Bandipora-Gurez road blocked due to avalanche, clearance operation underway Top News Report

BANDIPORA, Mar 17

BANDIPORA, Mar 17 (Agencies): The Bandipora-Gurez road in the Jammy and Kashmir has been blocked due to multiple snow avalanches on Sunday.

The Border Roads Organisation (BRO) has commenced an extensive clearance operation in the snow avalanche-hit area.

Earlier in the month, a group of seven local trekkers stranded at Mughal Road in Jammu and Kashmir's Poonch district amid heavy snowfall and avalanches were safely rescued, officials said.

The rescue operation was carried out by a team of officials from the mechanical engineering wing of the Public Works department.

Horrific: A mother saves her two children as leopard enters home

Azad requests EC to hold assembly election in J&K one month after LS Polls

(Agencies): Democratic Progressive Azad Party (DPAP) chairman Ghulam Nabi Azad requested the Election Commission (EC) on Sunday to hold the muchawaited Assembly polls in Jammu and Kashmir a month after the completion of the Lok Sabha election.

The Lok Sabha polls

in the Union Territory will be held in the first five phases on April 19 (Udhampur), April 26 (Jammu), May 7 (Anantnag-Rajouri), May 13 (Srinagar) and May 20 (Baramulla). The counting of votes will be taken up on June 4.

"The EC has stated that it is not holding the Assembly polls with the Lok Sabha election because of security considerations.

"It is true that if 10 candidates fight from each parliamentary seat, we have five seats and the number of candidates will be 50. Similarly, if we have 15 candidates from each of the 90 Assembly segments, the number of candidates will be around 1,500. It is difficult to pro-



vide security to 50 candidates," the former Jammu and Kashmir chief minister said

However, he requested the EC and the Centre to hold the Assembly polls a month after the completion of the parliamentary election.

"The Assembly elec-

tion should be held after a month's rest post the Lok Sabha polls," he said. Azad, who was a member of a high-level committee chaired by former president Ram Nath Kovind to look into the feasibility of the "one nation, one election" concept, said the report has been submitted to the president and it is now for

the government and the EC to take a call on the recommendations.

Asked about the opposition's criticism over holding the Lok Sabha polls in seven phases, the former Union minister said even during the Congress rule, elections used to take place in seven or eight phases.

He said the DPAP has announced one candidate from the Udhampur Lok Sabha seat and the decision with regard to other seats will be taken in due course of time.

"We have announced one candidate and will see where else we are going to field candidates," he said. Earlier, addressing a public meeting at the heart of the city here, Azad said a legislation is needed to protect Jammu up to Samba.

"Our land and jobs were protected by Article 35A (of the Constitution) but after its abrogation with Article 370 (in August 2019), Jammu has become vulnerable as anyone coming from outside will prefer the city rather than going to the hilly districts of Jammu or the Kashmir valley. People from the 22 districts of Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh are living in Jammu and we have to protect the city up to Samba (district)," he said.

Azad sought the people's support in forming the next government in Jammu and Kashmir and said he will give top priority to mitigating the problems being faced by them due to a lack of electricity and water, besides ensuring development.

He also asked people to wisely vote in the parliamentary polls so that the elected candidates become their voice and highlight their issues.

"Elections in J&K will be held as per SC direction": BJP'S Tarun Chugh

JAMMU, Mar 17 (Agencies): Bharatiya Janata Party general secretary Tarun Chugh said on Sunday that the Assembly elections in Jammu and Kashmir will happen according to the Supreme Court's direction.

"Everybody has faith in the Election Commission. According to the Supreme Court's direction, the elections will happen in Jammu and Kashmir in September," he said.

Earlier today, Senior Advocate Kapil Sibal said that it was shocking but was expected.

"Shocking, but that is expected. They will have no polls in J&K, and what is even more shocking is that Sonam Wangchuk, who is on fast, wants to have 'district hill status' and they are not even providing that, "he said.

Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) Rajiv Kumar said on Saturday that the J-K Assembly polls will be held after the Lok Sabha elections.

In an interview with ANI, CEC Kumar said, "We are yet to hold assembly elections in Jammu and Kashmir. I mentioned in the press conference

persons on the sidelines of Public Grievance Redressal Programme (PGRP) in Doda, the DGP Swain said that police and other security



agencies are committed to root out terrorism and terrorists in Jammu and Kashmir. He said the J&K Police is having a clear roadmap in this regard and will be able to rootout it exponentially.
"We are clear in our

roadmap and we will not retreat from our modusoperandi. I can't assure you that terrorism will end in Jammu and Kashmir on a fixed date, but it will be rooted out exponentially," DGP Swain said.

On the conduct of Lok Sabha general elections in Jammu and Kashmir, the DGP Swain said security issue is an important factor for J&K Police in the upcoming LS polls. "Election Commission of India (ECI)

Election Commission makes fresh electoral bonds data public

NEW DELHI, Mar 17 (Agencies): The Election Commission on Sunday made public fresh data on electoral bonds, which was previously submitted to the Supreme Court in sealed covers, following a directive from the apex court to make it available to the public.

"The Election Commission of India has today uploaded the data received in digitized form from the registry of the Supreme Court on electoral bonds on its website," the poll panel said in a statement.

The ECI had submitted it in the sealed covers to the Supreme Court and was later asked to put them in the public domain.

Notably, this information pertains to transactions that occurred before April 12, 2019, while details of electoral bonds issued after this date were disclosed by the election commission last week.

"Data so received from political parties was deposited in the Supreme Court without opening sealed covers. In pursuance of the Supreme Court's order dated March 15, 2024, the Registry of the Supreme Court has returned physical copies along with a digitized record of the same in a pen drive in a sealed cover. The Election Commission of India has today uploaded the data received in the digitized form from the registry of the Supreme Court on electoral bonds on its website," the EC state-

ment said.







Hamas-Israel Conflict: Implications on National Security of India

JAMMU, Mar 17: Panun Kashmir organized a Seminar, today, at Press Club Jammu on the topic "Hamas-Israel Conflict-Implications on National Security of India". The Seminar was addressed by eminent security experts including Lt. Gen. KR Rao (Retd) former DG Artillery, Dr. SP Vaid, IPS (Retd) former DGP of Jammu & Kashmir Police, Maj. Gen. Goverdhan Singh Jamwal (Retd), a war veteran, former Commander and Military Secretary to the President of India, and Dr. Ajay Chrungoo, Chairman, Panun Kashmir. Col. Rakesh Aima (Retd) anchored the proceedings.

The panelists were unanimous in suggesting that developments in Gaza are ominous for world-order and pose a grave threat to the world-peace. The terrorist groups, which are controlling territories and ruling the people, especially after take-over in Afghanistan and now Gaza, pose a formidable challenge to the entire civilized world. It is quite obvious that these terror organizations, backed by religious fundamentalism and ideological paradigms, have raised conventional armies, conjured up strength and depth through non-conven-



tional war tactics, and have gained support and sympathy from some select states, political and sectarian groups and the academia.

The panelists warned that a spillover of Gaza has already entered all such states and territories where the supporters and cadres of these ideologies are comfortably placed and have subverted the socio-political space, be it in Africa. Europe or the Indian sub-continent. Their success in stretching the conflict, the optics of mayhem reeked upon victims, mixed with narratives of victimhood and human destruction, have won them supporters and sympathizers. The world seems more divided today than ever before in condemnation and denunciation of what these terrorists organizations have done.

The panelists called upon the Indian state and the citizens to be careful in dealing with this

new spate of radical indoctrination, tactful regroupings of Jihadi outfits and their entrenchment in public and political space. While the panelists seemed satisfied with the Government's handling and response at diplomatic level, they appealed to the Indian state to beef up national security.

