Man found dead in abandoned shopping complex in Budgam

SRINAGAR, July 5: A male body was found in an abandoned complex near Sebden bridge of central Kashmir's Budgam district on Friday afternoon.

An official told news agency Kashmir Scroll that an unidentified male body was found lying in the second story of an abandoned shopping complex at Sebden bridge in Budgam.

The body is in decomposed condition while police have taken up legal and medico formalities in this regard.

Inquest proceedings in this regard have been initiated, he said.

Hemant Soren, out on bail in money laundering case, takes oath as **Jharkhand CM**

JHARKHAND, Jul 5 (Agencies): Jharkhand Mukti Morcha executive president Hemant Soren, who is out on bail in a money laundering case, took oath as the Jharkhand chief minister at Raj Bhavan on Thursday.

Governor C.P. Radhakrishnan administered the oath and office of secrecy to Soren.

Earlier in the day, the JMM announced that Soren would take oath as the chief minister on July 7, following the governor's invitation to form government in the state. Later, the partyled coalition decided that Soren would take oath on Thursday.

Soren, along with a delegation of the JMM and its allies, met the governor at Raj Bhavan on Wednesday and staked claim to form government after his party colleague Champai Soren resigned as the chief minister.

Congress state unit president Rajesh Thakur, RJD minister Satyanand Bhokta and CPI(ML)-L MLA Vinod Singh were part of the

cies): A fresh batch of 6,900 pilgrims left for the cave shrine of Amarnath in south Kashmir Himalayas on Friday, officials said.

The eight batch of pilgrims left the Bhagwati-Nagar Yatri Niwas in 277 vehicles for the twin base camps of Baltal and Palagam at 3.45 am and were escorted by CRPF security personnel, they said.

While 4,377 pilgrims took the 48-km traditional Pahalgam route, 2,542

With this, a total of 44,441 pilgrims have left the Jammu base camp for the valley since June 28. The number of pilgrims who have paid obeisance

stands at 1.33,000. The 52-days yatra formally began from June 29 and will conclude on August 19.



"In continuation of NBEMS notice dated 22.06.2024, the conduct of NEET-PG 2024 examination has been rescheduled. It will now be conducted on August 11 in two shifts. The cutoff date for the purpose of eligibility to appear in the NEET-PG 2024 shall continue to be August 15,

2024," the Board said. The Union Health Ministry on June 22 postponed

the NEET-PG entrance examination, scheduled to be held on June 23, as a "precautionary measure" in the wake of allegations on the integrity of certain competitive

In fake encounter, former cop gets bail after 18 years in custody

SRINAGAR, Jul 5 (Agencies): The Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh High Court recently granted bail to a former policeman who was arrested in 2006 for murdering a man and then projecting him as a militant.

Justice Atul Sreedharan expressed shock over the fact the trial was yet to be completed, as it noted that out of the 72 witnesses, only 28 had been examined in the past seventeen years.

"This Court is astound[ed] by the facts of this case. This is a clear cut case of violation of Article 21 on account of delayed trial. The trial is delayed at the stage of prosecution witnesses. The State is unable to show how the delay could be attributed to the applicant," the judge said in the order dated July 3.

The 56-year-old accused, Bansi Lal moved the Court this year through his wife seeking bail.







Every third Indian has fatty liver; predates diabetes, metabolic disorders: Dr Jitendra

NEW DELHI, July 5: Every third Indian has fatty liver, which predates Type 2 Diabetes and other metabolic disorders, said Union Minister Dr Jitendra Singh who is himself a nationally renowned Diabetologist.

Union Minister Dr. Jitendra Singh launched Indo-French Liver and Metabolic Disease Network (InFLiMeN) a virtual node to prevent/cure metabolic liver diseases at Institute of Liver and Biliary Sciences Today in New Delhi.

Addressing the launch programme Dr. Jitendra Singh highlighted that the Indo-French Node, InFLiMeN, aims to address key issues related to a common metabolic liver disorder, non-alcoholic fatty liver disease (NAFLD), which can progress to cirrhosis and primary liver cancer eventually. It predates diabetes, hypertension, heart disease and many other diseases. As an endocrinologist myself, I understand the nuances of fatty liver and its relation with diabetes and other metabolic disor-

Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) for Science and Technology, Minister of State (Independent Charge) for Earth Sciences, MoS PMO, Department of Atomic Energy and Department of Space and MoS Personnel,

Public Grievances and Pensions Dr. Jitendra Singh said "Both the Indian subcontinent and Europe attributable to changes in lifestyle, diet and importantly metabolic syndromes such as diabetes and obesity has contributed to a significant rise in NAFLD." The Minister shared that nearly 1 in 3 Indians has fatty liver. While in the West most NAFLD is associated with obesity, intriguingly in the Indian subcontinent, NAFLD occurs in about 20% in

Emphasizing the vitality of this initiative the science and technology minister "There is a considerable burden of alcoholic liver disease (ALD) in India and France." He further added that both NAFLD and ALD exhibit a very similar progression from steatosis to steatohepatitis, cirrhosis and

non-obese patients.

HCC. Highlighting India's progress in the last decade in the health sector, Dr. Jitendra Singh said "India became a global leader not just in curative healthcare but also in preventive healthcare." There is an urgent need to develop simple low-cost diagnostic tests for the detection of different stages of fatty liver and their progression to severe full-blown diseases. The approaches and algorithms should suit the Indian context, low priced and point of care.

Dr. Jitendra Singh

advised that a joint multidisciplinary collaborative program like InFLiMeN is urgently needed to understand the development, progression and possible management of liver diseases using a comprehensive omics approach for biomarker discovery.

Emphasising on the cooperation and collaboration of both the Government and Private sector to provide best services to citizens and promote ease of healthy living. He also highlighted the government's initiatives and policies aimed at supporting and improving the healthcare system.

The Minister highlighted the need of generous funding for cutting-edge science. Expressed his belief that the virtual node would become a real node within a short span. He also assured that his departments would help the node in all possible manner. He also appreciated 'Department of Science and Technology' (DST) andIndo-French Centre for the Promotion of Advanced Research (CEFIPERA) for taking this novel approach proposed by ILBS.

The Minister congratulated Dr. Shiv K. Sarin and his team along with the French collaborators directed them to find remedies for the metabolic disorders in a low cost and high output manner. 11 French and 17 Indian doctors work jointly in this

Why New Delhi needs to take fresh look at Beijing

ith the Narendra Modi government having begun a fresh term last month, it is time for it to undertake a full-scale review of its policy towards the People's Republic of China. One only has to see the sordid happenings during its 2019-2024 second term. This included the Dragon's unilateral push to Delhi to the precipice, to show who's the real boss of Asia, especially South Asia.

The unilateralism shown by the post-1949 Communist Party of China and its overlord, Chairman Mao Zedong, has now rubbed off on his successors. Little wonder then that what Mao did to India in 1950s and 1962, Xi Jinping did to India in 2019-2024 with vengeance. History repeated itself in its ugliest form to hit the 21st century successors of India's first Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru (1947-1964).

Nehru, a liberal, had idealism and a vision, which regrettably led to his monumental China failure. It will be wrong, however, to look at Nehru's broad vision and policies only through the China prism, for he also had mega-successes which far outweigh the negativity. Just as non-violence was Mahatma Gandhi's path-breaking means to end British rule, "non-alignment" and "Panchsheel" were Nehru's enduring contributions to the world of diplomacy. India still follows this path with great elan, as seen by the world in the 28-month ongoing Russia-Ukraine war. So far, India has done very well; thanks to inherited wisdom of the professional mandarins of South Block, who have kept the ship of state steady, even in a rocky ambience of deceptive Chinese hostility and Western diplomatic irritants and pressure.

