CRPF man dies after falling from roofton near Srinagar Airport

SRINAGAR, Aug 24 (Agencies): A Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) man, died after he fell from the rooftop of a Panchayat Bhawan building near the Srinagar airport, reports

Quoting an official, the news agency NVI reported that a CRPF man died after falling from the roof of Panchayat Bhawan near airport on Saturday.

The CRPF man was identified as Pawane Kakasahib, official said.

The official said that the police have taken up the investigation into the matter.

Missing **Arunachal** man traced in Kashmir

SRINAGAR, Aug 24 (Agencies): A man from Arunachal Pradesh was brought back by police from Kashmir. The man identified as Kangge Perme, was found at Budgam in Kashmir.

Media reports said that a team of East Siang police started tracing him after a missing report was filed by his father at Mebo police station on July

East Siang SP said Perme last talked to his family on July 13 and told them he was in Delhi looking for a job.

The police officer said they collected ATM transaction and call detail records of the missing person.

However, his phone location could not be traced as his mobile was switched off.

MHA providing security to conduct polls in J&K: CEO PK Pole

JAMMU, Aug 24: PK Pole, Chief Electoral Officer, Jammu and Kashmir said on Saturday that the Ministry of Home Affairs is providing security to conduct the upcoming Assembly elections in Union Territory.

Pole said that this decision has been taken by the home ministry given the security challenges in the Jammu and Kashmir region, and to carry out a peaceful election process.

"There have been secu-

rity challenges in Jammu and Kashmir over the last 2-3 decades. There has been a reduction (in terror incidents) in recent years. It is an on-and-off situation. We have worked out detailed security arrangements. For candidates, political parties, our RO officials, observers, strong rooms, all this was taken up with the Ministry of Home Affairs and accordingly, security is being provided," Pole said.

He was speaking on the security arrangements for the upcoming polls in Jammu and Kashmir



He said the Lok Sabha elections were conducted peacefully. "There will be no political violence. We are fully prepared (for any kind of situation.)"

When asked about the extra deployment of forces at polling stations in Doda given the recent incidents of terrorism, he said, "In areas where the activities of anti-national elements have increased recently, we provide additional security there and have also activated Village Defence Committees. So overall, it seems that there will be peaceful

Meanwhile, PK Pole, Chief Electoral Officer, Jammu and Kashmir, said that about 88 lakh voters will cast their ballot in the upcoming Assembly elections in Jammu and Kashmir.

The Chief Electoral Officer said seven districts will go to polls in the first phase on September 18, six districts in the second phase on September 23 and seven districts on October 1.

He further said that the four districts of South Kashmir and three districts of Doda will go to polls in the first phase.

He also said that basic minimum facilities have been made at all polling booths.

He further added that 209 new polling stations were created under the special summary revision and the location of about 200 polling stations after holding consultations with political parties.

"There will be separate queues for men and women. There will be separate arrangements for the elderly...," he said.

Webcasting will be done at every polling booth following the directions of the Chief Election Commissioner, he added.

"There are about 88 lakh voters, of which 44.89 lakh are male and 43.83 lakh are female voters, and there are 163 transgender voters," Pole said.

The last date for filing the nomination papers is August 27.

Assembly elections in Jammu and Kashmir will be held in three phases on September 18, 25 and October 1. The results will be announced on Octo-

CM Yogi questions Congress, National **Conference Pre-Poll Alliance for J&K elections**

LUCKNOW, Aug 24 (Agencies): Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath has questioned the decision of the Congress party to forge a pre-poll alliance for the upcoming Assembly elections in Jammu and Kashmir with the National Conference, which in its election manifesto pitched for a dialogue between India and Pakistan

Polling will be held in three phases in Jammu and Kashmir with the first phase starting from September 18 following annoucement of election



schedule by the Election Commissision.

Reacting to their announcement, chief minster Adityanath said on Saturday, "Elections have been announced for J&K assembly elections. This election is not only important for the people of Jammu and Kashmir but also for every Indian who believes in democracy. The Congress, which is leading the INDI Alliance, has formed a coalition with the National Conference of the Abdullah Family and once again placed its anti-national plan before the country."

Adityanath said that the pre-poll alliance of the two parties gives rise to big questions about national security and committment to the Constitution.



Nixon a serious signal and, five vears after he became President that year, he pulled out of Vietnam with some face-saving cover with the North Vietnamese who, under Ho Chi Minh, stormed Saigon. Some unperceptive rabble-rousers commented that this week's Democratic convention, again in Chicago, which will endorse Kamala Harris as the party's presidential candidate and her prospective V-P Tim Walz, might witness the same sort of demos and disturbances as those of 1968. Only, this time it would be about Gaza. Also Read - K.C. Singh | PM's Mission Kyiv bid for belated strategic balance? Yes, outgoing President Joe Biden and his team have repeatedly endorsed "Israel's right to defend itself" after the Gaza-based Hamas command launched a kill-and-kidnap operation into a pop concert and some kibbutz on October 7 last year. Mr Biden has backed up his support with deadly arms supplies to Israel which have undoubtedly contributed to the 40,000 or so deaths of civilian Palestinians in Gaza. Kamala Harris, as his vicepresident, didn't distance herself from Mr Biden's policies and complicity in Israel's war, but has, now that she is a presidential candidate herself, softened her attitude by publicly denouncing the

