Over 4,100 pilgrim leave Jammu base camp to join Amarnath Yatra

JAMMU, Jul 16 (Agencies): Amid heightened security, over 4,100 pilgrims left Jammu city in the early hours of Tuesday for the twin base camps in Kashmir to join the Amarnath Yatra, officials said.

The security has been heightened in and around the base camps and the yatra route following ambush that left four soldiers, including an officer. dead in a gunbattle in Dessa area of Jammu and Kashmir's Doda district.

Comprehensive arrangements — threetier security, area dominations, elaborate route deployment and checkpoints — have been put in place for a smooth yatra.

Army Officer among four soldiers Martyred in encounter with terrorists in Doda



JAMMU, Jul 16 (Agencies): Four army personnel, including an officer, who were critically injured in a gunfight with heavily-armed terrorists, succumbed to injuries in Doda district of Jammu and Kashmir early Tuesday, official

sources said. The encounter took place when the troops of Rashtriya Rifles and Special Operations Group of J&K Police launched a joint cordon and search operation at Dhari Gote Urarbagi in Desa forest belt, some

55 km from Doda town, late Monday evening, the officials said.

After a brief exchange of fire, the terrorists tried to escape but were chased by the brave troops led by an officer, despite challenging terrain and thick foliage, leading to another firefight in the woods around 9 pm, they said. Five soldiers were critically injured in the encounter and four of them, including the officer, later succumbed to injuries, the officials said

GANDERBAL, Jul 16 (Agencies): Three family members of a tourist group lost their lives, and one was seriously injured when a Tata sumo vehicle fell into a deep gorge at Zojila Pass on Tuesday.

Reports said that the tragic accident occurred on Tuesday morning when a Tata Sumo, bearing registration number JK13B 9919, was traveling from Sonamarg to Zero Point Zojila for site seen.

Reports said the driver of the vehicle had stopped to check on the vehicle at Panimatha Zojila pass apparently due to some technical issue. As he stepped out and moved to the back of the vehicle, the vehicle suddenly rolled down the slope and plummeted into the deep gorge.

Rescue teams, Police Locals and civil administration rushed to the scene, as the vehicle had already fallen into the deep gorge, making it challenging to reach the victims. Despite the efforts of the rescue teams, and locals three family members one male and two female were succumbed to their injuries and were pronounced dead at the spot. 



TERROR **INCIDENTS**

n the rugged terrain of Jammu and Kashmir, where beauty and conflict often coex-L ist, a recent terror incident has once again shaken the region to its core. This incident, like many before it, unfolded with tragic consequences, leaving a trail of devastation and sorrow in its wake.

It was a crisp morning in a remote village nestled amidst the Himalayan foothills. The villagers, predominantly farmers and herders, were beginning their day's work under the watchful gaze of the surrounding mountains. Little did they know that their tranquility would soon be shattered by the harbingers of terror.

The incident underscored the complexities of the longstanding conflict in J&K, where deep-seated grievances, geopolitical rivalries, and ideological differences continue to fuel instability. Yet, amidst the turmoil, there remained a glimmer of hope—a belief that through dialogue, cooperation, and mutual understanding, a sustainable peace could one day be achieved. The people of Jammu and Kashmir, resilient in the face of adversity, yearned for a future where such terror incidents would be consigned to history, and their homeland could flourish in peace and prosperity once more.

Constitution gives right to propagate religion... But laws make it an offence

o Indians have freedom of religion? Meaning, do they have the right to invite others into their faith and the right to easily leave their faith? The Constitution says yes, but the laws say no. India is an unusual nation where propagation is both a fundamental right and a criminal offence. A fundamental right is defined as one that enjoys a high level of protection from encroachment by the State. But Article 25 (right to freely profess and propagate religion) doesn't enjoy such protection.

In effect, the Constitution tells us we are free to propagate but when we do so the police shows up and takes us away. On July 11 this year it was reported that the Allahabad High Court rejected the bail of a man named Shriniwas Rav Nayak with the observation that "the Constitution confers on each individual the fundamental right to profess, practice and propagate his religion. However, the individual right to freedom of conscience and religion cannot be extended to construe a collective right to proselytise".

