

### **CM Omar Abdullah chairs Supreme Court agrees to hear petition** first Cabinet meeting seeking statehood restoration to J&K

NEW DELHI. Oct 17 (Agencies): The Supreme Court on Thursday agreed to consider a petition, seeking a time-bound restoration of statehood to Jammu and Kashmir.

Senior advocate Gopal Sankaranarayanan file the application before three-judge bench headed by Chief Justice DY Chandrachud, requesting it be listed. Sankaranarayanan highlighted the need for a time-bound restoration of statehood in the Article 370 matter and

asked for an urgent

hearing. The chief justice agreed to consider the request. The application was

filed as a miscellaneous application in the case related to Article 370 of the Constitution, where the Supreme Court had

upheld the abrogation of Jammu and Kashmir's special status. Although the court did not directly rule on

the constitutionality of the Jammu and Kashmir Reorganization Act 2019, which changed the region's status to a Union Territory, it had directed that statehood be restored "as soon as possible," without specifying a timeline. Applicants Zahoor Ahmed Bhat, a college

teacher, and Khurshid Ahmad Malik, an activist. noted that despite the assurance of statehood restoration, the Union Government has taken no action in 11 months following the judgment.

### **Reducing J&K to UT 'Constitutional** Misdemeanour', Statehood must be restored: Kapil Sibal

NEW DELHI, Oct 17 (Agencies): Rajva Sabha MP Kapil Sibal on Thursday said it was a "constitutional misdemeanour" to have reduced Jammu and Kashmir to a Union Territory and asserted that it was time to restore its statehood.

His remarks come a day after National Conference leader Omar Abdullah took oath as the chief minister of Jammu and Kashmir, heading the first elected government in the union territory since 2019



when its special status was revoked.

As Jammu and Kashmir turned another page in its troubled history, the 54-year-old Abdul-

In a post on X, Sibal said, "It was a constitutional misdemeanour to have reduced the state of J&K to a Union Territory. It was wrong for the Supreme Court not to have decided that issue.'

"Time to restore statehood. This is the constitutional right of the people of J&K." the former Union minister asserted.

### Security detail of Farooq Abdullah and Ghulam Nabi Azad Set for Major Overhaul as NSG Withdraws from VIP Duties

SRINAGAR, Oct 17 (Agencies): In a significant shift, the Union Government has ordered the complete withdrawal of the National Security Guard (NSG) from VIP security duties, with nine high-profile individuals, including prominent political leaders from Jammu and Kashmir,

set to be transferred to the Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) for protection. Among the affected

SRINAGAR, Oct 17 (Agencies): The Jammu and Kashmir administration Thursday ordered an inquiry against the National Conference MLA from Sonwari, Hilal Akbar Lone, for not standing up for the national anthem during the oath taking ceremony yesterday, reports

said. Omar Abdullah was sworn in as the chief minister of Jammu and Kashmir on Wednesday. During the oath taking ceremony at the Shere-Kashmir International



Convention Centre (SKICC), a number of attendees did not stand up for the national anthem and Lone was one of them.

Clarifying the matter, Lone said that his medical condition forced him to remain seated. "When I went inside,

I spoke to media, following this the national anthem was played, and I stood up for some seconds, then was forced to sit because of my back ache," Lone told Greater Kashmir.

This is no act of crime, asserted the MLA. Supreme Court has a reservation too, that not standing during the national anthem is not a crime, said Lone.







# MSP FOR RABI CROPS

inimum Support Prices (MSP) play a pivotal role in India's agricultural landscape, particularly for Rabi crops those sown in winter and harvested in spring. By ensuring that farmers receive a guaranteed price for their produce, MSP acts as a safety net against market fluctuations and price volatility. This mechanism is essential for promoting the cultivation of various crops, including wheat, barley, mustard, peas, and chickpeas, which are vital not only for food security but also for the livelihoods of millions of farmers across the country.

The determination of MSP is guided by the Commission for Agricultural Costs and Prices (CACP), which evaluates several factors, including the cost of production, market demand and supply, and prevailing market trends. The government sets the MSP to encourage farmers to invest in better farming practices and higher-quality inputs. This assurance of a stable income allows farmers to cultivate Rabi crops with confidence, thereby contributing to national food security and supporting the rural economy.

