Avalanche warning in four districts of Kashmir

SRINAGAR, Apr 28 (Agencies): Amid inclement weather. Jammu and Kashmir **Disaster Management** Authority (JKDMA) on Sunday issued an avalanche warning in the higher reaches of four districts of Kashmir valley during the next 24 hours, officials said. An avalanche with "medium danger" level is likely to occur above 3,000 metres above the sea level in north Kashmir districts of Baramulla, Bandipora and Kupwara besides central Kashmir's Ganderbal district in the next 24 hours.

People living in these areas have been advised to take precautions and avoid venturing in the avalanche prone areas till further orders

The Kashmir Valley has been lashed by widespread rains during the past few days and some upper reaches also received light snowfall prompting authorities to issue a fresh avalanche warning as a precautionary measure for the people.

The authorities have also asked the people living in these districts to dial 112 for help in case of any emergency.

Panara village, Search operation underway JAMMU, Apr 28 (Agencies): A Village Defence Guard (VDG) member was killed in a gunfight with terrorists in a remote village in Jammu and Kashmir's Udhampur district early Sunday, officials said.

A massive search operation is underway to flush out the terrorists, who are believed to have recently infiltrated from Pakistan, they said.

The exchange of fire was reported from Panara village of Basantgarh when a patrolling party of police and VDGs confronted the suspected terrorists around 7:45 am, the officials said. According to them,



following an initial exchange of fire that last over half an hour, the terrorists fled deep into the forest area and were being chased by the security forces.

VDG member Mohd Sharief, a resident of Khaned, was critically injured in the firing and later succumbed to injuries, the officials stated. "After receipt of inputs

regarding movement of suspicious individuals late Saturday evening, J&K Police activated the security grid in Basantgarh police station limits. Today morning,

a party of police picket Sang carrying along with them VDG members proceeded towards Chochru Gala heights where a face-off ensued with a group of hiding terrorists," a police spokesperson said.

Upon receiving the information, a BRO team along with the necessary equipment rushed to the spot for the rescue operation, the officials further said.



Shiv Sena and AAP support protest against instructions to vacate decades old lands

JAMMU, Apr 28: Jammu and Kashmir units of Shiv Sena (UBT) and Aam Aadmi Party have been protesting in Mira Saheb for the last 62 days, demanding protection of their lands and compensation for the lands occupied by the underconstruction Ring Road. Participated and supported their demands

Shiv Sena state chief Manish Sahni, senior AAP leader Safir Chaudhary and spokesperson Nirmal Mahana said in their address that injustice is being done to the residents of Bal Sultan village of Block Meera Saheb. The administration has been forcibly vacating the lands occupied by them for decades and rendering them homeless. Along with this, they are

not being given compensation as their lands have been taken under the Ring Road under construction. Sahni said that These lands have been

in the possession of the local residents of the village for decades since the time of the Rajas and Maharajas. These people have built small houses on these pieces of land and are supporting their families by doing farming. How can the government make them homeless in one stroke? Sahni said that the Prime Minister promises to provide houses to everyone, but the administration of Jammu and Kashmir is busy taking decades-old lands of common and poor people into government possession. On the other hand, Aam Aadmi Party's Safir Choudhary has termed the order

ORGAN DONATION

rgan donation refers to the surgical removal of organs from a living or deceased donor and transplanting them into the recipient's body to provide a new life. Organ donation has been encouraged around the world. However, the demand for human organs still far exceeds the supply. The low rate of organ donation around the world can be attributed to various reasons

The ethical status of the black market of organ donation is controversial. While some talk in its favor, others are completely against this idea. It is seen that the people who donate their organs are generally from the weaker section of the society. Their economic condition is very bad and those who can buy organs have good wealth. Thus an imbalance is seen in this trade.

It has been observed that people who can buy organs are taking advantage of those who want to sell their organs. This is one of the reasons for the growing disparity of status between the rich and the poor. On the other hand, it is argued that people who want to sell their organs should be allowed to do so because they can strengthen their economic status.

Those who are in favor of organ trade also argue that exploitation is better than death and hence organ trade should be legal. However, according to a survey, organ donors later in life regretted the decision to donate their organs.

There have also been several cases of organ theft, while those in favor of legalizing the organ market say this is due to the black market nature of the trade, but others believe that legalizing organ donation will reduce the number of such crimes. This would be encouraged because criminals can easily tell that the organ being sold is not stolen.

A person has a moral duty. Almost all societies in the world believe that donating organs voluntarily is morally acceptable. Many scholars believe that everyone should donate their organs after death.

The main issue from the point of view of deontological ethics is the debate over the definitions of life, death, body and human. It has been argued that organ donation is an act of causing self-harm. Another controversial topic is the use of cloning organs identical to the genotype of the organ recipient. Xenotransplantation, which is the transfer of animal organs into the human body, has also created a stir. Although this has resulted in an increase in the supply of organs, it has come under a lot of criticism. Some animal rights groups oppose animal sacrifice for organ donation. Campaigns have been launched to ban this new field of transplants. Different religious groups have different views regarding organ donation. Hinduism does not prevent people from donating organs. Proponents of Hinduism say that organ donation is a personal choice. People who believe in Buddhism also follow the same idea. Catholics regard it as an act of love and charity. According to him it is morally acceptable. The Christian Church, Islam, United Methodism and Judaism encourage organ donation. However the Gypsies oppose this as they believe in life. Shinto is also against it as they believe that removing organs from a dead body is a heinous crime. Apart from this, the political system of a country can also change the problem of organ donation if the government provides proper support. This can increase the rate of organ donation. There has to be a strong political will to ensure transplant rates increase. Special training, care, facilities and adequate funding should be provided to ensure growth. The demand for organs has always been much higher than their supply due to the various issues discussed above. There is a need to focus and work on these issues to increase the number of organ donors.

