

Soldier injured in firing incident in Rajouri

JAMMU, Jul 7 (Agencies): A soldier was injured in a firing incident in Rajouri district, official sources said on

They said the incident took place near army camp in Manjakot area of the district during wee hours.

Initial reports, they said, also suggest that it was militant attack on the army camp which was prevented by alert sentry who retaliated, forcing the militants to run away.

They said a soldier was injured in the attack and subsequently shifted to hospital.

However, there was no official word so far about the incident. The army and Police have launched a manhunt to trace the attackers who are believed to have escaped via thick forest area in the area. More details are awaited.

Dumper hits 7 vehicles on JK **National** Highway

JAMMU, Jul 7 (Agencies): At least seven vehicles were damaged after being hit by an overspeeding dumper national highway early Sunday, police said.

No one was injured in the incident which took place near Kunfar on the busy road, they

The officials said the dumper was coming from the Jammu side when its driver lost control apparently due to overspeeding and hit seven vehicles before coming to a halt.

A section of the highway remained closed for traffic for over an hour following the accident, they said, adding police have registered a case and further investigation is on.

'Jobless Growth' | Congress slams govt over 'Accentuated Unemployment Crisis'



NEW DELHI, Jul 7 (Agencies): The Congress on Sunday alleged that the Modi Government had accentuated India's "unemployment crisis" with the decimation of job-creating MSMEs through the "Tughlakian demonetisation, a hastily rushed GST, and rising imports from China".

In a statement, Congress general secretary, in charge of communications, Jairam Ramesh cited a new report by


Citigroup, a global bank, to flag "alarming numbers", which he claimed confirmed what the Conaress stated throughout the recent election campaign.

"The Indian National Congress has been sounding the alarm on India's unemployment crisis for the past five years at least. The crisis has been accentuated with the decimation of job-creating MSMEs through the 'Tughlakian demonetisation, a hastily rushed through GST, and rising imports from China," Ramesh said.

"With his economic policies that favour only large conglomerates, the non-biological prime minister has created India's highest unemployment rate in 45 years, with the unemployment rate for graduate youth at 42 per cent," he said.

Ramesh shared highlights of the report which stated that India must create 1.2 crore jobs per year for the next 10 years to employ our youth.

"Even 7 per cent GDP growth will not create enough jobs for our youth - under the nonbiological PM's Government, we have averaged just 5.8 per cent GDP growth. The failing Modi

SOLAR ENERGY

ncreasing global warming and pollution day by day has forced people to think about the alternatives of nonrenewable sources of energy like petrol diesel and electricity. The government has recently prepared a plan till 2070, in which the use of solar energy and other renewable energy sources has been emphasized.

With a population of close to 1.4 billion and a fast-growing economy with huge potential for growth, India's energy mix in future years will be critical to the world's and India's climate action goals. India is already the third largest energy consuming economy after China and the United States.

In this situation, supplying energy to such a huge population is nothing less than a huge challenge. No country can supply uninterrupted power supply to 1.4 billion people, in this situation the need for solar energy becomes essential.

India is facing many problems in meeting its energy demand, solar energy can play an important role in providing energy security. The pollution-free nature of solar power, along with its virtually inexhaustible supply and global distribution, make it a very attractive energy resource.

Now the world is getting ready to deal with the increasing climate change day by day, and our weapon to deal with climate change will be; solar energy. The Government of India is also committed to the development of solar energy, that is why the government is aiming to increase the installed renewable energy capacity to 500 GW (gigawatts) by 2030.

India, located in the tropical belt, receives high amounts of solar energy for 300 days of the year, which amounts to more than 5,000 trillion kWh for 2300–3,000 hours of sunshine.

Solar energy venture in India is a fast growing industry as part of renewable energy in India. The country's solar power installed capacity as of 31 August 2021 was 44.3 GW.

India has established about 42 solar parks to provide land to the promoters of solar plants. India has the 5th largest installed capacity of solar power in the world. India's Intended Nationally Determined Contribution (INDC) commitment includes 100 GW of solar power out of 175 GW of renewable energy by 2022.

There is immense potential for creating new jobs in this sector; The 1 GW solar manufacturing facility creates around 4000 direct and indirect jobs. In addition solar deployment, operation and maintenance creates additional recurring employment in this sector.

Progress is being made for storage, which has the potential to revolutionize this sector globally, until then the dependence on fossils can be reduced by gradually increasing the share of renewable energy. India is expected to have 8% of global solar capacity by 2035. With a potential future capacity of 363 gigawatts (GW), India can be a global leader in reaping the benefits of the energy sector.

According to a report prepared by The Energy and Resources Institute (TERI), India's reservoirs with a cumulative surface area of 18000 sq km have the potential to generate 280 GW of solar power through floating solar PV.

The National Institute of Solar Energy (NISE) estimates that India will have a solar power potential of about 750 GW, with Rajasthan, Jammu and Kashmir (before bifurcation), Maharashtra being the top states with the highest solar potential.

With solar energy of about 5000 trillion kWh per year, India has the potential to generate 35 MW/sq km using solar PV and solar thermal energy.

Ignoring future of youth is business as usual for Parl

The world's largest democracy, its central shrine — the Parliament — is facing its worst crisis since Independence. The BJP, even if short of an absolute majority, functions as if nothing has changed after the mandate of 2024. And a strengthened and more strident Opposition is hell bent on settling past scores. The net result is an ugly impasse, in which no side is willing to cede ground.

Events were building up to this eventuality. When the UPA government was in power between 2004 and 2014, the BJP made disruption of the House into a fine art, and its leaders of the Lok Sabha, Sushma Swaraj, and of the Rajya Sabha, Arun Jaitley, even justified such disruption as part of democratic practice. When the BJP came to power in 2014, a diminished Opposition tried to emulate such disruptive tactics, but its numbers were small, and that of the BJP unassailable.

The cumulative impact is the unbearable public denigration of parliamentary proceedings we see now. The manner in which Prime Minister (PM) Modi's speech was drowned out by the constant sloganeering and heckling of the Opposition, was deplorable, especially when the earlier debut speech of Rahul Gandhi as Leader of the Opposition was given a fair hearing. There are some aspects of parliamentary decorum that must prevail. Walking into the well of the House has to stop. The PM, when he speaks, must be listened to. If the Leader of the Opposition (LOP) requests to make a point during the speech, the PM should graciously yield. Any other rebuttals must be made after the speech. It cannot be the law of the jungle in a House which has in the past heard some of the most scintillatingly reasoned and cerebral debates.

In any case, the short point is that Parliament is paralyzed, and this raises serious doubts about its ability to respond to the real concerns of the people. To be relevant, Parliament must rise above its internecine battles to collectively tackle issues of urgent and national public importance. Parliamentary rules allow for this. The Lok Sabha has provision for a motion for an adjournment of the business of the House for the purposes of discussing a definite matter of urgent public importance with the consent of the Speaker. In the Rajya Sabha, a notice under Rule 267 to suspend listed business to discuss a national issue of importance exists. Why then did the Speaker and the Rajya Sabha chairman disallow the legitimate request of the Opposition to suspend the traditional — and mostly routine - debate on the Rashtrapati's opening address to Parliament to discuss the devastating issue of the leakage of papers of the National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (Neet), including the abject failures of the National Testing Agency (NTA)?

(NTA)?
Some 24 lakh students gave the Neet exam this year, to somehow find a place in the highly limited number of vacancies available to study medicine. For this exam, students prepare for months, if not years. Many families sacrifice a great deal to ensure that their child gets the best coaching and other facilities to qualify. Nor are paper leaks a new phenomenon. In the last 10 years, several impor-

tant exams that could provide employment to the growing army of our unemployed youth have been cancelled due to as many as 70 paper leaks. The future of some two crore students has been affected. The manifest inadequacies of the NTA to conduct a zeroerror exam, is appalling.

