SRINAGAR, Feb 24 (Agencies): Renowned educationist and psychologist Prof Abdul Ghani Madhosh passed away on Saturday morning.

He was former Dean and Head school of Education, physical education, and former Director SRC Kashmir University.

His nimaz-e-jinazah will be performed at 10.30 am at his residence in Srinagar.

Prof. Madhosh has contributed immensely to the education policy and planning, both at the state and the national level.

Kupwara Admin seeks data for railway line extension survey

SRINAGAR, Feb 24 (Agencies): In a latest development vis-à-vis the extension of approximately 33.7 kilometer long railway line from Sopore to Kupwara under the Udhampur-Srinagar-Baramulla Rail Link (USBRL) project, the Kupwara administration has sought latest requisite data from various offices in the district for the purpose of 'Final Location Survey' (FLS) by the Railway authorities.

"Dy. Chief Engineer/ C-II, Northern Railway, USBRL Project, Banihal vide communication under reference has conveyed that Northern Railway is conducting the Final Location Survey (FLS) for extending the Railway Line from Sopore to Kupwara. An assessment of the anticipated traffic on this proposed new line has to be made as a part of the project report which will help in deciding the requisite infrastructure at various stations," reads a communiqué by ADC Kupwara to General Manager DIC, Chief Agricultural Officer, ARTO, Assistant Director FCS&CA, Area Marketing Officer, Deputy Registrar Cooperatives Society Kupwara and Executive Officer MC Kupwara/ Handwara/Langate.

"Now therefore, you are requested to provide latest data pertaining to your respective departments with regard to the population of the towns in the Project area and the transportation requirement for various commodities i.e

ECI takes strong exception to defiance of instructions on transfers, postings of officers in wake of anticipated LS Polls

SRINAGAR, Feb 24 (Agencies): Observing contravention to the instructions on transfers and postings of officers in wake of upcoming Lok Sabha polls, Election Commission of India has directed the offices concerned in all states and union territories to strictly adhere to and comply with the transfer policy instructed by the Commission.

Secretary, Ashwani Kumar Mohal, in a communiqué to Chief Sec-



retaries of all the States & Union Territories and Chief Electoral Officers of all the States & Union Territories that, "I am directed to refer to the

Commission's instruction of even number dated 21.12.2023 on the subject cited and to state that the said instruction clearly indi-

cated that the Commission has been following a consistent policy that officers connected with conduct of elections in an election going State/ UT are not posted in their home districts or places where they have served for considerably long period."

About 36% Rajya Sabha candidates declared criminal cases against themselves: ADR

NEW DELHI, Feb 24 (Agencies): "Thirty-six per cent of Rajya Sabha candidates have declared criminal cases against themselves while the average assets of candidates analysed stood at ₹127.81 crore," according to poll rights body Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR).

The ADR and the National Election Watch analysed the self-sworn affidavits of 58 out of the 59 candidates in the fray for 56 seats in 15 States. The Rajya Sabha polls are scheduled for February 27.

Congress candidate from Karnataka G. C. Chandrashekar was omitted from the analysis due to poorly scanned documents. The analysis found that 36% of the scrutinised candidates have declared criminal cases against themselves.

Additionally, 17% of these individuals face serious criminal charges with one candidate having cases related to attempted murder.

According to the analysis, eight (27%) out of 30 BJP candidates, six (67%) out of nine Congress candidates, one

(25%) out of four TMC candidates, two (67%) out of three SP candidates, one (33%) out of three YSRCP candidates, one (50%) out of two RJD nominees, one (50%) out of two BJD candidates, and one (100%) BRS candidate have declared criminal cases against themselves in their affidavits. Moreover, the analysis delved into the financial backgrounds of the candidates.

Approximately 21% of the candidates are billionaires, boasting of assets exceeding ₹100

Sub-zero night temp continue in Kashmir; minus 3.1°C in Srinagar, 9.0°C in Gulmarg

SRINAGAR, Feb 24 (Agencies): Freezing cold conditions continued in Kashmir Valley as Srinagar recorded minus 3.1°C on Saturday, officials said.

A meteorological department official here told GNS that Srinagar saw a fall of 0.5°C from previous night's minus 2.6°C and it was below normal by 4.0°C for the summer capital of J&K for this time of the year, he said.

Qazigund recorded a minimum of minus 3.0°C against minus 3.8°C on the previous night and it was 2.9°C below normal for the gateway town of Kashmir, the MeT official said.

Narco Terror Case | NIA attaches properties of 4 accused in Handwara; Seizes over 2 Cr Cash

SRINAGAR, Feb 24 (Agencies): The National Investigation Agency (NIA) on Saturday attached properties of four narco terror smugglers associated with Hizb-ul-Mujahideen and Lashkar-e-Taiba in Jammu & Kashmir's Handwara and Kupwara district. The properties were seized as part of a narco terror module probe.

The properties belong-

ing to the four accused have been attached in Handwara. The agency also seized a total of Rs 2.27 crore in cash under Section 25 of the UA(P) Act.

The immovable properties attached include the double-storeyed house belonging to once accused Afaq Ahmad Wani, a single-storeyed residence in the name of accused

Man gets four year imprisonment for raping minor girl in Kashmir

SRINAGAR, Feb 24 (Agencies): A fast-track court in Kulgam district of Jammu and Kashmir has sentenced a man to four years of rigorous imprisonment for raping a six-year-old girl.

According to media reports, additional sessions judge, fast track court, Kulgam Parvez Iqbal on Thursday held Sajad Ahmad Bhat guilty of raping the minor in his neighborhood in 2012.

The court also slapped Bhat with a fine of Rs 10,000. If the accused does not pay the fine, he will undergo a further imprisonment of six months, the reports added.

The state was represented by public prosecutor Zia ur Rehman while advocate Mohammad Shafi appeared for the accused.

