Baramulla **Doctor Becomes** First from **Kashmir To Buy** Piece of Land

on Moon

SRINAGAR, Dec 21 (Agencies): A doctor from Baramulla has become the first person from Kashmir Valley and second overall in Jammu and Kashmir to buy a piece of land on lunar surface (moon). Dr. Kousar Bakshi, a Kashmir-based doctor from Baramulla and CEO of ARML Labs in Handwara, has been officially communicated by the Lunar Registry about his successful bid.

As per a registered claim, reads that Dr. Kousar Bakshi is recorded as the true owner of the property located at Mare Tranquillitatis (Sea of Tranquillity) 8.35 Degree North Latitude, 30.85 Degree East Longitude. Tract 34, Parcel 21024.

Dr. Bakshi expressed his elation over the achievement. "I applied for the bid on July 6, 2023, and as per a communiqué received by me, my bid shows to have gone through as of September 12,

2023", Dr. Bakshi said. "I am quite happy to become the first from Valley to make it...', Dr. Bakshi, who runs one of the most reputed testing labs' in north Kashmir said.

The bill provides for the appointment, qualifications, Search Committee, Selection Committee, term of office, salary, resignation and removal, leave, pension of the Chief Election

Election Commission (Conditions of Service of **Election Commissioners** and Transaction of Business) Act, 1991 does not contain provisions regarding the qualifications, search committee for preparing a panel of persons for consideration and recommenCommittee for appointment as CEC and election commissioners.

The Supreme Court, in a writ petition, declared that the appointment of CEC and ECs shall be made by the President on the basis of advice tendered by a committee consisting of the Prime Minister, the Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha or leader of the largest opposition party in the House and the Chief Justice of India. Meghwal said judgment had noted that the norm provided by the Supreme Court will continue to hold good till a law is made by the Parliament.

Opposition holds protest against suspension of MPs from Parliament



NEW DELHI, Dec 21 (Agencies): Congress president Mallikariun Kharge on Thursday alleged that Rajya Sabha Chairman Jagdeep Dhankhar had brought casteism to Parliament, after the Vice President had slammed a TMC leader's mimicry of him and called it an insult to his background as a farmer and Jat.

Kharge made the remarks after opposition MPs marched to Vijav Chowk from Parliament to protest the suspension of 143 MPs from the House.

The Congress president, flanked by MPs and leaders of INDIA bloc parties, alleged that it was a matter of breach of privilege of the House that Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Home Minister Amit Shah had spoken outside Parliament while it was in session and did not apprise the House over the Lok Sabha security breach incident.

"We wanted to raise Parliament security breach issue as to why it happened and who is responsible," Kharge

"Lived my life with honesty, Have nothing to hide": CM Kejriwal responds to fresh ED summons

(Agencies): Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Thursday responded to the fresh summons issued by the Directorate of Enforcement (ED) in connection with the Delhi excise policy case, saying it was 'politically motivated' and 'illegal' like the previous one.

"I am ready to accept every legal summons. This summons of ED is also illegal like the previous ones. ED's summons are politically motivated. They should be



withdrawn. I lived my life with honesty and transparency. I have nothing to hide," CM Kejriwal said in a statement on Thursday.

The ED, on December 18, issued fresh sum-

18 Rohingyas marry locals in J&K for **Indian Identity Cards**

SRINAGAR, Dec 21 (Agencies): Jammu and Kashmir (J&K) Police have uncovered a scheme in which 18 Rohingyas illicitly obtained 'Indian National' identity cards by marrying locals in the reported. The investigation disclosed that these Rohingyas entered into marriages in seven districts of Jammu and Kashmir, encompassing four districts in Jammu and three in the Kashmir valley.

Officials informed Republic that the police identified 18 Rohingyas who had wed locals, with six in Kishtwar, three in Doda, and two in each of Jammu, Ramban, Poonch, and Bandipora, along with one in Anantnag district of south Kashmir.

Kishtwar Police reported the arrest of 13 individuals, including six Rohingyas and their spouses. The Rohingyas collaborated with locals from Dachan area to obtain documents such as Domicile Certificate, Aadhaar Card, Voter ID Cards, and Ration Cards.

The arrested women in Kishtwar are named Zinta Begum, Anwara Begum, Shabu Begum, Laila Begum, Hassina Jan, and Shaheena Begum.

An official involved in the investigation said that the current number is preliminary and may increase as the probe advances. The interrogation of those arrested or detained during the raids in the Jammu





That's especially true in the past few years, as data collection and analysis has ramped up considerably thanks to robust IoT connectivity, the proliferation of connected devices and everspeedier computer processing.

With companies spending billions of dollars on AI products and services annually, tech giants like Google, Apple, Microsoft and Amazon spending billions to create those products and services, universities making AI a more prominent part of their curricula and the U.S. Department of Defense upping its AI game, big things are bound to happen.

"Lots of industries go through this pattern of winter, winter, and then an eternal spring," former Google Brain leader and Baidu chief scientist Andrew Ng told ZDNet. "We may be in the eternal spring of AI."

Artificial intelligence in TRANSPORTATION

Transportation is one industry that is certainly teed up to be drastically changed by AI. Self-driving cars and AI travel planners are just a couple of facets of how we get from point A to point B that will be influenced by AI. Even though autonomous vehicles are far from perfect, they will one day ferry us from place to place.

Artificial intelligence IN MAN-UFACTURING

Manufacturing has been benefiting from AI for years. With AI-enabled robotic arms and other manufacturing bots dating back to the 1960s and 1970s, the industry has adapted well to the powers of AI. These industrial robots typically work alongside humans to perform a limited range of tasks like assembly and stacking, and predictive analysis sensors keep equipment running smoothly.

Artificial intelligence IN HEALTHCARE

It may seem unlikely, but AI healthcare is already changing the way humans interact with medical providers. Thanks to its big data analysis capabilities, AI helps identify diseases more quickly and accurately, speed up and streamline drug discovery and even monitor patients through virtual nursing assistants.

