Over 17.67 lakh voters to decide fate of 22 candidates in Jammu Parliamentary Constituency

JAMMU, Apr 10 (Agencies): The fate of 22 candidates will be decided by over 17, 67, 837 lakh voters of Jammu-Samba-Reasi Lok Sabha seat in the second phase of General Elections to be held on April 26. On the last day of withdrawal of candidature in Jammu Parliamentary Constituency, Independent candidate Roop Krishen Dhar withdrew his nomination, leaving a total of 22 candidates in the fray.

SC says it does not want to be generous, declines to accept affidavits by Ramdev, Balkrishna



NEW DELHI, Apr 10 (Agencies): The Supreme Court on Wednesday said it declines to accept the

affidavits filed by yoga guru Ramdev and managing director of Patanjali Ayurved Ltd Acharya Balkrishna tendering an unconditional apology in the misleading advertisements case.

"We don't want to be so generous in this case," a bench of Justices Hima Kohli and Ahsanuddin Amanullah said during the hearing.

The apex court also came down heavily on the Uttarakhand State Licensing Authority for not taking action against Patanjali Ayurved.

The hearing in the matter is underway.

Rai From Ghazipur **Parliamentary** Constituency

NEW DELHI, Apr 10: The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) has released its 10th list of 9 candidates for the Lok Sabha Election 2024. The list has eight new names, while the party replaced its candidate from West Bengal's Asansol. The party has earlier fielded Bhojpuri star Pawan Singh from Asansol, who has now been replaced by SS Ahluwalia.

Of the 8 new names, 7 are from UP and one from Chandighar. The saffron party has fielded Sanjay Tandon from Chandigarh, while Neeraj Shekhar, son of former PM Chandrashekhar, has been given a ticket from UP's

Ballia.

The party has fielded Parasnath Rai from Ghazipur, Jaiveer Singh from Mainpuri, Vinod Sonkar From Kaushambi, Praveen Patel from Phulpur, Neeraj Tripathi from Allahabad, and BP Saroj from Machhlishahr.

The BJP on Wednesday announced the nomination of former Union minister SS Ahluwalia from the Asansol Lok Sabha seat in West Bengal. Ahluwalia would take on TMC's heavyweight candidate and the party's star face, Shatrughan Sinha, in Asansol, an industrial hub encapsulating the state's coal belt.

"We congratulate everyone on Eid. We should spread love and brotherhood and not create enmity among people," Mufti Ainayatula Qasmi said.



Kashmir: A Shark-Infested Heaven on Earth

fter having served multiple Atenures in J&K, we, a group of three veterans, decided tenures in J&K, we, a group to revisit the pristine Kashmir valley with our wives to experience the post Art 370-abolition environment. It was an eight-day tour from 21 to 28 March 24. We stayed in local 3/4 - star hotels and had a dedicated Innova Crysta for

Kashmir is witnessing an unprecedented rush of tourists. Every single hotel is fully booked. All tourist spots are teeming with hordes of tourists. At some places, even walking is difficult. Surprisingly, most of the tourists were of higher age groups. Apparently, every Indian is keen to get a first-hand experience of the changed environment. All were happy to observe that J&K had been rescued from the abyss in which it had been sliding. CRPF personnel are doing an admirable job through regular patrolling to instil confidence in the

The natural beauty of the valley is unparalleled. It is truly a heaven on earth. But then...Whereas the Centre has made immense efforts to promote tourism, the local administration has failed miserably. It appears to have washed its hands off all the

responsibilities. During our complete visit, we did not come across a single state official or policeman at the tourist places. Local trade unions rule the roost and swindle the helpless

tourists. Extortion by the local thugs is rampant and tourists are left to fend

for themselves. It is a well-organised mafia operation.

All reputed tour operators issue an advisory to the Kashmir-bound tourists to caution them, "Be very careful while negotiating. Be very clear and certain what you commit and what they commit. Do not get into arguments with them, they can be rude as well. Also beware of vendors like photographers, guides, ponywalas and cab drivers. Remember to take decisions yourself. Do not believe anyone, not even us or the driver or the hotel manager."

Fearing reprisals by the local goons, the tour operators ask the tourists not to tell anyone about the cautionary advice. They beseech, "For any help, call us separately, not in front of anyone

: driver, guide, vendors, etc." Can there be a more damning proof of the dreadful state of affairs in Kashmir, wherein even the tour organisers are scared of the mafia?

THE MUGHAL GARDENS

Most of them are under renovation. Sadly, their upkeep and maintenance are not up to the mark. At many places the steps need urgent attention. There are no railings. Toilets are too far away and poorly kept. There is always a local goon demanding money for their use. There are no garbage bins. At one garden, security staff at the entry gate was retaining the entry tickets for recycling, thereby pocketing the ill-gotten

DOODHPATHARI

Although an excellent tarred road exits, taxies are stopped 2km short of the tourist spot

(Shaliganga river site) and the tourists are asked to get down. They are given three options to reach the site walk both-ways in high-altitude area (8957 feet); or hire a pony by paying the demanded charges; or ride an ATV (a four wheeled all-terrain vehicle) for a fee of Rs 1,000-1,500 per person. With a single pillion rider straddled behind the driver, it is no option for the ladies. Moreover, an ATV ride is an adventure and only the young can dare. As all the three options are unviable for most tourists, especially the elderly, they never reach the river site. The State government is guilty of succumbing to the local

hoodlums and thereby depriving the tourists of reaching Doodhpathari shameful indeed!

Tarmaced Road to Doodhpathri but Tourists are Forbidden to Use Vehicles and are Forced to Hire Ponies or ATV: Exploitation at its Worst

SONMARG

It was a lesson in human ingenuity to mint money at the cost of others' helplessness. The area was teeming with thousands of tourists. Heavy snowfall had covered the ground with a thick white blanket and the tourists were enjoying playing in the snow. However, lack of basic facilities made the visit a nightmare for most. There were no toilets at all. A few enterprising hotels had erected a tent in their backyard with a solitary pot, common for men and women. Even the path to the tent was terribly slippery as it had not been cleared of snow. Users had to pay Rs 10 each. As it was freezing cold, the queues were long and the wait unbearable for

A Common Extortion Racket: Asking a Hapless Lady Tourist to Pay Rs 2,000 for Using Toilet. I have personally witnessed an owner of a third-rate hotel (photo above) declining to let a lady use the toilet unless she hired a room for one hour for Rs 2,000. The hapless lady had tears in her eyes. She paid. It is an open loot of the tourists in connivance with the officials. It defies logic as to why the local authorities cannot build adequate toilet facilities.

PAHALGAM

It is around 90 kms from Srinagar. Srinagar taxies are not allowed to take tourists to Aru Valley, Betaab Valley and Chandanwari. They have to hire a local taxi-union cab for Rs 2,700. Thus, the tourists end up paying for two taxies - one, that they had brought from Srinagar (lying idle in Pahalgam) and the second one from the local union. Although the whole circuit is scheduled to take about 4-5 hrs, the local union drivers keep hurrying up the tourists to save time for the second trip. Worse, they never take the tourists to Chandanwari, stopping 6km short and turning back. It is outright cheating. They charge for Chandanwari but go just one Km beyond Betaab Valley. There are no officials or policemen to help. The local drivers unite to act as bullies.

