Traffic movement on Srinagar-Jammu highway to remain suspended tonight

SRINAGAR, Jun 3(Agencies): J&K Traffic Police Monday informed that traffic movement on Srinagar-Jammu National Highway will remain suspended in the intervening night of June 3 and 4, owing to urgent repair and maintenance which has to be carried out on NH44 between Ramban and Banihal.

The officials said that as intimated by NHAI that urgent repair/ maintenance has to be carried out on NH44 between Ramban and Banihal during today's intervening night of 3rd and 4th of June 2024. All type of vehicular movement will remain suspended tonight.

They said no movement of any kind of vehicle including fresh perishable/livestock will be allowed on NH-44 today on 03.06.2024 (Monday) after 6 pm from Qazigund towards Ramban. Similarly no vehicular movement shall be allowed from Nagrota (Jammu) after 5 pm and from Udhampur 6 pm.

The officials advised commuters to avoid journey on NH-44 till the work is completed.

Fire engulfs Forest and **Urban areas** across six **Districts**

JAMMU, Jun 3(Agencies): Several fire incidents in the past 24 hours have devastated vast tracts of forest land and urban areas across six districts in Jammu and Kashmir, officials said on Monday.

No injuries or loss of life occurred during any of the incidents, which were reported in Jammu, Udhampur, Reasi, Rajouri, Kathua, and Poonch districts, they added.

In Poonch district, a blaze, which spread from across the Line of Control (LoC) on Sunday night, triggered multiple mine explosions along the Salotri forward area, the officials said.

Ready to hold assembly polls in Jammu and Kashmir: ECI



NEW DELHI, Jun 3 (Agences): The Election Commission of India Monday said it is ready to hold assembly polls in Jammu and Kashmir and that the Union Territory recorded highest voter turnout in the 2024

Lok Sabha polls in last four decades.

Addressing a press conference in New Delhi to give an overview of marathon 7-phase 2024 general elections that concluded on June 01. Chief Election Commissioner Rajiv Kumar said the commission is ready to hold assembly polls in Jammu and Kashmir. He said that Jammu and Kashmir recorded

highest voter turnout in the 2024 Lok Sabha polls in last four decades

with 58.58 overall percentage, while Kashmir Valley recorded 51.05 percent turnout.

He also said that there was no major incident reported during polls anywhere in the country including Jammu and Kashmir.

The 7-phase Lok Sabha polls concluded on June 01, while votes will be counted tomorrow. On June 01, the exit polls predicted a landslide victory for PM Modi-led NDA with the alliance poised to win over 350 seats.

Meanwhile, all arrangements have been put in place with heightened security measures for counting of votes across the country including

Tight security arrangements in Kashmir ahead of vote counting on **Tuesday**

SRINAGAR, Jun 3 (Agencies): Stringent security arrangements have been made for the counting of votes for three Lok Sabha constituencies of Kashmir as additional security personnel have been deployed at key places in the valley, officials said on Monday.

A three-tier security blanket has been thrown around the counting centres in Srinagar, Baramulla and

Three-Tier security deployed for counting of votes in Jammu, Kathua

JAMMU, Jun 3 (Agencies): A day ahead of the counting of votes for the Jammu and Udhampur Lok Sabha constituencies along with rest of the country, three-tier security has been activated in and around the counting centres in the two districts.

The counting of over 23.94 lakh votes in these constituencies, scheduled for Tuesday, will determine the fate of 34 candidates, including senior BJP leader and Union Minister Jitendra Singh, current Jammu MP Jugal Kishore Sharma and former

ministers Choudhary Lal Singh and Raman Bhalla of the Congress.

"All arrangements are in place for the June 4 vote counting. Three-tier security has been implemented," said Returning Officer and Jammu District Magistrate Sachin Kumar Vaishya.

Vaishya, who reviewed the security measures, logistics and essential amenities at the counting venues, said the counting process will take place in the Polytechnic College and MA M College.

"Votes from the seven assembly constituencies

will be counted at MAM College, while 11 constituencies will be tallied at Polytechnic College," he added.

The administration has fully trained the staff and sensitized all polling agents for the counting process. This includes a detailed examination of the deployment of paramilitary and police personnel as well as the set up for counting staff and agents.

"All counting staff are fully trained and all political parties and their agents have been briefed and issued I-cards. The

27-yr-old daughter of IAS officers jumps off building in Mumbai; Suicide note found

MUMBAI, Jun 3 (Agencies): In a tragic incident early Monday morning, a 27-year-old woman named Lipi, daughter of Maharashtra cadre IAS officers, allegedly ended her life by leaping from the 10th floor of a building near Mantralaya in south Mumbai, according to police reports.

Lipi, who was pursuing an LLB course in Sonipat, Haryana, was reportedly anxious about her academic performance. The young law

student took the drastic step around 4 am, with officials stating that she was declared dead upon arrival at GT Hospital.

A suicide note recovered at the scene indicated that no one should be blamed for her death. The police have registered a case of unnatural death. Lipi's father, Vikas Rastogi, serves as the principal secretary in Maharashtra's Higher and Technical Education Department,

NHAI increases toll fees on expressways by 5% starting Monday

NEW DELHI, Jun 3 (Agences): National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) has announced an average toll hike of 5 percent starting Monday. The revised toll rates, which were initially scheduled to take effect on April 1, were deferred due to the Lok Sabha elections.

The new toll rates will be implemented from June 3, 2024, according to a senior NHAI official. This annual revision aligns with changes in the wholesale price index (CPI)-based inflation, which influences the user fee adjustments.

India's extensive national highway network features approximately 855 toll plazas. Of these, around 675 are public-funded, while the remaining 180 are operated by concessionaires. The toll hikes are part of an annual exercise conducted under the National Highways Fee (Determination of Rates and Collection) Rules, 2008.

Exit polls indicates PM Modi's likely third-term win: Rohiin Chandan

JAMMU, June 3: Describing Prime Minister Narendra Modi as a "messiah" of the poor in India, Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) District Secretary and Media Prabhari Jammu South Rohiin Chandan claimed today that as many as 25 crore people have been lifted from below the poverty line under the PM's leadership.

He said that despite decades of Congress' "Gareebi Hatao" campaign, it was Modi's government that lifted 25 crore Indians out of poverty.

Only US, not Israel, can ensure a Gaza solution

Doised on the brink of electoral uncertainty, India defended Palestine's rights last week with a shade more confidence than before. Yet, by making the future dependent on "direct and meaningful" negotiations with Israel, India's ambassador to the United Nations, Ruchira Kamboj, fell into the trap of making peace and justice hostage to the Israelis, who are the problem in West Asia rather than the solution. But then, she must be loyal to Prime Minister Narendra Modi's fervent declaration that "the people of India firmly stand with Israel".

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's recalcitrance makes it clear that if a solution does emerge, it will be not because -- but in spite of -- Israel.

Today's fashionable phrase is again a "two-state solution" with secure borders for an independent Palestine as well as cast-iron guarantees of Israel's security.

True, this is the only realistic answer to the problem created by Zionist land-grabbing camouflaged in myth and mysticism. But US secretary of state Antony Blinken is wrong to call Hamas ("human animals" for some Americans) and Iran its worst enemies. The real opponents are not Muslim terrorists but fanatical Jews who never stop reliving the Holocaust and seem determined to make Palestinians pay for Nazi sins.

