Migrant labourer dies after falling from an under construction building at **CUK**

SRINAGAR, Sep 30 (Agencies): A labourer died after falling from an under construction building at the Central University of Kashmir in Ganderbal late last night, reports said.

Quoting an official news agency NVI reported that a labourer was seriously injured in the incident.

He said the labourer was immediately rushed to District Hospital (DH) Ganderbal for treatment, from where he was referred to SKIMS Soura, where doctors declared him brought dead on arrival.

The official identified the labourer as Ramjee Thakur, son of Late Durga Thakur, a resident of Bihar.

Search **Operations** in Kathua, Rajouri extended to fresh areas

JAMMU, Sep 30 (Agencies): Security forces on Monday extended the ongoing search operations to new areas in Jammu and Kashmir's Kathua and Rajouri districts to hunt down terrorists following recent encounters in the region, officials said.

While a policeman and a terrorist were killed and two police officers injured in a fierce gunbattle in remote Kog-Mandli forest village in Billawar tehsil of Kathua district on Saturday evening, a brief exchange of fire took place between terrorists and security forces in Manial Gali in Thanamandi area of Rajouri district on Sunday evening.

A massive search operation is going on for the third day in Kathua with cordon extending to over a dozen other villages near the scene of Saturday's encounter, the officials said.

They said at least three more foreign terrorists of Pakistanbased Jaish-e-Mohammad (JeM) are believed to be hiding in the forest belt.

In Rajouri, the officials said the terrorists fled after a brief encounter with security forces at Manial Gali in Thanamandi area Sunday evening.

The operation was called off late Sunday and resumed and extended to new areas

"Tried to create an atmosphere free from fear, intimidation," says DGP RR Swain on last day of his service

SRINAGAR, Sep 30 (Agencies): On the final day of his service, the Director General of Police (DGP) R R Swain Monday visited the newly constructed Martyr's Memorial or Balidan Stambh at Pratap Park in Srinagar's Lal Chowk.

Talking to reporters after paying tributes to killed soldiers, the J&K police chief said that he too could have been among his hundreds of colleagues killed in the line of duty.

During his threedecades of service, the DGP said that he



has tried to ensure a fear-free atmosphere in Kashmir.

"For a police officer, Balidan Stambh is not less than a place of worship. There are hun-

dreds of fallen heroes who have sacrificed their lives for the cause. It is my duty to pay rich tributes to all the heroes on the last day of my serfrom being a Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) to be promoted to the DGP rank, Swain said, "this opportunity doesn't come to all. For this. I am thankful to the Almighty and the government and then to my colleagues.'

CBI arrests 26 cybercriminals in multi-state crackdown



NEW DELHI, Sep 30 (Agencies): In a multistate crackdown on organised cybercrime, the CBI has arrested 26 alleged cybercriminals involved in fraudulent activities targeting people globally, officials

said on Monday.

The action under operation Chakra-III started with raids at 32 different places across Pune, Hyderabad, Ahmedabad and Visakhapatnam late night last Thursday. The central agency has seized Rs 58.45 lakh cash, locker keys and three luxury vehicles, they said.

Four call centres — V.C. Inconformities Pvt. Ltd at Regent Plaza, Pune; V.C. Infrometrix Pvt. Ltd, Murli Nagar, Visakhapatnam; Viajex Solutions, Hyderabad: and Atriya Global Services Pvt. Ltd, Visakhapatnam — were among the places raided by the agency.

The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) intercepted 170 people engaged in live online

"Congress confident in forming govts in Haryana, Jammu-Kashmir", Says MP Jairam Ramesh



NEW DELHI, Sep 30 (Agencies): Congress leader Jairam Ramesh stated that the party is confident about forming a government in Harvana as well as Jammu and Kashmir following the end of the assembly polls.

In an exclusive interview with news agency on Monday, the Rajya Sabha MP highlighted key issues such as justice for soldiers, farmers, and wrestlers and emphasised the slogan "Jai jawan, jai kisaan, jai pehelwan" to address perceived injustices in

the state. "It is clear that the Congress government will be formed in Haryana. It is a big storm against the BJP. The issues in Haryana are 'Jai jawan, jai kisaan, jai pehelwan'... There has been injustice with jawans and farmers

and discrimination with wrestlers. So this is our slogan for Haryana," he

Ramesh stressed the demand for a legal guarantee of Minimum Support Price (MSP), citing the farmers' protest and also slammed the Prime Minister for being during the protest.

He also mentioned the party's commitment to loan waivers and the removal of the 50 per cent reservation limit and reiterated the importance of conducting a caste census by



Mehbooba had earlier condemned the killing of Hezbollah leader Hassan Nasrallah in Israeli airstrikes and cancelled her election campaign for a day to extend support to the people of Lebanon and Palestine.

"The International Criminal Court has given a verdict against Netanyahu. This (attacks in Lebanon) incident has proved that he is really a criminal who has killed thousands of persons in Palestine and is now doing the same in Lebanon. No condemnation is enough," Mehbooba told agency Videos.

Terming Netanyahu as "the biggest terrorist after Hitler", the former chief minister said, "Hitler set up gas chambers to kill people but Netanyahu



has turned Palestine and Lebanon into gas chambers where they are killing people in thousands," she said.

Mehbooba said the government's decision to have ties with the Netanyahu regime is wrong. "We have stood by Palestine since the times of Mahatma Gandhi. Having ties with a regime and supplying weapons and drones that are being used to kill people, I think, is a wrong decision," she added.

Asked about BJP criticism of her tweet terming slain Hezbollah chief Hassan Nasrallah a martyr. Mufti said the saffron party should look at the "outpouring" in the

country against the killing "What will the BJP tell me? They are the ones who stood by the rapists of an eight-year-old girl in Kathua. Those convicts are today serving their sentences. I had to remove two of their ministers for supporting the rapists," the PDP chief said.

"What do they (BJP) know about the long struggle of Nasrallah for the people of Palestine? They should see how many people are coming out in Kashmir, in Lucknow and other parts of the country and raising slogans for the martyr. They should realise how wrong their thinking is,"


The Central Board of Film Certification told the Bombay High Court on Monday that actor-producer Kangana Ranaut has agreed to the cuts suggested by the CBFC in her movie 'Emergency'.

