Vehicle overturns in Navyug Tunnel on JammuSrinagar National Highway, all passengers safe

SRINAGAR, Apr 3 (Agencies): A speeding Sports Utility Vehicle (SUV) on Wednesday overturned inside Banihal-Qazigund tunnel along Srinagar-Jammu highway.

However all passenger boarding into the vehicle have been evacuated safely.

An official said that an SUV bearing no. DL7 CS 4042 overturned inside the Navyug tunnel near Qazigund on the Jammu-Srinagar highway. He said no one has been injured in the incident.

The vehicle was coming towards
Jammu, the official said.

He added that all passengers are safe and have been evacuated from the overturned vehicle safely.

Beacon labourer dies of cardiac arrest in Ganderbal

SRINAGAR, Apr 3 (Agencies): A beacon labourer died after suffering cardiac arrest in Railpathri Baltal Area of Central Kashmir Ganderbal district on Tuesday late evening.

An official told news agency Kashmir Scroll that a labourer of Beacon 122 RCC Abdul Rashid Bhat son of Ali Mohammad resident of Kullan Gund fell unconscious at Railpathri Baltal Ganderbal.

He said that the labourer was shifted to PHC Sonamarg where doctors declared him brought dead.

He said that the apparent cause of his death seems to be cardiac arrest while necessary legal action has been intiated.

Home Ministry cancels FCRA registration of Five NGOs for 'Violation' of Laws

NEW DELHI, Apr 3 (Agencies): The Union Home Ministry has cancelled the registration of at least five NGOs for alleged violation of various provisions of the Foreign Contribution Regulation Act, sources said on Tuesday.

The NGOs whose registrations have been cancelled are CNI Synodical Board of Social Service, Voluntary Health Association of India, Indo-Global Social Service Society, Church's Auxiliary for Social Action, and Evangelical Fellowship of India, they said.

With the cancellation of their Foreign Contribution Regulation Act (FCRA) registration, these NGOs will no longer be able to receive



foreign contributions nor utilise the existing available funds.

The sources said the home ministry cancelled the FCRA registration of the NGOs for allegedly utilising funds for works that were not in their mandate.

The NGOs violated the laws by being involved in activities that are con-

trary to the provisions of the FCRA, they said. There were 16,301

NGOs with valid FCRA licences as on July 17, 2023.
The Centre has can-

celled the FCRA licences of more than 6,600 NGOs in the last five years for violation of the law. Overall, FCRA

Gangster shot dead in encounter with Police, Injured officer dies during treatment

JAMMU, Apr 3 (Agencies): A gangster has been shot dead in an exchange of fire with police near Government Medical College (GMC) hospital in Jammu and Kashmir's Kathua, officials said on Wednesday.

Probationary Sub-Inspector Deepak Sharma, who suffered head injuries during the encounter, died during treatment on Wednesday, they said, adding that a special police officer was also injured.

Three OGWs arrested, 7 identified in Rajouri drone delivery case

SRINAGAR, Apr 3 (Agencies): Three people have been arrested for picking up the drone-dropped materials that were coming from across the Pakistan border, police said on Tuesday.

The three Over Ground Worker (OGW) have been identified as Gulshan Naz, a resident of Kotranka (already arrested under the UAPA), Imtiaz Ahmed, and Abid Shah, a resident of Budhal, Rajouri.

The police said that in this regard, the other seven OGWs have also been identified.

Addressing a press conference, J-K DGP RR Swain said, "In a major security development, it becomes important to bring to the public



domain those involved in transporting, hiding and delivering arms, ammunition, cash, and narcotics smuggled through drones from Pakistan."

"Three people were arrested in the case of receiving goods using drones. Searches were conducted at their homes and digital evidence was recovered as to how they used to stay in touch with their handlers in Pakistan. Their forward linkages and





Lok Sabha Elections 2024 | Triangular Fight in the offing in Udhampur



The entry of former Minister G M Saroori on the ticket of his Democratic Azad Party (DPAP) has made it a three-cornered contest.

Though there are 12 candidates in the fray, the real fight is between the BJP candidate and his Congress rival.



Jitendra Singh had retained the Udhampur Lok Sabha seat in 2019, defeating Congress candidate Vikramaditya Singh, the grandson of erstwhile Maharaja Hari Singh, by a margin of 3,53,272 votes. Lal Singh only got 19,049 votes.



In 2014, Jitendra Singh had defeated former Union Minister Ghulam Nabi Azad from the Lok Sabha seat by a margin of 60,976 votes. He was inducted in the Modi Government as the Minister of State in the Prime Minister's Office. Choudhary Lal Singh,



in 2004 and 2009, besides being a three-time former MLA. He switched from the Congress to the BJP in 2014 and was also a Minister in the previous PDP-BJP Government in Jammu and Kashmir that collapsed in June 2018 after the national party pulled out of the alliance. 





HUMAN RIGHTS

T uman rights are indisputable rights because every person on earth is entitled to them as a human being. These rights are available to every human being free from the constraints of his gender, culture, religion, nation, location, caste, creed or economic status. The idea of human rights has been around since human history, although there was considerable variation in the concept in earlier times. At the international level human rights are broadly classified into: civil and political rights and social rights which include economic and cultural rights. It is very important for the simple and normal life of every person that he should get the necessary human rights in every situation. On the basis of these, different types of human rights have been classified. Civil right limits the power of the government with respect to actions that affect the autonomy of the individual. It gives people a chance to participate in the government and contribute to the determination of laws.

These rights direct the government to act in a positive and interventionist manner so that the needs essential for human life and development are met. The government of every country hopes to ensure the well-being of all its citizens. Every person has the right to social security. In today's time, human rights are such a facility, without which our life would become very scary and miserable because without human rights, we can be subjected to all kinds of atrocities and we can be exploited without any fear. In fact, human rights have been very important not only in today's time but also in the entire history of human civilization. Even in India, in ancient times, citizens of many republican states enjoyed many special human rights. West's disquiet about India: Meddling or friendly nudge?