Is not the tragically jeopardised future of our youth compromised by a faulty testing system a matter of "urgent public importance"? In my opinion it is, and the PM would have won the gratitude of the aspirants, if he himself would have proposed to immediately discuss this matter. But he did not do so, and when the Opposition did, both the presiding officers of the House turned it down.

Over 50 per cent of our population is under the age of 25, and 65 per cent below that of 35. We take pride in being demographically one of the youngest countries in the world. If Parliament had given due recognition to the exam crisis they are facing, and discussed it immediately, it would have boosted their faith in the democratic system.


In the last decade, we have witnessed the near complete inflexibility of the Treasury benches in accommodating the concerns of the Opposition, irrespective of the merits of the issue. The approach of the ruling party has been that we have the numbers, and we shall act as we wish to, while the Opposition can keep protesting. Given such an attitude, bills have been passed without adequate discussion or reference to select committees, and valid issues directly involving the pressing concerns of the people, have been dismissively brushed aside. This has naturally led the Opposition to protest. In the ensuing cacophony, both Houses have been adjourned when its members should have — as representatives of the people — been seriously discussing issues of urgent public importance.

The vital discussion on Neet, and the repeated paper leaks, fell a victim to this unfortunate syndrome. In my view, the presiding officers of both Houses should have agreed to accommodate this request of the Opposition. In the past, a similar request to urgently discuss the situation in the sensitive border state of Manipur, which has been in a state of civil war for over a year, and on which even RSS chief, Mohan Bhagwat, was constrained to make a critical comment directly indicting the Central government, was also turned down.

The question now before the ordinary citizen is: For how long can myopic parliamentary bitterness finesse the pressing concerns of the people? The future of millions of students is hanging in the balance, while parliamentarians continue to squabble. If Parliament refuses to give the plight of the young the priority it deserves, what faith will they have on its efficacy and responsiveness? A reasoned and constructive discussion in Parliament on how the examination malaise can be tackled, and the efficiency of the NTA improved, would have been the right thing to do.

After watching innumerable crime dramas and thrillers, it doesn't take much brain to guess that there would be a good cop and a bad cop. Contrary to that, with Disney+Hotstar's latest offering Bad Cop, director Aditya Datt has made his point clear — 'there's only bad policing and criminal activity involved'.

Datt has cast an unusual pair of actors, Anurag Kashyap and Gulshan Devaiah, who are at loggerheads on the screen. While director-actor Kashyap essays a gangster, Kazbe, Devaiah is seen in a double role.

When creating identical twin characters, it's important to draw stark personality differences through acting skills. In Datt's opinion, "Apart from acting, an actor needs to have lots of patience. Gulshan has shot with me for Commando 3 before, so he knew my madness and method of shooting more than anyone else. He ticked all the boxes required for the twin roles. With advancements in technology, things have become easier while shooting but as far as presenting twin characters on screen is concerned, the process is tedious. On top of that, the series involved action sequences, so it can be a nightmare for the director and actor concerned.'

Creative adaptation

On how Datt ended up making the Indian remake of German show Bad Cop, he elaborates, "My first contact was Aradhna Bhola, managing director of Fermantle India, who simply



narrated the idea to me. I think she caught my attention with the word 'twins'. Then the head writer, Renzil D'Silva, and his team, which had been working on the script, met me. I have used my own creative voice while making this series suitable for an Indian setting."

According to Datt, the approach of a director does change with each project. "Especially when you know whether it's long or short format, for theatre or OTT. For OTT film or series, you are less afraid of taking chances, be it the casting, which is not dictated by the box-office, or the content, which can be experimental, according to the director's choice, and

Karenjit Kaur – The Untold Story of Sunny Leone (Sunny Leone biopic) was my first long format content, but this series is very different. Bad Cop as a switch from feature film was easier for me, as far as the narrative format was concerned. Every episode for me is a short film in itself with different subplots leading the narrative forward."

In times when social media marketing for any content is a must, Datt calls the trend a sad reality. "Social media is the only way to go in today's world, the entire globe is on the phone. It's sad in some way but it's the truth. I try to be on social platforms too, but nowhere close to

exploring and reaping its benefits as opposed to how many other people do."

Family man

Other than being a hardcore film buff, Datt is a family man. "Life for me other than movies is all about family, honestly. I like to spend time with my sons, my pet and my wife when taking a break. My wife will kill me for keeping her third in the order," he chuckles.

On his agenda as a director is to be known for his versatility. That's why Datt wants to make a superhero film, a horror and romantic musical in the coming times. "I have to try it all," he says. Datt doesn't give away much on the plans to make a sequel of Bad Cop, but confirms he has the wits and means to revive it only on audiences' demand. "You never know," are Datt's parting words.

Directing a director

I had never met Kashyap (Anurag) to begin with. Before I approached him for the show, I have only been a big follower of his cinema and obviously seen him through media over a period of time. So, when we were more than half-way through writing, Kashyap's face popped up in my mind as I imagined certain mannerisms of Kazbe. Directing a director is the easiest is what I feel now, as one director understands the creative process of another and also respects the creative decisions taken on or prior to shooting days. Consequently, she is said to have taken up arms against her management team and insurance company to launch her shows as

scheduled (they were set to begin on July 15, 2023, in Vancouver) but had to give in to pushing the dates back due to her health.

Her latest celebratory Fourth of July post also includes several PDAfilled snaps with a mystery man almost two months after her split with ex Josh Popper.

3 killed, 3 injured as building collapses in Jharkhand's Deoghar



DEOGHAR, Jul 7 (Agencies): people were killed and three were injured after being buried under the debris of a two-storey building that collapsed in Jharkhand's Deoghar district on Sunday, officials said

A rescue operation was under way as a few others were feared trapped under the debris of the building that collapsed around 6 am.

"As many as six people were retrieved from under the debris and brought to the Sadar Hospital here. Of them, two were brought dead. Another woman succumbed to the injuries. The treatment of the three others, including a child, is under way," Deoghar Civil Surgeon Ranjan Sinha told agency.

A team of the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) has been deployed for the rescue

operation.

Deoghar Sub-Divisional Police Officer (SDPO) Ritvik Srivastava told agency, "A few more seem to be still trapped under the debris. The rescue operation is under way." NDRF inspector Randhir Kumar, who is leading the operation, said efforts are on to retrieve the trapped people.

TDP will regain past glory in Telangana, restructuring soon: Chandrababu Naidu

HYDERABAD, Jul 7 (Agencies): Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu on Sunday said the Telugu Desam Party (TDP) will soon regain its past glory in Telangana also.

Addressing TDP workers in Hyderabad, Naidu said the party was born in Telangana (four decades ago) and soon it will be restructured.

The TDP did not contest the Assembly polls in November 2023 and the Lok Sabha polls this year in Telangana for a variety of reasons.

The party is currently headless after Kasani Gnaneshwar resigned as the state president before the Assembly polls last year.

"TDP, which was born for Telugu people, should be in Telangana. I am asking you whether the party which was born on the land of Telangana should function or not (in the state)? There were several people who worked for the party. We will restructure the party very soon (in Telangana)", Naidu said amid cheers by the party

Asserting that he would work to bring the past glory to the party in Telangana, he said the TDP will encourage



youth and the educated in the state.

On the meeting with his Telangana counterpart A Revanth Reddy on Saturday, Naidu said though different parties are in power in Andhra Pradesh and here (Telangana), when it comes to the interests of Telugu people, there is a need to work together.

