Man electrocuted in South Kashmir

SRINAGAR, Aug 3 (Agencies): An elderly man died after receiving an electric shock at his home in the Trich area of South Kashmir's Pulwama district, officials said on Saturday. They said 75-year-old

Ghulam Qadir Bhat, son of Mohammad Abdullah Bhat and a resident of Trich, Pulwama, was shocked while handling an electric motor during domestic work.

He was brought to District Hospital Pulwama in an unconscious state and later succumbed to his injuries.

The body of the deceased is at District Hospital Pulwama for medico-legal formalities.

Kashmir reports 43 drownings in July, several confirmed as **suicides**

SRINAGAR, Aug 3 (Agencies): A video of a woman committing suicide by jumping into the Jhelum River has gone viral on social media. Many similar videos of people ending their lives by jumping into water bodies have recently emerged on these plat-

forms. Last month, the Kashmir recorded 43 drowning cases, with over a dozen being suicide attempts, according to an official from the State Disaster Response Force. "This year so far, there has been a significant number of drowning cases. As per the data available with us, 40 such incidents occurred last month, and out of them, more than a dozen were suicide cases," the

Govt terminates six employees over narco-terror links

SRINAGAR, Aug 3 (Agencies): The Jammu and Kashmir administration on Saturday sacked six government employees, including five policemen, for their "deep involvement in anti-national activities", officials said.

J-K Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha invoked article 311(2)(c) of the Constitution to terminate them from service, they said.

Under proviso 'c' of the Article, the president or the governor, is empowered to terminate an employee without



procedure if satisfied that the person's retention in public service is prejudicial to the security of the

"The government today dismissed six employees - five from the police department (constables) and one from the education department (teacher) - for their deep involvement in anti-national activities," an official said.

Their activities had come to the notice of law enforcement and intelligence agencies, and they found them "thickly involved" in activities prejudicial to the interests of the State, evidencing their involvement in terror-related activities, they

According to the report, due to climate change events, schools are being closed every year in most low and middle income countries. While education systems and their consequences are already being disrupted by the effects of climate change, this report revealing the facts of school closures is certainly worth considering.

The direct effects of climate

The report shows that schools were closed during at least 75 percent of extreme weather events in the last 20 years, affecting 5 million or more people. While children and teachers lost their lives due to the continuity of natural disasters like floods and cyclones, it also caused damage to school buildings. The report also mentions in detail the impact of climate change on India.

When various states in our country are affected by floods, children miss school for a long time. Children are unable to go to school during forest fires. in different states, every year, holidays have to be given to small children in

the harsh winter by the order of the District Collector. Similar precautionary measures are taken during extreme heat and rains. Certainly, this is harming the education of children. If they fall behind in studies, they are unable to score the expected marks. Climate change is a big crisis, to avoid it, full preparation will have to be done. Education is necessary for this. Only educated children will be able to understand the causes of climate change and ways to deal with it. Today, as much as literacy is necessary, climate literacy is also as inevitable.

The Prime Minister said agriculture is at the centre of India's economic policies, and the Union Budget 2024-25 has given a big push to sustainable and climate-resilient farming and developing a complete ecosystem to support Indian farmers.

NEW DELHI, Aug 3 (Agencies): Prime Minister Narendra Modi today said India has become a food surplus country and is also working to provide solutions for global food and nutritional security.

The Prime Minister said agriculture is at the centre of India's economic policies, and the Union Budget 2024-25 has given a big push to sustainable and climate-resilient farming and developing a complete ecosystem to support Indian farmers.

He was addressing the 32nd International Conference of Agricultural Economists (ICAE), which is being organised in India after 65 years.

Recalling the last International Conference of Agricultural Economists, PM Modi mentioned that India was then a newly Independent nation, and it was a challenging time for the country's agriculture and food security.

"Now, India is a food surplus country," he said, adding that the country is the number one producer of milk, pulses and spices in the world.

Also, the country has become the second-largest producer of foodgrains, fruits, vegetables, cotton, sugar and tea.

"There was a time when India's food security was a concern for the world. Now, India is working to provide solutions for global food security and global nutritional security," he said at the conference, attended by about 1,000 delegates from around 70 countries.

Uddhav Thackeray accuses BJP



PUNE, Aug 3 (Agencies): Shiv Sena (UBT) chief Uddhav Thackeray on Saturday launched a broadside against the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), accusing the former ally of indulging in "power jihad" by breaking political parties to form a government.

Hitting back at Union Home Minister Amit Shah for his "Aurangzeb Fan Club' barb aimed at him, he dubbed the top BJP leader a political descendant of Ahmad Shah Abdali, the Afghan king who defeated the Marathas in the third battle of Panipat.

Addressing party workers at the Shiv Sankalp rally here, he also accused the Eknath Shinde-led dispensation of bribing voters by giving "revdis" (freebies) to them in the form of schemes like the Mukhyamantri Ladki Bahin Yojana, under which eligible women in the state will get Rs 1,500 every month.