Maj. Gen. Goverghan Singh Jamwal lauded the effort of Panun Kashmir in organizing this seminar. He stated that the Hamas-Israel conflict is likely to get prolonged and shall further embolden elements that stand pitted against the nation-state. He said that in Jammu & Kashmir the scale of terrorist violence is likely to escalate as a spill-over of the Hamas's ability to stretch conflict and inflict destruction on Israel. He appealed to the sections of society in Jammu & Kashmir to stand united against the forces of destabilization. Taking pride in the sacrifices of his ancestors, the valiant Dogras, for protecting the stretching the boundaries of the J&K State to Tibet and Central Asia, he urged that the Dogra valour and cerebral abilities of Kashmiri Pandits must collaborate in order to recreate that era of peace and harmony for which the Dogra Rule is remembered.

He assured that the day will not be far when the Hindus of Kashmir shall get back their Homeland.

Dr. SP Vaid, IPS, said that the Hamas Israel conflict has serious implications for the security of the world in general and India in particular. He stated that prolonged conflict could lead to increased radicalization in the world and Indian subcontinent. "Already we have Pan Islamic terrorists organizations like ISIS, AI Qaeda, Lashkar-e-Taiba and JeM in India 's neighborhood who also subscribe to radical Islamist ideology like that of Hamas and could lead to increasing radicalisation of the youth in the region and more serious terrorists attacks like the Mumbai attack already faced by people of this country. It could also impact serious disruptions of fuel and food supplies leading to problems of fuel security and inflation", said the former DGP who also categorically stated that the radical ideologies and thought process pose serious threat to whole humanity and world peace and world must unite to take steps to contain it. "What happened in Israel on 7th October 2023 was barbaric and brutal and all sane persons in the world condemned it" said Dr. Vaid.

How I lost the debate with Mr Development

larmed by the mad love being showered Alove being showered on a movie called Manjummel Boys, on the seventh of March, I posted something on Facebook. I must confess that, while it came from my own love of all things quiet, I also have a personal stake, sort of, in Kodaikanal. My plant-loving, environmentalist in-laws have lived there for nearly half a century, and watched Kodaikanal slowly wither away in front of their eyes despite their tireless efforts along with a small group of people who care.

My post went something like

"I don't care what anyone says but I won't watch Manjummel Boys. On principle.

I hear it's based on a true story, a survival drama, in which a gang of boys (men, really) go to a remote place, a location popularised in a movie, trespass into a prohibited area, and pay the price.

Here are the reasons why:

- 1. Any movie that romanticises all-male groups and bonding is a no-no for me. No good has ever come of a large, unsupervised group of men on holiday, irrespective of where they congregate.
- 2. The movie paeanised in Manjummel Boys is Guna, a '90s film in which the protagonist, a mentally unstable stalker, kidnaps a girl and

holds her hostage in the cave that the group of men in the present film go to. This cave is off the town of Kodaikanal, TN.

3. Kodaikanal, the hapless, once idyllic, hill town in the Western Ghats has, of late, been abused so brutally by tourism that its unique, priceless flora and fauna is in grave danger. Illegal construction and deforestation have led, for instance, to herds of gaur straying into town, endangering both themselves and the townsfolk. The unceasing efforts of environmental activists have had little or no effect. The biggest perpetrators, other than the people of Kodaikanal's home state themselves, have been the lovely folk (mostly loud, drunken, unhinged all-male groups) of neighbouring states.

4. We live in a world today where it has become a rite of passage for jobless men to emulate the protagonists of movies. Poor Kodaikanal, thanks to the success of this movie, will see a doubling of large, ugly, noisy, all-male gangs on bikes and in vans, hell-bent on causing even more damage on this struggling hill town in the name of nostalgia and male-bonding, leaving empty bottles, bewildered animals, terrified women and a devastated landscape in their wake."

A few people liked my post. Many didn't. I was somewhat luckier, thanks to my obscurity no doubt, than poor Jeyamohan, the Tamil writer, whose piece (ninth of March, on his blog) that carried similar sentiments earned him no fans.

But just as I was thanking my guardian angel, my old pal, S.K., invited me for a drink. I've found that whenever I say something about the environment, poverty, unemployment, stray dogs, orphan children, anything at all with a whiff of humanity, somehow, S.K. The Businessman invites me for a drink.

'Why do you write such rubbish, da?' was his opening gambit. I had barely tasted the Talisker he was buying.

Before I could respond, he showed me three articles in quick succession on how tourism had doubled in Kodaikanal even though it was off-season, and how local businesses were rejoicing at the inflow of revenue. Just as I had predicted in my piece, sigh.

"This is development. You can't stop it," he told me, tapping his phone with the authority of one who had experienced much development. "How do you expect the owner of the tea stall to survive if there is no tourism? This is nature."

Nature it wasn't, but I nodded and ordered my second. I might as well, I figured, because there was no way I was going to win this

argument.

As S.K. provided evidence of the hundred ways in which I was an idiot, I thought of why the very idea of anything that questioned the sacred cow of continuous, exponential growth scared businessmen even more than a visit from the ED guys. S.K. was an engineer, for god's sake. How could anything, even that holiest of holies, Business, keep doing a 45 degree ascent on the time-turnover chart, till the end of time? Even Arjuna's arrow aimed at the sky, fuelled by Veda Vyasa's mythic prowess, no less, descended to Mother Earth, did it not?

Didn't someone say what goes up must come down? Perhaps this is the time. For things to come down. Even Business. There, I said it. Maybe it should have come down yesterday. Or the day before. And given way to a tree or two.

"If you continue this kind of thinking," I heard my friend say as if from far away, "we'll have to go back to prehistoric times..."

I imagined my friend as a prehistoric man. His first words, when early human language consisted of grunts, clucks and growls, would have been "cash flow". And his cave drawing would have been a pie chart of his share of bear meat versus how much went to the rest of the cave.

Who will corner the Matua vote? Seat for Nirmala a poser for BJP

hey may be political adversaries but Prime ▲ Minister Narendra Modi and West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee have something in common. Both are averse to sharing the stage with anyone else, making sure they alone remain in the spotlight. Take the case of Mamata Banerjee. More than a week after she kickstarted the Lok Sabha poll campaign with an impressive public rally at Kolkata's Brigade Parade Grounds, everyone is still talking about her ramp walk at the venue when she strode in solo before going on to deliver her speech.

It was on this occasion that she announced the names of the 42 candidates being fielded by the Trinamul Congress for the upcoming Lok Sabha elections. After the rally, she walked out with these 42 candidates in tow. Significantly, Abhishek Banerjee, the Chief Minister's nephew and political heir, did not walk beside her but was among the chosen candidates even though he was the other star speaker at the rally. The message was clear: Mamata Banerjee is the leader and everyone else is either a follower or an apprentice.

It was no surprise when foreign secretary Vinay Mohan Kwatra got a six-month extension as both Prime Minister Narendra Modi and external

affairs minister S. Jaishankar are known to have a soft spot for him. Not only is Kwatra ideologically aligned with the current dispensation, he also keeps a low profile. Now that Mr Kwatra's extension is through, South Block mandarins are busy speculating about the next Indian ambassador to the United States. If the buzz in bureaucratic circles is to be believed, deputy national security advisor Vikram Misri is a frontrunner for this coveted post. Mr Misri, who has earlier served as India's envoy to China, is also said to be in Mr Modi and Mr Jaishankar's good books. Meanwhile, former Indian ambassador to the US Taranjit Singh Sandhu, looks set for a political career with the BJP. He is being tipped for a Lok Sabha ticket from Amritsar. His senior colleague and former foreign secretary Harsh Shringla has already launched a mass contact programme in Darjeeling as he is in the running for a BJP ticket from there.