Chandrababu Naidu and Revanth Reddy met in Hyderabad on Saturday and decided to constitute committees of ministers and officials to address pending issues related to bifurcation of undivided Andhra in 2014.

"Yesterday, we held discussions with the Telangana government. I am hoping that they will be taken forward in future also," he said.

Recalling his contribution as a Chief Minister to the development

of Hyderabad city two decades ago, the TDP supremo said that now Telangana enjoys the top slot as far as per capita income is concerned and the gap between it and Andhra Pradesh was 33 per

cent in 2014.

He said he was able to reduce the gap to 27 per cent during his tenure as chief minister between 2014 and 2019. However, it again went up to 44 per cent during the YSR Congress regime.

The Andhra chief minister claimed that several industries are expressing their willingness to invest in the state, but are apprehensive of the opposition YSRCP's "attitude".

Despite several hurdles and problems, he assured that he would take responsibility of the development of Andhra Pradesh.

CJI-led Supreme Court Bench to hear on Monday petitions seeking scrapping of NEET-UG 2024 exam

Both the Centre and NTA have opposed scrapping of the May 5 examination, saying it would be irrational and hugely counterproductive

NEW DELHI, Jul 7 (Agencies): Amid allegations of paper leak and other irregularities, the Supreme Court will hear on Monday petitions seeking scrapping of NEET-UG 2024 examination held on May 5 and conducting it afresh.

There is another set of petitions, including the one filed by 56 Gujarat-based successful medical aspirants, seeking to restrain the Centre and the National Testing Agency (NTA) from going for a re-test.

Both sets of petitions – totalling 38 -- are listed before a Bench of Chief Justice DY Chandrachud, Justice JB Pardiwala and Justice Manoj Misra.

The top court has so far refused to stay the counselling of the successful candidates for admissions to MBBS, BDS and other courses. The Union Health Ministry on Saturday refuted reports of postponement of NEET-UG counselling, saying the process was yet to be notified.

Earlier, the NTA had told the top court that counselling would begin on July 6. However, now it's learnt that counselling will begin in the third week of July as the process of issuing permission letters to a section of medical colleges was under way and additional seats were likely to be added.

Both the Centre and the NTA -- which conducts the NEET-UG test - have opposed scrapping the examination.

In an affidavit filed in the top



court, the Centre said scrapping the entire examination would seriously jeopardise lakhs of honest candidates who didn't adopt any unfair means.

"In the absence of any proof of any large-scale breach of confidentiality in a pan-India examination, it would not be rational to scrap the entire examination and the results already declared," the Union Ministry of Education said in an affidavit filed in the top court.

"It is submitted that in any examination, there are competing rights that have been created whereby the interests of a large number of students who have taken the examination without adopting any alleged unfair means must not be jeopardised," the affidavit read.

"The Union of India remains committed to protecting the interests of lakhs of students who have attempted the ques-

tion paper fairly and after years of hard work, without trying to obtain any illegal advantage," the Centre submitted.

In a separate affidavit, the NTA also opposed cancellation of the controversy-ridden NEET-UG 2024, saying it "would be hugely counterproductive and significantly harmful to the larger public interest, especially to the career prospects of the qualified candidates".

Around 24 lakh students appeared for NEET-UG 2024 examination conducted on May 5 by the NTA across 4,750 centres in 511 cities and 14 centres abroad for admission to MBBS, BDS. AYUSH and other related courses in more than 700 government and private institutions.

As many as 67 students got a perfect score of 720 out of 720 and some of the Rank 1 holders had the same sequence of roll numbers which raised suspicion of malpractice and irregularities. The majority of them were from the same examination centres in Rajasthan (11), Tamil Nadu (8), Maharashtra (7), Haryana (6) and four each from Andhra Pradesh and Bihar, In 2019 and 2020, there was one topper each while there were three toppers in 2021, one in 2022, and two in 2023.

A large number of students protested in Delhi on June 10 demanding a probe into alleged irregularities in NEET-UG 2024. They alleged that grace marks led to 67 students sharing the top rank.

The matter has since been handed over to the CBI which has made several arrests in connection with the alleged paper leak.

On June 18, the Supreme Court had said even if there was "0.001 percent negligence" on the part of anyone in the conduct of the examination, it should be thoroughly dealt with.

Following scrapping of the grace marks given on account of loss of time to 1,563 NEET-UG 2024 candidates, they were given an option of appearing again on June 23 for the test to secure admission to MBBS. BDS and other courses.

The NTA has already announced the revised rank list after issuing the results of the June 23 re-test. The number of candidates sharing the top rank was reduced to 61 from 67 in the revised results announced by the NTA.

Five Naxalites held in Chhattisgarh's Sukma, explosives seized



SUKMA, Jul 7 (Agencies): Police have arrested five Naxalites and recovered explosives, including two barrel grenade launcher shells and a tiffin bomb, from them in Chhattisgarh's Sukma district, an official said

Those arrested have been identified as Hemla Pala (35), Hemla Hunga (35), Sodi Deva (25), Nuppo (20) and Kunjam Masa (28), all residents of adjoining Chintalnar police station limits and active as militia members in Surpanguda area

The cadres were apprehended on Saturday from Jagargunda police station limits when a joint team of the District Reserve Guard (DRG), Bastar Fighters and district force was out on an area domination operation, he said.

On sensing the presence of security personnel near Singavaram, some Naxalites, clad in civil dress, tried

to hide and escape, the official said. Two country-made barrel grenade launcher (BGL) shells, one tiffin bomb, seven gelatin rods, nine detonators, explosive powder and other items used in making improvised explosive devices (IEDs) were recovered from their possession, the official added.

Man beaten to death in Bengal amid crackdown on mob violence

KOLKATA, Jul 7 (Agencies): In yet another case of mob violence in West Bengal, a man was beaten to death by a group of people on suspicion of theft in Bhangar in South 24 Parganas.

The incident came on the heels of the Mamata Banerjee government's order to the police to increase their vigilance to curb incidents of mob violence, especially following the attack on a couple.

Azgar Mollah, a resident of Phoolbari, was attacked by a group of locals in the early hours of Sunday at a location close to a police station.

It is alleged that the police did not attend to the body, which lay on the road for a long time until the villagers recovered it.

Some locals claimed that theft incidents had increased in the locality recently. The residents suspected him of being a thief and beat him up. Azgar fell unconscious during the attack and later succumbed to his injuries.

"Theft has been happening in this area for a long time. There is a night guard, but as soon as they leave, the incidents of theft increase. Today, one person was caught. He was tied up with a rope. Locals came and beat him up. The man fainted and later succumbed to his injuries," a resident of the area, Sheikh Rafigul Hasan, said.

The relatives of Azgar, who arrived at the spot after the incident, said they were unaware of the cause of the inci-

Multiple incidents of mob attacks have been reported recently in West Bengal. In the last week of June, the state registered 12 cases of mob violence, with one of them in the Uttar

Dinajpur district leading to a political outcry.

A couple was beaten up by local Trinamool Congress strongman Tajmul Haque, also known as JCB, who allegedly has ties to MLA Hamidul Rahaman in the North Dinajpur district on June 28. The act was filmed by onlookers, and the video went viral. The Trinamool leader was arrested after the video went viral.

On July 2, Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee instructed the state police to exercise more vigilance and take strict action against those involved.

The state government has also decided to provide financial assistance of Rs 2 lakh each to the family members of the victims. Additionally, the government will provide the job of a home guard for the next of kin of the victim.

Mayawati Demands CBI Probe Into Aide's Murder In Chennai



CHENNAI, Jul 7 (Agencies): Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP) chief Mayawati on Sunday demanded a CBI probe into the death of her party's Tamil Nadu president K Armstrong, who was hacked to death in Chennai on Friday.

