Srinagar-Leh highway closed due to heavy snowfall

SRINAGAR, Feb

19 (Agencies): Major

snowfall during the last 24 hours closed most of the highways leading out of Kashmir in J&K on Monday except the Srinagar-Jammu highway on which traffic was moving smoothly. Traffic department officials said that Srinagar-Jammu national highway is open for traffic while the Srinagar-Leh, Mughal Road, Bandipora-Gurez road, Sinthan-Kishtwar and roads leading to Keran/ Karnah border towns are also closed. While the Valley received rainfall, higher reaches like Zojila Pass, Baltal,

Reports from Gulmarg ski resort said heavy snowfall was continuing there in the morning.

Lt Gen Upendra Dwivedi takes over as new Army Vice Chief

NEW DELHI, Feb 19 (Agencies): Lieutenant General Upendra Dwivedi on Monday took over as the new Vice Chief of Army Staff. After assuming the

appointment of Vice Chief of Army Staff, the General laid a wreath at the National War Memorial in Delhi.Lt Gen Dwivedi is an alumnus of Sainik School, Rewa (MP) and was commissioned into the 18 JAK RIF on December 15, 1984, which he later commanded in the Kashmir valley and the deserts of Rajasthan. He has had the unique distinction of having balanced exposure of both Northern and Western theatre.

He has also held the important appointments of Inspector General Assam Rifles (North) and Sector Commander Assam Rifles in intense counter terrorist operations and held various other staff and command appointments in the North East.

After commanding the Rising Star Corps, the General was given the command of the most prestigious Northern Army from 2022-2024 in



an extremely challenging operational environment.

During his command, he provided guidance and operational oversight for the planning and execution of sustained operations along the northern borders with China and the Western Front with Pakistan, besides orchestrating the dynamic counterterrorism operations in Jammu and Kashmir.

He was also involved in the modernization and equipping of the largest Army Command of the Indian Army, where he steered the induction of indigenous equipment as part of Atmanirbhar Bharat.

He has also worked towards creating sysnergy with the people of Jammu, Kashmir, and Ladakh for convergent nation-building outcomes and infrastructure development.

The General officer,

during his illustrious career spanning across 39 years, has held various staff appointments in the headquarters of the Armoured Brigade, Mountain Division, Strike Corps and Integrated HQ (Army). As an instructor at the Indian Military Academy and the Army War College (Higher Command), he shaped the future generations of tri-services and Friendly Foreign Countries. The appointment of DG Infantry empowered him to steer and fast-track capital procurement cases of weapons for all three services, leading to significant and visible capability enhancement for our Armed Forces.

As Dy Chief (IS&C), the officer gave impetus towards automation and the absorption of niche tech in the Indian Army. Being a tech enthusiast, he worked towards enhancing the tech threshold of all ranks in Northern Command and pushed for Critical and Emerging Techs like Big Data Analytics, AI, Quantum and blockchain-based solutions.

The Genral officer's two overseas tenures include Somalia, as pw1art of HQ United Nations Operation in Somalia (UNOSOM) II and Seychelles, as Military Advisor to the Gov-

ernment of Seychelles. Besides attending Staff College, Wellington and the Higher Command Course at Army War College (AWC), Mhow, the officer was conferred 'Distinguished Fellow' in the coveted NDC equivalent course at USAWC, Carlisle, USA. Complementing his illustrious military career, are an M Phil in Defence & Management Studies, in addition to two Master's degrees in Strategic Studies and Military Science, including one

JAMMU, Feb 19 (Agencies): A multi-tier security setup has been put in place and traffic advisories issued for Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to Jammu on Tuesday, officials on Monday said. Modi is scheduled to address a public rally at Maulana Azad Stadium in the heart of winter capital of Jammu and Kashmir during his visit on February 20, they said.

Jammu declared No-Fly Zone for Drones Govt, Ladakh delegation ahead of PM Modi's visit

JAMMU, Feb 19 (Agencies): Jammu district has been made no-fly zone for drones and quadcopters with immediate effect as security arrangements are being tightened across Jammu and Kashmir ahead of PM Narendra Modi's visit on February 20.

Jammu District Magistrate Sachin Kumar Vaishya, keeping in view intelligence reports highlighting potential security threats, issued a comprehensive order under Section 144 of the Criminal Procedure Code, 1973.

The ban order will continue until February 20. It imposes restrictions on drones, remote-controlled micro-light aircrafts, para-gliders, para-motors, hand gliders and hot air balloons within the district. The ban order exempts security forces.

The Tribune quoting an official reported that the precautionary measure was in place to counter possible activities by terrorist and anti-national elements.

Security has also been strengthened along the Pathankot-Jammu highway as the prestigious project of AIIMS will also be inaugurated by the PM in Samba, located along the highway.

Special security measures have been taken at the MA Stadium in Jammu where the PM will address a rally and likely talk about the post-Article 370 era and Central

Rains, snow continue in Kashmir; Gulmarg receives 16 inches of snowfall

SRINAGAR, Feb 19 (Agencies): Rains continued to lash Srinagar and other plains while higher reaches including Gulmarg received snowfall on Monday.

A meteorological department official here told GNS that Srinagar received 12.4mm of rain in 24 hours till 0830 hours and recorded a low of 2.0°C against 5.8°C on the previous night. It was above normal by 1.0°C for the summer capital of J&K for this time of the year, he said.

Qazigund received 12.8mm of rain and recorded a minimum of 3.6°C against 3.8°C on the previous night and it was 3.7°C above normal for the gateway town of

Pahalgam received 18.6mm of rain and recorded a low of 0.8°C against 2.5°C on the previous night and it was 5.2°C above normal for the famous resort in

Kokernag, also in south Kashmir, received 8.0mm of rain and

recorded a minimum of 3.5°C against 5.0°C on the previous night and the temperature was above normal by 4.4°C for the place, the official

Jammu, he said, received 4.9mm of rain and recorded a minimum of 13.8°C and it was above normal by 3.3°C for the winter capital of J&K.



TRIUMPHANT RETURN

ord Rama, the 7th avatar of Vishnu, one of the Trimurti in Hinduism, is believed to have been born in Ayodhya, which lies in the state of Uttar Pradesh, India. Hence, Ayodhya is also called Ram Janmabhoomi. This place is very holy for Hindus as Rama is a highly revered deity, who is also called Maryada Purushottam or the ideal man.

It has been a long-cherished dream of Hindus to have a grand temple for their beloved deity, Lord Rama, in his birthplace, Ayodhya. Ayodhya is holy ground for Hindus, as Ram was born here. Moreover, he is the avatar of Vishnu. Hence, to rebuild the Ram temple in Ayodhya, where people worshipped him in ancient times, has been a highly emotive issue for the Hindu community.

The new Ram Mandir will symbolize the triumphant return of Rama to Ayodhya after centuries of exile following the Mughal invasion. It means many things to many people. It means a validation of faith for devotees. For the people of Ayodhya, it means brighter days ahead, as the temple will attract tourists from all over India and the world, giving a boost to the economy. It will also burnish the image of the city as a renowned pilgrimage destination due to the vastly improved infrastructure and other facilities.

Hindus believe that many centuries ago, there was a temple for Rama in his birth-place. Here, devotees worshipped Rama in his child form, Ram Lalla. However, the Mughals destroyed this temple, and a mosque came up in the same location. This was the Babri Masjid mosque.

