Currency-in-circulation (CiC) refers to notes The growth of Reserve Money (RM), as per the RBI data, decelerated to 5.8 per cent as on February 9, 2024 from 11.2 per cent a year ago (8.8 per cent adjusted for the first-round impact of change in Cash Reserve Ratio (CRR).

Components of RM include CiC, banks' deposits in RBI and other deposits with the central bank.

The growth in CiC, the largest component of RM, decelerated to 3.7 per cent from 8.2 per cent a year ago, reflecting the withdrawal of Rs 2,000 banknotes, according to the RBI. On May 19, 2023, RBI announced withdrawal of Rs 2,000 denomination banknotes from circulation.

KPDCL announces disconnection drive over unpaid electricity bills

SRINAGAR, Feb 25 (Agencies): The Kashmir Power Distribution Corporation Limited (KPDCL) has reiterated that an essential escalation in power curtailment measures is underway due to restricted power availability and related constraints. The corporation emphasized that this decision, considered crucial for upholding grid discipline and preventing the risk of major trunk line failures and extensive blackouts. Assuring the public of a relaxation in restrictions once power availability improves, KPDCL has urged consumers to refrain from power theft and adopt responsible

electricity usage practices. The recent surge in power demand coupled with limitations in supply has forced utilities to implement stricter curtailment protocols These measures entail regulated reductions in electricity supply to certain areas during peak demand hours, aimed at balancing the grid load and preventing system overloads. Officials emphasize that while the current situation necessitates stringent curtailment measures, efforts are underway to alleviate the strain on the power infrastructure. The genesis of these structural fault lines ironically lie in the progressive and beneficial legislation enacted immediately after independence, namely the various land ceiling and Zamindari/Ryotwari/ Mahalwari abolition laws that were correctly promulgated to give land to the tiller and end the pernicious exploitation of the peasantry by the rural feudal elite — the notorious and rapacious Zamindars that the British created to extract revenue from poor and impoverished farmers.

Those who may have watched the 1953 Bollywood film Do Bigha Zameen can perhaps relate to the atrocities perpetrated by the Zamindars on hapless small and marginal farmers during those times.

Obviously, therefore, there is no question that these progressive legislation that were inserted into the Ninth Schedule of the Constitution of India in 1951 vide the First Amendment can ever be rolled back. That is where the Minimum Support Price (MSP) becomes a germane issue.

The average size of a land holding in India is 1.08 hectares or 2.66 acres. Two-thirds of these land holdings are classified as marginal and have an average size of 0.39 hectares or 0.9 acres. This makes agriculture on a standalone basis an unviable economic activity, thereby putting a severe strain on livelihoods solely based upon agriculture.

According to a Press Information Bureau Press Release of November 2022, "Agriculture continues to be the prime pulse of the Indian economy and is at the core of the socioeconomic development of the country. It accounts for around 19 per cent of the GDP and about two-thirds of the population is dependent on the sector." This means 93 crore or 930 million people.

In a good year a farmer of a selfowned three-acre plot is able to make about Rs 20,000 per month de-hors the labour cost of an entire family tilling their own land. If a person is a contract agriculturalist the same numbers come down to about Rs 9,500 a month. These calculations are near accurate approximations based upon the rice and wheat cycle prevalent in the breadbasket of India, i.e. Punjab and Haryana, at the Minimum Support Price (MSP). That is why a legal architecture around the MSP question is even more a critical issue for the farmers of Punjab.

Government statistics underscore a far grimmer reality. "As per the National Sample Survey, the estimated average monthly income per agricultural household increased from Rs 6,426 in 2012-13 to Rs 10,218 in 2018-19." Presuming these numbers are correct because government data is suspect even then it is a mere pittance.

In 2004, the then UPA government established the National Commission of Farmers (NCF) under the leadership of M.S. Swaminathan. The NCF was created with the objective of determining the causes of farmer distress, the rise in farmer suicides, and how to address these issues.

One of the significant recommendations of the Swaminathan Committee was the method of calculating the Minimum Support Price which was to be set at 50 per cent more than the average cost of production of the crop. This was intended to ensure viable returns for the farmers. Accordingly, the formula determined by the Swaminathan Committee is expressed as "C2 + 50". This formula includes the cost of production (C2), encompassing the total actual cost of producing the crops, imputed rent on the land owned by the farmer, and imputed interest on any fixed capital owned by the farmer.

