BSF seeks additional manpower

for droneaffected **Puniab Border**

JALANDHAR/NEW DELHI, Aug 25 (Agencies): The BSF has sought the deployment of an additional battalion to check the onslaught of crossborder drones carrying drugs and ammunition and curb infiltration along the Punjab front of the India-Pakistan border.

The force currently has about 20 battalions to guard the more than 500-kilometre-long front, out of which 18 are "actively deployed" at the border while the rest are mobilised in view of the requirements at the Attari integrated check post in Amritsar and the Kartarpur corridor at Dera Baba Nanak in

Gurdaspur district. The drone menace that started around 2019-20 along this front is dominant in the border districts of Amritsar and Tarn Taran. One more **Border Security Force** (BSF) battalion has been sought to better secure the Punjab ■Turn to page 9

BJP to bank more upon new faces in 3-phase J&K Assembly Polls

JAMMU, Aug 25 (Agencies): The mainstream political party, Bhartiya Janata Party (BJP) will be banking on new faces and may repeat a few old stalwarts in the three-phase Assembly elections to the 90-member Jammu and Kashmir Assembly scheduled to be held on September 18, September 25 and October 1.

"The names of the candidates are almost



final and submitted to the high command for final stamp and the party this time will be banking more upon new faces,

party sources said. The Election Commission of India (ECI) has already issued a notification for the first phase

of voting for the Jammu and Kashmir Assembly election, being held after a decade.

The notification sets August 27 as the last date for filing nominations, with scrutiny on August 28: the last date for the withdrawal of candidature is August 30 and the voting will be held on September 18.

2 killed, one injured as oil tanker plunges into deep gorge in Kupwara

SRINAGAR, Aug 25 (Agencies): At least two people were killed and another seriously injured when an oil tanker met with an accident in Jammu and Kashmir's Kupwara district.

Police said the ill-fated tanker was on its way to Kupwara when it skidded off the road after the driver lost control over it and rolled down to a deep gorge at Machil late Saturday night.

The driver and the conductor of the vehicle died on the spot, police

said. They have been identified as Jasbir Singh Thakur, a resident of Balshama Sunderbani Rajouri, and Ankush Choudhary of Nowshara in Jammu division.

The seriously injured, identified as Anu Sharma of Sunderbani district, Rajouri, have been admitted to a nearby hospital for treatment.

Police have registered an FIR at Police Station Kupwara and started an investigation to ascertain the cause of the accident.

Police Commission-

Usman **Majid says** will fight as independent candidate, decide alliance after election

BANDIPORA, Aug 25 (Agencies): The former Member of Legislative Assembly (MLA) from north Kashmir's Bandipora, Usman Majid on Sunday said that he will be fighting as an independent candidate and "will bargain with the likeminded party in power for the best interests of Bandipora people in the upcoming Assembly Elections.

Majid parted ways with Congress in 2019 to join Altaf Bukhari's Apni Party as its vice president.

However, in early August, Majid resigned from the Bukhari-led party, terming it necessary to "achieve his objectives.

Majid said he is in talks with regional parties, but he won't be a part of any pre-poll alliance.

He told Greater Kashmir that he will fight as an independent candidate. This, he said, has also been supported by the people of his area.

"Politics is a dynamic thing, you don't know who will form alliance with who, so I am staying away from it," he said at a youth convention held in his office today.

However, he said, that if he is elected, he will decide about the alliance after consulting his work-

While acknowledging the power of youth, Majid said that the youth overturned the mainstream parties in recently held Lok Sabha elections.

He was referring to north Kashmir seat where imprisoned leader Er. Rashid won a landslide victory, defeating JKNC vice president Omar Abdullah.

J&K witnessed landmark elections in 2002

THE Election Commission of India's (ECI) announcement on holding the three-phase Assembly elections in Jammu and Kashmir brought back memories of the landmark polls held in September-October 2002. While the forthcoming elections would be the first in the Union Territory, the one in 2002 was also significant for several reasons.

While there has been a rise in terror attacks in the Jammu region in the recent past, it was the Kashmir valley that had witnessed an escalation of terror activities in 2002. It was the first time that the Jammu and Kashmir Peoples Democratic Party (PDP) participated in the Assembly polls. There was a call for boycotting the elections, given by the Tehreeke-Hurriyat. This was also the first poll in J&K in which EVMs (electronic voting machines) were used.

Even before the announcement of the dates of the fourphase elections was made, it was widely known that they were in the offing. While the PDP had pulled out all stops to reach out to the electorate, the J&K National Conference appeared to be relying on its solid organisational structure down to the grassroots level in its traditional strongholds. While the political parties had already begun their preparations, the official machinery had also started gearing up for the important event. It included, besides the Central and state governments, various security forces and intelligence services.

The dynamic security situation was being closely watched and discussed regularly at the Unified Command Headquarters.

It was apparent that the security situation was widely different in urban and rural areas. The terrorists, wanting to make their presence felt, were more active in towns and cities, which had a large concentration of population, rather than in sparsely populated villages and hamlets. The urban population, which enjoyed better civic amenities, had more time to participate in political activities. In those areas, it was relatively easier for terrorists to enlist overground workers and quasi-political organisations like the Hurriyat. In mofussil areas, daily life was hard in the absence of basic facilities like medical treatment, supply of water and electricity which left little time for politics, except at the local level. The urban population was thus more polarised along existing political lines, whereas rural folk looked forward to the polls as an opportunity to have their say to improve their lives. In the rural areas, the enthusiasm to vote in the elections was palpable, especially among the youth and first-time voters. Interestingly, the rural population showed greater inclination to participate at the hustings, even defying threats and intimidation from terrorists and at times tearing posters warning voters of dire consequences.

The first phase of the elections was to be held on September 16, 2002. James Michael Lyngdoh, then Chief Election Commissioner, visited Srinagar a few times in the weeks prior to that

to hold detailed discussions with the state administration and oversee polling arrangements. He was unequivocal in emphasising that he would accept no mismanagement at booths and would order repolling as many times as needed to ensure free and fair polling.