Manifesto fiasco costs Cong dear; BJP forced to lean on Chouhan

aunched with great fanfare and described las a path-breaking document, the Congress Party's election manifesto has been grabbing headlines for all the wrong reasons. The Bharatiya Janata Party has clearly studied the manifesto in great detail and come out with an aggressive strategy to corner the Congress. This is in sharp contrast to the Congress whose members have a cursory knowledge of the manifesto's contents. On its part, the party has made little effort to acquaint its spokespersons and other key functionaries in the states with the details of the manifesto. Soon after it was released, the party had initially planned to hold press conferences at multiple venues across the country to explain the party's agenda to the people. But nothing came of it. Also, copies of the manifesto have not been distributed as widely as would be expected. As a result, most party functionaries are illequipped to rebut the charges being bandied about by the BJP regarding the Congress plans for redistribution of wealth and minority appeasement.

The low voter turnout in the first phase of the general election has turned out to be a blessing in disguise for former Madhya Pradesh chief minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan. He

was gradually sidelined after last year's Assembly election after being denied another term in office. Keen to make a mark, Mr Chouhan wanted to contest from the Chhindwara Lok Sabha constituency known to be senior Congress leader Kamal Nath's stronghold. However, the party denied him the opportunity to emerge as a possible giant killer just in case he did defeat Kamal Nath's son who is battling it out for a second term. Instead, Mr Chouhan was fielded from his old constituency Vidisha, a safe BJP seat which presented no challenge to him. To make matters worse, the BJP deliberately chose not to deploy him for campaigning though individual candidates did ask Mr Chouhan to address meetings in their constituencies. However, there has been a sea change after the first phase of voting. Realising that the party needs all hands on deck, the BJP has belatedly started involving Mr Chouhan in the poll campaign for the forthcoming phases. The former chief minister is once again in demand for participation in election rallies.

Not just Madhya Pradesh but the low voter turnout in the first phase is also worrying the Bharatiya Janata Party in Uttar Pradesh. While this is being attributed to several factors like voter indifference, election fatigue and the heat, there are murmurs

in the party that an unhappy Uttar Pradesh chief minister Yogi Adityanath is not making sufficient efforts to mobilise voters. BJP leaders informally point to the possibility that Yogi Adityanath may be replaced, as was the case with Shivraj Singh Chouhan, if Prime Minister Narendra Modi notches up a spectacular victory in this election. Yogi has emerged as a leader in his own right and is often mentioned as a worthy successor to Mr Modi. This is obviously not acceptable in the present BJP which has room for only one leader. But for Mr Modi to achieve his goal, the BJP has to necessarily improve upon the 62 seats it won in Uttar Pradesh in 2019 for which Yogi's cooperation is critical. While Yogi is said to be ambivalent, the Thakur community to which he belongs is angry as it feels it has not got its due in the selection of candidates. Well aware that he cannot afford to alienate Yogi, Mr Modi has now taken to praising the chief minister in his public rallies.

The Rajasthan unit of the Congress discovered a new popular campaigner these elections. The state unit president Govind Singh Dotasra surprised everyone with his oratorical skills and ability to connect with the people in the recently-concluded poll campaign. Though Mr Dotasra is a three-time legislator and has been in the Congress for nearly three decades, not many were acquainted with this side of his personality. This was not surprising as former chief minister Ashok Gehlot has been a domineering figure in the desert state and has tended to eclipse other Congress leaders till the arrival of his younger colleague Sachin Pilot. Mr Dotasra got an opportunity to campaign extensively this time as Gehlot was preoccupied with his son Vaibhav's election from Jalore. Mr Pilot, too, concentrated on the Gujjar-dominated areas. Like Shivraj Singh Chouhan, this election also proved lucky for Mr Dotasra who turned out to be a hit with the crowds.

While Rahul and Priyanka Gandhi are busy campaigning, a relaxed Sonia Gandhi was spotted last week at the Capital's India International Centre. Accompanied by Rupika Chawla, wife of the former chief election commissioner Navin Chawla, the former Congress president had dropped in to see an art exhibition. Sonia Gandhi slipped in virtually unnoticed except for a few stray members who took note of her presence. The irony is that a number of Congress functionaries were also present at the IIC at the same time but were busy gossiping over tea in the lounge. They were later fretting about how they had learnt about Sonia Gandhi's visit only after she had left, the sub-text being that they lost an opportunity to register their presence with her.

Palestine, and a tale of two democracies

t's fascinating to watch how functioning democracies L totally abhor any semblance of democratic behaviour from its citizens. You need go no further than the United States of America and the treatment of student protests right now. America's most liberal colleges - 21 at last count - have tried every trick in the book to silence their students – academic, admission-related, curfews and boundaries and now brutal law enforcement. The students, oddly enough, continue to protest because they continue to believe that they live in a democracy and have a constitutional right to protest. They shout for free Palestine and for an end to genocide. Both of which sentiments upset the forces of democracy. Maybe we should backtrack a bit? College authorities from Harvard to Columbia to Barnard to Yale to NYU to Michigan to Stanford to Texas to Southern California are caught in a terrible bind. The end of the Second World War led to an acceptance that Europe's Jews had been treated cruelly, brutally, unconscionably and abominably for thousands of years. The Holocaust made the world swear that antisemitism is unacceptable. As it is. But with the formation of Israel in 1948, the milk of human compassion has been forced into an impossible choice – sacrifice the rights of Palestinians over the rights of Jews, and in particular the rights of Israeli Zionist Jews.

And with that, human compassion is tainted and in effect, meaningless.