Accusing the former ally of breaking parties, he said, "If Muslims are with us after we explained to them our Hindutva, then we are (according to the BJP) the Aurangzeb Fan Club. Then what you are doing is power jihad."

During an event in Pune last month, Shah had attacked Thackeray and dubbed him "the head of the Aurangzeb fan club" who was "sitting with people who sought pardon for 1993 Mumbai serial blasts convict Yakub Memon".

Referring to his remarks, Thackeray, who had challenged his friend-turned-adversary and Maharashtra Deputy Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis that "either you will be there or I will (in politics)", said he was not referring to any person.

"Some people thought I challenged someone, but I don't challenge bed bugs. Here, 'I' means my cultured Maharashtra and 'you' means the party which loots Maharashtra," the former chief minister said.

Bed bugs are not supposed to be challenged, but crushed, he said.

Attacking Prime Minister Narendra Modi over photos of leakage in the new Parliament building, Thackeray said the new complex has started leaking in just 14 months.

The PM asks what the Congress did in 60-70 years, but Modi should give an account on why the new Parliament building, which was built barely a year ago, started leaking, he said.

"This government (at the Centre) is a leakage government. There are paper leaks also," he said.

Thackeray also accused the BJP of engineering division among castes.

"This is not the Hindutva taught to us by Chhatrapati Shivaji. This (the one practised by the BJP) must have been taught by Aurangzeb which we do not believe in. Our Hindutva is the one that takes forward the Maharashtra dharma of Chhatrapati Shivaji," he said

Taking a dig at the delay in getting judgement on disqualification of MLAs who rebelled against him, Thackeray said, "We have faith in the judiciary. The result will be given in 5-50 years. The term of (the legislative assembly) is getting over. Even if they (the rebel MLAs) are disqualified, they can contest polls."

Thackeray added that democracy was getting murdered in broad daylight and stressed that justice will be delivered in the court of the people.

Talking about the pothole-riddled roads during the monsoon, he hit out at Union Road Transport Minister Nitin Gadkari.

"Potholes are everywhere, including in Mumbai, Pune and other cities. Gadkari once said he will build such roads that even after 200 years there will be no single pothole on it. But looking at the condition of roads, Gadkari should be given the 'Khadde Purush' (man of potholes) award. The Mumbai-Goa Highway is still under construction," Thackeray added.

The National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) recovered the body on Saturday and sent it for post-mortem, they said.

Locals said that the driver had been warned against crossing the submerged bridge.

Torrential rains have led to waterlogging in both Paschim Bardhaman and Purba Bardhaman districts and in

RUDRAPRAYAG, Aug 3 (Agencies): The operation to rescue pilgrims stranded along a rain-ravaged trek route to the Himalayan Kedarnath shrine in Uttarakhand entered its third day on Saturday.

More than 10,500 people have been evacuated, some airlifted by air force helicopters.

Officials said around 1,300 pilgrims are stranded in Kedarnath, Bhimbali and Gaurikund, and are safe.

Personnel of the State Disaster Response Force (SDRF), the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) and police are engaged in the rescue operation

The Indian Air Force's Chinook and MI17 helicopters airlifted some pilgrims from the area on Friday.

Rudraprayag Superintendent of Police (SP) Vishakha Ashok Bhadane dismissed rumours of



a large number of people missing following a cloudburst near the trek-route.

"Almost all reported individuals have reached home," the official said and appealed to the public not to believe rumours.

She said, "Many people may not be able to contact their families due to poor network and bad weather."

The pilgrim, who died in a landslide near Tharu camp at Lincholi on Friday, was identi-

fied as Shubham Kashyap. He was a resident of Saharanpur in Uttar Pradesh, District Disaster Management Officer Nandan Singh Rajwar said.

Two mobile-phones were among the items found near the body and have been handed over to the Lincholi police outpost, Rajwar said.

The trek route to Kedarnath suffered extensive damage as a result of a cloudburst in Jungle-chatti near Lincholi on Wednes-

day nigh

The pilgrims got stranded beyond Bhimbali along the Gaurikund-Kedarnath trek route when a 20-25 metre stretch of the road was washed away by the waters of a swollen Mandakini river.

The trek route to the Himalayan temple is blocked by boulders at Ghoraparav, Lincholi, Badi Lincholi and Bhimbali.

The yatra to Kedarnath has been put on hold for the time being, with an advisory of the Rudraprayag administration asking pilgrims to wait wherever they are till the route is cleared of debris and repaired.

Two helpline numbers --7579257572 and 01364-233387 -- and one emergency number 112 have also been issued by the district administration to help people get information about their stranded kin among the pilgrims, the officials said.

32 Killed In Al-Shabaab Suicide Bomb Attack In Somalia's Capital

MOGADISHU, Aug 3 (Agencies): An Al-Shabaab suicide bomber and gunmen attacked a busy beach in the Somali capital Mogadishu, killing 32 people and wounding scores more, in one of the deadliest attacks in months, police said on Saturday.

