Kashmir, Pahalgam coldest at minus 4.6 degree Celsius

SRINAGAR, Dec 27 (Agencies): Dense fog continued to engulf most parts of the Kashmir Valley on Wednesday while the mercury settled below freezing point at all the stations across the Valley.

Amid forecast of dry weather conditions till December 31st, Director Meteorological department. Dr Mukhtar foggy mornings would continue to be witnessed during the next few days.

However, the night temperature continues to settle below freezing point across the Valley today while Pahalgam was the coldest place at minus 4.6 degree Celsius.

According to the data prepared by the MeT department here, Srinagar, the summer capital of Jammu & Kashmir shivered at minus 2.6 degree Celsius while the night temperature of minus 3.2 degree Celsius was also recorded in South Kashmir's Qazigund station.

Gulmarg, a famous ski-resort, has recorded a low of minus 2.8 degree Celsius.

Kupwara in north Kashmir has recorded a low of minus 4.2 degree Celsius while Kokernag recorded a minimum temperature of minus 2.2 degree Celsius.







State Taxes Department Jammu collects record Rs 4.93 Cr. penalty till December 2023 Scrap, Electrical Goods, Motor Parts, Building Material dealers turn Prime GST Defaulters

JAMMU, Dec 27: Jammu and Kashmir State Taxes Department's Jammu Division has recovered a penalty of rupees 4.93 Crores from April 2023 to December 2023 from Goods and Services Tax (GST) defaulters for various violations under the GST Act.

As per a handout issued on Wednesday, Rs 3.78 Crores has been recovered through various enforcement activities during the tax period of April to December 27, 2023, in Jammu division on various violations including e-invoicing, stock mismatch, other noncompliance while additional Rs 1.15 crores have been realized during special inspections and enforcement drives by Special



Task Force. Moreover, cases with potential of more than Rs 3.50 crores tax liability on defaulters are under scrutiny.

"The major sectors on which penalties have been imposed are Metal Scrap, Electric, Electronics Goods, Motor Parts dealers, building/ construction materials, etc", the statement reads.

Additional Commis-

sioner State Taxes, Administration Enforcement, Jammu, Namrita Dogra appreciated the efforts of the team led by Deputy Commissioners and State Tax Officers.

She also urged upon the Officers/Officials to redouble their efforts of enforcement action to create strong deterrence with special emphasis on transporters who are carrying goods without

Namrita Dogra added that noncompliance also leads to suspension or cancellation of registration, legal proceedings or even seizure and confiscation of goods. So, it's very important for businesses to adhere to GST rules, file returns on time, and fulfill their tax obligations to avoid these penalties and consequences. Additional Commis-

sioner urged taxpayers to avail the service of GST Suvidha Kendras, which is functional in all 20 districts of Jammu and Kashmir, to clear their doubts regarding GST. She further informed that the department have a dedicated X handle @JK_GST_JK, which provides all necessity information from tax notifications to changes/ upgradation in GST law.



The Supreme Court judgment in the Ram Janmabhoomi-Babri Majid case had decided the issue in terms of a property dispute. Neither religion nor myth was given any credence. But for the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), ever since it adopted in its Palampur session the Ayodhya dispute as its core agenda, along with Article 370 and the Uniform Civil Code, it has been purely a political matter. But there was enough ambiguity in its stance. It did not fight any election from 1989 to 2019 on the issue of the temple. Mr Narendra Modi was silent on the issue in 2014 and 2019, and Mr Amit Shah had said that it could either be decided in a court of law or it has to be based on a compromise between the Hindu and Muslim communities. It never became the party's poll plank.

The ambiguity persists and looms larger than before when Prime Minister Modi wants to give it the pride of place on his political agenda. He wants to make it a grand affair, showcase it as an issue of revival of national glory, and there is a thin, blurring dividing line between the political agenda and the party's, and the Modi government's, rhetoric of cultural nationalism. The BJP governments at the Centre and in Uttar Pradesh are trying to

maintain that the construction of the temple is that of the Shri Ram Janmabhoomi Teerth Kshetra Trust, which the Central government had set up in February 2020 through an announcement by the Prime Minister in the Lok Sabha, and 12 of its 15 members were nominated by the government. This is an autonomous body which does not come under government purview. It is in more ways than one a legal fig leaf. Ayodhya has been declared Shri Ram Janmabhoomi Teerth Kshetra "place of historical importance" and "place of public worship of renown", which do not really survive critical scrutiny. But a government can take arbitrary decisions, especially after the Supreme Court judgment in the mosque-temple matter. Despite everything, the Modi government has to maintain the legal façade that the construction of the temple, the functioning of the temple, is not by the government. The state-church separation is sought to be maintained. There is no doubt that the undeclared intention of the BJP is to claim it as its political victory and flaunt it as an achievement in the 2024 Lok Sabha election.

Right from 1949, when the idol of Lord Ram was stealthily placed under the central dome of the then mosque, it had turned into a battle between the two communities, and both Hindus and Muslims have been guilty of taking the matter out of Ayodhya and turning it into a national issue. The Muslim community, especially the Uttar Pradesh Sunni Waqf Board, had accepted the judicial verdict and it is busy building a mosque at the five-acre plot away from the Ayodhya town

allotted by the state government following the directive of the Supreme Court. The BJP governments have been managing the Ayodhya temple construction and the sprucing up of the little town with grand plans to make it a spot of international tourist attraction.

The interesting cultural and religious aspect of North Indian culture is the widespread popularity of 17th century Hindi (Avadhi) poet Tulsidas and his devotional epic Ramcharit Manas, which dominates the consciousness and sentiments of the people, both the sophisticates and the ordinary folk. The Ramcharit Manas is saturated with piety for Lord Ram as the great god incarnating as a human being, and displaying divine uprightness and compassion. The temple that is set to be symbol of the BJP's cultural nationalism is literally trying to overwhelm the unparalleled popularity of the Tulsi Ramayan. The temple would want to appropriate the text of Tulsi. It will then be a contest between the modern building and the old text. The Tulsi text has survived the test of time. It is to be seen whether the newlyconstructed temple at Ayodhya will become a sacred place for the Hindus. The Tulsi Dhyan Mandir in Varanasi has not been able to outshine the religious and cultural status of the Tulsi Ramayan.

