Wanted decision on Article 370 to happen with concurrence of people rather than imposition: PM Modi

NEW DELHI, Aug 5 (Agencies): "There was complete clarity in my mind that taking the public in Jammu and Kashmir into confidence was absolutely essential for the execution of the decision," Prime Minister Narendra Modi says about his government's decision to abrogate Article 370 in Jammu and Kashmir.

The prime minister's remarks come in the foreword of a new book titled "370: Undoing the Unjust, A New Future for J&K".

"We wanted the deci-



sion, whenever it would be taken, to happen with concurrence of the people rather than imposition," he writes in the book, researched and written by non-profit organisation BlueKraft Digital Foundation and published under the Penguin Enterprise imprint.

The book mentions in detail how Modi managed to achieve the goal that he set out for himself.

The publishers said the book, which is scheduled to release this month, "chronicles, what is inarguably the greatest constitutional feat in India's history and tells the inside story of how Prime Minister Modi managed the seemingly impossible".

It "delves into multiple blunders at the time of independence that culminated into the unjust regimen of Article 370. It discusses the social,

Kharge criticises BJP's JK Policy, Demands elections as per SC deadline

NEW DELHI, Aug 5 (Agencies): The Congress on Monday demanded that elections in Jammu and Kashmir must be held according to the Supreme Court-set deadline, with party chief Mallikarjun Kharge alleging that the BJP's policy on J-K and Ladakh neither respects 'Kashmiriyat' nor upholds 'Jamhuriyat'.

Kharge's remarks come on the fifth anniversary of the abrogation of Article 370 and the bifurcation of the state

Army opens fire on suspected infiltrators along LoC in J&K

JAMMU, Aug 5 (Agencies): Army troops opened fire after noticing the movement of two groups of infiltrators along the Line of Control (LoC) in Akhnoor and Sunderbani sectors of Jammu and Kashmir in the early hours of

Monday, officials said. Though there was no exchange of fire, a massive search operation is underway in both areas to ensure that there is no infiltration from across the border, they said.

Alert Army troops fired after picking up suspi-

cious movement of three to four infiltrators in a forward area in the Battal sector of Akhnoor on the outskirts of Jammu around 1:30 am, the officials said.

The area was illuminated with flares and put under surveillance

through drones with reinforcements mobilised to lay a tight cordon. A search operation was launched at first light, they said.

The Army troops also fired a few rounds on noticing suspicious



Political Parties Observe 'Black Day' on Article 370 Abrogation Anniversary

JAMMU, Aug 5 (Agencies): The Congress and Peoples democratic Party (PDP) on Monday observed the fifth anniversary of Article 370 abrogation as a "black day" by holding separate protest rallies here to demand the restoration of statehood and special status for Jammu and Kashmir.

Jammu and Kashmir Congress chief Vikar Rasool Wani criticised the BJP-led Centre for failing to curb the rise in terror attacks in the region following the abrogation of Article 370 and the bifurcation of the state into two union territories.

Wani, dressed in black, led hundreds of Congress workers carrying black flags in a rally here. Chanting slogans against the BJP, Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Home Minister Amit Shah, and in favour of statehood restoration, the protestors sat on a dharna after

being stopped by police from proceeding further. Flanked by senior lead-

ers and former ministers Choudhary Lal Singh and Raman Bhalla, and former legislator Ravinder Sharma, Wani said August 5 has become the darkest day in Jammu and Kashmir's history.

"It is a day when our prosperous, happy state was downgraded into a union territory, its historic statehood and special status snatched, and bifurcated into two UTs. We are marking it as a black day, wearing black clothes and badges to protest against this injustice," the Congress leader told reporters.

Wani held the BJP and its government responsible for the decision, which he called a "draconian measure".

"For this symbol of injustice to the people of J-K, they are celebrating this day as UT Divas,"



he added

Meanwhile, the PDP also held a protest rally in Gandhinagar here on the fifth anniversary of the abrogation of Article 370

Led by party general secretary Amrik Singh

and spokesperson Virender Singh, the PDP workers wore black badges and raised anti-BJP slogans, demanding the restoration of the special status and statehood of Jammu and Kashmir

Police did not allow them to move towards the national highway, prompting them to hold a brief sit-in.

"We are observing this day as black day. We held protests against the BJP which destroyed our state. We are demanding restoration of special status of J-K", Vijender Singh told reporters here.

During the Congress protest, Wani slammed Union Home Minister Amit Shah for his assurance that the abrogation of Article 370 would end terrorism in Jammu and Kashmir, and questioned if terrorism had indeed been eradicated.

"Instead, there has been a significant increase in terrorist violence. Fifty soldiers have been martyred in the last three years in the Jammu region. The attacks are increasing," he said.

He said that the secu-

rity situation has worsened in the region and the government has failed to contain the chain of terrorist attacks. Wani also mocked

the Centre's claims of development and job opportunities for youth, stating that Jammu and Kashmir ha the highest unemployment in the country, with little industrial development.

He accused the BJP government of looting Jammu and Kashmir by awarding contracts to outsiders and fostering a drug problem among the youth.

"They have created all sorts of records in J-K, including a huge increase in drug addiction," he said.

The J-K Congress chief demanded the immediate restoration of statehood, accusing the BJP of destroying the princely state by dividing it into two union territories.

"They have destroyed this historic state. We demand immediate restoration of statehood to Jammu and Kashmir," he stated, as he urged the people to vote the BJP out of power.

Meanwhile, PDP president Mehbooba Mufti and several other regional party leaders on Monday claimed that they have been placed under house arrest amid heightened security on the fifth anniversary of the reading down of Article 370 of the Constitution.

On August 5, 2019, the Centre revoked the special status of Jammu and Kashmir under Article 370 of the Constitution and bifurcated it into the union territories of Jammu and Kashmir, and Ladakh. The Jammu and Kashmir Reorganisation Act, which formalised the division, came into effect on October 31, 2019.

Manjit Singh asks voters to bring change in J&K

Non-Gazetted Police Pensioners Welfare Forum projects demands

JAMMU, Aug 5: Non-Gazetted Police Pensioners Welfare Forum held a protest at Hari Singh Park, Jammu, under the chairmanship of Ajit Singh.

During the protest, several issues concerning the retired police fire services personnel of Jammu and Kashmir were raised.

The forum brought the points to the attention of the Government of Jammu and Kashmir Union Territory:

According to Govt. Order No. 229-F of 2014 dated 17-16-2014, the effect of the pay anomaly correction is being given prospectively from the date of the order.

The forum argued that the effect should have been retroactive, starting from 1996 when the



5th Pay Commission was implemented across the state, except for the police department. Many of the affected personnel have passed away, and the surviving members should receive the benefits they are entitled to.

The forum requested that state police personnel receive medical facilities similar to those provided to paramilitary forces, as the J&K State Police now falls under the Home Min-

istry due to its status as a Union Territory.

The forum proposed a 10% reservation for the children of police personnel in admissions to professional colleges and recruitment processes.