Excavations carried out at the site in 1976-77 revealed the remains of an ancient and grand Hindu temple beneath the Babri mosque. Twelve pillars of the Babri mosque, which was under police custody at the time, were made from the remains of the temple, says K.K. Muhammad, one of the members of the ASI (Archeological Survey of India) team that carried out the excavation. Many such mosques in India in fact were built using the spoils of Hindu temples. This is a historical fact.

Some people contested the discovery of the temple remains, so another excavation took place in 2003, by which time the mosque had been destroyed. In 1992, a rampaging Hindu mob of kar sevaks demolished the mosque, leading to widespread riots and communal tensions. The second excavation revealed that a very large and imposing structure had existed once. The team found more than 50 pillar bases in 17 rows. The structure dates back to the 12th century AD. As terracotta objects depicting living beings like animals and also gods and goddesses were found in the ruins, it was clear that they belonged to a temple and not a mosque, as Islam does not allow such depictions.

Also, the archeologists discovered two pieces of a Vishnu Hari Sheela Phalak inscription in the ruins. The evidence suggested that the temple had associations with an avatar of Vishnu who had slain Bali and a 10-headed person.

The first police complaint in the Ayodhya dispute was in 1858, and the first cases were filed in 1885. However, the movement for Ram Mandir got a huge thrust in 1989 when the Vishva Hindu Parishad (VHP) laid a foundation stone ('shilanyas') at the disputed site.

In September 1990, BJP leader, LK Advani, began a Rath Yatra from Gujarat's Somnath to Ayodhya in Uttar Pradesh to create awareness about the Ram Janmabhoomi issue and to raise support for building a Ram Mandir in Ayodhya. It led to communal tensions, and in December 1992, kar sevaks climbed the Babri Masjid mosque and demolished it.

Hindus and Muslim litigants fought a prolonged court battle to claim the disputed site, and finally, the Supreme Court delivered a verdict in 2019 allowing temple construction at the site. Muslim litigants got a 5-acre plot of land to build a mosque elsewhere in Ayodhya as compensation.

Once the dispute ended, the temple construction began. The inauguration of the Ram Mandir temple will be on January 22, 2024, by Prime Minister Narendra Modi in the presence of spiritual leaders and other eminent personalities.

The bond of wealth, power: SC verdict won't end nexus

The verdict of the Supreme Court on the electoral bonds scheme has been widely welcomed. Even the Bharatiya Janata Party, the scheme's biggest beneficiary, has also welcomed it. While this verdict may make the scheme more transparent, it is unlikely to end the nexus between wealth and power that defines any democracy.

During the Congress era, the Communists used to refer to the Union government as the "Tata-Birla ki Sarkar". Today they refer to it as the "Adani-Ambani ki Sarkar".

Through the electoral bonds scheme, the Narendra Modi government spread its net wide, beyond big business, and garnered more than a lion's share of the contributions. The late Rakesh Jhunjhunwala, the Big Bull on Dalal Street, once famously told a journalist that his Agrawal community within the bania caste "owned the country". Look at the names, he said, Jindal, Goyal, Mittal, Bansal, Singhal and so on and on. "So, boss, do we own the country or not?" The dominant section of the business community across the country is invested heavily in Prime Minister Narendra Modi, in his BJP and in Hindutva. So, why would the BJP not corner as much as 90 per cent of the electoral bonds issued in this past half-decade?

The shifts in Indian politics over the past seven decades have, without doubt, shaped the social composition of the political power elite. Their caste, class and regional composition has certainly changed. The rise of the inter-

mediate castes, the OBCs, has been one of the major structural changes in both the class and caste composition of the ruling political class. Yet, the land-owning upper castes have retained their place of prominence and dominance in many regions. From the Jats and Rajputs of North India to the Marathas and Patels of western India and the Reddys, Kammas, Velamas, Chettiars and Nairs of the South, the upper castes have retained their presence in business and politics.

As I have tried to explain in my book, India's Power Elite: Caste, Class and a Cultural Revolution (Penguin, 2021), in India's "psephocracy", as sociologist Ashis Nandy characterised an electoral democracy, wealth remains, above all, the most important determinant of power. The cost of getting people out on election day to cast their vote is rising even as their trust in the system may be waning. Several recent studies have focused on the role of "money power" in politics and the nexus between crime, business and politics. The rising cost of election campaigns, the inability of the State to enforce the rules pertaining to election funding and, more recently, the brazen manner in which political parties in power are able to corner the bulk of the funds provided by corporates and other donors has made politics a game of the rich in which the wealthy become wealthier and are able to become politically more powerful.

It is not, therefore, surprising that a disproportionate number of the members of state legislatures and Parliament are wealthy. There

had been some dilution of this aspect in the first decade after Independence with more members of the middle class, including rich peasants, entering politics. However, as election expenses have grown and with the rising importance of political office as a source of both power and wealth, there has been a rise in the number of the wealthy among the elected

representatives of the people. Consider the social composition of the 17th Lok Sabha, that was elected in 2019. It has more wealthy members than any other Lok Sabha in the past half century. Data collated by the Association for Democratic Rights shows that as many as 475 MPs (constituting 88 per cent of the 539 MPs for whom data was available) have assets upwards of Rs 10 million (Rs 1 crore), slightly up from 443 (82 per cent) in the 16th Lok Sabha. Out of 542 winners analysed during the Lok Sabha 2014 elections, 443 (82 per cent) winners were crorepatis. In the 15th Lok Sabha (2009-14), the comparable number was appreciably less at 315 (58 per

The ADR study shows that not only had MPs become richer during the five years they were members of the Lok Sabha, but that in successive elections since 2009 the proportion of "crorepati" candidates among the victors has also risen. In other words, the wealthy had a better chance of securing admission to political office, and that office became an important source of acquiring wealth. In a country with a nominal per capita income that is less than Rs 200,000 per annum, and at least a fifth of the population living in abject poverty, it is surprising that an overwhelming number of elected representatives, both in the Lok Sabha and in the state Assemblies, are millionaires, if not billionaires.

The ADR data showed that with the exception of MPs from the Communist parties, all other MPs of all other parties were millionaires, with the BJP having the largest number of them. As many as a third of MPs in the 17th Lok Sabha had assets worth more than Rs 50 million, while average assets per winning MP was Rs 21 million. The wealthiest MPs, however, came from smaller political parties like the YSR Congress, Nationalist Congress Party, DMK, Bharat Rashtra Samiti (BRS) and the Akali Dal.

These are, of course, declared assets, and that too, in the name of the specified individual and not of all family members taken together. Many wealthy Indians hold considerable wealth in the name of their spouse. The ADR data also shows, interestingly, that MPs from regional parties like the Akali Dal, BRS and the Nationalist Congress Party saw the highest increase in wealth of sitting MPs between the general elections of 2014 and 2019.

The role of money power in politics has only increased with time and this is reflected in the wealth of elected politicians. With the decline of the Congress, the balance of power and wealth has shifted in favour of the BJP. New-look London Overground open; Baroness Shreela's remarkable legacy

'iracles will never Paul cease. ■ McCartney's original bass guitar — a Hoffner 500/1, no less, that he bought in 1961 for thirty pounds (a lot of money in those days) has been found. He played it at the Cavern club in Liverpool and at Abbey Road for that iconic LP. But then the guitar was "lost". Now after 54 years it has been returned to him by a student, Ruiadhri Guest, who said he had inherited it. It was discovered in an attic in Hastings. The last time McCartney had used it was in the Beatles album, Let It Be.

