#### **Fresh Snow** in Higher Reaches of Kashmir, Met **Forecasts Wet Weather** in Valley

SRINAGAR, Nov 23 (Agencies): Some places in the higher reaches of Kashmir received fresh snowfall on Saturday, with the Met office forecasting a spell of wet weather in the Valley amid an increase in the minimum temperature, officials said.

The tourist resort town of Sonamarg in central Kashmir's Ganderbal district and the upper areas of Gulmarg received light snow, the officials said.

They said there were reports of light snowfall at some other areas in the higher reaches, including Zojila, and Sadhna Top in Kup-

Some places in the Valley also received light rain.

Owing to the cloud cover, the minimum temperature at most places in Kashmir. ıncıuding Srinagar which had experienced the coldest night of the season on Friday settled above freezing point, the officials said.

The city recorded a low of 2.5 degrees Celsius, rising from minus 1.2 degrees on Friday.

Qazigund recorded a low of 0.8 degrees Celsius while Pahalgam registered 3.2 degrees.

Gulmarg, a tourist

destination famous for skiing, recorded a low of minus 0.5 degrees Celsius while Kupwara registered 2.1 degrees. In Kokernag in south Kashmir, the night temperature settled at 2.4 degrees Celsius. The Met office has forecast light rain or snow at scattered to fairly widespread places in the higher

reaches of Kashmir on Saturday. On Sunday, there is a possibility of light rain or snow at isolated places in the higher reaches while the weather will remain mainly dry afterwards

till the end of the

month, it added. While there are chances of light rain or snow at scattered to fairly widespread places in the higher reaches on December 1, the weather is likely to stay dry during December 2-5, it said.

### **BJP-Led Mahayuti sweeps Maharashtra, Oppn INDIA to bag Jharkhand**

MUMBAI/RANCHI, Nov 23 (Agencies): Maharashtra was coloured a vivid saffron on Saturday with voters giving the BJPled Mahayuti alliance a landslide win over a tottering MVA while the opposition INDIA bloc looked set to return to power in Jharkhand.

As votes were counted for the assembly elections in the two states, it was time for celebration in the BJP with the party poised to win 125 of the 149 seats it contested in

the powerhouse state of Maharashtra. Together with its partners Shiv Sena and NCP, the ruling Mahayuti alliance could win 219 of the 288 seats in the state, leaving the Congress-Shiv Sena(UBT)-NCP(SP) tie-up with just 51 seats.

As the opposition reeled under the impact of the decisive mandate against it in Maharashtra, Jharkhand offered some consolation with voters in both states going for continuity rather than change.

In the Jharkhand assembly. the BJP was ahead in 27 seats, while the Chief Minister Hemant Sorenled JMM was leading in 30 seats, the Congress in 14, the RJD in four and the CPI-ML in one. according to the Election Commission website.

"We are going to get the reward for the work we did... and also for the manner in which we remained connected to the public. What can be seen in trends, we can say that we are going to

form the govt again and the fulfil the promises we made," Congress leader Rajesh Thakur told PTI Videos as the INDIA bloc neared victory in Jharkhand.

"I thank everybody for this victory. We have such a big victory because of the work Mahayuti did. Very grateful," Maharashtra Chief Minister Eknath Shinde told reporters while his alliance colleagues attributed the stunning win to welfare



### **US-India Defence Industrial Roadmap**

Both nations recognize the growing complexity of global threats, such as cyber warfare, regional instability, and military assertiveness in the Indo-Pacific region, necessitating enhanced cooperation.

The Defence Industrial Roadmap builds on this momentum, integrating the shared goals of the US's National Security Strategy and India's vision of \*Atmanirbhar Bharat\* (Self-Reliant India). It focuses on fostering innovation, reducing dependency on third-party suppliers, and creating a sustainable defense ecosystem by enabling joint production and advanced technology sharing.

A cornerstone of the roadmap is technology transfer, which enables India to access critical defense technologies. Advanced systems, such as drones, jet engines, and naval platforms, are part of the collaboration. The roadmap seeks to establish mechanisms for co-development, allowing Indian defense firms to work alongside US companies in producing state-of-the-art systems. This partnership is not only intended to enhance India's domestic manufacturing but also to integrate Indian firms into global defense supply chains.

Recognizing the importance of modern warfare, the roadmap prioritizes collaboration in cutting-edge domains like artificial intelligence (AI), quantum computing, space technologies, and cybersecurity. By pooling resources and expertise, the two nations aim to develop systems that provide strategic advantages in both conventional and hybrid warfare.

The roadmap aims to deepen industrial collaboration by connecting US defense giants with Indian public and private sector companies. By leveraging India's large and skilled workforce and competitive manufacturing base, the roadmap facilitates the production of cost-effective defense solutions. This collaboration is also intended to address supply chain vulnerabilities by ensuring diversification and reducing reliance on any single source.

One of the roadmap's crucial objectives is the harmonization of regulatory frameworks. By simplifying export controls and licensing processes, both countries seek to ensure smooth technology transfer and joint development. The establishment of joint task forces and regular dialogues between defense officials further aids in resolving bureaucratic hurdles.

For India, the roadmap aligns with its goal of achieving self-reliance in defense production. Collaborative projects, such as the manufacturing of military aircraft, armored vehicles, and naval ships, aim to elevate India's domestic capabilities. Simultaneously, the United States benefits from expanding its defense exports and accessing India's vast market.

The roadmap reinforces both nations' commitment to a free, open, and inclusive Indo-Pacific region. The integration of advanced defense systems and increased military interoperability enhances the security architecture, particularly in countering assertive actions in the South China Sea and beyond.

The defense partnership under this roadmap sends a strong message to adversarial forces in the region, notably China and Pakistan. By bolstering India's military capabilities, it enables India to play a more assertive role in maintaining regional stability, thereby complementing US

strategic objectives.

As India emerges as a defense manufacturing hub, it can cater to the needs of smaller nations in the region, promoting stability and reducing dependency on aggressive powers. This aligns with the US vision of supporting allies and partners to ensure a balanced global defense order.

The roadmap is expected to generate significant economic benefits. For India, it means increased employment, technological advancement, and a boost to its industrial base. US defense companies gain access to one of the largest defense markets, creating new business opportunities.

The focus on co-production also stimulates research and development, fostering innovation that can spill over into civilian applications. Moreover, the enhanced defense trade between the nations contributes to narrowing trade imbalances, a critical aspect of bilateral economic relations.

### Chump returns! Democracy sets off nightmares across the globe

es, 2024 has been the super year for global elections. People in 70 countries, half the world's population, went to the polls. If you discount the populations of Russia, China and North Korea, whose "democracies" have infinite quotation marks around them, then the voting nations exceed that 50 per cent. The trumping of Donald Trump and his MAGA (Make America Gaga Again) campaign is only the latest example of the overthrow of incumbent governments. Forty out of 54 voting nations kicked their incumbents out. Very many surveys and analysts attribute Chump's victory (and this applies to other triumphant Oppositions) to his constant refrain during the campaign asking voters if they had more money in their pockets when he was POTUS or when Joe Biden and Vice-POTUS Kamala Harris had their term.

