J&K Govt shifts to **PFMS** for police salary payments

JAMMU, Sep 16 (Agencies): In a significant step toward enhancing financial transparency and efficiency, the Jammu and Kashmir Government has announced the transition of budgetary processes for the Jammu and Kashmir Police to the Public Financial Management System (PFMS).

The new system will specifically cover the disbursement of salaries for JK Police personnel and aligns with the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) budget for the fiscal year 2024-2025.

Punjab | **Counter Intelligence Arrests** Army Deserter, **Seizes 12.5 Kg Heroin**



JALANDHAR, Sep 15 (Agencies): In a big blow to the trans-border narcotic networks, Counter Intelligence Jalandhar has arrested an army deserter identified as Amritpal Singh alias Fauji, a key player in the Pakistan-linked heroin smuggling racket, and seized 12.5 kg heroin from his possession, said Director General of Police (DGP) Punjab Gaurav Yadav.

Notably, arrested accused Amritpal Singh Fauji, a resident of village Kasel in Tarn Taran, was on the run since August 2024, when his accomplice identified as Sartaj was arrested from Jammu Bus Stand with 33 kg of

heroin. DGP Gaurav Yadav said that the cartel has international connections as it is being led by a notorious fugitive identified as Amrit Pal Singh Baath, a native of village Mianpur in Tarn Taran and presently operating from Dubai. Notably, the latter is a notorious gangster/ smuggler, who has 15-20 cases registered against him in various police stations of Punjab, including two murder cases. "Acting swiftly on reli-

Neither terrorism nor Article-370 will return to J-K: Amit Shah in Kishtwar

KISHTWAR, Sep 16 (Agencies): Union Home Minister Amit Shah Monday said that as long as Prime Minister Narendera Modi government was at the Centre, no power can revive terrorism in Jammu region on the lines of 1990's. He said the BJP led government will bury terrorism to the extent that it doesn't erupt again.

"Anti-national and antipeace elements are trying to bring back the 90's like atmosphere in the Jammu region. Let me assure you that we will push the terrorism several feet below the ground so that it doesn't erupt again," Shah said addressing a massive



rally in Paddar-Nagseni Assembly constituency in Kishtwar area, reported news agency KNO.

Launching a scathing attack at National Conference chief Dr Farooq Abdullah. Shah asked where he was when "bloodbath was at its peak in Kishtwar." "He should be asked if he comes here. But I know

where he was then. He was enjoying on London beaches," Shah said.

He said the NC-Congress alliance has always set a base for terrorism and separatism in J&K ever since they joined hands. "These parties pushed Maharaja Hari Singh from J&K. Later, only his mortal remains

returned to J&K," Shah said. "These parties are responsible for the mass exodus of Kashmiri Pandits in 1990.3 This was the Home

Minister's second visit to Jammu region since September 6. He said that Village Defence Guards (VDGs) and Special Police Officers (SPOs) have been laced with the latest weapons and powers. "This is being done to ensure infiltrators who come here to disrupt peace are buried in the mountains only and not allowed to enter the hinterland," Shah said.

He said nobody will be allowed to use Indian soil for terrorism. About



J&K don't buy Shah's assurance of restoration of statehood: Bhalla

JAMMU, Sep 16: JKPCC Working President Raman Bhalla today asked Home Minister Amit Shah who addressed a rally at Paddar today, when will full statehood return to the union territory and alleged that this will turn into another Jhumla like hundred others which didn't see light of day. Bhalla was addressing election gathering at Maishian in RS Pura Jammu South constituency on Monday.He noted that since the fall of the PDP-BJP government in 2018, Jammu and Kashmir has been administered by Modi government.Posing questions to the HM, Bhalla asked when will full statehood return to Jammu and Kashmir. He alleged that since 2018, the people of J&K have been denied any avenue to express their grievances.

While claiming to have ended special status for J&K, the government had in fact created an extra-special situation of a new and unique political system: one where the state had been downgraded to a UT, elections suspended, and all norms of constitutional morality violated," he alleged. In his speech in Parliament on December 11, 2023, Home Minister Amit Shah stated that full statehood to J&K would be restored at an "appropriate time", he pointed out. "Five vears after being stripped of their statehood, the people of J&K still lack clarity on what the timeline for this return of statehood is. Based on the experience of the last five years. where the Assembly elections were delayed on one pretext or the other, the people of J&K don't buy the center's assurance of restoration of statehood," Bhalla said

Can Home Minister give a straight answer to this key question as to when will full statehood return to Jammu and Kashmir, he asked.Bhalla further asked who will take moral responsibility for the martyedom Indian Army personnel to terrorist attacks in Dda-Kishtwar. "One of the most repeated talking



Government's decision on Aug 5 2019 has curbed terrorism in Jammu and Kashmir. The mood on the ground in J&K, however, is one of anxiety. At least fifty-three security personnel have been martyred to the south of Pir Panjal since 2021, in an area where there were no major incidents of terrorism between 2007 and 2014," he said.