BETAAB VALLEY

A Picturesque Tourist Spot where Boulders Provide Privacy for Toilet -Shame on the Government!

All through the above trip we did not come across a single toilet or a garbage bin or parking areas. It is chaos all around.

GULMARG

It is around 60 kms from Srinagar. It is a beautiful place, famous for its gondola and the ski slopes. On reaching the place, one is attacked by hordes of guides, ponywalas and other vendors. Once again, to visit Bhutaphatri and the Maharaja Palace, one has to hire a local union taxi for Rs 3,500 as Srinagar taxies are not allowed to go there.

Gondola tickets are sold online. Mysteriously, they get sold out within minutes of the opening of sale. According to the local guides, there is a thriving black market in gondola tickets. A ride in gondola is an experience of a lifetime. One is mesmerised by the sheer expanse of the glaciers. Incidentally, gondola hosted over a million riders in

We saw long queues for gondola, entailing wait for up to three hours. There were no shelters or benches for the tourists. Even the snow had not been cleared. Tourists had to hold hands to prevent slipping and falls. One is amazed at the callousness of the organisers. They are minting millions but make no effort to ensure safety and comfort of the tourists.

Finally, As J&K has recently emerged from the decades-long turmoil, it enjoys high curiosity quotient. Understandably, tourists are rushing to Kashmir in lakhs. charging exorbitant rentals. A young couple was frank enough to state that Thailand, Dubai and Malaysia were far better organised tourist destinations.

All tourist places in Kashmir are in mountainous high - altitude areas where the weather remains unpredictable. Bright sunshine can suddenly turn into heavy rains or snowfall, and even blizzards. Not one place has any shelter or benches for such eventualities. There are no rescue teams or medical aid posts. It appears that the government has abdicated its responsibility totally and will wake up from its slumber only after a major tragedy.

On the morning of our departure, our houseboat caretaker casually asked for the mobiles of two guests. Without their permission, he cleverly sent feedback on their behalf, grading every aspect as 'excellent'.

Never seen such deviousness.

Despite all my patriotic feelings, I do not recommend a visit to Kashmir as yet. It is ill -organised and ill-prepared to receive the rush of tourists. It lacks elementary infrastructure, basic amenities and essential facilities at present. Worse, the tourists are always at the mercy of the local mafia. They have to remain on guard at every step. Let the government get its act together and make sure that the tourists are not used as easy prey by the sharks that infest the tourism milieu in the much acclaimed 'Heaven on Earth'.

The Antisocial Network — Memes to Mayhem brings viewers face-to-face with kids who facilitated a mob to storm into the Capitol Building in Washington, DC, back in January 6, 2021

Picture this — a lonely child. bullied at school, ignored by busy parents, low on self-esteem; confidence at the nadir. What does this being do? Find refuge in the dark world of the web, internet, which boosts his ego, soothes his frayed nerves and ignites his hidden fantasies; a real...err... virtual dopamine rush!

This is precisely what Netflix documentary The Antisocial Network: Memes to Mayhem is all about. How during the early 2000s, a nondescript website, 2Chan, in the East, namely Japan, impacts children in the West, USA to be precise, in the form of 4Chan a popular online portal, built by a handle named MOOT, a young chubby boy whose identity is revealed later. Notably, with time and growing popularity 2Chan spawns crime, as a Japanese youth hijacks a bus, even kills one passenger, in the infamous Neomugicha incident.

These misguided youngsters come up with statements like 'Trolling is like performance art'; 'We didn't know we were right or wrong', 'I felt like the coolest criminal child in the world', 'We were dumb kids'. Only that the ramifications are far wider, much beyond they can ever imagine.

Meanwhile, as this online community grows, 4Chan gradually becomes a pressure group, so much so that it flames rebellion, decimating reputations and destroying established rules. From behind the curtains, anonymous is the word; anonymity is what appeals to most of these hackers, some among them even physically challenged. They become a band of chaos-stirrers called QAnon, a word which coalesces into an identity. In escapism, they find solace.



Gradually, 4Chan becomes a hydra-headed monster, fuelling mass delusion of avid internet users: 4Chan leads to 8Chan and the chain grows as 'vigilante justice

Such is their reach, also skill, that they hack CIA website, US Senate's website, FBI, law enforcement websites and more. From

protests on the streets to clashes with the law-keepers, to the final storming of the United States Capitol Building in Washington, DC, on January 6, 2021, based on a thread, QAnon, the phenomena indeed goes from memes to mayhem!

After a major crackdown, a bunch of hackers and mischief-mongers

are brought too book; however, one wonders why the authorities took that long to act? Isn't any antistate movement supposed to be nipped in the bud, before shrewd politicians, Donald Trump in this case, use it to his or her advantage? It all becomes too political and commercial, with Facebook and Twitter making a quick buck from all this turmoil.

Chris Poole aka MOOT wasn't in it for politics in the first place; all he meant was fun, so he backs out officially. The creators of QAnon ultimately regret the Frankenstein they create. 'Hacking can trick you into thinking that you are fighting for good, but in reality, you are just high on the feeling of having power', says one of them. 'The world of simulation is one where you experience less and less of life', says another. Realisation dawns, but a bit too late, when things have gone too far, leading to destruction, chaos — 'Anonymous, deanonymised everybody'

With a runtime of 1 hour 25 minutes, the documentary has been directed well, with neat animation in the backdrop. Real people, real stories, not told through the prism of virtual tools; the faces that narrate the stories are the ones who had lived them live.

The camerawork is sharp and real footage lends much credibility to the narrative.

They came armed with stars, including the likes of Kevin Costner, Michael Keaton, Robert Pattinson, Anya Taylor-Joy and Chris Hemsworth, as well as footage and trailers to show.

"Joker" director Todd Phillips showed the audience a trailer for "Joker: Folie a Deux". out October 4, which brings Joaquin Phoenix back as the violent and mentally ill Arthur Fleck and introduces Gaga's Harley Quinn. Phillips thanked the exhibitors in the room for helping the first movie become such a big success.

Addressing rumours that the sequel is a musical, Phillips said that he hasn't referred to it as

"It's a movie where music is an essential element," Phillips said. "To me that doesn't veer very far from the first film."

Before its world premiere at the Cannes Film Festival next month and theatrical release on May 24, "Furiosa" director George Miller, stars Taylor-Joy and Hemsworth, spoke a bit about the prequel and showed some explosive new footage.

"We just finished last week," said the 79-year-old filmmaker, whose first Mad Max film came out 45 years ago.

This new film is focused on a young Furiosa, who was



played by Charlize Theron in "Mad Max: Fury Road," the 2015 blockbuster that made over USD 300 million at the box office and won four Oscars.