The forum called for the implementation of orders similar to those from the Government of Gujarat and the Punjab & Haryana High Court regarding the recovery of commuted pensions. Specifi-

cally, they requested that the recovery period be reduced from 15 years to 12 years. The forum highlighted

the delay in processing pension papers and completing formalities like obtaining NOCs in the police department. This delay often results in retirees not receiving their pension and other retirement benefits promptly, which they need immediately after retirement.

government to issue strict instructions for adhering to a time frame for processing pension papers. They recommended starting the pension paperwork at least two years before retirement, similar to procedures followed in the army and other sectors.

The forum noted that

The forum urged the

Special Police Officers (SPOs) face delays in receiving their salaries, which causes significant financial difficulties. They urged that SPOs be paid their salaries on time, according to a proper schedule, to help them manage their households effectively.

The forum requested that these issues be addressed urgently and that the government take appropriate action to resolve them.

Anti-migrant rage after kid stabbings; play sparks fainting fits among UK men

t has been an extremely sad week in the country following the cruel stabbing of young children at a dance class in Southport. This act led to the death of three young girls — while other children and two adults who were also present were critically injured. All were wounded and traumatised by British-born 17-year old Axel Radukubana who wielded the knife. The children who died were between the ages of nine and six — and were at a community centre where dance and yoga classes were often conducted. Advertisement While one hears of random gun-related murders in the US often targeting school children — it is still comparatively rare in the UK. But there has been a rise in knife crime, which has been referred to often, in recent years, with concern. The outpouring of grief was spontaneous and many went to Southport to express their sorrow and solidarity with the families of the victims and survivors, including the Prime Minister, Sir Keir Starmer. AAP tug-of-war killed students in Delhi However, the situation soon turned violent when the rumour mill, instigated by social media posts began claiming that the murderer was a Muslim youth — which turned out to be incorrect. In fact, he is of Rwandan origin but was born in Cardiff after his parents (who are Christians) fled from Rwanda. They now live just a few miles away from Southport. But instead of waiting for the police to reveal his name, far right goons, led by the English Defence League (EDL), began stoning a mosque in Southport — and soon the violence, unabated, has spread to other parts of the country. Yogi, Shivpal exchange jibes This weekend has seen many confrontations between EDL, their supporters and the police as well as a continuous barrage of assaults at targets associated with immigrants. Now the far right has shifted their attack from Muslims to anti-immigration. The police has been struggling to keep the situation under control as many other areas such as London, Bristol, Brighton and Liverpool have also become flashpoints. depressing moments like this) is that the EDL and other right wing protesters have been confronted by gatherings of those who believe in inclusivity and multi-culture. While this has been an encouraging development — the confrontations taking place between the protesters and the counter-protesters will certainly lead to more problems. The police again has stepped in -- and arrests have been made. In the midst of all this, the victims who deserve our sympathy have been overshadowed. Axel Radukubana's name was revealed early by the presiding judge as he felt that there were far too many rumours on social media adding to the present turmoil. Indeed, if there has been another culprit in this sorry saga - it has been those irresponsible people who have been forwarding unverified messages. No doubt some action will also be planned against those social media providers who have allowed this kind of rampant fake news to spread. Meanwhile "fakery" can be put to good use as well. For instance the recent revelation that a cat had been impersonating as an academic! Larry the cat was given the (fake) persona of Larry Richardson, a respected academic, who had published many papers, by two intrepid scholars - when they realised

that Google Scholar was being misused by fraudsters, to promote other academics by publishing bogus papers. The two, Reese Richardson and Nick Wise, decided to explore and expose the lacuna in the system by creating a fake identity around his grandmother's cat. So the cat as "Larry Richardson" was also cited by other academics, apart from publishing his own papers. One has to be really careful about everything on the Internet, it seems! And meanwhile — the weather is superb — with the sun shining almost every day. It is bringing some relief at this sad time – with hordes of tourists descending on London undeterred. And we know that summer has truly arrived when necklines plunge and hemlines rise — and everyone is on a bicycle going somewhere. And for those who don't want to go anywhere there is always art and performances to be enjoyed. Theatre shows are running houseful one which has become a little controversial is based on Nobel Prize winning Annie Ernaux's novel about her life. Truly speaking, to be in this career, one should have strong conviction and commitment to learn and cope with challenging conditions on-board.

The job requires a lot of hard work, stamina, alertness of mind, adaptability to follow difficult time schedules, good team spirit as well. To discharge his duties efficiently and effectively he/she requires special training which is provided by some of the best-given institutions in India.

Air Hostess/Flight Steward Eligibility

Air Hostess Qualifications To be eligible for becoming an Air Hostess/Flight Steward in India, one should be 10+2/Graduate with a diploma/degree in

Tourism Management or Hotel

Management. Fluency in English, Hindi and knowledge of an international language is an added advantage in this field.

Age Limits

A female aspirant should be below 25 years and a male counterpart should be below 26 years of age and should hold an Indian Passport.

Physical Standards

A female aspirant should be 157.5 centimetres long whereas a male aspirant should have at least 163cm of height. The weight should be in proportion to height.

Marital Status

One must be unmarried, with normal eyesight of 6/6 uncorrected vision in each eye.

Air Hostess/Flight Steward Required Skills

For adopting Air Hostess as a career one should have discipline, patience, sense of responsibility, punctuality, commitment, self-confidence, and above all a friendly outgoing pleasing personality.

They also possess good communication skills; confidence in dealing with a range of people; the ability to work as a team member and be supportive of colleagues.

They should also be competent in handling difficult situations and the ability to remain calm under pressure and in emergency situations; the ability to be tactful and diplomatic but also assertive when necessary.

They also have commercial awareness and sales skills; flexibility in working unsocial hours on any day of the year.

How to become an Air Hostess/Flight Steward?

To be an Air Hostess one has to follow the given steps:

Step 1

As and when advertised in the National Newspapers or other mass media, the aspirants have to apply in various airlines for the required post with demanded certificates.

Step 2

Once shortlisted after the initial screening airline company calls the most eligible candidates for a written examination, usually an objective type multiple choice one. Successful candidates in this written test are called for a group discussion followed by a personal interview.

Step 3

Successful candidates of the second step are trained for 2 to 3 months in various fields in which they learn about service, grooming, safety and first aid etc. After successful training in the technical and non-technical aspects and grooming in the required field, the prospective Air hostess is put on trainee flights before assigning duties on to full-fledged commercial

Air Hostess Job Description The job of an Air Hostess/ Flight Steward is not less important than the job of the Pilot of the plane itself. If it is the responsibility of a pilot to carry the

This is not a less demanding task by any means. An Air hostess is the one who sees the well being and comfort of the passenger and that also in quick time. He/She is one who boosts up the morale of the passengers when there is any kind of challenging moment during the flight. We can say that from welcoming the passenger's to the aircraft, till their boarding, she/he is the sole representative or one must say the human face of the airlines.

He hosts 'KBC' since its inaugural season in 2000



Sonam Kapoor expresses shock at rising death toll amid student protests in Bangladesh: 'This is horrible'

Sonam Kapoor is once again the first Indian celebrity to take a stance on a political matter. On Monday, she took to Instagram to share a post about the unrest in Bangladesh, calling in 'horrible'. Bangladesh has been engulfed by protests and violence that began last month after student groups demanded scrapping of a controversial quota system in government jobs.