"In the last few months

"In the last few months, it has spread even to neighboring districts that we considered largely peaceful: as evinced by the attack in Reasi on the 9th of June, the attack in Kathua on the 10th of June, in Doda on the 11th of June, in Udhampur on the 19th of August, and in Kishtwar on 13th of September. Infiltration from Pakistan is rising along the International Border, and a palpable sense of insecurity prevails across J&K," the Congress leader said. "The Home Minister Minister has been conspicuously silent even amidst this surge in terrorism," Bhalla said. Why has Modi's government failed to salvage the security situation in J&K and what is his vision to restore normalcy, Bhalla asked."Why is the central government consistently lying to the country about the security situation in J&K?" he said.He further asked why has there been a "sharp increase in narcotics smuggling" under the Union government's

administration.
One fundamental reason for the upsurge in terrorist activity, particularly in Jammu, is the sharp rise in naroc-

tics smuggling over the last few years with the International Border in Jammu rather than the LoC in Kashmir, being the primary area of operation for the smugglers, he claimed. Narcotics consumption has seen a 30 percent hike in five years, and the smuggling rings have become very sophisticated, with involvement even of government officials, he alleged.Between 2019 and 2023, state police and other security forces seized over 700 kg of heroin valuing roughly Rs 1,400 crore in the international market, he said. This is apart from the 2,500 kg of charas and nearly 1 lakh kg of opium derivatives seized across J&K in the same period, he said.Bhalla said that the BJP government at the Centre has proved to be an "utter failure" on all fronts and they will never be forgiven for bringing "anti-people" policies. The reality is that instead of bringing the Achhe Din promised by the BJP, it has brought only miseries to the common people

of the nation.' Questioning the BJP government, the Congress leader said that the nation and its people want to know when the promised Achhe Din will come. "J&K has been the worst victim of the BJP's misrule: during 10 years. the price of LGP has rocketed from Rs 450 to Rs 1200 and unemployment front the progress during these years is that unemployment has broken all previous records. He castigated the present dispensation for neglecting the people residing in rural and remote areas. He asserted the ruling Government has miserably failed to stand on the expectations of the people of Jammu and Kashmir despite getting mandate for consecutive two terms. He said that the people across the State are being

This process of machine learning is slightly different as compared to Google Surya, because under this, the computerized software itself continuously learns from the experiences gained from the

tasks performed and keeps improving accordingly. For example, once the communication has been done in that language, new words and quotations learned in that language are incorporated into the next answers. It can be said that in the process of machine learning related to AI, computerAnd the software keeps training itself. Since both natural language processing and machine learning are used in artificial intelligence tools like PatGPT and Gemini (BARD), it can be said that the answers given in languages other than English, such as Hindi, are improving every day. It will happen. On this basis, it would be appropriate to say that the future of Hindi in AI is bright. If there is any hindrance in this, it is only that studies and studies are being conducted in organizations and higher educational institutions related to technology. Use of Hindi or other local languages is not given priority in research work. The day this starts being done there, the Hindi dot on the forehead of AI will start shining with full intensity.

"One Nation, One Election Not Possible Under Present Constitution": P Chidambaram

NEW DELHI, Sep 16 (Agencies): Congress leader P Chidambaram on Monday lashed out at the BJP-led NDA government at the Centre over the 'one nation, one election' issue, saying it is not possible under the present Constitution and requires at least five constitutional amendments.

Replying to a question on reports that the BJP-led NDA government would implement 'one nation, one election' within its current tenure, he said Prime Minister Narendra Modi does not have the numbers to place those constitutional amendments either in the Lok Sabha or Rajya Sabha.

In his Independence Day address last month, the prime minister made a strong pitch for 'one nation, one election', contending that frequent polls were creating hurdles in the country's progress.

Addressing reporters here, Mr Chidambaram said, "One nation, one election' is not possible under the present Constitution. It requires at least five constitutional amendments." "Mr Modi does not have the majority to put those constitutional amendments in either in the Lok Sabha or Rajya Sabha," the former Union minister

said.

He asserted that there were greater constitutional obstacles to 'one nation, one election'. "It is not possible.

The INDIA bloc is totally opposed to 'One Nation, One Election." To a question on PM Modi recently alleging that the Congress wanted to end reservation, Chidambaram rejected the charge. "Why should we abolish reservation?" he asked rhetorically.

"We are the ones who are saying that the reservation ceiling of 50 per

cent must be removed. We are the ones who are asking for a caste census. We are saying reservation must be according to the population. Do not believe everything the prime minister says," he told the reporters.

At a rally in Kurukshetra on September 15, Prime Minister Modi had lashed out at the Congress, alleging its "royal family" intended to end reservation for Dalits and asserted that as long as he was there, he would not let even a fraction of reservation given by B R Ambedkar be looted or removed.

At the media interaction here on Monday Mr Chidambaram was asked if the Congress would announce its chief ministerial face for the October 5 Haryana assembly polls. He said that normally, the Congress does not announce a CM candi-



"The practice is that elections take place, MLAs gather and their preferences are asked. Then the high command announces who will be the chief minister. I think the same practice will be followed in Haryana," he said.

The senior Congress leader hit out at the BJP government in the state over several issues, including unemployment, agriculture and state debt.

He appealed to the people to vote for the Congress in the Assem-

bly elections and promised that his party would bring back Haryana's growth rate, give a fillip to development, agriculture, and industry, and tackle issues of unemployment and inflation.

"The BJP boasts of a double-engine government. One engine is without fuel and the other is completely broken down.

What is the use of such a double-engine government? The time has come to junk the two engines," Mr Chidambaram said.