This is not the first time the poison of this choice has been exposed and it won't be the last. But the effects on the world's notions of democracy are catastrophic. Or is that too strong a word for you? That a sovereign democracy that set a democratic standard for the rest of the world to follow - albeit full of contradictions, warts, injustices and cruelty - finds itself forced to attacks its own citizens, its children, protesting against injustice because the sovereign democracy is forced by precedent to defend another sovereign country's rights to annihilate people plus defend the other sovereign nation's fragile sentiments about its identity, exposes every faultline in such a democracy. What are these students at American universities demanding that is so awful that they have to be restrained, hit with rubber bullets and denied education? Let's see if it's hair-raising brutal stuff, one that any government, democratic or otherwise, would be forced to put an immediate end to, like demanding brutal killing of thousands, with particular emphasis on children and patients in hospitals... But what odd students, they seem to want peace, a ceasefire in Gaza, the end of apartheid of the Palestinian people within their own homeland which was handed by Western powers to the new state of Israel, and for the US government to stop funding genocide in Palestinian areas.

If it was against any other country but Israel, it is unlikely that the students would have found much pushback from college authorities, let alone the state administration's law and order arms. money for everyone forever. The collapse of 2008 took care of that for the Western world.

For us in India, the illusion of faux historic greatness has con fined us for the last 10 years, where the cracked shell of democracy is papered within, hiding from us its tattered state. We do not have the stamina to protest for ourselves effectively, forget the people of other lands. We watch this election season go past in the extreme heat, lacklustre, unable to believe what anyone says. We do not even have the luxury of knowing that apartheid and discrimination are wrong. Our notions of the past are stirred up so that we are in a perpetual confused spin – we cannot eat enough because we cannot afford to eat or we have so much to eat that we've forgotten that beyond our profusion of choice, there are others without anything. Elected monarchies, old promises, past transgressions have all landed up in the same stodgy soup, in which we, the people, struggle to keep our heads above the surface. Student protests in India are not treated much differently than those in America. We are the mother of democracy, after all, where students have the right to study hard and listen to their parents. Not have protests like anti-national people. It's not this land is your land, this land is my land. It's not into some heaven of freedom that we may awake. Unless we do actually wake up and speak up. Maybe those students do have something going for them after all.

What then is democracy as the US understands it, as we understand it, as the world understands it?

Democracy in the 2000s appears to mean whatever the government of the day thinks it means. It could be majority rules in an unofficial poll, like Brexit. Or it could be "I don't believe I lost even if I did" like Donald Trump and his supporters. Or it could be "because I got elected I can do whatever I want", like in Turkey and India, with Recep Erdogan and Narendra Modi.

As we see it, all of those things. And not the few things that humans choose democracy for – freedom from monarchic rule, and the ability to makes the rules and choose the people to run the state that would not crush or rubber-bullet or destroy you.

And maybe it did work for a few decades. But the more appealing power became, the more hydra-headed notions of democracy have become. And so, in the world's exemplar democracy we see democracy threatened by the upholders of democracy.

Will the students win? It's a different world from the 1960s and 70s and the protests against the Vietnam War. And it's a different world from the neo-libcon world where young people became part of The System very early, contained and conservatised by the illusion of lots of

Irritable bowel syndrome most frequent functional GI disorder: Dr. GS Sidhu


CHANDIGARH/ JAMMU, Apr 28: Irritable bowel syndrome (IBS) is the most frequent functional gastrointestinal (GI) disorder. It affects 5-20% of the general population. It is characterized by non-specific symptoms of pain in the abdomen, abdominal cramps, change in bowel habits, that wax and wane over the time and can have serious impact on quality of life.

Dr. GS Sidhu, Principal Consultant Gastroenterology at Max Super Specialty Hospital, Mohali said that careful study of patient medical history is critical for its diagnosis.

Nevertheless, severity of patient symptoms sometimes compels physicians to perform expensive diagnostic tests, transforming IBS into diagnosis of exclusion.

He further said," The presence of alarming symptoms like fever,



patients.' Talking about why IBS can go undiagnosed, Dr. GS Sidhu informed that

most of the time symptoms of IBS like cramps, abdominal discomfort, bloating, alternate diarrhoea or constipation etc. remain nonspecific. This may change over an

interval of time and most importantly no visible signs of disease. Another reason in clinical practice is that most of the time, the nature of disease is not explained to the patient by the clinician."

Talking about the causes behind IBS, Dr. GS Sidhu said that the pathophysiology of IBS is not yet completely clear. Genetic, immune, environmental, inflammatory, psychological factors in addition to visceral hypersensitivity can all play an important role, one that most likely involves the complex interactions between gut and brain (gut- brain axis). Diagnosis can be made on the basis of

symptoms only, he said. "It's disruption of the brain gut axis that alters bowel motility and gut function. In addition intestinal microbiota could play a role by altering integrity of intestinal barrier and permeability. 33% of IBS patients have family history of IBS," Previously the IBS was also being called as spastic colon. In recent years it has been observed that ingestion of wheat may cause abdominal discomfort and IBS-like symptoms in subjects without diagnosis of celiac disease. So careful history is critical for making diagnosis of IBS, maintained Dr. GS Sidhu.

Taapsee Pannu: My success is not a fluke, I worked really hard and pushed myself every single day

Taapsee Pannu is in a "very happy, content and satisfied" space in life, both personally and professionally. With a string of meaningful films that strengthened her position in the film industry, and having turned producer, Pannu has had a great run so far. Her last release, Dunki (2023) where she played Shah Rukh Khan's love interest only helped her up her game. However, the actor asserts that it's not a very easy place to be in. Why? "The kind of films I've done so far have been so diverse that it's very difficult and challenging to choose what to do next," she quips.