In dealing with China, one has to be prepared for more deception. Remember Mao's formula of "one step backward and two steps forward" when the situation so demands? Remember Deng Xiaoping's prescription once China started interacting with the world of foreign "barbarians" from its claustrophobic Forbidden City: "Hide your intent and bide your time"? Secretiveness is in the DNA of Chinese diplomacy. That is what needs to be effectively countered by India today.

The inflexibly bellicose Han dictator must be tackled upfront. As China now faces a robust pushback from the West and East on trade, import, export and military hotspots, out of sheer exasperation Xi Jinping was forced to quote Nehru's 1954 "Panchsheel" (Five Principles of Peaceful Co-existence) to influence the world, without of course giving Nehru due credit for coining those memorable words.

In India, two Chinese diplomats (the ambassador in Delhi and the consul-general in Kolkata) arrived in midst of the parliamentary election and straightway began a verbal charm-offensive to impress Indians and create a pro-China lobby. The idea was to put pressure on Indians -- to humble the enemy without a fight, through internal sabotage. The Chinese take their cue from India's history, where battles were lost to foreigners, with internal lobbyists ensuring victory for external foes.

One need not go into the myriad ways in which China has inflicted damage on India. The question is how India should re-orient its entire policy spectrum in order to counterbalance Han aggression. The Hans' psyche solely revolves around the Opium War (1839-1842) and subsequent events like the burning of

Royal Summer Palace (1860), Boxer Revolt (1898), and suppression by the "barbarians" (foreigners) of the "Son of Heaven" (Emperor) living in the opulent Forbidden City of Beijing

This "revenge factor" is deeply embedded in the psyche of 1.5 billion Chinese people. Let India not be bullied or get carried away by false hopes from outside and internal pressures mounted by China's lobbyists for their own private agenda, which may not necessarily benefit the 1.4 billion Indians.

Therefore, first insist on going back to India's territorial status quo ante of April-May 2020. This is absolutely non-negotiable. Inviolability and sovereignty of territory comes first and foremost for any nation-state. It's good that India's external affairs minister, at least, has been publicly harping on this for quite some time. Despite the parrot-like utterances of some of China's "wolf-warrior" diplomats, there can be no "business as usual" without a proper territorial resolution. Beijing is circulating a false narrative that "India and China have more convergence than divergence". This is nothing more than a backdoor device to open the gates for hordes of Chinese people to enter India for "business", which will only benefit Beijing. New Delhi must not fall into this trap, otherwise the leaders of today will face the harsh judgment of history, even worse than Nehru in 1962.

India-China bilateral trade is in shambles. The \$100 billion-plus deficit can't be wished away with a magic wand. The options are limited, and some hard decisions are needed. It's time to take action to prohibit through the commerce ministry the import of all non-essential goods from the Chinese, on which India's traders are making humongous profits by selling in the

domestic market at steep markups. Second, impose stiff tariffs on all Chinese imports. Then, impose nontariff barriers as well.

The WTO today is hardly in a position to deal with disputes between the "big boys". The United States imposed 100 per cent tariffs on Chinese-made electric vehicles. The European Union followed, with a maximum 38.4 per cent import duty. The entire West is trying to protect their domestic industry from brutal Chinese assault through cheap products. Let India recognise the harsh reality that the days of rampant globalization may be past. The monopoly-like Chinese juggernaut has taken on the entire West, and India is bound to be Dragon's next target.

The global pushback Beijing is facing is bad news for its economy. India must keep watch on the fast-unfolding scenario. Unfortunately, it has let itself become excessively dependent on cheap Chinese products and raw material. It's now heard that some Indian companies may "collapse" without "imported Chinese managers" running them. Truly bizarre! Have some people, in their over-enthusiasm to make money through any means, lost their mind? Can India be (mis)-guided by them?

It's time for South Block to crack the whip and ensure that the tentacles of the Chinese Dragon don't spread any further in this country. Just consider some facts. In a reply to a Parliament question in December 2022, the government had acknowledged that "nearly 3,560 companies in India have Chinese directors" and that "174 Chinese companies are registered in India". These need to be kept under close watch and acted upon, to ensure that India's self-interest is not compromised in any way.

After the fiasco over Neet leaks & NET row, what's the way forward?

The National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test (Neet) fiasco is becoming increasingly complex and contentious. Intense discussions and widespread protests are occurring on multiple fronts. In Parliament, heated debates are taking place, while on the legal front, petitions have been filed in the courts in several states. Meanwhile, the government is implementing mechanisms to investigate the issue and recommend remedial measures.

Politically, the issue has ignited sharp criticism and pertinent questions in Parliament. The Opposition leaders have demanded a detailed discussion, urging the Prime Minister to facilitate a debate as the issue impacts millions of hopeful students. Samajwadi Party MP Akhilesh Yadav has accused the government of fostering paper leaks. Rahul Gandhi's call for a debate deserves serious consideration. A thorough discussion on this critical issue is crucial for the nation. The government could improve its image by engaging in such a debate and showing commitment to addressing significant studentrelated problems. No system is perfect, but efforts must be made to rectify exposed flaws. The discussion should aim to identify loopholes and find solutions. The government must prioritise student welfare by allowing this discussion. Rhetoric alone is insufficient. Although President Droupadi Murmu did mention the issue in her address to the joint sitting of both Houses, and emphasised the government's commitment to a fair investigation, a debate in both Houses of Parliament would be a good starting point. Also, it is important not to dismiss the government's actions, such as replacing officials and postponing exams, as mere "cover-up" tactics. However, to restore faith in the system, the government must engage in a thorough discussion, as the nation deserves to know the truth.

On the legal front, aggrieved stu-

dents are seeking a fair resolution, but the path is fraught with challenges. Opinions are divided: some students advocate for a re-examination, while others are firmly opposed, and both sides have made some valid points. Cancelling the exam and ordering a retake would impose additional stress on students who genuinely prepared and performed well, subjecting them to further hardship. However, given the malpractices that compromised the exam's integrity, the results cannot be deemed valid for selecting candidates. This situation presents a classic Hegelian dilemma, where the courts must choose between two justifiable yet conflicting options. Deciding without causing harm to one party will be a difficult task for the judiciary.

On the other hand, student organisations like NSUI, AISF, and AISA are intensifying their protests. Their anger is natural and spontaneous. Interestingly, even the ABVP, affiliated with the ruling BJP, has raised concerns. Some organisations demand scrapping the National Testing Agency (NTA), while others have called for the Union education minister's resignation. While the minister's resignation might be seen as a political move, it is up to the minister to decide on moral grounds.

The call to disband the NTA is more significant due to its ongoing controversies. As the investigations continue, doubts about the exam's reliability and the NTA's role are only mounting. For instance, the retest results for 813 out of 1,563 candidates, where no one achieved full marks, highlight systemic corruption. This casts doubt on the NTA's practices since its inception in 2017 and questions past candidate selection. Sadly, public faith in the NTA is waning. An opinion poll showed only 18 per cent of 857 respondents have confidence in the NTA, while 77 per cent believe it should no longer conduct exams.

One of the major problems contributing to the NTA's current predicament is the overwhelming volume of work it has been assigned. A brand-new organisation with inadequate and underqualified staff to meet millions of aspirants' needs to compete in topnotch exams was a sure recipe for disaster. Lord Acton's words ring true: "Power corrupts, and absolute power corrupts absolutely." Such an outcome was almost inevitable. Compounding the issue, several officials responsible for maintaining the integrity of the exam process have also fallen prey to greed and corruption. The arrest of a school principal and district coordinator of Neet exams in Hazaribagh, Jharkhand, has further eroded public confidence.

The silver lining in these troubling events is the government's acknowledgment that not all is well with Neet and the NTA, prompting the initiation of reforms. A sevenmember expert committee, led by K. Radhakrishnan, former chairman of the Indian Space Research

Organisation (Isro), is expected to submit its recommendations in two months. While it is unlikely that the committee will recommend abolishing the NTA -- indicating the government's continued commitment to its "one nation, one exam" approach -- the focus will be on reforms in the examination process, improvements in data security protocols, and the overall structure and functioning of the NTA.

