Independence Day | Will never allow neighbouring Country's 'Terror Designs' to succeed in J&K: LG Sinha

SRINAGAR, Aug 15 (Agencies): Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha Thursday said that the UT administration and the security forces will never allow the neighbouring country to revive terrorism in J&K and the people of Jammu must help forces to wipe out terrorism from the region.

Addressing the 78th

Independence Day gathering at Bakshi Stadium in Srinagar, the LG, said that efforts are being made by the neighbouring country to revive terrorism in J&K. "We will never allow neighbouring country's terror designs to succeed in J&K. The Jammu people have never supported terrorism and I urge the people of Jammu to stay united with the security forces to wipe out terrorism from the region," the LG said, adding



that security forces are committed to dismantle terrorism and terror networks from J&K soil. Pertinently, Jammu region has of late seen a spate of terror attacks inflicting heavy casualties on security forces. On Wednesday, an army captain and a foreign terrorist was killed in

an encounter at Assar, Doda, where a counter terror operation is still on.

The LG hailed J&K police for bagging scores of gallantry medals stating that police is working on multiple fronts in a professional manner. He said that the J & K administration left no







Heavy rains cause flash floods in north Kashmir's Bandipora; crops damaged



BANDIPORA, Aug 15 (Agencies): Heavy rains in north Kashmir's Bandipora on Thursday triggered flash floods, with water inundating several areas, primarily in the upper reaches of the district.

Reports reaching Greater Kashmir suggested that heavy rains due to cloudbursts cre-

habitations.

Although no loss of life has been reported, damage to property is being estimated, with locals suggesting that crop loss is "going to be massive," as the water has begun flowing into paddy fields.

"The worst has happened; the water is overflowing the banks and has entered the villages. More villages downhill, like Barzulla and Panzigam, are in danger," Yasir Rafique from Barzulla village said, as the Rish Kul rivulet was breached in the morning.

Yasir said the flash floods have created extensive damage to crop while also wreaking havoc in the village as road, and water pipes have been washed away besides damaging vehicles parked on the roadside. He said

no team from adminis-

tration had reached to the village so far.

He said the administration should deploy disaster management teams to prevent the situation from worsening, as the embankment is on the verge of collapse, "endangering all the habitation."

At various places, water was seen entering villages and inundating roads and lawns.

Meanwhile, the flash floods also triggered a landslide near Chandaji near Gurez-Bandipora road, prompting the administration to close the road as a precautionary measure.

ADC Bandipora confirmed to Greater Kashmir that there was a "flood-like situation" in some areas following the heavy rains in the morning.

He said the situation is being monitored, and teams are assessing the damage.

REFLECTIONS OF AN AMATEUR ON INDIA @ 78

I missed being a member of the exclusive club that author Salman Rushdie popularised as 'Midnight Children' in his novel with the same name by a decade but this had its own advantages. For example, with India having adopted the metric monetary system in 1955, one didn't have to undergo the agony of memorising the complicated values of three pies making one pice, four pice making one Anna, and 16 Annas being equal to a Rupee.

While many in our age group fondly reminisce about what they jubilantly refer to as the 'good old days', I recall that life wasn't as good as what some our age make it out to be. Though I can't speak about what adults felt those days but at home and even outside, one often heard snatches of conversation between elders that certainly did not give an impression that those days were exceptionally good ones. I distinctly recall the shortage of essential commodities being a common topic of discussion and marveling at advertisements of electronic gadgets like transistors in foreign magazines like Life and Woman & Home-old

copies of which sometimes came our way!

In those days every household had what was commonly referred to as a ration card that allowed you to buy rations from government run shops at subsidised rates, but since the amount of ration one could buy depended upon the number of family members, inflating the number of children and adding grandparents was commonplace.

Then there were permits- letters issued by the local authorities allowing those constructing houses to buy cement and other such commodities at what was referred to as government rates. Needless to say, getting a permit or padding the number of family members in ration cards was only possible through use of influence or the ubiquitous baksheesh [bribe].

The local administration did release an additional quota of sugar during festivals and marriages in the family which could be drawn by showing your ration card but the quantity [despite fudging the numbers of family members] was largely insufficient. However, one could buy any amount of sugar from the blackmarket. In fact, black marketing was a lucrative and thriving business where you could for a price pick up anything ranging from car tyres to cars itself!

In the summer months, power outages were frequent but didn't cause us much discomfort because the common Indian household then had neither a fridge nor any coolers. But what upset us kids most was the ban on sale of milk-sourced sweetmeats by the district magistrate due to acute shortage

of milk.