After the official announcement of the election schedule, the elected state government went into suspended animation and the Governor, Girish Saxena, took charge. About a week prior to the first round of polling, he held a meeting to take stock of the situation and satisfy himself that all was in readiness for the big event. Apart from officials directly involved in the conduct of polling, the meeting was attended by local heads of various security forces, intelligence agencies, senior bureaucrats of the state government and a few others. At the end of the meeting, the Governor wanted to know what in our estimate would be the percentage of polling (voter turnout). As he went around the room, the estimates varied from 10 to 20 per cent. The Army's estimate of 'nothing less than 40 per cent' seemed too optimistic to all present, including the Governor.

By the evening of September 16, reports of polling started pouring in. As expected, the percentage was low in urban areas, but that from the countryside were above 40 per cent; in fact, in remote areas along the border regions and the Line of Control, where the number of voters was small, it was as high as 80 per cent! The overall turnout that day was almost 48 per cent.

Pakistan's proxies had already increased their activities to somehow force the cancellation of the elections or at least impede the process. It had also stepped up its propaganda broadcasts on radio and TV. An amusing incident occurred on September 16. That evening, in a round-up of news from 'Indiaoccupied Kashmir', a Pakistani TV channel showed fake footage of 'unwilling voters' being 'pulled out from their houses to cast their votes' by Indian security forces, besides other 'atrocities' being committed by them. The red-faced channel had to withdraw the story in a hurry as it became known that there was no polling in that constituency that day, having been countermanded following the death of a candidate due to cardiac arrest!

All four phases of the elections were conducted smoothly. At the planning stage, the ECI felt that it had a tough assignment ahead; various agencies involved in holding the elections also considered it to be a challenging task. However, the skeptics and naysayers were proved wrong in the end. While the ECI, along with the state and Central governments deserved to be applauded for the successful conduct of the election, the real winners were the people of J&K.

In the end, the elections reflected the true will of the people. People elected those in whom they placed their trust to make a fresh start with a new dispensation. It was a victory of the ballot over the bullet, a paradigm shift in the political landscape of J&K.

I had come as a Punjabi translator for the inaugural SALT (South Asian Literature in Translation, a multi-year project at the University of Chicago) Summer School, an opportunity that promised to be remarkable.

As I stepped into my role as a translator of Punjabi into English, surrounded by other translators - each of us tethered to our own languages like lifelines – I couldn't help but feel that the air there was thick with the echoes of Sinhala, Tamil, Bengali, Urdu and Hindi, a cacophony of tongues that felt at once foreign and familiar. Even English seemed out of place here, as though it, too, was trying to assert itself in a landscape that resisted any kind of easy categorisation.

I felt this resistance in me as I moved through my days there, listening, observing, translating, and yet never quite arriving at a full understanding of where I was, or who I was within it.

In Punjabi, the language of my home and my translation, I've often felt a sense of alienation. This feeling likely stems from the underlying tension I've always been exposed to — that Punjabi is the other language, not just another language. So, returning to Punjabi after I've established alternate careers in alternate languages isn't merely wishful thinking.

In one of my favourite podcasts, Indy and Dr, the host, Indy, speaks with a representative from Naujawani, an online media platform. Indy poses a question: "If Punjabi is the seventh largest language in the world and still growing, why is there such a fixation among my generation, or the generation above us, on the idea that Punjabi is dying?" Naujawani responds reasonably, "I'd guess there are a number of reasons. Probably, the most prominent is that we are a very negative community because of all we've faced over the last 50 to 75 years, including numerous defeats. All these negative experiences lead us down a road where we start to believe we're constantly under attack, that we're besieged, and so we resort to tropes like the Punjabi language is dying."

However, many millennials and Gen Z individuals aren't anywhere close to believing that the Punjabi language is dying. We have our ways of staying connected to it — through music, literature, films, and translation.

In a translation workshop, translation felt less like a mechanical process and more like meditation. We found ourselves deeply immersed in our texts, feeling the weight of each word, the flow of each

line, and the silences between them. I realised that my role was not just to translate the words, but to convey the essence of them — to allow the audience to feel what the writer felt, even if the words themselves were different. This was not a task I could accomplish alone; it required me to draw upon my own experiences, my own understanding of both languages, and the shared history of our cultures — all this accompanied by the companionship of other translators.

While I was a part of the multilingual prose workshop, working on translating some Punjabi short stories into English, there were separate strands of workshops for Bangla, Hindi/Urdu, Tamil and multilingual poetry. In the workshops that solely focused on translating from a single language, the authors whose works were being translated were present in the seminar room. We heard many anecdotes, but the most fascinating reflections came from the Hindi/Urdu translators, who were translating a two-page short story by Asghar Wajahat, which we had the opportunity to hear him read at the inaugural event.

Our co-translators from the Hindi workshop told us that since their group was working on translating the same story, sometimes their days were so rigorous that by the end of it, they had only been able to translate three to four sentences. This made me reevaluate translation not just as a task to be completed, but as a way of being in the world, of engaging with the complexities and contradictions inherent in any act of comprehension in any given language.

I thought of Kate Briggs' words in 'This Little Art', "If a translation is like a table, then it has known and is open to different kinds of making (for example, both its initial assemblage and its later repeated setting)."

By the end of the Summer School, I realised that Colombo had become a kind of metaphor for the act of translation itself — messy, layered, complex, resistant to easy understanding. I left with a sense of incompletion, of something unfinished, unsaid. And perhaps, that is the true purpose of translation, not to erase differences or to smooth over the rough edges, but to dwell in the space between, to inhabit the tension, the discomfort, the uncertainty. In translating, we are not merely bridging gaps; we are acknowledging them, respecting them, and allowing them to exist.

Colombo, in all its chaotic, incomprehensible beauty, taught me this. And for that, I am grateful.