The rumblings were audible in India for months as inves-L tigative agencies like the Enforcement Directorate and the income-tax department had been selectively targeting Opposition leaders and parties. It was expected that once the elections to the Lok Sabha were announced the Model Code of Conduct would compel balanced restraint till the elections were over. However, if anything, the arrest of Delhi chief minister Arvind Kejriwal on March 21 and exaggerated incometax claims from the Congress, the main Opposition party, defied that logic. The un-levelling of the playing field continues under the very nose of the Election Commission.

Germany was the first country to express discomfort over this scenario. India reacted with calculated diplomatic ire, advising the Germans to mind their own business. But when the US state department expressed similar anxiety, the ministry of external affairs first strongly protested, although less stridently, and then followed up by summoning acting US deputy chief of mission Gloria Berbena. India's expectation was that the matter would end there, both sides having appeased public opinion in their respective countries.

However, US state department spokesman Mathew Miller, when asked about the summoning of their diplomat, in seniority next only to the ambassador, had no hesitation in reiterating that "we continue to follow these actions closely, including the arrest of the Delhi CM". Not stopping there, he added that the US was also aware of tax authorities hampering the electioneering ability of the Congress Party by freezing their accounts. Mr Miller concluded that

they "encourage fair, transparent and timely legal processes for each of these issues". Justice and fairness of the proceedings was also emphasised.

Amongst those who were trolled in India was an anchor of a major television channel when he simply tweeted the latest US reaction. This writer's comments a day earlier on a major business television channel, when posted on X and YouTube, generated huge viewership and some acerbic comments. The main line of counterattack by pro-BJP elements was that comments on the fairness of Indian elections by foreign powers was a breach of Indian sovereignty and interference in India's internal affairs. All those reporting such criticism, and especially those pointing out the misuse of the agencies only against government's opponents were anti-national.

This writer, in his social media response, pointed out that the "bhakts", or hardcore BJP supporters, failed to perceive the difference between the government and the nation. Mark Twain's quote captures it perfectly that "loyalty to the country always, loyalty to a government when it deserves it".

The fracas raises the broader question about the validity of the Indian defence that any criticism of the Indian electoral processes is a breach of Indian sovereignty. US President Joe Biden came into office in January 2021 promising a summit of democracies, intending thereby to globally advance the values that the liberal democratic model represents. But the United States has a poor record historically of such evangelism. Late US secretary of state Zbigniew Brzezinski had named his memoir Power and Principle, underscoring the conflict in the conduct of foreign policy between ethics and realpolitik. A case in point is Pakistan. The minute the Soviet Union militarily intervened in Afghanistan in 1979, the US sidelined its ire over Gen. Muhammad Zia-ul Haq's military coup, the hanging of former Prime Minister Zulfigar Ali Bhutto and Pakistan's clandestine nuclear weapons programme. A similar long rope was offered again to military dictator Gen. Pervez Musharraf after Al Qaeda's 9/11 terrorist attack on the United States.

However, India presents a separate case. Even during the Cold War, the US was drawn to India as a citadel of democracy in Asia. Thereafter, India became additionally attractive for its economic rise, huge market, increasing military strength and as a counterfoil to China. But its basic relevance persists as an established democracy, which shares the American commitment to a global liberal democratic order. Prime Minister Narendra Modi has promoted this soft power of India by coinages like India as the "mother of democracies".

Understandably, thus, India's friends among the Western nations get concerned about any democratic slippage in India. In the European Union itself, they have similar anxiety about democratic recession in member nations like Hungary. Brazil, as the 21st century opened, was seen alongside Germany, India and Japan as a natural candidate for permanent membership of the UN Security Council. But after the short and democratically destructive presidency of Jair Bolsonaro, that edge is gone.

On March 28, UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres' spokesman also commented on the Indian elections, hoping in "India, as in any country that is having elections, that everyone's rights are protected, including political and civil rights, and everyone can vote in an atmosphere that is free and fair". India may tell the UN to stick to more pressing issues like the humanitarian crisis in Gaza and the protracted war in Ukraine. However, the fundamental question of partisan conduct by the investigative agencies cannot be ignored.

The Indian legal system is basically sound, but faces questions about its independence. One is symbolised by an anti-Opposition judge of the Calcutta high court quitting overnight to become the BJP's candidate in the forthcoming election. Similarly, an excessive number of sensitive political cases have gone to a Supreme Court judge with past Gujarat government links. This may be a coincidence but the Chief Justice must ensure, as the phrase goes, that "Caesar's wife must be above suspicion".

What can happen next? It is possible that, diplomatic demarches aside, the Indian government realises the damage that it is doing to India's reputation as a robust democracy. It may curb its inexplicable desire to overplay its winning hand, with possibilities of diminished gain. Separately, the highest court may freeze the income-tax orders and also start de-weaponising the Prevention of Money Laundering Act by restricting the detention powers of the ED. A warning signal was one member of the Election Commission suddenly resigning.

Hopefully, like the US institutions defending the democratic framework when defeated incumbent President Donald Trump attempted to subvert the verdict, Indian institutions will not completely wilt. It would be a mistake to ignore warnings from the US and other Western powers as mere bluster. The people of India may be thinking analogously and vote accordingly.

Reasoning questions Numeric Ability: It includes basic mathematics like addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. In some tests, data interpretation is also present which means the interpretation of charts and graphs. The numeric ability can be categorized as a speed test. A speed test means that the questions are very simple and the methods used to solve them are very clear. It is just considered with how many questions you can answer correctly within a given period of time. You are not allowed to use a calculator. The questions included in numeric ability can be of the following types:

Arithmetic questions Sequence and series

Numbers represented by the alphabet

Data interpretation Abstract Reasoning: It includes the questions which have a very little or no application in the real world. The question tests your understanding of patterns and figures and also the similarities and differences between shapes and figures. This test does not require any educational qualification.