What is emerging in the construction of the temple and its inauguration in January is the power play of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and not so much of Hindu piety, which is the hallmark of the people in this country, where the story of Ram exists in its various literary retell-

ings in many languages of India, and there is no Ram temple in brick and mortar to counter this cultural and religious legacy of the Hindus. In contrast, the Krishna cult has its temple centres in Dwarka, in Puri, in Guruvayoor, in Udupi and in Nathdwara, and the Krishna worshippers feel fulfilled visiting these temples. The BJP, it seems, is caught at the wrong end of the religious and cultural consciousness of the Hindus. The BJP and the Hindutva folks are babes in the wood, and that too in the shameful sense of ignoramuses and in the sense of innocence, while they grapple with the history and legacy of the Hindus.

Like Tulsi in the Varanasi of 17th century, which was not part of the Ramayan lore, in the early 19th century, Tyagaraja was content with the idols of Ram, Sita and Lakshman in his home, to pour his devotion through the immortal songs that he composed. The subtleties of Hindu culture are beyond the grasp of the vulgar politics of power of the BJP. After the pyrotechnics of the temple inauguration in Ayodhya recede and the 2024 parliamentary election gets over, Ayodhya will remain the small place it has been, and the people will find Ram in Tulsi and Tyagaraja for centuries to come. There will be an initial gold rush of tourists and then the dust will settle. The new temple in Ayodhya will not inspire Hindu piety the way the Golden Temple in Amritsar inspires Sikh piety. The show of power symbolised by the construction of the temple in Ayodhya will remain an expression of worldly pomp.

Four killed, several injured in collisions due to fog across Uttar Pradesh

UNNAO/ BAGHPAT/ ETAWAHA, Dec 27 (Agencies): At Least four people were killed and several others injured in separate road collisions in various parts of the state due to a heavy fog the previous night and Wednesday morning.

In Unnao district, adjoining the state capital, a man was killed and at least 15 others injured in a pile-up of three buses, one container truck, and two cars on the Agra-Lucknow expressway last

Bangarmau Police Station SHO Gyananedra Singh said, "A bus collided with a container truck from behind due to low visibility caused by heavy fog. Two other

buses later collided with the bus followed by two cars leading to a pileup."

The accident occurred on the intervening night of Dec 26 and 27.

"According to police, the victim of the collision was 50-year-old Vijay Kumar, and the 15 injured were all from the buses.

They have been admitted to a hospital.

In the Baghpat district of Western UP, two women were killed and 11 others injured when the van they were travelling in hit a truck in an area under the Khekra Police Station.

"A passenger van collided with a truck on the Eastern Peripheral Expressway during the wee hours of Wednesday," SHO Rajiv Singh

Seema, 44, and Mandeep, 38, were killed in

the accident. The injured were

rushed to a hospital. "It appears that the accident occurred because the van driver failed to notice the truck due to fog," the SHO said.

In Etawah, three people were injured after being hit by a truck on the Agra-Kanpur National Highway under the Jaswantnagar area of the district Wednesday morning.

According to police, the three were standing on a roadside when they were hit by a truck.

The three were admitted to a hospital, where one of them is said to be in a critical state.

Several injured in pile-up on Yamuna Expressway in **Greater Noida amid fog**

NOIDA, Dec 27 (Agencies): Several commuters were injured in a pile-up on the Yamuna Expressway in Greater Noida on Wednesday morning amid reduced visibility due to fog, police officials said.

According to the officials, the incident took place around 8 am on the Agra to Noida lane of the expressway in the Dayanatpur area under the Jewar police station

"No person suffered fatal injury in the incident while the number of those injured was yet to be ascertained," Additional Deputy Commissioner of Police (Greater Noida) Ashok Kumar said.

The officer said most of the damaged vehicles have been removed from the expressway and normal traffic move-



ment resumed on the stretch.

A video of the pile-up that surfaced on social media showed multiple damaged vehicles, including private and commercial ones, on the expressway.

One lane of the carriageway also appeared to have barricades where some construction work was underway, the purported video showed.

Rahul Gandhi to begin 'Bharat Nyay Yatra' from Manipur to Mumbai on January 14

NEW DELHI, Dec 27 (Agencies): Senior Congress leader Rahul Gandhi is set to undertake the second edition of the 'Bharat Jodo yatra' on January 14 from Manipur and Mumbai covering 6200 km. It is set to conclude on March 20.

The yatra will be called 'Bharat Nyay Yatra'. It will be undertaken mostly by bus with short walks across 14 States. The states to be covered in the yatra include Manipur, Nagaland, Assam, Meghalaya, West Bengal, Bihar, Jharkhand, Orissa, Chhattisgarh, Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, Gujarat and Maharash-

Announcing the yatra, AICC general secretary in charge of organization KC Venugopal and general secretary in



charge of communications Jairam Ramesh said that the yatra would be flagged off by the Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge from Imphal on January 14.

The main aim of the 'Nayay Yatra' will be to secure economic, social, and political justice for the country's people.

Venugopal said, "Following the unanimous resolution of the Congress Working Committee on December 21 that Mr Gandhi should

do the second phase of the Yatra from East to West, it was decided that he (Gandhi) should do the second phase of the yatra from Imphal to Mumbai.'

Replying to a question about choosing Manipur as the starting point, he said, the state was an important part of the country and also the party wanted to begin the process of healing the wounds of the people of Manipur.

He said that while in

the first phase, Gandhi covered about 4,500 km from Kanyakumari to Kashmir covering 12 states, this time he will cover 6,200 km covering 14 states. This time the mode of the 'yatra' will be a bus with off-and-on walking stretches.

Ramesh said that while during the 'Bharat Jodo Yatra', Gandhi raised the issues of economic disparities, polarization, and dictatorship, the 'Nyay Yatra' will focus on social, economic, and political justice for the country's people.