"This is the story of one woman's relentless commitment to impossible hope," Taylor-Joy said. "We see her go through everything."

Hemsworth plays a warlord named "Dementus". The audience was especially excited to hear from Kevin Costner, who will be back in theatres this summer with a two-part Western. "Horizon: An American Saga", which he directed, cowrote and stars in. Set during the Civil War. Costner wanted to look at the idea of the promise of America

"It was the promise that if you could come west, if you could survive it, you could make a home at the expense of a lot of things," Costner said. "To me, that's drama.

The film is getting an unconventional release, with "Part 1" hitting theatres on June 28 followed by "Part 2" on August 16. The ensemble includes Sienna Miller, Sam Worthington, Danny Huston and "Stranger Things" breakout Jamie Campbell Bower.

"A lot of people like plot movies," Costner said. "I have a tendency to like journey movies.'

"Horizon: An American Saga" will premiere at Cannes next month as well.

Tim Burton was also on hand to hype "Beetlejuice Beetlejuice", the sequel to his 1988 hit, which brings back Keaton, Winona Ryder and Catherine O'Hara to reprise their roles, and introduces new characters played by Jenna Ortega, Monica Bellucci, Willem Dafoe and Justin Theroux. It opens in theatres on September 5.

Burton said he always related to Lydia Deetz and wanted to know what happened to the Deetz women over the years and was happy that Ryder. O'Hara and Keaton were on board too. "It was like a weird family reunion," Burton said.

Keaton said they had discussed the possibility many times over the years and they finally got it right. "It's good. It's really, really good," Keaton said. "In fact, it's great."

Oscar-winning director Bong Joon-ho showed a trailer for his new film, "Mickey 17", starring Robert Pattinson, which will be in theatres in January 2025.

"It's about a simple man who ultimately ends up saving the world," the "Parasite" director said through a translator. "It's a very strange type of hero's journey."

Pattinson called the story unusual, funny and bizarre. "I was told, you're going to love the script, but the part is impossible," he said.

Warner Bros is also at work rebooting its DC superhero universe, under the supervision of Peter Safran and James Gunn, who is currently filming the new "Superman" in Atlanta for a summer 2025 release.

Before that, the studio is releasing a documentary about the first cinematic Superman, Christopher Reeve, which they acquired out of Sundance. "Super/Man: The Christopher Reeve Story" will be in theatres in September.

Three years after the studio's former leaders made the decision to release all of their films day-and-date in theatres and on its streaming service, Warner Bros has re-established itself as a vital part of the movie theatre ecosystem.

In December, they made the unconventional move to release three major films in short order: "Wonka", "Aquaman and the Lost Kingdom" and "The Color Purple". It was done in agreement with theatre owners who said that they needed more

Those movies, domestic distribution president Jeff Goldstein said, cumulatively made over USD 1 billion globally, and the studio was responsible for approximately 50 per cent of the box office at Christmas.

This year has gotten off to a strong start too, propelled by "Wonka" and leading into "Dune: Part Two" (both have made over USD 600 million globally) and "Godzilla x Kong" which has surpassed USD 300 million at the box office.

"Storytelling is our business," Goldstein said. "We are committed to making big, crowdpleasing, event movies."

I enrolled myself at the Panjab University for a diploma in drama. There was no looking back and I did Masters in the same field. I opted for a career in the film and television industry

Theatre love

Berry feels had there been a way to earn a livelihood through theatre, he would have never left it for cinema and television. But at the same time, every platform is great if you choose good content. He added, "I believe theatre is the toughest medium to perform on. There are no retakes. I think every film actor should do theatre once."

While Berry earned recognition for Gul Gulshan Gulfaam, he had already worked in Govind Nahlani's TV show Tamas in a short role, and essayed 12 different characters in



Shyam Benegal's Bharat Ek Khoj. "It helped me learn a lot of things about the film and television industry, and how it was different from theatre. Only Gul Gulshan Gulfaam released first. In fact, before moving to Mumbai, I had worked in a Punjabi project, which never got released. It was made in Hindi and Punjabi, and had different titles for the same. I think the Punjabi title was Vaqde Paani. So, basically I started my career in 1986," he added.

Long innings From Gul Gulshan Gulfaam (1987) to Qayaamat Se Qayaamat Tak (2024), Berry has managed to keep the audience entertained. "I always aspire to do tedhe roles," he said.

On changing characters and much-loved character of Tathacharya in Tenali Rama, Berry shared, "I feel blessed to have landed this role, which encapsulates all the nine rasas in one character. I have always enjoyed becoming a new character, and feel make-up and costume has a great role in it. For Dil Diyaan Gallaan, I played a Sikh grandfather. I actually grew a long beard and lived that character for the entire time."

"Whose protection do these drug mafias have? Which family does the drug mafia arrested by NCB belong to?... DMK Party makes people fight in the name of region, religion and caste. DMK knows that the day people understand the politics of divide and rule, DMK will not get a single vote. That is why they make people fight among themselves for votes, I have also decided that I will continue to expose this decades-old dangerous politics of DMK," PM Modi said

The Prime Minister again targeted the Congress and DMK



over the Katchatheevu issue, saying that the parties kept the state in the dark for many years.

He alleged that Congress and DMK show false sympathy over the arrest of fishermen by Sri Lanka near the island.

"Another hypocrisy of Congress and DMK is now in debate across the country. When the Congress was in power at the Centre, they gave Katchatheevu island to Sri Lanka. However, it remains quiet on which cabinet took the decision and who got benefitted. Several fishermen have been arrested in the last few years and then they (Congress) show false sympathy." PM Modi said.

The PM further said that the ruling government has always made efforts to bring the Indian fishermen back from Sri Lanka.

"NDA government is continuously working to bring these

fishermen back," he added. Modi had recently targeted Congress over "ceding" of the islet in 1974. He cited a media report and alleged that new facts revealed that the Congress "callously" gave away Katchatheevu to Sri Lanka.

The media report was based on an RTI reply received by Tamil Nadu BJP president K Annamalai to his queries on the 1974 agreement between India and Lanka when Indira Gandhi was the Prime Minister.

In his speech, PM Modi also lauded Tamil Nadu and said that the state has made its contribution to the space sector and manufacturing.

"India is emerging as a world power today and Tamil Nadu has played a crucial role. Tamil Nadu has made its contribution to the space sector and manufacturing. I believe that the defence corridor which is being built will take this state to the next level," he added.

PM Modi also spoke of his efforts to promote the Tamil language and referred to Kashi Tamil Sangamam.

"At the United Nations, I try to speak in Tamil language so that the whole world knows that our Tamil is the oldest language in the world," he said.

"As MP of Kashi, I have come to invite you to make Kashi Tamil Sangam more glorious. Secondly, I was born in Gujarat and many families from Gujarat live here too. As a Gujarati, I invite you to the Saurashtra Tamil Sangam," he added.