Sonam's post for Bangladeshi people Sonam reposted an IG post by The Juggernaut, which mentioned how 66 people had died in a single day amid the clashes. "This is horrible. Let's all pray for Bangladeshi people," Sonam wrote. The death toll has now risen to 100.

What's happening in Bangladesh? At least 91 people were killed and hundreds injured on Sunday in a wave of violence across the country of 170 million people as police fired tear gas and rubber bullets to disperse tens of thousands of protesters. Starting Sunday evening, a nationwide curfew has been imposed, the railways have suspended services and the country's

huge garments industry has closed.
The protests escalated into a campaign to seek the ouster of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, who won a fourth straight term in January in an election

boycotted by the opposition.

Sunday's death toll, which included at least 13 policemen, was the highest for a single day from any protests in Bangladesh's recent history, surpassing the 67 deaths reported on July 19 when students took to the streets against the



quotas.

The government declared the indefinite nationwide curfew starting at 6 p.m. (1200 GMT) on Sunday and also announced a three-day general holiday starting from Monday.

Zubin Mehta, whose film Bus No 7 makes it to the online edition of IFFM, says he wants to tell simple stories and engage with people emotionally and artistically

"I am not an intellectual...." With these words Chandigarh based, prolific theatre person Zubin Mehta lets us into the method behind his large body of work, including his films Bus No 7 and The Usher. As the 60-minute Bus No 7 makes it to the online edition of Indian Film Festival of Melbourne (IFFM), he not only stands a happy man but also at the cusp of new tidings. For someone who has dedicated nearly two decades of life to theatre, at the young age of 39, he is now interested in filmmaking. And as with theatre, his motto remains — "Training, formal or informal, is paramount."

"Intention and passion alone are not enough. You have to master the craft," he says. This sagacious advice he proffers to not only students at his Wings Theatre Academy but practices it on his own self. Thus before turning behind the camera he self-trained himself in the art of filmmaking. Fully aware that theatre can often be too verbose, he ensured that his movies are more visual and paid much heed to imagery.

"The difference between the two performing arts," he feels, "is not too stark for at the end of the day in both its eyes that watch and ears that listen and both appeal to the head and the heart." His movies, in fact, are



slice of life, inspired as much from personal emotions as his keen eye for observation. A true incident in Chandigarh led him to imagining one of his key characters the female attendant in Bus No 7. Produced by Vivek High School, it talks of class differences as well as how three persons, including two students, dealing with voids in life, come together.

"Not only you get exposure and audiences at film festivals but also avenues for finance." Interestingly, his ideal is renowned Iranian filmmaker Majid Majidi whose film Children of Heaven he adapted for a play.

With 80 plus productions to his credit, Zubin's theatre innings has been most satisfying. Beginning his career on stage at the age of nine, his mentor has been the late Gursharan Singh. Only over a period of time he felt that aesthetics need to be as integral a part of a play as passion that drives it. Associated with stage productions of several elite schools of the City Beautiful, he insists, "Schools don't impose diktats and have allowed me to do theatre the way I want to and the kind I want to." But, yes, one adverse fallout could be, "People tend to see your work as child's play and don't take you as seriously." An avid theatre buff himself, he is an ardent admirer of theatre czarina Neelam Mansingh Chowdhry and is especially taken in by her visual language, "so brilliant and stunning that often cinema can't achieve the same effect."

What he intends to do through his newfound ardour for cinema is to tell simple stories and engage with people emotionally and artistically too. When he set up Wings Theatre Academy, the idea was not to create professional actors but to create empathetic human beings. As the world is moving towards corporate order of 'profit, profit and profit,' he feels theatre can make us sensible and sensitive. In his new flight as a filmmaker he may have bid adieu to school productions but theatre will remain his first and abiding love. Much of his life may have gone into creating plays in English but in the world of cinema he is aspiring to make a Punjabi feature film.

First love

Acting may have been an occasional foray for Zubin Mehta whose love for theatre began with donning the greasepaint in his formative years. But he thoroughly enjoyed his acting stint in acclaimed web series Kohrra. Especially, he loved his rapport with one of its leads Suvinder Vicky.

Supreme Court raps UP government over delay to consider remission petitions

The court took strong exception when the counsel for the state government again sought time when the matter came up today for hearing.

NEW DELHI, Aug 5 (Agencies): The Supreme Court on Monday rapped the Uttar Pradesh government for not complying with its order to consider remission pleas within the time frame specified by it and directed the principal secretary of the state's prisons department to appear before it on August 19.

"We want to correct the system," a bench of Justices Abhay S Oka and Augustine George Masih said while hearing a convict's plea seeking remission in



accordance with the applicable policy of the state. The apex court directed the prisons department principal secretary to appear before it through video

for hearing.

"Four months have passed. Again you are asking for two more months to decide the plea. Nothing has been done. As far as state of UP is considered, we have seen that the orders passed by this court for considering remission plea of accused persons in a specific time is not being considered." In April, the top court

had granted six weeks to the Uttar Pradesh government. On July 10, when the matter came up for hearing, the top court was informed that the state government has not passed any order despite jail authorities favourably recommending the case of the petitioner.

Row over inclusion of castes in OBC list: SC seeks from WB quantifiable data on backwardness

NEW DELHI, Aug 5 (Agencies): The Supreme Court on Monday asked the West Bengal government to provide quantifiable data on social and economic backwardness and the inadequate representation in public sector jobs of the castes that were included by it in the OBC list for granting quota

The top court also issued notices to the private litigants who had moved Calcutta High Court against the inclusion of 77 castes, mostly Muslims, in the Other Backward Classes (OBC)

The high court on May 22 struck down the OBC status of several classes in West Bengal granted since 2010, finding such reservations to vacancies in services and posts in the state

"Issue notice, including on the application of stay (of the judement filed by the state government).

The state of West Bengal shall file an affidavit before this court explaining the process followed for classification

of 77 communities as OBCs: (1) the nature of survey; (2) whether there was a lack of consultation with the Commission (state backward panel) in respect of any communities in the list of 77 communities designated as OBCs," said a bench of Chief Justice DY Chandrachud, Justice JB Pardiwala and Justice Manoj Misra.

The bench also asked whether any consultation was done by the state for the sub-classification of the OBCs.

The state government filed the appeal against the high court verdict.

"Religion indeed appears to have been the sole criterion" for declaring these communities as OBCs, the high court had said and added that it "is of the view that the selection of 77 classes of Muslims as backwards is an affront to the Muslim community as a whole".

In all, the high court had struck down 77 classes of reservation given between April and September 2010. and 37 classes created on the basis of a 2012 law.

Air Force approves production of 200 Astra missiles

NEW DELHI, Aug 5 (Agencies): The Indian Air Force (IAF) has given clearance to the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) and the Bharat Dynamics Limited (BDL) to produce 200 Astra air-to-air missiles for its Su-3O and LCA Tejas fighter aircraft.

The clearance was given to the DRDO and public sector firm BDL, during a recent visit by Indian Air Force Deputy Chief Air Marshal Ashutosh Dixit to Hyderabad.

While DRDO is the development agency for the project, BDL is the production agency for it, senior defence officials told agency

The programme was cleared by the Defence Acquisition Council for the IAF and Indian Navy, under which 248 missiles were expected to be produced for both services in 2022-23.