He said that after spreading the message of unity, love, and harmony, Gandhi will seek justice for the people of the country.

Replying to a guestion about whether the Indian National Developmental Inclusive Alliance (INDIA) parties will also participate in the yatra, Venugopal said, the final details were being worked out.

Ramesh pointed out that during the 'Bharat Jodo Yatra', leaders of various political parties had also participated in that yatra.

On September 7 last year, the Congress launched the Kanyakumari-to-Kashmir 'Bharat Jodo Yatra' that covered over 4500 km. During the yatra, Gandhi traversed across 12 States and two Union Territories with a clarion call for unity and a mantra of 'open a shop of love in the market of hatred'. It also saw the par-

ticipation of celebrities like Pooja Bhatt, Swara Bhasker, Opposition leaders Shiv Sena's Aaditya Thackeray and NCP's Supriya Sule, former RBI governor Raghuram Rajan, among many others.

Ammonia gas leaks from subsea pipeline of TN fertiliser plant, several people hospitalised shortness of breath, said in a statement: "As

(Agencies): An ammonia gas leak from a subsea pipeline linked to a private fertiliser manufacturing unit in north Chennai has caused illness among local residents, with about 25 people hospitalised. Officials on Wednesday reported symptoms such as shortness of breath and nausea among the affected people, who are currently undergoing treatment.

Following the leak, at about 11.45 pm on December 26, an odour that caused severe discomfort to people spread through air in north Chennai areas.

A number of persons fainted after experiencing 'burning sensation' in their throat and chest. Many people who were asleep woke up in panic and scurried out of their homes and alerted neighbours and all of them soon reached the main roads unsure of what to do.

For the people of north Chennai, it was double whammy, as they were affected by the recent oil spill and now the ammonia gas leak. About 25 people including children, who were residents of areas close to the fertiliser manufacturing facility were hospitalised. Most of them experienced unease,

nausea, and faintness.

According to representatives of fishermen villages, Chinna Kuppam, Periya Kuppam, Netaji Nagar, Burma Nagar in north Chennai were among the affected neighbourhoods.

People had a tough time finding vehicles midnight and used whatever vehicles were available like autorickshaws and motorcycles to reach hospitals.

An elderly woman fainted after bouts of vomiting and she was rushed to a hospital in an autorickshaw. Buses and ambulances were also deployed by authorities to immediately bring

affected people to hospitals many kilometers away from the location of the fertiliser unit.

Some fishermen and local people who happened to be on the beachfront at midnight noticed unusual sound and water gushing out from select spots above the subsea pipeline.

Health Minister Ma Subramanian visited the Government Stanley Medical College Hospital here and spoke to people admitted from gas-hit areas and interacted with hospital authorities.

Coromandel International Limited, a Murugappa group company

part of routine operation. we noticed abnormality on December 26 at 23.30 hrs in the ammonia unloading subsea pipeline near shore side, outside the plant premises. Tamil Nadu: 2 wanted in murder case killed in police encounter



KANCHIPURAM, Dec 27 (Agencies): Two men, accused of killing a history-sheeter, were shot dead during an encounter with police in Tamil Nadu's Kanchipuram district on Wednesday morning.

According to sources, police had to open fire in retaliation after the duo, identified as Raghuvaran and Karuppu Asain, allegedly attacked police personnel, who had



gone to arrest them in connection with the murder case.

The history-sheeter, Prabhakaran, was murdered on Tuesday by a group of men on the Pudhupalayam street in the district. According to the police, Raghuvaran and Asain were allegedly involved in the murder. Following the murder, the duo hid in a dilapidated building near the new railway station bridge, from where the

police arrested them. The duo then tried to escape and allegedly attacked the cops with a sickle.

Police said to prevent further assault on his team members, Sub-Inspector Sudhakar had to open fire on both of them, after which both the accused were taken to a hospital, where the doctors declared them dead. Meanwhile, the injured police officials. Special Sub-Inspector of Police Ramalingam and Constable Sasikumar, were also admitted to the hospital.

Both Raghuvaran and Asain had several criminal cases registered against them in various police stations.



Security agencies have collected multiple CCTV footage from the lanes of Abdul Kalam Road and Prithviraj Road.

Security officials who visited the spot said since no remnants of the explosive were found at the spot, the possibility of a "chemical explosion" could not be ruled out.

War With Hamas Will Last "Many More Months", **Warns Israel Army Chief**

Israel's leaders have repeatedly vowed to keep up their offensive until Hamas is destroyed, and army chief Herzi Halevi signalled there would be no quick end to the war.

JERUSALEM, Dec 27 (Agencies): Israel's army chief warned its war with Hamas will last "many more months" as the military stepped up strikes inside the Gaza Strip, where more than 20,000 people have already been reported killed.

Concerns over a spiralling humanitarian crisis inside the besieged territory have amplified calls for an end to the hostilities, while incidents linked to Iran-backed groups acting in solidarity with Hamas have fanned fears of a wider regional conflict.

On Tuesday, the United States reported shooting down a barrage of drones and missiles over the Red Sea fired by Yemen's Huthi rebels.

But Israel's leaders have repeatedly vowed to keep up their offensive until Hamas is destroyed, and army chief Herzi Halevi signalled there would be no quick end to the

"This war's objectives are essential and not simple to achieve," Halevi said on Tuesday night.

"Therefore, the war will continue for many more months."

The war erupted when Hamas gunmen attacked Israel on October 7 and killed about 1,140 people, mostly civilians, according to an AFP tally based on Israeli figures.

During the attack -- the deadliest in Israel's history -- Hamas also took around 250 hostages, of whom 129 remain inside Gaza, Israel says.

Israel retaliated with a relentless bombardment and a siege followed by a ground invasion. The campaign has killed at least 20,915 people, mostly women and children, according to the latest toll issued by Gaza's Hamas-run health ministry.

One woman took advantage of the sunshine on Tuesday to wash her family's clothes by hand, telling AFP: "I've pleaded with people for water. I have absolutely nothing. I've borrowed everything, even the blankets, from others.

