Three Caught with Fake Aadhaar Cards at Jammu Airport

JAMMU, Feb 12 (Agencies): The Jammu and Kashmir Police apprehended three people, including a woman, who were attempting to board a flight from Jammu Airport using fake Aadhaar

According to reports, two of the suspects hail from Gurdaspur district in Punjab, while the third is from the Kathua district of Jammu.

Officials said that the trio tried to board using a fake Aadhaar card. While two of them successfully passed the security check, the third individual was apprehended. He had created a fake Aadhaar card using the name on the ticket but overlooked that the ticket belonged



Substandard Bitumen being used for Blacktopping of roads in JKUT: Balvinder

Loss of State Exchequer to the tune of more than 700 crores. Demands CBI Probe

JAMMU, Feb 12: Renowned RTI activist S. Balvinder Singh has raised alarming concerns about the usage of substandard bitumen in road construction projects across Jammu and Kashmir Union Territory (JKUT). Singh highlighted that the disregard for quality control measures has led to significant financial losses. estimated to exceed 700 crores for the state exchequer.

Singh emphasized the issuance of a comprehensive quality control manual titled "Execution and Quality Control and DLP Enforcement manual dated 03.02.2022" by the then Principal Secretary works Sh. Shailendra Kumar. However, Singh lamented the lack of follow-up and enforcement of these guidelines by the Principal Secretary, resulting in widespread non-compliance by engineers and contracting agencies.

Key violations include the continued use of penetration grade bitumen, despite its ban according to manual guidelines. Singh pointed out that this inferior quality bitumen contributes to frequent deterioration of road surfaces.



Balvinder further stated that It is very unfortunate that there is hardly any Hot Mix Plant in having Capacity of 100-120 TPH & even the most of the HMP's (Drum type) are not of 60-90 TPH Capacity. But it is has been observed that the allotments have been made to the Contractors for Drum Capacity of HMP 100-120 TPH. Which is another violation of the guidelines & huge loss to the Government exchequer. As per guideline in the manual

at Plant and must have well-equipped laboratory for testing facility at HMP site. In absence of these Contractor must not be allowed to proceed with the dispatch of bituminous mixes. But it has been observed that most of Engineers/ Hot Mix Plant holders (HMP) are violating the above mention guide-

Singh stated that after submitting an RTI request to the PWD(R&B) Department Jammu and lodging a complaint with Principal Secretary Sh. Shailendra Kumar, Div Com Jammu, and DC Jammu, the Chief Engineer PMGSY hastily issued a corrigendum. However, it only urged to interpret Bitumen S-90 as VG Bitumen, yet failed once again to specify the Viscosity Grades of Bitumen to be used in different regions under their jurisdiction, in accordance with climatic conditions as prescribed in IS:73-2013 Code.

Despite clear instructions in the manual for all contractors and engineers to use VG grade Bitumen with legible and indelible markings including the manufacturer's name, month and year of manufacture, type of material, grade, and batch number, it has come to light that contractors, under the direction of engineers, are still using spraypainted markings, which is a clear violation of the manual.

Singh said though IS 73: 2013 code defines the grade of Viscosity like 10/20/30 & 40 to be used as per the climatic condition and temperature of the area i.e VG 20 is suggested for Jammu district but Engineers have allotted works with the specification of Bitumen As VG-10 instead of VG 30.

Singh highlighted that despite substantial taxpayer funds spent by PWD (R&B) Jammu on establishing well-equipped labs at Material Testing Lab (MTL) Nagrota and DIQC Nagrota, shocking revelations indicate a lack of bitumen quality testing, especially for Penetration value and Viscosity Grade. Moreover, it has emerged that no payments to contractors have been withheld based on MTL failure reports of bitumen material, due to the collusion between engineers and contractors. This has allowed contractors to obtain satisfactory reports from private labs, fostering the execution of substandard work driven by vested interests.

In light of these grave concerns, Singh urged the Honorable Lieutenant Governor of JKUT to initiate a thorough investigation by the Crime Branch/CBI to ensure accountability, uphold quality standards, and safeguard public funds.

AGRICULTURAL RESEARCH

Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR)/ National Agricultural Research System (NARS) has taken several initiatives for innovation/ development of new technologies in the farm sector across the country like Genetic enhancement of plants/animals/ fish for higher productivity, mechanization of agriculture and food system, enhancing value, safety and income through food processing, development of energy efficient technologies, farming practices, and promoting technology transfer to the farmers and other stake holders.

During the last eight years (2014-2022), ICAR has released a total of 2122 crop varieties of food crops, oil seeds, pulses, commercial crops, horticultural crops, potential crops and fodder crops which has not only stabilized the production but also increased the productivity and production of food grains in India. The new technologies developed have significantly enhanced the production of food grains, fruits, vegetables, milk, meat, egg and fish; and addressed the farmers' specific needs despite land resource limitations, increasing weather uncertainties, and emerging more virulent pests and pathogens. These agricultural technologies helped in increasing production of cereals, pulses, oilseeds, sugarcane and milk from 234.87, 17.15, 275.11, 3623.33, 146.31 million tonnes in 2014-15 to 288.03, 27.69, 376.96, 4318.12 and 209.96 million tonnes in 2021-22 respectively. The egg production increased from 78.48 billion in 2014-15 to 129.53 billion in 2021-22. Further, the strong collaboration of ICAR with government and non-governmental agencies, academic and scientific institutions, industry, and farmers has helped Indian agriculture to sustain natural resources, improve food supply and dietary nutrition pro-

The course curricula are revised periodically to make it relevant to the changing requirements of the farming communities. Further, keeping in view the emerging threats of climate change to agricultural sector, a project 'National Innovations on Climate Resilient Agriculture (NICRA)' has also been implemented since 2011 with an aim to enhancing resilience of Indian agriculture to climate change.

ICAR has established 731 Krishi Vigyan Kendras (KVKs) at district-level to refine the technological interventions suited to various agro-climatic conditions.

We need legal framework to regulate AI, deep fakes

he rise of deep fake videos targeting all genres of people has raised alarm bells, prompting widespread concern and an urgent need to curb the misuse of deep fake technology. The United States Senate has introduced bipartisan legislation called the Disrupt Explicit Forged Images and Non-Consensual Edits (DEFIANCE) Act. This law would make it illegal to share non-consensual, sexualised images, and videos created by artificial intelligence without the individual's consent. Similarly, the European Union's proposed Artificial Intelligence Act aims to provide strict regulations to address deep fakes. As this technology becomes more available to the public, an increasing number of countries are grappling with the dilemma of deep fakes and how to tackle this issue.

