Fire engulfs forest belt in Rajouri

RAJOURI/POONCH, May 27 (Agencies): A massive blaze erupted in the forest area of Jammu and Kashmir's Rajouri district, officials said on Monday.

The fire broke out in the Bathuni forest belt late on Sunday, engulfing seven to eight acres and causing severe damage to trees and wildlife, they

The Forest Protection Force launched an extensive firefighting operation that continued through the night. By Monday, the flames had been brought under control, the officials said.

Throat-slit body of man found in Kupwara

SRINAGAR, May 27: A throat-slit body of a man was found in his residence in a village in Jammu and Kashmir's Kupwara district, police

said on Monday. Officials identified the man as 50-year-old Abdul Hamid Khan.

"The throat-slit dead body of Abdul Hamid Khan of Mir Muqam Awoora village of Kupwara district was found inside his home today morning. The body has been shifted for medico-legal formalities, " said the officials.

"A case has been registered in this incident and an investigation is now underway to ascertain the exact facts and those responsible for the man's murder. " the officials added.

Cop injured after being assaulted in **Shopian** village, case filed

SRINAGAR, May 27 (Agencies): A policeman was injured after he was assaulted by some persons during execution of a court order in south Kashmir's Shopian district on Monday, officials said.

No family member of terrorists, stone pelters will get govt job in J&K: Amit Shah

NEW DELHI, May 27 (Agencies): Sending a tough message, Union Home Minister Amit Shah has said that no family member of any terrorist nor close relatives of stone pelters will get Government jobs in Jammu and Kashmir. Shah also said that the

Narendra Modi Government has not only targeted terrorists but also eliminated the terror ecosystem, resulting in a drastic fall in terror incidents in the country.

"In Kashmir, we have taken a decision that if someone joins a terrorist organisation, their family

members will not get any Government job," he told PTI in an interview over the weekend.

Similarly, Shah said, if someone indulges in stone pelting, his family members will also not get a government job.

He said some human rights activists went to the Supreme Court against the decision but, at the end, the Government prevailed.

The Home Minister, however, said the Government will make an exception in case someone from a family comes forward and informs the authorities that his or her close relative has joined a terror outfit.

Water crisis threat looms large in Katra Two Rohingya from Budgam, JAMMU, May 27 police register

case SRINAGAR, May 27 (Agencies): Two Rohingya girls were recovered from a residential house in the Khansahib area of central Kashmir's Budgam district.

A police official told news agency Kashmir Scroll that police station Khansahib recovered two Rohingya girls identified as Hassna (17) daughter of Aziz-ul-Rehman and Rona Lela (21) daughter of Habib Khatoon from the house of Nazir Ahmad Bhat son of Mohd Sultan resident of Check-e-Shara Khansahib.

(Agencies): Amidst the soaring mercury and heatwave, the water crisis threat is looming large in Katra townthe base camp of Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Cave Shrine—nestled in Trikuta Hills in Reasi district of Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir.

The administration however, said that it is 'on job' to address the matter on priority as pilgrims rush is expected to witness a surge from June in view of summer vacations.

"Water crisis-like situation is prevailing in the Katra town due to heatwave and rising temperature," official sources in the Jal Shakti Department said.



They said, "due to hot conditions, the water level at the natural water sources is decreasing and they have started drying up.

"As Katra is a pilgrimage destination but despite having a floating population, the town on an average during rush season requires 40 lakh gallons to 45 lakh gallons of water every day, but on normal days, 20 lakh gallons to 25 lakh gallons of water is supplied to the base camp," sources added.

"Due to gradual drying up of natural source water bodies, the Katra town is unable to meet daily required water supply," they said.

Official sources stated

that presently water on a daily basis is being supplied from Baba Dhansar Water Project, Jhajjar Kotli Water Project and Ban Ganga water source to handle the crisis like situation but these bodies are drying up slowly.

Moreover, they added unannounced power cuts and other power related issues are adding more worries to the situation.

Meanwhile the hotel industry is also partially hit due to the water crisis

Hotel and Restaurants Association (HRA), Katra, president, Rakesh Wazir when contacted, told UNI, "the water shortage matter is already taken up with

Train cancellations spark protest in Jammu, brief halt of express service

JAMMU, May 27 (Agencies): Two individuals, including a woman, briefly stopped the Shri Shakti Express train on Monday by staging a protest at a railway station here.

The protest was sparked by frustration over cancellation of trains and a lack of timely information about the train schedule.

A young man and his female relative sat on the tracks as the Shri Shakti Express was arriving at the Jammu railway station from New Delhi on Monday, officials said.

The train was stopped briefly at the entry to the station on track number one. The police detained the duo shortly after and the train resumed its journey following a brief

halt, they said. A relative of the protestors described their action to be a result of extreme frustration and admitted that it was a wrong step.

"We have been visiting Jammu and Kashmir and have been stranded here for days due to train cancellations. We repeatedly asked the railways for updates on our journey, but received no information. With temperatures exceeding 42 degrees Celsius amid extreme heatwave, we reached a point," she said.

India's good fortune to have had Nehru at the beginning

-awaharlal Nehru died sixty years ago on May 27, 1964. He was seventy-four. He had a stroke that morning at 6.25 am and lost consciousness almost immediately. He died without regaining consciousness, and according to a member of his household, his death was due to "an internal hemorrhage, a paralytic stroke, and a heart attack". He had returned the previous day from Mussoorie, "hale and hearty", but Nehru was clearly ailing. Parliament, which was then in session, and the nation were told about his death at 2.05 pm.

A major event such as this inevitably gives rise to "where were you?" questions. Where were you when John F. Kennedy was assassinated? Where were you when Indira Gandhi was killed? Where were you when the World Trade Centre in New York was brought down? The shock of the event magnifies the immediate around you and imprints it in your mind. I still can vividly recall the day Nehru died and the moment I learnt about it.