The UN Security Council, in a resolution last week, called for the "safe and unhindered delivery of humanitarian assistance

In Iraq, the US military launched strikes on pro-Iran groups it has blamed for numerous attacks on US and allied forces during the Israel-Hamas

The strike claimed at least one life, Iraqi authorities said.

An anti-tank missile fired by Lebanon's Iran-backed Hezbollah movement wounded nine soldiers, Israel's military said, while Hezbollah announced the death of two of its fighters.

Over 120 Kg 'Cocaine Bricks' Wash Up On Australia Beaches Over Christmas

SYDNEY, Dec 27 (Agencies): Australian police said Wednesday they were scouring beaches after mysterious packages believed to contain more than 120 kilograms of cocaine washed up over the Christmas period.

A first batch of 39 barnacle-encrusted, one-kilogram bricks of suspected cocaine was discovered on Friday near Magenta Beach, north of Sydney, police said.

Since then, another 85 packages of the same size had been spotted along about 80 kilometres (50 miles) of the New South Wales coastline, state police said.

Police urged people to report any suspicious packages, Detective Chief Superintendent Jason Weinstein said

"Detectives and specialist police are currently combing beaches and coastlines for any outstanding packages and working behind the scenes to make sure we find and hold accountable those responsible," said Weinstein, who is director of the state's crime command.

Six dead, tens of thousands hit by southern Thailand flooding

BANGKOK, Dec 27 (Agencies): Floods in southern Thailand have killed at least six people and affected tens of thousands of households, authorities said on Wednesday.

The floods, which began on December 22, have hit more than 70,000 homes across the provinces of Satun, Songkhla, Pattani, Yala, and Narathiwat, regional officials said.

Six people including an 89-year-old woman and a toddler were killed in Narathiwat, deputy provincial governor Preecha Nualnoi told agency.

Another person was still missing following days of intense rain, which sparked floodwaters that reached around



three meters in height in some places, he said.

Russia says redirected most oil exports from Europe to China, India

MOSCOW, Dec 27 (Agencies): Russia has redirected its oil exports from Europe to China and India, Deputy Prime Minister Alexander Novak said Wednesday, almost two years after Moscow was hit by Western sanctions over the Ukraine

After President Vladimir Putin sent troops to Ukraine in February 2022, Western countries hit Russia with a slew of sanctions including a European Union embargo on its seaborne oil deliver-

"We previously supplied a

total of 40 to 45 percent of oil and oil products to Europe," said Novak, who is in charge of energy policy.

"This year, we expect the figure not to exceed four to five percent of total exports," Novak said in a televised interview.

As it was losing much of its market share in Europe, Moscow pivoted to other buyers including China.

"China -- whose share (of oil exports) has grown to 45-50 percent -- and India have become our main partners in the current situation," Novak said.



India, which previously received almost no shipment, has become a major buyer.

"In two years the total share of supplies to India has increased to about 40 percent," Novak said.

India has been able to snap up discounted crude from Russia before refining it and selling it to European

customers, reports say. While these sales are legal,

critics say they amount to a backdoor route for Russian oil and undermine the impact of the sanctions.

Russia has also had to find new markets for its natural gas exports as Moscow cut its exports to EU nations, which have also looked for new suppliers.

Novak said the Russian energy industry had successfully developed despite multiplying sanctions in

Novak said he expected Russian oil and gas rev-

enues will amount to almost nine trillion rubles (\$98 billion) this year -- a level similar to before the offensive in The oil and gas industry

accounts for 27 percent of Russia's gross domestic product, according to Novak, bringing in 57 percent of Russia's export revenues. Novak said Russia was

open to other buyers.

"There are a lot of people who want to buy Russian oil. These are Latin American countries, African countries, and other countries of the Asia-Pacific region."

The Army is also conducting a Staff Court of Inquiry against the 13-Sector Rashtriya Rifles Commander, who is a Brigadier, for the recurring lapses in operations in which the Army has lost many troops.

The Staff Court of Inquiry is being headed by a Major General-rank officer who would also be taking responsibility for the deaths of three civilians who were taken into custody by 48 RR troops right after the Dera ki Gali terror attack, in which four troops were killed and their bodies were also mutilated. Indian Army chief Gen. Manoj Pande also visited the Poonch-Rajouri sector today and is expected to visit again along with senior defence ministry functionaries this

During the visit, he was briefed by the top commanders about the current operations and the steps to be taken to target terrorists effectively in the coming days.

Sources said the Pakistan Army and its intelligence agencies want to revive terrorism in the Poonch Rajouri sector to pressurise the Indian Army to cut down troops on the northern border with China.

The security forces have also managed to cut down on terrorist activities in the Kashmir valley.

Asked about his remarks on Kashmir turning into Gaza, a defiant Abdullah hit back and said, "What will happen if the two countries do not find a way for friendly relations? We have terrorism. China is also

sitting over our heads. If there is a war here, where will the bombs fall? Will the bombs explode in the air or fall on us?" On Tuesday, Abdullah said he favoured talks with Pakistan, saying that otherwise "we will face the same situation as is happening with Palestinians in Gaza".

The former J&K chief minister said he has been advocating talks between India and Pakistan to ensure friendly relations between the two countries.

"That's why I often repeat Vajpayee's

words that we can change friends but we cannot change neighbours. The incumbent PM has also said that this is an era when war cannot resolve issues but talks can.
"We will pray that such time comes and

"We will pray that such time comes and talks happen here also so that the clouds of problems hovering over us disappear," he added.

On the Israel-Palestine war, Abdullah said "If America wishes, this war (in Gaza) will stop tomorrow but they also want Muslims to be killed." He said the conflict in the Middle East was not new and dates back to times when "kings from foreign lands would come to kill Muslims."

Real estate space sizzles with surging demand, soaring sales; rush for properties to continue in 2024

The real estate industry saw record sales of residential properties in terms of both volumes and value.