In a policy brief for the International Centre of Counter-Terrorism, entitled the 'Weaponisation of Deep Fakes Digital Deception', the far right Ella Busch and Jacob Ware stated "the words, 'deep fake', are derived from the concept of deep learning, a subset of artificial intelligence-machine learning (AI/ML). Deep learning algorithms are composed of deep neural networks, which simulate the human brain in a way that enables the AI to 'learn' from large amounts of data. Deep learning is unique from machine learning for its ability to process unstructured data, such as text and images, which make it ideal for creating deep fake videos, audio, images, or text. Deep fakes are created using a specific deep learning algorithm called a generative adversarial network (GAN). GANs, first developed by researcher Ian Good fellow in 2014, consist of two neural networks a generator algorithm and a discriminator algorithm. The generator algorithm creates a fake image (or other form of media) and the discriminator judges the media's authenticity. The action repeats for hours, or even days, until reaching a stable state in which neither the generator nor the discriminator can improve their performance."

In other words, deep fakes are a type of synthetic media that involves the manipulation of someone's facial appearance through deep-generative methods. Although the technique of mimicking someone's face or voice isn't new, what is revolutionary about deep fake is its reliance on Generative Adversarial Networks (GANs). GANs rely on two AI models that work in tandem. The first AI model, the forger, helps in manipulating someone's face based on the provided sample. The second AI model, the detective, scrutinises the forger's creation and, based on Face Training Data, identifies all the reasons why it's fake. The forger then makes improvements based on the inputs provided by the detective. This process of improvement continues until the detective is unable to find any difference between the real image and the generated image.

Like any technology, deep fakes have both positive and negative uses. Filmmakers are extensively using this technology to translate films, age/de-age actors, help speed film production and reduce its costs. In the field of education, deep fakes can help in creating much more innovative lessons which are far more engaging than the traditional form of learning. It can be used to re-enact historical moments; help understand human anatomy and assist in architecture. It can also be used by medical researchers to develop new ways of treating diseases without actual patients. Deep fakes have numerous benefits to offer.

numerous benefits to offer.
On the other hand, deep fakes are extensively being used to commit crimes such as financial scams, spread misinformation, and share sexually explicit videos. According to Europol's Innovation Lab, deep fakes could

become a staple tool for organised crimes, as they can be extensively used for bullying, allowing intellectual property violation, facilitating fraudulent documents, manipulating evidence, supporting terrorism, and fostering social unrest and political polarisation. There have been reports that deep fakes were employed in the last Assembly elections to malign opponents, and if no steps are taken, they may be widespread during 2024 general elections.

This writer, himself, was a victim of a deep fake video impersonating his voice that was maliciously circulated the day before polling in the 2019 parliamentary elections. Fortunately, the impersonation was so crude and amateurish that it got caught out and exposed before it could do substantial reputational and electoral damage. Nonetheless, the deep fake did end up creating apprehensions in the minds of a certain section of the electorate.

In response to an unstarred question raised in the Rajya Sabha regarding the regulation of AI and deep fakes, the ministry of information and broadcasting stated that it currently relies on Section 469 of the IPC (forgery for the purpose of harming reputation) and the Information Technology (Intermediary Guidelines and Digital Media Ethics Code) Rules, 2021 (IT Rules, 2021), to address the issue of deep fakes. These rules impose an obligation on social media intermediaries to ensure the expeditious removal of prohibited misinformation, patently false information, and deep fakes. Unfortunately, these rules fail to effectively address the issue of deep fakes. Moreover, these rules are highly ambiguous and generic, lacking substantial measures to regulate deep fakes. Even the proposed Digital India Bill fails to provide any provision or principle on which the ministry intends to rely while regulating deep fakes. Thus, there exists a legal vacuum which results in the failure of properly regulating deep fakes.


This vacuum has resulted in a rise of AI and deep fakerelated crime in India. According to McAfee's survey on AI voice scam, about 47 per cent of Indian adults have experienced some form of AI voice scam which is almost double the global average of 25 per cent. Moreover, according to the UK-based Sumsub Identity Fraud Report, India has witnessed 1,700 per cent growth in the number of deep fakes. This clearly shows that India is severely unequipped and unprepared to keep pace with the rapid advances in technology.

The first Industrial Revolution fundamentally transformed the world by enabling transition from agrarian and manual labour to machinedriven manufacturing. Similarly, the AI revolution holds the potential for a comparable paradigm shift. If India wants to reap the benefits of this AI revolution, then it must ensure that it is prepared to tackle the upcoming challenges.

Europol estimates that by the year 2026, nearly 90 per cent of the online content may be synthetically generated. This shall significantly alter the way we interact with one another, consume information and spend time on the internet. Similar to the United States, and the EU, India also needs a law to tackle the rise of artificial intelligence and deep fakes.

The next Parliament should suo motu constitute a joint committee of Parliament to address this issue, and ensure that proper consultations are carried out with all concerned stakeholders. The objective should be to draft a comprehensive legislation that takes into account the perspectives of all stakeholders, and helps shape a law that would tackle the challenge of deep fakes before it becomes portentously pervasive.

Farming will be done on 'Electronic Soil'

The world's population is continuously increasing. And we are also seeing the consequences of climate change. It is clear that we will not be able to meet the world's food demands using existing agricultural methods alone. It is necessary to increase agricultural production through new methods. Researchers

at Sweden's Linköping University have developed 'electronic soil', which increases crop production. Researchers have developed an electrical conductor "soil" for soil-less farming. to grow crops without soilThe method is known as hydroponics. With hydroponics, food can be grown even in urban environments in a very controlled manner. Researchers have now developed an electrically conducting substrate (another surface in place of soil), suitable for hydroponic farming. This substrate is called 'e-sil'. Barley plants grown in electrically conductive "soil" grew 50 percent more in 15 days when their roots were electrically stimulated. Hydroponic farming means that plants grow without soil.

just themIt requires water, nutrients and roots. This system enables recirculation of water, so that each seedling gets exactly the nutrients it needs. Therefore this method of agriculture requires very little water and all the nutrients remain in the system, which is not possible in conventional farming. Through hydroponics, we can make maximum use of the limited space available for farming in cities. With this technology, vertical farming can be done in multi-storey buildings and towers in cities. this way in Advance Crops being grown include lettuce, herbs and some vegetables. Generally, grains are not grown using hydroponics method, but in the study, researchers have shown that barley plants can

be cultivated using hydroponics. Electrical stimulation improves their growth rate. In this way, fast growing plants can be obtained with less resources. Electronic clay is made from cellulose, an abundantly available biopolymer. It is mixed with an electrically conducting polymer called PEDOT. Linkopin The advantage of Ga researchers' "soil" is that it has very low energy consumption and there is no risk of high voltage. Hydroponic farming can help in areas where environmental conditions are very harsh and cultivable land is very little.