Mr Blinken was reminded that Mr Netanyahu presents formidable objections to the two-state solution when he calls the West Bank, where the bulk of Palestinian refugees live, "Judea and Samaria", the Jewish homeland of Biblical times. Even the language suggests eternal and inalienable possession.

With US President Joe Biden gushing that "if there were not an Israel, we would have to invent one to make sure our interests were preserved", it is no surprise that the Zionists are confident of American backing. Bilateral talks, as demanded by the United States and repeated by Ms Kamboj at the UN, will only give them the power of veto over the future. President Biden's latest proposal for a temporary six-week cease-fire leading to negotiations to end the war and rebuild Gaza must be scrutinised in that light.

Israeli propaganda suggests that the war began with the horrors which Hamas perpetrated on October 7, 2023. Even Ms Kamboj referred to a conflict of "over seven months". At least 76 years would be nearer the mark for the October 7 terrorist raid into Israel marked only another milestone since the "Naqba" -- Catastrophe -- whose anniversary the Palestinians mourn every year on May 15. That was the day in 1948 when Palestine was ethnically cleansed of some 800,000 Palestinians so that Israel could be carved out of the ruins of a once flourishing community.

Actually, Zionist terrorists had launched the process of displacing Palestinians long before May 15, 1948. In fact, by then, half the total number of Palestinians had already been expelled. That process still continues in Mr Netanyahu's "Judea" and "Samaria".

Making a solution to this tragedy dependent on Israel's goodwill is to equate murderer and murdered. An Israel that has already killed more than 36,000 Palestinians in Gaza cannot be the solution. The solution can only come from the US. It is clear too that Mr Netanyahu is battling as much to save his own career as to defeat Hamas. Adversaries like Benny Gantz, a member of Israel's War Cabi-

net and touted as the next Prime Minister, will renew their attack over pending charges of corruption, breach of trust, bribery and fraud as soon as the crisis ends. President Biden's invitation last month to Mr Gantz to Washington may have improved his prospects.

There is no legal reason why Israel, with its own smash-andgrab lineage, should have any say in Palestine's future. But as the de facto occupying power, although without de jure sanction, Israel exercises the authority of legitimacy while dismissing the more than 140 governments that now recognise Palestine as irrelevant. But with Sweden, Norway, Ireland and Spain joining the list, and the European Union calling for a ceasefire in Gaza, cracks have appeared in the Western façade. Even the US is worried that postwar Gaza might be rudderless like Afghanistan after the American pullout, which is why Mr Blinken stresses that Israel must "focus on what the future can and must be" to avoid "anarchy and a vacuum that's likely to be filled by chaos".

He may also have in mind the duplicity of an Israel that financed Gaza's Islamist movement to counter the Palestinian secularists led by Yasser Arafat's Fatah, which dominated the Palestine Liberation Organisation.

An offshoot of the Muslim Brotherhood, Hamas was formally established with Israel's support soon after the first Intifada in 1987 opposing the Israeli occupation. The twofold objective was to split the nationalist Palestinian movement and, more fundamentally, thwart the two-state proposal. Israel calculated that the rise of a rejectionist Islamist group would undermine the two-state formula and curb Western support for an independent Palestine.

Victor Ostrovsky, a Mossad

whistleblower, revealed in The Other Side of Deception that this was part of "Mossad's general plan" for an Arab world "run by fundamentalists" whose rejection of "any negotiations with the West" would leave Israel as "the only democratic, rational country in the region".

The immediate question is: Who will rule Gaza now? Warning that he opposes Israeli control, Yoav Gallant, Israel's defence minister, wants Mr Netanyahu to publicly rule out Israeli governance and to disclose his post-war plans. Only Palestinian entities under international supervision can provide an alternative to Hamas, he says, calling on Mr Netanyahu "□to declare that Israel will not establish civilian" or military control over the Gaza Strip.

Mr Gallant's remarks came as questions were being asked about Israel's long-term strategy with military officials warning that the lack of one would mean repeating the Gaza tragedy again and again. Mr Netanyahu says that neither Hamas nor the Palestinian Authority can provide acceptable governments, and that he will not "replace Hamastan with Fatahstan", meaning Fatah. As for the US, Mr Blinken does "not support and will not support an Israeli occupation" but he doesn't support Hamas either. "There needs to be a clear and concrete plan, and we look to Israel to come forward with its ideas."

Israel is the tail that wags the American dog that has tied not just its security but its very existence to the Zionist state whose government is charged with genocide and crimes against humanity. Many more Palestinians will die as Israel continues to bomb indiscriminately and prevent adequate aid from entering the devastated enclave that is still home to more than two million victims of racist imperialism.

Failing in a competitive exam is not the end of the world

I ife does not adhere to a rigid template or offer a one-size-fits-all formula that could potentially offer a sure-shot route to success for everyone. Living a life free of templates is not an easy choice because we are living in an age of meritocracy. While meritocracy itself is not a flawed concept, it is essential to subject it to a more thorough examination.

A recent tweet by a social media-savvy industrialist sparked a debate about the most challenging entrance exams in the academic world. It also brought to light the fact that three of the 10 most difficult exams to crack in the world are held annually in India. According to the World Ranking Website, the IIT-JEE (Joint Entrance Exam), the UPSC Civil Services Exam, and the Graduate Aptitude Test in Engineering (GATE) are ranked the second, third, and eighth toughest exams in the world respectively. In this article, let us focus on IIT-JEE given its popularity among students and parents and its role in creating a perennial pipeline of highly skilled manpower.

Test composition

Each year, nearly 1-1.2 million young Indians take a crack at this exam, knowing fully well that around only 7-12% have a realistic chance of gaining admission into one of the 23 IITs. Such low odds of success make it seem more like winning a lottery than a reasonable chance to build a strong academic foundation on which future careers can be built. Further, it is not just the slim odds that should bother us, but the composition of the exams itself. While most aspirants want to become engineers of varying kinds, the test continues to check aptitude for subjects unrelated to these fields. The exams don't seem like an accurate assessment, let alone a fair gauge of a student's intelligence or potential.

Extremely competitive entrance exams like the IIT-JEE also ensure that everyone has a similar kind of coaching routine, as they shuttle between schools and institutes. Many even forgo regular schooling and dedicate three to four years of their lives to cracking the IIT-JEE. However, this is not a sustainable approach to building careers or shaping one's life.

Even if one is willing to look beyond the inherent flaws in IIT-JEE as a selection filter for future engineers, other pertinent issues remain. There is no room for debate over the academic excellence IITs deliver or the rigour required to finish the four-year programme. However, it is equally important to consider alternatives. The world, and India in particular, currently offers a multitude of alternative learning platforms and programmes across diverse streams, including Robotics, AI, Semiconductors, hardware, and so on, apart from typical programmes from IITs and NITs. These often have equally strong, if not better, and more focused admission processes and can lead to equally rewarding career outcomes.

Holistic approach

Therefore, instead of holding on to unreasonable notions like "It is either IIT or nothing", students and those who guide them in their educational pursuits may want to consider the following suggestions to help them take a more holistic and realistic approach to higher education, careers, and life in general.

Identify potential interest areas/career opportunities;

Research alternative educational platforms and edtech players that offer programmes suiting your career plans.

