cadre under the Seniority cum Selectivity Channel the court directed the respondent Bank to duly consider and accord the petitioners their rightful promotion.

It is clarified that filing of Immovable Property Return under Rule 16 of the All

India Services (Conduct) Rule, 1968, by all IPS officers is mandatory, reads the note, adding, "In case the officer fails to submit the IPR (online) within the stipulated time limit, his/her vigilance clearance will be denied in terms of DoPT (Department of Personnel and Training) Office Memorandum No.104/76/2022-AVD.IA dated September 28, 2022."

How are Houthi attacks on ships in the Red Sea affecting global trade?

The Red Sea is a busy waterway with ships traversing the Suez Canal to bring goods between Asia and Europe.

LONDON, Dec 16 (Agencies): Yemen's Houthi rebels have escalated attacks on ships passing through the Red Sea during the Israel-Hamas war, raising concerns about the impact on the flow of oil, grain and consumer goods through a major global trade artery.

Israeli-linked vessels have been targeted, but the threat to trade has grown as container ships and oil tankers flagged to countries like Norway and Liberia have been attacked or drawn missile fire while traversing the waterway between Africa and the Arabian Peninsula. About 10% of the world's trade passes through the Red Sea.

In a sign of widening impact on global trade after a series of attacks or nearmisses this week, Maersk, the world's biggest shipping company, said Friday that it's told all of its vessels due to pass through a maritime chokepoint in the southern Red Sea to "pause their journey until further notice."

German-based shipper Hapag-Lloyd that was operating a vessel attacked also said it was pausing all its container ship traffic through the Red Sea until Monday. MarineTraffic, a vessel tracking firm, showed plenty of ships still moving through the region.

Here are things to know about the recent attacks and the impact on global shipping:

WHO IS ATTACKING

SHIPS IN THE RED SEA AND WHY?

The Houthis are Iranianbacked rebels who swept down from their northern stronghold in Yemen and seized the capital, Sanaa, in 2014, launching a grinding war against a Saudi-led coalition seeking to restore the government.

The Houthis have sporadically targeted ships in the region, but the attacks have increased since the start of the Israel-Hamas war.

They have used drones and anti-ship missiles to attack vessels and in one case used a helicopter to seize an Israeli-owned ship and its crew.

They have threatened to attack any vessel they believe is either going to or coming from Israel. That's now escalated to apparently any vessel given recent attacks, with the Houthis also hailing vessels by radio to try to convince them to change course closer to the territory they control.

"The numerous attacks originating from Houthi-controlled territories in Yemen threaten international navigation and maritime security, in grave contravention of international law," the European Union foreign policy office said.

WHY IS THE RED SEA IMPORTANT?

The Red Sea has the Suez Canal at its northern end and the narrow Bab el-Mandeb Strait at the southern end leading into the Gulf of SAUDI ARABIA

A huge amount of Europe's energy supplies, like oil and diesel fuel, come through that waterway, said John Stawpert, senior manager of environment and trade for the International Chamber of Shipping, which represents 80% of the world's commercial fleet.

So do food products like palm oil and grain and anything else brought over on container ships, which is most of the world's manufactured products.

HOW ARE HOUTHI ATTACKS AFFECTING TRADE?

Copenhagen-based Maersk said recent attacks on commercial vessels in the southern Red Sea "are alarming and pose a significant threat to the safety and security of seafarers." It noted a missile was fired at but missed one of its container ships traveling from Oman to Saudi Arabia.

"We have instructed all Maersk vessels in the area bound to pass through the Bab al-Mandab Strait to pause their journey until further notice," the company said in statement Friday, referring to the narrow waterway that separates Yemen from East Africa and leads north to the Red Sea.

The company says it's monitoring the security situation and is working to minimize the effect on custom-

Shipper Hapag-Lloyd, whose vessel was attacked, said it was pausing its ships through the Red Sea until Monday and "will decide for the period thereafter."

Some Israeli-linked vessels have apparently started taking the longer route around Africa and the Cape of Good Hope, said Noam Raydan, senior fellow at the

Washington Institute for Near East Policy. That lengthens the trip from around 19 days to 31 days depending on vessel speed, increasing costs and adding delays,

The global oil market has shrugged off the most recent attacks. Prices have fallen, and the market is more worried about weak demand in major economies.

The single biggest immediate impact of the Houthi escalation has been increased insurance costs.

Recent attacks show the increased threat to vessels in the Red Sea and represent a "significant impediment" to commercial shipping in the region, said Munro Anderson, head of operations for Vessel Protect, which assesses war risks at sea and provides insurance with backing from Lloyd's, whose members make up the world's largest insurance marketplace.

There is "a further degree of instability facing commercial operators within the Red Sea which is likely to continue to see heightened rates across the short to medium term." he said.

Insurance costs have doubled for shippers moving through the Red Sea, which can add hundreds of thousands of dollars to a journey for the most expensive ships, said David Osler, insurance editor for Lloyd's List Intelligence, which provides analysis for the global maritime industry.