EDITORIAL

GURU RAVIDAS JAYANTI

T t is said that when Ravidas ji was born on the full moon day of Magh month, it was a Sunday, due to which he was named Ravidas. He was born on the full moon day of Magha month. Saint Ravidas was born on Magh Purnima in 1376 AD, in Gobardhanpur village in Varanasi city of Uttar Pradesh. His mother's name was Karma Devi (Kalsa) and father's name was Santokh Das (Raghu). His grandfather's name was Shri Kaluram ji and grandmother's name Lakhpati ji. His wife's name was Lonaji and the son's name was Shrivijay Das ji. Ravidas ji cobbler being from a clan, he used to make shoes. They worked with full dedication and hard work. He was born at a time when North India

when there was Mughal rule in some areas, atrocities all around, poverty, corruption and illiteracy were prevalent. At that time, efforts were made by Muslim rulers to convert Hindus into Muslims. Saint ravidas's fame was continuously increasing due to which there were lakhs of his devotees which included people of every caste. Seeing everything, a learned Muslim 'Sadna Peer' told him to become Muslim. He thought that if Ravidas becomes a Muslim, millions of his devotees will also become Muslim. Thinking like this, he attack them in every way. Pressure was created but Saint Ravidas was a saint. He was concerned with humanity and not with any Hindu or Muslim. Saint Ravidasji was very kind and charitable. Saint Ravidas, through his couplets and verses, removed caste based discrimination in the society, laid emphasis on social unity and laid the foundation of humanistic values. Ravidasji wrote directly that 'Raidas, no one is despicable by birth, no man is despicable, he is despicable by his deeds', that is, any person is despicable only by his deeds. The person who does wrong things is despicable. No person is ever inferior by birth. Saint Ravidas has used the Braj language of the common people for his poems. Besides, it also contains a mixture of words from Awadhi, Rajasthani, Khari Boli and Rekhta i.e. Urdu-Persian. About forty verses of Ravidasji have also been included in 'Guru Granth Sahib', the holy scripture of Sikhism. It is said that Swami Ramanandacha-

rya is a great saint of Vaishnav Bhakti sect. Saint Ravidas was his disciple. Saint Ravidas is considered a contemporary and Gurubhai of Saint Kabir. I was moved to tears during the dramatic "vastaharan" scene -- the turning point in the epic. Ironically, we have two extraordinary, indomitable women -- Sita and Draupadi -- symbols of courage and resilience. Both deserve our veneration and respect. Instead, we are busy creating leonine separations in zoos!

A social environment that encourages puerile "controversies" instead of throwing them into the dustbin indicates a political hawa that's sympathetic towards any and every matter which can be manipulated to generate suspicion and hate between communities. People who claim that things are not soooooo bad need a reality check. In our zeal to reclaim what we perceive as our lost legacy, we are encouraging bigotry and feeding into hate. Political philosopher and Harvard professor Michael Sandel, often described as an intellectual "with the global profile of a rock star", says: "As an interested outside observer, I'm struck by the deep polarisation in India now...'

Inciting riots is the job of hired goons without anything at stake -- not even their own lives. These are professional rioters, paid to generate trouble. Some of them double up as actors, donning different costumes, assuming identities and parroting lines given to them by riot organisers, who in turn are agents of different political parties. Social media manipulation has never been as easy. Anybody with a smartphone can shoot potentially dangerous videos narratives that are neither accurate nor authentic. But hey -- does anyone bother to cross-check?

Skewered takes on practically anything and everything have swamped and choked the social media. Deepfakes and AI-generated material are so rampant that it's near impossible to counter them. If even top stars like Vidya Balan and others have to invest time, money and energy to protect their reputations in the aftermath of scams featuring them, imagine the rest of us. A single line plucked out of a long podcast can so easily be converted into a mega controversy with just a super-imposed, inflammatory heading. We live in a post-truth era where diminishing attention spans lead to massive misrepresentation and conjecture. Political parties pounce on exactly these golden opportunities to shame their critics/opponents. No point whining about it, since there's little or nothing that can be done to actually prevent such blatant misrepresentation in future.

"Sarvapratham Bharat" is here. "INDIA" doesn't count. The mother and son (Sonia and Rahul) are stuck in quicksand. Rats have abandoned the sinking Congress ship and been welcomed by the BJP. In 1957, Chairman Mao Zedong urged his countrymen to "let a hundred flowers bloom... and a hundred schools of thought contend". Ostensibly, the Chinese intelligentsia were invited to publicly criticise the political system... but it turned out to be a deadly trap to flush out and identify all the dissidents. Those who aired anti-Mao views were executed. A lesson worth remembering as thousands of lotuses bloom across India.

masked villain mugs a London tourist and takes his twenty-five-thousand-pound Rolex watch. He justifies his action saying" "This fellow has a French villa, three Rolls-Royces and a yacht. I live in a hovel, don't have an income and so need his watch more than he does." How would you respond?

You might say: "These are the inevitable inequalities of our world. That doesn't justify your crime."

Suppose he then quotes Proudhon: that "all proper tea is theft". (You've got that wrong, you idiot. Proudhon said: "All property is theft!" --Ed. Sorry yaar, wretched predictive text... --fd) Or you may think this thief is working towards correcting the crass injustice of this world where people don't get rich by working hard, but by making other people work hard. Or by

Sunoch did.

These thoughts, gentle reader, are prompted by a couple of experiences. The first was, I can proudly say, watching the documentary made for the BBC by my daughter Tir Dhondy. It was about the Rolex thieves and Tir boldly interviewed several of these face-masked, anonymous

muggers and snatchers who spoke in great detail and quite menacingly about their operations.

They work in gangs and in several of the sequences in which Tir confronted them, alone or in clusters, they carried weapons -guns, machetes and knives. She asked one of them whether he had any qualms about stealing a Rolex watch from an old, helpless lady. His reply, if I remember right was something like "It's my job, morality doesn't come into it, and if it did, I wouldn't be doing what I do."

Of course, several friends who saw the documentary remarked how courageous Tir was to get immersed in this murky and multi-million-pound criminal world. A jeweller from whom I bought a modestly-priced bracelet for Tir -- no! not as a reward for being courageous, but for her thirtieth birthday -- told me that there were diamond-studded gold Rolex watches worth millions of pounds. The one on his wrist may not have been one of those, but it did look large and expensive. As we talked, I pulled the sleeve of my jacket adequately over my right wrist to cover my nineteen-pound watch. I might add that I am not in the least ashamed of this instrument as it tells the time accurately, is absolutely water-proof as it

resists being dipped in baths and swimming pools and doesn't bore me or anyone else by telling me how much money I spent at the bar a few minutes ago or switching on the drawing-room lights without my going to the switch on the wall. Those functions, which other watch-owners boast about, strike me as a form of idleness.