In response to an unstarred question in the Rajya Sabha regarding the fixing of MSP (Starred Question No. 110), the NDA government stated that it will abide by the recommendations of the Swaminathan Committee and fix the MSP at one-and-a-half times the total cost of production. However, it relied upon a formula which was absolutely in dissonance with the Swaminathan Committee's formula. The NDA/BJP government relied on "A2 + FL" to calculate MSP. Herein A2 was the average cost of production and FL was the imputed cost of family labour. This formula fails to take into consideration the value of owned rent or capital.

If the Swaminathan Committee's report is implemented, it would significantly help in boosting the Minimum Support Prices (MSP) of crops and provide valuable assistance to farmers. According to Down To Earth, the MSP for Rabi crops for the marketing season 2024-2025 would be as follows: Wheat would be Rs 2,478 as against the current Rs 2,275; barley would be Rs 2,421 as against the current Rs 1,850; lentil would be Rs 7,335 as against the current Rs 6,425, and finally, gram would be Rs 6,820.50 as against the current Rs 5,440.

The anti-farmer policies of the current dispensation has increased income inequality among farmers. According to the Centre for Financial Accountability, New Delhi, an average of 30 farmers commit suicide per day during the NDA/BJP government's tenure. Moreover, we also see that the absolute number of indebted farmers has increased from 902 lakhs to 930 lakhs in the same period. And the average amount of outstanding loans has surged about 1.6 times compared to 2013.

What is further distressing is the manner in which the government is dealing with the farmers' protest. The government is using colonialera laws, such as the Temporary Suspension of Telecom Services (Public Emergency or Public Safety) Rules, 2017, of the Indian Telegraph Act, 1885, to block Internet services and suppress the farmers' legitimate right to articulate their anguish on grounds of "public emergency" and "public safety". Moreover, drones are being employed to tear-gas and disperse crowds.

This stands in stark contrast to how authorities are handling farmer protests in France, Poland and other parts of the European Union, where the objective is not to squelch dissent but to try and resolve their problems.

Punjab is a border state that has contributed to the defence of the nation in a substantial manner. It makes 7.7 per cent of the Indian army despite having a 2.3 per cent share in the national population. An overwhelming majority of them are sons and daughters of the very farmers who are being brutalised on the borders of Punjab and Haryana and prevented by the "hukumrans" from coming to Delhi to even exercise their fundamental right of protest guaranteed under Article 19(1) (b) of the Constitution of India.

"EYES WIDE OPEN: STORY OF TIRANGA IN KASHMIR"

"Eyes Wide Open: Story of Tiranga in Kashmir," is among the latest books written by displaced Kashmiris in exodus, to hit the stands. Published by Sabre and Quil and authored by Ranjana Raina, it is another addition to the Exodus Literature; books written by ethnically-cleansed Kashmiri Hindus and others, who faced a tragic fate in early nineties when Pakistansponsored armed uprising took the Valley by storm. Whereas most books falling in this category of Exodus Literature contained anguished accounts of personal and community-level experiences the writers had undergone or were witness to, this book under review describes the positive changes sweeping the Valley during the last few years. The author, Ranjana Raina, has solid credentials to write this account. She is a displaced Kashmiri Pandit who spent years in a refugee camp at Jammu. Ranjana is married to Col Rajeev Raina who, after serving multiple tenures in insurgency-hit Jammu and Kashmir state, was posted as a staff Officer at Srinagar Sub Area, the formation responsible for carrying out civic action programs in Kashmir. Here, he not only had a bird's eye view of the events in the Valley but was an active participant in activities that went a long way in turning the tide in Kashmir in considerable measure. Author of this book and Rajeev's wife, Ranjana, as part of the women-led initiatives toured the length and breadth of Kashmir rendering a helping hand to common women who had experienced years of fear and bloodshed. The book gives a detailed account of the numerous initiatives launched by the army under the directions of General Officer Commanding 31 Sub Area, Maj Gen Sanjay P Vishwasrao who, as the book makes it clear, was the central figure of the civic action programs that contributed immensely to bring in positive change in Kashmir. Gen Sanjay was not new to the situation he faced when he was posted to Srinagar in 2021. Having dealt with the situation during his multiple tenures at various levels in the concerned theatre of operations and subsequently, as Military Attache