That is not the only good news. The sun is shining and there is a promise of spring in the air. Even the by-elections or the recession in the economy is not dampening down the people enjoying the lovely weather.

London has always had the Underground. Now it has Overground railways as well. Sadiq Khan who faces election as Mayor just unveiled the new lines. The underground has routine names like Northern and Central. These new Overground railways have

trendy names. There is Lioness celebrating the successful English women's soccer team. Windrush — in honour of the boat that brought Afro-Caribbean people back in the 1940s and which changed the cultural scene with Bob Marley and the Notting Hill carnival. There is the Suffragette line to commemorate the women who fought for the vote.

These overground lines (somewhat like Paul McCartney's guitar) have been recovered from little used overground railway lines. So Sadiq Khan is frugal as well as imaginative. Let us hope it helps him get back in as Mayor.

But elsewhere there is trouble. Students can no longer afford night life. Swinging London from when the Beatles and the Rolling Stones ruled the roost is gone. Night venues for dancing are shutting down. Even pubs are suffering. There is a recession in the economy and it is telling.

But fortunately for authors

— money is not everything.

There is now to be a new literary prize for women authors for nonfiction writing. It turns out that women have caught up with men in fiction but

they are lagging in the nonfiction prize field. So we now have 16 women shortlisted for a nonfiction prize worth 30,000 pounds. Naomi Klein, the well-known Guardian columnist, is shortlisted. Sixteen titles on the long list will be narrowed down to six on March 27 and winner will be announced on June 13.

One person who will be sorely missed is Baroness Shreela Flather, who just passed away.

She was a pioneer in many ways. She was the first woman Mayor of Maidenhead as well as a member of the European Parliament and entered the House of Lords as the first woman of Indian origin.

She sat on the Conservative benches and remained a fiercely independent member with a marvellous wit and a keen debating style. She married Gary Flather, a barrister and judge, but revelled in her Indian roots. We, at the Partition Museum (set up by the trust that I chair in Amritsar and Delhi) were delighted to interview her as she was the descendant of the great Sir Gangaram — who set up institutions in Lahore and India. She was proud of the connection - especially when one remembers that the hospitals he set up in both countries have survived the Partition. But in her own right she has left a permanent monument in London in the vicinity of the Buckingham Palace. It is a memorial to all the soldiers of the Commonwealth who fought and died during the world wars. She raised the money, made the arrangements and secured the place. There is a memorable photograph of hers in the Parliament gallery. A true pioneer. Shreela ushered in a new chapter for Parliament but the House of Lords has recently gained a new woman member who is also a novelty. She is only 27, Welsh and does not approve of the unelected House. She belongs to the Welsh nationalist party Plaid Cymru which nominated her. She intends to take her oath in Welsh and wear her Martens Boots. That may wake up some noble lords from their afternoon nap but then they are used to that. Perhaps it was about time the House of Lords got a young rebel!

'Oppenheimer' wins seven prizes, including Best Picture, at British Academy Film Awards

Atom bomb epic 'Oppenheimer' won seven prizes, including best picture, director and actor, at the 77th British Academy Film Awards on Sunday, cementing its frontrunner status for the Oscars next month.

Gothic fantasia 'Poor Things' took five prizes and Holocaust drama 'The Zone of Interest' won three.

Christopher Nolan won his first Best Director BAFTA for 'Oppenheimer', and Cillian Murphy won the best actor prize for playing physicist J Robert Oppenheimer, the father of the atomic bomb.

Murphy said he was grateful to play such a "colossally knotty, complex character". Emma Stone was named best actress for playing the wild and spirited Bella Baxter in 'Poor Things', a steampunk-style visual extravaganza that won prizes for visual effects, production design, costume design, and makeup and hair.

'Oppenheimer' had a field-leading 13 nominations, but missed out on the record of nine trophies, set in 1971 by 'Butch

Cassidy and the Sundance Kid'. It won the best film race against 'Poor Things', 'Killers of the Flower Moon', 'Anatomy of a Fall' and 'The Holdovers'. 'Oppenheimer' also won trophies for editing, cinematography and musical score, as well as the Best Supporting Actor prize for Robert Downey Jr.

Da'Vine Joy Randolph was named best supporting actress for playing a boarding school cook in 'The Holdovers' and said she felt a "responsibility I don't take lightly" to tell the stories of underrepresented people like her character Mary.

'Oppenheimer' faced stiff competition in what was widely considered a vintage year for cinema and an awards season



energised by the end of actors' and writers' strikes that shut down Hollywood for months.

'The Zone of Interest' — a British-produced film shot in Poland with a largely German cast — was named both best British film and best film not in English — a first — and also took the prize for its sound, which has been described as the real star of the film.

Jonathan Glazer's unsettling drama takes place in a family home just outside the walls of the Auschwitz death camp, whose horrors are heard and hinted at, rather than seen.

"Walls aren't new from before or since the Holocaust, and it seems stark right now that we should care about innocent people being killed in Gaza or Yemen or Mariupol or Israel," producer James Wilson said. "Thank you for recognising a film that asks us to think in those spaces."

Ukraine war documentary '20 Days in Mariupol', produced by The Associated Press and PBS 'Frontline', won the prize for best documentary.

"This is not about us," said filmmaker Mstyslav Chernov, who captured the harrowing reality of life in the besieged city with an

Chernov said the story of the city and its fall into Russian occupation "is a symbol of struggle and faith. Thank you for empowering our voice and let's just keep fighting." The awards ceremony, hosted by 'Doctor Who' star David Tennant — who entered wearing a kilt and sequined top while carrying a dog named Bark Ruffalo — was a glitzy, British-accented appetizer for Hollywood's Academy Awards, closely watched for hints about who might win at the Oscars on March 10.

The prize for original screenplay went to French courtroom drama 'Anatomy of a Fall'. The film about a woman on trial over the death of her husband was written by director Justine Triet and her partner, Arthur Harari. "It's fiction, and we are reasonably fine," Triet joked.

Cord Jefferson won the adapted screenplay prize for the satirical 'American Fiction', about the struggles of an African-American novelist Jefferson said he hoped the success of the movie "maybe changes the minds of the people who are in charge of greenlighting films and TV shows, allows them to be less risk-averse."

The historical epic 'Killers of the Flower Moon' had nine nominations for the awards, officially called the EE BAFTA Film Awards, but went home emptyhanded.

There also was disappointment for Leonard Bernstein's biopic 'Maestro', which had seven nominations but won no awards. Neither did the griefflecked love story 'All of Us Strangers' with six nominations, and barbed class-war dramedy 'Saltburn', with five.

'Barbie', one-half of 2023's 'Barbenheimer' box office juggernaut and the year's topgrossing film, also went home empty-handed from five nominations. 'Barbie' director Greta Gerwig failed to get a directing nomination for either the BAFTAs or the Oscars, in what was seen by many as a major snub.

Britain's film academy introduced changes to increase the awards' diversity in 2020, when no women were nominated as best director for the seventh year running and all 20 nominees in the lead and supporting performer categories were white. However, Triet was the only woman among this year's six best-director nominees.

The Rising Star award, the only category decided by public vote, went to Mia McKenna-Bruce, star of 'How to Have Sex'.