The second trigger for these recollections of the criminal dialogue was an encounter with a rich young British Indian lady who lives occasionally in London and says she despairs at the amount of street crime on central London's streets. She had several anecdotes of her friends, or acquaintances of friends, being mugged in open daylight for the earrings, necklaces or expensive watches they were wearing. She said she was very wary of going out onto London's streets with any forcibly transferable adornment.

I have a lady friend who was mugged a few yards from her home in south-east London. She has long been a resident of south-east London and not a rich visitor. It was in the day-time when a young man passing her, riding a bicycle on the pavement, suddenly called her attention saying she'd dropped something. She looked down and was certain she hadn't, but as her

attention was on the pavement behind her, he snatched the two necklaces she was wearing and swiftly pedalled away.

The first young lady, who was wary of the London streets, insisted that London was now the most street-crime-ridden city in the world. I am not used to reaching for my mobile phone and checking on the Internet if this sort of statement can be substantiated or is manifestly false, so I didn't contradict her. She was of the opinion that the mayor of London, Sadiq Khan, was responsible for this rise in crime. In fact, the 2023 figures for street crime are higher than those in 2021, but they are still lower than those for 2018. They've fallen since. (OK. I did look it up later on my computer).

This prepossessing young lady is not alone in blaming Sadiq who does, with the home secretary, have some responsibility for, but limited powers of control over, the Metropolitan Police. Sadiq has for the past few months convened consultations on renaming branches of the network of the city railways, known as the "OVERGROUND". From autumn this year, he has concluded, sections of this network will be called names such as The Windrush Line, The Suffragette Line, etc.

'No justice, no closure': Family of Jaahnavi Kandula as US police officer is let off the hook

HYDERABAD, Feb 24: With the Seattle police officer who struck her with his vehicle off the hook, the family of Jaahnavi Kandula called the news "devastating".

A family member told The Indian Express, "First they joked about it, now the officer responsible has been let off. There is no justice and no closure for us. It is devastating."

Jaahnavi was killed on January 5 last year when a police car driven by officer Kevin Dave struck her near Northeastern University's Seattle campus. She was 23 and was pursuing a MS in Information Systems. In September, an audio emerged wherein an officer investigating the case could be heard joking about her death, and saying it had limited value and a cheque for \$11,000 would suffice.

Hailing from Halvi village in Kowthalam Mandal of Kurnool district, Jahnavi's parents live in Adoni, where her mother K Vijayalakshmi was a school teacher while her father K Srikanth had retired from



the police department. "We keep receiving one bad news after another about the case," said a family member. Her mother has withdrawn into a shell while her sister remains traumatised, the family said. Hailing from a middle-

class family, Jahnavi first studied at a government school before joining the Dr Jyothirmayi Degree College at Adoni. She completed her B.Com in 2019 and went to the US in September 2020 to pursue the two-vear MS course, which was to finish in December. BRS chief KTR also posted on social media, calling the decision "disgraceful and absolutely unacceptable". In his tweet, he demanded that the Indian Embassy take up the matter with US authorities and deliver justice to the family.

Land grabbed from Sandeshkhali villagers be returned immediately: **DYFI** leader Mukherjee

KOLKATA, Feb 24 (Agencies): DYFI West Bengal state secretary Minakshi Mukherjee on Saturday demanded that land grabbed from villagers in Sandeshkhali region of North 24 Parganas district be returned immediately.

Mukherjee, who reached river-bounded Sandeshkhali using a detour to avoid detection by the administration, was stopped by the police and taken to Sandeshkhali ferry ghat on the banks of River Kalagachi.

"We want the administration to immediately take steps to give back agricultural land of the villagers, which were grabbed by TMC leaders Shajahan Sheikh, Shiba Prasad Hazra and Uttam Sardar and were turned into water bodies for fish farming," she said.

She claimed that people want the arrest and prosecution of Sheikh, Hazra, Sardar and also some police personnel who allegedly did not pay heed to complaints against these TMC leaders by the affected villagers.

"I have been told that I cannot move around since prohibitory orders under Section 144 of CrPC are in force in the area." Mukheriee. the leader of CPI(M)'s youth wing in the state, told reporters at Sandeshkhali

She said that while ruling party leaders were being allowed to move around Sandeshkhali, opposition leaders were being stopped from interacting with the affected villagers.

"Ministers Sujit Bose and Partha Bhowmick are from the same party as Shajahan Sheikh," she said, while refusing to leave the area.

Bose and Bhowmick visited Sandeshkhali on Saturday and went around some villages.

"I have come here as the state's irrigation minister and not as a political leader," Bhowmick said, reacting to Mukherjee's charge.

The DYFI leader asked why lands snatched from the villagers were not returned at the state government's Duare Sarkar programme held regularly at various places in the state with the aim of bringing government services to the doorsteps of people.

ED files new case against TMC's Sandeshkhali strongman Shahjahan Sheikh, searches 6 locations linked to him



KOLKATA, Feb 24 (Agencies) The Enforcement Directorate (ED) on Friday filed a fresh case against Trinamool Congress (TMC) leader Shahjahan Sheikh in an old cheating case related to land encroachment and conducted searches across West Bengal at several locations linked to his associates.

Sheikh, an influential TMC leader from Sandeshkhali, has been on the run since January 5 when ED officials who had gone to raid his house were attacked and chased away.

According to ED sources, searches are being held at six places, including Kolkata, Howrah and North 24 Parganas, at the houses of businessmen and others "close" to Sheikh. Around 7 am on Friday,

ED officials accompa-

nied by central forces began searches at the house of businessman Parthapratim Sengupta in Haldarpara, Howrah. Locals claimed that Sengupta traded in shrimp and fish along with running other businesses. Businessman Arup Som's house in Vijaygarh in Kolkata is also being searched. ED sources said these traders were in the import-export business and Sheikh was in touch with them.

Sheikh and his close associates have been accused of building fisheries and chicken farms by encroaching upon land in Sandeshkhali and have been accused of not paying villagers for the lease of fish stocks. Friday's searches are part of the ED's investigation into 'irregularities' in the import-export business

and a fresh Enforcement Case Information Report (ECIR) has been registered, sources said. Investigators are looking into whether money from the alleged land-grabbing was invested in the importexport business, whether fish and other items were exported illegally etc, sources added.