He graduated with a degree in Bachelor of Science in 1962


Megastar Amitabh Bachchan shared that he had a day of surprises, duty, discipline and music, which he says is the source of the most creative moments in one's life.

For the casting of the lead, Vindu Dara Singh, Deepak Tijori and Faraaz Khan auditioned for the role of Prem. While Faraaz Khan, son of actor Yusuf Khan who played the villainous Zabisco in 'Amar Akbar Anthony', was almost finalised for the role, but

he was replaced at the last minute due to health issues. The role eventually went to Salman Khan, and earned him commercial success.

Bengali female actor levels 'misbehaviour' charge against eminent Malayalam filmmaker Ranjith

A Bengali actor has levelled accusation of misbehaviour against eminent Malayalam film director and chairman of the state-run Kerala Chalachitra Academy, Ranjith, spelling fresh trouble for the Pinarayi Vijayan government which is facing opposition heat on its alleged inaction over the Justice Hema Committee report.

The report had revealed instances of harassment and exploitation of women in the Malayalam cinema industry, prompting calls for action against the guilty.

The filmmaker has reportedly rejected Mitra's charge and said he was the "real victim" in the case.

Key LDF constituent CPI was among those seeking a probe into the allegation of Bengali actor Sreelekha Mitra, who has recalled a years-old incident in the backdrop of the ripples being created by the Justice Hema Committee findings.

"The person concerned (Ranjith) is a big name in Malayalam film industry and a national award winning director. I went to his residence to discuss an upcoming film project and I did not like his behaviour. He made certain advances subtly and I felt uncomfortable while we were discussing the script," Mitra told agency in Kolkata.

He did this without her consent and she made her disapproval very clear. "I immediately communicated my deci-



sion not to be part of the project any more, left the place and came back to Kolkata the next day," she added.

"I don't know if he has treated other female actors in the film industry in the same way. It is upto them to open up or not if they had faced similar situation. May be his power and influence played a role for others to not to speak out," she added.

Mitra said she did not have any such experience in the Bengali cinema industry, but that there could be similar situations for other female actors as well with regard to someone. Such women should muster the courage and speak out without any fear.

"The incident in Kerala was years back...but it is heartening that women are speaking out with greater vigour and conviction against any form of misconduct now, taking out rallies, and I am looking forward to the day when number of any instance of gender abuse, misconduct will go down and women will not have such har-

rowing tales any more," Mitra added.

In Kerala, many demanded Ranjith stepped down as the Chairman of the film academy. Several people including well-known filmmaker Dr Biju came out against Ranjith.

While opposition Congress said it expects Ranjith would step down as film academy chairman, BJP said he has no moral right to continue.

CPI national leader Annie Raja urged the government to carry out a probe based on Mitra's allegations and wanted to keep Ranjith away from the position during investigation.

Kerala Cultural Affairs Minister Saji Cheriyan assured the government would not protect anyone who had committed a wrong.

If the allegations against Ranjith were proved, action would surely be taken against him, he said in a Facebook post.

He told the media earlier Ranjith is one of country's eminent filmmakers and that he had already responded to the actor's allegation.
"The allegation raised

by the actress and the reply given by Ranjith are in front of us. If she has a complaint, let her come here and lodge a complaint. Then we will take action in accordance with the law," he said

No case can be registered based on just allegations and such cases won't stand, Cheriyan added.

He underlined the government's support for women who face harassment at their workplaces and said stringent action would be taken against wrongdoers.

Health Minister Veena George said all facilities and support would be provided to the actress to lodge a complaint against the director.

"If she wishes to go ahead with the complaint, the government will provide all facilities for the same. The government's stand is clear in this. The CM has already made it clear that the government won't protect wrongdoers," she said.

Higher Education Minister R Bindhu said action would be taken after understanding the facts in the issue and said she expects the government would do it, as a woman has come up with such a complaint.

Sharing similar views, Women's Commission chairperson P Sathidevi said she came to know about the allegations about the actress

through the media and if it is proved correct, Ranjith should step down as academy chairman.

Opposition leader V D Satheesan also said Ranjith is an acclaimed director who has contributed several good movies in the Malayalam film industry.

"As a friend and as a brother, I request him to step down as film academy chairman. I think he will step back from his current responsibility," the Congress leader told reporters.

BJP state chief K Surendran attacked Cheriyan and Ranjith and said both of them should quit.

"Ranjith has no moral right to continue in the position. A victim herself has come up with the complaint. She raised the allegation openly.... before the public society," he told a press conference in Thiruvananthapuram.

He accused Cheriyan of challenging the legal system in the country by defending Ranjith.

Annie Raja said the actress has raised the allegation and named the accused person also.

"So, the government should carry out a probe into it and action should be taken based on that. When such a probe is being carried out, he should be kept away from the position of Academy chairman," she said. The legal system permits him to return to the same position if the allegations are proved wrong.

Varun Dhawan joins Sunny Deol in 'Border 2': Dharti maa jab bulati hai...

In an Instagram post, Sunny Deol officially welcomed Varun Dhawan onboard 'Border 2'. The film is scheduled for release during Republic Day, 2026.

Those who commit crimes against women won't be spared: PM amid Kolkata horror

PM Modi addressed the nationwide outrage over rising crimes against women, and assured that the government was strengthening laws to ensure perpetrators do not go unpunished.

JALGAON, Aug 25 (Agencies): In a strong message amid rising concerns over crimes against women, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Sunday assured that those committing such offences "will not be spared."

Speaking at the Lakhpati Didi event in Maharashtra's Jalgaon, PM Modi addressed the recent nationwide outrage over cases like the Kolkata doctor's rape and murder, the Badlapur school sex abuse case, and the Assam gangrape.

"We are strengthening and making stricter laws for criminals who commit sins against women," the Prime Minister

PM Modi highlighted the government's efforts to enhance legal frameworks and enforcement mechanisms, including the introduction of amendments to existing laws and the creation of new systems to make justice more accessible to victims.