For the 2023-24 agricultural year, the government has set MSPs for key Rabi crops at Rs 2,125 per quintal for wheat, Rs 1,735 for barley, Rs 5,450 for mustard, Rs 5,200 for chickpeas, and Rs 4,700 for peas. These prices reflect an increase from the previous year, illustrating the government's commitment to enhancing farmer incomes. By providing these price guarantees, the MSP framework not only aids individual farmers but also stabilizes the broader rural economy, encouraging spending in local markets.

Despite its advantages, the implementation of MSP is fraught with challenges. Many farmers, particularly in remote areas, lack awareness of MSP provisions, limiting their ability to benefit from this safety net. Additionally, market conditions can sometimes lead to prices falling below the MSP, putting farmers in a precarious position. Moreover, inadequate storage and procurement infrastructure can exacerbate post-harvest losses, further undermining the effectiveness of the MSP system. Regional disparities also pose a significant challenge. While some states have robust procurement mechanisms in place, others lag behind, leading to uneven access to MSP benefits. This inconsistency can create frustration and disillusionment among farmers, particularly those in less-developed areas. Critics argue that while MSP is a valuable tool, it can inadvertently lead to the overproduction of certain crops, overshadowing the importance of diversifying agricultural practices. In conclusion, Minimum Support Prices for Rabi crops are a critical component of India's agricultural policy, providing essential support to farmers and promoting food security. However, addressing ongoing challenges such as awareness, infrastructure, and regional disparities is crucial for maximizing the effectiveness of MSP. By continuing to evolve and strengthen the MSP framework, India can work towards a more resilient agricultural economy that benefits both farmers and the broader community.

# Northern India Face yet Another Year of Deteriorating air quality

ithout swift and sustained efforts, northern India would face yet another year of deteriorating air quality, leaving millions to grapple with bad air quality

The Supreme Court has taken a strong stance against the Commis-

ing a recurring crisis like stubble burning.

Moreover, the Commission has issued only 82 directives since its inception, a number that the court described as insufficient to deal with the scale of the problem. A significant concern raised by the Supreme Court is the lack of adequate staffing within the pollution control boards of Delhi-NCR and other affected states, including Uttar Pradesh. The court ordered that these vacant posts be filled by April 30, 2025, to improve monitoring and enforcement capabilities. Effective staffing is critical for implementing measures on the ground, particularly when dealing with farmers who rely on burning crop residue as a quick and costeffective way to clear their fields. Despite repeated interventions from both the National Green Tribunal (NGT) and the Supreme Court, stubble burning incidents continue to surge. Last year alone, more than 33,000 incidents of stubble burning were recorded in Punjab, even after explicit instructions to engage with farmers to explore alternatives. The lack of a coordinated effort between the state governments and the CAQM has only exacerbated the pollution crisis during the winter months. Turning Stubble into a Resource: While the focus remains on the failures of the CAQM and the continued challenges in states like Punjab, Uttar Pradesh has emerged as a notable example of how stubble can be managed more sustainably. The state has successfully implemented initiatives that transform stubble into an energy resource and natural fertiliser, benefiting both the environment and the agricultural community. The key to this transformation has been the establishment of Compressed Biogas (CBG) plants that convert crop residue into energy and high-quality compost. This

approach has not only addressed environmental concerns but has also created an additional income stream for farmers, who sell stubble as raw material for the CBG process. In this way, stubble has shifted from being a burden to becoming a valuable asset in Uttar Pradesh's rural economy. As of last vear. Uttar Pradesh led the country in CBG production, with ten operational plants. Currently, 24 CBG units are active, and another 93 are under construction. The state aims to have more than 100 CBG plants operational soon, a goal endorsed by Union Petroleum and Natural Gas Minister Hardeep Singh Puri. During a March 2024 announcement, he highlighted the state's plan to double its bio-coal and biodiesel production by 2025. The success of CBG production in Uttar Pradesh has been bolstered by the Uttar Pradesh State Bio-Energy Policy 2022, which offers various incentives for establishing bio-CNG and CBG units using agricultural waste. The policy aims to set up CBG plants in every district, providing local solutions for managing stubble while promoting energy selfsufficiency. A significant milestone in this journey was the inauguration of a CBG plant in Dhuriyapar, Gorakhpur, on March 8, 2023, by Union Petroleum Minister Hardeep Singh Puri and Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath. The plant, built for Rs 165 crore, processes 200 metric tonnes of straw, 20 metric tonnes of press mud, and 10 metric tonnes of cattle dung daily. It produces 20 metric tonnes of biogas and 125 metric tonnes of organic manure, contributing to higher agricultural yields while reducing dependency on chemical fertilisers. This initiative allows farmers to diversify their income sources and play a crucial role in the energy sector. By reducing the practice of stubble burning, the state is making strides in environmental protection. The Yogi Adityanath government has expressed confidence that the enhanced production of biocoal and biodiesel will help reduce air pollution in the region over the next five years.

