"My condolences to his family," the post on X said.

They said one person died on the spot while the other two were seriously wounded and have been shifted to district hospital Anant-

J&K Assembly polls: New history scripted; people have understood futility of gun, power of vote: LG Sinha

SRINAGAR, Oct 2 (Agencies): Expressing gratitude to the people of J&K, especially Kashmir for coming out in record numbers to exercise the franchise in the just concluded Assembly polls held after a decade, Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha Wednesday said people of Kashmir have understood the power of vote and futility of gun.

Speaking to a gather-



ing at Raj Bhawan on the occasion of Gandhi Jayanti, the birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi (father of nation), the LG, said that historic voter turnout was witnessed in the Assembly polls as they were held peacefully across the UT.

"The candidates of political parties were engaged in political rallies and road shows till midnight. Great enthusiasm was seen among candidates as well as voters," the LG said.

He said that 1.40 Crore people showed their

Sonam Wangchuk detained again after release, indefinite fast continues



NEW DELHI, Oct 2 (Agencies): Climate activist Sonam Wangchuk and 150 other protestors from Ladakh who are under detention

on Wednesday continued their indefinite fast, saving they find their rights "trampled upon" on Gandhi Jayanti, a day that symbolizes peace Wangchuk was leading

'Delhi Chalo Padyatra', which began from Leh a month ago. They were detained on Monday

In a statement issued on Wednesday morning, Jigmat Paljor, Coordinator Apex Body, said their detention, which is continuing for over 24 hours, is illegal.

"We, the 'padyatris', find ourselves in an alarming situation. We have been detained

for over 24 hours. This detention is illegal, as the 24-hour period has elapsed, and we must be produced before a magistrate," Paljor said.

"Some groups have been released after just under 24 hours, only to be returned to the police station. Last night, the police attempted to forcibly relocate us to an unknown location, but we stood our ground in resistance," he added.

Poll body revises voter turnout to over 69% in Third Phase of **J&K Assembly Election**

JAMMU, Oct 2 (Agencies): Over 69 per cent voter turnout has been recorded in the third phase of assembly election in Jammu and Kashmir, the poll body said on Wednesday.

In a statement, the approximate voter turnout of 69.65% has been recorded in 40 constituencies in the third phase.

"The same shall continue to be updated by the field level officers



as the remaining polling parties keep returning and updated figures will be available AC and district wise live at Voter T urnout App," the statement reads.

According to figures, Bandipora recored 67.68 percent turnout, Baramulla recorded 61.03 percent, Jammu 71.40 percent, Kathua 73.34 percent, Kupwara 66.79 percent, Samba 75.88 and Udhampur recorded 76.09 percent turnout.

The poll body said that this is an approximate trend, as data from some







political party. "Despite the MCC being in place, JU is rushing to fill long-vacant positions such as Registrar, Controller of Examinations, Director of Internal Quality Assurance (DIQA), and Director of IT, with interviews scheduled for October 4-5." Dr. Sharma stated.

The core of the controversy revolves around what Dr. Sharma described as the illegitimacy of some candidates shortlisted for these positions. "There are candidates with questionable qualifications, including those with fraudulent PhD degrees, as highlighted in the Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) report. This process seems engineered to favor individuals tied to a political faction," he alleged.

Further intensifying his remarks, Dr. Vikas pointed out that while the J&K Government has halted contractual appointments of lecturers due to the MCC, JU is proceeding to fill permanent administrative posts that have been vacant for over 15 to 20 years. "JU's justification that the post notifications were issued prior to the election announcement is a blatant lie. Just recently, JU issued a selection list for contractual teachers," he asserted.

Dr. Sharma demanded the Election Commission immediately intervene and halt the recruitment process, calling for the cancellation of the interview notifications. He warned of escalating protests if the issue is not addressed.

Additionally, Dr. Sharma highlighted a violation of university norms, stating that certain candidates are directly involved in the recruitment process, which he emphasized is against the established rules. "Those who are candidates for the top posts are directly involved in the recruitment process which is a mockery of the system but the Vice Chancellor is a mute spectator as if he is willingly a party to this wrong-doing," he stated.

He also highlighted an instance from the past wherein a person without having any academic credentials was directly appointed as Professor just because he had high level connections.

In his closing remarks, Dr. Sharma urged the public and authorities to take a stand against this alleged breach of democratic principles, vowing that protests would continue until justice is served.