She claimed those who have been arrested so far were not the real culprits and urged Chief Minister MK Stalin to refer the probe to the central agency to ensure justice for the

Mayawati, former Chief Minister of Uttar Pradesh, paid homage to Armstrong here and placed a wreath before the body of the 52-yearold leader at a private school in Perambur in the city.

Expressing anguish over Armstrong's death, she also said the way he was killed, by a group of assailants late in the evening, showed "there was nothing called law and order" in the state.

Mr Stalin must ensure justice for Armstrong and transfer the probe to the Central Bureau of Investigation, he said.

"The way he was

killed, shows there is nothing called law and order in Tamil Nadu. Those who have killed

him, the real culprits have not been nabbed," she said.

"The real culprits have not been nabbed. Transfer the probe to CBI. We are not hopeful that the state government will ensure justice. So, refer the matter to CBI immediately," she demanded.

The BSP leader further

said Dalits all over the state were apprehensive following Armstrong's killing and urged the Chief Minister to ensure their safety.

The BSP has taken the matter seriously, but party workers should not take law and order into their hands, she said.

14 Killed, 9 Missing After Deadly Floods, **Landslides In Nepal**

Flooding in neighbouring India, as well as in downstream Bangladesh, has also caused widespread damage and impacted millions.

KATHMANDU, Jul 7 (Agencies): Lashing rains in Nepal causing flash floods and landslides have killed at least 14 people across the country, with disaster teams searching for nine missing, police said Sunday

Flooding in neighbouring India, as well as in downstream Bangladesh, has also caused widespread damage and impacted millions.

"Police are working with other agencies and locals to find the missing people," Nepalese police spokesman Dan Bahadur Karki told agency.

Those killed and missing are in multiple locations.

Monsoon rains from June to September bring widespread death and destruction every year across South Asia, but the numbers of fatal floods and



landslides have increased in recent years.

Experts say climate change and increased road construction are exacerbating the prob-

Parts of Nepal have been receiving heavy rainfall since Thursday, prompting disaster

authorities in the Himalayan nation to warn of flash floods in multiple rivers.

There have been reports of inundation in several districts of lowland areas bordering

Last month 14 people were killed in Nepal in ferocious storms that brought landslides, lightning and flooding.

In India, floods have swamped the northeastern state of Assam, with six people killed in the last 24 hours, Assam's Disaster Management Authority said Sunday.

That takes the death toll from the downpours since mid-May to 58.

In low-lying Bangladesh, downstream from India, the disaster management agency said floods had impacted more than two million people.

Much of the country is made up of deltas where the Himalayan rivers the Ganges and the Brahmaputra wind towards the sea after coursing through

The summer monsoon brings South Asia 70-80 percent of its annual rainfall.

France is voting in key elections that could see a historic far-right win or a hung parliament

PARIS, Jul 7 (Agencies): Voting has begun in mainland France on Sunday in pivotal runoff elections that could hand a historic victory to Marine Le Pen's farright National Rally and its inward-looking, antiimmigrant vision — or produce a hung parliament and years of political deadlock.

French President **Emmanuel Macron took** a huge gamble in dissolving parliament and calling for the elections after his centrists were trounced in European elections on June 9.

The snap elections in this nuclear-armed nation will influence the war in Ukraine, global diplomacy and Europe's economic stability, and they're almost certain to undercut President **Emmanuel Macron for** the remaining three

years of his presidency. The first round on June 30 saw the largest gains ever for the antiimmigration, nationalist National Rally, led by Marine Le Pen.

A bit over 49 million people are registered to vote in the elections. which will determine which party controls the 577-member National Assembly, France's influential lower house of parliament, and who will be prime minister. If support is further eroded for Macron's weak centrist majority, he will be forced to share power with parties opposed to most of his pro-business, pro-Euro-

pean Union policies. Prime Minister Gabriel Attal cast his ballot in the Paris suburb of Vanves Sunday morning.

Le Pen is not voting,

because her district in northern France is not holding a second round after she won the seat outright last week. Across France, 76 other candidates secured seats in the first round, including 39 from her National Rally and 32 from the leftist New Popular Front alliance. Two candidates from Macron's centrists list also won their seats

in the first round. Racism and antisemitism have marred the electoral campaign, along with Russian cybercampaigns, and more than 50 candidates reported being physically attacked - highly unusual for France. The government is deploying 30,000 police on voting

The heightened tensions come while France is celebrating a very special summer: Paris is about to host exceptionally ambitious Olympic Games, the national soccer team reached the semifinal of the Euro 2024 championship, and the Tour de France is racing around the country alongside the Olympic torch.

The elections wrap

up Sunday at 8 p.m. (1800 GMT) in mainland France and on the island of Corsica. Initial polling projections are expected Sunday night, with early official results expected late Sunday and early Monday.

Voters residing in the Americas and in France's overseas territories of Saint-Pierre-et-Miguelon, Saint-Barthélemy, Saint-Martin, Guadeloupe, Martinique, Guyana and French Polynesia voted on Saturday.

The elections could leave France with its first far-right government since the Nazi occupation in World War II if the National Rally wins an absolute majority and its 28-year-old leader Jordan Bardella becomes prime minister. The party came out on top in the previous week's first-round voting, followed by a coalition of center-left, hard-left and Green parties, and Macron's centrist alliance.

But the outcome remains highly uncertain. Polls between the two rounds suggest that the National Rally may win the most seats in the 577-seat National Assembly but fall short of the 289 seats needed for a majority. That would still make history. if a party with historic links to xenophobia and downplaying the Holocaust, and long seen



as a pariah, becomes France's biggest political force.

If it wins the majority, Macron would be forced to share power in an awkward arrangement known in France as "cohabitation."

Another possibility is that no party has a majority, resulting in a hung parliament. That could prompt Macron to pursue coalition negotiations with the center-left or name a technocratic government with no political affiliations.

Both would be unprecedented for modern France, and make it more difficult for the European Union's No. 2 economy to make bold decisions on arming Ukraine, reforming labor laws or reducing its huge deficit. Financial markets have been jittery since Macron surprised even his closest allies in June by announcing snap elections after the National Rally won the most seats for France in European Parliament elections

Regardless of what happens, Macron said he won't step down and will stay president until his term ends in 2027.

Many French voters,

especially in small towns and rural areas, are frustrated with low incomes and a Paris political leadership seen as elitist and unconcerned with workers' day-today struggles. National Rally has connected with those voters, often by blaming immigration for France's problems, and has built up broad and deep support over the past decade.

Le Pen has softened many of the party's positions — she no longer calls for quitting NATO and the EU — to make it more electable. But the party's core far-right values remain. It wants a referendum on whether being born in France is enough to merit citizenship, to curb rights of dual citizens, and give police more freedom to use weapons.

Deadly strikes hit Gaza as war enters tenth month



PALESTINIAN TER-RITORY, Jul 7 (Agencies): Israel carried out deadly air strikes in the Gaza Strip as the war entered its tenth month on Sunday, with fighting raging across the Palestinian territory and fresh diplomatic efforts underway to halt the violence.

Israel has said it will send a delegation in the coming days to continue truce talks with Qatari mediators that began recently in Doha.But Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's spokesman said "gaps" remained with Hamas on how to secure a ceasefire and hostage release deal.

"It was agreed that next week Israeli negotiators will travel to Doha to continue the talks. There are still gaps between the parties," the spokesman said in a statement on Friday.

Meanwhile, the fighting in Gaza continued unabated, with the Palestinian Red Crescent saying Sunday that the bodies of six people, including two children. who were killed in Israeli strikes had arrived at Al-Aqsa Martyrs Hospital in the central city of Deir al-Balah. Paramedics also said Sunday that six people had been killed in an Israeli strike on a house in a northern area of Gaza City.

