MeT forecasts mainly dry, 'Hot' weather in J&K

SRINAGAR, May 7 (Agencies): Mainly dry and "hot" weather has been forecast over Jammu and Kashmir till May 10.

"Mainly dry and hot weather is expected in Jammu and Kashmir," said meteorological department here in a statement for the forecast during the next 24 hours and subsequent two days. However, the MeT department has said that thundershower activity during the afternoon can't be ruled out at a few places till May 10.

On May 11, it said, there is forecast of partly to generally cloudy weather with light rain and thunder at a few places.

Generally cloudy weather with light rain/ snow (over higher reaches) has been predicted at many places with thunder activity at few places on May 12.

On May 13, it said, partly to generally cloudy weather is expected with light rain at few places.

Regarding temperature, a MeT spokesperson said that Srinagar recorded a low of 10.5°C against 11.2°C on the previous night and it was 0.2°C below normal for the summer capital of JK for this time of the year.

Qazigund recorded a minimum of 9.0°C, same as on the previous night and it was 0.2°C below normal for the gateway town of Kashmir, he said.

Pahalgam recorded a low of 5.8°C against 5.4°C on the previous night and it was 0.3°C above normal for the famous resort in south Kashmir.

Kokernag, also

in south Kashmir, recorded a minimum of 10.3°C against 9.7°C and it was 1.1°C above normal, the official said. Kupwara town recorded a minimum of 8.6°C against 8.0°C on the previous night and it was 0.7°C below normal there, the offi-

cial said. Gulmarg recorded a minimum of 7.6°C against 5.2°C on the previous night and it was above normal by 2.4°C for the world famous skiing resort in north Kashmir's Baramulla district.

This includes the Information Technology Act, 2000 and the Information Technology (Intermediary Guidelines and Digital Media Ethics Code) Rules 2021, the Indian Penal Code and framework of the twin acts namely the Representation of People Act,

Man killed over land dispute; Police ACB arrests Naib conduct multiple raids

JAMMU, May 7 (Agencies): The Jammu and Kashmir police has stepped up their efforts in the ongoing investigation into the murder of a person over a land dispute here and have conducted multiple raids at the residences of suspects, officials said on Wednesday.

The incident occurred on May 1, when Avtar Singh (40), son of Balbir Singh, was hit on his head with an iron rod and died because of excessive bleeding during a scuffle between two groups, who staked their claim over the piece of land in Greater Kailash locality.

An angry mob, including the family and relatives of the deceased, blocked Kalu-Chak road on Jammu-Pathankot national highway and demanded a CBI probe into the killing, police "Continuing crack-

down on suspects and accused involved in the

Greater Kailash murder case, police seized two vehicles involved in the commission of crime along with raids at houses of suspects to affect their arrest, " a police spokesman said. He said that the police examined the CCTV

Tehsildar, Khrew for accepting bribe

SRINAGAR, May 7 (Agencies): Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) on Tuesday said to have trapped and arrested Naib Tehsildar Khrew, Pulwama while a Constable was also held for allegedly facilitating the offence.

The spokesman said J&K Anti Corruption Bureau received a complaint against Naib Tehsildar, Khrew, District Pulwama alleging therein that the said Naib-Tehsildar is demanding Rs 10,000 from complainant through his clerk namely Ajaz Ahmad for settlement of dispute of ancestral land at village Sathpokhran, Khrew Pulwama,

"The complainant





What kind of laws will our new MPs enact? Take a look over last 10 years

Parliament is to legislate. When we elect people to the Lok Sabha, we are choosing who will write and pass our laws. In India, laws are now passed without debate, both at the Union and the state levels. This means that parties which have a majority and an ideology can legislate what they want without pushback.

As we elect MPs for the next five years, let us look at many of the laws and amendments that we have been given in the previous decade:

Right to Information (Amendment) Act, 2019

This amendment gives the Union the powers to set the salaries and service conditions of information commissioners at the Union as well as state levels. Instead of fixed terms, commissioners can be appointed on arbitrary conditions and salaries. India fell from second place in global RTI ratings in 2014 to ninth place.

The Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Amendment Act, 2019
Before this amendment, UAPA
only allowed organisations to be
categorised as "terrorist". The
State can now categorise any
individual as a "terrorist". These
individuals need not even have
any affiliation with any of the
36 terrorist organisations mentioned in the law to be classified
as terrorists and then jailed.

The Karnataka Education Act (1983) Order 2022

In 2022, Karnataka banned Muslim women and girls from covering their heads in schools and colleges that had uniforms.

Even in colleges which did not have a prescribed uniform, the covering of heads by Muslims was prohibited because "clothes which disturb equality, integrity and public law and order should not be worn". Sikhs were excluded from the order.

Maharashtra Animal Preservation (Amendment) Act, 2015

After the Prime Minister's speeches against what he called the "pink revolution", states began to criminalise the possession of beef. This began a series of violent attacks the media called "beef lyn-chings". Someone accused of having a beef sandwich can be jailed five years. This first law began a series of copycat laws in other BJP-ruled states.

The Haryana Gauvansh Sanrakshan and Gausamvardhan Act, 2015

Possession of beef is punishable by up to five years in jail. The burden of proof is on the accused

The Gujarat Animal Preservation (Amendment) Act, 2017

This law extended the punishment for cow slaughter to life in prison. No other economic crime attracts life. Minister of state for home Pradipsinh Jadeja said the logic was to equal cow slaughter with murder.

Uttar Pradesh Recovery of Damage to Public and Private Property Act, 2020

Enacted after the UP Police shot dead 21 people protesting against the CAA, this law gives the government the power to set up tribunals to decide damage to any public or private property due to riots, hartals, bandhs, protests or public processions. All orders passed by the tribunals will be final and cannot be appealed before any court, under the law's Section 22.

Uttarakhand Freedom of Religion Act, 2018

This is the first of seven state laws introduced and legislated by the BJP after the conspiracy theory of "love jihad" began to be circulated. It criminalises marriages between Hindus and Muslims if conversion is involved. However, "if any person comes back to his ancestral religion", then this shall not be deemed conversion. Those who change their faith without applying to the government "in the prescribed pro-forma" and without the consent of the government after the police inquiry face jail.

Himachal Pradesh Freedom of Religion Act, 2019

Similar to Uttarakhand's law, under this law the punishment for propagation (a fundamental right under Article 25) is seven years in jail.

Uttar Pradesh Vidhi Viruddh Dharma Samparivartan Pratishedh Adhyadesh, 2020

Similar to the previous laws, this one prohibits conversion except with government permission and 60 days' notice. Similar laws were passed by BJP governments in MP (Madhya Pradesh Freedom of Religion Act, 2021), Gujarat (Gujarat Freedom of Religion (Amendment) Act, 2021), Karnataka (Karnataka Protection of Right to Freedom of Religion Act, 2022) and Haryana (Haryana Prevention of Unlawful Conversion of Religious Act, 2022).

Temporary Suspension of Telecom Services (Public Emergency or Public Safety) Rules, 2017 This gives the Union and state governments the power to suspend, for any reason, mobile and Internet services. India is the world's leader in Internet shutdowns. Of 213 total global shutdowns in 2019, India accounted for 56 per cent (12 times more than the next nation, Venezuela). Of 155 global shutdowns in 2020, India accounted for 70 per cent.

Gujarat Prohibition of Transfer of Immovable Property and Provision for Protection of Tenants from Eviction from Premises in Disturbed Areas Act, 2019 Amendment

This law bans Hindus and Muslims from buying or renting properties from each other without the government's permission. The government will determine if the sale of a property would lead to the likelihood of "polarisation" or "improper clustering" of people from a particular religion. It also gives the government the power to undo transactions, even if the buyer and seller make no appeal. In effect, even foreigners can lease and buy property in those parts of Gujarat's cities where Indian Muslims cannot. It should be noted that some of these laws have remained even after the party that has legislated them in a state has been unseated. These laws have a long-term effect and have conditioned the police and bureaucrats and the judiciary to think of our society in a particu-

They are a reflection of the sort of nation India has become and give us a glimpse into what more we can expect in the years to come after this election ends.

- 7. Digital media is democratic unlike print media which is privatized and often run by big businesses.