Certainly, the scare stories of immigrants making nations poorer, spreading crime and eating pets, and consequently the promise to deport millions of illegal immigrants from the United States, was a determining factor in the devastating reversal. Analysis of the other elections attribute this tendency to dismiss incumbent governments and parties to precisely the same two factors—the rise in inflation and prices

caused by the Covid-19 pandemic and the fuel crisis after Russia's invasion of Ukraine and the fear of an immigrant "invasion".

But is that the whole picture? Certainly, the UK voted in Keir Starmer's Labour Party with a huge majority, humiliating Hedgie Sunak and the Tories by presenting them with their greatest electoral defeat since 1832 in their long and nasty history. Keir Starmer's Labour is very centre-left with more crowd-and-capitalist-pleasing-centre than left. His government's chancellor of the exchequer, Rachel Reeves, presented her first Budget in October. The theme of the Budget was economic restraint. She said Labour was not raising taxes on working people, but only on employers. Economic commentary concludes that the rise in National Insurance she imposed on employers will be passed on, in one way or another, to employees and consumers. In the wake of the Budget after Rachel Reeves' pronouncements and Keir Starmer's follow-up support for the Budget, they were asked to define whom they meant by the word "worker". Answer came there none.

At the Labour Party conference, as Ms Reeves was speaking, a heckler interrupted saying that Labour was continuing to sell arms to Israel and contributing to the genocide in Palestine. He was promptly

dragged out of the hall. Ms Reeves responded by telling the audience that Labour was not any more a party of "protest" but one that sided with the working class. Not much of answer or even excuse for the continued support to the billionaires of the British arms industry? Across the Channel, in France and Germany (tragically "isolated" now, through Brexit), the voters didn't quite overthrow the governments but gave a very favourable vote to extreme right-wing parties. Italy voted in a party formerly associated with fascism. Hungary and Turkey (though the latter has not yet been admitted into the European Union but is in Nato) have elected rightwing governments, apologists for Russia's invasion and bombing of civilians in Ukraine. Democracy, with its traceable origins in Athens -- though undoubtedly there must have been other societies which pioneered government through majority franchise of allowed personnel which didn't have a recorded influence on subsequent history -- was supposed to reflect the material concerns of the classes that voted. If one believes the analysts who say that the Covid crisis and the wars which the West expends funds on are responsible for high prices, welfare cuts, etc, then yes, the majority who feel a pinch in their pockets voted in the hope that the oppos-

ing right-wing parties would

loosen the pinching fingers. But then, there are the other elements that distort the democratic ideal of classes voting for their material and social benefit. They vote for religious prejudice, they vote to keep foreigners out of their country, they vote out of fear that some current ideology is distorting their culture... Gentle reader, I confess I voted for the losing side in the Brexit vote. Some of my left-wing friends voted for Britain to leave the EU on the grounds that Polish plumbers, for instance, were coming to the UK and undercutting the wages of British plumbers. I am using "plumbers" here as one category of craftsperson, though of course it applies to a myriad other trades. Yes, Brexit kept the Polish plumbers out. British plumbers could now charge what they wanted to. Millions of working-class families who needed some plumbing in their homes had to pay their price. British plumbers and their unions were served and happy. The working-class families who needed their drains unclogged or taps refitted were not. This "best of all worst systems", as Winston Churchill said, is not free from the distorting influence of irrational nationalism, religious loyalty or bigotry, racism, xenophobia, conspiracy theories, plausible deceit, the lure of demagoguery and even superstition. These, as we now witness, make for demockracy.

Delivers. Nitrogen content is measured in some protein tests of milk. Due to the high nitrogen content of urea, the protein content of milk mixed with urea appears artificially high in tests. This adulteration not only confuses consumers but alsoIt also becomes very dangerous for health. According to the report of the World Health Organization (WHO), every year about 60 crore people fall ill due to food adulteration, including. Many cases involve consumption of adulterated milk. Similarly, a

report by the Food Safety and

Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) stated that in a study conducted in 2018, 68 percent of milk samples were not up to the standard quality. The authority warned that those consuming adulterated milk would be at risk. There may be a 30 percent increase in cancer cases among peopleIs. This condition becomes especially serious when the adulteration contains chemicals, such as formaldehyde and urea, which cause cancer and can cause gene changes., Formaldehyde increases the risk of cancer by altering genes in body cells, while adulteration with urea artificially increases the quality of milk. Consumption of these chemicals not only poses a risk of cancer, but can also cause serious diseases like kidney and liver failure. It is also clear from the researchIt is said that due to adulteration, the cases of kidney failure can increase by forty percent and the cases of heart diseases can increase by twenty-five percent. It has also been made clear in WHO's 'Cancer Risk Assessment' report that cases of breast and prostate cancer are increasing in people affected by chemical adulteration. In such a situation, development and implementation of reliable testing systems becomes extremely important. At present many methods are used to test the purity of milk in India, but many of these tests are based on technical means. A are proving to be old and ineffective. We should use state-of-the-art technologies, which are capable of quickly and accurately detecting adulteration in milk, so that the problem of adulteration can be effectively controlled. For example, HPLC is a highly sensitive technique used to identify milk urea, detergents and synthetic substances. Adulteration can be detected

using this technique. According to research published in 'Journal of Dairy Science', adulteration of milk was detected using HPLC technology. The accuracy of identification was up to ninety-seven percent. Gas chromatography (GC) is also an effective technique used to identify volatile organic compounds and other chemicals in milk. This method is considered highly accurate for identifying adulterated elements in milk. The use of these technologies will not only help in ensuring the quality of milk, but will also reduce the cases of adulteration. Therefore, it is necessary to take concrete steps, so that the purity of milk is maintained and the safety of people's health is ensured.Could get. These should be tested and implemented to effectively enforce strict food laws and penal provisions to deal with this crisis. The Food Safety and Standards Authority of India has made strict safety rules, but ensuring their effective compliance and proper implementation of the rules remains a big challenge. Even when adulteration is found in most of the milk products sold in the market, sometimes appropriate action is not taken against the culprits. This boosts the morale of criminals and the business of adulteration continues unhindered. for thisIt is necessary that strict legal action is taken against such milk producers, distributors and sellers. Food adulteration should be considered a serious crime and provisions should be made to impose heavy fines and harsh imprisonment on the culprits, so that such crime can be stopped. Apart from this, it is necessary to run public awareness campaigns so that consumers can check the milk they purchase themselves and be aware of adulteration. Through technological innova-

tions in milk products, consumers' awareness and alertness will increase, thereby making them better informed about their purchases. Take decisions and ensure availability of pure and safe milk products. It will be possible. Producers should understand that adulteration for short-term profits is playing with the health of the society. A research also proves that when adulterated sellers are identified, there is a decline of about forty percent in the sales of their products. Therefore, consumers should also prefer to buy milk from local sources to ensure purity. Milk from reliable sources Milk which causes cancerAdulteration is having a serious impact on the health system of our country, increasing the risk of cancer, heart, kidney and liver diseases. It is not the job of the government alone to control adulteration, but milk producers, traders and consumers also have to fulfill their moral responsibilities. There is a need for a joint effort against adulteration, in which the government, milk industry and consumers should work together. For this, it is necessary to promote strict laws, better testing systems and ethical awareness, so that its serious consequences can be avoided in future.Can be avoided.