Before the ceremony, nominees, including Bradley Cooper, Carey Mulligan, Emily Blunt, Rosamund Pike, Ryan Gosling and Ayo Edebiri walked the red carpet at London's Royal Festival Hall, along with presenters Andrew Scott, Cate Blanchett, Idris Elba and David Beckham.

Guest of honour was Prince William, in his role as president of the British Academy of Film and Television Arts.

No point getting upset over award snubs, says actress Helen Mirren



Veteran Hollywood star Helen Mirren has said there is no point in being 'upset' at a lack of awards' nominations, though she does wish actress Margot Robbie and Greta Gerwig had been nominated for Oscars. The 78-year-old actress found it disheartening when Robbie and Gerwig failed to be recognised in the Academy Awards shortlists for their work in Barbie.

Helen said, "You can't get upset about things like that, honestly. What is fantastic is that Barbie was the highest-grossing film that Warner Brothers has ever had in their lives and do you remember who won best film of the year before last? I mean, of course I would have loved to have seen Greta be nominated, and I think she should win best director. It's so difficult, it's not a running race, you know, you can't."

"Christopher Nolan's work on Oppenheimer was spectacular, extraordinary. But for me, Greta's work was so out there, it was so brave, it was something we'd never seen before. I just love the fact that the audience responded the way it did," she added.

Helen also confirmed rumours that there is a deleted scene from Barbie in which she fought with a 'drunk' Olivia Colman, as the Crown actress attempted to take over her narrator's job. She said, "We did shoot that scene, yes we did. I'd love to see it sometime."

Paramvir Singh Cheema says playing Prashant in Sapne v/s Everyone helped him disengage from the emotional turmoil he internalised while portraying dark and aggressive

Paramvir Singh Cheema is currently revelling in the success of his latest OTT venture, Chamak. These days, he is best known as Kaala, the character he portrays in the show. Centered on the journey of a Punjabi singer, the series vividly captures the grind and hustle of an artiste. However, he isn't your typical musician; Kaala is dark and aggressive.

To embody this character, Paramvir shares, "I had to lose a significant amount of weight to ensure my eyes stood out, as much of my performance relied on my eyes. I grew my hair for six months, tanned my skin to achieve a darker look, and revamped my wardrobe."

While physical preparation was essential, delving into Kaala's psyche required even more effort. Paramvir explains, "I immersed myself in understanding the journeys of singers by reading about them, watching their interviews, and exploring their biographies. Influenced by artistes like Kanwar Grewal, Gurdas Maan, Sidhu Moosewala, Arif Lohar, and Tupac among rappers, I crafted a backstory in my mind to authentically portray emotions on screen."

Initially, Kaala may evoke a sense of revulsion, but Paramvir assures that as the show progresses, viewers will develop a connection with the char-



acter. "In the storyline, Kaala's father is killed in his homeland, leading to a tale of revenge that rationalises Kaala's behaviour as the narrative unfolds."

The death of Kaala's father, portrayed by Gippy Grewal, in the first episode draws parallels to a historical event in Punjabi music. It bears resemblance to the assassination of Amar Singh Chamkila and Amarjot Kaur in 1988. When asked if the show is loosely based on their lives, Paramvir responds, "While that particular scene might suggest a connection, the focus of the show is to highlight that such tragic deaths should not occur. Numerous artistes, not only in the Punjabi music industry but also globally among rappers, have faced similar fates. The recent incident with Sidhu Moosewala remains shrouded in mystery." Having immersed himself in the role of Kaala for months, Paramvir found it challenging to disengage from

the character's emo-

tional turmoil. "Holding onto that trauma was not easy. Fortunately, Sapne v/s Everyone came along, and portraying Prashant in the show helped me move beyond it."

Paramvir has experienced consecutive success with Tabbar, Chamak, and now Sapne v/s Everyone. Anticipation surrounds the release of Chamak Season 2, but he admits, "After completing the shoot for Chamak 2, director Rohit Jugraj cautioned me against taking up another dark or negative role, fearing that people might start disliking me. That's how much pain I've lived

through Kaala." Reflecting on his journey to success, it's hard to ignore the fact that he contemplated giving up acting during the lockdown. The son of an advocate-turned-farmer, Paramvir returned to Jalandhar to do farming in 2020 after spending four years in Mumbai. His story unfolds like a movie script. "It all happened spontaneously. In 2016, a friend asked

Serious constitutional crisis has arisen in Delhi, says CM Kejriwal in Assembly



NEW DELHI, Feb 19 (Agencies): Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Monday said a "serious constitutional crisis" has arisen in the national capital as officers are saying they will not work because of alleged "threats and pressure" from the BJP.

This problem stems from Delhi not enjoying full statehood and the real power lies with the central government, which is led by a different party, and "that other party does not want that the elected government (of Delhi) does its work", he said during his address in the

Delhi Assembly. Kejriwal also said the one-time settlement scheme to rectify water bills is being "obstructed" by some officers.

The chief minister alleged that the officers are being threatened to block the one-time settlement scheme for correcting water bills because of pressure from the BJP.

There was no immediate reaction from the BJP.

Kejriwal also claimed the officers' unwillingness to work has led to a "serious constitutional crisis" in Delhi.

appealed to Lt Governor VK Saxena to call the officers for clearance of the scheme and added that 10.5 lakh families will benefit from this "good scheme".

"Must Be Careful Of Rumours": Mayawati Rejects **Poll Alliance Reports**

NEW DELHI, Feb 19 (Agencies): Amid widening the rift over the INDIA bloc, and the speculation of many Congress leaders that are likely to join the BJP, the Bahujan Samaj Party Chief Mayawati on Monday reiterated that there is no alliance ahead of the Loksabha election and said that her party will contest the

election alone. "Despite BSP's repeated clear declaration of not forging an alliance with any party in the upcoming Lok Sabha general elections, spreading rumours about alliance every day proves that without BSP, some parties are not going to fare well here, while BSP is going to do well. The welfare of our people is paramount," BSP Chief posted on X.

"Therefore, keep-

ing in view the interest and welfare of the Sarv Samaj (Entire Society), especially the poor, exploited and neglected, BSP's decision to contest the Lok Sabha general elections on its strength with the body, mind and money of its people across the country is firm. People must be careful of rumours," she added.

Earlier, Mayawati reiterated her party's stand for the 2024 Lok Sabha election and said that her party will contest the polls alone.

Addressing a press conference here, the BSP chief said that her party may consider about alliance once the elections are over.

"Our experience with alliances has never been beneficial for us and we suffer more losses from alliances.



For this reason, most of the parties in the country want to ally with BSP. An alliance can be considered after the elections. If possible, BSP can extend its support after the elections...our party will fight the elections all alone," she said.

On December 21, 2023, Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP) chief Mayawati, lashed out at member parties of the

INDIA bloc, especially the Samaiwadi Party (SP), who make com-

ments on opposition

parties that are not a

part of the alliance. "It is inappropriate for anyone to make unnecessary comments on parties, including the BSP, that are not a part of the opposition alliance. My suggestion to them is that they should refrain from it because

you can never say who will need whom in the future in the public interest. It would not be correct for such people and parties to feel ashamed later. SP is a living example of this," said Mayawati.