Gau Dhwaj Sthapana Bharat Yatra: Shankaracharya Avimukteshwaranand to arrive in Jammu on Oct 22

JK Polls- should not be"much ado about nothing"

he adage "much ado about nothing" seems to perhaps fit the assembly election scenario of 2024. No doubt the people of the troubled J&K are very enthusiastic about the elections which are taking place after a long pause of 10 years and also being the first election after the centers overriding and significant decision of the abrogation of article 370, article 35 A coupled with the reorganization of the erstwhile state of J&K and its bifurcation into two UT's of Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh in August 2019. The people of the UT are taking active part in the assembly elections as is evident from the overwhelming and significant voter turnout in the very first phase of polls held on 18 September in which there was aggregate voter turnout of 61% and this record voter turnout has even surpassed the voter turnout of the Lok Sabha polls which were concluded not much before .So far so good and encouraging but the way political parties and politicians have taken this crucial and historical election, forces one to opine that there are enough indications that at the end of the political churning of elections ,there is no possibility of a majority government of a single party and if everything goes well at the end of the day there may be a fractured and hung verdict at the most and this will give rise to some coalition government which experiment has failed at least two times in the erstwhile state of Jammu and Kashmir as after 2014 assembly elections ,the coalition government of PDP-BJP did fall

in the mid way and gave birth to governors rule which continued in one or other form for the long ten years and robbed the people of JK of a democratic and popular government .Similarly before this coalition experiment, the coalition arrangement entered between the NC and congress also did not last for the full term of 6 years and the coalition government fell midway. Thus it is the history of coalition that in J and K coalition experiment and arrangement has not been a viable and stable option. There are enough indications that after the assembly elections at the most there will be the chances of a coalition government which will not be stable and strong and in all probability will fall in the mid way .Besides ,it will not be a responsive and people friendly government and will hardly come up to the expectations of the people who stand robbed of the special status and statehood. The way there is mushroom growth of the regional political parties and the way a large number of independent candidates are in the fray for all the three phases of polls, it is enough to surmise that there are big chances of the division and subdivision of votes, with the result both NC's ,PDP's as well as the national party Congress's votes will be divided besides the Apni party of Altaf Bukhari, Peoples conference of Sajad Lone and the Engineer Rashid's Awami Itthad Party and the new political development of Jamat-i-Islami jumping in the poll fray but both of these parties are not recognized by the election commission of India and thus are fielding their candidates as independents in big number gives

credence to the fact that in these polls ,the votes will get divided ,with the result no single party will be in a position to get majority and form a government on its own .Thus coalition government is the foregone conclusion and hundred percent possibility .Realizing this ,NC and Congress has entered into a pre-poll alliance and other parties are also in favor of doing post poll alliance if the situation demands. .People of Jammu and Kashmir should vote consciously ,carefully and decisively so that at the end of the voting a stable coalition government is formed which will care for the people and work sincerely for addressing the problems confronting the people .But in any case even if there is a coalition government, it is definitely better than a governors rule or LG dispensation .The people should vote cautiously ,carefully and consciously so that there will be no chances of again putting the J&K on LG rule which will be a dangerous situation and the sagacious and matured voters should ward against this unfortunate and sad possibility as this will be akin to robbing the people of their democratic rights. Thus a great responsibility lies on the shoulders of the voters of Jammu and Kashmir and they should not allow the division and subdivision of votes rather the sagacious voters should vote decisively so that at the end of the electoral exercise there will be a viable ,stable and responsive coalition arrangement which will balm the wounds and hurt psychic of the alienated and isolated people of the UT and will also address the issues of the people so that they

will feel a bit relieved .So the onus of great responsibility rests on the beleaguered and gullible people of Jammu and Kashmir and as such they should vote in such a manner as to not result in the unwanted dispersal and division of votes and at the end of the election exercise ,a stable coalition government will be formed which will care for the people and work in their interest .The sagacious and mature voters should show their maturity and sagaciously vote so that the Jammu and Kashmir will not again fall in the trap and ditch of governors rule or LG dispensation. .There are forces at work which are working to see that the UT again is under the LG dispensation and centre rule which will be against the wishes and aspirations of the people .The political parties, politicians and the voters at large should guard against this possibility happening and thus save the gullible people of J &K again falling in the ditch of LG administration. The political scenario as it is obtaining and emerging in Jammu and Kashmir and the indications coming from the political see saw is enough to surmise that the current Jammu and Kashmir polls point to the old adage" much ado about nothing" and this possibility should not be allowed to happen and spoil the whole elections which people of J&K are enthusiastically participating.

Excessive use of flour and sugar during festivals There is a lot of use of flour and sugar during festivals,

which is quite harmful for our body. There is silver work on the sweets, which is actually made of aluminium. This is not good for healthls. Apart from this, to make sweets beautiful, artificial colors and chemical preservatives are added to them, which can damage the kidneys and liver. Nowadays, there is a trend of giving dry fruits or nuts to friends or relatives instead of sweets, which is a good option. Food items are made in poisonous oil, there is a risk of heart attack During festivals, sweets or snacks made in shops are repeatedly fried in burnt oil. Oil gets converted into poisonous chemicals due to repeated burning. Using cooking oil more than three timesWhen ingested it becomes carcinogenic. A carcinogen is an agent that causes cancer. Apart from cancer, blockage in heart veins, kidney and liver diseases can occur. Burnt oil increases low density lipoprotein i.e. bad cholesterol in the body. It increases heart attack and heart stroke. Eating burnt oil can cause throat irritation and acidity. There is a risk of obesity and diabetes. Women who eat too much sweets suffer from depression National Institutes of HealthIn a study, the effect of sugar was seen on 69 thousand women. Researchers found that women who consumed more sugar had a higher risk of depression. Whereas women who took less sugar did not fall prey to depression. These methods will maintain your health during the festival Overeating: How to control it Drink plenty of water every now and then throughout the day. Maintain