Sandeshkhali has been witnessing widespread protests against local strongman Sheikh from the beginning of February, with women accusing his close aides Uttam Sardar and Shivprasad Hazra of sexual harassment. The protests have led to the TMC and the BJP taking potshots at each other even as the police are trying to restore peace in the area. While

Sardar and Hazra have

been arrested, Sheikh is

still at large.

BJP will win all 25 Lok Sabha seats in Rajasthan: Gajendra Singh Shekhawat

(Agencies): Union Jal Shakti Minister Gajendra Singh Shekhawat has exuded confidence in the BJP winning all 25 seats of Rajasthan in the upcoming Lok Sabha elections.

The Union minister also expressed confidence of the BJP-led NDA forming the government at the Centre with a strong majority.

Shekhawat said whether it is construction of the Ram Mandir, the abrogation of Article 370 or resolving the issue of Eastern Rajasthan Canal Project, it may indirectly benefit the BJP in the elections but the party does this work not for votes but to change the

lives of the people. "I do not see any challenge in winning 25 out of 25 seats in the state. The trend of forming a government with absolute majority since 2014 is there," Shekhawat told PTI videos here.

"As far as elections are concerned, the BJP is not a party with a machine to win the elections but the BJP is a party which has been continuously increas-



ing its presence since its inception by being active on issues of social concern, national importance and local issues," he added.

Shekhawat said the "result of BJP workers" continuous struggle was that we uprooted the Congress".

"On the basis of the same confidence, I can say that the way BJP worked to change the country under the leadership of the prime minister, it will again win with a huge majority," he said, adding the NDA will cross the 400mark this time.

Shekhawat further said for the BJP, the issues of Ram Mandir and abrogation of Article 370 are not for gaining election benefits.

"It may be possible to get benefits from it indirectly in the elections, but these are being used for the benefit of the elections. The commitment of the BJP is to work to bring change in the lives of people," he added.

Attacking former chief minister Ashok Gehlot, Shekhawat alleged that the Congress leader only did politics on the Eastern Rajasthan Canal Project (ERCP) issue.

When asked whether he will contest the Lok Sabha elections from Jodhpur this time also, Shekhawat said it is for the BJP to decide because "there is no tradition in the party that we decide who will get ticket".

Two years of Ukraine-Russia war: Can Kyiv sustain the fight against the Kremlin?

(Agencies): The future looks bleak for war-weary Ukraine: It is beset by shortages in soldiers and ammunition, as well as doubts about the supply of Western aid. Ukrainian forces also face a Russian enemy that has recently seized the initiative on the battlefield.

Two years after Russia's full-scale invasion captured nearly a quarter of the country, the stakes could not be higher for Kyiv. After a string of victories in the first year of the war, fortunes have turned for the Ukrainian military, which is dug in, outgunned and outnumbered against a more powerful opponent. As the war enters its

third year, here is a look at the situation on the ground, the challenges ahead and some of the potential consequences if Ukraine does not acquire the people, ammunition and assistance it needs to sustain the fight.

What is the state of play?

Triumphs have turned to attrition for Ukraine along the snaking front line in the country's east. With Russia gaining advantages, shortages mounting and a major military shakeup still fresh, questions abound about whether Kyiv can keep going.

As things stand, neither side has won. Neither side has lost. Neither side is anywhere near giving up. And both sides have pretty much exhausted the manpower and equipment that they started the war with, said Gen. Richard Barrons, a British military officer who is co-chair of a defence consultancy.

Ukraine suffered setbacks after the muchanticipated summer counteroffensive failed to produce any breakthroughs. The armed forces switched to a defensive posture in the fall to repel new advances from Moscow.



On February 17, Russian forces took control of the embattled city of Avdiivka, where Kyiv's troops were under constant fire with Russians approaching from three directions. Ukrainian commanders had complained for weeks of personnel and ammunition shortages. It was the biggest battlefield victory for Russia since the fight for Bakhmut, and it confirmed that Moscow's offensive was gaining steam.

Away from the battlefield, Ukraine has proven successful in the Black Sea, where it has used long-range weapons to strike military installations in Crimea and maritime drones to sink Russian warships. Ukraine has disabled a third of the Black Sea Fleet, according to the Atlantic Council.

Ukraine is looking to acquire more longrange missiles to strike deep into Russianoccupied territory, a move that some European countries fear may spark escalation from Moscow.

How many people have been killed?

Both Russia and Ukraine have sought to keep casualty figures under wraps.

Few details about Ukrainian military deaths have emerged since the full-scale invasion began in 2022. But it's clear that tens of thousands of Ukrainian civilians have been

Without more soldiers, Ukraine's defensive lines will be overstretched and more vulnerable to Russian attack, especially if Moscow launches intense multi-pronged assaults along the 1,000-kilometre (620mile) front line.

The Ukrainian military has an average personnel shortage of 25 per cent across brigades, according to lawmakers. Military commanders are unable to give their soldiers enough rest, and Russia has recently increased the tempo of attacks. As a result, soldiers are tired - and more easily injured exacerbating the effects of the shortage.

Ukraine's military command has said 4,50,000 to 5,00,000 additional recruits are needed for the next phase of the war. Even if Ukraine succeeds in mobilising that number, which is unlikely, it still would not be able to match the manpower of Russia, which has more than three times Ukraine's population.

Lawmakers have spent months mulling over a controversial proposal to increase the conscription pool, as many Ukrainian men continue to evade the war in Ukrainian cities.

Commanders say they don't have enough men to dig trenches or carry out offensive operations. Shortages have also required them to

on preserving the lives of the soldiers they do have, sometimes at the expense of holding territory

What about weapons and ammunition?

If they continue, ammunition shortages will jeopardise Ukraine's ability to hold territory and keep soldiers alive.

Military leaders

appear to be rationing shells, sending trickles of ammunition to firing positions to preserve stockpiles, while promises for more ammunition from Western allies have gone unfulfilled. The European Union failed on its promise to deliver 1 million rounds by the start of the year, delivering only a few hundred thousand.

At the same time, Russia is mobilising its defence industry and may soon be able to fire 5,000 artillery rounds a day, Barrons said. Ukraine is building up its domestic arms production but will not be able to match Moscow in scale in the short-term.