Notably, Samajwadi Party reportedly opposed the move to induct the BSP into the INDIA alliance at the fourth meeting of the INDIA bloc

The BSP, a Scheduled Castes-centric party, was a major political force in Uttar Pradesh in the 1990s and 2000s but witnessed a gradual decline over the past decade.

In the 2022 assembly elections, the party polled only 12.8 per cent votes, its lowest in almost three decades.

Uddhav Sena wants to contest in 18 Lok Sabha seats, including 4 in Mumbai

MUMBAI, Feb 19 (Agencies): Amid ongoing seat-sharing talks between the Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) leaders in Maharashtra, Shiv Sena (UBT)appointed Election Coordinators said the party wants to contest in 18 of 48 Lok Sabha seats in the state. This aiso includes tour out of six constituencies in Mumbai for the upcoming general elections.

The appointment of **Election Coordinators** by Shiv Sena (UBT) is seen as an assertion of their demand to contest in 18 of 48 Lok Sabha seats in Maharashtra.

The four parliamentary seats in Mumbai are --Mumbai South, Mumbai South Central, Mumbai North West and Mumbai

North East. The Uddhav Thackeray faction of Shiv Sena is proposing to leave only two seats for their allies to contest in the Lok Sabha polls, likely to be held in April-May.

The last meeting of MVA over seat-sharing distribution was held on February 2, after which former Maharashtra Chief Minister Ashok Chavan left the Congress to join the BJP.

No discussion was held between MVA leaders since then after Chavan's exit from Con-

In the previous meeting, Prakash Ambedkar of Vanchit Bahujan Aaghadi (VBA) also took part in the meet, his first after his party's induction in the MVA.

Ambedkar insisted on having a Common Minimum Programme (CMP) before deciding on the seat-sharing within the MVA allies.

The next meeting is likely to be on February

In the 2019 Lok Sabha polls, undivided Shiv Sena was part of an alliance with the BJP and fought in 22 out of 48 seats. The Shiv Sena won 18 seats, including three in Mumbai.

But with prominent Congress leaders Ashok Chavan and Milind Deora leaving the party, the Shiv Sena (UBT) wants to contest in those seats which they won in 2019 as a backup plan.

Protest March Case: Supreme Court Halts Proceedings Against Siddaramaiah

NEW DELHI, Feb 19 (Agencies): The Supreme Court on Monday stayed proceedings against Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah and others in connection with a protest march held in the state in 2022.

A bench of Justices Hrishikesh Roy and P K Mishra issued notice to the Karnataka government and the complainant in the case.

The top court also stayed the high court order, which had imposed a fine of 10,000 on him as well as Congress general secretary and Karnataka in-charge Randeep Singh Surjewala, state ministers M B Patil and Ramalinga Reddy, and



directed him to appear before a special court on March 6.

The case was registered against the Congress leaders after they took out a march to lay siege to the then chief minister Basavaraj Bommai's residence in Bengaluru, demanding the resignation of KS Eshwarappa, who was then the rural development and panchayat raj minister in the southern state.

The agitation was staged after a contractor, Santosh Patil, died by suicide accusing Eshwarappa of demanding 40 per cent commission for a public work in his village.

According to police, the case pertained to blocking roads and causing trouble to commuters.

Parliament Panel Probe Against Bengal Officers On Hold In Sandeshkhali Case

NEW DELHI. Feb 19 (Agencies): The Supreme Court on Monday paused a Parliament panel's proceedings against top officers of the West Bengal government that was triggered by allegations of misconduct by state BJP chief Sukanta Majumdar. The case is linked to the alleged atrocities against villagers in Sandeshkhali.

A bench led by Chief Justice of India DY Chandrachud issued notices to the Lok Sabha Secretariat, West Bengal BJP president Sukanta Majumdar, and the Union Home Ministry, and sought their responses within four weeks.

Notices have also been issued to the West Bengal Director General of Police, the Chief Secretary, and the local District Magistrate.

The Privileges Committee of the Parliament had ordered the Chief Secretary, the DGP, the local District Magistrate, the Superintendent of Police, and the local police station in-charge

to appear before it on Monday. The notice was issued after Mr Majumdar, an MP from Balurghat, filed a complaint alleging "misconduct, brutality and life-threatening injuries to him".

Challenging the notice, Chief Secretary Bhagwati Prasad Gopalika, DGP Rajiv Kumar, and other officers told the court that political activity can never

be a breach of privilege. Referring to Mr Majumdar's complaint that he was injured during a clash with the cops when his delegation tried to enter Sandeshkhali, senior advocate Kapil Sibal pointed out that 38 state police officials - including eight women cops also sustained injuries.

The petition filed by the officers argued Mr Majumdar was demonstrating on the top of a police car when a woman member of his party pushed him and he fell on its bonnet. The police had no role in the incident which is evident in videos, they argued. "How can this be a violation

of privilege of the Parliament? The MP violated Section 144. He jumped on the bonnet of a car and was inciting violence. The complaint is based on a completely wrong story," said Mr Sibal.

He also pointed out that the DGP and the Chief Secretary were not even present at the

The Lok Sabha secretariat's counsel said the officers were not being accused of anything and it was a regular process to issue notices after an MP files a complaint.

The case in Sandeshkhali surrounds a Trinamool leader and local strongman Sheikh Sahajan, who and his aides have been accused of systematically exploiting the villagers and multiple counts of sexual assault. Two of his henchmen - Uttam Sardar and Shibu Prasad Hazra - have been arrested, but Shah-

jahan is still on the run. A BJP delegation led by

Mr Majumdar to the island was stopped by the cops on Wednesday.

Governor CV Ananda Bose, who has visited Sandeshkhali, said that "women in numbers" have told him they were harassed and intimidated, and that he has forwarded their written complaints to the state government.

"Women in numbers met me and told me about their grievance. They said they were molested, harassed, and intimidated, their husbands were beaten up," Mr Bose told NDTV.

Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee has accused the BJP of making a "mountain out of a molehill". "Instead of peace, they are starting fires," she has claimed.

The National Commission for Scheduled Castes, which visited Sandeshkhali last week, had recommended President's Rule in the state amid violence and political tension.

China on the march, US needs more friends: Nikki **Haley bats for closer India ties**

WASHINGTON, Feb 19 (Agencies): Indian-American Republican presidential aspirant Nikki Haley has said that if voted to power in the November 2024 election, her administration will not only strengthen the alliance with Nato but also with several other countries, including India, Australia, Japan, South Korea and the Philippines. She said this was for "America having more friends, not less friends"

Haley, the 52-year-old former US Ambassador to the UN, said that if former US President Donald Trump is re-elected a threat to the Nato alliance is one of the things she is wor-

"I'm worried about a lot of things if Trump is re-elected. That is one of them," she told ABC News, adding that Nato is a 75-year success story.

Haley is the only candidate left against Trump in the Republican Party's 2024 presidential nomination race.

The two-term former governor from South Carolina said that Russia has never invaded a Nato country because it has typically been very intimidated by this alliance.

Houthi rebels suspected of attack that damaged a Belize-flagged ship in Bab el-Mandeb Strait

DUBAI, Feb 19 (Agencies): Yemen's Houthi rebels are suspected in an attack that damaged a Belize-flagged ship traveling through the Bab el-Mandeb Strait connecting the Red Sea and the Gulf of Aden, authorities said early Monday.

The attack on the ship came as the U.S. military acknowledged conducting new airstrikes targeting the rebels, including one that targeted the first Houthi underwater drone seen since the rebels' began launching their attacks on shipping in November.