"Earlier, there were complaints that FIRs were not filed. We brought the BNS [Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita] and made a lot of amendments," he said. "If a woman does not want to go to the police station, she can file an e-FIR. Nobody can change or tamper with an e-FIR."

On the issue of crimes against women after marriage, PM Modi noted that his government has introduced specific amendments to the BNS to address such concerns. He assured that the central government stands firmly with state governments in tackling crimes against women.

"Today, I challenge you - keep the seven decades of previous governments on one side and put 10 years of the Modi government on the other scale... The amount of work that the Modi government has done for the sisters and daughters of the country, no government has done after Independence," he

The Prime Minister was in Jalgaon to interact with 'Lakhpati Didis,' women members of selfhelp groups who have achieved an annual income of Rs 1 lakh. During the event, PM Modi felicitated 11 lakh new Lakhpati Didis and disbursed bank loans totalling Rs 5,000 crore, benefiting 25.8 lakh members of 2.35 lakh self-help groups (SHGs).

Since the inception of the Lakhpati Didi scheme, one crore women have joined the initiative, with the government setting an ambitious target to make 3 crore women Lakhpati Didis, news agency reported.

Lauding the Eknath Shinde dispensation's focus on empowering women and fostering economic growth, PM Modi remarked, "Mahayuti government means a government for development."

Illicit drug trade not only a challenge for India but also a global issue: Amit Shah



RAIPUR, Aug 25 (Agencies): Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Sunday said the illegal narcotics trade is not only a challenge for India but also a global issue, stressing that the country can fight the menace if it pursues with determination and strategy.

Addressing a meeting at a hotel in Nava Raipur on the scenario of narcotics substances in Chhattisgarh, Shah emphasised the need to adopt four formulas of 'drug detection, network destruction, culprit detention and addict rehabilitation' in achieving success.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi has pledged to make the country drug-free in 2047 when the 100th year of the country's independence will be celebrated and gradually the resolution has become the resolution of the 130 crore population.

"I believe that the resolution of a drug-free India is very important in making a prosperous, safe and glorious India," Shah said.

The illicit drug trade is not only a challenge for India but also a global issue, he said, pitching for the need to raise awareness of this menace

"If we pursue with determination and strategy, we can win this fight," he said, cautioning, "several countries have lost their fight against it".

Besides aiming at destroying youth, the money generated through the illicit narcotics trade is also used for anti-national activities, he said.

"It is also our national responsibility to make the country drug-free with a zero-tolerance

policy," he said.

Shah also expressed concerns over the use of narcotic substances in Chhattisgarh. He said that the percentage of sedative use in Chhattisgarh is 1.45 which is more than the national average.

Chhattisgarh shares a border with seven states including Odisha and Andhra Pradesh from where drug smuggling is done.

Chhattisgarh has reported 4.98 per cent use of ganja which is more than the national average of 2.83 per cent and it is a matter of concern, he added.

Shah, who is on a three-day visit to the state, virtually inaugurated the zonal office of the Narcotics Control Bureau in Nava Raipur at the beginning of the meeting.

"U in UPS stands for...": Mallikarjun Kharge jabs centre on pension move

NEW DELHI, Aug 25 (Agencies): Congress chief Mallikarjun Kharge today took a swipe at the Narendra Modi government over what he called was a "government of U-turns", a day after the Centre announced its approval of the Unified Pension Scheme (UPS)

The UPS provides an assured pension, minimum pension, and assured family pension. Mr Kharge said the 'U' in UPS stands for "Modi

government's U-turns."

"Post June 4, the power of the people has prevailed over the arrogance of power of the Prime Minister. Rollback in the budget regarding long-term capital gain/

indexation, sending Waqf Bill to joint parliamentary committee, rollback of broadcast bill, rollback of lateral entry," Mr Kharge said in a post on X.

"We will keep ensuring accountability and protect 140 crore Indians from this despotic government," the Congress chief said In response, BJP

spokesperson Tuhin Sinha told agency that wherever the Congress rules, such as Telangana and Karnataka, they always end up making a mess of the finances.

"Every morning, they (Congress) come and spread lies. They have nothing to do. The New UPS has been in the

works for over a year. Finance Secretary TV Somanathan conducted over 100 meetings before it was finalised. Unlike the Congress, who thinks in extremely hasty manner, and messes up finances where they are in power, in Telangana and Karnataka, the central government takes care before taking key decisions," Mr Sinha told agency.

Fulfilling long-pending demands of government employees ahead of the assembly elections in Haryana and Jammu and Kashmir, the cabinet meeting, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, approved the UPS.



The new pension scheme also guarantees an assured minimum pension of ₹ 10,000 per month on superannuation after a minimum of 10 years of service.

This option scheme will benefit 23 lakh central government employees, and the number would rise to 90 lakh if state governments want to join the scheme.

The anti-corruption unit of the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) also searched the residences and offices of those engaged in supplying materials for the management and care of patients.



At least seven officers of the Central probe agency have been questioning Ghosh at his Beliaghata residence since 8 am, while others were grilling Vashisth, the former medical superintendent and viceprincipal of the hospital, and another professor of the forensic-medi-

cine department of the medical establishment, among others, they said.

Accompanied by a huge team of Central forces, the CBI team reached Ghosh's residence around 6 am but was made to wait for nearly one-and-a-half hours before he opened the doors, the officials

The other officers of the Central agency went to the residence of a supplier in Howrah, he added.

"Vashisth is being questioned on how much he knew about the financial irregularities that happened in the hospital when he was the MSVP," he said.

Another team of CBI officers also conducted searches at the ex-principal's office in the hospital and also went to the canteen in the academic building.

They asked present principal Manas Kumar Bandyopadhyay to reach the hospital in the morning and accompany them during their searches in the medical establishment.

A postgraduate trainee woman doctor was allegedly raped and murdered in the seminar hall of the hospital on August 9, following which a Kolkata Police civic volunteer was arrested.

The gruesome crime resulted in nationwide protests by doctors and citizens.