The Supreme Court's critique of the CAQM underscores the urgency of finding a balanced approach to stubble burning that respects both environmental concerns and the practical challenges faced by farmers. Uttar Pradesh's model of converting stubble into a resource could serve as a blueprint for other states grappling with similar issues. However, the broader challenge remains: implementing such solutions at scale requires consistent policy support, adequate resources, and a willingness to engage with farmers directly. The court's directive for the CAQM to improve its approach and for state governments to fill vacant posts by 2025 is a step towards accountability. Yet, the real test will lie in translating these directives into action before another winter brings the familiar, suffocating haze back to the skies of Delhi-NCR. The question remains whether the CAQM, in partnership with state governments, can adapt and adopt innovative solutions like those seen in UP. Without swift and sustained efforts, the region risks facing another year of deteriorating air quality, leaving millions to grapple with the health consequences of inaction.

strong stance against the Commission for Air Quality Management (CAQM) for its failure to control stubble burning, a major contributor to air pollution in Delhi-NCR. The court's rebuke, delivered during a hearing on October 3, emphasised the need for effective ground-level interventions and questioned why the Commission had not implemented any provisions of the relevant Act to curb pollution from crop residue burning. Stubble burning, especially in the northern states of Punjab, Haryana and Uttar Pradesh, has been a major environmental challenge for years.

Farmers often resort to burning crop residue after harvesting paddy and wheat due to the increasing mechanisation of farming, the use of combined harvesters, a shortage of labour, and rising labour costs. This practice, prevalent in October and November following the paddy harvest, results in the release of large amounts of particulate matter into the atmosphere, contributing to the hazardous air quality in Delhi-NCR.

The Supreme Court's criticism of the CAQM reflects a broader frustration over the Commission's inability to effectively tackle this issue. Despite being set up three years ago to address pollution in the National Capital Region and surrounding areas, the CAQM has been criticised for its slow pace and lack of tangible outcomes. The court particularly highlighted that the Commission meets only once every three months, a frequency deemed inadequate for address-


# Ankur Rathee, who is seen in the series Reeta Sanyal, believes the universe works on the law of abundance

On screen in the Disney+ Hotstar series Reeta Sanyal, they might be competing for the same woman. But off screen, the bonhomie of Ankur Rathee and Manik Papneja is more than palpable. As Manik plays Watson to Adah Sharma's titular part of a Sherlock Holmes, a lawyer-detective, and Ankur steps into the shoes of a cop and provides romantic interest, they are not just gung-ho about the series but also about each other's talent.

A mutual admiration club? An amusing one too, as Ankur puts it, "As a rule, we take our jobs too seriously and get involved in outperforming each other. But Manik has this felicity to bring the fun part of being an actor to life." With many scenes together, there was no feeling of insecurity when they were on the sets. Rather, Ankur, seen in the popular series Undekhi in which Surya Sharma walked away with lion's share of praise for his portrayal of Rinku paaji, is not in the least bit envious of his co-actors

On the contrary, when he observes the career graph of his colleagues, be it Triptii Dimri's meteoric rise or others, he is heartened by the fact that if they can reach these heights it means, "Someone else's success is further proof that it's possible. Insecurity comes from the scarcity concept. The universe works on greater law of abundance. I would be worried if no one was succeeding."

"And it's only the nature of the beast that actors end up being its face and people confuse an actor with the character."

For those making the same mistake and believing his Daman in Undekhi has some sort of semblance with his real journey of a man coming back home from foreign lands, he quips, "Oh, that's a very broad stroke. In unison he and Manik chip in, "For, stylistically, it's like no other, wacky and fun, imagination fuelled fiction; it has all the masala of a Bollywood film packed in a series." Quite a team they are, even when they are batting for the woman in absentia, the lead Adah Sharma? In the series based on Amit Khan's eponymous character of book series, Adah's Reeta might be looking out for bad guys, but in real life she sure has good ones for company.




# Sanjay Dutt's powerful revelation: Reflecting on his struggle and triumph over years of drug addiction!

Sanjay Dutt, a renowned figure in Bollywood, has been candid about his battle with drug addiction. After struggling for nearly four decades, the actor has successfully moved past this difficult phase in his life.