On the subcontinent, Nepal doesn't allow conversions, while Pakistan has the same phrasing as India does, with the same restrictions. There is no real freedom of religion in Pakistan, just as the honest observer will conclude there isn't in India. But this is not what was intended by those who wrote the Constitution.

The Constituent Assembly debate on religious freedom

happened on December 6, 1948. It came after meetings of the Minorities Committee and the Committee on Fundamental Rights, which discussed the issue in detail and produced a text, which is today Article 25. It reads: "Right to freedom of religion: Subject to public order, morality and health and the other provisions of this Part, all persons are equally entitled to freedom of conscience and the right freely to profess, practise and propagate religion".

The key word here is "propagate", which the dictionary defines as to spread and promote, and to breed. The context in which the word was debated by India's Constituent Assembly was of conversions, specifically by Christians.

Gujarat's K.M. Munshi, the Hindu conservative, was part of a group that arrived at the text and he said of the word "propagate" that: "I know it was on this word that the Christian community laid the greatest emphasis, not because they wanted to convert people aggressively, but because the word 'propagate' was a fundamental part of their tenet." And "so long as religion is religion, conversion by free exercise of conscience had to be recognised". People must not fear the idea of a right to propagate, Munshi said, because "whatever conversions take place... are only the result of persuasion and not because of material advantages".

Note that conversion was always accepted as the reason for propagation.

In the Interim Report on

Fundamental Rights dated May 1, 1947, Frank Anthony had spoken to the committee and said: "My community (he was an Anglo-Indian) does not propagate. We do not convert, nor are we converted. But I do appreciate how deeply, how passionately millions of Christians feel on this right to propagate their religion." Anthony, the founder of a school network around India, congratulated the majority for retaining "in spite of its contentious character" the words "to propagate", "a right which is regarded as perhaps the most fundamental of Christian rights".

T.T. Krishnamachari said Dalits became Christian because of the status it gave them, that Hindu reform would deter such conversions, and that the right to propagate also applied to Hindus and Arya Samaj members who were free to carry out their conversion activities, which they called "Shuddhi". The point here is that the meaning of the word "propagate" was understood by all as the right to, in Munshi's

words, "persuade people to join their faith". That is, to convert. But what would happen instead in India, as we see around us, is that the State would step in to not only the right to propagate but also the individual's right to change his/her religion.

The only opposition in the Constituent Assembly came from a 26-year-old man from Odisha, who wanted the word "propagate" removed. This was Loknath Misra, brother of Ranganath Misra, who would later become Chief Justice of

India, and uncle of Dipak Misra, also to become Chief Justice. Loknath Misra said he didn't have any problem with propagation. "If people should propagate their religion, let them do so", he said, but "only I crave, let not the Constitution put it as a fundamental right and encourage it". His opposition also came from an understanding of the right to propagate as meaning the right to convert.

V.P. Bharatiya, writing in the Journal of Indian Law Institute in 1977, says the specificity in the debates gave the impression that the inclusion of the word propagate "creates a specific fundamental right to convert".

Dr B.R. Ambedkar was present in the debate but did not speak. He said he had nothing to add to what the others had said in defence of the right to propagate. It must be noted that Ambedkar's original draft submitted to the Constituent Assembly's committees bore the words: "right to profess, to preach and to convert, within limits compatible with public order and morality". He was satisfied that propagate meant the same thing. He would himself leave Hinduism and convert to Buddhism along with more than three lakh other Dalits in Nagpur on October 14, 1956.

Beginning in the 1970s, India's judiciary and police began instituting a series of practices that have resulted in where we are today: a nation whose Constitution gives citizens freedom of religion but whose establishment disallows it through indiscriminate use of criminal law.


The poster features a hand holding a braid in a firm grip, a significant element in the film's narrative.



Congress Has Always Been Anti-Backward Classes: Amit Shah

Amit Shah asserted that the BJP will form the government in Haryana with a complete majority.