On the direction of the Calcutta High Court, the CBI registered cases into the killing as well as alleged financial irregularities.

Middle East crisis: 100 Israeli jets strike Lebanon as Hezbollah fires hundreds of Katyusha rockets

The attacks come as Egypt hosts new round of talks aimed at ending Israel-Hamas War

JERUSALEM, Aug 25 (Agencies): Israel launched a wave of airstrikes across southern Lebanon early on Sunday in what it said was a pre-emptive strike on Hezbollah, as the militant group said it had launched hundreds of rockets and drones to avenge the killing of one of its top commanders last month.

The heavy exchange of fire threatened to trigger an allout war that could draw in the United States, Iran and militant groups across the region. It could also torpedo efforts to forge a cease-fire in Gaza, where Israel has been at war with the Palestinian group Hamas, an ally of Hezbollah, for over 10 months.

By mid-morning, it appeared that the exchange had ended, with both sides having confined their attacks to military targets. But the situation remained tense, and the full extent of casualties and damage was not immediately known.

The Israeli military said Hezbollah was planning to launch a heavy barrage of rockets and missiles toward Israel. Soon after, Hezbollah announced it had launched an attack on Israeli military positions as an initial response to the killing of Fouad Shukur, one of its founders, in an Israeli airstrike in Beirut last month.

The attacks came as Egypt hosts a new round of talks aimed at ending the Israel-Hamas War. Hezbollah has said it will halt the fighting if there is a cease-fire in Gaza. Iran supports both groups as well as militants in Syria, Iraq and Yemen who might join any larger conflict.

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, speaking at the start of a Cabinet meeting, said the military had eliminated "thousands of rockets that were aimed at northern Israel" and urged citizens to adhere to directives from the Home Front Command.

"We are determined to do everything to defend our country, to return the residents of the north securely to their homes and to continue upholding a



simple rule: Whoever harms us — we will harm them," he said.

Air raid sirens were reported throughout northern Israel, and Israel's Ben-Gurion international airport closed and diverted flights for approximately an hour due to the threat of attack. Israel's Home Front Command has raised the alert level in northern Israel and encouraged people to stay near bomb shelters.

Lt. Col. Nadav Shoshani, an Israeli military spokesman, said Hezbollah had intended to hit targets in northern and central Israel. He said initial assessments found "very little damage" in Israel, but that the military remained on high alert. He said around 100 Israeli aircraft took part in Sunday's strikes.

Lebanon's Health Ministry reported that two people were wounded in the Israeli strikes in southern Lebanon. One of them, a 17-year-old Syrian, was hospitalised, civil defence officials said. Separately, a fighter for the Amal group, which is allied with Hezbollah, was killed in a strike on a car, Amal said.

Hezbollah said its attack involved more than 320 Katy-usha rockets aimed at multiple sites in Israel and a "large number" of drones. It said the operation was targeting "a qualitative Israeli military target that will be announced later" as well as "enemy sites and barracks and Iron Dome (missile defence) platforms."

Hezbollah later announced the end of what it said was the first stage of retaliatory strikes, which it said would allow it to launch more attacks deeper into Israel. But a later statement said "military operations for today

have been completed."

The group said all the exploding drones it launched hit their targets, without saying how many. It listed 11 bases, barracks, and military positions that it said it targeted in northern Israel and the Israeli-annexed Golan Heights. It also dismissed Israel's claim that its pre-emptive strikes had succeeded in warding off a stronger Hezbollah attack.

Randa Slim, a senior fellow at the Washington, DC-based Middle East Institute, said Sunday morning's exchange was "still within the rules of engagement and unlikely at this point to lead to an all-out war."

In the US, a spokesman for the National Security Council, Sean Savett, said President Joe Biden was "closely monitoring events in Israel and Lebanon."

"At his direction, senior US officials have been communicating continuously with their Israeli counterparts," Savett added. "We will keep supporting Israel's right to defend itself, and we will keep working for regional stability."

The Pentagon said Defense Secretary Lloyd Austin spoke with his Israeli counterpart, Yoav Gallant, about Israel's defenses against Hezbollah. Austin "reaffirmed the United States' ironclad commitment to Israel's defense against any attacks by Iran and its regional partners and proxies," a statement said. In recent weeks, diplomats

from the US and European countries have made a flurry of visits to Israel and Lebanon in an attempt to tamp down the escalation that they fear could spiral into a regional war.

Last week, Israel's defence minister said he was moving more troops toward the Lebanese border in anticipation of possible fighting with Hezbollah.

Hezbollah began attacking Israel almost immediately after the start of the war in Gaza, which was triggered by Hamas' October 7 attack into Israel. Israel and Hezbollah have been exchanging fire almost daily, displacing tens of thousands of people on both sides of the border. Until Sunday, both sides had been careful to avoid allout war.

Hezbollah, which fought Israel to a stalemate in the summer of 2006, is believed to be far more powerful than it was during that conflict. The United States and Israel estimate it has some 150,000 rockets and is capable of hitting anywhere inside Israel. The group has also also developed drones capable of evading Israel's defences as well as precision-guided munitions.

Israel has one of the world's best militaries and an extensive multi-tiered missile defence system, and it is backed by a US-led coalition that helped it shoot down hundreds of missiles and drones fired from Iran earlier this year. The US military has been building up its forces across the region in recent weeks.

Israel has vowed a crushing response in the case of all-out war, one that would likely demolish critical civilian infrastructure, especially in south Beirut and southern Lebanon, where Hezbollah's main strongholds are located. A war would likely displace hundreds of thousands of people on both sides.

Hezbollah is a close ally of Iran, which has also threatened to retaliate for the killing of a senior Hamas leader, Ismail Haniyeh, in an explosion in Tehran last month that was widely blamed on Israel, which has not said whether it was involved.

29 people killed as bus falls into ditch in Pakistan's Punjab province: Report



LAHORE, Aug 25 (Agencies): At least 29 people were killed after a passenger bus fell into a ditch in Pakistan's Punjab province on Sunday, according

to a media report.