Military commanders have complained for months of ammunition shortages for infantry fighting vehicles, machine guns, artillery and multiple rocket launch systems. Those shortages grew particularly acute by the end of 2023, with some artillery commanders saying they can meet only 10 per cent of ammunition

needs.

Commanders say long-range artillery in particular serves two important purposes: first, it acts as a protective umbrella to cover infantry, allowing them to hold territory and prepare for offensive operations. Second, by striking Russian troops and heavy weaponry from a distance, artillery prevents planned assaults by seriously degrading

Moscow's capabilities. Without it, Ukraine will increasingly come under the pressure of Russia's relentless artillery barrages. Com-

manders say their soldiers have no choice but to dig in deeper to hold their lines.

Is western support waning, and what if it does?

Ukraine is reliant on western allies and international organisations not just for military aid but also for financial support and humanitarian help.

Without western assistance, Ukraine will not have the weapons, ammunition and training it needs to sustain the war effort, nor will it be able to keep its battered economy afloat or reach Ukrainians trapped in the crossfire of battles.

Between divisions about the future of aid within the EU and \$60 billion in military aid languishing in the United States Congress, western countries have not been as forthcoming with money this year.

Kyiv breathed a sigh of relief in February when the EU approved extending a 50-billioneuro (\$54-billion) aid package for Ukraine after resistance from Hungary. That money is meant to support the economy and rebuild the country, not to fight Russia.

But it's the US funding that many Ukrainian leaders are waiting for. The funds will enable Ukraine to purchase weapons and equipment from American firms, access more military training and intelligence sharing, and bolster air and sea defences. The money will also provide direct budget support for Kyiv.

Ukrainian leaders also need western help to cover the salaries of public servants and medical workers.

On the humanitarian side, the United Nations and its partner agencies said if an appeal for \$3.1 billion in new funding for the year is not fulfilled, the UN won't be able to meet the basic needs of 8.5 million Ukrainians living on the front line.

Sanrio Puroland in Tama notified the public about the hazardous object in a statement on its website: "We will be temporarily closed today as we are unable to adequately ensure the safety of our customers, performers and on-site staff at this time".

Located in Tama, the Sanrio Puroland Park brought the police up to speed at 9 am local time about the warning issued to them via e-mail. It highlighted the presence of 'hazardous' objects at the park premises.

The following reports from public broadcaster NHK confirmed that the



police hadn't discovered anything suspicious at the park after scouring it. Authorities have yet to identify the e-mail's sender.

Tokyo's Hello Kitty theme park

Hello Kitty represents an anthropomorphised white cat, a widely known fictional character. Yuko Shimizu created it originally. The Japanese entertainment company Sanrio owns the character as its creative entity.

The indoor Tokyo theme park, Sanrio Puroland, is also known as Hello Kitty Land. Located in the Tokyo suburb of Tama, this park opened in 1990.

Like how Disney theme parks host their customers, the Japanese centre of attraction is dedicated to many exclusive characters such as My Melody, Cinnamoroll, Gudetama, Pochacco, Keroppi and others. It was temporarily closed during the COVID-19 pandemic in

The Hello Kitty Park offers numerous cutesy attractions, including rides, walkthrough centres, food factory displays, game corners, several parades and stage shows, and even a fireworks spectacle.

Donald Trump says his criminal indictments boosted his appeal to Black voters

NEW YORK, Feb 24 (Agencies): Former President Donald Trump claimed on Friday that his four criminal indictments have boosted his support among Black Americans because they see him as a victim of discrimination, comparing his legal jeopardy to the historic legacy of anti-Black prejudice in the US legal system.

Trump argues he is the victim of political persecution, even though there is no evidence President Joe Biden or White House officials influenced the filing of 91 felony charges against

Earlier in the week, Trump compared himself to Alexei Navalny, Russian President Vladimir Putin's top domestic rival, who died in a remote Arctic prison after being jailed by the Kremlin leader.

"I got indicted for nothing, for something that is nothing," Trump told a black-tie event for Black conservatives in South



Carolina ahead of Saturday's Republican primary.

"And a lot of people said that's why the Black people like me, because they have been hurt so badly and discriminated against, and they actually viewed me as I'm being discriminated against. It's been pretty amazing but possibly, maybe, there's something there." Trump has centred his third campaign for the White House on his grievances against Biden and what he alleges is a "deep state" targeting him, even as he faces charges from his efforts to overturn the 2020 election, keeping classified documents at his Florida estate, and allegedly arranging payments to a porn actress. He is the dominant Republican front-runner. as many GOP voters echo his beliefs, and is favoured to soundly beat former UN Ambassador Nikki Haley in her home state.

Trump noted the mug shot taken by Georgia authorities after he was indicted on state racketeering charges over the 2020 election.

"When I did the mug shot in Atlanta, that mug shot is No. 1," he said, adding: "You know who embraced it more than anyone else? The Black population." Trump's campaign has predicted he can do better with Black voters in November than he did four years ago, citing Biden's faltering poll numbers with Black adults and what Trump sees as advantages on issues like the economy and the recordhigh number of people crossing the US-Mexico border, often ending up in cities with large Black populations.

Navalny aides say Russian authorities give mother 3-hour ultimatum over burial

LONDON, Feb 24 (Agencies): A spokeswoman for the late Alexei Navalny said on Friday that Russian authorities had told his mother he would be buried in the penal colony where he died unless she agreed within three hours to lay him to rest without a public funeral.

Navalny, the bestknown political opponent of President Vladimir Putin, died suddenly a week ago in the Arctic penal colony where he had been serving sentences totalling more than 30 years.

His mother Lyudmila, 69, has been demanding for days that authorities hand over his body to be buried in a way that will allow his friends, family and supporters to pay their respects.

Navalny's spokeswoman Kira Yarmysh posted on X: "An hour ago, an investigator called Alexei's mother and gave her an ultimatum. Either she agrees within three hours to a secret funeral without a public farewell, or Alexei will be buried in the penal colony."