However, importantly, the committee should consider regional realities and the perspectives of state governments, many of which advocate for education to be returned to the State List from the Concurrent List. It is commendable that the committee has invited feedback from various stakeholders, but it would be worthwhile to include opinions from state representatives as well.

In this regard, closely examining the A.K. Rajan committee report on Neet could provide valuable insights for Dr Radhakrishnan and his team. The solutions proposed by the committee need to be enduring rather than mere knee-jerk reactions. Understanding the negative impacts of a centralised approach, its effects on different sections of society, and how a "one-size-fitsall" method undermines equality and social justice is absolutely essential. Any proposed solutions will likely be superficial and cosmetic without sincerely addressing these concerns in the recommendations. The committee's work must ensure that the reforms lead to substantial, long-lasting improvements in the examination system while simultaneously avoiding disparity and discrimination and ensuring fairness and equity to all.



Samantha Ruth Prabhu issues clarification on nebuliser post after backlash

Samantha Ruth Prabhu has issued a clarification after doctors slammed her for propagating dangerous medical practices. She recommended hydrogen peroxide nebulisation to treat viral infections and shared a picture of herself taking the treatment.

Her post caught the attention of Dr Cyriac Abby Philips aka "The Liver Doc". He said that this technique has adverse effects on health and slammed the actor, calling her "health and science illiterate".

Samantha's clarification

"Over the last couple of years, I've had to take many different types of medicines. I've tried everything I was strongly advised to take. As advised by highly qualified professionals and after doing as much self research as is possible for a lay person like me. "Many of these treat-

ments were also very very expensive. I would always keep thinking about how fortunate I am that I could afford it and about all those who cannot. And for the longest time, conventional treatments weren't making me better. There's a good chance it was just me and am sure they will work very well for others.

"These two factors led me to also read up on alternate therapies and treatments. And after trial and error, I found treatments that worked wonderfully for me. Treatments that also cost a fraction of what I was spending on conventional healthcare."

On Liver Doc's 'attack' She added, "I am not naive enough to go about strongly advocating a treatment. I merely suggested with good

intention because of all that I have faced and learnt in the last couple of years. Especially that treatments can be financially draining and many may not be able to afford them. End of the day, we all depend on educated doctors to guide us. This treatment was suggested to me by a highly qualified doctor who is an MD, who has served DRDO for 25 years. He, after all his education in conventional medicine, chose to advocate an alternate therapy.

"A certain gentleman has attacked my post and my intentions with rather strong words. Said gentleman is a Doctor too. I have no doubt that he knows more than I do. And I am quite sure his intentions were noble. It would have been kind and compassionate of him had he not been so provocative with his words.



Especially the bit where he suggests I should be thrown in prison. Never

mind. I suppose it goes with the territory of being a celebrity. I posted as

someone who needs medical treatments and not as a celebrity. And I certainly am not making any money from the post nor endorsing anyone. I was merely suggesting a treatment as an option after undergoing it myself, for others who may be looking for options because conventional medicine isn't working for them. Especially more affordable options."

On her medical ideas Samantha said it would have been better had The Liver Doc debated the same with her doctor rather than targeting her. "We cannot just give up when medicines aren't working. I certainly wasn't ready to give up... Coming back to the topic of the said gentleman Doctor, it would have been nice had he politely invited my Doctor, whom I have tagged in my post, rather

than go after me. I would have loved to have learnt from that debate and discussion between two highly qualified professionals.

"And as far as sharing information about the treatments that have helped my health, I shall be more careful as my intentions are only to help others. Not to harm anyone. I've had so many well meaning people suggesting ayurveda, homeopathy, acupuncture, Tibetan medicine, pranic healing etc. I heard them all out. I was merely doing something similar. Sharing something that worked for me, as an option. And I know many of us dealing with health issues need that help, especially given how overwhelming it is when every option has qualified people who are so certainly sure of their polar opposite

opinions. Both sides, for and against every treatment, are both so sure and persuasive. It's difficult to navigate these and find good help," she added.

In an interview with agency, Dr Rituja Ugalmugle, Internal Medicine, Wockhardt Hospitals, Mumbai, said, "Both hydrogen peroxide and distilled water nebulization come with potential risks. Hydrogen peroxide is generally not recommended for nebulization due to its potential to cause oxidative stress, mucosal irritation, and other serious respiratory issues. Distilled water, while safer than hydrogen peroxide, can still pose risks if used inappropriately. Normal saline remains the preferred choice for nebulization due to its safety profile and compatibility with the body's electrolyte balance."

India's defence production hits record high of nearly Rs 1.27 lakh crore in 2023-24: Defence Ministry

Defence exports also touched record high of Rs 21,083 crore in FY 2023-24, reflecting a growth of 32.5 per cent

NEW DELHI, Jul 5 (Agencies): India's annual defence production has hit a record high of approximately Rs 1.27 lakh crore in 2023-24, with the Make in India programme crossing new milestones, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh said on Friday.

The value of defence production in FY 2022-23 was Rs 1,08,684 crore, it added.

In a post on X, Singh also said that the government is committed to creating a more conducive regime for developing India as a leading global defence manufacturing hub.

"The Ministry of Defence has achieved the highest-ever growth in indigenous defence production in value terms during financial year (FY) 2023-24, on the back of successful implementation of the policies and initiatives of the government, led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, focussing on achieving 'Aatmanirbharta'," the defence ministry said in a statement on Friday.

The annual defence production has hit a record high of approximately Rs 1.27 lakh crore in 2023-24, it said.

"As per the data received



from all Defence Public Sector undertakings (DPSUs), other PSUs manufacturing defence items and private companies, the value of defence production in the country has gone up to a record-high figure, i.e., Rs 1,26,887 crore, reflecting a growth of 16.7 per cent over the defence production of the previous financial year," the statement said.

Singh congratulated the Indian industry, including defence public sector undertakings and other public sector undertakings manufacturing defence items, and the private industry for the feat.

"The Make in India programme is crossing new milestones, year after year, under the leadership of PM Shri @narendramodi," he

"India has registered the highest ever growth in the value of defence production in 2023-24. The value of production has reached to Rs. 1,26,887 crore in 2023-24 which is 16.8 per cent higher than the value of production of previous financial year," he wrote on X.

The Defence Ministry said that of "the total value of production (VoP) in 2023-24, about 79.2 per cent has been contributed by DPSUs/other PSUs and 20.8

per cent by the private sector".

The data shows that in terms of absolute value, both DPSUs/PSUs and private sector have recorded a steady growth in defence production, the statement said.

The feat has been achieved due to the policy reforms and initiatives and ease of doing business brought in by the government in the last 10 years with focus on attaining self-reliance, the ministry said.

"The indigenisation efforts have been pursued aggressively on a sustained basis, that resulted in the highest ever VoP. Moreover, the spiralling defence exports have contributed tremendously to the overall growth in the indigenous defence production," the statement said.

Defence exports touched a record high of Rs 21,083 crore in FY 2023-24, reflecting a growth of 32.5 per cent over the last fiscal when the figure was Rs 15,920 crore, it added.

In the last five years (since 2019-20), the value of defence production has been increasing steadily, and grown by over 60 per cent, the statement said and also shared year-wise data in this period.

Rahul Gandhi meets family members of stampede victims in Uttar Pradesh's Hathras



HATHRAS/ALIGARH (UP), Jul 5 (Agencies): Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi on Friday met the family members of the victims of the stampede that killed over 100 people in Uttar Pradesh's Hathras.

Before meeting family members in Hathras, Gandhi made a stop at Aligarh and met the kin of victims from the district.