These series of airto-air missiles are part of the Astra program, which aims to enhance the aerial combat capabilities of the Indian Armed Forces. The Astra Mark 1 missile, a predecessor to the Mark 2, has already been successfully inducted into both the IAF and the Navy.

Senior defence officials informed India Today TV that work is currently underway on the Astra Mark 2 missiles and the first test of this 130 km strike range missile is scheduled to take place in the upcoming months.

DRDO is focusing on developing a special motor to extend the missile's range, they said.

The existing Astra Mark 1 missile has a range of up to 100 kilometres, with the potential for further extension.

The journey towards developing an indigenous air-to-air missile system began in 2001, when the DRDO initiated discussions with various stakeholders. The aim was to design and develop a missile system capable of engaging adversary targets beyond visual range.

Hyderabad's Defence Research and Development Laboratory (DRDL) was subsequently identified as the nodal lab for this project. A dedicated task force was formed to undertake preliminary studies and drive the project forward.

Samajwadi Party to oppose Centre's move to amend law governing Waqf boards

LUCKNOW, Aug 5 (Agencies): Samajwadi Party chief Akhilesh Yadav on Monday said his party will opposed the Centre's move to bring a Bill in Parliament to amend the 1995 law governing Waqf boards, and accused the BJP of trying to snatch the rights of

His remarks came after it emerged that the government is all set to bring a Bill in Parliament to amend the 1995 law governing Waqf boards to ensure more accountability and transparency in their functioning and mandatory inclusion of women in these

The amendment Bill will make it mandatory for Waqf boards to register their properties with district collectors to ensure their actual valuation.

"We will be against it (Wakf act amendment bill)." Yadav told reporters when asked about the proposed amendment "BJP's only work is to divide Hindus and Muslims, snatch the rights of Muslim brothers and work on how to snatch the rights given to them in the Constitution," he said after paying tributes to late MP and party leader Janeshwar Mishra on his birth anniversary

The SP chief charged that the Modi government had earlier snatched the rights of Anglo-Indians.

"Anglo-Indians used to have one seat in



the Lok Sabha and one in the Vidhan Sabha. They had their own representation, but they got a fake census done and snatched the seats of Anglo-Indians," he charged.

The SP chief also targeted Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath over the Uttar Pradesh Nazul Property (Management and use of public purposes) Bill, 2024 presented by the state government.

"Look how intelligent our chief minister is... He found out that nuzul is an Urdu word. The officers kept explaining to him that nuzul means something else but he said no, nuzul means land of Muslims." Yaday claimed.

"Think about it, this person was getting the whole of Prayagraj and Gorakhpur vacated only because of the Urdu word nuzul.

He has some personal interest in Gorakh-

pur or some of his colleagues have some personal interest," he charged.

The Bill presented by the state government was sent to the select committee in the Upper House (Legislative Council) and could not be passed after some BJP leaders opposed it.

Targeting Union Minister Anupriya Patel, who has been demanding reservation in the private sector, Yadav, without naming her, said, "It is being heard that a minister is shouting that reservation has ended...Those who are concerned about reservation, whether in Delhi or Lucknow, should immediately leave the BJP."

Referring to the caste-wise census, he targeted the state's Deputy Chief Minister Keshav Prasad Maurya, and said, "There is a 'stool kit' leader. He is doing a lot of 'kit-kit' (talks). I think I will have to end the offer. It is being heard that the 'stool kit' ministers get orders, only then he does it. At least he should talk about caste-wise census and also talk about the reservation that is being abolished." Yadav was apparently referring to his recent monsoon offer to ruling party MLAs.

"Monsoon offer: Bring hundred, form government," the former chief minister had said. Yadav used the 'stool' prefix while talking about deputy CM Maurya as once he was seen sitting on a stool at a programme due to non-availability of a chair on the dais.

Arvind Kejriwal's bail plea, challenge to CBI arrest dismissed by Delhi High Court

NEW DELHI, Aug 5 (Agencies): The Delhi High Court on Monday rejected Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal's bail plea and simultaneously dismissed a challenge to his arrest by the CBI in the alleged liquor policy scam.

The court directed the Aam Aadmi Party leader to first approach the trial court for relief.

However, AAP sources have told agency Mr Kejriwal will now move the Supreme Court.

First arrested by the **Enforcement Directorate** in March, weeks before the 2024 Lok Sabha election, Mr Kejriwal has now spent 115 days in jail.

This is despite the Supreme Court granting regular bail on July 12. However, that was for his arrest by the ED and not by the CBI.

The CBI had arrested Mr Kejriwal in June, days after Delhi's Rouse Avenue Court granted bail - in an order later upheld by the Supreme Court - for his arrest by the Enforcement Directorate.

Last month, senior advocate Abhishek Singhvi, appearing for Mr Keiriwal, slammed the CBI's case against his client as hearsay and that the federal agency is trying implicate the Chief Minister using "presumptions and hypothesis".

"They refer to AAP spending 4 crore on publicity.

I wonder how much money the ruling party has spent on publicity. I wonder if CBI will ask them the question. Today there is no direct evidence, no recovery. There is pure hearsay," he said.

Mr Singhvi insisted the AAP leader met the triple test for bail - he is not a flight risk, he is unlikely to tamper with evidence or to influence witnesses.

He doubled down that Mr Kejriwal's arrest is an "insurance arrest". "I got bail thrice, in one form or another, in the ED case. Since I was arrested by the CBI, there has been no confrontation, nothing."

The CBI, meanwhile, said it had traced the money trail in the case and it amounted to 44 crore.

"This money went to Goa. Kejriwal himself told his candidates don't worry about the money, contest elections," the agency's lawyer said.

Nine Kanwariyas electrocuted to death in Bihar, several others injured

HAJIPUR, Aug 5 (Agencies): As many as nine 'Kanwariyas' (devotees) were electrocuted, and several others received burn injuries when a vehicle carrying them came in contact with an electric wire on Hajipur-Jandaha road in Bihar's Vaishali district, officials said on Monday.

The incident took place around midnight on Sunday when a group of 'Kanwariyas' were on their way to visit Pahleja Ghat of the Ganga River to take the holy water to offer at Hariharnath Temple in Sonepur.

The Kanwariyas were going on a DJ-mounted trolley. The DJ-mounted trolley was very high and there was a wire in which it got entangled. DJ trolley came in contact with 11000 high tension wire due to which some devotees

died, while some others were injured and are undergoing treatment," Sadar SDPO Hajipur Omprakash told report-

The victims were rushed to Sadar hospital at Hajipur where nine of them

Six others who had received burn injuries in the incident were undergoing treatment at the hospital.

Vaishali district magistrate Yashpal Meena rushed to the Sadar hospital and directed the civil surgeon to ensure proper treatment of the injured.

6 more people killed in Bangladesh as protesters gather for 'Long March to Dhaka'

The government in the morning ordered a complete internet shutdown as protestors asked the general public to join a 'Long March to Dhaka'

DHAKA, Aug 5 (Agencies): At least six people were killed in a fresh outbreak of violence in Bangladesh on Monday as thousands of protesters started gathering for a "Long March to Dhaka", a day after over 100 people died in fierce clashes between the ruling party supporters and demonstrators demanding Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's resignation.