Yarmysh said Navalny's mother was refusing and continuing to demand that his body be handed to her. There was no immediate comment from the authori-

Navalny's family and supporters have accused Putin of having him killed, an accusation that the Kremlin has angrily rejected. He had survived a poisoning attempt in 2020 and years of harsh treatment in prison, including long spells in solitary confinement

Rights group OVD-Info says 400 people were detained in the days following Navalny's death for trying to commemo-

rate it in public. In a 95-second video released on Thursday, Lyudmila Navalnaya said authorities were trying to "blackmail" and threaten her into agreeing to a non-public burial, something she said she would not

accept.

"They want this (burial) to be done secretly, with no farewell. They want to bring me to the edge of a cemetery, to a fresh grave and say: here lies your son. I don't agree to this." she said.

"I want you, who cared about Alexei, and for whom his death was a personal tragedy, to have an opportunity to say goodbye to him," she added, addressing Navalny supporters in Russia

Navalny's aide Ivan Zhdanov said Lyudmila's lawyers had filed a legal complaint alleging "violation of the body of a deceased person". He also offered a

reward to members of the security establishment in return for information about what he called Navalny's murder.

"If you still have any trace of humanity, stop taunting his mother and return the body of her son to her," said Evgenia Kara-Murza, wife of opposition politician Vladimir Kara-Murza, who is serving a 25-year sentence in Siberia on

charges, including treason, that he has denied. Journalist Dmitry Muratov, a winner of the Nobel Peace Prize, posted on X, "Just give Lyudmila Ivanovna her son. Just give him back."

Belarusian Nobel literature prize winner Svetlana Alexievich posted: "I want to appeal not only to the Kremlin. I want to ask all people, all of us - keep on saying and saying that they must give back the body to his mother." A Russian fact-check-

ing organisation said it had uncovered a fake audio message being circulated on social media and reported by some news outlets that purported to be a statement from Navalny's mother accusing his wife Yulia of unseemly behaviour since his death. Yulia and her daughter Dasha on Thursday met U.S. President Joe Biden, who called Navalny "a man of incredible courage" and has said he holds Putin responsible for his death.

Nikki Haley mocks Trump and Biden's age during final pitch to home crowd ahead of South Carolina Primary

NEW YORK, Feb 24 (Agencies): Before the South Carolina Primary in her home state, GOP presidential hopeful Nikki Haley made her last pitch to the voters in Mount Pleasant on Friday. She attacked her main rival Donald Trump and claimed that she was the only one who could beat President Biden in the general election. The former governor of South Carolina, said to the crowd, "The best America can do is two candidates in their 80s?" She was referring to Trump, who is 77, and Biden, who is 81.

"We need someone who can do eight years of hard work day and night, getting the job done for the American people. No drama, no vendettas," she added.

According to the latest polls, Haley is trailing Trump by 28 points in South Carolina. But her campaign manager Betsy Ankney said in a call with reporters on Friday morning that Haley would not give up



and would fight on until Super Tuesday. Ankney stated, "As we

look to the path ahead, we know that this is an uphill battle. We know that the road is difficult. We know that the math is challenging, but this has never just been about who can win a Republican primary this battle is about who can win in November, defeat the Democrats and finally get our coun-

marks. We won't start now. Once again, she made very clear in her speech on Tuesday that we are marching on and that's what we intend to do," she continued.

Some of Haley's supporters in South Carolina said that they wanted Haley to stay in the race in case something happened to Trump, such as getting "locked up" or having a health issue. But they also admitted that they did not expect

her to win. Meanwhile, Rep. Dean Phillips (D-Minn.), who is challenging Biden for the Democratic nomination, said on Friday that he was open to the idea of running as an independent with Haley as his running mate.

He said, "I think it's a conversation that Ambassador Haley and I should have if that's what this comes down to." Phillips had a strong showing in New Hampshire, where he got more than 20% of the vote and Biden was not on the ballot.



"EYES WIDE OPEN: STORY OF TIRANGA IN KASHMIR"

JAMMU, Feb 24: "Eyes Wide Open: Story of Tiranga in Kashmir," is among the latest books written by displaced Kashmiris in exodus, to hit the stands. Published by Sabre and Quil and authored by Ranjana Raina, it is another addition to the Exodus Literature; books written by ethnically-cleansed Kashmiri Hindus and others, who faced a tragic fate in early nineties when Pakistan-sponsored armed uprising took the Valley by storm.

Whereas most books falling in this category of Exodus Literature contained anguished accounts of personal and community-level experiences the writers had undergone or were witness to, this book under review describes the positive changes sweeping the Valley during the last few years.

The author, Ranjana Raina, has solid credentials to write this account She is a displaced Kashmiri Pandit who spent years in a refugee camp at Jammu. Ranjana is married to Col Rajeev Raina who, after serving multiple tenures in insurgency-hit Jammu and Kashmir state, was posted as a staff Officer at Srinagar Sub Area, the formation responsible for carrying out civic action programs in Kashmir Here, he not only had a bird's eye view of the events in the Valley but was an active participant in activities that went a long way in turning the tide in Kashmir in considerable measure. Author of this book and Rajeev's wife, Raniana, as part of the women-led initiatives toured the length and breadth of Kashmir rendering a helping hand to common women who had experienced years of fear and bloodshed.

of the numerous initiatives launched by the army under the directions of General Officer Commanding 31 Sub Area, Maj Gen Sanjay P Vishwasrao who, as the book makes it clear, was the central figure of the civic action programs that contributed immensely to bring in positive change in Kashmir. Gen Sanjay was not new to the situation he faced when he was posted to Srinagar in 2021. Having dealt with the situation during his multiple tenures at various levels in the concerned theatre of operations and subsequently, as Military Attache in Pakistan, he had gained a first-hand knowledge of the big role played by Pakistan's Islamic parties in radicalizing the gullible Kashmiri youth by exploiting their religious sentiments and, above all, of Pakistan Army itself who, during the past 30 years between 1990-2020, had waged a proxy war against India in Kashmir by using its own jihadi cadres inside the valley as also a huge network of its sympathizers, both overground and underground.

Initially, Gen Sanjay took baby steps which sent a clear message to the youth of Kashmir to shun fear and raise their voice against violence and destruction of the fabric of Kashmiri society. The youth were encouraged to take part in events which would help common people, youth, the womenfolk, the small-time business community, and the marginalized segments

of the society. Gradually, the General built a dedicated group of young men and women to implement his ideas that basically revolved around conveying the following message to the Kashmiri Awam (people):

History Society.