Take up projects and internships in your desired fields;

Network with seniors from school/coaching institutes, to understand what skills one needs to continue the learning journey;

Use the Internet to learn about trending technologies and learn from free resources/courses

Most importantly, take some time off. Failing to clear IIT-JEE or skipping it is not the end of the world. There are many ways in today's world to build successful careers. Focus on finding your individual strengths and accordingly figure out the steps to succeed using them.

He had reached Kanyakumari on May 30 on a spiritual sojourn after the Lok Sabha polls cam-

Modi called upon people to move forward in every aspect of life towards the direction of

In the write-up, which appeared in many newspapers on Monday, Modi said India's reforms should also align with the aspirations of a 'Viksit Bharat' (developed India) by 2047, stating that reform can never be a unidimensional process for any country.

"Therefore, I have laid out the vision of reform, perform, and transform for the country. The responsibility of reform lies with leadership. Based on that, our bureaucracy performs, and when the people join in with the spirit of Jan Bhagidari, we witness a transformation taking place," he said.

The article appeared a day before the counting of votes for the Lok Sabha elections takes



place, with exit polls predicting that Modi is set to retain power for a record-equalling third term with a big majority for the ruling BJP.

In a clear elucidation of his government's agenda if it is re-elected, he said, "We must make excellence the fundamental principle to make our country a 'Viksit Bharat'. CEC Kumar dares Opposition to give proof of attempts to influence poll process



NEW DELHI, Jun 3 (Agencies): Chief Election Commissioner Rajiv Kumar on Monday dared the Opposition to share evidence of allegations that returning officers and district magistrates were influenced to vitiate the poll process so the panel could take action against them.

The Opposition should also tell the Commission about those trying to influence the poll process before the counting of votes begins, Kumar said at a press conference. He was flanked by **Election Commissioners** Gyanesh Kumar and S S Sandhu

"You cannot spread a rumour and bring everyone under a cloud of suspicion," Kumar said. The Commission had

made preparations to deal with any foreign attempt to influence the poll process but these allegations have come from within the country itself, he said in an apparent dig at the Opposition.

Taking exception to allegations that district magistrates were being influenced, the CEC said, "Those levelling allegations should say which DM was influenced and we will punish them. They should tell us before the counting process begins."

District magistrates and collectors are the returning officers of their respective districts during election.

Ramesh claimed that Shah had already spoken with 150 district magistrates or collec-

Kumar had accepted all the demands made by the multi-party delegation that met the panel on Sunday, and asserted that the issues raised by them were part of the election process going on for seven decades.

"Some demands were made by a multiparty delegation. We have agreed to all the demands," Kumar said, indicating that most of the issues raised by the multi-party delegation were part of election manuals

"This process has been going on for 70 years... We have instructed every RO/ARO. These are our orders and they are no joke... Everyone has been instructed to follow the handbook/ manuals," Kumar said.

Kumar admitted that the Election Commission had failed to counter the mischievous narratives spread during the poll process.

BJP leaders hold meeting a day before LS poll counting

NEW DELHI, Jun 3 (Agencies): Senior BJP leaders, including Union ministers Amit Shah and Rajnath Singh, held a meeting on Monday, a day before the Lok Sabha poll results will

They are learnt to have taken stock of the prevailing political situation following the exit polls predicting a big win for the BJP-led alliance, and the opposition INDIA bloc's series of meetings rejecting the forecast and sticking to its claim that the Prime Minister Narendra Modi-led government is on its way out.

Though there was no official word from the BJP on the meeting in which party president J P Nadda was also present, its senior leaders are learnt to have also brainstormed over the strategy to take on the opposition.

A BJP delegation had on Sunday approached the Elections Commission, accusing the Congress and its allies of trying to undermine the integrity of India's electoral process, and

urged the poll body to prevent any attempts of "violence and unrest" during the counting of votes for the Lok Sabha polls on June 4.

Leaders from the INDIA bloc have urged the EC to ensure that postal ballots are counted and their results declared before the outcome of the EVMs is announced and stressed that the poll panel should issue clear guidelines on the counting process and ensure that those are implemented.

Very hopeful our results will be totally opposite to exit polls: Sonia Gandhi

NEW DELHI, Jun 3 (Agencies): Congress leader Sonia Gandhi on Monday said her party is very hopeful that the results of the Lok Sabha elections will be totally opposite to what has been shown in the exit polls.

"We have to wait, just wait and see," Sonia Gandhi told agency when asked about her expectations from the results scheduled to be announced on Tuesday.

"We are very hopeful that our results are completely opposite to what the exit polls are showing," the Congress parliamentary party chief added

Sonia Gandhi made the remarks after attending an event held at the DMK office here. She paid tributes to DMK stalwart M Karunanidhi on his 100th birth anniversary.

Most exit polls have predicted that Prime Minister Narendra Modi will retain power for a third straight term, with the BJP-led NDA expected to win a big majority in the Lok Sabha polls.

While some exit polls have given the NDA more than 400 seats, most have predicted that it will win over 350, which is way above the majority mark of 272 seats needed to form the government.

The Congress and other INDIA bloc parties have trashed the exit polls, claiming that these surveys were a work of "fantasy" and asserting that the opposition alliance will form the next government.

"This is not called an exit poll but its name is 'Modi media poll'. This is Modi ji's poll, it is his fantasy poll," former Congress president Rahul Gandhi had said on Sunday.

Congress leaders have said that the INDIA bloc will win 295 seats and form the government.

Earlier, speaking at the event marking the



100th birth anniversary of Karunanidhi, Sonia Gandhi said, "It's my pleasure to be here with my colleagues from the DMK on the very auspicious occasion of the 100th anniversary of Dr. Kalaignar Karunanidhi." "I had the good fortune

of meeting him on many occasions, listening to what he had to say and benefiting from his words of wisdom and advice. I feel fortunate to have met him," she said and extended her best wishes to those present on the occasion.

which has since gone viral on social media. shows the man in a pink jersey executing a perfectly timed lofted shot over the bowler's head. As he prepared to face the next delivery, he suddenly collapsed. Fellow players immediately rushed to his aid, attempting to revive him, but their efforts were in vain. The man remained unresponsive on the ground.

The identity of the cricketer has not been revealed yet. According to the police, the authorities are investigating the case to ascertain the exact cause of death.

Akhilesh questions credibility of exit polls, says INDIA bloc will win maximum seats in UP

SP chief alleges that many agencies that conducted exit polls used to do work of booth management for BJP

LUCKNOW, Jun 3 (Agencies): Samajwadi Party chief Akhilesh Yadav questioned the veracity of exit polls on Monday and claimed the agencies conducting them were only trying to create a conducive atmosphere in favour of the BJP.

At a press conference ahead of the Lok Sabha poll results on Tuesday, the former Uttar Pradesh chief minister said the INDIA bloc's victory will be a victory for the country and its

"Our exit poll says that the INDIA bloc is winning

the maximum number of seats in Uttar Pradesh. I have got an internal survey done that also shows good numbers for us," he said.

"We and you (media) were among the people to strengthen democracy. We have seen they (BJP) did not have people (in their rallies), their tents were empty... nothing was seen in their

favour," Yadav said. Questioning the exit polls, the SP chief alleged that many agencies that conducted the exit polls used to do work of booth management for the BJP.

"They (exit polls agencies) are making a 'mahaul' (conducive atmosphere) in the BJP's favour," he said. "They (BJP) want to

threaten the opposition. This has been their politics since the beginning... But this time, people are ready. Our youths and all sections of society are ready to protect the votes cast by them," Yadav said.