MAHENDRAGARH, Jul 16 (Agencies): Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Tuesday targeted the Congress, saying the opposition party has always been anti-backward classes. Addressing a 'Backward Classes Samman Sammelan' in Mahendragarh, Haryana, Amit Shah referred to the Kaka Kalekar Commission formed in the 1950s to provide reservation to Other Backward Classes (OBCs) and said the Congress did not implement its recommendations for years. "In 1980, (the then prime minister) Indira Gandhi put the Mandal Commission in cold



storage. In 1990, when it was accepted, Rajiv Gandhi gave a two-and-a-half-hour speech and opposed OBC reserva-

Muslims. The same will happen here if they come (to power) here," Amit Shah said.

"I want to assure you that we will not allow Muslim reservation in Haryana," he said.

He asserted that the BJP will form the government in Haryana with a complete majority.

The Haryana Assembly elections are scheduled to be held later this year.

This is Shah's second visit to Haryana in over the last fortnight. On June 29, he had addressed BJP leaders and workers during a meeting of the party's extended state executive in Panchkula.

5 killed, 42 injured as bus ferrying pilgrims hits tractor on Mumbai-Pune Expressway

MUMBAI, Jul 16 (Agencies): At least five persons were killed and 42 others injured when a bus carrying pilgrims hit a tractor on the Mumbai-Pune Expressway, police said on Tuesday.

The bus was ferrying 54 'warkaris' (devotees of Lord Vitthal) who were on their way to Pandharpur for the Ashadhi Ekadashi celebrations from their hometown Dombivli in Thane district near Mumbai, they said.

The accident took place at around midnight near Panvel in Navi Mumbai, an official said

Delhi High Court sets July 25 as deadline for Centre to decide on allotment of office space to AAP

NEW DELHI, Jul 16 (Agencies): The Delhi High Court on Tuesday granted the Centre time till July 25 to decide on allotment of office space to the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) here on account of it being recognised as a national party.

"In Karnataka, the Congress

On June 5, the high court granted six weeks to the Centre to decide the AAP's request in this matter.

The Directorate of Estates, Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs, on Tuesday, sought four more weeks to comply with the court's direction, stating it was occupied with the "mammoth task" of allotting accommodation to parliamentarians.

The senior counsel appearing for AAP opposed the Centre's request and emphasised that keeping in view the six-week deadline, which is expiring on Wednesday, the Supreme Court has granted the party time till August 10 as the last opportunity to vacate its present office in Rouse Avenue.

In March, the Supreme Court first granted the AAP time till June 15 to vacate its Rouse Avenue office after noting that the land was allotted to the Delhi High Court for expanding judicial infrastructure.

The senior counsel said the extension of time was being sought to leave the party without any remedy and the Centre did not express before the top court its inability to comply with the Delhi High Court's direction regarding the allotment of office space.

"Tomorrow is the last date when the order completes six weeks... You chose not to come before this court. What is the purpose to come at the fag end? If you don't want to give, what is stopping them from giving a reasoned order that you don't want to give," the senior counsel said. Justice Sanjeev Narula said "substantial time" has been granted to the authority to take a decision on the office space

allotment issue and a further extension of four weeks cannot be given.

"However, considering the overall facts and circumstances, the time period is extended till July 25, 2024. This court expects that no further applications will be presented by the applicant for seeking extension," the court said.

On June 5, the high court said the AAP was entitled to a space for a party office here like other national political parties and asked the Centre to decide on the issue within six weeks.

It had observed that national political parties have the right to secure allotment of one housing unit from the general pool in Delhi for office use on payment of licence fee until land is acquired by them for constructing its own accommodation.

"Pressure" or non-availability of a house in the general pool cannot be a reason for rejection of the request, the high court had said.

If the AAP's representation is rejected by the Centre, the party can take appropriate steps under law, the high court had said in its June order.

The party had moved the high court last year by filing two separate petitions seeking a piece of land in the national capital for the construction of its offices in view of its status as a recognised national party or allotment of a housing unit on a licence basis for the time being.

The petition seeking allotment of land to the AAP is still pending in the high court.

The Arvind Kejriwal-led party had said in court that since land has been allotted by the authorities to all other national parties for building offices in central locations of New Delhi, it is incumbent upon them to ensure that a similar allotment is also made to the AAP in accordance with its entitlement as per the Centre's policy.