"We have the majority and we will be invited and then the process for oath-taking will happen. This should take a week," he added. AAP supremo Kejriwal on Sunday announced to resign and not sit in the CM's chair till the people give him a "certificate of

honesty" and and sought early polls in the

national capital.

The BJP has said if Kejriwal wanted early polls he should get the Delhi Assembly dissolved instead of creating this "drama" around his resignation.

At Monday's press conference, Bharadwaj said, "The ball is in the BJP's court. They can decide on early polls if they are ready to face Kejriwal."

Delhi elections will be the first polls that will be fought on the plank of "honesty", the senior AAP leader said.

"The Centre with all its agencies is after the CM. They have made all efforts to defame him. Despite this, he has faith in people and his honesty. This is a historic incident," he said.

Kolkata cop tried to save rape accused, got victim's body cremated in haste: CBI

KOLKATA, Sep 16 (Agencies): The CBI has alleged that senior Kolkata police officer Abhijit Mondal tried to protect accused Sanjoy Roy in the RG Kar rape-murder case, and got the trainee doctor's body cremated in haste, India Today has exclusively learnt by accessing documents linked to the investigation.

Mondal, the station house officer (SHO) of Tala police station was arrested by the CBI on Saturday along with Dr Sandip Ghosh, for delay in registration of the First Information Report (FIR) in the case and missing evidence.

The CBI officials have alleged that Mondal received information about the discovery of the 31-year-old trainee doctor's semi-naked body inside RG Kar's seminar hall at 10.03 am on August 9 from Ghosh. However, the cop failed to reach the scene immediately and only arrived an hour later, at 11 am.

The distance between Tala police station and RG Kar hospital is barely 10 minutes, with both located in north Kolkata.

The officials have also alleged that Abhijit Mondal's registration of the general diary in police records contained incorrect information. It mentioned that the doctor's body was found "lying unconscious in the seminar room of Chest Medicine" despite she being declared dead by doctors who had examined the body earlier.

The federal agency suspects that the cop deliberately mentioned wrong facts in the general diary entry as part of a conspiracy with RG Kar hospital authorities and other unknown persons.

Furthermore, the CBI has alleged that Mondal failed to cordon off the crime scene to preserve and protect it, thereby allowing unauthorised persons to access the same and damage vital evidence. The CBI investigation has revealed a 14-hour delay



by the Kolkata Police in lodging the FIR. Abhijit Mondal has been accused of failing to ensure videography of the complete process of sealing articles, exhibits, and biological samples, among others, from the crime scene, as required under the provisions of the Bengal Narcotics and Psychotropic Substances Act (BNSS).

The CBI officials have also alleged that the cop allowed a hurried cremation of the doctor within days of the rape-murder dis-

covery despite her family's demand for a second autopsy.

Mondal has been accused of an unnecessary delay of two days in seizing the clothes and belongings of accused Sanjoy Roy even though he was arrested on August 10 - a day after the doctor's body was found.

The federal agency suspects that a criminal conspiracy was hatched with the intent of throwing the investigation into the rape-

murder off the course.

Earlier in the day, Agency reported that Dr Sandip Ghosh attempted to deceive investigators and did not intend to file an FIR in the case that has invited widespread condemnation, massive protests and demands for Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee's resignation.

The CBI's remand note mentioned the forensic report of Ghosh's polygraph test, which revealed that the former RG Kar

principal had been in contact with Abhijit Mondal since 10.03 am on August 9. However, Ghosh tried to downplay the rape.

Similar to Mondal, Ghosh too did not go to the hospital immediately, even though news about the body found was conveyed to him at 9.58 am on August 9.

Earlier, the doctor's family claimed that the Kolkata Police attempted to suppress the case by hurriedly cremating her body and even tried to bribe them. Her father said that they were made to wait for hours at the police station while his daughter's body was taken for autopsy. He alleged that the doctor's body was cremated despite there being three more bodies at the crematorium.

The manager of the crematorium, however, denied the claims, saying the body could have decomposed owing to a sixhour gap between the autopsy and the time when it reached the place.

Tribal shootouts near PNG gold mine kill at least 30

PORT MORESBY, Sep 16 (Agencies): Shootouts between hundreds of tribal warriors have left at least 30 people dead in Papua New Guinea's highlands, police said Monday, as security forces were given emergency powers to quell the violence.

Police said the unrest started in August when "illegal miners" inflicted life-threatening injuries on a landowner in the Porgera Valley, home to one of Papua New Guinea's largest gold deposits.

Peace talks failed, and the situation spiralled into intense tribal fighting that saw 300 shots fired on Sunday alone, according to police commander Joseph Tondop.

Police said 30 men had been killed across the rival clans and hundreds of women and children displaced, with "many" homes burned to the ground.

Two officials were also killed while waiting for a lift home after work, said Tondop,

Police Commissioner David Manning said "lethal force" would be used to restore order in the hard-to-reach highlands region.

"Put simply, this means if you raise a weapon in a public place or to threaten another person, you will be shot," Manning said in a statement at

the weekend "This deteriorating sit-

uation has been caused by illegal miners and illegal settlers who are victimising traditional landowners and using violence to terrorise local communities."

Police said illegal miners from the Sakar clan had been squatting on land owned by their Piande rivals.

Alcohol sales have been banned and an overnight curfew is in place, added Manning, who vowed to remove the artisanal miners from the valley.

Tribal conflicts are a frequent occurrence in Papua New Guinea's highlands, but an influx of automatic weapons has made clashes deadlier.