A division bench of Justices BP Colabawalla and Firdosh Pooniwalla was hearing a petition filed by the film's co-producer Zee Entertainment Enterprises, seeking a direction to the CBFC to issue a certificate for the film, helmed by Ranaut.

The movie, which was initially slated for a September 6 release, has been embroiled in a battle with the censor board for non-issuance of certificate for its release.

Ranaut, who has directed and co-produced the film besides playing the lead role of former prime minister late Indira Gandhi, had accused the CBFC of stalling certification to delay the release.

The biographical drama is caught up in controversy after some Sikh organisations including the Shiromani Akali Dal



objected, accusing it of misrepresenting the community and getting historical facts wrong.

During the hearing on Monday, advocate Sharan Jagtiani, representing Zee Entertainment,

told the high court that Ranaut has informed them about the revised changes that they (CBFC) wanted to make.

The matter has been agreed and discussed between her

(Kangana) and the CBFC, he said.

However, Zee Entertainment needs time to confirm about the cuts that are to be made, he added.

Ranaut's Manikarnika Films is the co-producer of the movie. CBFC counsel Abhinav Chan-

drachud told the bench that the cuts would not touch even one minute and it won't affect the movie's length.

Most of the changes have been agreed upon by the Manikarma Films, he added.

The court adjourned the matter till October 3 and asked both the parties to seek proper instructions.

Zee Entertainment in its plea claimed the CBFC had already made the certificate for the movie but was not issuing it.

It had earlier alleged the certificate was being withheld due to political reasons and due to the upcoming elections in Haryana.

The bench had then wondered as to why the ruling party would act against Ranaut, who is herself a BJP MP.

'It's good to be back': Shah Rukh Khan on best actor win at IIFA 2024



Superstar Shah Rukh Khan, who won the best actor trophy for 'Jawan' at the IIFA Awards 2024 ceremony, said he and his family went through a "tough time" while the movie was under development, and that he was happy to end his year on a high after the victory.

Directed by Atlee, 'Jawan' follows the emotional journey of a man who is set to rectify the wrongs in the society. It starred Shah Rukh in the dual role of Vikram Rathore and his son Azad.

Shah Rukh, who also hosted IIFA Awards with Vicky Kaushal and Karan Johar, said while he did not like talking about his personal life, 'Jawan' was made "under stress".

"We all were going through a little bit of a tough time while making 'Jawan'... It's good to be back. I'm extremely grateful for this award. I love awards, I'm greedy about awards... I'm genuinely back and really happy to end the year like this," the actor said in his awards acceptance King Khan had taken a break post the release of 2018's 'Zero' after some of his films didn't do well at the box office. Tough times also hit home when his

eldest son, Aryan Khan, was arrested in connection with the Mumbai cruise drugs case in 2021 and spent 22 days in jail.

The family was under intense media scrutiny during this time. In 2022, Aryan was cleared of all charges.

"We are all professionals who are supposed to do our job, but I'd like to thank the team behind me Arun, Raj, Sharina, Anjali, Khushboo, Preety who did the make-up, and of course, Pooja (his manager). They all worked very, very hard for 2-3 years to make this film happen. I thank you all from the bottom of my heart." he said.

Coldplay ticket rush: BookMyShow CEO, technical head summoned by Mumbai cops

The CEO and cofounder of BMS, Ashish Hemrajani and its technical head have been issued fresh summons by the Economic Offences Wing (EOW) over the alleged black marketing of tickets for the Coldplay concert which is set to be held in Navi Mumbai at the DY Patil Stadium from January



19 to January 21, 2025. The Mumbai Police's Economic Offences Wing (EOW) has asked them to appear before an investigating officer on Monday.

Ashish Hemrajani and the technical head have

not yet got in touch with the police, reportedly.

Coldplay's India tour tickets, which were originally priced at Rs 2,500, are being resold by third parties and influencers for as much as Rs 3


Earlier, the fans of the band were left disap-

The tour is also travelling to Abu Dhabi, Seoul and Hong Kong between January and April of 2025.

It's a responsibility, can't afford to play with people's emotions: Rakeysh Mehra on 'Karna'



A filmmaker has a certain responsibility towards millions of cinema goers, who turn up to watch movies, and he cannot afford to play with their emotions, says director Rakeysh Omprakash Mehra, whose next film 'Karna' is reportedly based on the iconic Mahabharata character.

According to reports, Mehra's ambitious project will see Tamil movie star Suriya in the titular role, with Janhvi Kapoor playing the role of Draupadi.

Asked if he was spending a lot of time on research, the filmmaker said, "I wake up at 3.30 in the morning and start working."

Kharge's comments on PM Modi absolutely distasteful, disgraceful: Amit Shah

NEW DELHI, Sep 30 (Agencies): Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Monday termed Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge's remarks on Prime Minister Narendra Modi at a public meeting in Jammu and Kashmir "absolutely distasteful and disgraceful".

Modi is removed from power. "I am 83 years old. I am not going to die so early. I will stay alive till PM Modi is removed from power," the Congress leader said. "I wanted to talk.

But due to dizziness, I have sat

down. Please pardon me." Shah hit out at Kharge over his remarks.

"Yesterday, the Congress President Shri Mallikarjun Kharge Ji has outperformed himself, his leaders and his party in being

absolutely distasteful and disgraceful in his speech.

"In a bitter display of spite, he unnecessarily dragged PM Modi into his personal health matters by saying that he would die only after removing PM Modi from power," Shah wrote on X.

He said Kharge's remarks showed how much hate and fear the Congress people have for PM Modi and that they are constantly thinking of him.

"As for the health of Mr. Kharge Ji, Modi Ji prays, I pray and we all pray that he lives a long, healthy life. May he continue to live for many years and may he live to see the creation of a Viksit Bharat by 2047," the minister said.

No 'spin-doctoring' can change fact that last 10 years saw 'jobloss growth': Congress

NEW DELHI, Sep 30 (Agencies): The Congress on Monday dismissed as "half-truths" government's assertions of creating eight crore employment opportunities between 2021 and 2024 and 6.2 crore net subscribers joining the EPFO data-

Congress general secretary in-charge communications Jairam Ramesh said that amidst the "U-turns and scandals" that have marked the last few months of this "tottering" government, "the PM and his drum beaters have tried to find some solace in their economic record, claiming to have created eight crore employment opportunities between 2021 and 2024".