The Al-Qaeda-linked jihadists have been waging an insurgency against the internationally backed federal government for more than 17 years and have previously targeted the Lido beach area, popular with business people and officials.

Unverified videos shared online in the immediate aftermath of the attack showed people scattering along a street, with a number of clips purporting to show bloodied bodies lying on the beachfront.

"More than 32 civilians died in this attack and about 63 others were wounded, some of them critically," police spokesman Abdifatah Adan Hassan told reporters during a press conference.

Hamas commander among 5 killed in Israeli airstrike in West Bank

An Israeli airstrike on a vehicle in the occupied West Bank killed a Hamas commander and four others, with their identities still not clear.



RAMALLAH, Aug 3 (Agencies): An Israeli airstrike on a vehicle in the occupied West Bank killed a commander in the Palestinian armed group Hamas on Saturday, Hamas media reported, while Palestinian news agency WAFA said four other men were also killed.

The identities of the others were not clear, according to the WAFA report, which cited health officials.

The Israeli military said it had carried out

an airstrike against a terror cell around the West Bank city of Tulkarm. Hamas media said a vehicle carrying fighters had been struck and that one of the commanders of its Tulkarm brigades was killed.

Violence in the West Bank was on the rise before the Israel-Hamas war in Gaza began on October 7 and has risen since, with frequent Israeli raids in the territory, which is among those that the Palestinians seek for a state. Regionwide tensions have soared this week after the assassination of Hamas' leader, Ismail Haniyeh, in Tehran on Wednesday, a day after an Israeli strike in Beirut killed Hezbollah senior military commander Fuad Shukr.

Haniyeh's death was one in a series of killings of senior Hamas figures as the war in Gaza between the Palestinian outfits and Israel nears its 11th month and concern grows that the conflict is spreading across the Middle East.

Hamas and Iran have both accused Israel of carrying out the killing and have pledged to retaliate against their foe. Israel has neither claimed nor denied responsibility for the death.

Hezbollah, like Hamas, is backed by Iran and has also vowed revenge.

Vietnam's Communist Party names To Lam top leader

HANOI, Aug 3 (Agencies): Vietnamese President To Lam was formally named the country's top leader Saturday, pledging to "speed up" a sweeping graft campaign that has snared thousands in recent years.

The Communist Party elected Lam as general secretary in the morning, the party said at a press conference, making him the most powerful figure in Vietnam's leadership structure,

It was not immediately clear if Lam would simultaneously continue to serve as president, a largely ceremonial position.

In his first remarks as general secretary, Lam pledged to "speed up" a sweeping anti-corruption campaign that has seen thousands -- including top officials and senior business leaders -- caught up in the crackdown.

"(I will) continue to speed up anti-corruption ... regardless of who the person is," Lam told a press conference.

"We have gained the trust of the people, and international friends, in our fight". Lam's appointment comes two weeks after the death of General Secretary Nguyen Phu Trong, Vietnam's most powerful leader in decades.

Trong died in the capital Hanoi "due to old age and serious illness" and Lam was informally handed the reins of power.

Lam's succession to the top job follows a long career within the secretive public security ministry, which deals



with the monitoring of dissent and surveillance of activists in Vietnam, a one-party state.

Lam, 67, led the ministry from 2016 until earlier this year, when he was voted in as president.

That came in the wake of the resignation of his predecessor, as part of the sweeping anti-graft purge.

The so-called "blazing furnace" campaign has proved popular with the public, but analysts have warned the turmoil is threatening the country's reputation for stability.

The communist party has undergone a series of upheavals in recent months, with ministers, business leaders and two presidents all falling from grace as part of the vast campaign.

And with many fearful of being caught in its crosshairs, everyday transactions within business and the state apparatus have slowed.

At least two dead, 17 went missing after landslides in southwest China

BEIJING, Aug 3 (Agencies): Landslides in southwest China destroyed homes and caused a highway bridge to collapse on Saturday, killing at least two people and leaving around 17 others missing, authorities said.

State broadcaster CCTV said "local mountain torrents and land-

slides" swept away part of Ridi village in Garze Tibetan autonomous prefecture, Sichuan province.

In a separate statement, Garze's local government said "a sudden mountain torrent and landslide" caused a highway tunnel bridge to collapse along the highway between Kang-

ding and Luding. Traffic was suspended along stretches of two highways in Garze, the government said in a further statement. Garze lies in a mountainous area at the foothills of the Himalayas and has a large Tibetan population.

Officials had confirmed that at least three vehicles had plunged off the road, carrying six people of whom "one person has been rescued and five are missing", the government said in a social media post.

22 injured during explosion in paddock area at Germany's Nuerburgring racing track

BERLIN, Aug 3 (Agencies): Twenty-two people were injured by an explosion in the paddock area of Germany's famous Nuerbergring racetrack, police said Saturday.