moisture in the body. If you go somewhere to eat, first sit down and eat at one place only. Set a time to eat. putting something in the mouth every once in a whileDon't stay. Do not open food packets received as gifts during festivals and sit together. Eat only a little. Take only any three food items in your plate. Finally, have some freshly prepared sweet or dessert. Alcohol: stay away or drink fruit juice Any kind of alcohol can cause harm. It is better to stay away from it. If you want to have a drink, have it only after eating food. Be sure to drink a glass of water between two drinks. Instead of alcohol, have fruit juice or coconut water. If your health is unstable then do this the next dayWork Adopt normal routine. Neither eat fast nor less nor exercise too much. Start the day with a glass of water. If you have a headache, eat banana. If you have acidity or flatulence, you can also eat Gulkand. Stay away from market sweets, take fiber in your diet According to doctors, during the festive season we get to eat only puri-kachori, pakodas, snacks, samosas etc. Stay away from them once you eat them. Make sure to use curd in your food. Wherever you go, minimize the amount of carbohydrates in food. Take it. Apart from this, take special care of the following things- 1. You can take khichdi or porridge, butNeither pulses nor pulses are to be eaten. 4-Eat salad of vegetables and fruits. If you do not like raw vegetables or fruits, then make juice, soup or smoothie and drink it. 5-Do not take dairy products like milk, cheese. Take ginger and turmeric water. 

Coldplay hints at retirement amid black marketing of concert tickets in India



Coldplay announces retirement amid black marketing of concert tickets in India; cites 'Less is More' philosophy

The highly-anticipated Coldplay concert in Mumbai in January 2025 has been marred by concerns about black marketing ticketing scams, as millions of fans struggle for tickets.

The band has three shows at the DY Patil Stadium in Navi Mumbai on January 18, 19 and 21 next year as part of its "Music of the Spheres World Tour 2025".

Chris Martin, lead singer of Coldplay said the British band plans to release 12 "proper albums" out of which it has already put out 10, including the upcoming "Moon Music".

The five-member group, also comprising guitarist Jonny

Buckland, bassist Guy Berryman, drummer and percussionist Will Champion, and manager Phil Harvey, is currently on its "Music of the Spheres World

In an interview with Apple Music's Zane Lowe, Martin said it's important to set a "limit" to what Coldplay needs to do as a group.

"We are only going to do 12 proper albums, and that's real... because less is more. And for some of our critics, even less would be even more. It's really important that we have that limit.

"There's only 12 and a half Beatles albums. There's about the same Bob Marley, so all of our heroes. And also having that limit means that the quality control is so high right now, and for a song to make it, it's almost impossible, which is great," the 47-year-old said.

His comments hark back to a 2021 interview Martin gave to BBC Radio 2 in which he said that Coldplay will stop recording new music in 2025, adding the band will only tour then and maybe "do some collaborative things".

Coldplay, known for songs such as "Yellow", "The Scientist", "Clocks", "Fix You", "Paradise", "A Sky Full Of Stars" and "Magic", was formed in London back in 1997.

In the new interview, Martin said the members are trying to improve day-by-day instead of "coasting" at this stage of the band's career.

"That will always continue in some way, but there's something about the Coldplay thing. I don't know where the songs come from. I don't know where the ideas come from, but that's just been coming to me for about four or five years now.

"Like, 'You have to finish like this,' and I trust that just like I trust the songs. So if we do something together after that creatively beyond touring, then it'll be something different, or it'll be a side thing, or it'll be a compilation of things we hadn't finished," he added.

Another reason why the singer wants to retire from making albums is because he wants to give "the others some of their life for themselves".

"I don't want to be, when we're 60, be like, 'Will, we need you. Come on! We can do better than

According to Martin, the quintet is having more fun now "than ever"

"Because of getting older, because of Covid, because of everything going on in the world, because of how lucky we know we are, because of the places we get to go, because of the optimism that it gives us to see all different kinds of people gathering together, because of songs that arrive from nowhere, because we go at a slower pace. All these things mean that we love it," he said.

Coldplay's "Music of the Spheres World Tour" -- which began in 2022 in San Jose, Costa Rica -- will also come to India to perform three shows in Mumbai in January. The tour will conclude on September 8, 2025, with a show in London.