I was in Pune (then Poona) studying German at the Goethe Institute, and after class that afternoon I was cycling into town to meet a friend. As I passed a government building, I saw a flag flying at half-mast. I asked and when told a great fear descended over me.

Like many young Indians, I too was unwilling to contemplate India without Nehru, despite having read much speculation about "who next?" The most widely-read book on the subject was by American journalist Welles Hangen After Nehru Who? Hangen speculated on a list

of personalities, and wrote: "Many people in India who concede that Nehru can now be replaced have told me that only he could have held the country together in the early days after the Partition of British India." Clearly to many, Nehru had outlived his purpose, particularly after the disastrous India-China war of 1962. Not knowing what was in store next sent me scurrying down back to my hostel, where a radio set was reporting the mourning as only AIR and Melville de Mello's dulcet voice could.

We began discussing the succession, even though Gulzarilal Nanda was appointed the interim PM, few took him seriously as a successor. By late in the night our fears took over. One refrain was that the military would take over. Another was that either the Communists or the CIA would set off a coup. None of this happened. Nehru had built a modern and democratic India to last.

India was fortunate to have his leadership in the formative years of the republic. We took the road less traveled and it made all the difference. Recall Robert Frost who wrote: "I shall be telling this with a sigh/Somewhere ages and ages hence:/Two roads diverged in a wood, and I.../I took the one less traveled by, /And that has made all the difference."

We could have done better but we could also have done worse, like many other countries in our situation did. The India conceptualised by Nehru and the founding fathers still endures, weathering blows from the philistines opposed to the foundational philosophy of modern India. Nehru was a man with a towering intellect and a long

vision. No one who has read his Discovery of India will think otherwise. He tried to forge a new all-inclusive nationality for us. I have often tried to explain this notion in simple terms. This is to make the Meenakshi Temple in Madurai or the Taj Mahal in Agra or the Golden Temple in Amritsar equally our heritage. Every invasion or migratory wave, every musical instrument and kind of music, and every literary form and style that flourished in India was equally ours. The raga and ghazal were ours just as Bhimsen Joshi and Begum Akhtar were our very own.

Nehru made mistakes. When big people make mistakes, they are often monumental. He misunderstood the nature of the dispute with China. He tied the economy in the ropes of central planning, which while giving us an industrial base, helped spawn very many undeserving millionaire tycoons. But he had a bigger vision. He contemplated the new India to be guided by reason and infused with the scientific temper. Instead, we are now increasingly a people driven by dogma and blind faith. Religion and blind faith are our biggest fault lines and the cause of much social friction and breakdown of orderly public behaviour and order.

In recent years, the assault on Nehru's memory has become vicious. It is led by small men, men who don't know history and who confuse Taxila with Patna, Indus with the Ganga, and Alexander with Selucus; who don't know science and think Ganesh was real and not a symbol and who can't tell between a transplant and plastic surgery; who cannot distinguish between history and mythology, science and

superstition, and fact and fiction. They are now trying to define our identity in narrow and divisive terms, and hence excluding the majority.

Our never-ending economic malaises and the seemingly intractable problem of Jammu and Kashmir serve as ready sticks to beat the memory of Nehru. And in the hands of the half knowing and politically vicious politician these become deadly weapons, however false they may in fact be. Then of course there is the myth perpetuated that it was Jawaharlal Nehru's eagerness to become Prime Minister that forced the agreement for the Partition of India. There is a good deal of irony in this for those who seem to castigate him loudest on this are those who hate the Muslims the

The attempted deification of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, who supposedly disagreed with Nehru on all these and other issues, serves the political purpose of those who having got their day in office, misused it, and now are desperately hoping to get another term. It is sad to see few willing to stand up and take a position in defence of Jawaharlal Nehru these days. In my time I have been a frequent critic of Nehru, yet even I will have little hesitation in stating that he was the greatest statesman this country has known for several centuries. We were fortunate to have had him in the beginning.

Our unique diversity and common perception about ourselves bound by a modern and egalitarian Constitution is now being challenged. India has weathered worse. We are, after all, the people of India, that is Bharat. And we still live in the house that Jawaharlal Nehru built.

Keir Starmer is the favourite on July 4; J.K. Rowling getting trolled in Edinburgh

o it is official at last. the weather. As you may have noticed, Rishi Sunak made the announcement on a rainy day. That is the beauty of the English summer. Entirely predictable – you always know that you never know when it may rain. I would imagine the outgoing PM had not planned on a wet farewell speech. But then what could be more memorable and British? However, thanks to him, you will enjoy a not very noisy, not very controversial, election. They do not make them like that anymore.

There some other startling, but still predictable news. Spoiler warning — as this is bad news for the monarchy. Our King Charles the Third is not, sadly, the richest person in the land. On the Sunday Times Rich List, King Charles is the 258th richest person. He has only £610 million in net worth. Mind you this is just his personal wealth. As a King, his estate is worth £600 billion. And Prime Minister Rishi Sunak is just ahead of the monarch. He is 245th in the ranking and has £651 million. On the top as always are the Hinduja brothers. Very nice.

It will not be the same without Kate or the King... but this is the new reality we live with, still dominated by the "Emperor of Maladies", which triumphs kings and commoners.

Dimple rejects BJP's promises on J&K **Statehood, Assembly Elections**

Best year yet for Indian filmmakers with three wins at Cannes Film Festival 2024



It was a triple feat for Indian talent at the 2024 Cannes Film Festival with Payal Kapadia's "All We Imagine As Light", "Sunflowers Were the First Ones to Know" by FTII student Chidananda S Naik, and Anasuya Sengupta of "The Shameless" fame winning major awards in each of the three competitive sections of the prestigious gala.

The 77th edition of Cannes, which concluded on Saturday, was undoubtedly the best year for the country which found space at the fest through eight Indian, or Indiathemed, films.