CONCLUSION

Both print and digital media have their own advantages and disadvantages and have a solid user base. So if we consider the present trends the consumers of digital media are increasing at a rapid rate and the share of print media is going down. But it is not exactly dying. With the increasing literacy rates print too is having a stronghold. So we can say that print and digital media are co-existing quite happily.

RANCHI, May 7 (Agencies): The Enforcement Directorate on Tuesday arrested Jharkhand Minister Alamgir Alam's personal secretary Sanjiv Lal and the latter's house help Jahangir after it recovered "unaccounted cash" worth Rs 34.23 crore during a raid on Monday.

The news agency said the two men were arrested under provisions of the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) after they were questioned overnight.

A video shared by news agency showed Sanjiv Lal and Jahangir Alam being brought to the court before their arrest.

On Tuesday, Lal and Jahangir will be produced before a court, following which the Enforcement Directorate will take them on

On his part, Alam, the 70-year-old Con-



gress leader and Jharkhand's Rural Development Minister, has denied any wrong doing. On Monday, the Enforcement Directorate conducted multiple raids in Ranchi, including a flat occupied by Lal's house help, in connection to a money laundering case against Virendra K Ram, a former chief engineer of the Jharkhand Rural Development Department, who was arrested in February 2023. The case is linked to alleged irregularities

in the implementation of some schemes in the department.

Besides the huge amount of cash, jewellery and a luxury SUV recovered from Jahangir's premises, the probe agency also found Rs 3 crore at another location that belonged to builder Munna Singh, who used to work as a contractor in the Jharkhand Rural Development Department.

The money laundering case against Virendra K Ram stems from a complaint by the Jharkhand Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB).

The Enforcement Directorate had alleged in a statement last year that he had "generated proceeds of crime in the name of commission from contractors in lieu of allotment of tenders to them".

103-Year-Old Woman Votes In Assam's Dhubri



GUWAHATI, May 7 (Agencies): A 103-year-old woman cast her vote in Assam's Dhubri today in the third phase of the Lok Sabha elections. Video footage from Birsing Aminerchar village shows the woman being escorted to a polling station by a relative before she enters the booth and casts her vote.

According to election commission data, approximately 10.12 per cent of the 81.49 lakh eligible voters cast their votes during the initial two hours of polling in four Lok Sabha constituencies in Assam today. Among these, Dhubri saw the highest turnout with 10.75 per cent, followed by Guwahati at 10.38 per cent, Kokrajhar at 9.77 per cent, and Barpeta at 9.26 per cent by 9 am.

Sparse queues marked the early hours of voting at the 9,516 polling stations, likely due to heavy rainfall the night before. However, authorities anticipate an increase in voter participation as the day progresses.

A total of 81,49,091 voters, including 41,00,544 men, 40,48,436 women, and 111 individuals belonging to the third gender, are eligible to exercise their voting rights. They will determine the fate of 47 candidates contesting in the third and final phase of polling in Assam. Polling began at 7 am and is scheduled to continue until 5 pm.

Israeli forces take control of the Gaza side of the Rafah crossing with Egypt



JERUSALEM, May 7 (Agencies): An Israeli tank brigade seized control Tuesday of the Gaza Strip side of the Rafah border crossing with Egypt, authorities said, moving forward with an offensive in the southern city even as cease-fire negotiations with Hamas remain on a knife's edge.

The Israeli 401st Brigade entered the Rafah crossing early Tuesday morning, the Israeli military said, taking "operational control" of the crucial crossing for both aid and those able to flee into Egypt

Footage released by the Israeli military showed a tank entering the crossing. Details of the video matched known features of the crossing and showed Israeli flags flying from tanks that seized the

The Israeli military claimed it seized the

crossing after receiving intelligence it was "being used for terrorist purposes." The military did not provide evidence to immediately support the assertion, though it alleged the area around the crossing had been used to launch a mortar attack that killed four Israeli troops and wounded others near the Kerem Shalom Crossing.

The military also said that ground troops and airstrikes targeted suspected Hamas positions in Rafah.