"Mahatma Gandhi's vision for tribal development is our asset, he (Mahatma Gandhi) believed that India can develop only when tribal communities will develop. BJP government accords top priority to tribal development and Rs 80,000 crore will be spent on Dharti Aaba Janjatiya Gram Utkarsh Abhiyan to develop 65,000 tribal villages," he said.

Rays of development are now reaching remote tribal villages, he said.

"I had come to Jamshedpur from where I had launched several schemes. Beneficiaries got pucca homes," he said.

The rally was organ-

ised in the Jadavpur area of Kolkata seeking justice for the trainee doctor who was raped and murdered on August 9. The incident sparked a wave of protests by healthcare professionals across India, demanding guidelines for their safety at workplaces.

According to sources, the organisers of the rally are also likely to be summoned by the Kolkata Police, sources

4 of family found dead inside Nagpur house, suicide note recovered

A purported suicide note found in the house pointed to the family being under stress due to the arrest of one of the sons in a fraud case,

When the police broke open the house door, the four family members were found hanging from ceiling hooks,

the official said. The deceased have been identified as

retired teacher Vijay Madhukar Pachori (68). his wife Mala (55) and their sons Ganesh (38) and Deepak (36), the police official said.

A purported suicide note recovered from the premises indicated the family was under immense stress due to Ganesh's arrest earlier this year in a fraud case registered at Pandhurna police station in Madhya Pradesh, he said.

The note had the signatures of the four family members, the official said.

The Narkhed police have registered a case of accidental death and are conducting further investigation into the matter, he added.

US condemns Iran's 'unacceptable' attack on Israel, pledges support

Iran fires nearly 200 missiles at Israel, world condemns

WASHINGTON, Oct 2 (Agencies): The Iranian missile attack on Israel appears to have been defeated and ineffective, US President Joe Biden said, hours after Tehran fired nearly 200 missiles at

The Israeli military reportedly said there were no news of injuries from the attack.

Speaking to reporters at the White House, Biden said, "At my direction, the United States military actively supported the defence of Israel. We are still assessing the impact but, based on what we know, the attack appears to have been defeated and ineffective and this is a testament to Israeli military capability... (It is) also a testament to intensive planning (between) the United States and Israel to anticipate and defend against a brazen attack." "Make no mistake, the United States is fully supportive of Israel. And I just spent the morning and part of the afternoon in the situation room, meeting with my whole national security team... The national security team, as I said, is in constant contact with Israeli officials and counterparts...," he added.

Biden directed the US military to aid Israel's defence against Iranian attacks and shoot down missiles targeting the country, the White House said.

While most of the missiles were destroyed before reaching their target, some did impact and cause minimal damage, the Pentagon press secretary Major General Patrick S Ryder said.

Two Arleigh Burke-class destroyers -- the USS Cole and USS Bulkeley -- deployed in the eastern Mediterranean fired a dozen interceptors at the incoming Iranian ballistic missiles as

Condemning the attack, Vice-President Kamala Harris said, "I condemn this attack unequivocally. I am clear-eyed -- Iran is a destabilising, dangerous force in the Middle East and today's attack on Israel only further demonstrates that fact." Iran is not only a threat to Israel but also to American personnel in the region, American interests, and innocent civilians across the region who suffer at the hands of Iran based and backed terrorist proxies, she added.

"We will never hesitate to take whatever action is necessary to defend US forces and interests against Iran and Iran-backed terrorists. And we will continue to work with our allies and partners to disrupt Iran's aggressive behaviour and hold them accountable," Harris said.

US Secretary of State Antony Blinken noted that this was Iran's second direct attack on Israel in five months.

"This is totally unacceptable and the entire world should condemn it," he said.

"Initial reports suggest that Israel, with the active support of the United States and other response.

Before and during the attack, US Defense Secretary Lloyd Austin spoke with his Israeli counterpart Yoav Gallant, said Ryder.

"He reaffirmed the United States' ironclad commitment to the defence of Israel and underscored that the US remains wellpostured throughout the Middle East region to protect US forces and defend Israel in the face of threats from Iran and Iranbacked terrorist organisations," he said.

Former president Donald Trump, on the other hand, blamed the Biden administration for the attack.

"The world is on fire and spiralling out of control. We have no leadership, no one running the country. We have a non-existent president in Joe Biden, and a completely absent Vice-President Kamala Harris, who is too busy fundraising in San Francisco... No one is in charge and it is not even clear who is more confused: Biden or Kamala. Neither has any idea what is even going on," he said in a statement.

"When I was president, Iran was in total check. They were starved for cash, fully contained, and desperate to make a deal. Kamala flooded them with American cash and, ever since, they have been exporting terror all over... Under 'President Trump,' we had no war in the Middle East, no war in Europe, and Harmony in Asia, no inflation, no Afghanistan catastrophe. Instead, we had peace. Now, war or the threat of war is raging everywhere and the two incompetents running this country are leading us to the brink of World War III. You would not trust Joe or Kamala to run a lemonade stand, let alone lead the free world," Trump said.