In a recent interview with agency, the 65-year-old actor shared how his journey began. He started using drugs during his college years, "It was just the 'in' thing then. Somebody just said to try it, and that was it."

During this tumultuous period,



Dutt noticed the signs of drug puffiness and realized he was on a dangerous path. Understanding the severity of his situation, he knew he needed help and told his father, "I need help." After this moment of clarity, Dutt was admitted to Breach Candy Hospital for three weeks before heading to the U.S. for rehabilitation. He successfully overcame his addiction and described a significant moment upon his return to India: "No one knew I was coming back after two years. When I landed, my servant informed me that someone had come to see me. It was my drug peddler. He said, 'l've got some new stuff; you can keep it.' In that moment, I faced a choice: to either take it or send him away. I chose to send him away That day, I knew I had won the battle." # 'One Direction's' Liam Payne falls from hotel balcony, dies at 31

Former One Direction singer Liam Payne, 31, whose chart-topping British boy band generated a global following of swooning fans, was found dead Wednesday after falling from a hotel balcony in Buenos Aires, local officials said today.

Buenos Aires police said in a statement that Payne fell from the third floor of the Casa Sur Hotel in the trendy Palermo neighbourhood of Argentina's capital, resulting in "extremely serious injuries". Medics confirmed his death on the spot, the statement said.

Pablo Policicchio, the communications director for the Buenos Aires Security Ministry, said in a statement to The Associated Press that Payne "had jumped from the balcony of his room".

Police rushed to the hotel in response to an emergency call just after 5 pm local time, he said, warning of an "aggressive man who could be under the influence of drugs or alcohol.

The hotel manager can be heard on a 911 call obtained by the agency saying they had "a guest who is overwhelmed with

drugs and alcohol ... He's destroying the entire room and, well, we need you to send someone, please." The manager's voice became more anxious as the call went on, noting the room had a balcony.

Alberto Crescenti, head of the state emergency medical system, told Argentina's Todo Noticias TV channel that authorities were investigating the circumstances of his death and conducting an autopsy.

Payne had been vocal about struggling with alcoholism, posting a video in July 2023 to his YouTube channel where he said he had been sober for six months after receiving treatment.

Representatives for Payne did not immediately return emails and calls.

Dozens of One Direction fans flocked from across Buenos Aires to the Casa Sur Hotel after the news broke, forming lines that spilled into the cordoned-off street outside the hotel where police stood sentinel.

Forensic investigators were seen exiting the hotel, from where Payne's body was removed around three hours after the fall. Young women filming with their cell phones expressed shock and heartbreak as a makeshift memorial with rows of candles and bouquets quickly grew outside the hotel. "I didn't think he was going to die so young," 21-year-old Isabella Milesi told the agency

Payne was one of five members of One Direction, which formed when they each auditioned for the British singing competition series "The X Factor" in 2010, two years after Payne's first attempt to get on the show. At 16 the second time around, Payne sang Michael Buble's version of "Cry Me a River", appearing nervous at the start but warming up with the audience's cheers and applause.

After each singer failed to make it through the competition as solo acts, Simon Cowell and his fellow judges combined Payne, Zayn Malik, Harry Styles, Niall Horan and Louis Tomlinson into what would become one of the most successful boy bands even though they lost the competition.

Each member had their own persona, with Payne — who hailed from Wolverhampton, a city in the West Midlands region of England — being known as the responsible one.

The band became known for their pop sound and romantic hits like "What Makes You Beautiful", "Night Changes" and "Story of My Life".

Payne had prominent solos on songs including "Stole My Heart" and "Change Your Ticket", co-writing several of the band's hits. They had six Top 10 hits on the Billboard charts by the time they disbanded in 2016 and a highly loyal fan base, known as "Directioners", many of whom were teen girls. "I've always loved One Direction since I was little," said 18-year-old Juana Relh, another fan outside Payne's hotel. "To see that he died and that there will never be another reunion of the boys is unbelievable, it kills me." With his meteoric rise to fame, Payne had said that it took some time to adjust to the public eye.

"I don't think you can ever deal with that, it's all a bit crazy for us to see that people get in that sort of state of mind about us and what we do," he said in a 2013 interview with the AP after recounting an experience where a fan was in a state of shock upon meeting him.

After the group's dissolution, Payne like each of his erstwhile bandmates pursued a solo career, shifting toward EDM and hip-hop. His 2017 single "Strip That Down", featuring Quavo, reached the Billboard Top 10, and stayed on the charts for several months. He put out an album "LP1" in 2019, and his last release — a single called "Teardrops" — was released in March.