Artificial intelligence IN EDU-CATION

AI in education will change the way humans of all ages learn. AI's use of machine learning, natural language processing and facial recognition help digitize textbooks, detect plagiarism and gauge the emotions of students to help determine who's struggling or bored. Both presently and in the future, AI tailors the experience of learning to student's individual needs.

Artificial intelligence IN MEDIA

Journalism is harnessing AI too, and will continue to benefit from it. One example can be seen in The Associated Press' use of Automated Insights, which produces thousands of earning reports stories per year. But as generative AI writing tools, such as ChatGPT, enter the market,

questions about their use in journalism abound.

Artificial intelligence IN CUSTOMER SERVICE

Most people dread getting a robo-call, but AI in customer service can provide the industry with data-driven tools that bring meaningful insights to both the customer and the provider. AI tools powering the customer service industry come in the form of chatbots and virtual assistants. The Impact of AI on Society

HOW AI WILL CHANGE WORK

During a lecture at Northwestern University, AI expert Kai-Fu Lee championed AI technology and its forthcoming impact while also noting its side effects and limitations. Of the former, he warned:

"The bottom 90 percent, especially the bottom 50 percent of the world in terms of income or education, will be badly hurt with job displacement ... The simple question to ask is, 'How routine is a job?' And that is how likely [it is] a job will be replaced by AI, because AI can, within the routine task, learn to optimize itself. And the more quantitative, the more objective the job is—separating things into bins, washing dishes, picking fruits and answering customer service calls – those are very much scripted tasks that are repetitive and routine in nature. In the matter of five, 10 or 15 years, they will be displaced by AI."

New Rajasthan CM hits the ground running

In a notable display of urgency, newly appointed Rajasthan chief minister Bhajan Lal Sharma wasted no time in making his mark on the administration. Even as he is consulting the Centre on the composition of his cabinet, within hours of assuming office he announced the selection of three seasoned IAS officers for crucial roles in the Chief Minister's Office (CMO).

Though it is pointed out that this is a temporary arrangement, T. Ravikanth was appointed as the principal secretary to the chief minister, succeeding Kuldeep Ranka who served ex-chief minister Ashok Gehlot. Adding further depth to Mr Sharma's team, Ms Anandhi, an IAS officer of the 2007 batch, assumed the role of Secretary to the CM, while Dr Saumya Jha of the 2017 batch joined as joint secretary to the CM, to inject fresh perspectives and youthful dynamism.

Such prompt actions, observers note, not only set the tone for Mr Sharma's leadership but also underscore the urgency with which he aims to address key issues facing Rajasthan, as much as his desire to distance his government from the previous Congress government

under Mr Gehlot. Still, these are early days of the administration and among Sharma's tasks will also be to show that despite his rookie status within the BJP, he has what it takes to do a good job.

Security breach fallout: Time for a swift overhaul

The recent security lapse at the Parliament has highlighted the inherent risks associated with prolonged vacancies in critical positions, emphasizing the urgent need for a reevaluation of our approach to national security. This most significant breach since the 2001 terror attack, has prompted a reassessment of key affairs, particularly the management of personnel at the highest echelons.

One glaring issue lies in the extended absence of a full-time joint secretary to head the Parliament security service. Currently filled by Brijesh Singh, a director-level officer, the executive director (security) position at the Parliament has been vacant for too long.

In the aftermath of the security breach, there was a presumption among officers across services that the executive director (security) would be promptly replaced. However, it was discovered that the vacancy had persisted since mid-November, following the departure of Raghubir

Lal, a 1997-batch IPS offer to Uttar Pradesh as ADG (security) after completing an extended one-year tenure.

Further, the incident has woken up the government to the precarious situation of key central armed police forces like the CRPF and CISF, which have been operating under ad hoc arrangements for months. Notably, the post of CRPF Director General has been ad hoc managed by ITBP DG Anish Dayal Singh since the beginning of this month, replacing Dr Sujoy Lal Thaosen. Similarly, the DG CISF post has been filled by IPS officer Neena Singh in an ad hoc arrangement, since the retirement of Sheel Vardhan Singh in August.

Prolonged vacancies in such critical roles pose a direct threat to national security and demand swift action.

UP chief secy's next move remains a mystery

With the appointment of three new faces as chief ministers in Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan and Chhattisgarh, the Modi Sarkar, once again, revealed its penchant for unpredictability. The attention has now shifted to the intensifying politicking in Uttar Pradesh, where some punters are predicting a similar upheaval. However, among UP babu circles the big question is whether chief sec-

retary Durga Shanker Mishra will get another extension of service.

Mr Mishra's trajectory follows a unique and unprecedented path. Originally the Union Secretary for Urban Affairs, he became chief secretary of Uttar Pradesh in December 2021. A growing consensus suggests that Mr Mishra's tenure may extend beyond this month, marking his third successive extension. But, unlike previous extensions, this one might be limited to six months.

If Mishra indeed secures another extension, sources claim that political rivals are expected to resort to legal challenges, as seen recently in similar cases like that of ED chief S.K. Mishra and Delhi chief secretary Naresh Kumar. However, the Centre has successfully navigated such challenges in the past.

Another school of thought suggests that after December 31, Mishra may wade into politics and potentially contest the 2024 Lok Sabha elections from UP. This however seems like a remote possibility given the Centre's likely reluctance to release him before achieving its Mission 2024. Mr Mishra is unlikely to defy the decisions of the Centre.

NEW DELHI, Dec 21 (Agencies): Prime Minister Narendra Modi has said that "any talk of amending the Constitution is meaningless" and maintained that ties with the US were on an upward trajectory despite US federal prosecutors alleging an Indian link in a plot to assassinate Sikh separatist Gurpatwant Singh Pannun on American soil.

"Regarding the best words to describe this relationship, I leave it to you. Today, the India-US relationship is broader in engagement, deeper in understanding, warmer in friendship than ever before," he said.

On the Hamas-Israel conflict, the PM said he was in touch with the leaders in the region and said India is willing to do everything to take forward efforts towards peace.

The PM sidestepped a question on the recent relaxation of US-China tensions, saying they are "best addressed by the people and governments of America and China"

On plans to amend the Constitution and democratic backsliding, the PM, in a rare interview to the London-based Financial Times, said, "Our critics are entitled to their opinions and the freedom to express them. However, there is a fundamental issue with such allegations, which often appear as criticisms. These claims not only insult the intelligence of the Indian people but also underestimate their deep commitment to values like diversity and democracy."