Wael Abu Omar, a spokesman for the Palestinian Crossings Authority, acknowledged Israeli forces had seized the crossing and had closed the facility for the time being. He said strikes had targeted the area around the

crossing since Monday.

Putin is starting his fifth term as president, more in control of Russia than ever

Already in office for nearly a quarter-century and the longest-serving Kremlin leader since Josef Stalin, Putin's new term doesn't expire until 2030.

MOSCOW, May 7 (Agencies): Vladimir Putin begins his fifth term as Russian president in an opulent Kremlin inauguration Tuesday, after destroying his political opponents, launching a devastating war in Ukraine and consolidating all power in his hands.

Already in office for nearly a quarter-century and the longest-serving Kremlin leader since Josef Stalin, Putin's new term doesn't expire until 2030, when he is constitutionally eligible to run for another six years.

He has transformed Russia from a country emerging from economic collapse to a pariah state that threatens global security. Following the 2022 invasion of Ukraine that has become Europe's biggest conflict since World War II, Russia has been heavily sanctioned by the West and is turning other regimes like China, Iran and North Korea for support.

The question now is what the 71-year-old Putin will do over the course of another six years, both at home and abroad.

Russian forces are gaining ground in Ukraine, deploying scorched-earth tactics as Kyiv grapples with shortages of men and ammunition. Both sides are taking heavy casualties.

Ukraine has brought the battle to Russian soil through drone



and missile attacks, especially in border regions. In a speech in February, Putin vowed to fulfill Moscow's goals in Ukraine, and do what is needed to "defend our sovereignty and security of our citizens.'

Shortly after his orchestrated reelection in March, Putin suggested that a confrontation between NATO and Russia is possible, and he declared he wanted to carve out a buffer zone in Ukraine to protect his country from cross-border attacks.

At home, Putin's popularity is closely tied to improving living standards for ordinary Rus-

He began his term in 2018 by promising to get Russia into the top five global economies, vowing it should be "modern and dynamic." Instead, Russia's economy has pivoted to a war footing, and authorities are

spending record amounts on defense.

Analysts say now that Putin has secured another six years in power, the government could take the unpopular steps of raising taxes to fund the war and pressure more men to join the military.

At the start of a new term, the Russian government is routinely dissolved so that Putin can name a new prime minister and Cabinet.

One key area to watch is the Defense Ministry.

Last year, Defense Minister Sergei Shoigu came under pressure over his conduct of the war, with mercenary leader Yevgeny Prigozhin launching withering criticism against him for shortages of ammunition for his private contractors fighting in Ukraine. Prigozhin's brief uprising in June against the Defense Ministry represented the biggest threat to Putin's rule.

After Prigozhin was killed two months later in a mysterious plane crash, Shoigu appeared to have survived the infighting. But last month, his protege, Deputy Defense Minister Timur Ivanov, was detained on charges of bribery amid reports of rampant corruption.

Some analysts have suggested Shoigu could become a victim of the government reshuffle but that would be a bold move as the war is still raging in Ukraine.

In the years following the invasion, authorities have cracked down on any form of dissent with a ferocity not seen since Soviet times. There is no sign that this repression will ease in Putin's new term.

His greatest political foe, opposition leader Alexei Navalny, died in an Arctic penal colony in February. Other prominent critics have either been imprisoned or have fled the country, and even some of his opponents abroad fear for their security.

Laws have been enacted that threaten long prison terms for anyone who discredits the military. The Kremlin also targets independent media, rights groups, LGBTQ+ activists and others who don't hew to what Putin has emphasized as Russia's "traditional family values."

Malaysian government defends presence of companies that supply weapons to Israel at defense show



KUALA LUMPUR, May 7 (Agencies): Malaysia will not interfere in business relations between arms manufacturers and other countries, its defense minister said Tuesday, after protesters demanded that the government expel companies that supply weapons to Israel from an international exhibition.

More than 1,300 companies from 60 nations are participating in Defense Services Asia and the concurrent National Security Asia exhibitions that started Monday. The events are hosted and co-organized by Malaysia's Defense Ministry and Home Affairs Ministry.