On the Election Commission revising polling percentages days after voting, Yadav said, "The Election Commission should reply to this. I hope EC will follow all



the rules.'

Urging the poll watchdog to make adequate security arrangements for agents of opposition parties, the SP chief claimed that when the BJP appears weak, it

will try to threaten the agents as the adminis-

tration is with the party. "It might happen that they will slow counting or cut the power at night,"

he alleged. "The elections are

over. The exit polls are showing many things. The BJP is responsible for many things. They disturbed peace and brotherhood. They conspired to end the reservation. They increased crime against women. They made a record of wrong behaviour. They triggered inflation and unemployment. The poor become poorer," he added.

Yadav also blamed the BJP for paper leaks in Uttar Pradesh and also referred to atrocities on women in Hathras and Manipur. He alleging that historic corruption

was done in the name of electoral bonds.

Sharpening his attack on the BJP, Yadav said, "Businesses were ruined by demonetisation. Small shopkeepers were made victims of recession by corrupt GST. BJP wanted to usurp farmers' land and to bring black laws for farmers. It did not give remunerative prices for crops and pushed the country into unemploy-

ment." "Loans worth billions of rupees of the rich were waived but farmers had to commit suicide due to loans. Savings of the middle class were rendered useless by reducing interest rates and other charges.

"The BJP government brought a deadly vaccine without testing. This will have a direct impact on the health of the public and will also affect the health of the coming generations," Yadav added.

Mexico elects Claudia Sheinbaum as its first woman President

She promises to continue all of López Obrador's policies

MEXICO CITY, Jun 3 (Agencies): Mexico's projected presidential winner Claudia Sheinbaum will become the first woman President in the country's 200-year history.

The climate scientist and former Mexico City mayor said on Sunday night that her two competitors had called and conceded victory.

"I will become the first woman president of Mexico," Sheinbaum said with a smile, speaking at a downtown hotel shortly after electoral authorities announced a statistical sample showed she held an irreversible lead.

"I don't make it alone. We've all made it, with our heroines who gave us our homeland, with our mothers, daughters and granddaughters.'

"We have demonstrated that Mexico is a democratic country with peaceful elections," she said.

The National Electoral Institute's President said Sheinbaum had between 58.3 per cent and 60.7 per cent of the votes, according to a statistical sample. Opposition candidate Xóchitl Gálvez had between 26.6 per cent and 28.6 per cent of the votes and Jorge Álvarez Máynez had between 9.9 per cent and 10.8 per cent of the

The preliminary count, which started off very slowly, put Sheinbaum 27 points ahead of Gálvez with 42 per cent of polling place tallies counted shortly after her victory speech.

The governing party candidate campaigned on continuing the



political course set over the last six years by her political mentor President Andrés Manuel López Obrador.

His anointed successor, the 61-year-old Sheinbaum led the campaign wire-to-wire despite a spirited challenge from Gálvez. This was the first time in Mexico that the two main opponents were women.

"Of course, I congratulate Claudia Sheinbaum with all my respect who ended up the winner by a wide margin," López Obrador said shortly after electoral authority's announcement. "She is going to be Mexico's first woman president in 200 years."

If the margin holds, it would approach his landslide victory in 2018. López Obrador won the presidency after two unsuccessful tries with 53.2 per cent of the votes, in a three-way race where National Action took 22.3 per cent and the Institutional Revolutionary Party took 16.5 per cent.

Earlier, Gálvez wrote on the social platform X, 'The votes are there. Don't let them hide them. Sheinbaum is unlikely to enjoy the kind of unquestioning devotion that López Obrador has enjoyed. Both belong to the governing Morena party.

In Mexico City's main colonial-era main plaza, the Zocalo, Sheinbaum's lead did not initially draw the kind of cheering and jubilant crowds that greeted López Obrador's victory in 2018.

Fernando Fernández, a chef, 28, joined the relatively small crowd, hoping for a Sheinbaum victory, but even he acknowledged there were problems.

"You vote for Claudia out of conviction, for AMLO," Fernández said, referring to López Obrador by his initials, as most Mexicans do. But his highest hope is that Sheinbaum can "improve what AMLO couldn't do, the price of gasoline, crime and drug trafficking, which he didn't combat even though he had the power."

Also in the crowd, Itxel Robledo, 28, a business administrator, expressed hope that Sheinbaum would do what López Obrador didn't. "What Claudia has to do is put professionals in every area.'

Elsewhere in the city, Yoselin Ramírez, 29, said she voted for Sheinbaum, but split her vote for other posts because she didn't want anyone holding a strong majority.

"I don't want everything to be occupied by the same party, so there can be a little more equality," she said without elaborating.

The main opposition candidate, Gálvez, a tech entrepreneur and former senator, tried to seize on Mexicans' concerns about security and promised to take a more aggressive approach toward organized

Nearly 100 million people were registered to vote, but turnout appeared to be slightly lower than in past elections. Voters were also electing governors in nine of the country's 32 states, and choosing candidates for both houses of Congress, thousands of mayorships and other local posts, in the biggest elections the nation has seen and ones that have been marked by violence.

The elections were widely seen as a referendum on López Obrador, a populist who has expanded social programs but largely failed to reduce cartel violence in Mexico. His Morena party currently holds 23 of the 32 governorships and a simple majority of seats in both houses of Congress. Mexico's constitution prohibits the president's reelection.

Sheinbaum promised to continue all of López Obrador's policies, including a universal pension for the elderly and a program that pays youths to apprentice.

South Korea plans to nullify peace deal to punish North Korea over trash-carrying balloon launches

SEOUL, Jun 3 (Agencies): South Korea announced Monday it'll suspend a rapprochement deal with North Korea to punish it over its launches of trash-carrying balloons, even after the North said it would halt its balloon campaign.

Over several days, North Korea flew hundreds of balloons to drop trash and manure on South Korea in an angry reaction against previous South Korean civilian leafleting campaigns. On Sunday, South Korea said it would take "unbearable" retaliatory steps in response, before North Korea abruptly announced it would stop flying balloons across the border.

On Monday, South Korea's presidential national security council said it has decided to suspend a 2018 inter-Korean agreement aimed at easing frontline animosities, until mutual trust between the two Koreas is restored, according to the presidential office.

The security council said the suspension would allow South Korea to resume military drills near the border with North Korea and take effective, immediate responses to provocations by North Korea. It said a proposal on the suspension will be introduced at the Cabinet Council on Tuesday for approval.

Observers say South Korea needs the deal's suspension to restart blasting anti-Pyongyang propaganda broadcasts, K-pop songs and outside news from border loudspeakers. They say such broadcasts have previously stung in the rigidly controlled North, where most of its 26 million people are not allowed official accesses to

The 2018 agreement, reached during a brief period of reconciliation between then-liberal South Korean President Moon Jae-in and North Korean leader Kim Jong Un, require the Koreas to cease all hostile acts against each other, including propaganda broad-

But the accord doesn't clearly state civilian leafleting should also be banned. That has allowed South Korean activists to continue to fly balloons to drop anti-Pyongyang leaflets, USB sticks with South Korean dramas and world news, and U.S. dollars in North Korea. Enraged over such leafleting campaigns, North Korea has previously fired at incoming balloons

and destroyed a South Korean-built,

unoccupied inter-Korean liaison office

in the North.

casts and leafleting campaigns.