"inordinate" killings and bombing of schools, hospitals and other Gaza facilities in which the Israeli Defence Force says Hamas militants are stationed. Ms Harris has in the past consistently supported a "two-state solution" though she hasn't gone as far as endorsing or recognising a Palestinian state of Gaza and the West Bank. Though Antony Blinken, the US secretary of state is now in the Middle East and has announced that Israel has been persuaded to respect the American call for a ceasefire, there has been no indication from Kamala Harris that she will end the supply of deadly missiles and billions of dollars of military equipment to Israel. This partial call for peace and condemnation of the "excessive" deaths of civilians may have contributed to limiting the number of demonstrators outside this Chicago convention. The reports are that the demos are peaceful, hopeful and waiting for further announcements of a ceasefire. Perhaps the 15,000 or so demonstrators, which the protest leaders claim, are also supporters of a two-state solution. But what does such a solution mean? Will it mean that President Kamala Harris' putative future administration will initiate negotiations to freeze the borders as they are today without demanding a retreat of recent armed-settler incursions into and de facto annexations in the West Bank? Can the borders of the two states be drawn with some reference to Israel's retreat from at least some of the territory it has grabbed since the formation of the State of Israel in 1948? My pie in the unco-operative sky

is not a two-state solution but one which appeals to me as most civilised. (Gentle reader, I've just said I'm eating pie-in-the-sky, so don't laugh or mock as you would at conspiracy theorists or spaceinvader wallahs.) My argument is based on the fact that while religions have urged human beings towards decency, they have also prompted and precipitated the worst human behaviour throughout history. Think: burning at stakes, crucifixion, crusades, wars, persecution of minorities, denial of science, misogyny... (I've only got 900 words!). There are those who believe that God impregnates virgins, some that He dictates books and others that he promises land to people of a particular religion. The State of Israel, despite ultra-orthodox Jews opposing this tooth and nail, is founded on this "Promised Land" belief. Is it in the Old Testament? And then isn't also Moses' Sixth Commandment from Jehovah: "Thou shalt not kill"? 40,000 and counting, Bibi Netanyahu? Some of the most enlightened human beings, even in recent twentieth-century history, have attempted to found non-religious "secular" states in which every religion is allowed to exist and thrive. Can there ever, on that principle, be a one-secularstate solution in Israel-Palestine? It would inevitably involve constitutional guarantees of the freedom of worship and of course a democratic structure which precludes any religious section being supreme within it. That would be the end of its "secularity". It has happened elsewhere.

Easy Ways to handle Body Odour During Monsoon

Increase in humidity during the monsoon creates a breeding ground for bacteria on the skin, leading to that unpleasant musty smell.

Body odour is the result of your sweat mixing with the existing bacteria on your skin

It is most prevalent among those who sweat a lot, with athletes, overweight people, diabetics and groups with weakened immune systems most at risk.

Excessive sweating in armpits, feet,palm and groin are major cause of embrassement during monsoon season.

Damp monsoon days can mean excessive perspiration and with that comes body odour.

Sweating is the body's mechanism to strike a balance between the temperature difference in the internal body and the outside environment.

Factors such as stress, genetic background, processed and spicy food with garlic and onion base, aerated drinks, and other mental, psychological disorders can also affect the body odour.

Bathing and scrubbing help to clear away germs, dirt and odour. All parts of the body must be washed well, specially the neck, armpits and feet. These are the areas where germs accumulate and cause odour. Adding cologne to the bath water leaves the body fragrant. Colognes also have a cooling effect. Shower gels and body shampoos,

containing natural ingredients, like sandalwood, rose and khus have a cooling and refreshing effect. They are not only natural coolants, but have germicidal and antiseptic benofits

Pour 2-3 drops of lavender essential oil while bathing; it helps you stay fresh and smell nice. Essential oil helps in controlling sweat and body odour.

Wear cotton underwear and clothes during the hot, humid monsoon season. Porous materials help sweat to evaporate. change your underwear regularly, especially if you sweat excessively.

Opt for fresh, clean underwear after each shower or if you feel dampness .

After showering, pat yourself dry with a clean towel, paying particular attention to areas prone to moisture buildup (like armpits or between skin folds). This gentle approach removes excess moisture without disrupting your skin's natural microbiome or damaging the skin barrier.

Loose, light clothing is much more appropriate and comfortable during monsoon season. Tight clothing can trap moisture and inhibit airflow, leading to increased sweat and discomfort.

Daily changes of clothing is, of course, a must.

The combination of moisture and warmth in the underarm area creates an ideal environment for the growth of bacteria and fungi and unpleasant odor. By keeping the underarms dry you can minimise the risk of bacterial infections and the amount of sweat that accumulates.

The use of anti-perspirants and deodorants do help. Most deodorants are also anti-perspirants. A spray, rather than the roll-on deodorants may be more suitable in monsoon , but this is a matter of personal choice. However, be sure to choose a mild deodorant, as strong built-in anti-perspirants

can cause skin irritation or sensitive reactions. It is always better to try them out on a small area, on the inner arm, first. If the skin tingles or burns for more than a minute, you should not use it. Some people find the use of talcum powders quite adequate. They absorb perspiration and maintain freshness for some time .

Climate also plays a part in choosing the right perfume. In hot and humid monsoon conditions, it is better to go for light, lemony and fresh fragrances, rather than heavy ones. The effect of perfumes intensifies in hot,humid weather. A heavy perfume can be quite overpowering. Lemon, rose, lavender or sandalwood are light and refreshing during monsoon weather.

Here are some tips for preventing body odour:

A deodorant or a body spray should be a part of your daily routine. Before leaving the house, give a quick fragrant shower to your body. Always go for the body sprays which last for long and have extra powerful fragrance.