Police said the accident, which they believe was caused by the explosion of a compressed air canister on Friday night, injured one person severely, three seriously and the others slightly, German news agency dpa reported. Police were still on the scene to investigate the cause



on Saturday

Several people were taken to nearby hospitals by helicopter.

The accident took place behind a pit in track's paddock area during a test and set-up run ahead of the NLS4 race, officials at the track in the West German town of Nuerberg said in a statement.

Organizers said the NLS24 race would go ahead after consultation with all parties involved, but said participation was voluntary.

Hezbollah to choose targets, strike "deeper" inside Israel: Iran

TEHRAN, Aug 3 (Agencies): Iran said on Saturday it expects Lebanon's Tehran-backed Hezbollah group to hit deeper inside Israel and no longer be confined to military targets after Israel killed the Hezbollah military commander.

Hezbollah has been exchanging near-daily fire with Israeli forces, saying it is targeting military positions over the border, since its Palestinian ally Hamas attacked Israel on October 7, sparking war in Gaza.

But a strike claimed by Israel in an overcrowded residential area of South Beirut changed the calculus, Iran's mission to the United Nations said.

"We expect... Hezbollah to choose more targets and (strike) deeper in its response," said



the official IRNA news agency.

"Secondly, that it will not limit its response to military targets."

The strike on Tuesday killed Hezbollah commander Fuad Shukr. According to Lebanon's health ministry, five civilians -- three women and two children -- also died. Israel said Shukr was responsible for rocket fire that killed 12 youths

in the annexed Golan

Heights, and had direct-

ed Hezbollah's attacks

on Israel since the Gaza

war began.

"Hezbollah and the (Israeli) regime had observed certain lines", including limiting strikes to border areas and military targets, Iran's mission said.

The Beirut strike crossed that line, it added.

Hours after Shukr's killing, the political leader of Hamas, Ismail Haniyeh, was killed in a pre-dawn "hit" on his accommodation in Tehran, Iran's Revolutionary Guards said.

Israel has declined to comment.

On Thursday, Hezbollah chief Hassan Nasrallah said Israel and "those who are behind it must await our inevitable response" to the killings of both Shukr and Haniyeh.

Iran and Hamas have also vowed to retaliate.

Islamic State commander among 3 arrested in Pakistan's Punjab



LAHORE, Aug 3 (Agencies): Pakistani law enforcement agencies have arrested three suspected terrorists, including an "important" commander of Islamic State (ISIS) in the Punjab province of the country, police said on Saturday.

The Counter Terrorism Department (CTD) of Punjab Police said in a statement that three ISIS terrorists have been arrested during an intelligence-based operation in the Faisalabad, Jehlum and Chakwal cities.

ISIS, Abdul Wahab, has been among the arrested terrorists. The other two ISIS terrorists have been identified as Saifullah and Khurram Abbas.

Explosives and weapons have been recovered from

The CTD said that an "important" commander of

the suspects, according to the statement.

Those arrested have been shifted to an undisclosed place for further investigation.

Last month, the CTD arrested 38 suspected terrorists, mostly belonging to ISIS and the Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) in the Punjab province.

6.8-magnitude earthquake hits off Philippines' Mindanao: USGS MANILA, Aug 3 damage was expected Earthquakes regu-

MANILA, Aug 3 (Agencies): A 6.8-magnitude earthquake struck off the coast of the southern Philippines on Saturday, but no tsunami warning was issued and there were no immediate reports of damage, said the United States Geological Survey.

The shallow quake hit just before 6:30 am (2230 GMT) about 20 kilometres (12 miles) away from the village of Barcelona on the east of Mindanao island, USGS said.

A series of aftershocks were felt in some areas in Mindanao, with the strongest at 5.9 magnitude about 36 kilometres east of Barcelona, according to USGS.

The local seismological agency said no from the earthquake.

In Lingig municipality, where Barcelona is located, local disaster officer Ian Onsing said he was woken by the tremor.

"The shaking was

quite strong. The things around here were moving. I guess, the shaking took around 10-15 seconds. So far, there are no reported casualties or damages. We are now monitoring the shores for any rough movement," Onsing told agency over the telephone.

"Aftershocks are happening here every after two minutes, but we're glad it's not as strong as the earthquake this morning," Onsing said.

Philippines is an earthquake prone country larly strike the Philippines, which sits along the Pacific Ring of Fire, an arc of intense seismic and volcanic activity that stretches from Japan through Southeast Asia and across the Pacific basin.

Most earthquakes are too weak to be felt by humans but strong and destructive that come at random with no technology available to predict when and where they will happen.

In December, a 7.6-magnitude quake struck off Mindanao, briefly triggering a tsunami warning that sent residents along the east coast of the island fleeing buildings, evacuating a hospital and seeking higher ground. At least three people died.