The Solidarity for Palestinian coalition held a brief rally outside the exhibition center on Tuesday to protest the presence of U.S. weapons maker Lockheed Martin, European missile manufacturer MBDA and others that provide arms to Israel. The coalition accused the manufacturers of being complicit in Israel's offensive in Gaza.

They said the companies' presence was inconsistent with the Malaysian government's support of Palestinian statehood and insensitive to the many Malaysians who oppose Israel's actions in the Palestinian territories. Muslims account for two-thirds of Malaysia's 34 million people.

"We urge the Malaysian government to take a firm and consistent stand. Do not allow these murderous arm dealers to par-

ticipate and prevent their war mongering," coalition spokesperson Tian Chua said.

Defense Minister Khaled Nordin said Malaysia opposes all forms of injustice against the Palestinian people but is also a "free trade country." He said the exhibition is a space for the defense industry to display its latest technology and help countries strengthen their defense preparedness.

"This exhibition does not favor or give advantage to any particular country or company," Khaled said in a statement. "The relationship of some global defense companies with certain countries is a business matter that Malaysia will not interfere with."

He noted that many Islamic countries are participating in the exhibition, including Turkey, Indonesia, the United Arab Emirates, Iran and Pakistan.

Former Prime Minister Mahathir Mohamad has also called for the arms suppliers to be expelled from the country.

Pro-Palestinian protesters retake Massachusetts institute's encampment, occupy building at Rhode Island School of Design

NEW YORK, May 7 (Agencies): A Monday deadline for pro-Palestinian protesters to leave an encampment at Massachusetts Institute of Technology cleared many demonstrators only to have the site retaken while protesters at the Rhode Island School of Design began occupying a building in the ongoing protest movement connected to the Israel-Hamas war.

At MIT, protesters were given an afternoon deadline in which to voluntarily leave the protest site or face suspension. Many left, according to an MIT spokesperson, who said protesters breached fencing after the arrival of demonstrators from outside the uni-

On Monday night, dozens of protesters remained at the encampment in a calmer atmosphere, listening to speakers and chanting before taking a pizza dinner break.

Sam Ihns, a graduate student at MIT studying mechanical engineering and a member of MIT Jews for a Ceasefire, said the group has been at the encampment for the past two weeks and that they were calling for an end to the killing in

"Specifically, our encampment is protesting MIT's direct research ties to the Israeli Ministry of Defence," he said.

Earlier in the day Erica Caple James, a professor of medical anthropology and urban studies at MIT, attended the protests as a faculty observer and an adviser to the Alliance of Concerned Faculty.

"My hope is that the day ends without harm befalling anyone, without there being physical violence and hopefully with space to open negotiations again between the administration and students, faculty and staff who are concerned about MIT's global influence," she said.

No arrests had been made as of Monday night, according to the MIT spokesperson.

At the Rhode Island School of Design, where students started occupying a building Monday, a spokesperson said the school affirms students' rights to freedom of speech and peaceful assembly and that they support all members of their community. The RISD president and provost were on site meeting with the demonstrators, the spokesperson said.

Demonstrations at Columbia University, where the protest movement began about three weeks ago, have roiled its campus. Officials on Monday cancelled its large main ceremony, but said students will be able to celebrate at a series of smaller, school-based ceremonies this week and next.

The decision comes as universities around the country wrangle with how to handle commencements for students whose high school graduations were derailed by COVID-19 in 2020.

Another campus shaken by protests, Emory University, announced Monday that it would move its commencement from its Atlanta campus to a suburban arena. Others, including the University of Michigan, Indiana University and Northeastern, have pulled off ceremonies with few disruptions.

Columbia's decision to cancel its main ceremonies scheduled for May 15 saves its president, Minouche Shafik, from having to deliver a commencement address in the same part of campus where police dismantled a protest encampment last week. The Ivy League school in upper Manhattan said it made the decision after discussions with students.

Columbia had already cancelled in-person classes. More than 200 pro-Palestinian demonstrators who had camped out on Columbia's green or occupied an academic building were arrested in recent

Similar encampments sprouted up elsewhere as universities struggled with where to draw the line between allowing free expression while maintaining safe and inclusive campuses.