When asked what future the Muslim minority has in India, Modi pointed to the economic success of India's Parsis, as per an impressionistic interview released by the FT.

"Despite facing persecution elsewhere in the world, they have found a safe haven in India, living happily and prospering. That shows that the Indian society itself has no feeling of discrimination towards any religious minority," he elaborated.

The PM had a "long and hearty laugh" before answering a question about the Centre's alleged crackdown on his critics. "There is a whole ecosystem that is using the freedom available in our country to hurl these allegations at us every day, through editorials, TV channels, social media, videos, tweets, etc. They have the right to do so. But others have an equal right to respond with facts," he said.

The PM then suggested that the criticism overseas about narrowing of democratic space in India was as misinformed as dressed in a cream kurta and rust-coloured sleeveless jacket, and immaculately barbered and manicured.

He identified the "most transformative steps" as "Clean India" and digital public infrastructure push.

"The world is interconnected as well as interdependent," he said while outlining India's "mixand-match foreign policy".

Putting national interest foremost "allows us to engage with various nations in a manner that respects mutual interests and acknowledges the complexities of contemporary geopolitics".

The PM also batted away criticism about the slow pace of employment generation by citing unemployment data gathered by the Periodic Labour Force Survey, which points to "a consistent decline in unemployment rates".

"When evaluating different performance parameters like productivity and infrastructure expansion, it becomes evident that employment generation in India, a vast and youthful nation, has indeed accelerated," he added.

He also did not agree about extensive corruption by stating that India wouldn't have achieved the status of the world's fastest-growing economy "if the issues you've highlighted were as pervasive as suggested".

On the flight of skilled people abroad, the PM said India's goal should be to create such an environment in India that it naturally gets people to have a stake in India.

Brij Bhushan loyalist Sanjay Singh elected Wrestling **Federation of India chief**



NEW DELHI, Dec 21 (Agencies): Sanjay Singh on Thursday became the new president of the Wrestling Federation of India (WFI) with his panel comfortably winning most of the posts in the delayed polls as outgoing chief Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh gained indirect control over the sports body.

Sanjay, who is a Brij Bhushan loyalist and UP Wrestling Association vice-president, secured 40 votes as against seven that his rival Anita Sheoran got. RSS-affiliate Sanjay hails from Varanasi and is a very close associate of Brij Bhushan. Given the tremendous interest the outgoing chief has in the sport, it is expected that Sanjay will consult him in policy decisions.

"It's triumph for thousands of wrestlers in the country who suffered in the past 7-8 months," Sanjay Singh told reporters after his huge win.

"We will respond to politics with politics and wrestling with wrestling," Sanjay replied when asked about the politics being played within federation.

The panel of Sheoran, a CWG gold medallist, though managed to win the key post of Secretary- General as Prem Chand Lochab, a former RSPB secretary, beat Darshan Lal 27-19.

Devender Singh Kadian, who runs a chain of food joints on National Highways and is considered to be close to protesting wrestlers, claimed the senior vice-president's post, beating I D Nanavati 32-15.

The Brij Bhushan camp The Brij Bhushan camp won 13 of the 15 posts. It swept all the four posts of vicepresidents with Delhi's Jai Prakash (37), West Bengal's Asit Kumar Saha (42), Punjab's Kartar Singh (44) and Manipur's N Phoni (38) winning the elections.

Three-year jail term for DMK minister K Ponmudi in disproportionate assets case

CHENNAI, Dec 21 (Agencies): In a lethal blow to Tamil Nadu Minister for Higher Education K Ponmudi and the ruling DMK, the Madras High Court on Thursday sentenced him to three years of imprisonment in a disproportionate assets case.

Justice G Jayachandran pronounced the sentence under the Prevention of Corruption Act (PCA), in the jam-packed court hall number 46 of the Madras High Court even as the Minister was present through video-conferencing.

His wife P Visalakshi is sentenced to undergo imprisonment in the same case for the same quantum of three years.

The court suspended the sentence of imprisonment for 30 days to enable the couple to appeal in the Supreme Court.

Appearing before the court, Ponmudi and his wife Visalakshi submitted their medical records and prayed for a minimum sentence citing their age and poor health.

Since the sentence is for three years, he stands automatically disqualified as a member of the Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly, to which he was elected in the 2021 polls. The court verdict has deprived him of the eligibility to contest for elections for six years, leaving him in the sunset of his illustrious political career, and given his age, 72 years, a comeback appears to have remote chances.

The Minister is sentenced for the offence under Section 13 (2) r/w 13 (1) (e) of PCA for amassing wealth to the tune of Rs 1.72 crore, which accounts for 64.90 per cent, more than his known sources of income during his tenure as Minister for Higher Education, Mines and Minerals during 2006-11.

Ponmudi, an influential leader of DMK, started his career as a teaching faculty in an university and turned to politics later, and became a close confidante of late party patriarch M Karunanidhi and his son and



current Chief Minister MK Stalin.

He is the second senior leader of a political party and a sitting Minister in Tamil Nadu to be disqualified from the membership of the Legislative Assembly after late CM J Javalalithaa who was stripped of the public position of CM and MLA after a special court in Bengaluru convicted and sentenced her in a wealth case.

A PhD holder, Ponmudi is known for his sharp political comments. H continues to remain the face of the party in the northern region of the state.

A 2011 FIR over disproportionate wealth filed by the Directorate of Vigilance and Anti-Corruption (DVAC) after the AIADMK came back to power did him in.

Ponmudi and his wife were acquitted by the special court for PCA cases in Villupuram on April 18, 2016. Challenging this order, the DVAC had filed an appeal in the High Court in 2017.

After almost six years, the High Court convicted him on December 19 and announced that the sentence would be pronounced on December 21, 2023.

"The charge of an offence punishable under section 13 (2) r/w 13 (1) (e) of PCA framed against A-1 (Ponmudi) stands proved. The charges under section 13 (2) r/w 13 (1) (e) of PCA and 109 IPC against A-2 (Visalakshi) stands proved," Justice Jayachandran had said in the conviction order.