Govt terminates six employees over narco-terror links

Din, Khalid Hussian Shah and Irshad Ahmad Chalkoo, Constable Rahmat Shah and teacher Nazam Din.

Saif Din, a resident of Shigani Bhallesa in Doda district, was a "deeply motivated and committed drug peddler as well as an over ground worker for terrorists of proscribed terrorist organisations like the Hizbul Mujahideen", the official said.

"He had established drug channels which are being used by anti-national agencies and elements to smuggle weapons, narcotics and to facilitate infiltration of terrorists into J-K," the official added.

Head Constable Sheikh, a resident of Ibkoote Tangdar area of Kupwara, along with Khalid Shah and Rahmat Shah received a huge consignment of narcotics from Pakistan-occupied Jammu and Kashmir-based smugglers from across the LoC, the officials said.

Sheikh was in contact with Pakistan-based terrorists who have been involved in smuggling narcotics, weapons and money from across the Line of Control (LoC), they said.

Khalid Shah, a resident of Chanipora Payeen Tangdar area of Kupwara, used his knowledge of the area to establish contact with drug smugglers in PoJK. He was at the forefront of running a drug cartel in the Kupwara-Karnah region.

The officials said Rahmat Shah, a resident of Panjowa Pingla Haridal in the Karnah area of Kupwara, had received a huge consignment of narcotics from across the LoC for selling it in other parts of the country. The earnings were to be used for a "larger game plan of adversary agency to destabilise J-K", they said.

The officials said all three — Sheikh, Khalid Shah and Rahmat Shah — had established contacts with Pakistan-based terrorists.

"They used to smuggle drugs from Pakistan, and the money generated through the illegal trade of these drugs was being used for fuelling unrest as well as financing terrorism activities...." the official said.

"They were in contact with large number of drug peddlers and over ground Workers of a proscribed terrorist organisation, and were a part of the modus operandi for arranging funding for terrorism in the Kashmir Valley and other parts of the country," the official added.

Chalkoo, a resident of Silikote area of Uri in Baramulla, had developed a close relationship with terrorist associates in the area and started working as an over ground worker for the Laskhar-e-Taiba, the officials said.

"He was in close contact with various Kashmiri origin terrorists based in PoJK, through encrypted messaging applications and had received arms/ammunition for further delivery to the terrorists," the official said.

Being a resident of Uri, Chalkoo utilised his knowledge of the local terrain to establish contact with terrorists based in PoJK. He used to assist terrorist groups, during infiltration, by providing logistics and transportation of their illegal arms and ammunition in the interior areas of the Kashmir Valley, the officials said.

Teacher Nazam Din, a resident of Kirni Haveli of Poonch district, is a "highly motivated and committed drug peddler", and an over ground worker for terrorists of the Hizbul Mujahideen, they said.

"He had received consignments of narcotics from across the LoC for onward delivery to drug peddlers, even in Punjab. He was in constant touch with hardcore terrorists in Pakistan, who ex-filtrated for terrorist training

and are currently active in terrorist activities from PoJK," the official said.
"He smuggled drugs from Pakistan, and

the money generated through illegal trade of these drugs was used for fuelling unrest as well as financing the terrorism activities in the Kashmir valley, as well as other parts of the country, being an important source in the narco-terror system," the official said.

SSB DG Chawdhary to hold additional charge of BSF

Chawdhary is the DG of the Sashastra Seema Bal (SSB), the force that guards India's fronts with Nepal and Bhutan.

absence of a democratically elected government in the region since 2014.

"Jammu and Kashmir has been stripped of its status and downgraded to a Union Territory. This move was rejected by the people of J&K and Ladakh. Never before has such a measure been taken, where a full-fledged state has been dismantled in this way. The people of J&K and Ladakh reject these decisions. It is time to rectify these injustices. Our statehood must be reinstated, and a democratically elected government should be restored to the region," he said.

He also highlighted the decline in conditions at the Sher-i-Kashmir Institute of Medical Sciences (SKIMS) in Lok Sabha. During his speech regarding health grants in the budget, Mian Altaf noted the negative impact of removing SKIMS' autonomy on hospital management and patient care.

"SKIMS is an old health institution of Kashmir whose autonomy was ended by the BJP government. BJP aimed to end the autonomy of Jammu and Kashmir but not the autonomy of SKIMS. Removing SKIMS' autonomy affected hospital management and patient care," he added.

He also referred to the issues of transferring state power projects from the State Hydro Power Corporation to NHPC.

"Despite the power generating potential, locals receive a small share of it, and what they receive is at high rates. The return of hydel projects has been a long-standing demand of J&K, which remains unfulfilled. There is no action to address this issue. Is this how they plan to bridge the gap between the people and the capital? There are no visible initiatives to make these promises a reality," the Anantnag-Rajouri MP said.

He noted that the President's address ignored key issues facing JK, including inflation, unemployment, and lack of development.