in Pakistan, he had gained a first-hand knowledge of the big role played by Pakistan's Islamic parties in radicalizing the gullible Kashmiri youth by exploiting their religious sentiments and, above all, of Pakistan Army itself who, during the past 30 years between 1990-2020, had waged a proxy war against India in Kashmir by using its own jihadi cadres inside the valley as also a huge network of its sympathizers, both overground and underground. Initially, Gen Sanjay took baby steps which sent a clear message to the youth of Kashmir to shun fear and raise their voice against violence and destruction of the fabric of Kashmiri society. The youth were encouraged to take part in events which would help common people, youth, the women-folk, the small-time business community, and the marginalized segments of the society. Gradually, the General built a dedicated group of young men and women to implement his ideas that basically revolved around conveying the following message to the Kashmiri Awam (people): 1. During the past three decades, Kashmiris have suffered hugely. This has mainly been due to Pakistan-sponsored insurgency and the excesses perpetrated on the men and women of Kashmir by its armed cadres. 2. Whereas the ordinary Kashmiri youth were motivated to pick up arms by leaders owing allegiance to Pakistan, their own children rarely did so. In fact, they were well educated and landed cushy jobs in India and abroad. 3.Kashmiri women folk were the worst sufferers of the turmoil as the violence took away their bread-winners and because in their helpless situation they became the victims of the militant's lust and other forms of exploitation. 4. While India was economically taking great strides, Pakistan, the sponsor of militancy, was falling deep into political chaos and economic gloom. Many generations of Kashmiri youth had been destroyed by picking up arms, joining the paid gangs of stone pelters. This situation needed to be reversed to save Kashmir's future.

it became a self-sustaining movement. Within a year of launching such initiatives successfully, Gen Sanjay launched the 'Har Ghar Tiranga' movement as part of the Azadi Ka Amrit Mahatsov. A 100 feet-long iron pole with Tiranga on one end was hoisted on top of Haeri Parbat within the fort, built by Mughal King Akbar in late sixteenth centry, on August 15, 2021. The author describes in detail the enormous physical work and technical sophistication that was galvanized to have this heavy pole taken up the mountain and have it erected at the right place. It was for the first time that a Tiranga would now be visible to the whole Srinagar city from all directions. Incidentally, I had been asked to provide a brief history about Haeri Parbat to be narrated during the recording of the video of this event. Tiranga now became a ubiquitous presence on many important days of National Importance, i.e., Republic Day, Independence Day, Accession Day, etc. Many women wove the National Tri-color in their homes as part of cottage industry. Such was its popularity. Gen Sanjay Vishwasrao was kind enough to present me one of these. As far as dealing with the ordinary women of Kashmir, who spend their entire lives in a highly conservative environment, was concerned, Gen Sanjay's wife Mrs Sanjeevani Vishwasrao took the initiative to address their concerns and as far as possible improve their lot. With the group of Army women, including the author, Anjana Raina, she forayed into unknown territory; first with great trepidation and later with greater confidence as the welfare schemes became popular among the women folk. As more and more women saw the advantages accruing to them through various schemes, many womens' NGOs and self-help groups lent a helping hand in extending the reach of these schemes to remote and relatively inaccessible areas. The Ex-Servicemen of Kashmir, coming from across the Kashmir Valley, too joined the mission of popularizing these schemes. Ms Ranjana Raina was at the forefront of this activity. In the book, she describes in detail how Mrs Sanjeevani Vishwasrao and her dedicated team of women volunteers carried out welfare schemes in remote and least frequented inland waterways of Dal Lake