"This claim initially emerged from the RBI KLEMS data, which we had earlier countered on July 15th, 2024. The government now claim that 6.2 crore net subscribers joined the Employees' Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO) database between September 2017 and March 2024. Both claims are based on half-truths," he said

in a statement. A large part of the claimed "employment growth" has recorded the unpaid household work by women as "employment", he said, adding that it is not new job creation.

Amidst the poor economic climate, workers are moving to lowproductivity informal and agricultural jobs. While crucial sectors like education saw 12 lakh fewer jobs in 2020-

2021, a whopping 1.8 crore 'jobs' were 'created' in agriculture," he said. Thus, factory workers, teachers, miners, etc. who returned home during COVID-19 and had to return to farming, Ramesh argued.

This shift to low-productivity, poorly paid jobs is an economic travesty, which the government is touting as an achievement, the Congress leader said.

He further said the government cites the addition of 6.2 crore net subscribers in the EPFO database to show record employment growth, without revealing the full picture.

EPFO only tracks the organised sector which is less than 10 per cent of total employment.

The Supreme Court verdict in 2020 required



the EPFO to include contractual workers at any establishment which employs more than 20 people.

A substantial number of workers who were already employed are now being reflected in its data -? these are not new jobs created," Ramesh said.

Ramesh further said that firms with 20 or more employees come under the purview of the EPF act moved from 19 to 20 employees in one year will suddenly appear in the EPFO data as 20 new "jobs" even though net job creation is a single job.

India's unemployment rate today is the highest it has been in 45 years, with the unemployment rate for graduate youth at 42%.

The final straw has been the PM's economic policy of favouring a few large business groups, which is destroying competition and impacting inflation as well, he said.

Keep gods away from politics: Supreme Court on Tirupati laddu row

NEW DELHI, Sep 30 (Agencies): Observing that at least the gods should be kept out of politics, the Supreme Court on Monday questioned Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu's claim that animal fat was used in making Tirupati laddus and sought proof

A bench of Justices BR Gavai and KV Viswanathan noted that the chief minister made the claim on September 18, even though the FIR in the matter was lodged on September 25 and a special investigation team (SIT) constituted on September 26.

...it was not appropriate on the part of a higher constitutional functionary to go in public and make a statement which can affect the sentiments of crores of people," the bench said.

The bench asked Solicitor General Tushar Mehta to assist it in deciding whether the investigation by the state-appointed SIT should continue or the probe should be conducted by an independent agency.

The bench was hearing a batch of pleas, including those seeking a court-monitored probe into the alleged use of animal fat in making Tirupati laddus.

During the hearing, the apex court sought proof that contaminated ghee was used in making Tirupati laddus.

"At least, we expect

the gods to be kept away from politics," the bench observed.

Mehta told the bench that it was a matter of faith and if contaminated ghee was used in preparation of laddus, it was unacceptable.

The bench has posted the matter for October 3. Andhra Pradesh CM N Chandrababu Naidu claimed earlier this month that animal fat was used in preparing Tirupati laddus during the previous YS Jagan Mohan Reddy-led government in the state, triggering a massive political row.

The YSR Congress Party has accused Naidu of indulging in "heinous allegations" for political gains.

Maharashtra declares indigenous cows 'Rajyamata-Gomata' ahead of Assembly polls

MUMBAI, Sep 30 (Agencies): The Maharashtra government has given indigenous cow breeds the status of 'Rajyamata-Gomata' (state mother cow) in recognition of their cultural and agricultural significance.

The state Cabinet led by Chief Minister Eknath Shinde took the decision months ahead of the Maharashtra Assembly election.

A statement issued by the state Agriculture, Dairy Development, Animal Husbandry and Fisheries Department on Monday read, "Keeping in view the status of the native cow in Indian culture since the Vedic period, the usefulness of the milk of the native cow in human diet, the important place of cow dung and cow urine in Ayurveda medicine, Panchgavya treatment system and organic farming systems, it has been approved to declare the native cows as 'Rajyamata Gomata' from now on."

Speaking about the decision, Deputy Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis said, "Indigenous



cows are a boon for our farmers. So, we have decided to grant this (Rajyamata) status to them. We have also decided to extend help for the rearing of indigenous cows at goshalas (cow shelters).'

Cow holds deep spiritual and cultural significance in Hinduism. The cow is regarded as a symbol of motherhood because of its ability to provide milk, a vital resource. Hindus often refer to cows as "Gau

Mata" (mother cow). reflecting their role in sustaining life.

The Maharashtra Cabinet also accepted the second and third reports of the Justice Shinde committee, set up to finalise the protocol for issuing Kunbi-Maratha and Maratha-Kunbi certificates based on historical records.

The move is seen as a significant move to placate the Maratha community protesting for inclusion in the OBC category ahead of the Assembly election.

Malayalam actor Siddique granted pre-arrest bail by **Supreme Court in rape case** NEW DELHI, Sep

30 (Agencies): The Supreme Court on Monday granted interim protection from arrest to Malayalam actor Siddique in a sexual assault case lodged against him by an actress. The relief to the Malayalam actor came days after the Kerala High Court refused the pre-arrest bail plea in the sexual assault case.

The top court provided the pre-arrest bail to Siddige on the condition that he would appear before police for questioning and cooperate with the investigation.

A bench of Justices Bela M Trivedi and Satish Chandra Sharma also issued notice to the Kerala government and the actress in the case during the hearing of the plea by Siddique challenging a Kerala High Court order.

An FIR was filed against Siddique in connection with the sexual assault allegations by an actress in August this year. The case was registered by the Trivandrum Museum Police under the non-bailable offence of rape based on the complaint.



Speaking about the case, Siddique, who was charged with offences under sections 376 (rape) and 506 (criminal intimidation) of the Indian Penal Code (IPC), claimed that the complainant actress had subjected him to a "prolonged campaign of harassment and false accusations since 2019".

Siddique also claimed that the complainant is making these allegations because he conducted a press conference along with other office bearers of the Association of Malayalam Movie Actors (AMMA) after

the release of the Justice Hema Committee report. The Hema Committee

report shed light on the widespread and persistent sexual harassment faced by women in the Malayalam cinema, with many alleging they were subjected to unwanted advances even before commencing work.