The Prime Minister sought support for Pattali Makkal Kachi's Dharmapuri candidate Soumya Anbumani as well as the New Justice Party's Vellore candidate AC Shanmugam, who is contesting on the BJP symbol. All 39 seats in Tamil Nadu will vote in a single phase on April 19. The counting of votes will be held on June 4.

In 2019, the DMK-led alliance swept the Lok Sabha polls in Tamil Nadu, winning 38 of the 39 seats.

forms, he added. Gandhi's remarks come amid repeated attacks by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, saying that the Con-

gress manifesto bears a

'Muslim League imprint'. The Congress has moved the Election Commission against his remarks while party chief Mallikarjun Kharge has said that "there is a stink of RSS" in Modi's speeches.

The Congress has alleged that the prime minister is resorting to the "cliched Hindu-Muslim script" as he is scared that the BJP may struggle to even cross the 180-seat mark in the Lok Sabha polls.

The Congress has countered the BJP pointing out that Jan Sangha founder Syama Prasad Mookerjee, the president of the Hindu Mahasabha then, was himself part of the coalition government in Bengal with the Muslim League in the early 1940s.

Bus ferrying distillery company staffers falls into soil mine pit in Chhattisgarh; 15 killed, dozen injured

DURG, Apr 10 (Agencies): At least 15 people were killed and more than a dozen injured ,all employees of a private firm as the bus they were travelling in fell into a 'murum' soil mine pit in Chhattisgarh's **Durg district on Tuesday** night, police said today.

The accident took place around 8:30 pm near Khapri village under Kumhari police station limits when the victims, all employees of a distillery company, were returning home

after work, City Superintendent of Police (Chhavni area) Harish Patil said.

As per preliminary information, the bus with more than 30 people onboard skidded off the road and plunged into the 40 feet deep 'murum' mine, he said. Murum, a type of soil,

is mostly used for construction. Soon after being alerted, a police team reached the spot and

launched a rescue

operation, Patil said.

The injured persons were shifted to a nearby hospital, the official said. Chief Minister Vishnu

Deo Sai expressed grief over the accident and said adequate arrangements have been made for treatment of the injured people.

"Received the news about death of 11 employees of a private company in a bus accident. I pray that departed souls rest in peace and may God give strength to the bereaved family members," Sai said.

Excise 'scam': Supreme Court agrees to consider Kejriwal's request for urgent hearing of petition against Delhi HC order upholding his arrest

NEW DELHI, Apr 10 (Agencies): The Supreme Court on Wednesday agreed to consider Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal's request for urgent hearing of his petition challenging a Delhi High Court verdict that dismissed his plea against his arrest by the Enforcement Directorate in a money-laundering case linked to the excise policy scam.

Senior counsel AM Singhvi mentioned Kejriwal's petition before a Bench led by CJI DY Chandrachud seeking urgent hearing. The high court's order was based on certain material that was suppressed from the petitioner, Singhvi submitted.

"Send an email. I will look into it," the CJI told Singhvi. The CJI was expected to take a call on urgent listing of Kejriwal's petition by this afternoon.

A day after the Delhi High Court dismissed his petition against his arrest by the ED, Kejriwal on Wednesday moved the Supreme Court challenging the high court's verdict.

Spelling further trouble for beleaguered Delhi Chief Minister, Justice



Swarana Kanta Sharma of the Delhi High Court had on Tuesday dismissed his petition challenging his arrest by the ED, saying there was no violation of law or the Supreme Court's verdicts.

Justice Sharma held that Kejriwal's arrest by the ED and his subsequent remand in Enforcement Directorate's custody and later in judicial custody can't be held to be illegal as the probe agency was in possession of "enough material" that led to his arrest, and the trial court remanded him in the custody of the agency by a well-reasoned order.

"Material collected by the ED reveals that Kejriwal conspired and was involved in formulation of the excise policy

and used the proceeds of the crime. He is also allegedly involved in his personal capacity in formulation of the policy and demanding kick-

backs in the capacity

of national convenor of

AAP," the HC said. The ED had arrested Kejriwal on March 21 after the Delhi High Court refused to grant him protection from coercive action by the probe agency in the money laundering case. On April 1, a Delhi Special Court sent Kejriwal to 14-day judicial custody till April 15 on the expiry of his ED custody. The ED alleged that

Kejriwal was the kingpin and the key conspirator of the excise scam and there were reasons to believe on the basis of material in its possession that the AAP leader

was guilty of the offence of money laundering.

The high court said there was evidence to show that the proceeds of crime were used for political campaigning in the 2022 Goa legislative assembly elections.

Rejecting his allegation of political vendetta on the eve of Lok Sabha elections, Justice Sharma said "Courts are concerned with constitutional morality and not political morality." The court had to apply the law as it existed, she added.

"This Court is of the opinion that the accused has been arrested and his arrest and remand has to be examined as per law and not as per timing of elections... Political considerations cannot be brought before the court as they are not relevant... The Court must remain vigilant that it is not influenced by any extraneous factors," the HC said.

It said Keiriwal's challenge against his arrest was not sustainable in the absence of any mala fide on part of ED.

"In the case at hand, it is important to clarify that the matter before this court is not a conflict between the central government and petitioner Kejriwal. Instead, it is a case between Kejriwal and the Directorate of Enforcement," it said.

The HC also dismissed Kejriwal's argument that the ED could have visited his residence to record his statement, the Bench said the investigation can't be conducted at the convenience of the accused. It said there can't be two categories of laws – one for the common citizens and the other for a chief minister or any person in power.

The court also relied on the statements of witnesses and approvers to uphold his arrest and the remand to be "legal".

Justice Sharma took exception to Kejriwal's submissions that cast doubt on approvers' statements, saying the statements were recorded by courts as per laws that have existed much before the parties and even the judge in the cases were born and have been upheld by the top court.

"To cast doubt on the manner of recording statement of approver would amount to casting aspersions on the Court and judge," the HC said.

Five person lose lives attempting to rescue cat from biogas pit in Maharashtra's Ahmednagar

PUNE, Apr 10 (Agencies): The bodies of five persons, who drowned in an animal waste slurry collected in a pit in Maharashtra's Ahmednagar district, have been recovered hours after the incident, officials said on Wednesday.

The incident took place at Wakdi village in Nevasa tehsil on Tuesday evening, and the bodies of the five deceased persons were fished out post-midnight by the authorities, they

"We have recovered the bodies of the victims from the animal waste slurry in the biogas pit. The bodies were taken out by 12.30 am on Wednesday and sent to a government hospital for post-mortem," Nevasa police station's



inspector Dhananjay Jadhav said. A cat had fallen into the pit, and one person climbed down to rescue it but got stuck in the sludge inside, he said.

"To rescue him, five others climbed down one after another and also got stuck inside," Jadhav said.

While five persons died in the incident, one was rescued and is currently undergoing treatment at a hospital, he added.

However, the Jalahalli police acted swiftly, arrived at the scene and arrested Gangadevi.