The day before, the health ministry in Hamas-run Gaza said 16 people had been killed in a strike on a school run by the UN refugees (UNRWA) that was sheltering displaced people in Nuseirat, in central Gaza. The Israeli military said its aircraft had targeted "terrorists" operating around the Al-Jawni school.

The military earlier said it had conducted operations across much of the Gaza Strip, including Shujaiya in the north, Deir al-Balah and Rafah in the south.

Shujaiya is among the areas the military had previously declared to be cleared of Hamas, but where fighting has since resumed.

The Hamas press office and paramedics said four journalists working for local media outlets were killed in strikes overnight into Saturday, and UNRWA said two of its employees had been killed.

UNRWA, which coordinates much of the aid delivered to Gaza, says 194 of its employees have been killed in the war.

'Ball in Israel's court'

The United States, which has mediated ceasefire negotiations alongside Qatar and Egypt, has talked up the prospects of a deal, saying there is a "pretty significant opening" for both sides. US President Joe

Biden announced a pathway to a truce deal in May that he said had been proposed by Israel. It included an initial six-week truce, an Israeli withdrawal from Gaza's population centres and the freeing of hostages held by Palestinian militants.

Talks subsequently stalled, but a US official said Thursday that a new proposal from Hamas "moves the process forward and may provide the basis for closing the deal".

Senior Hamas official Osama Hamdan told agency that new ideas from the group had been "conveyed by the mediators to the American side, which welcomed them and passed them on to the Israeli side".

"Now the ball is in the Israeli court.'

There has been no truce since a one-week pause in November when 80 Israeli hostages were freed in return for 240 Palestinians held in Israeli prisons. Pressure has mounted domestically for another hostage release deal, with regular protests and rallies in Israel.

"It's important that we reach a deal so that all the mothers can embrace their children and husbands, just as I hug my mother every morning now," rescued hostage Almog Mair Jan

said in a recorded message to a rally in Tel Aviv Saturday.

The Israel - Gaza war began with Hamas's unprecedented October 7 attack on southern Israel that resulted in the deaths of 1,195 people, mostly civilians, according to an AFP tally based on Israeli figures. The militants also seized hostages, 116 of whom remain in Gaza, including 42 the military says are dead.

In response, Israel has carried out a military offensive that has killed at least 38,098 people in Gaza, also mostly civilians, according to the health ministry in the Hamas-ruled territory.

The war has uprooted 90 per cent of Gaza's population, destroyed much of its housing and other infrastructure, and left almost 500,000 people enduring "catastrophic" hunger, UN agencies say.

The main stumbling block to a truce deal has been Hamas's demand for a permanent end to the fighting, which Netanyahu and his farright coalition partners strongly reject.

The veteran hawk demands the release of the hostages and insists the war will not end until Israel has destroyed Hamas's ability to fight or govern.

Lebanon attacks

Israel and Lebanon's Iran-backed Hezbollah movement have exchanged cross-border fire almost daily since the Gaza war began, but attacks have escalated over the past month.

This has raised fears of a major conflagration between the bitter enemies that could draw in others including Iran. Israel's army said

late Saturday that its jets had struck Hezbollah targets in southern Lebanon and troops had fired artillery across the border "throughout the day".

Earlier Saturday, sirens blared over northern Israel and the military said it had downed a "suspicious aerial target" and that two "hostile aircraft" launched from Lebanon had hit open ground.

A source close to Hezbollah said an Israeli drone strike targeted a vehicle in eastern Lebanon Saturday, killing a Hezbollah official.

Israel said he was part of the group's air defence unit.

summit in Washington. He will do so under an increasingly unforgiving spotlight, as pressure mounts for him to drop out after his disastrous debate against Donald Trump last month ignited

Biden has remained defiant, unequivocally declaring -- at a rally, to reporters and on social media -- that he is fit to serve, the only one who can defeat Trump, and staying in the race.

"I beat Trump in 2020. I'm going to beat him again in 2024," his campaign social media account posted Satur-

But a televised interview with ABC News on Friday has failed to quell concerns. His next major test in the public eye will be a press conference scheduled for Thursday, during the NATO summit.

So far, five Democratic lawmakers have called on Biden to drop out, with the drumbeat of dissent slowly rising.

The House minority leader, Hakeem Jeffries, has scheduled a virtual meeting of senior Democrat representatives for Sunday to discuss the best way forward, and Democrat Senator Mark Warner is reportedly working to convene a similar forum in the upper chamber.

First Lady Jill Biden, who -- according to some US media reports -- is urging her husband to stay in the race, is scheduled to campaign in Georgia, Florida and North Carolina on Monday.



But after Sunday's rallies in Philadelphia and Harrisburg, the president will have to step away from the campaign for the NATO summit beginning Tuesday.

Here, too, he will find himself having to reassure allies at a time when many European countries fear a Trump victory in November. The 78-year-old

Udhampur Forest Division to plant 1.1 lakh saplings to restore greenery after recent fires

JAMMU, July 7 (Agencies): In an effort to restore greenery to the forests of Udhampur, the Forest Division has prepared a plan to plant 1.1 lakh saplings of various species. These saplings have been nurtured in the nurseries of the Udhampur Forest Division, officials said on Sunday.

There are around six nurseries dedicated to cultivating these saplings. Among these, the Central Nursery of the Jammu and Kashmir Forest Department and the Udhampur Range Mand are particularly noteworthy. Forest department employees there cultivate saplings of various varieties, which are then transplanted into the forests of the Udhampur Division, they said.

According to forest officials, this initiative is crucial in light of the recent spate of forest fires in Udhampur, which have ravaged a significant number of trees. Consequently, the Forest Department has identified these fire-affected areas for the plantation drive, aiming to restore their lost verdure.

Divisional Forest Officer (DFO) Navneet Singh elaborated on the department's nursery network and plantation plans. He stated that the Udhampur Forest Division's six nurseries have a combined production capacity of 5 lakh saplings, with over 3 lakh saplings currently in stock.

Singh explained that 1.1 lakh saplings will be planted in Udhampur's forests during this phase, while an additional 20,000 saplings will be used in plantation drives conducted in collaboration with schools. colleges, the Army, the Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF), and the police.

Political start-uns in J&K: A growing trend with limited impact

Many of these have either refrained from contesting elections or have faced defeat in the recently held Lok Sabha polls.

Veteran politician and CPI(M) leader Mohammed Yusuf Tarigami said the leaders of these political start-ups often begin with a bang, enjoy patronage like security and other things, and then disappear like "lost planets when elections are held".

Instead of floating political start-ups, "we should concentrate on strengthening democratic institutions in the entire Jammu and

Kashmir," he asserted. Echoing similar views, PDP leader Waheed Para said these start-ups have a "negative impact" on the democratic space and highlighted their lack of popular support and legitimacy.

Para said these political start-ups only demolish and discredit the democratic space. "The recent Lok Sabha election has shown them the mirror clearly," he added.

In a veiled reference to businessmanturned-politician Altaf Bukhari's JK Apni Party and the veteran politician Ghulam Nabi Azad-led DPAP, Para said almost three parties were created by breaking up the PDP which only led to demolishing the democratic space in Kashmir and discrediting those left behind.

"Results reflect that only people should be given the right to choose and elect. Parties created in hybrid form don't enjoy the popular support or legitimacy," he added.

Noted Kashmiri Pandit leader and lawyer Titoo Ganjoo said the aftermath of the abrogation of Article 370 in August 2019 saw the emergence of top-down political start-ups in Jammu and Kashmir that lack organic growth and fail to resonate with the local populace.