Removal of barricades at Shambhu Border: Supreme Court to hear Haryana government's plea on July 22

NEW DELHI, Jul 16 (Agencies): The Supreme Court on (KMM) announced to march towards Delhi to press for their demands, including a lega guarantee to minimum support price (MSP) for crops. Citing the law and order situation as the reason for the blockade, the state government said, "It is humbly submitted that though the petitioner is most concerned about any inconvenience of any kind caused to the general public, the present SLP has been filed on an urgent basis...' "Despite the categorical submission regarding law and order issue that may arise, the threat to life and property and despite a plea to shift the agitators out of the National Highway, the high court has on an 'experimental basis' directed for opening of the Shambhu Border without passing any directions against the agitators," it said. The Haryana Government said law and order is a state subject under the Constitution and it is entirely the state's responsibility to assess ground realities, threat perception, likelihood of

breach of peace and violation of law. It said the high court order recorded that 400-500 trollevs and 50-60 other vehicles with a gathering of around 500 agitators are still at site at Shambhu Border but no directions had been issued to these "illegally agitating groups" to vacate the highway, to stop causing inconvenience and to stop creating law and order issues. More than five months after the "unlawful sealing of the border between Haryana and Punjab" to prevent farmers from "protesting peacefully", the Punjab and Haryana High Court had on Wednesday directed the state of Harvana to open the Shambhu border on an experimental basis to prevent inconvenience to the general public.

An HC Bench of Justice Gurmeet Singh Sandhawalia and Justice Vikas Bahl had said it was apparent that the "lifelines of the state of Punjab" were blocked on mere apprehensions, while "the cause has dwindled". As such, it would be in the general public's interest

The Supreme Court had on July 12 asked the Haryana Government to remove the barricades set up at the Shambhu border as it wondered how it could block a highway.

"How can a state block a highway? It has a duty to regulate traffic. We are saying open it but regulate," an SC Bench of Justice Surya Kant and Justice Ujjal Bhuyan had said after the Haryana Government counsel said the state was in the process of filing an appeal against the July 10 order of the Punjab and Haryana High Court directing it to open the highway in seven days. The Bench was hearing the Haryana Government's petition challenging the Punjab and Haryana High Court's order to constitute a committee headed by a former high court judge to investigate the death of Shubhkaran Singh - a farmer -- during a clash with Haryana security personnel in February.

Bihar: Six killed, several injured as speeding jeep rams into parked truck

PATNA, Jul 16 (Agencies): Six people were killed and several others were injured when the jeep they were travelling in rammed into a parked truck in Barh area on the outskirts of Patna on Tuesday, police said.

The identity of the deceased is yet to be ascertained.

Speaking to reporters, Barh II Subdivisional Police Officer (SDPO) Abhisek Singh said, "The incident took place on National Highway 31 (Bakhtiyarpur-Nalanda) in Barh early on Tuesday."

"According to eyewitnesses, the jeep in which victims were travelling hit a truck parked on the roadside from behind.

Four people died on the spot, while two others succumbed to their injuries during treatment," he said.

The other injured persons have been admitted to a hospital and their condition is stated to be stable, Singh said, adding further investigation is underway.

Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar condoled the deaths in the road accident.

The CMO, in a statement, said that Nitish Kumar expressed his deep anguish on the accident and offered his condolences to the bereaved families.

11-Year-Old Raped In Maharashtra's Thane, **Girl Among 4 Minor Accused**

MUMBAI, Jul 16 (Agencies): An 11-yearold girl was raped at Ambernath in Maharashtra's Thane district, police have said.

The main accused, a minor, has been detained along with five others. Four of the accused are minor and one is a girl, according to police.

Police said the 11-year-old was in Ambernath town when the accused girl talked



her into accompanying her to a nearby locality, where the other accused were waiting. There, the main accused raped her in an auto-rickshaw, the girl has said in her complaint.

News agency reported that the accused threatened the girl against talking about the assault to anyone.

But she managed to flee and reach home, and told her parents about the assault. A rape case has been registered under the new criminal code, Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, and the stringent Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act has also been invoked. Inspector Jagannath Kalaskar of Ambernath police station said two adult accused have been remanded in police custody and the minor accused have been sent

to a reform home.