Gangadevi, who works at a private marketing firm, had previously lodged a complaint against her husband for misconduct with



Following her complaint, her husband was arrested in a POCSO case and sent to jail.

Police are trying to find out the motive behind the crime and have launched an investigation.

DCP Saidulu Adavath said Gangadevi was struggling to make ends meet and was disturbed over this. "We received the call around 1 am in the night. When we reached the spot, the woman confessed she killed the children. Based on this prima facie information, we have registered the FIR,' the DCP said.

(Agencies): China vowed Wednesday it would not accept "criticism or pressure" over its ties with Russia, after Washington warned that it will hold Beijing responsible if Moscow makes gains in Ukraine.

Deputy Secretary of State Kurt Campbell said Tuesday that Washington would "not sit by and say everything is fine" after Beijing renewed pledges of cooperation with Moscow during a visit by Russia's top diplomat.

In response, foreign ministry spokesperson Mao Ning insisted that "China and Russia have the right to engage in normal economic and trade cooperation".

tion should not be interfered with or limited, and China also does not accept criticism or pressure," she added on Wednesday.

The two countries have in recent years ramped up contacts, and their strategic partnership has only grown closer since Moscow's invasion of neighbouring Ukraine.

Analysts say China holds the upper hand in the relationship with Russia, with its sway growing as Moscow's international isolation deepens as its war drags on.

On Tuesday, the two said they would strengthen strategic cooperation as Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov held talks with President Xi Jinping and top diplomat Wang Yi.

China Rejects US "Criticism Or Pressure' Over

Xi told Lavrov that China attached "great importance" to relations with Moscow and "stands ready, with Russia, to strengthen bilateral communication, (and) strengthen multilateral strategic coordination", according to Chinese state broadcaster CCTV.

Xi and President Vladimir Putin have agreed to maintain "close exchanges" to ensure the steady development of their ties, the readout - Continued support -

While China says it is a neutral party in the Ukraine conflict, it has been criticised for refusing to condemn Moscow for its offensive and for indirect support for the war effort by continuing to trade with Russia.

US officials have recently stepped up warnings to Beijing against providing indirect aid to the Russian war effort.

In Brussels last week, US Secretary of State Antony Blinken told reporters that "China continues to provide materials to support Russia's defence industrial base".

And Treasury Secretary Janet Yellen, who wrapped up a visit to China on Monday, said she had warned officials of the consequences of supporting Russia's military procurement.

Campbell reiterated on Tuesday that "we have told China directly, if this continues, it will have an impact on the US-China relationship".

"We will see this not as just a Russian unique set of activities but a conjoined set of activities backed by China but also North Korea," he told the National Committee on US-China Relations, an educational group.

"This is antithetical to our interests," he warned.

Beijing responded on Wednesday that it has "always played a constructive role" in seeking a resolution to the war in Ukraine.

"If any country is truly concerned about peace in Ukraine, and hopes for an early end to the crisis, they should first reflect on the root causes of the crisis," Mao said.

Ratings Agency Fitch Downgrades China Credit Outlook Over Debt Fears

BEIJING, Apr 10 (Agencies): Ratings agency Fitch said Wednesday it had downgraded China's sovereign credit outlook to negative, citing increased risks to the country's public finances, in a move Beijing swiftly called "regrettable".

Chinese officials have struggled for months to kickstart economic growth as they battle a range of headwinds, particularly a prolonged property sector crisis that has fueled fears of wider contagion.

Policymakers have announced a series of targeted measures as well as the issuance of billions of dollars in sovereign bonds, aimed at boosting infrastructure spending and spurring consumption, but analysts have said much more needs to be done.

Beijing last month set a goal of five percent growth for the world's number-two economy in 2024, an ambitious objective that the leaders admitted would be a challenge to meet.

Fitch said its outlook revi-



sion "reflects increasing risks to China's public finance outlook" as the country "contends with more uncertain economic prospects".

"Wide fiscal deficits and rising government debt in recent years have eroded fiscal buffers from a ratings perspective," the agency warned.

And it said "fiscal policy is increasingly likely to play an important role in supporting growth in the coming years which could keep debt on a steady upward trend".

It also said projected lower economic growth "exacerbates challenges to managing high

economy-wide leverage". Beijing's finance ministry immediately said the decision was "regrettable".

"From the results, it can be seen that the indicator system of Fitch's sovereign credit rating methodology has failed to effectively and proactively reflect" Beijing's efforts to promote economic growth, it said in a

Beijing has pledged to do

more to boost employment and stabilise the property market, though an official last month admitted doing that remained "very difficult".

Real estate companies that "need to go bankrupt should go bankrupt, and those that need restructuring should be restructured", Housing Minister Ni Hong told a news conference on the sidelines of a major political meeting.

Fitch also on Wednesday affirmed China's credit rating at "A+".

It said that move reflected the country's "large and diversified economy, still solid GDP growth prospects relative to peers, integral role in global goods trade, robust external finances, and reserve currency status of the yuan".

But, it added, "these strengths are balanced against high economy-wide leverage, rising fiscal challenges and per capita income and governance scores below those of 'A' category peers"

IRAN, Apr 10 (Agencies): Iran's supreme leader, Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, said on Wednesday that Israel "must be punished, and it shall be" for attacking the Iranian embassy compound in Syria.

In a major escalation of Israel's war with regional adversaries. suspected Israeli warplanes bombed Iran's consulate in the Syrian capital on April 1 in a strike that Iran said killed seven military advisers. "When they attack

the consulate, it is as if they have attacked our soil," Khamenei said in a speech marking the end of the Muslim holy month of Ramadan. "The evil regime made a mistake and must be punished, and it shall be," he added.

In an apparent response to Khamenei, Israeli Foreign Minister Israel Katz said on Wednesday that Israel will respond if Iran attacks Israel from its own soil.

"If Iran attacks from

its own territory, Israel will respond and attack Iran," Katz said in a post on the social media platform X.

Iran backs groups that have entered the fray across the region since Israel launched its invasion of Gaza following the October 7 attack on southern Israel by Hamas. Some 33,360 Palestinians have been killed in six months of Israeli bombardment of Gaza Hamas' October 7 attack on Israel killed 1,200 people, according to Israeli tallies.

The Iran-backed Lebanese Hezbollah group has exchanged fire on a daily basis with Israel, while Iraqi groups have fired on US forces in Syria and Iraq and the Houthis of Yemen have targeted shipping in the Red Sea and the Gulf of Aden.

Joe Biden says PM Benjamin Netanyahu's approach to the war is a mistake, deepening a rift between the two allies

TEL AVIV, Apr 10 (Agencies): US President Joe Biden called Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's handling of the war in Gaza a mistake and called for his government to flood Gaza with aid, ramping up pressure on Israel to reach a cease-fire and widening a rift between the two staunch allies that has worsened as the war has dragged on.