"These new entities were predominantly composed of disenchanted politicians engaging in exploratory efforts, ultimately doomed to fail in gaining significant political traction," he said, adding that these start-ups never pose a challenge to the established political order.

The leadership of these political start-ups, conceived to be driven by some government agencies, failed to reflect the genuine aspirations of the local populace, Ganjoo added.

These leaders exhibit a significant disconnect from the region's realities, focusing more on reclaiming their political relevance rather than addressing the core issues faced by the people, according to prominent social activist Firdous.

Ganjoo argued that the behaviour and conduct of these leaders highlight their opportunistic tendencies and lack of substantial commitment to the region's longterm stability and development.

"Their efforts were perceived as superficial and self-serving, failing to foster genuine political engagement or meaningful change," he said, adding that the lack of inspirational leadership and substantive direction has left the region in a state of disillusionment with no coherent or compelling vision for the future emerging from these political start-ups.

Dr Touseef Bhatt, a socio-environmental activist, said that despite representing a new wave of political innovation in a conflict-ridden region, political start-ups in Kashmir face challenges in making a meaningful impact due to their limited experience and resources.

Their dependence on external funding raises concerns about their autonomy and long-term sustainability in a volatile political environment, he said.

While these start-ups aim to engage young Kashmiris in the political process and address local concerns, questions remain about their potential influence on the existing political dynamics and the peace process in the region.

As Kashmir grapples with ongoing challenges and aspirations for change, the fate of political start-ups in the region remains uncertain, raising questions about their ability to effect meaningful political change.

Amarnath Yatra: 1.59 lakh pilgrims visit holy cave shrine in 9 days

With this, the number of pilarims who have visited the 3,888-metre-high cave shrine in the South Kashmir Himalayas has now reached 1,59,498, officials added.

Meanwhile, the fresh batch (11th) of 6,145 Yatris left Bhagwati Nagar Yatri Niwas in Jammu in two escorted convoys for the Valley today," said the officials.

The batch include 4695 men, 1218 women, 19 children, 177 sadhus & 36 sadhvies (female sadhus). The pilgrims left the base camp in a cavalcade of 238 vehicles early this morning.

Of these, 2697 pilgrims left for Baltal at 3:10 AM and 3448 for Pahalgam base camp at 3:42 AM from where they will proceed for their further journey to the holy cave.

The Meteorological (MeT) department has forecast partially cloudy weather on both the Yatra routes with the possibility of intermittent light rain and thundershowers during the day.

Yatris take either the 48-km long traditional Pahalgam route or the shorter 14-km long Baltal route to perform the Yatra.

Those using the Pahalgam route take four days to reach the cave shrine while those taking the Baltal route return to the base camp the same day after having 'darshan' inside the cave shrine. The cave shrine situated 3888 metres above sea level houses an ice stalagmite structure that wanes and waxes with the phases of the moon.

Devotees believe that the ice stalagmite structure symbolises the mythical powers of Lord Shiva. Extensive arrangements for security have been made this year all along the nearly 300 km long Jammu-Srinagar

highway, at the twin Yatra routes, the two base camps and the cave shrine to ensure a smooth, incident-free Yatra.

Over 124 'langars' (community kitchens)

have been set up along both the routes and also at the transit camps and the cave Over 7,000 'Sevadars' (Volunteers) are

serving the Yatris during this year's Yatra. Helicopter services are also available for the Yatris on both routes.

The 52-day pilgrimage will conclude on August 19. More than 4.5 lakh pilgrims paid obeisance at the cave shrine last year.

Tariff hike by telecom companies complies with the prescribed regulatory framework: DoT

All three major private telecom service providers, Jio, Airtel, and Vodafone have announced tariff hikes ranging from 10% to 25% last week.

NEW DELHI, Jul 7 (Agencies): A day after the Congress party criticised the government over the tariff hike by telecom service providers (TSPs), the Ministry of Communication defended the increase, mentioning that the hike complies with the prescribed regulatory framework.

In a press statement issued in response to the Congress party's claims that consumers would face an additional burden of Rs. 34,824 crore due to the tariff hike, the Department of Telecommunications (DoT) clarified that telecom service providers (TSPs) have raised mobile service prices after more than two years.

"In last 2 years, some of the TSPs have invested heavily in rolling out the 5G services across the country. This has resulted into a significant increase in median mobile speed to the level of 100 Mbps and jump in the India's international rank from 111, in October



2022, to 15 today," said the DoT in its press statement.

All three major private telecom service providers — Reliance Jio, Bharti Airtel, and Vodafone Idea Limited — have announced tariff hikes ranging from 10% to 25% last week. The last such hike occurred in November 2021. This time, Reliance Jio led with a tariff increase of 12-25%, followed by Airtel with hikes ranging from 11% to 21%

across its prepaid and postpaid plans. Vodafone Idea (Vi) also increased tariffs by 10-23%.

The DoT also highlighted that the tariff hike was implemented in accordance with the provisions of the Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI) Act 1997, which empowers TRAI as an independent regulator to set telecom service rates in the country. It noted that for the past two decades, mobile service

rates have been determined under forbearance by TRAI.

The government further explained that with three private sector players and one public sector player, the current mobile services market operates under the forces of demand and supply. It emphasized that the focus remains on safeguarding subscriber interests, promoting orderly growth through investments in cutting-edge technologies, and ensuring financial sustainability.

The government underscored the importance of investing in advanced technologies such as 5G, 6G, IoT/M2M for Industry 4.0, emphasizing their role in ensuring the financial viability of the sector. It also mentioned that in the decade preceding the last ten years, the telecommunications sector was beset by controversies and lacked transparency, leading to stagnation in the growth of mobile services.

Q1 securitisation volume dips 20% to Rs 45,000 cr



MUMBAI, Jul 7 (Agencies): Despite increased participation by banks, the overall securitisation volume has declined by 20 per cent on-year to Rs 45,000 crore in the June quarter of the current fiscal, primarily because of the exit of the industry leader HDFC after its reverse merger with its subsidiary HDFC Bank from July 2023.

Excluding housing finance companies, securitisation volume remained largely flat on an annualised basis, but non-banks and the HFCs continue to utilise securitisation as a funding tool to raise liquidity as well as to diversify their funding avenues and grow their investor base, according to an analysis by Icra Ratings.

The agency projects securitisation volume to pick up in the subsequent quarters and cross the Rs 2 trillion mark by March.

According to Abhishek Dafria, a senior vice president and group head

for structured finance ratings, at the agency, the securitisation market has declined in Q1 as overall disbursement growth of NBFCs has moderated, especially in the unsecured lending space, following the cautionary advice from the Reserve Bank. However, the market continues to widen with new originators, even from the banking sector, raising funds through this route in the quarter, which bodes well in the long term.

Accordingly, the agency expects securitisation volume to pick up in subsequent quarters and cross Rs 2 trillion in FY25, he said.

The share of pass-through certificates (PTCs) form 55-60 per cent of the overall securitisation volume with the remaining coming in from direct loan sell-downs or direct assignments.

Vehicle loans continue to form the biggest asset class in the PTC space, though leading originators in this space have carried out lower securitisation in Q1 on-year, possibly due to the general elections that would have dampened the sale of commercial vehicles.

Microfinance and mortgage-backed loans, however, continue to be largely securitised through direct assignments. The proportion of personal loans has slightly moderated due to the recent concerns raised by the RBI, though its current proportion remains relatively lower in the overall volumes.

BMI alone not sufficient, waist-to-height ratio more effective in diagnosing obesity: Researchers

NEW DELHI, Jul 7 (Agencies): Obesity can no longer be just defined by body mass index (BMI) and rather should be about how body fat is distributed throughout one's body, researchers said while launching a new framework for diagnosing and managing obesity.