Payne had a 7-year-old son, Bear Grey Payne, with his former girlfriend, the musician Cheryl who was known as Cheryl Cole when she performed with Girls Aloud. She was an "X Factor" judge during One Direction's season, although their relationship began years later.

Payne was previously engaged to Maya Henry, from August 2020 to early 2022. Henry released a novel earlier this year that she said was based on their relationship. In addition to his son, he is survived by his parents, Geoff and Karen Payne, and his two older sisters, Ruth and Nicola.

# PM Modi highlights Pali recognition as tribute to Lord Buddha's heritage

NEW DELHI, Oct 17 (Agencies): Prime Minister Narendra Modi emphasised the significance of recognising Pali as a classical language during the International Abhidhamma Divas event on Thursday and said that this recognition honours India's rich cultural legacy, particularly that of Lord Buddha.

PM Modi criticised past governments for neglecting India's cultural heritage post-Independence, saying, "While every nation associates its heritage with its identity, India was left far behind."

He pointed out that both historical invaders and those with a "slave mindset" contributed to



erasing India's identity. "The world plagued by instabil-

ity and insecurity can find solutions in the teachings of Lord

Buddha," he said, adding that peace should be sought not through "yuddh" (war) but Buddha's teachings.

Highlighting the importance of Pali, Modi said, "It is everyone's responsibility to preserve the language, which is no longer in common usage." He also noted that the recognition of Pali and Marathi as classical languages reflects India's transformation towards self-respect and confidence.

During the event, PM Modi visited an exhibition showcasing the life and teachings of Lord Buddha, further underscoring the relevance of Buddha's philosophies in contemporary society.

### **Road accident in Mathura claims** lives of four, including two toddlers

The accident occurred near Nagaria Satbisa on the Kosi Shergarh road, within the Kosi Kalan police station limits. The deceased have been identified as Gauri Devi (35), her daughter Komal (2), Kunti Devi (28), and her daughter Priyanka (2). The injured victims,

(19), Kumari Mana (21), and Gagan (3), were initially rushed to the community health centre in Kosi Kalan. However, their condition worsened, necessitating their transfer to the district hospital for further treatment.



# 25 Lakh contract for Salman Khan hit, AK-47 from Pak: Chargesheet

MUMBAI, Oct 17 (Agencies): A contract of 25 lakh was taken out to kill actor Salman Khan near his farm-

Moosewala was killed. The accused had hired boys below 18 years of age to kill Salman Khan, all of whom are hiding in Pune, Raigad, Navi Mumbai, Thane and Gujarat. # 18 more die after 'consuming illicit liquor' in Bihar, toll reaches 24

Chief Minister Nitish Kumar instructed authorities concerned to take stringent action against those involved in the illegal trade

PATNA, Oct 17 (Agencies): Eighteen more people lost their lives after allegedly consuming illicit liquor in dry Bihar's Siwan and Saran districts, taking the toll in the tragedy to 24, officials said on Thursday.

Chief Minister Nitish Kumar instructed authorities concerned to take stringent action against those involved in the illegal trade and reminded people of ill effects of consuming spurious liquor.

The suspected hooch tragedy triggered a political blame game with opposition parties questioning the efficacy of the ban on sale and consumption of liquor, imposed by the Nitish Kumar government more than eight years ago.

"As many as twenty people in Maghar and Auriya panchayats in Siwan district have so far died for consuming suspected illicit liquor," Deputy Inspector General (DIG) of Police, Saran range, Nilesh Kumar told PTI.

Four people in Ibrahimpur area under the jurisdiction of Mashrakh police station in Saran district also died under "mysterious circumstances", he added.

Locals, however, claimed that the four lost their lives after "consuming illicit liquor". Both Siwan and Saran districts come under the jurisdiction of DIG, Saran range. According to local police officers, more than 25 people from both districts are battling for their lives at various hospitals in Siwan, Saran and Patna districts.

"At least seven people from Saran district have been referred to Patna Medical College and Hospital (PMCH) for better treat-



ment," the Saran district administration said in a statement issued on Thursday.

The bodies have been sent for post-mortem examinations and the exact cause of the incident can only be known after receiving the

autopsy reports, the DIG said. Villagers in Maghar and Auriya panchayats alleged that the victims fell ill after consuming spurious liquor on Tuesday night.

Officials have not disclosed the identity of the deceased and those under treatment. The administrations of both districts have suspended three chowkidars of Maghar, Auriya and Ibrahimpur areas following the incident, another senior officer said on Thursday.