He also mentioned that the recruitment process in the region has been stagnant

for a decade, leaving educated youth with degrees in limbo.

"There is no mention of metro trains for Srinagar and Jammu. Tribals have been neglected and receive no support. Promises for tribal communities are rarely implemented. The government should involve tribal MPs in formulating policies for the tribal population," he added.

United Opposition stages protest in Jammu for restoration of J&K's Statehood

The protesters, including senior members of the Congress, National Conference, PDP, CPI (M) and Shiv Sena (UBT), assembled outside the statue of Maharaja Hari Singh near Tawi bridge in the heart of the city, also seeking rollback of a recent Central Government order providing more powers to the

Lieutenant Governor.

"The main opposition parties, minus BJP and its cohorts, have come together to convey a strong message that we want immediate restoration of the full statehood before holding of the assembly elections along with democratic rights to the people of Jammu and Kashmir," Pradesh Congress Committee senior vice-president Ravinder Sharma said.

He accused the BJP-led Central government of "shamelessly downgrading" the historic Dogra state and snatching the "status, dignity, identity and rights" of people.

"The BJP is on record having promised restoration of statehood to the people of J&K in Parliament and the Supreme Court. It failed to keep its promise and also hold assembly polls in the last six years. Now when the Supreme Court set the deadline for assembly elections draws nearer, it has given more powers to the Lt Governor to continue its proxy rule." Sharma said.

Last month, the Union Home Ministry gave more powers to the lieutenant governor by amending rules framed under the Jammu and Kashmir Reorganisation Act. 2019.

This act, passed alongside the abrogation of Article 370, bifurcated the erstwhile state into two Union Territories — Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh.

The move empowered the Lieutenant Governor to make decisions on crucial matters such as police and all-India services officers and granting sanctions for prosecution in various cases.

The protesters were carrying placards and chanted slogans in support of restoration of statehood, land and job rights and holding of the assembly elections.

Sharma also criticized the BJP-led Government for its failure to tackle terrorism and said the situation has worsened especially in the peaceful Jammu region where the terrorists have carried out sensational attacks in the recent past.

National Conference provincial president Rattan Lal Gupta also slammed the BJP for delaying the assembly elections and expressed hope that the Election Commission which is visiting J&K next week will ensure the holding of much awaited polls.

"National Conference is going to form the

"National Conference is going to form the next Government and will revoke all the black laws implemented by the BJP," he said, demanding restoration of statehood before holding of the assembly elections.

J&K Shiv Sena (UBT) president Manish Sahni said a spark has been lit with this peaceful protest and it will turn into a flame in the coming days if the BJP delays restoration of statehood.

"We will intensify this struggle across Jammu and Kashmir," he said. Last month, the APUF constituted an

11-member core committee to carry forward the struggle for restoration of full statehood. The committee, headed by former MP Sheikh Abdul Rehman, included members from the Congress, PDP, National Conference, Shiv Sena (UBT), AAP and CPI(M) among others.

Fresh batch of over 990 pilgrims leaves Jammu for Amarnath Yatra

the commencement of the 52-day-long yatra from the twin base camps of Pahalgam in Anantnag district and Baltal in Ganderbal district on June 29.

More than 4.85 lakh pilgrims have so far visited the cave shrine situated at the height of 3,880 metre, housing an ice-shivling. The natural formation, which has now melted completely, is the main reason behind the declining number of pilgrims over the past week. Officials said that around 5,000 pilgrims are still visiting the cave on a daily basis to offer their prayers. The pilgrimage will enter its final phase on August 14 when the 'Charri Mubarak', the holy mace of Lord Shiva, will join the yatra in Pahalgam.

Officials said the 37th batch, comprising a total of 991 pilgrims, who also included 41 sadhus and nine sadhvis, left Bhagwati nagar base camp for the valley amid tight security arrangements around 3.30 am. While 815 pilgrims are heading for the traditional 48-km Pahalgam route, 176 yatris have opted for the 14-km Baltal track, the officials said.

official said. The National Crime Record Bureau also highlights the spike in suicide cases in Jammu and Kashmir. According to the National Crime Record Bureau (NCRB) report, Jammu and Kashmir accounted for about 30 percent of all suicides in India in

Dr Yasir Ahmad Rather, Professor in the Department of Psychiatry, IMHANS, GMC Srinagar, said that 90 percent of suicide cases have underlying mental health issues. He said if these issues are addressed, individuals can be prevented from taking such drastic steps.

"Suicide has symptoms, and such persons mostly suffer from severe depression due to various reasons including financial issues, domestic violence, relationship failure, or academic pressure. Because of mental illness, the person is not able to cope with the stress and takes a life-ending step," he said.

Dr Yasir claimed the increasing suicide rate depicted prevailing mental issues within society. He noted that suicide cases show multiple warning signs before taking the life-ending step. "The person prefers to spend time in isolation, disconnected from society. Their social media handles too show signs of their mental health," he said.