'Barbenheimer' was a phenomenon impossible to manufacture. But, more than a year later, that hasn't stopped people from trying to make 'Glicked'— or even 'Babyratu'— happen.

The counter programming of 'Barbie' and 'Oppenheimer' in July 2023 hit a nerve culturally and had the receipts to back it up. Unlike so many things that begin as memes, it transcended its online beginnings.

Instead of an either-or, the two movies ultimately complemented and boosted one another at the box office.

And ever since, movie-goers, marketers and meme makers have been trying to recreate that moment, searching the movie release schedule for odd mashups and sending candidates off into the social media void. Most attempts have fizzled.

This weekend is perhaps the closest approximation yet as the Broadway musical adaptation 'Wicked' opens Friday against the chest-thumping sword-and-sandals epic 'Gladiator II'.

Two big studio releases (Universal and Paramount), with onename titles, opposite tones and aesthetics and big blockbuster energy — it was already halfway there before the name game began: 'Wickiator', 'Wadiator', 'Gladwick' and even the eyebrow raising 'Gladicked' have all been suggested.

"'Glicked' rolls off the tongue a little bit more," actor Fred Hechinger said at the New York screening of 'Gladiator II' this week. "I think we should all band around 'Glicked'. It gets too confusing if you have four or five different names for it."

As with 'Barbenheimer', as reductive as it might seem, 'Glicked' also has the male/female divide that make the fan art extra silly.

One is pink and bright and awash in sparkles, tulle, Broadway bangers and brand tie-ins; the other is all sweat and sand, blood and bulging muscles.

Both films topped Fandango's most anticipated holiday movie survey, where 65 per cent of respondents said that they were interested in the 'Glicked' double feature.

Theatres big and small are also pulling out the stops with movie-themed tie-ins. B&B Theatres will have Roman guards tearing tickets at some locations and Maximus popcorn tubs.

Marcus Theaters is doing Oz photo ops and friendship brace-let-making. Alamo Drafthouse is leaning into the singalong aspect (beware, though, not all theatres are embracing this) and the punny drinks like 'Defying Gravi-Tea'.

"Rather than it being in competition, I think they're in conversation," 'Gladiator II' star Paul Mescal said. "This industry needs a shot in the arm. Those films gave it last year. We hope to do it this year."

And the hope is that audiences will flock to theatres to be part of this moment as well. It's a sorely needed influx of could-be block-busters into a marketplace that's still at an 11 per cent deficit from last year and down 27.2 per cent from 2019, according to data from Comscore.

"Competition is good for the marketplace. It's good for consumers," said Michael O'Leary, the president and CEO of the National Association of Theatre Owners. "Having two great movies coming out at the same time is simply a multiplier effect."

'Glicked' is currently tracking for a combined North American debut in the USD 165 million range, with "Wicked" forecast to earn around USD 100 million (up from the USD 80 million estimates a few weeks ago) and 'Gladiator II' pegged for the USD 65 million range.

'Barbenheimer' shattered its projections last July. Going into that weekend, 'Barbie' had been pegged for USD 90 million and 'Oppenheimer' around USD 40 million. Ultimately, they brought in a combined USD 244 million in that first outing, and nearly USD 2.4 billion by the end of their runs.

It's possible 'Glicked' will exceed expectations, too. And it has the advantage of another behemoth coming close behind: 'Moana 2', which opens just five days later on the Wednesday before the Thanksgiving holiday. 'Glickedana' triple feature anyone?

"These are 10 important days," O'Leary said. "It's going to show the movie going audience that there's a lot of compelling stuff out there for them to see." There are infinite caveats to the imperfect comparison to 'Barbenheimer', as well. 'Wicked' is a 'Part One'. Musicals carry their own baggage with moviegoers, even those based on wildly successful productions (ahem, 'Cats'). "Gladiator II" got a head start and opened internationally last weekend.

In fact, in the UK, it played alongside 'Paddington in Peru', where that double was pegged 'Gladdington'. 'Gladiator' reviews, while positive, are a little more divided than the others. And neither directors Ridley Scott nor Jon M Chu has the built-in box office cache that Christopher Nolan's name alone carries at the moment.

The new films also cost more than 'Barbie' (USD 145 million) and 'Oppenheimer' (USD 100 million). According to reports, 'Gladiator II' had a USD 250 million price tag; 'Wicked' reportedly cost USD 150 million to produce (and that does not include the cost of the second film, due next year).

NEW DELHI, Nov 23 (Agencies): The Indian Army is set to induct domain experts into its regular cadre to ensure a technologically advanced and battle-ready force. This initiative, announced by Deputy Chief of Army Staff Lieutenant General Rakesh Kapoor, marks a significant step in restructuring the Army in line with global military advancement.

Addressing the media, Lieutenant General Kapoor said that the Army is actively monitoring recent global conflicts to adapt its structure, strategy, and operational approach to the challenges of modern warfare.

As part of this transformation, the Army plans to recruit specialists in critical domains such as information warfare, cybersecurity, linguistics, and IT at both officer and non-commissioned officer (NCO) levels.

PILOT SUCCESS AND RECRUITMENT PLANS

A pilot project for the induction of domain specialists has already been conducted and



was successful. The first phase of regular recruitment will feature 17 specialised entries, including five for strategic linguistic experts.

Officers will be recruited at the postgraduate level, while soldiers will be inducted at the graduate level. The selection process will include Service Selection Board (SSB) interviews, with advertisements for the new entries expected to be released soon. The induction of these specialists will be for men and women both to ensure gender neutrality in the armed

### Something is fishy, there's a big conspiracy: Raut on poll trends suggesting Mahayuti's win



MUMBAI, Nov 23 (Agencies): Shiv Sena (UBT) leader Sanjay Raut on Saturday alleged that there was a "big conspiracy" and something was "fishy" in the Maharashtra assembly poll results with trends suggesting a landslide victory for the Mahayuti combine.

Talking to reporters, he said the poll results do not reflect people's mandate as the situation was very different on the ground and there was palpable anger against the government.

"I see a big conspiracy in this...This is not a mandate of Marathi 'manoos' and farmers," he said.

"We do not accept this as people's mandate. Something is fishy in the election results," Raut added.

There was no doubt that money was used in the polls, he alleged.

"How can all MLAs of Chief Minister Eknath Shinde win? How can Ajit Pawar, whose betrayal angered Maharashtra, win?" the Rajya Sabha MP asked.

The ruling BJP-led Mahayuti alliance appeared set to retain power in the state, and was leading in 204 of the 288 assembly seats, as per the latest figures by the Election Commission.

The opposition Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) was stumbling, with its candidates leading in just 47 seats, as per the early trends.

In the ruling Mahayuti alliance, the BJP contested 149 assembly seats, Shiv Sena 81 seats, and the Ajit Pawar-led NCP fielded candidates in 59 constituencies.

In the MVA combine, the Congress fielded 101 candidates, Shiv Sena (UBT) 95, and NCP (SP) put up 86 candidates.