Kiran, on the other hand, is excited to be getting work in Punjabi





Handing over recruitment letters for government jobs to more than one lakh youngsters via video-conference during a Rozgar Mela programme, Modi slammed the previous government for taking an inordinately long time to complete recruitment exercises and said it bred bribery.

The prime minister said his government had brought transparency and is working to ensure that recruitment is done in a time-bound manner.

Youngsters now believe that they all have equal opportunity and can find a place for



themselves in the government system through hard work and talent, he said.

The prime minister asserted that the measures taken by his government, be it a scheme for rooftop solar power for one crore homes or the massive investment in infrastructure, had

been creating a lot of employment opportunities.

With over 1.25 lakh start-ups, India is the third largest eco-system in the sector, and youngsters are launching new firms in even smaller cities, he said, adding that it is creating lakhs of jobs.

The government has extended tax rebates to start-ups and has announced a fund of Rs 1 lakh crore for research and innovation, Modi said.

Accusing previous governments of not paying due attention to the railways, he said the entire sector is amid a transformation.

"They neglected the common people's expectations," Modi said, attacking the previous governments.

Suvendu Adhikari Among 6 BJP MLAs Suspended From Bengal Assembly



KOLKATA, Feb 12 (Agencies): Six BJP MLAs, including Leader of Opposition Suvendu Adhikari, were suspended from West Bengal assembly today after they staged protests in the House over the unrest in Sandeshkhali.

Besides Mr Adhikari, Agnimitra Paul, Mihir Goswami, Bankim Ghosh, Tapasi Mondal and Shankar Ghosh were suspended for the remaining part of the current session or 30 days, whichever is earlier.

From the beginning of the question hour, BJP legislators today raised slogans against the Trinamool Congress government for the unrest in Sandeshkhali in North 24 Parganas district, which has snowballed into a major political controversy.

The BJP legislators squatted on the floor of the House, raising slo-

gans.

Speaker Biman Banerjee then allowed Trinamool Congress MLA Sobhandeb Chatterjee to move a motion for the suspension of the BJP legislators. Subsequently, the BJP MLAs were suspended by the Speaker.

A large number of women in Sandeshkhali held protests over the last few days, alleging that local Trinamool leader Sheikh Shajahan and his "gang" captured swathes of land by force and sexually harassed them.

They demanded the arrest of Shajahan who has been absconding since last month after a team of the Enforcement Directorate that went to raid his house in an alleged ration scam was attacked by a mob.

Former Maharashtra chief minister Ashok Chavan resigns from Congress; may join BJP

NEW DELHI, Feb 12 (Agencies): Former Maharashtra chief minister Ashok Chavan has resigned from the Congress in a pre-election jolt to the party.

Sources close to Chavan say he will join the BJP.

Chavan is the second top Maharashtra Congress leader to resign from the party after former Union minister Milind Deora, who had joined the Shiv Sena.

Chavan is learnt to

have submitted his resignation as an MLA to the Maharashtra Assembly Speaker and



may join the BJP in New Delhi.

Chavan was unhappy

with the functioning of state Congress chief Nana Patole.

"DMK Stands For Dynasty, Money Swindling, Katta Panchayat": BJP Chief

CHENNAI, Feb 12 (Agencies): BJP chief JP Nadda on Monday slammed the ruling DMK in Tamil Nadu as a party that stands for "dynasty, money swindling and katta panchayat (kangaroo courts)". A rich state like Tamil Nadu has poor leaders, he said during a statewide footmarch by his party in Chennai.

"Do you know the meaning of DMK? DMK stands for dynasty, money swindling, katta panchayat. Karunanidhi, Stalin, Udhayanidhi...only Stalin family. They are not ashamed of corruption. A state minister is languish-



ing in jail for 200 days and still keeps his post. What type of democracy you're having?" he said

The BJP chief was pointing to Chief Minister MK Stalin, his father and former chief minister M Karunanidhi and minister-son Udhayanidhi Stalin.

Further sharpening his attack on the DMK, a key contender in the opposition's INDIA alliance, Mr Nadda said that instead of a promised Horticulture Research Centre, DMK has established

a "Corruption Research Centre". "The state's contribution can't be forgotten. DMK leadership lacks wisdom and respect for democracy," he added.

Mr Nadda, however, remained silent on AIADMK, a former ally. The AIADMK, a rival of the DMK, had snapped all ties with the BJP last year following setbacks in two consecutive elections that it had contested in alliance with the

saffron party.

The BJP chief also pointed to Bharat Ratna being awarded to late agricultural scientist MS Swaminathan and said, "Tamil Nadu is special for the Prime Minister and it is the heart of the BJP leadership."

The DMK has termed Mr Nadda's criticism as "signs of jittery" with party spokesperson A Saravanan saying, "JP Nadda is frustrated that they are losing. Let them first list what have they achieved in the last 10 years."

The BJP, which neither has a prominent presence in the state nor an alliance with a major regional party, is counting on its state chief and former IPS officer K Annamalai's footmarch to rally support ahead of the national elections. Prime Minister Narendra Modi is expected to participate in the outreach event later this month.

Journalist Soumya Vishwanathan murder case: Delhi High Court grants bail to four life convicts

NEW DELHI, Feb 12 (Agencies): The Delhi High Court, on Monday, granted bail to four convicts serving life imprisonment in the murder case of TV journalist Soumya Vishwanathan

A bench of Justices Suresh Kumar Kait and Girish Kathpalia suspended the sentence of Ravi Kapoor, Amit Shukla, Baljeet Singh Malik and Ajay Kumar till the pendency of their appeals challenging their conviction and sentence.

The bench noted that the convicts have been in custody for 14 years.

The high court had on January 23 asked the Delhi Police to respond to the appeals filed by the four convicts.

Vishwanathan, who worked with a leading English news channel, was shot dead in the early hours of September 30, 2008, on Nelson Mandela Marg in south Delhi while she was returning home from work in her car.

A special court had on November 26, 2023, awarded two life terms to Ravi Kapoor, Amit Shukla, Baljeet Malik and Ajay Kumar under Section 302 (murder) of the Indian Penal



Code (IPC) and Section 3(1) (i) (committing organised crime resulting in the death of any person) of the Maharashtra Control of Organised Crime Act (MCOCA).

The court had made it clear

that the sentences will run 'consecutively'.

The fifth convict, Ajay Sethi, was handed down three years of simple imprisonment under Section 411 (dishonestly receiving stolen property) of the IPC.