Gandhi left from Delhi early morning on Friday by road for Hathras and was accompanied by state Congress chief Ajay Rai, state Congress in-charge Avinash Pande, party spokesperson Supriya Shrinate and other office bearers.

A total of 121 people,

mostly women, died in a stampede at self-styled godman Baba Bhole's satsang in Hathras on

In Aligarh, the Congress leader was seen interacting with the family members of the victims of the Hathras stampede.

Tuesday.

Rai told agency that Gandhi left Delhi around 5.10 am. He reached Pilakhna village in Aligarh around 7.15 am.

Earlier, Rai told agency that Rahul Gandhi will first make a condolence visit at Pilakhna in Aligarh and will later meet the families of the victims at Green Park and Vibhav Nagar near Navipur Khurd in Hath-

Monu, a family member of the deceased, when

asked about's Gandhi visit, said, "He also said that he will try his best to help (us), and will talk to the government as his party is not in power."

Khusboo, who had lost her mother, said that she would get help.

Another woman who lost her sister-in-law in the stampede told reporters, "He (Rahul Gandhi) told us that the (Congress) party will help us, and assured us help. He also inquired from us how it (the incident) took place."

She also said that there was laxity in treatment given to the victims, and added that they could have survived.

Congress MP from Saharanpur Imran Masood were also present where Gandhi met the families of victims.

The Uttar Pradesh government on Wednesday formed a three-member judicial commission headed by a retired high court judge to probe the Hathras tragedy, looking also into the possibility that a conspiracy was behind the stampede.

BJP flays TMC MP Mahua Moitra over her remarks against NCW chief

NEW DELHI, Jul 5 (Agencies): The BJP on Friday flayed TMC MP Mahua Moitra over her comments against NCW chief Rekha Sharma and demanded that she be "sacked" from her party.

This came a day after the TMC, commenting on a video posted on X showing the NCW chairperson's arrival at the site of a stampede that recently took place in Uttar Pradesh's Hathras, wrote, "She is too busy holding up her boss's pajamas".

Reacting sharply, BJP national spokesperson Shehzad Poonawalla termed Moitra's comment on the microblogging site as "extremely indecent, objectionable and shameful", and said this is the "true face" of the TMC and the opposition parties' INDIA bloc.

"MP Mahua Moitra who justified and remained silent during Sandeshkhali, Chopra Talibani flogging, silent on Swati Maliwal now makes a disgusting comment at a women that too the NCW Chief," he charged.

Posting a screenshot of Moitra's comment on X against the NCW chief, the BJP spokesperson demanded that she should be sacked by the TMC.

The BJP spokesperson also targeted the Congress and the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) over the TMC MP's comment and asked, "Will Priyanka Vadra, Rahul Gandhi, (Mallikarjun) Kharge ji, Sonia Gandhi, Priyanka Chaturvedi, AAP call this out?"

"Will Mamata Didi act on her? Nope, just like they remained silent on Sandeshkhali and (flogging of a couple) in Chopra (West Bengal)," he added.

CM Chandrababu Naidu meets FM Sitharaman, seeks financial aid for debt-ridden Andhra Pradesh

NEW DELHI, Jul 5 (Agencies): Ahead of the Union Budget presentation, Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu on Friday met Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman, pressing for enhanced financial support to the debt-burdened state.

Sources said Naidu, during the meeting in North Block, highlighted various ongoing projects in Andhra Pradesh that require urgent central assistance.

"The CM presented a detailed memorandum outlining the state's financial requirements and the rationale behind the demand for increased allocation," the sources added.

TDP ministers at the Centre were present during the meeting.

According to the state govern-



ment data, the public debt of Andhra Pradesh has increased from 31.02 per cent of the Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP) in 2019-20 to 33.32 per cent in 2023-24 fiscal, indicating deterioration in the fiscal health of the state in the last five years.

Key among Naidu's demands

were funds for the Polavaram irrigation project, special assistance for backward regions, and support for the development of the new capital, Amaravati.

The chief minister also sought resolution of pending issues stemming from the bifurcation of the erstwhile Andhra Pradesh.

The meeting assumes significance as it comes just weeks before the presentation of the Union Budget 2024-25.

The sources indicated that Sitharaman gave a patient hearing to Naidu's concerns and gave an assurance that she will look into Andhra Pradesh's demands within the broader fiscal constraints.

Naidu has been vocal about the state's financial distress and sought increased central support to tide over the fiscal challenges, when he met with Prime Minister Narendra Modi and several Union Ministers on Thursday.

The Naidu-led Telugu Desam Party is a crucial partner of the NDA with its 16 Lok Sabha MPs supporting the Narendra Modiled government.

'Education Ministry sabotaging education of children': Congress slams Centre over delay in publishing Class 6 textbooks

NEW DELHI, Jul 5 (Agencies): The Congress on Friday slammed the Centre over the delay in publishing new Class 6 textbooks, alleging the Education Ministry is "sabotaging" the education of children.

Congress general secretary Jairam Ramesh hit out at the government over the issue, saying that either the "rot runs deep", or the incompetence scales new heights everyday.

In a post on X, he said, "After sabotaging the examination process through the incompetent National Testing Authority, the non-biological PM's Education Ministry is sabotaging the education of our children."

"Even as the school year has begun, the NCERT - the National (read Nagpur) Council of Educational Research and Training - has failed to publish new textbooks for Science, Mathematics, and Social Sciences for Class 6 students," Ramesh said.

The textbooks themselves have not been finalised by the National Syllabus and Teaching Learning Material Committee (NSTC), he said. Ramesh pointed out

that printing will take another 10 to 15 days. Officials expect a delay of two months before they can make new books available to students, he claimed.

"Either the rot runs deep, or the incom-



petence scales new heights everyday!" Ramesh said.

His remarks come a day after Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan reviewed the development of school textbooks in accordance with the New Curriculum Framework (NCF) at a meeting here.

The meeting came in the backdrop of a delay in the publication of Class 6 textbooks that were supposed to be taught from April and are yet to hit the market.

The National Council for Educational Research and Training (NCERT) had earlier announced that new textbooks for Classes 3 and 6 will be introduced from the 2024-25 academic session.

"For the academic year 2024-25, new and engaging textbooks will be introduced in Classes

3 and 6. The textbook development work is in the final phase and nine textbooks for Grades 3 and 6 are already available. The remaining eight will be available very soon," a senior Ministry of Education (MoE) official said.

The NCERT had an initial aim of releasing the new textbooks based on the NCF 2023 only for Classes 3 and 6 this year. While the textbooks for Class 3 are available in the market, those for Class 6 have been delayed.

It was only this week that the NCERT released new English and Hindi textbooks for Class 6 in the middle of the academic session.

Man, two sons among 5 dead after inhaling suspected toxic gas inside well in Chhattisgarh's Janjgir-Champa

JANJGIR-CHAMPA, Jul 5 (Agencies): Five people, including a man and his two sons, died due to suspected inhalation of poisonous gas inside a well in Chhattisgarh's Janjgir-Champa district on Friday, police said.

The incident occurred in the morning in Kikirda village under the Birra police station area. A team from the State Disaster Response Force (SDRF) has been engaged to fish out the bodies from the well, they said.

The deceased have been identified as Ramchandra Jaiswal (60), Ramesh Patel (50), his two sons Rajendra Patel (20) and Jitendra Patel (25), and Tikeshwar Chandra (25), Inspector General of Police (Bilaspur Range) Sanjeev Shukla said.

As per preliminary information, Jaiswal entered the well on the premises of his house to take out a wooden strip after it fell into it. When he fainted, his wife shouted for help following which three others from the Patel family in the neighbourhood entered the water

body, he said.

When none came out, Chandra entered the well but he also became unconscious, prompting locals to alert the police, the official said.