1.During the past three decades, Kashmiris have suffered hugely. This has mainly been due to Pakistan-sponsored insurgency and the excesses perpetrated on the men and women of Kashmir by its armed cadres.

2. Whereas the ordinary Kashmiri youth were motivated to pick up arms by leaders owing allegiance to Pakistan, their own children rarely did so. In fact, they were well educated and landed cushy jobs in India and abroad.

3.Kashmiri women folk were the worst sufferers of the turmoil as the violence took away their bread-winners and because in their helpless situation they became the victims of the militant's lust and other forms of exploitation.

4. While India was economically taking great strides, Pakistan, the sponsor of militancy, was falling deep into political chaos and economic gloom. Many generations of Kashmiri youth had been destroyed by picking up arms, joining the paid gangs of stone pelters. This situation needed to be reversed to save Kashmir's future.

Gradually, through word of mouth, innovative use of social media and some solid work on ground, more and more people joined Gen Sanjay's core team till it became a self-sustaining movement.

Within a year of launching such initiatives successfully, Gen Sanjay launched the 'Har Ghar Tiranga' Amrit Mahatsov. A 100 feet-long iron pole with Tiranga on one end was hoisted on top of Haeri Parbat within the fort, built by Mughal King Akbar in late sixteenth centry, on August 15, 2021. The author describes in detail the enormous physical work and technical sophistication that was galvanized to have this heavy pole taken up the mountain and have it erected at the right place. It was for the first time that a Tiranga would now be visible to the whole Srinagar city from all directions. Incidentally, I had been asked to provide a brief history about Haeri Parbat to be narrated during the recording of the video of this event. Tiranga now became a ubiquitous presence on many important days of National Importance, i.e., Republic Day, Independence Day, Accession Day, etc. Many women wove the National Tri-color in their homes as part of cottage industry. Such was its popularity. Gen Sanjay Vishwasrao was kind enough to present me one of these.

As far as dealing with the ordinary women of Kashmir, who spend their entire lives in a highly conservative environment, was concerned, Gen Sanjay's wife Mrs Sanjeevani Vishwasrao took the initiative to address their concerns and as far as possible improve their lot. With the group of Army women, including the author, Anjana Raina, she forayed into

unknown territory; first with great trepidation and later with greater confidence as the welfare schemes ame popular among the women folk. As more and more women saw the advantages accruing to them through various schemes, many womens' NGOs and self-help groups lent a helping hand in extending the reach of these schemes to remote and relatively inaccessible areas. The Ex-Servicemen of Kashmir, coming from across the Kashmir Valley, too joined the mission of popularizing these schemes. Ms Ranjana Raina was at the forefront of this activity. In the book, she describes in detail how Mrs Sanjeevani Vishwasrao and her dedicated team of women volunteers carried out welfare schemes in remote and least frequented inland waterways of Dal Lake in Kachari Mohalla inhabited mostly by the Shia community. She describes in detail how the local women of the area were initially reluctant to join such initiatives, but gradually joined in large numbers when it became evident that these schemes were meant for their own good. The change in the peoples' perception took place gradually till it became visible to everyone.

ally till it became visible to everyone. Two of the most noticeable events that pointed to the changed situation in Kashmir were the complete absence of any protests post-abrogation of Article 370 and 35 A on August 5, 2019, and presence of large number of Tirangas in Lal Chowk, the heart of militancy, dominated particularly by JKLF. It was on August

15, 2022, that five brave women of Kashmir, installed a Tiranga atop the Ghantaghar at Lal Chowk. Since then, Lal Chowk is now buzzing with tourist activity like it was prior to the start of militancy in late eighties.

The book describes in detail the frustration of those whose vested interests were hit by the success of Gen Sanjay efforts at turning the clock of violence and militancy back in Kashmir. The author describes in detail an article that appeared in Caravan Magazine after Gen Sanjay had been posted out of Kashmir in December 2023. Similarly, some other voices too were raised by frustrated elements who could not see common people celebrating Tiranga; something that hit at the root of their industry of violence perpetuated through fear, money, gun, and religious exploitation.

Kashmiris who had become part of Gen Sanjay Vishwasrao's initiatives and those who had seen a visible and positive change coming over the valley under his guidance, would have preferred to have his tenure in Srinagar going beyond the traditionally followed two-year or so deadline. However, overlooking the contribution made by the General and the need to extend his tenure by at least a vear more in national interests, in order to consolidate the gains Kashmiris had made, he was posted out to an innocuous NCC Directorate at New Delhi. It is quite apparent that Army does not see itself performing roles beyond the routine.

Fourth Test: India bowl out England for 353; reach 34/1 at lunch

Ollie Robinson scored his maiden half-century



NEW DELHI, Feb 20 (Agencies): Ollie Robinson gifted away his wicket after making a career-best 58 that resulted in England's first innings ending at 353 even as Joe Root remained unbeaten on 122 on the second day of the fourth Test against India, on Saturday.

England had made a solid start this morning, making Indians toil hard without success before Robinson's choice of shot - a reverse sweep - off Ravindra Jadeja brought India back in the opening session.

It ended a dogged 102-run stand between Robinson and

In their reply, India lost skipper Rohit Sharma (2) cheaply to be 34 for one at lunch, trailing England by 319 runs.

Veteran James Anderson saw the back of Sharma with a delivery that moved away slightly off the surface after pitching on a perfect length, taking edge from Indian captain's bat that was taken by Ben Foakes. Yashasvi Jaiswal (27 batting) was his usual confident self and giving him company was Shubman Gill (4) at the break.

England added 51 valuable runs to their overnight total of 302/7 as the Indian attack failed to make early penetration. The last five England batters added 241 runs after being 112/5 at lunch on the opening day.

While Mohammed Siraj (2/78) erred in his line and length, debutant Akash Deep could not add to his tally of three wickets to

return with 3/38 from 19 overs. For India, Ravindra Jadeja took all the three wickets to return with 4/67 from his 32.5 overs.

Root, who dug in deep with his classical century spanning a little more than six hours, remained stranded on 122 from 274 balls (10x4).

Robinson had a great start to morning when he flicked one away from a wayward Siraj in the first ball of the day for a boundary through fine leg.

There was no stopping him as he looked for every opportunity and took on Akash Deep with three boundaries that took him past his previous career-best Test score of 42.