The government in the morning ordered a complete internet shutdown as protestors asked the general public to join a 'Long March to Dhaka'.

However, a government agency gave a verbal order to start broadband internet around 1.15 pm on Monday, leading Bengali-language newspaper Prothom Alo said quoting sources.

There were no instructions about restoring mobile internet.
The police and military were



seen on roads as protesters started gathering in the capital. At least six people were killed during clashes between police and protesters in Jatrabari and Dhaka Medical College areas, The Daily Star newspaper said.

Some students from various educational institutes gathered

at Dhaka Central Shaheed Minar before and after 10 am to participate in the 'March to Dhaka' programme, prompting the police to fire tear gas shells to disperse them.

All students and parents were requested to return home safely.

Bangladesh Army Chief Gen-

eral Waqar-uz-Zaman is expected to address the nation after consulting all political parties.

The Army issued a statement asking people to remain patient until the Army chief addresses them. The clashes broke out on Sunday morning when protesters attending the non-cooperation programme under the banner of the Students Against Discrimination with the one-point demand of Hasina's resignation over a job quota system faced opposition from the supporters of the ruling Awami League, Chhatra League, and Jubo League activists.

At least 101 people, including 14 policemen, were killed in clashes on Sunday, leading Bengali-language newspaper Prothom Alo reported.

The violence forced authorities to cut off mobile internet and enforce a nationwide curfew for an indefinite period.

Australia raises terror threat level to 'probable' amid spike in extremist views

Prime Minister Anthony Albanese and security officials urge vigilance despite no imminent threat



SYDNEY, Aug 5 (Agencies): Australia on Monday raised its terror threat level to "probable" from "possible", citing an increase in extremist views in the country leading to a more than 50% chance of the planning of an onshore attack in the next 12 months.

Prime Minister Anthony Albanese said he had raised the country's threat level following advice from security services, but said there was no imminent threat of an attack.

"The advice that we have received is that more Australians are embracing a more diverse range of extreme ideologies and it is our responsibility to be vigilant," he told a news conference.

Australia lowered the threat level to "possible" in 2022, following eight years at "probable".

Mike Burgess, director general of the Australian Security Intelligence Organisation, the country's main intelligence agency, said tensions in the Middle East, including a conflict between Israel and Hamas that began on Oct. 7, were a contributing factor to raising the threat level.

"The conflict has fuelled grievances, promoted protests, undermined social cohesion and elevated intolerance," he said.

Australia has seen several violent attacks in recent months, some of which have been designated as motivated by extremism.

In April Australian police said a knife attack on an Assyrian church bishop and some of his followers in Sydney was a terrorist act motivated by suspected religious extremism.

Protesters in Pakistan-held Kashmir mark 5th anniversary of India stripping region of semi-autonomy

MUZAFFARABAD, Aug 5 (Agencies): Hundreds of angry people took to the streets in Pakistan-administered Kashmir Monday to mark the fifth anniversary of India's decision to strip the disputed region of its semi-autonomy and take direct control of it.

The decision— which Islamabad insists was unilateral and violated United Nations resolutions — has tested the already strained ties between the two countries.

Protesters in Muzaffarabad, the capital of Pakistan-held Kashmir which is split between Pakistan and India and claimed by both in its entirety, burned an effigy of the Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Indian national flags, vowing to fight New Delhi's decree until its dissolution.

Another protest of about 200 people was led by Deputy Prime Minister Ishaq Dar in the capital.

Pakistan's Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif was also expected to address lawmakers in Muzaffarabad later on Monday. In a statement, he called to resolve the tense territorial dispute over Kashmir through the diplomatic channels of the U.N., saying Pakistan will continue to "extend its strong moral, political and diplomatic support to the Kashmiri people."

In 2019, India's Hindu nationalist-led government revoked the special status of Muslim-majority Kashmir after cutting off communications and deploying thousands of troops in the restive Himalayan region amid uproar from Pakistani lawmakers.

In December, India's top court upheld the decision by Modi's government.

The future of Muslim-majority Kashmir was left unresolved at the end of British colonial rule in 1947, when the Indian subcontinent was divided into predominantly Hindu India and mainly Muslim Pakistan. Pakistan has long pushed for the right to self-determination under a U.N. resolution passed in 1948, which called for a referendum on whether Kashmiris wanted to merge with Pakistan or India.

The rebels in Indian-administered Kashmir have been fighting Indian rule since 1989.

Australian probe into Gaza aid worker deaths 'omitted crucial details': Israel

CANBERRA, Aug 5 (Agencies): Australia "omitted crucial details" when presenting a report into the deaths of seven aid workers in Gaza, Israel's embassy in Canberra said Monday in a frank diplomatic rebuke.

Australian national Lalzawmi "Zomi" Frank-com was among a group of seven charity workers killed in April when their World Central Kitchen aid convoy was mistakenly hit by an Israeli air strike.

A declassified Australian report last week blamed the lethal error on operational failures such as the "mistaken identification" of armed security staff as Hamas hijackers.

njackers. Israel's embassy hit back on Monday morning, saying the Australian government "regrettably included some misrepresentations and omitted crucial details", such as its military's willingness to cooperate.

"The IDF (military) has taken full responsibility for the grave mistakes that led to the tragic incident of the night of April 1," the embassy said in a statement.

The deaths -- of an Australian, three Britons, a North American, a Palestinian and a Pole -- triggered global outrage and a renewed push to ensure the safety of aid workers in Gaza.

Former Australian air force chief Mark Binskin was tasked with moni-

toring Israel's efforts to unravel what went

His declassified report, released Friday, found three vehicles in the aid convoy were "struck in relatively quick succession" after they were tagged as suspicious.

An Israeli surveillance drone flagged the vehicles after noticing some of the charity's security personnel were carrying guns, Binskin found.

His report said some within the Israeli military believed the charity had "inadvertently" employed security guards from an "entity that had links to Hamas".

Based on the information available to him, this was a possibility his report "cannot rule out". Aside from the litany of operational failures, Binskin's report said Israel's actions in the months following had been "timely" and "appropriate".

Two officers were quickly stood down, three others were reprimanded and Israel was swift to issue a public apology.

Israel's embassy said Monday it would work "hand in hand" with aid organisations in a bid to "improve the humanitarian situation in the Gaza strip".

Australian Foreign Minister Penny Wong has said the Israeli military needs to do more to make amends with the victims' families.

She said she would

continue to press for "full accountability", including potential criminal charges.

"We do believe an apology should be provided," Wong told reporters last week.

"The Australian government will persist until proper protections for aid workers are in place," she added.

"The best protection for aid workers and civilians is a ceasefire."

Kim Jong Un deploys 250 ballistic missiles on North Korea's south border

SEOUL, Aug 5 (Agencies): North Korea has deployed 250 ballistic missile launchers to its southern border, with leader Kim Jong Un describing the weapons as a "powerful treasured sword" to defend its sovereignty, state media said Monday.

The olive green mobile launchers were displayed during a special "transferring" ceremony in the capital Pyongyang on Sunday, the official Korean Central News Agency reported.

The missile launchers were

an "up-to-date tactical attack weapon", Kim was quoted as saying in a speech.

