Gautam Adani charged in **US with USD** 250 mn bribery, fraud



NEW YORK/NEW DELHI, Nov 21 (Agencies): Billionaire Gautam Adani has been charged by US prosecutors over his role in an alleged years-long scheme to pay USD 250 million bribe to Indian officials in exchange for favourable terms for solar power contracts.

US prosecutors charged Adani, 62, his nephew Sagar and other defendants for paying over USD 250 million in bribes between 2020 and 2024 to Indian government officials to win solar energy contracts on terms that could potentially bring in more than USD 2 billion in profit.

This, they alleged, was concealed from the US banks and investors from whom the Adani group raised billions of dollars for the project.

Jammu and Kashmir tops Urban Youth Unemployment Rate at 32 **Per Cent: PLFS Report**



SRINAGAR, Nov 21 (Agencies): Jammu and Kashmir recorded the highest urban youth unemployment rate at 32 per cent among jobseekers aged 15 to 29

during the July-September quarter, according to the latest Periodic Labour Force Survey (PLFS). The Times of India reported that Odisha followed closely

with a youth unemplovment rate of 30.4 per cent, while Delhi had the lowest rate at 4.3 per cent, followed by Gujarat at 8.3 per cent.

The nationwide urban youth unemployment rate stood at 15.9 per cent for the quarter, marking an improvement from 16.8 per cent in the preceding April-June period. Overall unemployment across all age groups in urban areas also reached a record low of 6.4 per cent, down from 6.6

JDA demolishes Kashmir Migrants' Shops; sparks protests, condemnations

JAMMU, Nov 20 (Agencies): The Jammu **Development Authority** has demolished a dozen shops belonging to displaced Kashmiri Pandits in Jammu city, allegedly without issuing notices, sparking protests from various sections that demanded action against the officials.

The demolition drive was launched on Wednesday, targeting shops built by displaced Kashmiri Pandits near the Muthi camp three decades ago, officials

The old shops were located on land belonging to the Jammu Devel-



opment Authority (JDA). Relief Commissioner Arvind Karwani visited the area to assess the situation and assured the affected families that new shops would be constructed for them

in the area. "These shops were on JDA land. The relief organisation has floated tenders for constructing a shopping complex in Muthi Camp Phase II. Ten shops will be constructed soon and allotted to these shopkeepers," he said.







Formulate proposal to address inter-state trafficking of bonded labourers: SC to Centre

SC seeks unified proposal with states, NHRC involvement to streamline financial aid for rescued minors

NEW DELHI, Nov 21 (Agencies): The Supreme Court on Thursday directed the Centre to hold a meeting with all the states and union territories and formulate a proposal to address the issue of inter-state trafficking of bonded labourers, including minors.

A bench of Justices B R Gavai and K V Viswanathan termed as "alarming" after figures placed before it showed in Uttar Pradesh of the 5,264 bonded labourers released, only 1,101 had received immediate financial assistance.

The apex court observed the problem was in the disbursal of immediate financial assistance to the rescued children as in some cases minors were taken from their home states and forced into bonded labour in adjoining states.

"We find that in order to address the issue of inter-state trafficking of children, the issue needs to be addressed by the union as well as all the states in a unified manner," the bench said.

The top court was hearing a plea seeking enforcement of fundamental rights of people trafficked as bonded labourers.

It therefore directed the secretary of the Ministry of Labour and Employment to have a meeting with his counterparts in all the states and union territories and formulate a proposal to address the social evil.

"Taking into consideration the importance of the matter, we find that it will be appropriate to have the assistance of the Attorney General. We, therefore, request the Attorney General to assist us in the matter," it said.

The Centre was further directed by the apex court to take on board the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC)

while finalising the procedure. The matter will be heard after six weeks.

During the hearing, the counsel appearing for the petitioners flagged the issue over the immediate disbursal of financial assistance to the rescued bonded labourers.

It said the secretary of the ministry concerned should hold a meeting with his counterparts in all the states and union territories and come out with a unified formula applicable to all.

The bench further observed in the digital era, there should be a portal akin to the one pertaining to missing children.

"You have to find a unified procedure," the bench remarked.

During a hearing in August, senior advocate H S Phoolka, appearing in the matter, said not even 10 per cent of such labourers were paid financial

assistance or compensation. In July 2022, the apex court agreed to hear the petition and sought responses from the Centre, the NHRC and some states and union territories on the plea.

One of the petitioners claimed he and some other bonded workers were rescued and released on February 28, 2019 from a brick kiln in Shahjahanpur district in Uttar Pradesh before being trafficked by an unregistered contractor from their native in Bihar's Gaya district.