For Israeli ship owners, they have gone up even more — by 250% — and some insurers won't cover them at all, he said.

While shippers are applying a so-called war risk charge of \$50 to \$100 per container to customers bringing over everything from grain to oil to things you buy off Amazon, that's a low enough fee that it should not drive up prices for consumers, he said.

Osler expects insurance costs to keep rising but said the situation would have to get a lot worse — such as the loss of several ships — to raise prices considerably and make some ship owners rethink moving through the region.

"At the moment, it's just an inconvenience that the system can handle," he said. "Nobody likes to be paying hundreds of thousands of dollars more, but you can live with it if you have to."

COULD THE HOUTHIS

BLOCK THE RED SEA?

Unlikely, experts say. The Houthis have no formal naval warships with which to impose a cordon, relying on harassing fire and only one helicopter-borne assault so far. Meanwhile, U.S., French and other coalition warships patrol the area, keeping the waterway open.

Still, the attacks are making the shipping industry nervous, and "it's not being taken lightly," said Stawpert of the shipping chamber. But "you'll still see there's an awful lot of trade going through the Red Sea because it's such a crucial supply line for Europe and Asia."

He noted that the Houthis' area of influence in the waterway also remains limited.

"I just don't see there being a possibility of the Houthis shutting transport through the Red Sea," he said. It is "simply not how the shipping industry works. It's not how we respond to threats like this. We will do everything we can to mitigate any such threats and keep trade flowing."

That's been on display in other conflicts like the war in Ukraine, with the closure of some parts of the Black Sea, Stawpert said.

He doesn't see a threat to shipping in general or closure of Red Sea routes, but "if that were to arise as a potentiality, I think we would see a much more robust reaction from navies in the area."

Indices log longest winning run in 6 yrs

Victory of BJP in state elections, fall in oil prices, strong GDP numbers, possible Fed rate cuts help market rally

NEW DELHI, Dec 16 (Agencies): Backed by the high possibility of interest rate cuts by the US Federal Reserve in the coming months, domestic equity market witnessed another week of stellar gain with the benchmark indices -- BSE Sensex and NSE Nifty50 -- surging about 2.3% each between Monday and Friday (December 11-15).

This is also the longest weekly winning streak in six years (since January 2018) for the two benchmarks as they registered a gain for the seventh consecutive week. Sensex gained 969.55 points or 1.37% to close at 71,483 on Friday while the NSE Nifty advanced 273.95 points or 1.29% to shut shop at 21,457. Like Thursday, IT stocks were again in major demand on Friday as the Federal Reserve's dovish view on the US economy



indicates healthy business opportunities for domestic IT companies in the world's biggest market.

Ongoing rally picked up a pack after the victory of PM Narendra Modi-led Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) in Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan and Chhattisgarh state elections. The market received another booster this week when the US Federal Reserve in its latest policy meeting maintained interest rates within the range of 5.25%-5.50% and signalled a plan to implement three rate cuts in 2024. This led to a sharp rally in equity markets

worldwide.

The two developments coupled with favourable factors such as sharp growth in September quarter GDP numbers, robust GST collections, a fall in consumer inflation, a fall in crude oil prices and an easing of bond yields have made India a very attractive market, especially for the foreign institutional investors (FIIs), despite being more expensive than other emerging economies. FIIs net bought '9,329 crore worth of equities on Thursday, according to provisional NSE data.
Vinod Nair, Head of

Research at Geojit Financial Services, said the ease in US bond yield and the expectation of multiple rate cuts by the Fed in 2024 further fuelled market optimism. "Investors expressed confidence that clouds over US economic growth would dissipate in H2CY24, anticipating a soft landing facilitated by normalization in monetary policy.

The IT sector rallied 7.6% this week in expectation of a rise in demand from the US, optimism about Albased opportunities, and hope that the Fed will cut interest rates in 2024," said Nair. Shares of Tata Consultancy Services (TCS) and Infosys logged more than 5% gain on Friday.

Six public issues expected next week amid market rally

NEW DELHI, Dec 16 (Agencies): The Initial public offers (IPOs) are looking to reap the benefits of the domestic equity markets, which are at record high over the past one month. A silent threat to bone health

Out of 6 crore cases of osteoporosis in India, 80 per cent are of women. Elderly and postmenopausal women are more at risk

NEW DELHI, Dec 16 (Agencies): An old man falls in the bathroom and fractures his hip. An 80-plus woman, travelling in a car, has vertebral compression fracture (spinal). These are relatively common in an ageing population. A major reason behind frequent fractures in the elderly is the weakening of bones due to osteoporosis.

What is osteoporosis In normal bones, solid bony tissue is separated by tiny spaces. In an osteoporotic bone, due to depletion of bony tissue, the spaces are quite wide, leading to weak bones that are prone to fracture even A normal bone keeps on rebuilding the bony tissue continuously. The age of 25-35 years is known as the age of peak bone mass. Women are affected by osteoporosis earlier (usually six years after the onset of menopause) than men due to hormonal changes. While men are affected after the age of 60, sexa-

increased in India, the diseases of the elderly, including osteoporosis, have shown an exponential rise. In recent years, osteoporosis has emerged as a major public health problem and fractures in the elderly have risen manifold.