The University of Southern California earlier cancelled its main graduation ceremony. Students abandoned their camp at USC on Sunday after being surrounded by

police and threatened with arrest. Other universities have held graduation ceremonies with beefed-up security. The University of Michigan's ceremony was interrupted by chanting a few times Saturday.

Emory's ceremonies scheduled for May 13 will be held almost 20 miles (30 kilometers) northeast of the university's Atlanta campus, President Gregory Fenves said in an open letter.

"Please know that this decision was not taken lightly," Fenves wrote. "It was made in close consultation with the Emory Police Department, security advisors and other agencies — each of which advised against holding commencement events on our campuses.'

The 16,000-student university is one of many that has seen repeated protests stemming from the conflict that started October 7 when Hamas militants attacked southern Israel, killing about 1,200 people, mostly civilians, and taking roughly 250 hostages.

Student protesters are calling on their schools to divest from companies that do business with Israel or otherwise contribute to the war

Vowing to destroy Hamas, Israel launched an offensive in Gaza that has killed more than 34,500 Palestinians, about two-thirds of them women and children, according to

the Health Ministry in the Hamasruled territory. Israeli strikes have devastated the enclave and displaced most of its inhabitants.

Hamas on Monday announced its acceptance of an Egyptian-Qatari cease-fire proposal, but Israel said the deal did not meet its "core demands" and that it was pushing ahead with an assault on the southern Gaza town of Rafah.

"Cease-fires are temporary," said Selina Al-Shihabi, a Georgetown University sophomore who was taking part in a protest at George Washington. "There can be a cease-fire, but the US government will continue to arm the Israeli military. We plan to be here until the university divests or until they drag us out of here.

At the University of California, San Diego, police cleared an encampment and arrested more than 64 people, including 40 students.

The University of California, Los Angeles, moved all classes online for the week due to ongoing disruptions following the dismantling of an encampment last week which resulted in 44 reported arrests.

Chancellor Gene Block said Monday night that UCLA's newly appointed chief safety officer would lead an investigation to identify and prosecute the "group of instigators" who led a violent attack on pro-Palestinian demonstrators on April

30. The university has asked Los Angeles police, the FBI and the district attorney's office for assistance, Block said.

Schools are trying various tactics from appeasement to threats of disciplinary action to get protestors to take down encampments or move to other areas of campus.

The School of the Art Institute of Chicago said in a Facebook post Sunday that it offered protesters "amnesty from academic sanction and trespassing charges" if they moved and that many protesters voluntarily left.

"Those that remained were arrested," the school said.

A group of faculty and staff members at University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill asked the administration for amnesty for student protesters who were recently arrested and suspended. UNC Faculty and Staff for Justice in Palestine said in a media advisory that it would deliver a letter on behalf of more than 500 faculty who support the student activists.

Harvard University's interim president, Alan Garber, warned students that those participating in a pro-Palestinian encampment in Harvard Yard could face "involuntary leave." That means they would not be allowed on campus, could lose their student housing and may not be able to take exams, Garber

Dimple holds protest against malpractices within PDD

demanded a CBI inquiry into the actions of PDD officials and urged for the cessation of their salaries until they could prove that their electricity was not being bypassed through smart meters. This demand for accountability sought to root out corruption and restore trust in the functioning of the department.

Dimple also directed his demands towards the Lieutenant Governor of Jammu & Kashmir, Manoj Sinha, calling for an inquiry into the residences of all PDD officers across the region and insisting on the suspension of their salaries

proof of legitimate electricity usage. These measures were proposed to ensure that officers were held accountable for their actions and to deter future misconduct.

Dimple advocated for the return of power projects in Jammu & Kashmir, such as Salal, Uri, and Ratli, to the region's control. He argued that this would enable the provision of free electricity to the people, addressing the issue of unscheduled power cuts and alleviating the burden on resi-

(Agencies): A team of scientists from the world's leading universities have developed a new all-inone vaccine that they hope can protect humans about yet, said Hills. against a broad range of coronaviruses, including ones that are yet to emerge.