NEW DELHI, Dec 27 (Agencies): India's housing market defied logic this year to register all-time high sales as home buyers snapped up deals despite a jump in asking prices and the highest interest rates in six years.

Market experts strongly believe the demand will not only sustain in 2024 but rise further, albeit at a slower pace, on high economic growth and expectations of a fall in home loan interest rates.

The real estate industry saw record sales of residential properties in terms of both volumes and value, real estate market data showed that consumers are increasingly buying into the idea of home ownership post-Covid pandemic.

The ouster of dubious developers from the real estate market thanks to greater regulatory oversight via RERA helped boost confidence among home buyers.

The insolvency law too has played a role in the elimination of defaulting builders.

According to real estate consultant Anarock, housing sales are estimated to rise by 30 per cent this year to a record 4.74 lakh units in primary (fresh sales) markets of top seven cities -- Delhi-NCR (National Capital Region), Mumbai Metropolitan Region (MMR), Chennai, Kolkata, Bengaluru, Hyderabad and Pune.

In value terms, the sales of residential properties are seen at a whopping Rs 4.5 lakh crore, supported by higher ticket prices.

Housing prices, which started moving up last year after remaining stagnant for almost a decade, continued an upward trend and appreciated by an average of 14 per cent this year, encouraging investors to return to the primary residential

"The changing sentiments of homebuyers -- wherein not only are home-renters convert-



ing into buyers but also buying bigger homes -- has played a huge contributing hand to sectoral and economic growth.

The consumer has realised the importance of owning a home and we expect this sentiment to continue in the foreseeable future," realtors' apex body **CREDAI President Boman Irani** told agency.

Property developers and consultants think that the industry is witnessing the "best time" and it is possibly in the first or second year of a long-term upcycle.

Sales were strong across price brackets, be it affordable, midincome, premium and ultra-luxury homes, but what surprised everyone was the huge demand for properties starting from Rs 3-4 crore range to as high as Rs 100 crore.

"The Indian residential real estate sector experienced remarkable growth in 2023, reaching a pinnacle not seen in the past 15 years. On the back of a strong Indian economy, real estate sector is seeing this robust end user-led growth in the residential demand and supply," Anarock's Chairman Anuj Puri said.

He expressed confidence that the real estate market will grow further next year.

"Given the ongoing developments and sustained momentum in the Indian economy and residential real estate sector, the upcoming year is poised for continued growth, although the rate of increase may be more moderate due to high base effect,"

Sales are expected to surpass supply or maintain equilibrium, he said, adding that prices might rise 8-10 per cent in 2024 across major markets.

Big branded developers having a good track record of executing projects reported sales of entire inventories in their project within a few days, as potential homebuyers and investors queued up to book their flats in large numbers, outstripping the supply.

DLF, the country's largest real estate firm, announced in March sales of 1,137 luxury apartments, priced Rs 7 crore and above in its housing project in Gurugram for over Rs 8,000 crore within 3 days.

DLF, Prestige Estates, Macrotech Developers and Godrej Properties all reported sales bookings between Rs 12,000 crore and Rs 15,000 crore during the last fiscal year and they expect to better their performance in the 2023-24 fiscal.

The consolidation in the housing market, in terms of both supply and demand, gained further momentum towards branded and trusted developers, prompting them to aggressively expand their land bank for future development.

Among other segments of real estate, the demand for office space is estimated to remain flat this year at 37-39 million square feet across seven major cities.

There were apprehensions that the leasing or absorption of office space would decline this year because of geopolitical concerns and the global economic slowdown.

The flexible space segment expanded its portfolio in a big way to meet demand from corporates who have started adopting managed workspace instead of conventional office to save cost and also get rid of facility management.

Leasing of retail space in shopping malls and major highstreet locations also increased as retail consumption surged.

The year also saw India's first retail assets-backed REIT --Nexus Select Trust -- sponsored by global investment firm Blackstone, which also made a complete exit from the country's first REIT -- Embassy Office Parks -- by selling 23.5 per cent stake for Rs 7.100 crore this month in open market transactions.

REITs are Real Estate Investment Trusts. Builders also diversified their portfolio to develop warehousing projects and data centres projects. Co-living, which was badly hit during the pandemic, recovered a lot.

In a nutshell, builders are upbeat that the housing market sustained strong demand and was able to post a healthy arowth.

Since 2022, the sector has been on an upswing and seems to have overcome disruptions caused by demonetisation. implementation of RERA and GST laws, NBFC crisis and the Covid pandemic.

"The prospect of being the world's fastest-growing nation, coupled with current affordability levels, is expected to sustain the real estate momentum in 2024. Hopefully with inflation and interest rates getting moderated, we may see 2024 as a record year ahead of 2023 on both supply and demand for residential from end users." Puri said.

If the growth trend continues, the size of the Indian real estate market will expand in a big way and may reach USD 5.8 trillion by 2047 from USD 477 billion last year, according to a recent NAREDCO-Knight Frank report.

Treating tumours in under a day with radiosurgery treatment

KOCHI, Dec 27 (Agencies): Radiation therapy, also known as radiotherapy, is a common treatment for cancer, but it takes around 25 to 30 days or sittings. However, patients can opt for radiosurgery treatment which can last from a few minutes to a few hours, depending on the location and type of area being treated.

However, for several reasons - the lack of expertise and awareness, the less timeconsuming treatment method is not popular in India. "Lars Leksell, a Swedish neurosurgeon who also specialised in radiation, invented the method in the 1960s. The surgery takes only a day. So, he combined radiation with surgery to treat tiny tumours in a day.