The Modi government's decision to notify the Citizenship (Amendment) Act rules ahead of the upcoming Lok

Sabha election was taken with the primary purpose of further consolidating the support of West Bengal's Matua community which has been pushing for the implementation of this law. Predictably, the news about the notification was greeted with loud

cheers and celebrations, led by Union minister of state for shipping Shantanu Thakur who has taken up the cause of the Matua community' s demand for citizenship. But confusion soon set in regarding the application process. While Thakurnagar residents from the Matua community are weighing the risk of applying for citizenship under the new rules, the junior minister's local office has told them it is trying to figure out what the form

figure out what the form requires and the consequences of submitting an application. Taking advantage of this lack of clarity, the TMC has pointed out that an applicant will be required to submit his or her father's birth certificate.

West Bengal CM Mamata Banerjee has described the form as legally dubious while pointing out that, like many others, she, too, does not have her father's birth certificate.

While several RS members have been fielded for the LS polls by the BJP, its leadership is struggling to find a winnable seat for finance minister Nirmala Sitharaman. There were strong rumours till a week ago that she could be fielded from a constituency in Bengaluru. However, those rumours have died down. Karnataka BJP leaders say the state unit had told the party bosses in Delhi that Sitharaman's candidature from the state may not be

received well and could even damage the party's prospects on other seats. They maintained that Sitharaman's outsider tag could prove to be a big negative as both the BJP and Congress have invoked Kannada pride in recent poll campaigns. More importantly, the state unit felt Sitharaman's silence on Karnataka's woes over the Cauvery waters issue, coupled with her Tamil identity, could prove to be a negative. BJP insiders now say Ms Sitharaman may be fielded from Tamil Nadu or AP, another state she has represented in the Rajya Sabha.

How the mighty have fallen. Once an important member of the Congress leadership's inner coterie, Suresh Pachouri has been reduced to another face in the crowd following his recent induction into the BJP. If Pachouri thought he would enjoy the same prominence here as he did in the Congress, he was mistaken. A recent photograph of a party function in MP says it all. It shows the present and former chief minister, flanked by several smiling BJP state leaders, while Pachouri can barely be spotted in the last row. This is a far cry from his long association with the Congress which rewarded Pachouri with several terms in Rajya Sabha and entrusted him with key assignments even though he has never been a mass leader.

Sara Ali Khan, Shruti Haasan, Fatima Sana Shaikh dazzle on day 4 of Lakme Fashion Week



Tom Cruise uses helicopters to overcome roadworks during 'Mission: Impossible 8' filming


Nothing can stop Hollywood royalty Tom Cruise if he has set his mind to filming some of the most nerve-racking sturts

International students at Gujarat University attacked for offering namaz in hostel; 2 hospitalised

FIR registered against 20-25 people, nine teams of security personnel formed to conduct probe into the incident

AHMEDABAD, Mar 17 (Agencies): Students hailing from different foreign countries were assaulted allegedly by a group of persons in the Gujarat University hostel in Ahmedabad for offering namaz in the facility's building, police said on Sunday.

Two students - one from Sri Lanka and another from Tajikistan - were hospitalised after the incident which took place on Saturday night, they said.

An FIR was registered against 20-25 people and nine teams of security personnel were formed to conduct a probe into the incident, Police Commissioner GS Malik said.

The incident was reported at around 10.50 pm on Saturday when nearly two dozen people barged into the (governmentrun) Gujarat University's hostel and raised an objection to stu-



dents from Afghanistan, Uzbekistan and other countries offering namaz in the facility where they stayed, Malik said.

There are around 300 international students enrolled at the Gujarat University, including from Afghanistan, Tajikistan, Sri Lanka and countries in Africa, he said

Nearly 75 of the international

students stay in the A-block hostel of the university where the incident occurred, the official said.

"Some 20-25 people entered the hostel premises and objected to the international students offering namaz there, asking them to do so in a mosque. They argued over the issue, assaulting them and hurling stones,"

Malik said.

The police responded within minutes after a call was made to the control room at 10.51 pm. A police van reached the spot and action was taken, he said.

Two students -- one from Sri Lanka and another from Tajikistan -- have been hospitalised. he said

An FIR was registered against 20-25 people and they will be arrested soon, Malik said, adding the situation was under control.

Nine teams have been formed, including four from the crime branch and five from local police under DCP, to conduct a probe into the case, he said.

All those involved in the incident will be arrested, the official said, adding the case will be monitored by the joint commissioner of police (crime).

1 killed, 13 injured as truck falls into Goa valley; CM Pramod Sawant, minister rush to help victims

PANAJI, Mar 17 (Agencies): One person was killed and 13 others were seriously injured after a truck fell into a valley in Goa, police said on Sunday, as Chief Minister Pramod Sawant who was passing by the spot rushed to help the victims.

The accident took place near Quepem town in South Goa district on Saturday night.

Goa CM Sawant and state social welfare minister Subhash Phal Desai, who were passing by the spot after participating in poll campaign, got down from their cars to help the victims.

Sawant, who is an Ayurvedic doctor, checked the pulse of the victims, while Phal Desai got down into the valley and helped in pull-



ing out the victims from the accident-hit vehicle. A senior police official

said the victims were sitting on the truck's car-

The driver lost control over the wheels following which the truck turned turtle and fell into the valley, he said, adding the victims got trapped inside the vehi-

One person died on the spot while 13 others. including five children, as many men and three

women, were seriously injured, he said.

CM Sawant and minister Phal Desai joined the rescue work along with the police, fire and emergency services personnel and locals.

The injured persons were taken out of the truck and Phal Desai accompanied them while they were being shifted to the Goa Medical College and Hospital near Panaji in ambulance and police vehicles, the official said.

Rahul Gandhi Liability For INDIA Opposition Bloc, Says BJP's Mukhtar Naqvi

KOLKATA, Mar 17 (Agencies): Senior BJP leader Mukhtar Abbas Nagvi feels Congress leader Rahul Gandhi is the biggest liability of the opposition bloc and warned that several opposition parties could risk losing recognition from the Election Commission after defeat at the hands of the Narendra Modi-led BJP in the upcoming Lok Sabha polls.

The former Union minority affairs minister tried to dispel fears revolving around the implementation of CAA by saying, "Not a single Indian citizen, including Muslims, would be affected by the new legislation" and accused the opposition of trying to create communal conflict and confusion across the country.

In an interview to agency, Mr Naqvi predicted a decisive victory for the BJP government for a third consecutive term, citing a widespread loss of faith among the populace in opposition parties, particularly the Congress.

He criticised opposition bloc INDIA, saying it lacks coherent leadership and policies, with internal conflicts and ambitions hindering its effectiveness.

"INDIA bloc is a challenge for their allies and not the BJP. There is a lot of conflict and confusion among them as there is neither any leadership nor any clear policy. Everybody has prime ministerial ambition. People don't want a remotecontrolled government by the Congress, which is the biggest ally. It has no visibility on the ground," he said.

Regarding the leadership crisis within the opposition, Mr Nagvi singled out Rahul Gandhi as a liability for the INDIA bloc, suggesting that the opposition's frustration is evident in their rhetoric.



He said, "Rahul Gandhi is a liability of the opposition bloc INDIA. Now, their depression over imminent defeat is visible through their abuses which reflect their frustration. INDIA bloc in no way is a challenge to the BJP." Mr Naqvi suggested that post-election, several political parties may struggle to maintain their recognition due to low vote counts.

He said, "The mood of the nation is very clear that they will defeat those political parties which are creating hurdles in the path of good governance." "Several political parties after the Lok Sabha polls will make rounds to the Election Commission to protect their recognition (as the votes garnered will be so less than the prescribed norms for having recognition)," he added.