The 2018 deal has already been in the danger of collapsing. Tension spiked after North Korea's spy satellite launch last November prompted both Koreas to take steps in breach of the accord — South Korea resuming frontline aerial surveillance and North Korea restoring border guard posts.

Since last Tuesday, a total of about 1,000 North Korean balloons carrying manure, cigarette butts, scraps of cloth and waste paper have been discovered in various parts of South Korea. No hazardous substances were found, according to South Korea's military.

On Sunday night, Kim Kang II, a North Korean vice defense minister, said the North would stop its balloon campaign because it left the South Koreans with "enough experience of how much unpleasant they feel." He said North Korea will fly balloons again if South Korean activists restart their own balloon activities.

Experts say North Korea's balloon campaign, reportedly the first of its kind in seven years, is meant to trigger a divide in South Korea over its current conservative government's tough policy on the North. Since 2022, North Korea has dramatically ramped up its weapons tests in what analysts call an attempt to bolster its nuclear capability and increase its leverage in future diplomacy with the U.S.

Sri Lanka closes schools as floods and mudslides leave 10 dead and 6 others missing

COLOMBO, Jun 3 (Agencies): Sri Lanka closed schools on Monday as heavy rain triggered floods and mudslides in many parts of the island nation, leaving at least 10 people dead and six others missing, officials said.

The education ministry announced that the reopening of schools would depend on how the weather develops.

Heavy downpours have wreaked havoc in many parts of the country since Sunday, flooding homes, fields and roads, and forcing authorities to cut electricity as a precaution. Six people died after

being washed away and drowning in the



capital, Colombo, and the remote Rathnapura district on Sunday, according to the disaster management center. Three others died when mounds of earth collapsed on their houses, and one person died when a tree fell on him. Six people have gone missing since Sunday.

By Monday, over 5,000 people had been moved to evacuation centers and more than 400 homes had been

damaged, the center

said in a statement. Navy and army troops have been deployed to rescue victims and provide food and other essentials to those affected

Sri Lanka has been grappling with severe weather conditions since mid-May caused by heavy monsoon rains. Earlier, strong winds downed trees in many areas, killing nine people.

Tens of thousands of children in Afghanistan are affected by ongoing flash floods, UNICEF says

KABUL, Jun 3 (Agencies): Tens of thousands of children in Afghanistan remain affected by ongoing flash floods, especially in the north and west, the U.N. children's agency said Monday.

Unusually heavy seaonal rains have been wreaking havoc on multiple parts of the country, killing hundreds of people and destroying property and crops. The U.N. food agency has warned that many survivors are unable to make a living.

UNICEF, the U.N. children's agency, said the extreme weather has all of the hallmarks of an intensifying climate crisis, with some of the affected areas having



experienced drought last year.

The World Food Program said the exceptionally heavy rains in Afghanistan killed more than 300 people and destroyed thousands of houses in May, mostly in the northern province of Baghlan. Survivors have been left with no

homes, no land, and no source of livelihood. WFP said.

UNICEF said in a statement Monday that tens of thousands of children remain affected by ongoing floods.

"The international community must redouble efforts and investments to support communities

to alleviate and adapt to the impact of climate change on children," said Dr. Tajudeen Oyewale, the UNICEF representative in Afghanistan.

At the same time, "UNICEF and the humanitarian community must prepare ourselves for a new reality of climate-related disasters," Oyewale said.

Afghanistan ranks 15th out of 163 nations in the Children's Climate Risk Index. This means that not only are climate and environmental shocks and stresses prominent in the country, but children are particularly vulnerable to their effects compared with else-

where in the world. Last week, the private group Save the Children said about 6.5 million children in Afghanistan are forecast to experience crisis levels of hunger in 2024. Nearly three out of

10 Afghan children will face crisis or emergency levels of hunger this vear as the country feels the immediate impact of floods, the long-term effects of drought, and the return of Afghans from neighboring Pakistan and Iran, the group said in a report.

More than 557,000 Afghans have returned from Pakistan since September 2023, after Pakistan began cracking down on foreigners it alleges are in the country illegally, including 1.7 million Afghans.

China Accuses British Secret Service Of Recruiting Its Citizens To Spy

BEIJING, Jun 3 (Agencies): China on Monday accused Britain's Secret Intelligence Service (MI6) of recruiting a couple who worked for the central government to spy for the UK, adding to months of mutual espionage allegations between Beijing and Western powers.

The Ministry of State Security said in a post on its official WeChat that MI6 operatives convinced a man surnamed Wang, who worked in a "core confidential role" in the central state apparatus, to defect along with his wife, surnamed Zhou.


"Recently, after careful investigation, the national security organs uncovered a major espionage case in which

the British Secret Intelligence Service (MI6) instigated a couple, Wang and Zhou, who were staff members of a central state agency of China, to defect," it said.

The ministry said British spies began cultivating Wang after he began a course of study in the UK in 2015, arranging dinners and tours for him in order to "understand his character weaknesses, interests and demands".

After learning that Wang "had a strong desire for money", they then approached him to provide well-paid consulting services that came to involve the internal workings of central state agencies,

the ministry said. MI6 personnel later



revealed their identities to Wang and directed him to return to China to collect intelligence, convincing him to coerce Zhou into doing the

The ministry said it had gathered evidence and taken "decisive measures" against Wang, adding that the case was under further investigation.

The statement gave no details of Wang or Zhou's current occupations in China, the nature of the information they provided, or their whereabouts.

Agency has contacted Britain's Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office, which handles MI6 press enquiries, for comment. China and Western powers have long traded accusations of spying but only recently started to disclose details of alleged individual cases. Last month, British

A total of 225 tables, each staffed by three personnel, will facilitate the counting process. Sixty tables are designated for ETPBS votes, each with a counting agent, a micro observer, a supervisor and an Assistant Returning Officer (ARO), the officials said.

The CCTV footage of the EVM strong rooms has been shared with the political parties' representatives. Nearly 10,000 staff members will handle the entire counting process, including transferring Electronic Voting Machines (EVMs) from strong rooms to counting halls, they added.

The Udhampur-Doda parliamentary constituency recorded a 68.23 per cent voter turnout on April 19, with 16,23,195 eligible voters casting their ballots. This takes the total number of accused chargesheeted in the case, which had exposed global linkages with foreign handlers, to 20, said the statement issued by

the federal probe agency. The accused, chargesheeted under various sections of the Indian Penal Code, Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, Arms Act and Explosive Substances Act, "were found to have been engaged in a massive ISIS conspiracy involving recruitment, training and propagation of the Islamic State of Iraq and Syria (ISIS) ideology among gullible youth, along with fabrication of explosives and improvised explosive devices (IEDs) and fund-raising for the banned outfit", it said.

The NIA, which has been cracking down on various ISIS modules active in the country with the intent to dismantle the nefarious terror network of the international organisation, had registered a case in November 2023 to probe this terror conspiracy. Its investigation had subsequently led to

the seizure of several incriminating documents and data relating to manufacturing of explosives and fabrication of IEDs, along with propaganda magazines like 'Voice of Hind', 'Rumiyah', 'Khilafat', 'Dabiq', published by the Islamic State (IS), the statement said. The agency had further found during investigations that the accused had been sharing digital files related to IED fabrication with their contacts. They were also found to be actively raising funds to further their terror plans as part of the ISIS agenda to spread violence in India and destroy its secular ethos and democratic systems, it said. The accused had carried out several acts preparatory to unleashing terrorist attacks, including recruitment of vulnerable youth into the organisation, the statement said. "They had taken 'bayath' (pledge of allegiance) from an arrested accused Saguib Nachan, a habitual offender in many previous terror cases and a self-styled Amir-e-Hind for ISIS in India," the NIA said.