Kapadia, an alumna of the Film & Television Institute of India (FTII), charted history by becoming the first Indian filmmaker to win the Grand Prix award for "All We Imagine as Light".

"It is a great achievement for us that we have given this award to our country after thirty years. I am deeply grateful for your generous appreciation. Your recognition motivates me to work even harder. Thanks a lot," she said in an X post on Sunday.

"All We Imagine As Light", Kapadia's feature directorial debut, is the first Indian film in 30 years and first ever by an Indian female director to be showcased in main competition, last being Shaji N Karun's "Swaham" (1994).

"Thank you, Cannes Film Festival for having our film here. Please don't wait 30 years to have another Indian film," she had said in her speech.

The movie earned the honour, the second-most prestigious prize of the gala after the Palme d'Or, which went to American director Sean Baker for "Anora".

"All We Imagine as Light", a Malayalam-Hindi feature starring Kani Kusruti, Divya Prabha and Chhaya Kadam, revolves around three women in Mumbai who go on

a road trip to a beach town.

That the film will win an award

became almost certain when it received glowing reviews following its premiere, with some international critics describing it as a "portrait of urban connection" and "poetic meditation" as well as

of masters like Satyajit Ray and Wong Kar Wai.

These women have scripted history and inspired the Indian film fraternity, said Congress leader Rahul Gandhi about Kapadia and Sengupta.

"Indian stars shining bright at the 77th Cannes Film Festival!" Gandhi said on X.

Writer-lyricist Varun Grover said it was an "unbelievable day" for Indian cinema.

"Dissent, in art and in life, is a tough path to choose. But sometimes it does create magic," he wrote on X.

Kapadia, who led a student protest against the appointment of actor-politician Gajendra Chauhan as FTII chairman, had won the Oeil d'or (Golden Eye) award at Cannes for acclaimed documentary "A Night of Knowing Nothing"

which premiered under Director's Fortnight section in 2021.

Her 2017 short film "Afternoon Clouds" opened at Cannes under Cinefondation category, dedicated to supporting the next generation of talented filmmakers.

That's not all.

Production designer Sengupta, who starred in a key featuring role in Bulgarian director Konstantin Bojanov's "The Shameless", became the first Indian to win the best actress prize in Un Certain Regard.

"The Shameless" explores a dark world of exploitation and misery in which two sex workers forge a bond.

Sengupta dedicated her win "to the queer community and other marginalised communities".

"You don't have to be queer to fight for equality, you don't have to be colonised to know that colonising is pathetic — we just need to be decent human beings," she

said.

Neeraj Ghaywan's "Masaan" previously won two awards—FIPRES-CI, International Jury of Film Critics prize and Promising Future prize in the section.

Naik's "Sunflowers...", which won the La Cinef first prize (film school fiction or animated films), was another feather in FTII's cap. Based on a Kannada folktale, the movie follows an old woman who steals a rooster following which the sun stops rising in the village.

Previously, Indian films to be selected for the Cannes Competition segment include Mrinal Sen's "Kharij" (1983), M S Sathyu's "Garm Hava" (1974), Satyajit Ray's "Parash Pathar" (1958), Raj Kapoor's "Awaara" (1953), V Shantaram's "Amar Bhoopali" (1952) and Chetan Anand's "Neecha Nagar" (1946).

This year, India's presence at Cannes also saw the restored version of Shyam Benegal's 1976 crowdfunded film "Manthan" in Cannes Classics. Karan Kandhari's "Sister Midnight" appeared in Directors' Fortnight and Maisam Ali's "In Retreat" was picked for ACID Cannes. "Maya: The Birth of a Superhero", a virtual reality title with an India connect, was also selected.

In 2013, Indian cinema sent five films to various sections – "Monsoon Shootout" (Midnight Screening), "Bombay Talkies" (a Special Screening to mark 100 years since Dada Saheb Phalke's "Raja Harishchandra"), "Ugly" (Directors' Fortnight), "The Lunchbox" (Critics' Week) and "Charulata" (Cannes Classics).

Lok Sabha polls 2024: Supreme Court refuses to entertain BJP's plea against Calcutta High Court order on advertisements

'This is not in the interest of voters,' a Vacation Bench of Justice JK Maheshwari and Justice KV Viswanathan says

NEW DELHI, May 27 (Agencies): The Supreme Court on Monday refused to entertain the BJP's petition challenging the Calcutta High Court's order restraining the saffron party from publishing certain alleged derogatory advertisements against the TMC and its leaders during the ongoing Lok Sabha polls as they violated the Model Code of Conduct.

"This is not in the interest of voters. This will degenerate... We are not inclined to interfere (with the high court's order)," a Vacation Bench of Justice JK Maheshwari and Justice KV Viswanathan told senior counsel PS Patwalia who represented the BJP.

"We have seen the advertisements. Prima facie, the advertisements are disparaging. You can say you are the best...but we don't want to lend our hands to promote further acrimony....," Justice Viswanathan said even as Patwalia asserted that the



advertisements were based on facts.

As the Bench was not inclined to entertain the petition, Patwalia chose to withdraw the petition and it was "dismissed as withdrawn".

"Your rival is not your enemy," the Bench noted.

The top court had on Friday agreed to consider the BJP's petition after it was mentioned before another Vacation Bench led by Justice Bela M Trivedi for urgent listing.

A Division Bench of the Calcutta High Court had on May 22 refused to interfere with a single-judge order restraining the BJP from publishing 'derogatory' advertisements against the TMC and its leaders, saying "Laxman Rekha" should not be crossed and there should not be any personal attacks.

Refusing to interfere with the

May 20 single judge order, the Division Bench had said the BJP could move the single judge, seeking a review or recall of its

"You (BJP) are a national party. There should be an internal mechanism either at central or state level which will approve what propaganda can be printed. There should be some Lakshman Rekha... We are not complimenting them (TMC)...but imagine the impact on normal people," the HC had said.