The primary criterion, to apply the method, is the tumour has to be small/ tiny and the treatment is restricted to the tiny tumour. If a larger area has to be treated - we cannot opt for radiosurgery," said Dr Arunlal, consultant radiation oncologist at

Lisie Hospital, Kochi. "In the last 10 to 12 years, there has been a shift in terms of indications, data generation and refinement of

the treatment. We have 10-year follow-up data that shows how safe and effective radiosurgery is. It has helped to improve the acceptance of radiosurgery," said Dr Debnarayan Dutta, assistant professor with the Department of Radiotherapy at Amrita

Hospital, adding that

robotic radiosurgery

came to India in 2010. Earlier, the procedure, called stereotactic radiosurgery, was only used to treat brain conditions. The technology can be now used to treat small tumours in the lungs and liver. The procedure is called stereotypic body radiotherapy. "We never used radiosurgery for prostate, liver or lung diseases earlier. Now it has become standard

If someone has a small bone metastasis, it is treated with radiosur-

care.

gery and the outcome is better than the conventional surgery. It is similar for the lungs and liver too," added Debnarayan. The procedure is similar to radiation therapy. "For a patient undergoing radiosurgery, it is pretty similar to standard radiation treatment. An initial planning scan will be performed with an immobilisation device, on which the doctors mark the area to be treated and the normal tissues to be

The planning takes place where angles are decided which will optimally treat the tumour and spare unaffected tissues. On the day of treatment, the patient will once again lie on the couch, scans will be taken to verify the position and treatment will be delivered. It will be painless and complete-

ly non-invasive. Unlike earlier, there is no need for fixed frames or fiducials to track in modern radiation oncology. Most of the difficult work is behind the scenes and patients can enjoy the benefits," said Arunlal. Advantages

"The difference between radiation therapy and radiosurgery is the time required for treatment. Conventional radiation will require 25 to 30 sittings. In radiosurgery, it is given in a single shot. The radiation dose to surrounding parts is reduced and thus the side effect profile of the method is less," added Arunlal. "Radiosurgery is a short treatment, usually last-

ing one to five days. So the recovery time for patients, bystanders, day losses etc is lesser. It does not have many side effects. The quality of life is better maintained in radiosurgery as there aren't many reactions," said Debnarayan. "In case of brain metastasis, we don't have to treat the whole brain. When we treat the brain completely, they may experience memory decline and it can be avoided when radiosurgery is used. Also, in certain cases, it can be an acceptable alternative to surgery," added Arunlal

Options available


The treatment is available in almost all major cities in India. "Highend Linear accelerator (LINAC) machines that can give both conventional radiation treatment and radiosurgery are available in all major super-speciality hospitals.

Facilities for gamma knife radiosurgery are available in AIIMS Delhi, NIMHANS Bangalore, Apollo Hospitals etc," said Arunlal. "We need the expertise, machine and team to perform the procedure to deliver the high dose. We cannot make any errors. Expertise is critical. It is the only thing that stops the expansion of radiosurgery in India," added

Debnarayan.

Cases of Covid sub-variant JN.1 rises to 109 in India

Three new fatalities two from Karnataka and one from Gujarat were reported in the last 24 hours



NEW DELHI, Dec 27 (Agencies): Forty more cases of the COVID-19 sub-variant JN.1 were recorded, with the tally of cases of the new variant across the country till December 26 rising to 109, official sources said on Wednesday.

Thirty-six cases were detected from Gujarat, 34 from Karnataka, 14 from Goa, nine from Maharashtra, six from Kerala, four each from Rajasthan and Tamil Nadu, and two from Telangana, they said. Most of the patients are currently in home isolation, they added.

NITI Aayog member (Health) Dr V K Paul had said last week that the new variant was being closely investigated but he stressed on the need for states to ramp up testing and strengthen their surveillance sys-

Even though the number of cases is rising and the JN.1 sub-variant has been detected in the country, there is no cause of immediate concern as 92 per cent of those infected are opting for home-based treatment, indicating a mild illness, officials have said.

There is also no increase in hospitalisation rates and COVID-19 is an incidental finding in those hospitalised due to other medical conditions, they said.

CENTURION, Dec 27 (Agencies): Kagiso Rabada had just cleaned up Shreyas Iyer on an overcast Tuesday afternoon at Centurion — a sharp inswinger that went between the bat and pad, and hit the middle stump on the last ball of the first over after lunch. It was his 497th international wicket, 282nd in the format and second on the day. Having won the toss and put in India, in conditions that assisted the pacers, South Africa had reduced India to 92/4 with Rabada, Gerald Coetzee, Nandre Burger and Marco Jansen yet to put a foot wrong.

Rabada, in particular, had been breathing fire. It is a format where he holds ground like no other, where his legend is less spoken of despite having the all-time best strike rate (39.3) for a pacer with a minimum of 200 wickets. Facing him in his next over was KL Rahul, the new batter, in his new role for the Indian Test team.

For the first time in nine years, Rahul is batting in the middleorder, and Rabada was not going to let him off easy. Two length deliveries, followed by two short balls, one of which



Rahul tried to hook and missed and then back-of-length deliveries that lifted off length. Rahul survived, breathed and took guard again. That in itself was a job well done.

When Rabada ran for the next over, Rahul was ready. Another delivery that bounced extra, but this time, Rahul had his hands on line and above, pulling the ball into the ground. It bounced near the legs of Tony de Zorzi and went through to the ropes. Rahul was officially off the mark with a shot that was a sign of what was to come.

On a surface where the ball was moving not just sideways, but also rising and keeping low, Rahul did what he does best —

take guard, watch, leave if you can, defend if you have to, rinse, repeat. Get something too full, lean forward a bit and gently caress it through covers for four. If it's on the body, fend it off if you can and take a single, pull it into the ground when possible and take the blow if you have to. When there is width on offer, guide it behind gully or free your arms and pull it in front of the square. Rahul did it all to perfec-

tion, with not much fuss.

Once Rabada sent back Virat Kohli and R Ashwin to close in on the 500th wicket, Rahul freed his arms, channelled his whiteball personality to play his shots — lofting Burger over cover for a six to get to his half-century. First

with Shardul Thakur, then with Jasprit Bumrah and Mohammed Siraj, he took India to 208/8 and remained unbeaten on 70 along the way before rain drew curtains on the day's play.