Another senior police officer said show cause notices have been issued to at least five police personnel.

Earlier in the day, the CM inquired about the progress of the investigation into the suspected hooch deaths in

Siwan and Saran. According to a statement issued by the Chief Minister's Office, the CM directed the Bihar Director General of Police (DGP) to personally monitor the situation and ensure that "strict action is taken against those involved in the crime". He also directed Department of Prohibition and Excise Secretary Vinod Singh Gunjiyal and the Bihar Police ADG (Prohibition) to personally visit the areas where the incident took place and thoroughly investigate the matter. "The stringent action must be taken against the accused," the CMO directed the police. Commenting on the incident, RJD leader Tejashwi Yadav, in a post on X, wrote, "Several people have been killed due to spurious liquor

consumption...Dozens have

lost their eyesight. Liquor

trade has been banned in Bihar but due to the nexus among ruling party leaders, police and mafia, liquor is available everywhere in the state." He also said, "So many people died but the chief minister did not even express condolences. Every day people in the state are dying due to spurious liquor consumption and increasing crime. Despite the ban, liquor is available in the state. This is a failure of the Home Department and the chief minister. Who is responsible for these murders?" The Bihar government imposed a total ban on sale and consumption of alcohol on 5 April, 2016.

The government recently admitted that more than 150 people have died due to consumption of illicit liquor after prohibition was imposed in the state in 2016.

# Iran warns Israel of 'painful attack' in retaliation for missile attack

### *Fears of a wider Middle East conflict have grown as Israel plans its response to the October* 1 missile attack carried out by Iran after Israeli airstrikes on Iranian-allied militants.

DUBAI/BEIRUT, Oct 17 (Agencies): The commander of Iran's elite Revolutionary Guards warned Israel on Thursday against attacking the Islamic Republic in retaliation for a missile barrage as its arch-foe stepped up its offensive in Lebanon against Tehran-backed Hezbollah.

Fears of a wider Middle East conflict have grown as Israel plans its response to the October 1 missile attack carried out by Iran after Israeli airstrikes on Iranian-allied militants.

"We tell you (Israel) that if you commit any aggression against any point we will painfully attack the same point of yours," Hossein Salami said in a televised speech, adding that Iran could penetrate Israel's defences.

US Defence Secretary Lloyd Austin spoke to Israeli Defence Minister Yoav Gallant on Wednesday about Israel's operations in Lebanon and Gaza, aiming to avert a regional war. Iran's Foreign Minister Abbas Araqchi landed in Cairo for talks with Egyptian officials as part of a Middle Eastern tour as tension builds.

The European Union held its first summit with Gulf states and issued a statement calling for calm: "We underscore the importance of diplomatic engagement with Iran --- to pursue regional de-escalation," it said

Israel shows no signs of



easing its military campaigns against Hezbollah in Lebanon after assassinating several of its leaders, and Hamas in Gaza, and it has vowed to punish Iran for its October 1 attack.

Qatar, which has mediated in talks aimed at securing a ceasefire in Gaza, said there had been no engagement with any parties for the last three to four weeks on the issue.

Israeli airstrikes killed 11 Palestinians in Gaza City on Thursday, medics said, while Israeli forces sent tanks into Jabalia in the north, where Palestinians and United Nations officials expressed alarm over shortages of food and medicine.

Residents of Jabalia said Israeli forces blew up clusters of houses from the air, by tank shells and by placing bombs in buildings before blowing them up remotely.

On its northern front in Lebanon, Israel has said it will not stop fighting a now weakened port of the

Hezbollah before it can safely return its citizens to their homes near the Lebanese border and said any ceasefire negotiations will be held "under fire".

The Israeli military said on Thursday that over the past 24 hours it had killed 45 Hezbollah fighters in southern Lebanon, including a battalion commander, and seized many weapons. ATTACK ON MUNICIPAL HEADQUARTERS

The mayor of a major town in south Lebanon was among 16 people killed on Wednesday when an Israeli airstrike destroyed its municipal headquarters in the biggest attack on an official Lebanese state building since the Israeli air campaign began.

Lebanese officials denounced the incident, which also wounded more than 50 people in Nabatieh, a provincial capital, saying it was proof that Israel's campaign against the Hezbollah armed group was now shifting to target the Lebanese state. The Israelis "intentionally targeted a meeting of the municipal council to discuss the city's service and relief situation" to aid people displaced by the Israeli campaign, caretaker Prime Minister Najib Mikati said.