Published in the journal Nature Medicine, the framework looks specifically at fat accumulated in the abdomen, measured as 'waist-to-height ratio'—an increased value of which is related to a higher risk of developing cardiometabolic complications, accord-

ing to the researchers.

An "important novelty" of the framework is including a waist-to-height ratio higher than 0.5, along with a BMI of 25-30, for diagnosing obesity, the authors, representing the European Association for the Study of Obesity

(EASO), said.
"The choice of intro-



ducing waist-to-height ratio, instead of waist circumference, in the diagnostic process is due to its superiority as a cardiometabolic disease risk marker," they wrote.

Accumulation of abdominal fat is a more reliable predictor of health deterioration, compared to BMI, even for individuals not meeting the current standard cut-off value for obesity diagnosis, which is a BMI of 30, the authors said.

They said that the current guidelines are based on evidence from studies in which participants meeting cut-off

values were included for analysis, rather than on a "complete clinical evaluation".

"The basis for this change is the recognition that BMI alone is insufficient as a diagnostic criterion, and that body fat distribution has a substantial effect on health," they wrote.

The researchers said that introducing the suggested changes in the diagnostic processes could reduce risk of undertreatment in this particular group of patients—low BMI and high abdominal fat—in comparison to the current BMI-based definition of obesity.

ITR filing: These individuals are exempt from paying tax

NEW DELHI, Jul 7 (Agencies): Filing the income tax return (ITR) is an essential duty of an Indian citizen and failure to do so can attract legal repercussions such as penalties, increased tax scrutiny, etc.

It is important to note that every individual in the country needs to file their income tax returns, even if their income is not taxable or they are not paying any income tax. Filing the ITR by July 31 of a financial year helps avoid penaltics.

Under the Income Tax
Act in India, specific
groups residing in certain regions of select
states are eligible for
exemptions from paying
income tax.

These exemptions are given based on predefined criteria such as income thresholds, socio-economic standing, and occupations of individuals within these communities.

These targeted tax relief measures aim to reduce the financial burden on marginalised populations in these areas, promoting fair opportunities for all.



Exemptions for residents of Northeastern States and UTs

"Under Section 10(26) of the Income Tax Act in India, members of Scheduled Tribes residing in Tripura, Mizoram, Manipur, Nagaland, Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, and the Ladakh region of the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir are exempt from paying income tax," said Rohit Jain, Managing Partner, Singhania & Co.

Exemptions for individuals in certain areas
As outlined in Section
10(26) of the Income Tax
Act, a specific category
of income is exempt
from income tax obligations. This exemption pertains to income
generated within specified areas or states, in
the form of dividends or
interest on securities.

More specifically, this exemption applies to members of a Scheduled Tribe who reside in regions designated

within the Constitution.

"This exemption also

applies to those living in specific areas within these regions, including the North Cachar Hills District, Karbi Anglong District, Bodoland Territorial Areas District, Khasi Hills District, Jaintia Hills District, and Garo Hills District in Meghalaya. The exemption covers income generated within these specified areas, including income from dividends or interest on securities. However, income from renting property or conducting business outside these regions is not eligible for the exemption," said Rohit Jain, Managing Partner, Singhania & Co.

Additionally, the states of Manipur, Tripura, Arunachal Pradesh, Mizoram, Nagaland, and the Ladakh region are also covered under this exemption.

Claiming tax exemp-

One can claim tax exemption under Section 10(26) by filing an income tax return (ITR). Since their incomes qualify for tax exemptions based on the nature of that income, these individuals need to disclose the income generated and the exemption

exemption.
Individuals belonging to Scheduled Tribes residing in several northeastern states and the Ladakh region of the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir are required to submit Income Tax Returns (ITRs) if their earnings exceed the limit set by the Income Tax Department.

It is essential for them to declare their total income and avail the exemptions provided under Sections 10(26) and 10(26AAA) of the Income Tax Act.

ITR exemption for certain senior citizens

An individual resident aged 60-79 is considered a Senior Citizen for Income Tax purposes, while a Super Senior Citizen is someone aged 80 years or older.

These classifications impact tax benefits and exemptions, and compliance with regulations for each category is crucial for accurate tax filing and financial planning.

Under Section 194P of the Income Tax Act, individuals who are 75 years old or above and receive pension income along with interest income from a specified bank account are eligible to opt out of filing their Income Tax Return (ITR)

To proceed with this option, qualifying seniors need to complete a declaration in Form 12BBA.

The form must be submitted to the designated bank where the pension and interest income is received.

The bank will then assess and deduct the applicable income tax based on the information provided in the form.

Zika virus can be sexually transmitted from person who is infected, even if asymptomatic: Expert

NEW DELHI, Jul 7 (Agencies): Zika virus that recently infected five people in Maharashtra's Pune is majorly asymptomatic, but can resemble dengue fever, said health experts here.

Zika virus disease (ZVD) is a mosquitoborne disease transmitted by Aedes mosquitoes, the mosquito which also transmits dengue, chikungunya, and yellow fever.

It usually bites during the daytime. It is usually a mild to moderate severity disease in adults and requires no specific treatment.

Common symptoms include mild fever, rashes, headache, muscle and joint pain, and inflammation of the underside of the eyelid, which normally lasts for

2-7 days.

"Around 80 per cent of cases are estimated to be asymptomatic, though the accuracy of this figure is hindered by the wide variance in data quality," Dr. Suruchi Mandrekar, Consultant Internal Medicine, Manipal Hospital, Pune, told agency.

On the other hand, "symptomatic cases are usually mild and can resemble dengue fever, and may include fever, red eyes, joint pain, headache, and a maculopapular rash," the doctor said.

Dr. Digvijay Adke, Consultant and In-charge, Emergency Department, DPU Super Specialty Hospital, Pune, noted that "the rise in Zika virus cases, identical to dengue, is primarily owing to multiple factors,



including sudden weather changes, followed by clogging of drains and water accumulation in the surroundings along with poor personal hygiene practices at an individual level."

Meanwhile, Dr. Suruchi pointed out that Zika virus infection raises concerns during pregnancy as it can cause microcephaly and other brain malformations in some babies.

In adults, it has been

linked to Guillain-Barre Syndrome (GBS) and is known to affect human Schwann cells, that play an important role in supporting the development, function, and regeneration of peripheral nerves linked to movement, breathing,

"Prevention involves decreasing mosquito bites in areas where the disease occurs, and proper use of condoms,

heartbeat, and diges-

tion, among others.

as it can be sexually transmitted," Dr. Suruchi said.

Even as there is no current vaccine, the doctors called for efforts such as insect repellent, covering much of the body with clothing, and mosquito nets, and getting rid of standing water where mosquitoes reproduce.

"It is advised to follow hygiene practices like regular washing of hands and refrain from consuming food from unhygienic spots, especially anything that is under-cooked. Including nutritionally rich elements in your daily diet like fruits and vegetables helps in building a strong immune system that helps fight against such vector-borne ail-

ments," said Dr. Digvijay.

Cut down smoking to avoid cognitive ageing, reveals study



NEW DELHI, Jul 7 (Agencies): Want to maintain sharp memory skills and cognitive function as you age? Cutting down on smoking suggests a large study that found it to be a key lifestyle factor linked to cognitive decline.

The study, published in Nature Communications, is based on a 10-year survey of 32,000 adults aged 50 or over from 14 countries in Europe.

The team led by researchers from the University College London, UK showed

that cognitive decline was faster for lifestyles that included smoking. People who smoked had cognitive scores that declined up to 85 per cent more over 10 years than those who did not.