Multiple FIRs have been registered against many high-profile Malayalam film personalities following allegations of sexual harassment against them in the wake of revelations made in the Hema Committee report.

Doctor at UP hospital forgets surgical needle inside woman's head, probe on

Chief Medical Officer for Hapur district, Dr Sunil Tyagi, said they are aware of the incident at the community health centre

HAPUR (UP), Sep 30 (Agencies): In an incident that raises serious questions about the state healthcare system, the doctor at a government hospital in Uttar Pradesh's Hapur left a surgical needle inside an 18-year-old's head after stitching up an injury.

Sitara was rushed to a community health centre after she suffered a head injury during a clash with neighbours. The doctor said she needed stitches on her head. He and the healthcare staff performed the procedure, bandaged the woman's head and sent her home.

Back home, the woman started screaming with pain. Her family members rushed her to



a private hospital. The doctors there opened up the wound again and were shocked to find the needle inside. It was only after it was removed that the woman felt some relief.

The woman's mother said the doctor at the state-run community health centre was drunk. "We don't want anyone to go through this. We want action," she said. The woman's mother

also showed the needle extracted from her daughter's head.

Chief Medical Officer for Hapur district, Dr Sunil Tyagi, said they are aware of the incident at the community health centre. "We have ordered an investigation by a two-member team. As soon as we get a report, we will take

Asked about the family's allegation that the doctor was drunk at the time of the procedure, the senior medical official replied, "There is no such doctor in the district. And the doctor in this case does not drink at all."

Surgical needles left in the body of the patient can cause chronic pain, irritation, and even organ injury.

Putin says Russia will accomplish 'all goals set' in Ukraine

MOSCOW. Sep 30 (Agencies): Russian President Vladimir Putin on Monday vowed that Moscow would accomplish all goals it has set for itself in Ukraine, in its third year of conflict.

"The truth is on our side. All goals set will be achieved," Putin said in a video message released to mark the second anniversary of what Russia calls "Reunification Day", when Moscow annexed four Ukrainian regions.

After it sent troops into Ukraine in February 2022, Russia annexed the regions of Lugansk, Donetsk, Zaporizhzhia and



Kherson. It does not fully control all territory in these regions.

In his address, Putin repeated his justification for sending troops into Ukraine as protecting Russian speakers against a "neo-Nazi dictatorship" that aimed to "cut them off forever from Russia, their historic homeland".

He also slammed "Western elites" who "turned Ukraine into their colony, a military base aimed at Russia" and who fanned "hate, radical nationalism... hostility to everything Russian".

"Today we are fighting for a secure, prosperous future for our children and grandchildren", he said.

Tiwari said efforts are under way to clear the obstructed highways to resume transportation.

Kathmandu's main river, the Bagmati, was flowing above danger levels after incessant rain lashed large swathes of eastern and central Nepal on Friday and Saturday, a report published by the International Centre for Integrated Mountain Development (ICIMOD) said.

"A low-pressure system in the Bay of Bengal and the more northerly than usual position of the monsoon trough was the reason" behind the exceptionally intense rain, it said.

Japan's next PM aims for snap election, stocks sink

TOKYA, Sep 30 (Agencies): Japan's incoming prime minister Shigeru Ishiba said on Monday he aimed to call snap elections for October 27, as equities plunged on a strong yen and fears that tax hikes are on the cards.

Ishiba, who was set to be formally appointed as premier on Tuesday after winning the leadership of the ruling party, supports the Bank of Japan's drive to hike interest rates and has said "there is room" to raise corporate levies.

The leadership contest for the Liberal Democratic Party (LDP), which has governed almost uninterrupted for decades, went down to the wire on Friday, with right-winger Sanae Takaichi tipped to win when markets closed.

With Takaichi a fan of former prime minister Shinzo Abe's unorthodox "Abenomics" economic policies of ultralow interest rates and tax cuts, the prospect of her winning sent stocks higher and the yen lower.

Takaichi, an arch nationalist, would also have been the first woman prime minister in a country where men still dominate politics and business.

Ishiba, 67, is a fierce critic of Abe and his lastgasp victory -- on his fifth attempt - sent the yen soaring to around 142 per dollar from around 146.50. Investors dumped stocks on Monday, with exporters among the worst hit.

The Nikkei index closed down 4.8 per cent, with Toyota tumbling 7.6 percent and real estate company Mitsui Fudosan off 8.7 percent.

Ishiba confirmed on Monday media reports that he aimed to call snap elections for October 27, saying it was "important for the new government to be judged by the people as soon as possible".

LDP elders are banking on Ishiba, a self-confessed defence "geek" fond of making model ships and planes, to boost the party's popu-



Its poll ratings fell sharply under outgoing premier Fumio Kishida, hit by a damaging party slush fund scandal and anger over rising prices.

Defence ties Ishiba vowed on Friday to restore confidence in the LDP after the scandal and to shore up defence ties among neighbours rattled by recent Chinese actions.

He is considering appointing as finance minister Katsunobu Kato, a former chief cabinet secretary who ran in the LDP leadership race, media reports said.

Gen Nakatani, a veteran former defence minister, will return to his old job while Takeshi Iwaya, another former defence

Taro Saito, senior economist at NLI Research Institute, told AFP that Ishiba has so far focused on how to improve public finances in Japan, which has one of the world's highest debt mountains.

military among Japan's shrinking population.

"He seems not so interested in policies to boost economic growth, although what is most important for Japan is low growth rather than fiscal health," Saito said.

Chief cabinet secretary Yoshimasa Hayashi, who is reportedly set to remain under Ishiba, declined to comment on Monday on the fall in stocks but said the government would "make judgements with calm heads".

"We will continue closely watching trends in financial markets at home and abroad with a sense of vigilance and, while cooperating closely with the Bank of Japan, we will do our best in management of the economy and finance," he said.

Hamas confirms death of its leader in Lebanon in Israeli airstrike

BEIRUT, Sep 30 (Agencies): Palestinian militant group Hamas said its leader in Lebanon was killed Monday in a strike on the country's south, as official media reported a strike on a Palestinian refugee camp.