When the 1962 Sino-Indian conflict broke out, I was only six years old. Yet I vividly remember the frantic government appeals on radio and advertisements in news reels that preceded movie screening requesting people to donate gold jewellery, money and even woollens to help arm and clothe our soldiers fighting the Chinese. So much for the good old days!

Things started improving significantly during the seventies and life became much easier and more comfortable. This inference is duly reflected in the World Bank's data which shows India's per capita income has risen from a modest \$82 in 1960, jumped to a whopping \$2,388 in 2022. This is indeed a remarkable achievement when viewed in isolation, but for accurately determining the precise degree of progress made over the years, a comparative analysis is essential.

As China's per capita income in 1960 was \$ 89 as against India's \$82, comparison between the two countries is fair. In 2022, however, while China's per capita income swelled to \$ 12, 720, India's per capita income was only \$2,388. So, while India has definitely done well over the years, it would not be inappropriate to say that we could have certainly done much better.

Hence, the centre's decision to declare 'Vikasit Bharat' [Developing India] as the central theme of India's 78th Independence Day celebrations is most appropriate as it gives a clarion call for the government's vision of transforming India into a developed entity by the centenary of Independence in 2017. Thanks to

well conceived and dynamically executed infrastructural development projects, adopting a 'bottomup' approach and public participation to improve quality of life of the people through imaginative schemes as well as reducing foreign dependency by facilitating indigenisation through the 'Make in India' initiative, much lost ground has been covered.

Though the results achieved thus far are remarkable, there's no room for complacency or negativity, as in this competitive world there's no place for laggards. Simultaneously, since India's continuing progress is bound to upset certain countries and entities whose captive market is under threat from India's 'Make in India' programme, spreading negativity and creating a hostile working environment would only help inimical forces to exploit public emotions and impede progress.

India has all it takes to become a world leader provided we remain united and play our respective roles as its citizens in a responsible manner.

India saw a catastrophic partition that led to the creation of Pakistan, India still emerged as a sovereign nation with a rich cultural heritage and diverse population.

The economy of India has transitioned from a mixed planned economy to a mixed middleincome developing social market economy and has become the largest South Asian economy with a notable public sector in strategic industries. It is the world's fifth-largest economy by nominal GDP and the third-largest by purchasing power parity (PPP). According to the International Monetary Fund (IMF), on a per capita income basis, India ranked 139th by GDP (nominal) and 127th by GDP (PPP). From independence in 1947 until 1991, successive governments followed the Soviet model and promoted protectionist economic policies, with extensive Sovietization, state intervention, bureaucrat driven enterprises and economic regulation. This is characterised as dirigism, in the form of the Licence Raj. The end of the Cold War and an acute balance of payments crisis in 1991 led to the adoption of a broad economic liberalisation in India and indicative planning. Since the start of the 21st century, annual average GDP growth has been 6% to 7%. The economy of the Indian subcontinent was the largest in the world for most of recorded history up until the onset of colonialism in early 19th century.India accounts for 7.2% of the global economy in 2022 in PPP terms, and around 3.4% in nominal terms in 2022.

India does, however, face some challenges. It has significant informal domestic economies. The COVID-19 pandemic reversed both economic growth and poverty reduction and credit access weak-

nesses contributed to lower private consumption and heightened inflation and affected new social and infrastructure equity efforts. Economic growth slowed down in 2017 due to the shocks of "demonetisation" in 2016 and the introduction of the Goods and Services Tax in 2017. Nearly 70% of India's GDP is driven by domestic consumption. The country is the world's sixth-largest consumer market. Apart from private consumption, India's GDP is also fueled by government spending, investments, and exports. In 2022, India was the world's 6th-largest importer and the 9th-largest exporter.India has been a member of the World Trade Organization since 1 January 1995. [27] It ranks 63rd on the Ease of doing business index and 40th on the Global Competitiveness Index. Due to extreme rupee/dollar rate fluctuations India's nominal GDP fluctuates significantly. With 476 million workers, the Indian labour force is the world's second-largest. India has one of the world's highest number of billionaires and extreme income inequality. Despite considerable efforts for widening the tax base, the number of taxpayers in the country remains low. However, the number of income tax returns filed have been increasing year on year reaching a record 6.77 crores of Income Tax Returns (ITRs) filed till 31July 2023 which was a 16.1% Yearon-Year increase.India is predicted to be the third largest economy by market exchange rates in 2027.