The ship targeted in the Houthi attack Sunday reported sustaining damage after "an explosion in close proximity to the vessel," the British military's United Kingdom Maritime Trade Operations center reported. It said that the crew aboard the ship were safe.

The private security firm Ambrey reported

the British-registered, Lebanese-operated cargo ship had been on its way to Bulgaria after leaving Khorfakkan in the United Arab Emirates.

Ship-tracking data from MarineTraffic.com analyzed by The Associated Press identified the vessel targeted as the Rubymar. Its Beirutbased manager could not be immediately reached for comment.

Ambrey described the ship as being partially laden with cargo, but it wasn't immediately clear what it had been carrying. The ship had turned off its Automatic Identification System tracker while in the Persian Gulf early this month.

The Houthis did not immediately claim the attack, though a military spokesman for the rebels, Brig. Gen. Yahya Saree, said a statement on their activities likely would be released sometime Monday morning.

Since November, the rebels have repeatedly targeted ships in the Red Sea and surrounding waters over Israel's war targeting Hamas in the Gaza Strip. They have frequently targeted vessels with tenuous or no clear links to Israel, imperiling shipping in a key route for trade among Asia, the Mideast and Europe. Those vessels have included at least one with cargo for Iran, its main benefac-

Meanwhile, the U.S. military's Central Command reported it carried out five airstrikes targeting Houthi military equipment. Those strikes targeted mobile anti-ship cruise missiles, an explosive-carrying drone boat and an "unmanned underwater vessel," Central Command said.

"This is the first observed Houthi employment of a UUV since attacks began in Oct. 23," Central Command said.

Six killed, 30 trapped in Afghanistan avalanche: provincial official

KABUL, Feb 19 (Agencies): An avalanche has killed at least six people and trapped 30 more in the eastern Afghan province of Nuristan, a provincial official said on Monday, after swaths of the country saw heavy snowfall.

"It is still snowing. Rescue efforts are under way and the number of dead may increase," provincial head of information and culture Jamiullah Hashimi told agency.

The avalanche swept through the village of Nakre in the Tatin Valley of Nuristan overnight on Sunday, blanketing homes in snow and

Around 20 houses were destroyed or heavily damaged, Hashimi added.

"Due to clouds and rain, the helicopter cannot land in Nuristan," said Maulvi Mohammad Nabi Adel, the head of public works in the



province, adding that snow had blocked one of the main roads into the province, making "the rescue operation

difficult". Nuristan province. which borders Pakistan, is mostly covered by mountainous forests and hugs the southern end of the Hindu Kush mountain range.

This year, the arrival of snow was delayed across much of Afghanistan, which is accustomed to harsh winters.

The exceptionally low level of rain in a country that relies heavily on agriculture has forced many farmers to delay planting.

Afghanistan is one of the world's poorest countries, wracked by decades of war, prone to natural disasters and vulnerable to extreme weather events linked to climate change.

Once flush with humanitarian aid following the US-led invasion of the country, funding to Afghanistan has plummeted since the Taliban returned to power in mid-2021, in part over the many restrictions it imposed

on women.

Bilawal Bhutto says he rejected power-sharing formula offered by Nawaz Sharif's party over prime minister's post to respect people's mandate

KARACHI, Feb 19 (Agencies): Pakistan People's Party (PPP) Chairman Bilawal Bhutto-Zardari has revealed that he said "No" to a power-sharing formula in which the prime minister's post would be shared between his and former premier Nawaz Sharif's parties, as he did not want to take up the top post without the people's mandate.

The 35-year-old former foreign minister was the prime ministerial face of the PPP. However, in the February 8 elections, his party came third with 54 seats in the National Assembly, behind more than 90 seats won byindependents backed by jailed prime minister Imran Khan's Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) and Nawaz Sharif's Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N).

To form a govern-



ment, a party must win 133 seats out of 265 contested seats in the 266-member National

Assembly. The PPP and PML-N, who have formed a postpoll alliance, have failed to reach a consensus on a power-sharing formula despite several meetings between their top leadership.

Addressing a Yaumi-Tashakur (Thanksgiving Day) rally in Thatta to celebrate the PPP's election victory in Sindh province, Bilawal said, "I was told (by PML-N) that let us be the prime minister for three years and then you can take the premiership for the remaining two years."

"I said no to this. I said I do not want to be a prime minister like this." he said. "If I become the prime minister, it would be after the people of Pakistan elect me." Without taking any names, Bilawal said the party had decided that it would move forward with "those who have asked for its votes" and would not seek any min-

Bilawal also said his father Asif Ali Zardari

would be the PPP's candidate for president, insisting that the former president would play his role to defuse political tension.

"To control the fire spreading in the country, we have decided that Zardari will be our candidate for the presidential election. And when he takes up the post, he will put out this fire, and will save the Centre and the provinces," he said.

He said the country needed a political party that talked about people's problems, adding that the brewing economic and political crisis had divided society.

"What should happen is that politicians and all political parties should think about the people of this country instead of focusing on their personal benefit," Bilawal stressed.

He claimed that a PTIbacked candidate was made to win against a PPP leader.

He said the PPP had decided to collect the election complaints of party workers from all over the country and raise them at appropriate forums. "If we are unsuccessful, we will come to you and protest together," he said.

Bilawal appealed to all the political parties to "stay within the system" and work for the coun-

try's betterment. Reacting to Bilawal's comments. PML-N leader Ishaq Dar stressed that it was not appropriate to divulge details about talks between the parties vying to form the next government.

He insisted that the PPP chairman had made the time-sharing formula public but "that was just one aspect and there can be more formulas".

"Stop Harassing Chinese **Students For No Reason": China Urges US**

BEIJING, Feb 19 (Agencies): China's public security minister urged the US homeland security secretary to stop alleged "harassment" of Chinese students entering the United States in a meeting between the two in Vienna, Beijing's state media reported Monday.

In a readout of talks Sunday between Wang Xiaohong and Alejandro Mayorkas, Beijing urged Washington "to stop harassing and checking Chinese students for no apparent reason", state news agency Xinhua said.

Beijing has repeatedly alleged that Chinese nationals with valid travel documents have been subject to aggressive interrogations and deportations at US airports, with its embassy in Washington last month urging Chinese travellers to avoid the capital's Dulles

In his meeting with Mayorkas, Wang urged the United States to "ensure that Chinese citizens enjoy fair entry treatment and full dignity," according

Wang also pressed Mayorkas to "rectify" the US decision to place China on a list of major countries transiting or

producing narcotics

US officials have long charged that China is complicit in the trade of fentanyl, which is many times more powerful than heroin and is responsible for more than 70,000 overdose deaths a year in the United States.

Last month in Beijing, US and Chinese officials agreed to cooperate to curb the production of ingredients to make fentanyl, known as precursor

A US readout of Sunday's talks said Wang and Mayorkas had held "candid and constructive discussion on the steps needed to combat the spread of precursor chemicals".

"The two sides also made commitments with respect to continued law enforcement cooperation, technical bilateral exchanges between scientists and other experts, scheduling of precursor chemicals, and furthering multilateral cooperation," it said.

Washington and Beijing also discussed expanding cooperation "in the fight to protect children from online child sexual exploitation and abuse", the readout added.