"Fatah Sharif Abu al-Amine, the leader of Hamas... in Lebanon and member of the movement's leadership abroad" was killed in an air strike on his "home in the Al-Bass camp in south Lebanon", a Hamas statement said. It said he was killed with his wife, son and daughter in a "terrorist and criminal assassination".

The official National

News Agency reported an air strike on Al-Bass near the city of Tyre, saying it was the "first time" the camp had been targeted.

The statement came hours after the Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine (PFLP), a secular left-wing group, said three of its members were killed in a strike on Beirut's Kola district early Monday.

Israel has repeatedly targeted Hamas officials in Lebanon since the Gaza war erupted almost a year ago.

A strike in January, which a US defence official said was carried out by Israel, killed Hamas deputy leader Saleh al-Aruri and six other militants in Hezbollah's south Beirut stronghold.

In August, an Israeli strike on a vehicle in the south Lebanon city of Sidon killed Hamas commander Samer al-Hajj.

Lebanon's official Palestinian refugee camps were created for Palestinians who were driven out or fled during the 1948 war at the time of Israel's creation.

By longstanding convention, the Lebanese army stays out of the camps and leaves the Palestinian factions to handle security.

Thai court orders extradition of Vietnam activist who rights groups say will be at risk if returned

BANGKOK, Sep 30 (Agencies): A Thai court on Monday ordered the extradition of a 32-year-old Vietnamese activist detained in Bangkok, despite fears among rights groups he could be at risk if sent home.

The Bangkok Criminal Court granted Vietnam's request for the extradition of Y Quynh Bdap, who was detained in the Thai capital in June.

The co-founder of the Montagnards Stand for Justice group was convicted in absentia in Vietnam in January of terrorism and sentenced to 10 years in prison on allegations that he was involved in organizing anti-government riots in Vietnam's central highland province of Dak Lak last June.

Bdap's attorney, Nadthasiri Bergman, said she was already working on an appeal, which has to be filed within the next 30 days. Regardless of the outcome, the Thai government could also decide diplomatically not to enforce the extradition order as well.

"The prime minister has the right, if they want to protect human rights, they can do it," she told reporters outside the court. "If he goes back to his country there will be a threat to his life, so the government should respect that evidence.

Bdap has been seeking asylum in Canada and had a meeting with Canadian Embassy officials in Bangkok the day before he was taken into custody. Canadian officials have refused to comment on the case.

Bdap was in Thailand at the time of the Dak Lak riots at two district government offices in which nine people were killed, including four police officers and two government officials. Overall, about 100 people have been

tried for alleged involvement in the riots, and 53 have been convicted on terrorism charges.

Days after the verdicts, Vietnamese Foreign Ministry spokesperson Pham Thu Hang rejected criticism that Vietnam had used the trial as an opportunity to crack down on ethnic minorities.

Vietnam has long been criticized by rights groups and others for its treatment of the country's Montagnard minority, a term loosely used to refer to many predominantly Christian ethnic groups that live in the central highlands and neighboring Cambodia.

Human Rights Watch has said many have been driven to seek asylum in Cambodia and Thailand as Vietnamese authorities have subjected their communities to intimidation, arbitrary arrests and mistreatment in custody.

"Y Quynh Bdap would be at real risk if returned to Vietnam," said Bryony Lau, deputy Asia director for Human Rights Watch, at the time the activist was apprehended.

"Thai authorities should immediately release this prominent religious freedom advocate and refugee. Returning him to Vietnam would be a violation of Thailand's obligations under Thai and international law," Lau said.

Human Rights Watch has criticized Thailand for sending home dissidents from Cambodia, Vietnam, Laos and China to uncertain fates, in what it said in a recent report was a quid-pro-quo form of transnational repression, in which those countries sent home dissidents wanted by Thailand.

Saudi Arabia voices "great concern" for Lebanon amid Israeli strikes

RIYADH, Sep 30 (Agencies): Saudi Arabia expressed its "great concern" at the conflict in Lebanon on Monday, calling for the country's "sovereignty and territorial integrity" to be respected.

A foreign ministry statement said: "the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia is following with great concern the developments taking place in the Republic of Lebanon."

As the country's health ministry said more than a hundred people had



been killed in Israel's strikes on targets across the country on Sunday, Riyadh stressed the need to respect Leba-

non's sovereignty. "The Kingdom calls on the international community to assume its

responsibilities towards

protecting regional peace and security to spare the region and its people the dangers and tragedies of wars,"

Israel has carried out several days of deadly strikes on targets in Lebanon, killing the leader of the Iran-backed Hezbollah group Hassan Nasrallah on Friday and other senior figures in the movement.

There have been growing calls internationally for restraint from Israel as it prepares for a possible ground offensive against Hezbollah in Lebanon, amid fears of all-out war in the Middle

UAE says residence of its ambassador in Sudan attacked by military aircraft



DUBAI, Sep 30 (Agencies): The United Arab Emirates said early on Monday the residence of its ambassador in Khartoum was attacked by a Sudanese military aircraft,

condemning it as a "heinous attack". The UAE's foreign ministry said in a statement that the attack on its ambassador's residence had caused extensive damage to the building. The Sudanese army has not immediately commented on the accusation.

The Sudanese army has repeatedly accused the UAE of providing weapons and support to the paramilitary Rapid Support Forces (RSF) in Sudan's 17-month-old war. The Gulf state denies the allegations. UN sanctions monitors have described as credible accusations that the UAE had provided military support to the RSF.

War erupted in April last year between the Sudanese army and the RSF over a transition to free elections.

The U.N. says nearly 25 million people half Sudan's population - need aid, famine is looming and some 8 million people have fled their homes.

"The Ministry stressed the importance of protecting diplomatic buildings and embassy staff residences, in accordance with the treaties and customs that regulate diplomatic relations," the UAE statement added.

SRINAGAR, Sep 30: With the stage set for 3rd and final phase of General Elections to Legislative Assembly, scheduled for October 01, the fate of 415 candidates will be determined by over 39.18 lakh

voters. The third phase of the Legislative Assembly Elections 2024 will cover 40 Assembly Constituencies (ACs) across seven districts of Jammu & Kashmir. These include Kupwara, Baramulla and Bandipora in the Kashmir Division while as Jammu Udhampur, Kathua and Samba in the Jammu Divi-

Baramulla Assembly Segment of North Kashmir leads with the highest 25 candidates in poll fray, while as Akhnoor assembly constituency of Jammu district will witness contest among three candidates only during this phase.