The BJP had contended that the single judge passed the order without giving it hearing and that the Election Commission was the appropriate authority for redress in case of any dispute during a poll process.

The high court on May 20 restrained the BJP from publishing advertisements that violated the Model Code of Conduct until June 4, the day results are to be declared.

Arvind Kejriwal moves Supreme Court for extension of his interim bail by a week on medical grounds



NEW DELHI, May 27 (Agencies): Accused of money-laundering in a case linked to the excise policy scam, Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Monday moved the Supreme Court seeking extension of his 21-day interim bail by a week on health grounds, saying he has lost 7 kg. Arrested on March 21 by the ED - the Aam Aadmi Party national convener was released on interim bail by the top court on May 10 to campaign in the ongoing Lok Sabha polls. He was ordered to surren-

der on June 2. A Bench of Justice Sanjiv Khanna and Justice Dipankar Datta had barred him from visiting the Chief Minister's Office and Delhi Secretariat and said that he would not sign official files unless it's required and necessary for obtaining clearance/ approval of Delhi L-G. It had also restrained him from commenting on his role in the money-laundering case against him and ordered him not to interact with witnesses and/or have access to

official files connected with the case.

However, six days before the expiry of his interim bail on June 1, Kejriwal urged the top court to extend his interim bail by seven days on the grounds that he had to undergo certain diagnostic tests/ investigations, including PET-CT scan.

The Supreme Court had on May 17 reserved its verdict on Kejriwal's petition challenging his arrest by the Enforcement Directorate in a money- laundering case linked to the Delhi excise policy scam. Kejriwal has challenged the Delhi High Court's April 9 verdict upholding his arrest in the case.

The top court had, however, said without prejudice to his rights and contentions, Kejriwal was free to move the trial court for grant of bail "in accordance with law".

Prajwal Revanna says will appear before police on May 31, cooperate in probe

BENGALURU, May 27 (Agencies): Karnataka JDS MP Prajwal Revanna, who fled the country after his sex tapes went viral and following sexual harassment cases against him, said that he will appear before the Special Investigation Team (SIT) on May 31.

"Don't mistake me, on the 31st at 10 am, I will be in front of the SIT and I will cooperate. I trust the judiciary and these are false cases against me. I trust the law," he said to agency.

The 33-year-old Hassan MP, who is the grandson of JDS patrıarch and former Prime Minister HD Deve Gowda, is facing charges of multiple instances of sexually abusing women. He left the country on April 26 after several videos of him sexually abusing multiple women emerged.

He called the allegations "a political conspiracy" and said he was in "depression



and isolation". He also apologised to the JDS leader and party workers for not providing his whereabouts.

"I want to apologise to my family members, my Kumaranna [HD Kumaraswamy], and the party workers for not providing proper information about my whereabouts abroad. On April 26th, when the elections were over, there was no case against me. The SIT wasn't formed. Two or three days after I left, I saw these allegations against me on YouTube. I also wrote to the SIT via my lawyer asking for seven days' time,"

Prajwal further alleged that Congress leader

Rahul Gandhi and other senior leaders spoke about it openly in public, saying, "This is a political conspiracy".

"I apologise as I went into depression and into isolation," he added.

A Special Court for Elected Representatives had issued an arrest warrant on May 18 against Prajwal Revanna, following an application moved by the SIT.

A 'Blue Corner Notice' seeking information on his whereabouts has already been issued by Interpol, following a request by the SIT via the CBI.

Prajwal, son of JDS MLA HD Revanna, is said to be in Germany.

2 die as Cyclone Remal ravages parts of West Bengal; heavy rain to continue

KOLKATA, May 27 (Agencies): Two persons died in West Bengal and its coastal areas suffered extensive damage to infrastructure and property, as Cyclone Remal tore through the state and neighbouring Bangladesh with wind speeds reaching 135 km per hour, officials said on Monday.

A man died of his injuries when a wall collapsed due to the relentless downpour on Sunday evening at the Bibir Bagan area of Entally in Central Kolkata, a state disaster management official said.

An eldery woman in the Mousuni Island near Namkhana adjacent to the Sunderbans delta also succumbed to injuries on Monday morning, following a tree collapse on her hut that resulted in the roof caving in,

the official said. After tearing through the coasts of Bangladesh and West Bengal, Cyclone Remal left a trail of destruction with pictures of devastation becoming evident across the state's coastal areas, with extensive damage to infrastructure and property. soon after daybreak on Monday.

Roofs of thatched huts were blown away, uprooted trees blocked roads in Kolkata as well as in the coastal districts, and electricity poles were knocked down causing significant power disruption in various parts of the state, including in the city's outskirts, the officials said.

While several pockets of Kolkata remained waterlogged on the morning of the first working day of the week, suburban train services from the Sealdah terminal station remained partially suspended for at least three hours, adding to commuters' woes, before operations limped back to normal

Flight services at the Kolkata airport resumed on Monday morning after remaining suspended for 21 hours in view of



Cyclone Remal. Airport sources, however, said it would take some more time for the situation to become normal.

The cyclone ravaged adjacent coasts of the state and Bangladesh between Sagar Island and Khepupara, near the southwest of Mongla in the neighbouring country, after its landfall process began at 8.30 pm on Sunday and lasted for a good four hours.

In a later update, the Met office said 'Remal' weakened into a cyclonic storm at 5.30 am on Monday, about 70 km northeast of Canning and 30 km west-southwest of Mongla. The system is likely to gradually weaken further.

Efforts to restore normalcy are under way, with emergency services working to clear debris and restore power in the affected areas.

However, the relentless heavy rain is hampering these operations in most of the affected areas, the officials said.