Regular use of anti-bacterial soap can help reduce the growth of bacterial, minimising the chances of

Reduce the number of products you're using on your face, opting for light, multitasking ones that could reduce the amount you sweat.

Mild exfoliation helps remove dead skin cells and prevent ingrown

Gentler exfoliants like lactic acid and mandelic acid are also effective and kinder to the skin. Exfoliating once or twice a week should suffice

Be generous with the use of colognes, even splashing them on. Colognes and Eau de Toilette constitute mainly water, or a mixture of alcohol and water, with only 2 to 5 % perfume. They are lighter and leave a light lingering fragrance.

Colognes can be added to bath water. Or, add eau de cologne to a mug of water and used as a last rinse. It has a cooling effect too.

Bicarbonate of soda (baking soda) helps to prevent body odour. Make a paste of baking soda and water and apply under the arms. You can also add lemon juice to this paste. Leave on for ten minutes and wash off with water. Or, mix a little baking soda with your talcum powder and apply under the arms, or on the feet.

Potato slices can also be rubbed on areas where odour forms easily.

You can rub neem paste on your underarms as an effective herb because of its antibacterial and antiseptic properties.

Rose water can always be added generously to bath water. It is a natural coolant and also fragrant.

Add 2 drops of Tea Tree Oil to two tablespoons of water or rose water. Apply this under the arms with cotton wool.

You can rub lemons on your armpits to stop the growth of microorganisms. However, do not use lemon if you have cuts or irritated skin.

To remove odour from the hair, add the juice of a lemon and half a cup of rose water to a mug of water and use as a last rinse.

For excessive perspiration (which can result in body odour), Ayurveda gives some dietary suggestions: Sip "nimbu paani." Sip ginger tea before and after your meals. Chop fresh ginger root finely and mix with a pinch of salt. Chew a little of this before your meal. Sipping warm water with your meal may also help. Light diet and less spices are advised. Eat smaller meals after short intervals

Needs urgent attention of Displaced KP community Should Displaced Kashmiri Pandits participate, abstain or boycott upcoming J&K Assembly Elections: KPC

JAMMU, Aug 24: As the Jammu and Kashmir Assembly elections approach on September 18, 2024, a crucial question looms large for the displaced Kashmiri Pandit (KP) community: Should they participate in these elections?

The issue is far from straightforward, as it touches upon deepseated concerns about representation, fairness, and the practical realities of their displacement.

For over 35 years, the displaced KP community has been living in exile, far from their ancestral homes in the Kashmir Valley. Despite being voters in these constituencies, they are not physically present to benefit from the elected representatives' work.

The funds allocated to these constituencies, meant for development and welfare, cannot serve the needs of those living hundreds of miles away in different states of the Indian nation.

This disconnect raises the question: What real benefit do displaced KPs derive from participating in an election where they have no voice or stake in the local issues?

Politicians, political parties and agencies are urging displaced KPs to shift their votes back to the Valley, despite knowing that the community



lives outside the region in practical and physical terms. This insistence on their participation in the Valley's electoral process is not just a logistical challenge but also raises ethical and democratic concerns. Voting for candidates who cannot address their immediate needs, or whose constituency they do not reside in, goes against the principies of fair representation and democratic integrity.

The argument for participation in these Assembly elections is often framed as a matter of maintaining a connection to the Valley. However, this connection is symbolic at best, as the displaced KP community remains cut off from the benefits of their vote.

The upcoming elections in J&K are unlikely to bring any tangible benefits to the displaced KP community. Voting in constituencies they do not live in, and for candidates who cannot serve their interests, is neither democratically fair nor ethically sound. The

community must carefully consider whether participation in these elections truly serves their long-term interests or if it's time to demand a more just and representative system. The choice to participate or boycott must be made with the understanding that their voice, when united, can challenge the current electoral framework that fails to accommodate

their reality.

It is imperative to adopt an honest and proper approach that truly addresses the unique circumstances of displaced Kashmiri Pandits, rather than treating them as mere electoral pawns.

This is also the right

time for displaced Kashmiri Pandits, who are currently residing outside the valley in various parts of the country, to reconsider being pressured to vote for unknown candidates from the Valley. As responsible and true citizens of India, we must question whether it is appropriate to vote under these circumstances. The community must seriously consider whether to vote, abstain, or boycott the upcoming elections to send a powerful message of dissatisfaction and displeasure to both the Government of India and the Government of the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir for ignoring and isolating

PM Modi arrives in Delhi after concluding his visit to Poland, Ukraine

NEW DELHI, Aug 24 (Agencies): Prime Minister Narendra Modi arrived at Palam airport in Delhi today after concluding his two-nation visit to Poland and Ukraine.

Prime Minister Modi's visit to Poland was the first by an Indian Prime Minister in 45 years. It was also the first Prime Ministerial visit from India to Ukraine.

During his visit to Ukraine, PM Modi and President Volodymyr Zelenskyy reiterated their readiness for further cooperation in upholding principles of international law, including the UN Charter.

They agreed on the desirability of closer bilateral dialogue in this regard.

The Indian side reiterated its principled position and focus on peaceful resolution through dialogue and diplomacy, as a part of which, India has attended the Summit on Peace in Ukraine, held in Burgenstock, Switzerland, in June 2024.

The Ukrainian side welcomed such participation by India and



highlighted the importance of high-level Indian participation in the next Peace Summit

in the next Peace Summit.