Explaining her point, she tells us, "Today when the world is going around for an action, spy world, I did that in the beginning of my career with Baby (2015) and Naam Shabana (2017). When people think playing a really shrewd antagonist, I did that in Badla (2019). When you think of playing someone totally out of my skin, I did that in Saand Ki Aankh (2019). Talk of grey shades and I've done that from Haseen Dillruba (2021) to someone who makes wrong choices in life in Manmarziyaan (2018). I've also experimented with sports films when I did Rashmi Rocket (2021) and Shabaash Mithu (2022), where I've learnt a new skill altogether. I've done murder mysteries, time travel thrillers, horror and biopics, too. So, it's very tricky as a lot of these conventional genres have been so easily ticked away." **10 YEARS AND COUNTING** That being said, the 36-yearold is enjoying this moment, and says that this "weird space" she is in, comes out of a place of contentment. "I'm at a position where I feel I've done quite a bit, I worked really hard and did everything by my own merit, so my success is not a fluke. I consistently pushed myself, so it's a very happy and satisfied place," says Pannu, who isn't on any signing spree and has only three projects - Woh Ladki Hai Kahaan, Phir Aayi Haseen Dillruba and Khel Khel Mein eyeing a release this year. At this point, the actor takes a moment to reflect on the last one decade spent in Bollywood and how she has been "jumping from one film to another". Therefore, without any qualms, she admits that this is a much deserved position to be. "I need to sit back. enjoy the time, relax and rejuvenate, and then come back with something that's going to challenge me further." How-



"I don't have those kind of people around me who are unaware of the fact that I have never gotten things without taking risks. I have thrived on the risks that I have taken. "When I started off in Bollywood a decade ago, there were huge fashion mistakes, which I accept and own up. I'm not a fashion conscious person, so I relied on a lot of people who I thought are good at their job and will dress me up in a way that suits me. So, submitting myself blindly to them backfired in the beginning of my career where I went ahead dressing a certain way believing that this is a trend," Pannu recalls, stressing that it took her a while to find her own ground and personality in the industry.

She goes on to share, "When you are new, you just find it very hard to fit in. You're trying very hard to make sure that you are a mix of glam and bossy; that you are as Indian as it can get and you can look equally hot and nice in a bikini. Basically, you are becoming a buffet. I was also trying to do that. But, it took me years to realise that I'm not a buffet. I am a specialty restaurant, and I'm going to make sure that remain an acquired taste, which is not everybody's cup of tea. It did take time to realise and accept that it's okay to not be that aaloo that fits into every meal."

So now that she has had her share of ups and down with the fashion police, Pannu describes her style statement as "chic mixed with edgy". She elaborates, "It's classic with a mix of being proper. I don't like the word boss vibe. Chic mixed with edgy is what I actually identify it. Chic in the sense it won't be shabby or street kind of a vibe. Remember her no filter views on nepotism in the film industry? Asked if anyone advised her otherwise while she chose this name for her production house and Pannu says she can't really recall anyone who told her not to get into it. wedding because I wanted to dance a lot on all functions."

Congress Taking Support Of Banned PFI To Win Wayanad Seat: PM Modi

PM Modi also continued his attack against the Congress on the "inheritance tax" issue and targeted the party's government in Karnataka on law and order issues.

BELAGAVI (KARNATAKA), Apr 28 (Agencies): Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Sunday accused Congress leader Rahul Gandhi of insulting India's Rajas and Maharajas, but remaining silent on the atrocities committed by Nawabs, Nizams, Sultans and Badshahs for the sake of appeasement politics.

He also continued his attack against the Congress on the "inheritance tax" issue and targeted the party's government in Karnataka on law and order issues

The BJP is working on increasing the assets of the people, but Congress' shahzade (Rahul Gandhi) and his sister (Priyanka Gandhi Vadra), both are announcing that if they come to power, they will do the 'X-ray' of the country, PM Modi said.

"They will x-ray your property, bank lockers, lands, vehicles, also 'Streedhan' and ornaments of women, gold, the Mangalsutra. These people will raid every house and capture your assets. After capturing they are talking about redistributing it, they want it to give it to their loved vote bank...will you allow this loot to happen?" he asked.

"I want to alert Congress," PM Modi said, asserting that "leave this intention. Until Modi is alive, I will not allow it...

Addressing a mega public meeting here, he said, "Congress has ensured the writings of our history and our freedom struggle with an eye on appeasement and vote bank. Even today, the Congress' shehzade (prince) is carrying forward that sin. You might have heard Congress' shehzade's recent statement -- he says Bharath's Rajas and Maharajas were atyachari (oppressive)." "He (Gandhi) has accused

them (Rajas and Maharajas) of usurping the lands and properties of people and poor...Congress' shehzade has insulted great personalities like Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj and Kittur Rani Channamma, whose administration and patriotism inspire us even today," the prime minister said.

Recalling the contribution of the erstwhile Mysuru royal family for which they are respected across the country even today, he said, "The Congress' shehzade's statements were intentional, aimed at vote bank politics and appeasement." "Shahzade spoke ill about Raja, Maharajas, but the shahzade's mouth was locked regarding the 'atyachar' that Nawabs, Nizams, Sultans and Badshahs committed in India's history. His mouth was shut on them, but on Raja, Maharajas he speaks ill and insults them," he said.

Noting that Mr Gandhi cannot remember Mughal emperor Aurangzeb's oppressions, PM Modi said, "He (Aurangzeb) impured a number of our temples and destroyed them. Congress is happily making alliances with parties that praise Aurangzeb...they don't remem-



religious places and indulged in killing, killing of cows. They don't remember the Nawab, who played a role in the partition of India." He further recalled the contributions of the Raja of Banaras in setting up Banaras Hindu University, and Maharani Ahilyabai Holkar in the reconstruction of temples.

"It was the Maharaja of Baroda who had identified the talent of Ambedkar...the Congress's shehzade doesn't remember the contributions of Rajas and Maharajas. For vote bank they show the guts of speaking against Rajas and Maharajas, but don't have the strength to speak against Nawabs, sultans and Badshahs," he said adding that Congress' "appeasement mindset" has come out in the open before the country, and the same reflects in their manifesto. Veteran BJP leader B S Yedi-

yurappa, the party's candidate from Belgaum (Belagavi) former Chief Minister Jagadish Shettar, and Chikkodi candidate Annasaheb Shankar Jolle, were among those present.