The petitioner said he and his fellow workers were forced to work without the payment of minimum statutory wages and their fundamental rights to movement and employment were severely curtailed.

Five killed in bus-truck collision on Yamuna Expressway in Aligarh

ALIGARH (UP), Nov 21 (Agencies): Five people were killed and several injured when a bus collided with the truck on Yamuna Expressway here, police said Thursday.

The incident took place in the intervening night of Wednesday and Thursday when the vehicles were passing through the Tappal area of the district, they said.

An injured passenger told reporters that the privately operated bus was en route to Azamgarh in eastern Uttar Pradesh from Delhi's Kashmere Gate.

The truck involved in the collision was

carrying glass items, the man added.
Police said it reached the spot immediately on receiving information about the accident and carried out relief and



rescue operations.

"Police sent the injured to the hospital for treatment. The bodies of five deceased were sent for post-mortem," Aligarh Police said in a brief statement on X.

Police said legal proceedings were initiated in the case and normal traffic was resumed on the Yamuna Expressway carriageway where the accident took place.

Zambian student at Chandigarh university charged with murder dies by suicide in police custody

CHANDIGARH, Nov 21 (Agencies): A Zambian student from Chandigarh University allegedly murdered a Tanzanian student from the same university and died by suicide in the Punjab Police custody by hanging himself.

Police sources said that 24-year-old Saviour Chikopela of Zambia on the intervening night of November 20 and 21 allegedly committed suicide in the police lock-up at the Sunny Enclave Police Post in Kharar near Chandigarh by hanging himself using thin nylon rope inside the jail bar.

The police rushed him to the Kharar Civil Hospital around 12.10 am where he was declared brought dead.

He was arrested yesterday at 11.38 pm on the charges of allegedly murdering another foreign student Nuru Mari hailing from Tanzania who was his batch mate.

The police have remained tightlipped on

the incident and even kept the gates of the police station closed on Thursday morning.

A case under section 103 BNS dated November 20 has been registered at Police Station City against Saviour.

Sources further said that the girl Nuru Mari was found dead in Kharar. Police investigated and found out that the alleged accused Saviour Chikopela murdered her. The police traced the CCTV footage of where Nuru lived and also spoke to the students of the African community thus cracking the case.

Confirming the development, Senior Superintendent of Police of SAS Nagar, Deepak Pareek confirmed that a student was found dead. Initially, police suspected suicide; however, murder was confirmed after the investigation.

"The accused student was arrested yester-

day late evening but he committed suicide in the police lock-up. The investigations are going in this matter," he said.

Meanwhile, in another incident, Chandigarh Police arrested two students including a Panjab University student for the death of an outsider in the boys' hostel number 7 of the university on Monday night following drug overdose.

Those arrested are

21-year old Aryan Parbhat, a student at the University Institute of Hotel and Tourism Management, hailing from Banjar village of Kullu district of Himachal Pradesh and 24-year old Parikshit Kaushal belonging to Madhawani village in Shimla district of Himachal Pradesh. He is an ex-student of the university. The deceased also a resident of Kullu, had been staying in hostel number 7 as a guest of his friend.

Addressing a press conference, BJP spokesperson and MP Sambit Patra made it clear that as far as allegations against the Adani group are concerned it is for the company to issue a clarification and defend itself.

"Law will take its own course," he said, while keeping the focus on Gandhi's allegations against the prime minister and the BJP government at the Centre.

Since 2002, Rahul Gandhi, his mother Sonia Gandhi and the



Congress have been trying to tarnish Modi's image, but they have not succeeded and the prime minister received the highest civilian award in a foreign country on a day the opposition party was attacking him, the BJP leader said.

Rahul Gandhi claimed in his press conference that the opposition has been successful in destroying Modi's credibility over his alleged proximity to the business tycoon.

Citing the Adani group's investment in various states ruled by the Congress and its allies, Patra noted that it invested Rs 25k crore and Rs 65k crore in Chhattisgarh and Rajasthan when Bhupesh Baghel and Ashok Gehlot were at the helm there respectively.

The conglomerate invested Rs 45k crore in the DMK-ruled Tamil Nadu and had recently given Rs 100 crore donation to Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy for a skill development foundation, he added.

If Adani is "corrupt", then why are the Congress governments seeking investment from his company, he asked.

The billionaire industrialist has been charged by US prosecutors for allegedly being part of a scheme to pay over USD 250 million (about Rs 2,100 crore) bribe to Indian officials in exchange of favourable terms for solar power contracts.

This was concealed from the US banks and investors from whom the Adani group raised billions of dollars for the project, the prosecutors have alleged.