Biden has been an outspoken supporter of Israel's war against Hamas since the militant group launched a deadly assault on October 7. But in recent weeks his patience with Netanyahu has appeared to be waning and his administration has taken a sterner line with Israel, rattling the countries' decades-old alliance and deepening Israel's international isolation over the war. The most serious disagreement has been over Israel's plans for an offensive in the southernmost Gaza city of Rafah and the rift has spiralled since, worsened by an Israeli airstrike last week on an aid convoy, which killed seven workers with the food charity World Central Kitchen (WCK), most of them being foreigners.

Biden's comments, made in an interview that aired late Tuesday after being recorded two days after the WCK strike, highlight the differences between Israel and the US over humanitarian aid to people in Gaza, where a month's long war has led to warnings of imminent famine. "What he's doing is a mistake. I don't agree with his approach," Biden told Spanish-language broadcaster Univision. He was responding to being asked if Netanyahu is prioritizing his political survival over the national interest. Biden said Israel should agree to a cease-fire, flood beleaguered Gaza with aid for the next six to eight weeks and allow other countries in the region to help distribute the aid. "It should be

done now," he said. Hunger in Gaza is overshadowing the Muslim holiday of Eid al-Fitr, a typically joyous festival during which families

celebrate the end of the holy month of Israel halted aid deliveries to Gaza in

the early days of the war, but under US pressure has slowly increased trucks allowed to enter the territory. Still, aid groups have complained that supplies are not reaching desperate people quickly enough, blaming Israeli restrictions, and countries have attempted other ways to deliver them including air drops and sea. Israel says it has steadily ramped up aid throughout the war, opening up more entry points for trucks to enter and to reach especially hard-hit areas like northern Gaza, an early target of Israel's in the war. Israel and Hamas are currently

engaged in talks meant to bring about a cease-fire in exchange for the release of hostages captured by Hamas and others who stormed across the border on October 7. But the sides remain far apart on key issues, including the return of Palestinians to hard-hit northern Gaza. Netanyahu has vowed to achieve "total victory" in the war, pledging to destroy Hamas' military and governing capabilities to prevent a repeat of the October 7 attacks and to return the hostages. He says that victory must include an offensive in Rafah, which Israel says is Hamas' last major stronghold, but more than half of Gaza's 2.3 million people are currently seeking shelter there. Six months into the war, Israel is growing ever more isolated, with even its closest partner increasingly vocal about its discontent in the war's direction and longtime trading partners like Turkey taking potentially painful economic steps to express dismay.

Netanyahu is under pressure to decide on a post war vision for Gaza but critics say he is delaying because he doesn't want to anger his ultranationalist governing partners, who support resettling the Gaza Strip, which Israel withdrew from in 2005 and an idea Netanyahu has ruled out.

How the EU wants to reshape its asylum system

BRUSSELS, Apr 10 (Agencies): The European Parliament votes Wednesday on a landmark reform of EU laws on asylum-seekers and irregular migrants.

Here are the main changes which, if adopted, will come into force from 2026:

Border filtering

The new EU Asylum and Migration Pact will see migrants irregularly entering the EU undergo identity, health and security checks and have biometric readings of their faces and fingerprints recorded, which can take up to seven

Children will get special treatment, and member countries are to have independent monitoring mechanisms in place to ensure rights are upheld.

The procedure aims to determine which migrants should receive an accelerated or normal asylum application process, and which ones should be sent back to their country of origin or transit.

Streamlined vetting

Asylum-seekers with lower chances of receiving protection status -- defined as those coming from countries whose nationals' asylum applications are, on average, rejected in at least 80 percent of cases -- will be processed faster.

Nationals from countries such as Tunisia, Morocco and Bangladesh figure in that category. Their streamlined applications



quickly sent back if their request is judged to be unfounded or inadmissible. This would require using

detention centres, though alternative measures can be used, such as confinement in residences Up to 30,000 people can

be held in the centres at any period, with the EU expecting up to 120,000 migrants annually to pass through them.

Unaccompanied minors believed to pose a security risk and families with children would also be held in them. Solidarity mechanism

The new system would reform the EU's so-called Dublin III mechanism under which, generally, the country in which an



Currently that places stress on Italy, Greece and Malta, which have received the bulk of land

and sea arrivals in recent years. Under the new rules, the Dublin III principle of first-country responsibility would be maintained, but with extra criteria that could shift the asylum-seeker's file to another EU country.

And a mandatory solidarity mechanism would oblige member states to take in a certain number of asylum-seekers arriving in the outer-rim EU countries.

If they choose not to, those other countries could instead provide money or other material or personnel contributions.

At least 30,000 asylum-seekers a year will come under this relocation system. An annual financial compensation of 600 million euros (\$650 million) would be fixed for those preferring to pay instead of host.

Surge response

The package establishes an emergency response in the event of unexpected migration surges -- the same sort of crisis the EU faced in 2015-2016 when more than two million asylumseekers entered the bloc, many of them from war-torn Syria and

Asylum requests stood at 1.14 million in 2023, the highest level since 2016.

It would allow member states to reduce protections for asylum-seekers, making it possible to hold them longer than usually permitted in detention centres on the EU's external borders.

EU members also want to address the "instrumentalisation" of migratory flows by outside countries. Belarus and Russia, for example, have been accused of encouraging migrants to try to enter the EU to destabilise the bloc.

'Safe third country'

The concept of a "safe third country" will be allowed when vetting asylum-seekers.

That could mean that an irregular migrant who came to the EU via a country deemed "safe" enough to lodge a request for protection there could have their EU application rejected. But for that to be invoked, a sufficient "link" has to be established between the asylum-seeker and the transit country.

The apparent scarcity of stock should not be misconstrued as a deliberate act rather, it reflects our measured approach to production," he asserted. Moreover, Mir highlighted the emergence of a new wave of home-based

bakers, contributing to an expanded landscape of competition, expressing support for the new entrants, and acknowledging their role in

diversifying the market. "We are adapting our approach to bakery manufacturing in light of evolving consumer preferences and the shifting health landscape of the valley," Mir remarked. He underscored the association's commitment to meeting consumer demands while prioritizing health considerations and also assured of action against any baker associated with their association, found involved in selling the bakery items

beyond the prescribed rates of association.

It is pertinent to mention that in recent years, Kashmir has witnessed a surge in lifestyle-related diseases attributed to the overindulgence in sugary and salty foods. According to the experts, high sugar intake has been linked to a rise in cases of obesity, type 2 diabetes, and cardiovascular ailments among the locals. The top court had said Patanjali Ayurved Ltd is "bound down to such assurance".

The non-observance of the specific assurance and the subsequent media statements irked the apex court, which later issued notice to them to show cause as to why contempt proceedings be not initiated against them.

This announcement comes just months after the company had raised prices across its model range in January 2024, citing mounting inflationary pressures and increased input costs.

At the time, Maruti had said: "We have been trying to absorb



the increased input costs for a while now, but the current market conditions have compelled us to pass on some of the hikes to our customers. The price increase will be substantial in some models.