In Kashmir Division, 16 Assembly Constituencies comprising Karnah, Trehgam, Kupwara, Lolab, Handwara, Langate, Sopore, Rafiabad, Uri, Baramulla, Gulmarg, Wagoora-Kreeri, Pattan Sonawari, Bandipora and Gurez (ST), and in Jammu Division 24 Assembly Constituencies comprising Udhampur West, Udhampur East, Chenani, Ramnagar (SC), Bani, Billawar, Basohli, Jasrota, Kathua (SC), Hiranagar, Ramgarh (SC), Samba, Vijaypur, Bishnah (SC), Suchetgarh (SC), R.S.Pura-Jammu South, Bahu, Jammu East, Nagrota, Jammu West, Jammu North, Marh (SC), Akhnoor (SC) and Chhamb will go to the polls in this phase.

According to the latest electoral rolls, 39,18,220 voters are eligible to cast their ballots in this phase, comprising 20,09,033 male voters, 19,09,130 female voters and 57 third-

gender voters. Underlining the significance of the role to be played by youth of Jammu and Kashmir in strengthening the democracy, as many as 1.94 lakh youths voters aged 18 to 19 are eligible to vote in 3rd phase of Assembly Elec-

This phase will also see participation from 35,860 Persons with Disabilities (PwDs) and 32,953 voters above the age of 85.

To facilitate the voters for smooth and hassle free electoral participation, Election Commission of India (ECI) has established 5,060 polling stations with casting across 40 Assembly Constituencies. These include 974 Urban Polling Stations and 4,086 Rural Polling Stations.

To enhance voter participation, 240 special polling

stations have been established across 7 districts in this phase, including 50 polling stations managed by women, known as Pink polling stations, 43 polling stations manned by specially abled persons and 40 polling stations manned by youth. Also, there will be 45 green polling sta-tions in order to spread message about environmental concern, 29 polling stations are established near the LOC/ IB for resi-

dents residing there and 33 Unique Polling stations. A total of 24 special Polling Stations have been established for Migrant Voters of Kashmir Division, which includes 19 Special Polling Stations in Jammu, 4 in Delhi and 1 in Udhampur District. Special Polling Stationwise extract voter list will be with BLOs.

A team of four officials, including Presiding Officer will be stationed in every polling station. In total, more than 20.000 Polling staff will be deployed on duty for 3rd phase of assembly election.

"In some instances, the cybercriminals intimidated the victims into transferring funds to them through international gift cards or crypto currency. Extensive wrongful losses were incurred by the victims targeted by this criminal network," the statement said. So far, the CBI has arrested 10 cyber-

criminals from Pune, five from Hyderabad and 11 from Visakhapatnam. Further investigation and questioning into the role of other workers at these illegal call centers is ongoing, it said.

"These operations have resulted seizure of critical digital evidence and incriminating material. 951 items have been seized including electronic devices, mobile phones, laptops, financial information, communication records and incriminating material used by this cyber crime network for criminal activity and to defraud victims," the spokesperson said.

This operation has resulted in significant disruption and dismantling of a major trans national technology enabled crime

"The National Conference-Congress government will be formed; this is the atmosphere there... After the Bharat Jodo Yatra, support has been witnessed for Congress. Our only demand is the restoration of full statehood to Jammu and Kashmir. We will fight for it," he said.

"Let us see what happens... PDP is a part of the INDIA alliance but our alliance for elections is only with the National Conference. Let's see what will happen postpolls," he further added.

In response to the recent remark made by Union Minister Amit Shah against Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge's statement on Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Ramesh advised the Union Home Minister to concentrate on his responsibilities, including the situation in Manipur.

"The Home Minister should focus on his

work and also Manipur," Ramesh said. He also called for the resignation of the

Walnut variety 'Parbat' approved for release

JAMMU, Sep 30: The Central Sub-Committee on Crop Standards, Notification, and Release of Varieties for Horticultural Crops has officially approved the release of the walnut variety 'Parbat,' developed by the Sher-e-Kashmir University of Agricultural Sciences and Technology of Jammu (SKUAST-J). This decision was made during the committee's 31st meeting, chaired by Prof. Sanjay Kumar Singh, Deputy Director General of Horticultural Science. The meeting took place over two sessions on July 19 and August 5, 2024, in New Delhi, where a range of horticultural crop varieties were evaluated.

The 'Parbat' walnut, spearheaded by Principal Breeder Dr. Parshant

Bakshi, was recognized for its adaptability to the unique agro-climatic conditions of Jammu and Kashmir. This walnut variety boasts several advantageous characteristics, including a nut weight of 19.18 grams and a kernel percentage of 53.28%. With a nut yield of 90 kg per tree and a protein content of 22%, the 'Parbat' walnut offers significant potential for enhancing agricultural productivity in the region. Located at an elevation of 1,968 meters in GowPadder, the 'Parbat' walnut trees are particularly well-suited to the harsh winter climate, which includes heavy snowfall from October to March. The variety's late leafing and maturity make it resilient to the impacts

nuts within the hull before dehiscence helps prevent quality degradation during the rainy season, a common challenge for farmers in the area.

The successful release of the 'Parbat' walnut underscores SKUAST-J's dedication to developing superior horticultural varieties tailored to local conditions. Looking ahead, two more walnut and pecan varieties from Poonch and Bhaderwah are currently under review and are expected to be recommended for release in the upcoming meeting of the State Seed Sub-Committee. This advancement is anticipated to significantly boost walnut production in Jammu and Kashmir, providing local farmers with greater resilience against climate variability and enhancing their liveli-

It took 24 years for the National Cricket Academy (NCA) to find a dwelling that suits its stature and growth, but the wait was worth it as the facility finally took a new avatar as the BCCI Centre of Excellence,...

BENGALURU, Sep 30 (Agencies): It took 24 years for the National Cricket Academy (NCA) to find a dwelling that suits its stature and growth, but the wait was worth it as the facility finally took a new avatar as the BCCI Centre of Excellence, a hub of ultra-modern features including three different kind of pitches.