The latest burst of fighting had been turbocharged by the presence of more than "100 high-powered weapons in the wrong hands", police said.

Security teams have been posted along the highway leading to the mine, using loudhailers to broadcast messages of peace.

Biden on Trump's 'attempted assassination': No place for political violence in US

WASHINGTON, Sep 16 (Agencies): US President Joe Biden said there is no place for political violence in America, following the second "assassination attempt" on former President and Republican presidential candidate Donald Trump at a golf club. In a statement on X, Biden commended the Secret Service and their law enforcement partners for their swift action and "vigilance" in keeping Trump safe.

"I am relieved that the former President is unharmed. There is an active investigation into this incident as law enforcement gathers more details about what happened. As I have said many times, there is no place for political violence or for any violence ever in our country, and I have directed my team to continue to ensure that Secret Service has every resource, capability and protective measure necessary to ensure the former President's



continued safety," Joe Biden said in a statement.

The 81-year-old President said he has been briefed regarding the incident, and that the suspect is in custody.

"I commend the work of the Secret Service and their law enforcement partners for their vigilance and their efforts to keep the former President and those around him safe," the statement added.

Donald Trump was rushed to safety on Sunday after the



Secret Service thwarted what the FBI called an "apparent assassination attempt". The Secret Service agents spotted and fired on a gunman in bushes near the property line of the former US President's Florida golf course, closer to where he was playing, law enforcement officials said.

The suspect, though, fled the scene in a vehicle leaving behind an AK-47-style assault rifle along with other items. he was arrested later. He has been identified as 58-year-old Ryan Wesley Routh.

US Vice President and Trump's opponent in the US elections Kamala Harris also reacted to the "assassination attempt", saying she was "glad" that the 78-year-old Republican was safe.

"I am deeply disturbed by the possible assassination attempt of former President Trump today. As we gather the facts, I will be clear: I condemn political violence. We all must do our part to ensure that this incident does not lead to more violence," she said after the attack on Trump.

"I am thankful that former President Trump is safe. I commend the U.S. Secret Service and law enforcement partners for their vigilance. As President Biden said, our Administration will ensure the Secret Service has every resource, capability, and protective measure necessary to carry out its critical mission," Kamala Harris added.

Bebinca, the strongest Typhoon to hit Shanghai in 70 years, makes landfall

SHANGHAI, Sep 16 (Agencies): The strongest storm to hit Shanghai in over 70 years made landfall on Monday, with flights cancelled and highways closed as Typhoon Bebinca lashed the city with strong winds and torrential rains.

A red alert is in place, and some coastal residents have been evacuated, city authori-

The typhoon landed early Monday morning in the coastal area of Lingang New City, in Pudong to the city's east, the China Meteorological Administration said.

It is the strongest storm to hit Shanghai since Typhoon Gloria in 1949, state broadcaster CCTV said shortly after Bebinca made landfall.

Many businesses were already closed for the Mid-Autumn Festival public holiday, and the city's 25 million residents have been

advised to avoid leaving their homes. All flights at Shanghai's two main airports are grounded, and ferry services and some trains have been suspended.

Highways were closed at 1:00 am local time (1700 GMT), and a 40-kilometre (25mile) per-hour speed limit is in place on roads inside the city. At rush hour, live video feeds showed Shanghai's normally jammed roads almost empty of traffic, and its famed skyline obscured by thick fog.

Nine thousand residents have been evacuated from Chongming District, an island at the mouth of the Yangtze River, authorities

Footage from northern Baoshan District showed ferocious winds ripping through a line of trees on the riverbank.

Shanghai's flood control headquarters told CCTV they had already received dozens of reports of incidents related to the typhoon, mostly fallen trees and billboards.

CCTV broadcast footage of a reporter by the coast in neighbouring Zhejiang province, where waves pounded the craggy coastline under leaden skies. "If I step out into (the storm), I can barely speak," the reporter said.

"You can see that the surface of the sea is just wave after wave, each higher than

Another typhoon, Yagi, killed at least four people and injured 95 when it passed through China's southern Hainan island this month, according to national weather authorities.

Bebinca has also passed through Japan and the central and southern Philippines, where falling trees killed six people.

CCTV said Bebinca was expected to move northwest, causing heavy rain and high winds in Jiangsu, Zhejiang and Anhui

UK PM Starmer meets Italy PM Meloni to discuss illegal immigration

LONDON, Sep 16 (Agencies): British Prime Minister Keir Starmer meets Italian counterpart Giorgia Meloni in Rome on Monday to discuss tackling illegal immigration, a day after another Channel migrant shipwreck claimed eight lives.

Starmer, whose centre-left Labour Party was elected with a crushing parliamentary majority in July, has vowed to fight illegal immigration, a hot-button topic in British politics for years.

Far-right riots shook cities and towns across England and Northern Ireland shortly after Starmer's election, the UK's worst unrest since 2011, with mosques and migrant accommodation centres often taraeted.

The perilous cross-Channel journeys migrants attempt from northern France have posed a fiendishly difficult problem to solve for successive British prime ministers

Eight migrants died on Sunday after their overcrowded boat capsized in the Channel, bringing to 46 the number of people who have lost their lives this year trying to reach British



Around 800 people crossed the Channel on Saturday, the second-highest figure since the start of the year, according to the UK interior ministry.