Nine years ago, coming back from his debut tour of Australia where he scored a hundred, Rahul piled on runs in the 2014-15 Ranji Trophy. He smashed 838 runs in nine innings, including a triple hundred, and helped Karnataka lift the title, living up to the reputation he had built as a batting prodigy. However, his international career since then has not always been a smooth ride despite the backing he had (he averages 33.44 after 47 Tests). The last three years, though, have been different. The 31-year-old has shown he is ready to do what's needed and do it to the best of his capabilities.

And on Tuesday — where Rabada showed why he is one of the best in the business, taking a fifer and reaching the milestone (500) — Rahul has reminded everyone that he is capable of guiding the Test team through the transition over the next few years.

Vinesh to return Khel Ratna and Arjuna Award

NEW DELHI, Dec 27 (Agencie): After Bajrang Punia and Sakshi Malik, another prominent face of the protests in the sexual harassment case against Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh, Vinesh Phogat, has announced that she would be returning her awards.

Vinesh, who has won two World Championships medals, announced that she would be returning her Major Dhyan Chand Khel Ratna as well as Arjuna Award to Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

In a letter to PM Modi, which she released on micro-blogging site X, Vinesh said she was hurt how Olympics medallists Bajrang and Sakshi were forced into taking extreme measures.

"No mother in India would have the same fate as her daughter. Now I want to get rid of that image of receiving the award because that was a dream and what is happening with us right now is a reality," Vinesh wrote in her social media post.

"I was awarded the Khel Ratna and Arjuna Award but now they don't seem important to me. Every woman wants to live her life with respect so that's why Prime Minister sir, I want to return my Major Dhyan Chand Khel Ratna and Arjuna Award to you so that these awards do not become a roadblock in my life," she added.

Sakshi had announced her retirement on the day that Sanjay Singh, who was backed by Brij Bhushan, won the election to become the new Wrestling Federation of India (WFI) president last Thursday.

Bajrang, meanwhile, left his Padma Shri medallion on a pavement near Kartavya Path after he was stopped by the Delhi Police from heading towards the Prime Minister's Office.

In the letter, Vinesh also pointed to the fact that Sakshi was made the brand ambassador of the Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao campaign and that ever since registering their complaints against Brij Bhushan, women wrestlers have been targeted by him and his supporters. "Our lives are not like those fancy advertisements. Women wrestlers have suffered a lot over the years and one can realise how we have lived our lives under pressure. Those fancy flex advertisement boards are now old and now Sakshi Malik has retired," she wrote.

"The abusers have announced how powerful they still remain and in fact he was involved in the humiliating sloganeering. If you take five minutes to watch what all he said in the media, you will know exactly what all he has done. He has called women wrestlers Manthara, he has owned up to the fact that he made us uncomfortable and he has never shied away from humiliating us all. Importantly, he has forced women wrestlers to withdraw their complaints," she added.

"I have tried to forget all this but it is not that easy. Sir, I raised this issue when we met. We spent last year on the roads for justice but no one came to our aid. Sir, our medals were pegged at Rs 15 but they are worth more than our lives. We were honoured by our country when we won these medals but when we demanded justice we were painted as anti-nationals. Prime Minister ji, I want to ask you this, are we anti-nationals?" she added.

Hardik Pandya to miss T20I series vs Afghanistan, likely to be fit ahead of IPL

NEW DELHI, Dec 27 (Agencie): Indian allrounder Hardik Pandya is set to miss the upcoming T20I series against Afghanistan due to an ankle injury he sustained during the 2023 World Cup. However, India Today has learnt that Hardik is likely to be fit before the Indian Premier League (IPL) 2024.

Pandya was a member of India's World Cup squad and played four matches, taking five wickets with the best bowling figures of 2/34 and scoring 11* against Australia in his only innings before suffering an ankle injury during a league stage game against Bangladesh on October 19.

Pandya hasn't played any international cricket since, missing the five-match T20I series against Australia as well as the three-match T20I and ODI series during the South African tour. In the absence of Pandya and regular skipper Rohit Sharma, who requested a break from white-ball cricket after the World Cup



final against Australia, Suryakumar Yadav led India in all T20ls, while KL Rahul led the team in ODIs.

The selectors may consider other leadership options for the national side against Afghanistan, with names like Ravindra Jadeja being floated around, given his vice-captaincy experience during the South Africa T20I series. However, with Jadeja's involvement in the five Tests against England, workload management will be a key consideration.

As it stands, Hardik Pandya's focus will likely be on regaining fitness ahead of the IPL 2024, where he is expected to lead the Mumbai Indians, provided he recovers in time. Fans and officials alike will be eagerly awaiting updates on his condition and potential return to the field.

Pandya was traded from the Gujarat Titans (GT) to his former franchise, the Mumbai Indians (MI), in November of this year. The allrounder captained GT for two years, spearheading their campaign with aplomb. Hardik ensured GT's fairytale start in 2022, lifting the coveted trophy, while they finished runners-up in their second season after a last-ball defeat in a thrilling final earlier

Finish Line: Good year with final twists for Indian cricket

While India might not have an ICC trophy to show in 2023, both the men and women's team had a year to remember.

NEW DELHI, Dec 27 (Agencie): On the evening of October 7, less than 24 hours before India's first match of the 2023 Men's ODI World Cup against Australia, Rohit Sharma was at the ground floor press conference room of the MA Chidambaram Stadium, Chennai. As with every media interaction that involves Rohit, that one, too, was candid and interesting.

However, it had its share of intense moments. When asked about his quest to win an ODI WC, the one white-ball trophy Rohit has not won as a cricketer, things got real. The Indian captain's desire to win was unmistakable as he spoke about the "desperation" to get his hands on the trophy, while trying to be pragmatic as he kept talking. And as he often does, Rohit ended the answer with "but yeah, it will be nice to win a World Cup," making most people in the room smile. It was the kind of 'but' phrase that one uses at the end of a vulnerable conversation with a friend just to ease out the mood.