The state government has initiated relief operations, providing food, drinking water and medical assistance to the people affected.

The authorities have urged residents to remain indoors and take necessary precaution till the heavy rain persists.

Kolkata recorded a rainfall of 146 mm in the period between 8.30 am on Sunday and 5.30 am on Monday, the weatherman

The metropolis logged a maximum wind speed of 74 kmph, while Dum Dum in the northern outskirts of the city recorded maximum wind speed of 91 kmph, the weather office said.

Several areas of Kolkata remained waterlogged, compounding the misery of the affected residents. Streets in significant pockets of Ballygunge, Park Circus, Dhakuria and Alipore in South Kolkata, Behala in the West and College Street, Thanthania Kali Bari, CR Avenue and Sinthi in the North remained inundated till late in the day.

Reports indicated that trees were uprooted in several areas, including Southern Avenue, Lake Place, Chetla, DL Khan Road, Dufferin Road, Ballygunge Road, New Alipore, Behala, Jadavpur, Golpark, Hatibagan, Jagat Mukherjee Park, College Street, and the adjoining Salt Lake area.

As many as 68 trees were uprooted in Kolkata, with an additional 75 trees downed in the nearby Salt Lake and Rajarhat areas.

The cyclone caused rain with strong winds in areas such as Digha, Kakdwip and Jaynagar, which intensified on Monday mornina.

Other places in south Bengal which received heavy rain during the period are Haldia Nimpith (70 mm), the Met office The storm and accompanying

(110 mm), Tamluk (70 mm) and

heavy rain flooded homes and farmlands. In some regions, salt water from the adjoining Bay of Bengal breached embankments and gushed into farmlands, damaging crops.

The West Bengal government evacuated more than one lakh people from vulnerable areas ahead of the cyclone's landfall.

The North and South 24 Parganas and Purba Medinipur districts reported widespread damage. News footage from the coastal resort town of Digha showed tidal waves crashing into a seawall, with surging waters sweeping fishing boats inland and inundating mud-andthatch houses and farmlands.

The weatherman has fore cast more rain in Kolkata and the southern districts including Nadia and Murshidabad, with one or two spells of intense downpour, along with gusty surface winds till Tuesday morning. State Power Minister Aroop

Biswas said the disruptions and damage to the power supply infrastructure caused by Cyclone Remal would be addressed soon. He noted that there had been

one or two incidents of power outages in the CESC area, due to fallen trees.

A total of 14 National Disaster Response Force teams were deployed for relief and restoration work across districts in south Bengal, including Kolkata, North and South 24 Parganas, Howrah and Hooghly.

Relief materials, including dried food and tarpaulins, had been dispatched to the coastal areas and quick response teams comprising trained civil defence volunteers and equipped vehicles were in place, the officials

2 Killed As Dumper Hits Pedestrians, 5 Vehicles In Maharashtra's Palghar



PALGHAR, May 27 (Agencies): Two women were killed and four others injured when a speeding dumper hit them in Maharashtra's Palghar district on

Monday, police said. Before crushing the two women to death, the dumper also hit two buses and three other vehicles, causing damage to them, they said. The accident took place at around 9.30 am at Sativali in the Vasai area, an official from Valiv police station said, adding the dumper driver was detained.

The two women, both in their 40s, were on their way to their workplace when the dumper coming at a high speed from the wrong direction ran over them and also hit some other persons, he said.

Police reached the spot after being alerted and sent the bodies to a government hospital for postmortem.

The injured persons were shifted to a nearby hospital where they were undergoing treat-

Some persons present at the spot caught hold of the dumper driver and handed him over to police, the official said. An FIR was registered against the dumper driver under relevant sections of the Indian Penal Code and the Motor Vehicles Act, the

police said.

Fire breaks out at Baghpat hospital in UP, no injuries reported



BAGHPAT, May 27 (Agencies): A fire broke out in a hospital in the

Badaut area here on Monday due to a short circuit, triggering panic among the patients and staff, police said.

No one was injured in the incident. The fire broke out at about 4.30 am on the third floor of Astha Multispeciality hospital here after which fire tenders were rushed to the spot, the

police said. It took a few hours for the firefighting team to douse the blaze, they added.

District Magistrate Jitendra Pratap Singh said that the fire broke out on the hospital's third floor where waste items were kept in a tin shade.

Twelve patients, who were admitted to the hospital, have been shifted to other nearby hospitals, he said, adding that no one was injured in the blaze.

The DM said that the hospital was served a notice 15 days ago to remove the waste dump from the third floor.

The hospital has a fire NOC for only two of its floors, he said, adding that a probe is on in the matter.

Papua New Guinea reports more than 2,000 people **buried** in landslide

A once-bustling remote hillside village in Enga province was almost wiped out when a chunk of Mount Mungalo collapsed

PORT MORESBY, May 27 (Agencies): Papua New Guinea informed the UN on Monday that more than 2.000 people were buried in a massive landslide that swept over a remote village. according to a copy of the letter obtained by agency.

"The landslide buried more than 2,000 people alive and caused major destruction," the country's national disaster centre told the UN office in the capital Port Moresby.

A once-bustling remote hillside village in Enga province was almost wiped out when a chunk of Mount Mungalo collapsed in the early hours of Friday morning, burying scores of homes and the people sleeping inside them.

The landslide caused "major destruction to buildings, food gardens and caused major impact on the economic lifeline of the country", the disaster office said.

The main highway to Porgera Mine was "completely blocked", it said in the letter, which was received by UN officials on Monday morning.

"The situation remains unstable as the landslip continue to shift slowly, posing ongoing danger to both the rescue teams and survivors alike."

The scale of the catastrophe required "immediate and collaborative actions from all players", it said, including the



army, and national and regional responders.

It called on UN to inform Papua New Guinea's development partners "and other international friends" of the latest situation. Assistance should be coordinated through the disaster centre, it said.