It, however, set off the threeyear sentence against the time Sethi had already served, noting he remained in custody for more than 14 years and underwent incarceration during the trial for offences under the IPC and MCOCA for conspiring to abet, aid, or knowingly facilitate organised crime and receiving proceeds of organised crime.

5 charred to death as car catches fire after colliding with bus on Yamuna Expressway in Mathura



NOIDA/MATHURA, Feb 12 (Agencies): Five people were charred to death on Monday as their car caught fire after a collision with a bus on the Yamuna Expressway in Mathura, police said

The incident took place near the 117th milestone on the Agra-Noida carriageway of the expressway under the Mahavan police station limits in the

morning, a senior officer said.

"There was a collision between the bus and the Swift car. So far it has come to light that a tyre of the bus burst, it went out of control and overturned on the road. The Swift car coming from behind hit the bus and both vehicles caught fire," Mathura SSP Shailesh Pandey said.

The occupants of the bus managed to evacuate, but those in the car could not and all five were charred to death, Pandey said.

He said one of the deceased had been identified and efforts were on to contact his family.

Further legal proceedings are being carried out, the officer added.

Delhi man arrested month after killing wife, burying her body in forest

NEW DELHI, Feb 12 (Agencies): A 19-year-old man has been arrested more than a month after he allegedly strangled his wife to death and buried her body in a forest near Ashok Vihar in Delhi, said police today.

According to Delhi Police, Vicky murdered his wife Sapna (23) and, with the help of his brother, buried her body in the forest near Ashok Vihar in December last year. Sharing details, the police said, "The incident pertains to December 26, when Vicky, who had an argument with Sapna, first strangled her to death under the influence of alcohol and then buried her in the forest with the help of his brother."

Police said Vicky then fled from home and the incident came to light only after Sapna's mother, Savitri, lodged a missing report of both with the police.

"Almost a month after Vicky and Sapna had gone missing, Savitri lodged a missing report with the police on January 25, after which a search operation was conducted to find them. However, the police had no clues on their where-

abouts," said the police. Incidentally, on February 8, a dog got

stuck in the pit at the very place where Vicky had buried his wife's body.

"We received a PCR call that a dog had got stuck inside a pit in the jungle area. During the rescue operation for the animal, the police discovered Sapna's body," said the police.

Initially, the police did not know whose body it was but after matching several missing reports, it became clear that it was Sapna's body, after which the police started an investigation. With the help of technical surveillance and human intelligence, the police found that Sapna's husband was involved and Vicky was nabbed. According to the Delhi Police, Vicky confessed that he had murdered Sapna. Vicky said Sapna was also addicted to alcohol and that she had given birth some time ago but their child had died due to anaemia. As per the accused, after the child's death, the duo had regular fights and on December 26, the fight between them escalated and Vicky strangled her to death. The police have registered a case of murder and arrested Vicky.

A search is under way for his brother, who helped the accused bury the body.

1 Dead In Blast At Firecracker Warehouse In Kerala, 25 Houses Damaged KOCHI, Feb 12 (Agencies): One person spot alarmed by the huge sound of the explo-aged. Doors and windows of many house sound of the explo-aged.

KOCHI, Feb 12 (Agencies): One person died and 16 others including women and children sustained injuries in a massive blast at an illegal firecracker warehouse operated from a residential area at Tripunithura near here on Monday, police said.

The condition of four injured persons is reportedly serious and they were rushed to Kalamassery Medical College from a nearby hospital for expert care.

According to the district administration, the victim was identified as Vishnu hailing from Thiruvananthapuram but other details were not available immediately.

Over 25 houses and some shops in the vicinity were severely damaged and two vehicles were charred completely in the explosion. Though the exact cause of the blast is yet to be ascertained, Fire and rescue personnel who rushed to spot said a huge cache of firecrackers brought to the warehouse was suspected to have exploded together.

A senior Fire and Rescue Department official confirmed that it was a massive blast, tremors of which were felt several km away. He said the tremors were felt even at the local fire station and they proceeded to the

sion. The blaze was soon brought under control but it had already caused heavy damage in the vicinity and surrounding areas, the officer said.

"We had no clue that a firecracker warehouse was being operated in this thickly populated area. Those who operated it did not seek any permission for the same," the Assistant Station Officer told the media.

Making it clear that the exact cause of the explosion was yet to be known, he said they were relying on the information provided by the local people who said that the mishap happened when firecrackers were unloaded to the warehouse from a vehicle.

"Local people said the warehouse was being operated in the area for some time and firecrackers were stored as part of a local temple festival. We have to verify such details. But, we had no information about its operations so far," the officer added.

Meanwhile, local residents are yet to recover from the impact of the unexpected massive explosion which shook the area.

The roofs of many two storey buildings in

The roofs of many two-storey buildings in the locality were found to be severely dam-

aged. Doors and windows of many houses were blown off from the wall by the impact of the explosion and cars parked in porticos were destroyed after bricks and tiles fell upon them. Even tall trees could be seen charred completely due to the fire with remnants of the blast spotted several metres away.

"We have lost everything...My house is completely damaged. There are no doors and windows...how can we stay here?" a shocked woman in the locality said.

An elderly man was seen sharing the happiness of not losing his life while a teenager boy could be seen shivering under the impact of the huge blast.

Authorities said an investigation was launched into the illegal storage of a huge cache of firecrackers in a thickly populated residential area.

Meanwhile, Health Minister Venna George gave instructions to ensure expert medical care to those injured in the blast.

The district medical officer has already taken steps to ensure necessary care to those admitted in Kalamassery Medical College and Ernakulam General Hospital, she said in a statement.

Israeli attacks kill 37 in Gaza's Rafah, many were asleep when strikes hit

Israel launched a special forces operation that freed two Israeli hostages in Rafah amid air strikes early on Monday

JERUSALEM, Feb 12 (Agencies): Israel launched a special forces operation that freed two Israeli hostages in Rafah amid air strikes early on Monday, which local health officials said killed 37 people and wounded dozens in the southern Gaza city.

An air strike was carried out to allow the forces to be extracted, he said.

The air strikes caused widespread panic in Rafah as many people were asleep when the strikes started, said residents contacted by agency using a chat app. Some feared Israel had begun its ground offensive into Rafah

Israeli planes, tanks and ships took part in the strikes, with two mosques and several houses hit, according to residents.

The Israeli military said on Monday it had conducted a "series of strikes" on southern Gaza that have now "concluded", without providing further details.

Before previous assaults on Gaza cities, Israel's military



has ordered civilians to leave without preparing any specific evacuation plan.