India and Ukraine signed four agreements during the visit.

During his visit to Poland, PM Modi held bilateral discussions with his counterpart Donald Tusk. The two countries decided to elevate their ties to "Strategic Partnership".

The two leaders expressed their deepest concern over the war raging in Ukraine including its terrible and tragic humanitarian consequences.

They reiterated the need for a comprehensive, just, and lasting peace in line with international law, consistent with the purposes and principles of the UN Charter.

They also noted the negative impacts of the war in Ukraine with regard to global food and energy security, especially for the Global South.

In the context of this war, they shared the view that the use, or threat of use, of nuclear weapons is unacceptable.

Russia and Ukraine have been

engaged in a conflict for nearly two-and-a-half years.

India and Poland also reiterated their unequivocal condemnation of terrorism in all its forms and manifestations and emphasised that no country should provide a safe haven to those who finance, plan, support or commit terrorist acts.

Both sides stressed the need for firm implementation of relevant resolutions of the UN Security Council, the UN General Assembly, as well as the implementation of the UN Global Counter-Terrorism Strategy. They also reaffirmed on the early adoption of the Comprehensive Convention on International Terrorism (CCIT).

The two sides reinforced their commitment to a free, open and rules-based Indo-Pacific in accordance with the international law of the sea as reflected in UNCLOS and with full respect for the sovereignty, territorial integrity and freedom of navigation to the benefit of the maritime security and international peace and stability.

On CCTV, NRI shot at by 2 men at his Amritsar residence



AMRITSAR, Aug 24 (Agencies): An NRI was shot at on Saturday by two armed turbaned assailants at point-blank range at his residence in Daburji village in Punjab's Amritsar district.

The NRI, Sukhchain Singh, an American resident, was shot in the head and neck by assailants in front of the family, comprising minor children, who were pleading not to harm their father with folded hands.

He was immediately rushed to a private hospital in Amritsar with critical bullet injuries.

The shooting is suspected to be linked to local gang activity and is believed to be a prop-

erty dispute with in-laws. The entire incident was captured on a CCTV camera.

In CCTV footage, the two men, who came on a motorcycle and did not wear masks, entered the house in the morning. The children were playing in the house. An armed assailant is seen approaching the NRI and asking him to enter a bedroom at gunpoint. As he resisted, both assailants fired at him at close range.

The entire family was in the house when the crime took place and the family was trying to rescue the victim.

After committing the crime, they managed to escape.

The video also showed

locals rushing to help the victim, who was lying on the ground after

the attacker shot at him.
As per the police, two assailants entered the house on the pretext of asking for the registration certificate of his luxury car that was pur-

chased this week.

Additional Deputy Commissioner of Police Vishaljit Singh told the media the police had obtained the CCTV footage of the crime and started the investigation to know the motive behind the crime and information about the assailants.

As per information, Sukhchain Singh had returned from the US about a month ago and was engaged in the purchase of a hotel and a luxury vehicle.

The shooting is suspected to be related to some property dispute.

Kolkata medic's murder: Healthcare services affected in Bengal as junior doctors continue ceasework

KOLKATA, Aug 24 (Agencies): Healthcare services were affected at state-run hospitals in West Bengal on Saturday as junior doctors continued their ceasework for the 16th consecutive day to protest the alleged rape and murder of a postgraduate trainee at R G Kar Medical College and Hospital.

Senior doctors were attending to patients at the emergency services at government hospi-

"Our protest will continue till justice is served to our sister. There cannot be any alternative to that," an agitating doctor at the KMCH told agency.

The Supreme Court on Thursday reiterated its appeal to the doctors protesting over the rape and killing of the medic

against them.
The court said judges and doctors cannot strike since they deal with matters involving

life and liberty.

Assam gang-rape: Prime accused dies in police custody; villagers refuse burial

According to police, the accused tried to escape and fell into the pond when he was brought to the crime scene late at night.

GUWAHATI, Aug 24 (Agencies): The prime accused in the alleged gang-rape of a 14-year-old girl in Dhing, Assam, has died after falling into a pond while attempting to escape from police custody, authorities said.

Tafiqul Islam, also known as Tafazzul Islam, was taken by police to the crime scene in the early hours of Saturday.
The villagers of Borb-

The villagers of Borbheti, the family home of the accused, have taken a decision not to participate in his funeral prayers and not allow his burial in the village graveyard.

Swapnanil Deka, Superintendent of Police for Nagaon district, stated that during the investigation at the scene, Islam attempted to flee and jumped into a nearby pond. The area was dark, and police, assisted by the State Disaster Response Force (SDRF), retrieved his body after a search operation.

"After interrogation, the accused was taken to the scene of the crime. But he attempted to flee and fell into a pond which was full of water. The area was cordoned off and the SDRF (State Disaster Response Force) was informed. The SDRF retrieved the body after a search," the SP said.

"A constable holding the rope tied to the accused's handcuff sustained injuries in his hand. We will investigate the incident," the SP further said.

The senior police official said that operations are underway to nab the other two accused persons.

The villagers of Borb-



heti held a meeting on Saturday morning and took three decisions regarding the crime committed by the youth.

'We have decided not to allow his burial in the village graveyard, not participate in his 'janaza' (burial prayers) and social boycott of his family', a village elder Md Shahjahan Ali Choudhury told agency.

'The village youth's crime has shamed us and we cannot allow his burial in the community graveyard', he added.

Meanwhile, a march

was also taken out from

the village mosque to protest against the incident.