US law allows pursuing foreign corruption allegations if they involve certain links to American investors or markets.

The Adani group, however, has denied the charges.

The Congress, Patra alleged, cannot tolerate the Indian economy gaining in strength with Modi as prime minister, as it is now on track to become the third biggest

Australia cracks down porn access for minors after social media ban for children younger than 16

Australia is also looking for ways to prevent children under 18 from accessing online pornography

MELBOURNE, Nov 21 (Agencies): Australia's communications minister introduced a world-first law into Parliament on Thursday that would ban children younger than 16 from social media, saying online safety was one of parents' toughest challenges.

Michelle Rowland said TikTok, Facebook, Snapchat, Reddit, X and Instagram were among the platforms that would face fines of up to 50 million Australian dollars (USD 33 million) for systemic failures to prevent young children from holding accounts.

"This bill seeks to set a new normative value in society that accessing social media is not the defining feature of growing up in Australia," Rowland told Parliament.

"There is wide acknowledgement that something must be done in the immediate term to help prevent young teens and children from being exposed to streams of content unfiltered and infinite," she added.

The bill has wide political support. After it becomes law, the platforms would have one year to work out how to implement the age restriction.

Former Pak PM Imran Khan arrested in protest case hours after bail in second Toshakhana case



ISLAMABAD, Nov 21 (Agencies): The chances for the release of jailed former prime minister Imran Khan vanished after he was arrested in a protest case hours after getting bail in a case of alleged corruption, a media report said on Thursday.

The Islamabad High Court (IHC) on Wednesday granted him bail in the second Toshakhana case related to the purchase of an expensive Bulgari jewellery set at a throwaway price, igniting hopes of his release.

However, hours later, Rawalpindi police arrested him late at night in connection with a case registered at New Town Police Station on terrorism and other charges.

The police alleged that Khan, while imprisoned in Adiala Jail in Rawalpindi, had called for a protest in Rawalpindi on September 28.

Dawn newspaper quoted a police spokesperson as saying that Khan had been detained in the case filed on September 28 and a team has been tasked to probe the charges.

The charges include violations of the Anti-Terrorism Act, defying the government ban on public gatherings, obstructing police duty, damaging police vehicles and endangering public safety.

Even before the formal arrest in the

case, federal information minister Atta Tarar doused the idea of his release by saying that Khan was wanted in eight cases related to May 9, 2023 violence and should secure bail before being set free from jail.

Dawn reported that Khan needs to secure bail in nearly two dozen other cases registered across Lahore, Rawalpindi and Islamabad before being released.

According to Islamabad police, at least 62 cases were registered against Khan in various police stations of the capital while his PTI party said that another 54 cases were registered in Punjab province.

Meanwhile, an accountability court on Wednesday held a hearing on the GBP 190 million case at the Adiala Jail and was informed that Khan and Bushra Bibi have yet to submit responses to the questionnaires issued to them.

The court granted Bibi's request for an exemption from court appearance on medical grounds and adjourned the hearing till November 22.

Separately, the Lahore High Court dismissed a plea by Khan's sister, Noreen Niazi, seeking bail for her brother in all cases against him in Punjab and Islamahad

An assistant attorney general presented a report to the court, stating that 62 cases had been registered against Khan by the Islamabad police.

After going through the report, Justice Farooq Haider turned down the request, observing that bail petitions must be filed personally by the suspect.

Dozens of cases have been registered against Khan since losing power in April 2022.

His party maintained that all cases were politically motivated.

Philippines typhoon death toll rises to 12

MANILA, Nov 21 (Agencies): The death toll from Super Typhoon Man-yi in the Philippines has risen to 12, the national disaster agency said on Thursday.

Man-yi submerged villages and smashed flimsy buildings in the archipelago nation over the weekend, packing maximum sustained wind speeds of 185 kilometres (115 miles) an hour

It was the sixth major storm in a month to strike the Philippines.

The storm have killed at least 175 people and displaced thousands, as well as wiping out crops and livestock. Most of the Man-yi deaths were in mountainous areas north of the capital Manila, including seven people killed after a landslide buried their house in Nueva Vizcaya province.

A boulder also crushed a house, burying three people alive, in the coastal town of Dip-



aculao, where Man-yi had made a second landfall, Ariel Nepomuceno, a senior official with the government's civil defence office, told agency. Four people remain missing, he added.

"We are now in the recovery period, people have started to fix their houses. Construction materials have been arriving in hard-hit provinces," Nepomuceno

In the northern city of Tuguegarao, floodwaters induced by a dam release and a swollen Cagayan River have started to subside, after swamping thousands of

houses in the days after the typhoon exited the country.