US President Joe Biden told Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu on Sunday that Israel should not launch a military operation in Rafah without a credible plan to ensure the safety of the roughly 1 million people sheltering there, the White House said.

Aid agencies say an assault on Rafah would be catastrophic. It is the last relatively safe place in an enclave devastated by Israel's military offensive.

Biden and Netanyahu spoke for about 45 minutes, days after the U.S. leader said Israel's military response in the Gaza Strip had been "over the top" and expressed grave concern over the rising civilian death toll in the Palestinian enclave.

Netanyahu's office has said that it had ordered the military to develop a plan to evacuate Rafah and destroy four Hamas battalions it says are deployed there

Hamas militants killed 1,200

people in southern Israel and abducted at least 250 in their Oct. 7 incursion, according to Israeli tallies. Israel has responded with a military assault on the Gaza Strip that has killed more than 28,000 Palestinians, according to the Hamas-run health ministry.

Netanyahu said in an interview aired on Sunday that "enough" of the 132 remaining Israeli hostages held in Gaza were alive to justify Israel's war in the region.

Hamas-run Aqsa Television on Sunday quoted a senior Hamas leader as saying any Israeli ground offensive in Rafah would "blow up" the hostage-exchange negotiations.

Egypt warned on Sunday of "dire consequences" of a potential Israeli military assault on Rafah, which lies near its border.

Joe Biden's re-election campaign opens a TikTok account to reach young voters



WASHINGTON, Feb 12 (Agencies): US President Joe Biden's re-election campaign has joined TikTok to reach young voters ahead of the presidential election in November. The video-sharing platform owned by Chinese tech giant ByteDance is, however, under review in the US for potential national security concerns.

Some US lawmakers have long called for the app to be banned over concerns that the Chinese government could access user data or influence what people see on the app.

Last year, the Biden administration ordered government agencies to remove TikTok from federal government-owned phones and devices.

TikTok has maintained that it would not share US user data with the Chinese government and has taken substantial measures to protect the privacy of its users.

Biden campaign advisors said in a statement it would "continue meeting voters where they are", including on other social media apps like Meta Platform's Instagram and Truth Social, which is owned by former U.S. President Donald Trump.

The campaign is taking "advanced safety precautions" for its devices and its presence on TikTok was separate from the app's ongoing security review, a campaign official added.

Trump, the Republican frontrunner in the presidential race, does not have an official account on TikTok.

The video posted by the Biden-Harris HQ TikTok account made light of a fringe conservative conspiracy theory that the Super Bowl was rigged in favour of the Chiefs, in order for pop superstar Taylor Swift, who is dating Chiefs tight end Travis Kelce, to announce an endorsement of Biden.

Amid rapid-fire questions asking the president to choose from one of two options, Biden was asked if he was "deviously plotting to rig the season, so the Chiefs would win the Super Bowl" or whether the Chiefs were simply just a good football team.

"I'd get in trouble if I told you," Biden joked.

TikTok used by Indonesian presidential candidates to draw young voters

JAKARTA, Feb 12 (Agencies): In an effort to woo the young voters of Indonesia, the three candidates who will contest the presidential election on Wednesday (February 14) are posting videos on TikTok, where they can be seen dancing and also answering questions in real-time during livestreamed sessions. The video-sharing platform has 125 million users in Indonesia, second only to the US.

At an Indonesian presidential campaign event, 22-year-old voter Irene Putri Aisyah was busy uploading everything she saw, from cute dances to cooking demonstrations, to the short video app.

But experts say the platform is also flooded with problematic content that attempts to manipulate young voters, who make up over half of about 205 million registered voters in the country.

In this new online battleground, Prabowo Subianto, a oncefeared military man, has rebranded himself as a cuddly statesman. Videos of his awkward dance moves, reminiscent of local martial arts, have got millions of

views, inspiring others to mimic him.

When the frontrunner faced stinging barbs from rivals in a televised debate, women supporters shared videos of themselves crying for Prabowo.

Rivals Anies Baswedan and Ganjar Pranowo have also ramped up their presence on the app, answering questions in real-time during livestreamed sessions or sharing videos of heartfelt encounters with voters.

"TikTok is the most appealing app for first-time voters, so it does have a big influence as a platform to campaign and propagate election-related information," said Anita Wahid, a researcher who has worked with TikTok on issues related to online trust and safety.

Enduring Popularity

During the campaign period, TikTok became Indonesians' second-most used source of information on politics, after television, according to a January survey by pollster Indikator Politik Indonesia.

"We can easily find information about Prabowo on TikTok," voter Irene said. But experts have flagged that some of this information may be incorrect.

Endah Triastuti, a communications researcher at the University of Indonesia, says that because of such content, many young voters may not be aware that Prabowo has been forced to deny allegations of human rights abuses during his time as special forces commander.

Manipulated images and 'deepfake' videos of the candidates have also circulated widely.

TikTok says on its website its policy is to remove "harmful misinformation" and work with fact-checkers to flag or debunk it. Political ads and fundraising are also banned on the platform.

LAHORE, Feb 12 (Agencies): Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) chairman Bilawal Bhutto-Zardari and Asif Ali Zardari held a meeting with Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) president Shehbaz Sharif.

The two parties have agreed "in principle to save the country from political instability".

According to a report, the PML-N would take the post of prime minister, and the posts of the President and Speaker will be set aside for its partners if an alliance is agreed upon.

Similarly, the post of deputy speaker could be given to the Muttahida Qaumi Movement-Pakistan (MQM-P) or any of the Independent members joining the coalition. Besides, the PML-N may keep the finance ministry, and other ministries will be distributed among allies with mutual consultation, according to the report.

As per sources, the decision regarding the nomination for the positions of the Senate chairman and deputy chairman will be made in consultation with the allies after the Senate elections.

The leaders of two parties spoke about the overall situation of the country and political cooperation in the future, according to the statement released by PML-N president on X. Shehbaz Sharif and Bilawal Bhutto-Zardari agreed to cooperate politically to bring the nation to political stability.

According to the statement, the PPP leadership will put forward the proposals of PML-N in the Central Executive Committee meeting. The delegation of PML-N included Azam Nazir Tarar, Ayaz Sadiq, Ahsan Iqbal,



Rana Tanveer, Khawaja Saad Rafiq, Malik Ahmad Khan, Marriyum Aurangzeb and Shaza Fatima.

In a post on X, the PML-N president said, "Lahore: President PPP Asif Ali Zardari, PPP Chairman Bilawal Bhutto Zardari met former Prime Minister Muhammad Shahbaz Sharif at Bilawal House. US Defense Chief Lloyd Austin "Admitted To Critical Care Unit": Pentagon

WASHINGTON, Feb 12 (Agencies): US Secretary of Defense Lloyd Austin has been admitted to the critical care unit as he undergoes treatment for a bladder issue, the Pentagon said late Sunday, in a statement citing his doctors.