The Swift, which has been one of the best-selling cars in the Indian market, is likely to

see a significant impact on its sales due to the price hike. The Grand Vitara, a relatively new entrant in the compact SUV segment, may also face challenges in attracting buyers with the increased prices.

Leakage reported in Oil India's well in Assam



TINSUKIA, Apr 10 (Agencies): Oil explorer Oil India Limited reported leakage in the x-mass tree assembly on top of a crude oil well at Dighaltarang Tea Estate in the Tinsukia District of Assam. The x-mass tree on top of a well comprises an assembly of valves that control the flow of oil and gas from

The incident occurred at approximately 11:30 pm on April 9, 2024 and was controlled by 2:20 am.

The District Administration was promptly informed, and officials were present at the site to assess and address the situation, OIL said. As a precautionary measure, the fire service was mobilized and kept on standby.

Upon examination, a hole was discovered on the flow path from the X-mass tree, which is currently under investiga-

The leak resulted in the spread of gas and crude oil over nearby areas within a radius of approximately 100 meters from the wellsite. OIL has formed an on-site assessment team to evaluate the affected areas and initiate remediation measures.

OIL said it is conducting an internal enquiry to thoroughly investigate the incident. The company said the well is now completely controlled and closed, and there is no cause for panic.

Apple assembles \$14B worth of iPhones in India during FY 2024, comprising 14% of global production

NEW DELHI, Apr 10 (Agencies): In a significant development for India's mobile manufacturing sector, American tech giant Apple reportedly assembled \$14 billion worth of iPhones in India during fiscal 2024. This constitutes 14% of Apple's global iPhone production, meaning 1 in 7 of its devices are now manufactured in India. The move reflects Apple's strategy to diversify its production base away from China due to geopolitical tensions between the US and China.

Last year, Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal mentioned

that Apple would start 25% of the total iPhone production in India by 2025. Apple began manufacturing iPhones in India in 2017 and has since scaled up production. Currently, Apple is assembling iPhones ranging from the legacy 12 to its latest iPhone 15 in India, but not the higher-spec Pro and Pro Max

In India, the iPhone is manufactured by three contract manufacturers: Foxconn, Pegatron Corp., and Tata Group (formerly Wistron Corp.). According to the report, Foxconn is the biggest manufacturer as it assembles nearly 67%, while Pegatron Corp. makes about 17% of the India-made iPhones.

The surge in production also means that Apple will increase exports from India. According to the Indian Cellular and Electronics Association, India's mobile phone exports are expected to cross 1.2 trillion at the end of this financial year, led by Apple and Samsung. Now, mobile phones have become India's fifth-largest export as an individual commodity.

Last year, India's conglomerate Tata Group acquired Taiwan's Wistron plant in Karnataka. The company is also in talks to take control of another iPhone manufacturing facility owned by Pegatron in the country. Tata plans to hold at least a 65% stake in a joint venture that will operate the Pegatron plant near Chennai.

Tata, one of the largest conglomerates in India, will operate the joint venture through its Tata Electronics unit.

Meanwhile, Apple's market share in India grew from 4.6% in 2022 to 6.4% in 2023, a 38.6% increase. In 2023, Apple opened its first two stores in New Delhi and Mumbai.

Prostate cancer cases to double between 2020 and 2040, deaths to rise by 85 per cent: Lancet study

NEW DELHI, Apr 10 (Agencies): Prostate cancer cases worldwide are projected to more than double and deaths are expected to increase by 85 per cent between 2020 and 2040, with low- and middle-income countries (LMICs) likely to bear the "overwhelming brunt" of this spike, according to The Lancet Commission on prostate cancer.

The surge in cases is "inevitable", with actual numbers likely to be much higher because of under-diagnosis and missed opportunities for data collection in LMICs, researchers said.

They said ageing populations and improving life expectancy will lead to more cases of prostate cancer in older men, and given that being 50 years or older is a risk factor, lifestyle changes and public health interventions may not be able to prevent the

upcoming surge. "As more and more men around the world live to middle and old age, there will be an

number of prostate cancer cases. We know this surge in cases is coming, so we need to start planning and take action now," said lead author of the commission, Nick James, professor of prostate and bladder cancer research at The Institute of Cancer Research, London.

inevitable rise in the

The commission called for evidence-based interventions, including early detection and diagnosis, along with education and awareness programmes, to help save lives from prostate cancer in the coming years.

"This is especially true for low- and middle-income countries which will bear the overwhelming brunt of future cases," said James.

The authors called for improving the "poor" levels of awareness in LMICs about the dangers and symptoms of metastatic prostate cancer, such as bone pain, among men and

their families. "One of the common pains in prostate cancer

comes from spine metastasis, where the cancer spreads to the spine. While this usually presents in the later stages of the disease, it could even be the presenting symptom. Other pains may be associated with urination or treatment, such as post-surgical or chemotherapy-induced pain," said pain specialist Dr Lakshmi Vas, director of the Ashirvad Institute for Pain Management and Research, Mumbai.

Similarly, there is a low general awareness that treatments available in LMICs can prolong survival and decrease suffering, including cheap, effective ones such as hormone therapy.

Acknowledging the "fear of suffering" that comes with a cancer diagnosis, Vas advocated for consulting with a pain specialist.

"The greatest fear is the suffering associated with cancer and patient education in this regard is very vital. I strongly suggest that right after being diagnosed with prostate cancer, take

an appointment with a pain specialist. This way the patients can be reassured that pain management is possible whatever the stage of cancer might be, and also for other pains that come with cancer treatments. Forewarned is forearmed, after all," said Vas.

As with early diag-

nostic capacity, there is a need to scale up availability and improve access to treatments for advanced disease in LMICs, the authors said. Globally, the study estimated yearly cases of prostate cancer to be 14 lakh and yearly deaths due to the disease to stand at 3.75 lakh in 2020. The prostate cancer cases are projected to rise to 29 lakh a year and almost seven lakh prostate cancer deaths a year by

The commission includes researchers from the International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC), an intergovernmental agency forming part of the World Health Organisation.

New study discovers link between men with infertility and families' cancer risk

The study found that the families of men with infertility are most susceptible to cancer of the bone and joint, soft tissue, colon and the testis, among others.

10 (Agencies): Families of men diagnosed with infertility could be at a higher risk of certain cancers, including those of colon and testis, according to a new study.

While it is known that men experiencing infertility tend to have more health problems, including cancer, heart and related diseases, and autoimmune conditions, researchers said they wanted to examine if their families were at a higher risk for these conditions.

The team said the results, arrived at through algorithms, could help develop a more personalised approach to assessing cancer risk, thus helping prevent cancer more effectively.

The findings could also prompt further conversations between the families of men having infertility and their doctors, they said.



The study found that the families of men with infertility are most susceptible to cancer of the bone and joint, soft tissue, colon and the testis, among others.

For the study, the researchers used Utah Population Database, containing genetic and public health information. Hosted at Huntsman Cancer Institute in University of Utah, US, the database carries an extensive set of Utah family histories, in which family members are linked to demographic and medical information.