The judge found that Rs 1.72 crore worth of assets were amassed by the couple disproportionate (64.90 per cent) to known sources of income.

"Considering the overwhelming evidence against the respondents, and the unsustainable reasons given by the trial court for acquittal by ignoring that evidence, compel this court to declare the judgment of the trial court is palpably wrong, manifestly erroneous and demonstrably unsustainable. Hence,

this is a fit case for the

appellate court to inter-

fere and set it aside,"

Justice Jayachandran

had ruled. He had also assailed the trial judge saying that acceptance of the self-serving declaration of income to the Income Tax authority by an accused in a DA case by ignoring the first principle of law and the judicial pronouncements, is not a possible view but "an erroneous view conceived due to misconception".

Justice Jayachandran had then termed the trial court's misinterpretation of the bank account statements as proof of income, as a "complete miscarriage of justice" that occurred by the "omission of reliable evidence", and by "misinterpretation of evidence".

Further, he had also said that the trial court's ready acceptance of the I-T returns of Ponmudi's wife without any independent evidence is "palpably wrong and manifestly erroneous".

"In the light of the above observations, the dictum and principles postulated by the apex court applied to the case on hand, this court finds that the trial court on a superficial reading of the evidence had proceeded with the process of decision-making on the premise that A-1 and A-2 are separate entities and they both cannot be clubbed together. This is a fallacious approach by the trial court," the judge had said.

UP woman gets triple-talaq for donating kidney to brother Act, which imposes a

GONDA (UP), Dec 21 (Agencies): A man gave triple-talaq to his wife over WhatsApp after she donated a kidney to her ailing brother.

The man works in Saudi Arabia, while the wife stays in Bairiyahi village in Uttar Pradesh's Gonda district.

The incident unfolded after the wife took a decision to save her brother by donating one of her kidneys. Little did she anticipate that the noble act would become the catalyst for the dissolution of her marriage. The husband gave her

triple-talaq soon after she sent a message to inform him about the kidney donation.

On the complaint of the woman, police have registered a case and said that they will take legal action.

The practice of tripletalag had been declared illegal and unconstitutional in the country in

Four die of suffocation in Jharkhand's Hazaribag after they lit charcoal to beat the cold



HAZARIBAG, Dec 21 (Agencies): Four persons, including a teenager, died of suffocation after they lit charcoal in their room to get respite from severe cold in Jharkhand's Sirshi village, police said on Thursday.

The deceased were identified as Rahul Kumar (20), Akhilesh Kumar (21), Prince Kumar (20) and Armaan Ali (19), a senior police officer said.

All of them hailed from Buxar district

of Bihar, and were pursuing a computer course at an institute in Sirshi, he said. They had lit charcoal in their rented accommodation on Wednesday to beat the cold, and prima facie, the deaths occurred due to suffocation after inhaling the smoke, Deputy SP (HQ) Rajiv Kumar said.

A cold wave has been sweeping parts of the state, including Hazaribag, for the last 10 days, the Met Department said. When the youths did not respond on Thursday morning, locals broke open the door and found them lying motionless, police said.

The bodies were sent for post-mortem examination, and family members of the deceased have been informed, they added.


12 Dead, 13 Injured In Coal Mine Accident In China: Report

SHANGHAI, Dec 21 (Agencies): Twelve people have been killed and 13 others injured in a mining accident in northeast China, state media reported on Thursday.

The incident took place at 3:50 pm local time (0750 GMT) on Wednesday at a coal mine on the outskirts of Jixi city in Heilongjiang province, state broadcaster CCTV said.

The accident -- which involved a vehicle in the mine's inclined shaft -- "caused 12 deaths and injured 13, and the injured have all been sent to hospital for treatment", CCTV said on Thursday.

"The cause of the accident is still under investigation," CCTV



Mining safety in China has improved in recent decades, as has media coverage of major incidents, many of which were once overlooked.

But accidents are still common in an industry with a poor safety record and where regulations are not necessarily enforced.

Last year, 245 people died in

168 accidents, according to official figures.

In November, an accident at another coal mine in Heilongjiang killed 11 people.

In September, at least 16 people were killed in a coal mine fire in southwest China's Guizhou province.

In February, a coal mine partly collapsed in the remote and sparsely populated Alxa League of the northern Inner Mongolia region after a 180-metre-high (590-foot) slope gave way.

Dozens of people and vehicles were buried under a mountain of debris, but authorities did not disclose the final death toll for months.

It was only revealed in June that 53 people had been killed.

Ukraine Says Shot Down 35 Drones Launched By Russia Overnight



KYIV, Dec 21 (Agencies): Ukraine said Thursday that air defence systems in the capital Kyiv and other locations across the country had downed dozens of Iranian-designed drones launched by Russian forces in Moscow's latest overnight barrage.

"Russian occupiers attacked with 'Shahed' type UAVs from three directions: Chauda - occupied Crimea, Primorsko-Akhtarsk, Kursk," the Ukranian air force wrote on Telegram.

It said it shot down 34 of the 35 drones, without reporting any casual-

Drone attacks have been near-daily occurrences in Ukraine, and Kyiv has reinforced its air defence systems with weapons from its European and US

Lately, Moscow has stepped up night-time attacks.

Ukraine has asked its allies to provide more air defence systems.

The Democratic and Republican leaders of the US Senate said Tuesday that Washington would not be able to approve new aid for Ukraine before the year's end.

Kyiv has accused the Kremlin of seeking to terrorise its civilians and destroy its energy facilities in a bid to plunge the country into darkness and cold this winter.

Missing Indian Student Found Dead Near Lake In UK. Probe Ordered

LONDON, Dec 21 (Agencies): The UK's Metropolitan Police are on Thursday appealing for information to piece together the last movements of Gurashman Singh Bhatia, a missing Indian student whose body was found by police divers in a lake in Canary Wharf area of east London.

The Met Police said the 23-year-old had been reported missing after a night out with friends last Thursday, December 14.