"Tonight, after a series of tests and evaluations, the Secretary was admitted into the critical care unit at Walter Reed National Military Medical Center for supportive care and close

monitoring," the statement read.

Austin's hospitalization comes weeks after it emerged that the 70-year-old had kept previous hospital stays secret and had not immediately informed US President Joe Biden of a cancer diagnosis, sparking criticism as the United States faces crises in the Middle East and Ukraine.

Austin effectively vanished from the public eye for treatment for prostate cancer in



December and again in January after suffering complications from the procedure.

This time, the public was alerted around two hours after he was

sent to the hospital on Sunday afternoon, and Deputy Secretary of Defense Kathleen Hicks "assumed the functions and duties" of defense chief just before 5:00 pm (2200 GMT), according to Pentagon spokesman Pat Ryder.

"At this time, it is not clear how long Secretary Austin will remain hospitalized," added the latest statement, attributed to Dr John Maddox and Dr Gregory Chesnut of the Walter Reed National Military Medical Center in Maryland.

"The current bladder issue is not expected to change his anticipated full recovery. His cancer prognosis remains excellent."

Ready to fight for victory in poll: Rishi Sunak



LONDON, Feb 12 (Agencies): British PM Rishi Sunak has said he is "totally up for the fight" of pitching his policies to the electorate to win another term for the governing Conservative Party as he prepares for a general election expected to take place in the second half of the year. In an interview this weekend, the 43-year-old British Indian leader said he had reasons to be optimistic

because the economy was "pointing in the right direction" and that the "future is going to be better".

"At the beginning of this year there is a sense that the country is pointing in the right direction," he told a newspaper. "Because economic conditions have improved, because the plan is working, you are starting to see mortgage rates come down and we have been able to cut taxes. I do believe those pressures are starting to ease and that hopefully over the course of this year, we can continue to make even more progress," he said. In a message as much for the voters as for the rebels within his own Tory ranks, the Conservative leader reiterated his plan to cut taxes for the hardworking people of the country.



Yesterday, a Tata Sumo Gold vehicle bearing number JK 17-7378 while on way from Gulabgarh to Hakoo Pallali met with a tragic accident near Hakoo on Machail Gulabgarh road axis . The vehicle was fully overloaded carrying a total of 15 passengers which was more than the permissible limits. Out of 15 passengers, 03 persons died and 12 others were injured, 04 seriously injured who were later shifted to GMC Jammu. The said accident has again send whirlwinds of shock waves and despair among the residents of Chenab valley and once again refreshed the memories of fatal bus accident which happened at Assar few months back in which 38 persons lost their lives . Crisis-hit SpiceJet plans to lay off around 1,000 staffers as part of cost cuts

The airline which has a fleets of 30 aircraft has around 9,000 employees

NEW DELHI, Feb 12 (Agencies): Spice-Jet plans to hand out pink slips to at least 1,000 employees in the coming days as the airline works to significantly reduce costs and streamline operations of its depleted aircraft fleet, officials said on Monday.

Faced with financial woes, legal battles and other headwinds, the no-frills carrier might ask more staff to leave as there is excess manpower now compared to the number of planes in service. A final decision on the quantum of layoffs is expected this week, one of the officials in the know said.

The airline has around 9,000 employees and is now looking at reducing the strength by 10-15 per cent, the official said, adding that layoffs are necessary to reduce the overall



costs and annual savings could be up to Rs 100 crore.

A reduction of 15 per cent would mean around 1,350 people will lose their jobs.

The second official

in the know said that layoffs are expected across departments and the final list is being prepared. People from the management and consultancy are working on chalking out the contours of letting staff leave, and all the departments have been asked to give their inputs, the official added.

There was no official

comment from Spice-Jet on the proposed job

The second official explained that the airline has stopped operations on certain RCS (Regional Connectivity Scheme) routes and at those stations, there is excess manpower, especially staff with lower salaries. Relocating such people will be a challenge, the official

Currently, SpiceJet has a fleet of little over 30 aircraft apart from 10 planes that are on wet lease.

During a meeting with the airline's senior

officials last month, SpiceJet Chairman and Managing Director Ajay Singh emphasised the importance of judicious spending and that he will personally oversee all major expenditures.

The carrier will prioritise fleet upgrades, enhance on-time performance and costcutting measures will be implemented to streamline operations, according to an internal note last month.

SpiceJet, which has undergone multiple ownership changes since inception and is currently helmed by Ajay Singh, is in the process of raising funds from various investors.

On January 26, the carrier announced that it has received Rs 744 crore as the first tranche of the total Rs 2,250 crore proposed to be raised through the issuance of securities

on a preferential basis. There were reports that there has been a delay in raising the requisite funds.

The airline has also availed funds worth around Rs 1,000 crore under the government's Emergency Credit Line Guarantee Scheme (ECLGS) and Singh has committed to infuse Rs 500 crore.

In recent times, Spice-Jet also witnessed lessors taking legal recourse to take back their leased aircraft due to non-payment of dues. India is one of the

world's fastest growing civil aviation markets and the domestic air traffic is on an upward trajectory. However, SpiceJet has been struggling for sometime now. In 2023, the carrier flew 83.90 lakh passengers and had a domestic market share of 5.5 per cent.

Opening on a positive note, the 30-share BSE Sensex climbed 52.48 points or 0.07 per cent, to 71,647.97 points in early trade. However, it shed the gains and fell 147.85 points or 0.21 per cent to 71,447.64 points.

Similarly, the broader Nifty rose 30.70 points or 0.14 per cent to 21,813.20 points before declining 44.60 points or 0.20 per cent to 21,737.90 points.

In the Sensex pack, Wipro, HCL, Tech Mahindra and Infosys were the major gainers while PowerGrid, Hindustan Unilever, Reliance, Bharti Airtel and ICICI Bank were among the laggards.

V.K. Vijayakumar, Chief Investment Strategist at Geojit Finan-



cial Services, said that rising US bond yields may trigger selling from foreign institutional investors. "So, the tug of war between the bulls and the bears is likely to continue."

"Apart from positive economic cues, a major factor supporting the market is the sustained flows to the market through mutual funds... however, the frothy valuations of the broader market are a matter of concern. From the long-term perspective, safety is in large-caps," he added.

Willing to work with 'important player' Paytm: Axis Bank CEO Amitabh Chaudhry

NEW DELHI, Feb 12 (Agencies): Arjun Chowdhry, the lender's Group Executive, noted that talks with Paytm are on, though only for the bank's 'general business and not any specific business.'