in Kachari Mohalla inhabited mostly by the Shia community. She describes in detail how the local women of the area were initially reluctant to join such initiatives, but gradually joined in large numbers when it became evident that these schemes were meant for their own good. The change in the peoples' perception took place gradually till it became visible to everyone. Two of the most noticeable events that pointed to the changed situation in Kashmir were the complete absence of any protests post-abrogation of Article 370 and 35 A on August 5, 2019, and presence of large number of Tirangas in Lal Chowk, the heart of militancy, dominated particularly by JKLF. It was on August 15, 2022, that five brave women of Kashmir, installed a Tiranga atop the Ghantaghar at Lal Chowk. Since then, Lal Chowk is now buzzing with tourist activity like it was prior to the start of militancy in late eighties. The book describes in detail the frustration of those whose vested interests were hit by the success of Gen Sanjay efforts at turning the clock of violence and militancy back in Kashmir. The author describes in detail an article that appeared in Caravan Magazine after Gen Sanjay had been posted out of Kashmir in December 2023. Similarly, some other voices too were raised by frustrated elements who could not see common people celebrating Tiranga; something that hit at the root of their industry of violence perpetuated through fear, money, gun, and religious exploitation. Kashmiris who had become part of Gen Sanjay Vishwasrao's initiatives and those who had seen a visible and positive change coming over the valley under his guidance, would have preferred to have his tenure in Srinagar going beyond the traditionally followed two-year or so deadline. However, overlooking the contribution made by the General and the need to extend his tenure by at least a year more in national interests, in order to consolidate the gains Kashmiris had made, he was posted out to an innocuous NCC Directorate at New Delhi. It is quite apparent that Army does not see itself performing roles beyond the routine.

Gradually, through word of mouth, innovative use of social media and some solid work on ground, more and more people joined Gen Sanjay's core team till



DEVBHUMI DWARKA, Feb 25 (Agencies): Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Sunday inaugurated 'Sudarshan Setu', the country's longest cablestayed bridge of 2.32 km, on the Arabian Sea connecting Beyt Dwarka island to mainland Okha in Gujarat's Devbhumi Dwarka district.

Modi began his day by offering prayers at Lord Sri Krishna temple at Beyt Dwarka.

He later inaugurated the four-lane cablestayed bridge called the 'Sudarshan Setu', which

boasts a unique design, featuring a footpath adorned with verses from Srimad Bhagavad Gita and images of Lord Krishna on both sides. The 2.32 km bridge,



including 900 metres of central double span cable-stayed portion and a 2.45-km-long approach road, has been constructed at a cost of Rs 979 crore, as

per an official release. four-lane The 27.20-metre-wide bridge has 2.5-metre-wide footpaths on each side, it said.

The bridge, which

was known as 'Signature Bridge', has been renamed 'Sudarshan Setu' or Sudarshan Bridge.

Beyt Dwarka is an island near Okha port, which is nearly 30 km from Dwarka town, where the famous Dwarkadhish temple of Lord Krishna is situated. At present, devotees visiting the temple at Beyt Dwarka can travel only during the day by boat, while the construction of the bridge will

No 'Mann ki Baat' broadcast for 3 months in view of general election: PM Modi



NEW DELHI, Feb 25 (Agencies): Prime Minister Narendra Modi said on Sunday that his monthly 'Mann Ki Baat' broadcast would not be aired for the next three months in line with political decorum in view of the upcoming general election.

In the 110th episode of the programme, he said there is a possibility that the Model Code of Conduct will

"It is a programme of the people, for the people and by the people," the prime minister said.

"When we meet the next time, it will be 111th episode of the Mann Ki Baat," Modi added, noting the auspiciousness associated with the number. What can be better than this, he said.

The prime minister has frequently expressed confidence of retaining power in the election.

The programme was deferred before the 2019 general elections as well.

At least 4 dead in blast at firecracker unit in UP's Kaushambi

LUCKNOW, Feb 25 (Agencies): At least four people were killed, and several others injured in an explosion at a firecracker factory in Uttar Pradesh's Kaushambi district on Sunday. The injured people have been sent to the district hospital for treatment.

The cause of the explosion is yet to be ascertained.

Addressing mediapersons, SP Kaushambi Brijesh Kumar Srivastava said the factory in Bharwari had the license to both sell and manufacture firecrackers.