Spatial Reasoning: It includes your ability to draw or interpret drawings. It tests your imagination. The question may require you to imagine a given drawing rotated at some angle or visualize a 2-dimensional drawing in a 3-dimensional view. It may also include visual assembly or disassembly of an object. The questions included in spatial reasoning can be of the following types:

Shape matching Group rotation

Combining Shapes 3 dimension views

Maps and plans

Mechanical Reasoning: It tests your knowledge of mechanical and physical concepts.

Your score significantly depends on your knowledge. The various aspects included

in it are: Levers

> Gears Pulleys Electrical circuits

Springs

Fault Diagnosis: It tests your ability to find faults in mechanical and electronic systems. This type of test is taken by those who want to work as technical personnel.

Data Checking: It tests that how accurately and speedily you can find out errors in the given data. Mostly, you would be given two columns of data and you have to find the differences between the two. The data is not much meaningful. This type of test is done for clerical jobs, administrative jobs, or jobs related to banking and accounting.

Work Sample: In this, you will have to give the sample of the work you are expected to do after you get the job. Therefore, it will involve a specific skill

What is the Importance of an Aptitude

The Aptitude Test can be used as a measure of the abilities of a person. These tests give the complete picture of a person's mind. The aptitude test is of a great importance for the students studying in school or those people who want to change their profession. The test will give them a precise result of what is the actual abilities of a person. The importance of an aptitude test can be understood by the fact that they being widely used now for various purposes. Some of them are:

Placement Purpose: If a job requires some specific skill or some particular trait in the person, it is evaluated by aptitude tests. Know your Weak Points: You should know in which topics u lag behind. You should prepare those topics first because you do not need much time to prepare those topics which you are good at.

Do not Waste Time: Time is very precious. If you get stuck on a question and you do not find any way out, leave it for that particular time and come back to it later.

Be Careful while Attempting: Most of the tests have negative marking. So just do not attempt the question if you are not sure about the answer. Do not assume your answer to be right. A zero is always better than a minus

Avoid Gaps: Avoid gaps in your practising routine as it can decrease your speed. Large gaps can make you forgetful. If you have a busy schedule on a particular day, try to take out at least 30 minutes for practising questions. Do not waste any day without

Have a Fresh Mind: Aptitude needs a lot of concentration which can be devoted only to a fresh and peaceful mind. If you had a fight with someone or you are feeling low or you have diverted mind, do not practice aptitude. If you will practice aptitude at this instance, you will get all your questions wrong because you will not be able to devote

full concentration. Take Care of Yourself: Body and mind are interlinked. For a healthy mind, the body should also be healthy and vice versa. Sleep well and eat well. Take at least 6 hours of

Disadvantages of an Aptitude Test

With all these advantages of aptitude tests, there also come disadvantages attached to them. The disadvantages of aptitude tests

Costly: It is quite costly to make an aptitude test or to administer it. To meet this cost, the institutes or organizations which hold these tests charge a huge sum of money from the students appearing for it. The companies which use aptitude test for recruitment have to spend a lot of money on these tests as the number of people appearing is quite a lot. For every different type of the job, the company has to modify the test which adds to the cost.

Stressful: Aptitude tests are quite stressful. A person appearing for the test devotes his entire mind to it before and during the test. If the person appeared for the test for placement or some other fruitful purpose, he would be tensed for the result. This increases the stress level

Cannot tell Everything: Aptitude tests can only tell your weak and strong areas, but it cannot tell how well you can learn new things. It only tells about your natural abilities and intelligence, not about your interests. Moreover, it only tells about your mind, not about your personality. For example, your aptitude test results say that you would be good in the field of sales and marketing but you lack those speaking skills and confidence required for conversing with the customers, you will not be able to find success in these fields. Also, the tests cannot predict your

artistic capabilities. Conclusion

Considering both the advantages and disadvantages, it is concluded that do not stick to what your aptitude test result says. For choosing a career, there is no harm in taking the test but doing exactly what the result says is not right. Have a deep thought and connect the test result with your interest and your personality and then make a decision for choosing a career. If you are appearing for the test for other purposes, that is, placement or something else, prepare for it. The test will not be easy.

LUCKNOW, Apr 3 (Agencies): Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday said Opposition leaders develop cold feet seeing the enthusiasm of BJP workers, and asked them to work with a resolve to break all old poll records.

Addressing a digital rally of Uttar Pradesh BJP workers at 22,648 booths in 10 Lok Sabha seats through the NaMo App, Modi said new records are being made in polls due to the hard work of BJP workers.

The "soul of victory in elections lies in the victory of the polling booth", he said while stressing that they "will have to work with a resolve to break all old records of the polling booths".

"Be it Lok Sabha elections or assembly polls, new records are being made due to your hard work. I am happy to see your enthusiasm but seeing your enthusiasm, other party leaders develop cold feet," he said.

Modi expressed confidence that BJP workers in the state are working hard to ensure victory on every seat and at every polling booth.

Manmohan Singh ends 33-year-long innings in the Rajya Sabha



NEW DELHI, Apr 3 (Agencies): As many as 54 members of the Rajya Sabha including former Prime Minister Manmohan Singh and nine Union Ministers are set to retire on April 2 and April 3.

Former Prime Minister Manmohan Singh ends his 33-year-long parliamentary innings in the Rajya Sabha on Wednesday (April 3), just as former party chief Sonia Gandhi will enter the Upper House of Parliament for the first

Mr. Singh, who is known for ushering in several bold reforms in the economy. became a member of the House for the first time in October 1991. He was the Finance Minister in the Narasimha Rao government from 1991 to 1996 and the Prime Minister from 2004 to 2014.

Sonia Gandhi will enter the Upper House for the first time from Rajasthan, filling the seat that will fall vacant after 91-year-old Singh completes his tenure on April 3.