However, a bizarre shot selection ended his gritty knock as he employed a grounded reverse sweep which was not necessary at that moment as Indian bowlers were hardly troubling the visitors.

The ball missed the edge of the bat touched the gloves of Robinson before being grabbed by 23-year-old Dhurv Jurel.

England then fell in a jiffy with Shoaib Bashir swinging his bat to the second ball and skied the ball to be caught at point. Jadeja trapped James Anderson to end England resistance.

Liverpool eye 'special' League Cup final triumph against Chelsea

LONDON, Feb 24 (Agencies): Liverpool have their sights on a "special" League Cup triumph in Sunday's final against Chelsea as Jurgen Klopp reaches the first milestone moment of his long goodbye.Klopp is in his last season as Liverpool manager after the German's bombshell announcement that he will step down at the end of the current cam-

Although Klopp is convinced he no longer has the energy to drive Liverpool's relentless quest for silverware, there has been little sign of the feared decline in his side's fortunes following his stunning revelation.

Liverpool have won five of their six matches in all competitions, scoring 21 goals in the process, since the 56-year-old revealed

his plan to quit.

Extending that hot streak at Wembley this weekend would give Liverpool their first trophy since 2022, when they beat Chelsea in both the FA Cup and

League Cup finals.

Root.

Klopp has won six major trophies during an iconic nine-year reign and his quadruple-chasing players are desperate to give him a silverware-filled farewell.

As well as this weekend's date with Chelsea, Liverpool sit four points clear at the top of the Premier League, face Southampton in the FA Cup fifth round on Wednesday and take on Sparta Prague in the Europa League last 16.

"We want to make it a special day and get our first trophy of the season," Liverpool captain Virgil van Dijk said.

"The end of the season will probably be very emotional for a lot of people, including the manager, but we are not there yet."

Klopp's assistant Pep Lijnders echoed Van Dijk's call to make it a day to remember for their boss.

"We'll go for it. It's a special game. Special games need special performances so we have to focus on that," Lijnders said.

Lijnders insisted Klopp was always confident Liverpool's players would keep their focus after his shock announcement.

"I think you underestimate our squad, the personalities in it," he

"A lot of these boys didn't win anything with Liverpool yet so of course they give everything despite the manager saying he is leaving. We are stable enough to deal with it."

'Dream for us'

Lijnders' reference to several of Liverpool's young squad waiting to taste success underscores Klopp's achievement in rebuilding his team after the pre-season departures of Jordan Henderson, Fabinho, Roberto Firmino and James Milner among others.

The Reds' resolve will be tested at Wembley by a mounting injury crisis that leaves them without Alisson Becker, Trent Alexander-Arnold, Curtis Jones and Diogo Jota.

Meanwhile, Mohamed Salah, Darwin Nunez and Dominik Szoboszlai face late fitness tests.

But taking advantage of Liverpool's injury woes will be easier said than done for inconsistent Chelsea.

Mauricio Pochettino's team were one of Liverpool's victims during their recent goal spree, losing 4-1 at Anfield in

January.
Former Tottenham and Southampton boss Pochettino, yet to win a trophy in England, has been under fire from angry Chelsea fans as a troubled season threatens to spiral out of control.

With Chelsea languishing 25 points behind Liverpool in 10th place in the Premier League, a surprise win at Wembley would be a major boost to the Argentine's job security.

Chelsea co-owner Todd Boehly is expected to fly in from the United States to watch the Blues' first cup final since he and Behdad Eghbali bought the London club from Roman Abramovich in

Rohit Sharma-led India's on-field attitude prompts Manjrekar, Karthik to 'miss' Virat Kohli in India vs England 4th Test

NEW DELHI, Feb 24 (Agencies): One of the most prominent criticisms of Rohit's Test captaincy has always been his lack of proactiveness. On Day 2 of the 4th Test, it made India 'miss' Kohli.

Rohit Sharma's nonproactive captaincy once again came to the fore during the India vs England 4th Test at the JSCA Stadium in Ranchi prompting former India cricketers to "miss" Virat Konli's presence in the field. Sanjay Manjrekar and Dinesh Karthik discussed the absence of Kohli, which they believed was one of the major reasons behind the lack of energy among India's fielders on Day 2 of the fourth Test against England in Ranchi.

One of the most prominent criticisms of Rohit's Test captaincy has always been his lack of proactiveness. He tends to wait for things to happen rather than getting ahead of the game, especially when a partnership is build-



ing. His laid-back body language doesn't help.

The situation was quite similar towards the end of Day 1 and at the beginning of Day 2 in Ranchi. India had England huffing and puffing at 112/5 in the first session. From then, Joe Root and Ben Foakes got through the next session wicketless. While they showed admirable patience one of the biggest talking points was the late introduction of Kuldeep Yadav. It took Rohit 41 overs to throw the ball to the left-arm wrist spinner.

When they finally managed to get the breakthrough in the final ses-

sion and followed it up with another wicket to have England 245/7, Rohit failed to go for the kill. The second new ball wasn't taken and another partnership between Root and Ollie Robinson made sure they got to sumps on without further damage.

In the first session on Saturday, there was no urgency in the Indian camp. Robinson and Root batted without any trouble. The former got to his maiden half-century in Test cricket as the partnership for the 8th wicket crossed 100. It was at that moment when Majrekar and Karthik talked about

the need to show some energy.

Manjrekar said it is during these times that India start to miss someone like Virat Kohli, who used to make things happen with his energy and body language.

"Virat Kohli is one of

those guys. If the fielders are quiet, he will get the crowd to back the players, andbring some energy. When he's out there, he just gets that intensity going. India are missing Virat Kohli. There is no one quite like him. He carries that energy," Manrjekar said. Dinesh Karthik was quick to join in: "Has the uncanny knack of getting the crowd behind

him."

impossible situation. India after swallowing a bitter pill in the opening Test made a comeback in the second game in Visakhapatnam by beating the visitors by 106 runs-A comeback led by Jasprit Bumrah's heroics.

The third Test in Rajkot was the first time where India completely thrashed England. The game seemed on an even keel after Day 2 on the back of Ben Duckett's ton but Yashasvi Jaiswal had different ideas. India took the lead in the series after beating England by a whooping 434 runs at Rajkot.