They declined to say whether anyone had been arrested.

Heavily armed officers, search dogs and forensic teams were inspecting the area which had been cordoned off.

Copenhagen's Jewish school, Carolineskolen, which is just down the street from the embas-

sy, was already due to remain closed on Thursday and Friday for the Jewish New Year holidays, Michael Rachlin, a spokesperson for Denmark's Jewish community told agency.

2 explosions rock the area around

There will also be extra security around the main synagogue in downtown Copenhagen, the Jewish community said in a statement. Community chairman Henrik Goldstein wrote that he "would like to encourage people to be aware when moving in public spaces."

"And be critical of what you hear on social media and rumors," he wrote, adding that "there is no reason to refrain from participating in Jewish

Police refused to give details about the intensity of the reported blasts or the damage they may have caused.

Denmark's Justice Minister Peter Hummelgaard told broadcaster TV2 that the incident was "inherently serious," adding it was too early to say anything about a motive.

On Tuesday night, the area around the Israeli Embassy in Stockholm was also closed off after a loud bang was reported. Police later announced that findings from the scene indicated that the embassy was hit by bullets. No one has been arrested, they said.

Swedish broadcaster TV4 said that a weapon and an empty shell casing had been found at or near the embassy. Sweden's domestic security agency told the news agency that it was not conducting a preliminary investigation linked to Tuesday's incident in Stockholm and referred to the ordinary police.

"Otherwise, we will end up locking ourselves into dialogues among the deaf, where participants seek to advance their own causes or agendas without listening to others and, above all, without listening to the voice of the Lord," he said in his homily.

The first phase of the synod process ended last year by concluding it was "urgent" to guarantee fuller participation by women in church governance positions, and calling for theological and pastoral research to continue about allowing women to be deacons.

Deacons perform many of the same functions as priests, such as presiding over baptisms, weddings and funerals, but they cannot celebrate Mass.

Advocates say allowing women to be deacons would help offset the Catholic priest shortage and address longstanding complaints that women have a second-class status in the church: barred from the priesthood yet respon-

sible for the lion's share of the work educating the young, caring for the sick and passing the faith onto next genera-

Opponents say ordaining women to the deaconate would signal the start of a slippery slope toward ordaining women to the priesthood. The Catholic Church reserves the priesthood for men, saying Christ chose only men as his 12 apostles.

Francis has repeatedly reaffirmed the allmale priesthood and as recently as this weekend sharply criticized "obtuse" agitators pressing for a female diaconate. After a contentious visit to Belgium where he was challenged by female students, Francis said such calls were an attempt to "make women masculine."

His arguments have outraged proponents of women's ordination, who have organized a series of events outside the synod this month in Rome to press their

"It's so insulting to keep on saying that the only valid role that will

get the approval of this pope is to be nurturing, is to be a mother, while you can be nurturing and mothering and be a priest," said Miriam Duignan, a trustee at the Wiingaards Institute for Catholic Research.

"He is putting a spiritual stamp of approval on sexism," she said at a prayer event this week co-organized by the Women's Ordination Conference. "It is so irresponsible and dangerous for him to constantly criticize, belittle, dismiss and demonize women who are just saying 'Stop lying. Stop hiding and stop trying to relegate us to secondclass citizenship."

While ordained ministry for women is out of the question, a host of other proposals are being discussed, including calls for women to have greater positions of responsibility in seminaries and sit as judges on canonical courts that decide everything from marriage annulments to priest discipline cases.

There are 368 members of the synod, including 272 bishops and 96 non-bishops. In all. 85 women are participating, including 54 with the right to vote.

In addition to delegates who were selected by their respective bishops conferences, Francis named a few members himself to participate, including two bishops from mainland China, many of his closest cardinal advisers and the exiled Nicaraguan Bishop Rolando Jose Alvarez.

Also on the list of pontifically nominated members is the retired prefect of the Vatican's doctrine office, Cardinal Gerhard Mueller. who has been critical of the synod process and Francis' pontificate as a whole.

In an essay this week on German Catholic site kath.net, Mueller took particular aim at the penitential liturgy that Francis celebrated Tuesday during which he begged forgiveness for a host of sins as a way to atone for the church's transgressions before the start of the meeting.

Mueller blasted what he called "newly invented sins" -- including sins against the synod itself and the sin "of using doctrine as stones to be hurled," a reference to how conservatives have criticized Francis' reform efforts as undermining traditional church doctrine.

Mueller said such a laundry list of invented sins "reads like a checklist of woke and gender ideology, somewhat laboriously disguised as Christianity."

Non-bishop members named by the pope include the Rev. James Martin, an American Jesuit who runs an LGBTQ+ outreach ministry. Martin has a sympathetic ear in both Francis, who approved same-sex blessings unilaterally after the first session of the synod ended, and the Rev. Timothy Radcliffe, who is one of the "spiritual assistants" for the svnod.