Forty dead in heavy rains in eastern Afghanistan; 17 killed in bus accident

Taliban officials say heavy rains in eastern Afghanistan have killed at least 40 people and injured nearly 350 others

KABUL, Jul 16 (Agencies): Heavy rains in eastern Afghanistan have killed at least 40 people and injured nearly 350 others, Taliban officials said Tuesday. Separately, at least 17 died when a bus overturned on a main highway, official media said.

Sharafat Zaman Amar, a spokesperson for the Public Health Ministry, confirmed that 40 people had died in Monday's storm and that 347 injured people had been brought for treatment to the regional hospital in Nangarhar from Jalalabad, the capital of Nangarhar province, and nearby districts. Among the dead were five members of the same family who were killed when the roof of their house collapsed in Surkh Rod district, according



to provincial spokesperson Sediqullah Quraishi. Four other family members were injured. About 400 houses and 60 electricity poles were destroyed across Nangarhar province, Quraishi said. Power was cut in many areas and there were limited communications in Jalalabad city, he said. The damage was still being assessed, Quraishi said. Abdul Wali, 43, said much of

the damage occurred within an hour. "The winds were so strong that they blew everything into the air. That was followed by heavy rain," he said. His 4-year-old daughter received minor injuries, he said.

In May, exceptionally heavy rains killed more than 300 people and destroyed thousands of houses, mostly in the northern province of Baghlan, according to the World Food Program.

Separately, the official Taliban news agency Bakhtar reported that at least 17 people were killed and 34 others injured when a bus overturned Tuesday morning on the main highway linking Kabul and Balkh in northern Baghlan province.

The cause of the accident wasn't immediately clear, but poor road conditions and careless driving are often blamed for such incidents in the country.

Pakistani troops kill 10 militants responsible for attack on military base that left 8 soldiers dead

DERA ISMAIL KHAN, Jul 16 (Agencies): All 10 militants who rammed an explosive-laden vehicle into a Pakistani military facility were killed in an 18-hour operation, officials said Tuesday

In its statement, the Pakistani military said eight soldiers were killed when a suicide bomber early Monday rammed his explosive-laden vehicle into the outer wall of an army housing complex in Bannu, a city in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province.

A splinter group of Pakistani Taliban, led by a militant commander Gul Bahadur, claimed the attack, which has been denounced by the country's Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi and other officials.

The military said the suicide attack collapsed a portion of the wall and damaged nearby infrastructure, resulting in the killing of the eight soldiers. Responding to the attack, security

forces killed all ten attackers, it said. The military said a "timely and effective response by the security forces prevented major catastrophe."

Pakistan has consistently raised its

concerns with the Taliban government in Afghanistan, the military adds, "asking them to deny persistent use of Afghan soil by the terrorists and to take effective action against such elements.

The military said Pakistan's armed forces "will keep defending the motherland and its people against this menace of terrorism and will take all necessary measures as deemed appropriate against these threats emanating from Afghanistan."

There was no immediate comment from Kabul.

Pakistan has witnessed a surge in militant attacks, mostly in the northwest which borders Afghanistan, in recent years.

Most such previous attacks have been blamed on Pakistani Taliban, who are known as Tehrik-e-Taliban Pakistan or TTP. They are a separate group but also an ally of the Afghan Taliban. TTP has stepped up its attacks on security forces across the country since the Afghan Taliban seized power in Afghanistan in 2021.

Israeli police shoot, kill a Palestinian who stabbed an officer in the West Bank

GAZA, Jul 16 (Agencies): Israeli police said officers shot and killed a Palestinian after he stabbed a police officer Tuesday in the occupied West Bank. Police said the officer was lightly wounded in the attack and identified the Palestinian as a 19-year-old from the Gaza Strip. It wasn't immediately clear what he was doing in the West Bank.

The bloodshed is part of a wave of violence surging in the West Bank since the start of the war in Gaza. More than 500 Palestinians have been killed in the territory during that time, according to the Palestinian Health Ministry, most of them in fighting with Israeli forces. Others were killed while throwing stones, or in protests against the military. Some of those killed were not involved in confrontations with Israeli forces. Palestinian attacks against Israelis in the West Bank have also been on the rise since the war broke out.