"According to information, four people have died. Of the injured people, some are in serious condition and have been sent to the hospital. The victims

UP Man Borrows Money For Online Gaming, Kills Mother In Payback Plan: Cops

FATEHPUR, Feb 25 (Agencies): An addiction to online gaming led a man to murder his mother so that he could claim her life insurance payout and settle his mountain of debt, police have said. The shocking incident has been reported in Uttar Pradesh's Fatehpur where the accused, Himanshu, allegedly killed his mother to claim a ₹ 50 lakh insurance and then disposed off her body near the Yamuna river bank.

The accused, police have said, was addicted to gaming on popular platform Zupee. Such was the addiction that his repeated losses prompted him to borrow and keep playing. After a point, he realised he owed nearly ₹ 4 lakh. The question now was how to pay back creditors. What followed was a ruthless plot.

Himanshu, police said, stole his paternal aunt's jewellery and used the money to buy life insurance policies worth ₹ 50 lakh each



for his parents. Soon after, he allegedly choked his mother Prabha to death when his father was away, said police. He put the body in a jute bag and drove his tractor to the Yamuna river bank to dispose it.

Himanshu's father Roshan Singh, who had gone to the Chitrakoot temple, did not find his wife and son at home when he returned. He asked around and then headed to his brother's home in the same locality. No one knew where Prabha was. Then a neighbour mentioned that he had seen Himanshu on the tractor near the river.

Police were informed and the body recovered from near Yamuna. Himanshu was arrested soon after. His questioning revealed the shocking plot a son hatched to murder his mother so that he could clear his debt. "The son was on the run after murdering his mother. We caught him and unearthed the sinister crime," senior police officer Vijay Shankar Mishra said.

Donald Trump sweeps South Carolina Republican primary, beats rival Nikki Haley

Former US President Donald Trump has defeated his Indian-American Republican rival Nikki Haley in the crucial party primary in the latter's home turf of South Carolina.

COLUMBIA, Feb 25 (Agencies): Former US President Donald Trump has defeated Nikki Haley, his last remaining challenger in the 2024 Republican race to the White House, in the crucial party primary in her home state of South Carolina, according to Edison Research projections. This extends Trump's winning streak as he marches toward a third consecutive presidential nomination and a rematch with Democratic President Joe Biden.

The former President had been widely favoured to win the Southern state, with one opinion poll after another showing him holding a sizeable lead despite his litany of criminal charges and Haley's status as a native of South Carolina who won two terms as Governor.

"I have never seen the Republican Party so unified as it is right now," Trump told supporters in Columbia, the state capital, just minutes after the polls closed at 7 p.m. on Saturday night.

He did not mention Halev once in about 30 minutes of remarks.

The lopsided outcome will bolster calls from Trump's allies that Haley, Trump's last remaining challenger, should drop out of the race.

Trump has dominated all five contests thus far, in Iowa, New Hampshire, Nevada, the US Virgin Islands and now Haley's home state, leaving her with virtually no path to the Republican nomination.

A defiant Haley, who served as UN ambassador under Trump, insisted this week that she would sustain her campaign through at least "Super Tuesday" on March 5, when Republicans in 15 states and one US territory will cast ballots.

It was too early in the evening to know whether Haley would capture a stronger-than-expected share of the vote, which

Trump was leading 63 per cent to 36.8 per cent with just 2.5 per cent of the expected vote tallied, according to Edison Research. She has notably sharpened her attacks on Trump in recent

days, questioning his mental acuity and warning voters that he would lose November's general election.

But there is scant evidence that Republican voters are interested in any standard-bearer except Trump.

Immigration, which Trump has made a key focus of his election campaign, was the No. 1 issue for voters in the Republican primary on Saturday, according to an Edison exit poll.

Some 39 per cent of voters cited that issue compared with 33 per cent who said the economy was their top concern.

Approximately 84 per cent of voters said the economy is not so good or poor, highlighting a major potential weakness for Biden in November's general election.

Once again, however, exit polls also pointed to Trump's own vulnerabilities. Nearly onethird of voters on Saturday said Trump would be unfit to serve as president if he were convicted candidate Vivek Ramaswamy emerged as favourites for Trump's vice presidential pick, according to a poll of activists at the conservative conference. They each received 15 per cent support.