The "ring" well appears to be deep and has water at the bottom. The SDRF team is trying to take out the bodies, another police official said.

Prima facie it seems that they died after inhaling some poisonous gas inside the well. However, a forensic team has reached the spot and the exact cause of death will be known once the bodies are retrieved from the well, he said, adding that a probe is

under way.
Chief Minister Vishnu Deo Sai expressed grief over the incident.

In a post in Hindi on X, CM Sai wrote, "The news of the death of 5 villagers in an accident in a well in Kikirda village of Janjgir is extremely tragic. I pray to God to rest the departed souls in peace and give strength to the bereaved families to bear this immense loss. Om Shanti."

Rajasthan family kills woman, burns her body for marrying against their wish

JHALAWAR, Jul 5 (Agencies): A 24-year-old woman in Rajasthan's Jhalawar was killed by her own family for marrying a man of her choice.

According to the details, the woman was abducted by her family members in front of her husband.

She was later killed, and her body was burnt at a cremation ground. Investigations into the case revealed the woman had married one Ravi Bheel against her family's wishes.

The couple stayed at different locations to escape the wrath of



their family members.

The woman was abducted after her family members received information that the couple would be visiting a bank in a Madhya Pradesh village.

Her body was burnt while her husband approached the police to

file a complaint.

The woman's body was more than 80 per cent burnt by the time the police reached the spot.

Her family members fled the spot. The woman's burnt remains were sent to the forensics for further investigation.

Keir Starmer to be new UK PM; Rishi Sunak says 'he's sorry for defeat'

A glum Sunak conceded defeat and said he had called Starmer to congratulate him on his victory.

LONDON, Jul 5 (Agencies): Keir Starmer vowed to bring change to Britain as its next prime minister after his Labour Party surged to a landslide victory in a parliamentary election on Friday, ending 14 years of often tumultuous Conservative government.

The centre-left Labour won a massive majority in the 650seat parliament with Rishi Sunak's Conservatives suffering the worst performance in the party's long history as voters punished them for a cost of living crisis, failing public services, and a series of scan-

"We did it," Starmer said in a victory speech. "Change begins now ... We said we would end the chaos, and we will, we said we would turn the page, and we have. Today, we start the next chapter, begin the work of change, the mission of national renewal and start to rebuild our country." With about a dozen results still to come, Labour had won 410 seats, the Conservatives 117 and the centrist Liberal Democrats 70 - their best ever performance.

About 250 Conservative lawmakers were ousted in the crushing defeat, including a record number of senior ministers and former Prime Minister

A glum Sunak conceded defeat and said he had called Starmer to congratulate him on his victory.

"Today power will change hands in a peaceful and orderly manner, with goodwill on all sides," Sunak said. "There is much to learn and reflect on and I take responsibility for the loss to the many good hardworking Conservative candidates ... I am

Despite his convincing victory, polls have suggested there is little enthusiasm for Starmer or his party. Thanks to the quirk of Britain's first past the post system. Labour's triumph looked set to be achieved with



fewer votes than in both 2017 and 2019 - the latter its worst electoral showing for 84 years.

Starmer also comes to power at a time when the country is facing a series of daunting chal-

Britain's tax burden is set to hit its highest since just after World War Two, net debt is almost equivalent to annual economic output, living standards have fallen, and public services are creaking, especially the much cherished National Health Service which has been dogged by

He has already had to scale back some of Labour's more ambitious plans, such as its flagship green spending pledges, while he has promised not to raise taxes for "working people".

"I don't promise you it will be easy," Starmer said.

"Changing a country is not like flicking a switch. It's hard work. Patient, determined, work, and we will have to get moving immediately."

RISE OF REFORM

Much of the heavy damage to the Conservative support was inflicted by the right-wing Reform UK party, headed by Brexit campaigner Nigel Farage, who had campaigned strongly on curbing immigration.

Starmer has promised to scrap the Conservative's controversial policy of sending asylum seekers to Rwanda, but with migration a key electoral issue, he will be under pressure himself to find a way to stop tens of thousands of people arriving across

the Channel from France on

small boats.

Within the Conservative Party, the recriminations and debate over its future direction began immediately, with some saying its failure stemmed from abandoning the centre ground while others argued Reform had won over voters who felt the party had deserted its roots.

Reform has captured four seats, with Farage himself finally being elected to parliament at his eighth attempt, and won more than 4 million votes, often taking more than the Conservatives across swathes of the country.

"There is a massive gap on the centre right of British politics and my job is to fill it, and that's exactly what I'm going to do," a triumphant Farage said. "Believe me folks, this is just the first step of something that is going to stun all of you.

The growth in support for a right-wing alternative echoed recent similar results in Europe, where the far right have been surging.

But, unlike France where Marine Le Pen's National Rally party made historic gains in an election last Sunday, overall the British public has plumped for a centre-left party to bring about change.

Starmer has promised to improve relations with the European Union to resolve issues created by Britain's split from

However, despite opposing Brexit, rejoining the EU is not on the table.

He may also have to work with Donald Trump in the United States if he wins November's presidential election. Trump has already sent congratulations to his friend and supporter Farage, via his social media platform Truth Social.

While he has promised to bring change domestically, Starmer has vowed to continue London's unequivocal support for Ukraine in its war against Russia. On many foreign issues, his policies are similar to Sunak's.

TURNAROUND

The election victory represents an incredible turnaround for Starmer and Labour, which critics and supporters said was facing an existential crisis just three years ago when it appeared to have lost its way after its 2019 drubbing.

A series of Conservative scandals - most notably revelations of parties in Downing Street during COVID lockdowns - undermined then prime minister Boris Johnson and its commanding poll lead evaporated.

Truss' disastrous six-week premiership, which followed Johnson being forced out at the end of 2022, cemented the decline, and Sunak was unable to make any dent in Labour's now commanding poll lead.

Sunak stunned Westminster and many in his own party by calling the election earlier than he needed to while trailing badly in the polls, and his campaign then proved a disaster.

"We deserved to lose. The Conservative Party just appears exhausted and out of ideas," Ed Costello, the chairman of the Grassroots Conservatives organisation, which represents rank-and-file members, told agency.

"But it is not all Rishi Sunak's fault. It is Boris Johnson and Liz Truss that have led the party to disaster. Rishi Sunak is just the fall guy.

Iran votes in Presidential runoff amidst public apathy, regional tensions



DUBAI, Jul 5 (Agencies): Iranians began voting Friday in a runoff election to replace the late President Ebrahim Raisi, killed in a helicopter crash last month, as public apathy has become pervasive in the Islamic Republic after years of economic woes, mass protests and tensions in the Middle East.

Voters face a choice between the hard-line former nuclear negotiator Saeed Jalili and Masoud Pezeshkian, a heart surgeon and longtime parliament member who has allied himself with moderates and reformists within Iran's Shiite theocracy.

An initial round of voting on June 28 saw no candidate get over 50% of the vote, forcing the runoff. It also saw the lowest turnout ever for an Iranian election, leaving turnout Friday a major

There have been calls for a boycott, including from imprisoned Nobel Peace Prize laureate Narges Mohammadi, though potential voters in Iran appear to have made the decision not to participate last week on their own as there's no widely accepted opposition movement operating within or outside of the country.

State television broadcast images of modest lines at select polling places around the country as polls opened

As has been the case since the 1979 Islamic Revolution, women and those calling for radical change have been barred from the ballot while the vote itself will have no oversight from internationally recognized monitors.

The voting comes as wider tensions have gripped the Middle East over the Israel-Hamas war in the Gaza Strip. In April, Iran launched its first-ever direct attack on Israel over the war in Gaza, while militia groups that Tehran arms in the region — such as the Lebanese Hezbollah and Yemen's Houthi rebels - are engaged in the fighting and have escalated their attacks.