The chargesheeted accused are part of Delhi-Padgha (Maharashtra) ISIS terror module case, an official said, adding the NIA is actively pursuing investigations in the case to trace further links of the accused persons.

MUMBAI, Jun 3 (Agencies): Benchmark stock indices Sensex and Nifty rallied more than 3 per cent to close at lifetime highs on Monday following across-theboard buying as exit polls predicted a massive win for the BJPled NDA in the general elections.

The 30-share BSE Sensex soared by 2,507.47 points or 3.39 per cent to settle at a new closing peak of 76,468.78, marking its biggest single-day gain in three years. During the day, the barometer jumped 2,777.58 points or 3.75 per cent to hit a record intra-day peak of 76,738.89.

The NSE Nifty climbed 733.20 points or 3.25 per cent to finish at 23,263.90. During the day, it soared 808 points or 3.58 per cent to hit a fresh intra-day all-time high of 23,338.70.

A sharp rally in bluechip stocks Reliance Industries, ICICI Bank, HDFC Bank and State Bank of India propelled the indices to lifetime high levels. Strong GDP data also added to the buoyancy in equity markets.

Shares of all Adani Group companies continued their sharp rally on Monday, with Adani Power surging nearly 16 per cent, in line with a massive surge in the equity market.

Among sectors, PSUs, Power, Utilities, Oil, Energy, Capital Goods, and Realty indices soared up to 8 per cent.

India's manufacturing sector growth eases in May; upturn in exports strongest in over 13 years: PMI survey

The slowdown was attributed to reduced working hours amid intensive heatwave and rising production costs.

NEW DELHI, Jun 3 (Agencies): India's manufacturing sector saw a slower growth rate for the second straight month in May but stayed firmly in expansion mode with global sales increasing to the greatest extent in over 13 years, a monthly survey said on Monday.

The seasonally adjusted HSBC India Manufacturing Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI) fell from 58.8 in April to 57.5 in May, signalling a slower but substantial improvement in the health of the sector.

The index had climbed to a 16-year high of 59.1 in March.

In PMI parlance, a print above 50 means expansion while a score below 50 denotes contraction.

According to HSBC Global Economist Maitreyi Das, "The manufacturing sector remained in expansionary territory in May, albeit the pace slowed, led by a softer rise in new orders and output."

The slowdown was attributed to reduced working hours amid intensive heatwave and rising production costs.

"Panelists cited heatwaves as a reason for lower work hours in May, which may have affected



production volumes," Das said. The headline figure was nearly four points higher than its longrun average.

May data showed a further upturn in Indian factory production, which stretched the current sequence of expansion to nearly three years.

Despite easing to a threemonth low, the rate of increase remained sharp.

Growth was supported by new business gains, demand strength and successful marketing efforts, the report said.

New orders rose at a substantial pace that was nonetheless

the slowest in three months. The rise was associated with marketing efforts, demand strength and favourable economic conditions, as per the

Growth was reportedly stymied by competitions and election-related disruptions, it said, adding that in contrast to the trend for total sales, new export orders rose at a faster pace in

The upturn in international sales was the strongest in over 13 years as manufacturers witnessed gains from customers across several countries in Africa, Asia, the Americas, Europe, and the Middle East.

The ongoing strong sales performances, combined with upbeat growth forecasts, fuelled job creation in May, the report

Manufacturing employment rose to one of the greatest extents seen since data collection started in March 2005, the report said, adding that jobs growth, parallel to rising material and freight costs, underpinned a quicker increase in input costs at goods producers.

"On the price front, higher raw material and freight costs led to a rise in input prices. Manufacturers were only able to pass on a part of this increase to consumers, resulting in a squeeze in manufacturing margins," Das

"The positive news is that May recorded the highest level of positive sentiment among manufacturing firms in just under a decade, resulting in increased job creation," Das added.

The HSBC India Manufacturing PMI compiled by S&P Global, is based on responses to questionnaires sent to purchasing managers in a panel of around 400 manufacturers.

Amul milk price hiked by Rs 2/litre across all variants with effect from June 3

AHMEDABAD, Jun 3 (Agencies): The price of Amul milk across all variants has been hiked by Rs 2 per litre with effect from Monday in view of the increase in the overall cost of operation and production of milk, Gujarat Cooperative Milk Marketing Federation (GCMMF) said.

With this, the price of the Amul milk pouch will go up by Rs 2 per litre in all markets across the

The price of Amul milk across all variants has been raised by Rs 2 per litre with effect from June 3, said Jayen Mehta, MD of GCMMF, which markets the milk and dairy products under the 'Amul' brand.

The last time GCMMF had raised the milk price was in February 2023.

The hike is necessitated to compensate farm-

ers for their increased cost of production, Mehta said.

With the fresh hike, the revised milk prices for variants such as 500 ml Amul buffalo milk, 500 ml Amul Gold milk, and 500 ml Amul Shakti milk stand at Rs 36, Rs 33, and Rs 30, respectively.

"The increase of Rs 2 per litre translates to the range of 3-4 per cent increase in MRP which

is much lower than the average food inflation.

It is worthwhile to note that since February 2023, Amul has made no increase in prices of fresh pouch milk in major markets," GCMMF said in a state-

This price hike is being done due to the increase in the overall cost of operation and production of milk, it said.

Amul as a policy passes on almost 80 paise of every rupee paid by consumers for milk and milk products to milk producers, according to GCMMF.

"The price revision shall help in sustaining remunerative milk prices to our milk producers and to encourage them for higher milk production," it added.

Mediterranean diet may lower risk of death in women, finds study

NEW DELHI, Jun 3 (Agencies): Women consuming the largely plant-based Mediterranean diet were found to be at a 23 per cent lower risk of dying prematurely, according to a new research.

The study following more than 25,000 US women for up to 25 years found that adhering to the diet reduced cholesterol, obesity and insulin resistance, all of which are known risk factors for developing metabolic disorders, including diabetes and heart disease.

The Mediterranean diet is rich in nuts, fruits and vegetables, along with whole grains and legumes. The dishes are mainly cooked in olive oil and also include a moderate intake of fish, poultry, dairy and eggs. Red meat and sweets are rarely consumed.

Adopting this diet pattern was also found to lower risk of death due to cancer in the women studied. The findings were published in The Journal of the American Medical Association.

"Our research provides significant public health insight: even modest changes in established risk factors for metabolic diseases can vield substantial long-term benefits from following a Mediterranean diet. This finding underscores the potential of encouraging healthier dietary habits to reduce the overall risk of mortality," said lead author Shafqat Ahmad, a researcher at the Division of Preventive Medicine in Brigham and Women's Hospital in US.

The researchers included participants aged at least 45 years at the start of the women's health study. The women responded to questionnaires and provided information on their weight, height and body mass index, along with details about their lifestyle and medical and social history. Their blood pressures were also taken.

For understanding possible biological mechanisms that could explain the diet's health benefits, the researchers assessed over 30 biomarkers of metabolism and inflammation. including lipids and insulin resistance.