Officers went on to carry out "extensive enquiries", including viewing CCTV, speaking to witnesses and analysing phone and financial data. Water searches were also carried out in the area and a body believed to be that of Bhatia was recovered by police divers in the water in South Quay.

"Gurashman's death is being treated as unexpected, and while there is nothing to suggest it was suspicious, we will ensure our investigation is as thorough as possible to confirm this," said Detective Chief Superintendent (DCI) James Conway, responsible for local policing in the Tower Hamlets area of Canary Wharf.

"Because of this, we are releasing a CCTV image of Gurashman that was taken before his disappearance and would like anyone who



may have seen him in the Marsh Wall area on the evening of Thursday, 14 December and in the early hours of Friday, 15 December, to contact us," he said.

Conway added that this was an "extremely tragic outcome" to their missing persons inquiry and not the news he was hoping to give to Gurashman's family and friends.

The police noted that although formal identification has not yet taken place, Gurashman's family has been informed. Meanwhile, anyone with information about Gurashman's movements has been asked to call 101 quoting the reference CAD5787/15Dec.

North Korea's Kim warns of 'nuclear attack' if provoked with nukes: Report

SEOUL, Dec 21 (Agencies): North Korean leader Kim Jong Un said Pyongyang would not hesitate to launch a nuclear attack if an enemy provokes it with nuclear weapons, state media reported on Thursday.

Kim made the remark as he met with soldiers under the military's missile bureau over its recent launching drill of an intercontinental ballistic missile (ICBM), KCNA news agency said.

"He (Kim) said that the resolute military activity conducted by the company this time ... was ... a clear explanation of the offensive counteraction mode and the evolution of the nuclear strategy and doctrine of the DPRK not to hesitate even a nuclear attack when the enemy



provoke it with nukes," KCNA reported.

DPRK are the initials of the North's official name, the Democratic People's Republic of Korea.

North Korea said on Tuesday

it had tested its newest ICBM on Monday to gauge the war readiness of its nuclear force against mounting U.S. hostility, drawing condemnation from the United

States and its allies.

Kim said Monday's launch

demonstrated the military's high mobility and rapid attack capability, and called for efforts to further strengthen its combat efficiency, KCNA reported.

In a separate statement, Kim's sister, Kim Yo Jong condemned the United Nations Security Council (UNSC) for holding a meeting over its ICBM launch, saying it was an exercise of the country's right to self-defence.

"The UNSC should place heavy responsibility on the irresponsible behavior and act of the U.S. and the ROK, which have aggravated the tension on the Korean peninsula through all sorts of military provocations all year round," she said.

ROK stands for South Korea's official name, the Republic of Korea.

US Man Hides 17 Bullets In Baby Diaper At New York Airport, Caught By Security



NEW YORK, Dec 21 (Agencies): In a shocking incident, security personnel discovered 17 bullets hidden inside a disposable baby diaper At LaGuardia Airport in New York on Wednesday, according to the Transportation Security Administration (TSA). The TSA stated

that after the diaper set off an alarm in an X-ray machine at an airport security checkpoint, they removed the otherwise clean diaper from the passenger's carry-on luggage, as per a report.

They added that the passenger, a man from Arkansas who

was flying to Chicago, claimed that he did not know how the bullet-filled diaper ended up in his bag. Sometime later, he stated that his girlfriend put it there. Port Authority police cited him for illegal possession of the 9mm ammunition.

However, this is not the first such case to be reported. Airports all across the United States are experiencing similar issues.

TSA agents discovered a.45-caliber pistol and six bullets in a pair of Nike shoes that were hidden in a checked suitcase at LaGuardia Airport last month. It is to be noted that weapons may be checked as luggage as long as they are kept in a sealed, hard-sided container.

Officers found a carry-on bag

containing two boxes of ammunition (more than 100 bullets) and a loaded.22-caliber handgun in April. According to the TSA, the traveller stated he had been at a shooting range and had forgotten to take the gun and ammunition out before leaving for the airport. He remained under arrest.

In another case, 13 bullets that were concealed within a Mentos chewing gum packet inside a carry-on bag were discovered by security checkpoint agents in January 2021.

According to the TSA, the rounds were packed in with gum pieces. The passenger claimed the bag belonged to his son. He was charged with unauthorised possession of ammunition, according to the agency.

China's cold snap reaches Shanghai with chilliest year-end in 40 years

SHANGHAI, Dec 21 (Agencies): China's financial hub Shanghai was set to record its chilliest period in December in four decades, spurring authorities to issue warnings for low temperatures and wind, while northern cities battled icy conditions forecast to ease only next week.

The city's lowest temperatures on Thursday will be minus 4 to minus 6 degrees Celsius (21 to 24 degrees Fahrenheit) in Shanghai's suburbs, and temperatures will remain below zero all day throughout the city, the Shanghai Meteorological Bureau said in a post on its Weibo social media account.

Wang Kaiyun, 59, a cleaner in downtown Shanghai who commutes from the city's suburbs on an electric scooter, said the tem-

perature was minus 5 C on her one-hour ride in on Thursday.

"Even though I was wearing gloves, I quickly lost feeling in my hands and they are still painful now," Wang said.

While the city's temperatures remain far warmer than those in northern China, where many provinces have recorded historically low temperatures in recent weeks, the run of cold weather was unusual for Shanghai.

The city's weather bureau said it expects the minimum temperature at one downtown reading station to remain below zero for five straight days until Dec. 25, a run of cold in the month of December that hasn't occurred in 40 years.

"This year is not normal. This year is super cold and it was not

this cold last year," said a 68-year-old Shanghai resident surnamed Li.

The unusually frigid weather ushered in by a powerful wave of cold air from Siberia has spread across China since the middle of last week, with many northern provinces rewriting December records as the mercury sank as low as minus 30 C in some cities.

While the snowfall was modest compared to deep snowdrifts and blizzards seen in North America and Europe, the bitter cold, ice and gusty conditions in China have disrupted road, rail and air transportation, sharply increased demand for heating, and even hampered rescue efforts in the northwest where an earthquake destroyed

over 200,000 homes. On Dec. 13, as the cold wave swept into northern China, Yuanqu, a small county in northern Shanxi province, suddenly found itself without electricity. The rare power outage persisted for the next three days as its grid operator raced to de-ice transmission lines.