The bus was travelling with 30 passengers from Haveli Kahuta to Rawalpindi, Geo News reported quoting sourc-

es said.

The accident took place near Pana Bridge.

According to the sources, the cause of the accident - which occurred in a moun-

tainous area - is not yet

known, the report said.
The local residents are retrieving the bodies from the bus, while the police and the rescue teams are on their way to the site of the incident.

Kahuta is a tehsil in the Rawalpindi district and is one hour away from the city.

Thirteen dead after migrant boat sinks off Yemen: UN agency

Eleven men and two women were among those confirmed dead, as search operations continue to locate the missing, including the Yemeni captain and his assistant, the IOM said.

DUBAI, Aug 25 (Agencies): At least 13 people have died when a migrant boat sank off Yemen, also leaving 14 missing, a UN agency said Sunday, in the latest disaster on the perilous migration route.

"Thirteen people have tragically lost their lives and 14 others remain missing after a migrant boat capsized off the coast of Yemen's Taez governorate on Tuesday," the International Organization for Migration (IOM) said.

The vessel had departed from Djibouti carrying 25 Ethiopian migrants and two Yemeni nationals, according to the UN agency.

Eleven men and two women were among those confirmed dead, as search operations continue to locate the missing, including the Yemeni captain and his



It noted that the cause of the shipwreck remains unclear.

"This latest tragedy is a stark reminder of the perils faced by migrants on this route," said Matt Huber, the acting chief of IOM's mission in Yemen.

Tens of thousands of migrants set off yearly from the Horn of Africa, seeking to escape conflict, natural disasters or poor economic prospects and sailing across the Red Sea in a bid to reach the oil-rich Gulf.

The IOM recorded over 97,200 migrant arrivals in Yemen in

2023, surpassing the previous year's numbers.

The latest shipwreck follows similar incidents off Yemen in June and July that left dozens dead.

Migrants who do reach Yemen often encounter further threats to their safety, as the Arabian Peninsula's poorest country has been mired in civil war for nearly a decade.

Many are trying to reach Saudi Arabia and other Gulf Arab countries where they can find employment as labourers or domestic workers.

Cop among 4 injured in crash, knife attack in Sydney, suspect arrested



SYDNEY, Aug 25 (Agencies): Four people, including a police officer, were injured in a car crash and subsequent stabbing incident in Sydney, Australia on Sunday, reported ABC News.

Police said in a statement that "a crash and suspected stabbing" occurred at a highway intersection in the suburb of Engadine around 9 a.m. No one was killed in the attack, police said.

Officers arrived at the scene and found a man who appeared to have been stabbed allegedly running from the scene.

Police used a Taser to subdue and arrest the man. A male police officer suffered a wound to his left wrist during the arrest.

Sky News Australia said that the 55-year-old suspect stabbed others and himself before he was taken into custody.

A 40-year-old woman, who police believe was a passenger in one of the vehicles involved in the crash, had multiple stab wounds. Another person received emergency treatment at the scene after suffering a heart attack.

Sydney has seen a spate of knife attacks this year, prompting the New South Wales state government to toughen its knife laws.

According to news agency, the state parliament passed laws in June giving police electronic metal-detecting scanners to check people without a warrant at shopping centres, sporting venues and public transport stations.

In April, six people were killed and 12 injured in a knife attack at a mall in Sydney's Bondi area.

Flash flood on Indonesia's eastern Ternate Island leaves 11 dead

TERNATE ISLAND, Aug 25 (Agencies): A flash flood following torrential rains on Indonesia's eastern Ternate Island left 11 people dead on Sunday.

Search and rescue teams working with local residents recovered 10 bodies in Rua village in North Maluku province. The team was working to retrieve one more body, according to Bram Madya Temara, an official from the island's search and rescue agency.

The flash flood swept away residential areas and cut off the main road and access to Rua. Dozens of houses and buildings were

buried in mud.

Heavy rains cause frequent landslides and flash floods in Indonesia, where millions of people live in mountainous areas or near floodplains.



Kamala Harris faces uphill battle to win back muslim votes in swing state

DEARBORN, Aug 25 (Agencies): In key US swing state Michigan, Democratic voters of Arab and Middle Eastern heritage say Kamala Harris is going to have to win them back after they were alienated by President Joe Biden's handling of Israel's military offensive in Gaza.

The town of Dearborn, home to 110,000 people and a cultural hub for Arab Americans, could play a decisive role in deciding the fate of the battleground state in November's presidential election.

Members of the community interviewed by agency said they were willing to hear what the vice president had to say and weigh their options -- a marked change from the outright hostility towards Biden.

"We are in a listening mode right now," said Osama Siblani, publisher of The Arab American News.

Accepting the Democratic presidential nomination at the party's convention on Thursday, Harris pledged to get a Gaza ceasefire "done" and ensure Palestinians realize their right to "dignity, security, freedom and self-determination."

But there was outrage among pro-Palestinian delegates that their request for a speaker spot at the convention was rejected. The group Muslim Women for Harris-Walz said the decision sent a "terrible message" and announced it was disbanding and withdrawing its support from the campaign.

Harris, who has vowed "not to be silent" about the suffering of Palestinians, recently met with members of the national "Uncommitted" movement that led the charge against Biden during the Democratic primary process

Although she made no firm promises, leaders said she impressed them with a show of empathy.

At the forefront of concerns are Israel's 10 months of military operations in Gaza, which have devastated the Palestinian enclave since the war began in response to Hamas's attack on Israel on October 7, 2023.

Growing influence



Michigan, home to the "big three" automakers -- Ford, General Motors and Chrysler -- has long been an essential stop for White House aspirants.

Economic downturns in the 1970s led many to leave the so-called "Rust Belt" state, just as unrest in the Middle East brought new waves of Lebanese, Iraqi, Yemeni, and Palestinian immigrants.

"We're a global city, where nearly 55 per cent of our residents are of Arab background," said Dearborn Mayor Abdullah Hammoud in a recent interview. "For many of us, when you talk about what's happening in Gaza, these are our family and our friends."