After capturing the hearts of audiences with Stree back in 2018, the beloved cast and crew are back with a highly anticipated sequel.



I-Day: Punishment given for crimes against women should be publicised, says PM Modi

Expresses concern over incidents of rape and violence against women

NEW DELHI, Aug 15 (Agencies): Prime Minister Narendra Modi Thursday underscored the need to widely publicise punishments given for atrocities against women so that there is a fear of consequence, his comments coming in the backdrop of the horrific rape and murder of a trainee doctor in Kolkata.

Addressing the nation from the ramparts of the Red Fort on the 78th Independence Day, Modi expressed profound concern over incidents of rape and violence against women.

"Crimes against women should be probed swiftly, and stringent punishment given to those who commit such demonic acts," Modi said, stressing the need for societal introspection and creating fear of consequences among perpetrators.

"Today, from the Red Fort, I want to express my pain. As a society, we will have to think seriously about the atrocities against our mothers, sis-



ters, and daughters. There is anger among common people because of this. I can feel that rage," he said.

He also said such disturbing incidents continue to occur.

The fear of punishment must be struck among the perpetrators, he said. "Those who commit such sins should know that they will be hanged."

Addressing the issue of advancements in women's rights, Modi discussed the extension of paid maternity leave from 12 weeks to 26

weeks

"The extension of paid maternity leave is not just about respect for women but also about making thoughtful decisions to ensure that the child in a mother's care becomes an exemplary citizen," he said.

He underscored that this change reflects a compassionate and constitutional approach to supporting working mothers and their children.

He celebrated the inclusion of approximately 10 crore new women in self-help groups, highlighting their growing role in family decision-making and broader social change.

"We are proud to see that women are becoming economically self-reliant. When women become self-reliant, they participate in family decision-making processes, which will ensure significant social transformation," he said.

Modi drew a parallel between the global success of Indian CEOs and the achievements of these women. "While our CEOs gain global recognition, one crore women are becoming Lakhpati Didis".

Modi said the government has allocated between Rs 10 and 20 lakh to these groups with a total of Rs 9 lakh crore provided in support so far.

The Prime Minister highlighted the government's efforts in promoting a "women-led development model" across various sectors, including innovation, employment, and entrepreneurship

Tallest Tricolour in northeast hoisted at army headquarters in Manipur



IMPHAL, Aug 15 (Agencies): The tallest flag in Northeast India was hoisted at the INA headquarters complex at Moirang in Manipur's Bishnupur district on the occasion of the country's 78th Independence Day on Thursday.

Indian National Army (INA) soldiers in 1944 had hoisted its flag for the first time in Moirang on Indian soil.

"Today, we proudly witness the unfurling of the tricolour at the historic INA headquarters in Moirang, Bishnupur district. The flag flies high atop the 165 ft tall flagpole, the tallest in North-East India, symbolising our nation's pride and glory. The INA headquarters, established by Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose, holds great historical importance. On April 14, 1944, the Indian National Army (INA) first hoisted the tricolour here, marking a pivotal moment in our struggle for independence," Manipur Chief Minister N Biren Singh said on X.

"As we celebrate Har Ghar Tiranga, let us remember and honour the sacrifices made by our freedom fighters and the enduring legacy of India's Freedom Struggle," Singh said.

Earlier, Singh said

"I thought of unfurling the tallest flag in Eastern India and engaged a few persons to do it. A new architectural design which covers the old building of the INA headquarters was built. I wanted to surprise Prime Minister and Union Home Minister. We heard that the old Azad Hind Forces headquarters still had bullet holes and a place of hiding. We reached out to the owner of the house and told him that the government will properly compensate the owners by giving them land."

Convenor of INA Memorial Y Modhu Singh applauded the initiative taken by the Biren Singh government to restore the INA's old headquarters.

"We want to convey our congratulations and appreciation to CM Biren Singh for showing keen interest and building a new structure above the old headquarters of INA without altering the old buildings. This will attract pilgrims from all across the country."

The house previously belonged to social activist Hemam Nilamani Singh and witnessed iconic moments in India's freedom struggle with Azad Hind Forces launching an all-out attack on British forces and declaring independence long before the country achieved its independence in 1947.

Grandson of Nilamani Singh, Hemam Nandkumar Singh said "My grandfather joined the INA movement in 1944 and his residence became the INA headquarters after Moirang was liberated on 14th April 1944. The residence was handed to Colonel Shaukhat Malik. After the retreat of INA, he went to Rangoon (in Myanmar) and dedicated to the cause of India's freedom struggle for a year under the leadership of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose in Rangoon.'