Seven Union ministers — Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan, Health Minister Mansukh Mandaviya, Animal Husbandry and Fisheries Minister Purshottam Rupala, Information Technology Minister Rajeev Chandrasekhar, MoS External Affairs V Muraleedharan, Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises Minister Narayan Rane and MoS Information and Broadcasting L Murugan — end their tenure in the Rajya Sabha

Environment Minister Bhupendra Yadav and Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw will end their tenure on April

Except for Mr. Valshnaw, all the Union Ministers are contesting the Lok Sabha elections. Mr. Vaishnaw has been given another Rajya Sabha term.

As many as 49 members are retiring on Tuesday (April 2), while five are retiring on Wednesday (April 3).

Of those retiring from the Upper House include Samajwadi Party's Jaya Bachchan who has been renominated to the Council of States by her party for another term. So is Manoj Kumar Jha, who has been renominated by his party RJD for another term in the Rajya Sabha from Bihar, and Naseer Hussain (Congress), who has been renominated from Karnataka.

Abhishek Singhvi of the Congress party, whose tenure in Rajya Sabha ends today will not be in the upper house as he lost his election from Himachal Pradesh.

Among others who will be retiring include BJP's national media in-charge Anil Baluni, who is contesting the Lok Sabha election from Garhwal seat in Uttarakhand, Besides, BJP's Prakash Javadekar, a former union minister and Sushil Kumar Modi, former deputy chief minister of Bihar, also retire from the Rajya Sabha and have not been renominated by the party.

BJP's Anil Jain also retires on Tuesday as he has not been given another term by the party and so has Saroj Pandey from Chhattisgarh, who is contesting the Lok Sabha election in the state.

Rahul Gandhi submits files nomination papers from Kerala's Wayanad LS Seat

WAYANAD (Kerala), Apr 3 (Agencies): Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Wednesday filed his nomination papers from Kerala's Wayanad Lok Sabha

Rahul, accompanied by his sister Priyanka Gandhi and other senior party leaders including AICC general secretary K C Venugopal, submitted his nomination papers to the Wayanad District Collector who is also the Returning Offi-

After submitting the

papers, he read out the oath to uphold the Constitution which concluded the submission process.

Rahul arrived in Wayanad by helicopter in the morning and then held a roadshow from Kalpetta to Civil Station here before reaching the District Collector's office to submit his nomination.

Prior to reaching the collector's office, he addressed the public towards the end of the roadshow and said he was always with the people of Wayanad on

all issues, including the human-animal conflicts which have claimed many lives in the high range district of the state.

Voting in Kerala for the Lok Sabha polls this year will be on April 26.


Rajasthan Magistrate Asks Dalit Rape Survivor To Strip, **Cops File Case**

7 die of suffocation after fire at tailoring shop in Maharashtra's Chhatrapati Sambhajinagar CHHATRAPATI

SAMBHAJINAGAR, Apr 3 (Agencies): Seven persons, including two children, died of suffocation after a fire broke out in a tailoring shop in Maharashtra's Chhatrapati Sambhajinagar city early Wednesday morning, a senior police official said.

The blaze erupted at around 4 am in the shop located at Dana Bazar in Cantonment area.

The tailoring shop and other commercial establishments were located on the ground floor of a building while people were residing on the upper floor, the official said.

"The shop suddenly caught fire at around 4 am. The police came



to know about the incident at 4.15 am. Following the fire, smoke entered the first floor where a family was residing above the shop. Seven casualties have occurred due to suffocation," Police Commissioner Manoj Lohiya told reporters.

The deceased included three women, two men and two children.

he said. The exact cause of the fire would be known after an inquiry, he added.

Boxer Vijender Singh quits Congress, joins BJP

NEW DELHI, Apr 3 (Agencies): The Congress suffered another pre-poll jolt on Wednesday with pugilist Vijender Singh, who had contested on its ticket in 2018 Lok Sabha election, joining the BJP in the National Capital.

Singh, 38, hails from Bhiwani in Haryana. He had extended support to the farmers' agitation against the agricultural reforms laws and more recently to the agitation of women wrestlers against former Wrestling Foundation of India chief Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh.

Singh had shot to fame by winning a bronze in the 2008 Beijing Olympics, the first Indian to do so.

He later won bronze at the 2009 world championships and then 2010 Commonwealth Games



In the 2006 and 2014 Commonwealth Games, he bagged silver and in the 2010 Asian Games, he won a gold.

Singh hails from the dominant Jat community and was being widely rumoured to be a Congress candidate opposite Hema Malini in Mathura.

In 2019, Singh contested South Delhi parliamentary seat opposite BJP's Ramesh Bidhuri and lost.

He was awarded

the Rajiv Gandhi Khel Ratna Award in 2009 and Padma Shri in 2010. Of late, Singh had been politically inactive.

However, Singh had reposted one of ex-Congress chief Rahul Gandhi's posts only 22 hours ago keeping the Congress distant from his immediate political goals and ambitions.

It remains to be seen if Singh will be fielded by the BJP in the Lok Sabha polls.

Kerala YouTuber **Arrested Over Fake News On Voting Machines: Report**

THIRUVANANTHAPURAM, Apr 3 (Agencies): The owner of a YouTube channel has been arrested in Kerala for propagating fake news about the Electronic Voting Machines ahead of the upcoming Lok Sabha polls, police said today.

The Alappuzha South police registered a case against the owner of the YouTube channel Venice TV Entertainment for allegedly propagating that EVMs involved fraud, reported news agency Press Trust

He was arrested for allegedly unleashing a campaign urging people to conduct voting for the general election through ballot paper.

It was done with the intention of creating a rift and tension in society, police said on its official Facebook

The police said social media patrolling has been intensified in Kerala at the state, district and range levels to monitor online content in the wake of Lok

The police also shared the numbers of various officials who are in-change of cyber patrolling and urged social media surveillance teams to inform them if any objectionable content come to their notice.

The Lok Sabha polls will be held in Kerala on April 26.