Starmer has rejected the previous Conservative government's plan to expel all illegal migrants to Rwanda while their asylum claims are examined.

Instead, UK media say he is interested in the strategy of Meloni leader of the far-right Brothers of Italy party and whose country is on the front line of the European Union's migration crisis.

Between January 1 and September 13, 44,675 people arrived in Italy compared to a figure of 125,806 for the same period in 2023.

Philippines says 'we have not lost' South China Sea reef after pullout



MANILA, Sep 16 (Agencies): The Philippines insisted on Monday that it had not given up a South China Sea reef, two days after it pulled out a ship stationed there following a months-long standoff with rival claimant

Manila had deployed the coast guard flagship BRP Teresa Magbanua to Sabina Shoal in April to stop Beijing from building an artificial island there, as it has atop several other disputed features in the strategic waterway.

But the ship was abruptly called back to the western Philippine island of Palawan, with Manila citing damage from an earlier clash with Chinese ships, ailing crew members, dwindling food and bad weather.

"We have not lost anything. We did not abandon anything. Escoda Shoal is still part of our exclusive economic zone," Philippine Coast Guard spokesman Commodore Jay Tarriela told a news conference Monday, using the Filipino name for Sabina Shoal.

Beijing claims most of the South China Sea, including Sabina Shoal, despite an international tribunal ruling that its assertions have no merit.

It has acted aggressively towards Philippine government vessels at Sabina and other disputed features in recent months, ramming, blocking, watercannoning and even boarding them, causing damage and injuries.

The confrontations have sparked concern that the United States, a military ally of Manila, could be drawn into armed conflict with China.

With the Chinese harassing resupply missions, Tarriela said it came to a point that the BRP Teresa Magbanua's water desalinator broke down, forcing the crew to rely on rainwater for drinking "for more than one month

He said the crew were also reduced to "eating porridge for three weeks", which "obviously is not nutritious". Following the ship's pullout, China's coast guard insisted on Sunday that Beijing has indisputable sovereignty" over Sabina.

It warned the Philippines to "stop inciting propaganda and risking infringements", adding Beijing would "continue to carry out rights protection and law enforcement activities" there.

But Tarriela on Monday maintained the withdrawal from Sabina was "not a defeat", rejecting comparisons to the Scarborough Shoal, which Manila lost to Beijing after a similar months-long standoff in

He said it would be "impossible" for China to totally stop the Philippines from sending its ships around the 137-square-kilometre (53-square-mile) Sabina Shoal.

"The coast guard can carry out whatever it takes for us to make sure that China will not be able to occupy and even reclaim Escoda Shoal," he said.

"We have other coast guard vessels that, as we speak right now, may have been or may already be proceeding to Escoda Shoal," Tarriela said without providing details, citing operational security considerations.

Sabina is located 140 kilometres (86 miles) west of Palawan and about 1,200 kilometres from Hainan island, the nearest major Chinese landmass.

Pakistan court grants bail to 10 MPs linked to jailed ex-PM Imran Khan

ISLAMABAD, Sep 16 (Agencies): An anti-terrorism court in Pakistan granted bail Monday to 10 lawmakers from jailed former prime minister Imran Khan's party,

an agency journalist witnessed. At least 30 people from Khan's Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) party -- including the 10 MPs -- were remanded in custody last Tuesday, two days after they led a major rally

in the capital, Islamabad. The anti-terrorism court granted them bail

of 30,000 rupees (\$100). PTI has faced a sweeping crackdown since Khan was jailed in August last year on a series of charges he says are politically moti-

vated and designed to keep him from power. The 10 MPs, some detained at their offices in the National Assembly, were charged under a new protest law and the anti-terrorism act.

They were accused of violating the Peaceful Assembly and Public Order Act, passed just days before the rally was held, in a move rights groups say was an attempt to curb freedom of expression and peaceful protest. PTI has sparred with the military since

Khan was deposed two years ago. The confrontation came to a head after the former cricket star's first arrest on corruption

charges in May 2023. His supporters waged days of sometimes violent protests and attacked military installations, sparking a sweeping crackdown on PTI led by the army -- Pakistan's most pow-

erful institution. But the clampdown failed to diminish

Khan's popularity and candidates backed by the former premier won the most seats in 2024 polls -- marred by allegations of widespread rigging.

Khan rose to power in 2018 with the help of the military, analysts say, but was ousted in 2022 after reportedly falling out with the

JAMMU, Sep 16: A delegation from the Chamber of Commerce and Industry, led by President Arun Gupta and accompanied by Sr. Vice President Anil Gupta, Jr. Vice President Rajeev Gupta, Secretary General Manish Gupta, and Secretary Rajesh Gupta, met with the Chief Secretary to discuss various pressing issues affecting trade, industry, and the general public in

During the meeting, Arun Gupta highlighted significant challenges related to urban development. He pointed out that the government has failed to create sufficient additional colonies, leading to the proliferation of unapproved and unauthorized developments. Gupta noted that while maps for plots in these unauthorized colonies are being approved, similar approvals are being denied for plots sanctioned by the Housing Board. This discrepancy, he argued, exacerbates the housing

Gupta also addressed the issue of outdated urban planning, citing Gandhi Nagar, which has



been developed since 1955. He mentioned that due to generational changes, multiple families now occupy individual portions of the same plot. He further noted that some residents face delays in selling their plots due to pending No Objection Certificates (NOCs). which are not being issued in a timely manner. Gupta requested that the requirement for an NOC from the Housing Board or JDA for construction on freehold property be abolished.