Calling Paytm an 'important player,' Axis Bank MD and CEO, Amitabh Chaudhry, on Monday stressed that the private sector lender is willing to work with the Noida-based fintech major.

Chaudhry made the remark at the launch of Axis Bank's '2023 Burungdy Private Hurun India 500,' as per Moneycontrol. Speaking at

the same event, however, Arjun Chowdhry, Group Executive, Axis Bank, said that though discussions are on with Paytm, these are for 'general business and not specific to any business.'

Subject to regulatory approval, and if the regulator (RBI) allows us to work with Paytm, of course we will work with them. They are an important player," Chaudhry said.

Chowdhry, meanwhile, highlighted: 'Discussions with Paytm are for our normal business services. Post the development that happened on January 31,

we are discussing new things."

He was referring to the Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) crackdown on Paytm Payments Bank Limited (PPBL), Paytm's banking arm, due to PPBL's 'persistent non-compliances.' The measures include a ban on accepting fresh deposits and doing credit transactions after February 29.

Lenders such as Axis Bank, HDFC Bank, and ICICI Bank support multiple fintechs through the third-party route, it noted.

A typical VPA a mix of the brand name of both the fintech and the latter's partnering lender. In Paytm's case, the address ends with @ paytm.

As UPI launches in Sri Lanka and Mauritius, PM Modi calls it 'uniting partners with India'

NEW DELHI, Feb 12 (Agencies): On Monday (February 12), India launched its unified payments interface (UPI) system in Sri Lanka and Mauritius. RuPay card services were also introduced in Mauritius as part of this strategic initiative.

"For the three friends (India, Mauritius and Sri Lanka) in the Indian Ocean region, this is an important day," Prime Minister Narendra Modi said during the launch. "We are connecting our historical ties digitally. With fintech connectivity, not just cross border payments, but cross border connectivity will also strengthen. India's upi is playing a new role - uniting partners with India," he added.

The launch will enable availability of UPI settlement services for Indian nationals travelling to Sri Lanka and Mauritius as well as for Mauritian nationals travelling to India. The extension of RuPay card services in Mauritius will enable Mauritian banks to issue cards based on RuPay mechanism in Mauritius and facilitate usage of RuPay Card for settlements both in India and Mauritius.



The virtual ceremony witnessed the participation of Mauritian Prime Minister Pravind Jugnauth, Sri Lanka's President Ranil Wickremesinghe, India's External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar and Governors of the central banks of the three countries.

"Both countries will

benefit from UPI as it will increase the speed of digital transformation and will benefit tourism in our countries. Indian tourists will also prioritise destinations which accept UPI. People from Mauritius coming to India will have to buy fewer hard currencies and we can transact in our own currencies in real-time at a lower cost. Eventually we can also move towards peer-topeer (P2P) transactions

as well," the PM added. PM Modi also said that India has a "neighbourhood first" policy and its aim is to ensure peace, security and development of the entire Indian Ocean region.
"India has emerged

as a leader in Fintech innovation and Digital Public Infrastructure. Prime Minister has placed a strong emphasis on sharing our development experiences and innovation with partner countries. Given India's robust cultural and people-topeople linkages with Sri Lanka and Mauritius, the launch will benefit a wide cross-section of people through a faster and seamless digital transaction experience and enhance digital connectivity between the countries," the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said in a statement.

The Centre has been pushing to export its UPI system along with the RuPay network which is a rival to Mastercard and Visa - to a number of countries. Earlier this month, NPCI International Payments, in partnership with Lyra, a French e-commerce and payments firm, had announced the acceptance of UPI in France starting with tickets to the Eiffel Tower. Singapore, Bhutan, and the



India have real battle on their hands, says lan Chappell ahead of Rajkot Test against England

"As the home side India should eventually win a tough series, but it has a real battle on their hands," Chappell wrote in his column for 'ESPNCricinfo'.

"England under the aggressive leadership of Stokes are a far cry from the poorly captained Joe Root team that capitulated against spin on their last tour of the country," he added. In their previous tour of India



in 2021, England, playing under Joe Root, had surrendered the Test series after winning the

While star batter Virat Kohli will not be part of the series, the India team will be bolstered

by the return of the KL Rahul and Ravindra Jadeja, who have been included in the squad for the remaining three Tests.

"India is a strong side and they also have a good leader in Rohit Sharma. They will be greatly strengthened by Ravindra Jadeja's and KL Rahul's recovery from injury, but that Virat Kohli will not return for the rest of the series is a blow."

Shreyas Iyer has been dropped for the remainder of the series. The 29-year-old made 35, 13, 27, 29 in the opening two Tests and was guilty of not building on the starts.

"Hopefully the selectors will now stop overestimating Shreyas lyer's batting ability and learn to value Kuldeep Yadav's wicket-taking capability more.

"This India versus England contest is shaping up as it should: a tough five-match encounter between two talented sides." Chappell added.

The third Test will begin in Rajkot on February 15.

Maxwell smashes fifth T20I ton, equals Rohit's record

for me today."

Maxwell's last nine international scores now read 106, 41, 201 not out, 1, 2 not out, 12, 104 not out, 10 and 120 not out. "I feel really comfortable in this format. I think over the last probably 18 months, I've felt really good about my batting and really good about my game," he said.

Maxwell was the fastest to reach five centuries, touching the landmark in 93 innings, compared to Rohit's 143 innings.

Travis Kelce was 'never in doubt' of Kansas City Chiefs winning the Super Bowl LVIII

LAS VEGAS, Feb 12 (Agencies): The Kansas City Chiefs clinched back-to-back Super Bowls with their win in Las Vegas on Monday, February 12, with a 3-yard touchdown by Mecole Hardman from a Patrick Mahomes throw at the dying moments of the game. Hardman's match-winning touchdown gave the Chiefs a close-call win over the San Francisco 49ers by a scoreline of 25-22

Despite the high-value nature of the game with many stars in the lineup of both teams, the majority of the eager eyes were on the Chiefs' popular tight end Travis Kelce. Kelce put in an effective performance at the Allegiant Stadium in Nevada on Monday, making 9 catches for 93 yards during the game. Irrespective of the tight nature of the game between the two sides, Kelce in his post-match comments said that he was fully confident

of his side bagging the win.

"Never a doubt in my mindâ€æWe've got the best quarterback in the league, we've got the best offensive line in the league, and we've got the most determination out of any team in the NFL and you saw all that tonight," Travis Kelce

The tight-end emphasised that his confidence in the Chiefs was not lim-



ited to the Super Bowl, but has been the same throughout his stint with them.