Dr Yasir said one of the strong reasons for the recent spikes in suicides can be explained by the copycat phenomenon. "When someone who died by suicide is all over the news, their circumstances are discussed, which can trigger imitative behaviour in a person who shares a similar situation. Those struggling with mental health issues may start having stronger suicidal ideations after listening to or seeing reports of suicide," he said.

He said society, particularly parents and religious scholars, can play an important role in combating increasing suicides. "Religious scholars and leaders have a significant influence on people. They can raise awareness and discuss such topics within the backdrop of religion. Similarly, parents and teachers too can counsel children," he said.

Parenting and Mass Awareness: The Need of the Hour

Kashmir's Grand Mufti, Nasir-ul-Islam, said that effective parenting and raising mass awareness can prove beneficial in curbing such evils. "Parenting is the most important aspect here. A parent has to check whether their son or daughter is going through any mental issues. They can sit together and resolve it. Parents have to develop a close connection with their child," he said.

Mufft Nasir-ul-Islam said mass awareness can also help restrict suicide cases in Kashmir. "Awareness regarding the consequences of suicide needs to be spread within society. Such topics should be discussed so that every person gets educated and refrains from taking such a step even if their life is disturbed," he

Indian batters sans Rohit Sharma flounder as **Sri Lanka earn a tie**

COLOMBO, Aug 3 (Agencies): Skipper Rohit Sharma played on a different 'track' from his other colleagues, who were thoroughly exposed against quality spin bowling as Sri Lanka managed to eke out a tie against India in a low-scoring but thrilling opening ODI here.

In a chase of 231, skipper Rohit smashed 58 off 47 balls on a rank turner with variable bounce, taking his team to 71 in 10 overs but all the other batters never looked comfortable against an army of Lankan spinners as skipper Charith Asalanka got wickets off back-to-back deliveries to play his part in the 44th tie in the history of ODI cricket.

When Shivam Dube (25) hit those two sixes and a boundary through the extra cover to tie the scores, it seemed like Sri Lanka's woes would continue, but Asalanka took it upon himself to at least earn a psychological win for the home team.

Rohit didn't look one bit rusty during his destructive half-century but the Indian middle-order stuttered badly, showing their ineptitude against slow bowlers.

After the Indian bowling unit collectively put up a good show on a turner, restricting Sri Lanka



to 230 for 8, Rohit's 58 gave India a destructive start. Things went into a downward spiral after that as Sri Lanka's battery of spinners, led by Wanindu Hasaranga (3/58 in 10 overs), Akila Dananjaya (/140 in 10 overs), Dunith Wellalage (2/39 in 8 overs) and skipper Charith Asalanka (3/30 in 8.5 overs), not only choked the run flow but also got breakthroughs when necessary.

On a pitch where Rohit made batting look ridiculously easy, KL Rahul (31 off 43 balls) seemed to once again play his natural waiting game that has always proved to be detrimental for his team's cause. And, by the time he threw away his wicket, he couldn't ensure a decisive turnaround.

Virat Kohli (23), Shreyas Iyer (24) and Axar Patel (33) all got starts but couldn't capitalise.

However, it was Rohit, who looked like playing on a different track compared to all other batters across both teams. He started with an 88-metre six over cow corner off the very third ball of India's innings bowled by Asitha Fernando and then welcomed debutant pacer Mohamed Shiraz with a couple of boundaries and a slap over deep mid-wicket for a six.

While Shubman Gill (16) struggled at the other end. Rohit treated the Lankan bowlers with disdain.

Once he was adjudged legbefore trying a slog sweep off Dananjaya, suddenly the pitch, which looked easy to bat on, started showing its vagaries.

The ball started turning a wee bit more and the variable bounce also created confusion. Kohli got a skidder and was plumb in front while Washington Sundar (5) got one that Dananjaya fired in with an angle. Iyer didn't look bad in his short innings before an in-cutter from Fernando breached his defence.

Earlier, intelligent fifties from Pathum Nissanka and Dunith Wellalage carried the hosts to a fighting score.

Sri Lanka last won a bilateral ODI series against India 27 years ago and will be full of confidence when the teams meet at the same venue on Sunday before the last game on Wednesday.

The hosts were thrashed 3-0 in the preceding T20I series last month.

Paris Olympics: India to lock horns with Great Britain in hockey quarterfinals

PARIS, Aug 3 (Agencies): The Indian Men's Hockey Team will lock horns with Great Britain in the quarterfinals of the ongoing Paris Olympics 2024 on Sunday. The Indian men's hockey team bounced back in the men's competition with a 3-2 win over Australia in their last Pool B match on Friday. It is their first victory against Australia in the Olympics since 1972 Munich games. India bounced back from a 1-2 loss to the defending champions, Belgium, in their previous game. With this victory, India finished second and will now face Great Britain in the quarterfinals of the ongoing marquee event.

The other three quarterfinals of the ongoing mega event will be between Belgium and Spain, Netherlands and



Australia; and Germany and Australia.