The alleged gang-rape of the minor girl reportedly occurred on August 22 while the victim was returning home from tuition. After the assault, the girl was found unconscious by locals, who took her to a local health centre before she was transferred to Nagaon Medical College and Hospital.

The incident has led to widespread protests in Dhing, with locals and various organizations demanding strict action

against the accused. Assam Director General of Police GP Singh visited the site and met the victim's family. Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma has called for prompt and aggressive action in response to such crimes, noting the need to ensure public confidence in the government's response.

Addressing the media,

Sarma said, "I would like to say just one thing. When there is any atrocity against women, we need to take prompt action. But the public should see that the government is taking strict action. When people feel that the government is showing laxity, they get angry. When such incidents take place, the government should take very aggressive action. The government

3 dead, 5 injured in knife attack on German festival

Police believe the stabbings were carried out by a lone attacker

SOLINGEN (GERMANY), Aug 24 (Agencies): An attacker with a knife killed three people and seriously wounded at least five late on Friday at a festival in the western German city of Solingen, authorities said today.

Witnesses alerted police shortly after 9:30 p.m. to an unknown perpetrator having wounded several people indiscriminately with a knife on a central square, the Fronhof. Police said the attacker was on the run, and that they so far had only very little information on the man. They said they believe the stabbings were carried out by a lone attacker.

One of the festival organizers, Philipp Müller, appeared on stage and asked festivalgoers to "go calmly; please keep your eyes open, because unfortunately the perpetrator hasn't been caught." He said many people had been wounded by "a knifeman." At least one helicopter was seen in the air, while many police and emergency vehicles with flashing blue lights were on the

Roadside bomb kills at least 2 children and wounds 15 people in restive southwest Pakistan

Officials say a roadside bomb went off near a police office in restive southwestern Pakistan, killing two children and wounding 15 persons



QUETTA, Aug 24 (Agencies): A roadside bomb went off near a police office in restive southwestern Pakistan on Saturday, killing at least two children and wounding 15 people, authorities said.

Police officials said the wounded included policemen and passersby.

Local police official

Mujirbur Rehman said some of those wounded were hospitalized in critical condition, adding that the bodies of the dead were also transported to a nearby hospital.

No one immediately claimed responsibility for the attack that happened in Pishin, a district in Balochistan province. However,

suspicion is likely to fall on separatist groups who have stepped up attacks on security forces and civilians in recent months.

Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi denounced the bombing in a statement and mourned the slain children, saying those behind the attack "do not deserve to be called humans."

For years, Baluchistan has been the scene of a low-level insurgency by groups demanding independence from the central government in Islamabad. Although the government says it has quelled the insurgency, violence in the province has persisted.

Pakistan to introduce polymer plastic currency, redesign banknotes by year-end

KARACHI, Aug 24 (Agencies): Pakistan's central bank will introduce a new polymer plastic currency banknote later this year while also redesigning all existing banknotes to enhance security and incorporate hologram features.

State Bank of Pakistan Governor Jameel Ahmed informed a Senate committee on banking and finance in Islamabad that the redesign of all paper currency notes, with new security features, is expected to be completed by December this year. The denominations to be redesigned include Rs 10, 50, 100, 500, 1000, and 5000.

"The old notes will remain in circulation for five years, gradually being phased out by the central bank," a source close to the committee revealed.



In addition to the redesign, the State Bank plans to introduce a new polymer plastic banknote in one denomination later this year. "If it is received well by the public, plastic currency will be introduced in other denominations," Ahmed stated.

Currently, around 40 countries use polymer plastic banknotes, which are more difficult to counterfeit and offer enhanced security fea-

tures, such as holograms and see-through windows. Australia was the first country to introduce polymer banknotes in 1998.

Governor Ahmed also

confirmed that there are no plans to cancel the Rs 5,000 note, despite suggestions from some members of the Senate committee, including Mohsin Aziz, who argued that the high-denomination note facilitates corruption.

Nikki Haley says isolationist policy is not healthy while showing support for Trump in Taiwan

TAIPEI, Aug 24 (Agencies): Former U.S. ambassador to the United Nations, Nikki Haley, put in good words for Republican nominee Donald Trump on Saturday during her visit to Taiwan, saying that an isolationist policy isn't "healthy" and called on her party to stand with her country's allies.

Haley, who ran against Trump for the party's presidential nomination, told reporters in the capital, Taipei, that supporting U.S. allies, including Ukraine and Israel, was vital while underscoring the importance of Taiwan — which Beijing claims as its territory to be brought under control by force if necessary. "I don't think the isolationist approach is healthy. I think America can never sit in a bubble and think that we won't be affected," she said.

While the U.S. doesn't formally recognize Taiwan, it is the island's strongest backer and main arms provider.



However, Trump's attempt to reclaim the presidency has fueled worries. He said Taiwan should pay for U.S. protection in an interview with Bloomberg Businessweek published in July and dodged answering the question of whether he would defend the island against a possible Chinese military action.

When Haley shut-

When Haley shuttered her own bid for the GOP nomination, she did not immediately endorse Trump, having accused him of causing chaos and disregarding the importance of U.S. alliances abroad. But in May she said she would be voting for him while making it clear that she felt her former boss had work to do to win over voters who supported her

On Saturday, she said that having previously served with Trump's administration, "we did show American strength in the world", pointing to their pushback against China and their sanctioning of Russia and North Korea among other efforts.

"I think that all of that strength that we showed is the reason that we didn't see any wars, we didn't see any invasions, we didn't see any harm that happened during that time. I think Donald Trump would bring that back," she said.