### **Mobile internet suspension** extended for two days in Manipur

MPHAL, Nov 23 (Agencies): The Manipur Government on Saturday extended suspension of mobile internet services for two days in seven districts of the state, according to an order.

Amid escalating violence, the administration suspended the services on November 16 for two days to prevent anti-social elements from spreading content that might create law and order problems. It has been extended several times since then.

"The state government after reviewing the prevailing law and order situation has decided to



continue suspension of mobile internet services in Imphal West, Imphal East, Kakching, Bishnupur, Thoubal, Churachandpur and Kangpokpi for another two days in public interests," the order issued by the

home department said. Internet services were suspended on November 16 after violence broke out in the state following recovery of bodies of three women and three children. The Manipur Government had lifted the suspension on broadband services on November 19, considering the hardships faced by common people, healthcare facilities, educational institu-

### Delhi's air quality slips back to 'severe' with AQI at 420

NEW DELHI, Nov 23 (Agencies): Delhi's air quality slipped back to the 'severe' category on Saturday morning with an AQI of 420 while the minimum temperature was recorded at 11.4 degrees Celsius.

Out of 38 monitoring stations, nine recorded air quality in the 'severe plus' category with AQI exceeding 450. Nineteen other sta-

tions recorded 'severe' air quality with AQI levels between 400 and 450.

The remaining stations recorded AQIs in the 'very poor' category.

The humidity level was 97 per cent at 8.30 am. The maximum and minimum temperatures are expected to settle at 25 and 12 degrees Celsius respectively.



Delhi's air quality has remained hazardous for over 20 days. On October 30, it first slipped into the 'very poor' category and stayed there

for 15 days. It worsened further last Sunday as Delhi recorded 'severe' air quality and stayed so on Monday and Tuesday. By Wednesday, the air quality was in the 'severe plus' category.

Favorable wind conditions brought slight relief on Thursday but the air quality began deteriorating again, nearing the 'severe' category, on Friday.

# claims diet helped wife beat cancer

Oncologists at Tata Memorial Hospital asserted that there was no evidence to support Navjot Sidhu's remarks that his wife overcame cancer following a strict dietary regimen.

NEW DELHI, Nov 23 (Agencies): After Congress leader Navjot Sidhu revealed that his wife overcame cancer following a strict dietary regimen, oncologists advised patients not to follow "unproven remedies" while asserting that there was no evidence to support the former cricketer's remarks. The director at Tata Memorial Hospital, in a statement, slammed the unscientific and baseless recommendations.

"Parts of the video imply that starving the cancer by not eating dairy products and sugar, consuming haldi (turmeric) and neem helped cure her 'incurable' cancer... These comments have no high quality evidence to support them," Dr CS Pramesh said.

The statement was signed by



262 present and former oncologists of the Tata Memorial Hospital. The statement further said that there was no clinical data to recommend the use of neem and haldi as anti-cancer agents.

In a press conference, Sidhu revealed that his wife, Navjot Kaur, overcame stage 4 cancer following a simple dietary and lifestyle regimen. He claimed that Kaur, who was given a 5% chance to survive, was discharged from hospital after 40

Sidhu said his wife's diet included turmeric, neem water, apple cider vinegar, lemon

water. This was coupled with strict avoidance of sugar and carbohydrates and intermittent fasting.

The oncologists urged cancer patients not to delay their treatment by following unproven remedies. "Cancer is curable if detected early and proven treatments for cancer include surgery, radiation therapy and chemotherapy," read the state-

Dr Pramesh, posting a clip of Sidhu's press conference on X, said one should not get "fooled" by such claims.

"These are unscientific and baseless recommendations. She got surgery and chemotherapy that were evidence based which is what made her cancer-free. Not the haldi, neem etc," he said.

### Israeli airstrike hits central Beirut, security **sources say**

At least four people were killed and 23 wounded

BEIRUT, Nov 23 (Agencies): A powerful Israeli airstrike targeted central Beirut on Saturday, security sources said, shaking the Lebanese capital as Israel pressed its offensive against the Iran-backed Hezbollah group.

At least four people were killed and 23 wounded in the attack in Beirut's Basta neighbourhood, Hezbollah's al-Manar broadcaster reported, citing the health ministry.

Lebanon's National News Agency said early on Saturday that the attack resulted in a large number of fatalities and injuries and destroyed an eight-storey building. Footage broadcast by Lebanon's Al Jadeed station showed at least one destroyed building and several others badly dam-



aged around it. The blasts shook the capital around 4 a.m. (0200 GMT), agency witnesses said. Security

sources said at least four bombs were dropped in the attack. It marked the fourth Israeli airstrike this week targeting a central area of Beirut, where the

bulk of Israel's attacks have tar-

geted the Hezbollah-controlled southern suburbs. On Sunday an Israeli airstrike killed a Hezbollah media official in the Ras al-Nabaa district of central

Israel has killed several leaders of its long-time foe Hezbollah in air strikes on Beirut's southern suburbs.

Israel launched a major offensive against Hezbollah in Lebanon in September, following nearly a year of cross-border hostilities ignited by the Gaza war, pounding wide areas of Lebanon with airstrikes and sending troops into the south.

The conflict began when Hezbollah opened fire in solidarity with its Palestinian ally Hamas after it launched the Oct. 7, 2023 attack on southern Israel.

A U.S. mediator travelled to

Lebanon and Israel this week in an effort to secure a ceasefire. The envoy, Amos Hochstein, indicated progress had been made after meetings in Beirut on Tuesday and Wednesday, before going to meet Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu and Defence Minister Israel Katz.

### At least 33 killed in fighting between armed groups in northwestern Pakistan

PESHAWAR, Nov 23 (Agencies): Fighting between armed Sunni and Shiite groups in northwestern Pakistan killed at least 33 people and injured 25 others, a senior police officer from the region said Saturday.

The overnight violence was the latest to rock Kurram, a district in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province, and comes days after a deadly gun ambush killed 42 people.

Shiite Muslims make up about 15% of the 240 million people in Sunnimajority Pakistan, which has a history of sectarian animosity between the communities.

Although the two groups generally live together peacefully, ten-

sions remain, especially in Kurram.

The senior police officer said armed men in Bagan and Bacha Kot torched shops, houses and government property.

Intense gunfire was ongoing between the Alizai and Bagan tribes in the Lower Kurram area.

"Educational institutions in Kurram are closed due to the severe tension.

Both sides are targeting each other with heavy and automatic weapons," said the officer, who spoke anonymously because he was not authorized to speak to the media.

Videos shared with agency showed a market engulfed by fire and orange flames piercing the night sky. Gunfire can also be heard.

The location of Thursday's attack was also targeted by armed men, who marched on the

Survivors of the gun ambush said assailants emerged from a vehicle and sprayed buses and cars with bullets. Nobody has claimed responsibility for the attack and police have not identified a motive.

Dozens of people from the district's Sunni and Shiite communities have been killed since July, when a land dispute erupted in Kurram that later turned into general sectarian violence.

### Bushra Bibi faces non-bailable arrest warrant in GBP 190 million corruption case

RAWALPINDI. Nov 23 (Agencies): A Rawalpindi accountability court has issued nonbailable arrest warrants for Bushra Bibi, the wife of Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founder Imran Khan, in connection with the GBP 190 million corruption case linked to the Al-Qadir University Trust, agency reported.