"The water level has subsided and is now just one foot (0.3 metres) high. Some evacuees have also gone back to their homes," city disaster official lan Valdepenas told agency on Thursday.

Schools and government offices have reopened.

About 20 big storms and typhoons hit the Southeast Asian nation or its surrounding waters each year, killing scores of people, but it is rare for multiple such weather events to take place in a small window.

Hong Kong activist Jimmy Lai denies he asked a newspaper colleague to draft list of sanction targets HONG KONG, Nov Whether he intended to nese rule in 1997

HONG KONG, Nov 21 (Agencies): Former publisher Jimmy Lai denied that he asked a colleague to draft a list of potential sanction targets in his second day of testimony Thursday at his landmark national security trial in Hong Kong.

77-year-old founder of the nowshuttered Apple Daily pro-democracy newspaper is being tried on charges of colluding with foreign forces to endanger national security and conspiring with others to issue seditious publications. He was arrested in 2020 in a political crackdown following massive antigovernment protests in 2019. If convicted, he faces up to life in prison.

The testimony highlighted WhatsApp conversations between Lai and Apple Daily's ex-associate publisher Chan Pui-man. She



was one of six former Apple Daily executives who pleaded guilty to conspiring with Lai to call for sanctions or a blockade or to engage in other hostile activities against Hong Kong or China.

Lai's lawyer Steven Kwan showed the messages in court after Chan earlier in the trial said that Lai had suggested the newspaper prepare a sanction list after then-President Donald Trump signed a directive seeking to punish those the U.S. government determines

have helped to curtail Hong Kong's civil liberties.

Lai said Thursday he did not write that message and had just copied and pasted the text he received from a person he suspected was connected with the White House. He said he did not read the full text thoroughly before forwarding it. He said the text "sounds so foreign to me."

Kwan said Lai sent the same message to several pro-democracy politicians, including Lee Wing-tat. Asked ask Lee to work up such a list, Lai answered "that would be ridiculous."

After the security law was enacted in June 2020, the Trump administration imposed sanctions on Hong Kong officials, accusing them of cooperating with Beijing's effort to undermine autonomy and crack down on freedom in the city.

in the city.

Authorities have used the law to prosecute Lai and other leading activists. Under the threat of the law, dozens of civil society groups disbanded and some other activists were forced into self-exile. Apple Daily closed in 2021 following the arrests of some of its senior managers.

Critics say the drastic political changes reflect the freedoms promised to be kept intact in the former British colony when it returned to Chi-

nese rule in 1997 were shrinking. But Beijing and Hong Kong governments said the law restored the city's stability following the 2019 protests.

The court also heard Lai had reminded his staff working on international news not to go against Trump in 2020 when they were hoping Trump would do something to stop the national security law. Lai said he did not interfere with the way those journalists worked until the law loomed.

On Wednesday, asked how he thought Trump could help, Lai said "a call to China, a call to Xi Jinping, whatever," referring to the Chinese president. He said his newspaper would not be able to survive under the law but he never communicated with Trump.

The trial will continue on Friday.

Former UK Deputy Prime Minister John Prescott dies at age 86

LONDON, Nov 21 (Agencies): Britain's former deputy prime minister John Prescott, who served under Tony Blair and with him helped transform the country's Labour party, has died aged 86, his family said on Thursday.

"We are deeply saddened to inform you that our beloved husband, father and grandfather, John Prescott, passed away yesterday (Wednesday) at the age of 86," a statement read.

Blair, the privately educated lawyer who appointed working-class Prescott to help appease the Labour left as he moved the party to the centre ground, said he was "devastated" at Prescott's death. "There was no one quite like him in British politics," he told BBC radio.

Keir Starmer, who became Labour's first prime minister since 2010 after a landslide general election win in July, called Prescott "a true giant of the Labour movement". "He was a staunch defender

of working people and a proud trade unionist. During a decade as deputy prime minister, he was one of the key architects of a Labour government that transformed the lives of millions of people across the nation," he added. "So much of John's work set the path for those of us fortunate enough to follow. From leading climate negotiations to fighting regional inequality, his legacy will live on well beyond his lifetime." Prescott, a former merchant seaman and trade union activist who served as a member of parliament for Hull in northern England for four decades, died "peacefully" at a care home, his wife Pauline,

and two sons said.
"He did so surrounded by the



love of his family and the jazz music of Marian Montgomery," they added. Prescott, who was appointed to the House of Lords, suffered a stroke in 2019 and had been suffering from Alzheimer's. He stopped being a member of the upper chamber of parliament in July because of his health problems. Plainspeaking, Prescott served for 10 years as Blair's deputy following Labour's landslide 1997 general

election win. During a campaign stop in north Wales he punched a protester who threw an egg at him. But he also acted as a mediator between Blair and his finance minister Gordon Brown, who also helmed the transformation of Labour in the 1990s and who had designs on power.