Locals and rescue teams have been using shovels and pieces of wood to find bodies under the landslide -- a mix of car-sized boulders, uprooted trees and churned-up earth that is thought to be up to eight

metres (26 feet) deep. 'Serious risk'

"The landmass is still sliding, rocks are falling from the mountain," UN migration agency official Serhan Aktoprak told agency.

Streams of water were flowing between the soil and debris while cracks were appearing in land adjacent to the landslip, Aktoprak said.

"This might trigger a further sliding," the UN official warned, posing a "serious risk" both to rescuers and people living in the area.

Locals said the landslip may have been triggered by heavy rains in recent weeks.

Papua New Guinea has one of the wettest climates in the world, and research has found shifting rainfall patterns linked to climate change could exacerbate the risk of landslides.

Aktoprak said his colleagues had to flee falling rocks at the site at the weekend.

The estimated death toll has been climbing since the disaster struck as officials reassessed the size of the population lying beneath mud and rubble spanning almost four football fields in length.

Five bodies and the leg of a sixth had been pulled from the debris by Saturday night.

"It has been already three days and seven hours since this disaster

A school teacher from a neighbouring village, Jacob Sowai, said more than 2,000 people lived in the disaster zone.

"Nobody escaped. We don't know who died because records are buried," he told agency. People from adjoin-

US Lawmaker Pledges Support For Taiwan Against Chinese Aggression



TAIPEI, May 27 (Agencies): A senior US lawmaker affirmed on Monday Washington's support for Taiwan against Chinese "aggression", on the first congressional visit to the self-ruled island since it swore in a new president.

Sitting down Monday morning with President Lai Ching-te, Representative Michael McCaul -- who heads the influential House Foreign Affairs Committee -- said he and his colleagues stood in "strong support of this beautiful island".

Three days after Lai was sworn in, Chinese warships and fighter jets encircled Taiwan in drills that Beijing said were a test of its ability to seize the island.

China claims democratic Taiwan as part of its territory, and says it will never renounce the use of force to bring the island under its control.

McCaul on Monday condemned those "intimidating military exercises", saying they showed China was "not interested in taking Taiwan by peaceful means".

"All democracies must stand together against aggression and tyranny," McCaul said.

"Whether it's Putin in Russia, the Avatollah in Iran or Chairman Xi next door to us in China, an unholy alliance is eroding peace around the world," he told I ai.

"Not since World War Two... have we seen such blatant violence and naked aggression,' he said.

McCaul arrived in Taipei on Sunday accompanied by both Republican and Democratic lawmakers.

The United States switched its diplomatic recognition from Taiwan to China in 1979 but remains the island's most important ally and supplier of military hardware.

US President Joe Biden has said he does not support Taiwan's independence but also that he would back sending forces to defend the island. The official US position on intervention is one of strategic ambiguity.

And McCaul on Monday affirmed that the US Congress "on a bipartisan basis supports Taiwan".

"We are not here as Republicans or as Democrats, but as Americans," he said.

Thailand Activist Musician Sentenced To 4 Years For Insulting Monarchy

BANGKOK, May 27 (Agencies): A Thai court on Monday sentenced activist musician Chaiamorn Kaewwiboonpan to four years in jail for insulting the monarchy and violations of the computer crimes act, local media reported.

The case stems from Chaiamorn burning a portrait of King Maha Vajiralongkorn in 2021, which he admitted to doing, but had argued it was not a violation of the royal insult law.

A lawyer for Chaiamorn could not immediately be reached for confirmation of the sentence.



Cyclone Remal Devastates Bangladesh, 10 Killed, Over 30,000 Homes Destroyed

DHAKA, May 27 (Agencies): The death count from a cyclone that smashed into low-lying areas of Bangladesh has risen to at least 10 people, with more than 30.000 homes destroyed and tens of thousands more damaged, top local officials said Monday.

"They mostly died after they were crushed under fallen houses or collapsed walls," said Showkat Ali, government administrator of Barisal district, where seven people

Three others died in neighbouring districts, some by drowning.

Fierce gales and crashing waves battered the coast as Cyclone Remal made landfall on Sunday night.

By Monday afternoon, it had weakened into a storm, but winds and rain still lashed the coast.

"Heavy rains unleashed by the cyclone are going on, and the wind speed is also high," Ali added.



In Khulan district, two people died, government administrator Helal Mahmud told agency.

"The cyclone has damaged more than 123,000 homes in the division, and among them some 31,000 homes were completely damaged," he said.

Another person died in Chittagong, where "more than 40,000 people are still in cyclone shelters due to heavy rains and strong

wind", administrator Tofael Islam told agency.

Power was knocked out to more than 12.5 million people, said Biswanath Sikder, chief engineer of the Bangladesh Rural Electrification Board, the country's largest state-run power distribution

"We will resume power supply after the cyclone situation improves," he said.

North Korea informs Japan of satellite launch plan by early next week

SEOUL, May 27 (Agencies): North Korea has revealed plans to launch a satellite by early next week, Japan said on Monday, an apparent effort to put the North's second military spy satellite into orbit in yet another violation of UN bans. The launch notification came as leaders of South Korea, Japan and China gathered in Seoul for their first trilateral meeting on Monday.

Japan's Coast Guard said it was notified by North Korea about its planned launch of a "satellite rocket", with safety caution in the waters between the Korean Peninsula and China and east of the Philippine island of Luzon beginning on Monday and running through midnight June 3.

North Korea gives Japan its launch information because Japan's coast guard coordinates and distributes maritime safety information in East Asia.

Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida instructed officials to cooperate with the US, South Korea and other countries to strongly request North Korea not to go ahead with the launch and to take the utmost measures in case of any contingency, his office said.

The launch plan likely refers to the North's push to launch its second military spy satellite into space.