Hamas' Oct. 7 attack sparked the war with militants storming into southern Israel, killing some 1,200 people mostly civilians — and abducting about 250. Since then, Israeli ground offensives and bombardments have killed more than 38,400 people in Gaza, according to the territory's Health Ministry. It does not distinguish between combatants and civilians in its count.

Most of Gaza's 2.3 million people are crammed into squalid tent camps in central and southern Gaza. Israeli restrictions, fighting and the breakdown of law and order have limited humanitarian aid efforts, causing widespread hunger and sparking fears of famine.

Under American pressure, Israel has pledged to deliver large quantities of humanitarian aid into the war-ravaged Gaza Strip. But at the same time. the U.S. and Israel have allowed taxdeductible donations to far-right groups that have blocked that aid from being delivered

Violent clashes over quota system in government jobs leave scores injured in Bangladesh

DHAKA, Jul 16 (Agencies): Police fired tear gas and charged with batons during violent clashes between a pro-government student body and student protesters overnight, leaving dozens injured at a public university outside Bangladesh's capital, police and students said Tuesday.

The violence spread early Tuesday at Jahangir Nagar University in Savar, outside Dhaka, where the protesters were demanding an end to a government job quota for family members of heroes who fought in Bangladesh's war of independence in 1971.

In a post on X, JD Vance stated, "Just overwhelmed with gratitude. What an honor it is to run alongside President Donald J. Trump. He delivered peace and prosperity once, and with your help, he'll do it again. Onward to victory!"

His statement comes after former US President Donald Trump made his pick for Vice President, selecting JD Vance as his running mate on Monday. Trump confirmed Vance's candidature through a post on Truth Social.

"After lengthy deliberation and thought, and considering the tremendous talents of many others, I have decided that the person best suited to assume the position of Vice President of the United States is Senator JD Vance of the Great State of Ohio," Trump posted on Truth Social

After years of criticising Trump, Vance has embraced the populist ideology of the former president; this choice further elevates him.

After getting support from Trump in a fierce Republican primary, Vance -- a venture entrepreneur and the author of the best-selling memoir "Hillbilly Elegy"--was elected to the US Senate in 2022, according to CNN.

Vance was born James David Bowman in Middletown, Ohio, to a mother who struggled with addiction and a father who left the family when JD was a toddler. He was raised by his grandparents.

In 2017, Vance returned to Ohio and continued to work in venture capital. He and his wife, Usha Chilukuri Vance, whom he met at Yale. have three children. Usha Vance, born Usha Chilukuri, is an attorney who has carved out a successful career in the legal field

Born to Indian immigrant parents, she grew up with a strong emphasis on education and hard work in a San Diego, California, suburb. Usha attended Yale University and also graduated from Yale Law School.

While at Yale, Usha served as managing editor of the Yale Journal of Law & Technology and executive development editor of The Yale Law Journal, according to a biography from the Munger, Tolles & Olson law firm.

Germany's top security official bans a far-right magazine, accusing it of spreading hatred

BERLIN, Jul 16 (Agencies): Germany's top security official on Tuesday banned a farright magazine, accusing it of stirring up hatred against Jews, people with immigrant roots and parliamentary democracy.

Interior Minister Nancy Faeser banned Compact magazine and the company that publishes it, Compact-Magazin GmbH, as well as a film production company, Conspect Film. Police raided properties and apartments in four German regions linked to the organizations, their management and shareholders, her ministry said.

Faeser described Compact as "a central mouthpiece of the rightwing extremist scene." She said in a statement that "this magazine agitates in an unspeakable way against Jews,

against people with a history of migration and against our parliamentary democracy."

"Our signal is clear: We will not allow who belongs in Germany and who doesn't to be defined by ethnicity." Faeser added.

Compact is run by far-right figure Jürgen Elsässer and produces the monthly magazine of the same name, which has a circulation of about 40,000, as well as an online video channel, Compact TV. It also runs an online shop selling books, CDs, DVDs and other merchandise. Compact has been published since 2010. In its annual report for 2023, Germany's domestic intelligence agency said that it "regularly disseminates ... antisemitic, anti-minority, historically revisionist and conspiracy theory

content."