A few metres from the INA headquarters is the INA museum which houses letters, weapons and other war memorabilias. The complex has a life-sized bronze statue of Bose which was a gift from West Bengal.

Speaking on the most valuable items in the museum, Curator L Sadhna Devi said "We have handwritten letters of Netaji and the original ones are displayed here...".

UP woman scolds son, 16, over video game addiction, he dies by suicide

BANDA, Aug 15 (Agencies): A 16-yearold student in Uttar Pradesh died by suicide after allegedly being scolded by his parents for playing video games for too long, police said. Anand Kishore, a class 10 student, spent excessive time playing the Free Fire game, neglecting his studies. Angered by this, his mother allegedly scolded him and asked him to stop playing video

Assam's future at risk as Hindu-Muslim population balance shifts: Himanta Sarma

GUWAHATI, Aug 15 (Agencies): Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma expressed concerns on Thursday about the state's future, stating that the declining population balance between Hindus and Muslims poses a significant challenge. During his Independence Day speech, Sarma highlighted that the indigenous people of Assam are increasingly becoming a minority in 12-13 districts due to demographic changes.

Sarma pointed out that the Hindu population, which once constituted 60-65% of the state, has now dropped to around 57%, while the Muslim population has risen to 41% as of 2021. He urged all com-



munities to adhere to family planning norms and cautioned against polygamy, emphasising the need to restore the population balance.

The Chief Minister also discussed the government's efforts to protect indigenous land and interests. He announced that the government has reclaimed 167 square

kilometers of forest land from encroachers, attributing the encroachment primarily to one community.

He further stated that a strong law would be introduced to prevent the sale of land by indigenous communities, such as tribals and Adivasis, to others in the undivided Goalpara district

To safeguard the land rights of communities like Koch-Rajbongshi, Bodo, and Rabha, the Revenue Department plans to introduce new legislation in the upcoming Assembly session. Sarma also mentioned the creation of micro tribal belts outside existing tribal areas to ensure land protection.

Starting October 2, the Assam government will launch the third edition of Mission Basundhara, aimed at granting land rights to indigenous people in the hills of Guwahati. Sarma also announced plans to return tea garden land to workers, with a policy to be unveiled soon.

In addition to land

reforms, the Chief Minister revealed plans to introduce a state domicile policy to ensure that only locals can secure government jobs. He also expressed his commitment to resuming the National Register of Citizens (NRC) update process, which was halted due to the suspension of 9.22 crore biometric records.

Sarma emphasised the government's progress in reducing child marriage, noting that 5,413 cases had been filed by May 31 this year, with many resulting in convictions. He vowed to eradicate child marriage in Assam by 2026, emphasising education as a critical tool in this fight.

Probe Agency Attaches Avantha Group's Properties Worth 678 Crore

NEW DELHI, Aug 15 (Agencies): Directorate of Enforcement (ED) has provisionally attached immovable properties of Gautam Thapar's Avantha Group. Valued at 678.48 crore, the properties are in the form of land located in Haryana, Maharashtra and Uttarakhand.

On August 19, 2019, CG Power and Industrial Solutions Ltd had disclosed under Regulation 30 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 to Bombay Stock Exchange and National Stock Exchange regard-

ing findings which had potential implications on the financial position of the company.

The disclosure made by CG Power and Industrial Solutions Ltd revealed that assets and liabilities of the company have been understated considerably; that advances to related parties and unrelated parties have also been understated; additionally, certain assets' company have been provided as collateral, the company was made a co-borrower and/or guarantor for enabling financing of loans which were immediately routed out of the company without due authorisation.

The notice of the disclosure was taken by the lender banks of the company and on the basis of a complaint made by State Bank of India, CBI, New Delhi registered an FIR dated 22.06.2021 under the various sections of IPC and Prevention of Corruption Act against CG Power and Industrial Solution Ltd: Gautam Thapar, along with K. N. Neelkanth, Madhav Acharya, B. Hariharan, Omakar Goswami and unknown public servant(s) and private person(s) in peron consortium of banks to the tune of 2,435 crore. On the basis of the above FIR, ED initiated the investigation under PMLA, and during the course of the investigation, earlier two Provisional Attachment Orders were issued wherein the properties of 14.43 crore were attached.

have been involved in the offence of money laundering.

Most of the funds have been paid without the due authorisation of the board and the funds ultimately paid to Avantha Group companies remained still outstanding on Avantha Group. Therefore, the properties of companies of Avantha Group worth 678.48 Crore have been attached.