The court, presided over by Judge Nasir Javed Rana, issued the arrest warrants following the ongoing investigation into the alleged financial discrepancies involving the former prime minister and his family.

Former Pakistan Prime Minister Imran Khan was also presented before the court in connection with the case. Despite the new arrest warrants. both Khan and his wife Bushra Bibi had previously been granted bail by the Islamabad High Court (IHC) in relation to the National Crime Agency (NCA) settlement reference concerning the GBP 190 million.

The IHC's two-member bench, headed by Chief Justice Aamer Faroog and Justice Tarig Mehmood Jahangiri, had



reserved its verdict after hearing the case. In a short order, the court had instructed the authorities to release Imran Khan against a surety bond of PKR 1 million, reported

Meanwhile, Bushra Bibi, in a separate development, issued a video message urging PTI supporters to participate in the party's planned protest on November 24. She referred to the protest as a "final or door-die" call, urging party workers to rally against the government.

She claimed that negative propaganda against her family started after their visit to Madinah, Saudi Arabia, followed by calls for her character assassination and accusations against her husband, Imran Khan, of being a "Jewish agent." The National Account-

ability Bureau (NAB) had launched an investigation into the alleged gain of hundreds of acres of land under the Al-Qadir University Trust, with the claim that it caused a loss of GBP 190 million to the national treasury.

> According to the charges, Imran Khan and others accused in the case allegedly misallocated PKR 50 billion (equivalent to GBP 190 million at the time) that had been sent by the UK's National Crime Agency (NCA) to the Pakistani government, agency reported.

In response, NAB filed a corruption reference involving Imran Khan, his wife Bushra Bibi, and six other individuals related to the Al-Qadir University project, which was registered on December 26, 2019.

### Philippine vice president publicly threatens to have the president assassinated

MANILA, Nov 23 (Agencies): Philippine Vice President Sara **Duterte said Saturday** she has contracted an assassin to kill the president, his wife and the House of Representatives speaker if she herself is killed, in a brazen public threat that she warned was not a joke.

Executive Secretary Lucas Bersamin referred the "active threat" against President Ferdinand Marcos Jr. to an elite presidential guards force "for immediate proper action." It was not immediately clear what actions would be taken against the vice president.

"Acting on the vice president's clear and unequivocal statement that she had contracted an assassin to kill the president if an alleged plot against her succeeds, the Executive Secretary has referred this active threat to the Presidential Security Command for immediate proper action," a government statement said.

"Any threat to the life of the president must always be taken seriously, more so that this



threat has been publicly revealed in clear and certain terms," it said.

Marcos ran with Duterte as his vicepresidential running mate in the May 2022 elections and both won with landslide victories on a campaign call of national unity.

The two leaders and their camps, however, rapidly had a bitter falling-out over key differences, including in their approaches to China's aggressive actions in the disputed South China Sea. Duterte resigned from the Marcos Cabinet in June as education secretary and head of an anti-insurgency body.

Like her equally outspoken father, former President Rodrigo Duterte, the vice president became a vocal critic of Marcos, his wife

Liza Araneta-Marcos and House Speaker Martin Romualdez, the president's ally and second cousin, accusing them of corruption, incompetence and politically persecuting the Duterte family and its close supporters.

Her latest tirade was set off by the decision by House members allied with Romualdez and Marcos to detain her chief of staff, Zuleika Lopez, who was accused of hampering a congressional inquiry into the possible misuse of her budget as vice president and education secretary. Lopez was later transferred to a hospital after falling ill and wept when she heard of a plan to temporarily lock her up in a women's prison.

In a pre-dawn online news conference, an angry Sara Duterte accused Marcos of incompetence as a president and of being a liar, along with his wife and the House speaker in expletives-laden remarks.

When asked about concerns over her security, the 46-yearold lawyer suggested there was an unspecified plot to kill her. "Don't worry about my security because I've talked with somebody. I said 'if I'm killed, you'll kill BBM, Liza Araneta and Martin Romualdez. No joke, no joke," the vice president said without elaborating and using the initials that many use to call the president.

"I've given my order, 'If I die, don't stop until you've killed them.' And he said, 'yes,'" the vice president said.

Under the Philippine penal code, such public remarks may constitute a crime of threatening to inflict a wrong on a person or his family and is punishable by a jail term and fine.

Amid the political divisions, military chief Gen. Romeo Brawner issued a statement with an assurance that

the 160,000-member Armed Forces of the Philippines would remain nonpartisan "with utmost respect for our democratic institutions and civilian authority."

"We call for calm and resolve," Brawner said. "We reiterate our need to stand together against those who will try to break our bonds as Filipinos."

The vice president is the daughter of Marcos' predecessor, Rodrigo Duterte, whose policeenforced anti-drugs crackdown when he was a city mayor and later as president left thousands of mostly petty drug suspects dead in killings that the International Criminal Court has been investigating as a possible crime against humanity.

The former president denied authorize ing extrajudicial killings under his crackdown but has given conflicting statements. He told a public Philippine Senate inquiry last month that he had maintained a "death squad" of gangsters to kill other criminals when he was mayor of southern Davao city.

### South Korea will not attend Sado mines memorial event in Japan amid lingering historical tensions

SEOUL, Nov 23 (Agencies): South Korea's government said Saturday it will not attend a memorial service near Japan's Sado Island Gold Mines due to disagreements with Tokyo over the event, which stirred longstanding tensions over the abuse of Korean forced laborers at the site before the end of World War II.

The decision marked a rare display of friction between the countries since the 2022 inauguration of South Korean President Yoon Suk Yeol. Yoon has prioritized improving relations with Japan following years of disputes over their bitter history and solidifying threeway security cooperation with Washington to counter North Korean nuclear threats, but has faced accusations at home that he was

neglecting the suffering of Korean survivors.

South Korea's Foreign Ministry said in a statement it was impossible to settle the disagreements between both governments before the planned event near the mines on Sunday. Japanese officials had no immediate comment. Some South Koreans had criticized Yoon's government for throwing its support behind an event without securing a clear Japanese commitment to highlight the

South Korean sentiment over the event worsened after the Japanese government said this week it would send Akiko Ikuina, a parliamentary vice minister, to the event. Ikuina had reportedly visited Tokyo's controversial Yasukuni Shrine

following her election as a lawmaker in 2022. The shrine honors the country's 2.5 million war dead, including convicted war criminals. Japan's neighbors view the shrine as a symbol of the country's past militarism.

In an interview with MBN television, South Korean Foreign Minister Cho Tae-yul acknowledged that Ikuina's Yasukuni visit was an issue of contention between the countries' diplomats. "That issue and vari-

ous other disagreements between diplomatic officials remain unresolved, and with only a few hours remaining until the event, we concluded that there wasn't sufficient time to resolve these differences," Cho said. "We notified them of our decision in the afternoon."