As per WHO estimates,

one in three postmenopausal women suffer from osteoporosis. This number is likely to be higher in India due to poor nutritional practices among women. Out of a total of around six crore osteoporotic patients in India, 80 per cent are women. Further, the onset of osteoporosis

in India is observed



to occur 10–20 years earlier than in Western countries.

Risk factors

The risk factors include smoking, alcohol consumption, sedentary lifestyle, poor nutrition, calcium and vitamin D deficiency, long-term intake of some drugs and certain hormonal diseases.

Osteoporosis is known as a silent killer because it does not have any

symptoms. The disease only comes to light when one suffers an osteoporotic fracture due to some minor injury. The common areas are the spine (vertebral column), the hip region and wrist. Other areas like shoulder, ankle and elbow may also suffer. Even jaw bones are affected and the anchorage of teeth in the jaw bones starts becoming loose. In severe osteoporosis, the teeth start falling.

Prevention and treat-

A lifestyle disease, osteoporosis is largely preventable by having a healthy lifestyle, avoiding alcohol and smoking, along with regular

physical activity (walking/yoga/light weight training), can keep your bones healthy.

In addition, regular exposure to direct sunlight of at least 30 per cent bare skin (not covered with clothes and not through glass) for at least 30 minutes every day helps to keep vitamin D levels normal that are essential to prevent osteoporosis.

Calcium is an important constituent of the bony tissue and a balanced diet containing milk products, green vegetables and protein prevents nutritional osteoporosis. However, rising consumption of junk food, particu-

larly among the young when bone growth is maximum, is creating a severe nutritional imbalance and may lead to even greater number of osteoporosis cases in the future. However, with the increase in surgical expertise and advanced technology, the osteoporotic fractures have become treatable effectively now.

As prevention remains the best medicine, a periodic screening after menopause in women and men after the age of 60 years (at earlier age for high-risk individuals) helps to detect the onset of osteoporosis that is treatable with drugs and healthy lifestyle.

India Thrash England By 347 Runs, Biggest Win In **Women's Test History**

NAVI MUMBAI, Dec 16 (Agencies): The Indian women's cricket team, led by Harmanpreet Kaur thrashed England in some style in Navi Mumbai on Saturday, setting a world record in the process. Boosted by Deepti Sharma's match haul of nine wickets, India beat England by 347 runs. This is the biggest margin of win (in terms of runs) in the history of women's Tests. The previous best was Sri Lanka's 309-run win over Pakistan in Colombo in 1998. The win was also Indian women's team's first over England at home.

It was also India's first win over England at home in 15 Tests, having beaten them in away games twice in 2014, giving them a big boost ahead of the oneoff Test against Australia starting next week.

Talking about the match, Deepti Sharma played the enforcer's role to perfection for the



second time in as many days as the dominant India Women scripted a historic 347-run victory over England on the third day of the one-off Test on Saturday. India set in motion the hunt for triumph while declaring their second innings closed at the overnight score of 186 for 6, leaving England to climb a huge mountain of 479 runs in their second innings.

The Indian bowlers led by off-spinner Deepti Sharma (4/32) and pacer Pooja Vastrakar (3/23) then bundled out England for 131 to celebrate a victory which now stands as the biggest in terms of runs in the history of women's Test cricket.

Over the course of the last three days the Indians did not show any rust of not having played Test cricket in two years,

and a first at home after nine years, while being

at their ruthless best. But for all that slew of records, the Harmanpreet Kaur-led side should thank Deepti (8-2-32-4) who was in her elements after that sensational 5 for seven in the first innings, as England lacked gumption to fight even on a pitch that appeared to be far more gentle.

India did not have to wait for long for the first breakthrough this morn-

It came in the form of Tammy Beaumont (17) with pacer Renuka Singh moving the ball in from outside the off to knock down her offstump.

England sunk deeper after suffering twin blows in Vastrakar's first over. Sophie Dunkley (15) played one straight into the hands of substitute

Deepti then had Amy Jones (5) pulling one straight to short midwicket, and in her seventh over of the innings, the 26-year-old hit the timber twice to dismiss Kate Cross (16) and Lauren Filer (0).

While Deepti narrowly missed taking 10 wickets in the game to become the first Indian Women's player to do so, Rajeshwari Gayakwad (2/20) enjoyed some success.

The left-arm spinner had her first success in the form of Sophie Ecclestone (10) when the batter went for a sweep and missed to connect, while Lauren Bell (8) was caught by Jemimah Rodrigues at silly point for the final wicket of the game.

It was a perfect outing for India also given that all their debutants in the game - Shubha Satheesh, Rodrigues and Renuka - tasted success, but there also was a dampener in the form of Shubha missing the action on the second and the third day owing to a fractured finger.