Haley also criticized Trump's rival U.S. Vice President Kamala Harris, saying she would "do exactly" what President Joe Biden had done. She said Harris was part of his administration when the Taliban took over Afghanistan in 2021, when Russia invaded Ukraine in 2022 and when the Hamas-Israel war broke out last

year.

"She was in the situation room right next to Joe Biden. She was there making the exact same decisions. Those decisions have made the world less safe," she said.

Haley added that while the Republicans and Democrats may not currently concur on much, they agree on "the threats of China," adding that Taiwan is now looking "to make

sure that if China starts a fight with them, that they are prepared to make sure that they can fight back."

She said her party should stand with the country's allies and make sure that the country shows strength around the world. She also said any authoritarian regime and "communists" harming or hurting other free countries should be a personal matter to the U.S.

"We don't want to see communist China win. We don't want to see Russia win. We don't want to see Iran or North Korea win," she said.

Haley began her trip to Taiwan, this week, and met Taiwanese President Lai Chingte. She called for more international backing for the self-ruled island, a coordinated pushback against China's claims over it, and for Taiwan to become a full member of the United Nations.

MANILA, Aug 24 (Agencies): Hundreds of police officers backed by riot squads raided a vast religious compound in a southern Philippine city Saturday in search of a local preacher accused of sexual abuse and human trafficking, police officials said.

A supporter of the group, called Kingdom of Jesus Christ, reportedly died due to a heart attack during the massive police raid that started at dawn in the group's compound in Davao city, livestreamed online by a local TV network owned by the group, police said, adding that the death was not related to the police operations.

Officers brought equipment that could detect people behind cement walls. But by mid-afternoon, they found no sign of Apollo Quiboloy in the compound — some 30 hectares (75 acres) that includes a cathedral, a

hangar and a taxiway leading to Davao International Airport.

Quiboloy and his lawyer have denied the criminal allegations against him and his religious group, saying these were fabricated by critics and former members, who were removed from the religious group after committing irregularities.

Quiboloy's followers, many filming the police raid with their cell-phones, yelled at the police, questioning the legality of the raid and pronouncing the innocence of Quiboloy, who was a close supporter and spiritual adviser of former President Rodrigo Duterte.

Duterte had criticized previous attempts by large numbers of police to arrest Quiboloy as overkill.

Quiboloy claims to be the appointed son of God. In 2019, he claimed he stopped a major earthquake from hitting the southern Philippines.

Police Brig. Gen. Nicolas Torre III, who led the raid, said officers wanted to serve warrants for the arrest of Quiboloy for various criminal cases, including child abuse and human trafficking. He justified the large deployment, saying there were more than 40 buildings and structures to be searched in the religious compound, where large numbers of Quiboloy's followers heckled and opposed the raid noisily.

"We won't leave here until we get him," Torre told reporters as sirens blared in the background. "We have nobail warrants for Quiboloy and four others for very grave crimes, including human trafficking, child abuse and other cases."

In 2021, United States federal prosecutors announced the indict-

ment of Quiboloy for allegedly having sex with women and underage girls who faced threats of abuse and "eternal damnation" unless they catered to the self-proclaimed "son of God."

Quiboloy and two of his top administrators were among nine people named in a superseding indictment returned by a federal grand jury and unsealed in November 2021.

The superseding indictment contained a raft of charges, including conspiracy, sex trafficking of children, sex trafficking by force, fraud and coercion, marriage fraud, money laundering, cash smuggling and visa fraud.

Quiboloy's group said then that he was ready to face the charges in court, but he went into hiding after a Philippine court ordered his arrest and several others for child and sexual abuse. The Philippine Senate has separately ordered Quiboloy's arrest for refusing to appear in committee hearings that was looking into criminal allegations against him.

Marcos Jr. has urged Quiboloy to surrender and assured him of fair treatment by authorities. When he was mayor

of Davao city and later as president, Duterte appeared in Quiboloy's news program to promote his policeenforced drug crackdowns, which left thousands of mostly poor suspects dead. Duterte and his police officials have denied authorizing extrajudicial killings of drug suspects, but he openly threatened drug dealers with death when he was in office.

The International Criminal Court has been investigating the widespread killings under Duterte's campaign against illegal drugs as a possible crime against humanity.

Turkey and Russia resume joint patrols in northern Syria as Ankara seeks to mend ties with Assad

ISTANBUL, Aug 24 (Agencies): Turkey and Russia have resumed joint military patrols in northern Syria after nearly a year's break, the Turkish Defense Ministry announced Saturday.

Combined patrols began in the Operation Peace Spring area, the statement said, referring to a 30-kilometer (19-mile) -deep strip of land on the Syrian side of the Turkey-Syria border between Tal Abyad and Ras al-Ayn. The territory was captured from Kurdish fighters by Turkish and allied Syrian forces in 2019.

The renewed Turkish-Russian patrols come as Ankara is trying to repair its relations with Syrian President Bashar Assad, whose regime draws support from Moscow.

Assad has said he will only meet Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan to discuss the withdrawal of Turkish troops from Syria and an end to Ankara's support for Syrian fighters that Damascus considers terrorists.

Turkish and Russian soldiers first began joint operations in the area in November 2019, conducting 344 patrols until October last year, when they were suspended, the ministry said.

Some 24 Turkish personnel in four vehicles took part in the first resumed patrol on Thursday at the eastern end of the Operation Peace Spring area.