It was the first time North Korea had publicised the scale of an arms transfer to its border units, Han Kwon-hee of the Korea Association of Defence Industry Studies told agency.

Each launcher was designed to hold four missiles, Han said, adding that Pyongyang's supply of arms to Moscow might have "interfered with the North's capacity to actually produce 1,000 missiles".

Relations between the two Koreas are at one of their lowest points in years, with the North ramping up weapons testing and bombarding the South with balloons full of trash.

South Korea has responded by resuming propaganda broadcasts along the border, suspending a tension-reducing military deal and restarting live-fire drills near the border.

This year, Pyongyang



declared South Korea its "principal enemy", jettisoned agencies dedicated to reunification and outreach, and threatened war over "even 0.001 mm" of territorial infringement.

Kim noted that presenting the new weapons at a time when the country was reeling from flood damage was a "manifestation of the firm will of our Party to push ahead with the bolstering of defence capabilities".

Heavy rainfall hit the nuclear-armed country's northern regions in late July, with a South Korean media report claiming up to 1,500 people could have died.

Kim has lashed out at the reports, dismissing them as a "smear campaign to bring disgrace upon us and tarnish" the North's image.

The North has said there were no casualties at all in the Sinuiju area, the region Pyongyang said had suffered the "greatest flood damage".

It claimed North Korea's Air Force rescued over 5,000 people, with around 4,200 of them saved by helicopter "within a few hours".

Effective stage

Kim said in his speech that the country was facing a "significant and strategic shift due to the transformation of US-led alliances into nuclearbased military blocs", a trend he said required an upgrade in war deterrence, according to a KCNA transcript.

"The strength of our armed forces... must continue to accelerate," Kim said.

Photos released by KCNA showed rows of mobile launchers positioned before a podium where Kim spoke.

Banners flown from a balloon painted with the North Korean flag read: "Let's open the golden age of defence industry development under the leadership of the great comrade Kim!"

While it was possible that

Pyongyang had previously deployed ballistic missile launchers to its southern border, Han said it was the first time he had "seen such official reports detailing the scale of arms transfers" to military units in the area.

Producing such a large number of weapons and displaying them together indicates the event had been "planned months in advance", Hong Min, a senior analyst at the Korea Institute for National Unification, told agency.

"Producing 250 mobile launchers requires massive manpower and capital, which shows that the event on Sunday was not staged on a short notice," he

"Pyongyang appears to have judged that staging such a performance-like event would be an effective message to the United States."

Among the event attendees was Kim's teenage daughter, Ju Ae, who Seoul's spy agency said last week was being groomed as Kim's heir.

Ju Ae, whose exact age has not been confirmed, was seen clapping behind her father in one KCNA photo.

While Kim claimed that the new weapon system was designed by himself, it is likely that they copied the raw technology from overseas, Hong added.

"It is possible that Kim directed the modification using the original technology."

Israeli strike kills 2 in Lebanon amid growing middle east tensions

BEIRUT, Aug 5 (Agencies): Lebanon's health ministry said two people were killed Monday in an Israeli strike on the country's south, where Hezbollah has been trading near-daily fire with Israel since the start of the Gaza war in October.

Since last week, tensions have soared as Iran and Tehran-backed groups, including Hezbollah, vowed revenge for the killing of Hamas's political leader in Tehran and Israel's killing of Hezbollah's military chief in Beirut.

"The enemy raid that took place near the (Mais Al-Jabal) town's cemetery killed two people," Lebanon's Health Ministry said in a statement.

"One of the two martyrs who fell in the Mais Al-Jabal raid this morning was a Risala Scouts paramedic," Lebanon's state-run National News Agency said.

Ali Abbas, a rescue worker from the Risala Scouts which is affiliated with Hezbollah ally the Amal movement, told agency that the paramedic had travelled by motorcycle with another person to inspect the site of an earlier strike.

He went "to see if there were civilians or people (in the area)... and the second strike happened immediately," Abbas said.

Mais al-Jabal, a frontline village less than two kilometres away from the border with Israel, has experienced heavy bombardment since the cross-border clashes began, forcing most residents to leave.

Early on Monday, Hezbollah said it had targeted military sites in northern Israel with "explosive-laden drones" in response to Israeli "attacks and assassinations" in southern Lebanon.

The Israeli military said "numerous suspicious aerial targets were identified crossing from Lebanon" into northern Israel, starting a fire and leaving an officer and a soldier "moderately injured".

The cross-border violence since October has killed at least 549 people in Lebanon, mostly fighters but also including at least 116 civilians, according to an agency tally.

On the Israeli side, including the annexed Golan Heights, 22 soldiers and 25 civilians have been killed, according to army figures.

Government likely to amend Waqf Law

NEW DELHI, Aug 5 (Agencies): The Government is all set to bring a Bill in Parliament to amend the 1995 law governing Waqf boards to ensure more accountability and transparency in their functioning and mandatory inclusion of women in these bodies sources said.

They claimed that the move comes in the backdrop of demands from within the Muslim community

The Bill to amend the Waqf Act, 1995, will make it mandatory for Waqf boards to register their properties with District cCollectors to ensure their actual valuation. There are 30 Waqf boards in the country

The sources on Sunday pointed out that the revenue generated by all Waqf properties is estimated at Rs 200 crore per annum. This is not in

sync with the number of properties such bodies have, they said.

Originally, Waqf boards had around 52,000 properties throughout India. By 2009, there were 3,00,000 registered Waqf properties covering four lakh acres of land, and as on date, there are 8,72,292 such properties in more than eight lakh acres of land.

While referring to the revenue generated by such bodies, the sources underlined that the money can only be used for the welfare of the Muslim community and for no other purpose

The amendment Bill with as many as 40 changes in the current law could be brought in the ongoing Parliament session. The Government, as of now, does not plan to leave the Bill pending in Parliament after introduction, the sources said.

The key changes proposed in the law include ensuring verification of land before a board announces it as a Wagf property

Fresh verification of disputed lands claimed by various state boards will also be sought, according to the proposed bill. The changes with regard to the composition of the Wagf boards will ensure inclusion of women in these bodies

The sources cited the recommendations of the Justice Sachar Commission and the joint committee of Parliament headed by K Rahman Khan as few of the reasons for amending the law.

"There have been demands from within the community to amend the law to bring transparency and accountability ...Some Muslim high court judges had flagged that the decision taken by Waqf boards cannot be challenged in courts. Now, the amendment bill seeks to set that right," a

person familiar with the government's decision said.

Reacting to the move to amend the law, senior BJP leader Dinesh Sharma said Bohra and other members of the Muslim community have raised the issue of anomalies by Waqf boards. The main reason behind this is that there have been complaints against Waqf boards, made for benefitting the minorities, being involved in other works, he claimed.

All India Muslim Personal Law Board spokesperson SQR IIyas said, "The BJP government always wanted to do this. Following the conclusion of the 2024 (Lok Sabha) elections, we thought that there will be a change in the BJP's attitude, but that's not the case. I, however, feel that this is not the right move.

Advocate Raees Ahmad said there is a "false narrative" that a Waqf board

Waqf board was introduced for the benefit of Muslims, he said, reacting to the move to amend

"This is what passes for democracy & free speech in J&K. A handful of BJP 'leaders' are encouraged to celebrate today while those who would have registered their protest against what was done to J&K are locked up in homes across the valley," he said in a post on X.