The delegation also discussed the lack of progress in establishing new commercial areas or residential colonies over the past three decades. Gupta urged the Chief Secretary to explore possibilities for Heritage Complex. Gupta urged the Chief Secretary to expedite these projects and initiate a light and sound system at Mubarak Additionally, Gupta pro-

posed developing Patnitop as a major tourist hub similar to Gulmarg and Pahalgam in the Kashmir Valley. He suggested modernizing and promoting other tourist destinations in Jammu, including the Perpanchal mountains, Poonch, Rajouri, and several religious sites such as Shiv Khori and Mata Vaishno Devi.

The delegation raised several concerns related to commercial and industrial sectors. Gupta requested the renewal of expired lease deeds for allotments in Sabzi Mandi and Fruit Mandi Narwal, urged the execution of lease deeds for commercial shops in Bahu Plaza, and sought the immediate execution of pending lease deeds at Shiv Market Railway Station. He also asked for the repair and redevelopment of the old bus stand building into a multistory project to accommodate existing businesses.

Gupta highlighted the slow progress of the

Transport Nagar Narwal development and called for increased funding to expedite its completion. He also requested the release of turnover incentives for existing industries without caps and the elimination of any negative lists for industrial products.

The delegation proposed that the government formulate a scheme to grant ownership rights of leasehold industrial land to local entrepreneurs after 25 years, charging only a nominal fee. They also requested the announcement of a power amnesty scheme for commercial consumers, similar to the one provided to domestic users.

Gupta addressed the challenges faced by local flour millers due to insufficient wheat production in the region. He pointed out that millers are charged a 6% mandi fee on wheat from neighboring states, making their products more expensive compared to those from other regions. Gupta requested intervention from the Chief Secretary to resolve this issue or provide viable incentives to local flour millers to offset their higher production costs.



India captain Rohit Sharma and head coach Gautam Gambhir are devising a plan to surprise Bangladesh in the Test series opener.

CHENNAI, Sep 16 (Agencies): As the Indian cricket team gears up for the Test series opener against Bangladesh, starting September 19, a new strategic call seems to be in line. India head coach Gautam Gambhir and captain Rohit Sharma looked at a few experiments in the nets, but the one that particularly caught the eye was the decision to have Yashasvi Jaiswal bowl leg spin. Jaiswal, who has also taken the opener's role in Tests like fish takes to water, also seemed serious about spin bowling, a skill that would strengthen his position in the team, not just in Tests but other formats as well.

In a video shared by Jio Cinema, the official broadcaster of the Test series, the likes of Ravichandran Ashwin and Ravindra Jadeja faced Jaiswal's deliveries in the nets. Though the responsibility of bowling spin primarily relies on the shoulders of Jadeja and Ashwin, they



could find a new partner in the form of Jaiswal soon.

When it comes to his Test career, Jaiswal has bowled just one over before, against England in Ranchi, where he had gone for six runs.

The Chennai pitch, where the first Test is scheduled to

be played, is expected to be a red soil pitch which would help pacers more. Considering the wonders that Bangladesh spinners did against Pakistan in the recently-concluded 2-match Test series, Team India seem to have opted for a more measured approach.

The Bangladesh squad landed in Chennai, the venue for the opening Test beginning on September 19, on Sunday afternoon. "It's definitely going to be a very challenging series for us," Shanto was quoted as saying at the pre-departure press briefing at the Dhaka airport.

"After a good series (vs Pakistan) there is definitely an extra confidence in the team, in the people of the country. Every series is an opportunity.

Both Bangladesh and India will be training at the MA Chidambaram Stadium in Chennai.

Ishan Kishan posts two-word message after superb hundred in Duleep Trophy

ANANTAPUR, Sep 16 (Agencies): Indian wicket-keeper batter Ishan Kishan made a significant return to red-ball cricket, smashing a superb hundred in the Duleep Trophy to reignite talks of his comeback to the Indian national team. Playing for India C, Kishan scored 111 runs off 126 balls, showcasing his aggressive strokeplay and undeniable talent. His performance comes after a prolonged absence from red-ball cricket, marking an impressive return to the format.

Kishan, who had last represented India during the tour of South Africa in 2023, withdrew from the series due to mental fatigue and has since been missing from India's playing XI. Despite his absence from Jharkhand's Ranji Trophy campaign, the wicket-keeper batter did feature in the 2024 Indian Premier League (IPL) for the Mumbai Indians. However, his absence from the Test squad left many questioning his red-ball future.

Kishan silenced his critics with a commanding century, laced with 14 fours and three sixes, playing a pivotal role in India C's innings. The young wicketkeeper shared a crucial 189-run part-

nership for the third wicket with Baba Indrajith, who scored 78 off 136 balls. After the game, Ishan took to Instagram to share pictures from his innings, simply captioning his post: "Unfinished Business." The two-word message created a buzz amongst fans and experts, hinting at his determination to make a strong case for a return to the Indian Test side.

Though Kishan was not part of India's squad for the upcoming Test series against Bangladesh, his hundred in the Duleep Trophy will certainly have caught the attention of the selectors. His innings came at a time when India's wicket-keeping department is undergoing transition, and Kishan's impressive form could lead to opportunities shortly.