Lightning bolt scorches four people near Sydney **Opera House**

SYDNEY, Feb 19 (Agencies): A lightning bolt scorched and knocked out four people near the Sydney Opera House on Monday as they sheltered under a tree during a violent electrical storm, rescue officials said.

The four were struck beneath the tree in the Botanic Gardens, ambulance workers said, just a stone's throw from the harbourside architectural master-

"They all had a brief loss of consciousness," said New South Wales ambulance service's Dominic

They also suffered burns and presented cardiac symptoms, he told reporters.

The victims -- two men and two women aged from their late teens to their 30s -- were treated at the scene by paramedics and taken to Sydney hospitals in a "serious and stable" condition, he said.



53 killed in fight between two tribes in Papua **New Guinea**



SYDNEY, Feb 19 (Agencies): At least 53 people were killed in tribal fighting in the northern highlands of Papua New Guinea, Australian Broadcasting Corporation (ABC) said on Monday, citing

local police. The men were killed in an ambush in Enga Province, according

to the Australian state broadcaster.

A report by local newspaper the Post-Courier said the violence took place on Sunday and was connected to a battle between two tribes.

"This is by far the largest (killing) I've seen in Enga, maybe in all of Highlands as well, in

Papua New Guinea," George Kakas, a senior officer in the country's police force, told the ABC.

The Pacific nation is home to hundreds of tribes, many of which still live in inhospitable and remote terrain.

The ABC said the latest violence involved the same tribes that were responsible for clashes that killed 60 in Enga Province last year.

"That is very disturbing the news that has come out of Papua New Guinea," Australia Prime Minister Anthony Albanese said in a radio interview on Monday.

"A multi-tier security setup has been put in place across Jammu for the Prime Minister's visit to the city of temples. The major focus of heightened security arrangements remains the venue of his public meeting and adjoining areas," a senior police officer said.

He said that a high alert had been sounded along the borders, while the border and highway grids were further strengthened with the officers asked to intensify patrolling and checking of vehicles to keep subversive elements at bay.

The officials said the Maulana Azad Stadium has been taken over by the security agencies who conducted a thorough antisabotage check. On February 17, Jammu District Magistrate Sachin Kumar Vaishya announced a temporary ban on the use of drones, paragliders and remote controlled micro-light aircrafts as a precautionary measure to counter possible activities by the terrorists and anti-national elements.

The order was issued under Section 144 of the Criminal Procedure Code while responding to intelligence reports highlighting potential security threats.

"Effective immediately and continuing until February 20, the order imposes restrictions on the operation of drones, remote-controlled micro-light aircrafts, para-gliders, para-motors, hand gliders and hot air balloons within the (Jammu)

district," the order said.

However, the order said exceptions to the ban include aerial surveillance conducted by the security forces during the VVIP visits or with specific written permission from the district magistrate's office.

"Defence and Para Military Forces are exempted from these restrictions. Violation of this order is subject to punitive action under section 188 of the Indian Penal Code," the order read.

Given the prediction of isolated to widespread rains in Jammu for the next 24 hours, a BJP spokesperson said that necessary arrangements, including waterproof tents, have been erected to accommodate one lakh people who are expected to turn up for the rally from across Jammu and Kashmir.

Govt, Ladakh delegation meet on issues of UT

Ladakh currently has one Lok Sabha constituency. Ladakh, which no longer has any MLA constituency, was part of Jammu and Kashmir state.

The erstwhile state was bifurcated on August 5, 2019, into two Union Territories — Jammu and Kashmir, and Ladakh.

Article 370, which gave special status to Jammu and Kashmir, was also abrogated on that day.

As per the provision of the Jammu and Kashmir Reorganisation Act, Jammu and Kashmir has been made a UT with a legislative assembly and Ladakh has been made a UT without any assembly.

There were four representatives from Ladakh in the erstwhile Jammu and Kashmir Assembly.

The Centre had assured the delegation from Ladakh in December last year that it

was committed to fast-track the development of the UT and to meet the aspirations of the people there.

The assurance was given at a meeting held with the High Powered Committee (HPC) for Ladakh headed by minister Rai. Sources said the 14-member delegation will on Monday press for their four-point demands before Rai and seek an early resolution of their issues.

The Ministry of Home Affairs had constituted the High Powered Committee for Ladakh under Rai's chairmanship with a mandate to discuss measures to protect the Ladakh region's unique culture and language taking into consideration its geographical location and strategic importance.

Also to ensure protection of land and employment, measures for inclusive development and employment generation in the region, measures related to empowerment of Ladakh Autonomous Hill Development Councils (LAHDCs) of Leh and Kargil and Constitutional safeguards that could be provided to ensure the measures and protection as mentioned above.

Several organisations of Ladakh were demanding a separate Union Territory for the region for decades and the demand was fulfilled on August 5, 2019, with the bifurcation of the erstwhile state of Jammu and Kashmir into the Union territories of Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh.

The KDA and the ABL, however, in the recent past protested at different locations, including New Delhi, Jammu and Ladakh, highlighting the four demands.

Most of the sectoral indices were trading in positive territory but with marginal gains as global cues remained weak. The biggest drag among all sectoral indices was the Nifty IT index, which fell nearly 1 per cent.

The weakness in IT stocks came after fresh US data dampened hopes of an early rate cut by the US Federal Reserve.



The top five gainers on the Nifty50 were Bajaj Auto, Bajaj Finance, ITC, Grasim and Adani Enterprises. On the other hand, the top losers were SBI Life, TCS, Apollo Hospitals, Wipro and LTIM.

Meanwhile, shares of digital payments firm Paytm jumped 5 per cent after the central bank provided relief to its associate, Paytm Payments Bank. On Friday, the RBI extended its earlier deadline of February 29 for the payments bank to stop key operations. The RBI has

now extended the deadline to March 15.

Deven Mehata, research analyst at Choice Broking, said, "With the support of FII's buying, we can expect Nifty to cross its all-time high levels. If Nifty closes above 22,125 we can expect the market to move higher towards 22,400-22,500 levels."

"Traders are advised to hold their long position with a trailing stop loss for the above given targets. On the lower side Nifty has a strong support at 21900 levels," he added.

After record win, Rohit Sharma backs team to succeed on any pitch

RAJKOT, Feb 19 (Agencies): Skipper Rohit Sharma stressed on the Indian team's ability to win games on any surface, including rank turners, following its record win over England. "We have won a lot of matches on such wickets before. The turning tracks and on pitches where the ball turns remain our strength. It gives us balance," Rohit said.

"We have given results for many years and we will get results in the future as well. But we don't have control over certain things — we don't discuss whether we want rank turners or not. We come here (at the venues) two days before the match and how much can we do anyway in two days? The curators decide and make the pitch. We have the strength to play on any wicket and win on it. When we won the Test in South Africa (at Cape Town), everyone knows what kind of wicket it was " he added

Rohit said the Indian team has



found a way through all conditions witnessed in the first three Tests. "(In) the last three Tests we played, there were different challenges. In the first Test (Hyderabad), the ball was spinning and the pitch was slow. In Vizag, it was (keeping) low. As the game progressed, the wicket became slower. Here, it played well for the first three days. Today, we saw that the

ball was turning and it was low. This is (in) the nature (of pitches), we get pitches like these in India. But if we get rank turners, we will play on them as well," he said.