Meanwhile, Iran continues to enrich uranium at near weapons-grade levels and maintains a stockpile large enough to build — should it choose to do so — several nuclear weapons. Its 2015 nuclear deal with world powers. reached by officials now backing

Pakistan's Punjab to ban social media platforms for

Pezeshkian, collapsed in 2018 after then-President Donald Trump unilaterally withdrew America from the accord. In the time since hard-liners have taken control of all levers of power within Iran's government.

While Iran's 85-year-old Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei has the final say on all matters of state, presidents can bend the country's policies toward confrontation or negotiation with the West.

Interior Minister Ahmad Vahidi, who is in charge of overseeing the election, announced all the polls had opened at 8 a.m. local time.

Khamenei cast one of the election's first votes from his residence, and television cameras and photographers captured him dropping the ballot into the box.

"I have heard that people's enthusiasm is more than before," Khamenei said. "God willing, people vote and choose the best" candidate.

However, Khamenei on Wednesday said that those who didn't vote last week weren't against the country's Shiite theocracy.

"There are reasons behind this matter which should be examined by sociologists and those involved in poli-

tics," he said. More than 61 million Iranians over the age of 18 are eligible to vote, with about 18 million of them between 18 to 30. Elections are scheduled to end at 6 p.m. local but traditionally get extend-

ed until midnight to boost participation. Friday's election marks only Iran's second presidential runoff since 1979. The first came in 2005 when hard-liner Mahmoud Ahmadinejad bested former President Akbar Hashemi Rafsanjani. Under Ahmadinejad, Iran faced international sanctions over its advancing nuclear program, as well as the 2009 Green Movement protests and the crackdown that smashed them.

Pezeshkian's supporters have been warning Jalili will bring a "Taliban"style government into Tehran, while Jalili has criticised Pezeshkian for running a campaign of fear-mongering.

The 63-year-old Raisi died in the May 19 helicopter crash that also killed the country's foreign minister and others. He was seen as a protege of Khamenei and a potential successor as supreme leader. Still, many knew him for his involvement in the mass executions that Iran conducted in 1988, and for his role in the bloody crackdowns on dissent that followed protests over the 2022 death of Mahsa Amini, a young woman detained by police over allegedly improperly wearing the mandatory headscarf, or hijab.

Liz Truss, former UK Prime Minister, loses her seat in general elections

LONDON, Jul 5 (Agencies): Former British prime minister Liz Truss, who became the country's shortest-serving leader ever when she sparked a bond market meltdown and a collapse in sterling, lost her parliamentary seat in the election on Friday. Truss secured 11,217

votes in her South West Norfolk constituency in eastern England, behind 11,847 votes for Labour candidate Terry Jermy.

Taking over from the scandal-ridden premiership of Boris Johnson, Truss, 48, was forced to announce her resignation after just 44 days when her unfunded tax



cuts sparked financial market turmoil, raising the cost of mortgages for homeowners already in the middle of a costof-living crisis.

Lampooned in the media - one tabloid newspaper asked in the dying days of her premiership whether she

would last longer than a supermarket lettuce - Truss had become synonymous for many voters with the chaos and failures of Conser-

> vative government. She has, however, remained an influential voice among right-wing lawmakers in the party.

6 days during Muharram to control 'hate material' LAHORE. Jul 5

(Agencies): After blocking X, formerly Twitter, for over four months, the government in Pakistan's Punjab province is now set to ban all social media platforms -- YouTube, WhatsApp, Facebook, Instagram and TikTok -- for six days between July 13 and 18, citing the need to control "hate material" during the Islamic month of Muharram.

Chief Minister Marvam Nawaz's cabinet committee on law and order has recommended banning of all social media platforms -- YouTube, X, WhatsApp, Facebook, Instagram, and



TikTok, among others -- during 6th to 11th day of Muharram (July 13-18) in Punjab, a province of over 120 million people, to "control hate

material, misinformation to avoid sectarian violence", according to a notification issued here late Thursday night.

The Punjab govern-

ment of Maryam Nawaz has also requested her uncle Shehbaz Sharif's government at the Centre to notify the suspension of all social media platforms on internet for six days (July 13-18).

Pakistan Army Chief Gen Asim Munir has already declared social media a "vicious media" and underscored the need to fight what he called "digital terrorism".

Pakistan's Deputy Prime Minister Ishaq Dar, who also holds the portfolio of foreign minister, recently called for placing a complete ban on social media.

The Shehbaz govern-

ment had shut down X in last February following allegations of change of general election results by the Election Commission of Pakistan, apparently on the order of the military establishment to stop Pakistan Tehreeki-Insaf's jailed founder Imran Khan from coming to power.

Both the military and the government were receiving backlash on social media since the ouster of former prime minister Imran Khan through a no-confidence motion in April 2022.

The government has arrested dozens of social media activists of Khan's party since then.

Taiwan Urges China To Avoid Escalation Amid Renewed Military Activity

TAIPEI, Jul 5 (Agencies): Taiwan on Friday reported renewed Chinese military activity nearby with another "combat patrol" as the government called on Beijing not to escalate tensions after the seizure of a Taiwanese fishing boat.

China, which views democratically governed Taiwan as its own territory, has stepped up its pressure over the past four years, both militarily and politically.

On Tuesday, Chinese officials boarded and detained a Taiwanese fishing boat for ille-

gally operating in the country's waters, in what a senior Taiwan official said may be an act of psychological warfare.

Taiwan's defence ministry said that starting just before 7 a.m. (2300 GMT) on Friday, it had detected 26 Chinese military aircraft, including J-16 fighters, carrying out a "joint combat readiness patrol" with Chinese warships.

The Chinese aircraft flew into airspace to the north, centre and southern part of Taiwan, the ministry said.

Taiwan has detected at least

127 Chinese military aircraft operating near the island since the start of this month.

China's defence ministry did not immediately respond to a request for comment.

Speaking to reporters earlier on Friday, Taiwan Premier Cho Jung-tai said fishermen should raise their alert level and not do anything that could be considered illegal.

"At the same time, I also want to ask the Chinese side not to escalate with any the use of any excessive measures, because this can easily cause tension and unnecessary confrontation which is extremely unnecessary," he added.

China says the root cause of its problems with Taiwan is what Beijing views as the "separatist" views of new President Lai Ching-te.

China staged war games shortly after Lai took office in May, and has rebuffed his repeated calls for talks.

Lai rejects China's sovereignty claims, saying only Taiwan's people can decide their future.

Nestle's French Unit Faces Charges In Pizza Contamination Case



PARIS, Jul 5 (Agencies): Nestle's French subsidiary has been charged in a case involving contaminated pizzas that are sus-

pected of having led to

the death of two children, the company said Friday.

The unit that manages the factory in the north of France that made the Buitoni-branded pizzas

as well as Nestle France were indicted this week, the company said in a statement, without providing details of the charges.

French investigative magistrates opened a probe in May 2022 for involuntary manslaughter and unintentional injuries after several customers fell sick from eating pizzas containing E.coli bacteria.

For taking oath, Rashid was granted a twohour custody parole, excluding the travel time from Tihar to Parliament, and Singh a fourday custody parole, beginning July 5, in view of the travel from Assam to Delhi and back.

Their parole orders stated that during their period of temporary release, they can neither speak to or address the media on anv issue or make any statements. Their family members also cannot make a statement in

any form of media. While Singh, a Khalistani sympathiser who heads the 'Waris Punjab De' outfit, has been allowed to meet his family in Delhi. Rashid's family had permission only to attend his oath taking. The parole for Rashid, who has been in jail since 2019 after his arrest in 2017, was granted by a court in Delhi and that of Singh by the district magistrate of Amritsar from where he was arrested in April 2023 for barging into a police station in February and clashing with police personnel in a bid to free

one of his aides from custody.