Notably, Kishan was a late inclusion in the India C squad, joining the team on the eve of the game after recovering from a groin injury that had kept him out of the first round of the tournament. Sanju Samson had initially replaced him in the India D squad due to his injury, but Kishan's timely recovery allowed him to make his mark.

Despite his efforts, the India B vs India C match ended in a draw.

Chess Olympiad: Indian Men Crush Azerbaijan, Women Beat Kazakhstan

BUDAPEST, Sep 16 (Agencies): Backed by the two in-form stars in World Championship challenger D Gukesh and Arjun Erigaise, the Indian men scored a 3-1 victory over Azerbaijan in the fifth round of the 45th Chess Olympiad in Budapest. It seems like Gukesh and Arjun can do nothing wrong in this Olympiad as they overpowered Aydin Sulemanli and Rauf Mamedov respectively with their white pieces in quick time. Praggnanandhaa played another draw on board two to only ensure an Indian victory while Vidit Gujrathi played out a draw with Shakhriyar Mamedyarov in a marathon game to complete the triumph.

After scoring the fifth victory on the trot, the Indian men maintained a clean slate on ten points and they were joined by



Vietnam who continued with their impressive show and downed Poland 2.5-1.5.

The other two teams that joined the leaders' pack were China and Hungary who scored identical 2.5-1.5 victories over Spain and Ukraine respectively.

With six rounds still to come in the biggest chess event, Magnus Carlsen's Norway and Iran are the only two teams sharing the fifth spot on 9 points apiece. Norway defeated a talented Turkey team by

a 3-1 margin while Iran made most of the opportunities to down Canada 3.5-0.5.

In the women's section, Grandmaster D Harika suffered a shock defeat to give Kazakhstan an early lead. Better for most of the game, Harika misplayed after many pundits believed her position to be winning against Bibisara Assaubayeva.

On the fourth board Vantika Agarwal yet again played the anchor and won a clean game with white pieces against Alua Nurman while Xeniya Balabayeva split the point with Divya Deshmukh.

With the scores tied at 2-2 it was Vaishali's turn to come up triumphs for the team and she outwitted Meruert Kamalidenova.

Team India joined Armenia and Mongolia in the lead on ten points. Armenia halted the Chinese party for now handing them a 2.5-1.5 defeat while Mongolia proved superior to United States with a similar score.

The three leaders have 10 points apiece and they are now followed by Georgia and Poland a half point behind.

Gukesh scored his fourth victory in a row at the expense of Sulemanli.

The World championship challenger got a huge middle game advantage with scat-

tered black pieces and a weak king and made no mistakes in converting that in to a full point.

Arjun is the only Indian

who has played all five games thus far and the primary reason is his ability to complicate matters with either colour. Up against Mamedov, it was Sicilian Dragon structure wherein Arjun converted to a complicated endgame and then his precise calculation helped him carve out his fifth win as many games. England continue to be cautious as Jofra Archer returns to ODIs after 18 months

LONDON, Sep 16 (Agencies): England's interim coach Marcus Trescothick said they will continue to monitor Jofra Archer's workload in the upcoming five-match ODI series against Australia. Archer will be rested for a couple of games in the ODI series, which will be crucial to England and Australia's preparations for the Champions Trophy next month. England and Australia will meet in th ODIs from September 19 to 29 across five venues.

Archer proved his worth for England in the recently-concluded T20I series, nailing yorkers at will in the season opener in Southampton. Archer bowled 3.3 overs and picked up two wickets before he was rested for the second T20I in Cardiff.

Archer was due to play the final match of the series in Manchester, but the series finale was washed out due to rain on Sunday, September 15.

Archer was picked in England's squad for the ODI series, marking his return to the 50-over format for the first time since England's tour of Bangladesh in March 2023. Trescothick highlighted the jump in workload for Archer in the 50-over format of the game, adding that everybody in the team, including the fast bowler, is well aware of the plan.

Archer has been struggling with elbow and back injuries and has been in and out of the senior national team since the start of 2020.

England will look to have a fully fit Archer for the Champions Trophy in February-March next year. The pacer, despite the nagging injury concerns over the last four yeas, has not given up hopes of returning to Test cricket during the Ashes next year.

'Still Playing In Shane Warne's Shadow': Nathan Lyon's Massive Praise For Late Australian Great

SYDNEY, Sep 16 (Agencies): Australia spinner Nathan Lyon has accepted to live with the fact of being constantly compared to legendary bowler Shane Warne throughout his career. The 36-year-old, who once felt pressure because of the comparison, has now found peace with it. The veteran of 129 Test matches and 530 wickets, Lyon revealed that the tall figure of Warne made it difficult to establish himself in international cricket. The greatest leg-spinner of all-time, who passed away at the age of 52 in 2022, had retired from international cricket in 2007 with a massive tally of 708 Test wickets.

However, Lyon, who made his Test debut in 2011, felt the enormous pressure of filling Warne's boot early in his career.

"I probably struggled with it early doors because you would be trying your hardest every game, but I feel like the media and the Australian public were asking, 'who's the next spinner? We need a spinner to do what Shane Warne did on the last day," Lyon told Sky Cricket

"And I'm 10 matches into my first-class career. I'm never going to be able to do what Warnie did. Warnie's once-in-a-generation, he's the greatest to play the game in my opinion.