Haley, whose foreign policy credentials are at the centre of her campaign, has focused in recent days on Trump's stance toward Russia following the death of Alexei Navalny, the main opposition leader there.

She criticised Trump for waiting days before commenting on Navalny's death and then for failing to blame Russian President Vladimir Putin.

She also condemned Trump's recent remarks that he would not defend NATO allies from a Russian attack if he felt they had not spent enough on defence.

Haley had hoped that South Carolina's "open" primary, which allows registered voters to cast a ballot, would lead to turnout among independents and even some Democrats who are determined to stop Trump.

But Edison exit poll data showed only 21 per cent of voters considered themselves moderate or liberal, only slightly higher than the 19% who said the same in the party's 2016 primary.

Kelli Poindexter, a Democrat and transcriptionist who lives in Columbia, voted for Haley "simply to, maybe, cancel out one of the Donald Trump votes". "I think he's dangerous," Poindexter said. "I think he's a threat. And if Democrats come out and give a vote to Nikki, it takes one

away from him." But Kevin Marsh, a 59-yearold Republican and truck driver who also lives in Columbia, said he voted for Trump on Saturday because he trusts him more than Haley. "She's more of a globalist and I just can't support that," Marsh said.

"We must be bolder in seizing the hundreds of billions of frozen Russian assets," Sunak said in an article in The Sunday Times newspaper.

"That starts with taking the billions in interest these assets are collecting and sending it to Ukraine instead.

"And then, with the G7. we must find lawful ways to seize the assets themselves and get those funds to Ukraine too.'

The prime minister's comments follow G7 leaders pledging Saturday to explore "all possible avenues by which immobilised Russian sovereign assets could

be made use of to support Ukraine".

Minister Eliyahu, a member of the far-right Otzma Yehudit party, warned that the US President Joe Biden 'is leading us to a disaster' as he supports the twostate solution."

"I want to say thank you to the United States and the Biden administration for all of their support," but "Biden is making a very big mistake," the Israeli Minister told the Times of Israel. He claimed that an

Impact of Rs 2,000 Notes withdrawal: currency-incirculation growth dips to 3.7% in Feb

As on January 31, nearly 97.5 per cent of the Rs 2,000 banknotes were returned to the banking system, and only about Rs 8,897 crore worth of such notes are still with the public.

The total value of Rs 2,000 banknotes in circulation was Rs 3.56 lakh crore at the

close of business on May 19, 2023, when the withdrawal of Rs 2,000 banknotes was announced

Public and entities holding such notes were initially asked to either exchange or deposit them in bank accounts by September 30, 2023. The deadline was later extended to October 7, 2023. Deposit and exchange services at bank branches were discontinued on October 7, 2023.

Starting October 8, 2023 individuals have been provided with the choice of either exchanging the currency or having the equivalent sum credited to their bank accounts at the 19 offices of RBI.

The Rs 2,000 banknotes were introduced in November 2016, following the demonetisation of the then-prevailing Rs 1,000 and Rs 500 banknotes.







ICC suspends Wanindu Hasaranga for 2 matches; Rahmanullah Gurbaz fined 15 per cent of match fees



DUBAI, Feb 25 (Agencies): The ICC has suspended Sri Lanka captain Wanindu Hasaranga for two matches and docked a fine of 15 per cent on the match fee of Afghanistan wicketkeeper-batter Rahmanullah Gurbaz for breaching its Code of Conduct during the

third T20I in Dambulla. The global governing body said in a release that Hasaranga has been banned after the spin bowling all-rounder accumulated a total of five demerit points within a 24-month period, which includes his latest breach of the ICC Code of Conduct.

"Sri Lanka's T20I skipper and second-ranked T20I bowler on the ICC Men's Player Rankings, Wanindu Hasaranga has been presented with a two-match suspension after his total demerit points reached five within a 24-month period following his latest breach of the ICC

Code of Conduct, for which he received a 50 per cent fine and three demerit points," the ICC said in a statement.