Since the time Congress came to power in Karnataka, the law and order situation in the entire state has worsened, PM Modi alleged, recalling the atrocity against an adivasi woman in Belagavi and the killing of a Jain monk in Chikkodi. These shameful incidents have degraded Karnataka's pride.

Citing the recent murder of a Hubballi student, Neha Hiremath, at her college premises that created "sensation" in the country, he said, the family sought action, but the Congress government gave priority to appeasement.

"For them, the lives of daughters like Neha have no value, they think only about their vote bank." Even when there was a bomb blast in a Bengaluru cafe, the Congress government did not take it seriously initially; they even termed it a cylinder blast initially. "Why are you -- Congress -- lying to the people of the country, if you can't, leave and go home," PM Modi said.

The Congress for the sake of votes is taking support of banned PFI -- the anti-national organisation that supported terrorism. "To win one seat in Wayanad, are you surrendering to them? BJP has banned PFI and has put its leaders behind bars," he said.

PM Modi said Congress has come up with a "dangerous" formula of "inheritance tax", according to which the party, in the event of coming to power, will tax what one saves for his children, either money or property.

"They (Congress) say, you cannot give what you save for your children. If you have to give, you have to pay 55 per cent tax on it...to distribute to its vote bank they want to capture your assets," he alleged.

1 killed, 3 injured in gunfight between village volunteers in Manipur

IMPHAL, Apr 28 (Agencies): One person was killed and three others injured in a gunfight between village volunteers of two warring communities in ethnic strife-torn Manipur's Kangpokpi district on Sunday, police said. Dozens of gunmen had attacked Koutruk in Imphal West district on Sunday morning from elevated hilltops of neighbouring Kangpokpi district prompting village volunteers deployed in the fringe village to retaliate. Exchange of fire gradually spread to adjacent villages of Kadangband and Senjam Chirang, they said. Koutruk village has been witness to intense

gunfights between village volunteers of two warring communities since ethnic violence broke out on May 3 last year. It has been identified as one of the most vulnerable areas for gun attacks. More than 200 people have been killed and thousands rendered homeless in ethnic strife between Imphal Valley-based Meiteis and adjoining hills-based Kukis since May 3 last year.

Meanwhile, denouncing the killing, the Kangpokpi district-based Committee on Tribal Unity (COTU) has called for a 12-hour shutdown in the district from noon of April 28.

Cab driver, 2 others injured as speeding **Jaguar hits 3 vehicles in Delhi**

NEW DELHI, Apr 28 (Agencies): A cab driver and two more people sustained serious injuries after a speeding luxury car hit their vehicle here, police said on Sunday.

The incident took place early in the morning when a speeding Jaguar hit the cab and two other vehicles before coming to a halt near the Dhaula Kaun area of southwest Delhi, the police said.

"A PCR call was received at about 4.55 am regarding the accident of three vehicles and three injured individuals. A team, which was sent to the spot, found that the injured had been shifted to hospital," Deputy Commissioner of Police (southwest) Rohit Meena said. Later, at 8.32 am, the police received information from AIIMS Hospital regarding the cab driver, identified as Harjeet Singh, and two other people, who were travelling in the same cab, "We have identified the owner of the Jaguar car, who fled the scene after the accident. Teams have been sent to nab the accused," he said. DCP Meena said investigations are under way and the police are trying to find out if more people were injured in the accident.

Criticism of Biden administration's support for Israel's 6-month-old military offensive in Gaza has spread through American college campuses, with students pitching encampments in effort to force their universities to divest from Israel

WASHINGTON, Apr 28 (Agencies): An election-year roast of President Joe Biden before journalists, celebrities and politicians at the annual White House correspondents' dinner Saturday butted up against growing public discord over the Israel-Hamas war, with large protests outside the event condemning both Biden's handling of the conflict and the Western news' media coverage of it.

In previous years, Biden, like most of his predecessors, has used the glitzy annual White House Correspondents' Association gala to needle media coverage of his administration and jab at political rivals, notably Republican rival Donald Trump.

With hundreds of protesters rallying against the war in Gaza outside the event and concerns over the conflict and humanitarian crisis in Gaza and the perils for journalists covering the conflict, the war hung over this year's event.

"Shame on you!" protesters draped in the traditional Palestinian keffiyeh cloth shouted, running after men in tuxedos and suits and women in long dresses who were holding clutch purses, as guests and other participants hurried inside. Chants accused US journalists of undercovering the war and

misrepresenting it. "Western media we see you, and all the horrors that you hide," crowds chanted at one point.

Other protesters lay sprawled motionless on the pavement, next to mock-ups of flak vests with "press" insignia.

Ralliers cried "Free, free Pal-



estine." They cheered when at one point someone inside the Washington Hilton — where the dinner has been held for decades - unfurled a Palestinian flag from a top-floor hotel window.

Criticism of the Biden administration's support for Israel's 6-month-old military offensive in Gaza has spread through American college campuses, with students pitching encampments in an effort to force their universities to divest from Israel. Counter protests back Israel's offensive and complain of antisemitism.

Biden's speech before an expected crowd of nearly 3,000 people was being followed by entertainer Colin Jost from "Saturday Night Live."

There will also likely be a spotlight on the many journalists detained and otherwise persecuted around the globe for doing their jobs, including Wall Street Journal reporter Evan Gershkovich, who has been imprisoned in Russia since March 2023.

Law enforcement, including the Secret Service, have instituted extra street closures and other measures to ensure what Secret Service spokesman Anthony Guglielmi said would be the "highest levels of safety and security for attendees."

The agency was working with Washington police to protect demonstrators' right to assemble, Guglielmi said. However, "we will remain intolerant to any violent or destructive behavior." Protest organizers said they wanted to bring attention to the high numbers of Palestinian and other Arab journalists killed by Israel's military since the war began in October.

More than two dozen journalists in Gaza wrote a letter last week calling on their colleagues in Washington to boycott the dinner altogether.