South Korea's military said on Friday that it detected signs that North Korea was engaging in activities believed to be preparations to launch a spy satellite at its main Tongchangri launch facility in the northwest. The UN bans North Korea from

conducting any satellite launches, viewing them as cover for testing its long-range missile technology. North Korea has steadfastly

maintained it has the right to launch satellites and test missiles. It says spy satellites would allow it to better monitor the US and South

Korea's moves and enhance the precision-strike capability of its nuclear-capable missiles.

In phone talks, senior diplomats from Japan, South Korea and the US agreed to urge North Korea to cancel the launch, noting that any North Korean launch using ballistic technology would violate multiple UN Security Council resolutions.

South Korea's Unification Ministry separately called a satellite launch by North Korea "a provocation that seriously threatens our and regional security.'

Last November, North Korea sent its first military reconnaissance satellite into orbit as part of its efforts to build a space-based surveillance network to cope with what it calls increasing US-led military threats.

North Korean leader Kim Jong Un later told a year-end governing party meeting that the country would launch three additional military spy satellites in 2024.

There is widespread doubt about how much militarily meaningful imagery the North Korean satellite can produce. But some civilian experts say the operation of several such satellites could still help North Korea monitor big targets among its rivals at all times.

According to North Korea's latest launch notification to Japan, the danger zones where rocket debris would fall are the same places the country identified prior to its November launch.

That suggests North Korea would use the same first and second stages of the rocket as those in the previous launch, said Chang Young-keun, a missile expert at the Seoul-based Korea Research Institute for National Strategy.

Chang said the launch of three more spy satellites this year would allow North Korea to obtain imagery on sites in South Korea, Japan and the US Pacific territory of Guam more frequently.

Since 2022, North Korea has been engaged in a provocative run of missile tests to modernise and expand its weapons arsenals, prompting the US, South Korea and Japan to strengthen their security partnership in response.

Experts say North Korea likely believes an enlarged weapons arsenal would increase its leverage in future diplomacy with the

North Korea wasn't among matters listed on the official agenda for Monday's trilateral meeting between Kishida, South Korean President Yoon Suk Yeol and Chinese Premier Li Qiang.

But during a bilateral meeting with Li on Sunday, Yoon asked China, as a permanent member of the UN Security Council, to contribute to promoting peace on the Korean Peninsula, while speaking about North Korea's nuclear program and its deepening military ties with Russia, according to Yoon's office.

South Korea, Japan and the US have long urged China -- North Korea's major ally and economic pipeline -- to use its leverage to persuade the North to abandon its nuclear ambitions. But China is suspected of avoiding fully enforcing UN sanctions on North Korea and sending clandestine aid shipments to help its impoverished neighbour stay afloat.

On Sunday, North Korean Vice Defence Minister Kim Kang II threatened to take unspecified "offensive action" in response to what he described as South Korean navy and coast guard ships violating the rivals' disputed western sea boundary, which has been the scene of several bloody maritime skirmishes in recent vears.

He also vowed to retaliate against South Korean activists flying anti-Pyongyang propaganda leaflets across the border.

Rafah Strikes Could 'Hinder' Gaza Truce Talks, Says Mediator Qatar engaged in months of The foreign ministry

DOHA, May 27 (Agencies): Israel's latest strikes on a displaced people's camp near Gaza's southern city of Rafah could hinder talks towards a truce and hostage release deal, mediator nation Qatar said on Monday.

The foreign ministry voiced "concern that the bombing will complicate ongoing mediation efforts and hinder reaching an agreement for an immediate and permanent ceasefire".

Qatar, alongside the United States and Egypt, has been talks aimed at securing a truce deal between Israel and Hamas in the devastated Gaza Strip. But behind-the-scenes

negotiations reached a stalemate earlier this month as Israel sent ground forces into Rafah.

Qatar, which has hosted Hamas's political leadership since 2012 with the blessing of the United States, condemned the Israeli bombing as a "dangerous violation of international law".

called on the international community to act urgently to prevent Israel from "implementing its plans to forcibly displace (Palestinians) from the city, which has become a final refuge

for hundreds of thou-

sands" of people.

Saudi Arabia said it condemned "in the strongest terms the continued massacres committed by Israeli occupation forces".

In a statement, the Saudi foreign ministry called on the international community "to intervene immediately to halt the massacres" committed by the Israeli military. Kuwait's foreign min-

istry also decried the Israeli attack on the camp housing displaced Palestinians near Rafah, saying it exposed Israel's "blatant war crimes and unprecedented genocide to the whole world".

The Gulf monarchy called for "immediate and firm intervention by the international community".

"We call family members like his mother or wife and ask them to make an appeal to the terrorist to surrender. If he (the terrorist) does not listen, he dies," Shah said.

The Home Minister said terror incidents have gone down significantly in Jammu and Kashmir as the government has not only targeted the terrorists but also eliminated the terror ecosystem.

"Through the NIA (National Investigation Agency), we have taken strong action against terror funding and ended it. We have taken a very tough stand on terror funding," he said.

Why Rahul Singh of Tata MF feels balanced advantage or multi-asset funds should be part of core allocation

(Agencies): Benchmark equity indices hit fresh record highs on Monday, with the Sensex touching 76,009.68 in intra-day trade. On Friday too, markets had hit fresh highs but failed to maintain the momentum and closed slightly lower. As such, there has been a lot of volatility in the markets over the last few weeks, ahead of the Lok Sabha election results on June 4. Rahul Singh, chief investment officer, equities, Tata Mutual Fund, says the fund house would be conscious of valuations if markets continued to rally. At the same time, one can't be extra-conservative either, he tells agency.