Mocking the opposition bloc over its allies such as JD(U) and RLD deserting it, Mr Naqvi said the Congress wants to rule by the "virtue of dynasty, deputation (whom they will decide) and dictation (who will work as per their whims)." "And whichever coalition has not acted as per their dictation such as Chandra Sekhar or Chaudhury Charan Singh or HD Deve Gowda government, the Congress has ensured the fall of that govern-

ment," he said. The former minister dismissed the opposition's concerns about the CAA and the speculation about a National Register of Citizens (NRC), calling them fear-mongering tactics aimed at stirring communal tensions for political gain.

Hitting out at the opposition for trying to create "communal confusion" in the country over their false propaganda over CAA, Mr Naqvi claimed, "Every section of minorities including the Muslims is safe and secure in India. The CAA is not about omitting or taking away anybody's citizenship. It is about giving persecuted religious minorities from neighbouring countries citizenship." "It is a conspiracy for creating communal confusion by merchants of lies (opposition) at the merit of truth," he said.

As per the Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA), rules of which were notified on Monday, the government will now start granting Indian nationality to persecuted non-Muslim migrants -- Hindus, Sikhs, Jains, Buddhists, Parsis and Christians -from Pakistan, Bangladesh, and Afghanistan who arrived in India before December 31, 2014.

Refuting speculation over NRC that it is going to be a possible follow-up, which had triggered fear among the minorities, Mr Naqvi said such fears are unwarranted.

"The opposition is creating fear psychosis based on speculation that after CAA, NRC will be implemented. The opposition presuming that NRC will also be brought in is trying to create communal conflict to pursue vote bank politics," he said.

Mr Naqvi said the Muslim community has realised the development work the BJP government has ushered in the last 10 years.

"Muslims have realised that PM Modi has not discriminated against them in terms of development. Before 2014, a communal campaign was run against Modi that the Muslims would be in danger if he came to power.

Now the Muslims, too, have realised that those were completely false," he said.

Mr Naqvi said maintaining communal harmony in the country is one of the biggest achievements of the Modi government, as the "secular commitments of the BJP as per the constitution are much higher than the previous Congress government". Lambasting the Congress, the Left and the Trinamool Congress, he said Prime Minister Modi's "mathematics of inclusive work has spoiled the chemistry of the feudal families"

"We have delivered development with dignity and empowerment without appeasement. In today's date, Modi's secular commitment as per the constitution is much higher than that of former Prime Ministers Jawaharlal Nehru and Indira Gandhi," he said.

Alleging that the country witnessed an "era of policy paralysis" during the successive Congress governments, Naqvi said Modi has destroyed "corruption and dynastic politics and has delivered a new era of development." By destroying the "custom of corruption and dynastic politics", Modi has become a global brand of "perform, reform and transform through his commitment to good governance and inclusive empowerment," Naqvi said.

"The mood of the nation is that the BJP government led by Narendra Modi is going to return to power for the third consecutive term. Be it welfare policies, national security, and good governance, the Modi government has set new records in every sector. Now terrorist attacks every month in parts of the country are a thing of the past," he said.

Mild tremor hits Kutch in Gujarat; no casualty



AHMEDABAD, Mar 17 (Agencies): A mild tremor of 3.3 magnitude hit Gujarat's Kutch district shortly after midnight on Sunday, the Institute of Seismological Research (ISR) said.

The tremor was recorded at 12.12 am with its epicentre 22 km east-south east of Khavda, the Gandhinagar-based institute said in its latest update.

District authorities said no casualty or

damage to property was reported. Kutch district is located in a very high risk seismic zone, where earthquakes of lower intensity occur regularly. This

month, Kutch has so far witnessed three tremors. The district recorded a tremor of 3.2 magnitude on March 5 and of 3.5 inten-

sity on March 11, as per the ISR record. The 2001 earthquake in Kutch was the third largest and second most destructive in India over the last two centuries.

Around 13,800 persons were killed and 1.67 lakh injured, while a large number of towns and villages in the district suffered almost complete destruc-

ED summoned Kejriwal in 'fake' case linked to Delhi Jal Board: Atishi

NEW DELHI, Mar 17 (Agencies): Senior AAP Leader and Delhi minister Atishi on Sunday said the Enforcement Directorate has sent Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal a fresh summons to join its probe in a "fake" case linked to the Delhi Jal Board.

"Nobody knows what this DJB (Delhi Jal Board) case is about. This seems to be a backup plan to arrest Kejriwal anyhow and stop him from campaigning for the Lok Sabha polls," she claimed at a press conference here.

Atishi said two summonses asking Kejriwal to appear before the federal agency next week were received hours after the Lok Sabha poll date announcement on Saturday.

One of them is related to the excise policy case and the other to the DJB, she added.

The AAP leader charged that the BJP was using ED and CBI as its "goons" to finish off political opponents.

There was no immediate reaction from the ED and the CBI on this.

Directorate (ED) has summoned Chief Minister Kejriwal for questioning on March 18 in a The Enforcement money laundering probe linked to alleged irregularities in the DJB.


This is the second case registered under the anti-money laundering law in which the 55-year-old politician, also the Aam Aadmi Party national convenor, has been summoned.

Man with criminal record murdered in Pune; hunt on for assailants



PUNE, Mar 17 (Agencies): A 31-year-old man having multiple criminal cases against him has been hacked to death after being shot at allegedly by eight persons in Maharashtra's Pune district, police said on Sunday.

The incident, which took place on Saturday night in Indapur area, seems to be the fallout of a previous enmity, they said.

The deceased has been identified as Avinash Dhanve and the police have found CCTV footage of the incident. "We have identified eight assailants through the CCTV footage and teams have been mobilised to apprehend them," a senior official from Pune rural police said.

"Dhanve, who had multiple cases against him, was shot at and hacked to death," he

A previous enmity with a rival group seems to be the reason behind the killing, the official said, adding that an investigation is on into the incident.

Putin poised to rule Russia for 6 more years after election with no other real choices



MOSCOW, Mar 17 (Agencies): Russian President Vladimir Putin is poised to extend nearly a quarter century of rule for six more years on Sunday after wrapping up an election that gave voters no real alternatives to an autocrat who has ruthlessly cracked down on dissent.

The three-day election that began Friday has taken place in a tightly controlled environment where no public criticism of Putin or his war in Ukraine is allowed. Putin's fiercest political foe, Alexei Navalny, died in an Arctic prison last month, and other critics are either in jail or in exile.

The 71-year-old Russian leader faces three token rivals from Kremlin-friendly parties who have refrained from any criticism of his 24-year rule or his full-scale invasion of Ukraine two years ago. Putin has boasted of Russian battlefield successes in the run-up to the vote, but a massive Ukrainian drone attack across Russia early Sunday sent a reminder of challenges faced by Moscow.

The Russian Defence Ministry reported downing 35 Ukrainian drones overnight, including four near the Russian capital. Moscow Mayor Sergei Sobyanin



said there were no casualties or damage.

Russia's wartime economy has proven resilient, expanding despite bruising Western sanctions. The Russian defence industry has served as a key growth engine, working around the clock to churn out missiles,

tanks and ammunition.
Russia's scattered opposition
has urged those unhappy with
Putin or the war to express their
protest by coming to the polls at
noon on Sunday. The strategy
was endorsed by Navalny not
long before his death.

Voting is taking place at polling stations across the vast country's 11 time zones, in illegally annexed regions of Ukraine, and online. Despite tight controls, at least a half-dozen cases of vandalism at polling stations

were reported Friday and Saturday.