Famous as the birthplace of Henry Ford, Dearborn appears at first glance just like any small US city, with its wide thoroughfares and strip malls.

But it is also home to the Islamic Center of America -- the largest mosque in the country -- and countless Middle Eastern supermarkets, eateries, and coffee shops.

When Siblani first started his newspaper in the mid-1980s, he remembers the then-mayor campaigned on a platform to address the "Arab problem."

But as the community's numbers grew, and the children of blue-collar factory workers

took up positions as lawyers, doctors, and businesspeople, so too did their political influence.

'Lesser of two evils'

Historically socially conservative, Arab and Muslim Americans heavily favoured George W. Bush in the 2000 election.

Years of the US "War on Terror" -- which saw wars in the Middle East and Afghanistan, and Muslim American communities put under stricter law enforcement scrutiny -- swung them firmly to the Democratic camp.

In 2018, southeast Michiganders elected Rashida Tlaib, the first Palestinian-American in Congress -- a milestone for the community. Three Arab-American mayors have also recently been elected in suburbs known for historic racism towards non-whites.

Angered by former president Donald Trump's travel ban on Muslim countries, support for Israeli settlements in the occupied West Bank, and more, Dearborn voters overwhelmingly backed Biden in 2020, helping secure Michigan for the Democrats by a slim margin.

Residents here are tired, however, of being asked to vote for the "lesser of two evils" and instead want candidates who will deliver on demands, such as a permanent cease-fire and an end to the supply of weapons to Israel.

"I think VP Harris has a window of opportunity," said Faye Nemer, a community activist and CEO of the MENA American Chamber of Commerce. "She can either continue President Biden's legacy or set her own agenda."

Arab Americans in Dearborn have been impressed by Harris's pick of Tim Walz as her running mate. Walz has taken a conciliatory approach to opponents of the war, unlike Pennsylvania Governor Josh Shapiro, who took a hard line against college protesters.

But demands are hardening.
"We don't want crumbs anymore," declared
Soujoud Hamade, a business lawyer and
long-time Democrat, who vowed to vote for
Green Party candidate Jill Stein if Harris did
not deliver on the campaign trail.

He said a missing report was filed on August 19 by Singh's brother after he failed

India are currently on the top of the WTC points table with six wins from nine matches along with a draw and have a points percentage of 68.51%. Australia are ranked second with eight wins from 12 matches and one draw having points percentage of 62.50%.

India to take on Australia in five-match Test series

The two teams are once again favourites to reach the final having met in the summit clash of the last cycle as well. Australia beat India by 209 runs in the

final held at the Oval to become the first nation to have all the major ICC trophies in their cabinet

However, ahead of the final, the two teams will clash in the highly anticipated Border Gavaskar Trophy set to begin from November 22. India have retained the trophy since 2017 having won the last four series over the current World Test Champions.

They also beat them in Australia in back-to-back series held in 2018-19 and 2020-21 further adding the spice for the upcoming edition. It will be the first time that the two teams will be contesting in a five-match series since 1991-92. Hence, fans are eagerly waiting for it to get underway as captain Rohit Sharma aims to help India reach their third consecutive WTC final.

PAK vs BAN: Babar Azam narrowly escapes consecutive ducks in Rawalpindi Test



RAWALPINDI, Aug 25 (Agencies): Pakistan batter Babar Azam narrowly survived the worst fate for a batter in the Test first match against Bangladesh in Rawalpindi. After scoring 0 in the first innings, Babar almost got out for another duck in the second innings off pacer Shoriful Islam on Sunday, August 25. The senior batter had edged Shoriful's delivery back to the keeper, but Litton Das was not able to hold on to the ball behind the stumps.

Babar, who has been in woeful form since the 2023 ODI World Cup just about escaped falling for consecutive ducks in a Test match, also known as a 'pair'. Incidentally, Babar had gotten out to Shoriful in the first innings of the match as well, after he edged a ball

down to the leg side. Wicketkeeper Litton Das had grabbed the catch with a sensational diving effort to the leg side but he was not able to repeat the same in the second innings of the match.

Babar Azam has faced intense criticism since Pakistan's group-stage exit from the T20 World Cup 2024. Pakistan had lost group-stage matches against USA and India, which led to their early exit from the tournament. Babar was expected to do well in the docile pitches of Pakistan in the home season but that did not turn out to be the case in the first innings of the Rawalpindi Test.

At the time of writing, Pakistan were 67/4 after losing Saim Ayub, Shan Masood, Babar Azam and Saud Shakeel in the second innings of the match. Babar got out to youngster Nahid Rana on Sunday, after dragging a ball into his stumps. Babar got out after scoring 22 runs.

Pakistan still trail Bangladesh by 50 runs and will need to show some resilience to save the match on the final day of the Test.

Manu Bhaker meets Suryakumar Yadav: 'Learning techniques of a new sport'

NEW DELHI, Aug 25 (Agencies): Paris Olympics double medallist Manu Bhaker posted a special photo alongside India's T20I captain Suryakumar Yadav. Bhaker, who is currently enjoying a 3-month break after her double bronze medal win in Paris wrote in her post that she was trying to learn techniques of a new sport from the India captain.

Bhaker made history at the Paris 2024 Olympics, securing two bronze medals in the women's 10m air pistol and mixed 10m air pistol events. She became the first ever Indian athlete since independence to win two medals in a single edition of the games. The remarkable achievement marked a significant redemption for Bhaker, who had faced disappointment at the Tokyo 2020 Olympics where she failed to reach the finals in all three of her events.