The Centre of Excellence, now operating closer to the international airport here, was inaugurated by BCCI secretary Jay Shah, and the most striking features were three international-quality grounds and 86 decks — prepared specifically to make players feel at home in any condition at home or abroad.

Ground A, the main ground, boasts an 85-yard boundary with 13 meticulously maintained Mumbai red-soil pitches that will offer a good amount of bounce.

It may be recalled that such a pitch was used in the first Test against Bangladesh in Chennai. It might come in handy when India travel to Australia, a home



to bouncy tracks, in November for the Border-Gavaskar Trophy. Another unique feature of this

ground is the herringbone drainage system that allows quick evaporation of water in case of

"Its innovative subsurface drainage system ensures quick recovery after rainfall, minimising disruptions and maintaining a consistent playing schedule," said the project manager.

The ground is also equipped with floodlighting and state-ofthe-art broadcasting facilities,

if ever the venue is required to

host a high-profile match. Ground B and C serve as dedicated practice grounds with 75-vard boundaries, featuring 11 Mandya soil pitches and nine Black Cotton soil pitches from Kalahandi, Odisha

"It is just about getting exposure to different kind of conditions. So that when they graduate to the national team, they are ready," said VVS Laxman, head of the Centre of Excellence

"I think the pitches here will

allow them to improve their adaptability.

And the three beautiful grounds will allow them to face any situation with a lot of confidence," he added

Apart from the three grounds, the comprehensive practice resources in the centre, sprawling over 40 acres, offer an impressive 45 outdoor net pitches for practice divided into nine clusters, separated by safety nets sourced from England.

The outdoor facility will also receive a dedicated fielding practice area and six outdoor running tracks with natural grass and synthetic surfaces.

The indoor practice facility is as impressive as the outdoor one. It gets eight pitches with premium English and Australian

The Sports Science & Medicine Block is equipped with best-in-class equipment such as four athletics tracks, a physiotherapy rehabilitation gym, a sports science and medicine lab and recovery area.

ISSF Junior World Championship: Shooters win twin team gold



NEW DELHI, Sep 30 (Agencies): India's shooters began their ISSF Junior World Championship campaign in Peru on a good note, winning team gold in the men's and women's 10m air pistol events, though a potential top podium finish was lost in the individual category after a marksman was docked two points for reporting late for the final.

The junior men's trio of Umesh Choudhary, Pradhyumn Singh and Mukesh Nelavalli topped the men's team competition in the 10m air pistol with a tally of

1726 points. They finished 10 points ahead of second-placed Romania, while Italy took bronze with 1707.

The combination of Kanishka Dagar, Lakshita and Anjali Chaudhary tallied 1708 to clinch the women's 10m air pistol team gold. They pipped Azerbaijan by a point and bronzewinning Ukraine by four points.

Dagar also made the individual final in third place with a score of 573. Kanak also shot the same score but with lesser inner 10s, bagging the fifth qualifying spot. In the final, Kanak

won bronze with a score of 217.6, while Dagar finished eighth. Chinese Taipei's Chen Yu-Chun won gold, while Slovakia's Manja Slak bagged the silver.

Docked two points

Choudhary though missed a potential individual gold after being penalised two points for reporting late for the final. Choudhary and Pradhyumn had made it to the individual finals placed third and fourth, respectively, in the qualification round. Choudhary and Pradhyumn finished sixth and eighth, respectively. Luca Joldea of Romania won the gold medal, while Chinese Taipei's Hsieh Hsiang-Chen clinched the silver. The 20-year-old Choudhary got 7.4 points in his first shot in the final after deduction of the two points.

3rd seed Jessica Pegula continues late-season charge

BEIJING, Sep 30 (Agencies): Thirdranked Jessica Pegula responded to losing a marathon first set by raising her game to a near-perfect level in her 6-7(9) 6-1 6-2 win over Veronika Kudermetova in the third round of the China Open.

Pegula has won 17 of her last 19 matches, including defending her title in Toronto and making finals at Cincinnati and the US Open, where her only defeats have come to Aryna Sabalenka, the top-seeded player in

The American made three service breaks in the first set, but also lost three of her own, with Kudermetova prevailing in a lung-busting 20-point tiebreaker to take the lead.

The loss of the tiebreaker seemed to spur Pegula to life as she found her groundstroke range to break her Russian opponent's serve twice in each set to take the match in just over two-and-a-half hours. It



was Pegula's first win against the 39th-ranked Kudermetova in three attempts.

Pegula will play the 15th-seeded Paola Badosa in the fourth round after the Spaniard beat Serbian Rebecca Sramkova 7-5 7-5.

Frech, seeded 23rd. overcame a disastrous start to rally to a 0-6 6-3 6-4 win over 12th-seeded Diana Shnaider and next faces the 595thranked wildcard Zhang Shuai, who beat Greet Minnen of Belgium 6-2 6-3. The No. 6-ranked Coco Gauff beat Katie Boulter of Britain 7-5 6-2. In the men's draw, local favourite Bu Yunchaokete upset Paris Olympics bronze medallist

Lorenzo Musetti 6-2 6-4 for the 22-year-old's first victory against a top-20 player.

Seveth-seeded Karen Khacharov made 15 fewer winners and four more unforced errors than Argentine Francisco Cerundolo, but Poland's Magdalena found a way to win the big points in a 7-6(4) 7-6(9) victory to take him through to the quar-

terfinals. He next faces thirdranked Carlos Alcaraz, who beat Tallon Greikspoor 6-1 6-2. Alcaraz needs to make at least the semifinals this week to rise above Alexander Zverev to No. 2 in the rankings. Zverev is not playing in Beijing as he recovers from an illness.

T20 World Cup: VVS Laxman lauds India women's team's unmatched preparation

NEW DELHI, Sep 30 (Agencies): Former India batter and head of the BCCI Centre of Excellence, VVS Laxman, has praised the India women's cricket team for their rigorous preparation in the leadup to the Women's T20 World Cup. According to Laxman, the hard work put in by skipper Harmanpreet Kaur and her squad during a preparatory camp at the Centre of Excellence will prove crucial as they set their sights on T20 glory.

India will begin their World Cup campaign with a high-stakes match against New Zealand on October 4 in Dubai. Laxman, who has had a firsthand look at the team's preparation, expressed his admiration for their efforts during an exclusive media briefing.