A 50-year-old university professor was imprisoned Saturday for 15 days after she tried to throw green liquid into a ballot box in the Urals city of Ekaterinburg, local news site Ura.ru reported.

In Podolsk, a town close to Moscow, a woman was fined 30,000 rubles (\$342) and charged with "discrediting the Russian army" after spoiling her ballot with an unspecified message, according to OVD-Info, a police monitoring group.

Ahead of the election, Putin cast his war in Ukraine, now in its third year, as a life-or-death battle against the West seeking to break up Russia.

Putin has boasted about recent gains in Ukraine, where

Russian troops have made slow advances relying on their edge in firepower. Ukraine has fought back by intensifying cross-border shelling and raids, and by launching drone strikes deep inside Russia.

Air raid sirens sounded multiple times Saturday in the Russian border city of Belgorod, where two people were killed by Ukrainian shelling, regional Gov. Vyacheslav Gladkov said.

Russia's Defence Ministry said it had thwarted attempts to enter the country by "Ukrainian sabotage and reconnaissance groups," following claims by Ukraine-based Russian opponents of the Kremlin last week that they had made an armed incursion into the Belgorod and Kursk regions.

Western leaders have derided the election as a travesty of democracy.

Beyond the lack of options for voters, the possibilities for independent monitoring are very limited. No significant international observers were present. Only registered, Kremlin-approved candidates, or state-backed advisory bodies, can assign observers to polling stations, decreasing the likelihood of independent watchdogs.

Suspected attack by Yemen's Houthi rebels target ship in Gulf of Aden

DUBAI, Mar 17 (Agencies): A suspected attack by Yemen's Houthi rebels targeted a ship early Sunday in the Gulf of Aden, potentially marking their latest assault on shipping through the crucial waterway leading to the Red Sea.

The British military's United Kingdom Maritime Trade Operations centre offered few details in an announcement about the attack, saying only it happened off the coast of Aden, the port city in southern Yemen home to the country's exiled government.

The Houthis have launched repeated drone and missile attacks in the same area, disrupting energy and cargo shipments through the Gulf of Aden.

The rebels did not immediately claim responsibility for the attack, though it typically takes the Houthis several hours before acknowledging their assaults.

Separately, the US military's Central Com-

mand said it carried out a series of strikes targeting the Houthis. It said it destroyed five drone boats and one drone before take-off from Houthi-controlled territory in Yemen on Saturday. It was an unusually high number of drone boats to be destroyed.

Separately, the US military shot down one Houthi drone over the Red Sea, while another was "presumed to have crashed".

"There were no reports of damage or injuries from ships in the vicinity," Central Command said.

The Houthis have attacked ships since November, saying they want to force Israel to end its offensive in the Gaza Strip against Hamas.

The ships targeted by the Houthis, however, largely have had little or no connection to Israel, the US or other nations involved in the war. The rebels have also fired missiles toward Israel, though they have largely fallen short or been

The assaults on shipping have raised the profile of the Houthis, who are members of Islam's minority Shiite Zaydi sect, which ruled Yemen for 1,000 years until 1962.

A report Thursday claimed the Houthis now have a hypersonic missile, potentially increasing that cachet and putting more pressure on Israel after a cease-fire deal failed to take hold in Gaza before the Muslim holy month of Ramadan. Hypersonic missiles

Hypersonic missiles would pose a more serious threat to American and allied warships in the region.

Earlier in March, a Houthi missile struck a commercial ship in the Gulf of Aden, killing three of its crew members and forcing survivors to abandon the vessel. It marked the first fatal attack by the Houthis on shipping.

Other recent Houthi actions include an attack last month on a cargo ship carrying fertiliser that later sank after drifting for several days.

21 dead in bus collision with tanker in Afghanistan: provincial official

KABUL, Mar 17 (Agencies): Twenty-one people were killed and 38 injured in southern Afghanistan's Helmand province on Sunday when a bus collided with an oil tanker and a motorbike, a provincial official said.

"Early in the morning today, based on the information we have received so far, 21 people were killed" in an accident "between a passenger bus, a tanker, and a motorbike", the provincial governor's spokesman

Mohammad Qasim Riyaz told agency.

Another 38 people were injured in the collision, the provincial information department said, updating an initial tally of 11 provided by Riyaz.

The collision caused the vehicles to ignite, with images shared by the Helmand information department on social media showing charred, twisted metal and the crushed cabin of the tanker.

The accident took place early Sunday

morning on a main highway between the capital Kabul and northern Herat City in the Grishk district of Helmand.

Deadly traffic accidents are common in Afghanistan, due in part to poor roads, dangerous driving on highways, and lack of regulation.

In December 2022, an oil tanker overturned and caught fire in Afghanistan's highaltitude Salang pass, killing 31 people and leaving dozens more with burn injuries.

Donald Trump says US democracy would end, warns of 'bloodbath' if he's not elected

VANDALIA, Mar 17 (Agencies): Former US President Donald Trump has said American democracy would likely come to an end if he does not win November's presidential election. He also said it would be a "bloodbath" for the whole country if he did not get elected.

Trump's remarks came after he reiterated that his 2020 election defeat to Democratic President Joe Biden was the result of election fraud.

"If we don't win this election, I don't think you're going to have another election in this country," Trump said in Dayton, during an outdoor speech that was whipped by strong winds and punctuated by some profane language.



In the middle of a section in his speech about placing tariffs on imported cars, and foreign competition for the US auto industry, Trump also said, "If I don't get elected, it's going to be a bloodbath for the whole country."

Later, in clarification, his campaign pointed to a post on the social media platform X by a New York Times journalist, which said Trump's "bloodbath" comment came amid a discussion about the US auto industry

and the economy, news agency reported.

During his opening remarks, the former US President paid tribute to his supporters who are currently in jail for rioting at the US Capitol on January 6, 2021, as they sought to block certification of Biden's 2020 election win.

Trump saluted and called them "patriots" and "hostages".

Trump, who is under criminal indictment in Georgia for trying to overturn the result of the 2020 election there, this week won enough delegates to mathematically clinch the Republican nomination.

A general election rematch with Biden is likely to be extremely close.

Imran Khan demands high treason proceedings against Pakistan poll mandate thieves

ISLAMABAD, Mar 17 (Agencies): Pakistan's jailed former prime minister Imran Khan has sought high treason proceedings against officials who allegedly stole the people's mandate in the February general elections.

Khan's remarks came as he spoke to reporters after the hearing of the Al-Qadir Trust corruption case in which his wife Bushra Bibi, aide Farah Gogi and property tycoon Malik Riaz are also implicated.

The February 8 elections in Pakistan were marred by the allegations of vote rigging.

Though more than 90 independent candidates backed by Khan's Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) won the maximum number of seats in the National Assembly, the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) led by former prime minister Nawaz Sharif and the Pakistan Peo-



ple's Party (PPP) led by former foreign minister Bilawal Bhutto struck a post-poll deal and formed a coalition government in the country. PTI says the new government was formed by stealing its mandate.

Khan claimed that his party bagged over 30 million votes whereas the rest of the 17 political parties jointly secured the same number of votes, Dawn newspaper reported.

He said his party took up the irregularities in polls with the International Monetary Fund (IMF) and that non-government organisations also pointed out flaws in the electoral process.

Meanwhile, a protest was held outside the IMF headquarters in the US against the alleged rigging in the polls.

Khan, 71, in his remarks, endorsed the demonstration outside the IMF office but distanced himself from the anti-Army slogans raised by the protesters.

"First, the PTI was denied its electoral symbol of bat under a conspiracy and then the former ruling party was deprived of its share of reserved seats," Khan said, as he sought high treason proceedings against officials who stole the people's mandate.