Residents without power also went without heating, as well as hot food and even mobile phone signal, according to Chinese media.

In Lvliang, a city of 3 million people also in Shanxi, firefighters had to put out a fire in a building even as their protective helmets and jackets quickly became encased in ice in minus 18 C conditions, state media reported on Thursday.

The cold snap has also threatened to freeze China's busy online food delivery sector. On social media, some people have expressed their reluctance to order takeout in the extreme cold due to worries for the safety of delivery drivers.

Their concerns prompted the official Workers' Daily on Thursday to urge people "not to dwell on narratives of suffering", but instead, think of the potential loss of income for delivery drivers.

Across China, prices of vegetables have also risen due to the impact of the cold weather. The commerce ministry on Thursday said it would take measures to safeguard a stable supply of daily necessities.

The prolonged subfreezing conditions across China are expected to ease from Friday, with temperatures rising back to historical averages next week, according to national forecasters.

Russian frontline troops hit by 'mouse fever' that causes eye bleed, claims Ukraine

KYIV, Dec 21 (Agencies): An outbreak of 'mouse fever' with symptoms ranging from vomiting and bleeding eyes is mowing down Russia's frontline troops, Ukraine claimed, reported the Mirror.

The country's Main Intelligence Directorate (HUR) said the outbreak of the disease was seen among Russian units in Kupyansk, as troops were struggling with a lack of winter provisions.

It said the disease, a type of bacterial infection, was transmitted to humans through direct contact with rodents, or by inhaling their faeces. Listing several symptoms, it said it can cause a "severe headache, body temperature rising to 40 degrees, rashes and redness,

decreased blood pressure, haemorrhages in the eyes, nausea and vomiting several times a day". The agency alleged

that Russian commanders had dismissed complaints about the outbreak, viewing them as excuses to avoid combat. In the Kupyansk front direction, the directorate reported a widespread occurrence of mouse fever, significantly diminishing the fighting capability of Russian troops. Russian army personnel's complaints about the fever have been disregarded by command, perceived as attempts to evade combat participation, with the initial stage of 'mouse fever' resembling the common flu.

As Ukraine's armed forces shift to a more defensive stance fol-

lowing an unsuccessful summer counteroffensive against Russia's army, they are fortifying field defences. Despite Western-supplied weapons, Ukraine's recent assault faced resistance from the Kremlin's deep defences along the approximately 600-mile front line, lacking crucial air cover.

Russian President

Vladimir Putin anticipates that Western allies will tire of financing Ukraine's costly war effort, enabling a new offensive push next year. In response, he has geared the Russian economy for war. However, Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy remains confident in the United States' promise of billions in aid to support Kyiv's ongoing fight.

People spend more time indoors to avoid catching common ailments like flu, cough

Traditionally, the valley residents used to consume dried vegetables to overcome the scarcity of fresh vegetables during the winter months as the Srinagar-Jammu would often be closed due to heavy snow-

While dried vegetables are still consumed as delicacies, the highway to Jammu does not face frequent closures anymore.

'Chillai-Kalan' will end on January 31. The cold wave continues even after that in Kashmir with a 20-day-long 'Chillai-Khurd' (small cold) and a 10-day-long 'Chillai-Bachha' (baby cold).

Retail inflation for farm workers rises to 7.37 pc in November, 7.13 pc for rural labourers

Retail inflation in October was 7.08 per cent and 6.92 per cent for farm workers and rural labourers, respectively

NEW DELHI, Dec 21 (Agencies): Retail inflation for farm workers rose to 7.37 per cent and that for rural labourers climbed to 7.13 per cent in November, mainly due to higher prices of certain food items.

Retail inflation in October was 7.08 per cent and 6.92 per cent for farm workers and rural labourers, respectively, according to an official statement.

Food inflation stood at 9.38 per cent and 9.14 per cent for agricultural and rural workers, respectively, in November compared to the respective figures of 8.42 per cent and 8.18 per cent in October 2023, and 6.19 per cent and 6.05 per cent recorded in the corresponding month of previous year (November 2022), a labour ministry statement said.

According to the statement, point-to-point rate of inflation based on the CPI-AL (Consumer Price Index-Agricultural Labourers) and CPI-RL (rural labourers) stood at 7.37 per cent and 7.13 per cent in November this year as compared to 7.08 per cent and 6.92 per cent,

respectively, in October 2023. The two comparable numbers



were 6.87 per cent and 6.99 per cent in November last year, the ministry said.

All-India Consumer Price Index for agricultural labourers in November this year increased 12 points to 1,253, while the index for rural workers advanced 11 points to 1,262.

The two indices were 1,241 points and 1,251 points, respectively, in October this year.

Major contribution towards the rise in general index of agricultural labourers and rural labourers came from the group of food items to the extent of 10.85 and 10.50 points, respectively,

driven by a rise in prices of rice, wheat, pulses, onion, turmeric whole, garlic, mixed spices, etc.

There has been an upward trend in the index across all the states except West Bengal (both CPI-AL and CPI-RL indices decreased) and Himachal Pradesh (CPI-AL index decreased).

In case of agricultural labourers, the index increased 1 to 10 points in 11 states, rose 11 to 20 points in four states and went up more than 20 points in three states. With 1,453 points, Tamil Nadu topped the index table whereas Himachal Pradesh stood at the bottom with 958

The benchmark for rural labourers increased 1 to 10 points in 11 states, climbed 11 to 20 points in five states and jumped more than 20 points in three states.

Andhra Pradesh and Tamil Nadu with 1,439 points each topped the index table whereas Himachal Pradesh stayed at the bottom with 1,015 points.

Among states, the maximum increase of 27 points in CPI-AL index was seen in Maharashtra, which was mainly driven by the increased prices of jowar, rice, wheat atta, tapioca, arhar dal, onion and sugar etc.