The incident involving Hasaranga took place towards the end of the third and final T20I on Wednesday when he approached the onfield umpire Lyndon Hanibal to criticise a decision regarding a full toss delivery not being adjudged a no-

ball. Hasaranga was thus found guilty of breaching the article 2.13 of the ICC Code of Conduct for Players and Player Support Personnel. The article relates to "personal abuse of a player, player support personnel, umpire or match referee during an International Match". With Hasaranga accumulating five demerit

two suspension points, the ICC said. "This means he will either get a ban for

points, it converts to

one Test match or two ODIs or T20Is, whichever comes first, for the player or player support personnel. Consequently, Hasaranga will be suspended from participating in Sri Lanka's first two T20Is against Bangladesh next month," the ICC said.

Afghanistan batter Gurbaz too was penalised for breaching Level 1 of the ICC Code of Conduct in the same match for having violated the article 2.4 of the code, which concerns "disobeying an Umpire's instruction during an International Match".

This has resulted in one demerit point being added to Gurbaz's disciplinary record, which marks his second such offence in a 24-month period and the player accumulating two demerit points.

"The sanction was imposed on Rahmanullah for altering the grip of his bat on the field despite repeated warnings against doing so," the ICC said.

The ICC added that both the players have admitted to the offences and have accepted the sanction proposed by Chris Broad from the elite panel of match referees

Australia Win Rain-Hit Third T20 Against New Zealand By 27 Runs

AUCKLAND, Feb 25 (Agencies): A "clinical" Australia beat New Zealand by 27 runs in the rain-shortened third Twenty20 in Auckland on Sunday to complete a clean sweep of the series. Responding to Australia's 118-4 from 10.4 overs, New Zealand scored 98-3, falling short of a target adjusted to 126 off 10 overs under the Duckworth-Lewis-Stern method.

The required run rate grew quickly after the home side lost two quick wickets before Glenn Phillips posted their top score for the second straight game, finishing on 40 not out off 24 balls. Australian pace bowler Spencer Johnson impressed in his first appearance of the series taking 1-10 off his two overs

Three rain stoppages curtailed Australia's innings after they were asked to bat first at Eden Park.

Opener Travis Head top scored with 33 off 30 balls but the most punishing batting was

player of the match Matthew Short's 27 off 11 balls and Glenn Maxwell's 20 off nine.

Australia dominated the series, winning the opener by six wickets in Wellington on Wednesday, followed by a 72-run victory in game two in Auckland on Friday.

Wicketkeeper Matthew Wade, promoted to Australian captain after Mitch Marsh was rested for the final game, said the series was ideal preparation ahead of the T20 World Cup in June.

"We wanted to have a look at the depth in our squad and we were lucky enough to do that today with Spencer and Matty Short," Wade said.

"Our bowlers were unbelievable today, the way they came out and executed. It was as clinical a bowling effort as I've seen from an Australian outfit.

"For Matthew Short to come out and bat the way he did is really exciting for the future." New Zealand were not helped by injuries, which ruled out key



batsmen Daryl Mitchell, Rachin Ravindra and Devon Conway at different stages of the series while veteran Kane Williamson was absent because of the birth of his child.

Captain Mitchell Santner would not use that as an excuse, saying Australia were simply too good.

"They're obviously a quality side," Santner said.

"The first game was a close one but we were obviously outplayed in the last two.²

The first Test of a two-match series between the teams starts in Wellington on Thursday.

BPL is like a circus: Chandika Hathurusingha slams domestic franchise league

DHAKA, Feb 25 (Agencies): Bangladesh head coach Chandika Hathurusingha has slammed the Bangladesh Premier League, comparing it to a circus. The 2024 season of the BPL is currently underway with Rangpur Riders leading the points table.

Speaking to ESPNcricinfo, Hathurusingha said Bangladesh does not have a proper T20 tournament, adding that he sometimes switches the TV off when



Ravichandran Ashwin leads Indian charge but Crawley's breezy 60 takes England lead past 150 at tea on day 3 of Ranchi Test

RANCHI, Feb 25 (Agencies): Veteran offspinner Ravichandran Ashwin worked his magic to take three wickets, while left-arm wrist spinner Kuldeep Yaday struck twice as England went to tea at 120/5 on day three of the fourth Test against India here on Sunday. England now lead by 166 runs, and they should thank opener Zak Crawley's 60 off 91 balls for adding a large chunk of runs.