It said a main feature is agitation against parliamentary democracy in general and the German government in particular, and quoted Elsässer as saying on Compact's home page last year that "we want to topple this regime."

The strength of the far right has caused increasing concern in Germany in recent months.

Last month, the farright Alternative for Germany party took 15.9% of the vote to finish second in the European Parliament election, despite recent scandals and setbacks.

The co-leaders of the party, Alice Weidel and Tino Chrupalla, decried the ban on Compact as "a serious blow to press freedom." They alleged that Faeser "is abusing her authority in order to suppress critical reporting.'

Hardik Pandya to lead India in 3-match T20Is against Sri Lanka

For ODI series, Pandya has asked for leave and communicated this to skipper Rohit Sharma, who is also taking a break from this series

NEW DELHI, Jul 16 (Agencies): Star all-rounder Hardik Pandya is all set to lead India in the three-match T20 International series against Sri Lanka starting July 27.

However, one of the heroes of India's T20 World Cup victory last month will take a break during the three-match ODI series, which is scheduled in August, due to "personal reasons"

"Hardik Pandya was India's T2O vice-captain under Rohit Sharma. He is completely fit and available for the threematch T20I series and will lead the side," a senior BCCI source told agency on conditions of anonymity.

Rohit retired from T20 Internationals at the end of the World Cup.

The T20Is against Sri Lanka will run from July 27 to 30 in Pallekele, followed by the ODIs from August 2 to 7 in Colombo. The squad for the series is expected to be announced in the next couple of days.



While there is still no clarity on who would be Pandya's deputy, the toss-up is between Shubman Gill, who recently captained India to a 4-1 series win over Zimbabwe, and Suryakumar Yadav, who led the side during the T20Is against South Africa last year.

About the ODIs, the official confirmed that Pandya has asked for leave and has already communicated this to regular skipper Rohit Sharma, who is also taking a break from this series.

"The break from ODIs is for very personal reasons. Hardik doesn't have any fitness issue as is being floated in the media." the official said.

For the ODIs, KL Rahul, who

led in the last ODI series in South Africa, and Gill are in contention for the leadership role. Thrust on domestic availability BCCI secretary Jay Shah has made it clear that even star cricketers must make themselves available for domestic engagements when they are free from national duty. But exceptions will be made for the likes of Rohit, Virat Kohli and pace spearhead Jasprit Bumrah.

The BCCI would, however, want all the other Test specialists to play at least one if not a couple of Duleep Trophy games in August as a precursor to the Tests against Bangladesh and New Zealand.

"This time there is no zonal selection committee for Duleep Trophy. Only national selection committee will pick Duleep teams.

"All Test team contenders will be picked. For Rohit, Virat and Bumrah, it will be their choice if they want to play or not," the source added.

Paris 2024: Lakshya Sen is underdog in reasonable Olympics draw, says coach Vimal

NEW DELHI, Jul 16 (Agencies): Indian shuttler Lakshya Sen has received a "fair" draw for his debut at the Paris Olympics, according to his coach Vimal Kumar. Vimal believes Sen, currently World No. 19, can play freely thanks to his "underdog" status and recent technical improvements. Sen's path to an Olympic medal is challenging, featuring familiar adversaries like Indonesian Jonatan Christie, Guatemala's Kevin Cordon (the surprise semifinalist from the last Olympics), and Belgium's Julian Carraggi in Group L. "I think it (the draw) is very fair, I feel it is a very reasonable draw for him," Vimal, a former India coach, told PTI from Marseille, France, where Sen is currently training ahead of the Paris Olympics. "A couple of times, he has lost to Jonatan Christie in close matches. It's a 50-50 match. You have to convert (chances) if you have to get to the second stage. In my opinion, Lakshya has nothing to lose. He will be the underdog and he can play a lot more freely," he asserted. Vimal described Sen

as a big-match player, expressing confidence in his ability to overcome Christie, a former Asian Games champion and member of Indonesia's 2022 Thomas Cup-winning team. Sen worked on his front-court alertness and composure in the closing stages. At 22, he aims to become the first Indian male shuttler to reach the Olympic podium. India's previous badminton Olympic medals have been won by Saina Nehwal (bronze in 2012, London) and P V Sindhu (silver in 2016, Rio de Janeiro and bronze in 2020, Tokyo). "Jonatan will be the last match of the group and Lakshya should pull through. So I see a lot of posi-