In an essay this week in the Vatican newspaper L'Osservatore Romano, Radcliffe argued strongly for even doubters in the church to recognize the good in LGBTQ+ Catholics and their relationships, and why the church ought to welcome them.

"The acceptance of gay people is seen in some parts of the church as evidence of Western decadence," he wrote. "But the church must fight for the lives and dignity of gay people, still liable to capital punishment in 10 countries and criminal prosecution in 70. They have the right to live," he

At the same time, those opposed to a pastoral approach to gays have gifts the Western church should appreciate, including a deep sense of the divine life in all of creation, he said.

"The Body of Christ needs all our gifts," he concluded.

Gambhir vs Dravid: Could India have pulled off Kanpur heist under former coach?

NEW DELHI, Oct 2 (Agencies): The Green Park Stadium in Kanpur has hosted two starkly different Test matches in recent times -- one in 2021 and the other in 2024. Both posed challenges for India, but the outcomes were worlds apart.

In November 2021, under Rahul Dravid's newly minted tenure as head coach, India came tantalisingly close to victory against New Zealand but were forced to settle for a hard-fought draw. The match saw New Zealand's last-wicket pair bat out close to 10 overs to deny India a win. In contrast, in October 2024, led by Gautam Gambhir in his first home Test series as head coach, India pulled off a remarkable victory against Bangladesh in a raincurtailed Test, becoming the first Indian side to win a Test match in which two full days of play were washed out.

Dravid's first Test as coach of the Indian cricket team in Kanpur was a closely contested affair. India, after scoring 345 in their first innings, bowled out New Zealand for 296, securing a 49-run lead. The team, however, found themselves in a tricky position at 51 for 5 in their second innings. It was Shreyas Iyer (65), Wriddhiman Saha (61), and Axar Patel (28) who managed to steady the ship, taking India to 234 for 7 before declaring late on Day 4. Critics questioned the timing of the declaration, as it left New Zealand with enough time to save the match.

On Day 5, despite India's best efforts, the Black Caps managed to bat through the day, with their last pair holding on for a memorable draw. Many pointed to the lack of urgency in India's batting and the late declaration as reasons for the missed opportunity.

THE MIRACLE IN KANPUR IN 2024

Fast forward to October 2024, the Test match against Bangladesh was meandering towards a damp draw. After wet weather wiped out nearly three days of play, India found themselves in a race against time to secure a victory over Bangladesh. The visiting team resumed their first innings only on Day 4—at 107 for 3—and were bowled out



for 233, giving India a narrow window to force a result.

What followed was a display of breathtaking aggression. India scored 285 runs in just 34.4 overs in a little over a session on Day 4—at an astonishing 8.22 runs per over, the fastest team innings (minimum 100 runs) in Test history. With captain Rohit Sharma showing the way, the team smashed records for the fastest 50, 100, 150, 200, and 250 in Test cricket. India declared with a 52-run lead and proceeded to bowl Bangladesh out for a second time on Day 5.

Coach Gambhir and captain Rohit Sharma were both elated when Rishabh Pant struck the winning runs, securing victory with a session to spare. India needed just six sessions to defeat a hapless Bangladesh side, which struggled to respond to India's aggressive onslaught. The dominant start to India's home Test season has given wings to the dreams of fans, who witnessed the highs and lows of the senior national team during Rahul Dravid's tenure as head coach.

NOT DRAWING CONCLUSIONS

By no means does the stark difference between the two Kanpur Tests reflect negatively on Dravid's legacy as the head coach in Tests.

Gambhir and Dravid stand at opposite ends of the spectrum when it comes to body language. Gambhir wore his heart on his sleeve, while Dravid approached the game with monk-like composure. Both men poured their hearts into serving the team's interests.

As a coach, Dravid rarely displayed his emotions. He was guarded during press interactions, never revealing more than what was already apparent. Even when selection debates or

controversies arose, Dravid, in his characteristic style, kept his cards close to his chest, leaving plenty of room for speculation. In contrast, Gautam Gambhir has been more candid in his

media conferences.

"The best style is the winning style," Gambhir stated before his first assignment as Test coach, and he has certainly walked the talk over the past two weeks.

KANPUR 2021 ONE-OFF FOR COACH DRAVID?

During Dravid's tenure, India played 24 Tests, winning 14 of them, with seven losses, including two at home. The team drew only three times during this period and reached the final of the World Test Championship in 2023, where they ultimately lost to Australia in the summit clash.

Was the Kanpur Test of 2021 merely a one-off for Rahul Dravid? It certainly appears that way.

In 2022, during a rain-affected Test match in Port of Spain, India adopted an aggressive batting strategy in the second innings, aiming for a favourable outcome. They scored 181 runs in just 24 overs, achieving an impressive rate of over seven runs per over. However, India was unable to secure a win as rain completely washed out the final day's play.