Official sources said the office of Apni Party, headed by Altaf Bukhari, was also closed for the day as a precautionary measure

National Conference chief spokesman Tanvir Sadig claimed that he has been placed under house arrest.

"I have been detained at home which was completely unnecessary. I needed to leave for some work, but policemen outside my gate prevented me from doing so. This is unwarranted and illegal,' Sadiq said in a post on X. He also posted a picture showing police personnel

outside the gate to his residence in Hassanabad area of the city. "August 5 is and will

The Centre on August 5, 2019 revoked Article 370 of the Constitution which provided special status to Jammu and Kashmir within the Indian Union.

The Centre also brought the Jammu and Kashmir Reorganisation Act that bifurcated the erstwhile state into two union territories of Ladakh and Jammu and Kashmir.

People's Conference president Sajad Gani Lone said August 5 will be a reminder of "complete disempowerment of Kashmiri people".

"August 5 will always be an ugly reminder of the complete disempowerment of the Kashmiri people. Five years on there is no elected Assembly and the locals have no say in running their own affairs. And sadly there aren't enough powerful voices in the country to seek questions as to why J and K has been selectively targeted for such humiliating existence," Lone posted on X.

In a statement, the National Conference alleged that the Government has "unjustly placed our leaders under house arrest, effectively isolating the party headquarters Nawa-e-Subha in Srinagar".

"This blatant suppression of mainstream democratic activities only serves to showcase the administration's underlying fear and exposes the hollowness of their claims of progress over the past five years.

"August 5, 2019, remains a stark reminder of the disempowerment of the people of J&K, a process that continues unchecked with the absence of a democratically elected government in the region. The unilateral and undemocratic decisions made on August 5, 2019, are a betrayal of the promises made to the people of Jammu and Kashmir by New Delhi," the party said.

It said these decisions are unacceptable to the people of J&K, as demonstrated by the recent parliamentary election results in the region.

"As far as JKNC is concerned, we will persist in our fight for the restoration of our abridged rights through democratic, legal, and peaceful means. The unjust actions of the government will not deter us from our mission to uphold the rights and freedoms of the people of Jammu and Kashmir," it added.

Rohit Sharma first Indian, second overall batter to hit 300 sixes in ODI cricket

Rohit Sharma has achieved a significant milestone by becoming the first Indian and second overall batter to hit 300 sixes in One-Day Internationals. Despite India's 32-run defeat against Sri Lanka, Rohit's accomplishment was a standout moment.

COLOMBO. Aug 5 (Agencies): Indian captain Rohit Sharma etched his name into the record books again, becoming the first Indian and second overall batter to hit 300 sixes in One-Day Internationals (ODIs). Rohit achieved this remarkable feat during India's 32-run defeat against Sri Lanka in the second ODI in Colombo on Sunday. Rohit's blistering knock of 64 runs from just 44 balls included four towering sixes and five elegant fours. Despite the team's loss, his milestone was a standout achievement in the match. This innings brought his career tally of sixes as an opener to an impressive 302 from 177 matches, making him the second opener in history to cross the 300-sixes mark in ODIs. He trails only the legendary Chris



Gayle, who has smashed 328 sixes in 280 games.

Sanath Jayasuriya, the current Sri Lankan coach and a former explosive opener, ranks third on the list with 263 sixes from 388 ODIs. Rohit Sharma's career as an opener has been nothing short of phenomenal. With

8,801 runs from 177 matches, he has amassed 29 centuries and 55 fifties, maintaining a stellar average of 55. These statistics highlight his consistency and dominance at the top of the

In the overall list of most sixes in ODIs, Rohit stands third with 330 sixes in 264 matches. He is surpassed only by Pakistan's Shahid Afridi, who tops the list with 351 sixes from 398 games, and Chris Gayle, who is just one six ahead with 331 sixes from 301 matches. Rohit also holds the record for the most sixes by an Indian in ODIs, surpassing notable names like Mahendra Singh Dhoni (229 sixes from 297 matches) and Sachin Tendulkar (195 sixes from 463 games). Moreover, across all three for-

mats in international cricket-Tests, ODIs, and T20Is-Rohit Sharma leads the charts for the most sixes with a staggering 619 sixes from 482 matches. This incredible record underscores his ability to clear the boundary with ease and his status as one of the most destructive batters in the modern game.

Manu Bhaker to be India's flag-bearer in the closing ceremony of Paris Olympics



PARIS, Aug 5 (Agencies): Star shooter Manu Bhaker has been chosen as India's flagbearer at the Paris Olympics 2024. The 22-year-old created history by clinching two Olympic medals in single edition of the Games at Paris. Manu opened India's medal tally by winning a bronze medal in the women's 10m air pistol event. She went on to win another bronze in the 10m air pistol mixed team event alongside Sarabjot Singh. She was on the cusp of creating history by becoming the only Indian to have won three Olympic medals, but missed out by a whisker in the women's 25m pistol event.

An official from the India's Olympic Association revealed about Manu being India's flagbearer and praised her for doing exceptionally

pics 2024. Manu also expressed her gratitude and said she was honoured to be given the responsibility. The closing ceremony of the Paris Olympics 2024 will be held on August 11, Sunday. The 22-yearold joined an elite list including PV Sindhu and Norman Pritchard to have won two medals in the Olympics.

"Yes, Manu has been chosen to be the flag bearer. She has done exceptionally well and deserves the honour," an IOA official told agency.

"There are many in the contingent who are more deserving but it will be a real honour, if I am asked to," Manu had told agency.

Amit Rohidas gets one-match ban, set to miss India's Olympic hockey semi-final; **Hockey India lodges appeal**

PARIS, Aug 5 (Agencies): India's key defender and first rusher Amit Rohidas will miss Tuesday's Olympic men's hockey semifinal against Germany after he was handed a one-match suspension following his red card against Great Britain in the quarterfinal.

This means India will have only 15 players available for the key clash, which is big setback for the eight-time Olympic champions.

"Amit Rohidas was suspended for one match for a breach of the FIH Code of Conduct which occurred during the India vs Great Britain match on August 4," an FIH statement read.

"The suspension affects match No. 35 (India's semi-final match against Germany), where Amit Rohidas will not participate and India will play with a squad of 15 players only.

Rohidas was given the marching order against Great Britain almost 40 minutes from the final hooter after his stick unintentionally hit a rival player on Sunday.

In the second quarter of the match against Great Britain, the 31-year-old Rohidas was engaged in a midfield slug fest against Will Calnan.

Rohidas swung his stick and hit Calnan's face in an attempt to flee the British forward.

The on-field umpire initially did not rule the challenge to be a serious offence, but TV umpire changed the decision

Down to 10 men, the Indians, however, fought tenaciously for the remaining time of the match and defended stoutly to hold Great Britain to a 1-1 draw at the end of regulation time.

In the subsequent shoot-out, veteran goalkeeper PR Sreejesh's heroics handed India a 4-2 win to seal a second consecutive Olympic semifinal berth.

Hockey India lodges appeal against Rohidas' suspension

A miffed Hockey India has already lodged an appeal against Rohidas' suspension and a decision on the matter will be taken by the International Hockey Federation (FIH) Jury Bench later in the day.