Prescott's brief included the environment and transport, as well as leading negotiations for Britain for the international Kyoto Protocol on climate change.

Blair said in a 2007 letter to Prescott that he saw his role as "smoothing out colleagues and sorting out colleagues and trouble-shooting".

"The completely unique Prescott blend of charm and brutality... got you through the decade, kept the government together and above all, gave me a lot of fun. I was lucky to have you as my deputy," he told him.

Ukraine's military says Russia launches ICBM, a claim denied by Western official

KYIV, Nov 21 (Agencies): Russia on Thursday launched an intercontinental ballistic missile toward Ukraine, officials in Kyiv said, but a Western official told agency that the attack did not appear to be an ICBM.

It was instead a ballistic missile, which was aimed at Dnipro, in Ukraine's southeast, the Western official said.

The claim was not immediately confirmed by Moscow, with Kremlin spokesperson Dmitry Peskov declining to comment, saying questions about it should be instead directed to the Russian Defense Ministry.

The launch of an ICBM, if confirmed, would arrive amid concerns that the conflict between Russia and Ukraine could further escalate. Ukraine's military this week first launched U.S.-made ATACMS missiles toward targets within Russia, days after U.S. President Joe Biden allowed for such use of the longrange weapons.

Within hours of Russia announcing it had struck down some of those ATACMS missiles, the Kremlin announced that Russian President Vladimir Putin had updated the country's nuclear doctrine, a move that lowered the bar for a response with nuclear weapons.

The Ukrainian Air Force announced on Thursday morning that it had tracked the launch of the ICBM, along with six additional missiles, all of which were targeting the Dnipro region. The ICBM appeared to have been launched from the Astrahan region, in Russia's southwest, Ukrainian military officials said.

All of the missiles were launched in about two hours, beginning at about 5 a.m., Ukraine said. They were targeted at businesses and critical infrastructure.

The six other missiles were shot down, Ukraine said. No casualties or damages were reported, officials said.

Jammu Petrol Pumps declare 'No Fuel For **Vehicles Driven By** Minors', DSE issues circular

specifically focuses on minors riding twowheelers without helmets or four-wheelers, is aimed at ensuring the safety of children,' said an employee of the petrol pump.

This step has drawn praise from residents and encouraged the authorities to take pro-

active measures. On November 14, two young boys died while another was critically injured after a tragic collision between two vehicles near the Tengpora area in Srinagar. This incident sparked a debate on driving by minors and road safety in the valley.

Following another accident in Srinagar last week, in which two teenage boys died and two others were injured after their car rammed into a stationary truck, the DSE issued an order prohibiting minor students from driving motor vehicles, including twowheelers and four-wheelers, to school.

"It has come to notice that some underage students are driving vehicles while going to schools or coaching centres. Such an act has the potential of causing road accidents, endangering public safety, and is also in violation of the provisions of the Motor Vehicle Act," the DSE said in a circular issued on Thursday.

It further said. "In view of the above, it is impressed upon Heads of Institutions of all government and private schools & coaching centres to implement these instructions strictly. They should keep a close vigil to ensure that no underage student is allowed to attend the institution while driving any motor vehicle, including two-wheelers or four-wheelers."

Such students must not be permitted entry and their parents should be informed accordingly, the circular added.

The directive further instructed schools and coaching centres to ensure proper sensitisation of students and parents about the dangers and risks involved in underage driving. Awareness programmes on age restrictions and traffic rules should be organised in collaboration with the traffic

"Parents and guardians should be educated through PTMs (parents-teachers meetings) about the consequences of underage driving and their responsibilities," it stated.

Additionally, schools and coaching centres are required to monitor parking areas and entry points to ensure compliance, it

"Any instance of a minor driving a vehicle should be immediately reported to the concerned authorities. They should also regularly coordinate with the Traffic Police to enforce strict measures," the circular said.

The directive emphasised activating all road safety and school safety clubs to raise awareness in schools.