"I guess at this point I take it for granted, but I know we're in every single game I've ever played in, no matter what the score is or no matter how much time is left, that guy's got magic in his right arm," Kelce said.

KELCE'S PROMISE TO GIRLFRIEND TAYLOR SWIFT

Kelce did not shy away from mentioning his girlfriend after the match, dedicating the win to Taylor Swift. Kelce mentioned that on the day Swift earned her fourth career Grammy for album of the year the previous week, he informed her that he would "have to hold up his end of the bargain and bring home some hardware, too."

The Ohio-born American footballer acknowledged the big nature of his side's win and talked about how much it means to him

"I'm going to go ahead and enjoy this and everything that just happened," he said. "This is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity that I've been able to go through three times now. It gets sweeter and sweeter every time," Kelce added.

From beating cancer to firing Ivory Coast to AFCON glory: Sebastien Haller's incredible comeback story

ABIDJAN (IVORY COAST), Feb 12 (Agencies): Borussia Dortmund striker Sebastien Haller became a national hero for the Ivory Coast after guiding his side to their third AFCON title with a late goal against Nigeria in the Final on Monday, February 12.

It was Nigeria who surprised everyone after taking an unlikely lead against the hosts with a powerful header by their skipper William Troost-Ekong in the 38th minute, giving his side a vital lead at the end of the first half. However, the Elephants maintained their composure even after going behind, spearheaded by a defensive masterclass by Calvin Bassey early in the second half.

Ivory Coast's emphatic turnaround came with Franck Kessie's header from a Simon Adingra corner, sending the home crowd into a frenzy. Their winning step came in the final nine minutes of the game when Haller converted another Adingra cross, which they managed to hold on to till the end.

HALLER'S COMEBACK

Even before the Elephants took the field on Monday, all eyes were on Sebastien Haller. Numerous football enthusiasts across the globe were wishing glory for the player who came



back to footballing action only a year after being diagnosed with Testicular cancer in 2022.

2022: Haller joins Borussia Dortmund from Ajax

After two massively impressive spells with Dutch club Ajax, during which he won two Eredivisie titles and emerged as his side's top UEFA Champions League goalscorer, Sebastien Haller was recruited by German club Borussia Dortmund. He was brought in as a replacement for their star striker Erling Haaland, who had recently moved to Manchester City.

Many considered this move as a significant step in his career, especially due to his impressive goalscoring record, which placed him on the Champions League record board alongside the likes of Cristiano Ron-

aldo, Lionel Messi, and Robert Lewandowski.

JULY 2022: Cancer diagnosis Only two weeks into his stint in Germany, during Dortmund's pre-season training camp at Switzerland, Haller complained about abdominal discomfort to the team doctors and was then sent for a consultation to a urologist.

urologist.
Upon diagnosis, to the worst of any human's imagination, a testicular tumour was discovered on Haller, which marked the beginning of his tumultuous recovery journey.

recovery journey.

The 29-year-old underwent surgery to remove his entire cancerous testicle, which was followed by chemotherapy. The following two months, Haller spent the majority of his time making rounds of the hospital,

in the hope of regaining fitness and only dreaming about returning to footballing action.

January 2023: Back on the field

After being declared fit only in December 2022, Haller, who had been training as extensively as possible, travelled with his Dortmund teammates for their pre-season camp in Spain.

It was on January 10, 2023, when Haller stepped back onto the footballing field for a friendly between Dortmund and Fortuna Dusseldorf. After winning his biggest battle, the player's comeback was met with a round of applause from his teammates, the opposition and all the crowd at Marbella's Dama de Noche football centre.

February 2024: Glory
During this time, Haller successfully turned his story into an inspiration for many battling their own struggles, regardless of their location in the world.

Haller's goal in the 81st minute of the AFCON final against a strong Nigeria, marked the culmination of two comeback stories simultaneously. One was his personal journey, and the other was that of his national team, which, at the outset of AFCON 2023, appeared unlikely to advance past the tournament's group stages.

Like senior team, India U19's unbeaten campaign ends with loss to Australia in final

BENONI (SOUTH AFRICA), Feb 12 (Agencies): A fresh chapter was added to the script of Australia's domination over India in the ICC World Cup finals when they bagged the Under-19 title with a 79-run victory here.

Batting by choice, the Aussies posted a healthy 253/7 as India were forced to mount the highest chase in a youth World Cup summit clash.

But Uday Saharan's side floundered in the final step to glory, stumbling to 174 all out as the relentless Aussie bowlers led by pacer Mahli Beardman (3/15) and off-spinner Raf Mac-Millan (3/43) did not give them any breathing space.

This was Australia's fourth U19 title and first since 2010. In a way, they also washed away the pain of losing to India in the title matches in 2012 and 2018.

Many would view this result as a continuation of Australia's win over India in the senior World Cup last year at Ahmedabad.

Pacer Callum Vidler started Australia's victory march by packing off Indian opener Arshin Kulkarni, inducing an edge to

stumper Ryan Hicks.
From that point, India simply



failed to stitch together any meaningful partnership as frontline batters, including skipper Saharan (8), Musheer Khan and Sachin Dhas (9), departed without making any real contributions

Beardman broke through the defence of Musheer (22) with a delivery that kept a tad low. The pacer then tempted Saharan, the tournament's highest rungetter, with a slightly wide delivery and the batter's slash ended in the hands of Hugh Weibgen at point.

Beardman later dismissed opener Adarsh Singh, who was India's highest scorer on the day

with a 77-ball 47, to bulldoze the Indian batting unit with pace and bounce.

If the Indian batters could not cope with the hostility of Beardman, a disciple of the legendary Dennis Lillee, they could not counter the guile of MacMillan, Australia's lone spinner today.

MacMillan was introduced in the 20th over and he dismissed Dhas off his first ball, a regulation catch to Hicks behind the stumps. India were reduced to 68/4 then, and the ouster of the free-flowing Dhas was a body blow to their chances.

The spinner also bagged the

wickets of Aravelly Avanish and Raj Limbani, preventing any late Indian fightback. Murugan Abhishek (42 off 45 balls) tried gamely in the company of Naman Tiwari, adding 46 runs for the ninth wicket, but the task proved beyond his reach.

However, the Australian batters too can claim the right amount of credit for this triumph. No one really made a tall score but they fired collectively around Harjas Singh (55 off 64 balls) to give the Antipodeans a competitive total to defend amidst strikes by Indian pacers Limbani (3/38) and Tiwari (2/63). Harry Dixon (42 off 56 balls) and skipper Weibgen (48 off 66 balls) also made crucial contributions.