There were also complaints over South Korea agreeing to pay for the travel expenses of Korean victims' family members who were invited to attend the ceremony. Ties between Seoul

and Tokyo have long

been complicated by grievances related to Japan's brutal rule of the Korean Peninsula from 1910 to 1945, when hundreds of thousands of Koreans were mobilized as forced laborers for Japanese companies, or sex slaves at Tokyo's military-run brothels during World War II. Many forced laborers are already dead and survivors are in their 90s.

Historians say hundreds of Koreans were forced to labor at the Sado mines under abusive and brutal conditions during World War II. Japan's government has said Sunday's ceremony will pay tribute to "all workers" who died at the mines, without specifying who they are. Critics saw this as part of a persistent policy of whitewashing Japan's history of sexual and labor exploitation before and during the war. The 16th-century

mines on the island of Sado, off the western coast of Niigata prefecture, operated for nearly 400 years before closing in 1989 and were once the world's largest gold producer. The mines were designated as a UNESCO World Heritage site earlier this year after Tokyo and Seoul settled a yearslong dispute. South Korea withdrew its opposition to the list-

ing after Japan agreed

to acknowledge Korean suffering more clearly in the site's exhibition and to include Koreans in a memorial ceremony.

In 2023, Yoon took a major step toward improving ties with Japan that had deteriorated for years over historical grievances and trade disputes, by announcing a plan to compensate Korean forced laborers from the colonial period without requiring contributions from Japanese companies.

Yoon's plan, which relies on money raised in South Korea, drew an immediate backlash at home from former forced laborers and their supporters, who had demanded direct compensation from the Japanese companies and a fresh apology from the Japanese government.

BANGKOK, Nov 23 (Agencies): The Laos government said Saturday it was "profoundly saddened" by the deaths of foreign tourists in Vang Vieng, with the toll from a suspected methanol poisoning incident

Two Danish citizens, an American, a Briton and two Australians have now died after being rushed to hospital following a night out in backpacker hot spot

They were among a group of about a dozen foreigners who fell ill and were rushed to hospital shortly after November 12.

In a statement on its website, Laos' Ministry of Foreign Affairs said Saturday it expressed "sincere sympathy and deepest condolences to the families of the deceased", adding an investigation was underway.

Australian Holly Bowles, 19, became the incident's latest fatality on Friday when she died in a Bangkok hospital surrounded by family.

Canberra is pressing Laotian authorities for a full and transparent investigation into what happened.

Vang Vieng has been a fixture on the Southeast Asia backpacker trail since Laos' secretive communist rulers opened the country to tourism decades ago.

The town was once synonymous with backpackers behaving badly at jungle parties but has since rebranded as an eco-tourism destination.

The Vietnamese manager of the Nana Backpackers Hostel where the tourists were staying has been detained for questioning, the Laos tourist police told

No charges have been filed thus far.

Police in Laos could not be reached for comment on Saturday.

As the Mahayuti walked the road towards power in a result that went ahead of what exit polls had predicted, on the other side of the spectrum was Shiv Sena (UBT) leader Sanjay Raut who alleged that there was a "big conspiracy" and something was "fishy".

"I see a big conspiracy in this...This is not a mandate of Marathi 'manoos' and farmers. We do not accept this as people's mandate," he said.

Adding that there was little doubt in his mind that money was used in the polls, Raut said, "How can all MLAs of Chief Minister Eknath Shinde win? How can Aiit Pawar, whose betrayal angered Maharashtra. win?"

Voters in the politically significant western state, which sends 48 MPs to the Lok Sabha and gave the MVA a decisive 30 seats, clearly decided to go against the trend of that parliamentary victory just five months ago.

Their mandate gives a fillip for the BJP, which won an unprecedented hat-trick in Haryana last month, and helps the party overcome some of its reverses in the general elections where it bagged just 240

The Maharashtra verdict — which gives primacy to the BJP within the Mahayuti alliance and opens up the possibility of a shift in power with Devendra Fadnavis as chief minister again - was the stuff of sober introspection too for the Congress and Maratha strongman Sharad Pawar.

The BJP was ahead in 125 seats, close to the halfway mark of 144 on its own, while the Shiv Sena had leads in 56 and the NCP in 35. In contrast, the Congress was ahead in just 21, the Shiv Sena(UBT) in 17 and the NCP(SP) in 13.

Maharashtra Chief Minister Shinde and his deputies Fadnavis and Ajit Pawar were leading in their respective assembly constituencies. Maharashtra Congress president Nana Patole was leading narrowly from Sakoli constituency and Shiv Sena (UBT) leader and sitting MLA Aaditya Thackeray was leading in Worli assembly seat. BJP MLC Darekar said, "Based on the current trends, I believe the BJP will be the single largest party and Devendra Fadna-

vis should become the chief minister." The Congress, for which Priyanka Gandhi's win the Wayanad Lok Sabha bypoll is

the proverbial silver lining in a dark cloud, counted its reverses in Maharashtra. Its legislature party leader and former minister Balasaheb Thorat was trailing in Sangamner as was senior Congress leader and former chief minister Prithviraj Chavan in the Karad South assembly seat.

"It's devastating, heartbreaking for us ... The BJP is leading due to the amazing ground work they must've done and seat distribution," Congress spokesperson Lavanya Ballal told deKoder.

In the ruling Mahayuti alliance, the BJP contested 149 assembly seats, the Shiv Sena 81 seats, and the Ajit Pawar-led NCP in 59 constituencies. In the MVA combine. the Congress fielded 101 candidates, Shiv Sena(UBT) 95 and the NCP(SP) 86.

The results will decide the electoral fate of 1.211 candidates in Jharkhand, including Soren, his wife Kalpana from Gandey, former CM and BJP state president Babulal Marandi from Dhanwar and ex-CM Champai Soren from Seraikela.

Other prominent candidates include Speaker Rabindra Nath Mahato of the JMM from Nala, Deepika Pandey Singh of Congress from Mahagama, Sita Soren (sister-in-law of CM Hemant Soren) from Jamtara, AJSU Party chief Sudesh Mahto

senger ropeway project between Tarakote Marg to Sanji Chhat along the 12-kilometre track to the shrine after shelving the project in the past due to similar protests.

While shops and business establishments remained open in Katra town, the base camp for pilgrims visiting the shrine, shopkeepers along the trek route downed shutters for the second day, the officials said. Pony and palanquin owners also stayed away, causing hardships to many pilgrims during their journey.

The protesters assembled at Shalimar Park in Katra town and held a peaceful sit-in, raising slogans against the shrine

"The ropeway project will be completed within the next two years and lead to the loss of opportunity to earn livelihood for the service providers. The government should come out with a proper rehabilitation plan for the poor labourers who will get affected by this project," senior Congress leader Bhupinder Singh Jamwal said in an address to the protesters.

Suggesting a financial assistance of Rs 20 lakh for each affected person, he said they would meet on Sunday to chalk out the future course of action.

The shopkeepers and pony and palanquin owners — who routinely assist thousands of pilgrims — are apprehensive that the ropeway will render them jobless.

"We will not allow the ropeway project to be implemented in Katra. We have been fighting against it for three years. Assurances were given to us in the past but now they have gone ahead with the project," shopkeepers' association leader Prabhat Singh said.