Lead author Mikaela Bloomberg (UCL Behavioural Science & Denamoral Health) said the study "is observational; it cannot definitively establish cause and effect, but it suggests smoking might be a particularly important factor influencing the rate of cognitive ageing".

As per previous studies, people who engaged in more healthy behaviours like regular exercise, and moderate alcohol intake have slower cognitive decline. However, it did not specify whether all behaviours contributed equally to cognitive decline.

However, the new study showed that among the healthy behaviours, "not smoking may be the most important in terms of maintaining cognitive function"

Among those unable to stop smoking, the study suggests engaging in other healthy behaviours such as regular exercise, moderate alcohol consumption, and remaining socially active "to offset adverse cognitive effects", Mikaela said.

MS Dhoni turns 43, wife Sakshi shares mid-night birthday celebration video

NEW DELHI, Jul 7 (Agencies): MS Dhoni, a name synonymous with calmness in world cricket since he made his debut in 2004 for India, is celebrating his 43rd birthday on Sunday.

Dhoni's wife Sakshi made sure he had a great start to his special day with a mid-night cake cutting celebration. She even went on to touch his feet in a playful gesture.

Sakshi later shared the video on social media.

Bollywood actor Salmam Khan was also present on the occasion. He posted a photo on Instagram with a caption, 'Happy Birthday Kaptaan Sahab!'

Dhoni, who usually stays away from the buzz of social media, recently congratulated the Indian team on their T20 World



Cup win, calling it his special birthday gift.

'Happy Birthday, Mahi bhai! Wishing you a day as cool as your helicopter shot and as epic as your stumping skills. Have a fantastic one, brotherman,' former India batter and Dhoni's good friend Suresh Raina wrote on X.

Fondly known as Thala, Dhoni led India to three ICC trophies and Chennai Super Kings to five IPL titles.

Dhoni played 350 ODI matches over a period of a decade and a half and accumulated 10,773 runs at an average of 50.58. In Test cricket, he represented India in 90 matches and scored close to 5,000 runs at an average of 38.09. In the IPL, he has scored over 5,000 runs.

Rahul Dravid never liked chopping & changing



MUMBAI, Jul 7 (Agencies): As Rahul Dravid bids farewell to Team India, the legend said that during his tenure as head coach he abhorred chopping and

changing the side too much and always tried to be a foil for skipper Rohit Sharma so that he could devise his own

Dravid's coaching stint

came to an end with India winning the T20 World Cup in Barbados last week.

"I'm someone who actually likes continuity and don't like to chop and change too many things because I believe that creates a lot of instability and doesn't create very good environment," said Dravid in a video posted by BCCI. "I feel that I am a part of the team whose responsibility is to create the right professional, safe, secure environment that doesn't really have a fear of failure as such but is challenging enough to push people. That has always been my endeavour."

Zimbabwe vs India 2nd T20I, Predicted Playing XI: Battered India eager to fightback

HARARE, Jul 7 (Agencies): A young team India was handed a surprise defeat by Zimbabwe in the first T20I of the five-match series on Saturday, July 6 at Harare Sports Club, Harare. Chasing a low total of 116, the Men in Blue were bundled out for 102 in 19.5 overs with captain Shubman Gill being the top scorer with 31 (29).

After a humiliating loss, India don't have much time to regroup as they will take the field in the second T20I on Sunday, July 7 at the same venue. The young Turks will be desperate to turn things around after tainting the crown of world champions handed over by the senior pros

There are a lot of areas to improve with the bat for the young side as they failed to stitch small partnerships in the middle overs which eventually cost them the game. A total of three debutants featured for India in the first T20I namely Riyan Parag, Dhruv Jurel and Abhishek Sharma.

However, the trio had a game to forget with Sharma getting dismissed for a four-ball duck while Parag (2 off 3) and Jurel (6 off 14) got dismissed cheaply. Ravi Bishnoi shone with the ball registering figures of 4/13 in four overs. Despite being hammered in the first T20I, the team management is unlikely

to make any changes in the playing XI and will look to give more chances to the underperforming youngsters.

Pace sensation Richard Ngarava feels series is a boost for Zimbabwean cricket

HARARE, Jul 7 (Agencies): Zimbabwean left-arm pacer Richard Ngarava was confident of his team notching a couple of wins against the newlook version T20 world champions — which, according to him, would mean the world to them and provide a boost to their long-term plans for the 2026 T20 World Cup and 2027 ICC Men's Cricket World Cup.

But, who would have thought the first game of the five-match T20I series against India would get them off the mark

"It (finding win) was never going to be easy against these guys (Indian team), but we were ready for the challenge. They have brought in a young side, but still it is going to be tough test," he said.

The odds of winning the series are heavily stacked against Zimbabwe, but the underdogs



have already shown bite, winning the first match by 13 runs.

Ngarava, who became the first player to take a five-wicket haul for Zimbabwe against Sri Lanka in an ODI series earlier this year, claimed the current series is a learning curve for them.

"To be frank, it's going to be really tough. However, a couple of wins will be like a learning lesson for us. We are having an entirely new coaching staff and a young side. We are aiming to prepare for the next T20 World Cup

and the 2027 ICC World Cup, which we are co-hosting. So, we are not nervous at all...but we also don't want any loose ends against them (India)," said Ngarava in a phonetic interview with The Tribune from Harare.

Zimbabwe has caused a few upsets in international cricket in the past – their one-run win in a thriller against Pakistan in the 2022 T20 World Cup being one of it.

However, the team has struggled to find feet in international cricket. They were knocked

out of reckoning for the recently-concluded T20 World Cup by Uganda. And with the emergence of teams like Afghanistan, Netherlands and Nepal things have become more complicated.

"Expectations are going to get high every time. However, handling the difficulties and challenges is the most important part. It takes lots of effort and time to have the revival. It's disheartening sometimes when results get adverse and it becomes very difficult to move forward," Ngarava said.

Bumrah, Arshdeep and IPL

As every other ardent cricket fan, Ngarava was keenly following the T20 World Cup. It turns out he's a big fan of Indian pace masters Jasprit Bumrah and Arshdeep Singh.

He considers them as his role models. "The Indian team played

well in the World Cup. The bowlers displayed a great class. I am following Bumrah and Arshdeep...they are fantastic. I am looking to replicate their exploits in this series. I hope for better results like them," he shared.

Not only the world, but the Zimbabwean players are also passionate about the BCCI's annual showpiece event — the IPL. Ngarava believes that inclusion of the Zimbabwean players in the cash-rich league can be a game changer for the country.

"The IPL is a nice set-up for world players. If we could fit in the set-up, it will surely lift our game. The BCCI usually helps Zimbabwean cricket, but it will be really nice if some of our youngsters get a chance to play in the event. It will also help us to find a right path for the betterment of Zimbabwean cricket," he added.

Rohit Sharma will captain India to success in WTC 2025, Champions Trophy: Jay Shah

NEW DELHI, Jul 7 (Agencies): Indian cricket board (BCCI) secretary Jay Shah on Sunday, July 7 confirmed that Rohit Sharma will captain India in the World Test Championship cycle and the Champions Trophy and expressed confidence that India will win two more International Cricket Council (ICC) tournaments next year. Jay Shah backed India to shine under Rohit's captaincy for at least another year while praising the efforts of the players in their T20 World Cup 2024 triumph.

BCCI secretary Jay Shah recalled that he had backed Rohit Sharma-led team to win the T20 World Cup and expressed delight that his words came true. Shah added that the heartbreak of the 2023 ODI World Cup final fuelled the Indian team to script history in the USA and the West Indies.

The Champions Trophy will be held in February-March 2025 as the 50-over tournament returns to the cricket calendar for the first time since 2017.