Israel and Hezbollah have been fighting since the militant group began firing missiles at its arch-foe a year ago in sup-

Palestinian Islamist group Hamas in Gaza and the conflict has sharply escalated in recent weeks.

Israeli operations in Lebanon have killed at least 2,350 people over the last year, according to the health ministry, and more than 1.2 million people have been displaced.

The death toll does not distinguish between civilians and combatants but includes hundreds of women and children. Around 50 Israelis, both sol-

diers and civilians, have been killed in the same period, according to Israel. Abdelnaser, a man displaced

from Beirut's southern suburbs. a Hezbollah stronghold, which Israel has repeatedly bombed, was on the waterfront early on Thursday morning.

"War has become normal for us. We know that every 10 years Lebanon gets built, and every 10 years it gets destroyed again," he said.

HO CHI MINH CITY, Oct 17 (Agencies): A Vietnamese property tycoon sentenced to death for fraud totalling \$27 billion arrived in court on Thursday to face a potential life sentence in a related trial on money laundering charges.

Property developer Truong My Lan was found guilty in April of swindling cash from the Saigon Commercial Bank (SCB) -- which prosecutors said she controlled -- in one of the biggest corruption cases in history, and sentenced to death.

Tens of thousands of people who had invested their savings in the bank lost money, shocking the communist nation and prompting rare protests from the victims.

On Thursday, Lan and 33 other defendants -- including her husband and niece -- were brought to court in Ho Chi Minh City in a convoy of police vans. Wearing a face mask,

Lan sat at the front of the court flanked by two police officers to await the verdict after a four-

week trial. Prosecutors have called for a life sentence for Lan on charges of money laundering, illegal cross-border trafficking of cash, and fraud.

Around 36,000 people who bought bonds issued by SCB have been identified as victims of the fraud. Online noodle seller Nguyen Thi Huong told agency she wanted to die after losing \$20,000, her entire savings, in 2022. "When I learned that I had lost all the money I had deposited at SCB Bank, I felt like I was losing my mind," said Huong, 33. She developed insomnia, her health deteriorated from stress and she

no longer had money to send her children to extra classes, making them fall behind their peers, she said.

"I sat by my father's grave, and wished he

would take me with him in death," Huong said. State media reported earlier that Lan and her associates stole around \$18 billion by taking assets from SCB between early 2018 and October 2022. Lan effectively owned a 90 percent stake in the bank.

Lan, chair of major real estate developer Van Thinh Phat, ordered her accomplices to withdraw cash and transfer it out of SCB's system, state media said.

She then hid the origins of the money and used it to settle debts between companies or transferred the money abroad for fake contracts.

Dozens of victims in the case held protests in central Hanoi as her latest trial started, demanding authorities help them get their money back.

Lan had apologised to the victims in court, according to state media, and said she was "not a bad person". She was given the death penalty in April after being found guilty of embezzling \$12.5 billion -- a verdict she is appealing, though no date has yet been announced for it. Prosecutors said the

total damages caused amounted to \$27 billion -- a figure equivalent to about six percent of Vietnam's gross domestic product in 2023.

# Youngest female to climb 14 tallest peaks says novice climbers should be regulated

KATHMANDU, Oct 17 (Agencies): A British mountaineer who set the record as the youngest female to climb all the 14 tallest mountains in the world said Thursday that inexperienced climbers should not be allowed to climb the highest peaks because they run the risk of endangering their lives and others.

Adriana Brownlee, 23, climbed Mount Everest at 20 in 2021 and earlier this month climbed Mount Shishapangma in China, completing her endeavor to scale all 14 peaks over 8,000 meters (26,247 feet) high.

She said she has seen numerous climbers who lack training in basic skills and in coping with

the unpredictable slopes of the high peaks.

"I have seen many examples of people in the mountains that should not really be there, that should have more training beforehand," Brownlee told agency in Kathmandu on Thursday. "We have had to support them and have had to help with like small things like how to put on crampons, how to put on harness."

She said that mountaineering authorities should ensure that climbers attempting to scale the highest peaks have at least climbed smaller mountains to ensure they can handle the altitude and have the proper skills.



Brownlee flew to Nepal this week alongside other climbers from Tibet including Nima Rinji Sherpa, who is now the youngest person to climb the 14 peaks at age 18.

There are generally no rules besides age restrictions on people who want to climb mountains as long as they are able to pay their permit

fees. In Nepal, climbers need to be at least 16 vears old.