All the matches will be played on Sunday. By a very strange coincidence, all 4 QF lineups are exactly the same at the Tokyo Olympics.

Talking about India's performance in the event so far, they began their Paris 2024 campaign with a stunning 3-2 win against New Zealand in a nervy contest on last Saturday in Paris. In the second game, with the help of skipper, Harmanpreet Singh's late goal, the Indian team held Argentina 1-1 at

the Yves-du-Manoir Stadium on Monday. The Indian team outclassed Ireland in their third group stage clash with a scoreline of 2-0 on Tuesday.

In their fourth match, reigning Olympic champions Belgium beat the Indian Men's Hockey Team 2-1 in a highoctane match at the Yves-du-Manoir Stadium on Thursday. While Abhishek (18') scored the lone goal for India, Thibeau Stockbroekx (33') and John-John Dohmen (44') scored for Belgium.

Lakshya aims to dial-up 'Sen-mode' against Super Dane Viktor Axelsen in Olympic semis

PARIS, Aug 3 (Agencies): India's Lakshya Sen will need to play out of his skin to keep his maiden gold medal hopes alive when he takes on the reigning Olympic champion Viktor Axelsen in the men's singles semifinals at the Paris Games on Sunday. Making his Olympics debut, Sen created history on Friday after becoming the first Indian individual male shuttler to reach the last four of the showpiece with a 19-21 21-15 21-12 win over Chinese Taipei's Chou Tien Chen in an intense quarterfinal match.

The Indian will have yet another uphill task at hand when he takes on Axelsen, the babyfaced badminton giant, who has terrorised his opponents in the last few years.

The 30-year-old from Odense, Denmark, has



won the Tokyo gold and Rio bronze, two world championship titles in 2017 and 2022, a Thomas Cup triumph in 2016 and multiple BWF world tour and Superseries titles to experience a dominating run as world No. 1 from December 2021 to June 2024.

Sen, a 2021 World championships bronze medallist, has lost seven times to the super Dane, who faced defeat just once against the Indian at the 2022 German Open.

The 22-year-old, how-

ever, has shown little

to no respect for the past records against higher-ranked opponents so far as he plotted the downfall of world number 4 Jonatan Christie in the group stage and Chou, ranked 11, in the quarters.

Axelsen has looked a tad subdued this season with just one title at the Malaysia Masters. The Dane also suffered an ankle injury in early June during the Singapore Open and was forced to withdraw from the Indonesia Open.

Sen, on the other hand, hasn't looked fitter in his career. He has been rock solid in his defence as he covered the court well and played at a high pace. His ability to produce winners at will has held him in good stead.

The 1.94m-tall Dane has an all-rounded game and is known to rain down brutal smashes from a great height.

Axelsen, who received a bye in the pre-quarterfinals, had just one real challenge in the quarterfinals but he got past former world champion Loh Kean Yew of Singapore without much ado.

In their eight meetings, only two matches have gone to three games, including the contest in Muelheim an der Ruhr.

After seeing off the speedy and consistent Chou in a gruelling three-gamer on Friday, Sen will be now backing himself to prevail if it goes the distance against the Dane.

Axelsen had robbed him of All England glory two years back when he beat him in the final. Then there were those twin losses in the 2021 **BWF World Tour Finals** and Sen will be itching to return the favour at the world's biggest stage.

A semifinalist gets two chances to return with a medal.

A win will keep Sen on course for Indian badminton's maiden Olympic gold, while a loss will give him a shot at the bronze medal in the play-offs.

"There's lot more work to do. Now, the real test starts," Sen had said after his quarterfinals.

For Sen, who wears "Sky is the limit" tattoo on his neck, only the gold can quench his hunger.

She lost to Hungarian bronze medallist Veronika Major in the shoot-off.

Before Bhaker, no Indian athlete has claimed more than one medal at the same Olympics. In the qualification

on Friday, Bhaker shot a total of 590 (294 in precision, 296 in rapid) out of a possible 600 to reach her third final of this Olympics at second place. Earlier in the sport-

ing spectacle, Bhaker had won bronze in the individual 10m air pistol competition and then combined with Sarabjot Singh to claim another third-place finish in the 10m air pistol mixed team event.

Bhaker's second bronze had made her the first Indian after Independence to win two medals at the same Olympic Games.

Saif Din, Selection Grade Constable in Police Department S/o Quasim Din R/o Shigani Bhallesa District Doda A/P Javid Nagar, Bali Charana Naki Tawi, Jammu, is a notorious drug peddler, a habitual offender and a mastermind for generation and distribution of narco terror funding. He is a deeply motivated and committed drug peddler as well as an Over Ground Worker for the terrorists of a proscribed

Hijbual Mujhahidin. He had established drug channels which are being used by anti national agencies/ elements to smuggle weapons, narcotics and to facilitate infiltration of terrorists in J&K.