Over the next 42 days, Rohit and his teammates seemed invincible to an extent where comparisons were made to the Chicago Bulls' last dance in the 1997-98 NBA season. The planning, the change of guard Rohit as captain and Rahul Dravid as head coach — that was made in the BCCI's pursuit to end the trophy drought, the ensemble they put together despite the multiple injuries to key players, all fell in place as India were on their way to write a fairytale script of winning a home WC. However, sport seldom works that way. Australia turned up at the final, and spoiled the party, silencing a billion fans. Another ICC event ended in a heartbreak for India. In a country where careers are made or broken from WC to WC, this particular one would sting for the longest time. However, as 2023 comes to an

end, looking back, the year was not all that bad for Indian cricket. Test series win against Australia, reaching the final of World Test Championship, dominating run to the ODI WC final, and smooth transition in the shortest and the longest format, the Men in Blue had a kind of year

"We played a brand of cricket which I like and I'm quite excited about what's the future for us. If this is the way India are going to play going forward, I think it's all in the right direction. Even the younger boys are playing like that, which is great to see. Unfortunately, the finals didn't go our way, but it was fabulous to see Mohammed Shami and others bowled, the way we batted, Virat Kohli and Rohit at the top, taking the game on. A lot of things are going ahead and for the future," Badani told

The consistency and the brand of cricket apart, the one thing that stood out the most is the way the younger players who came into the national team looked at home. The likes of Yashasvi Jasiwal, Rinku Singh, Ruturaj Gaikwad, and B Sai Sudharsan had to fill in the shoes of some big names and they have made the transition look seamless. Jaiswal scored a century on Test debut, Rinku held his own, finishing tense T20I matches, Gaikwad and Sai Sudharsan seemed solid at

Badani believes that the Indian Premier League has had a significant role in making this happen. "The transition is a lot easier because of the IPL. When you are sitting with all the big boys, you're chatting with them, they become your friends, you're picking their brains, you're learning new things all the time. IPL also has

its own pressures and expectations. So when you're playing for the national side after that, it's a lot easier. It wasn't the case for us when we played. I mean, you are playing Ranji Trophy to straight up, you are playing for India. It was a massive gap to bridge. Now, it's seamless," says the former Tamil Nadu captain.

Smooth transition without a senior ICC trophy to show pretty much sums up the year for India women as well. They had the biggest of the years at the global stage — winning the inaugural U19 T20 WC, the advent of Women's Premier League and the market it has generated, reaching yet another T20WC semifinal, historic Test wins against England and Australia at home, the list just goes on.

Newly-appointed head coach Amol Muzumdar, along with captain Harmanpreet Kaur, has kicked off his tenure in such a fashion that the road ahead looks well-lit. What also helps is that talents are being scouted by WPL franchises, the likes of Saika Ishaque, Shreyanka Patil and Shubha Satheesh made it to the national team and Jemimah Rodrigues and Pooja Vastrakar are coming of age.

In a video shared by the BCCI, all Kaur had to say when asked about back-to-back Test wins was "Oh my god" with a wide smile on her face. "I think this has been the best environment that I have seen (in the Indian team). I have been playing for so many years, I know we have won many matches and tournaments, but what we are enjoying now, the brand of cricket we are playing, I have never experienced all these years," she would add, crediting the support staff. With two big years ahead of them — a T20 WC in September 2024 and a home ODI WC in 2025 — Kaur and Muzumdar would want to maintain the consistency and the dressing room environment the captain spoke about, ensuring that the players are in a space to give their best.

As 2024 dawns upon us, the focus has shifted to the T20 format for both the teams, even as the men are trying to win a Test series in South Africa. On the eve of the Boxing Test in Centurion, Rohit, in his first media interaction since November 18, was, once again, asked about the "desperation" to prove a point; to win the T20 WC that is to be played in West Indies and United States next year amidst reports that the 36-yearold, who hasn't played a T20I since the 2022 WC, might return and lead the team again. "Everyone has the desperation to play cricket, do well in every chance they get, I know what you are trying to ask, you will get the answers," said Rohit like his typical self.

India men only have three T20Is against Afghanistan and the IPL before T20 WC, and Badani feels that now is the time for the selectors and team management to make it clear to the players about the role and availability for the global event. "I'm sure the Indian selectors and the management have a few players in mind already. It's a case of the support staff, be the coach or even the selectors start having conversations and defining roles. What is expected of a certain player? Player A, B and C, what is it that I want? You give them time to prepare and come ready for the World Cup. That preparation has to happen now. If you don't (and) just let them play the IPL and then you regroup after that and then you say 'let's go win the World Cup', No. It will have to happen now,"

With two T20 WCs to play for, whether India will go on and win it, only time will tell. What one can say now for sure is that the next generation looks ready. They are giving hope and the promise of a better 2024 for Indian cricket.

Cricket Australia eyes 3-match women's Test series vs India after majestic display in Mumbai: CEO Nick Hockley

SYDNEY, Dec 27 (Agencie): Cricket Australia's Chief Executive, Nick Hockley, is aiming to expand the women's Test series against India and England from a single match to a more prominent three-match series, emphasising the desire to elevate these encounters to marquee events at home.

The head of Cricket Australia expressed a commitment to increase the number of Test matches in women's cricket. Nick Hockley's remarks followed captain Alyssa Healy's sentiment of unresolved ambition following Australia's recent loss to India in Mumbai. Australia suffered an eightwicket defeat at the hands of India in the one-off Test in Mumbai, prompting a desire for more Test cricket opportunities.

"We'll keep advocating for more Test cricket as part of a multi-format series. Maybe that's something in the future that we can think about key marquee series going to three Tests," Hockley

told SEN.

Australia's marquee women's Test series are primarily with England and India, as New Zealand appears hesitant to include women's Tests in their schedule. The recent defeat in Mumbai marked Australia's first loss to India in 11 Tests.

Alyssa Healy expressed a strong desire to participate in more red-ball cricket following this match.

"It would create a real contest over three games. That would be an unbelievable experience for our group, and probably a true test of both sides' abilities.

The one-off Test, India playing in their home conditions, you'd expect them to be heavy favourites. We would love to have another crack at it, show what we learned and put it into practice." The last women's Test series of more than one match was played way back in 2006, while India had not hosted any red-ball cricket for nine years before 2023.