MIND GAMES: Lakshya Sen loses it in the mind, cracks after 20-17 in first game | To play for bronze today

PARIS, Aug 5 (Agencies): Viktor Axelsen, man mountain, leaps up and smashes down the shuttle from 10 feet high; yet that's not the reason he won the semifinal against India's Lakshya Sen today. Denmark's Axelsen, the defending Olympics champion, tapped the side of his head and said: "I won the match up here today!'

Sen, leading 20-17 in the first game, three game points in hand, cracked under pressure - hope and expectation made his heart pound, his mind race. Serving, he wanted to keep the shuttle close to the net, place it short of the reach of the 6ft 4in Dane, but it was too short and Axelsen roared. The crowd, most of them Danes, roared "Viktor! Viktor! Viktor!", drowning out the "India, India!" from Sen's supporters in the stands. Sen, 22, then simply fell apart: He hit long twice,



and then smashed out 21-20 for Axelsen, and then game for Axelsen as Sen failed to put his drop shot on the other side of the net.

Was that the turning point, then? Axelsen, two-time Olympics medallist, two-time world champion, thought so. "I could definitely feel that he was tense," said the 30-year-old. "He maybe started to think about what he was doing. The pressure was there. That was my chance to grab the game. It wasn't easy, and I did it."

To win today against the formidable Dane, Sen's best chance was to win the first game — he did unsettle Axelsen, but he didn't stay in the moment and became impatient and edgy.

Second game, Sen started strongly, Axelsen surprisingly error-prone: he smashed into the net, hit long, hit wide, and in no time Sen was up 7-0. He was moving like a dream, floating across the court, but Axelsen started clawing his way back — a smash on the line, an error by Sen, and another, and the scoreline was 9-7. Axelsen wasn't perfect, perhaps overeager in parts, smashing into the net and wide and long. But when he's smashing well, he's almost Sen did pick up the shuttle, as at 11-11 or 13-16 or 14-19, he was left scrambling and out of position, leaving the

court empty.

In no time, Axelsen had overturned the 10-11 deficit and gone 19-14 up, winning nine of the previous 12 points. Sen's agony ended at 12:54pm sharp, after 54 minutes of intense hope, intense thought, intense despair; Axelsen pranced about, sank to his knees, saluted the Danes in all four stands and sent his racquet flying into them for a

lucky catcher. Sen, never the most verbose of men, despaired, lamenting the errors he made late in the first game. "If I had closed the first set, I would have better chances in the third," he said. 20-17, 7-0... "I had to be more patient at that time," said Sen. "Overall, in that moment, I did whatever came to my mind."

At the elite level they operate, players being near equals, it boils down to the mind. "If you start to think, you have problems," said Axelsen about being 17-20 down in the first game. "I think Lakshya, he thought a lot about it. He was probably thinking 'I have a big chance'. I think he got nervous. And when he gets nervous, I know I have to strike."

And strike Axelsen did, winning 26 of the next 40 points, handing Sen an eighth defeat in the nine matches they've played.

Sen will fight for bronze tomorrow, against Zii Jia Lee of Malaysia.

"I'd look at things I can improve upon tomorrow," he said. "Forget this match, give my best tomorrow."

"He could easily have won today," said Axelsen. "I think in four years, Lakshya would be a stronger bet for gold."

Germany wins Olympic team relay triathlon

The relay is a four-person sprint triathlon, with two men and two women completing a 300-metre swim, a seven-kilometre (4.3-mile) bike ride and a 1.8km run.



PARIS, Aug 5 (Agencies): Germany won gold in the mixed triathlon relay on Monday at the Paris Olympics, with the build-up to the event marred by news that a Belgian athlete had fallen sick after swimming in the Seine last week.

Germany's Laura Lindemann won a sprint finish in the final leg, narrowly edging out Beth Potter from Britain in silver and Taylor Knibb from the United States in bronze who were separated in a photo finish.

The relay is a four-person sprint triathlon, with two men and two women completing a 300-metre swim, a seven-kilometre (4.3-mile) bike ride and a 1.8km run.

The Seine was used for the swim on Monday, as it was for the men's and women's individual triathlon last Wednesday.

But the river has been dogged by pollution problems despite a 1.4 billion euros (USD 1.5 billion) upgrade to improve the Paris sewerage and water treatment system.

No athletes' training in the Seine has been possible since the start of Games after the water repeatedly failed water tests, with bacteria levels above authorised limits.

On the eve of the mixed relay, the Belgian National Olympic Committee (COIB) revealed that Claire Michel had fallen sick after the women's triathlon last week.

"The COIB and Belgian Triathlon hope

that the lessons will be learned for future triathlon competitions at the Olympics," the committee said in a statement.

The Belgian team withdrew from Monday's relay event as a result.

The Paris 2024 organising committee said in a statement that testing on the day of the individual triathlon last week had shown that the quality of the water was "very good" based on World Triathlon's criteria.

"The decision on whether to proceed with an event is taken by the international federation, World Triathlon, in coordination with Paris 2024, and based on the test results and a range of (notably health) criteria," it said.

"Paris 2024 wishes to remind everyone that the health and wellbeing of athletes is our top priority," it added.

Former England cricketer Graham Thorpe dies aged 55



LONDON, Aug 5 (Agencies): Former England cricketer Graham Thorpe has passed away at the age of 55, the England and Wales cricket board confirmed on Monday, August 5. Thorpe played 100 Tests for England from 1993 to 2005 and also was a part of 82 ODIs during that time. Thorpe scored 6,744 runs for England in Tests, and hit 16 centuries during his time with the team at an average of 44.66.

On Monday, ECB released a statement on their website confirming the demise of Thorpe.

"It is with great sadness that the ECB shares the news that Graham Thorpe, MBE, has passed away."

"There seem to be no appropriate words to describe the deep shock we feel at Graham's death.

"More than one of England's finest-ever batters, he was a beloved member of the cricket family and revered by fans all over the world. His skill was unquestioned, and his abilities and achievements across a 13-year international career brought so much happiness to his teammates and England and Surrey CCC supporters alike. Later, as a coach, he guided the best England Men's talent to some incredible victories across all formats of the game."

"The cricket world is in mourning today. Our hearts go out to his wife

Amanda, his children, father Geoff, and all of his family and friends during this unimaginably difficult time. We will always remember Graham for his extraordinary contributions to the sport," read the statement from ECB.

Remembering Graham Thorpe Graham Thorpe made his firstclass debut for Surrey in the summer of 1988 and became a regular player in the 1989 season. He made his England debut in

1993 at age 24, scoring an impressive 114 runs against Australia at Trent Bridge. Thorpe became a key player in

England's middle order, with his unbeaten double-century against New Zealand in Christchurch in 2002 standing out as a career highlight. This innings included 28 fours and four sixes.

Though his international career was marked by intermittent appearances, he retired from England duty in 2005. Thorpe then transitioned into coaching, initially in Australia, where he mentored players like Steve Smith and David Warner at New South Wales. He later joined the England and Wales Cricket Board as a batting coach.

In March 2022, Thorpe was appointed head coach of Afghanistan's cricket team, but he could not assume the role due to ill health.