For CPI-RL, Andhra Pradesh and Tamil Nadu saw a rise of 24 points each, mainly due to increase in prices of rice, jowar, ragi, fish fresh, onion, arhar dal, vegetables and fruits (especially brinjal, tomato and lady finger)

West Bengal recorded the steepest fall of 14 points in both the indices due to a drop in prices of rice, ginger, chilly green, vegetables and fruits (especially brinjal & lady finger), firewood etc, the ministry stated.

Scientists find new method Ebola virus uses to infect cells

NEW YORK, Dec 21 (Agencies): A new study has shown that Fbola virus creates and uses intercellular tunnels to move from cell to cell and evade treatments.

The findings by scientists at Texas Biomedical Research Institute (Texas Biomed) revealed that Ebola virus creates the very tunnels it uses to hide and move within the human body.

The study, published in the Journal of Infectious Diseases, may help develop effective drugs and therapies that can stop viruses in their

"Our findings suggest that the virus can create its hiding place, hide and then move to new cells and replicate," said Olena Shtanko, Assistant Professor at Texas Biomed.

Specifically, the virus is generating something called tunneling nanotubes—dynamic connections between

cells that allow the cells to communicate by exchanging particles over relatively long distances, up to 200 microns

While these structures have been shown to play a prominent role in promoting neurodegenerative diseases, cancer, HIV-1 and influenza, Dr. Shtanko is the first to investigate their role in disseminating Ebola virus. "When we launched

this project a couple of years ago, we thought the general model of spread of Ebola virus infection—where a viral particle infects a cell, replication begins, new virus particles are made and released into the body to infect neighbouring cells-was a bit too simplistic," Dr. Shtanko said.

Using state-of-theart technology with live scanning electron and high-resolution 3D-microscopy, Dr. Shtanko and her team

showed that Ebola virus infection in cells enhanced the formation of tunneling nanotubes containing viral par-

The tunneling nanotubes then promoted the transfer of these particles to other cells. Notably, the full virus was not required to trigger nanotube formation, only small sections of the virus coding for individual proteins were

This happened even in the presence of treatments meant to stop Ebola virus.

"Importantly, we observed that Ebola virus infection could spread in cultures treated with virus entry inhibitors or therapeutic treatments that stop viruses from entering a cell," Dr. Shtanko explained.

However, the scientists are yet to learn how exactly Ebola virus particles are transported through tunneling nanotubes.

NEW DELHI, Dec 21 (Agencies): The use of an anti-cold fixed drug combination has been prohibited by the Indian drugs regulator Central **Drugs Standard Control**

> Organisation (CDSCO) to be used for children under the age of 4. This common cold fixed drug combination (FDC) is a cocktail of two drugs, chlorpheniramine maleate and phenylephrine.

This decision was made based on the recommendations of the Subject Expert Committee (SEC) which emphasised that this drug combination should not be used for children below four years of age.

All manufacturers of this common cold fixed-dose combination (FDC), containing chlorpheniramine maleate IP 2mg with phenylephrine HCL IP 5 mg per ml drops, have been directed to include a warning



on the label and the package about the caution: "FDC should not be used in children below 4 years of age.

The order by the regulator on the fixeddrug combination was issued on December 18 and made public on Wednesday.

All about this anti-cold fixed drug combination This anti-cold drug

combination contains chlorpheniramine maleate and phenylephrine. While chlorpheniramine maleate is an antiallergic drug (antihistamine), phenylephrine is a decongestant.

According to Cleveland Clinic, this drug combination helps treat symptoms of common cold or sinus inflammation. It can help relieve runny nose, sneezing and congestion in the nose. However, this medicine will not treat an infection.

However, experts suggest that it should be consumed after consulting a medical professional.

In case you're consuming this drug formulation, do not increase the recommended dose as it could result in serious harm such as hallucinations, seizure and death, as per WebMD.

Possible side effects of this drug combination could be allergic reactions like skin rashes, changes in vision,

breathing issues, anxietv. fast heartbeat, high or low blood pressure and headaches. However, one should consult a doctor before consuming this fixed-drug combination.

Speaking to India-Today.In, Dr Shreya Dubey, Consultant Neonatology and Paediatrics, CK Birla Hospital, Gurugram, the reason why India has prohibited the use of this drug combination for kids under the age of 4 is because of potential harmful side effects. "Cough is a predictive reflex. For a child less than 4 years old, if too many medicines, especially combination medicines, are given too much, it could suppress the cough but predispose the child to more infections. Cough medicines can cause sedation, irritability, respiratory depression and behavioural changes

in kids. If this combina-

tion is given more frequently, more than the recommended dosage, it can have potential side effects that can be harmful to the child's health," said Dr Shreya Dubey. Anti-cold drug formula-

tion prohibited This order comes after deaths of at least 141 children were linked to cough syrups manufactured in India. The regulator said concerns raised about promotion of an unapproved anticold drug formulation in infants prompted a discussion and a resulting recommendation to not use the combination for that age group, as quoted by news agency.

According to the recommendations by the World Health Organisation (WHO), over-thecounter cough syrups or medicines for the treatment of coughs and cold symptoms in children younger than five years of age are prohibited.

SA v IND, 3rd ODI: KL Rahul-led India look to bounce back and clinch rare series win in South Africa

PAARL, Dec 21 (Agencies): A young Indian side will be looking to bounce back and secure only the country's second-ever ODI series victory when they take on South Africa in the ODI series decider in Boland Park on Thursday, December 21. After winning the first ODI by 8 wickets in Johannesburg, India lost the second in Ggeberha by the same margin as the two have shared honours so far.

Neither India and South Africa have a full-strength squad as their stars, including the likes of Rohit Sharma, Virat Kohli, Jasprit Bumrah, and Kagiso Rabada, are preparing for the upcoming 2-match Test series, starting December 26.

KL Rahul and Aiden Markram are leading relatively inexperienced sides and a deciding game in a series that has lacked context seems to be the ideal way to spice things up on Thursday.

India have played 7 bilateral ODI series in South Africa and their only win came in 2018 under Virat Kohli in a 6-match series. In 2022, India were blanked 3-0 under KL Rahul and the Lucknow Super Giants skipper will be looking to avenge that and lead the visitors to a series win on Thursday.