"In this large-scale cohort study of 25,315 initially healthy US women who were followed up for 25 years, we observed that higher adherence to the Mediterranean diet was associated with a 23 per cent relative risk reduction in all-cause mortality," the authors wrote.

The researchers acknowledged that the study was limited to middle aged and older well-educated female health professionals who were predominantly non-Hispanic and white.

However, the study's strengths included its large sample size and a long follow-up duration, they said.

"The health benefits of the Mediterranean diet are recognised by medical professionals, and our study offers insights into why the diet may be so beneficial," said senior author Samia Mora, a cardiologist and the director of the Center for Lipid Metabolomics at Brigham and Women's Hospital.

Cancer patients often do better with less intensive treatment, new research finds

NEW YORK, Jun 3 (Agencies): Scaling back treatment for three kinds of cancer can make life easier for patients without compromising outcomes, doctors reported at the world's largest cancer conference.

It's part of a long-term trend toward studying whether doing less less surgery, less chemotherapy or less radiation — can help patients live longer and feel better. The latest studies involved ovarian and esophageal cancer and Hodgkin lymphoma. Thirty years ago,

cancer research was about doing more, not less. In one sobering example, women with advanced breast cancer were pushed to the brink of death with massive doses of chemotherapy and bone marrow transplants. The approach didn't work any better than chemotherapy and patients suffered.

Now, in a guest to optimise cancer care, researchers are asking: "Do we need all that treatment that we have used in the past?" It's a question, "that

should be asked over and over again," said Dr. Tatjana Kolevska, medical director for the Kaiser Permanente National Cancer Excellence Programme, who was not involved in the new research.

Often, doing less works because of improved drugs. "The good news is that

cancer treatment is not only becoming more effective, it's becoming easier to tolerate and associated with less short-term and longterm complications," said Dr. William G. Nelson of Johns Hopkins School of Medicine, who was also not involved in the new

Studies demonstrating the trend were discussed over the weekend at an American Society of Clinical Oncology conference in Chicago. Here are the highlights:

Ovarian cancer French researchers found that it's safe to avoid removing lymph nodes that appear healthy during surgery for advanced ovarian

cancer. The study compared the results for 379 patients — half had their lymph nodes removed and half did not. After nine years, there was no difference in how long the patients lived and those with less-extreme surgery had fewer complications, such as the need for blood transfusions. The research was funded by the National Institute of Cancer in France.

Esophageal cancer This German study looked at 438 people with a type of cancer of the esophagus that

gery. Half received a

A comparison of two chemotherapy regimens for advanced Hodgkin lymphoma found the less intensive treatment was more effective for the blood cancer and caused fewer side effects. After four years, the

less harsh chemo kept the disease in check in 94 per cent of people, compared to 91 per cent of those who had the more intense treatment. The trial included 1,482 people in nine countries — Germany, Austria, Switzerland, the Netherlands, Denmark, Sweden, Norway, Australia and New Zealand — and was funded by Takeda Oncology, the maker of one of the drugs used in the gentler chemo that was studied.

Giving babies peanuts could avert allergies later on, study finds the earlier Learning

NEW DELHI, Jun 3 (Agencies): Introducing peanuts into children's diets from infancy through age five can reduce the risk of peanut allergies in adolescence by 71%, according to new research by King's College London.

The study, published in NEJM Evidence, part of the LEAP-Trio trial, highlights the long-term benefits of early peanut consumption in preventing allergies.

The findings build on

Early About Peanut Allergy (LEAP) clinical trial. In the LEAP trial, infants were divided into two groups: one regularly consuming peanuts until age five and the other avoiding them. Results showed an 81% reduction in peanut allergy risk at age five for those who consumed peanuts

early. Follow-up research from ages 6 to 12 revealed that only 4.4%

of children who had eaten peanuts early developed allergies by adolescence, compared to 15.4% of those who had avoided them.

This demonstrates that early peanut introduction leads to sustained allergy prevention even when peanut consumption is inconsistent later

Lead author Professor Gideon Lack from King's College London emphasised that early peanut introduction induces

long-term tolerance, countering decades of advice that discouraged early peanut consump-

Professor George Du Toit, co-lead author, affirmed the intervention's safety and effectiveness, recommending that peanuts be introduced as early as four months, provided the infant is ready for weaning.

The LEAP-Trio study tested for peanut allergy using an oral food challenge, which involves gradually increasing peanut consumption in a controlled environment. The study also collected data on participants' peanut consumption habits and validated these with environmental samples. Professor Lack high-

lighted the global impact of the findings, noting that early peanut consumption could prevent over 1,00,000 new cases of peanut allergy every year worldwide.

It will also be a battle between one of the strongest batting units in the tournament against a bowling attack that is looking threatening. South Africa will be bolstered by the return of the likes of captain Aiden Markram, Tristan Stubbs, David Miller, and Heinrich Klaasen. T20 World Cup2024: Trumpelmann, Wiese Shine As Namibia Clinch Super Over Win Against Oman



Namibia's Ruben Trumpelmann became the first player to take wickets in the first two deliveries of a T20 international as his team beat Oman via the Super Over in a thrilling T20 World Cup match here. David Wiese and skipper Gerhard Erasmus smashed 21 runs for Namibia in the one-over eliminator with Oman managing 10 from the allotted six deliveries bowled brilliantly by the seasoned Wiese. Asked to bat first, Oman were earlier bowled out for 109 in 19.4 overs at the Kensington Oval. In reply, Namibia were also stopped at the same team score with Jan Frylinck making 45 in 48 balls and Mehran Khan taking 3/7 to force a Super Over.

This was after Namibia's South Africaborn left-arm fast bowler Trumpelmann created history.

The 26-year-old achieved the feat when he dismissed opener Kashyap Prajapati and Oman skipper Aqib Ilyas for golden ducks on the first two balls of the match.

Khalid Kail top-scored for Oman with 34 in 39 balls.

Trumpelmann took another wicket in his second over and returned with the career-best figures of 4-21.

He trapped Kashyap Prajapati leg before wicket with an in-swinging yorker on the first ball of the match and then dismissed llyas with one that crushed onto the batter's toes.

In the process, Trumpelmann also

registered the best figures for the team in T20 World Cup history. He beat the previous record of 3/17 set by him against Scotland in the 2021 edition of the T20 World Cup held in the UAE.

After sending back Prajapati and Ilyas off successive balls, Trumpelmann dismissed opener Naseem Khushi and then returned to pick up the wicket of Kalemullah at the death for his fourth scalp.

Wiese too was among wickets, returning fine figures of 3/28 in 3.4 overs as Oman found it hard to tackle the Namibia bowlers.

However, defending a small total, Oman bowlers showed a lot of discipline and refused to go down without a fight, eventually managing to tie the game.

But, on the day, Nambia had the last laugh.

While many thought Namibia captain Erasmus would hand the ball to Trumpelmann to bowl the Super Over, he chose the 39-year-old Wiese for his years of experience and it paid dividends

After the nervy win, Player of the Match Wiese, who was also born in South Africa, said, "Aged a couple of years tonight. Don't have a lot of years left in me (laughs). It was emotionally draining evening." Speaking about batting and bowling in Super over, "It helped that I had a feel of the game and knew if I get a few hits out in the Super Over then with the ball, felt like taking the ball and executing.