"It is planned to continue the United Land Patrol ... to ensure the security of our country's borders and the civilian population in the region

(and) to establish stability in northern Syria," the ministry said in its statement.

The operation would also identify "check-points, headquarters and military structures" of Kurdish fighters known as the YPG.

Turkey considers the YPG a terrorist organization due to its links to the PKK, which has fought a 40-year insurgency against Ankara, leading to tens of thousands of deaths.

The United States, however, partnered with the YPG in 2014 to fight the Islamic State group in Syria and continues to support the Kurdish fighters under the umbrella of the Syrian Democratic Forces. The relationship has led to tensions between NATO allies Turkey and the U.S.

Sikh outfits demand restoration of pre-August 5, 2019 status of J&K

JAMMU, Aug 24: Shiromani Akali Dal (Amritsar) J&K unit, supported by various Sikh organizations including Sikh Intellectuals Circle J&K, JK Sikh Council, International Sikh Federation, Sikh Students Federation, and Sikh Noujawan Sabhas of Jammu, Sikh leaders welcomed the announcement of Assembly Elections in Jammu and Kashmir.

They expressed their firm belief in democracy and secularism but also demanded the immediate restoration of the pre-August 5, 2019, status of J&K, including its special status as a state. Gaurav raises serious concern over non-functioning of Registration Software in J&K UT

Urges LG Sinha to take immediate steps to streamline registration process

JAMMU Aug 24: Gaurav Gupta, former General Secretary of the Chamber of Commerce and Industry Jammu, has expressed grave concern over the ongoing non-functioning of the registration software in the region.

In a statement on Saturday, Gaurav Gupta said that since January 2024, the software has been malfunctioning, causing significant inconvenience to the public, especially those dealing with land and immovable property transactions through powers of attorney.

He pointed out that more than 1500 individuals in Jammu, holding powers of attorney related to land, have paid stamp duties as required, but their transactions are being stalled. He explained that the software lacks the necessary provision to reflect the attachment of stamp duties with the corresponding sale deeds, leading to delays in registration processes.

He mentioned that the aggrieved applicants have been raised multiple times with concerned authorities, including the Sub-Registrar, Inspector General of Registration (IGR), and the Special Secretary of Revenue, but no effective resolution has been achieved. "Despite numerous meetings, the matter remains unresolved, leaving people with no option but to face continued delays in property registration," he said.

Gaurav Gupta urged the Lt. Governor to intervene and ensure that the necessary instructions are imparted to the concerned software handling agencies. "The delay is causing distress to thousands of citizens, and I urge the administration to take immediate steps to streamline the registration process. Only then can we hope to resolve this long-standing issue and provide relief to the aggrieved public," he added.

Dhawan appeared in 34 Tests, 167 ODIs and 68 T20Is for India

NEW DELHI, Aug 24 (Agencies): Veteran India opener Shikhar Dhawan announced his retirement from all forms of cricket two years after he last donned the national jersey, saying that he leaves the scene a content man after representing the country in all three formats.

The 38-year-old made his international debut in 2010 in an ODI against Australia in Visakhapatnam and his last India game was also a 50-over match, against Bangladesh in 2022.

"As I close this chapter of my cricketing journey, I carry with me countless memories and gratitude. Thank you for the love and support! Jai Hind!," Dhawan said in a post on 'X'.

"It's important to turn the page to move forward in life and that's why I am announcing my retirement from international and domestic cricket. As I bid goodbye to my cricket journey, I have peace in my heart that I played for so long," he said.

Dhawan appeared in 34 Tests,



167 ODIs and 68 T20Is for India but had fallen out of favour in the last couple of years due to patchy form and emergence of younger opening talents like Yashasvi Jaiswal and Shubman Gill.

His best came in the 50-over format in which he amassed 6793 runs at an average of 44.11, including 17 hundreds and 39 fifties. He averaged 40.61 for his 2315 Test runs,

which featured seven centuries.

"I am standing at a point in my life where when I look back, I see only memories, and when I look ahead, I see a new world. I had just one goal in life, to play for India, and I made it happen," he said.

"I am very thankful to DDCA (Delhi and Districts Cricket Association), the BCCI and my fans. And that's why I tell myself, don't be sad that you won't play

for India again but be happy that you played for your country. And that's the biggest thing for me, that I played," he said in his concluding remarks in the social media post.

At his peak, the Delhi swashbuckler was a sight to behold with his range of strokes and ability to hit powerfully.

He is a bonafide IPL legend, appearing in 222 matches, that yielded 6769 runs, including two hundreds and 51 half centuries.

His 768 fours in the tournament are the highest by any batter and he also holds the distinction of being the first to hit consecutive hundreds in the event

He was a part of the title-winning Sunrisers Hyderabad team in the 2016 season. He has also played for Delhi, Mumbai and Punjab. Of these, he captained Delhi and Punjab at various stages of his career.

He had appeared for Punjab this season but played in only five matches owing to fitness

Messi, who has been out of action since suffering an ankle ligament injury on July 14, has missed a significant portion of the season, including Inter Miami's entire 2024 Leagues Cup campaign. The injury occurred during the Copa América final between Argentina and Colombia, held at Hard Rock Stadium in Miami Gardens, Florida. While the 37-year-old has been sidelined since then, Martino remains optimistic about his imminent comeback.

Speaking to ESPN, Martino stated that while he couldn't pinpoint an exact return date, he assured fans that Messi's comeback is on the horizon. "I wouldn't be able to give an approximate number of days that he returns to training, but it is not a situation that is too far away," Martino said. "There is a part of the injuries that have to do with the physical, and there is a part that has to do with the mental. We have to overcome them both ways, and I think he is going through that process."