Bihar's ex-Deputy CM Sushil Modi to skip LS campaign after cancer diagnosis



PATNA, Apr 3 (Agencies): Forner Bihar Deputy CM Sushil Kumar Modi on Wednesday revealed that he was diagnosed with cancer six months ago, and would not take part in the BJP's Lok Sabha poll campaign.

Modi, 72, was named by the BJP as one of its star campaigners for the state and a member of its election manifesto committee.

"I have been battling cancer for the last six months. Now, I feel that the time

has come to inform people about it. I will not be able to do anything for the Lok Sabha elections," he posted on X. "I have told everything to Prime Minister Narendra Modi. I will always remain grateful and dedicated to the country, Bihar and the party," he added.

During his political career spanning over three decades, Modi was an MLA, an MLC, a member of Lok Sabha, and a Rajya Sabha MP.

He was the deputy CM of the state from 2005 to 2013, and from 2017 to

He joined students' politics while studying at Patna University, and became the general secretary of its students' union in 1973. He became an MLA for the first time in

1990 from the Patna Central constituency and was made the chief whip of the BJP legislature party. From 1996 to 2004, he was the leader of the opposition in the state assembly.

He became a member of Lok Sabha in 2004 from Bhagalpur. He gave up his Lok Sabha member-

ship in 2005 and became a member of the legislative council, following which he was made the deputy chief minister with Nitish Kumar as the CM.

He was elected to the Rajya Sabha in 2020, and retired earlier this year.

7 Dead, 730 Injured As "Strongest Earthquake In 25 Years" Hits Taiwan

Officials said the quake was the strongest to shake the island in decades, and warned of more tremors in the days ahead.

TAIPEI, Apr 3 (Agencies): At least seven people were killed and nearly 730 injured Wednesday by a powerful earthquake in Taiwan that damaged dozens of buildings and prompted tsunami warnings that extended to Japan and the Philippines before being lifted.

Officials said the quake was the strongest to shake the island in decades, and warned of more tremors in the days ahead.

"The earthquake is close to land and it's shallow. It's felt all over Taiwan and offshore islands," said Wu Chien-fu, director of Taipei's Central Weather Administration's Seismology Center.

Strict building regulations and disaster awareness appear to have staved off a major catastrophe for the island, which is regularly hit by earthquakes as it lies near the junction of two tectonic plates.

Wu said the quake was the strongest since a 7.6-magnitude struck in September 1999, killing around 2,400 people in the deadliest natural disaster in the island's history.

Wednesday's magnitude-7.4 quake struck just before 8:00 am local time (0000 GMT), with the United States Geological Survey (USGS) putting the epicentre 18 kilometres (11 miles) south of Taiwan's Hualien City, at a depth of 34.8 kilometres.

Three people among a group of seven on an early-morning hike through the hills that surround the city were crushed to death by boulders loosened by



the earthquake, officials said.
Separately, a truck driver died when his vehicle was hit by a landslide as it approached a tunnel in the area.

Social media was awash with shared video and images from around the country of buildings swaying as the quake struck.

"I wanted to run out, but I wasn't dressed. That was so strong," said Kelvin Hwang, a guest at a hotel in the capital, Taipei, who sought shelter in the lift lobby on the ninth floor.

Dramatic images were shown on local TV of multi-storey structures in Hualien and elsewhere tilting after it ended, while a warehouse in New Taipei City

Local TV channels showed bulldozers clearing rocks along roads to Hualien, a mountainringed coastal city of around 100,000 people that was cut off by landslides.

President Tsai Ing-wen called for local and central government agencies to coordinate with each other, and said that the national army would also be providing support.

The National Fire Agency confirmed the death toll, adding nearly 60 people had been treated for quake-related injuries.

- Regional impact - In Taiwan, Japan and the Philippines, authorities initially issued a tsunami warning but by around 10 am (0200 GMT), the Pacific Tsunami Warning Center said the threat had "largely passed".

In the capital, the metro briefly stopped running but resumed within an hour, while residents received warnings from their local borough chiefs to check for any gas leaks.

Taiwan is regularly hit by earthquakes as the island lies near the junction of two tectonic plates, while nearby Japan experiences around 1,500 jolts every year.

Across the Taiwan Strait, social media users in China's eastern Fujian province, which borders Guangdong in the south, and elsewhere said they also felt strong tremors.

Residents of Hong Kong also

reported feeling the earthquake. China, which claims self-ruled Taiwan as a renegade province, was "paying close attention" to the quake and "willing to provide disaster relief assistance", state news agency Xinhua said.

Fabrication at Taiwan Semiconductor Manufacturing Company -- the world's biggest chip maker -- was briefly interrupted at some plants, a company official told agency, while work at construction sites for new plants was halted for the day.

The vast majority of quakes around the area are mild, although the damage they cause varies according to the depth of the epicentre below the Earth's surface and its location.

The severity of tsunamis -- vast and potentially destructive series of waves that can move at hundreds of kilometres per hour -- also depends on multiple factors.

Japan's biggest earthquake on record was a massive 9.0-magnitude undersea jolt in March 2011 off Japan's northeast coast, which triggered a tsunami that left around 18,500 people dead or missing.

The 2011 catastrophe also sent three reactors into melt-down at the Fukushima nuclear plant, causing Japan's worst post-war disaster and the most serious nuclear accident since Chernobyl.

Japan saw a major quake on New Year's Day this year, when a 7.5-magnitude tremor hit the Noto Peninsula and killed more than 230 people, many of them when older buildings collapsed.

7 killed, people blown from flats as typhoon-like winds ravage southern China

Rare storms with typhoon-like winds have resulted in at least seven deaths in China's southern Jiangxi province. The extreme weather has affected 93,000 people across nine cities since March 31.



BEIJING, Apr 3 (Agencies): Rare storms with typhoon-like winds have killed at least seven people in China's southern Jiangxi province since the weekend, three of them blown out of their high-rise apartments in their sleen

The extreme weather, which began on March 31, has engulfed nine cities including Nanchang and Jiujiang with 93,000 people in 54 counties affected, said the Jiangxi provincial emergency flood control headquarters.