Both Singh and Rashid are to be accompanied by security personnel at all times during

their parole periods, the orders stated. The Delhi Police and Punjab Police were directed to coordinate with the secretary general of the Lok Sabha for procedures inside the Parliament complex.

The name of Rashid, a former MLA, cropped up during the investigation of Kashmiri businessman Zahoor Watali, who the NIA had arrested for allegedly funding terrorist groups and separatists in the Kashmir

The NIA had filed a charge sheet against several individuals, including Kashmiri separatist leader Yasin Malik, Lashkar-e-Taiba founder Hafiz Saeed and Hizbul Mujahideen chief Syed Salahuddin in the case. Malik was awarded life imprisonment by a trial court in 2022 after he pleaded guilty to the charges. Singh styled himself after slain Khalistani militant Jarnail Singh Bhindranwale and is in jail along with nine of his associates under the National Security Act.

NEW DELHI, July 5 (Agencies): Microblogging and social networking service Koo, which was touted as a desi alternative to X (Twitter), recently announced that it is was discontinuing its services

Co-founded by entrepreneurs Aprameya Radhakrishna and Mayank Bidawatka, Koo was launched in 2020 amid much fanfare and gained quick fame in the wake of a standoff between the Union government and X (then Twitter) over the platform's refusal to remove certain contents and block certain accounts. A slew of cabinet ministers, BJP leaders and Bollywood celebrities then joined Koo, giving the platform a much-needed push and increased visibility.

However, four years after it was launched, the founders announced that



they were shutting down Koo. The founders were forced to shut down the platform due to the funding winter. According to them, they needed five to six years of aggressive, long term and patient capital to make Koo a huge success.

Despite winning the 'Atmanirbhar Bharat App Innovation Challenge' in the Social category in 2020, and being ranked among the top 3 social media products in the

Asia-Pacific (APAC) region, Kood had been assailed by funding troubles. The company was forced to lay off 30 per cent of its workforce in April 2023 amid the fund

"It takes a lot to euthanize something you built with so much love," the founders said in a Linkedln post, adding, "may be next time". They said they can and they will try to challenge global giants at their game.

According to the found-

ers, they explored partnerships with multiple large internet companies, conglomerates and media houses, but these talks did not yield the desired results.

They said most of these organisations did not want to deal with usergenerated content and the wild nature of a social media company.'

"While we would've liked to keep the app running, the cost of technology services to keep a social media app running is high and we've had to take this tough decision," they

They claimed that they were just months away from beating X in India in 2022 and "could have doubled down on that short term goal" if they had enough funding. The founders said they were hit by a prolonged fund-

ing winter, forcing them to tone down on their growth trajectory.

Koo could have become successful internationally if the market was favourable and they had enough funds.

"The funding winter got the better of us," they

"Social media is probably one of the toughest companies to build even with all resources available as you need to grow users to a significant scale before one thinks of of revenue," they said.

The founders said they intended to democratize expression and help people connect with each other in their local languages, and built a product that was globally scalable in a fraction of the time that X did. They noted that X had superior systems algorithms and strong stakeholder-first philosophies.

He outlined the extensive campaign, which will involve planting various types of saplings across village panchayats, municipal bodies, parks, alongside roads, and in vacant spaces.

Tariff hikes on Chinese goods and Red Sea crisis are fuelling container shortages, impacting exporters

NEW DELHI, July 5 (Agencies): As European Union's 37.6 per cent tariffs on imports of Chinese Electric Vehicles (EVs) kick in from Friday, barely a month before US tariffs are slated to come into effect, India exporters as well as traders globally are hit by unprecedented container shortages.

At a review meeting in the Commerce Ministry last month, exporters brought up concerns of a sudden shortage of containers, pointing at structural weakness that has been hurting Indian goods exports since the COVID-19 pandemic.

Shortages have also resurfaced as voyage time of ships has increased amid the ongoing Red Sea crisis and fresh trade tensions between the US and China. The Indian Express explains why Indian exporters are facing repeated shortages of basic infrastructure for trade

Indian exporters are finding fewer containers for exports amid an increased demand for the steel boxes. This is primarily on account of the demand from Chinese exporters in the backdrop of fresh US and EU tariffs on products from China. In order to beat the steep US and EU tariffs, which in case of the US go up to as high as 100 per cent on Electric Vehicles (EVs) and 50 per cent on semiconductors that are set to come into effect on August 1, exporters are scrambling to ship as many items as possible. Due to the scale of trade between the US and China, container demand has gone up leaving Indian exporters with fewer containers for exports. This has added to the already short supply due to the Red Sea crisis.

The Red Sea ship-

ping route is still under blockade amid neardaily attacks targeting commercial vessels by Yemen's Houthi rebels that has slashed traffic through the route by 90 per cent compared to December last year as per US Defence Intelligence Agency report. Last month, a bulk carrier reportedly sank indicating escalation of tensions in the crucial maritime route. This has resulted in more ships taking the longer route via the Cape of Good Hope route and spending more time on the sea blocking a higher number of containers for reuse. The Red Sea crisis has also increased port congestion. Reuters reported that global port congestion has reached an 18-month high, with 60 per cent of ships waiting at anchor located in

Tariffs hikes have been a part and parcel of trade between the US and China for several years, especially beginning in the Donald Trump administration but shipping routes and containers did not have the impact as they are seen this time. One reason is that the US under Joe Biden not only kept the Trump era tariffs unchanged, he has targeted EV, the fastest growing traded item as per World Trade Organization (WTO). This urgency is displayed by Chinese traders also in the backdrop of significant over capacity of EV items in China. But China is set to lose out on two major markets: the US and the European Union. To make matters worse, Canada is also mulling higher duty on Chinese EVs. Indonesia has also announced an import tariff of up to 200 percent on a range of Chinese goods.

While the reasons for

the ongoing container crunch may be different this time around, the root cause of such repeated concerns is India's limited capacity for container manufacturing and complete dependance on China for the steel boxes crucial for global goods trade. China is the largest exporter of containers and makes up for 95 per cent of the large steel boxes production globallv. Much of the container manufacturing in China is done by a handful of highly subsidized state owned enterprises that has sparked security concerns in the US, EU as well as in India. Realizing high dependence on China for crucial port operation calls for domestic manufacturing of containers began after COVID-19. The US has initiated plans to de-risk its ports from over reliance on Chinese containers and cranes. India also began production after 2021.

The Indian Express had reported in 2021 that state-owned wagon manufacturer Braithwaite, and engineering major **Bharat Heavy Electricals** Limited had received an order from Container Corporation of India (CONCOR) to develop and produce 1000 containers each.

The digital transformation of India's kiranas: What next?

NEW DELHI, July 5 (Agencies): Local neighbourhood stores (momand-pop stores) have always been an important hub for community exchanges in India. With nearly 1.5 crore corner stores, locally known as Kiranas, across the country, they account for about three-fourths of India's consumer goods market as per various estimates. Local stores, often family-run, are a haven for Indian shoppers as they meet their emergency, fill-in, and stock-up requirements. They also evoke a sense of nostalgia and a yearning for familiarity.

Until a few years ago, and even today, a standard local store would be cramped with endless assortment of consumer goods. The store manager would pull down the shutters sharply at midnight and, after that, spend hours tallying the day's sales scribbled in his khata, or ledger. But things have changed, it is not uncommon to see pencils from the back of the ear disappear and compact POS machines taking their place; handwritten receipts are quickly giving way to printed ones and digital notifications.