The theft of the mandate was akin to treason, which attracted Article 6 of the Constitution, the politician said.

He said the order of the Peshawar High Court (PHC) on reserved seats would be challenged in the Supreme Court, adding that the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) could not allocate PTI's seats to other political parties.

In a huge blow to PTI, the PHC on Thursday unanimously rejected the Sunni Ittehad Council's petition challenging the election commission's decision to allocate reserved seats for women and minorities in the national and provincial legislatures meant for it to other parties. PTI-backed independents, who won the February 8 elections, joined the Sunni Ittehad Council, a political alliance of Islamic political and Barelvi religious parties in Pakistan, to get a share of the reserved seats.

Khan said the election was a fixed match in which the "ECP and the caretaker government ware hand in along"

were hand in glove".

A few political parties and the establishment "sabotaged the plan to bring in electronic voting", he said.

Ukraine drones attack refinery, target Moscow, disrupt power, Russia says

MOSCOW, Mar 17 (Agencies): Ukraine launched 35 drones against broad areas of Russia, sparking a brief fire at an oil refinery, targeting Moscow and disrupting electricity in border areas, Russia said early on Sunday, the final day of the country's presidential vote, opens new tab.

Moscow accuses Kyiv of election sabotage with its days of strikes on Russian infrastructure, one of the most sweeping air operations on Russian territory since President Vladimir Putin ordered the invasion of neighbouring Ukraine two years ago.

Putin, all but certain to win re-election, has vowed to punish Ukraine for the attacks.

Ukraine's President Volodymyr Zelenskiy thanked his military forces and intelligence for new "long-range capabilities" in his nightly video address on Saturday, without mentioning the reported intensified attacks by his nation's forces.

The Russian defence ministry posted on the Telegram messaging app on Sunday that 17 drones were destroyed over the southern Russian region of Krasnodar, four over the Moscow region and the rest over six other regions.

"The drones were neutralised, but a fire broke out as a result of the fall of one of the devices," the operational headquarters of the Krasnodar region in southern Russia said on Telegram.

The fire at the Slavyansk refinery in Krasnodar was extinguished and there were no casualties as a result of the fire,

although preliminary information indicated one person had died of a heart attack, the administration said.

Roman Siniagovskyi, head of the Slavyansk administrative district, said on Telegram refinery workers were evacuated and there was no threat to nearby populated areas from the inci-

dent.
The Slavyansk refinery, some 70 km (45 miles) north of Krasnodar, processes around 4.5 million metric tons of crude a year, producing fuel mainly for exports, but also sells some gasoline on the domestic market.

Moscow Mayor Sergei Sobyanin said there were no casualties or damage reported from the drones shot down over three districts near Moscow.

North of Moscow four drones were destroyed over the Yaroslavl region, with no damage or injuries reported, Governor Mikhail Yevrayev said on Telegram.

In the border region of Belgorod, an attack by four Ukraine-launched drones damaged electricity and gas lines in one village, said Governor Vyacheslav Gladkov.

Russia's defence ministry said Russian forces also shot down 12 rockets launched from Ukraine towards the Belgorod region on Sunday.

As Russia was facing attacks from Ukraine, Kyiv's military said on Sunday that Russian air attacks had damaged agricultural enterprises and destroyed several industrial buildings in the Black Sea port of Odesa overnight.

us," Wong said on social media platform Instagram, alongside a photo of her and Allouache in wedding attire and holding a bouquet of flowers.

Wong and Allouache have been together for nearly two decades and tied the knot on Saturday at a winery in Adelaide, the capital of South Australia,

HYDERABAD, Mar 17 (Agencies): Megha Engineering and Infrastructure Ltd (Meil), the second biggest electoral bond donor, has an unusual debt profile.

The little-known infrastructure company has an outstanding debt of Rs 11,422 crore, or approximately \$1.37 billion. This isn't a startling number for an infrastructure company, but what stands out in Meil's case is that 98% of the outstanding debt was added in just five months of 2023. Between July and December 2023, the company went on a debt binge raising a neat sum of Rs 11,252

Prior to that, Meil's debt barely exceeded Rs 1,000 crore in any given year over the past 18 years with just one exception. It was in 2013 that its debt stood at a princely sum of Rs 8,721 crore, which it duly paid off in

Though the company has projects worth an enviable Rs 1.87 lakh crore spread across 20 states and two union terri-



tories, as per Crisil Research, it maintained a rather low profile. However, the closely held public company came under the national spotlight soon after the Election Commission of India published details of the buyers and beneficiaries of electoral

According to India Ratings, its FY24 revenue is estimated at Rs 35,000 crore. This translates to a 10% increase over FY23, when revenue stood at Rs 31.766 crore.

According to data from the Election Commission of India,

CCI probe against Google Play Store billing policy

CHENNAI, Mar 17 (Agencies): The Competition Commission of India (CCI) has ordered an investigation into Google's Play Store billing policy over alleged misuse of market dominance.

The competition watchdog directs the Director General to investigate the matter and submit a report within a period of 60 days on receiving the order. CCI in its order stated Google introduced 'User Choice Billing' (UCB) system, it is offering an illusory choice for users to opt for an alternative billing option next to its existing Google Play's billing system (GPBS).

Google announced that app developers offering digital content can offer alternative billing systems (ABS) alongside GPBS. "The updated policies of Google have been alleged to be discriminatory and unfair which

skew and disrupt competition in the downstream app markets and continue to favour Google's own apps and cement Google's position in the payment processing market as well," CCI noted.

"It has been alleged that Google imposes a service fee/commission model wherein it admittedly makes only 3% of the app developers bear the entire cost of 100% of the app developers on Google Play Store by charging them exorbitant service fee /commission without commensurate additional services." While its earlier billing process was criticised as anticompetitive, In September 2022, Google introduced User Choice Billing pilot where certain changes were made to Play Store's payment policies.

CCI said Google's Play Store billing policies are in violation of Section 4 of the Act and allegedly

impacting app developers, payment processors and users. The commission observed that Google has violated the provisions of Section 4(2)(a), 4(2)(b) and 4(2) (c). Google's service fee is also alleged to be excessive as this commission / fee has no reasonable economic relation to the services provided by Google.

Google's discriminatory policies and excessive fee is likely to cause an appreciable adverse effect on competition (AAEC) in other markets. The informants in the case are People Interactive India Private Limited (PIIPL), which operates brands such as Shaadi.com and Sangam.com, Mebigo Labs Private Limited (Mebigo), which owns Kuku FM and Indian Broadcasting and Digital Foundation (IBDF) and Indian Digital Media Industry Foundation (IDMIF).

Neurological conditions now leading cause of ill health and disability globally: Lancet study

NEW DELHI, Mar 17 (Agencies): Neurological conditions such as epilepsy, Alzheimer's disease and dementia are now the leading cause of ill health and disability globally, affecting 3.4 billion people in 2021, according to a major new analysis published in The Lancet Neurology journal.

Globally, the number of people living with, or dying from, neurological conditions such as stroke, Alzheimer's disease and other dementias, and meningitis has risen substantially over the past 30 years. This is due to the growth and ageing of the global population as well as increased exposure to environmental, metabolic, and lifestyle risk factors, the researchers said.

The study suggests that worldwide, the overall amount of disability, illness, and premature death -- a measurement known as disability-adjusted life years (DALYs) -caused by neurological conditions increased by 18 per cent over the past 31 years, rising from around 375 million years of healthy life lost in 1990 to 443 million years in 2021

The analysis from the Global Burden of Disease, Injuries, and Risk Factors Study (GBD) 2021 shows that the absolute number of DALYs is increasing in large part due to ageing and growing populations worldwide.