India skipper Rohit Sharma credited the young and inexperienced members of his side for their role in delivering the team's

record Test win. "Obviously it's a very good feeling to win a game like that and especially with such a young team as well. (We had) two debutants (Sarfaraz Khan and Dhruv Jurel) and not a lot of Test matches amongst the playing eleven as well," Rohit said. "A lot of these guys are learning from the experience that they're having in the middle. We got to learn a lot about how we played in Hyderabad and then in Vizag when we won."

India vs England: Jasprit Bumrah likely to be rested, KL Rahul set to be available for Ranchi Test

NEW DELHI, Feb 19 (Agencies): Premier fast bowler Jasprit Bumrah is likely to be rested for the fourth Test of the ongoing 5-match series between India and England as the team management is keen on managing his workload. The development comes a day after India hammered England by 434 runs in the third Test in Rajkot and took a 2-1 lead in the series.

Jasprit Bumrah will not be traveling with the Indian team from Rajkot to Ranchi, a top source in the BCCI told India Today. Rohit Sharma and his men will travel to Ranchi on Tuesday.

On the other hand, KL Rahul is all set to return to action in the fourth Test, starting February 23 at the Jharkhand Cricket Association Stadium. Rahul had missed the second and the third Tests due to quadriceps strain. The star batter, who shone in the first Test in Hyderabad, was named in the squad for the last three Tests but was ruled out of the Rajkot Test in the eleventh hour after he failed to completely recover from the injury setback.

The Indian cricket board, in a statement, said that KL Rahul was 90 percent fit and that the team management

felt the star batter needed more time to completely recover from the quadriceps issue.

Captain Rohit Sharma, speaking to the press in Rajkot after India's 434run win, also gave a positive update on

Rahul's recovery from injury.

Jasprit Bumrah has been the leading wicket-taker in the ongoing Test series between India and England, claiming 17 wickets in three matches.

In fact, Bumrah had a great day out with the bat in Rajkot, scoring 26 runs off 28 balls on Day 2 to help India post 445 runs in the first innings.

The right-arm pacer claimed a wicket each in the two innings at the Niran-jan Shah Stadium, following up on his 9-wicket haul in Vizag and a 6-wicket haul in Hyderabad.

Bumrah's absence will present an opportunity for Mukesh Kumar to get a look in after he was released to play Ranji Trophy during the 3rd Test. India also handed a maiden Test call-up to Bengal pacer Akash Deep. The team management might also flirt with the idea of playing 4 spinners, if the conditions in Ranchi are conducive to spin

Sad Pacquiao accepts his Olympic dream is over

MANILA, Feb 19 (Agencies): A "saddened and disappointed" Manny Pacquiao conceded Monday his Olympic boxing dream was over after the ring great was denied a berth at this year's Paris games.

The International Olympic Committee rejected a special request for Pacquiao to take part, the Philippine Olympic Committee announced Sunday.

Pacquiao, 45, who hung up his gloves in 2021 before an unsuccessful presidential run, said he respected the decision of the IOC, which has an age limit of 40 for Olympic boxers.

"While I am very saddened and disappointed, I understand and accept the age-limit rules," said a statement from Pacquiao, who won world titles at eight different weights during a glittering professional ring career spanning more than a quarter of a century.

The Philippines last year asked the IOC for a "universality place" for Pacquiao, who has never boxed in the Olympics.

Universality places are usually awarded to athletes from smaller countries who struggle to secure slots in the Olympics through normal qualification.



Philippine Olympic Committee president Abraham Tolentino claimed Sunday the IOC decision would deprive the country of a "sure podium or first ever gold" in Olympic boxing.

Pacquiao said he will continue to support and cheer for Filipino athletes competing in the Olympics.

He also reminded his fans that despite his retirement, he intends "to bring pride and honour to my country inside the boxing ring in the near future".

A Pacquiao aide confirmed to reporters Monday that Pacquiao will fight Thai kickboxer Buakaw Banchamek in an April 20 exhibition match in Bangkok

April 20 exhibition match in Bangkok.
The match against Muay Thai great
Buakaw will be fought under international boxing rules, the aide said.

NBA All-Star Game: Damian Lillard stars as Eastern Conference beats Western Conference 211-186

INDIANAPOLIS, Feb 19 (Agencies): Milwaukee Bucks guard Damian Lillard scored 39 points and drained 11 three-pointers to lead the Eastern Conference to a record-setting 211-186 win over the Western Conference in the NBA All-Star Game on Sunday night in Indianapolis.

Lillard, 33, was named NBA All-Star Game MVP for the first time for his performance.

The Eastern Conference shattered the record for most points by a team in an All-Star Game. The previous mark was 196 points, which late Los Angeles Lakers great Kobe Bryant and the Western Conference notched during the 2016 All-Star Game.

Boston Celtics forward Jaylen Brown added 36 points on 15-for-23 shooting for the Eastern Conference in the win. Indiana Pacers guard Tyrese Haliburton finished with 32 points on 11-for-15 shooting to delight fans who watched him play on



his home court.

Karl-Anthony Towns of the Minnesota Timberwolves led the Western Conference with 50 points on 23-for-35 shooting. The Oklahoma City Thunder's Shai Gilgeous-Alexander tallied 31 points on 12-for-16 shooting, including a 7-for-10 mark from long distance.

The contest was dominated by 3-pointers and dunks, as neither side devoted much energy or attention to defense.

Eastern Conference shot 56.8

percent (83-for-146) from the field and 43.3 percent (42-for-97) from 3-point range. The Western Conference shot 55.9 percent (80-for-143) overall and 35.2 percent (25-for-71) from beyond the arc.

LeBron James made history by playing in his 20th All-Star Game. The 39-year-old surpassed fellow Los Angeles Lakers great Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, who earned 19 selec-

The career milestone did not

equate to a memorable performance on the court for James. He finished with eight points on 4-for-10 shooting, and he missed all three of his 3-point attempts.

The Eastern Conference led 104-89 at the half. Lillard had 22 points before the break, including a half-dozen 3-pointers, to help his team grab a 15-point lead.

Lillard maintained his hot hand in the second half. He drained a spot-up shot from halfcourt during the third quarter to make it 132-105.

After the shot swished through the basket, Lillard extended his arms into a full wingspan and walked back toward the defensive end.

The Eastern Conference scored at least 50 points in all four quarters.

The Western Conference scored 47 points in the first quarter, 42 in the second, 47 in the third and 50 in the fourth.

Simone Inzaghi Pushing Red-Hot Inter Milan To New Heights As Atletico Madrid Come To Town

MADRID. Feb 19 (Agencies): Simone Inzaghi is on the verge of a major breakthrough at Inter Milan as the Serie A leaders push towards the first Serie A title of his coaching career and eye another deep run in the Champions League. Inter are in red-hot form as they await the visit of Atletico Madrid on Tuesday, eight wins from eight in 2024 giving them the Italian Super Cup and a nine-point lead over Juventus in Italy's top flight -- with a game in hand. Inzaghi has long been viewed as a cup coach, one who can win the domestic knockout baubles but isn't capable of challenging for football's biggest prizes.

But last year's run to the Champions League final and their imperious current campaign in Serie A suggests that Inzaghi belongs at the top table.

Inter have two points fewer than reigning champions Napoli -- who charged to the Scudetto with five matches to spare -- did at the same point last season.

However Inter have scored a goal more and have a better goal difference than Napoli did after 24 games, on their way to finishing a trium-



phant season 16 points