"All government and private schools & coaching centres must strictly ensure the implementation of the above circular instructions in letter and spirit. Any violation of the instructions shall invite legal action under the Motor Vehicle Act and relevant laws, including the withdrawal of recognition and registration of the institution," it

JDA demolishes Kashmir Migrants' Shops; sparks protests, condemnations

PDP chief Mehbooba Mufti shared a clip of the affected shopkeepers on X and urged Chief Minister Omar Abdullah to address the issue with compassion and

"Heartbreaking scenes emerge as Kashmiri Pandit shopkeepers stand helplessly by the rubble of their demolished shops, reportedly brought down by the JDA without prior notice. This act further deepens their sense of alienation and loss," she said

EPG calls for high-level inquiry into deteriorating condition of Mirgund Wetland

SRINAGAR, Nov 21: In its continued efforts to address the environmental challenges facing Kashmir's wetlands, the Environmental Policy Group (EPG) conducted a detailed visit to the Mirgund Wetland, also known as Mirgund "Jheel," located 16 kilometers from Srinagar on the route to Gulmarg. Once a thriving bird sanctuary spanning approximately 4 square kilometers and primarily fed by the Sukhnag Nallah and the Jhelum Flood Spill Channel, the wetland now lies in an utterly desolate

Environmental Policy Group (EPG) has expressed grave concern over the alarming condition of the Mirgund wetland, which has now turned into a parched landscape due to mismanagement, lack of timely intervention, and insensitivity. During a recent visit, the EPG team, including Convener, Faiz Baskhi, Er. Ajaz Rasool, Dr. Tauseef Bhat, Ahmed Ayaz, Reyan Sofi, and Javaid Ahmad Ganie, found the wetland devoid of water and migratory birds—an indicator of the severe ecological degra-

dation. The EPG team found the wetland completely dry, devoid of water. marshes, or bird activitv. This alarming transformation has turned a once-vibrant ecosystem into a barren grassland, raising serious concerns about mismanagement, neglect, and insensitivity to environmental preservation. The drying up of the wetland has led to encroachment and illegal activities in the area. Some locals have begun cultivating portions of the wetland, ploughing the land and preparing it for agricultural use. Land mafias have also exploited the situation by marking plots with cement blocks and undertaking earthfilling to raise ground levels, likely for sale or construction purposes.

The team noted that the wetland's boundaries, as recorded in official revenue documents were indistinguishable on the ground, exacerbating the encroachment issue. Although the Wildlife Department has begun efforts to reclaim encroached areas on the northern side of the wetland by erecting boundary pillars, the process has been agonizingly slow, taking over 15 years of legal battles in the courts.

Adding to the dismay, infrastructure managed by the Wildlife Department, such as a tworoom shed commissioned in 2005, was found in a state of disrepair. The structure, with broken walls and missing doors and windows, symbolized the neglect faced by this critical wetland. Ironically, a signboard on the premises that once read "Life Thrives in Wetlands, Let's Protect Them" stood in ruins, a stark reminder of the disparity between intent and reality.

The EPG team also identified failures in water management as a key factor behind the wetland's deterioration. The Sukhnag Nallah, which could supply water to the wetland, remains disconnected due to a closed MS iron gate at the offtake point in Rakh Kawoosa village. The team observed that opening this gate could immediately restore water flow to the wetland, but no action has been taken in

this regard. During interactions with local stakeholders and Wildlife Department field staff, it became apparent that the higher authorities responsible for managing the wetland had failed to act proactively. Despite the drying of the wetland being partially attributable to climate change-

induced drought condi-

tions, the department's

lack of contingency plan-

ning and timely interven-

tions has exacerbated the situation. The Environmental Policy Group has called for an immediate highlevel inquiry to determine the circumstances that led to the current state of the wetland. The EPG emphasized that globally, the Rights of Wetlands movement underscores the importance of preserving wetlands' ecological balance and natural hydrological connections—rights that have

> in the case of Mirgund. EPG intends to escalate the matter by pursuing legal recourse to ensure the protection and restoration of the wetland. The group also plans to communicate its findings to the Government of Jammu and Kashmir. including Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha, with an urgent request for intervention. The EPG team strongly believes that opening the Sukhnag Nallah gate and implementing stricter measures against encroachments are essential first steps toward saving the

"Spoke to Rohit Sharma earlier but...": Jasprit **Bumrah on taking up Perth test captaincy**

India's stand-in skipper Jasprit Bumrah on Thursday insisted that his team is not carrying any baggage from the unprecedented 0-3 defeat at home against New Zealand as it embarks on a challenging Test series against fierce rivals Australia. Bumrah replaced Rohit Sharma as the team's captain for the series opener after the latter had to miss the match due to the birth of his baby boy. While it isn't a usual sight to see bowlers taking up the leadership role, Bumrah feels they are 'tactically better' than batters, and hence, should be given leadership responsibilities more often.