When the pandemic hit, the world around us turned upside down. Amidst on-ground restrictions, a lot of shutters were down, but a transition was at work with lakhs of local stores thinking of going digital-by selling online or taking orders on social media apps, organising deliveries and taking payments through digital instruments. We saw tens of thousands of local stores from across India come online on Amazon to sustain and grow their business and they continue to do so. While many may have hesitated to pivot from the conventional ways of business at first, the situation accelerated a shift that would have arrived

In parallel, the digital payments landscape has undergone a dramatic transformation. The Unified Payments Interface (UPI) has been a game-changer for digital payments in India and a precedentsetting innovation for the global fintech sector. According to the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI), UPI transactions hit a staggering Rs 18.41 lakh crore in January 2024, marking a 42 per cent increase



year-on-year. In 2023, the platform saw 11,765 crore transactions worth Rs 182.25 lakh crore. reflecting a 59 per cent increase in volume and 45 per cent in value compared to 2022. The way customers

shop and make shopping decisions has also transformed dramatically. They expect a seamless transition from one channel to the other with an experience that is personalised for them. To address this evolving customer behaviour local stores—big and small—are already looking at a range of tech solutions. The government and other stakeholders are helping create an enabling ecosystem for technology adoption by local stores. By paying closer attention to customer behaviour. local stores can use digital tools to craft strategies that better cater to growing customer needs. And this is by no means a question of offline vs online. It is about the digitisation of dukaans in a way that they can oper-

ate across channels. While the benefits of digitisation for local stores are well documented, the need to mesh physical experience with digital convenience cannot be exaggerated. Strengthening all customer touchpoints and breaking geographical barriers will help retailers meaningfully connect with customers, forge lasting relationships to build customer loyalty, and acquire new customers. By investing in systems where customers can order via the Internet, social media, or through an app, local stores can provide their customers with multiple avenues to return.

I was at a couple of retail industry events recently, and interestingly, the question on how to create the best strategies to serve customers in the world of online and offline in both the forums had the same answer – a combination of the two.

The government of India has set a vision

of India becoming a \$1 trillion digital economy by 2030. The retail sector itself is pegged to double to \$2 trillion in the next 8-10 years and notably, a lot of this growth will be powered by digitisation, whether it is e-commerce or integration of technology in stores. This means that local stores will need to be equipped to leverage technology and turn it into actionable insights.

Ultimately, it will be all about delivering better customer experiences To help local stores trade confidently, there are ready-to-roll tech solutions available for inventory procurement, inventory management, credit access, payments, etc. They can choose to invest in either one or a host of these tech solutions to better manage cash flow. Many store owners have already taken the first step towards digitisation by adopting UPI or digital

So what next? Local stores must think holistically about their digital transformation journey. They can start by identifying business functions that have significant pain points that are critical for their survival and growth. While going online can be the starting point, focusing on emotional intelligence, and investing in plug-and-play tech can help them identify and solve customer concerns. These stores have the advantage of knowing their customers more deeply, and if they leverage technology to serve their customers and grow their business more, that will perhaps be the secret sauce.

In a nation of shopkeepers, local stores are the true unsung heroes of the Indian neighbourhood. To lean into the brave new world of digitisation, the customers will still be centre stage, and so will embracing technology. The big lesson? Think seamless customer experience, adopt digitisation.

"This (crowd) tells that the desperation we had to win was similar to the desperation which the fans had. The win has brought smiles on faces of crores of people. This is a special team and this trophy belongs to the nation," Rohit said while addressing the fans



inside the stadium. Emotions run high Virat Kohli revealed to the packed Wankhede crowd that

he had never seen Rohit show "so much emotion" in their decade-and-a-half old association till the India captain hugged

him with welled-up eyes after the T20 World Cup triumph.

"This is the first time in 15 years that I have seen Rohit show so much emotion. When we were climbing those steps (at Kensington Oval) he was crying and I was crying," Kohli

On this very ground, a 21-yearold Kohli had seen Sachin Tendulkar, Harbhajan Singh and Yuvraj Singh teary-eyed and soaked in emotions after winning the 2011 World Cup. "I couldn't connect with the emotions of the senior players who cried that night but now I do," he said.

Earlier, the team could only fly from New Delhi around 3:40pm after their meeting with the PM. The Wankhede Stadium here was thrown open to fans, who filled up the stands within minutes to celebrate the team's title

After landing in the city, their aircraft got the famous 'Water Salute' at the Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj International Airport's Terminal 2.

The players walked out of the airport with a horde of fans and media waiting for them for several hours

Even as the euphoria of T20 World Cup triumph sweeps through the length and breadth of India, Shubman Gill, who was a reserve in that squad, will hit a refresh button along with a bunch of IPL performers.

All the fresh faces are expected to make their international debut during the series scheduled to be played entirely in the Zimbabwean capital

Two young men, who are lined for debut could be Punjab's Abhishek Sharma, who had a stupendous IPL for Sunrisers Hyderabad and the young Assamese lad Riyan Parag, who has given ample demonstration of his capabilities as a competent T20 batter.

Both of them tick all the boxes for this format.

While over the past few years, Rohit and Kohli have skipped a lot of bilateral series. especially in the shortest format, their international retirement from the format is bound to be felt more strongly. The skills and qual-

ity that the two modern greats brought to the table will be hard to replicate but as it is the order of nature, the old guard has to make way for the new one. Zimbabwe certainly

isn't the most formidable opposition but in T20 format, the gulf between sides is comparatively lesser than the other two traditional forms of the game.

The hosts, led by the gutsy Sikandar Raza, who played for Punjab Kings in the IPL recently, could prove to be a handful on nippy afternoons at the Harare Sports Club where the ball will jag around during the afternoon starts.

Some solid performances in this series will keep these youngsters



in contention for future when the first team players of the world champion side are back on national duty.

Shivam Dube, Sanju Samson, and Yashasvi Jaiswal will be available from the third match onwards and some of the young men would only get a couple of games to prove their

In future, the likes of T20 captain-in-waiting Hardik Pandya, his likely deputy Suryakumar Yadav, Rishabh Pant, Axar Patel, Arshdeep Singh and Kuldeep Yadav will also be back playing the format.

In case Abhishek opens, Gaikwad could come in at number three or swap positions with the Punjab southpaw. Parag's chances of a debut are brighter compared to Abhishek as he can bat at num in the first match, a slot he made his own for the Royals.

Rinku Singh, the designated finisher of the Indian T20 team for years to come, is expected to arrive at number five in this new look line-up while one among Jitesh Sharma or Dhruv Jurel will bat at number six while donning the big gloves.

If one looks at selection pattern, Jurel was the second keeper behind Sanju Samson for this series and Jitesh was a late entrant because of the unavailability of the World Cup squad members.

Hence Jurel, who made an impressive Test debut against England is likely play in the first two games before Samson arrives.

JAMMU, July 5: Expressing grave concern over the perpetual power and drinking water crisis in Jammu, especially during the summer months, Provincial Joint Secretary, JKNC Ankush Abrol on Friday called for creating a universal approach and administrative plan to meet the crisis like situation that keeps disrupting normal life time and again. He was addressing

a meeting at Old Janipur Ward No 34 where scores of youth joined NC. The meeting was organized by Rajinder Kumar.

Ankush Abrol alleged that state Administration has completely failed to provide drinking water and power to Jammu Kashmir especially in Jammu Municipal Corporation areas like Tali Morh, Rehari, Sarwal, New Plot, Subash Nagar, Paloura, Janipur, Roop Nagar, Muthi, Bantalab, Gandhi Nagar, Bahu Fort, Trikuta Nagar and



Nanak Nagar.

The people are getting drinking water after three four days and also facing unprecedented and unscheduled power cuts in this scorching heat. It is unfortunate people are facing hardships and there is nobody who listens to them.

He said that short-term and adhoc strategies were not enough to surmount the problem and the government must come up with a pragmatic plan for tackling the issues, put this in public domain, seek suggestions of stakeholders and implement it on a war footing basis, as these basic utility services are of paramount importance for the public.

the power and drinking water irritants are more pronounced and frequent in the semi urban and rural areas of the Jammu region, which have not been addressed so far.