"The toll exacted on us for merely fulfilling our journalistic duties is staggering," the letter states. "We are subjected to detentions, interrogations, and torture by the Israeli military, all for the crime' of journalistic integrity."

One organizer complained that the White House Correspondents' Association — which

represents the hundreds of journalists who cover the president - largely has been silent since the first weeks of the war about the killings of Palestinian journalists. WHCA did not respond to request for comment.

According to a preliminary investigation released Friday by the Committee to Protect Journalists, nearly 100 journalists have been killed covering the war in Gaza. Israel has defended its actions, saying it has been targeting militants.

"Since the Israel-Gaza war began, journalists have been paying the highest price- their lives-to defend our right to the truth. Each time a journalist dies or is injured, we lose a fragment of that truth," CPJ Program Director Carlos Martínez de la Serna said in a statement.

Sandra Tamari, executive director of Adalah Justice Project, a US-based Palestinian advocacy group that helped organize the letter from journalists in Gaza, said "it is shameful for the media to dine and laugh with President Biden while he enables the Israeli devastation and starvation of Palestinians in Gaza."

In addition, Adalah Justice Project started an email campaign targeting 12 media executives at various news outlets ---including The Associated Press - expected to attend the dinner who previously signed onto a letter calling for the protection of journalists in Gaza.

"How can you still go when your colleagues in Gaza asked vou not to?" a demonstrator asked guests heading in. "You are complicit."

DHAKA, Apr 28 (Agencies): Millions of students returned to their reopened schools across Bangladesh Sunday despite a lingering heatwave that prompted a nationwide classroom shutdown order last weekend.

Average maximum temperatures in the capital Dhaka over the past week have been 4-5 degrees Celsius (7.2-9 degrees Fahrenheit) higher than the 30-year average for the same period, with several more days of hot weather forecast.

Classes resumed with anxious relatives accompanying their children to school gates for the start of classes in Bangladesh, which follows the Sunday-

Forecaster Kazi Jebunnesa said rain would likely bring some

relief after Thursday. Another weather bureau meteorologist, Muhammad Abul Kalam Mallik, told agency Bangladesh had not seen such an intense heatwave since records began in 1948.

"It is a record as far as the duration and the coverage area in the country are concerned," he said, adding that the searing temperatures were affecting about three-quarters of the country.

Mallik said climate change and man-made causes including rapid urbanisation, forest clearance, shrinking water bodies and increased usage of air conditioning were to blame.

"The trouble is, we will see more such severe heatwaves in the future," he said.

Indonesia Volcano Erupts, Sends Ash Cloud 3.5 km Into The Sky

JAKARTA, Apr 28 (Agencies): A volcano in eastern Indonesia erupted on Sunday morning, spewing an ash tower more than two miles into the sky and prompting officials to warn people to keep away. Mount Ibu, located on the island of Halmahera in North Maluku province, erupted at 12:37 am (1537 GMT Saturday) and sent a thick column of dark smoke and ash west of the peak. The eruption lasted more than three minutes and the ash towered 3.5 kilometres (2.2 miles) above the peak, an official at Mount Ibu's monitoring post. Axl Roeroe, said in a statement on Sunday.

US Secretary of State Antony Blinken, Palestinian leaders and highranking officials from other countries trying to broker a ceasefire between Israel and Hamas are on the guest list for the summit in Riyadh, capital of the world's biggest crude oil exporter.

The Gaza war along with conflicts in Ukraine and elsewhere put "a lot of pressure" on the economic "mood", Saudi Finance Minister Mohammed al-Jadaan said at one of the first panel discussions of the two-day World Economic Forum (WEF) special meeting.

"I think cool-headed countries and leaders and people need to prevail, and you need to make sure that you actually de-escalate," Jadaan said. "The region needs sta-

bility."

The war in Gaza, which has sent regional tensions soaring, began with an unprecedented attack on southern Israel by Palestinian militant group Hamas on October 7.

The attack resulted in the deaths of about 1,170 people, mostly civilians, according to



an agency tally of Israeli official figures.

Israel estimates that 129 hostages seized by militants on October 7 are still being held in Gaza, including 34 the military says are dead. Vowing to destroy Hamas, Israel's retaliatory offensive has killed at least 34,388 people in Gaza, mostly women and children, according "The world is today

walking a tightrope right now, trying to balance security and prosperity," Saudi planning minister Faisal al-Ibrahim told a press conference on Saturday previewing the summit.

"We meet at a moment when one misjudgement or one miscalculation or one miscommunication will further exacerbate our challenges."

'New momentum' in hostage talks WEF president Borge

Brende told Saturday's press conference there was "some new momentum now in the talks around the hostages,

Hamas said on Saturday it was studying the latest Israeli counterproposal regarding a potential ceasefire in Gaza, a day after media reports said a delegation from mediator Egypt arrived in Israel in a bid to jumpstart stalled negotiations.

From the outset Saudi Arabia has worked with other regional and global powers to try to contain the war in Gaza and avoid the type of conflagration that could derail its ambitious economic reform agenda known as Vision 2030.

Spotlight on Saudi The kingdom also remains in talks about a landmark deal under which it would recognise Israel for the first time while strengthening its security partnership with the United States.

Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman, Saudi Arabia's de facto ruler, spoke optimistically about the deal in an interview with Fox News in September, but analysts say the war has made it more difficult.

Meanwhile the conservative Gulf kingdom, home to the holiest shrines in Islam, is trying

Days After Postponing India Trip, Elon Musk Heads To China



SHANGHAI, Apr 28 (Agencies): Tesla CEO Elon Musk has headed to China on Sunday on a surprise visit to the country, which is also the second biggest market of the electric vehicle giant, news agency reported citing two people with knowledge of the matter.

Musk's visit to China comes a week after his visit to India was postponed due to 'Tesla obligations.' He was scheduled to meet with Prime Minister Narendra Modi and announce plans to enter the Indian market.