On Sunday, freak storms led to gusts that ripped door-size windows off frames in two apartments in a high-rise building in Nanchang, the provincial capital. Three people were pulled from their beds through the holes, plunging to their deaths, according to local media reports.

Officials on Wednesday said seven people so far have died across the province and 552 had to be emergency evacuated. They also said 2,751 houses were damaged.

Accompanied by dramatic sheet lightning, pounding rain and hailstones the size of golf balls, the powerful storms - the most severe in more than a decade - also caused 150 million yuan (\$21 million) in economic losses, local officials said.

China's weather bureau had issued warnings of violent winds with speeds of up to level 12 on local wind scales, equal to a Category I hurricane.

Winds of such intensity are common when typhoons, as hurricanes are called in China and elsewhere in East Asia, make landfall but are rarely found inland such as landlocked Jiangxi.

China's national weather forecaster kept its highest severe convective weather warning advisory - orange - in several areas of southeastern China as strong winds, hail and thunderstorms continue through Wednesday.

The forecaster on Tuesday issued the first orange alert for severe convective weather since 2013, state media reported.

China has a three-tier, color-coded weather warning system for severe convective weather, with orange representing the most severe warning, followed by yellow and blue.

Taiwan Detects 30 Chinese Military Planes Around Island: Ministry

TAIPEI, Apr 3 (Agencies): Taiwan said Wednesday 30 Chinese military aircraft were detected around the island in a 24-hour window -- one of the highest daily numbers this year.

China considers self-ruling Taiwan its territory, and has never renounced the use of force to bring the island under its control.

Taiwan's defence ministry said 20 of the aircraft crossed into the island's socalled Air Defence Identification Zone (ADIZ).

Taiwan's armed forces "monitored the situation and employed (patrol) aircraft, Navy vessels, and coastal missile systems in response to the detected activities", it said in a statement.

Last month, Taiwan detected 36 Chinese warplanes around the island over

a 24-hour period, the highest daily count this year. The uptick in incursions follows a pattern of what experts dub "grey zone" actions -- moves that fall short of outright acts of war. These have ramped up since the 2016 election of President Tsai Ing-wen, who considers Taiwan "already independent" -- a red line for Beijing. China deploys warplanes and naval vessels around Taiwan on a near-daily basis, and balloon flights over the island have also increased. Taiwan's current Vice President Lai Ching-te -- who is disliked by Beijing -- won the January 13 presiden

Lai and Vice President-elect Hsiao Bi-khim of the ruling Democratic Progressive Party (DPP) will take office on May 20.

Ukraine lowers army draft age to 25 to plug shortfall in troop numbers fighting Russia

KYIV, Apr 3 (Agencies): Ukraine on Wednesday lowered the military conscription age from 27 to 25 in an effort to replenish its depleted ranks after more than two years of war following Russia's full-scale invasion.

The new mobilization law came into force a day after Ukraine President Volodymyr Zelenskyy signed it. Ukraine's parliament, the Verkhovna Rada, passed it last year.

It was not immediately clear why Zelenskyy took so long to sign the measure into law. He didn't make any public comment about it, and officials did not say how many new soldiers the country expected to gain or for which units. Conscription has been a sensitive matter in Ukraine for many months amid a growing shortage of infantry on top of a severe ammunition shortfall that has handed Russia the battlefield initiative. Russia's own

problems with manpower and planning have so far prevented it from taking full advantage of its edge.

The average age of Ukrainian soldiers, like those on the Russian side, is around 40, military analysts say. Some Ukrainians worry that taking young adults out of the workforce will backfire by further harming the war-ravaged economy, but the problem reportedly has become acute as Kyiv girds for an expected summer offensive by the Kremlin's forces.

Zelenskyy has rarely mentioned the mobilization issue, and parliament has held long and inconclusive debates about it in recent

Last December, Zelenskyy said Ukraine's military wanted to mobilize up to 500,000 more troops. But he said he had asked the top brass to spell out the details on what is

"a very sensitive matter" before deciding whether to grant their wish.

Such a major mobilization would cost Ukraine the equivalent of \$13.4 billion, Zelenskyy said at the time. Other aspects to be considered include whether troops currently on the front would be rotated or allowed home leave, he said.

The need for a broad mobilization to beef up the number of Ukrainian troops reportedly was one of the areas of disagreement between Zelenskyy and Gen. Valerii Zaluzhnyi, the popular commander in chief of Ukraine's armed forces whom the president replaced in February.

Ukrainian Defense Ministry statistics say the Ukrainian military had nearly 800,000 troops in October. That doesn't include National Guard or other units. In total, 1 million Ukrainians are in uniform.

North Korea says it tested new solid-fuel intermediate-range missile with hypersonic warhead

North Korean leader Kim Jong Un declared his country had acquired the ability to build solid-fuel, nuclear-capable systems for missiles of all ranges

SEOUL, Apr 3 (Agencies): North Korea said Wednesday it tested a new hypersonic intermediate-range missile powered with solid propellants, extending a run in weapons demonstrations that's deepening a nuclear standoff with neighbours and the United States.

With the supposed success of the test, North Korean leader Kim Jong Un declared his country had acquired the ability to build solid-fuel, nuclear-capable systems for missiles of all ranges as he pursues an arsenal that could viably threaten rivals in Asia and the United States.

The report by North Korean state media came a day after the South Korean and Japanese militaries detected the North launching a missile from near its capital toward its eastern sea.

North Korean state

media said the test was supervised by Kim, who described the Hwasong-16B missile as a key piece of his nuclear war deterrent he vowed to further build up to counter his "enemies," a reference to the United States, South Korea and Japan.

Kim said the North has now developed nuclearcapable, solid-fuel systems for "all the tactical, operational and strategic missiles with various ranges," the Korean Central News Agency said.