Paralympians...India organising the G20 Summit on a large scale has proven that India has the capability to organise largescale events...It is the dream of India to host 2036 Olympics, we are making preparations for that...," PM Modi said while addressing the nation from Red Fort.

Earlier in the month, Union Minister for Youth Affairs and Sports, Mansukh Mandaviya, confirmed the development in a written reply in Lok Sabha, according to a press release by

the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports.

The allotment of hosting rights for the Summer Games is done by the IOC through a detailed host selection process. The IOC has a dedicated body, the Future Host Commission (FHC), which deals with this subject.

India will look to continue the momentum of winning 19 medals at the Tokyo Paralympics and a historic 111-medal haul at the Para Asian Games. India has fielded its largestever contingent of 84 athletes

for the Paris Paralympics starting from August 28. The 84 athletes will compete in 12 sports, including archery, athletics, badminton, canoeing, cycling, blind judo, powerlifting, rowing, shooting, swimming, table tennis, and taekwondo.

Earlier. PM Modi was warmly welcomed by Defence Minister Rainath Singh and other dignitaries at the ramparts of Red Fort. The Prime Minister was pictured dressed in a white kurta and blue attire and a traditional multicolour safa.

This year's celebration

Ind-Ban Tests: Arshdeep, Khaleel to fight for India spot as Bumrah likely to be rested



NEW DELHI, Aug 15 (Agencies): Jasprit Bumrah is expected to make a comeback for the three-Test series against New Zealand starting on October 16 after a well-deserved break following India's T20 World Cup victory, but the pace spearhead could continue to be on rest for the two Tests against Bangladesh in September.

It is understood that the Indian team management and selectors are looking to bring in more variations into the pace attack and hence a left-arm seam and swing bowler could be added to the bouquet of pacers who are vying for a Test cap.

In terms of exposure and experience, the selectors have two choices in Arshdeep Singh, who is a regular in the T20 format, and the injury prone and slightly erratic Khaleel Ahmed, who is rated very highly in some circles

"In case of Bumrah, he knows his body the best and it will be up to

him if he wants to play in the Tests against Bangladesh. The team management and selectors are very clear that India needs a 120 per cent fit Jasprit Bumrah for all five Tests against Australia Down Under. Before that, there is New Zealand in India, where he will probably play and get ready for the sterner tests," a BCCI source said.

In case of Arshdeep, his initiation into red ball cricket was in fact in Rahul Dravid's plans as well and accordingly he was sent to Kent last year to play some County games.

Khaleel is a much improved bowler but has a tendency to be erratic. The other choice for a left-arm seamer is Yash Dayal, but he is behind Khaleel and Arshdeep in this race.

Steve Smith 'not fussed' about opening against India in Border Gavaskar Trophy

SYDNEY, Aug 15 (Agencies): Star Australia batter Steve Smith isn't too concerned about opening against India in the Border Gavaskar Trophy 2024-25. Notably, Smith began opening the innings in the series against West Indies after David Warner's retirement. The 35-year-old didn't have a memorable beginning at the top of the order registering scores of 12, 11* and 6 in his first three innings.

However, he finally shut his critics in the second Test against West Indies scoring a phenomenal 91* (146) with the help of nine fours and a six. Although the knock couldn't help Australia get over the line, Smith managed to prove that he can bat anywhere in his favourite format.

As Australia prepare themselves for the all-important upcoming five-match series against India, Smith was asked whether he's keen to open the innings against the Asian giants. The batting maestro said that he isn't too fussed about it and will bat wherever the team asks him to.

"You'll have to ask the men in charge but I'm not fussed either way. Some challenging conditions with the new ball, in particular. So I would have liked to score a few more runs. That's the game sometimes but i played pretty well in the second innings at the Gabba where we couldn't get over the line, unfortunately. It's just a position to me



so it doesn't really faze me too much," Smith was quoted as saying by Code

Smith has a stellar record in Test cricket having 9685 runs to his name at an average of 56.97 with 32 hundreds. The batting stalwart also enjoys batting against India having scored 2042 runs against them at an average of 65.87 with nine hundreds and five fifties.

Further speaking ahead, Smith talked about his absence from the T20 World Cup squad saying with he was disappointed to have not made it to the squad.

"I don't know about international T20 stuff. You'll have to ask the selectors there. I was disappointed not to be in the World Cup but that's the way things go. They wanted all the big hitters. I'd love to be part of the IPL again, for sure. I'll be putting my name in the hat so just have to keep scoring runs. You never know, we'll see what happens," he added.