Meanwhile, as of now, Musk is seeking to meet senior Chinese officials in Beijing to discuss the rollout of Full-Self Driving (FSD) software in China and to obtain approval to transfer data collected in the country abroad to train algorithms for its autonomous driving technologies, Reuters said, citing one of the two people.

In response to a query on social media platform X, the Musk stated that Tesla may make FSD available to customers in China "very soon." Notably, Musk's visit to China was not made prominently visible in public eyes.

According to agency, Tesla, since 2021, has stored all data collected by its Chinese fleet in Shanghai as required by Chinese regulators and has not transferred any, back to the United States.

The US EV maker rolled out FSD, the most autonomous version of its Autopilot software, four years ago but has yet to make it available in China despite customers urging it to do so.



Balanced diet boosts brain health and cognitive function

NEW DELHI, Apr 28 (Agencies): Researchers from the University of Warwick have unveiled a profound link between dietary choices and brain health. The study, which involved the analysis of 181,990 participants from the UK Biobank, has shed new light on the impact of food preferences on both physical and mental wellbeing

The research delved into a range of physical evaluations, including cognitive function, blood metabolic biomarkers, brain imaging, and genetics, to gain insights into the relationship between nutrition and overall wellbeing. The participants' food preferences were collected through an online questionnaire, and with the help of machine learning, the researchers categorized the data into 10 groups, such as alcohol, fruits, and meats.

The findings, published in Nature, revealed that a healthy and balanced diet is associated with superior brain health, enhanced cognitive function, and improved



mental wellbeing. Participants who adhered to a balanced diet exhibited higher amounts of grey matter in the brain, which is linked to intelligence. compared to those with a less varied diet.

Moreover, the study emphasized the need for gradual dietary modifications, especially for individuals accustomed to

highly palatable but nutritionally deficient foods. By gradually reducing sugar and fat intake over time, individuals may naturally gravitate towards healthier food choices.

The researchers also

highlighted the influence of genetic factors on the association between diet and brain health, emphasizing how a combination

Addressing the broader implications of the research, Professor Feng emphasized the role of public policy in promoting accessible and affordable healthy eating options. He stated, "Since dietary choices can be influenced by socioeconomic status, it's crucial to ensure that this does not hinder individuals from adopting a healthy balanced dietary profile. Implementing affordable informed and healthier dietary choices, thereby promoting overall public health."

Co-Author Wei Cheng from Fudan University underscored the importance of promoting nutritional awareness and fostering healthier eating habits across diverse populations, urging for concerted efforts in this direction.

Dr. Richard Pemberton, a Certified Lifestyle Physician and GP at Hexagon Health, who was not involved in the study, commented on the research, saying, "This exciting research further demonstrates that a poor diet detrimentally impacts not only our physical health but also our mental and brain health. This study supports the need for urgent government action to optimize health in our children. protecting future generations. We also hope this provides further evidence to motivate us all to make better lifestyle choices, to improve our health and reduce the risk of developing chronic disease."

candidates in first two phases of Lok Sabha Polls

constituting nearly half of India's electorate, their under representation in the candidate pool raises broader questions about the barriers hindering women's full participation in the political sphere, Dr. Iftekhar Ahmad Ansari, Associate Professor at the Aligarh Muslim University (AMU), said.

Beyond the symbolic gestures and promises, he stressed the importance of structural reforms to ensure equal opportunities for women in politics.

He highlighted the critical role of party leadership in promoting gender diversity.

"Political parties must prioritise gender inclusion in candidate selection and provide adequate support to women aspirants," she emphasised.

The issue of women's political representation extends beyond numerical quotas to encompass systemic changes in party dynamics and electoral processes, Farhat Jahan, a retired faculty member at the Abdullah Women's College at the AMU said while emphasising the need for gender-sensitive policies that address challenges faced by women in politics.

"The upcoming phases of the elections present an opportunity for political parties to demonstrate their commitment to gender equality through concrete actions. Initiatives such as mentorship programs, capacity-building workshops, and awareness campaigns can empower women to actively participate in the electoral process and pursue leadership roles," she added. Prof. Mohammad Aftab Alam from the political science department at the AMU

pointed out the challenges women often face in forming independent political opinions amidst societal influences

"Even the ones elected are often relegated to symbolic roles," he remarked, highlighting broader issues of token representation.

The BJD is the only party, which as a policy, gives 33 per cent tickets to female candidates.

Meera Parida, state vice president of the Biju Mahila Dal of the BJD, stressed the need for substantive action in women's empowerment and praised her party's initiative of reserving 33 per cent of seats for women.

"Reserving seats alone is not enough. We need a cultural shift where women are seen as leaders and decision-makers," she emphasised, advocating for comprehensive reforms.

Both major parties — the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and the Congresshave listed women-centric initiatives in their manifestoes

The BJP's manifesto promises to implement the Nari Shakti Vandan Adhiniyam to honour and empower women, integrate women Self-Help Groups (SHGs) into the service sector to enhance their economic participation and expand health services.

The Congress has pledged legislative reforms for women's empowerment, including the immediate enactment of the Women's Reservation Bill.

However, these commitments are yet to translate into substantial numbers of women contesting elections.

Alka Lamba, Chief of Congress Women's Wing, highlighted the Congress's commitment to gender equality across sectors.

"The Congress has extended political, economic, and social rights to women," Lamba affirmed, outlining ambitious targets for women's representation in leadership roles

As the Lok Sabha elections progress, the

spotlight is on political parties to address these concerns and demonstrate tangible commitments towards fostering women's participation and representation in governance

The upcoming poll phases will be closely monitored to assess whether there is a meaningful shift towards greater gender inclusivity in the political landscape especially after the hype over passage of the Women's Reservation Bill, Aftab said.