tives. Not going to the

Canada Open was a dampener, but he has overcome that. Being away here in similar conditions will help him." Vimal noted, referring to Sen's absence from the Canada Open due to

visa issues. To prepare Sen, Korea's Yoo Yong-Sung, a two-time men's doubles Olympic silver-medalist, was brought back to refine his net game, improve his on-court pace, and enhance his focus in critical moments. Yoo Yong-Sung had previously worked with Sen in 2022. "We have brought in a lot of speed work into closing stages, we introduced a lot of double drills in finishing, pushing the pace towards certain points. In the last three weeks, Yoo Yong-Sung has been helping us with those drills," Vimal said. Sen has also been practicing various service techniques. "(The idea is) basically to bring in some sort of

intensity in the routines. Certain sets of routines that we follow are mostly singles-oriented. He (Sen) worked on those flat exchanges, retrieving and things like approaching the net and being a little more alert at the net," Vimal explained.

Sen has been training at the Halles des Sports Parsemain in Fos-sur-Mer, about 45 minutes from Marseille city center. He is training with the Olympic-bound Popov brothers, Christo and Toma Junior, until July 21, alongside Indian shuttlers Kiran George and Ayush Shetty for sparring. "Next week, we will be doing one set of tournament practice because he needs that little bit of match practice. It would have been good to see him in Canada. So next week, I want to see how he is implementing what he learned. Against both the Popov brothers, it will be a good test. So

I'll be able to assess him. Once he gets into the village in Paris, we won't get to play much. We will have limited time for practice in the main arena," Vimal said. Sen struggled through much of 2023 and early 2024, lagging in the qualification race, but managed to turn things around with two semifinal finishes at the All England Championship and the French Open, securing his Olympic spot. "From all that he has survived, he got an opportunity to qualify. He has been practicing and has worked on his game. Lakshya has acclimatized to the conditions; he plays well there. We have also got some of that tournament shuttlecock (F-90) because the conditions are a little on the slower side in Paris. So we have been practicing with those shuttles," said Vimal, who guided Saina Nehwal to world No. 1 in 2015.

Remember their faces: Kohli says good luck to India's Olympic-bound athletes



NEW DELHI, Jul 16 (Agencies): Cricket's reigning superstar Virat Kohli has urged the nation to get behind its Olympic-bound contingent, asking the fans to join him in supporting the athletes as "they inch closer to the podium with dogged determination" in the quadrennial showpiece starting July 26 in Paris. In a little over a minute long video post on social media, featuring some Paris-bound athletes like javelin thrower Neeraj Chopra and boxing hope Nishant Dev, Kohli said it is time for India to be recognised as a global sporting powerhouse.

"There was a time when the world could only think of India as a land of snake charmers and elephants. Over time, that has changed. Today we are known to the world as the largest democracy, a global tech hub," he said. "We are known for cricket and Bollywood, for start-up unicorns and as the

fastest-growing economy in the world. So, what is the next big thing for this great nation? Well, that will be more gold, more silver and more bronze," he added.

He then went on to address Indian sports fans, asking them to support the 118-strong group of athletes, who would be aiming to better the country's best ever performance of seven medals achieved in the previous Games in Tokyo.

"Our brothers and sisters are headed to Paris, hungry for medals. A billion of us will be watching them nervous and excited as our athletes set foot in the tracks and fields and courts and rings," the veteran batsman said.

"Every neighbourhood, every corner of India will hear a chorus of voices chanting 'India, India, India'. Join me in remembering their faces as they inch closer to the podium with the dogged determination to wave the Tiranga with pride. Jai Hind and good luck India," Kohli, who is currently in London on a break after India's T20 World Cup triumph in the West Indies last month, said in his monologue.

Most of the Indian competitors are currently training abroad and will head to the French capital from their respective bases.

India's medal hopes will rest on shooting, badminton, wrestling, and boxing aside from the expectations of a second successive podium finish from Chopra, who scripted history with his javelin throw gold in Tokyo.

Infiltration bid foiled three terrorists eliminated while crossing LC