> Brownlee said she was just 8 years old when she began dreaming of becoming a mountaineer like her father, who she said was her main inspiration.

She said she now wants to scale unclimbed peaks in Nepal and explore mountains in other parts of the world. Brownlee and her partner have opened a mountaineering company in Nepal focusing on helping customers who are skilled and experienced enough to handle the harsh condition of the mountains.

Early assessments indicate no civilian casualties, according to CENTCOM.

# **46-all out: India register their lowest Test total at** home in Bengaluru nightmare

BENGALURU, Oct 17 (Agencies): A week after their heroic win in Kanpur, India suffered a nightmarish outing against New Zealand, getting bowled out for 46 on Day 2 of the first Test of a three-match series. India's innings lasted only 31.2 overs on an overcast morning in Bengaluru as the Asian giants registered an unwanted record, slipping to their thirdowest total in Test cricket history. It was also India's lowest Test total at home.

New Zealand pacers William O'Rourke and Matt Henry breathed fire after veteran Tim Southee started the collapse, getting the big wicket of India captain Rohit Sharma as early as the opening hour of the day's play. India paid the price for opting to bat under grey skies and on a pitch that remained under the covers for the good part of the last three days due to rain in the city.

There were as many as five ducks in the Indian innings. Virat Kohli, who was surprisingly asked to bat at No. 3, Sarfaraz Khan, Ravindra Jadeja, KL Rahul and R Ashwin were the batters who did not trouble the scorers at the M Chinnaswamy Stadium on Thursday.

AUSTIN, Oct 17 (Agencies): Max Verstappen will seek to reboot his title defence and end an eight-race winless streak this weekend when he locks horns with title rival Lando Norris at the United States Grand Prix.

Four weeks on from finishing second behind him in Singapore, Red Bull's three-time world champion and series leader hopes recent upgrades to his car will be enough for him to reel in the McLaren driver and repeat his 2023 triumph at the Circuit of the Americas.

"The car felt better in Singapore," said Verstappen. "It was already a good step for us in Baku and I think we are going in the right direction now, but it takes time. You can't change something like this in one or two weeks.'

The Dutchman admitted that Red Bull struggled to match the speed of their main competitors, McLaren, Ferrari and Red Bull, during much of the mid-part of the 24-race season, but with six races remaining, three including additional sprints, he hopes his 52-point lead will be enough for him to

hang on. Verstappen has not

won since the Spanish Grand Prix and Norris, despite some inconsistency, has beaten him in the last five races, igniting a late bid for the drivers' title to add to McLaren's takeover of the constructors' cham-

pionship. An extra eight points are on offer this weekend thanks to Saturday's sprint as the F1 circus begins a triple-header with races in Austin, Mexico and Brazil on successive weekends

### **Delhi Capitals announce major** operational changes before **IPL 2025**

NEW DELHI, Oct 17 (Agencies): The Delhi Capitals franchise has announced some major operational changes ahead of the IPL 2025 season on Thursday, October 17. The GMR and JSW Groups, owners of the Capitals franchise, announced a strategic decision to alternate the management of cricket operations for Delhi Capitals' IPL (Men) and WPL (Women) teams on a two-year rotational basis. This initiative aims to enhance operational efficiency across both teams within the Delhi Capitals franchise.

For the next two years, GMR Group will oversee the cricketing operations of the Delhi Capitals Men's team, while JSW Sports will manage the operations of the Women's team. In 2027, the roles will reverse, with JSW Sports taking charge of the Men's team. Despite this rotation, the franchise's business operations will continue to be handled by the Delhi Capitals management team. Key decisions, including auctions, captaincy, player retention, and releases, will be made by the Delhi Capitals' board,

with input from senior leadership of both GMR and JSW groups.

GMR Group, one of the founding owners of the IPL in 2008, initially launched the team as "Delhi Daredevils." In 2018, GMR partnered with JSW Sports in a 50:50 ownership deal, leading to the team's rebranding as Delhi Capitals.

Since 2008, the franchise has been a consistent participant in the IPL, reaching the semi-finals in its first two seasons and making several playoff appearances. In 2019, Delhi Capitals recorded their best-ever finish as second runners-up, followed by their first appearance in an IPL final in 2020.

The Delhi Capitals Women's team, acquired in 2023, has already made a strong impact, reaching the final in both seasons of the Women's Premier League so far.

Alongside the Indian teams, GMR will continue to manage the Dubai Capitals in the ILT20 League, while JSW Sports will oversee the Pretoria Capitals in the SA20 South African league.