The top 10 contributors to neurological health loss in 2021 were stroke, neonatal encephalopathy (brain injury), migraine, Alzheimer's disease and other dementias, diabetic neuropathy (nerve damage), meningitis, epilepsy, neurological complications from preterm birth, autism spectrum disorder, and nervous system cancers, the researchers

said. Neurological consequences of COVID-19 (cognitive impairment and Guillain-Barre syndrome) ranked 20th, accounting for 2.48 mil-

lion years of healthy life lost in 2021, they said.

The most prevalent neurological disorders in 2021 were tension-type headaches (around 2 billion cases) and migraines (about 1.1 billion cases). Diabetic neuropathy is the fastest-growing of all neurological conditions, the researchers said.

"The number of people with diabetic neuropathy has more than tripled globally since 1990, rising to 206 million in 2021," said study co-senior author Liane Ong from the Institute for Health Metrics and Evaluation (IHME), University of Washington,

"This is in line with the increase in the global prevalence of diabetes," Ong said in a statement.

The research builds on previous GBD study to provide the largest and most comprehensive analysis to compare the prevalence and burden of nervous system disorders between countries on a global scale between 1990 and 2021.

"Every country now

has estimates of their neurological burden based on the best available evidence," said study lead author Dr. Jaimie Steinmetz from IHME. "As the world's leading cause of overall disease burden, and with case numbers rising 59 per cent globally since 1990, nervous system conditions must be addressed through effective, culturally acceptable, and affordable prevention, treatment, rehabilitation, and long-term care strate-

gies," Steinmetz said. Over 80 per cent of neurological deaths and health loss occur in low- and middle-income countries (LMICs), the researchers said.

Overall, estimates reveal striking differences in nervous system burden between world regions and national income levels, they

The study shows that in high-income Asia Pacific and Australasia -- regions with the best neurological health -- the rate of DALYs and deaths were under 3,000 and 65 per 100,000 people, respectively in 2021.

In these regions, stroke, migraine, dementia, diabetic neuropathy, and autism spectrum disorders accounted for most health loss, it found.

In the worst-off regions of western and central sub-Saharan Africa, the rate of DALYs and deaths were up to five times higher (over 7,000 and 198 per lakh people respectively) in 2021, with stroke, neonatal encephalopathy (brain injury), dementia, and meningitis the biggest contributors to years of healthy life lost.

"Nervous system health loss disproportionately impacts many of the poorest countries partly due to the higher prevalence of conditions affecting neonates and children under 5, especially birth-related complications and infections," said Tarun Dua, Head of WHO's Brain Health unit and one of the co-senior authors of the study.

"Improved infant survival has led to an increase in long-term disability, while limited access to treatment and rehabilitation services is contributing to the much higher proportion of deaths in these countries," Dua said.

The researchers highlight that, as of 2017, only a quarter of countries globally had a separate budget for neurological conditions, and only around half had clinical guidelines.

The analysis suggests that modifying 18 risk factors over a person's lifetime --most importantly, high systolic blood pressure -- could prevent 84 per cent of global DALYs from stroke.

Estimates also suggest that controlling lead exposure could reduce the burden of intellectual disability by 63 per cent while reducing high fasting plasma glucose to normal levels could reduce the burden of dementia by around 15 per cent.

Men have greater risk of fractures from falls than women: Study

MASSACHUSETTS (US), Mar 17 (Agencies): A recent study titled "A meta-analysis of previous falls and subsequent fracture risk in cohort studies" found links between self-reported falls and increased fracture risk, as well as a slightly greater risk of fracture in men than in women.

Published in Osteoporosis International, this international metaanalysis of data pooled from 46 prospective cohorts comprising over 900,000 individuals also recommended that previous falls are a factor that should be included in patients' histories used by fracture risk assessment tools like FRAX (Fracture Risk Assessment) Tool to calculate a person's likelihood of getting a fracture over the next decade. FRAX is the



most commonly used assessment to predict fracture risk.

"FRAX was developed using longitudinal data from studies around the world. Although previous falls have long been recognised as a significant risk factor for fractures, until now, they have not been factored into the FRAX algorithm," said Douglas P Kiel, MD, MPH, director of Musculoskeletal

Research Centre and senior scientist at Hinda and Arthur Marcus Institute for Aging Research at Hebrew SeniorLife, a nonprofit, Harvard Medical School affiliated institution. "In this newly updated FRAX dataset, previous falls were included as a risk factor and were found to increase the risk for fracture. These findings underscore that falls are

to fracture in both men and women, but interestingly, slightly more in men.

Key findings of the meta-analysis include: Increased Fracture Risk: Individuals with a history of falls within the past year were found to have a significantly higher risk of any clinical fracture, osteoporotic fracture, major osteoporotic fracture, and hip fracture. One or more previous falls were significantly associated with an increased risk of death among women and men.

Sex Disparities: The association between previous falls and fracture risk was observed to vary by sex, with men exhibiting higher predictive values compared to women

Independent Risk Factor: The increased fracture risk linked to previous falls was largely independent of bone mineral density, emphasising the standalone significance of falls as a risk factor. A previous fall in the past year confers a significantly increased risk of any clinical fracture, osteoporotic fracture, and hip fracture with the increase in risk varying between 36 per cent and 59 per cent depending on the fracture outcome and sex.

"These findings underscore the importance of incorporating previous falls into the FRAX algorithm," Dr Kiel added. Integrating this information into tools like FRAX can enhance their predictive accuracy and ultimately help healthcare providers to more accurately predict fracture risk and tailor preventive strategies accordingly to improve patient outcomes.

Covid-19 origin in more probability unnatural than natural, lab leak potential source: New study

an important contributor

The study, findings of which were published in the journal Risk Analysis, said the possibility of a laboratory origin of the Covid pandemic cannot be easily dismissed

NEW DELHI, Mar 17 (Agencies): The Covid-19 pandemic in more probability had an unnatural origin than a natural one with a potential source being a lab accident or leak, according to new research that employed a commonly used risk analysis tool to arrive at this conclusion.

Originally designed to distinguish between natural epidemics and deliberate biological attacks, researchers modified the Grunow-Finke Tool (mGFT) by tweaking the criteria to determine the likelihood of the nature of the pandemic's origin.

The study, findings of which were published in the journal Risk Analysis, said the possibility of a laboratory origin of the Covid pandemic cannot be easily dismissed.

The mGFT tool, previously applied to smaller outbreaks, contains 11 criteria such as intensity and dynamics of the pandemic, including its rapid and unusual geographic spread, an unusual strain of the SARS-CoV-2 coronavirus and peculiarities in clinical symptoms



experienced.

The researchers at the University of New South Wales, Australia, assigned points from one to three to each criterion based on available evidence collected from literature and case data from the public source 'Our World in Data' that gathers information from the WHO, John Hopkins University and official government reports.

Factors such as biological risk of bat virus research at Wuhan Institute of Virology, unusual strain, pandemic intensity and dynamics were assigned points of three, three, and two, respectively, while clinical symptoms was assigned two points.

Each criterion was multiplied by a weighting factor (1-3) to compute a score. A final score of more than 50 per cent favoured unnatural origins, while less favoured natural origins.

The final score that the mGFT algorithm calculated produced a total of 41 out of 60 points. Being more than 50 per cent, the researchers concluded a higher probability of COVID-19 originating unnaturally, with a focus on lab accidents or leaks as potential sources.

Being used in the context of a pandemic for the first time, the researchers said the tool may

require further testing and training. Also, higher scores tend to be assigned to criteria such as pandemic intensity and unusual rapid spread, which can lead to overall high scores favouring unnatural origins.

To minimise subjectivity in scoring, the team's results were reviewed by two other experts.