Dravid's first overseas tour as coach was disappointing, with South Africa sweeping the Test series 2-0, marking the end of India's glorious overseas run. However, India redeemed themselves in the 2023-24 tour, returning home with a hardfought 1-1 draw.

The Border-Gavaskar Trophy victory in 2023 was crucial, as India fended off a formidable challenge from Australia, winning the series 3-0. Under the guidance of Rohit and Dravid,

India was clinical in their performance.

Earlier this year, India played fearless cricket during a highly anticipated five-match Test series against England. The pressure was palpable, especially with the absence of their star player, Virat Kohli, as England arrived in the subcontinent brimming with confidence. The cricketing world was eager to see if the much-talked-about "Bazball" strategy could end India's impressive home run. However, it did not. Dravid and Rohit's measured approach effectively deflated the hype and exposed the flaws in England's all-out aggressive strategy.

WHEN DRAVID LED INDIA'S WHITE-BALL REVOLUTION

Despite the ups and downs, Rahul Dravid concluded his coaching tenure on a high note, playing a pivotal role in India's T20 World Cup triumph in June in the USA and the West Indies.

Dravid's role in India's whiteball redemption is undeniable. Among his most significant achievements were instilling role clarity for players and helping the team overcome the fear of failure.

Following the disappointment of the 2022 T20 World Cup, Dravid and Rohit emphasised these principles, allowing their players greater freedom. This strategy yielded positive results, as India nearly captured the home World Cup, dominating the tournament until the final against Australia. The team did not stray from their course after the heartbreak of November 19; their persistence paid off as India ended an 11-year-long wait for an ICC trophy under the management duo of Dravid and Rohit.

Dravid's steady hand guided India through a challenging phase in world cricket, and his influence will undoubtedly continue to shape the team in the years to come.

The combination of Gambhir and Rohit holds promise for a brighter future. The captain-coach duo will face their toughest challenge in Australia later this year. If India can continue displaying the intent they demonstrated in Kanpur, a hat-trick of Test series wins Down Under could very well become a reality in January.

Big injury setback for Mohammed Shami, report says pacer likely to be out for...



NEW DELHI, Oct 2 (Agencies): Indian cricket fans are eagerly waiting to see the highly-anticipated comeback of pacer Mohammed Shami, who has been out of action due to a knee injury. After giving a memorable performance in the ODI World Cup 2023, Shami underwent a surgery for his injury and has been recovering from it since then. It was expected that the star pacer will returning to the national duty for the Border-Gavaskar Trophy against Australia in November this year but a recent development has left all the fans worried.

As per a report by agency, Shami has now suffered a swollen knee, which will apparently take another six to eight weeks to heal.

This means that his participation in the five-match Test series against Australia will now be uncertain.

"Shami had resumed bowling, and he was looking on track to make a comeback to competitive cricket soon. But this knee injury has flared up recently. BCCI's medical team is assessing the injury, but it may require quite a bit of time," TOI quoted a BCCI source.

"It's a jolt for the NCA medical team. They have been working on him for over a year. They have one of the best workload management systems in place. The medical team is trying its best to put him back in the park soon."

Earlier in September, Shami had revealed that he is putting his best efforts to return to the field for Team India at the earliest.

"Koshish jaldi hi kar raha hoon kyun ke main janta hoon kaafi time ho gaya hai team se bahar rehte hue (I am working hard to make a comeback soon because I know I have been out of action for quite some time). However, I want to ensure there is no discomfort when I return. I've to work on my fitness, so that there is no discomfort," Shami had said.

"The stronger I return, the better it is for me. I don't want to rush and risk getting injured again, be it against Bangladesh, New Zealand or the Australia series. I've already started bowling, but I won't take any chances until I am 100% fit," he added.

Irani Cup: Sarfaraz Khan hits hundred after returning from India squad

LUCKNOW, Oct 2 (Agencies): Sarfaraz Khan has marked his return to the Mumbai squad in fine fashion in the Irani Cup as he scored his 15th first-class hundred on October 2, Wednesday against the Rest Of India side. Sarfaraz would reach his landmark in 150 balls to put Mumbai in a strong position heading into lunch on Day 2 of the match at the Ekana stadium in Lucknow.

The Mumbai batter was one of the members in India's squad for the 2-match Test series against Bangladesh recently and was released from the side ahead of the start of play in the Irani Cup. Sarfaraz didn't take part in any of the matches against Bangladesh as KL Rahul was ahead of him in the pecking order. Sarfaraz had come in on Day 1 with Mumbai at 4 for 139. He would then join hands with Ajinkya Rahane and the duo would steady things for the defending Ranji Trophy champions.

Rahane and Sarfaraz added 98 runs by the end of Day 1 to ensure Mumbai finished at 237 for 4. The duo would add 43 more runs on Day 2 before Rahane would agonisingly miss out



on a deserved hundred as he was dismissed by Yash Dayal for 97 runs.