"I still feel in the shadow of Shane Warne now and I'm 129 Test matches in with 530 wickets. The thing is, I'm happy with that, and I'm comfortable with that now. A lot of us felt the pressure of Shane Warne's shadow... and it probably took me a good five, six, seven years to understand that pressure is a privilege. And if you've got pressure, you're doing OK, enjoy it," the spinner added.

Lyon will be in action in the much-anticipated fivematch Test series against India, scheduled to be played from November 22 in Perth.

Sri Lanka announce 16-member squad for home Test series vs New Zealand

COLOMBO, Sep 16 (Agencies): The Sri Lanka cricket board has announced a 16-member squad for the home Test series against New Zealand. Dhananjaya de Silva will lead the Sri Lankan team as they host the Kiwis for a 2-match Test series. Sri Lanka are coming off a 1-2 loss against England in an away 3-match series. Sri Lanka didn't make many changes to their squad from the England series. However, Oshada Fernando has been named after more than a year since his last appearance in red-ball cricket. The move could be aimed at solidifying the top-order batting, which couldn't step up against England. Wicketkeeper-batter Nishan Madushka was not included in the team, along with Nisala Tharaka and Kasun Rajitha.

Meanwhile, New Zealand hasn't had the best of years, suffering an early elimination in the T20 World Cup. They travelled to India for a one-off Test against Afghanistan. However, the match was abandoned without a ball being bowled or even a toss due to persistent rain and a poor outfield at the Greater Noida Sports Complex Ground.

Sri Lanka shows trust on youngsters Youngsters like Pathum Nissanka, Kamindu Mendis, and Milan Rathanayake will aim to continue their impressive performances from the England series. Nissanka became the first Sri Lankan opener in 13 years to score a Test hundred in England. His match-

winning 127* helped Sri Lanka record their 4th Test win on English soil in the last 40 years. Kamindu Mendis also had a dream start to his Test career, scoring a third Test century in his 4th appearance in whites for Sri Lanka in the 2nd Test against England.

New Zealand will return to the island nation after five long years for a bilateral series. The Test series is part of the World Test Championship calendar, set to conclude at Lord's Cricket Ground in 2025. Meanwhile, Sri Lanka will aim to make use of their home conditions and take confidence from their recent ODI series triumph against India in Colombo. The first Test match will take place on September 18 in Galle.

KISHTWAR, Sep 16: Senior National Conference (NC) leader and spokesperson for the Chenab Valley Zone, Ajeet Bhagat, has made a heartfelt appeal to the people of Jammu and Kashmir, particularly those in Kishtwar, Doda, and Ramban districts. to stand united against what he termed as the failures of the BJP-led government. Bhagat accused the government of significantly worsening the hardships of the masses over the past ten years, saying that the suffering of the people has increased "twenty-fold" under BJP's rule.

Bhagat lambasted the BJP administration for using excessive force against National Rural Health Mission (NRHM) employees, sanitation workers, Forest Department employees, and PHE daily wagers. He expressed his dismay at the government's neglect and high-handedness towards essential workers, stating that such actions have only deepened the frustration and discontent among the populace.

During his speech, Bhagat laid out the National Conference's manifesto, outlining its promises to the people if the party comes to power. Some of the key pledges include the creation of 100,000 jobs within the first few months of the new administration, providing 200 units of free electricity, and transferring hydroelectric power projects to J&K as rec-



Minister's Committee. He further promised free drinking water for every household and financial support of 5,000 per month for female heads of households under the **Economically Weaker** Section (EWS) category. Bhagat also highlighted several other welfare measures the NC plans to introduce, such as the provision of 12 free

LPG cylinders annually for EWS families, the enhancement of pensions for the elderly and widows to 3,000, an increase in marriage assistance from 50,000 to 75,000 for EWS families, and the raising of medical allowances for pensioners from 300 to 1,000 per month. Additionally, the party aims to increase free rice allocation to 10 kg per person per month and create a Medical Trust to offer free insurance coverage of 5 lakh annually for terminal diseases like cancer and heart or kidney transplants. A policy for the time-bound regularization of employees was also mentioned as part of the party's commitment to labor rights

Bhagat fiercely criticized the BJP for failing to address basic issues. particularly pointing out their decision to stop the

sale of sugar at ration depots, reduce ration quotas, and hike electricity bills from 40 to 1,040. He condemned the government's decision to subject ReT teachers to re-examinations in 2016 and slammed the administration for using force to suppress peaceful protests by NRHM employees. The increases in toll charges, passenger fares, and the alarming rise in unemployment from 15% in 2013 to 45% in 2024 the highest in 50 yearswere also focal points of Bhagat's speech

In his concluding remarks, Bhagat urged the public to reflect on how their 'Achhe Din' were when the NC was in power. He accused the BJP of bringing about the region's decline since December 2014 and expressed hope that the people would support National Conference candidates in the upcoming elections. He appealed to voters in Kishtwar to support Saijad Ahmed Kichloo, former Home Minister, and to those in Nagseni-Paddar to back Pooja Thakur, DDC Chairperson, in their respective constituencies.

Bhagat also predicted that BJP's communal politics would be rejected nationwide and called voting for the party akin to "investing in a crashing bank." He expressed optimism that the BJP government at the center would fall by June 2029 and that an alliance of secular forces would restore peace and progress in Jammu and Kash-