The team looked at parents, siblings, children, along with aunts, uncles and cousins of men diagnosed with infertility.

Since family members share genetics, environments and lifestyles, it would be easier to identify factors impacting their risk of getting cancer, explained Joemy Ramsay, a researcher at the institute, and lead investigator of the study published in the Human Reproduction journal.

Once the general risk is assessed, causes can be more accurately evaluated to understand their role in a cancer diagnosis, she said.

The researchers observed several types of cancers to develop an algorithm, which could group similar cancers by identifying about 13 characteristic patterns.

These patterns were discerned by observing similar multi-cancer risks across families. rather than looking at one cancer type, they said.

"Both cancer and subfertility are complex diseases and processes," Ramsay said. "This method helps create similar family groups, making it easier to uncover the reason behind a family being at high risk for certain diseases over others."

She added that while the link between male infertility and cancer risk is not fully understood, it is important to have these conversations with families and bring the concerns to doctors.

Further research on establishing the link is needed, as understanding the causes could ultimately lead to more personalised courses of treatment, screening and prevention, Ramsay said.

IPL 2024: Desperate times for Royal Challengers Bengaluru as they take on equally struggling Mumbai Indians

The RCB are just a rung below MI in points table at the ninth position with MI winning just one out of their four games so far

MUMBAI, Apr 10 (Agencies): Desperate Royal Challengers Bengaluru will be under tremendous pressure to get their act together against an equally struggling Mumbai Indians when the two teams face-off in an Indian Premier League match here on Thursday.

Four losses in five matches have not only vindicated how poor RCB were in the last IPL auction, but they have also missed the opportunity to make it up with better on-field show-

However, there is nothing much to separate the two teams as RCB are just a rung below MI in the points table at the ninth position with MI winning just one (29-run victory over Delhi Capitals) out of their four games so far.

Virat Kohli's brilliance, notwithstanding, RCB's campaign is under threat of falling apart even before they could register enough wins to have a real shot at the knockouts.

With the halfway mark of the ongoing IPL approaching rapidly, it is imperative for RCB's overseas stars, including skipper Faf du Plessis (109 runs), Glenn Maxwell (32) and Cameron Green (68) to find form.

Kohli's imperious form -- 316



runs with one century and two fifties at a strike rate of 146.29 -- has been the lone bright spot

With the memories of his 50th ODI century in the World Cup semifinal at the Wankhede Stadium just five months ago still fresh, Kohli would be keen to flourish again at the same venue on Thursday.

Any bowling attack would be left searching for answers if one of their part-timers is topping the list of wicket-takers. And in RCB's case, whose bowling looked threadbare even before they hit the ground running, Maxwell's four scalps neither provide any respite nor assur-

But their recent record against MI could boost RCB, who have won four of their last five games. The overall record in 32 matches, however, is tilted in favour of the five-time champions, who enjoy 18 wins against RCB's 14.

MI would know present circumstances provide them with a ripe opportunity to build up on their recent success and move further up in the points table after a rough start.

For a side which invariably starts IPL with a few losses, MI know their way around these lanes. A contest against a floundering RCB could bring about their second win on the trot

and some further boost in confidence, before facing defending champions Chennai Super Kings.

But it would be imperative for MI not to get too far ahead, since they also have their share of concerns.

Even though Rohit Sharma and Ishan Kishan have set the scoring tempo at the top, the middle-order has failed to carry the momentum for which skipper Hardik Pandya is answerable to a large extent.

It remains to be seen if the anger of MI fans against Pandya persists when he takes the field next, as he got some respite in their last game which was attended by thousands of children and not regular supporters.

Survakumar Yadav's return amid a lot of attention ended in a damp squib, but the world's no. 1 T20 batter would be itching to hit the strides and get a big score.

Romario Shepherd's blitz against Anrich Nortje for 32 runs in an over clearly proved to be the difference against DC here, since the visitors managed to go past the 200-run mark despite not looking threatening enough while chasing an imposing 235run target.

24 men's major titles. Djokovic has not

played in India since featuring in the now defunct International Tennis Premier League (ITPL) which was held from 2014 to 2016.

"Hopefully we can do something in India soon, we can play there, have not been to India for many years. It is a huge and amazing country.



Rohit Sharma keeps calm under pressure

MI lost the early wicket of Davy Jacobs, after which Ambati Rayudu also perished cheaply. Rohit came to bat at No.4 and did not show any nerves whatsoever. He built a handy partnership of 68 runs with the

legendary Sachin Tendulkar off 10.4 overs as MI chased down the target with 19 balls to spare. Rohit stayed not out on 27 runs off 30 balls with 3 fours.

Rohit had a decent season with the bat as he scored 372 runs from 14 matches at an average of 33.81 and a strike-rate of 125.25 with 3 half-centuries and a top score of 87 to his name. In 2013, Rohit took over from Ricky Ponting as the skipper of the MI team and the rest is history.

In 202 matches for MI, Rohit has scored 5159 at an average of 29.31 and a strike-rate of 130.44 with a top score of 109 to his name. Hardik Pandya recently replaced him as the MI skipper. As the Mumbai captain, Rohit won 91 out of 163 matches and lost 68. 4 matches ended in ties.

Offering wheat grains and kneaded flour to fishes brings benefits, especially if there are any doshas or planetary obstacles in one's horoscope. Feeding fishes is considered very auspiclous, leading to the accumulation of infinite merits. Lord Vishnu took the first Matsya (fish) incarnation on the third day of the Chaitra Shukla Paksha, elevating the importance of fishes. Besides, it's also an excellent practice for seeking blessings from all deities and planets. Feeding fishes with small balls of flour daily brings immense peace to the mind, promoting happiness and

Chanting:Chant the mantra "Om Matsyaya Manupālakāya Namah" or "Om Matsvarupava Namah" for one mala

first, wake up during the Brahma Muhurta (auspicious time before dawn) and take a bath with pure water. Then, clean the prayer room or any sacred place and purify it with Ganga water or cow urine. Place a clean pedestal, fill it with water, and adorn it with seven types of clay, betel nuts, coins, and mango leaves. Underneath the pedestal, sow seven types of grains and barley. On the same pedestal, establish the idols of Ganesh, Lord Vishnu, Matsya (fish) idol, Varuna, Navagraha, Shodasha Matrika, and Sapta Ghruta Matrika. After that, take the vow of fasting and perform the worship of Lord Vishnu and Matsya idol with the Shodashopachara method (16 steps of worship) using Vedic mantras. Offerings include invocation, seating, water for washing the feet, sipping water, bathing, clothing, sacred thread, sandalwood paste, vermilion, Durva grass, bilva leaves, ornaments, flower garlands, fragrant substances, incense, lamps, food offering, fruits, betel leaves, dakshina (offering to the priest), arati, circumambulation, and mantra pushpanjali. Finally, distribute prasad (sanctified food) and conclude the worship.Mantra