Recent sessions, we have seen a fair bit of volatility in the stock

The volatility in the last few weeks has led to 2-3 per cent correction, which is quite normal. Too much of effort goes in drawing a correlation between this and the ongoing elections. My own view is it is simple market dynamics and not related to election expectations, except for the fact that voting percentage was low. So, some people correlated that if voting percentage is low, does that mean good or bad news? It could be argued either way. So we just stop thinking about it. But at the same time, if the markets continue to rally from here leading up to the election results, we will be conscious of valuations and do what we need to do in our portfolios. We will not get overexcited.

As long as there is no big shock or surprise in the election, plus or minus 20 seats is not going to make any difference. The economy is looking quite solid and therefore markets are an outcome of that. We always have to be conscious of valuations, and maybe reduce risk a bit from some of the portfolios, but not to reduce risk completely. Since the economy is growing, driven by cyclical recovery on investment cycle, it will require something more concrete for us to be overweight on consumer and IT.



The IT sector has lagged broader markets for some time now. What makes you stay away from it still?

These are great compa-

nies, and the sector will

revive. If you see, this is

quite a steady sector, it will grow at 8-10-12 per cent CAGR if you take a five-year period and within that period, you get cycles. You got extra returns in COVID, in terms of the topline growing 20-25 per cent. Now, we are seeing the other extreme which is toplines struggling to grow in mid-single digits. And IT sector is competing with other sectors that have the potential to grow at 15-20 per cent. Although IT valuations are lower than peak, it is still not very attractive. So as on today it is difficult to visualise sector-level alpha even though bottom-up stock-level opportunities will keep arising. Outlook, near-term is uncertain. but long-term is steady.

What's your view on consumption as a basket?

Things are not looking as bad as it looked one vear back. The reason for that is the valuation premium of the rest of the market has come down. So, that is a good starting point for us to start looking at stock specific opportunities, which are beginning to emerge.

Which are the sectors that give you confidence at this point?

One sector that has done very well and I still think it can do well is power. There is a genuine shortage of power, which is going to hit us. Everything related to that chain, like capital goods, power financing companies, coal, even natural gas, is going to do well.

This is happening because the EM funds are dominated by negative sentiment around China which has large weight in EM indices. 'Sale of human milk not permitted': FSSAI asks authorities not to grant licence



NEW DELHI, May 27 (Agencies): The Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) has directed central and state authorites not to grant licences to sell or process breast milk.

In an advisory on May 24, the food regulator said "activities related to the commercialisation of human milk and its products should be immediately stopped."

Pointing out that it received several requests

from registered societies to commercialise breast milk, the food safety authority clarified that it is strictly prohibited and should be used only to feed newborns and infants in health facilities. "The State and Central Licensing Authorities should ensure that no license/registration is granted to such FBOs (food business operators) involved in the processing or selling of 'Mother's milk/Human milk.

The regulator warned that any violation will not be tolerated and action will be taken under the Food Safety and Standards Act, 2006. Guidelines on Lactation Management Centres in public health facilities state that human milk cannot be commercialised. Breast milk can be donated voluntarily but the donor cannot accept any monetary benefits, according to the guidelines.

"This office is in receipt of representations from various registered societies regarding commercialization of human milk and its products. In this regard, it may be noted that FSSAI has not permitted the processing and / or selling of human milk under FSS Act, 2006 and rules/regulations made there under," read the advisory.

Authorities seize 65 Cubic Feet of Illegal Timber in Nowgam

CHENNAI, May 27 (Agencies): After resisting the lure of lucrative private leagues for almost a decade because of his commitment towards the 'Baggy Green', Australian pacer Mitchell Starc has hinted that he might quit one format to make room for more franchise cricket in his schedule

While the 34-year-old didn't specify the format he intends to give up, it is likely to be ODIs considering that the next 50-over World Cup is in 2027.

Starc, who was bought for a record 24.75 crore by Kolkata Knight Riders, was magnificent in the business end of the tournament. He ended up with 17 wickets, including five in the two knock-out games, to engineer a dominant title triumph for the Shah Rukh Khan-owned team.

To a query from PTI as to how he would take it up from here after his best year in franchise cricket, Starc hinted that T20s could gain prominence in his roster.

"For the last nine years, I certainly prioritised Australian cricket. I have pulled out often to have a chance to give my body a break and spend some time away from cricket with my wife as well, so that's certainly been where my head has been for last nine years." Starc said after his match-winning 2/14 in the IPL final against Sunrisers



Hyderabad.

"Moving forward, I am certainly close to the end of my career than the start. One format may be dropped off as there is long time till next World Cup and whether that format drops off or not, that will open doors for a lot of franchise cricket," the 'King of Swing' said.

He mentioned that this year's IPL will help him in preparing for the T20 World Cup in West Indies starting June 1.

"...that's the other side of benefit of being here, some amazing players in an amazing tournament and great lead up to WT20 and success has been fantastic. It is great that a lot of players are in good position heading into the World Cup," he said.

He is hopeful of turning up for KKR even next year.

"I don't know the schedule exactly but I have thoroughly

enjoyed and hope to be back next year and hopefully, seen in purple and gold again.'

Pitches in Windies won't resemble IPL tracks

Starc, like many others agreed that the Impact Player rule led to tall scores in the IPL and the World T20 won't witness insane totals like 270. He said he foresees more help for spinners from worn-out tracks.

"T20 is not as physically demanding as Test cricket and it's been warm, humid, so that plays a part but that's fine. It would be cooler there in the West Indies than here," he said when asked how his body is holding up after two months of

"There's the Impact Player Rule here and that's not the case in the World Cup and after that you have to put a team that's more balanced and you rely more on all-rounders. You can't have your batting allrounder coming in at No. 9, like they do in IPL.

"I don't think the runs would be that much, I don't think 270 can be scored...Wickets may play a part as we have seen high-scoring matches here and wickets won't be same in West Indies.

"They might turn and will be a bit more tired, and towards end of tournament, they might pose more of a threat staying low and hope bowlers come into play more than they have come through in IPL," he said.