Sarfaraz was then joined by Shams Mulani at the crease, but the latter wouldn't last long as he was cleaned up by Mukesh Kumar. This meant that Sarfaraz had to now take charge of things and started to score runs freely. He was joined by Tanush Kotian and the duo scored 58 runs to guide Mumbai to 338 for 6 by lunchtime in Lucknow.

Sarfaraz would hit his 100 in the 92nd over after he survived a close call in the previous one. The Mumbai batter would head into lunch unbeaten on 103 off 155 balls, with 14 boundaries to his name.

Babar Azam resigns as Pakistan captain from limited-overs cricket

KARACHI, Oct 2 (Agencies): Babar Azam has tendered his resignation for the second time as Pakistan's captain with Mohammad Rizwan likely to replace him in limited-overs formats later this month.

Babar released a statement on X around midnight on Wednesday announcing he had informed the Pakistan Cricket Board and team management about his desire to quit sometime last month.

While Babar did not state when he had informed the board and team management about his decision to quit, the 29-year-old said he wanted to focus on his batting while shedding off the workload as a skipper.

"I'm sharing some news with you today. I have decided to resign as captain of the Pakistan men's cricket team, effective as of my notification to the PCB and Team Management last month." Babar wrote.

"It's been an honour to lead this team, but it's time for me to step down and focus on my playing role," he added.

Babar had quit Pakistan captaincy after their dismal show in the ODI World Cup in India 2023 but was reinstated as the skipper in white-ball formats in March this year.

However, his second stint had no change in fortunes for the team and Babar as the leader, as Pakistan performed abysmally in the T20 World Cup in the Americas in June, losing to the US and India and failing to make it to Super Eight stage.

Babar said captaincy had been a "rewarding experience" but also added a "significant workload" for him.

"Captaincy has been a rewarding



experience, but it's added a significant workload. I want to prioritise my performance, enjoy my batting, and spend quality time with my family, which brings me joy," he said.

"By stepping down, I will gain clarity moving forward and focus more energy on my game and personal growth."

"I'm grateful for your unwavering support and belief in me. Your enthusiasm has meant the world to me. I'm proud of what we've achieved together and excited to continue contributing to the team as a player," he added.

Babar was first made the T20 captain in 2019, before taking charge of the Test and ODI teams in 2020.

Babar's resignation adds more to Pakistan's woes as they are set to embark on three away assignments after hosting England for a Test series starting on October 7.

Pakistan will tour Australia for three ODIs and three T20Is in November followed by a tour to Zimbabwe for as many matches later in the month.

Pakistan will then head to South Africa for three T20Is, three ODIs and two Tests in December after which the team will return home for a series against the West Indies and New Zealand. Pakistan are also slated to host the Champions Trophy early next year.

Tim Southee quits New Zealand captaincy ahead of India tour, Latham to take over

AUCKLAND, Oct 2 (Agencies): Tim Southee has stepped down from New Zealand captaincy ahead of the three-Test series against India and Tom Latham has been appointed in the veteran pacer's place.

Southee captained New Zealand in 14 Tests in which the Kiwis won six, lost six and drew two.

"I've always tried to put the team first throughout my career and I believe this decision is the best for the team," said Southee in a New Zealand Cricket statement.

"I believe the way I can best serve the team moving forward is focusing on my performances on the field and getting



back to my best, to continue taking wickets and helping New Zealand win Test matches."

The 35-year-old rightarm pacer has so far played 102 Tests alongside 161 ODIs and 126 T20Is. With 382 wickets, he is the second-highest wicket-taker for the Kiwis after legendary Richard Hadlee (431).
"I will, as I've always done, continue to sup-

done, continue to support my teammates, especially the exciting young bowlers making their way on the international stage.

"I wish Tom all the

"I wish Tom all the best in the role and he knows I'll be there to support him on his journey, as he has done for me over the years," said Southee. New Zealand head

coach Gary Stead said Southee took the decision in the best interests of the team.

"Tim's a fantastic player and a very good leader who is held in high regard by the players and support staff."

"He's been a great servant of New Zealand Cricket over nearly 17 years playing on the international stage, and I'd like to acknowledge his humility in stepping down from the role as Test captain.

"It's not easy giving up something you love, but Tim is a true team-man and he's made the decision with the team's best interests at heart. He's one of our greatest ever players and we still very much see him playing a part in our Test side moving forward."

Southee took over as New Zealand captain after Kane Williamson stepped down from the role in December 2022.

Currently on tour of the subcontinent, New Zealand have played a two-Test series in Sri Lanka while their one-off Test against Afghanistan in Noida was washed out.

New Zealand will take on India in a three-Test series with the first match in Bengaluru from October 16-20, second in Pune from October 24-28 and third in Mumbai from November 1-5.