In recent years, North Korea has been focusing on developing more weapons with built-in solid propellants. Those weapons are easier to move and hide and can be made to launch quicker than liquid-propellant missiles, which need to be fuelled before launch and cannot stay fuelled for long periods

of time.

North Korea last year

tested a solid-fuel intercontinental ballistic missile for the first time, adding to its arsenal of long-range weapons targeting the US mainland. The country also has an extensive lineup of short-range and mid-range solidfuel missiles that can be fired from land vehicles, ships and submarines and are potentially capable of reaching targets throughout South Korea and Japan. The North in recent months demonstrated some of these missiles in drills it described as simulated nuclear strikes while issuing provocative threats of nuclear conflict.

The North has since 2021 also been testing hypersonic weapons designed to exceed five times the speed of sound. If perfected, such systems could potentially pose a challenge to regional missile defence systems



because of their speed and maneuverability. However, it's unclear whether the North's hypersonic vehicles consistently maintained a desired speed exceeding Mach 5 during tests in 2021 and 2022. During Tuesday's test,

the missile's hypersonic glide warhead after being separated from the launch rocket reached a peak altitude of 101 km (62 miles) and flew about 1,000 km (621 miles) while performing various flight maneuvers before landing in waters between the Korean Peninsula and Japan, the KCNA

aid.

The South Korean and Japanese militaries had assessed that the missile flew around 600 (372 miles) although Japan's Defence Ministry announced a similar apogee with the North Korean report.

The North had also tested a purported hypersonic IRBM in January, which came years after it flight-tested liquid-fuel IRBMs. Experts say such weapons if perfected is potentially capable of reaching remote US targets in the Pacific, including the military hub of Guam.

Kim Dong-yub, a pro-

fessor at the University of North Korean Studies in Seoul, said the missile tested on Tuesday was likely different from the system tested in January, which state media didn't name but would likely be the Hwasong-16A.

North Korea in previous tests have unveiled two different types of hypersonic vehicles – a conical one and a wedge-shaped one. State media images show that the January launch involved a conical warhead while the wedge-shaped design was used for Tuesday's launch.

While North Korea had initially tested its hypersonic warheads with liquid-fuel systems, the ability to load them on solid-fuel rockets would allow for faster launches and operation, said Chang Young-keun, a missile expert at South Korea's Research Insti-

tute for National Strategy.
"North Korea, in

declaring that it has fully accomplished the nuclear weaponisation of its missiles, also emphasised its commitment to arm its hypersonic missiles with nuclear weapons," Chang said. "North Korea's development of hypersonic IRBMs targets Guam, which hosts US military bases, and even Alaska." Tensions in the region have risen since 2022 as Kim used Russia's invasion of Ukraine as a distraction to accelerate his testing of missiles and other weapons. The United States and South Korea have responded by expanding their combined training and trilateral drills involving Japan and sharpening their deterrence strategies built around strategic US assets.

While supervising Tuesday's test, Kim Jong Un called for his country to further expand its nuclear and missile programme to acquire "overwhelming power capable of containing and controlling" his enemies, who have "recently run higher fever in boosting their military alliance and staging all sorts of war drills".

Hours after the launch, Seoul's Defence Ministry announced that South Korea, the United States and Japan conducted a combined aerial exercise above waters near South Korea's Jeju island that involved at least one nuclear-capable US B-52 bomber.

The United States in recent months has been increasing its deployment of strategic assets to the region, also including aircraft carriers and missile-firing submarines, in a show of force against North Korea.

NEW DELHI, Apr 3 (Agencies): India's passenger vehicle (PV) industry had a bumber 2023-24 financial year, with wholesales toping 42 lakh units for the first time. Sports utility vehicles are among the top driver of this demand, accounting for almost half of total PV sales. Not surprisingly then, most auto makers are targeting this segment.

Toyota Kirloskar Motor on Wednesday launched the new Urban Cruiser Taisor compact SUV in the country. The Taisor is essentially based on Maruti Suzuki's Fronx, and gets some cosmetic changes for the differentiation between the two.

The Taisor will come with two engine options. Prices for the 1.2 litre petrol engine model start at Rs 7.73 lakh ex-showroom, topping off at Rs 9.52 lakh. On the other hand, the model with the 1.0 litre turbo petrol engine will be available in the Rs 10.55 lakh to Rs 13.03 lakh range. A CNG option will also be

Bookings for the Taisor open from Wednesday and deliveries are set to begin from May this year.

Toyota already sells several SUVs and MUVs in the country. These include the Innova Crysta and Hycross, the Urban Cruiser Hyryder, Fortuner, Camry, Hilux and Vellfire.

The company had its best ever year in 2023-24, on the back of strong demand for these products. For the full year, Toyota Kirloskar dispatched over 2.63 lakh units, a 48 per cent jump over the 1.77 lakh units it had sold in 2022-23.

The launch of the Urban Cruiser Taisor will help the company re-enter the hot selling compact SUV segment and thus target a larger customer segment.

"This is placed in the A-SUV segment and will be the welcoming model for new customers as well as replacement customer. It will help us in bringing in more customers to Toyota and make them experience the 650 touchpoints we have across the countrv." said Sabari Manohar. vice-president, sales-service-used car business.

Toyota Kirloskar Motor. With the Taisor, Toyota is expanding the product footprint, through the partnership it has with Suzuki, where the two sell rebadged models in different markets. For instance, Toyota sells the Rumion MPV, which is a rebadged Maruti Suzuki Ertiga, the Urban Cruis-

er Hyryder is based on Maruti's Grand Vitara and Maruti Suzuki sells the Toyota Innova Hycross-

based Invicto MPV.

This partnership has helped Toyota gain market share in India. In February 2024, Toyota Kirloskar had a market share of 5.91 per cent, compared with a share of 4.36 per cent in February 2023, according to data from Federation of Auto Dealers Association.