Earlier, India were bowled out for 307 in their first innings as wicketkeeper batter Dhruv Jurel made a determined 90.

Starting with the new ball with Ravindra Jadeja at the other end, Ashwin was quick to exploit the widening cracks on the pitch and removed a tentative Ben Duckett (15) and out of sorts Ollie Pope (0) in successive deliveries. But his prized scalp was that of Joe Root, the first-innings unbeaten centurion, who was dismissed for 11, adjudged leg before after an excellent review by India.

The ball pitched just on the line, leaving the Englishman frustrated but India did not mind to have England at 65 for three in quick time after conceding a first innings lead of 46 runs.

Thereafter, it was a show of Crawley who looked in ominous mood and took on the Indian attack against the run of play to stretch their overall lead past 150-mark.

India persisted with Ashwin and Jadeja and the attack looked too unidimensional for Crawley who smacked seven fours in the company of Ben Stokes, putting together a quick 45 off 67 balls.

Kuldeep, who bowled just 12 overs in the first innings, was finally brought in and he made his presence felt cleaning up the England dangerman in his third over.

The left-arm wrist spinner was at his deceptive best and bowled Crawley with a beauty that skidded through, unsettling the middlestump.

Having survived an umpire's call, England skipper Ben Stokes was castled with the ball staying low as Kuldeep looked brilliant in his 5-1-10-2 spell.

Earlier, Jurel hit a resilient maiden fifty as India produced an incredible fightback to limit England's first-innings lead before being dismissed at the stroke of lunch.

Following up his dogged 46 in his debut Test in Rajkot, Jurel produced a career-best 90, showing that he can soak in pressure with ease as India's long search for a wicketkeeper-batter seemed to be heading in the right direction. After getting to his fifty from 96 balls, the Rajasthan Royals wicketkeeper-batter quickly changed gears, taking the English spin duo of Shoaib Bashir and Tom Hartley to cleaners.

Jurel hurried for a single off Hartley to bring up his maiden fifty in Test cricket, in an innings of supreme composure.

"The ICC need to step in. There has to be some regulations. A player is playing one tournament and then he is playing another tournament. It is like a circus. Players will talk about opportunities, but that's not right. People will lose interest. I have lost interest," Hathurusingha

added.

Hathurusingha suggested having another tournament ahead of BPL to help players grow into the roles required by the national team. 37-year-old Imrul Kayes led Comilla Victorians to the BPL title last season.

"We need to have a tournament where our players can do things like batting in the top three. Bangladesh bowlers bowling in the death. Where will we learn these things otherwise? We have only one tournament," said Hathurusingha.

"My suggestion is that we have another tournament before the BPL. The franchises do what they want. Some of the best players are not playing. Then how do you expect the Bangladesh team to be up with the other teams? I am fighting a steep battle," Hathurusingha added.

Fortune Barishal will face Chattogram Challengers, while Rangpur Riders will lock horns with Comilla Victoria on February 26.

New Zealand to send security delegation to Pakistan ahead of T20I series

KARACHI, Feb 25 (Agencies): New Zealand Cricket will send a security delegation to Pakistan ahead of their five-match T20I series in April this year. A reliable source close to the Pakistan Cricket Board confirmed that the delegation would include private security expert Reg Dickason and a senior official of the NZ players association Heath Mills

Dickason has been the regular security consultant for the ICC and other cricket boards when top tier teams have visited Pakistan in recent years. In the 2022-23 season, Pakistan hosted England and New Zealand twice along with Australia (once)

The delegation is due in early March to visit Lahore and Rawalpindi where the matches will probably be held, the source said.

The Kiwi team's visit is not part of the ICC FTP and is a return visit for the five T20Is that Pakistan played in New Zealand in January this year.

The security delegation will visit the match venues and team hotels and also meet with government and security officials to oversee the security plans for the visiting team.

In September 2021, the New Zealand white-ball squad returned home from Rawalpindi without playing a game in a long-awaited series owing to a security threat. The decision to call the team back home was taken at the highest level by the New Zealand government, which viewed it as a serious threat.

Later on, after New Zealand returned to Pakistan in the 2022-23 season to play a Test and ODI series followed by another separate white-ball series.