Asserting that the project would hurt the region's economy, Singh said thousands of families relied on the earnings from business establishments and services for

"We have started our 72-hour strike. If they do not concede to our demand of shelving the project, we will continue with the strike," he added.

Last week, the shrine board announced implementation of the long-awaited ropeway project to facilitate a safer and faster journey for the pilgrims.

"The ropeway project will be a game changer, especially for those pilgrims who find it challenging to undertake the steep trek to the shrine," shrine board CEO Anshul Garg had said.

With Donald Trump's recent victory, India is projected to have a good relationship with the US compared to the outgoing Democrat President. Further he mentioned that establishing robust ties with the Gulf countries has been another achievement of India's diplomacy over the years and India has leveraged its maritime ties in forging strong ties in the energy and economic sector in this region. The millions of India's expatriate population in the Gulf region is another asset to India's economy and diplomacy.

The Chancellor also held that India's performance in the international system is based on its impressive economic growth in the post-liberalization period.

The international institutions have been projecting the brighter prospects for this growth. This becomes important as strong foreign policy and bold negotiations of a nation are dependent on its

economic power. Concluding the lecture, Amb (Retd.) G. Parthasarathy emphasized that any country's dynamic foreign policy should rely on its national interest, which is based on its national consensus. India has been successful in forging a consensus over national interest and balancing its economic resilience and defence preparedness.

The lecture was followed by interesting questions from the audience about India's contemporary issues with Pakistan and China

### Ramnagar Sexual Harassment Case Accused sentenced to one year Rigorous Imprisonment

RAMNAGAR, Nov 23: In a significant judgement, the Court of Judicial Magistrate First Class (Sub Judge) Ramnagar, Shabnam Sheikh, sentenced Mohd. Saleem, son of Mohd. Munshi, a resident of Ward No. 6, Ramnagar, to one year of rigorous imprisonment and imposed a fine of Rs. 2000. The verdict pertains to FIR No. 128/2016, registered under Sections 354-B and 448 of the RPC at Ramnagar Police Station.

According to the prosecution, on November 10, 2016, at around 11:00 PM, the accused unlawfully entered the complainant's house and physically assaulted her, outraging her modesty. On hearing her cries for help, her family intervened, forcing the accused to flee the scene. Before leaving, he allegedly issued threats, coercing the complainant to accept an illicit relationship or face dire consequences.

The accused denied the charges and opted for a trial. During the hearings, the prosecution, represented by Assistant Public Prosecutor presented witnesses and evidence.

The prosecution argued that the evidence on record clearly established the accused's guilt under the charged sec-

After examining the evidence and hearing arguments from both sides, the Sub Judge found the accused guilty. The court emphasized the seriousness of the offence and delivered the sentence, marking a significant step towards justice in cases of crimes against women.

### Sunil Gavaskar calls out fake blog post about **Bumrah, Kohli, threatens legal action**

PERTH, Nov 23 (Agencies): Former India cricketer Sunil Gavaskar has threatened legal action against a website that published an article under his name during the Perth Test match. A website named Cricket Ception published a column under Gavaskar's name with the headline 'A New Era in Leadership: Bumrah's Captaincy and Kohli's Leadership Revive Team India'. Gavaskar called out the same on Saturday, 23 November, stating that it was fake and he had written no such thing.

Gavaskar took to Instagram on Saturday, on Day 2 of the opening Test match of the Border-Gavaskar Trophy, and slammed the website. The legendary batter wrote: Never believe everything you see on the internet. The former batter is currently contracted with Star Sports - the broadcaster for the Border-Gavaskar Trophy.

Before the Perth Test match, Sunil Gavaskar had advocated that Jasprit Bumrah should captain India for the entire BGT 2024/25 in case Rohit Sharma misses the first two Test match-



"It is important for the captain to play the first Test match. It's different if he is injured, but if he is not available, then the deputy leader will be under a lot of pressure. I have been reading that Rohit Sharma might not play the first two Tests of the Australia series. I feel that, in that case the selection committee should appoint Jasprit Bumrah the captain of the side for the entire Australia tour, and tell Rohit Sharma that you will participate as a player in this series. For the first Test match, Rohit Sharma has to be there," Sunil Gavaskar said on Sports Tak.

Using his vast experience and tactical acumen, Bumrah unleashed a spell of unrelenting accuracy and pace, utilising the spicy Perth pitch to full effect. Within six overs, he dismissed both Australian openers, Nathan McSweeny and Usman Khawaja, sending a clear message that India was far from defeated.

The pivotal moment came when Bumrah sent Steve Smith back for a golden duck, dismantling one of Australia's most reliable pillars and swinging momentum firmly India's way. This inspired his bowling unit, with Mohammed Siraj's 2/17 and debutant Harshit Rana's 1/33 ensuring Australia's middle order had no room to recover.

Bumrah pushed himself hard, brining him back into the attack for two 2-over bursts in the final hour or the day's play. The move worked as he knocked over Pat Cummins, who can frustrate opposition attacks, to help India finish the opening day on a high.

### Syed Mushtaq Ali Trophy: Tilak Varma scripts T20 world record with mammoth 151

RAJKOT, Nov 23 (Agencies): Hyderabad captain Tilak Varma broke multiple records during a jaw-dropping 151-run knock against Meghalaya in the Syed Mushtaq Ali Trophy on Saturday. Tilak became the first batter to record three consecutive T20 centuries while scoring the highest individual T20 total by any Indian batter in Hyderabad's SMAT opener at the Saurashtra Cricket Association Stadium.

Tilak's blistering 151 off just 67 balls not only set up a mammoth total of 248/4 for Hyderabad but also broke multiple records. His score is now the highest individual total in the history of the Syed Mushtaq Ali Trophy, surpassing Shreyas Iyer's 147. This knock also made him the first Indian man to score 150 or more in a T20 match, further solidifying his reputation as one of the brightest talents in the game.

Coming in at No. 3, Tilak Varma dismantled the Meghalaya bowling attack with a breathtaking knock of 151 off 67 balls, studded with 14 fours and 10 sixes. Displaying a perfect blend of precision and power, he raced to his half-century in 28 balls and reached his century in 51. His innings propelled Hyderabad to a commanding total of 248/4, one of the highest in Syed Mushtaq Ali Trophy history.

Tilak's incredible innings follows backto-back T20I centuries for India earlier this month in Centurion and Johannesburg during the series against South Africa. With three centuries in 10 days across formats, Tilak has become the epitome of consistency in T20 cricket. His feat of scoring consecutive T201 hundreds places him alongside Sanju Samson as the only two Indians to achieve this milestone. Tilak is closing in on the 3,000-run milestone in T20 cricket. The young batter already boasts four centuries in T20s, further highlighting his ability to deliver matchwinning performances on big stages. Tilak's recent perfor-

mances have catapulted him to international acclaim, highlighted by his exploits during the South Africa series, where he earned the Player of the Series award and climbed to third place in the ICC T201 Men's Batting Rankings. Now the highest-rated Indian batter in T20Is, trailing only Australia's Travis Head and England's Phil Salt. Tilak's rising star has also made waves in the IPL, as the Mumbai Indians retained him as one of their five key players ahead of the 2025 auc-

### Tahlia McGrath to lead Australia side in women's ODI vs India in Healy's absence

SYDNEY, Nov 23 (Agencies): Veteran allrounder Tahlia McGrath was named as the captain of the 13-member Australian women's side against India in regular skipper Alyssa Healy's absence in the threematch ODI series next month. The 34-year-old Alyssa has been troubled by a knee injury, which had ruled her out during the fag end of the Women's Big Bash League and also forced her to skip the ODI series against India, beginning in Brisbane on December 5.