The research published in Nature Nanotechnology' on Monday is based on a new approach to vaccine development called proactive vaccinology, where scientists build a vaccine before the disease-causing pathogen even emerges, which has shown promis-

ing results in mice. The study by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge in the UK and Caltech in the US says the vaccine works by training the body's immune system to recognise specific regions of eight different coronaviruses, including SARS-CoV-2 which caused the COVID-19 outbreak, and several that are currently circulating in bats and have potential to jump to humans and cause a pandemic.

Our focus is to create a vaccine that will protect us against the next coronavirus pandemic, and have it ready before the pandemic has even started, said Rory Hills, a graduate researcher in the University of Cambridge's Department of Pharmacology and first author of the report.

For example, the new vaccine does not include the SARS-CoV-1 coronavirus, which caused the 2003 SARS outbreak, yet it still induces an immune

response to that virus. We've created a vactection against a broad range of different coronaviruses including ones we don't even know

Key to its effectiveness is that the specific virus regions the vaccine targets also appear in many related coronaviruses. By training the immune system to attack these regions, it gives protection against other coronaviruses not represented in the vaccine, including ones that haven't even been identified vet.

We don't have to wait for new coronaviruses to emerge. We know enough about coronaviruses, and different immune responses to them, that we can get going with building protective vaccines against unknown coronaviruses now, said Professor Mark Howarth in the University of Cambridge's Department of Pharmacology, senior author of the report.

Scientists did a great job in quickly producing an extremely effective COVID vaccine during the last pandemic, but the world still had a massive crisis with a huge number of deaths. We need to work out how we can do even better than that in the future, and a powerful component of that is starting to build the vaccines in advance, he said.

The new Quartet Nanocage' vaccine is based on a structure called a nanoparticle a ball of proteins held

together by incredibly strong interactions. Chains of different viral antigens are attached to this nanoparticle using a novel "protein superglue". Multiple antigens are included in these chains, which trains the immune system to target specific regions shared across a broad range of

The latest study demonstrated that the new vaccine raises a broad immune response, even in mice that were preimmunised with SARS-CoV-2.

coronaviruses.

The new vaccine is much simpler in design than other broadly protective vaccines currently in development, which the researchers believe should accelerate its route into clinical trials.

The underlying technology that the scientific collaboration has developed also has potential for use in vaccine development to protect against many other health challenges. It is said to improve on previous work, by the Oxford and Caltech groups, to develop a novel all-in-one vaccine against coronavirus threats

According to experts, conventional vaccines include a single antigen to train the immune system to target a single specific virus, which may not protect against a diverse range of existing coronaviruses or against pathogens that are newly emerging.

The latest research was funded by the UK's Biotechnology and Biological Sciences Research Council.

India exported half its pharma produce last year

NEW DELHI, May 7 (Agencies): India exported half of its pharmaceutical produce last year, marking a significant rise since the Covid-19 pandemic. The country's drugs and pharmaceuticals exports increased 9.67 per cent year-on-year to \$27.9 billion in 2023-24, even as the total exports dipped by 3 per cent in the last fiscal. In 2022-23, the exports stood at \$25.4

"During Covid-19, the need to reduce our dependency on other countries for pharmaceutical drugs was strongly felt. Therefore, Performance-linked Incentives (PLI) scheme was introduced in the pharmaceutical and bulk drugs sector and we found good success," said Dr Arunish Chawla, secretary, department of pharmaceuticals. "Nearly 50 bulk drugs were identified out of which open offers were given for the production of 34 drugs We achieved success in producing 30 drugs and as per last year's figures,

India exported 50 per cent of its produce showing that the pharma industry in the country is now export-oriented and it is a big success. Dr Chawla, who was

speaking at a one-day workshop, 'Meditech Stackathon 2024', organised by the department of pharmaceuticals, ministry of chemicals and fertilizers and Confederation of India Industries (CII), emphasised on the need to replicate the pharma success in medical device industry as well. "This workshop has been organised so that stakeholders, especially the domestic and multinational industries can sit together and map their value chain on the basis of which a policy stack will be prepared. This will show gaps in policy, processes and incentives and lead to adequate policy nudge or arbitrage,

Dr. Chawla said. "The policy stack will be built up in four stages. First is value chain mapping, second is economic

classification for the value chains to be integrated with the policy and data framework. Third, tariffs and taxes and how they move and evolve across value chains in both industrial space and time and fourth, identifying various elements of policy, price, scheme and regulatory arbitrage to finally facilitate policy nudge which will have both financial and institutional (built bottom up) elements.