"It is an honour. I have my own style. Virat was different, Rohit was different. and I have my own way. It is a privilege. I don't take it as a position. I love



taking responsibility. I spoke with Rohit earlier. But I got a little bit of clarity on leading the side after coming in here," Bumrah said in the press conference on the eve of the start of Perth Test.

"I have always advocated

for pacers being captains. They are tactically better. Pat has done a phenomenal job. There are a lot of models in the

past as well. Kapil Dev and lot

of other captains in the past.

Hopefully a start of a new tradi-

tion," the pacer said on being

The five-match Test series starts here on Friday.

"When you win you start from zero but when you lose, then also you also start from zero. We are not carrying any baggage from India. Yes, we have our learnings from New Zealand series but those were different conditions and our results here have been different," said Bumrah, who is leading in the opening Test in the absence of Rohit Sharma, who is on paternity leave.

Bumrah also said that the team has finalised its playing XI although he will reveal it only at the toss.

"We have finalised our playing XI and you will get to know tomorrow morning before the start of the match," the skipper said.

Don't count yourself as favourite: Erigaisi's advice to Gukesh

NEW DELHI, Nov 21 (Agencies): Indian Grandmaster Arjun Erigaisi has a word of advice for World Championship contender D Gukesh ahead of his clash against China's Ding Liren — just focus on your preparation and don't count yourself as a "huge favourite" going into the title showdown. Gukesh, partly because of Liren's listless performances in the lead-up to the World Championship showdown in Singapore from

November 25, is being

seen as the firm favou-

rite for the crown.

"If I were Gukesh, I would not think that I am a huge favourite. I would just try to focus on my preparation and everything. And, I am sure, Gukesh is also doing the same," said Erigaisi, who earned the title of GM as a 14-year-old and achieved a peak rating of 2799 in September this year, making him the 15th-highest-rated player in history.

"I think it's clear that Gukesh is the favourite. Both of them have their strengths and weaknesses. But Gukesh is

a massive favourite. It's more to do with Ding's form because the Chinese has not been in good shape," said Erigaisi.

However, Erigaisi feels that if Ding plays to his potential it could turn out to be a cracker of a contest.

"If he (Ding) shows up anywhere close to his best, then it will be a really interesting match. And, as a chess fan, I hope that it happens. Not just me but any chess fan would hope that Ding shows up well

and is able to play at his best, so that it will be an interesting match. But, as an Indian, I cannot help but support Gukesh."

Gukesh recently

trained with acclaimed mental conditioning coach Paddy Upton, who has also worked with the Indian men's cricket and hockey teams, and Erigaisi feels it will help the teenaged Indian in crunch situations during the World Championship.

"Chess is a mental sport. To be in a good frame of mind is very important. We saw what happened to (Russian GM) Ian Nepomniachtchi in the 2021 World Championship match (against Magnus Carlsen). It started out with five draws, but then Nepomniachtchi lost the sixth game and then he just collapsed."

"He couldn't fight after he lost one game. So, I think, in that aspect, it surely helps if you have a mental coach who can guide you and put you in a good frame of mind," opined Erigaisi.

It's going to get more attritional, says Cummins on eve of five-match series against India



PERTH, Nov 21 (Agencies): Australian captain Pat Cummins anticipates the Border-Gavaskar Trophy against arch-rivals India to be a more "attritional" affair this year, with the two heavyweights of world cricket clashing over five Test matches instead of the usual four.

Australia are keen to avenge consecutive series losses on home soil as they face India in the opening Test at Optus Stadium on Friday.

"The Border-Gavaskar Trophy has always been very tight every series. A five-Test match series gets really attritional; it's a big one, really," Cummins remarked during the pre-match press conference on Thursday.

Cummins dismissed concerns about the Indian Premier League (IPL) auction, which is scheduled for Sunday in Jeddah, coinciding with the third day of the match. He believes the magnitude of the series will keep players focused

The Australian skipper also shared his thoughts on India's young allrounder Nitish Reddy, whom he played alongside in the IPL for Sun-Risers Hyderabad.

"He is an impressive youngster. Didn't bowl much for SRH. He can swing the ball and is a really talented kid," Cummins noted.

Interestingly, both teams will be led by fast-bowling captains, a rarity in international cricket. Cummins leads Australia, while Jasprit Bumrah steps in for India as regular skipper Rohit Sharma is on paternity leave.

"It should happen more (pacers leading teams)," Cummins said when asked about the unusual coincidence.