"Pitch was difficult, didn't play the way we thought. But we adapted well. It was two-paced, it was a difficult wicket to get yourself in. Definitely one you needed to spend a bit of time before capitalising." Namibia were on course to chase down the target of 110 until Mehran Khan (3/7) brought Oman back into the contest with his two wickets in the final over.

Babar Azam-Mohammad Rizwan as openers?: Ian Bishop wants Pakistan to change approach

DALLAS, Jun 3 (Agencies): Former West Indies legend Ian Bishop wanted Babar Azam and Mohammad Rizwan to change their batting approach going into the T20 World Cup. The Pakistan team resorted to their usual opening pair of Rizwan and Babar, right ahead of the marquee tournament, during the T20I series against England. Earlier, the successful opening pair had attained immense success while batting together. However, the young batter Saim Ayub was made to open alongside Rizwan during the 5-match T20I series against New Zealand.

While speaking on Star Sports, Bishop backed youngsters like Ayub and Mohammad Harris to be given opportunities at the top for Pakistan.

"If you're asking me what I want versus what will happen to Pakistan, I will tell you that I need and hope that down the road, I don't know if it's immediate but down the road guys like Saim Ayub, I know Mohammad Harris is not in the reckoning right now, but he's another young man. They've left back at home that I think until for T-20 cricket. But these guys are still very young and living the way," Bishop said.

While opening the batting, Ayub could manage to score only 229 runs in 15 innings with a strike0rate of just 126.52. He got to open the batting during the



2nd T20I match against England, but departed for a 7-ball 2. In the 4th T20I, captain Babar came out to bat and shared a 59-run opening stand with Rizwan.

Should Babar and Rizwan open?
Bishop raised the strike-rate concerns for both the openers and wanted Rizwan-Babar to shift gears early on in the innings.

"So, the experience of Babar and Riwan, they probably will go back there. But again, that's a template that needs to change with those two players who I think from what we've seen T 20 cricket going to even in a World Cup of challenging pitches, they need to shift another gear up in the way they approach their batting," Bishop added.

Pakistan will take on the hosts USA in their tournament opener on June 6 at the Grand Prairie Stadium in Dallas, Texas.

West Indies pushed to limit by plucky PNG in their T20 World Cup opener

GEORGETOWN, Jun 3 (Agencies): Two-time champions West Indies were put under extreme pressure by a plucky Papua New Guinea unit before scraping through with a fivewicket win in their T20 World Cup opener here.

Left-hander Sese Bau (50 off 43) made a fine half-century to take PNG to 136 for eight after the associate nation lost their first four wickets for 50 runs.

A power-packed West Indies should have chased down the below-par total comfortably but PNG made them work hard for the win despite their limitations.

PNG's spinners as well as medium pacers did not allow the hard-hitting West Indies batters to cut loose on a slow surface.

The tournament co-hosts eventually got home in 19 overs thanks to rearguard action from Roston Chase (42 not out off 27 balls) and Andre Russell (15 off 9).

The West Indies' innings was halted for 20 minutes due to rain but there was no loss of overs.

The passing shower arrived with the home team at 8 for one in the second over and



it would have been two down at the same score had rightarm pacer Alei Nao won a lbw review for the dangerous Nicholas Pooran.

After trapping Johnson Charles off his very first ball, Nao got another one to seam back in from short of length to leave Pooran stranded but luck was on the latter's side.

However, his scratchy effort ended when he was caught in the deep off left-arm spinner John Kariko.

PNG skipper Assad Vala made it 63 for three inside 10 overs when he deceived opener Brandon King (34) in flight and had him caught at deep midwicket.

Nerves increased in the West Indies dressing room when it became 97 for five in 16 overs before Chase and Russell got hold of the proceedings.

After PNG were sent in to bat, Bau made an instant impact on the big stage with his spirited effort.

PNG, playing their second T20 World Cup, were reeling at 50 for four before Bau shared a 44-run stand with Charles Amini (12) to save them the blushes.

Expecting the pitch to turn, the West Indies picked three spinners and put the opposition in after winning the toss.

The help for the spinners was visible as early as the first over bowled by Akeal Hosein.

However, it was pacer Romario Shepherd who picked up the first wicket by having Tony Ura caught behind in the second over of the game.

The ball seamed away, inducing a thick edge from the batter.

Hosein got rid of number three Lega Siaka with an arm ball before Alzarri Joseph sent back Vala (21 off 22 balls). Vala came up with a couple of crisp hits in the cover region before being caught brilliantly by Roston Chase at backward point.

Vala's six over extra cover off spinner Chase in the previous over was one of the highlights of PNG's innings.

Bau then ensured that the odd boundary kept coming as PNG tried to consolidate their innings.

Bau, a leftie like Vala, smashed left-arm spinner Gudakesh Motie for a six and a couple of fours to give the innings muchneeded momentum.

After his departure, the associate nation did rather well to get close to the 140-run mark.

Norway Chess: Praggnanandhaa Loses To Alireza Firouzja, Magnus Carlsen Jumps To Sole Lead

STAVANGER, Jun 3 (Agencies): The brother-sister Indian duo of R Praggnanandhaaa and R Vaishali suffered defeats in their respective section while Magnus Carlsen justified his top billing with a win over an off-colour Ding Liren to surge to the sole lead on 12 points in the Norway Chess tournament here. Fabiano Caruana also scored over compatriot Hikaru Nakamura to help Carlsen emerge as the front runner for the crown in the six-player double round-robin contest being fought for a

total prize pool of USD

Pragganandhaa lost to Firouzja Alireza of France in the Armageddon tiebreaker after suffering a bit through the Classical game too while Vaishali went down to world women's champion Wenjun Ju of China who outplayed the Indian in the endgame.

With four rounds still to come in both sections, Carlsen is now followed by Nakamura on 11 points while Praggnanandhaa is still third on 9.5 points in all.

Alireza is on fourth spot with eight points in

all and Caruana follows him with 6.5 points. Surprisingly, China's Ding Liren seems completely out of sorts with just 2.5 points thus far, needing a miracle to come back in the tournament.

In the women's section, Wenjun snatched the lead from Vaishali along with Anna Muzychuk of Ukraine who won a hard-fought Armageddon against Tingjie Lei of China. Both Wenjun and Muzychuk have an identical 10.5 points, a half point ahead of Vaishali.

Lei is fourth on seven points, enjoying a twopoint lead over Koneru



Humpy who suffered another loss at the hands of Pia Cramling of Sweden in the Armageddon.

Cramling has 4.5

points now and is still at the bottom of the tables. Gaining a small advantage out of the opening, the world number one Carlsen capitalised on his double Bishops to launch an offensive on the king side and used another blunder by Ding Liren to finish the game with a child-like queen sacrifice.

Liren looks a far cry from the man who won the last world championship title against lan Nepomniachtchi of Russia and needs to really gather himself to make a match of it in the next edition of the tournament against India's D Gukesh.

Currently, as per FIDE, the apex governing body, there are bids from Delhi, Chennai and Singapore to hold the World Championship match.

Praggnanandhaa suffered a jolt in his quest as Alireza played a nice game under Classical to put pressure and eventually drew the contest. In the return game however, the Indian faltered and could not really stage a comeback.

In the women's section, Vaishali had her chances but Wenjun Ju was at her technical best and seized opportunities as they came her way. The minor pieces end-

game had some chances but Vaishali could not sustain the pressure.