Queensland Sydney Thunder batter Georgia Voll has been included in her first Australia squad with captain Alyssa Healy to miss the India series due to a knee injury. Voll has had a stellar start to the summer with the bat and currently sits in the top three run scorers in the Weber WBBL and Women's National Cricket League. The 21-yearold has scored four halfcenturies across both tournaments, including scores of 98, 97 and 92.

Australia will play three One-Day Internationals against India from 5-11 December in Brisbane and Perth, with three ODIs against T20 world champions New Zealand to follow from 19-23 December in Wellington. All six matches form part of the ICC Women's Championship, with Australia currently sitting first in the standings

JEDDAH, Nov 23 (Agencies): The bids on Rishabh Pant could well soar like his audacious no-look six at Perth as he seems poised to become the highest paid player among the 577 who will go under the hammer at the twoday IPL mega auction starting here on Sunday.

There will be INR 641.5 crores cumulatively in the kitty of 10 teams with 204 possible slots to be filled but one can be rest assured that all eyes will be trained on Pant's name when it comes up.

Punjab Kings, with INR 110.50 crore in their coffers, are ready to outbid the other franchises.

Royal Challengers crore, can be another serious bidder, so can be Delhi Capitals, who have INR 73 crore and a Right To Match (RTM) card to get their skipper for past few seasons back.

However, it is reliably learnt that Pant doesn't want DC to flash the RTM card as their parting of ways has not been the most pleasant and he no longer feels a part of the franchise. His comment that "my Retention wasn't about money for sure" is a reflection of his thought process.

But the biggest question will be whether Pant can become the first Indian player to breach the INR Rs 25 crore mark? The answer lies in how the 10 franchises are stacked up and how



they are looking at their team composition.

A Chennai Super Kings (CSK) or Mumbai Indians (MI), with only Rs 45 crore, wouldn't even be going for the star keeper-batter.

But Punjab Kings, known for changing their team every two years, have kept their entire purse on advice of their head coach Ricky Ponting, who wants to reunite with his favourite player.

There are 81 players bracketed in INR two crore category base price and two sets of marquee players but one can trust the current India internationals to breach the million dollar mark (INR 8.5 crore).

If Pant would be the cynosure of this auction, Arshdeep Singh, with a staggering 96 T20 International wickets in three seasons, can easily have multiple teams going for him.

Punjab has the RTM card but they wouldn't know where the biddidn't take too kindly to. He is playing the Syed Mushtaq Ali Trophy and how his bidding goes would be noteworthy.

Other names to watch

1) Khaleel Ahmed: Those who won't be able to get Arshdeep can go whole hog for Khaleel. Since Yash Dayal has also been retained by RCB, Khaleel could end up getting handsome bids. He hasn't exactly shown his potential over the years but it is the demand-supply equation that can get him a million dollar deal.

2) Deepak Chahar: Injuries have pegged him back in past few years but there is no better swing bowler in Powerplay overs in Indian conditions like Chahar. Multiple franchises could bid for him. He has played Ranji Trophy and picked up a five-for and has not been unfit so far.

3) Avesh Khan:

He had 19 wickets last season for Rajasthan Royals and went for Rs 10 crore. He might once again fetch a bid as good as that if not better. 4) Harshal Patel:

It is that time of the year when people are left stunned as Harshal's name comes up and he walks away with a million dollar contract. He will once again be a hot property even though he is no longer considered good for national selection. But 24 wickets last season mean that he

5) Bhuvneshwar Kumar:

won't be ignored.

Indian seam and swing bowlers controlling powerplay overs are a rare commodity and experience isn't readily available in the Supermarket. He might not grab eyeballs but if he remains under Rs 10 crore, he could still be a bargain buy and world knows MS Dhoni (CSK's 'Real Captain') likes experienced blokes around him.

6) Jos Buttler:

It is unlikely that Yashasvi Jaiswal will get to pair up with his favourite 'Jos Bhai' but the Englishman, in the absence of Ben Stokes, could well be the highest paid foreign player. ### Harshit has potential to become multi-format bowler for India: Coach Negi

NEW DELHI, Nov 23 (Agencies): Harshit Rana's meteoric rise might have come as a surprise to many but not his coach in his formative years, NS Negi, who has seen the strapping youngster mature into a pacer with the "potential to become a multi-format bowler for India".

Starting as a net bowler with Gujarat Titans in 2022, Harshit played a key role in guiding Kolkata Knight Riders to IPL glory in 2024, and announced his arrival on the international stage with a dream debut in the opening Border-Gavaskar Test at Perth, where he returned figures of 48 for 3 in the first innings.

Negi, Harshit's coach from his U19 days in Delhi, couldn't hide his joy on seeing his ward's exploits on a bouncy and seaming Perth pitch.

"Harshit is a very talented bowler. He had been bowling extremely well in the last two seasons of the Ranji Trophy. Last year, when I was the fielding coach of the Delhi Ranji team, he made his debut and bowled extremely well.

"It is just the beginning; he is one such player who should go on and play at least 70-80 Test matches for India...in fact he should go on and play all three formats for India," Negi told agency in an interview.

Rana inclusion in the side raised many eyebrows given the fact that he had just 10-odd first-class games under his belt. But Negi felt this was the right time to debut him in Tests given his amazing bowling statistics.

In 10 first-class matches, Harshit has taken 43 wickets at 24.00 and has an



impressive batting average of 42.63, including a blazing unbeaten 122 against North-East Zone.

Negi and Rana met in 2018 when the fast

bowler was selected to play for the Delhi U19 team. Negi, who has also been associated as a fielding coach with Gujarat Titans in the IPL, said that Harshit always had the drive to bowl fast but gradual improvements in fitness played a big role in his

"In 2018, when I was the head coach of the Delhi U19 team, I noted that he had a very smooth action and a good rhythm. He could bat well. He worked on his fitness and pace and gradually improved as a bowler.

"The most important thing is that he is a fighter. When I first picked Mayank (Yadav) and Harshit in the team, they were both very raw but promising. I just hope that he continues to work on his fitness and gradually keeps increasing his pace," said Negi.

Negi believes that Harshit has the ability to come good with the bat lower down the order. His advice to the youngster is to learn as much as possible from pace spearhead Jasprit Bumrah and keep bowling to his strengths to succeed in interna-

Bumrah.

"He is a good batter as well and in the coming years may perform well with the bat as well. He is someone who can easily score 30-40 odd runs batting lower down the order for India.

"Harshit should keep a check on his fitness and try to learn a lot from the modernday legend, Jasprit Bumrah. He just needs to back his strengths while bowling and that will help him succeed in the international cricket... he has the talent, bounce and pace", concluded Negi.