Dr Chawla added that atmanirbharta in medical devices is their mission and is guided by world class quality (zero defect full effect) statement. "We will build world class product and will reduce our import dependence from 75-80 per cent to 50 per cent over the next five years in medical devices industry," said Dr Chawla. "The idea is to evolve a dvnamic world class competitive medical device industry where healthcare does not suffer, patients get top class treatment at

India have selected a spin-heavy side for the T20 World Cup 2024 set to be played in June in the United States of America and West Indies. India have opted to keep Kuldeep Yadav, Yuzvendra Chahal, Ravindra Jadeja and Axar Patel in the India 15.

India's T20 World Cup Squad

Rohit Sharma will lead a 15-man T20 World Cup squad and Hardik Pandya will be its vice-captain, the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) said in a statement on Tuesday, April 30. Sanju Samson and Yuzvendra Chahal were rewarded for their stellar IPL performances while Rinku Singh and KL Rahul were two of the biggest misses.

Virat Kohli, as expected, made the 15-man squad along with young opener Yashasvi Jaiswal. Wicketkeeper-batter Rishabh Pant was named in the T20I squad after his heroic return to competitive action in the IPL. Pant was not a regular in the T20I mix even before he suffered the car crash in December 2022. However, his stellar show with both bat and gloves, scoring 398 runs in 11 matches. Meanwhile, Sanju Samson, who missed the ODI World Cup squad last year, was rewarded for his stellar run in IPL 2024. The Rajasthan captain has been picked ahead of KL Rahul, who was also in contention.

Hardik Pandya, who has had a tough run in IPL 2024 as MI captain, has been backed to do the job as Rohit Sharma's deputy. Hardik led India in 16 matches when Rohit Sharma was not playing T20Is to focus on the build-up to the ODI World Cup last year. India also have picked seam-bowling all-rounder Shivam Dube, who has been in blistering six-hitting form for CSK in IPL 2024.

Australia coach McDonald backs captain Mitchell Marsh to be fit ahead of T20 World Cup

NEW DELHI, May 7 (Agencies): Australia coach Andrew McDonald has backed captain Mitchell Marsh to be back to full fitness before the start of the ICC Men's T20 World Cup 2024. Marsh was pulled out of the IPL early last month due to a hamstring rupture, and his recovery has been far slower than planned since returning from India. Marsh joined a cohort of Australia's squad members, not engaged in the IPL, for the initial three-day pretournament training camp in Brisbane. Another such camp is scheduled over the next two weeks before the squad leaves for the Caribbean on May 25th. Initially, Marsh wasn't slated to attend the first camp due to his hamstring injury. However, his recovery allowed him to participate and bat in the nets over the last couple of days. Nonetheless, McDonald reiterated that Marsh's bowling fitness would only be nearing completion closer to the tournament.

"You probably won't see him bowl in the next couple of weeks here," McDonald told reporters at Allan Border Field on Tuesday. "It'll probably happen the week before we leave. And then he'll be able to ramp that up when we're over there. We'll be able to cherry-pick the moments during the tournament where he'll be useful with the ball. We've got some all-round depth in the squad. which gives us good coverage anyway.



"[His recovery was] probably a little slower than expected on the back of the hamstring. But we've got plenty of time now that he has been ruled out the IPL. The first game is just short of a month away now. So ample time for him to get ready. But really positive to see the skipper on the park.

McDonald said there was no concern about Marsh's lack of match practice over the last two months, given that Australia will play some practice games before their debut match against Oman. "No real concern about match fitness," McDonald said. "We've got a couple of practice games when we get to Trinidad in the support period. So he'll likely get plenty of match opportunities. And if not, we'll be able to simulate those through practice, which our coaching staff are pretty good at."

Pant vs Samson as DC hope to stay alive in playoff race

NEW DELHI, May 7 (Agencies): DC will take on RR in another IPL 2024 match that carries immense weight in the race to the playoffs at the business end of the tournament.