Much of the 2nd ODI at St George's Park was overshadowed by the IPL 2024 mini-auction in Dubai on Tuesday. The broadcaster in India kept switching the live match to different channels while the commentary was also dominated by updates from the auction room in Dubai.

While the auction was taking place at the Coca-Cola Arena, South Africa's young guns stepped up and bounced back to level the series. While Arshdeep Singh and Avesh Khan picked up 9 wickets between them to decimate the South African



batting line-up in the first ODI, they looked flat in Ggeberha as South Africa chased down a 212-run target without breaking a sweat, riding on opener Tony de Zorzi's maiden ODI century.

For India, Sai Sudharsan has looked impressive with fifties in his first two ODIs. On a pitch that had a bit of uncomfortable extra bounce, Sai looked comfortable until he got a ripper of a delivery from Lizaad Williams in the 2nd ODI. KL Rahul also hit a fluent fifty but none of the other batters got going as South Africa pacers, led by leftarm pacer Nandre Burger, who has got a deal with Rajasthan Royals, dominated the Indian batting unit.

Ruturaj Gaikwad lit up the start of the home season in India with a T20I century against Australia, but the Chennai Super Kings opener has struggled so far in the series. With scores of 5 and 4, Ruturaj has been dismissed LBW in both his innings. While Wiaan Mulder got him in the first ODI, left-armer Burger got him with a fuller inswinger in the 2nd

If Ruturaj has to keep the selectors interested in him in the ODI format, the youngster needs to step up and deliver. In 6 ODIs, Ruturaj has scored only 115 runs, and considering the competition for the opener's slot

running out for the Maharashtra

Ruturaj might get another opportunity and runs in a decider is worth its weight in gold.

On the other hand, Tilak Varma, who has got a run of 4 matches in South Africa, is yet to light up the series. The left-hander might make way for Rajat Patidar as India would want to give the Royal Challengers Bangalore star, who has returned from a long injury layoff, a go for the first time in the series

Sanju Samson got an opportunity to bat in the 2nd ODI after returning to the squad following the World Cup squad and the senior man failed to make use of another opportunity as he went for 12. The Rajasthan Rovals captain will be desperate to return to scoring ways after having had a consistent run in the format in 2022.

Rinku Singh looked impressive for his 14-ball 17 on his ODI debut, but KL Rahul would want more from his batters in the series decider.

Arshdeep Singh and Avesh Khan did make merry in the first ODI, but they looked flat in

slightly flatter conditions in the second match. The two young guns are expected to get another go, while India might want to rest Mukesh Kumar ahead of the Test series.

However, India might look to give an opportunity to leg-spinner Yuzvendra Chahal in the series decider. Axar Patel has not had a lot of opportunities so far after his return from injury setback. The left-arm spinner struggled for rhythm in the 2nd ODI but he might get another opportunity. Washington Sundar has also been warming the benches.

South Africa played with a 4-man pace attack in the 2nd ODI and all of them impressed, but they will be tempted to bring back spinner Tabraiz Shamsi for the decider.

With the pitch in Paarl expected to be a little slower than the other venues in South Africa, India have the option to go in with three spinners for the decider. Are we going to see the return of Kul-cha? Keep in mind, the two spinners were pivotal to India's series victory in South Africa in 2018.

It's expected to be a hot day in the city on Thursday and expect an interruption-free game.

Archer Jyothi to approach court after Khel Ratna snub



NEW DELHI, Dec 21 (Agencie): On a day when the Sports Ministry released the list of the National Sports Awards winners, India's premier compound archer V Jyothi Surekha announced that she will approach the court for being snubbed for the Major Dhyan Chand Khel Ratna Award.

Jyothi and her father Surendra Kumar had been trying to get in touch with Sports Minister Anurag Thakur and other officials ever since her name did not feature in the list of recommended athletes for the country's highest sporting honour.

In fact, Jyothi wrote a letter to the Minister on December 14, urging him to reconsider as she had the highest points amongst the athletes. The 27-year-old from Andhra Pradesh won three gold medals in individual, women's team and mixed team events — in compound archery at the Hangzhou Asian Games.

Multiple sources have confirmed that she indeed had the highest points, but her name was dropped as the compound event was not an Olympics discipline. The committee also felt that the duo of Chirag Shetty and Satwiksairaj Rankireddy winning the Thomas Cup gold and a World Championships bronze medal was more cred-

Kumar today told The Tribune that they will file a petition in the Andhra Pradesh High Court very soon. "This is the biggest tragedy in Indian sport. How can someone who has the highest points as per the criteria, someone who has won medals in three backto-back Asian Games and World Championships fail to get the Khel

Ratna?" Kumar said. "I have consulted the lawyer and sent him the relevant papers. My understanding is that we will file latest by Friday because we feel that the committee took a very wrong decision. We were only waiting for the final list to come out," he added

Kumar also informed that Jyothi had tried to get in touch with the Ministry and the Sports Authority of India a number of times but she did not get any response from the officials.

In her letter to Thakur, Jyothi said she was "disheartened" by the snub. "Despite representing Indian Team for the last 13 years and winning 3 Gold medals in the 19th Asian Games, 2022 and winning 8 medals in the World Championships so far, and having a highest of 148 points as per the given criteria, I am very disheartened to see that my name has not been recommended by the committee for the Major Dhyan Chand Khel Ratna Award," Jvothi said in her letter.

"I would also like to mention that I am not against any athlete or the committee members but I would like to know the reasons or facts behind, as I am having the eligibility as per the criteria given in the Notifications," she added.

driven style of strategy for a long time," Morgan told the Times of India. "A decision like this reinforces that the franchise always comes first."

"You probably see this as being a tough decision that they've made hoping that the long-term benefits will see MI lifting another championship in the coming years. So, in a way, you've to admire the courage that it takes to make a decision like that because not every team would take that decision," he further said.

A lot is changing in Rohit's cricketing career, with there being question marks on his future as the captain of India's white-ball teams too.

With the T20 World Cup set to be held next year, reports suggest that Rohit seems to be the selection committee's No. 1 choice at present, despite the fact that he hasn't played a T20 international since the conclusion of the 2022 T20 World Cup.