Morne Morkel appointed India's new bowling coach, to take charge from Bangladesh series

He has been appointed till the end of the 2027 ODI World Cup in South Africa

NEW DELHI, Aug 15 (Agencies): Former South Africa pace great Morne Morkel has been roped in as the Indian cricket team's new bowling coach, BCCI secretary Jay Shah said on Wednesday, completing the appointment of new head coach Gautam Gambhir's preferred support staff.

It is understood that the 39-year-old, who replaces Paras Mhambrey, will take over as the bowling coach from the Bangladesh series that starts with the opening Test in Chennai from September 19. He has been appointed till the end of the 2027 ODI World Cup in South Africa.

"Yes, Morne Morkel has been appointed bowling coach of the senior India men's team," said Shah.

The other members of Gambhir's support staff are assistant coach Abhishek Nayar, and fielding coach Ryan Ten Doeschate.

Morkel was also Gambhir's preferred choice, having worked

with him at Lucknow Super Giants during the Indian's two IPL seasons as mentor of the franchise.

Morkel has played 86 Tests, 117 ODIs and 44 T20Is for South Africa with a total of 544 international wickets.

He will be reporting in Bengaluru's National Cricket Academy at the start of next month and is expected to watch the Duleep Trophy games. Once there, he will also touch base with VVS Laxman and head of bowling in NCA, Troy Cooley.

According to sources, Morkel was directly appointed on Gambhir's recommendation ahead of other options like Lakshmipathy Balaji and R Vinay Kumar.

"The Cricket Advisory Committee's (CAC) mandate was to interview the candidates for the head coach. When it came to choice of support staff, it was imperative that Gambhir's choice prevailed. He has worked with Morne and thinks of him highly as a bowling coach," a BCCI



source said.

"Also with the big series against Australia coming up Down Under from last week of November, there isn't a better choice than the South African, who has himself enjoyed fair bit of success over there. Also there will be the five-Test tour of England next year with a potential sixth match if India reach WTC final."

It is understood that Balaji and Vinay's names weren't considered once it was clear that Morkel would carry forward the good work done by Mhambrey. One half of the famous

fast bowling duo that featured Dale Steyn, Morkel is a cricketing heavyweight and has also played quite a lot in India to have a fair idea about the conditions.

Also, his stint in the IPL has allowed him to have a ringside view of India's next crop of fast bowlers including the most exciting of them all -

Mayank Yaday, Ayesh Khan and Yash Thakur to name a few.

A lot of observers believe that Morkel worked quite a lot with Mayank during the past two seasons of IPL even though he remained injured for the better part.

Morkel's biggest challenge will be to handle the transition phase as Mohammed Shami enters the business end of his illustrious career and Jasprit Bumrah needs more potent support apart from Mohammed Siraj, especially in red-ball cricket.

Morkel had last year worked with the Pakistan team till the end of the ODI World Cup and quit before his contract

expired. India have never had any spin bowling coach as such although former director Ravi Shastri was a distinguished left-arm spinner in his playing days. Sairaj Bahutule, who is a part of Laxman's team at NCA, has travelled on and off with the senior team.

"Parents would be more flexible": Manu Bhaker on historic Olympic medals



(Agencies): In a candid interview with agency, Indian shooter Manu Bhaker spoke on her achievements at the recently-concluded Paris Olympics 2024, where she won two bronze medals. Manu, who is the first Indian woman to win a medal in shooting at the Summer games, became the first Indian athlete to win multiple medals in the same edition of the Olympics. This was Manu's second appearance at the Olympics after her outing in Tokyo three years back when she suffered a heartbreak due to a pistol malfunction.

NEW DELHI, Aug 15

Manu revealed that she had a different regime for Paris 2024, and expressed her happiness that things went in her favour this time.

"I've already had a long career, eight years to be precise. I was there at the Tokyo Olympics as well. But this time, for Paris Olympics, we trained in a way that we were hoping for medals. We planned in a way that things turn out good and this worked in our favour this time. For me, sometimes it is hard to manage everything," Manu said during an exclusive chat with agency.

Manu also suggested that her achievements would motivate other to take up shooting as a

The 22-year-old won a bronze each in the women's 10m air pistol and 10m air pistol mixed team event -- where she had paired with Sarabjot Sinah.

She also came close to winning a third bronze in 25m pistol before finishing a creditable fourth in Paris. No Indian athlete has won more than two individual medals at the Olympics.