"While parties are vocal about empowering women, the lack of women candidates reflects a deeper issue of gender bias within political systems," noted Dr. Ramaswamy

iPhone exports double to \$10 billion, India now woos component makers

NEW DELHI, Apr 28 (Agencies): In the government's efforts to make India a key player in electronics manufacturing, one name that stands out is Apple. The Cupertinobased company, which had so far relied on facilities in China to manufacture iPhones, has shifted a sizable base of its assembly operations to India.

India exported smartphones worth around \$15 billion in 2023-24, of which iPhones contributed 65 per cent, or about \$10 billion – up from \$5 billion in the previous year. While the world's biggest electronics contract manufacturer, Foxconn of Taiwan, has major operations in India to assemble iPhones, for the first time. an Indian company, Tata Electronics, too secured a contract to assemble iPhones

Apple has also become a major employer, a large part being women, at its assembly factories in India. "Apple currently directly employs 1.5 lakh people and that number will increase significantly going forward," Union Minister of Electronics and IT Ashwini Vaishnaw told The Indian Express. Over the next three years, officials in the IT ministry estimate, the supplier chain ecosystem would so expand as to employ almost 5 lakh individuals.

The company's expansion has also set in motion a number of its foreign suppliers to set up shop in the country. "Every major entity in the component supply chain ecosystem, be it for camera modules, communications, power supply or digital signal processing are actively looking to set up a base

in India," Vaishnaw said. This automatically lends itself to much better infrastructure in the vicinity. At Sriperumbudur, Apple's main manufacturing base about 40 km from Tamil Nadu capital Chen-



nai, where Foxconn has two big iPhone assembly plants, two massive dormitories, primarily for women workers, are coming up, modelled after China's iPhone city, Zhengzhou.

As per a Bloomberg estimate, in FY24 one in seven iPhones sold globally was made in India. By 2028, the government expects a quarter of all iPhones to be made in India, with some of its accessories, such as Air-Pods also being assembled in the country. In the next two-three years, Apple wants to ramp up its iPhone production in India to more than 50 million units per year.

While the efficiency of the new iPhone unit in India is yet to match up with factories in China, New Delhi's unfavourable stance towards companies from the mainland, and high tariff rates for component imports, are also hurdles faced by Apple's suppliers planning a base in India.

According to Apple's suppliers' list for 2023, as many as 157 contractors manufactured in mainland China, up from 151 the previous year. The number of Indian suppliers, however, has remained remained stagnant at 14 — suggesting limited success so far in translating the tech giant's growing footprint in India and Southeast Asia to

a reduced reliance on China. But government subsidies under the produc-

tion-linked incentive (PLI) scheme for smartphone production, a worsening relationship between the US and China. and Beijing's tough Covid-19 curbs, have all prompted Apple to move a respectable portion of iPhone assembly to India.

Apple's contract manufacturers Foxconn, Pegatron and Wistron (which was acquired by Tata last October) have managed to meet sales and investment thresholds essential for securing payouts under the PLI scheme. While the government does not share the breakdown of payouts for individual entities, it is understood that the three Apple assemblers along with Samsung and homegrown electronics manufacturer Dixon are expected to receive upwards of Rs 4,500 crore for meeting their FY23 PLI targets.

Foxconn, which has the biggest iPhone assembly operations in India, currently hires more than 40,000 people at its plants in Tamil Nadu. Pegatron has a relatively smaller operation and employs around 10,000 workers. Winstron plant, acquired recently by Tata, employs 27,000.

Apple's expansion has spurred interest from companies like Google

in assembling phones in India; there has also been a rise of domestic contract manufacturers — Tata Electronics, Dixon, VVDN and Kaynes have stepped up to service assembly orders of foreign smartphone makers India has a big worker pool in this cat-

egory of assembly operations, which is relatively easier than component manufacturing, requiring higher skill sets "Contract manufacturing is a complex process and requires precision work. Over the last few years Indian manufacturers have perfected these processes and are meeting global standards and requirements," Vaishnaw said. Apart from Foxconn, Pegatron and Tata which

assemble iPhones. there are 11 other firms that have set up bases in India to supply various components needed to make the phones.

Foxlink, a subsidiary of Taiwanese Cheng Uei Precision Industry Co Ltd, based in Andhra Pradesh, makes cables for iPhone chargers. Apple sources battery packs from the US-based Flex Ltd, which has factories in Pune, Chennai, and Bengaluru, among others. China-based Sunwoda Electronic Company Ltd, which has a plant in Uttar Pradesh, is also a battery supplier to Apple. Jabil, from its plant in Pune, makes plastic casings

and enclosures for Air-Pods which are shipped to China and Vietnam where the earphones are finally assembled. Apple sources its chargers from the China-based Lingyi iTech (Guangdong) Company which has a plant in Chennai.

While some foreign suppliers have started manufacturing in India, this number is a fraction compared with Apple's suppliers in China. The industry believes India needs to fix its act on the import tariff front. Earlier this year, the India Cellular and Electronics Association in a report said that India has among the highest tariff lines for smartphone components - its simple average Most Favoured Nation (MFN) tariff for inputs is 8.5 per

cent, higher than China's 3.7 per cent. High import tariffs are typically put in place to prioritise the domestic industry, but experts have argued that in the absence of a local industry - as is the case with component makers in India – such high tax rates act as a deterrent for companies to invest in the country. An IT Ministry official said the government is aware of these concerns and the ministry was working with the Commerce Ministry to reduce or remove tariff rates for several components

"Globally there are 2-4 tax rates so it becomes easy to bring in components, but that number is much higher in India. We are moving to harmonise it so companies don't have to worry about classification. The reason for increasing tariffs during the growth stage is that a country wants to develop their own companies. But, the question is that if you want to bring more suppliers to India then we need to have the right mix between high and low tax rates," the official said.

of cricket equipment or clothing, ground equipment or fixtures and fittings during a match, even though the IPL organisers didn't clarify Kishan's offence.