The researchers said the modified GFT provides a risk analysis framework that can be applied to differentiate between natural and unnatural epidemics and the tool should be included in the toolset for investigating the pandemic's origins.

"The strengths of this study include a more comprehensive analysis of factors ranging from traditional virology, epidemiology, and medical factors to situational and other intelligence," the authors wrote in their study.

"The debate about the origins of SARS-COV-2 has been focused largely on medical evidence but not on other intelligence, which is key to identifying unnatural epidemics," the researchers wrote.

Rohit Sharma Having The Freedom To Walk Out And Bat Will Be Beneficial For Mumbai Indians: Aaron Finch

MUMBAI, Mar 17 (Agencies): With the burden of captaincy off his shoulders, Rohit Sharma will be able to play with a lot of freedom which will help fivetime champions Mumbai Indians, reckoned former Australia T20 skipper Aaron Finch. Hardik Pandya will lead MI this season, replacing Rohit who has led the side to five IPL titles. "I think for Rohit, the challenge would be just walking out and opening the batting as he's done so many times for India and Mumbai over the years. This might be a wipe off for his shoulders," Finch said during Star Sports' Show Game Plan.

"When you are captaining a team constantly, everywhere you go you are captain of the team. You can get engrossed a lot in that, so now having the freedom to walk out and bat will be beneficial for him personally and Mumbai Indians."

Two-time former champions Kolkata Knight Riders had finished seventh in the last edition and Finch hoped they will be able to put up a good show this



time after the addition of Australia pacer Mitchell Starc.

"I think KKR will improve on their last year (performance), they weren't at their best last year. But Shreyas (lyer's) injury cloud would be interesting to see how much of an impact he has throughout the tournament," said Finch, who featured for as many as eight IPL teams, including the Kolkata Knight Riders.

"When you add Mitchell Starc to any T20 team you are going to be better, his ability with the new ball to swing it upfront will provide very valuable wickets... and in the power play, which is so important for the game. And, his death bowling is obviously exceptional as well." Former India allrounder Irfan Pathan

felt Sunrisers Hyderabad could give the captaincy reins to Pat Cummins this season following his exploits for Australia.

Cummins led Australia to the 50-over World Cup title last November and also earned the World Test Championships crown for his country.

"Sunrisers Hyderabad taking punt on Pat Cummins' momentum which is especially good for him from last two seasons, be it the ICC 50-overs World Cup and WTC final and the way he is performing at the international level," he said.

"My doubt is only that his IPL numbers are not that great, eight-and-half economy in the IPL which is quite high for a premier quality fast bowler.

"Hopefully that can change in one season, so Sunrisers Hyderabad will be hoping he will able to come and lead the side to victory, which they haven't got for some time now. But I certainly think that T20 cricket is a different form of game compared to 50 overs and Test cricket."

Rishabh Pant's recovery earlier than anticipated, his background in gymnastics played huge role: NCA staff

NEW DELHI, Mar 17 (Agencies): Rishabh Pant's mental strength and his background in gymnastics has helped the dashing wicketkeeper-batter to make an early recovery.\

Fifteen months after Pant was involved in a horrific car accident on the Delhi-Dehradun highway in December 2022, the wicketkeeper-batter received a green signal to play in the IPL, starting March 22.

"The mental strength and confidence inside him made us give our 100 per cent in doing the rehab part for him," Thulasi Yuvraj, a physiotherapist at the National Cricket Academy told 'bcci.tv'.

"The doctors believed that he may take up to two years. Once he came to NCA, it was like a progressive phase for him," he added.

Pant had dabbled in gymnastics at a young age and that served as an asset in his recovery, according to Nishanta Bordoloi, the strength and conditioning coach at NCA.

"One thing was that Rishabh has a background for gymnastic which was a very big asset for us because there are a few things that come naturally to him," Bordoloi said.

"Anytime he would feel he couldn't move, he could tumble or roll over back to his feet again. Which was so much of an added advantage for him.

"The beginning phase was to get foundational strength in him, making his body understand what the movements are like.

"It's completely reconstructed thing and once it's reconstructed it takes a lot of mind and body connection. The neural system need to understand, the muscle, tendons have to function." he added.

Although Pant left no stone unturned, ticking all the boxes, the 26-year found the rehab

mundane.

"Rehab is very irritating, have to do same thing again and again. But you have to do it

because you don't have any other choice. It's boring but the more you do the better you get," said Pant.

But returning to the cricket field has made him love the sport more than he could imagine

"I feel so happy when I go to the ground. The love of cricket has gone up, I used to love it more than anything before but still there is an increase."

His treating doctor, renowned orthopedic surgeon Dinshaw Pardiwala has credited the NCA staff and the cricketer's extreme motivation for his comeback.

"NCA keeping a physio with him daily. Making sure the determination and intensity was there each and every day. He has returned so quickly, six months earlier than anticipated. It is because of his drive, his extreme motivation and also his expertise in rehab aspect," Pardiwal said.

Indebted to MS Dhoni for the rest of my life: Ashwin



CHENNAI, Mar 17 (Agencies): MS Dhoni, a master of out of the box strategies, flung the new ball to R Ashwin in the IPL 2011 final against Royal Challengers Bangalore and the then rookie off-spinner made an impact in the fourth ball itself, dismissing an in-form Chris Gayle.

That magical Chepauk night for Chennai Super Kings was just a beginning for Ashwin. Well over a decade, a roller-coaster ride has taken him to 100 Tests and 516 wickets in the traditional format.

Ashwin did not forget that moment of trust from Dhoni during a felicitation function organised by the Tamil Nadu Cricket Association (TNCA) to celebrate his twin feat of 500 wickets and a century of Tests, which was completed during the recent home series against England.

"I don't generally search for words to express how I feel. I am truly humbled and grateful to be here," said Ashwin, who was awarded Rs one crore by TNCA for his rare achievements, in a dipped-in-emotion voice.

Giving due credit to his

first IPL skipper Dhoni, Ashwin said: "In 2008 I met all the greats (in CSK dressing room) Mathew Hayden and MS Dhoni. I sat through (IPL) 2008. I was a nobody then, where am I to play in a team that had Muttiah Muralith-

"I am indebted to Dhoni for the rest of my life for what he gave me. He gave me an opportunity with the new ball to go head on with Chris Gayle and 17 years later Anil bhai would be talking about the same episode," he fondly recalled.

Ashwin was roped in as a local spinner in 2008 by CSK but he never got a game as the legendary Muralitharan led their spin attack.

The 37-year-old Chennai man is among the finest thinkers of the game and he has found a way to constantly reinvent himself, resulting in a bagful of wickets in the longest format.

"Anil bhai and Rahul (Dravid) bhai briefly mentioned that. It is very tough to win an argument with me. It is true because I believe argument is one of the greatest pathways to excellence. Argument is never with the person. It is always with the true

learning that comes at the end of it," he said as Kumble watched on from the stage.

Ashwin also thanked a host of Tamil Nadu greats, who were among the gathering, including his first First-Class captain S Badrinath and former batter S Sharath, who is now an India selector.

Ashwin, who is especially lethal against the left-handers, said Sharath helped him become a better bowler against the southpaws.

"This place has given me so much that I want to keep coming back here. People keep asking why do you want to go back. Tomorrow, I might not be alive but my soul will be hanging around this place. This is what this places means to me," added Ashwin.

Huge Injury Concern For MS Dhoni And CSK: Star Set To Be Ruled Out For 4-5 Weeks

CHENNAI, Mar 17 (Agencies): With less than a week left for the start of the Indian Premier League, Defending champions Chennai Super Kings (CSK) have received a huge blow ahead of their opening game against Royal Challengers Bangalore (RCB) on March 22.