"Learning techniques of a new sport with the Mr. 360 of India," Manu Bhaker posted on her social media accounts on Sunday, 25 August. Bhaker's success in Paris was nothing short of phenomenal. She



won her first bronze medal in the women's 10m air pistol event and then followed it up with another bronze in the mixed 10m air pistol event alongside Sarabjot Singh. Angelo Mathews calls out England's 'unfair' ball change on Day 3 of 1st Test

MANCHESTER, Aug 25 (Agencies): Sri Lanka batter Angelo Mathews called out the 'unfair' ball change by the England team on Day 3 of the first Test at Emirates Old Trafford, Manchester. Notably, England won the match by five wickets on Day 4 after they chased down 205 in the fourth innings.

A particular moment on Day 3 turned out to be game changing for the hosts as their request for a ball change after the 41st over of Sri Lanka's second innings was accepted by on-field umpires Chris Gaffaney and Paul Reiffel. The game was at a crucial juncture with Sri Lanka



on 146/4 having a lead of 24 runs with Mathews (59*) and Kamindu Mendis (33*) at the crease with an unbeaten stand of 51 runs.

However, the ball change worked wonders for England as they managed to end the fifth wicket partnership on 78 getting Mathews caught at gully for 65. Com-

menting on the change, Mathews said that England seemed to be running out of plans but the ball change changed the entire momentum.

"It looked like they were running out of plans but unfortunately the ball was changed. We were told they didn't have old enough balls to replace. It changed the

entire momentum of the game. You work so hard to get rid of that shine, and we did that. Once the ball was changed, it was a whole different game," Mathews told Sky Sports ahead of play on Day 4.

Further speaking ahead, he called the move unfair for batters of both teams and mentioned that they were comfortably playing them before the change. Ball Change controversy of Ashes 2023

"It was unfortunate, to be honest. Yester-day we were sitting pretty until the ball was changed. I think it could be unfair for batters on both teams, because

the batters want to get rid of the hard, shiny ball, and once we got to the 48-over mark, I think we were quite comfortably playing them," he added.

England managed to take just two wickets before the close of play on Day 3 but their bowlers got massive help with the changed ball which was dancing to their tunes. Meanwhile, earlier during the Ashes 2023 a similar ball change controversy came to light on the final day of the fifth Test at the Oval as England managed to run through the Australian batting lineup after the ball change.

Paris medallists Swapnil Kusale, Manu to miss World Cup Final

NEW DELHI, Aug 25 (Agencies): Two of the three shooters who combined for three medals at the recent Paris Olympics will miss the season-ending ISSF World Cup Final, to be held here in October.

Pistol shooter Manu Bhaker — who won bronze in the women's 10m air pistol and then combined with Sarabjot Singh to bag another bronze in the mixed team event — and 10m air rifle bronze medal winner Swapnil Kusale have pulled out of the competition.

The World Cup Final, which is the last competition on the calendar for international shooters, is scheduled to be held here from October 13 to 18. However, many of the shooters - including Manu, Swapnil and even Arjun Babuta, who finished fourth in the men's 10m air rifle event in Paris — have chosen to take some time away from the sport. They have informed the National Rifle Association of India (NRAI) of their decision. Sarabjot and a few others, however, have yet to send their writ-

ten consent about taking part in the event.

Manu, as her coach Jaspal Rana revealed, decided to take a break to rest and recover after the Olympics. "We had already decided that she will take rest after the Olympics. The World Cup Final was not our priority as she needs to give her body and mind some rest," Rana told agency.

"She has had no break in the last six-seven years. She is not a machine. Now the time is right. She has been dry-training and

working on her fitness, but will take more time to start training seriously," he added.

Swapnil, too, has taken a break and will start training seriously a month before the National Championships, to be held in November.

"Swapnil has also pulled out," his coach Deepali Deshpande said. "Currently, because of numerous felicitation functions, he is not able to do his daily physical exercises. But he should be back in all earnest before the Nationals."

24 seconds: Luis Suarez scores fastest goal in Inter Miami's history

Former Barcelona star Luis Suarez scored the fastest goal in Inter Miami FC's history on Sunday, August 25. Suarez took just 24 seconds to open the scoresheet against Cincinnati FC.

FLORIDA, Aug 25 (Agencies): Legendary Uruguayan forward Luis Suarez scored the fastest goal in the history of Inter Miami on Sunday, August 25. Playing against Cincinnati FC in Major League Soccer (MLS), Suarez scored Miami's opener in the 24th second of the match. After getting a cross into the centre of the box, Suarez chested the ball down and took a first-time shot to fire the ball past Cincinnati's goalkeeper.

Suarez, now 37, was once an integral part of the MSN trio at FC Barcelona alongside Lionel Messi and Neymar. In the absence of Messi at Cincinnati Suarez came crunch collecting a brace on Sunday's match. The goals fired Inter Miami into the MLS playoffs.

Miami (17-4-5, 56 points) opened an eight-point lead on Cincinnati (15-8-3, 48 points) in the East and avenged a 6-1 loss on July 6 at Cincinnati, where it



played without six starters and had a seventh starter red-carded in the second half.

Suarez was one of the missing six that night. So was fellow star Lionel Messi, who sat out this one as well with a right ankle injury suffered last month during the Copa America championship match. But Messi's presence

wasn't needed in the rematch.
With legendary former NFL
quarterback Tom Brady looking

on, Suarez put Miami ahead to stay only 30 seconds into the fixture. Marcelo Weigandt crossed from right to left and Suarez settled the ball in the middle of the box, then beat goalie Roman Celentano with a clinical finish inside the right post.

After scoring the fastest goal in franchise history, Suarez made it 2-0 in the sixth minute. Sent in on a pretty through ball by Matias Rojas, Suarez sailed

down the right side and made no mistake in scoring his teamleading 14th goal of the year.

That was pretty much it for the Herons' attack as they settled into a defensive shell after Tomas Aviles picked up his second yellow card in the 42nd minute from referee Armando Villarreal. But Miami was able to hold off Cincinnati while a man down.

Not even the insertion of MLS assists leader Lucho Acosta for the second half made a difference for Cincinnati. Worse yet, Acosta picked up a yellow card, meaning he's automatically suspended for the team's Aug. 31 home match against CF Montreal due to yellow card accumulation.