Martino noted that Messi has been gradually progressing in his recovery, adding, "He is feeling better and better. He has been working in the field for three or four days now. We cannot give a specific time frame because we do not know, and it would be speculative to do so. But it is close."

Despite Messi's absence, Inter Miami has been performing well. They currently lead the MLS Eastern Conference with 53 points from 25 games. The team is poised to secure a playoff spot, with their next match against FC Cincinnati at home on Saturday. Even if Miami does not win the game, multiple result combinations could still guarantee them a postseason berth.

Since joining Inter Miami in 2023, Messi has made a significant impact, recording 12 goals and 13 assists in just 12 regular-season matches (11 starts). His return would undoubtedly bolster the team's offensive capabilities as they head into the crucial final stretch of the season.

Inter Miami's regular season concludes on October 19 with a match against the New England Revolution, and fans eagerly anticipate seeing Messi back on the field, contributing to the team's success.

History unfolded in the ongoing season of the Maharaja T20 Trophy as a match between Bengaluru Blasters and Hubli Tigers witnessed a triple super-over for the first time in T20 cricket history. After being put into bat, Hubli Tigers put 164 runs on the board. Captain Mayank Agarwal hit a fifty but the Blasters' could only match the total, denied a win due to run out off the last ball. After the scores were tied for the first time, Agarwal came out to bat once again in the first Super Over. However, he was dismissed for a golden duck, with the Blasters putting 10 runs on the board.

Chasing 10 to win, Hubli Tigers' captain Manish Pandey hit a crucial six to tie the game once again, taking the game to another Super Over.

In the second Super Over, both teams scores 8 runs each. This took the game to a record third Super Over in the history of T20 cricket.

In the decisive Super Over, Manvanth Kumar hit two fours as Hubli Tigers chased down a target of 13. Earlier in the day Bengaluru's Lavish Kaushal logged the first five

Soon after Mayank Agarawal completed his half-century in 29 balls, including eight fours, he was caught behind off the bowling of Manvanth Kumar, leaving the Bengaluru Blasters in trouble at 96/5 in 13.2 overs.

Suraj Ahuja (26) and Anirudha Joshi (17) combined for 27 brisk runs. In the 17th over, Ahuja was run out and Joshi was bagged by Manvanth Kumar. With 30 runs needed off 18 balls, Naveen MG added the finishing touch, working three boundaries and a six in his 11-ball knock before he was picked

up by Kumar LR in the 19th over. Bengaluru Blasters needed one run off the last ball of the innings, but Kranthi Kumar was run out to finish the innings with a tie.

In the first innings, Thippa Reddy (7) fell early, Mohd. Taha gave the Hubli innings a jump-start hoisting two sixes and two fours off Santok Singh in the third over to race to 31 runs in 14 balls. Lavish Kaushal picked Taha in the fifth over with the Hubli Tigers finishing the powerplay at 53/2.

Shubhang Hegde broke through in his first over with the wicket of KL Shrijith (9) and Karthikeya KP (13) became Lavish Kaushal's second wicket of the night. Difficult for me if I recall Olympic setback: Boxer Nishant

CHENNAI, Aug 24 (Agencies): Boxing, in general, is a harsh sport. Cuts and bruises are widespread, and the participants, over time, learn to deal with them. It can become even harsher sometimes, as Nishant Dev, a proficient master of the craft, found out during the Paris Olympics. A controversial decision crushed his dreams into pieces, and he's yet to recover from that harsh outcome.

Nishant, who was representing the country in the men's 71kg category, was following the script to perfection and was just a step away from achieving his careerlong dream - an Olympic medal. In the do-or-die quarterfinal bout against Marco Verde of Mexico, Nishant had to operate with the same vigour that he had shown during the previous bouts to make history.

Like in his earlier fights, the 23-year-old started with conviction, giving himself an early advantage. After a close second round and a tough finishing round, Nishant was quite certain that he had done enough. A positive outcome on the day would have been life-changing. However, what followed was doom and gloom. That decision once again brought the sport's ref-

Almost three weeks have passed since that heartbreak, and Nishant, who is generally full of spirit, is visibly low. In fact, he refrains from talking about the subject with most people, as it gives him flashbacks of that moment - a moment that

brings a fair bit of pain.

"I can just continue to work hard.
Even if I think about that decision,
nothing will change now. That's
why I try to distance myself from
those talks. Family was also very
upset. If I think about it and talk
about it over and over again, then it
becomes difficult for me," Nishant,
who is currently at home in Karnal,

Haryana, told this daily.

Refereeing and judging in the sport at the Olympics have always been under scrutiny. Nishant has undergone surgery in the past, has spent countless hours train-

ing behind the scenes, and is well aware of the sacrifices athletes make. He is hopeful for reforms in the scoring system.

"I wish that the next time a competition is held, whatever the competition may be, the scoring system or judging should be changed so that it does not hinder the careers of the boxers," he said.

His family members and friends have been providing him with all the support at this hour, and the 2023 World Championships bronze medallist is also receiving necessary help from a sports psychologist.

"I'm just relaxing at the moment, spending time with my family. I have been in touch with the sports psychologist. It is quite helpful. She tells me what to do and what not to do. She asks me to be involved in various activities and not to think about the things that bother me."

Amidst the gloom, it is also clear that Nishant wants to keep up the fight, and though it is not finalised, he is very likely to resume training next month.