"The alliance is working well for both the partners. Its a multi-faceted collaboration going beyond sharing of platforms and cross-badging. It also involves key element of learning from each other's strengths and building on that," said Vikram Gulati, country head and executive vice-president, Toyota Kirloskar.

Despite the high base of last year, Gulati expects sales to remain in the fast lane this year too.

"The demand continues to be good and therefore looking forward we are very optimistic about this year as well and we believe its going to be a robust year. Given the fact that our penetration levels for PVs is not exceptionally high, with infrastructure coming up in a very big way, all these factors will help growth trajectory, "he said.

Some of Toyota's products have had a very high waiting period. For instance, the Innova Hycross hybrid has a waiting period of almost a year and the Innova Crysta has a six months

The company is taking steps to address these challenges. For instance, it has added a third shift at its first plant, which has given it additional capacity of around 33,000 units. It is also setting up a third manufacturing plant in Bidadi, Karnataka. In two years, the company's total capacity is expected to reach 445,000 units per year from 345,000 now.

"It has already started to come down significantly and we are working very hard to make sure that waiting period doesn't remain too long, because it is not a desirable situation we would

like to see," said Gulati. Toyota's strong hybrid products have been received well in the country. Gulati says India will need to adopt multiple sustainable technologies, not just electric but also bio-fuels, given the size of the auto industry and the pace at which it is growing.

Could have been handled better with clear communication: Ravi Shastri on Hardik Pandya captaincy row

NEW DELHI, Apr 3 (Agencies): Former India coach Ravi Shastri feels the fan backlash towards Hardik Pandya could have been avoided had Mumbai Indians shown "clarity in communication" while announcing him as captain.

Shastri also advised Pandya to stay calm and weather the storm with solid performances.

"This is not the Indian cricket team that's playing. This is franchise cricket. They have paid top dollar. They are the bosses. It's their entitlement as to who they want as captain. Okay, where I think this could have been handled better was with more clarity in communication," Shastri said told Star Sports' 'Cricket Live Show'.

"If you wanted Hardik Pandya as captain, then say that we are looking at the future. We are looking to build. Rohit has done a fabulous job, as everyone knows, and we want him to help out Hardik in these next three years as the team progresses.

"That communication, that clarity should have come out a little more for all this to die



down. So it's not a case of you saying, 'No, we don't want Rohit Sharma,' or 'He was treated badly,' and all the things that are coming out in social media," he added.

Shastri expects the tide to turn once Mumbai Indians start winning. The team is currently on a three-match losing streak.

"So, my advice to Hardik would be to be calm, patient, ignore, and just focus on your game. Get a couple of performances going. Mumbai Indians is a terrific side. If they get on a roll, they win three or four matches on the trot, everything will subside." he said.

"At the end of the day, nothing beats results. You win matches, and things will change. There's a lot of bull crap out there as well. You know, and some of the stories are just planted. A lot of it is just planted on other people's names, including my name," he added.

Former Australia batter Matthew Hayden also felt that fans' affection for Rohit is understandable given his 11-year tenure as MI captain.

"See the fans are the biggest stakeholders in this and they often don't have the politics,

the insights, but they want to understand this, they love Rohit Sharma. There's going to be no getting around that.

"So potentially how it could have been handled little bit differently is to ensure that Rohit is on board with it...," he said.

Hayden said it is not fair to judge Pandya based on just three matches.

"...there are some concerns in and around Hardik's leadership but I think it's grossly unfair to look at the start of the season which is notoriously slow for the Mumbai Indians, and judge one of the iconic cricketers in India and will be for a long time to come as well, subject to his own fitness which is always vulnerable being an all-rounder as he is.

"But it's grossly unfair to misjudge his performances so far, and the team's performances and then speculate around what is and what isn't happening inside that changing room which we don't know," he observed.

RCB slid from that point, losing skipper du Plessis, to a mindless run out, Glenn Maxwell and Cameron Green and found themselves at 58/4 in the eighth over.

This was the period when Mayank cranked up the pace in his three-over spell (3-0-13-2). Maxwell tried to pull a 151 km/h scorcher from Mayank, but the high pace meant that the Aussie could not time his pull, resulting in a catch to Pooran at short midwicket.

Green was beaten by Mayank's raw pace as the delivery straightened a bit after pitching on the good length to rattle his off-stump.

The right-arm quick later added Rajat Patidar (27) to his kitty to reduce RCB to 103/6, and the home side was sinking fast then.

Bronze finish for lifter Bindyarani Devi at World Cup

PHUKET, Apr 3 (Agencies): Commonwealth Games medallist weightlifter Bindyarani Devi clinched the bronze medal in the women's 55kg category at the IWF World Cup here.

Competing in a non-Olympics class, the 25-year-old lifted a total of 196kg (83kg+113kg) to finish third.

However, it was an underwhelming display by the Manipuri lifter, who had won the CWG silver in Birmingham with a total effort of 203kg in 2022.

She could manage three legal lifts in her six attempts here and her total was 38kg less than that of North Korea's Kang Hyon Gyong, who won gold for her effort of 234kg (103kg+131kg).

Romania's Mihaela Valentina Cambei, who has qualified for the Paris Olympics in Mira-



bai Chanu's 49kg class. took home silver with a personal best effort of 201kg (91kg+110kg).

Bindyarani also bagged the silver medal in the clean and jerk section for her 113kg lift. Medals are awarded separately for snatch, clean and jerk, and total lift in continental, World Cups and World Championships.

Despite her medalwinning performance at the final Olympics qualifying event, Bindvarani is out of contention for the Paris Games.

She had moved up to the 59kg class that features in the Paris Olympics and competed in the 2022 World Championships in that category, finishing 25th. But she switched back to her old 55kg division, in which she won an Asian Championships

silver last year.

She is currently ranked 29th in the 59kg Olympics qualification ranking (OQR) and is out of reckoning as the top 10 lifters in each class will qualify for the Games.