"The kind of commitment, dedication, and intensity with which they practice and prepare is unmatched. I am very proud of the way they

prepare," said Laxman. The camp, overseen by women's team head coach Amol Muzumdar, took a multifaceted approach to ensure the

players were ready both mentally and physically. Laxman detailed the structure of the camp, noting that it was divided into two phases to cover all aspects of the game. "It was a productive camp," Laxman

explained. "Amol had planned in such a manner that in the first phase of the camp, he focused on the mental and physical aspects of the game. Then there was a break, and when they came back, they

focused on the skill and tactical aspect of the game.'

Beyond nets and standard training routines, the players were tested in five practice matches that presented varied challenges. "Amol created different situations and different kinds of challenges for the players. This handson experience will help them adapt quickly in high-pressure matches," Laxman added.

Laxman also took a broader view, commenting on the rapid growth of women's cricket in India in recent years. He attributed much of this rise to the success of the Women's Premier League (WPL), which he believes will be a transformative platform for the sport.

"I think there is so much upside for women's cricket. The WPL is a great initiative. Just like the IPL helped Indian uncapped players get fast-tracked into international cricket, I am sure the WPL will be a game-changer for women cricketers," said Laxman.

Laxman also highlighted the success of India's Under-19 women's team, which claimed the inaugural T20 World Cup title in South Africa in January 2023, as a positive sign for the future of Indian women's cricket. India defeated England by seven wickets in the final, securing the prestigious title.

"The U-19 girls didn't have exposure to T20 cricket at that time, yet they went on to win the inaugural World Cup-a phenomenal achievement," Laxman remarked. "This shows the mental strength and resilience of young cricketers, which will certainly help them progress in their careers."

As the India women's team gears up for the upcoming T20 World Cup, the work put in at the camp, combined with the growing momentum around women's cricket in India, could position them well to challenge for the title. With players like Harmanpreet Kaur leading from the front and a support system that has shown faith in their talent. India is looking to make a strong impression on the global stage.

Comparing Kohli and Babar baseless, the Indian star way ahead: Zaheer Abbas

SHARJAH, Sep 30 (Agencies): Pakistan great Zaheer Abbas feels the comparisons between Virat Kohli and Babar Azam are baseless as the Indian superstar is a lot more consistent than the under-fire Pakistan batter.

Once regarded as part of the 'Fab Five' including Kohli, Steve Smith, Joe Root, and Kane Williamson, Babar is currently enduring an extended slump in form.

"Yeh fizool ki baatein hai (the comparisons are pointless). Virat Kohli scores in every match the other player (Babar) doesn't score in any match so then how can you compare. The person who scores, he is the bigger player," Abbas told agency on the sidelines of the Cricket Predicta Conclave here.

Kohli has 80 international hundreds to his name while the much younger Babar has scored 31 centuries across formats.

Abbar also acknowledged the consistency displayed by India across formats and said the Rohit Sharma-led team will be a strong contender for the upcoming Champions Trophy.

"Indian team overall is very good. Their batters are doing well and the bowlers both are good. It is a very balanced team, one that plays soch samajh kar (thoughtfully)," said Abbas.

"They have a very good captain, who understands cricket very well. So, when everything is going in your favour it is smooth sailing. That's the case with India right now.

"There is a very good chance of them doing well (at the Champions Trophy) because they have a balanced team," the 77-year-old said.

> Hailed as the 'Asian Bradman' for insatiable appetite for runs, Abbas was one of the most elegant batters of his time. He played 78 Tests and 62 ODIs for Pakistan, accumulating 5062 and 2572 runs respectively.

Teams in T20s can win by fluke, not in Tests The 77-year-old strongly believes that Test cricket truly tests the players' character, resilience, mental strength, technique, and consistency.

"Test cricket is real cricket. That it is the real Test of any player, bowler. At one point India and Pakistan's Test team used to be good. And now the



boards are realising that we can't go on without Test cricket

"How many T20s can you play? How many white-ball tournaments can the ICC organise? Maybe 2 or 3 but in the end you have to return to ODI or Tests.

"If you continue Test cricket the cricket will last longer. I know people like to get results fast but slowly they will get bored of T20s and we need Tests and ODIs."

An increasing number of players are turning down central contracts from their boards to focus on careers in T20 franchise leagues, a worrying trend that Abbas believes should be addressed.

"Test cricket is ultimate. Anyone can win in T20. Teams can win by fluke. But that is not the case in Test cricket as it has two innings. You have the scope to do well in one innings. Test cricket teaches you a lot.

"I know a lot of the players don't want to play Test cricket and play T20 instead. That needs to be stopped. They need to come up with something...

"Something like you have to play at least 5 or 6 Test matches a year then you can play ODI or T20s. Every year a minimum number of Test matches need to be allotted," he added. Loss to Bangladesh

was a huge setback Once a cricketing powerhouse, Pakistan now find themselves in a difficult situation.

Their downward spiral began with the Asia Cup last year which was followed by the team's early elimination from the ODI World Cup in

2023 and the T20 World Cup this year.

Earlier this month they suffered their first-ever Test series loss to Banaladesh.

"Bohot bada dhakka tha (It was a huge setback) that Pakistan lost to Bangladesh. We never thought that not only Pakistan will lose but it will lose so bad.

"Pakistan cricket abhi daamadol hai (is not doing great). The performance has dropped. I am hopeful that it will get better. The reasons

behind this are many. "It happens, the West Indies used to be the best in the world, that's not the case now. But I'm hopeful that Pakistan cricket returns to the top, the boys are

working hard." Pacer Shaheen Afridi replaced Babar as skipper in T20Is after the 2023 ODI World Cup but the former was reappointed as the cap-

tain earlier this year. Abbas urged the PCB to take some action before the issue escalates further.

"Yes, there have been rivalries in the Pakistan teams in the past but the board should take note of the rivalry between Babar and Shaheen fast. The faster the better because it will keep on escalating.

"Rivalry is good, but it should not become serious, if it does, it harms the team," said Abbas.

Abbas, former Pakistan player Mudassar Nazar and former Pakistan coach Dav Whatmore spoke at the conclave to celebrate the the centenary episode of Cricket Predicta, the largest cricket live stats based show in Asia.