The blockbuster series promises to be a battle of endurance and skill, with both teams eyeing supremacy in one of cricket's fiercest rival-

NEW DELHI. Nov 21 (Agencies): Former India cricketer Robin Uthappa has thrown Rajat Patidar into the mix as a possible contender to lead the Royal Challengers Bengaluru in the Indian Premier League (IPL) 2025. Ahead of the upcoming edition of the IPL 2025, RCB will be evaluating its captaincy options after deciding to go against retaining Faf du Plessis. While the likes of Jos Buttler, Rishabh Pant, Shreyas lyer and many more options are available in the mega auction, Uthappa believes that RCB should try their hand by using Patidar.

"I think they should look at Rajat Patidar to take over that role because it seems like you need a new leader after two years. the visitors. The highly anticipated five-match Test series begins on Friday, with Rohit unavailable for the opening game due to a paternity break. In his absence, pace spearhead Jasprit Bumrah

will lead the Indian side. "I just think there's potential for more disruption through their campaign with Sharma coming back and whatever else. So l'Il stick with it (3-1 verdict in favour of Australia)," Ponting said on ICC Review.

The second Test, a day-night match, is



scheduled to start on 6 December.

Australia banking on star performers

Ponting emphasised the importance of key players delivering for Australia. "Marnus (Labuschagne) and (Steve) Smith need to make runs for Australia. And their bowling attack obviously is as good as anyone's in the world. So I'll stick with my 3-1 Australia prediction," he

stated. Despite India's recent home series loss to New Zealand, Ponting believes the visitors appear well-prepared heading into the series. "India will be pretty

certain of what team they're going to play (in Perth). They've known for a while that Rohit probably wasn't going to be here. They've probably known for a while that Bumrah was going to be captain. So they've

India has dominated the past four series between the two sides, including consecutive away series wins in 2018-19 and 2020-21. Ponting reflected on his incorrect prediction during the 2020-21 series, which India won 2-1 despite being bowled out for their lowest-ever Test total of 36 in the first Test in Adelaide

"I think I might have said 2-1 at the start," Ponting recalled. "And then Sunny (Sunil Gavaskar) looked at me and said. 'It will be 2-1, but it will be 2-1 (in favour of) India.' And I thought there was no way in the world that they could bounce back after losing the way they did in Adelaide. But they did."

India's comeback included victories in Melbourne and Brisbane, achieved without several first-choice players, including then captain Virat Kohli, who returned to India after the Adelaide Test for the birth of his daughter.

Mental Preparation Key for Success Ponting stressed the importance of mental preparation for such a significant series. "Preparation is always a hard one to get right. Because I've seen guys like Travis Head in the past where they've almost had no preparation at all, going into a game and then turn up and play one of the alltime great innings," he explained.

". . . with this game, your skills don't ever leave you. They don't go too far away. But as long as you're thinking clearly and thinking the right things, then you can make your body do pretty much whatever you want it to do," Ponting concluded.



PERTH, Nov 21 (Agencies): Former India head coach Ravi Shastri wants Gautam Gambhir to keep a cool head on the tour of Australia. India coach Gautam Gambhir will be under pressure in the Border-Gavaskar Trophy having lost a home Test series against New Zealand 0-3. Speaking on Star Sports, Shastri said that Gambhir needs to understand his players and not make knee-jerk decisions in the 5-match series.

If reports in the Indian media are to be believed, the Board of Control for Cricket in India had a long meeting with the Indian coach and captain Rohit Sharma ahead of the Australia tour, and harsh decisions could be taken if India once again falter poorly in the upcoming Test series. However, amidst all this chaos, former India coach Shastri has asked Gambhir to not listen to outside noise.

"I think would be the first thing would be to be calm, you know, don't let outside elements, influence you in any way. Because of that, don't get into a position where knee-jerk reactions happen. Get to understand your players. You will see them in bad situations, you'll see them in India, you'll see them in overseas, you know, you will, notice what it takes for a player



to click. You will understand situations of a team where a certain player might be better than the other," Ravi Shastri said in the Star

Sports press room. Shastri said that building relationships with players does not happen overnight and Gambhir needed to be receptive to all the players and their quirks in the dressing room. Shastri said that Gambhir needed to respect the sensibilities of each individual and steer the ship towards success.

"It took me some time to understand everyone. He might have seen them from the outside of the IPL, and he might have sat with a

few players in the dressing room when he played the game, but there are a lot of other players and they come from different mindsets, different cultures, and different parts of the country. And for you to dig deep and understand their mindsets would be the most important thing. There could be a player, you know, who's an introvert, but actually, if you push him out there and give him the confidence, he could be a match-winner for you," Shastri concluded on the matter.

India begin their 5-match Test series against Australia on Friday, November 22. The opening Test match starts at 7:50 am IST.

Asks JDA to immediately rehabilitate the shopkeepers


